China, Pakistan change military commanders overlooking Indian borders

China and Pakistan have changed their military commanders overlooking the borders with India after the Taliban completely took over Afghanistan.

Top sources said that threats along the borders with China and Pakistan have also increased manifold as foreign terrorists would make attempts to enter into India to unleash unrest.

Interestingly, China has thrice changed its military commander for the Western Theatre Command, which is responsible for borders with India, in the last nine months.

"These moves are definitely a matter of concern for India," said a senior government official, adding that the resolution of disputes along the borders with these two countries would be nowhere in near future. On Tuesday, Pakistan appointed Lieutenant General Azhar Abbas, who was responsible for the security of the Line of Control (LoC) with India, as the next Chief of General Staff. The post is considered the most influential position within the army after the Pakistan Army chief. Chief of General Staff looks after operational and intelligence matters at the General Headquarters with the directorates of Military Operations and Military Intelligence.



Lieutenant General Sahir Shamshad Mirza has been posted as the Commander of Rawalpindi Corps and Lieutenant General Muhammad Chiragh Haider has been given the responsibility of the Commander of Multan Corps, which is one of the main strike Corps of the Pakistan Army.

Rawalpindi Corps looks after the Line of Control (LoC). The changes took place after Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) chief Lieutenant General Faiz Hameed met Taliban leader Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar recently. Baradar, the co-founder of

Taliban, has been made the Deputy Prime Minister of the Taliban government in Afghanistan.

On Monday, Chinese President Xi Jinping appointed General Wang Haijiang as the Commander of the Western Theatre Command of the People's Liberation Army.

The Western Theatre Command oversees the Xinjiang and the Tibet Autonomous Regions, as well as the borders with India.

General Wang Haijiang, 58, replaced General Xu Qiling, 59, who was only promoted in July this year to head the Western Theatre Command.

Earlier, General Xu replaced General Zhang Xudong, 59, in July who was appointed around mid-December last year to head the command, replacing 65-year-old Gen Zhao Zongqi who retired from the PLA.

It is not yet clear what will be the new role of General Xu Qiling and General Zhang Xudong, both still in service, after being relieved from the Western Command.

Seeing a change of guard on northern and western borders, the Indian military has enhanced security apparatus along the borders apart are making strategic changes.

WOMEN CAN BE INDUCTED INTO ARMED FORCES THROUGH NDA, SC TOLD

Nudged by the Supreme Court, the Centre on Wednesday informed the apex court that it has taken a decision to allow women into the National Defence Academy (NDA).

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, representing the Centre, submitted before a bench headed by Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul that there is "good news", as a decision has been taken at the highest level that women will be inducted into the NDA, and the chiefs of three Armed Forces have also agreed.

"A decision has been taken at the highest level of forces and the government that girls will be inducted into the National Defence Academy," she said, adding that the decision had been taken late Tuesday evening.

However, the government informed the bench also comprising Justice M.M. Sundresh that it needs some time to frame guidelines to pave the way for women to take NDA courses and sought exemption for the exam this year.

Justice Kaul said that the Centre has been periodically nudging the authorities to do it themselves, and sometimes things only move when the court steps in. "Armed forces are respected forces of this



country. But on gender equality, they have to do more", he said. "We are extremely glad to know that the armed forces themselves took the decision to induct women into the NDA. We know that reforms cannot happen in a day... The government will place time-lines of the process and the course of action," he said.

Bhati said it will be path-breaking and generational reform. However, the top court emphasised that it is important for it to take a stand on these issues. "We want them to take a proactive approach themselves in ensuring gender equality rather than waiting for courts to intervene," the bench noted.

The top court also asked the Centre to inform "What it is doing now? What is it planning to do in the future?"

Bhati submitted that Centre will place a detailed affidavit. "On June 24, the exam was

postponed to November this year. Please grant status quo in these exams as this needs procedural and infrastructural changes," she added.

The top court was hearing a PIL filed by advocate Kush Kalra, seeking the NDA to open its doors for women aspiring to join the Armed Forces. The plea was argued by senior advocate Chinmoy Pradip Sharma. The plea also sought a direction from the court to allow women to get trained in the Indian Naval Academy as well.


On August 18, the Supreme Court had said the mindset is not changing and emphasised why judicial orders are required to allow women candidates to take the entrance exam for the NDA, even after the top court's judgment expanding the horizons and extending the permanent commission in the Army to women.

DGCI APPROVES TRUENAT TEST KIT FOR DIAGNOSIS OF NIPAH

The Drugs Controller General of India (DGCI) has granted emergency use authorisation to Truenat, a real-time PCR platform manufactured by Goa-based Molbio Diagnostics, for testing people infected with Nipah virus. This is the first kit in India to receive regulatory approval to conduct tests for Nipah. Truenat is an indigenous portable, battery-operated, Internet of Things-enabled RT-PCR platform developed and manufactured in India. It can test for nearly 30 diseases, and results take less than an hour. Truenat is already playing a critical role in the management of infectious diseases such as TB, Covid-19, dengue, chikungunya, hepatitis, and HPV in the country.

"Covid-19 has brought out the importance of early and accurate testing for better disease management. Truenat is the first platform to be authorised by the DGCI for Nipah virus testing. We are proud to support our country in fighting Nipah Virus," Molbio Diagnostics Director and CEO Sriram Natarajan said in a statement. Nipah virus is an emerging zoonotic disease that causes severe disease in humans. Signs and symptoms range from asymptomatic to acute respiratory infection and fatal encephalitis.



Last week, it claimed the life of a 12-year-old boy in Kerala amid Covid surge.

Previously, India has seen three outbreaks: Siliguri in 2001 and Nadia in 2007 (both West Bengal), and Kozhikode and Malappuram in Kerala in 2018. Molbio first started R&D work on the Truenat test for Nipah virus in 2018 in collaboration with the National Institute of Virology, Pune. "The ability to quickly deploy the platform to the point of need and the rapid testing capability makes it a powerful tool in diagnosis and containment of the Nipah Virus. This collaboration with NIV allows us to react quickly in times of need such emergencies," Molbio Diagnostics Director and CTO, Dr Chandrasekhar Nair, said in the statement. Truenat is also approved by the World Health Organisation for TB diagnosis and approved by the ICMR for TB, Covid-19 and other diseases.

Cabinet nod to MSP hike for Rabi crops, rise highest for oilseeds, pulses

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) on Wednesday approved increase in the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for all mandated Rabi crops for Rabi Marketing Season (RMS) 2022-23 with an aim to realigning the MSPs in favour of oilseeds, pulses, and coarse cereals over wheat.

This has been done to encourage farmers shift to a larger area for these crops and adopt best technologies and farm practices, to correct demand-supply imbalance, a Cabinet communique said.

The government has increased the MSP of Rabi crops for RMS 2022-23, to ensure remunerative prices to the growers for their produce. The highest absolute increase in MSP over the previous year has been recommended for lentil (masur) and rapeseeds and mustard (Rs 400 per quintal each) followed by gram (Rs 130 per quintal).

In case of safflower, there has been an increase of Rs 114 per quintal, in comparison to last year. The differential remuneration is aimed at encouraging crop diversification.

For wheat, there has been an increase of Rs 40 per quintal while for barley, it is Rs 35 per quintal, over last year.

The MSP for RMS 2022-23 for wheat has been announced as Rs 2,015 per quintal considering the



cost of production for 2022-23 as Rs 1,008, for barley, it is Rs 1,635 against Rs 1,019, MSP for gram has been announced as Rs 5,230 against the cost of production of Rs 3,004, for lentil, it is Rs 5,500 against Rs 3,079, for rapeseed and mustard at Rs 5,050 against Rs 2,523 and the MSP for safflower has been announced as Rs 5,441 against the cost of production of Rs 3,627.

The cost of production as calculated refers to the comprehensive cost which includes all paid out costs such as those incurred on account of hired human labour, bullock labour/machine labour, rent paid for leased in land, expenses incurred on use of material inputs like seeds, fertilisers, manure, irri-

gation charges, depreciation on implements and farm buildings, interest on working capital, diesel/electricity for operation of pump sets etc, miscellaneous expenses and imputed value of family labour. The increase in MSP for Rabi Crops for RMS 2022-23 is in line with the Union Budget 2018-19 announcement of fixing the MSPs at a level of at least 1.5 times of the all-India weighted average cost of production, aiming a reasonably fair remuneration for the farmers, the statement said.

"The expected returns to farmers over their cost of production are estimated to be highest in case of wheat and rapeseed & mustard (100 per cent each), followed by lentil (79 per cent), gram (74 per cent), barley (60 per cent) and safflower (50 per cent), it said. Additionally, the National Mission on Edible Oils-Oil Palm (NMEOP), the centrally sponsored scheme recently announced by the government, will help in increasing the domestic production of edible oils and reduce import dependency.

The umbrella scheme 'Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay Sanrakhan Abhiyan' (PM-AASHA), announced by the government in 2018, will aid in providing remunerative return to farmers for their produce. It consists of three sub-schemes i.e. Price Support Scheme (PSS), Price Deficiency Payment Scheme (PPDS) and Private Procurement & Stockiest Scheme (PPSS) on a pilot basis, the release added.

Centre approves procurement of 56 transport aircraft from Airbus Defence

The Indian government on Wednesday approved the procurement of 56 transport aircraft from the Airbus Defence and Space SA of which 16 aircraft will be delivered in flyaway condition from Spain, while the remaining 40 will be manufactured in India. These 56 C-295MW transport aircraft of Airbus will replace the ageing Avro aircraft of the Indian Air Force. The Cabinet Committee on Security approved the procurement of 56 C-295MW transport aircraft from Airbus Defence for the Indian Air Force.

The C-295MW aircraft is a transport aircraft of five to 10 tonne capacity with contemporary technology. The aircraft has a rear ramp door for quick reaction and para dropping of troops and cargo.

These 56 C-295MW transport aircraft of Airbus will replace the ageing Avro aircraft of the Indian Air Force. The Cabinet Committee on Security approved the procurement of 56 C-295MW transport aircraft from Airbus Defence for the Indian Air Force.

Sixteen aircraft will be delivered in flyaway condition from Spain within 48 months of signing of the contract, and 40 aircraft will be manufactured in India by the TATA Consortium within 10 years of signing of the contract.

"This is the first project of its kind in which a military aircraft will be manufactured in India by a private company," the Defence Ministry said in a statement.

All the 56 aircraft will be installed with indigenous Electronic Warfare Suite.

"The project will give a boost to the aerospace ecosystem in India

wherein several MSMEs spread over the country will be involved in manufacturing of parts of the aircraft," the ministry said.

The programme will provide a major boost to the 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' mission of the government as it offers a unique opportunity for the Indian private sector to enter into the technology intensive and highly competitive aviation industry. The project will augment domestic aviation manufacturing, resulting in reduced import dependence and expected increase in exports.

A large number of detail parts,

sub-assemblies and major component assemblies of aero structure are scheduled to be manufactured in India. The programme will act as a catalyst in employment generation in the aerospace ecosystem of the country and is expected to generate 600 highly skilled jobs directly, over 3,000 indirect jobs and an additional 3,000 medium skill employment opportunities with more than 42.5 lakh man hours of work within the aerospace and defence sector of India.

It will involve development of specialised infrastructure in the form of hangars, buildings, aprons

and taxiway.

During the process of manufacturing in India, it is expected that all the suppliers of TATA Consortium who will be involved in special processes will gain and maintain globally recognised National Aerospace and Defence Contractors Accreditation Programme (NADCAP) accreditation. "Before completion of deliveries, a 'D' Level servicing facility (MRO) for C-295MW aircraft is scheduled to be setup in India. It is expected that this facility will act as a regional MRO hub for various variants of C-295 aircraft," the ministry said.

In addition, the original equipment manufacturer will also discharge its offset obligations through direct purchase of eligible products and services from Indian offset partners, giving further

COVID CASES CROSS 30,000K AGAIN IN KERALA



Thiruvananthapuram: After a few days, Kerala on Wednesday again recorded over 30,000 cases, with 30,196 new Covid cases after 1,71,295 samples were tested in the past 24 hours, and the test positivity rate rising to 17.63 per cent.

A statement issued here by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan said 27,579 people turned negative, taking the total active cases in the state to 2,39,480. It has been a few weeks since Kerala has been leading the rest of the country in the daily new cases, total active cases, and also daily deaths. The day saw 181 Covid deaths taking the death toll to 22,001. Thrissur district recorded the highest number cases, at 3,832, followed by Ernakulam with 3,611, and Kozhikode with 3,058. With regards to vaccination, 77.16 per cent of the Kerala population, or 2.21 crore, have been given one dose of vaccine, while 29.47 per cent, or 84 lakh, have been given both the doses.



NO GATHERING, PROCESSIONS ON GANESH CHATURTHI IN DELHI: DDMA

Apprehending a possible third wave of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Delhi Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) on Wednesday decided to ban public celebrations of the Ganesh Chaturthi festival. Any procession or gathering in connection with Ganesh Chaturthi celebrations will be prohibited, it said. The festival starts on Friday, and concludes on September 21.

"Considering the prevailing restrictions on gatherings and congregations and present situation of the Covid-19 pandemic, it has been decided that Ganesh Chaturthi celebrations may not be allowed in public places and people may be advised to celebrate the festival at their home only," a notice issued by Delhi Chief Secretary Vijay Dev said.

It added that all District Magistrates and the Delhi Police have been directed to ensure that no idol of Lord Ganesha is set up in tents, pandals, or public places. They also have been asked to strictly disallow any form of procession and not grant permission to any committees.



"All District Magistrates and their counterparts, Deputy Commissioners of Police and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitise the field functionaries about these instructions for strict compliance in letter and spirit,"

the order read. Every year, over 100 committees seek permission for community celebration of Ganesh festival in Delhi. "It is also directed that the District Magistrates and district DCPs shall convene meetings with religious/community leaders/Ganesh

festival committees before the festival to get their cooperation to maintain law and order and harmony and also to sensitise public for compliance of guidelines/instructions issued for combating Covid-19 by the government from time to time," the order added.

Odisha oppn besieges Speaker for rejecting adjournment notice

Opposition BJP and Congress stalled the proceedings of the Odisha Assembly and virtually confined the Speaker in his chamber for rejecting an adjournment notice on the "mining scam" in the state. The Congress had moved the notice for a discussion on the "mining scam," but Speaker SN Patro has rejected it.

As soon as the House assembled for the day at 10.30 am, Congress members rushed towards the Speaker's podium to protest. BJP members also stood up on their seats and created ruckus, forcing the Speaker to adjourn the proceedings till 11.30 am.

The opposition party members then surrounded the chamber of the Speaker and did not allow him to come to the House to conduct the business. At this, Deputy Speaker RK Singh adjourned the House till 4 pm. The situation remained



the same in the post-lunch session too. The Opposition members continued their protest and did not allow the Speaker to come to his chair in the House, and the Deputy Speaker conducted the businesses. Amid uproar, several reports were tabled and four Bills passed.

BJP chief whip Mohan Majhi alleged that the state government has a nexus with the owners of mines and is equally involved in the scam. Therefore, the Speaker rejected the notice citing it doesn't have any relevance at present, he said. Joining Majhi, Congress

legislator SS Saluja alleged that the government is so neck-deep in the mining scam that it is scared to even discuss the issue. Therefore, the government is avoiding discussion on mining irregularities in the State, he said.

The Speaker said the Congress members led by party leader Narasingha Mishra and BJP members had come to his chamber to inquire about the reason for rejecting the adjournment notice. Patro said he informed them about the reason for rejecting the notice and had told them to raise the issue during the zero hour.

Against muzzling of press but can't create separate avenues: SC

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said it does not want freedom of the press to be muzzled, but it also cannot create a separate avenue for journalists to approach it directly in connection with quashing of FIRs against them.

The apex court made this observation while hearing a plea filed by Foundation for Independent Journalism, which runs news portal The Wire, and three of its journalists seeking quashing of three FIRs lodged against them in Uttar Pradesh over some news reports. A bench of Justices L. Nageswara Rao, B.R. Gavai and B.V. Nagarathna granted two months protection to news portal and three of its journalists -- Seraj Ali, Mukul Singh Chauhan and Ismat Ara -- in three FIRs. The bench told the peti-



tioners' counsel that they have to go to the high court and argue for quashing the FIRs. "We will protect you in the interim," it noted. "We are aware of fundamental rights and don't want freedom of press to be muzzled," it said, but also added that if the petitioners' plea is allowed, then it would "open a Pandora's box." "We cannot create a separate avenue for journalists to directly come to this court

under Article 32 for quashing of FIRs," noted the bench. As Nitya Ramakrishnan, counsel appearing for petitioners, sought the court's permission to withdraw the petition to pursue other remedies available under the law, the bench ordered: "No coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioners for a period of two months from today. Writ petition is, accordingly, dismissed as withdrawn."

Mother of 3 elopes 25 times in 10 years, husband says he loves her

A middle aged Muslim woman in Assam eloped 25 times with different men while her husband and in-laws accepted her back every time with no serious complaint.

The 40-year-old woman 'eloped' 25 times in 10 years with different men after she tied the knot with Mafizuddin, a driver by profession, at remote Dhing Lahkar village in Central Assam's Nagaon district.

"In ten years, my wife fled with others around 25 times after we married in 2011. Every time, after coming back to the family, she promised that she would not do it again but so far she has failed to maintain her commitment."

"Sometimes my wife claimed that she went to her relatives' houses, some times she said she went to see her ailing relatives. "We have three children. Considering the care of the kids we



accepted her back everytime," Mafizuddin, husband of the woman, told the media.

He said: "On Saturday (September 4), when I returned home from work (driving a vehicle), I learned from my

father that she had run away after leaving my 3-month-old son at a neighbour's house."

"She told a woman in the neighbour's house that she was going to collect some feed for the goats. I do

not know when she will come back."

The husband said that before leaving on Saturday, his wife took Rs 22,000 and other material from the house. He is also unaware with whom she 'eloped' on Saturday.

"I would accept her as I genuinely love her and we also have three small children. Who will take care of them if I do not accept my wife? I did not lodge any complaint with the police to avoid legal and other troubles," Mafizuddin added.

The woman has two minor sons and a daughter. The age of her youngest son is just 3 months and the eldest child is a girl who is 6 years old. Her other son is 3 years old.

According to the neighbours of the fully Muslim dominated remote Dhing Lahkar village, the woman has illicit relations with many young men in the village and has run away with different lovers. After a few weeks or months she returned to her in-laws family.

1 Dead As Two Boats Collide In Brahmaputra In Assam, Several Missing

Sources said at least a 100 passengers were onboard the boats when they crashed into each other at Nimati Ghat in Jorhat, around 350 km from Guwahati.

A woman has died and around 30 people are missing after two passenger boats collided with each other in the Brahmaputra River in Assam's Jorhat today. Sources said nearly 200 passengers were onboard the boats when they crashed into each other at Nimati Ghat in Jorhat, around 350 km from Guwahati, around 4 pm today.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said "all possible efforts are being made to rescue the passengers."

One of the boats, a government passenger ferry of the Inland Water Transport department, was coming from Majuli (a river island district in Assam) to Nimati Ghat with around 120 passengers on board while the other boat was going in the opposite direction. Videos from the accident showed the

boat capsizing after the collision, as some passengers tried to hold on to it while others jumped into the water to save themselves. The passengers' luggage along with motorbikes and cars on the boats also washed away in the river.

State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and National Disaster Response Force officials reached the spot and started rescue operations. Around 42 people, including a baby, have been rescued till now from which many have been sent to hospitals. A woman who was rescued and sent to a hospital for treatment has died, government sources said late in the evening.

The state government has suspended three officials of inland water transport department after the accident.

Soon after the incident, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma directed the district administration of Majuli and Jorhat districts to carry out the rescue mission expeditiously with the help of the NDRF and SDRF.

He said Home Minister Amit Shah has promised all possible help. "HM Sri Amit Shah had kindly called to enquire about the accident in Nimati Ghat and took an update on the rescue operations

and conditions of those rescued so far. He said the Central Government is ready to lend all possible help. Grateful to him," he tweeted.

"I am pained at the tragic boat accident near Nimati Ghat, Jorhat," the chief minister wrote. He directed state minister Bimal Bora to immediately travel to Majuli and take stock of the situation, and asked principal secretary to the chief minister Samir Kumar Sinha to monitor the developments. The chief minister said he will visit Nimati Ghat tomorrow to evaluate the situation. Union Minister and former Assam chief minister Sarbananda Sonowal, who represents Majuli in the state assembly, said he has directed the ministry of ports, shipping and waterways to provide all necessary support.

"Anguished to learn of the ferry accident in Majuli. I have talked with Assam CM Himanta Biswa regarding the accident and he has informed me of ongoing rescue and relief operations. I have directed @shipmin_india to provide all necessary support to help the victims," he wrote on Twitter.

The army is also on stand-by to provide help with rescue operations.

SC RECOMMENDS 10 JUDGES FOR KARNATAKA HC, TWO FOR KERALA HC

The Supreme Court Collegium has approved the proposal for appointment of 10 additional judges of the Karnataka High Court and two additional judges of the Kerala High Court as permanent judges. In a separate statement, the top court collegium also approved the proposal for appointment of following additional judges of the Karnataka High Court as permanent judges: Justice Maralur Indrakumar Arun, Justice Engalaguppe Seetharamaiah Indresh, Justice Ravi Venkappa Hosmani, and Justice Savanur Vishwajith Shetty.

BJP IS BACKING ITS TWO AGENTS - KEJRIWAL & OWASI, SAYS SANDEEP DIKSHIT

Launching a scathing attack on the BJP, AAP and MIM, former Congress MP Sandeep Dikshit has alleged that the three parties are hand in glove to weaken the Congress. Dikshit speaking to IANS said, there has been no case of ED and Income Tax or no raids on the leaders of these political parties and while every opposition leader is summoned by ED or raided, he gave the examples of Maharashtra and West Bengal.

Later in a tweet Sandeep Dikshit added that he was told by a BJP MLA of Madhya Pradesh that, "the Modi-Shah have two point agenda, one to strengthen their own party and second, to strengthen agents like Kejriwal and Owaisi, the evidence that he gave was amazing."

Dikshit who is two time Lok Sabha MP and son of former Chief Minister of Delhi, the late Sheila Dikshit, questioned why the government is not taking any action on them because they are helping BJP wherever they want and dent votes of other secular parties. The AAP is contesting elections in Goa, Punjab, Uttarakhand and UP.

The Congress is in direct contest with BJP in Goa, Uttarakhand and Manipur, but AAP is posing a threat to eat into the votes of the Congress in Goa and Uttarakhand while in Punjab it has become main challenger. The AIMIM which was instrumental in upsetting the chances of the grand alliance in Bihar could not do anything in West Bengal and is contesting elections in UP with much fanfare. NCP leader and Congress ally in Maharashtra Sharad Pawar also attacked the Union government on Tuesday and alleged that the Enforcement Directorate (ED) was being used as a tool by the Centre to suppress opponents. He said that it's an attempt to infringe upon the State government's rights and to put down opponents, he also said that political cycles change in due course and he will raise the issue in Parliament.

FARMERS, KARNAL ADMIN 4TH MEETING INCONCLUSIVE; PROTEST TO CONTINUE

The fourth-round meeting between farmers and the administration of Karnal district in Haryana ended inconclusively on Wednesday. After coming out of the meeting, the farmers leaders said the administration has refused to take any action against SDM Ayush Sinha.

The farmers leaders said the protest will continue until their demands are met. Bharatiya Kisan Union (BKU) leader Rakesh Tikait said a parallel protest will run in Karnal, but they will not disrupt the administration's functioning.

"A peaceful protest will continue here at Karnal until the government takes action against the IAS officer. However, the administration will be allowed to function for daily services, so that the people

are not affected," Tikait said.

He said they will hold a meeting after one or two days and will decide on the strategies for the protest. "We have clearly told the administration that invite us (farmers) for a meeting only if they have got instructions from the higher authorities to take action against the SDM, otherwise don't call us for a meeting," Tikait added.

It was the fourth meeting between the farmers leaders and the Karnal administration since the protest began early on Tuesday. A delegation of 13 farmers led by Tikait attended the meeting with the administration officials and insisted on action against SDM Ayush Sinha and an independent inquiry into the matter.

Before going for the meeting, Tikait had accused Haryana chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar of

conspiring to confine the farmers agitation to one district (Karnal). "Ongoing farm protests at borders of Delhi will remain the main centre of the protest. No matter how much the governments try to suppress us we will not waste energy in the protest at Karnal but would like to solve this issue as soon as possible," he added.

The decision for the fourth round of talks with the district administration was taken in a meeting held among the representatives of the farmers unions on Wednesday. It was the fourth meeting in the last 24 hours, since scores of farmers sat on a protest against the August 28 lathicharge. Three meetings on the same issue were held on Tuesday, however, all those meetings were inconclusive.

They also alleged that the Haryana police have banned the

entry of farmers coming to join the protest. "All entry points to the mini-secretariat have been sealed. Farmers sitting here on protest would need water, food and other things but we are not allowed to enter. The more the government will harass the farmers the more this protest will intensify. The government must understand that farmers will not leave the place until our demands are met," said Chetan Singh, one of the protesters.

The agitating farmers said it has been more than 24 hours that they have been demanding action against the IAS officer who on August 28 ordered a lathicharge.

Firm on their demand for action against the IAS officer who has been transferred to Chandigarh, the farmers said they would not call off their protest until the gov-

ernment takes action against him. The protest which began at Anaj Mandi early on Tuesday shifted to the mini-secretariat at Karnal on Wednesday.

To intensify the protest, the farmers have set up tents outside the DC office. Some farmers said that the protest in front of the district administration office will be extended if their demands are not met.

Apart from action against the IAS officer, the farmers have also demanded compensation of Rs 25 lakh and a government job to the next of kin of Sushil Kajal, a farmer from Gharanda who received head injuries in the lathicharge on August 28 and died later due to a heart attack. They also demanded a compensation of Rs 2 lakh to all those who received injuries in the lathicharge.



Political parties eyeing tribal vote banks in MP

BJP's state spokesperson and MLA Yashpal Singh Sisodia said that Kamal Nath was "in power for 15 months in the state, if he had worked for the interests of the tribals, today he would not have needed to take out the 'Adhikar Yatra'. The Chief Minister has always been concerned about the rights of tribals. Kamal Nath is shedding crocodile tears for the tribals today." Sisodia added that the Congress in its 15 months in

power did not do any work for the tribals or for Lord Birsa Munda, Shankar Shah, Raghunath Shah and Veerangana Durgavati. "Today the tribal vote bank is slipping out of the hands of Congress, as such it is drawing the line of division in the society with the help of foreign forces. By taking out the Kamal Nath Yatra, they are only doing misleading the tribals," Sisodia said. Political analysts believe that bye-elections are coming up in one Lok Sabha and three assembly constituencies, so both the parties have intensified efforts to woo the tribals.

"We could achieve it through people's participation right from the village to the district levels," he said. He said, "We are praying that the third wave should never come but are preparing for the worst situation. The production capacity of medical oxygen has been increased and arrangements have been made for setting up of temporary hospitals in case of need."

The minister said that reducing IMR and MMR was a big challenge in the state. Early detection of pregnant women at risk of developing complications at the time of delivery was the key to bringing down MMR and IMR both. Dr Choudhary said that the government had expanded the child and infant health facilities in the state by establishing PICUs (Paediatric Intensive Care Units) in district and civil hospitals. Besides, the minister also launched

digital kits and a mini skill lab on the occasion. Director, HCL Foundation, Nidhi Pundhir said the foundation works in the fields of environment, health and education. She said that the MMR and Neonatal Mortality Rate (NMR) were unusually high in Shahdol. The foundation would be training grassroots-level health workers (ANMs, Anganwadi workers and ASHA workers) in three Community Health Centre (CHC) areas - Jaisinghnagar, Budhar and Sohagpur - of the district.

CRUCIAL FOR MP AND UP, KEN-BETWA RIVER LINK PROJECT TO BE INAUGURATED IN NOVEMBER

The ambitious Rs 45,000 crore Ken-Betwa river link project, which has been pending for the last 16 years, will be inaugurated by PM Narendra Modi in November, Madhya Pradesh water resources minister Tulsiram Silawat told media persons in Bhopal on Wednesday. The Centre, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh governments have reached a consensus on the project, said Silawat. He, however, said linking the project to UP assembly polls slated to be held next year was not appropriate as the inauguration was only aimed to address water needs of the two states. Silawat further said since there were no more pending issues between the two states, the link project work will resume from November. The Ken-Betwa project was mooted in 2005 to meet the water needs of the parched Bundelkhand region, which is spread

across MP and UP borders. The scheme though has been embroiled in several issues for the last 16 years. After lengthy negotiations on several issues, including water-sharing ratio, the two states and the Centre had signed the MoU on March 22 this year. As part of the project, surplus water of river Ken in MP will be transferred to river Betwa in UP for irrigating 3.64 lakh hectares in Bundelkhand. The projects involved construction of a 77 metre-tall and 2 km-wide Dhaudhan dam and a 230 km canal. The project had drawn public ire as it is expected to submerge parts of Panna Tiger Reserve, which will hamper the habitat of wild animals. The National Board for Wildlife cleared

the project in 2016. Once complete, the project will be one of its kind endeavor in the country and is expected to usher in a water revolution in the years to come. Late PM Atal Bihari Vajpayee had mooted this project aiming to make available irrigation facilities in UP's Jhansi, Mahoba, Lalitpur and Hamirpur and offering potable water facility to large part of Bundelkhand in both the UP and MP years ago. The Congress party was quick to link the same with the upcoming polls in UP. Kamleshwar Patel, the former minister in Kamal Nath government said it was nothing but part of the BJP's poll campaign for the UP

One District One Product Scheme

Action plan made for 6 districts for collection of minor forest produce

Forest Minister Kunwar Vijay Shah informed that action plan has been prepared for six districts for collection of minor forest produce under 'One District-One Product' scheme in the state. It includes Alirajpur, Singrauli, Umaria, Betul, Mandla and Anuppur districts. Shah informed that due to availability of sufficient quantity of Mahua flower and Safed Musli in Alirajpur, special efforts would be made to set up machines in 2 Van Dhan Kendras for marketing and processing. In Singrauli district, 7 Van Dhan Kendras will be used for processing Mahua flower. A plan has been prepared to make Mahua Laddu, Biscuit and Cake as well as extract oil from Mahua seeds through 6 Van Dhan Centers set up for processing and marketing of Mahua flowers in Umaria district. Mahua saplings have also been planted at 6 places under the local tree plantation scheme. Shah informed that Van Dhan Vikas Kendras are being set up in Betul district for processing and marketing of Mahua flowers and pickle kernels. Similarly, farmers will also be trained for the purpose of encouraging the cultivation of medicinal plants on private land. The finished product at these centres will be sold through local market, TRIFED and Sanjeevani Kendras. Shah informed that a plan has been prepared for processing of Amla, Arjun bark, honey and Mahua in Mandla district. In Anuppur district, special efforts will be made under the action plan for the conservation and production of Gulbakavali, including plantation. This will strengthen the economic condition of the local villagers.

More than 400 people were injured in traditional stone pelting in Madhya Pradesh during the annual 'Gotmar' fair on Tuesday. The fair was organised on the banks of river Jaam in Chhindwara district. The district administration had

deployed 1,000 policemen and a team of 35 doctors at the site of the fair, news agency PTI reported. The event was monitored by drones, PTI added. "During the Gotmar fair on Tuesday, over 400 people sustained injuries. Two people with severe injuries have been referred to Nagpur in neighbouring Maharashtra for further treatment,"

Chief Medical Health Officer (CMHO) Dr GC Chourasia said. It is a centuries-old and one of the bloodiest fairs in the world. People of two villages - Savargaon and Pandhurna - through either sides of river Jaam during the fair where a tree is erected in the middle of the river with a flag on top. Both the sides approach the tree

to remove the flag by pelting stones (called Got) at each other and those who remove the flag first, are declared winners. When is the fair organised? The Gotmar fair is organised in the month of September. The whole activity happens amidst the chanting of the sacred name of Maa Durga. District Collector Saurabh Kumar Suman said on Tuesday that the fair passed off peacefully this year and lesser people were injured when compared to previous year, adding that he had appealed to people to organise such events only in a symbolic manner. As per local legend, about 300 years ago, a boy from Pandhurna eloped with a girl from Savargaon and people from the latter threw stones to stop him from crossing the river with her, while his village folk retaliated in the same manner to bring the couple home safely.

Tigress gives birth to 2 cubs in Panna reserve

An eight-year-old tigress has given birth to two cubs in Panna Tiger Reserve, a senior forest official said. The tiger reserve management had the information about the birth of the cubs of tigress named T-234, but they were captured on cameras for the first time last week, Panna Tiger Reserve's (PTR) field director Uttam Kumar Sharma told reporters on Tuesday. Currently, there are about 70 tigers in the PTR, including 45 to 50 felines above one year of age and around 20 cubs, he said. "About a week back, this tigress was captured on cameras with the two cubs. The cubs seemed to be about three months old," the official said. In 2009, not a single tiger



was left in the PTR due to various reasons, including poaching. Later, two tigresses and a tiger were brought to the PTR from Panna Tiger Reserve as part of the Panna tiger reintroduction programme. According to the 2018 tiger census, Madhya Pradesh is home to highest number of tigers in the country, an official earlier said. The state has a number of tiger reserves, including Kanha, Bandhavgarh, Panna, Satpura and Panna.

Signs of recovery

In a sign of a sharp economic recovery, credit profiles of companies has seen a marked improvement in the five month period of current fiscal as compared to Covid affected April-August period of 2020. A testimony to improving conditions post the pandemic is the resilient performance of the corporate sector, particularly manufacturers ring, as it is also evident from rising number of credit upgrades by credit rating agencies (CRAs) that has grown by over 2.4 times this year so far. As per an analysis of the overall rating migration data for the April-August period over the last 3 years done by Acuite Ratings, there is a sharp recovery in the Credit Ratio (CR) of the CRA industry from 0.56x in the previous year to 2.30x in the current year which is significantly higher than the levels seen in the pre-pandemic year i.e. FY20. The number of upgrades during the period under review has increased by 2.4 times this year vis-a-vis April-August 2020 and the downgrades have almost reduced by 40 per cent. The number of upgrades during this five month period is almost similar to that in the pre-Covid year while the number of downgrades has almost halved from those levels, the ratings agency's analysis showed. With the removal of lockdown restrictions, the road sector has also started to see a recovery both in terms of project completion and toll collection. There is also a significant revival in sectors such as auto, gems and jewellery and textiles with expectation of a pent up demand. The improving credit ratio in the financial sector, Acuite said, reflects a significant moderation in concern on asset quality deterioration and liquidity impairment, given the monetary and the fiscal support measures; however, the credit ratio at 1.08x in April-August 21 indicates the continuing uncertainty particularly on retail asset quality. The travel and the hospitality sector, understandably has been severely impacted during the pandemic and the persistent weak credit ratio indicates that recovery herein will take at least a few quarters; similar is the case for the real estate sector.

NO CAUSE FOR CELEBRATION: INDIAN MUSLIMS AND THE TALIBAN TAKEOVER OF AFGHANISTAN

Taliban prides itself in following Islam according to the scriptures and yearns to establish an Islamic Emirate in Afghanistan. Their narrow vision rests on the claim that the foremost objective of maintaining law and order in the society is possible by following Islamic principles. Yet, they manifest themselves by committing violent acts in order to create fear and assert power.

Relying on the religion to further their agenda of control over the Afghan people, the Taliban is contemptuous to the likes of secularism, freedom of speech, human rights or anything that has to do with democratic ideals which for them are the vestiges of Western influence. In the previous regime which lasted from 1996 to 2001, the Taliban meted out strict punishments to anyone who went against their interpretation of Shariah rules that were to be followed. They practiced regressive policies which impinged upon the basic rights and freedom of the Afghan people, most particularly the women and the ethnic minorities of Afghanistan like the Tajiks, Hazaras and the Uzbeks.

The Hazaras in particular have been subject to some of the most violent attacks for their ethnicity and Shia faith. They even destroyed the famous Buddha statues in Bamayan. It's important to remember that in its thirst to gain control over Afghanistan, Taliban is killing the Muslims in Afghanistan. The Afghan Taliban found its education in Deoband Madrasah located in the Indian subcontinent. Although Taliban finds its influence from the Deoband school, the group also has deep roots in the Pashtun traditions that followed a pre-Islamic tribal code or Pashtunwali.

In their fight against the Soviet Union, it were the US and Pakistan that began pushing the Islamic agenda in Afghanistan. Over a period of time, with Pakistan creating the Taliban, the outfit has mainly sustained itself through narcotics and terror activities which are illegal according to the basic principles of Islam.

And still the Taliban claims to establish an Islamic Emirate. In reality, the brand of Islam that the Taliban practices and wants an ordinary Afghani to follow is merely a means to have absolute control over Afghanistan. Islam promotes tolerance and not compulsion. As such, the Taliban has resorted to a forced ideology and has thrived on it by having a strict control on the Afghani people.

The Deoband School in India has condemned the violent practices that are followed by the Taliban. There is definitely no need to draw a connection between the Afghan Taliban and the Deoband seminary of the All-India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) which the Taliban emerged cannot be placed on Islam or the theological school they belong to. And placing the Indian Muslims and the kind of religion they follow and Taliban on the same bar is just not right. Interestingly, with the Taliban back in the picture in Afghanistan, the attention is back on the Indian Muslims too. For the record, it has been reiterated time and again that the Taliban do not have anything to do with the Indian Muslims. Do the Taliban need to be condemned? Yes, by every citizen of India and also the world, not only Muslims.

Harrowing visuals of people desperate to flee the clutches of Taliban having been doing rounds on the internet, social media and television channels for which the Taliban need a strong condemnation from the international community; the onus should not be on the Indian



Muslims alone.

Muslims constitute roughly 14 per cent of India's population and are the third largest Muslim population in the world. It is important to remember that Indian Muslims rejected the Islamic state of Pakistan during the Partition and chose the secular state of India and have continuously reposed faith in democratic ideals of the Indian Constitution.

The whole narrative of drawing a connection of Indian Muslims to the Taliban is flawed. When isolated people like Maulana Sajjad Nomani of the All-India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) commended the Taliban for taking over Afghanistan, the AIMPLB immediately dissociated itself from this opinion. Except a few isolated cases, the members of the Muslim community do not glorify or sympathise with the Taliban.

Everyone knows very well the harm their medieval practices in the name of Islam are doing, is more to the religion than the practitioners themselves. A handful of radical statements cannot be taken

as representative of the whole Muslim community in India. India has long been a pluralistic society from the start and a lot of it is due to the social movements like the Bhakti and Sufi movements etc. The idea of sharing space binds the people together cutting across sectarian and religious differences.

So, we see a cultural balance and this has been the foundation of Indian Muslims. In India, Islam is also driven by culture, tradition along with theology. There has been an intermingling of cultural practices which have created a cohesive bond of a plural society.

For a Bengali-speaking Muslim or an Assamese-speaking Muslim, their ethnic identity is as important to them as their religious identity. Likewise, it is sometimes a common language which bonds people irrespective of the religion they belong to. There is Kerala Muslim, Tamil Muslim, Bengali Muslim, and so on. All take as much pride in their ethnicity as they identify them-

selves with their religion. Some Muslims in India believe that Islam as a religion involves syncretism and others believe in a Puritan Islam with no scope for heterogeneity. There are interpretations in the same faith and differences of opinion too, as what might be right to one might be wrong to the other.

And Indian Muslims respect these differences and opinions that have existed since time immemorial and do not believe in forcefully enforcing the ideologies like the way the Taliban does. Muslims need to reclaim Islam from the clutches of those who give fatwas at the drop of a hat and do not mind hobnobbing with political parties for their interests. What is needed is a more educational and economic amelioration of the Muslim community.

IS-KP WILL CLAIM RESPONSIBILITY FOR MORE ATTACKS ON WESTERN, INDIAN TARGETS IN THE REGION SOON

The Islamic State Khorasan Province (IS-KP) is also a Pakistani proxy that is thriving under Islamabad's patronage. Most of ISKP's cadres include disgruntled elements from the Taliban, Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan, and Pakistan's other proxy groups like Jaish-e-Muhammad (JeM) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT). The rest include foreign fighters from Uzbekistan, Kerala (India), etc., Abhinav Pandya wrote in National Interest.

There is a strong likelihood that IS-KP will claim responsibility for more attacks on Western and Indian targets in the region soon. Moreover, Pakistan's double game of keeping up the pretense of being the US ally against terror while sheltering, funding, and training terrorist groups with US aid money is likely to continue. The only difference



now is that IS-KP has replaced Al Qaeda and the Taliban as America's latest antagonist. Regardless, as long as the Pakistani Army's General Headquarters in Rawalpindi continue to play its bloody and covert intelligence game from behind the scenes, innocent Afghans will continue to suffer, the article said.

"Hence, since raising multiple proxies gives Pakistan deniability, the ISI is using the same model in

Afghanistan. For example, luring Indian nationals into IS-KP and inducing them to target Indian interests in Afghanistan has offered convincing deniability to Pakistan compared to using known proxies like LeT and JeM. Likewise, since Pakistan's links with the Taliban and HQN are well-known, it is nurturing IS-KP for three reasons: to maintain a degree of plausible deniability, to project an image of also being a vic-

tim of terror, and to make the Taliban more acceptable to international actors," it added.

In the Afghanistan-Pakistan region, there are numerous heavy-weight proxies that are supported by the Pakistani Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) like the Haqqani Network (HQN), JeM, LeT, and the Taliban. Given these groups' presence, it is almost impossible for a new organisation to survive without the blessings of the Pakistani Army's General Headquarters in Rawalpindi, the article said.

Reportedly, since its formation in 2015, the ISI has infiltrated the IS-KP with a sizable number of its cadres from LeT, JeM, and HQN.

There is no reason to believe that IS-KP and the Taliban are sworn enemies due to perceived ideological differences. If some disgruntled individuals deserted the Taliban to join IS-KP, it mainly was over the leadership clashes, turf wars, and the distribution of financial

resources from opium smuggling. "Interviews I had with informed interlocutors in Pakistan suggest that key figures in IS-KP have had links with individuals and entities associated with the Pakistani ISI since the group's inception.

"Further, this claim was substantiated through my conversations with the members of India's intelligence fraternity. In 2016, they found compelling evidence of Pakistani agencies radicalizing Indian youth from Kerala on IS-KP's behalf. Reportedly, they also assisted them in moving to the IS-KP stronghold in the Afghanistan-Pakistan region through third countries," the author said.

Having discussed the interconnected and overlapping nature of terror groups in the Afghanistan-Pakistan region, it becomes clear that the ISI is the common denominator among all of them, Pandya added.

PAK PROMOTING 'CULTURE OF VIOLENCE': INDIA

India has accused Pakistan of promoting a "culture of violence" and using the high-level UN meeting on the culture of peace for hate speech.

"We have witnessed yet another attempt today by the delegation of Pakistan to exploit a UN platform for hate speech against India, even as it continues to foment a 'culture of violence' at home and across its borders," Vidisha Maitra, a First Secretary at India's UN mission told the General Assembly on Tuesday.

"We dismiss and condemn all such efforts," she said in her address to the high-level forum on culture of peace while making a passive reference to Pakistan's Permanent Representative Munir Akram's remarks. Akram devoted six paragraphs of his nine-paragraph speech to India and the RSS and asked the General Assembly to "confront Hindutva". Though often speeches at the UN veer off the topic, Akram's address was unusual in that it almost entirely targeted an organisation in a member country using an inventive for it. Without identifying Pakistan, Maitra drew attention to the religion-based terrorism emanating from there, saying "There can be no doubt that terrorism, which is a manifestation of intolerance and violence, is the antithesis of all religions and cultures. The world should be concerned by terrorists who use religion to justify these acts and those who support them in this quest." She said that the UN and the member states "refrain from selectivity on such issues which hinders a culture of peace".

41 KILLED, DOZENS INJURED IN PRISON FIRE NEAR JAKARTA

At least 41 people were killed and about 80 others injured as fire broke out at a prison in Tangerang town near the Indonesian capital Jakarta early on Wednesday, officials said. All the injured were taken to nearby hospitals and health clinics, and eight of them are in serious condition,

according to Jakarta police chief Inspector General Fadil Imran, Xinhua news agency reported. The fire occurred at 2:20 a.m. local time and was extinguished at 3:30 a.m. Electrical short circuit is believed to be the cause of the fire, said Jakarta police spokesperson Senior Commissioner Yusri Yunus. The overcrowded

block, which was designed for holding 40 prisoners, accommodates 122, said Rika Aprianti, a spokesperson for the prison department at Indonesia's Law and Human Rights Ministry. Many of the prisoners held in the affected block were those involved in drug and narcotics related cases, according to her.

HOUSEHOLD GAS BLAST KILLS 2 NEAR MOSCOW

Moscow: At least two people were killed and five injured in a household gas blast in a Moscow suburb on Wednesday, RIA Novosti news agency reported.

The second, third and part of the fourth floors of a nine-storey residential building collapsed during the explosion in the town of Noginsk, the Moscow Region, and 24 apartments were damaged.

More than 170 people have been evacuated. It is not known yet if there are still people under the rubble. Search and rescue operations are underway, Xinhua news agency reported.


One killed as 7.1-magnitude quake shakes S Mexico

At least one person was killed after a 7.1-magnitude earthquake hit the southern Mexican coastal city of Acapulco in Guerrero state on Tuesday night, officials said.

Tremors were felt hundreds of kilometres away in the Mexican capital as buildings rocked and swayed in Mexico City, Xinhua news agency reported on Wednesday.

The National Seismological Service reported via Twitter that the earthquake occurred at 8:47 p.m. local time (0147 GMT Wednesday) 11 km southwest of Acapulco, with a depth of 10 km. A man was killed after a light pole fell on him in the municipality of Coyuca de Benitez, Guerrero State



Governor Hector Astudillo Flores told local television. The Civil Protection Agency of the state said the quake has led to rock falls and landslides on roads. Authorities reported no major damage in Guerrero and the neighbouring regions of Michoacan, Jalisco, Mexico City or other areas. In

Mexico City, people rushed to the streets as the quake was felt strongly, followed by power outages. Elsa Ramirez, an informal trader, was on her way home when she heard the seismic alarm. "It was very strong, what a scare! I thought the light cables on top were going to fall off," she told Xinhua while tak-

ing shelter outside a shop. The city's mayor Claudia Sheinbaum asked residents to stay calm via her social networks. "There have been three flyovers and no damage has been found. I just spoke with the president and gave him this information. We know that there are many places without electricity, I ask everyone to be very calm," she said. The earthquake was located at the coordinates north latitude 16.78 degrees and west longitude minus 99.93 degrees, specified the agency dependent on the Institute of Geophysics of the National Autonomous University of Mexico. Mexico is in an area of high seismicity due to the interaction of five tectonic plates: the North American plate, the Cocos plate, the Pacific plate, the Rivera plate, and the Caribbean plate.



Fresh curbs, lockdown will depend on oxygen demands: Maha govt

As Maharashtra grapples with a renewed surge in Covid-19 cases, the state government on Wednesday clarified that fresh curbs or lockdown-like measures would be considered only if the demands for liquid medical oxygen (LMO) crosses 700 tonnes daily. The fresh spike has raised apprehensions of more restrictions, especially with major festivals like the 10-day Ganeshotsav and Navratri round the corner.

An official said that during the second wave which peaked in April-May 2021, the state LMO production of around 1,200 tonnes daily has now been significantly increased to around 1,700 tonnes.

Currently, the state is reporting a LMO demand of over 200 tonnes for Covid patients and 150 tonnes for other patients, but during the expected third wave, the LMO requirements could shoot up drastically.

Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray is reviewing the daily LMO demand-supply on a regular basis with the ongoing hike in cases but has refrained from imposing new restrictions so far.

Health Minister Rajesh Tope said that as per a Central report, the state could report 6 million cases in the anticipated third wave and the government is making all preparations to tackle it.

"Currently we have a capacity of around 1,500 tonnes of LMO, and with the commis-



sioning of 250 out of 450 PSA plants, we target a capacity of up to 2,000 tonnes daily. However, if the Centre's estimates on the third wave prove true, then we shall need more oxygen," Tope said.

However, he hinted that if the daily LMO demands shoot beyond 700 tonnes, the government could consider new curbs or lockdown style measures.

Tope's cautionary came a day after the state Energy Minister, Dr Nitin Raut and Mumbai Mayor Kishori Pednekar warned that the third wave has already started in the state capital and second capital, Mumbai and Nagpur, respectively.

Thackeray, who is closely monitoring the Covid situation in Mumbai, Pune, Nagpur, and other hotspots that were badly affected in the first and second waves, is expected to take the final call on tightening up measures, if necessary.

NO VISITING MANDALS DURING GANESH CHATURTHI, ONLY ONLINE DARSHAN ALLOWED: MAHARASHTRA GOVT

People would not be allowed to visit Ganesh pandals during the coming festival in view of the coronavirus pandemic, the Maharashtra government said on Wednesday.

Only online 'darshan' or telecast from pandals would be allowed, said the state home department.

Earlier, it had said in a circular that social distancing should be followed strictly inside the pandals during the Ganesh festival.

The new circular said that "(people) are prohibited from visiting any Ganesh pandal." Organizers should instead provide the facility of online 'darshan' or telecast for the benefit of devotees, it said.

The decision has been taken to discourage people from venturing out and exposing themselves to the viral infection, said an official.

In the face of strong demand from Ganesh mandals to allow visarjan in natural water bodies, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) is standing firm, prioritising Covid safety protocol.

Aiming at preventing crowds during immersion, after Ganeshotsav begins from September 10, the BMC



has said that no processions will be allowed and mandals must deposit idols at collection points assigned by ward offices. Following this, BMC staff will carry out the immersion of the idols in natural water bodies.

The organisers had asked the state government and the BMC to allow 10 members from each mandal for visarjan. But just like it did last year, the

BMC has banned welcome as well as visarjan processions in the wake of the pandemic.

Mandal volunteers will not be allowed anywhere near Chowpatty or other waterfronts and will have to hand over the idols to the BMC volunteers or civic staff who will take over from that point.

Last year, the BMC had asked citi-

zens and mandals to give preference to the artificial ponds in each of the 24 wards.

The BMC and the state government in June had issued general guidelines on the festival, mandating residents and sarvajanik mandals to have smaller idols (2ft-high for households and 4ft-high for sarvajanik mandals), similar to last year.

MONSOON DOWNPOUR CONTINUES TO BATTER MAHARASHTRA

Wet weather conditions with intermittent heavy showers have characterised weather in Mumbai and other parts of coastal Maharashtra this week. As per forecasts, active monsoon downpours will prevail over parts of Maharashtra for the next few days. With 79 mm rainfall over the last 24 hours till Wednesday morning, Mumbai's Santacruz monitoring station has recorded a 2,732 mm rainfall so far this monsoon season. Despite registering nearly 40% surplus rainfall, the commercial capital is set to witness more rains this week.

Maharashtra's subdivisions have to brace for rough weather conditions in the form of heavy rains, strong surface winds, lightning and thunderstorms, starting today, Wednesday, September 8. The inclement weather conditions are brought by a low-pressure area that formed over the Bay of Bengal earlier this week. Now, this rain-bearing system is moving inwards in the Central belt, thus dumping rains on its path.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), a well-marked low-pressure area and associated cyclonic circulation hover over parts of north Vidarbha. The system and its remnant would move



west-north-westwards during the next 4-5 days. Heavy showers are also expected along the west coast as the system attracts moist winds from the Arabian Sea. Under the influence of this system, fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with isolated heavy to very heavy showers have been forecast over Madhya Maharashtra from September 8 to 11. Subdivisions Madhya Maharashtra may face the brunt of isolated extremely heavy rainfall on Wednesday. Similar rough conditions are expected to batter adjoining state Gujarat on Wednesday and Thursday.

Following the forecasts of extreme weather conditions, the IMD has issued a red warning for Mumbai.

Red warnings-IMD's highest weather warning level-instruct residents and authorities to 'take action' during inclement weather. Meanwhile, on Wednesday, Madhya Maharashtra has been placed under an orange alert, which urges residents to 'be prepared' for the rough weather conditions. The other surrounding subdivision, Marathwada has been kept under a yellow watch that instructs people to 'be updated' on September 8's weather situation. Come Thursday, the alert level would be demoted over Konkan, Goa and Madhya Maharashtra to the yellow watch for the next 48 hours. Rough conditions are on the horizon for several districts of Maharashtra, including Mumbai,

HEAVY RAINS LASH RAIGAD

Alibaug: Teams from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) have been deployed in Maharashtra's Raigad district, as heavy rains continued to batter the coastal region since the last 24 hours, an official said on Wednesday. Rains lashed large parts of the district, which has recorded 98.89 per cent of its average annual rainfall, the official said. An incident of landslide occurred at Salav in Murud taluka on Tuesday, affecting vehicular movement on Alibaug-Murud and Roha-Murud routes, he said. In light of the red alert issued by the weather department, warning of heavy rainfall, NDRF teams have been deployed at Mahad, he said. Murud recorded the highest 124 mm rain in the last 24 hours, followed by Shrivardhan with 122 and Panvel with 72.60 mm rainfall, the official said.

This week. As per the IMD's regional met centre in Mumbai, the suburbs of the financial capital are in for heavy to very heavy rains at some isolated places, while the city will experience moderate rains in the next 48 hours.

Pune tops in Covid-19 vaccination chart in Maha, Mumbai stands second

With vaccinations getting generated from Co-Win, Pune has set another milestone of administering most Covid vaccine shots on Tuesday. A total of 1.82 lakh beneficiaries got their vaccines on Tuesday till 8:00 pm. On the other hand, Mumbai recorded the second-highest vaccination figures in the state, with beneficiaries reaching 52,314 and vaccine doses, 79,000 in Ahmednagar on Tuesday.

According to the health department authorities in Pune, the total vaccination figure in Pune could reach up to 2 lakh as many vaccination centers were still updating the information late at night. This is the second time Pune has topped the vaccination dosage chart.

On August 31, the district had set a record by administering the vaccine to 2.57 lakh people.

The recorded vaccination figures till 8:00 pm show that the Pune rural had administered one lakh beneficiaries, the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) limits, 68,000, and the Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipal Corporation (PCMC) recording 14,000 vaccinations on Tuesday.

Pune sets another record for administering most Covid doses in a day.

Hospital, after being alerted about the mega vaccination drive, alone vaccinated around 692 beneficiaries in a short span. Ayush Prasad, the Pune Zilla Parishad chief executive officer (CEO), told TOI that the number of people getting vaccinated in the rural areas has increased only after local communities' involvement at the gram-panchayat level.

To yield maximum results in semi-urban areas, the authority has tied up with human societies. "Our micro-planning has made sure that all the eligible adults get their shots at the nearest vaccination site," he added.

He further added that maintaining consistency in the vaccination drive could not have been possible without the help of staff members and medical, paramedical staffers.

Sanjay Deshmukh, the assistant director (medical), Pune Circle, told the TOI that the district plans to vaccinate as many people as possible soon before the festive seasons take charge. For maintaining the same, the mega drive would continue for the next few days.

Maharashtra Cabinet approves solar capacity addition of 577 mw

In a bid to increase the share of solar power projects in the state's total generation capacity, the Maharashtra Cabinet on Wednesday approved establishment of solar power projects by the state-run Maharashtra State Power Generation Company (MahaGenCo) at various places. The government has cleared two proposals comprising solar power projects of total capacity of 187 mw and another of 390 mw. Currently, MahaGenCo has 180 mw of solar generation.

Of the total generation capacity of 187 mw, 50 mw is proposed in Osmanabad district, 60 mw in Latur, 20 mw in Bhusawal, 12 mw each at Parli and Koradi, 8 mw at Nashik and 25 mw in Dhule. The cabinet also approved MahaGenCo to borrow loan up to Rs 588.21 crore from KFW Bank Germany. These projects will be set up on an Engineering Procurement and Construction basis. Of the 187 mw, Rs 158.29 crore will come from MahaGenCo's

internal resources or debt. MahaGenCo will repay the loan borrowed from the KFW Bank Germany.

As far as 390 mw of solar power projects are concerned, 130 mw capacity (90 mw, 30 mw and 40 mw) will come up at different sites in Washim district on EPC model. Under Washim-1 category, two projects with 20 mw each and another with 40 mw will be developed. Further under Washim 2 category, 145 mw in Chandrapur district and three projects with 25 mw capacity each will come up in Yavatmal district.

The state cabinet has approved a loan of Rs 1,564.22 crore at 0.05% rate of interest per annum KFW Bank Germany with repayment in maximum 12 years. MahaGenCo is also expected to explore new project financing under innovative project conditions.

The state cabinet also approved MahaGenCo to raise share capital of Rs 364.18 crore from its internal resources or through debt. MahaGenCo will have to repay the loan taken from KFG Bank Germany.

Maharashtra govt mulls 'nodal centres' at smaller cities for IT workers as WFH continues

With work from home (WFH) continuing for employees in the information technology sector, Maharashtra is mulling to create 'nodal centres' on the lines of co-working spaces in smaller cities and towns, from where software professionals can work for their respective companies, a minister has said.

The state, which is home to the IT hub in Pune and also has a presence of enterprises in other pockets like Mumbai, Nagpur and Nashik, has invited suggestions from the industry for an 'inclusive IT policy', Minister of State for IT Satej Patil has said.

Almost the entire IT staff has been in the WFH mode since the beginning of the pandemic in March 2020 and companies have been saying that the future will have a 'hybrid model' where a good part of the employees continue working from offices.

The state, which is home to the IT hub in Pune and also has a presence of enterprises in other pockets like Mumbai, Nagpur and Nashik, has invited suggestions from the industry for an 'inclusive IT policy', Minister of State for IT Satej Patil said

A lot of the work done by IT professionals is for critical sectors like finance, where privacy concerns and data confidentiality are important which also forced a few of the professionals to continue working from offices even during the lockdowns.

"We are also planning to start government-run well-equipped nodal centres where IT employees can come and work for their respective companies. All ideas are welcome in this regard," Patil said in a tweet on Monday, responding to suggestions made by billionaire Anand Deshpande, the founder chairman of Pune's Persistent Systems. Major cities, including those in the state,

have co-working spaces like WeWork since before the pandemic as well which typically help workers from diverse companies and sectors to help from dedicated spaces.

Patil said the government is trying its best to promote IT in Tier-2 and -3 cities. He appealed to industry lobby groups Nasscom and the Software Export Association Pune (SEAP) to come forward with help on creating district-wise databases suggested by Deshpande. "Mumbai and Pune have been leading in the IT sector and have been saturated due to migration to these cities. We now want to take this progress to tier 2 and 3 cities like Nagpur, Satara, Amaravati, Latur,

Nanded and others by giving incentives to the industries. The industries will be incentivised with various facilities through a separate IT policy," Patil had said recently. A statement from Patil later said SEAP and Nasscom have responded positively to the appeal with suggestions.

"With hybrid work systems becoming a reality, our focus lies on ensuring equitable collaboration and access for all, regardless of location," Nasscom said in reply to a tweet from Patil. SEAP Vice-President Vidyadhar Purandare said the focus should be on tier-2 and -3 cities taking the growth forward. "This has to be in addition to enhancing infrastructure at existing IT hubs, to make them more attractive destinations.

"SEAP would be happy to work closely with the state government. A nodal agency to collect and collate data points is the need of the hour," Purandare said.

NIA: HOW VAZE & CO DIABOLICALLY 'SILENCED' HIRAN - BOLLYWOOD STYLE

Chilling details have emerged of how Thane businessman Mansukh Hiran paid with his life for refusing to implicate himself in the planting of his own SUV near Antilia, the home of businessman Mukesh Ambani, and was finally eliminated by several former cops and others in a cold-blooded Bollywood-style operation.

In its 290-page charge sheet, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has disclosed the investigations into the sensational SUV abandonment followed by Hiran's killing in a meticulously calculated conspiracy. The main players in the SUV and Hiran's killing cases are the 10

prime accused - Sachin H Vaze, Vinayak B. Shinde, Hisamuddin Kazi, Sunil D Mane, Pradeep R Sharma (all ex-cops), Naresh R Gor, Santosh A Shelar, Manish V Soni, Anand P Jadhav and Satish T Mothkuri, all slapped with murder and terror charges. After the SUV planting case erupted in a big way and it was transferred to the crack Crime Intelligence Unit (CIU), the then Investigating Officer (IO) Vaze pressurized Hiran, on a promise of immediate bail, to own up the crime.

When he flatly refused, Vaze was worried of the ramifications since Hiran was the only person who knew the entire sequence of events but was a 'weak link' who could 'spill the beans' on them and

get all the conspirators trapped in the crime. Vaze and Sharma discussed the implications and decided to 'eliminate' Hiran, and the latter hired a contract killer Shelar, who along with the other accused met on March 2, and Hiran's presence was ensured to identify him before the prospective killers.

The next day, Vaze met Sharma at his NGO, 'P.S. Foundation' office in Andheri west, and handed over a large bag containing bundles of Rs 500 notes.

Thereafter, Sharma called Shelar to finalise a red-coloured vehicle Chevrolet Tavera and Vaze asked Hiran, oblivious of the ongoing diabolic plot to bump him off, to meet Mane at a particular location in Thane on March 4.

Mane picked up the Tavera, bought half a dozen handkerchiefs and a hood, while Vaze hatched out a raid in the Topsy Bar at Grant Road, to create an alibi that he was far away from the crime scene of Hiran's murder.

Simultaneously, Vaze lured Hiran out from Thane to Kandivali to meet Mane, who used an alias of 'Inspector Tawde' on the pretext of transporting him (Hiran) safely to another location in a white Volkswagen Polo.

Hiran complied, informed his wife that he was going to meet the so-called 'Tawde' in Kandivali, travelled by auto near Suraj Waterpark on Ghodbunder Road and met Mane in the white Polo, around 8.30 p.m. on March 4.

By 9.30 p.m., Mane reached a spot near the Fountain Hotel where the Tavera was waiting, asked Hiran to hand over his mobile phone, and ordered him to step into the vehicle which would take him to a secure spot.

The Tavera was already quite crowded and Hiran was made to sit between Shelar and Jadhav, while Mothkuri grabbed his head from the rear seat, and gagged him with the handkerchiefs.


As Hiran struggled for his life, the trio held onto him and smothered the 'weak link' to death on the car seat - ending the potential threat to all emmeshed in the mega-conspiracy.

Then, Shelar asked Soni to drive the Tavera to Kasheli Bridge on the Thane

Creek where they reached after around 45 minutes. Halting the vehicle, the killer trio of Shelar, Jadhav and Mothkuri dragged Hiran's body, hoisted it up and threw it into the darkness of the Thane Creek below.

The following day, Hiran's body - washed away by the currents - was found stuck in the marshlands around a km away from the Kasheli Bridge, creating a fresh hullabaloo - barely a week after the SUV planting incident outside Antilia.

In between, the NIA detailed how Vaze and Co used and destroyed various evidences related to the twin cases, most of it were later either detected or recovered by the sleuths.

Paris replied: "I wanted to do a film to show the businesswoman I am and all I've accomplished. I feel like there are so many misconceptions about me. During shooting, I was so close to the director.

"Without naming the director, Paris said it was like a "sisterly relationship and that she could open up about anything."

Paris added: "This is so important that you tell your story to other survivors, and people want to come forward with theirs. It was very difficult for me because it wasn't something I ever wanted to talk about publicly."

The goal boosted the Navy side no end and coach Abhilash Nair also affected early changes bringing in Sarabjit Singh for Jijo in midfield. Willis Plaza, however, did have a golden chance to put his team back ahead just before half-time, but his shot from close range after a lovely through from Brazilian Barbosa had set him away, was thwarted by keeper Roy.

The second half did not rise to the competitive levels of the first for most parts before Dalraj ensured a grandstand finish. Rising above the crowd off a Navy corner in the 86th minute, he blasted a header past a hapless Manvir Singh in the Delhi goal.

ICC TEST RANKINGS

THAKUR AND WOAKES GAIN BIG, BUMRAH MOVES UP A SPOT

All-rounders Shardul Thakur and Chris Woakes have made big gains in the ICC Test Player Rankings updated on Wednesday. Pacer Jasprit Bumrah also moved a spot up in the bowlers' rankings after India's 157-run win in the fourth Test at The Oval on Monday.

Thakur scored 57 and 60 in both innings of the Test. The twin half-centuries see him jump 59 places to 79th position in batsmen rankings. He has also moved up seven places to 49th in the bowlers ranking after finishing with three wickets in the match.

Woakes, back in an England Test eleven after a year, has also made progress in the rankings. Scoring 50 and 18 in both innings of the Test sees him gain seven places to reach 87th among batsmen. He also jumps three places to 23rd among bowlers after finishing with seven wickets at The Oval. Woakes has also made a re-entry into the all-rounders rankings, jumping two places to be at seventh place.

Bumrah climbed to ninth from tenth in the bowlers' rankings. Bumrah picked up four wickets at The Oval, especially taking out Ollie Pope and Jonny Bairstow, breaking the back



of England's chase in the final day of the Test. Bumrah now has 18 wickets in the series, just three behind England pacer Ollie Robinson, who moved three places to 33rd in the rankings.

Rohit Sharma, who was adjudged as the Player of the Match at The Oval for his match-winning 127 in the second innings, remains at fifth place but has extended the lead over Virat Kohli from seven to 30 rating points in the batsmen rankings. At 813 rating points, Sharma has achieved his best-ever position and rating points in Test rankings.

England batsman Ollie Pope's first innings knock of 82 has helped him advance nine slots to 49th position in batsmen rankings. Pacer James Anderson has dropped two places to be seventh in bowlers rankings.

Ravichandran Ashwin continues to be at second spot on the bowlers rankings. But Ashwin, who is yet to feature in the Test series against England, has dropped from fourth to fifth in the all-rounder rankings. The fifth Test between England and India will take place at the Old Trafford Cricket Ground in Manchester from September 10. India are leading the five-match Test series 2-1.

MS Dhoni to join India team as mentor for T20 World Cup

Medvedev on course for title showdown against Djokovic

Russian second seed Daniil Medvedev further cemented his title credentials overcoming qualifier Botic van de Zandschulp of the Netherlands 6-3, 6-0, 4-6, 7-5 to reach his third consecutive US Open semifinal here.

Djokovic will next face 12th seed Canadian Auger-Aliassime, who made his first major semifinal at the US Open after Spanish giant-killer Carlos Alcaraz retired due to an injury trailing 6-3, 3-1. The Russian, who captured his 200th career win in the first-round victory against Richard Gasquet of France, had not dropped a set before Tuesday.

The world No. 2 played with confidence against van de Zandschulp, firing 36 winners and winning 83 per cent (54/65) of first-serve points as



he raised his level in the fourth set to advance after two hours and 22 minutes. Chasing his maiden Major title, Medvedev remains on course for a potential blockbuster final against world No.

1 Novak Djokovic, who is aiming to capture the Grand Slam at the US Open. The 25-year-old will first have to overcome a tricky test against either 12th seed Felix Auger-Aliassime in the last four.

Leylah Fernandez secures semifinal berth

Leylah Fernandez of Canada gave herself a perfect present a day after she turned 19, defeating No.5 seed Elina Svitolina of Ukraine 6-3, 3-6, 7-6(5) in a thrilling tie to secure a place in her first Grand Slam semifinal at the US Open. Fernandez's self-belief was on full display in a tough third set on Tuesday evening even as the tenacious Svitolina fought back from 2-5 down to force a deciding tiebreak, and therein came from 1-4 down to level at 5-5, but the Canadian teenager stood resolute. It was the first time she had won a third-set tiebreak at Tour level. Meanwhile, Aryna Sabalenka of Belarus breezed into her second Grand Slam semifinal in a row by defeating No.8 seed Barbora Krejickova of the Czech Republic, 6-1, 6-4, under lights at the Arthur Ashe Stadium at the US Open.

World No.2 Sabalenka, who made her first major semifinal at Wimbledon earlier in the summer, dispatched this year's French Open champion Krejickova, guaranteeing a first-time Grand Slam champion at this year's US Open.



NEVER LET PANDEMIC AFFECT OUR MORALE: DILPREET SINGH

The new schedule will be December 20-28, 2022, according to the COC statement. "The Olympic Council of Asia (OCA), the COC and the local organizing committee had an in-depth discus-



sion and made the decision together, in order to protect the interests of every national/regional Olympic committee and ensure the safety and health of all athletes," the statement said. Shantou won the right to host the 3rd Asian Youth Games in 2019. The Asian Youth Games are among the top five multi-sport events in Asia.

England to play white-ball series against India at home in July next year

three-match Royal London Series follows with matches at Edgbaston (July 9), the Kia Oval (July 12) and Lord's (July 14)," ECB said.

South Africa's tour will begin with a three-match Royal London Series in the north of England. The series will be staged at Emirates Riverside (July 19), Emirates Old Trafford (July 22) and Emerald Headingley (July 24).

A three-match LV= Insurance Test Series against South Africa will conclude the men's international summer. Lord's will host the first LV= Insurance Test (August 17-21) before the series moves to Edgbaston (August 25-29) and the Kia Oval (September 8-12).

Henry Nicholls (1) and Colin de Grandhomme (0) were









Baba Nirala! All I can say is that it is only onwards and upwards from here so thank you to the team of Lions Club Of Mumbai for this award."


