

Third wave may not happen if strong steps taken: Scientific Advisor

U-TURN

"If we take strong steps and measures, the third wave may not happen in all the places or indeed anywhere at all. It all depends on how much the guidelines are effectively implemented at local level."

Two days after warning that the third wave of Covid is inevitable, Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government, K. VijayRaghavan on Friday stepped back, saying that it may not happen if strong steps and measures are taken.

Asked about reports of mucormycosis among Covid-19 patients, NITI Aayog's Member, Health, Prof V.K. Paul said: "Mucormycosis (Black Fungus) is detected mostly in diabetic patients. We want to reassure that there is no major outbreak and we are doing proper surveillance of the situation."

He pointed out that there are three factors triggering this fungal infection: uncontrolled diabetes,



immunosuppression because of steroids or any other disease and exposure to a wet surface. "Mucormycosis is absolutely preventable and if one's diabetes is under control, there is no reason to worry," Paul said.

Meanwhile, Additional Secretary, Health, Arti Ahuja said: "States and UTs, including Delhi, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Jharkhand and Uttar Pradesh, are showing early signs of plateauing or decrease in daily new Covid cases."

INDIA RECORDS 4.14L NEW COVID CASES, 3,915 DEATHS

New Delhi: India has recorded 4,14,188 fresh Covid-19 cases in the last 24 hours -- the highest so far, along with 3,915 fatalities, taking the total number of cases in the country to 2,14,91,598, the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare said on Friday. It is the third time after May 1 that India has crossed the four lakh mark of active cases in last 24 hours. On Thursday, India recorded 4,12,262 cases. It is the 15th straight day when India recorded more than three lakh cases while over 3,000 casualties have been reported for the last nine days. India's total tally of Covid-19 cases now stands at 2,14,91,598 with 36,45,164 active cases and a total of 2,34,083 deaths, so far.

REMDESIVIR ALLOCATION MADE TILL MAY 16 ACROSS THE COUNTRY: GOWDA

New Delhi: Union Minister for Chemicals and Fertilisers D. V. Sadananda Gowda on Friday said that the allocation of Remdesivir vials across the country has been made up to May 16, so that no patient faces any difficulty amid the pandemic. Considering the requirement of Remdesivir in every state and ensuring its adequate availability, allocation of Remdesivir made up to May 16, said a letter written to all the states by the Department of Pharmaceuticals and the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

CENTRE HAS TO SUPPLY 700 MT OXYGEN TO DELHI DAILY: SC

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Friday said the Centre has to supply 700 MT of oxygen to Delhi every day till further orders. A bench comprising Justices D.Y. Chandrachud and M.R. Shah said: "We want 700 MT to be supplied to Delhi and we mean business. It has to be supplied and we don't want to be coercive." Senior advocate Rahul Mehra, counsel representing the Delhi government, submitted before the bench that the Delhi government has received 86 MT on Friday till 9 a.m. and 16 MT of oxygen is in transit.

TELANGANA TO GIVE ONLY SECOND DOSE OF COVID VACCINE

Hyderabad: In view of shortage of the Covid-19 vaccines, health authorities in Telangana on Friday decided to vaccinate only those awaiting their second dose. From Saturday, vaccine will be given to only those due for second dose, Director of Public Health Dr G. Srinivasa Rao told reporters. This arrangement will continue till May 12. However, there will be no vaccination on Sunday.

My values not in consonance with EC: Poll panel counsel resigns in SC

"It was an honour to represent the Election Commission of India (ECI). However, I have found that my values are not in consonance with the current functioning of the ECI; and hence I withdraw myself from the responsibilities of its panel counsel before the Supreme Court of India."

Advocate Mohit D. Ram, who was on the Panel Counsel for the Election Commission before the Supreme Court has tendered his resignation from the position.

The letter dated May 6, and was addressed to the director of law of the Election Commission. His association with EC started in 2013 when he was appointed as standing counsel for the poll body. Ram later became one of its panel counsel.



In the letter, Ram said he will undertake to ensure smooth transition of files, NOC and vakalatnamas in all pending matters with his office. On Thursday, the Supreme Court had dismissed a plea by Election Commission, which sought a gag on media from reporting oral observations made by judges during court proceedings. However, Ram was not part of this matter.

The Election Commission had moved the top court against the strong observation made by the Madras High Court against it saying that the poll body should probably be put up for murder charges, as it failed to curb the "wanton abuse" of Covid-19 protocol during election rallies.

RaGa writes to NaMo, criticises Covid, vax strategy

"I am compelled to write to you once more as the Covid-19 tsunami continues to ravage our country unabated. In such an unprecedented crisis, the people of India must be your foremost priority. I urge you to do everything in your power to stop the needless suffering that our people are going through."

Former Congress President Rahul Gandhi on Friday wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi saying his government's lack of a clear and coherent Covid and vaccination strategy, as well as his hubris in declaring premature victory as the virus was exponentially spreading, has placed India in a highly dangerous position.

He also said that government's failures have made another national lockdown almost inevitable, and to prevent a repeat of the manifold suffering caused by last year's lockdown, the government must act with compassion and provide critical financial and food support to "our most vulnerable people".



This is his second letter to the Prime Minister within a month. He has earlier written to Modi on April 9 calling for vaccinations to be opened up to "everyone who needs it" and an immediate halt on vaccine exports, predicting "catastrophic effects" on the economy if inoculations continued at the current pace. He further said that but it is also important to understand India's responsibility in a globalised and interconnected world.

RURAL WESTERN UTTAR PRADESH GRAPPLES WITH COVID-19

Lucknow:

After the spread of Covid-19 in urban pockets, the infection is gathering pace across rural areas in western Uttar Pradesh with villages in Muzaffarnagar district being the worst-hit. However, the number of villages impacted is yet to be officially included in the data compiled by the state government. After the recent UP panchayat elections, the situation in the villages has worsened resulting in a large number of deaths. Most of the people are suffering from high fever. People are also facing breathing problems in certain areas. Patients infected with the virus have not yet been tested in most rural areas. Their overall health condition would be known only after undergoing testing.




UNSC must include India for credible global leadership: Govt

The government on Friday reiterated that India should be included in the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) if the international body wants to be seen as a credible global leader.

In his statement at the high-level meeting of the UNSC on 'Maintenance of international peace and security: upholding multilateralism and the United Nations-centered international system', Foreign Secretary Harsh Shringla said, "At the core of India's call for reformed multilateralism, lies the reform of the UN Security Council, reflective of the contemporary realities of today." When power structures continue to reflect the status quo of a bygone era, they also start reflecting a lack of appreciation of contemporary geopolitical realities, he said. "Multilateral institutions must be made more accountable to their membership, they must be open and welcoming to a diversity of viewpoints and cognizant of new voices," Shringla added. "The Council must be made more representative of developing countries if it is to continue to engender trust and confidence in its ability to provide leadership to the entire world. It can deliver effective solutions only if it gives a voice to the voiceless rather than zealously guarding the status quo of the mighty," he added.



AIR FORCE, NAVY STEP UP EFFORTS TO FERRY OXYGEN, MEDICAL SUPPLIES



New Delhi: The C-17 aircraft of Indian Air Force have conducted 400 sorties from within the country, including 351 to airlift 252 oxygen tankers of a total capacity of 4,904 Metric Tonnes (MT), till Friday.


Both the Air Force and the Indian Navy have intensified their efforts to aid the civil administration in tackling the grim Covid situation in the country by ferrying oxygen containers and medical equipment. The cities the Air Force has covered include Jamnagar, Bhopal, Chandigarh, Panagarh, Indore, Ranchi, Agra, Jodhpur, Begumpet, Bhubaneswar, Pune, Surat, Raipur, Udaipur, Mumbai, Lucknow, Nagpur, Gwalior, Vijaywada, Baroda, Dimapur and Hindan.

The IAF aircraft also conducted 59 international sorties to airlift 72 cryogenic oxygen storage containers of 1,233 MT total capacity along with 1,252 empty oxygen cylinders. The containers and cylinders were procured from Singapore, Dubai, Bangkok, the UK, Germany, Belgium and Australia. In addition, the C-17 and IL-76 aircraft have been tasked to airlift cryogenic oxygen containers, oxygen generators and ventilators from Israel and Singapore. The Indian Navy deployed its ships -- INS Talwar, INS Kolkata, INS Airavat, INS Kochi, INS Tabar, INS Trikand, INS Jalashwa and INS Shirdul -- to ferry oxygen containers, cylinders, concentrators and related equipment from friendly foreign countries.

SC REFUSES TO INTERFERE WITH CENTRAL VISTA, ASKS HC TO GRANT EARLY HEARING

Citing that the Delhi High Court is already seized of the matter, the Supreme Court on Friday declined to interfere with the Central Vista redevelopment project. A bench comprising Justices Vineet Saran and Dinesh Maheshwari granted the petitioner liberty to mention the matter before the Chief Justice of Delhi High Court for early hearing.



The bench also asked the high court to preferably consider the plea for an early hearing. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, submitted that the high court has kept the matter for hearing on May 17.

Senior advocate Sidharth Luthra, representing the petitioners, argued: "We are facing a humanitarian health crisis. If this project is deferred by four to six weeks nothing will happen." He added that the IPL has already been suspended and we are facing an unprecedented Covid-19 crisis.

Mehta submitted that the petitioner coming to court by way of a PIL, and filing a Special Leave Petition (SLP) against an adjournment order of the high court raises serious doubt.

Mehta said that an appeal against an adjournment would set a wrong precedent. The bench responded that it is aware of the situation, but the court cannot make comments about the deaths, as it may be taken otherwise.

Covid crisis poses economic risk in Q1 FY22; 'muted impact' likely: FinMin

The 'Monthly Economic Review' for April 2021 published by the Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) said that learning to "operate with COVID-19" provides a silver lining of economic resilience amidst the second wave.

As states take to lockdowns amid the severe Covid crisis, the Finance Ministry in a report has said that second wave of the Covid-19 poses downside risk to economic activities during April-June, although the impact is expected to be muted compared to that in the first wave.

Noting that the global economy recovered further in March and April, powered with vaccination drives and fiscal stimuli by few large economies, it said that in India the momentum in economic recovery since the first wave moderated in April due to the second wave of coronavirus.



It said that agriculture continues to be the silver lining with record food grain production estimated in the ensuing crop year on the back of predicted normal monsoons. Rural demand indicators like tractor sales

recorded a growth of 172 per cent and 36 per cent compared to a low base in March 2020 and even the pre-Covid month of March 2019 respectively.

Industrial production showed mixed trends. While Index of

Industrial Production (IIP) in February 2021 registered a broad-based decline of 3.6 per cent (YoY) and 3.9 per cent compared to January 2021, the eight-core index posted a growth of 6.8 per cent (YoY) in March 2021 and 11.1 per cent compared to February 2021. In FY 2020-21, the core sector contracted by 7 per cent compared to 0.4 per cent growth in FY 2019-20 with fertilizer being the sole growing sector and electricity recovering steadily in the second half.

The Purchasing Managers Index for manufacturing rose further to 55.5 in April with consumer goods as the strongest-performing category, followed by capital goods and then intermediate goods. The rebound was also reflected in RBI's survey estimates on capacity utilization and manufacturers' optimism for the current year, the report said.

In the second half of FY 2020-21, GST collections registered a good growth and collections exceeded Rs 1 lakh crore in each of the last six months owing to economic recovery. GST collections registered another record high of Rs 1.41 lakh crore in April, indicative of continual economic recovery.

"The second wave of COVID-19 has posed a downside risk to economic activity in the first quarter of FY 2021-22. However, there are reasons to expect a muted economic impact as compared to the first wave. Learning to 'operate with COVID-19', as borne by international experience, provides a silver lining of economic resilience amidst the second wave."



CM STALIN AND HIS 33 MINISTERS TAKE OATH

Dravidha Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) President Muthuvel Karunanidhi Stalin was sworn in as the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu by Governor Banwarilal Purohit at Raj Bhawan on Friday.

After a gap of 10 years, the DMK with Stalin at the helm comes back to power for a sixth time in its history by winning the 2021 Assembly elections securing a comfortable majority on its own.

The 68-year-old Stalin wearing white shirt and dhoti came to Raj Bhawan at about 9 a.m. Purohit administered Stalin the Oath of Office and Secrecy. The Governor also administered the oath to 33 other lawmakers as the



Ministers. On Thursday, Purohit released the list of lawmakers who will be appointed as ministers and their portfolios. Stalin's Cabinet has two women Ministers. The Chief Minister's son Udhayanidhi Stalin who has won from Chepauk-Thiruvallikeni con-

stituency is not included in the Cabinet. Stalin's wife Durga, son Udhayanidhi and other family members, former Deputy Chief Minister and AIADMK Coordinator O.Panneerselvam, leaders of Congress and other parties attended the swearing in ceremony.

CASH PAYMENTS ABOVE RS 2 LAKH ALLOWED FOR PATIENTS IN COVID HOSPITALS

New Delhi: The Centre has relaxed rules, to allow hospitals and nursing homes accept cash payments in excess of Rs 2 lakh for treatment of Covid patients from April 1 to May 31, 2021.

A notification by the Department of Revenue states that under Section 269 ST of the Income Tax Act, 1961, hospitals, nursing homes, dispensaries, Covid care centres or similar other medical facilities are allowed to take benefit of the provision.

The hospitals will have to obtain the PAN or Aadhaar of the patient and the payee and the relationship between the patient and the payee for this provision.

Congress' poll performance unfortunate, disappointing: Sonia Gandhi

Congress president Sonia Gandhi on Friday termed her party's performance in the state assembly elections "unfortunate, disappointing and unexpected".

In the recently concluded assembly elections, results of which were declared on May 2, the Congress could not register win in any state, and its only consolation was in Tamil Nadu where the party contested along with DMK as its partner, and managed to win 18 seats.

Addressing the party MPs on Friday during a virtual meeting, she said: "Most unfortunately, our own performance in all the states was very disappointing and if I



may say, unexpectedly so. The CWC is meeting shortly to review the results but it goes without saying that we as a party collective must draw the appropriate lessons from this setback in a spirit of humility and honesty." Sonia Gandhi also congratulated Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

The Congress had on May 2 had said that the party will "study" the results, correct mistakes and do a course correction.

Congress spokesperson Randeep Surjewala read out a statement on the same day, and said: "The Congress will definitely study the results and all the reasons diligently and we are committed to correct our mistakes and do appropriate course correction."

"We recognize that the election results are not as per our expectations, particularly those of Assam and Kerala," he added.

Surjewala said the people's mandate is the final word in a democracy. "People of West Bengal, Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Puducherry have given their democratic mandate for the next five years. We accept the verdict with humility and a sense of responsibility."

Earth mover, bicycle cart used to shift Covid patients' bodies in Bihar

Patna: Amid the coronavirus pandemic, human sensitivity is also declining with a case emerging from Bihar's Araria where family members refused to perform last rites of a woman who succumbed to the disease, and social activists finally removed her body with an earth mover, two days after her death.

Radha Devi, 52, a resident of Jumman Chowk in Forbesganj city of Araria, was undergoing treatment in her house. She died on Tuesday night due to severe lung infection.

"Following the death of Radha Devi, her husband and other family members refused to cremate the dead body. They were not touching it in fear of infection. The deceased had four daughters and a minor son who urged neighbours for help but none of them came forward," said Dimple Chaudhary, a local social activist.

"When I learnt about the incident, I informed the local administration. By the time, the body had reached a



decomposed stage. The officials of the municipal committee finally sent a team, and workers in PPE kits, took out the dead body, put it on a JCB machine and took it for cremation," Chaudhary said. In another similar incident, the body of a 40-year-old man, who died due to corona in

Bakhtiyarpur area of Patna district, also languished at his home.

Dimple Kumar, who had high fever for five days, was living with his elderly parents and wife in ward no 4. After his death, his wife informed relatives and requested them to help in the last rites but none of them came forward.

Eventually, the neighbours raised funds and gave them to the municipal committee for cremation.

Municipal officials, wearing PPE kits, came with a bicycle cart to take the body to the cremation ground, where his wife performed his last rites.

Gandhinagar: In a shocking incident, three members of a family committed suicide in the wee hours of Friday after cremating the head of the family who succumbed to Covid-19 in Gujarat's Devbhumi Dwarka district. The police have registered a case of accidental death and further investigation is underway.

After the head of the family died of Covid in Dwarka City, the remaining three members of the family took the extreme step, the police said.

Businessman Jayeshbhai Vasantbhai Jain (60), who fell prey to Covid on Thursday evening, was the head of the family comprising his wife Shardaben (55) and sons Mukesh (38) and Durgesh (35).

After cremating Jain at the Dwarka crematorium, his wife and two sons returned to their home in the TV Station area at around 5 am on Friday. Soon after, all three of



them consumed some poisonous substance and died, the police said.

"The family originally belonged to Nashik in Maharashtra and their Aadhaar card details show their residence in the Halol

area of Vadodara. The incident came to light only after the milkman came to the house at around 8 am, following which the neighbours called the police," Inspector P.B. Gadhavi told reporter.

Punjab sets up new SIT to probe 2015 firing incident

Consequent to the orders of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, the Punjab government on Friday set up a new three-member Special Investigation Team (SIT), comprising of senior IPS officers, and directed it to complete the investigations into the 2015 Kotkapura firing incident, preferably in six months, as per the court's orders. An official spokesperson said that the newly constituted SIT, comprising ADGP, Vigilance Bureau, L.K.

Yadav, Ludhiana's Commissioner of Police, Rakesh Agarwal, and DIG, Faridkot Range, Surjit Singh, would investigate the two FIRs (dated October 14, 2015 and August 7, 2018) registered in connection with the Kotkapura firing incidents. As per the orders issued by the Home Department, the SIT would ensure meticulous compliance of the directions of the Punjab and Haryana High Court stipulating that there would be no interference from any quarter; internal or external, in the investigations.

73 MORE DIE OF COVID IN ANDHRA PRADESH

Covid-19 claimed 73 more lives in Andhra Pradesh while the state reported 17,188 new cases.

The fresh fatalities pushed the state's cumulative death toll to 8,519 while the case tally rose to 12,45,374.

Ten people each succumbed to the virus in Vizianagaram and Visakhapatnam district. East Godavari reported eight deaths followed by seven in Chittoor, six each in Guntur, and Krishna, five each in Kurnool, Prakasam, and West Godavari, two each in Nellore, and Srikakulam and two in Anantapur district.

According to state health officials, the government and private laboratories in the state tested 1,00,424 samples during 24 hour period ending 10 a.m. on Friday. The state has so far conducted 1,71,60,870 tests. The period saw 12,749 people recovering from the virus. The cumulative number of recoveries has gone up to 10,50,160. The number of active cases in the state now stands at 1,86,695. During the last 24 hours,



Chittoor reported maximum number of cases at 2,260. Visakhapatnam saw 1,868 new infections followed by 1,823 in East

Godavari, 1,779 in Anantapur, 1,632 in Srikakulam, 1,530 in Nellore, 1,515 in Guntur and 1,342 in Kurnool

Hand oxygen plants over to military: Haryana minister

Haryana Home Minister Anil Vij on Friday said the work of administration and arrangement of oxygen plants should be handed over to the military and the paramilitary for their safe and smooth functioning.

Vij said this step should be taken to deal with oxygen-related problems being faced at present, adding that such a step would be immensely helpful as even if one plant stops, then it may adversely affect the health of Covid patients.

"The state government is continuously making efforts

to distribute oxygen as per requirement in all hospitals of the state. With the assistance of the Central government, 60 oxygen plants will be set up in government hospitals with a capacity of 30, 50, 100 and 200 beds in the state," he said in a statement.

The minister said work is presently going on to set up six oxygen plants in government hospitals. After Ambala, oxygen plants will soon start functioning in Panchkula, Faridabad and Hisar towns.

Deal stringently with farm activists for lockdown violation: Punjab CM

Acting tough owing to Covid-19 surge, Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh on Friday issued directions to deal stringently with violations in view of the Kisan Sangharsh Morcha's anti-lockdown agitation on Saturday.

He authorised the Deputy Commissioners to impose any new and harsher restrictions, as needed, within their respective districts, but made it clear that no dilution of the existing curbs would be allowed, except for opening of non-essential shops and private offices on rotation. He directed the DGP to strictly enforce the weekend lockdown in the state.

Asserting that the Kisan Morcha, an amalgamation of 32 kisan unions, cannot dictate terms to the state government, Amarinder Singh warned of strict prosecution in case of violation of any restrictions. He said if any shops are opened in violation of the restrictions, the owners will be prosecuted.

Chairing a virtual high-level Covid review meeting, the Chief Minister authorised the



Deputy Commissioners to take any decision on opening of non-essential shops or private offices on rotation, after taking the local MLAs and other stakeholders into confidence.

However, the DCs cannot impose any restrictions on inter-district movement, he said, underlining the need to allow free flow of people and goods on the highway network of the state. The new curbs, if any, and the opening of shops on rotation will come into effect from Monday, he said.

Gauhati High Court stays termination of 252 NRC workers

The Gauhati High Court has stayed the termination of 252 Junior Assistants engaged on contract basis to update Assam's National Register of Citizens (NRC), as monitored by the Supreme Court.

The JAs were served a termination notice on March 26, three days after the Registrar General of India ordered the closure of the NRC office in Assam and refused to sanction funds after March 31.

The JAs were engaged in February 2015 at the district, sub-division and circle levels with fixed monthly



remuneration for NRC-related works. A High Court official on Friday said that hearing the petition filed by Biplab Kumar Medhi and 251 others JAs, Justice Prasanta Kumar Deka ordered the continuation of their service.

"Status quo as on date shall be maintained in respect of the service of the present petitioners," the judge said in his 47-page judgement.

Justice Deka has ordered to serve notice, returnable in two weeks, to the Centre, the RGI, Assam's Chief Secretary, Home Secretary and State NRC Coordinator Hitesh Dev Sharma. "Prima facie I am satisfied that though admittedly the petitioners were engaged on the basis of specific terms of contract, however, keeping in view that the service of the petitioners are governed under

Service Regulations, 2014, there is a case to be heard as to whether the issuance of the impugned notice of March 26, 2021 is proper in terms of the Service Regulations, 2014 and various terms and expression under the Citizenship (Registration of Citizens and Issue of National Identity Cards) Rules, 2003," the judge said. The draft of the NRC was published in August 2019, excluding 19.06 lakh people out of 3.3 crore applicants. Each of the 19.06 lakh people was to have been issued rejection slips, citing the reasons for their exclusion soon after the publication of the draft. However, the rejection slips are yet to be issued for the excluded people to approach a Foreigners' Tribunal within 120 days of receiving them. Around a 100 tribunals are tasked to scrutinise the documents of the excluded people and to decide if they would remain debarred or make it to the NRC.

Madhya Pradesh on Friday saw 11,708 fresh COVID-19 cases and 84 fatalities that took the tally of infections to 6,49,114 and toll to 6,244, an official from the state health department said.

At least 4,815 patients were discharged from hospitals in the last 24 hours, taking the count of recoveries in the state to 5,47,447, the official said.

Indore reported six deaths taking its toll to 1,190 and the fatalities in Bhopal stood at 781 with five more casualties, the official said.

Indore is now left with 13,546 active cases, while Bhopal's currently has 12,117 patients, he said, adding that the number of active cases in the state stands at 95,423.

With 65,262 swab samples tested during the day,

"The dates for conducting the postponed practical examinations will be announced separately," it added.

Earlier, on April 26, the board has postponed the Class 10 and Class 12 board exams. The Classes 10 and 12 Madhya Pradesh Board exams were scheduled to be held from April 30 and May 1.

The board is also considering alternative ways for Class 10 and Class 12 exams and will announce any decision with respect to conducting the Class 10, 12 board exams soon, an official statement released in this regard said.

The Madhya Pradesh School Education Department has already cancelled the Class 9 and Class 11 exams. The students will now be evaluated on the basis of their performance in the revision test held in November 2020 and the half-yearly exams that were held in February this year.

As per an official statement, the final results of Classes 9 and 11 will be calculated on the basis of best of five subjects. Students who fail to secure 33 per cent marks in more than one subject, a maximum of 10 grace marks will also be provided. However, the grace marks will be given in more than one subject as well, if required. And for those students who are unable to obtain the minimum required marks will be provided an option to take the exams once the situation arising out of COVID-19 improves.

CM CHOUHAN TRANSFERS 15 HUNDRED CRORES IN THE ACCOUNT OF 75 LAKH FARMERS

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has said that there is a Kisan Mitra government in Madhya Pradesh.

One grain each of the crop of the farmer will be earned. Earnings and payback deadlines have been extended. The farmer will not be allowed to be disturbed. He appealed to farmers and farmer organizations to cooperate in the ongoing fight against Corona. The government cannot win on its own due to infectious diseases. Chouhan was addressing farmers from the Chief Minister's residence through a video conference by depositing Rs 1500 crores in single bank accounts of 75 lakh farmers with a single click. Chouhan said that small farmers use the produce only to fulfill their needs. They do not get the benefits of the purchase schemes. In this scheme, 75 lakh farmers were transferred to the account of 1500 crore farmers today.

Chouhan said that Prime Minister Kisan Samman Nidhi is a boon for small farmers. He informed that there are 78 lakh farmers in the state, out of which only 24 lakh farmers get the benefit of minimum support price. Under the Prime Minister's scheme, farmers of half an acre also get 6 thousand rupees in a



year from the central government. Under the scheme, 77 lakh farmers have received about 8 thousand 465 crore rupees so far.

Chouhan informed that more than 90 lakh

metric tonnes of wheat and more than one lakh metric tonnes of gram have been purchased. Lentils are also being purchased. The date of purchase for Indore division has been extended from May 5 to May 15. Will be purchased in other divisions by 25 May.

Chouhan said that funds should be transferred in the account of farmers on time. Despite the difficulties, trying relentlessly. He said that the last date for repaying the loan received at zero percent interest has been extended till May 31. With this decision, the government will have to pay 31 crore rupees as interest to the banks.

The ban also covers vehicles that have All India tourist permits, he said, adding that the orders were issued in view of the current COVID-19 situation. Meanwhile, Madhya Pradesh has reported 12,421 fresh cases of COVID-19 and 86 fatalities that raised the tally of infections to 6,37,406 and the toll to 6,160 on Thursday. At least 12,965 patients were discharged from hospitals in the last 24 hours, taking the count of recoveries in the state

to 5,42,632, the official said. With the addition of 1,792 new cases, Indore's caseload went up to 1,21,694, while the tally in Bhopal rose to 99,639 after 1,584 persons tested positive, he said. Indore reported eight casualties that took its toll to 1,184 and fatalities in Bhopal rose to 776 after six patients died of the infection, the official said. Indore and Bhopal are now left with 12,017 and 10,829 active cases, respectively, he said, adding that the state currently has 88,614 active cases. "Amid increasing COVID cases, there will be open-book exams for final year students of UG and PG courses, just like it was during 1st and 2nd-year exams. There won't be any exam in college", State Higher Education Minister Mohan Yadav had earlier said.

The MP government had also postponed board exams for Classes 10, 12 students.

The School Education Department is considering alternative ways for Class 10 and Class 12 exams and will announce a decision in this regard soon, an official statement said.

Class 1 to Class 8 students will be promoted to their next classes on the basis of class project and Class 9 and Class 11 students will be evaluated on the basis of their performance in the previous tests, the government had earlier announced.

Crash-Landing Of Remdesivir-Carrying Plane In Madhya Pradesh To Be Probed

Gwalior: Aviation experts will conduct a probe into the crash-landing of a Madhya Pradesh government plane carrying a stock of anti-viral drug Remdesivir at Gwalior airport following a technical snag, a senior official said today. The plane had crash-landed around 8:30 pm on Thursday, in which the pilot and co-pilot had suffered minor injuries. "The plane had skidded off the runway at the airport during landing. Aviation experts will probe the incident," Gwalior collector Kaushlendra Vikram Singh told news agency Press Trust of India. Gwalior airport is the civil enclave airport at the Maharajpur Air Force station. Indian Air Force's Central Command spokesman Shantanu Singh said that the pilot, co-pilot and a crew member were given first-aid and handed over to the local administration for further medical treatment along with the boxes of Remdesivir. Sub divisional magistrate Anil Banwaria said the state plane had arrived in Gwalior from Indore. "Its main pilot S Majid, co-pilot Shivshankar Jaiswal and naib tehsildar Dilip Dwivedi suffered injuries in the incident and they are being treated at a hospital in Gwalior," he said. "The boxes of Remdesivir injections are safe," he added. According to another official, the plane was carrying 74 boxes of Remdesivir. In view of shortage of Remdesivir injections which are being widely used for the treatment of COVID-19 patients, the Madhya Pradesh government has deployed its aircraft for the medicine's transportation, officials said.

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said that the state government is committed to provide free treatment for Covid to all the economically weaker families of the state. In this sequence, the Mukhya Mantri Covid Upchar Yojana has been implemented. Under this scheme, important decisions have also been taken for free Covid treatment of families possessing Ayushman cards.

Secretary, Public Health and Family Welfare Akash Tripathi has issued a letter to all collectors and chief medical and health officers for information and implementation of the scheme. He informed that by increasing the rates of Ayushman package by 40 percent, it has been brought at par with the rates of private hospitals for treatment at present. In this, the maximum limit of special tests like CT scan, MRI etc. which was earlier Rs 5 thousand per family per year, it has been revised to treat Covid-19 in the year 2021-22.

At present, only 288 hospitals with medicine expertise, out of 579 hospitals identified for Covid treatment are expanded under the Ayushman Yojana in the

state. Therefore, the District Health Committee has been authorized to provide temporary affiliation for three months in Ayushman Bharat Yojana to the private hospital registered on the Sarthak portal for treatment of Covid-19 at the district level.

Tripathi said that due to the said decision, free Covid treatment will be provided to the financially weaker families with Ayushman cards, which is also a top priority of the state government. Therefore, it must be ensured that all the private hospitals providing Covid treatment in the district, which specialize in medicine and are registered on Sarthak portal are provided temporary affiliation for three months soon so that free Covid treatment of Ayushman card holders can be ensured under the new package of Ayushman scheme in all those hospitals. This affiliation should not be given to very small hospitals.

The state government is committed to provide Ayushman cards to every member of eligible families under the Ayushman Bharat Yojana. This work should be undertaken as a campaign. A special campaign should be launched for free treatment of Covid-19 to ensure that every member of Ayushman eligible fami-

lies gets a separate card and can avail free Covid treatment. If any eligible family does not have the Ayushman card and needs treatment of Covid, then free treatment must be ensured.

If any member of Ayushman card holder family whose Ayushman card has not been made reaches the hospital for Covid treatment, then he will be able to get admission in the hospital in three ways including that Ayushman card and food slip of a member of the family, will be proof that he is a member of the family of the Ayushman card holder. Presentation of the Ayushman card of a member of the Ayushman card-holder family along with Samagra ID, through which can prove that he is a member of the Ayushman card-holder family and the Ayushman card of a member of the family as well as the certification of the gazetted officer of any government department, that he is a member of the family of the Ayushman card holder. For this, government officials can verify through the Samagra portal that he is a member of the Samagra ID family of the Ayushman card holder.

Tripathi said that within three days after the Covid patient is admitted for treatment, the patient's family

will have to get the Ayushman card of the patient made and presented in the hospital. For this, a convenient arrangement for making cards will be ensured by the District Collector and Chief Medical and Health Officer and for this, permanent arrangement will be made to make Ayushman cards in government hospitals.

Under the scheme, admission and treatment of Ayushman card holders in Ayushman affiliated Covid hospitals will be ensured easily without any hindrance. For this an officer of a lower level than the Additional Collector of the district, will be made the nodal officer and a government official will be made the officer in charge for each Ayushman affiliated hospital authorized for Covid treatment. These nodal officers and in-charge officers will work continuously and will be available on call for easy admission and treatment in Ayushman hospitals identified for Covid treatment of the card holders of Ayushman Yojana. Any Ayushman card holder can contact the Nodal or Officer-in-Charge for assistance in admission or in case of any problem. For this, the D.C.C.C. telephone number or the number of other control room of the district should be widely publicized.

Delhi witnessed 341 new deaths due to Covid infection in the last 24 hours, taking the total toll so far to 18,739. A total of 79,593 samples were tested on Thursday, of which 65,663 by the RT-PCR method and 13,930 by Rapid Antigen.

Meanwhile, 19,085 people infected with Covid were reported recovered, taking the total recovery in the national capital so far to 11,83,093.

Active cases in the national capital rose to 91,035, of which 50,424 are in home isolation.

Kejriwal calls for meeting to review Covid situation in Delhi

Hours after the Supreme Court directed the Centre to ensure that Delhi gets 700 metric tonnes (MT) of oxygen supply every day, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal called for a meeting to review the Covid situation in the national capital.

This order has come as a relief to the people of Delhi. For over two weeks Delhi's hospitals have been fighting for oxygen supply. Delhi had received 730 MT of oxygen on Wednesday and had requested the Centre to continue supplying 700 metric tonnes of oxygen every day.

Kejriwal on Thursday said that the Delhi government is capable of increasing around 9000-9500 beds for Covid infected patients at its existing Covid care centres including



The Apex Court on Friday morning directed the Centre: "When we say 700 MT, it means (the amount of medical oxygen to be supplied) every day to Delhi. Please do not drive us to a situation to take coercive steps.

We are clarifying that it will be 700 MT every day." According to the Delhi government's data, out of 1919 ICU beds with ventilators available in Delhi's hospitals, only four are vacant (till 2.30 p.m. on Friday).

granted liberty to the DJB to approach the Upper Yamuna River Board, with their prayer relating to allocation of water to Delhi. It asked the board to consider the representation made by the DJB, clarifying that the top court is not expressing any opinion on merits of the case.

The observations were made by the top court during the hearing of an application by the DJB seeking directions to the Punjab and Haryana governments to stop the discharge of untreated pollutants causing rise of ammonia levels into the Yamuna river, and also ensure there is enough supply of water from Haryana side to the national capital. At the beginning of the matter, the top court informed the DJB's counsel that it has seen the committee's report.

"If you want us to pass an order on merits which may not be in your interest, we will hear you, otherwise we'd suggest please go to the Upper Yamuna River Board and make your suggestions. If you

still insist, we will hear you and pass orders."

The DJB has maintained that shortage in water supply may affect supply to hospitals, and urged the top court to fix a specific timeline in which the board may decide their grievance, preferably within 10 days, as beyond that, there may be difficulty. The counsel insisted that there is a genuine problem of water in the national capital and the top court could at least direct that Haryana side should provide whatever maximum they can provide. At this, the top court responded: "Whatever they have to, they are providing, and they are providing more according to the report."

During the hearing, the bench noted that the DJB should go to the monitoring body and make a request to it. "You can't keep coming here and telling us there is no water in Delhi. You asked us to appoint a committee, and we did. The ground reality appears to be different," it noted.

He said that on May 5, an information regarding a person selling Covid-related medical equipments at a higher price than market price, in M Block Market GK-1 area was received.

"Acting swiftly on the information, a team comprising Inspector Jai Prakash Nagar, Sub Inspector Anil Kumar and several others was constituted under the leadership of Inspector Ritesh Kumar, SHO Greater Kailash and overall supervision of ACP CR Park Lakshay Pandey,



to nab the accused. "Around 9 p.m., one Alto car was noticed coming towards M Block Market parking GK-1. The informer signalled towards the hoarder and team apprehended him," Bhatia said. The accused was identified as Saeed, a resident of Jamia Nagar and four medical oxygen concentrators, 10 infrared machines, 20 oximeter and 40 thermometer were found in his possession. During questioning, he stated that he works with one Muqueem and shares profit. "On further raid, six medical oxy-

'Gurugram hospitals with over 50 beds capacity to set up oxygen plants'

For this, they can either set up a liquid oxygen plant or arrange a Pressure Swing Adsorption (PSA), he said.

"To fulfil oxygen needs in Gurugram it is planned to set up 6 oxygen plants in the district. Besides, the administration is also trying to set up an oxygen plant under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).

"Till such time these plants are operational, the administration is also arranging oxygen concentrators to increase the supply of oxygen. The administration has already got about 50 concentrators and efforts are on to arrange 250 to 300 concentrators in the next 7 to 8 days," Garg said.

Gurugram Civil Surgeon Virender Yadav who also attended the meeting informed that



PSA based 1,000 LPM oxygen plants will be set up at the Civil Hospital in Gurugram. In addition, PSA based LPM plants will be set up at Sub Divisional Hospitals, Sohna and Pataudi. Garg assured that the Covid patients currently admitted in the city's hospitals registered with the district administration will not face oxygen shortage. Regarding the sup-

ply of the injections Remdesivir and Tocilizumab, Garg informed that the state government has decided that it will issue the quota of Remdesivir injections for each district which will be distributed to the hospitals by the civil surgeon according to the number of patients. For injection Tocilizumab, the government has constituted a 3-member

committee under the chairmanship of Dr Dhruv Chaudhary, senior physician at PGIMS Rohtak. This committee will release an injection after seeing the patient's prescription which will come from PGIMS Rohtak itself. These injections will not be available with the private stockists.

Garg said that temporary hospitals are being constructed in the district, in which about 400 beds will be arranged in the next one week. Around 100 beds are being arranged at Tau Devi Lal Stadium, which will be run by Medanta Hospital. In collaboration with Hero MotoCorp, in addition to 100 beds in Sector 27, 150 beds are being arranged jointly with the Indian Air Force and M3M. A 50-bed temporary hospital is being built in collaboration with DLF. The DC stated that a plan has also been prepared for patients in home isolation in the district who need oxygen. "A portal will soon be made where such patients or their attendants will be able to register. After that, cylinders of oxygen will be distributed to the needy people by making 25 - 30 decentralized points in the city.

Delhi Police recover 96 O2 concentrators from popular Khan Market eatery

A day after the Delhi Police arrested four people and seized 419 oxygen concentrators, on Friday continuing their search-op recovered 96 oxygen concentrators from South Delhi's famous Khan Chacha Restaurant. Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) South Delhi Atul Bhatia said: "We have recovered 96 oxygen concentrators from Khan Chacha Restaurant in Khan Market area." Earlier in the day, Bhatia said that the police have recovered nine more concentrators. The police action comes a day after it seized 419 concentrators being sold at exorbitant rates online. As per the police, after back to back incidents of illegal marketing of oxygen concentrators, "major outlets in Delhi are on Delhi Police's radar and the investigation against the nexus of restau-

rants is under way," said sources in Delhi Police. On Thursday, police recovered 419 oxygen concentrators after conducting raids at Nege Ju Restaurant and Bar in the central market of Lodhi Colony. The owner of the two restaurants is the same and is yet to be brought for questioning as his whereabouts remain unknown.

Police said during the raid on Thursday invoices of recovered oxygen concentrators were found in the laptop. Stickers of maximum retail price (MRP) indicating prices of Rs 69,999 per concentrator were also recovered. Police sources say they are probing into what could possibly be a larger nexus of multiple restaurants. As per police sources, the arrested accused have claimed that they imported the Oxygen Concentrators from various countries in large numbers and then sold them at a marked up price.

Accusing the BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) of 'betrayal', hundreds of resident doctors have launched a protest 'on-duty' demanding payment of arrears of their increased stipend announced last year, here on Friday.

The frontline medics, working 24x7 for Covid-19 patients started a social media campaign and carried placards bearing slogans like 'BMC Betrayed Us', 'Betrayed, Still Working' in various city hospitals.

The doctors from the BMC's Sion, KEM and Nair hospitals are taking part in the protests which started last week symbolically by wearing black badges on duty.

duty. At the height of the Coronavirus pandemic and lockdown in August 2020, the Maharashtra government had approved a proposal of increased stipend of Rs 10,000 per month.

The resident doctors have demanded that the stipend arrears must be cleared in full and not adjusted with the incentives given for Covid duty as the BMC has planned. If their demands are not met, the doctors plan to launch an 'on-duty' indefinite hunger strike from Monday, as per a statement by Maharashtra Association of Resident Doctors (MARD).

Despite repeated attempts by IANS, top BMC officials were not available on Friday to comment on the MARD's ultimatum of hunger-strike from May 10.

More than 18,000 Covid deaths in Maharashtra during second wave, fatality rate lower than first wave

During the second wave of the pandemic, Maharashtra has registered more than 18,000 Covid deaths in just four months. However, the state's case fatality rate is lower than what it was during the first wave.

During the second wave of the pandemic, Maharashtra has registered more than 18,000 Covid-related deaths in just four months. However, the case fatality rate in the state was higher during the first wave in 2020.

Between January and April 2021, the state recorded 18,959 Covid deaths. On the other hand, Maharashtra reported a total of 50,637 deaths due to Covid over ten months between March and December 2020. In the first wave, the case fatality rate



in the state was 2.7 per cent, which means that for every hundred positive cases, Maharashtra witnessed around three deaths. During the second wave, the mortality rate has fallen to 0.71 per cent. "During the second wave, we are seeing that deaths in absolute numbers have risen sharply as the number of Covid patients also increased rapidly. We are seeing this trend in all age

groups," said Dr Pradip Awate, surveillance officer in Maharashtra's epidemic control department. As compared to the first wave, the second wave of the pandemic has seen more positive cases among people aged 31 to 40 years in Maharashtra. In 2020, 4.1 lakh cases were recorded in this age-group. During the second wave, in just four months, more than 6 lakh Covid cases in this age-group have already been recorded. During both waves of the pandemic, the maximum mortality rate has been recorded in the age-group of 81 to 90 years. In 2020, this group saw a fatality rate of 11.67 per cent. This time, the rate has fallen to 3.58 per cent.

In the 61-70 years age-group, 5,491 deaths have been recorded in the state during the second wave of the pandemic. In 2020, more than 15,000 Covid deaths in this age-group were registered.

Last year, Covid-19 cases first began to emerge in Maharashtra in March and the peak was reached in September before it started subsiding. The second wave in the state began in February 2021 and it is being said that it has now reached its peak.

More than 50% e-pass applications rejected in state, 73% in Mumbai

The rejection percentage is much higher in Mumbai, with 73 per cent applicants being denied permission to travel by the city police.

Since April 22, of the over 6.8 lakh people who had submitted online applications to the state police seeking e-passes to travel to or within Maharashtra, 54 per cent were denied permission.

major reasons for denying e-passes - the applicants did not have an essential reason or emergency to travel and many did not upload necessary documents to prove they are traveling for an emergency and essential reason. To tackle the second wave of Covid-19, the state police, like last year, had started issuing e-passes from April 22 to all those motorists who are not part of essential services but need to travel to Maharashtra from other states or those who need to travel outside their cities and districts within Maharashtra due to an emergency or an essential reason. Even those engaged in essential services need an e-pass if they are not traveling for official work. E-passes are not required for anyone traveling within their city for an emergency or essential reason.

MY WISH FOR EVERY MOTHER THIS MOTHER'S DAY

I recently read the true story of a cow named Clarabelle. She had endured the loss of every one of her children. On a dairy farm, that's life for cows and buffaloes: you're artificially inseminated to keep your body producing milk, you give birth, they take your baby away so humans can steal as much of the infants milk as possible, and the process starts all over. Most male calves are marked for death by dairy farms around the world because they can't produce milk. In India, they're often left to starve, abandoned, or sent to slaughter. Abroad, they're typically crammed in a crate to be killed for veal. When her milk production started to wane and the farm was preparing to send her to slaughter, Clarabelle was rescued by a sanctuary. But she had a secret. She was pregnant. When sanctuary staff discovered that they would have a new baby to love, they were delighted. But a week before her due date, Clarabelle began sneaking off, avoiding them, and acting strangely. A search revealed why: she had already given birth and hidden her baby in a faraway patch of grass to save the infant's life. She was slipping away to nurse and running back so as not to arouse suspicion. But Clarabelle was at a sanctuary now, and she would never have to suffer the pain of losing a child again. As a mother reading Clarabelle's story in the book Animalkind, I thought about this gentle, loving cow finally getting to celebrate Mother's Day with her child. I was filled with happiness



for her and, at the same time, with grief for all of the other cow and buffalo mothers who will never know that joy. That's the main reason I've been vegan for years: I respect other species. However, just as the dairy industry considers male calves of no use since they cannot produce milk, the egg industry considers male chicks of no use because they can't lay eggs. These days, the chickens used for eggs are bred for higher egg production, while those used for meat are bred to grow fast and have bulkier bodies, so they are not the same. But I believe that cows, buffaloes, and chickens have the right to raise their babies, the right to be free from abuse and suffering, and the right to their own lives. As humans, I know that we can do better than exploiting them for our own ends. My decision to eat vegan was solidified when I came across the books Skinny Bitch by Kim Barnouin and Alicia Silverstone's The Kind Diet. They helped me understand the important relation between food and our body, and once I went vegan, I started noticing wonderful changes: I dropped a few kilos, my skin felt great, my hair became healthier, and I had a lot more energy. Vegan foods like greens and lentils are some of the most affordable -- and healthiest -- foods you can buy in India. Tofu makes an excellent egg replacer, and it's a good source of protein with no cholesterol. And the options for non-dairy milks, such as soya, almond, and oat, are becoming so numerous it's hard to keep up. Cows' milk is suited to the nutritional needs of calves, who have four stomachs and gain hundreds of kilos in a matter of months. Just like all mammals, we do not need to drink milk after weaning age, and we certainly do not need to drink the milk of another species.

MARK WAHLBERG UPS FOOD INTAKE TO 7,000 CALORIES DAILY TO GAIN WEIGHT FOR ROLE

Actor Mark Wahlberg's current food intake is over 7,000 calories daily, to gain weight for his role in the upcoming film "Stu".

According to his personal chef Lawrence Duran, the 49-year-old star is making a big commitment to his weight gain. "So, morning usually starts about 3 a.m. and his first breakfast is four eggs -- that's the pre-breakfast. Then, he does his workout and then after the workout, which is usually around 5 to 6 o'clock in the morning, we do eight eggs, six strips of bacon, a cup of rice, two tablespoons of olive oil and a protein shake," Duran said, according to a report in femalefirst.co.uk.

The chef said it is a protein-inspired, mass weight-gainer programme to help build a little more muscle. He added: "Then, three hours later, we do some kind of ground beef or ground turkey, whether it's been made into a hamburger patty or a meatloaf, with another cup of rice. And then, three hours later, I usually do half of a roasted chicken, another cup of rice, I'll do about a cup of cooked spinach and a cup of cooked beets as well."

"Three hours after that, we'll go into either a veal chop or a pork chop - I'll do about eight ounces of that and then a small, four-ounce piece of salmon with another cup of rice, olive oil and beets as well. And then we'll do another meal, which is usually eight ounces of some type of steak, eight ounces of some kind of white fish," the chef summed up.



Wahlberg also has one more meal before bed to help him pile on the weight.

He told E! News: "It's one cup of cooked oatmeal, two tablespoons of apple sauce, two tablespoons of

Curtis reinforced his positive message by reminding people to set their own realistic self-acceptance goal.



Hospitals needs to be self reliant

As Covid-19 pandemic moves from the urban centres to the hinterlands ravaging the over-burdened healthcare system, the medical fraternity on Saturday urged the government to install oxygen plants in all hospital premises as oxygen cylinders

and concentrators are unable to meet the surge in demand for the life-saving gas. The fact is that oxygen concentrators/cylinders cannot reach every nook and corner of the country and hospitals with their own oxygen-generating infrastruc-

ture can only supply oxygen to critical patients in this dire situation. In a life-saving measure, a oxygen generator donated by the French government was installed in record 18 hours at Narayana Super Specialty Hospital in East Delhi, which is helping the hospital fill 48 cylinders weighing 40 litres to 60 litres each in 24 hours. According to Dr V Ramana Prasad, Senior pulmonologist, KIMS hospital Hyderabad, installing oxygen plants is the need of the hour and the "government must ensure that it is implemented to avoid oxygen deprivation to the needy patients in smaller cities and towns where the pandemic is surging". The demand for oxygen has soared "seven-fold" in India amid the rising daily Covid-19 cases. According to the Union Health and Family Welfare Ministry, the demand for life-saving gas spread from 12 states on April 15 to as many as 22 states on April 24. In nine days, the demand for medical oxygen increased 67 per cent. According to reports, India so far only has 1,224 tankers with a capacity of 16,732 MT to carry medical oxygen and the central government is in the process of manufacturing more cryogenic tankers. The problem is that liquid medical oxygen is flammable and, in most cases, can't be flown and has to be moved via road, rail or sea, which takes longer time to reach the hospitals. An oxygen plant within the premises can quickly deliver the live-saving gas to patients. Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday said that they will set up 48 oxygen plants, including 21 that are being imported from France, across the capital. "Medical collage hospital and large corporate hospitals can have permanent plants, but this is not possible for small hospitals/nursing homes," Dr Sumant Mantri, Senior Consultant, Pulmonologist at Apollo Hospital, Bangalore told. Dr Pratibha Dogra, Senior pulmonologist from W Pratiksha Hospital Gurgaon said that the hospitals in the country urgently need their own oxygen plants.

NEARLY ONE-THIRD OF BJP MLAS IN BENGAL DEFECTED FROM OTHER PARTIES

Reality check

The Bharatiya Janata Party won 77 of the 292 seats in the recently concluded Assembly elections in West Bengal, way below the expectations of the party that was eyeing to wrest power from the ruling Trinamool Congress in the state.

But there is more that might bother the saffron brigade, which used all its resources in the run-up to the high-octane elections in its bid to breach the Trinamool citadel in Bengal.

A closer look into the winning seats of the BJP shows that nearly one-third of the party MLAs who made it to the state Assembly owed their political existence to other political parties before jumping ship to the saffron camp.

A lot has been said about Suvendu Adhikari, Nisith Pramanik and Mihir Goswami, who successfully retained their fort even after changing camps.

Adhikari was even more appreciated because he single-handedly dwarfed the mighty Mamata Banerjee, who was successful in retaining power in the state, but failed to combat son of the soil Adhikari in Nandigram, where she lost to her one-time close aide by a slender margin of 1,953 votes.

There are 18 more MLAs -- bulk of them who defected to the BJP from the Trinamool Congress -- who successfully retained their mass support even after changing their political ideology.

A close analysis of the winning BJP MLAs shows that 14 BJP candidates who won this time came from the Trinamool, including some big names like Adhikari in Nandigram, Pramanik in Dinhatra, Goswami in Natabri and Mukul Roy in Krishnanagr North.



There are six more MLAs, including two former ministers in the erstwhile Left Front government in the state, who won on a BJP ticket this time. One came from the Congress while another one joined the BJP from the Gorkha National Liberal Front (GNLF).

The big names who came from the Trinamool and won on BJP tickets include Satyendra Nath Roy from Gangarampur in South Dinajpur, a former Trinamool minister, Tanmoy Ghosh from Bishnupur, Sreerupa

Mitra Chowdhury from English Bazar and Sikha Chatterjee from Dabgram Phulbari in North Bengal. Chatterjee defeated the all-powerful state Tourism Minister Goutam Deb in the elections.

Mukul Roy, who is considered to be a master political strategist and was the second in command in Trinamool, switched over to the BJP years back but he never contested any election. In the recent polls, Roy won from the Krishnanagar North constituency.

Pawan Singh, who won from the Bhatpara constituency in North 24 Parganas, switched over to the BJP from Trinamool along with his father Arjun Singh, who is also a BJP MP from North 24 Parganas.

The list of Trinamool turncoats who won on a BJP ticket this time also includes Biswajit Das from Bagda, Subrata Moitra from Berhampur, Tanmoy Ghosh from Bishnupur, and Partha Sarathi Chatterjee from Ranaghat NorthWest. Apart from these, there are six other BJP MLAs who switched camps from the Left Front including two ministers in the former Left Front ministry.

Bankim Ghosh -- a former CPM legislature and a minister in the Left Front government -- switched over to the BJP and won the election from Chakdah in Hooghly district.

Similarly, Narahari Mahato -- a major Forward Block leader in the tribal belt and a minister in the Left Front government -- won from the Joyprur Assembly constituency in Purulia district. Former Forward Block members Biswanth Karak won from Goghat, Tapasi Mondal won from Haldia, ex-RSP man Monoj Orai won from Kumarganj while former CPM leader Sankar Ghosh won from Siliguri 1/2 on a BJP ticket this time.

Interestingly, Ashoke Lahiri, who was appointed CEA by the Government of India in 2002 during the prime ministership of Atal Bihari Vajpayee, and continued even when Manmohan Singh took the reins of the country, won from Balurghat. Lahiri never had any political background and was projected as the finance minister if BJP came to power. Similarly, actor-turned-politician Hiran, who won from Kharagpur Sadar, also didn't have any political allegiance before.

IPL POSTPONEMENT: INDIAN CRICKET NOT A COMPLETE LOSER

The show must go on' was what one had hoped would have been the way forward. Unfortunately, the second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic struck the progress of the second half of cricket's most popular entertainment, the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2021.

The safety net of the bio-secured bubble burst and was broken into, making it impossible for the tournament to continue. This was always an area of concern and this is the thought that lingers in the minds of every sport administrator involved in hosting any event at present. One is aware that just one mistake or blemish could jeopardise the sports event completely and the IPL became a victim of it.

The IPL was just a precursor to the T20 World Cup, scheduled to be held in India at the end of the year.

The second wave of the pandemic has blown the lid off and exposed the weak and disorganised healthcare and welfare system prevalent in India. The dire situation that the country is going through became the corner stone for the IPL as well.

India has failed on both accounts. One in safeguarding its millions of people from being infected by the virus as well as being



able to conduct a fool proof, safe and secure environment to host a major sporting event. The reality one perceives is the lack of infrastructure, planning, and understanding of the situation that was prevalent as one faced the dreaded virus.

The BCCI, one thought, had mastered the situation well, having successfully conducted and controlled an IPL in the UAE, a full cricket series against England and two domestic cricket tournaments without adverse issues.

One does regret the failure of the BCCI to complete what looked to be a well-run and structured IPL 2021 until the first phase of the tournament. It all crumbled so quickly, like a gush of wind that blew ones balls away, calling it a 'dead ball'. The IPL 2021 is still at an uncertain situation of whether it would be entirely cancelled or would be played on another dates.

However, there were some positives that came forth for India. The IPL did give the Indian selectors a good opportunity to assess many of the Indian players, especially as they will need to finalise the squad for the T20 World Cup.

The batting looks formidable with Shikhar Dhawan, K.L. Rahul, Virat Kohli, Rohit Sharma, Rishabh Pant, Sanju Samson, Suryakumar Yadav, Prithvi Shaw, Shubman Gill, Devdutt Padikkal and Rituraj Gaikwad. There are also Manish Pandey and Ambati Rayudu, both experienced batters in the wings as well. The problem that India may face is to choose correctly as the surfeit of options could prove difficult. The sterling performance of Ravindra Jadeja who returned after the injury with a bang is a big plus for the side. He is after all at present India's premier all-rounder. However, the concern is that of Hardik Pandya, whose

powerful batting is essential for India but without his contribution as a bowler, his place becomes uncertain.

The lack of another genuine all-rounder could be the Achilles heel for India at the T20 World Cup, so Hardik needs to get his bowling into play soon. The cupboard of pace bowling options is full and so is the leg-spin variety. Selecting the most effective combination of bowlers could prove to be another worrisome issue for the selectors.

Another positive aspect of the IPL was that the tournament was not a complete washout and that at least half of the schedule was completed. Although the expected revenue may not be received, even a 50 per cent collection is a sum that cannot be ignored easily. The absence of spectators may have been a concerning factor for players. However, for millions of cricket fans and followers of the IPL, watching it on TV was a much-needed break and entertainment from the lockdowns and lockdowns that all are facing. The gloom of the world around one was forgotten during those engrossing moments and one is grateful to cricketers, support staff, and the administrators who took it upon themselves to give us those precious moments.

Curtains may have come down on the second act of the IPL but the first act itself showed how important the tournament was for Indian cricketers and for the unknown domestic players to get heard. Some lucky ones may shortly be wearing the Indian colours soon. Indian cricket has definitely not been a complete loser.

25 KILLED IN RIO POLICE OPERATION

According to the Rio de Janeiro Civil Police, one police officer died as a result of the shootout on Thursday, while the other 24 victims were allegedly members of a criminal organisation that dominates the Jacarezinho favela, reports Xinhua news agency.

At least 25 people were killed and another five injured on Thursday in an intense shootout in Brazil's Rio de Janeiro between police and suspected drug traffickers. According to the Rio de Janeiro Civil Police, one police officer died as a result of the shootout on Thursday, while the other 24 victims were allegedly members of a criminal organisation that dominates the Jacarezinho favela, reports Xinhua news agency. The incident occurred during a Civil Police operation against drug trafficking

and organized crime in the area. Audio and video pieces circulating on social media networks showed intense gunfights and gas bomb explosions in several parts of the favela, and images taken from helicopters showed armed people fleeing across the rooftops and terraces. Jacarezinho is dominated by the so-called Red Command, the largest criminal faction in Rio de Janeiro.

Unlike many of the city's populous slums that sit on the hills, Jacarezinho is in a flat area where criminals have set up barricades to make it difficult for security forces to access. The Red Command is allegedly behind several homicides, robberies, trains hijackings and recruitment of minors for drug trafficking in Jacarezinho, according to the police.

UK CONSERVATIVES WIN OPPN-HELD SEAT



London: The UK's ruling Conservative Party has snatched a historically left-wing seat from the opposition Labour in a tense by-election in England.

Conservative party candidate Jill Mortimer won the north-east England seat of Hartlepool with a large majority, beating opposition Labour party candidate Paul Williams, reports dpa news agency. She described it as a "truly historic" result.

It is the first time since its creation in 1974 that the seat has been won by a Conservative politician. Previously it had only been held by Labour, at one point, a candidate who ran as an independent.

The result is a boost for Prime Minister Boris Johnson despite a rocky few months for the premier, with the country's successful vaccine campaign appearing to be a key factor.

It is equally a blow for Labour party leader Keir Starmer, who has only been chief for a year.

Afghan forces launch counter-offensive in Baghlan

According to the security officials, the Taliban has intensified activities in Helmand, Zabul, Baghlan, Herat, Farah, Faryab, Takhar and Badakhshan provinces, and scores of militants and security personnel have been killed.

Scores of militants have been killed in Afghanistan's Baghlan province as government forces launched a counter-offensive to repel Taliban attacks, a police official said on Friday.

"Scores of the armed insurgents have been killed over the past 48 hours and the Taliban attacks on Nahrin, Baghlan-e-Markazai and Dahn-e-Ghori districts have been repulsed," the official told Xinhua news

agency. He also added that reinforcement had been reached and the situation would be soon brought under control.

Taliban militants in have seized parts of the restive Baghlan province over the past few days. In the meantime, Brigadier Safiullah Mohammadi who serves as a member of the reinforcement forces in Baghlan, told reporters on Friday that some 100 Taliban fighters had been killed and injured over the past two days during operations backed by fighting planes.

However, Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid has rejected the claim, saying fighting has been continuing and the militants are defending their positions. Taliban militants have intensified their activities since the start of the US-led forces' withdrawal on May 1. According to the security officials, the Taliban has intensified activities in Helmand, Zabul, Baghlan, Herat, Farah, Faryab, Takhar and Badakhshan provinces, and scores of militants and security personnel have been killed.

15 arrested after clashes in EJerusalem

The status of Jerusalem is one of the central disputes in the Middle East conflict. Israel claims Jerusalem as its "eternal and indivisible capital," while the Palestinians claim East Jerusalem as their capital.

Israeli police said on Friday that they have arrested 15 people in clashes in eastern Jerusalem. Early on Friday morning, stones were thrown at officers and vehicles in the Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood, dpa news agency quoted the police as saying. Fireworks were also set off. Sheikh Jarrah is located in the Arab eastern part of Jerusalem, north of the Old City. The neighbourhood has been the focus of attention for decades because of

property disputes. Both Israeli settlers and Palestinians claim ownership there. Forced evictions of Palestinian homes have repeatedly provoked protests, some of them violent, in recent years. A Supreme Court decision in a case involving four Palestinian families was expected next week. For days, supporters of the families have been meeting in Sheikh Jarrah to break their Ramadan fast with the sunset iftar meal together outdoors.

According to the media, there have already been repeated clashes. As the portal ynet wrote, settlers also sat down at a table on a street on Thursday evening. Among them was the far-right politician Itamar Ben-Gvir.

The status of Jerusalem is one of the central disputes in the Middle East conflict. Israel claims Jerusalem as its "eternal and indivisible capital," while the Palestinians claim East Jerusalem as their capital.

GETTING INOCULATED MANDATORY TO ATTEND WORKPLACE IN SAUDI



Riyadh: Saudi Arabia said on Friday that getting vaccinated against Covid-19 would be mandatory for all employees to attend their workplaces in an effort to curb the spread of the virus. Saudi Arabia's state news agency SPA, citing the Ministry of Human Resources, reported that vaccination would be a "mandatory condition" for employees of the private and public sectors to be present in their place of work. The Ministry said it would clarify soon the procedure and date of implementation, dpa news agency reported.

Chinese emissions exceeded developed world in 2019: Study

Beijing | Agencies

A study published on Friday revealed that China's annual emissions of greenhouse gases in 2019 exceeded the emissions of all developed countries combined for the first time.

In a comparison with European Union countries, the US and the other members of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), the study by US think-tank Rhodium Group estimates that China alone contributed 27 per cent of global emissions of CO2 equivalents that year, reports dpa news agency.

CO2 equivalents are a unit of measurement used to standardise the climate impact of different greenhouse gases.

The study said that global emissions reached 52 gigatonnes of CO2 equivalent in 2019, a 11.4 per cent increase over the past decade. China's 27-per-cent share of global emissions was far larger than that of the US, which took second place with 11 per cent.



According to the calculations, India climbed to third place for the first time with 6.6 per cent of global emissions of CO2 equivalents. The study also indicated that China's emissions have tripled since 1990. They have increased by 25 per cent over the past decade. But due to its large population, China's per capita emissions have remained considerably lower than those in the developed world. Rhodium's study indicates that in 2019, China's per capita emissions reached 10.1 tonnes, just below average levels of 10.5 tons per capita across the OECD bloc in 2019. This was still significantly lower than the US, which has the highest per capita

emissions in the world at 17.6 tons per capita. "While final global data for 2020 is not yet available, we expect China's per capita emissions exceeded the OECD average in 2020, as China's net GHG emissions grew around 1.7 per cent while emissions from almost all other nations declined sharply in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic," the authors write. The study also noted that "China's history as a major emitter is relatively short compared to developed countries, many of which had more than a century head start." Strong economic growth and a large proportion of coal in China's energy mix are considered to be the main reasons for the increase in its carbon dioxide emissions. As the world's largest coal consumer, China has promised new efforts in terms of climate protection. At the virtual climate summit at the invitation of US President Joe Biden, Chinese President Xi Jinping promised two weeks ago that he would first "strictly limit" the increase in coal consumption by 2025 and then "gradually reduce it" by 2030.

Colombian Prez rejects violent acts during protests

Colombian President Ivan Duque rejected the "acts of violence" that have taken place in the past week during a national strike, including looting and damage to state and private property. "We have to categorically reject violence and all manifestations and expressions that threaten the life, honour and property, rights and liberties of citizens," Duque said after meeting with high court representatives on Thursday.



On April 15, Duque sent a tax law initiative to the Congress that would reform the national tax system, which will raise taxes on the middle class, who took to the streets in protest throughout the country, reports Xinhua news agency. For the last eight days, there have been heavy clashes in several cities between authorities and protesters,

as well as damage to state and private property. So far, 24 people have died in the protests and 46 others injured, according to El Tiempo newspaper. The President stressed that all acts against citizens and public servants in the last few days must be investigated and punished. Meanwhile, Duque and Vice President Marta Lucia Ramirez

announced on Thursday they hope to meet with strike organisers to negotiate their demands. "We want to announce that the President and Vice President are willing to meet with all social actors in the country, including members of the strike committee, to meet urgently," Labor Minister Angel Custodio Cabrera said.

KABUL HIT BY BLACKOUT AS 2 POWER PYLONS DAMAGED

Kabul: Kabul was hit by a blackout as two power pylons were destroyed in explosion on Friday, Afghanistan's Breshna Sherkat, the national power company, confirmed. The incident took place at 4.45 a.m. in Kalakan district, some 30 km outside Kabul city, the company said, adding that another power pylon was partially damaged in the attack, reports Xinhua news agency. Without providing more details, the company said in a short statement: "A technical team has been sent to the area to repair the power pylons and resume power transmission to Kabul and other provinces." Some individuals in the past years targeted power transmission pylons to get ransom from power authorities but had been arrested.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack on power pylons. The Taliban which has been fighting the government had in the past attacked power pylons, telephone towers, roads and bridges, according to officials.

'Florida moving in wrong direction after enacting voting law'

The White House slammed Florida after its Republican Governor signed into law a bill that will make it more difficult for certain residents of the US state to vote.

"The 2020 election was one of the most secure elections in American history. There's no legitimate reason to change the rules right now to make it harder to vote. That's built on a lie," Xinhua news agency quoted Deputy Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre as saying to reporters aboard Air Force One on Thursday.

"The only reason to change the rules right now is if you don't like who voted, and that should be out of bounds," she said.

"There are some states with bad laws that are trying to make them good and some states with good laws, trying to make them even better. That's moving forward." Florida is moving in the wrong direction," Jean-Pierre said.

Jean-Pierre reiterated the White House's support for the House-passed legislation, H.R.1, that would expand access to mail-in ballots, early voting and automatic registration, among other provisions.



The bill is unlikely to pass in the Senate. Florida Governor Ron DeSantis earlier Thursday signed the state's new voting legislation into law.

The new law, Senate Bill 90, will restrict the use of absentee ballot drop boxes; implement additional requirements for voters to sign up for mail-in ballots; impose additional voter identification rules; prohibit volunteers and organisations from returning ballots on behalf of voters; and ban counties from accepting grants or private funds to pay for election-related expenses. DeSantis said during the signing ceremony that "Floridians can rest assured that their votes count and that Florida will continue to conduct elections that are efficient, transparent and secure".

3 IS leaders killed near Baghdad

The Iraqi Counter-Terrorism Service (CTS) commandos killed three local leaders of the Islamic State (IS) terror group near Baghdad, the military said. Yahia Rasoul, spokesman of the commander-in-chief of the Iraqi forces, said in a statement on Thursday that the CTS forces attacked an IS hideout in the al-Radwanayah area, southwest of Baghdad, reports Xinhua news agency.

Rasoul said that the victims had helped the suicide bombers, who carried out twin bombings on January 21 in a bustling outdoor market for second-hand clothes in the Bab al-Sharji area in downtown Baghdad. A total of 32

people were killed and 116 others were wounded in the blasts.

The commandos also raided an IS hideout in south of Baghdad and arrested another local leader, Rasoul said, adding that based on information extracted from the detainee, the troops seized a cache of weapons in the al-Yousifiyah area. The security situation in Iraq has been improving since the security forces fully defeated IS militants across the country late in 2017. However, deadly incidents still occur sporadically in the war-ravaged country as IS remnants have since retreated into urban areas or deserts and rugged areas, waging frequent guerrilla attacks against security forces and civilians.

Signs of armed resistance in Myanmar

Armed opponents of the Myanmar military junta have killed three administrators appointed by them in the Yangon, Mandalay and Sagaing regions in targeted attacks.

Regime-appointed ward administrators and police informants have been attacked frequently since mid-April, but no one has claimed responsibility for the attacks.

IANS was the first to report the formation of armed resistance groups among ethnic Burmese from the hardline ranks of protesters upset with the random killings of their comrades.

The 'Federal Army' and few other such groups have now merged into the United Defence Force and hundreds of its new recruits have been undergoing weapons training in camps of ethnic rebel armies like Karen National Union (KNU).

"It seems the first batch of these recruits

are back in cities to start armed action," said a former NLD MP who has served in the army. But he was not willing to be identified for fear of being dragged to interrogation by the junta.

Municipal ward administration offices, key to the junta's governance network, have been targeted with bomb attacks to oppose new appointments by the regime.

Newly-appointed ward administrators and police informants are increasingly being targeted for collaborating with the junta in arresting anti-regime protesters, striking government staff and other civilians opposing military rule.

A newly-appointed ward administrator was stabbed to death on Thursday by unknown men in Chanmyathazi Township of Mandalay region, police said.

On Tuesday evening, a Kyeekan village tract administrator in Khin-U Township, Sagaing, was stabbed to death outside the village, according to a military-run newspa-

per. Motorcyclists also opened fire on the house of Witoke village administrator U Than Myint in Tamu Township, Sagaing, on Monday night.

Tamu is opposite Moreh in India's Manipur state. U Than Myint and his wife were injured and his daughter and grandson were killed, police said.

The attack follows a search operation in the village by security forces looking for traditional firearms. During the raids, two villagers were beaten and detained by troops, residents told local mediapersons.

Communities across Sagaing are resisting the military with homemade firearms and slingshots. On Tuesday, a ward administrator in Thaketa Township in Yangon was stabbed to death at his office by three men posing as informants.

Police stations and government and education offices have been attacked with firebombs and homemade bombs since March 14 when the regime killed more than 110

civilians in a day. The armed resistance have also targeted Chinese business interests.

On Wednesday, three police guards outside an off-take station on the China-installed Rakhine-Yunnan oil and gas pipeline were hacked to death by sword and machete bearing attackers who got away without being identified.

China has expressed deep concerns over the safety of its investments since 32 factories run by its companies were set on fire at the Hlaingtharyar industrial zone on the outskirts of Yangon in March.

Now it has much to worry because the attack on police guards outside the off-take station in Singtaing township in Mandalay section of the 800 km-long pipeline follows social media threats by pro-democracy protesters to blow it up. The crude oil pipeline carries 22 million tonnes of Middle East crude annually to China's Yunnan province after it is brought to Myanmar's western deep sea port of Kyaukphyu.



JADEJA RETURNS TO INDIA'S TEST SQUAD FOR ENGLAND TOUR

A 20-member India squad was named for the tour of England that includes the World Test Championship (WTC) final against New Zealand and five Test matches against England. There are four standby players besides the 20 players named in the main squad, taking the total number of the touring party to 24.

India play the WTC final against New Zealand in Southampton from June 18. That Test will be followed by five Tests against England in August-September. The first Test against England begins on August 4 and the final Test is scheduled to end on September 14.

The squad sees the return of all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja who missed the recent Tests in Australia and against England in India due to injury. Batsman KL Rahul and wicketkeeper Wriddhiman Saha have also been included, subject to fitness clearance. Pace bowler Jasprit Bumrah who missed

the last Test against England in early March due to marriage has also returned.

Rahul had to undergo surgery after he pulled out of the Indian Premier League due to appendicitis while Saha is down with Covid-19.

Following their 3-1 win against England at home, India finished as the No. 1 side with 72.2 percentage points and booked their place in the WTC final.

OLY BADMINTON QUALIFIERS: Blow for Indians as Malaysia Open postponed

The chances of several Indian badminton players hoping to qualify for this year's Tokyo Olympic Games were dealt a body blow on Friday as the Malaysia Open Super 750 tournament was postponed.

The Badminton World Federation (BWF) also announced that the tournament would no longer be an Olympic qualification event, leaving June's Singapore Open Super 500 as the only remaining Olympic qualifier where players will have to perform well to qualify.

Reigning world champion PV Sindhu, 2019 World Championships bronze medalist B Sai Praneeth and men's doubles pair Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty are the Indians who are hoping to qualify based on their ranking in the BWF's 'Race to Tokyo' standings. Those placed within the



top 16 of the standings in singles gain automatic qualification and in doubles, those within the top eight go through. Sindhu and Praneeth are ranked seventh and 13th respectively while Rankireddy and Shetty are eighth.

Among Indians who remain in contention for qualification are former singles world No.1 players Saina Nehwal and Kidambi Srikanth and, to a lesser extent women's doubles pair Ashwini Ponnappa and N Sikki Reddy. Saina is ranked


22nd while Srikanth is 20th. Ashwini and Sikki are 26th, 14 places below the qualification ranking.

The Singapore Open is scheduled to be held from June 1 to 6 while the Olympic qualification period ends on June 15.

"Tournament organisers Badminton Association of Malaysia and Badminton World Federation have jointly agreed to postpone the Malaysia Open 2021, scheduled for 25-30 May 2021," said the BWF in a statement on Friday.

The 39-year-old, regarded as one of the best Spanish strikers of all time, will be assisted by a dedicated team called DV7 (David Villa 7), which will have, among others, the former Odisha FC head coach Josep Gombau and Victor Onate.

"I will try to bring my experience. Obviously, I didn't play in India but I played soccer for 20 years as a professional and before that in the academy. And, in all of the projects that we (the team) are involved in, I'll try to give all of my experience that I have in soccer," said Villa after joining Odisha FC.

Villa was a part of the Spanish team that won the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa and the 2008 European Championship in Austria-Switzerland. He was also an integral part of Spanish giants Barcelona FC, who won the La Liga and the Champions League.

Solskjaer hails Cavani, de Gea after United's win against Roma

Ole Gunnar Solskjaer heaped praise on Edinson Cavani and David De Gea after Manchester United kicked off a run of four matches in eight days by reaching the Europa League final.

Having beaten Roma 6-2 in last week's semi-final first leg at Old Trafford, the Red Devils sealed their shot at glory against Unai Emery's Villarreal on May 26 despite losing the return leg 3-2 on Thursday.

Cavani scored twice in each game while De Gea produced some fine saves as United advanced 8-5 on aggregate. Cavani, who is out of contract this summer,



grabbed the goals but De Gea shone brightest. The long-serving number one flourished at the Stadio Olimpico, staking his claim for a starting role in the final having been displaced by Dean Henderson in the Premier League.

The Europa League final offers United a chance to secure their first silverware since winning the competition in 2017, but they have a lot to deal with before then.

The postponed clash against Liverpool has been rearranged for next Thursday, leaving the Red Devils facing four matches in a mere eight days.

ENGLAND COUNTY CLUBS EXPRESS INTEREST TO HOST IPL

England's county cricket clubs have reportedly offered to host the 2021 Indian Premier League (IPL). The tournament, which was being held amid the raging second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic in India, was postponed earlier this week after multiple positive cases of the coronavirus came up in the tournament's bio-bubble.

The Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC), Surrey and Warwickshire, who are based at Lord's, The Kia Oval (both London) and Edgbaston (Birmingham), respectively are understood to be part of the group who wrote to the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) inviting them to extend the opportunity to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), according to ESPNcricinfo. The plans would see the tournament completed in around two weeks in the second half of September.

While Lancashire is not one of the signatories in the letter, their home ground Old Trafford in Manchester could be used as one of the stadiums for the tournament should it be held in England.

However, the ECB has received no request from the BCCI to host the tournament. BCCI president Sourav Ganguly said on Wednesday that it remains too early to plan for the tournament to be held at a new venue at a later date.



ALIK EARNS OLYMPIC QUOTA IN MEN'S 125KG FREESTYLE WRESTLING

India's Sumit Malik has won the Olympic quota place in the men's 125kg freestyle wrestling event by reaching the final of the World Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament here.

Malik beat Jose Daniel Diaz of Venezuela 5-0 to set up the title clash with Russia's Sergei Kozlyev. Finalists in each of the weight categories in this tournament are eligible to win a quota place for the Tokyo Olympics.

In his first qualification round, Malik beat Aiala Lazarev of Kyrgyzstan 2-2 while in his second round he defeated Alexandr Romanov of Moldovan 2-2. In the quarterfinals, he outclassed Rustam Iskandari of Tajikistan 19-5. Malik is the fourth Indian freestyle wrestler to have won the Olympic quota place in the men's category. Ravi Dahiya (57 kg), Bajrang Punia (65 kg), Deepak Punia (86 kg) are the other three wrestlers to have won tickets to Tokyo Olympics from the 2019 Olympic qualification cycle. On Friday, three Indian women will compete with an eye on the Olympic quota.



Fifth edition of Abu Dhabi T10 to begin on Nov 19

The fifth edition of the Abu Dhabi T10 cricket tournament will take place at the Sheikh Zayed Cricket Stadium from November 19 till December 4 this year. The tournament, jointly sanctioned by the International Cricket Council (ICC) and the Emirates Cricket Board, will feature an increased number of matches played over 15 days, as against 10 in the previous seasons. Launched in 2017, the Abu Dhabi T10 is played in a round-robin format followed by the eliminators and the final.

"By bringing T10 to the UAE capital we have made Abu Dhabi the home of this truly exciting cricketing format, the potential of which is



now reaching ever-growing audiences of 144.2 million worldwide with 800 million video views on social media during Season 4," said Aref Al Awani, general secretary, Abu Dhabi Sports Council. "It is a matter of pride that a journey that started in 2017 with just four teams has now reached a stage where the tournament has become an important part of the world's cricketing calendar," said Shaji Ul Mulik, chairman, Ten Sports

Management (TSM), which owns the League.

The fourth edition in Jan-Feb this year was safely delivered against a background of strict Covid-19 prevention protocols and gained a global TV audience of 63.9 million, a 79.67% year-on-year increase. Past Abu Dhabi T10 champions include the Kerala Kings, Maratha Arabians and Northern Warriors, who have won the title twice.

Manchester United cruise into Europa League final, Arsenal lose to Villarreal

Manchester United lost 2-3 to Roma in second leg of the semi-final of Europa League but cruised through to the final on the basis of an 8-5 aggregate victory.

But it will not be Premier League rivals Arsenal they meet in Poland's Gdansk on May 26, rather Spaniards Villarreal, who are in a first major final after a goalless second leg in London, DPA reports.

The Yellow Submarine, as Villarreal are known, gained revenge for their 2006 Champions League semi-final loss to Arsenal with a 2-1 aggregate triumph while United dominated Roma 8-5. Manchester United's entry to the final means the club could claim both of the major European titles this year as neighbours Manchester City face Chelsea in the Champions League final three days later.

Only the city of Milan has managed this feat, when AC Milan won the Champions League and Inter Milan the UEFA Cup in



1994. Ole Gunnar Solskjaer had lost his previous four semi-finals as United manager but could finally taste victory.

Villarreal also ended a last four hoodoo as they had lost all five of their previous semi-finals in various competitions. Coach Unai Emery, a former Arsenal manager, won three Europa Leagues with Sevilla and is on the brink of glory once more.

They almost repeated their early goal from the first leg but keeper Bernd Leno saved well from Samuel Chukwueze, who was later carried off injured. Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang hit the post in the first half for Arsenal with a curling shot and headed onto the woodwork with his last involvement before being substituted 10 minutes from time due to lingering effect of a malaria infection. But Villarreal held on to claim a historic date with United later this month and Arsenal -- a lowly ninth domestically -- face a bitterly disappointing conclusion to the campaign.

Rowers win Olympic quota place in lightweight double scull

The Indian rowing team comprising Arun Lal Jat and Arvind Singh won the Tokyo Olympic quota place in men's lightweight double scull event at the World Rowing Asia and Oceania Olympic and Paralympic Qualification Regatta in Tokyo on Friday.

The Indian team covered the 2000-metre course in six minutes 36.92 seconds to finish second behind host Japan who clocked six minutes 34.70 seconds.

"A steady pace throughout the 2000m course was key to success. The Indian team, in fact, covered the last 500m of the 2000m course faster than the eventual winners. It was a good performance," an official of the Rowing Federation of India (RFI) told reporter.



Uzbekistan were third while Indonesia won the fourth spot. Hong Kong finished fifth and

Kazakhstan sixth. The top three teams won Olympic quota places.

Since Jakar Khan had posted a good time in his Thursday's preliminary round of the men's single scull, he also has a good chance of winning an Olympic quota place, said the RFI official. The semi-finals and final are scheduled for Friday. All the participating teams had to follow strict Covid-19 protocols. A member of Sri Lanka's support staff tested positive for the virus but reports of all other coaches and athletes were negative. "The rowers were tested on Wednesday and again on Thursday for Covid-19 to ensure safety of the competitors," said the Indian team official. More than 75 athletes from Asian countries are participating in the Olympic qualification tournament.

T20 WC SHOULDN'T BE HELD IN INDIA IF IT DRAINS RESOURCES: CUMMINS

Australia fast bowler Pat Cummins has said that the 2021 T20 World Cup should be held in India only if it is not going to be a drain on the country's resources in its fight against the Covid-19 pandemic.

Covid crisis poses economic risk in Q1 FY22; 'muted impact' likely: FinMin

As states take to lockdowns amid the severe Covid crisis, the Finance Ministry in a report has said that second wave of the Covid-19 poses downside risk to economic activities during April-June, although the impact is expected to be muted compared to that in the first wave. The 'Monthly Economic Review' for April 2021 published by the Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) said that learning to "operate with COVID-19" provides a silver lining of economic resilience amidst the second wave.

"The second wave of COVID-19 has posed a downside risk to economic activity in the first quarter of FY 2021-22. However, there are reasons to expect a muted economic impact as compared to the first wave. Learning to "operate with COVID-19", as borne by international experience, provides a silver lining of economic resilience amidst the second wave," it said. Noting that the global economy recovered further in March and April, powered with vaccination drives and fiscal stimuli by few large economies, it said that in India the momentum in economic recovery since the first wave moderated in April due to the



second wave of coronavirus.

It said that agriculture continues to be the silver lining with record food grain production estimated in the ensuing crop year on the back of predicted normal monsoons.

Rural demand indicators like tractor sales recorded a growth of 172 per cent and 36 per cent compared to a low base in March 2020 and even the pre-Covid month of March 2019 respectively. Industrial production showed mixed trends. While Index of Industrial Production (IIP) in February 2021 registered a broad-

based decline of 3.6 per cent (YoY) and 3.9 per cent compared to January 2021, the eight-core index posted a growth of 6.8 per cent (YoY) in March 2021 and 11.1 per cent compared to February 2021.

In FY 2020-21, the core sector contracted by 7 per cent compared to 0.4 per cent growth in FY 2019-20 with fertilizer being the sole growing sector and electricity recovering steadily in the second half. The Purchasing Managers Index for manufacturing rose further to 55.5 in April with consumer goods as the strongest-per-

forming category, followed by capital goods and then intermediate goods. The rebound was also reflected in RBI's survey estimates on capacity utilization and manufacturers' optimism for the current year, the report said.

In the second half of FY 2020-21, GST collections registered a good growth and collections exceeded Rs 1 lakh crore in each of the last six months owing to economic recovery. GST collections registered another record high of Rs 1.41 lakh crore in April, indicative of continual economic recovery.

Rs 50K cr on-tap term liquidity facility opened to ease access to emergency health services

In order to boost the provision of immediate liquidity for ramping up COVID-related healthcare infrastructure and services in the country, the Reserve Bank of India on Friday decided to open an on-tap liquidity window of Rs 50,000 crore with tenors of up to three years at the repo rate till March 31, 2022.

The on-tap liquidity window for healthcare infrastructure was announced by the RBI governor on May 5 when he announced several other measures as part of a Covid relief package.

Under the scheme, banks will provide fresh lending support to a wide range of entities including vaccine manufacturers; importers/suppliers

of vaccine and priority medical devices; hospitals/dispensaries; pathology labs and diagnostic centres; manufacturers and suppliers of oxygen and ventilators; importers of vaccines and COVID-related drugs; COVID-related logistics firms and also patients for treatment.

Banks are being incentivised for quick delivery of credit under the scheme through extension of priority sector lending (PSL) classification to such lending up to March 31, 2022. These loans will continue to be classified under PSL till repayment/maturity, whichever is earlier.

Banks may deliver these loans to borrowers directly or through intermediary financial entities regulated by the RBI. Under the scheme, banks are expected to create a COVID loan

book. By way of an additional incentive, such banks will be eligible to park their surplus liquidity up to the size of the COVID loan book with the RBI under the reverse repo window at a rate which is 25 bps lower than the repo rate.

Banks desirous of deploying their own resources without availing funds from the RBI under the scheme for lending to the specified segments mentioned above will also be eligible for the incentives.

The RBI has decided that the on-tap scheme will remain operational from May 7, 2021 till March 31, 2022. All banks eligible under the Liquidity Adjustment Facility (LAF) can participate in the scheme. Besides, requests from banks desirous of availing funds from the RBI will be subject to avail-

ability of funds as on the date of application, i.e., funds cannot be guaranteed in case the total amount of Rs 50,000 crore is already availed.

Furthermore, it has been decided that banks would need to lend such funds within a reasonable period, i.e., not later than 30 days from the date of availing the funds from the RBI. There is no tenor restriction regarding lending by banks under the scheme. However, the banks will have to ensure that the amount borrowed from the RBI should at all times be backed by lending to the specified segments till the maturity of the scheme. Also under the scheme banks would be allowed to park their surplus liquidity up to the size of the COVID loan book in a special 14-day reverse repo window.

The micro-blogging platform is using those services' external payment processors for transactions. "Now you can do more to support the many amazing voices who add to the conversation on Twitter -- send them tips," Twitter Support said in a tweet on Friday.

Demand momentum for jewellery continued in Q1

Consumer demand for gold in India saw robust growth in the first quarter of calendar year 2021.

According to a report by Motilal Oswal Institutional Equities, total consumer demand for gold in India, which includes jewellery, bars, and coins, witnessed a 37.4 per cent year on year growth in 1QCY21 to 140 ton. On a QoQ basis, demand was down 24.8 per cent.

Demand for jewellery remained robust in India, with volumes up 38.3% YoY to 102.5 tons in 1QCY21. Demand was boosted by easing of lockdown restrictions, lower gold prices, magnified by lowering of customs duty, and wedding demand.

Demand for gold bars and coins continued to witness a surge during 1QCY21. With the bottoming out of gold prices, consumers



advanced purchases in the form of gold bars and coins. Demand for bars and coins rose 33.8 per cent YoY to 37.5t in 1QCY21.

Net bullion imports, which constitute 85-90 per cent of India's gold supplies, saw a sharp (262 per cent) surge in 1QCY21. Although growth is on a soft base of 1QCY20, it is at the highest level since 2QCY13. This indicates the extent of pent up demand.

FII'S TURN NET BUYERS OF SOFTWARE & SERVICES, REAL ESTATE STOCKS

Mumbai: As foreign institutional investors (FII) largely pulled out investments in April amid the resurgent Covid crisis, software and services and real estate stocks ducked the subdued trend and attracted foreign funds during the second half of April. As per a research report released by Emkay Global Financial Services, the FIIs showed maximum interest in software and services and real estate sector companies. For the fortnight April 16-30, 2021, the software and services and the real estate sector saw buying worth \$281 million and \$232 million respectively.

On the other hand, FIIs turned sellers for the Materials sector last fortnight, with the highest sectoral outflow of \$570 million. FIIs also continued selling in banks and the energy sector, with each seeing outflows in excess of \$200 million. Automobiles and components stocks witnessed an outflow of \$125 million, followed by \$101 million worth of selling in diversified financial stocks.

Overall, FIIs turned net sellers in April, after six months. They pulled out net investments of Rs 12,039.43 crore last month. Over the past one year, FII inflow was unprecedented amid a stock market bull run and liquidity surge both in India and other economies. However, in the past one month the severe Covid crisis and the eventual lockdowns have weakened the investor sentiments.

Petrol, diesel prices maintain rally, rise again by 28-31 paise/ltr

Petrol and diesel prices in the country rose again sharply by 28 paise and 31 paise per litre respectively, on Friday as Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) continued to cover for their losses on holding back price rise for past 18 days due to state elections.

This is fourth increase in fuel prices in as many days as petrol and diesel prices rose by 15 paise and 18 paise per litre respectively on Tuesday and by 19 paise and 21 paise per litre respectively on Wednesday and by 25 and 30 paise respectively on Thursday after a 18 days break. With Friday's increase,

petrol is now being retailed at Rs 91.27 a litre and diesel Rs 81.73 a litre in the national capital. Across the country as well the petrol and diesel price increased on Friday but its quantum varied depending on the level of local levies in respective states.

Petrol prices in some states have breached the Rs 100 per litre mark while premium petrol has been hovering above that level for some time now. IANS had reported earlier that OMCs may begin increasing the retail price of petrol and diesel post state elections as they were incurring losses to the tune of Rs 2-3 per litre by holding the price line despite higher global crude and

product prices. The oil companies had already increased the ATF prices by 6.7 per cent effective this month.

OMCs benchmark retail fuel prices to a 15-day rolling average of global refined products' prices and dollar exchange rate. In the last fortnight global oil prices have hovered in \$66-67 a barrel range higher than the levels when petrol and diesel prices were last revised. Crude prices have jumped around \$ 69 a barrel now.

The price of the two auto fuels had fallen by 16 paise and 14 paise per litre respectively on April 15 after a 15 day break when OMCs kept its prices static. Thereafter, revision of fuel prices have been halted.

'Drop in some food prices will push CPI inflation down to 4.0% in April'

A high base and an unseasonal drop in some food prices will push CPI inflation down to 4.0 per cent in April, Barclays said in a research report on Friday.

According to the report, Core inflation will stay elevated, and rising commodity prices globally may pose some challenges in coming months.

The CPI inflation data for April is expected to be released by the statistics ministry on May 12.

"We expect CPI inflation to fall to 4.04 per cent y/y in April, below the January low and down from 5.5 per cent in March. The drop in inflation will be driven primarily by two factors - a high base owing to last year's pandemic-related lockdown, and an unseasonal fall in some food prices," Barclays said.

This year, despite the new restrictions, supply chains have not broken down to the same extent as 2020 and hence the effect on perishable prices has been opposite, with reduced traffic in stores causing prices to fall.

Looking at the details, the investment banker said it expect



food prices to rise 0.1 per cent m/m, which is significantly below the seasonal trend typically seen in the lean season

before sowing. Prices for cereals, vegetables and dairy products remain in

check and are offsetting the increase in prices of non-perishable items, such as cooking oil, pulses and prepared foods.

Still there is a limit to how much perishable prices can fall, and the unusually low prices could pose upside risks to food inflation in H2 21. Overall, we forecast food prices will rise 1.8 per cent y/y in April, the research report said.

Among other sub components, fuel costs likely declined modestly in April, but may rebound in May, as prices have started to rise following the completion of recent regional elections. Barclays has forecast core inflation will ease to 5.4 per cent, from 5.7 per cent in March. In addition to increases in the education and healthcare components, the expectation is that rising gold prices to add to upward pressure on m/m momentum. We believe concerns over the increase in core WPI inflation are overblown and expect the pass-through from higher commodity prices to be limited by weak underlying demand, the report said. Research by the RBI also suggests that the rise in core WPI inflation will pass through only to core goods CPI inflation (22.0 per cent weight in CPI basket) and will amount to just 20bp for every 100bp rise in core WPI in the current environment.

Fifty-something Mae hates being clicked. Which in turn leads to a peculiar problem. She realises there's no decent photograph of her in the house. That's no petty issue if you consider your primary source of remembrance, when you're no more, will be the picture that hangs in the living room. So, Mae decides she must fix the situation. Debutant duo Gayatri Patil and Aditya Rathi's Marathi film is a bitter-sweet comedy crafted out of middle-class quirks and the deeper question of identity, without getting too heavy about it. Rathi's script maintains a feel-good rhythm all along, and ends with a spot of black humour.

The storytelling derives its major impetus from the cast, led by a flaw-



less Neena Kulkarni. She is the quintessential lady-next-door, coy and withdrawn in her own world. The story gives her a character arch that

moves subtly, as her protagonist Mae plays out a very unlikely coming of age drama. There are two aspects to the narrative, as Mae sets out to figure out a way how to get the perfect image to frame for posterity. First, the film is a plain and enjoyable adventure of a woman, who has been a homemaker all her life, as she sets out to realise her 'dream' for a perfect photo-op. Her interest in the idea is stirred as she starts observing photographs at funerals, and feels most images of the departed seem far from perfect -- not at least in the way she would hope to appear on the walls of her home. Patil and Rathi execute this aspect of the narrative with assuredness. The other aspect that drives the story is Mae's internal journey, unfolding as the film's subtext. Patil and Rathi go for humour-laced simplicity as Mae makes an important realisation right at the end, about what really defines memories -- a moment's perfect pose before a camera or a lifetime's impression that one may leave behind. Simply photographed (Kedar Phadke) and adequately edited (B. Mahanteshwar and Rohan Sarode), "Photo Prem" is one of those films that leave a message even as it entertains, without forcing you to think too hard about what it has to say.

Musician Ehsaan Noorani of the Shankar-Ehsaan-Loy trio wrote: "Farewell Vanraj Bhatia one of India's finest composers... was glad to have known you worked with you and been part of your music. There will not be another you."
