

Guterres warns the world leaders on Climate Change

ACT OR PERISH

"We can either save our world or condemn humanity to a hellish future," is how the United Nations Secretary General Antonio Guterres warned the Ministers at the PreCOP26 held at Milan in Italy. With the UN's annual climate change talks less than a month away, Ministers from about 50-60 countries have gathered at Milan to develop a better understanding of how to resolve some of the remaining crunch issues ahead of the crucial climate conference in Glasgow in the UK.

Guterres ended with reminding the world how "young people, in particular, continue to lead the growing calls for more ambition. They will hold us accountable" and asserted: "Climate justice demands that we bequeath them a liveable planet."



of Parties (COP) each year. Applauding those nations, especially vulnerable developing countries, that have come forward with

more ambitious Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) -- actions at country-level that would total to combined actions helping to restrict global temperature rise below 1.5 degrees Celsius compared to pre-industrial era -- despite the ongoing Covid-19 crisis, Guterres said, "But we can only meet the 1.5-degree goal if all G20 countries, which are responsible for 80 per cent of global emissions, pledge more decisive action in new or updated NDCs."

Coming down heavily on the missing finance for adaptation and mitigation, he said, six years since the Paris Agreement, 2015, "we are nowhere close."

"Adaptation remains the neglected half of the climate equation, accounting for only 25 per cent of climate finance in support of developing countries. Even worse, adaptation represents only 0.1 per cent of private funding." He then repeated his call to donors and multilateral development banks to allocate at least 50 per cent of their climate support towards adaptation and resilience.

Guterres touched upon all aspects of the climate negotiations in his small address at the opening of the PreCOP26, a United Nations Framework Convention for Climate Change (UNFCCC) statement said. It is the UNFCCC that holds the Conference

"The principle of common but differentiated responsibilities in the light of national circumstances is a pillar of the Paris Agreement. That is why, I am asking all nations to enhance NDCs and domestic policies as often as necessary and without delay until we are collectively on the right track."

Dengue vaccine important, working closely with trials: ICMR chief

Indian Council of Medical Research Director General, Dr Balram Bhargava said that dengue vaccine has become an "important agenda" and the government is working on detailed trials.

Replied to a question at a press briefing on the ongoing Covid-19 situation, he said: "Dengue vaccine is a very important agenda. We are looking at it very carefully. There are certain dengue strains which have been licensed to some companies in India. Many of these companies have done their phase one trials abroad. "We are planning more rigorous trial with dengue vaccines."

About the current Covid situation in the country, Health Secretary Rajesh



Bhushan said that India continues to show declining trends in daily Covid caseload as around 23,000 cases have been reported in the last 24 hours, out of which almost 60 per cent have been reported from Kerala. He noted that Kerala also

has started showing a declining trend in number of cases, but still contributes a substantial number to the total caseload.

"Active cases are also on declining trend and recovery rate is improving day by day. There is one state only, Kerala, which has over 1 lakh Covid cases. A total of five states in the country have over 10,000 to 50,000 active cases while others have less than 5,000 active cases," Bhushan said.

He also said that this is 13th week in a row that positivity rate has been less than 3 per cent, and there are 48 districts which need special attention as 18 districts have a positivity rate between 5 to 10 per cent, and 30 districts have positivity rate over 10 per cent.

RAJ HC MOVED AGAINST AMENDMENT ALLOWING REGISTERING OF CHILD MARRIAGES

Jaipur: A Public Interest Litigation (PIL) petition has been filed by Jodhpur-based Saarthi Trusts managing trustee Dr Kriti Bharti in the Rajasthan High Court's Jaipur Bench challenging the constitutional validity of Rajasthan Compulsory Registration of Marriage (Amendment) Bill, 2021 which has the provision of registering child marriages in the state. The Assembly on September 17 passed the Rajasthan Compulsory Registration of Marriage (Amendment) Bill, 2021, which has provisions for registration of marriage of a girl below 18 years of age and marriage of a boy below 21 years of age. In her PIL, Bharti, a rehabilitation psychologist who is internationally renowned for her efforts for annulment and prevention of child marriages, has made the state government, the departments concerned, and the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights parties and pleaded for an early hearing. Bharti, who has annulled 43 child marriages and has stopped more than 1,500 child marriages so far, in her PIL, filed through Supreme Court advocate and Delhi Child Rights Protection Commission former member Shashank Shekhar, argued that through this amendment, the government has tried to give registered recognition to the malpractice of child marriage which is a cognisable offence. She also contended that the state government has also misinterpreted the Supreme Court's 2006 judgment as a reason for passing the amendment.



TN cop got his last service wish fulfilled on retirement day

Former Director General of Police (DGP)-Training Prateep V. Philip had one wish prior to his retirement - to sport the name badge and the cap that he had worn on May 21, 1991, his advocate Sanjay Pinto said.

It was on that fateful day that former Prime Minister and Congress leader Rajiv Gandhi was killed by a female suicide bomber belonging to Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) in Sriperumbudur. Philip, a 1987 batch officer was then an Assistant Superintendent of Police (SP) at Kancheepuram District was on security duty at Sriperumbudur when the blast occurred.

He was thrown away and was hospitalised. His name badge and the blood stained cap were found at the site.

"Philip wanted to file a petition to get back that name badge and the cap. We had asked for permanent

custody as they were just case exhibits and all avenues for appeal in that assassination case has been exhausted," Pinto told reporter.

However the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) counsel said the agency is agreeable for interim custody of those for two items and not for permanent custody. Philip retired on Sep 30, 2021 with his wish granted by a City Court on Sep 28, 2021. He had to execute a bond for Rs 100,000. As per the court order, Philip can be in the possession of the name badge and the cap till Sep 28, 2021 and has to hand them back to the court on or before that date.

The court had agreed that the two items are of sentimental value for Philip, "a reminder of the call of duty during his formative years in the service of nation and quite literally symbolize his blood, sweat and tears over 34 years of his professional career as accentuated by his counsel."



CENTRE ASSURED TO CLEAR HC JUDGES' APPOINTMENTS IN A DAY OR TWO: CJI

The Chief Justice of India (CJI), N.V. Ramana, said on Saturday that the top court collegium, which is headed by him, is targeting to fill the vacancies in various high courts at the earliest, and it does not want to cut down the pace of the process, rather it seeks Centre's support to enable access to justice and to strengthen the democracy.

Addressing an event organised by the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), in which Law Minister Kiren Rijiju was also present, Ramana said: "Since May onwards, my team so far has recommended appointments of 106 judges and 9 chief justices to various high courts. The government has cleared 7 names out of the 106 judges and 1 out of the 9 chief justices so far."

He added that the Law Minister has informed that the rest of the names will be cleared within one or two days. In total, there are 465 vacancies against a sanctioned strength of 1,098 judges in various high courts across the country.

The CJI said that these appointments will take care of pendency of cases to some extent.

"I seek the cooperation and support of the government to enable access to justice and to strengthen democracy," said Ramana, while speaking at the launch of the six-week 'Pan India



Legal Awareness and Outreach Campaign' of NALSA.

He emphasised that the quality of democracy rests on the quality of justice, and for a healthy democracy, a vibrant judiciary is essential.

Ramana added that loss of daily wage, prospect of eviction, lack of healthcare and uncertainty about the next meal -- all these flow from the absence of justice. "The social costs of this are unimaginable. Socio-economic justice would be impossible to achieve without providing equal

access to justice. Only when the vulnerable classes are aware about their rights can they shape their own future," he said. Ramana added, "We need people to feel that law and the institutions are for everyone. In a democratic country, it is the faith and trust of the people that sustains institutions." Citing that every person comes across legal issues in their lifetime, he said suppression of unmet legal needs results in the suppression of the full potential of an individual.

He emphasised that inclusive and sustainable growth would be impossible to attain without providing inclusive access to justice.

"Equality and 'access to justice' complement each other. In countries with major socio-economic gaps, unequal access to justice leads to widening of these divides," he added.

Reiterating that the Law Minister is dynamic, the CJI said: "I was told that he (Rijiju) set Twitter on fire with his high energy dance. His connect with the common people defines his commitment to society."

On his part, Rijiju said: "I would like to remind us all that speedy and affordable delivery of justice is the legitimate expectation of the people and is the collective responsibility of the different organs of the state."

He added that it is important that all the stakeholders work together to "deliver this mandate".

Cong govt will complete its 5-year tenure: Gehlot

Jaipur: Amid the crisis the Congress is facing in Punjab and Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Saturday said the Congress government in his state will complete its five year tenure, and also form the next government.

"Our bureaucrats are the first ones to remain tense on the issue discussing if the government shall continue or not. This is a burning topic in the secretariat too. But our government will continue in Rajasthan for the next five years. Also, we will form the government in the next tenure too," he added.

Gehlot said this while addressing a programme organised on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti. He launched the campaign Prashasan Gaon Ke Sang and Prashasan Shaharan Ke Sang.

"Nothing will go wrong for me for the next 15-20 years now... if someone wants to be sad, let him be.



"After the blockage in my artery, treatment has been done. The prayers of the people of the entire state have yielded fruits. Nothing is going to happen to me now," he added.

Slamming the Bharatiya Janata Party and the Sachin Pilot camp, he said the

Opposition keeps saying that Chief Minister has locked himself in a room.

"We did shut ourselves in a hotel room for around 34 days due to 'courtesy' of Amit Shah, Dharmendra Pradhan and others. With the 'blessings' of our MLAs, that time also passed," he said.

Theatres to open in Kerala from Oct 25; more relaxations announced

The Kerala government on Saturday during a Covid analysis meeting chaired by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan decided to announce more relaxations including opening the cinema halls from October 25.

It was also decided during the meeting that from next Monday, all colleges will open for final year students while the regular classes for all students will start from October 18.

Those who will come to attend the classes should be vaccinated with both the doses. Theatres will, however, be allowed to function with 50 per cent seating capacity and all employees, and those coming to watch the movies



should be vaccinated with the two doses. With regards to marriages, it has been decided to increase the number of guests from 20 to 50, and grama sabhas also can be convened, but will have to

follow the Covid protocols. On Saturday, 13,217 people tested Covid positive after 96,835 samples were tested in the past 24 hours and the test positivity rate was 13.64 per cent, said a statement.

CIVILIANS ATTACKED BY SUSPECTED TERRORISTS IN SRINAGAR



Srinagar: Suspected terrorists fired upon a civilian at Batmalloo in Srinagar on Saturday evening, officials said.

This is the second incident of a civilian being targeted and shot by terrorists in Srinagar on Saturday. Earlier in the day, Majid Ahmad Gojri was shot dead by terrorists near Madina Complex Karan Nagar area of Srinagar.

Sources said Mohammad Shafi Dar, 45, a resident of SD Colony, Batmalloo was shot at a close range near his residence. He received gunshot injuries and was moved to the hospital.

100 Delhi-NCR schools to be included in pilot project on road safety

Around 100 schools from Delhi-NCR will be included in a pilot project aimed at developing evidence-based interventions for preventing road traffic injuries among the adolescent and youth.

Three cities have been included in the pilot project - Delhi, Jaipur and Bhopal -- an official told reporter.

The 'Programme for Risky Behaviour, Attitude in Trauma Prevention' (PRAT-AP) is a joint initiative of the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), World Health Organization (WHO) and AIIMS Delhi, which focuses on road traffic injuries among school chil-



dren.

PRATAP will identify the risk factors in various categories such as factors that influence risky behaviour, factors that contribute to road injuries' severity, risk factors that influence post-crash outcome of injuries etc.

The findings from the study will explore knowledge, attitude and practices among school children that contribute to road traffic injuries

and accordingly risk communication strategies will be developed to prevent road traffic injuries.

According to the World Bank, road safety is a critical development priority for South Asia, which impacts people's health, well-being and economic growth.

Of the 13.5 lakh road traffic deaths every year, over 30 per cent are under the age of 25.

UP govt recommends CBI probe into Manish Gupta murder case

The Uttar Pradesh government has recommended probe by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) into the alleged murder case of Kanpur businessman Manish Gupta who died in a police raid at his hotel in Gorakhpur on September 28.

As per Union Home Ministry, on the request of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, a recommendation has been sent to the CBI to take up the investigation of Manish Gupta's death.

The Chief Minister has also ordered the appointment of Manish Gupta's wife



Meenakshi Gupta as an officer on special duty (OSD) in the Kanpur Development Authority. Yogi Adityanath has also directed to give a financial compensation of Rs 40 lakh to the family of the deceased businessman.

Yogi Adityanath has directed to transfer the murder

case from Gorakhpur to Kanpur. Till the time the case is not transferred to Kanpur and the CBI does not take up the case, probe will be carried out by a Special Investigative Team (SIT) in Kanpur.

FLOOD SITUATION IN BENGAL SNOWBALLING INTO POLITICAL ROW

The flood situation in seven south Bengal districts is snowballing into a political controversy.

On Saturday, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee increased pressure on the Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC), asking it not to release water without informing the state else the state will be forced to demand compensation. The BJP, however, held Banerjee responsible for the flood situation in the state. Speaking to the media, the Chief Minister said, "In the last three days, they (DVC) have released more than 10 lakh cusec of water, most of which has been released without informing the state. This is a crime and the state is not going to sit and watch. If they do it again, the state will be forced to demand compensation."



Asking the Jharkhand government to work out a comprehensive plan,

Banerjee said, "We have evacuated more than five lakh people and have

made arrangements for their food and rehabilitation. We have faced so many cyclones, but we didn't receive a single penny from the Central government. This cannot continue.

"The Centre should start dredging the canals so that the additional rain in Jharkhand doesn't come down as a curse on Bengal. I shall write to the Prime Minister and will ask the Chief Secretary to take the matter up with the Agriculture Ministry."

Reacting to the Chief Minister's remarks, Leader of the Opposition Suwendu Adhikari said, "The embankments are not repaired properly and it is because the Chief Minister asked them not to do that. She needs Rs 18,000 crore for her 'Lakshmir Bhandar' project and so the money has been diverted, endangering the lives of the people.

All barriers for authorisation of Sputnik V vax removed: Russia

All barriers preventing the authorisation of the Russian Sputnik V vaccine against coronavirus by the World Health Organisation have been removed, Russia's health minister said in a tweet on Saturday.

"All barriers for SputnikV authorisation by WHO have been removed, only minor administrative procedures need to be sorted. It has been confirmed by @WHO Director-General @DrTedros," Russia's Health Minister Mikhail Murashko tweeted.

Developed by Russia's Gamaleya National Center, the Sputnik V jab is currently registered in 70 countries with a population of over 4 billion people. Sputnik V received an emergency use authorisation in India in April. The vaccine uses two different vectors for the two shots in a course of vaccination. Its efficacy was determined to be 91.6 per cent.

"The position of the Russian Federation on promoting and registering the Russian Sputnik V vaccine was heard. We have completely resolved all issues to date," Murashko said at a briefing in Geneva to TASS news agency.

The health minister said that he discussed the procedure of including Sputnik V in the list of vaccines recommended by the WHO for the emergency use listing against Covid infection with Director General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus.



"The applicant company involved in certifying the Sputnik V vaccine with the WHO has to sign a number of documents, submit some additional paperwork -- this is an administrative procedure after all -- and this will be reviewed," he explained.

"As of today, all the barriers have been removed. So we do not see today any obstacles for further work. And this was confirmed to us

by the WHO Director General," the minister added.

Ghebreyesus in a tweet thanked the Russian health minister for the visit, saying the meeting was "constructive" and shared that they discussed efforts to fight Tuberculosis and non-communicable diseases.

Russia first applied for approval from the WHO for their vaccine in February but has not yet received an emergency use listing.

Last week, the WHO had suspended the approval process for Russia's Sputnik V Covid vaccine. According to a regional WHO official, the manufacturing process of the jab had not met the necessary standards, the Euronews reported.

The WHO said it has delayed approving the jab until a new inspection can be carried out at one of the plants where Sputnik V was manufactured.

Earlier this year, the WHO had inspected four Russian production sites within the framework of the preliminary evaluation of Sputnik V, publishing remarks on one of them. Another inspection will be possible after the production site makes appropriate adjustments.

The WHO has, so far, recommended seven vaccines against coronavirus for the Emergency Use Listing. Additionally, 13 other applications are at the various stages of the review process, including the Russian Sputnik V and EpiVacCorona vaccines.

Rally on wheels 'India for Tigers' launched

"We are trustees, not owners," said the Union Environment Minister while launching 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav-Iconic week' of the ministry.

He said that an intensive countrywide campaign with active citizen participation will be converted into a 'Janandolan' at the local level which will add up to significant national gains and help




reinforce the trusteeship concept and living in harmony with nature during the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav - Iconic week' and after the week.

CENTRE NOTIFIES RULES TO SCRAP RETROSPECTIVE TAX CLAUSE

The Central government has notified rules for implementing the 'Taxation Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2021'.

Accordingly, the amendment bill notified on October 1, 2021, will enable the scrapping of the contentious retrospective tax demand provisions. It was passed by the Parliament in the Monsoon Session.

Significantly, the notification of the bill is expected to end the much stretched tax disputes with UK's Cairn Energy, and Vodafone Plc.

This Bill would give Cairn Energy and Vodafone Plc a window to do away with the arbitrations and settle their long-drawn tax disputes with the government. An arbitration tribunal in The Hague had pronounced its award on December 21, 2020 in favour of Cairn Energy Plc and Cairn UK Holdings Ltd (CUHL), making the Indian government liable to pay an arbitration award of \$1.2 billion to it.

Recently, the government confirmed in the Parliament that a French court has directed the freezing of certain properties of the Indian government in the matter pertaining to the Cairn arbitration award.

Further, in the Vodafone arbitration case, the Permanent Court of Arbitration at The Hague ruled in



favour of the company last year.

The court ruled that the conduct of India's Tax Department is in breach of 'fair and equitable' treatment, thereby

rendering Vodafone not liable to pay a retrospective tax demand of more than Rs 20,000 crore raised by Indian authorities.

The Amendment

The Bill has amended the Income Tax Act, 1961 so as to provide that no tax demand shall be raised in future on the basis of the said retrospective amendment for any indirect transfer of Indian assets if the transaction was undertaken before May 28, 2012 - when the finance bill was passed by the Parliament in 2012. "The 2021 Act also provides that the demand raised for offshore indirect transfer of Indian assets made before May 28, 2012 shall be nullified on fulfillment of specified conditions," the Ministry of Finance said in a statement on Saturday. "Such as withdrawal or furnishing of undertaking for withdrawal of pending litigation and furnishing of an undertaking to the effect that no claim for cost, damages, interest, etc, shall be filed and such other conditions are fulfilled as may be prescribed." Besides, the amount paid or collected in these cases shall be refunded, without any interest.

INDIA, CHINA TO HOLD MILITARY TALKS IN MID-OCT: ARMY CHIEF



New Delhi/Leh: India and China are to hold 13th round of military talks for disengagement at the Line of Actual Control in mid-October, said Indian Army Chief General Manoj Mukund Naravane in Leh on Saturday. The Army chief visited forward locations in Ladakh and reviewed operational and logistic preparedness of the force as winter sets in. Talking to media persons, General Naravane said that the huge deployment of Chinese People's Liberation Army deployment across Line of Actual control is a matter of concern. He however expressed the disengagement would happen through dialogue. General Naravane, who is on a two-day visit to Ladakh, along with several senior Army officials attended the unveiling of 'Khadi national flag' that has been installed in Leh on the occasion of the 152nd birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi.

said that while the suspense prevails, no final decision on change of guard has been taken by the party leadership, even as both the camps are pulling their strings to showcase their strength to the party high command.

The MLAs, most of them belonging to the Baghel camp, have come to Delhi to meet the party high command ahead of Rahul Gandhi's visit to the state.

Both the camps are saying that they will abide by the party high command's decision. The Congress recently changed its Chief Minister in Punjab, and the buzz is that it may go for a similar change in

Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh. However, unlike Amarinder Singh in Punjab, both Baghel and Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot have the support of majority of the MLAs.

When Baghel was called to Delhi, more than 50 MLAs reached the national capital in his support.

Though the dates of Rahul Gandhi's visit to Chhattisgarh have not been finalised yet, he may go there in the second week of October.

The supporters of Singhdeo have been pushing for a change of guard since Baghel has completed 2.5 years in the office.

Post or no post, will stand by Rahul, Priyanka: Sidhu

Children can't wait forever to get justice: Delhi child rights body chief

Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR) Chairman Anurag Kundu has welcomed the recent Delhi High Court's order on the squashing of petty crime cases against minors and said these children can't wait forever to get justice.

Recently, the Delhi HC junked 1,108 criminal cases against minors for non-completion of trial by the Juvenile Justice Board (Children's Court) related to petty offences committed by minors. After the court's decision, criminal cases against 1,108 children have ended.

Criminal cases against 795 children will be decided in the next hearing by the High Court. All these cases are pending between six months to one year.



The court has sought a response from the DCPCR and will pronounce an order soon on this matter.

According to the DCPCR, a total of 2,773 children are being tried for minor offences, 1,282 children for serious crimes and 1,683 children are facing trial in

heinous crime cases. According to the Delhi child rights body, as many as 1,320 cases were pending in the six juvenile courts of the national capital till December 31, 2020 which increased to 1,903 cases till June 30, 2021. This should not have taken place.

MP FIRST IN THE COUNTRY BY VACCINATING MORE THAN 88% CITIZENS

Mahatma Gandhi was sent to serve terms here by the British rulers in 1920, 1932 and 1933.

The other prominent personalities who were jailed here included Motilal Nehru, Jawaharlal Nehru and Sarojini Naidu, among others. In the post-Independence era, some of the well-known people who spent time here were Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Pramila Dandavate and Balasaheb Thackeray, among others.

Also, State Council of Educational Research Maharashtra will prepare



an action taken plan & help ground level officials overcome any practical hurdles to resumption of physical classes. She has further instructed the education officers of the state to personally visit schools and monitor the reopenings.

"For a smooth transition to physical classes, effective coordination with health department, local administration will have to be maintained. We are committed to providing a conducive atmosphere to students, many among whom will be returning to class after a year and a half," the last tweet reads.

Maharashtra schools will reopen on October 4 onwards for classes 5 to 12. In rural areas the physical classes for class 5 to 12 will resume while in urban areas physical classes from class 8 to 12 will resume. The schools will be reopened in phased manner.

Maharashtra cumulative vaccination tally crosses 8.27 crore

In the ongoing vaccination drive, Maharashtra on October 1 has vaccinated 8,47,755 people in 4,792 sessions.

According to data released by the government, as of 7 am on October 2 Maharashtra inoculated 8,27,43,317 people. As per the state government data, 3,01,85,943 individuals aged between 18 and 44 years received their first vaccine dose and 74,63,497 received their second dose since the inoculation drive for this age group began on May 1. So far, 12,93,514 health care workers have been administered the first dose of the vaccine, while 10,82,304 of them have got their second dose. Similarly, 21,44,168 frontline workers in the state have till now received their first vaccine dose and of them, 17,57,840 got their second dose. Meanwhile, Maharashtra reported 3,105 new



coronavirus infections and 50 fatalities on Friday, the state health department said. The caseload in the state rose to 65,53,961 and death toll reached 1,39,117. With 3,164 patients discharged from hospitals, the number of recovered cases rose to 63,74,892. Maharashtra now has

36,371 active cases. There are 2,42,110 people in home quarantine and 1,355 in institutional quarantine.

Maharashtra's COVID-19 recovery rate is 97.27 per cent, while the fatality rate is 2.12 per cent.

The cumulative number of tests conducted in the state rose to

5,89,10,564 with 1,70,590 swab samples examined since Thursday evening. Rural parts of Ahmednagar district reported the highest 586 new infections in the state.

Among the eight regions of Maharashtra, the Mumbai region reported 904 new COVID-19 cases, Nashik region 718, Pune region 1,100, Kolhapur 233, Aurangabad 30, Latur 103, Akola 13 and Nagpur 14

Mumbai and Nashik regions reported nine deaths each, Pune 19, Kolhapur eight, Latur three and Aurangabad and Nagpur regions one death each. Mumbai witnessed 425 new COVID-19 cases and six deaths, while Pune city reported 161 infections and two deaths, as per the state government's data. Results of recruitment to 5,000 posts in MSEDCL declared

The results of 4,534 candidates have been announced, while those of 466 EWS candidates have been withheld due to ongoing litigation on reservation

State Minister for Energy Nitin Raut has announced the much-awaited results of the mega recruitment drive to 5,000 posts of Vidut Sahayyak at the Maharashtra State Electricity Distribution Company Ltd (MSEDCL) on Saturday. The results of 4,534 candidates have been uploaded on the MSEDCL website, while those of 466 candidates belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) have been withheld due to the ongoing litigation on

reservation at the high court.

"I tried to declare the results earlier, but was unable to do so due to litigations," said Raut, who consulted legal experts before announcing the same.

The selected candidates will soon be called for document verification and posting. The 4,534 posts for which results have been announced include 1,984 in the open category, 375 in SC category, 236 in ST, 109 in Vimukta Jati, 109 in Nomadic Tribe (B) category, 80 in Nomadic Tribe (C), 44 in Nomadic Tribe (D), 81 for Special Backward Classes and 1,507 for Other Backward Classes.

The results of EWS candidates will be announced only when the court resolves the matter. The Energy Department had announced the recruitment drive on July 9, 2019. The Maharashtra government and the MSEDCL are making all out efforts to lift the moratorium imposed by the court on the recruitment of EWS and other categories. Senior lawyers have been appointed to repre-

sent MSEDCL in this case, the minister reassured.

Explaining the delay Raut said, "The recruitment process for the post of Vidut Sahayyak could not get completed in due time because of the Covid pandemic and court cases after the Mahavikas Aghadi government came to power." While the process was underway, the Supreme Court stayed SEBC (Socially and Educationally Backward Classes) reservations on September 9 last year. In December, SEBC candidates were given an option to choose between EWS or open category. This was challenged by EWS candidates in the Mumbai High Court. On March 15 this year, the high court ordered that the process should not be finalised. Subsequently on May 5, the Supreme Court cancelled the SEBC reservation and on May 31 the state government issued a resolution for SEBC candidates to mandatorily choose between EWS or open category.

FAMED WHITE ONION GETS GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATION TAG

Alibag: The famed white onion of Alibag in Maharashtra's Raigad district has earned itself a 'Geographical Indication', giving the crop a unique identity and wider markets, agriculture department officials said on Saturday.

They pointed out that Alibag's white onion, which has medicinal qualities and is used for the treatment of heart ailments, controlling cholesterol and creation of insulin, has been mentioned in the official gazette as long back as 1883.

"The agriculture department here and Konkarn Agriculture University had jointly submitted the GI application on January 15, 2019. On September 29 this year, the proposal was scrutinised in the Mumbai office of the Registrar of Patents and it was decided to confer GI tag on Alibag's white onion," an official said. He said the average income per acre from the crop is around Rs 2 lakh.

Nagpur Police nab 3 women for trying to 'sell' 12-yr-old's virginity

In a shocking incident, the Nagpur Police have arrested at least three women pimps who allegedly tried to 'sell the virginity' of a 12-year-old girl to a customer for Rs 40,000, police said here on Saturday.

"We have arrested three accused so far and further investigations in the case are underway," Nagpur Police Commissioner Amitesh Kumar told IANS.

The Nagpur Crime Branch's Social Service Branch managed to rescue the minor girl safely before she became a victim to the pimps' evil designs to push her into the flesh trade, police said. The sinister incident happened when one of the accused lured the girl

to her home in Omnagar, Koradi locality on the pretext of a birthday party, and the two other accomplices contacted a customer with the Rs 40,000 deal.

Following a timely tip-off by a local NGO, the SSB sleuths sent in a decoy customer who confirmed the goings-on and alerted the police.

A crack police team comprising women officials raided the premises to save the girl and nab the three main culprits present there.

The accused have been identified as Archana Vaishampayan, 38, Ranjana Meshram, 45 and Kavita Nikhare, 30 and they have been remanded to police custody.

According to police, the prime accused,

Vaishampayan is said to have lured the little girl on the promise of giving her Rs 5000 to help for her mother's cancer treatment.

The accused also convinced the girl's mother to send her to work as a caretaker for Vaishampayan's two-year old son, without revealing her actual motives.

After the girl reached the party spot, Nikhare was tasked with finding a customer, and made the promise of the girl's virginity in return for Rs 40,000. Following the rescue, the minor girl has been shifted to a government shelter home and police are trying to trace the other accomplices of the accused trio to know since how long they are in the racket, etc.

Cop sexually assaults woman on promise of marriage; booked

The accused developed a physical relationship with the woman who was employed as a beautician after he allegedly promised to marry her.

In yet another shocking incident of crime reported from Maharashtra's Pune, a police Sub-Inspector has been booked on charges of allegedly raping a 25-year-old woman. The man committed this heinous offence by promising to marry the victim, who was employed as a beautician.

It was on Thursday night when the woman registered a complaint against him at Maharashtra's Kothrud police station. An FIR was lodged after the woman approached the cops and the SI, who was attached to the traffic control branch (Yerwada) of Pune city police was also booked. A thorough probe revealed that the duo met in the year 2018 and the couple later developed a physical relationship after he promised to marry her. However, the accused later denied marrying her and even warned her of dire consequences if she forced him to marry her.

In another incident reported from Maharashtra, a 27-year-

old man who allegedly sexually harassed and stalked his ex-wife on social media was arrested.

The victim, who worked as a costume designer approached the cops and lodged a complaint against her ex-husband. The woman, while narrating the entire episode stated that they got divorced in 2020 as the man assaulted her and often fought over petty issues.

He later started posting obscene comments about her on her social media profile to seek revenge. However, when this activity didn't stop, the woman lodged an FIR and he was booked under various sections of the IPC and IT Act.

First ever electric cars rally held in Mumbai to combat pollution

In a first initiative of its kind, an all-electric cars rally was held in Mumbai on Saturday as part of the 'Green Mumbai Drive-2021', to reduce pollution in the country's commercial capital, officials said.

procuring only EVs for all future requirements wherever feasible, he added. Autocar Editor & Publisher Hormazd Sorabjee said carbon dioxide is the root cause of global warming and the only way to reduce it is by getting rid of hydrocarbons on which internal combustion engines run. "EV are becoming popular globally because there are targets to reduce carbon dioxide and the best way is through alternative sources of energy. The goal of Green Mumbai Drive 2021 is to raise awareness about the role EVs can play in reducing CO2 emissions and combating climate change," said Sorabjee.

The unique EV rally started with the vehicles zooming off from Mahalakshmi Racecourse and ended in Vikhroli via the Sanjay Gandhi National Park, Mumbai's main green lung, turning heads en route. It saw participation of around 30 EVs, manufactured by Indian and foreign companies including Tata, Tesla, Volvo, Audi, Jaguar, Mercedes, MG, Hyundai and others.

The Aurangabad circle--which consists of Aurangabad, Aurangabad MC, Jalna, Hingoli, Parbhani, Parbhani MC--reported 34 fresh cases.

The Latur circle--which consists of Latur, Latur MC, Osmanabad, Beed, Nanded, Nanded MC--recorded 97 fresh cases. The Akola circle--which includes Akola, Akola MC, Amaravati, Amaravati MC, Yawatmal, Buldhana, Washim--recorded 5 fresh cases.

Nagpur circle--which includes Nagpur, Nagpur MC, Wardha, Bhandara, Gondia, Chandrapur, Chandrapur MC, Gadchiroli--reported 12 fresh cases.

Water-Starved Marathwada Region Records Excess Rainfall

At least 91 people died and over 25 lakh hectares of farmland were destroyed due to excess rainfall in Marathwada in the last four months, said officials.

Team Absolute | Aurangabad

Marathwada, which is considered a drought-prone region in Maharashtra, has received 1,041.5 mm rainfall during the monsoon season this year as against its average of 679.5 mm, while parts of it continue to get pounded by heavy rains, an official said on Saturday.

The region has received 153.27 per cent rainfall so far, he said.

Officials earlier said that at least 91 people have died, while over 25 lakh hectares of farmland were destroyed due to excess rainfall in Marathwada in the last four months. Marathwada comprises eight districts - Aurangabad, Latur, Osmanabad, Parbhani, Nanded, Beed, Jalna and Hingoli.

"Isolated parts of four districts in Marathwada received heavy rainfall



between Friday and Saturday. The highest rainfall of 107.25 mm was recorded at Vihmandwa circle of Paithan tehsil in Aurangabad district in 24 hours ending 12 pm on Saturday," a revenue department official said. The official said that above-65 mm rainfall was recorded in 12 circles in Aurangabad, Beed, Jalna and Parbhani districts starting Friday. Apart from Vihmandwa, heavy rains lashed Aurangabad, Balanagar (Aurangabad district), Ramnagar, Jamkhed, Talani (Jalna district), Beed circle and Sirsala (Beed district). In Parbhani, Takli-Kumbhakarna, Kupta and Sonpeth received showers.

Water-logging and flooding occurred in Naregaon area of Aurangabad due to heavy rains, he added. The water level of Jayakwadi dam, the biggest in the region, reached 99.06 per cent on Saturday morning. Eighteen gates of the dam were lifted to a height of 1.5 feet and the water discharge has been increased by 9,432 cubic with a total discharge of 28,296 into Godavari river, an irrigation official said. Aurangabad guardian minister Subhash Desai on Friday took stock of the rain situation in the district via video-conferencing.

Talking about the review meeting, collector Sunil Chavan later said in a video message, "63,000 farmers in the district have faced losses due to heavy rains in the last week of September. Fourteen deaths were reported (in the district) since June 1 in rain-related incidents. Aid of ? 4 lakh each has been provided to the family members of seven victims so far."

IFS Officer Turns Plastic Waste Into Employment Opportunity

During plantation, saplings are being taken out of plastic bags and then they are planted in the soil. The plastic waste ends up in landfills.

Planting saplings is considered one of the easiest ways to save the environment. The environmentalists also appeal to people not to use plastic bags to keep the environment clean. However, it is observed that huge plastic bags are used by workers in nurseries to grow saplings, which further pollutes nature. Anupam Sharma, Indian Forest Service (IFS) officer in Madhya Pradesh cadre, posted in the Maihar region saw



low-density polyethylene (LDPE) plastic bags thrown around during a plantation drive in the region. This incident prompted him to take any action that reduces environmental pollution and generates employment for three villages. Maihar forest sub-division in Madhya Pradesh, in June and July 2021, planted 4.7 lakh tree saplings under its annual plantation drive. Sharma visited the area for inspection and saw LDPE plastic bags that wrapped saplings. He estimated that about 5,000 kilos of plastic waste had accumulated during the

plantation activity. Anupam, who is posted as trainee sub-divisional officer said that plastic waste if left unchecked pollutes the environment and damages it for years, reported Better India. During plantation, saplings are being taken out of plastic bags and then they are planted in the soil. The plastic waste ends up in landfills.

According to The Better India report, Anupam failed to get support from the local civic bodies to buy or treat the waste but he did not give up on his plastic waste mitigation plan. With his help, the forest department earned Rs 59,000 by selling the plastic waste to a scrap dealer at Rs 12 per kg. The scrap dealer sent the plastic to recycling plants in Indore and Jabalpur. Anupam sought help from his wife Bhavna, a solid waste management expert to know how the money could be utilised for a social cause.

EOW registers case after 9-yr probe

Economic Offences Wing has registered a case pertaining to a mining scam after nine years of investigation. Now, almost a week has passed but mining department has not taken action against the officers.

On September 27, 2021, the EOW in Jabalpur registered a case against former officials including five of mining department and four from Western Coalfields Ltd (WCL) in Chhindwara district under whose jurisdiction coal mines operated without permission. An FIR has been registered against 10 officials in the case. From 2004 to 2011, 42,864 metric ton coal was produced in WCL Bhajipani and was transported without permission. A no objection certificate was also not taken from MP

Pollution Control Bhopal regional office in Jabalpur.

Following the irregularities, the EOW registered case against the then mining officers Anil Kumar, Prakash Pandre, Shashank Shukla, SN Patil and Arvind Tiwari. The officials ignored violations of mining department and MP Pollution Control Board (MPPCB) by the contractor of mines. As per directives of state government and MPPCB Jabalpur office, mines cannot be operated without their permission. To take permission from board, fees of Rs 1 lakh was to be charged and the annual renewal fee was Rs 80,000. In Chhindwara district, the MPPCB and mining department ignored the directives and operated the mines. Not only this, they did not make efforts to stop mining that was carried out without permission.

CM will lay the foundation stone of water supply schemes in Singrauli

About 11 lakh population will be benefited from these water supply schemes for about 700 villages of Singrauli and Sidhi districts. 183 villages of Baidhan and 100 villages of Chitrangi have been included in Baidhan-ek-water supply scheme built from water source of Rihand dam, 184 villages in Baidhan-two water supply scheme from water source of Son river and 206 villages have been included in the Gond Devar water supply scheme from water source of Gond dam.

The 24-year old Gaikwad, slammed his maiden IPL ton on Saturday in the match against Rajasthan Royals in Abu Dhabi in a most thrilling way, hitting the final ball of the innings for a maximum. He raced to his hundred in just 60 balls, smashing five huge sixes and nine boundaries. The batsman came into the limelight after his late-season heroics for CSK in IPL 2020. CSK were losing games, but Gaikwad was among the runs and hit three consecutive half-centuries back then. Continuing his superb batting form from IPL 2020, Gaikwad also played some entertaining knocks in the first leg of IPL 2021 in India. However, he is batting at a completely different level in UAE. His scores in the UAE leg of IPL 2021 read: 101*(60), 45(38), 40(28), 38(26), 88*(58), 62*(49), 72(53), 65*(51).

Jaiswal and Dube take Rajasthan to a cruising win over Chennai

Mumbai boys Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shivam Dube hit half-centuries in Rajasthan Royals' cruising seven-wicket win over Chennai Super Kings in match 47 of IPL 2021 at Sheikh Zayed Cricket Stadium here on Saturday. Chasing 190, Rajasthan completed a magnificent chase with 15 balls to spare. The win means that Rajasthan now have ten points from 12 matches and leapfrog Mumbai Indians to move to sixth place in the points table.

Rajasthan got off to a flying start, making 81 runs in the power-play. Yashasvi Jaiswal came out swinging, smashing boundaries against every bowler. Josh Hazlewood came under severe punishment from the youngster, taken for seven boundaries, including the last one, a flat six over long-off, taking him to a whirlwind half-century in just 19 balls.

Evin Lewis supported Jaiswal well before pulling to fine-leg off Thakur. But against the run of play, Jaiswal fell on the first ball after powerplay. Against a short ball from KM Asif, Jaiswal tried to paddle late but was caught behind. Despite losing both openers in quick succession, Rajasthan 'didn't lose the run-making assault.

Shivam Dube and Sanju Samson put up a match-



defining partnership of 89 runs in 58 balls. Dube, promoted to number four, was more aggressive of the duo, welcoming Ravindra Jadeja with a six over long-on in ninth over. He extended the thrashing by hitting Moeen Ali for back-to-back sixes in the next over.

Dube brought the half-century of the partnership with a four clubbed over mid-wicket off Sam Curran followed by a six over the same region in the 12th over. The all-rounder then reached his half-century in 31 balls with a single off Thakur. Though Samson fell while

pulling off Thakur in the 16th over, Rajasthan were well on course to chase the target. Debutant Glenn Phillips walloped Curran for a four and six followed by finishing off Moeen Ali.

Women's skeet team wins gold at Junior Shooting World Championship

India's Junior women's skeet team, comprising Ganemat Sekhon, Raiza Dhillon and Areeba Khan, struck gold on Day Three of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) Junior World Championship in Lima, Peru, according to information received here on Saturday.

They blanked out Italy 6-0 in the gold medal match. After winning silver on Thursday -- India's first skeet medal at the world championship level -- in the individual women's skeet, this was Ganemat's second medal of the competition.

Later the Indian junior men's skeet team of Rajveer Gill, Ayush Rudraraju and Abhay Singh Sekhon, also bagged a bronze beating Turkey 6-0 to make it seven medals so far. This includes two gold, three silver and two bronze medals, putting them behind leaders USA in the medal standings.

The women had qualified for the gold medal match by virtue of finishing second to Italy in qualification, shooting a combined 457 out of 525. Each of the three shooters had to



shoot seven rounds of 25-shots each and Ganemat led the effort with a 155 out of 175. Raiza shot 152, while Areeba shot 150. Italy topped the five team field with a total of 460.

In the final, however, it was Raiza and Areeba who led India's charge shooting a perfect 10 out of 10 targets in the first two rounds to give India a commanding 4-0 lead.

Australia finish day three at 143/4, trail India by 234 runs

Pink-ball Test

Jhulan Goswami (2/27) and Pooja Vastrakar (2/31) sparked on day three of the pink-ball Test at Metricon Stadium as Australia finished at 143/4 in 60 overs, trailing India by 234 runs and requiring 85 to avoid the follow-on.

Ellyse Perry (batting on 27) and Ashleigh Gardner (batting on 13) ensured that Australia didn't suffer more damage by batting out the 10.2 overs left in the first full day of play in the Test match.

After India declared their innings at 377/8, Jhulan gave the tourists a great start by hitting the top of Beth Mooney's off-stump as the batter tried to swing through the leg-side. Alyssa Healy and Meg Lanning stitched a 49-run partnership for the second wicket before Jhulan had Alyssa nicking behind to keeper Taniya Bhatia in her second spell.

In the final session, Pooja had Meg



dismissed with an lbw with a nip-backer. Replays suggested that there was an inside edge, but with no DRS in the Test, a displeased Meg had to march back to the pavilion. 17 overs later, Pooja had her second wicket of the day with Tahlia McGrath cutting straight to point. Earlier, Deepti Sharma raised her half-century to carry forward the pace of scoring runs for India. She and Taniya Bhatia had an association of

45 runs stand in 170 balls to take India beyond 300. Taniya was the first wicket to fall in the day, becoming teenage pacer Stella Campbell's first Test wicket after an outside edge carried to keeper Alyssa. Pooja joined Deepti to take India past 350. During the 40-run association, Deepti registered yet another half-century, her second in three innings. Ellyse clinched her 300th wicket in international cricket as Pooja

edged to a diving Beth at gully on the stroke of dinner break. Taking Pooja's wicket in the 143rd over of India's innings made Perry the first woman to do the double of 300 wickets and 5,000 runs in international cricket. In the over immediately after dinner break, Deepti hit Stella for back-to-back fours before Stella struck to take her second wicket of the match by trapping the left-hander lbw for 66. The visitors batted for eight more balls before declaring their innings at 377/8 in 145 overs. With just one day left in the Test, the possibility of draw looms high.

Former England cricketer Kevin Pietersen feels one of the main reasons for West Indies icon Chris Gayle leaving the Punjab Kings bio-bubble in the UAE and heading back to "recharge" his batteries for the ICC T20 World Cup was because he was "not being treated right in his environment".

A statement by the Indian Premier League (IPL) franchise on September 30 had said that, "Seasoned Caribbean batsman Chris Gayle has left the Punjab Kings team hotel and bio-bubble, owing to bubble fatigue accumulated over the months playing franchise and international cricket. The 42-year-old won't be available now for selection for the remainder of



Punjab Kings' games."

However, Pietersen told Star Sports on Friday that, "He (Gayle) is not being treated right in his environment. He feels like they are using him and getting rid of him, using him and getting rid of him. Didn't play him on

his birthday, cast him aside. If he is not happy, he is 42, let him do what he wants."

This season, Gayle has played 10 matches for PBKS, scoring 193 runs at an unflattering average of 21.44, with his highest being 46.

Former India skipper Sunil Gavaskar also said that the Punjab Kings, who are currently fifth on the table with 10 points from 12 games, will miss Gayle in the remainder of the matches.

"A game-changer like Chris Gayle, if he is not in the team, 100 per cent it's a big loss. I think he is in and out of the team. I don't know what the calculations are. Clearly only four overseas players can play but sometimes when you see the player who has picked in his place, knowing what he has delivered in the past. And sure, he is over 40 and he might not be able to do it at a consistent level that he used to do. But he is a game-changer. Three overs of Gayle storm and the game is gone from the opposition," added Gavaskar.

The couple were first seen together in Gautham Menon's iconic 2010 Telugu movie, 'Ye Maaya Chesave'.




Hrithik has been an inspiration to me: Tiger
