## GOVT AIMS TO PASS MORE BILLS IN RS AMID OPPOSITION PROTESTS

With the Monsoon Session entering its last week from Monday, the government has listed four bills related to the Finance Ministry for passage in the Rajya Sabha to get them Parliament's nod.

According to the list for business for Monday, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will move The Tribunals Reforms Bill, 2021, which seeks to amend the Cinematograph Act, 1952, the Customs Act, 1962, the Airports Authority of India Act, 1994, the Trade Marks Act, 1999, and the Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmers' Rights Act, 2001. She will also move The General Insurance Business (Nationalisation) Amendment Bill, 2021 for passage. Both these bills have been passed by the Lok Sabha. The Appropriation (No.4) Bill, 2021 and The Appropriation (No.3) Bill, 2021, pending in the upper house since last

week, will also be moved. The government rushed through eight bills through the house in 3 hours 25 minutes, amid the opposition alleging that the government is undermining Parliament, and the government blaming the opposition for the stalemate and not resolving the issue. The Constitution (Scheduled Tribe) Order (Amendment) Bill, The Commission for Air Quality Management in National Capital Region and Adjoining Areas Bill, The Essential Defence Services Bill, 2021, The Limited Liability Partnership (Amendment) Bill, 2021, the Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee (Amendment) Bill, 2021, the Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India (Amendment) Bill, 2021, the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Amendment) Bill, 2021 and The Inland Vessels Bill, 2021 have been passed.

The work in the third week increased by 24.20 per cent corresponding to previous week, while 21.36 hours was wasted. In the debates, opposition members tried to raise issues related to farm laws, the Pegasus snooping row,

and fuel hike but were not allowed by the chair. Congress leader Deepender Hooda alleged that "as you take name of farmers in the house the mic is put off". Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge tweeted on Sunday: "PM @narendramodi seems to have lost his nerves. Why is he not keen on answering questions in the Parliament?"

"The opposition parties are ready for discussions in the Parliament, but @BJP4India Govt is stalling the proceedings so that the truth doesn't get to the people."

But the Government claims that the opposition is raising a "non-issue". The opposition wants that the government should allow a discussion on the snooping row, farm laws and fuel price hikes under Rule 267. However, the government says that on the snooping row, only clarifications can be sought after the minister's statement while on the farm laws a short duration discussion has been allowed in the House but the opposition is not ready to discuss it before discussing the Pegasus issue.

### UP COURT TO HEAR CASE RELATED TO PAK PM ON AUG 26



**Pratapgarh:** A court in Uttar Pradesh's Pratapgarh will hear a petition seeking the registration of an FIR against Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan on August 26 to discuss the maintainability of the same. A criminal complaint had been filed against the Prime Minister at the Pratapgarh court, seeking registration of an FIR against him for permitting the destruction of a temple of Lord Ganesha in Pakistan. The complainant, Gyan Prakash Shukla, a lawyer and national president of the All India Rural Bar Association, has alleged that the alleged destruction of the temple was wilfully done by an unruly mob in order to disturb the communal harmony of India. He further alleged that Khan was hand in glove with perpetrators of this crime, as a leader of his party has made a video showing destruction of the temple viral on social media.

### Terror funding case:

## NIA raids 56 locations of banned J&K Jamaat

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Sunday raided 56 places in 14 districts in Jammu and Kashmir following registration of an FIR against prominent members of the banned J&K Jamaat-e-Islami in the terror fund case, officials said.

An NIA spokesperson said that the anti-terror probe agency, along with the CRPF and the Jammu and Kashmir Police, carried out searches in Srinagar, Budgam, Ganderbal, Baramulla, Kupwara, Bandipora, Anantnag, Shopian, Pulwama, Kulgam, Ramban, Doda, Kishtwar, and Rajouri districts. The official said that the agency had registered a case on the orders of the Union Ministry of Home Affairs on February 5 this year relating to separatist and secessionist activities of J&K JeL, an unlawful association under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, following its proscription on February 28, 2019.

Members of the organisation have been collecting funds domestically and abroad through donations, particularly



in the form of "Zakat, Mowda and Bait-ul-Mal" purportedly to further charity and other welfare activities, "but these funds are instead being used for violent and secessionist activities," the official said. Reports here said the Falah-e-Aam trust, owned by the JeL and situated in Nowgam outskirts area of Srinagar has also been raided.

NIA sources said the focus of these raids is to probe the funding sources of the banned organisation.

The source said that searches are also being held at the premises of Gul Mohd War, a resident of Manigam Ganderbal and the district head of JeL, Abdul Hamid Bhat, a resident of Gamchipora Betweena, Zahoor Ahmad Reshi, a JeL member and former teacher now running a shop at Safapora, and the premises of Mehrajdin Reshi in Safapora.

Reshi is a former terrorist and now runs a shop. The official, however, remained tight-lipped on sharing the names of other people whose premises were searched by the agency.

## CJI: Threat to human rights highest in police stations, even privileged not spared

Chief Justice NV Ramana on Sunday said the threat to human rights and bodily integrity are the highest in police stations and even the privileged are not spared the third-degree treatment.

Justice Ramana was delivering the keynote address at an event organised by the National Legal Services Authority of India (NALSA) to launch the "vision and mission statement" and the mobile app for NALSA.

Emphasising human rights and dignity are sacrosanct, the Chief Justice said: "The threat to human rights and bodily integrity are the highest in police stations. Custodial torture and other police atrocities are problems which still prevail in our society. Going by the recent reports even the privileged are not spared third-degree treatment". He stressed that in spite of constitutional declarations and guarantees, lack of effective legal representation at the police stations is a huge detriment to arrested or detained persons. He emphasized that the decisions taken in these early hours will later determine the ability of the accused to defend himself. "To keep police excesses in check dissemination of information about the constitutional right to legal aid and availability of free legal aid services is



necessary. The installation of display boards and outdoor hoardings in every police station/prison is a step in this direction", he said. For a society to remain governed by the rule of law, the Chief Justice said it is imperative to bridge the gap of accessibility to justice between the highly privileged and the most vulnerable.

"The realities of socio-economic diversity which prevail in our nation, cannot ever be a reason for denial of rights. If, as an institution, the judiciary wants to garnet the faith of the citizens, we have to make everyone feel assured that we exist for them. For the longest time, the vulnerable population has lived outside the system of justice," he added.

He added that despite the Covid-19 pandemic, we have successfully been able to continue our legal aid services. "Majority of those who do not have access to justice are from rural and remote areas which suffer from lack of connectivity. I have already written to the government emphasizing the need to bridge the digital divide on a priority basis", he added.

Citing NALSA has roped in Department of Post, the Chief Justice said: "The services of the existing postal network can be utilized to spread awareness regarding the availability of free legal aid services and to increase the outreach of legal services to the eligible category of persons, especially to the persons residing in rural and far-flung areas of the country".

Concluding the address, he cited Martin Luther King Junior, "Every step towards the goal of justice requires sacrifice, suffering and struggle, the tireless exertion and passionate concern of dedicated individuals."

## Politics on caste census heats up as parties step up pressure

**Politics on the caste census has escalated after the regional parties demanded that caste should be included in the census. Even the BJP ally, Janata Dal United is also pushing for the caste-based census in the country.**

S hakiluzzaman Ansari, former OBC commission member said, "The country should know what is the population of the OBC in the country and what is their social status so that welfare schemes may be diverted towards that particular community."

Though Nitish is an ally of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) but he said last week during his visit to Delhi, "Our job is to put forth our views, it is up to the Centre to do or not to do the caste census, and I do not think that one caste will like and another will not. It is in

everyone's interest." He further said that this will not bring any rift or tension in the society. There will be happiness. People will be benefited from the schemes, and such a census "happened under British rule too." Not only the JDU, other political parties such as the RJD, the Samajwadi Party and the DMK are also demanding caste-based census.

RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav had raised the issue of the caste census and had even met Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, who has also supported the demand for the caste-based census in the country. Ansari alleges that, "The

UPA government after direction from the OBC commission did a caste survey but data analysis was not published by the NDA government citing errors."

In 2011, Socio-Economic and Caste Census conducted by the Registrar General of India had come out with 46,73,034 categories of caste, sub-caste, but in July 2015, the Government of India stated that errors were found and some of them have been rectified since then.

The first caste census was conducted in India in 1881 after Britishers took over India and the last census based on caste was carried out in 1931.

### CONG FIELDS WOMEN SPOKESPERSONS TO QUESTION MINISTERS ON DELHI RAPE

New Delhi: The Congress on Sunday fielded a panel of its women spokespersons to question the silence of the Modi government's women ministers on the issue of rape and murder of a 9-year-old girl in the national capital. The press conference was jointly addressed by Alka Lamba, Supriya Shringi, Ragini Nayak, and Amrita Dhawan. Lamba said: "Despite the Congress' notice on the issue in the Rajya Sabha, a debate was not allowed while women ministers were busy in shopping for sarees at Delhi Haat." Shringi asked: "Why is the Home Minister silent when Delhi Police is directly under him." The Twitter account of former Congress President Rahul Gandhi was blocked on Saturday, after the NCPCR flagged the issue, of his photos with the victim's parents, with the social media platform. The Congress alleged that BJP is trying to silence its voices but it will not stop. "The rape and murder of the 9-year-old is not an issue, but the tweet is," said Nayak. Gandhi on Wednesday met the family members of the 9-year-old victim who was raped and killed and demanded justice for them. The minor girl was allegedly raped, murdered, and cremated without her parents' consent in Old Nangal crematorium recently. But the BJP alleged that Rahul Gandhi has revealed the identity of the victim's family which is unlawful. Following the complaint by the NCPCR, Gandhi's Twitter account had been temporarily suspended and the party, from his official handle, tweeted that due process is being followed for its restoration. It said that until then, Gandhi will stay connected with all through his other social media platforms and continue to raise his voice for people and fight for their cause.

## 2 weeks after clash, goods vehicles back on Assam-Mizoram highway

**After the withdrawal of "economic blockade", hundreds of Mizoram-bound goods vehicles, stranded since the July 26 clash, were moving normally on National Highway 306 on Sunday, ensuring supply of essentials, transport fuels, and vital medicines to the border state, officials said.**

P olice and district administration officials in Mizoram's Kolasib, which borders Assam's Cachar, said that till Sunday evening, over a hundred loaded goods trucks and other vehicles entered the state from Assam.

There are no obstacles and problems faced by the drivers and their assistants in plying their vehicles, Kolasib police chief Vanlalfaka Ralte told the media.

Mizoram Police remains on alert to facilitate the smooth movement of all types of goods and passenger vehicles all along to Aizawl, he added. Officials said that on the instructions of Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, state Urban Development Minister Ashok Singh and Environment and Forest Minister Parimal Suklabaidya, accompanied by Cachar's Deputy Commissioner and Superintendent of Police, held talks with all stakeholders at Lailapur, the entry point to Mizoram, since late Saturday.

"With the two ministers' persuasion, movement of vehicles began since Saturday night. Most stranded vehicles went to Mizoram on Sunday. There are no problems on the Assam side. We would provide all help and security to the drivers and others if necessary," Cachar Superintendent of Police Ramandeep Kaur told IANS over phone.

Due to the "economic blockade" on NH-



306, the life line of Mizoram, supply of essential commodities, transport fuels and medicines was acutely hit since the July 26 bloodiest border clash that left six Assam Police personnel dead and 100 others including civilians of the two states injured. However, several local organisations, civil society groups, and traders' bodies including the Barak Democratic Front, Youth Against Social Evils and Barak Upatyaka Banga Sahitya Sammelan, protesting against the "forceful withdrawal of economic blockade against Mizoram", separately told the media that the Assam government had "surrendered" to the Mizoram government despite six state policemen being killed. Mizoram Health Minister R. Lalhanglai said in Aizawl that besides the essential commodities and transport fuels, Mizoram has been facing a severe crisis of vital medicines during the past two weeks

due to the "economic blockade".

"Covid patients are dying for want of medicines. Seriously ill patients are in dire need of life-saving drugs..." he said in a video message. Assam and Mizoram held a crucial ministerial level meeting on August 5 in Aizawl where they decided to maintain peace along their border, and agreed that they would not send their respective forces and officials to the troubled areas.

A joint statement, issued after the meeting, said that both state governments also welcomed and agreed to take forward the initiatives taken by the Union Home Ministry and their Chief Ministers to remove tension prevailing on the inter-state border and to find lasting solutions to the disputes through discussions. Home Minister Lalchamliana, Revenue Minister Lalruatkima, and Home Secretary Vanlanglaihsaka represented Mizoram and Border Protection and Development and Agriculture Minister Atul Bora, Singh, and State Commissioner-cum-Secretary, Border Protection and Development, G.D. Tripathi comprised the Assam delegation.

After the meeting, the Assam government on August 6 withdrew its advisories and other circulars to facilitate return of normalcy along the inter-state border. Soon after the July 26 violence, it had asked its residents not to visit Mizoram and those staying in the neighbouring state to maintain utmost caution.

## Mild tremors felt in parts of Andhra, Telangana

T remors were felt in parts of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana on Sunday.


Pulichintala in Guntur district and parts of Suryapet district recorded three earthquakes between 7.15 a.m. and 8.20 a.m. According to seismologists at National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI), their intensity on the Richter Scale was recorded at 3.0, 2.7 and 2.3.

The tremors were felt in Chintlapalem and Mellacheruvu mandals of Suryapet district of Telangana. No loss of life or property was reported from any area. However, the tremors sent panic in some villages, and people ran out of their houses.

Pulichintala area on the banks of river Krishna that

divides Andhra Pradesh and Telangana has been experiencing mild tremors for the last one week. On July 26, an earthquake, measuring magnitude 4.0 on the Richter Scale, had rocked parts of the two Telugu states. The epicentre of the earthquake was in Andhra Pradesh, 156 kilometers south of Hyderabad.

Pulichintala area has been experiencing seismic activity for some time. A 4.6 magnitude quake struck the region on January 26 last year. Since then the region had been witnessing hectic seismic activity. Till June last year, over 900 micro earthquakes were recorded. The epicentre of these microquakes was 5 km downstream of Pulichintala dam. Microquake is a very low intensity earthquake which is 2.0 or less in magnitude.

# PM Modi to launch Ujjwala 2.0 on August 10

**P**rime Minister Narendra Modi will launch Ujjwala 2.0 (Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana - PMUY) by handing over LPG connections at Mahoba in Uttar Pradesh on August 10.

During the event, to be held via video conferencing, the Prime Minister will interact with beneficiaries of the Ujjwala scheme and will also address the nation, a government statement said on Sunday.

Describing the journey from Ujjwala 1.0 to Ujjwala 2.0, the release said, during Ujjwala 1.0 launched in 2016, the target was set to provide LPG



connections to five crore women members of BPL households. Subsequently, the scheme was expanded in April 2018 to include women beneficiaries from seven more categories: SC/ST, PMAY, AAY, Most backward classes, tea garden,

forest dwellers, Islands. Also, the target was revised to eight crore LPG connections.

"This target was achieved in August 2019, seven months ahead of the target date," the statement added.

In the Union budget for

FY 21-22, provision for an additional one crore LPG connection under the PMUY scheme was announced. These one crore additional PMUY connections (under Ujjwala 2.0) aim to provide deposit-free LPG connections to those low-income families who could not be covered under the earlier phase of PMUY.

"Along with a deposit free LPG connection, Ujjwala 2.0 will provide first refill and hotplate free of cost to the beneficiaries. Also, the enrollment procedure will require minimum paperwork. Ujjwala 2.0 will help achieve the Prime Minister's vision of universal access to LPG," the release claimed.

## North Indian ex-CM likely to be Congress working president

**A**s the Congress is contemplating a change in its setup, a serious churning within it is happening about an impending reshuffle at the General Secretary and state in-charge level. The party is also mulling the appointment of a working President to lessen the burden on Sonia Gandhi.

Sources say that a Hindi speaking north Indian former Chief Minister is being considered for the post. There are currently three former Chief Ministers in the party -- Digvijaya Singh, the former Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister; Bhupinder Singh Hooda former Haryana Chief Minister both had a two-term chief

ministership in their respective states. The other name is Kamal Nath, who was the Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh recently and has also been the Union Minister many times in the Centre. The fourth person is Ghulam Nabi Azad, who was the leader of opposition in the Rajya Sabha and former Chief Minister of Jammu Kashmir.

Sources say that Kamal Nath is likely to be appointed as a working president as he has vast experience and has good working relations with most of the political parties, including Left, Trinamool and NCP. He has been seen as a person with a good networking within the political set up, including those parties which are at fence.

Kamal Nath has been meeting Sonia Gandhi more frequently since the demise of veteran Ahmed Patel and had been instrumental in organising a meeting between the G-23 and Sonia Gandhi last December. Bhupinder Singh Hooda was one

of the signatories in the letter written to Sonia Gandhi last year in which Ghulam Nabi Azad was also a signatory.

Digvijaya Singh is most vocal on issues which are close to Rahul Gandhi like attacking the RSS, and this week he was taken into custody for participating in the Youth Congress agitation in which Rahul Gandhi was part. But there are critics who question his decision on various issues while being the General Secretary in the party and his tiff with Jyotiraditya Scindia which led to the collapse of the previous Congress-led government in Madhya Pradesh.

Kamal Nath is being seen as a potential candidate as he has been meeting Sonia Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra often and has been a trusted leader from the family point of view. Though sources close to him say that he is not keen to leave Bhopal and has forwarded many suggestions before the Gandhis. Sources also said that he wants no interference from

the Secretariat of Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra but only the Gandhis themselves.

Observers say that Kamal Nath has been part of the troika of Late Ahmed Patel and Murl Deora. The three were seen as smooth political players and those who knew which string to be pulled when to set right the political equations. The other Chief Ministers like Hooda, late YSR Reddy and Ashok Gehlot, late Vilas Rao Deshmukh were part of the second rung during 2000 to 2014 when Sonia Gandhi was at the helm.

But, the Congress insiders feel it is too early to say anything as Sonia Gandhi wants to settle the in house problems of states before making any such decision. She wants states like Rajasthan to be settled and preparation in elections going in states be firmed up. She is trying to pacify many other leaders, including Hooda. In Delhi, she has appointed MLAs, who are supporting Hooda as observers for the MCD polls.

## NO MERCY FOR MILITANTS AND THEIR SUPPORTERS: MANOJ SINHA

**J**ammu and Kashmir Lt governor, Manoj Sinha said on Sunday that there will be no mercy for militants and their supporters.

Addressing an official function in south Kashmir's Kulgam district, Lt governor, Manoj Sinha said, "There will be no mercy for militants and their supporters as there is no place for violence in the land of sufi saints. Misguided youths must shun violence and choose a better future for themselves."


Sinha urged local religious leaders to keep an eye on children so that they are prevented from treading the wrong path.

He praised a local youth, Tanveer Ahmad Khan who cracked the Indian Economic Service (IES) exam 2020.

Sinha said his administration is committed to ensure peace and development in Kashmir.

"In a place like Kashmir, where there are sufi saints everywhere, there is no place for violence and militancy."

"Sufi saints like Syed Simnani, who gave blood and sweat to promote peace and to defeat violence, there is no place for any sort of violence."



"UT administration is committed to promote the vision of Sufi saints like Syed Simnani and promote the culture of peace and progress in the region."

"Unfortunately some elements and the neighbouring country do not want peace to be promoted in Kashmir."

"Youth who have chosen the wrong path must shun violence. Those trying to mislead youth by pushing them towards violence are playing with the sentiments of the people of Kashmir", Sinha said.

"He is secular at his core. We will use Elvis' experience everywhere in Goa to create awareness in the people who are trapped by the topics (AAP's trademark caps), about this AAP agenda," Chodankar further said.



Apart from being the AAP convenor in Goa, Gomes was also the chief ministerial candidate of the Kejriwal party in the 2017 state assembly polls, where it performed poorly, with Gomes himself losing his election deposit in the contest.

Gomes quit AAP in December 2020. He had served as a state cadre bureaucrat in Goa for nearly two

decades and resigned from service soon after he was promoted into the Indian Administrative Service.

The former AAP leader, who had been critical of the Congress in his former role, especially the steady stream of defection of its MLAs, said that he had been assured by the state Congress leadership that the MLAs who had defected would not be taken back into the party.

"I stand by every word I had said that time. Was there no defection? There have been defections earlier

too. The last defection of 10 persons, a sword was put through the backs of Goans. I had expressed the emotions of Goans," Gomes told reporters after his induction.

"I asked (Chodankar) a hundred times as to whether defectors will be taken back. Till today, the stand is that they will not be taken back. This

will be a good cleansing process and those who want a good future for Goa and their children will come to the Congress fold," Gomes claimed.

He also said that he could not be branded as a "party hopper" because he had taken eight to nine months to join a new party after quitting AAP.

"I was in touch with the Congress leaders. Although I have switched parties... I quit one party eight to nine months back. I did not just jump. I took time to make the switch," Gomes said.

"I have taken a step. The Congress is one of the oldest political parties in the world. It has a rich history and ideology, the main thing is the ideology. (It believes in) the Constitution of India and secularism. People have come and gone, but the ideology is intact," Gomes said.

## TN to crackdown on religious intolerance, pushing for new law on communal harmony

**A**fter the Kanyakumari district police in Tamil Nadu arrested Father George Ponnaiah under the Kuzhithurai archdiocese on delivering hate speech hurting the sentiments of the Hindu community, the DMK government of MK Stalin has given a stern message that the state would not tolerate religious bigotry. The government was also keen that there were no untoward incidents of communal violence in the state.

The arrest of the Catholic priest took place on July 24 and he was subsequently remanded to judicial custody for 15 days. While the priest denied the charges, the Kuzhithurai archdiocese came out against the speech of the priest. In another incident of religious intolerance a few miscreants placed an

idol of Lord Ganesha at a barren land near a church property in Tiruchengode, the police immediately swung into action and arrested four people. The incident occurred on August 2. # RELAXATIONS ANNOUNCED; COVID CURBS EASED FOR MALLS, SHOPS, HOTELS

Deputy Chief Minister of Maharashtra Ajit Pawar on Sunday announced relaxations for Pune and Pimpri Chinchwad amid improving Covid-19 situation in these cities. Addressing a press conference, Pawar announced relaxations for shops, malls and also permitted the reopening of hotels and restaurants with restrictions. The new set of Covid-19 relaxations will come into effect from August 9, 2021.

In Pune and Pimpri Chinchwad, all the shops can remain open till 8 pm for six days a week. All hotels and restaurants have been allowed to operate with 50% seating capacity till 10 pm on all days. Shopping malls can remain open till 8 pm on



all days but entry will be only allowed to those who're fully vaccinated. Complete staff in the malls must be vaccinated. Indoor and outdoor activities/sports have been

permitted on all days. The announcement in Covid-19 relaxations came a day after Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray said his government was

planning more relaxations in the coming days for hotels and restaurants. He also said that the relaxations may be announced for Mumbai local trains as well.

Maharashtra reported 6,061 new coronavirus cases and 128 fatalities on Saturday which took the state's infection tally to 63,47,820 and death toll to 1,33,845, a health department official said. As many as 9,356 patients were discharged from hospitals, pushing the number of recoveries to 61,39,493.

Maharashtra has 71,050 active coronavirus cases now. As many as 4,31,539 people are in-home quarantine and 2,761 are in institutional quarantine. The state's case recovery rate is 96.72 per cent, while the fatality rate is 2.1 per cent.

## Maha govt to launch yearly commercial pilot training programme

Maharashtra government is trying to collaborate with aviation companies to train 25 people every year as commercial pilots.

The Maharashtra state Disaster Management Minister Vijay Wadettiwar on Saturday told reporters that the Maharashtra government is considering giving training to 2,000 OBC students for the Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) exams and 1,000 for the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) exams. The minister also said the government is in talking terms with aviation companies to impart pilot training to 25 students each year.

The state government has sanctioned funds to the tune of Rs 150 crore for Mahajyoti (Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Research and Training Institute), of which Rs 40 crore have been disbursed, he said. "Under Mahajyoti, we are going to train 2,000 OBC students for the MPSC exam and 1,000 for UPSC exams," Wadettiwar said.

The Maharashtra government will also train 25 people as commercial pilots, and 33 per cent of the 25 people will belong from the VJNT class and 67 per cent from the OBC category. He said the state govern-

ment is planning to set up a separate commission to gather the required data in court for the political reservation of OBCs. The minister further criticised the Union Cabinet for clearing a constitution amendment bill that seeks to give states the power to make their own OBC lists.

"The bill presented in the Parliament is incomplete. The Central government has pushed its responsibility on states regarding the reservation. Without Constitutional amendment, reservation beyond 50 per cent is not possible," he said.

worsened. We are investigating the matter." The officer added that MNS workers met him seeking strong action in the matter. President of Maharashtra Rickshaw Panchayat Baba Kamble said Pawar had told the agents that his earnings had dropped drastically. "Due to the Covid curbs he was not in a position to repay the loan," Kamble said. "All of them pounced upon him, beat him up mercilessly, smashed his mobile phone and threw him on the ground. He lay there for a while in a semi-conscious state before being shifted to the hospital. I heard he has suffered serious injuries," he elaborated. In a statement, Bajaj Finance Limited said, "We value customers and hold them in high esteem. We have a standard policy and process in dealing with customers and do not tolerate any inappropriate conduct or breach of the same, either by employee or agency personnel. We are in the process of ascertaining details of the incident and will work with the concerned authorities to take the matter to its appropriate conclusion." The panchayat has written to the



Chief Minister and Home Minister Dilip Walse Patil, urging them to extend support to auto-rickshaw drivers who have been hit hard by the pandemic-induced curbs. "For the last 14 months, the sector has suffered due to the Covid restrictions. If auto-rickshaw drivers have no money to feed their families, how will they repay their loans?" Kamble asked. He said the organisation has urged the Chief Minister to ask finance companies to postpone their recovery drive till curbs are fully relaxed. "Our delegation will also personally meet the Chief Minister."

The organisation's chief alleged that finance companies even forcibly take away the vehicles of those unable to repay their loan. "This is illegal and inhuman. The companies should first approach the courts and only on the court's direction will they be able to seize the vehicles," he said. Responding to this Inspector Jadhav said, "The finance companies are expected to inform the nearest police station about their action. However, they give us general intimation, not specific details," he said.



Around 1,250 villages are still reeling in the aftermath of floods triggered by torrential rains in the districts of Gwalior, Shivpuri, Guna, Sheopur, Datia, Ashoknagar, Bhind and Morena.

"The death toll in the rain-related incidents in the flood-hit parts of the state has risen to 24. These fatalities were recorded between August 1 and 7," Revenue Secretary Gyaneshwar Patil told PTI. In Guna district's Sunda village, at least 145



people were trapped in their homes after the Parvati river overflowed its banks on Friday night. The government dispatched helicopters and boats and all the trapped persons were successfully rescued and evacuated to Chabria in Rajasthan the next day. So far, 8,800 people stranded due to the floods have been rescued by the NDRF, SDRF, Army and the air force. As many as 29,000

people have been evacuated to safe places. The state has incurred massive loss of property, with over 25,000 houses and buildings damaged in the floods. Six bridges were washed away due to the force of the current in river.

At present, the Army has five units deployed for rescue and relief operations in Morena, Shivpuri, Bhind, Sheopur and Ashoknagar

districts. Twenty-nine teams of the SDRF have been pressed into service and nine NDRF units are stationed in Morena, Bhind, Guna, Ashoknagar and Shivpuri. Three Air Force helicopters are aiding in rescue efforts.

Divisional Commissioner Ashish Saxena told PTI that "no life threatening situation" due to flooding is prevalent in the Gwalior and Chambal divisions of the state. Meanwhile, Madhya Pradesh Congress leader Kamal Nath cornered the BJP regime in the state, saying that the Shivraj Singh Chouhan-led government was busy playing politics while the people suffered in the wake of the rains and floods. "I have never seen such a disaster in life... How you (the government) are going to assess the losses to pay compensation. How much help are you going to provide? When will the bridges damaged by rains will be repaired and houses will be provided to the people rendered homeless due to the flood," Kamal Nath questioned after conducting an aerial survey flood-affected areas in Sheopur and visits to other districts.

## Glimmer and darkness

*In spite of India's promising performance at the Tokyo Olympics, persistent problems plague Indian sports. The value of perspective cannot be overstated, especially when the odds that have to be battled are formidable. Indian athletes, in particular, are regularly expected to perform in situations where the odds are heavily stacked against them; that they are often able to give the nation the honour of a podium finish in spite of innumerable road-blocks is a testament to their grit and excellence. India's medal tally at the London Olympics was impressive - it had won six medals, of which two were silver and four were bronze. At the Tokyo Games, that concluded on Sunday, India has surpassed all expectations by putting up its best-ever performance at the Olympics it has won a gold, two silver and four bronze medals. For this, the nation's Olympians must be lauded, not least because their achievements come at a time when training for sportspersons has run into immense challenges owing to the global pandemic.*

*There are other, equally pressing, reasons for acknowledging the athletes' achievements. Their success seems to be falling prey to the oldest trick in the book of the political fraternity politicians claiming credit for the achievements of sportspersons. An Olympic gold in a track-and-field event is inspiring, but India's total kitty of medals remains modest, especially in view of its population and the fact that it sent its biggest-ever contingent of athletes to Tokyo. The absence of institutional support is one part of the problem; Indian sportspersons also have to contend with the lack of a thriving sporting culture that prioritizes excellence.*

I have been holding my sides watching two films, back-to-back, to dispel the Corona blues. There is an abiding moral in both.

In Michael Moore's Canadian Bacon, the US President builds up a war with Canada because his ratings in peace time are plummeting after the Soviet threat melted away in 1990-91. Peace destroys the business of his friend Hacker, an arms manufacturer.


The other movie, Wag the Dog, has spin doctor Robert De Niro and filmmaker played by Dustin Hoffman, collaborate to salvage the election campaign of a Bill Clinton look-alike, caught in a sex scandal two weeks before voting. The duet creates a national hysteria about a war with Albania even though there is no war. It takes place entirely on TV channels. The De Niro-Hoffman team has made the media eat out of their hands. The 72 days bombing of Serbia under Clinton's watch and the carving out of Kosovo with its large Albanian population created a certain familiarity with Albania which otherwise would be totally unknown.

In Canadian Bacon an attempt is also made by the President's men to persuade Russian President named Vladimir Krushkin to start a mutually beneficial Cold War. A Cold War with Russia would help boost the arms industry. Krushkin takes the sensible decision: he refuses to initiate a Cold War.

The media is central to Canadian Bacon. When the Commander of US forces, itching for action, gets ready to invade, the National Security Advisor intervenes. Military action with a weak country would end in a day. A huge quarrel with Canada has to be dragged on for a reasonable period, giving enough time for the American people to be mobilized. The President's ratings would then skyrocket. The channels, with an eye on their own ratings, serve the national purpose by saturating the media space with war drums and startling revelations. Canada now has a nuclear bomb directed at America, an anchor announces, emoting with suitable anger.

A charged-up Sheriff of Niagara county, Bud Boomer distributes guns to an equally frenzied beer drinking clientele in the crowded bar, all riveted on TV which is focused relentlessly on the Canadian enemy.

Boomer's girlfriend, Honey who is also his well-armed Deputy Sheriff, will not wait for



Washington to announce action. She has ideas of her own. To cut the story short, Honey climbs the pinnacle of the Toronto tower to hunt out secret codes designed to fire missiles aimed at America. The last scenes of the film show her firing automatic weapons in all directions. She earns for herself high praise in the ending montage: she is named the "Humanitarian of the Year" by the National Rifle Association. The delicious irony, in this vein, permeates the body not only of Canadian Bacon but numerous satirical films.

Will Bollywood ever have the courage to mount such satire on the establishment? I suppose it is insensitive to ask such a question when a new Bill for double distilled censorship is being scripted.

An overriding reason why such audacity cannot be on show here is because we are pri-

marily a feudal people: irreverence is alien to our ethos. We have our parochial humour, but cannot laugh at authority. Iconography comes easy to us. We cannot satirize "Mai Baap". Some youthful standup comedians are trying but not without incurring the wrath of the cultural custodians. The baby must not be thrown out with the bathwater. Indian cinema has after all set high standards in portraying social reality. This was particularly true during the early days of Indian cinema. Penury inflicted on a peasant (Balraj Sahni) deprived of his patch of land for a factory, is the theme of Bimal Roy's classic Do Bigha Zameen. In fact, as early as the late 40s, Chetan Anand's Neecha Nagar has the land-lord divert sewage water towards the township below to enhance the value of his land

on high ground. The film was made 60 years before Roman Polanski's Chinatown focused on the water wars in California, including in Los Angeles.

Japanese maestro Akira Kurosawa's remark was on Satyajit Ray's social realism. "Those who have not seen Ray, have not seen the sun."

Even though I have a sense of the reality, I was astonished nevertheless at the way Indian theatre or cinema ignored Enron, a scandal which had its centre of gravity in Maharashtra, home to Bollywood. There was an uproar, with the Shiv Sena and the BJP taking the lead. The opposition to the deal was over high electricity tariffs beyond the reach of the poor. It collapsed. Enron, facing a host of other problems, declared bankruptcy. The CEO, Kenneth Lay, friend of George W Bush, died a broken man.

Lucy Prebble wrote a superb play, Enron, which ran to packed houses at the Noel Coward theatre in London. Reception to the play at its Broadway premiere in 2010 was tepid. The Corporate World smarting under the Lehman Brothers collapse did not accord the show much encouragement. Even though earlier David Hare's "Stuff Happens" actually mimicked Dick Cheney, Donald Rumsfeld and Condoleezza Rice for manufacturing the Iraq war. Much of the script for Enron was centred on characters who negotiated the deal with the Dabhol power project. Surely there is a vigorous enough amateur theatre in Mumbai to have picked up the script.

However, even in the West the audacity of screen and stage is singularly missing in mainstream media. This is particularly so since post 9/11 wars for which the media, by and large, became the drum beaters, compromising its own credibility. The adage makes sense. "When wars break out, the first casualty is the truth." This has resulted in the media's declining credibility and, in consequence, a rise of "illiberal" democracies. When Donald Trump complained that "China is going ahead of us", Jimmy Carter's response was succinct. "China has not been to war since 1978; we have never stopped being at war."

## Iraqi PM says govt determined to hold polls as scheduled

Iraqi Prime Minister Mustafa al-Kadhimi announced that his government and the political parties are determined to hold the parliamentary elections as scheduled on October 10.

Al-Kadhimi's comment came during his meeting with leaders of the political parties in the presence of Parliament Speaker Mohammed al-Halbousi, head of the Supreme Judicial Council, the country's electoral commission, and the UN Assistance Mission for Iraq, the Prime Minister's media office said in a statement. He stressed his government's insistence on holding the elections on time and confirmed its ability to provide an appropriate atmosphere for them, Xinhua news agency reported. Al-Kadhimi and the political parties renewed the call for the political blocs that boycotted the elections to reverse their decision, the statement said. He also suggested forming a committee of political parties to open a dialogue with the boycotting parties to persuade them to change their decision, it added. Earlier in July,



a political bloc led by prominent Shia cleric Muqtada al-Sadr announced the withdrawal of his bloc from the parliamentary elections, citing "rampant corruption and unfair competition" among political parties. About a week later, the Iraqi Communist Party also withdrew from the elections, saying the political parties are "not serious" in achieving the demands of popular protests that broke out in 2019, and "the upcoming elections are nothing but a change of faces". Late last month, the Iraqi National Dialogue Front led by Salih al-Mutlak announced in a statement the withdrawal from the elections due to "the failure to provide a safe environment for early elections and the proliferation of out-of-control weapons".

## HEAVY FIGHTING UNDERWAY IN 3 AFGHAN PROVINCES

New Delhi/Kabul | Agencies

Heavy fighting between Afghan security forces and the Taliban is currently underway in three northern provinces of Kunduz, Sar-e-Pul and Jawzjan with reports of civilian casualties in the clashes, a media report said on Sunday.

Citing sources, the TOLO News report said the clashes in Kunduz have reached the centre of the city of Kunduz and some key government buildings have fallen to the Taliban.

At least 11 people have been killed and 39 more have been wounded in Kunduz clashes that started on Friday evening, the provincial public health directorate said.

A source from the province said clashes have intensified near the police headquarters and the main roundabout in the centre of Kunduz city.

Taliban spokesperson Zabiullah Mujahid in a social media post confirmed that the fighters have entered Police District 2 of Kunduz city.

The group has also reportedly attacked the province's central prison releasing inmates.



The Afghan government is however, yet to comment on the issue.

Meanwhile, the sources said that the fighting in Sar-e-Pul has reached the capital of the province and the Sancharak district.

The sources added that Babur Ishchi, head of

Jawzjan provincial council, surrounded to the Taliban along with his 20 fighters after hours of clashes against the group in Khawja Do Koh district, which is the hometown of former Vice President Marshal Abdul Rashid Dostum and was one of the two areas under government control in the province. Sources said that Taliban has released Ishchi's fighters but has "taken him and his brother" with them. The Taliban in a statement claimed that Ishchi and his men have surrendered to the group. The Afghan Defence Ministry also announced that airstrikes targeted a Taliban get-together in Jawzjan on Saturday night. It said that 40 Taliban militants were killed and 14 others injured in the strikes. The airstrikes come only hours after US President Joe Biden ordered the use of B-52 bombers and Spectre gunships to target the Taliban positions. The bombers have recently targeted Taliban positions in Kandahar, Herat, and Helmand provinces.

President Joe Biden ordered the bombers after the Taliban toppled two provinces in a matter of 24 hours.

## Biden pushes harder for masks, vaccines amid resurgence

US President Joe Biden is pushing harder on vaccines and masks as Covid-19 cases are surging across the country due to the spread of the highly contagious Delta variant.

Covid-19 cases, hospitalisations, and deaths have continued to increase in most parts of the country, especially in communities with lower vaccination coverage, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

The outlook is especially dire in the South. The states of Florida and Louisiana recently set seven-day case records, Xinhua news agency quoted report by The New York Times as saying on Saturday.

In Florida, coronavirus hospitalizations are roughly equal to their previous peak from last summer.

In Louisiana, intensive care units are strained and young adults are contracting serious cases of the virus.

The resurgence has prompted the CDC to issue new guidelines on mask wearing, and some areas are returning to restrictions seen last year during the height of the pandemic.

Mask wearing has been a subject of controversy in the United States for more than a year, with a significant chunk of the population refusing to wear masks for many different



reasons. Some believe such choices are up to the individual, others believe - against current data - that masks do not necessarily protect against the virus. Recent weeks have also seen a marked increase in the number of private sector companies promoting vaccinations for those who want to return to the office.

In a sharp about face of previous statements, recent days saw Biden say he would like to see companies move toward mandates.

Biden has announced that all federal workers must be vaccinated or be required to wear masks and undergo regular testing.

The President also said he believes more cities and states should institute rules like those in New York City, where customers at restaurants, gyms and other venues are required to be vaccinated.

So far, 50 per cent of the US population, or more than 165.9 million people, have been fully vaccinated against Covid-19, according to the CDC.

Brookings Institution Senior Fellow Darrell West told Xinhua: "Many public and private sector organizations have instituted mask and vaccine requirements. Some leaders

oppose this but they are in states with low vaccination rates and high Covid rates."

An article published on Yalemedicine.org, one of Yale University's websites, said people who are fully vaccinated "appear to have strong protection against Delta compared to those who aren't... But anyone who is unvaccinated and not practicing preventive strategies is at high risk for infection by the new variant".

As an increased number of cities call for employee vaccinations, they are seeing push-back from some labour unions.

New York unions were outraged last week after the city implemented employee vaccination requirements. "We are absolutely against an absolute mandate to vaccinate everyone," said Henry Garrido, executive of New York's health union. The New York Fire Department (FDNY) also expressed anger about the possibility of weekly Covid-19 testing paid for by employees. "This testing will not be done on our own time or our own dime," FDNY union president Andrew Ansbro said. "If the city wants this, they can make it possible and they can pay for it."

In its latest update on Sunday morning, the Johns Hopkins University said that the US continues to be the worst-hit country with the world's highest number of cases and deaths at 35,738,154 and 616,713, respectively.

## Iran dismisses G7's tanker attack allegations as 'baseless'

Iran's Foreign Ministry on Saturday dismissed as "baseless" the recent Group of Seven (G7) allegations over a tanker attack, according to the ministry's website.

On Friday, the foreign ministers of G7, including Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and the United States, as well as the high representative of the European Union, accused Iran of being behind a "reportedly" drone attack on July 29 against an Israeli-linked oil tanker in the Arabian Sea off the coast of Oman, which killed a British national and a Romanian national, Xinhua reported.

"We strongly condemn the baseless statement by the G7 foreign ministers... in which baseless allegations have been made against the Islamic Republic of Iran," said Saeed Khatibzadeh, spokesman for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Khatibzadeh called the incident as a "scenario"

which took place a few days before the inauguration of the new president of Iran.

Such "baseless scenarios" are designed to confuse the political climate, he was quoted as saying.

The Islamic Republic is fully committed to securing the strategic waterway of the Gulf region and the Strait of Hormuz, considers it as part of its own security and will not hesitate defending its sovereign right, he said.

In the meantime, Iran is ready to cooperate with the regional countries in establishing a collective security system in the region," he added.

Despite the global health crisis, the one-year delay, the soaring costs and strongly divided opinions among locals, the spectacle saw the light of the day after staving off numerous challenges on the way.


The ceremony opened with a video that looked back on the 17 days of events and competition.

In sync with the time he is living in, International Olympic Committee president Thomas Bach, after closing the Games, said, "Athletes went faster, went higher and were stronger because they all stood together in solidarity."

"You inspired us with this unified symbol of sport. And it was even more remarkable because of what you faced in the pandemic."

The festivities began in front of the athletes, dignitaries and officials from across the world after the Japanese flag was raised at the 68,000-seater National Stadium, which was out of bounds to spectators owing to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The athletes entered the stadium and formed a circle around the rostrum. Unlike the opening ceremony



which is a formal affair with the athletes dressed in formal attire, the closing was a time for the achievers to relax and enjoy the occasion.

The theme of the closing ceremony was the 'Worlds We Share' and featured a whole lot of items, from lights to music shows, dazzling fireworks and stunts.

Before extinguishing the Olympic flame that has been burning in the cauldron since the opening ceremony, the closing of the Tokyo 2020 Games broke away from history and propelled hundreds of millions of viewers right into the very heart of Paris.

For the first time in a handover ceremony, the next host country's national anthem was broadcast as a film shot entirely in the future host city.

In another first, the closing ceremony featured live and spectacular celebrations from the next host city as the people of Paris and France embraced their role as host of the 33rd Olympics.


With bronze-winning wrestler Bajrang Punia as its flag-bearer, the largest Indian contingent bid the Games a goodbye after finishing their campaign with the best medal tally in history. India certainly could look towards that brighter future after

claiming its best ever haul of seven medals, including their first gold medal in 13 years, from javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra, who is also going back as the country's first track-and-field medallist at the Games.

The country's haul also had two silver and four bronze medals.

The USA topped the medals tally with 113 podium finishes, including 39 gold, while China came second with 88 podiums that comprised 38 golds.

Hosts Japan finished a creditable third with a totals of 58 medals, including 27 gold.



## US Embassy India celebrates 7 medals success of nation's athletes

The embassy also posted a picture of the Indian contingent marching on the opening day of the Tokyo Olympic Games.

**Aditi's game will bring about a positive change in golf: Lahiri**

Top Indian golfer Anirban Lahiri, who had finished joint 42nd in the men's event at the Tokyo Olympic Games, has said that woman golfer Aditi Ashok's monumental effort of finishing fourth at the quadrennial showpiece on Saturday should "bring a change in attitude in people" about the sport. Despite India having produced some top golfers, who have played and won on tours across the world, golf is still considered an elitist sport and Lahiri said that the 23-year-old Aditi's performance in Tokyo should bring about a "positive change" in the game's ecosystem in the country. The world No. 200 carded a 3-under 68 in the final round to register a combined score of 15-under and missed out on a medal spot by one shot.

India's No.1 men's golfer Lahiri appreciated Aditi's performance and said, "I hope it brings a change in attitude in people and golf as a sport can grow like any other Olympic sport in India." "The biggest win for Aditi is that so many more Indians now know what golf is, how it works. And then, really just putting golf on the map in India, I think this is really quite a turning point for golf," Lahiri told Olympics.com. Lahiri added that the fact that a large number of Indians woke up early on Saturday to watch Aditi's final round in Tokyo was a "big win" for the sport.

Also Lahiri felt Aditi's performance will inspire a whole generation to take up the sport and represent the country on a big stage.



## 1ST TEST: RAIN PLAYS SPOILSPORT AS MATCH ENDS IN A DRAW

India's hopes of starting their Test series against England on a winning note were dashed by inclement weather as the first Test ended in a draw after no play was possible on the fifth and final day due to heavy rains. The stage was set for an intriguing finale as India had reached 52 for one wicket in their second innings chasing a target of 209 runs. India needed 157 more runs to win the match with nine wickets in hand. But the weather played spoilsport in a match in which the Indians had done well despite losing out some key players to injuries and held the upper hand.

The Indians could, however, claim psychological advantage as they definitely would have fancied their chances.

Though they had never successfully chased a target of 200 in the fourth innings of a Test match in England, they would have still fancied their chances as they were in a good position with Rohit



Sharma and Cheteshwar Pujara batting on 12 apiece. The Indians had shot out England 183 in their first innings with Jasprit Bumrah claiming four wickets for 46 runs and Mohammad Shami bagging three for 28. They then gained a handy 95-run lead thanks to opener K.L. Rahul's 84 and a fighting fifty by Ravindra Jadeja (56) as well as the tail that wagged. England could also take some positives from this match, especially skipper Joe Root who struck a fighting 109 to help them reach 303 in their second innings.

Speaking at a press conference, which was also attended by the entire first team, Messi reiterated that he wanted to continue with the club and did "everything he could" to stay. "I'm been here so many years, my entire life, since I was 13. After 21 years I'm leaving with my wife, with my three little Catalan-Argentine kids and I can't tell you everything we've lived in this city and I can't say that in a few years we won't come back, because this is our home and I promised my children that. "I'm just really grateful for everything, all my teammates, all my former teammates, everyone at the club, everyone who has been by my side."

## Top 10 medal winners at the Tokyo Olympics

who took the most medals in the Tokyo Olympics:

### 1. Emma McKeon

With seven medals, the swimmer from Brisbane earned the most medals by an individual athlete in Tokyo. She is now tied with gymnast Maria Gorokhovskaya for the record for most medals won by a woman in a single edition of the Olympics. The 27-year-old picked four gold and three bronze medals.

### 2. Caeleb Dressel

The star swimmer was selected as a co-captain for the USA men's swimming team. The 24-year-old was on a gold rush in Tokyo, collecting five gold medals on top of the podium. Dressel becomes the 4th male USA swimmer in the history to achieve the feat after Mark Spitz, Matt Biondi, and Michael Phelps.

### 3. Kaylee McKeown

The 20-year-old Queenslander made a splash at the biggest stage of swimming. She took the gold in 100m, setting a new Olympic record. All together she won gold at Tokyo and a bronze in the mixed 4x100m medley relay.

### 4. Zhang Yufei

One of the breakthrough stars of the Tokyo Olympics, Zhang won the gold in the 200m butterfly, setting a new Olympic record. She took two golds and two silver at Tokyo Olympics.

### 5. Kathleen Ledecky

The most decorated female swimmer of all time bagged four medals in Tokyo. She began with a silver medal in 400m freestyle, losing to Australia's Ariarne Titmus. This was her first loss in an individual event. She overall won two gold and two

silver medals in Tokyo.

### 6. Ariarne Titmus

Nicknamed 'Terminator', the Tasmanian swimmer was the cynosure of all eyes. Ariarne lived up to the billing by winning the gold in both events, edging out the competition from Kathleen Ledecky. In 200m freestyle, she set a new Olympic record. The Tasmanian booked two gold, one silver and one bronze medal in her name.

### 7. Duncan Scott

The man from Glasgow became the first swimmer from the Great Britain contingent to win four medals at the Olympics. He won a gold and three silver at Tokyo. The four medals at Tokyo have resulted for calls for him to be given knighthood.

### 8. James Guy


The freestyle and butterfly specialist had an Olympics to remember. The 25-year-old was a member of the gold-medal winning 4x100m mixed medley and 4x200m freestyle relays. He also clinched a silver in 4x100m medley relay.

### 9. Adam Peaty

The swimmer played a major hand in Great Britain having its best-ever time at the Olympics. Peaty became the first British swimmer to defend his title by winning the 100m breaststroke. He won two gold and a silver medal here. He has now taken a break from the game to focus on his mental health.

### 10. Daisuke Hashimoto

The 20-year-old artistic gymnast from Chiba became the first Japanese man to win two individual gold medals in one edition of the Olympics since 1984. He won two gold and a silver at Tokyo Olympics.




## SHAHID TO ROMANCE BHUMI IN ALI ABBAS ZAFAR'S NEXT


