SUPREME COURT SAYS CAN'T FORCE ANYONE FOR DNA TEST

'IMPINGES ON LIBERTY, PRIVACY'

A bench of Justices R. Subhash Reddy and Hrishikesh Roy said: "When the plaintiff is unwilling to subject himself to the DNA test, forcing him to undergo one would impinge on his personal liberty and his right to privacy." It added that the court's decision, on the aspect of DNA test, should be rendered only after balancing the interests of the parties -- the quest for truth, and the social and cultural implications involved.

The Supreme Court on Friday said forcing a person to undergo a DNA test, would impinge on his personal liberty and his right to privacy, as it emphasised that Indian law leans towards legitimacy and frowns upon bastardy.

The bench noted that in circumstances where other evidence is available to prove or dispute the relationship, the court should ordinarily refrain from ordering blood tests. It further added that the presumption in law of legitimacy of a child cannot be lightly repelled. Against the backdrop of these observations, the top court set aside a high court judgment, directing a plaintiff in a suit to undergo DNA test.

The plaintiff had filed a suit seeking declaration of ownership of property, which was left behind by Trilok Chand Gupta and Sons. He claimed to be the couple's son and arrayed their daughters as the defendants in the suit, who disputed his claim and denied his being son of their parents.



SC SLAMS FARMERS' GROUP

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Friday pulled the farmers' organisation, Kisan Mahapanchayat, for seeking permission to stage a Satyagraha at Jantar Mantar against the farm laws. The top court said after blocking highways and strangulating the city, the demonstrators now want to come inside to protest. The plea sought directions to allow the staging of the Satyagraha as it was permitted to the Sanyukt Kisan Morcha farmers. The bench told the council that the demonstrators have right to protest, but cannot destroy property, adding that this business should stop. The bench ordered to serve the copy of the petition to the office of AG and listed the matter for further hearing on October 4.

WAS THINKING OF PANEL FOR COMPLAINTS AGAINST OFFICIALS, ESPECIALLY POLICE: CJI

New Delhi: Chief Justice of India N.V. Ramana on Friday orally observed that he had thought of creating a panel to examine atrocities and complaints against bureaucrats, particularly police officers, headed by the Chief Justice of the high court concerned. "I have lot of reservations at the way, how bureaucracy particularly, how police officers are behaving in this country. I was at one time thinking of creating a standing committee to examine atrocities and complaints against bureaucrats, particularly police officers, headed by the Chief Justice of the high court. I want to reserve that. Don't want to do now," he said. A bench also comprising Justices Surya Kant and Hima Kohli was hearing a plea filed by suspended Additional Director General of Police of Chhattisgarh Gurjinder Pal Singh seeking protection from arrest in criminal cases - sedition, extortion, and owning disproportionate assets - against him.



India slaps reciprocal restrictions on visiting UK nationals

According to sources, the new regulations will come into effect from October 4 - the same day as the UK's new rules, and will be applicable to all UK nationals arriving from the UK.

India on Friday decided to impose reciprocal Covid-19 restrictions on UK nationals arriving in the country.

Citing the restrictions, a source said that from October 4 onwards, all UK nationals arriving in India from the UK, irrespective of their vaccination status, will have to undertake mandatory measures, such as carrying the report of pre-departure Covid-19 RT-PCR test taken within 72 hours before travel, and undergo Covid-19 RT-PCR test on arrival at any airport in India.

They are also expected to go for mandatory quarantine at home or at the destination address for 10 days after arrival in India, and on the 8th day after their arrival, will have to take a second RT-PCR test.

The row between the two countries started when the UK government placed Indians, who have been

vaccinated with Covishield - the Indian-made AstraZeneca Covid vaccine - in the category of "unvaccinated" and prescribed testing and quarantine measures but after India hinted that this might be reciprocated, the UK accepted Covishield but did not change the testing and quarantine rules.

AMARINDER SINGH TO FORM 'PUNJAB VIKAS PARTY'

Former Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh is soon going to announce a new party. According to sources, the name of Captain's new party will be 'Punjab Vikas Party'. Patna: Rumours in Bihar always spread like wildfire whether it comes to shortage of salt or cutting off boys' ponytail incidents. The latest rumour is related to the Jeeutiya festival wherein if children (male) would not eat Parle-G biscuits on Jeeutiya, they could face untoward incidents in future. The Jeeutiya festival is celebrated in Bihar every year where mothers fast for 24 hours for a long, healthy and prosperous life of their kids. Har Kishore Rai, the SP of Sitamarhi, confirmed the rumours. Following the rumours, people turned out in large numbers outside the grocery shops, paan shops and any other shops having stocks to purchase at least one packet of Parle-G biscuits. As a result, the stocks of Parle-G flew off the shelves quickly. Many of the shopowners were allegedly involved in black marketing. A Rs 5 packet of Parle-G biscuits was sold for Rs 50 in Sitamarhi district.

Zydus ZyCoV-D vax soon to be part of India's inoculation drive: Centre

Zydus Cadila's ZyCoV-D vaccine against Covid-19 will soon be a part of under India's mass inoculation drive, Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan announced, adding that talks were underway with the manufacturer on pricing issues.

Addressing a press briefing on the Covid situation across country, Bhushan on Thursday said the price of the job, which is needle-less and requires three doses, would be different from the existing vaccines. "As far as the price of the vaccine at which it will be procured is

concerned, we are in conversations with the manufacturer. Since it is a three-dose vaccine and comes with a needle-less delivery system, it would have a differential pricing than the existing vaccines that are being used in the vaccination drive."

Without giving any timeline for the roll-out, he said that the Zydus Cadila vaccine will not be brought in the market in the short run, but will be part of India's Covid-19 vaccination programme.

The ZyCoV-D vaccine was approved by India's regulatory authority on August 20. The three dose DNA built vaccine has 66.6 per cent efficacy against Covid, according to the the manufacturer.

Covid: Merck's oral pill shows promise against hospitalisation, death

Merck on Friday announced its anti-viral drug has shown "compelling results" in clinical trials -- halving the risk of hospitalisation or death for patients with mild or moderate cases of Covid.

Molnupiravir, co-developed with Ridgeback Biotherapeutics, is administered orally and works by inhibiting the replication of the coronavirus inside the body. The companies plan to seek emergency authorisation for the drug in the US as soon as possible, the company said in a statement.

An interim analysis of a Phase-3 study, based on 775 trial participants, found that 7.3 per cent of patients treated with molnupiravir were hospitalised within 29 days. Of the patients who received a placebo, 14.1 per cent were hospitalised or died by day 29. No deaths were reported in patients



who were given molnupiravir within the 29-day period, while eight deaths were reported in placebo-treated patients.

The drug's efficacy was not affected by timing of symptom onset or underlying risk factor. In addition, based on the participants with available viral sequencing data (approximately 40 per cent of participants), molnupiravir demonstrated consistent efficacy across viral variants Gamma, Delta, and Mu.

AIR INDIA'S NEW OWNER TO BE DECIDED IN NEXT FEW DAYS

The new owners of Air India will be decided in the next few days as the financial bids for the flag carrier are being scrutinised, sources said on Friday. Besides, conglomerate Tata Sons, which is one of the bidders, is touted to be the frontrunner to get hold of the carrier.

Furthermore, sources said that at present senior government officials are conducting separate meetings with the two bidders regarding other aspects of the sale such as the indemnity clause and carry over debt levels of the airline.

More or less, the final decision can be made within the next few days by the AISAM (Air India Specific Alternative Mechanism). The AISAM headed by Home Minister Amit Shah is an empow-

ered GoM, which has the authority to take the final call on the matter, without the need of a Cabinet approval. The AISAM is scheduled to meet after all its members are back in the country. After the announcement of the winning bid is made, the process of a complete handover is expected to take place within three-four

months time. The Centre on September 15 had received multiple financial bids for divestment of Air India. The government has of late taken several steps to fast-track the much-delayed privatisation of the national carrier. Recently, the Centre decided to waive taxes on the transfer of assets from the national carrier to Air India Assets Holding Ltd, a special purpose vehicle (SPV). During the Budget speech for FY22, Finance Minister Nirmala

This is the second attempt of the current Central government to divest its stake in the airline. In the pre-pandemic era, the airline, on a standalone basis, operated over 50 domestic and more than 40 international destinations. Besides, it operated over 120 aircraft prior to the Covid pandemic. During that period, the airline had over 9,000 permanent and 4,000 contractual employees.

Sitharaman had said that all the proposed privatisation process would be completed by the end of the fiscal, including the much-delayed strategic divestment of Air India.

The Prime Minister also highlighted the ease for mothers and

Massive traffic snarls on Delhi-Jaipur Expressway

Commuters on the Delhi-Jaipur Expressway were stuck in heavy traffic for hours on Friday evening.

During the busy evening hours, the traffic was completely choked on most major crossings on the National Highway.

Thousands of commuters on the stretch, travelling between the Delhi-

Gurugram border to enter Delhi took hours to cross the border. Commuters hit the snarl as soon as they entered the Sarhau border and moved bumper to bumper till Rajokri flyover in Delhi.

The reason behind the massive jam was the evening rush hours which slowed down vehicle movement.

Gurugram police personnel were present on the spot trying to smoothen traffic

movement. Traffic jams started from the Delhi-Gurugram border from 6.15 p.m. and kept on growing from Shankar Chowk in Gurugram till Rajokri flyover in Delhi as office goers started returning to Delhi from Gurugram.

The Gurugram police has deployed inspector-rank officers in the Delhi-Gurugram border area on the Expressway for smooth traffic movement.

Racket busted: 4 held for illegally terminating Pak calls in India

In a major bust, the Cyber Cell of Delhi Police has arrested four persons on charges of illegally terminating foreign calls, including from Pakistan, in India, bypassing the legal international and national gateways of Indian telecom service providers.

The accused persons, identified as Irfan Ali, Zulfikar Ali, Arib Ali and Mohd Irfan, all residents of Delhi, were arrested for setting up illegal international GSM termination exchanges in the Chawri Bazar area.

Calls from the US, the UAE, Canada, Nepal, Australia, Pakistan and many other foreign countries were being

terminated illegally to Indian mobile numbers.

"The arrested persons were masterminds of the syndicate and mostly calls were generated from the Gulf countries," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Central), Shweta Chauhan, said. The illegal international GSM termination exchanges were set up using SIP trunk, internet, and server-based technologies. The setups were illegally terminating foreign calls in India, bypassing the legal international and national gateways of Indian telecom service providers.

The Caller Line Identification (CLI) is used to display Indian numbers for internationally landed calls. In this manner, a huge num-

ber of calls, around 1,47,000 calls per day and call duration around 14,400 hours per day via CLI number +91-1135035487, and 1,43,000 calls per day and call duration of around 13,000 hours per day via CLI number +91-1135041003, went unregulated, causing massive loss of revenues and compromising the national security of India.

Notably, international calls can only be terminated in India through DoT licensed operators. The accused persons were bypassing the legal international gateways, thus incurring a 'massive financial loss of Rs 103 crore to the government exchequer, ILD licensees, NLD licensees, and access service licensees.

BENGAL BJP MLA KRISHNA KALYANI STEPS DOWN FROM PARTY

Kolkata: A day after Bengal BJP show-caused the party's MLA from Raiganj, Krishna Kalyani, for speaking against the party's Raiganj MP and former Union minister Debasree Choudhuri, Kalyani resigned from the party on Friday.

However, Kalyani did not resign from the legislative Assembly, nor did he say anything about joining any other party. Terming Raiganj MP Debasree Chowdhury as a traitor, the BJP MLA said, "I have come here to give service to the people. I cannot work with people who are more interested in other things and so I resigned. More specifically, I resigned because of Debasree Chowdhury. She has backstabbed me. I cannot work with people like her."

However, Trinamool Congress MP Sougata Roy said, "There are more in the queue. The film is yet not over. No right-thinking people can stay with them (BJP)."

Kalyani is the fifth MLA after Mukul Roy to leave the party after the Assembly election results were declared earlier this year. Kalyani, however, didn't divulge the details of his future plan of action, but sources said that he is likely to join the Trinamool.

SC seeks Centre's reply plea against Maternity Benefit Act proviso

The Supreme Court on Friday sought response from the Centre on a plea challenging the constitutional validity of a provision of the Maternity Benefit Act, 1961.

Section 5(4) of the Maternity Benefit (Amendment) Act, 2017 entitles maternity period benefits for a period of 12 weeks to only those mothers who are adopting a child below the age of three months. The plea contended that the provision was contrary not only to the scheme and object of the Maternity Benefit Act, but also in conflict with the letter and spirit of the Juvenile



Justice Care and Protection of Children Act, 2015.

After hearing arguments, a bench of Justices S.A. Nazeer and Krishna Murari issued notices to the Ministry of Law and Justice, and the Ministry of Women & Child Development.

The plea claimed that Section 5(4) apart from being discriminatory and arbitrary towards the adoptive mothers, also arbitrarily discriminates against orphaned, abandoned or surrendered children above the age of three months.

TERRORIST KILLED IN KASHMIR ENCOUNTER REFUSED TO SURRENDER

Srinagar: The terrorist killed in a gunfight with the security forces at Rakhama in South Kashmir's Shopian district on Friday refused to surrender and instead opened fire which triggered the encounter, officials said.

The Army said on receiving specific intelligence from the police about the presence of a terrorist in the vicinity of village Rakhama, a joint operation was launched by the Army and police at 11.30 p.m. on September 30. As per police, the terrorist has been identified as Mujeeb Amin Lone, a resident of Redwani in Kulgam district. He had joined the terrorist ranks in early September 2021.

UP: Woman held for luring girl for husband to rape

In a shocking incident, a woman has been arrested for luring a 19-year-old girl to her house, tying her up and allowing her husband to rape the girl.

The girl was also beaten up and her tongue was chopped off so that she may not be able to reveal the incident.

According to police reports, the accused woman, 40, first lured the girl to her house in Indira Nagar under Ghazipur police circle, where she tied her up after which her 45-year-old husband raped her several times in seven days. Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (ADCP), North, Prachi Singh, said, "The couple chopped the survivor's tongue to ensure she is unable to speak and tell anyone about her sufferings. Somehow, the girl fled from the clutches of the husband-wife duo and reached home. When her wounds started healing, she told her family about her ordeal through signs and a case was lodged."

"A 19-year-old girl of another locality had lost her way and met the accused Arti who



took her to her home instead on September 21. Station House Officer (SHO) Ghazipur Anil Singh said that the girl was raped and also thrashed badly, tortured and subjected to unnatural sexual intercourse. Her tongue was also chopped off. "When she got better, she wrote about her ordeal on a paper and told her parents about the sufferings and savagery she had faced through signs and actions," the station house officer added. The girl's father informed the police and filed a complaint. Police lodged an FIR and arrested the accused woman Arti on Thursday, while her husband Jeetu Soni is absconding.

Another man beaten to death in Gorakhpur

Nearly 72 hours after the murder of a Kanpur businessman in Gorakhpur, a 25-year-old man working at a model liquor shop was beaten to death by drunk customers.

The incident was captured on CCTV installed in the shop.

According to reports, the incident took place late on Thursday night, about half a kilometre from the Ramgarh Tal police station.

Manish Prajapati, the victim, was a native of Madhya Pradesh and was working in this model shop since the past few months.

On Thursday, a few men came into the shop and ordered drinks. The customers apparently got angry over the delay in getting the order and this led to a verbal spat with Manish.

The argument soon turned into an ugly fight and the customers allegedly attacked Manish and another staff member, Raghu.

The customers called in a few more of



their friends who also joined the assault, which continued for nearly 20 minutes.

By the time the police came, the attackers had fled.

Both injured persons were taken to hospital where Manish was declared brought dead. Raghu is still admitted in the hospital where his condition is critical. Police have registered a case and are

currently trying to identify the accused persons.

The Gorakhpur police tweeted that one of the accused has been arrested and a search is on for the remaining accused whose identity is being established through the CCTV footage.

Not the first time that Congress is on the verge of a split

The Congress has now become a divided house after the fresh attack launched by Kapil Sibal and the Congress workers protesting at Sibal's residence which many leaders termed as hooliganism.

This is not the first time there is a rift in the party. During Indira Gandhi's time the Congress was split into two on November 12, 1969 over differences with K Kamaraj. Indira Gandhi was expelled from the Congress party for violating party discipline. She then formed the Congress (R) and a majority of the AICC members walked over to her side.

A similar situation arose in March 1998 when in a CWC meeting Sitaram Kesri was removed and Sonia Gandhi was appointed president. Sharad Pawar, Tariq Anwar and PA Sangma walked out from the party and formed the NCP.

Apart from this there was the revolt by VP Singh against Rajiv Gandhi and he became Prime Minister with the help of the BJP in 1989, then when Narasimha Rao became party president Madhav Rao

Scindia formed the MP Congress, GK Moopanar the Tamil Manila Congress and ND Tiwari, Arjun Singh and Sheila Dikshit formed the Tiwari Congress only to merge when Sonia Gandhi became the party president.

Mamata Banerjee formed the Trinamool Congress which is now the ruling party in West Bengal. The YSRCP is also a Congress off-shoot which is at the helm in Andhra Pradesh, as is the NR Congress in



Puducherry.

Once again the party is on the verge of a split with the G-23 calling for action on the Sibal incident. But there is silence on the issue by the top leadership, which means it is unlikely that any action will be taken.

The leaders have reminded the workers of Sibal's contribution to the party in the courts and in parliament. Senior leader Ghulam Nabi Azad termed the incident orchestrated. "I strongly condemn the orchestrated hooliganism

@KapilSibal's residence last night. He is a loyal Congressman fighting for the party both inside and outside the Parliament. Any suggestion from any quarter should be welcomed instead of suppressing, hooliganism is unacceptable," he said.

Likewise Manish Tewari and Vivek Tankha have also expressed their displeasure while Anand Sharma said he is shocked. Former Chief Minister of Punjab Amarinder Singh who showed his intent to leave the party alleged that seniors are insulted. Now the rift between former party president Rahul Gandhi's loyalists and those who want reforms has widened with no sign of a truce, the reason being there is nobody who can bring both the factions to the table. A leader pointed out that, "its ironic that Rahul Gandhi has himself become a party in the entire crisis rather he should have been the solution provider." The leader said that due to bad advice and bad decisions of a coterie the party has reached such a low. Rahul Gandhi loyalists Ajay Maken and Randeep Singh Surjewala have attacked the leaders who are questioning the leadership.



SHIVPURI PLANT RUN BY WOMEN WILL BECOME AN EXAMPLE ACROSS THE COUNTRY - CHIEF MINISTER CHOUHAN

The key of "Take Home Ration Plant" handed over to the Women Livelihood Industrial Cooperative Society

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Friday handed over the key of "Take Home Ration Plant" costing Rs.17.35 crore to Women Livelihood Industrial Cooperative Society in Shivpuri in Jan Kalyan and Suraj Abhiyan. Chief Minister Chouhan said that this plant, run by women of Gwalior-Chambal division, would become a big example for women self-help groups across the country. The profits of the plant will be given to women self-help groups.

Chief Minister Chouhan said that only contractors and big businessmen cannot run industries. Women have also become capable of running industries. With this thinking, the responsibility of operating the "Take Home Ration Plant" of Shivpuri has been entrusted to the women's organisation. Today is Gandhi Jayanti...or in other words it's Khadi Day today...but what is Khadi? In simple words it is a hand spun and hand woven natural fiber cloth usually from cotton. However it may also include silk or wool, which are all spun into yarn on a spinning wheel called Charkhas. It is a versatile fabric, cool in summer and warm in winter. Weaving skill existed in India since ages...but after the first war of independence in 1857, domestic

textile production by mill or by traditional methods declined to its lowest levels and then Khadi emerged as silent economic revolution by an outcome of a long and laborious evolutionary process. Mahatma Gandhi, touched by the plight of farmers, focused the Swadeshi movement on hand spinning. In 1922 Gandhi ji asserted Indian National Congress to start Khadi Department for spinning and in 1925 All India Spinner Association (AISA) was formed. Thus we can say khadi is not only a

Doha agreement boosts Taliban!

Top US defence officials have said the Taliban's takeover of Afghanistan can be traced back to a deal between the group and the Trump administration, BBC reported. The so-called Doha agreement was signed in February 2020 and set a date for the US to withdraw its troops. Gen Frank McKenzie said the deal had a "really pernicious effect" on the Afghan government and military. Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin agreed, saying the agreement had helped the Taliban get "stronger". Gen McKenzie told the committee the Doha agreement had a strong psychological effect on the Afghan government because it set a date for "when they could expect all assistance to end", the report said. He said he had believed "for quite a while" that if the US reduced the number of its military advisers in Afghanistan below 2,500, the Afghan government and military would inevitably collapse. After the Doha agreement, he said the troop reduction ordered by President Biden in April was "the other nail in the coffin". Austin said that by committing the US to ending air strikes against the Taliban, the Doha agreement meant the Islamist group "got stronger, they increased their offensive operations against Afghan security forces, and the Afghans were losing a lot of people on a weekly basis". The defence officials previously spoke to the Senate Armed Services Committee on Tuesday, where Gen Milley and Gen McKenzie said they had recommended keeping a force of 2,500 troops in Afghanistan, ahead of the full US withdrawal in August. Gen Milley also said the Taliban takeover would make it harder to protect Americans from terrorist attacks, as he described the group as a terrorist organisation that "still has not broken ties with al-Qaeda".

COMMUNIST CHINA'S DEBT TRAP: AN EMPIRE OF LIES AND DECEIT

China's latest investment of an estimated \$1.4 billion in Sri Lanka's Colombo Port City project is the largest single foreign investment in the island nation's history. Dubbed as a public-private partnership (PPP) between the Government of Sri Lanka (or its representative agencies) and the CHEC Port City Colombo (CPC) Private Limited, the project has been much publicised for the employment opportunities and huge revenues, which it would generate for the Sri Lankans. What is seldom spoken about is the fact that of the 269 hectares of reclaimed land, 43 per cent will be controlled by the CPC through a 99-year lease agreement. This is reminiscent of the not too long ago takeover of the Hambantota port on a 99-year lease by China Merchant Port Holdings (CMPH). The port is now operated 'jointly' by the Sri Lanka Ports Authority and CMPH, with the latter holding 80 per cent stake in the port and exercising near

total control over its operations. Even more interesting, however, is the Colombo Port City Economic Commission Bill passed by the Sri Lankan parliament in May this year. This law provides special overarching powers of taxation and new projects and investments to the 'Commission', which itself could possibly be composed of foreign nationals. Recently, there were reports of Chinese personnel in military uniforms being employed in infrastructure work in Hambantota. Sri Lanka is just one example of how China uses its economic power to ensnare unsuspecting, and sometimes complicit governments, in an intricate web of debt and dependencies. The larger effort of China's debt-trap diplomacy is visible in Africa. It is reported that one-in-five infrastructure projects in Africa are funded by China and one-in-three are built by Chinese companies. Often these projects are taken up without appropriate studies on their socio-economic and environmental impact and even their commercial viability. One of the countries which is already reeling under its conse-

quences is Angola, which is repaying multibillion-dollar debt to China with crude oil, creating major problems for its economy. Another glaring example of this unviability is Kenya's 'railroad to nowhere', as captioned in a recent report. The Kenyan government, realising the enormity of the debt that was required to be serviced on account of the Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) project from Mombasa to Nairobi and further inland, attempted to renegotiate the terms of loan payments. The result was a 'freeze' on fresh instalments by China's Exim Bank for other infrastructure projects in Kenya. Worse, the threat of takeover of Mombasa's hugely profitable port is now looming large -- a la Hambantota -- given Nairobi's apparent inability to service the debt. Similar stories emerge from Central Asia, where China has made economic inroads to hedge against its own political and security vulnerabilities. As of today, all Central Asian countries are economically dependent on China for both exports and imports of goods, espe-

cially medical equipment and pharmaceuticals where Beijing is a world leader; and the debt is growing. Although, the Central Asian countries initially tried to balance their trade with Beijing by exporting gas -- Chinese imports from Central Asia grew 1,000 per cent in the last ten years -- these measures have proven to be insufficient. On the contrary, Beijing has seized several concessions from these nations, notably the ceding of 1,158 square km of territory in the Pamir mountains by Tajikistan and the increasing presence of China's Private Military Companies (PMCs) to provide security to infrastructure projects in Central Asia. To gauge the extent of China's increasing stranglehold across the globe, one only needs to look beyond Asia and Africa. In Europe, Montenegro is struggling to repay a multi-billion-dollar loan to China for a highway constructed by China Road and Bridge Corporation from 'nowhere to nowhere'. Only the

first 25-mile section of the proposed 270-mile road has been completed and the host country cannot afford to pay for the rest of project. Therefore, it is hardly surprising that China tries to elaborately gift wrap its ulterior motives in seemingly benign outreach to unsuspecting partners. In 2018, the Center for Global Development named Djibouti, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, the Maldives, Mongolia, Montenegro, Pakistan, and Tajikistan as "highly vulnerable to debt distress" due to China's Belt and Road Initiative. This should serve as a warning to these nations and to those which run the risk of eventual bankruptcy in this dangerous game of geopolitics. (N. C. TAJIK TROOPS DEPLOYED ON BORDER AS TENSION ERUPTS WITH TALIBAN

Moscow | Agencies

The Russian Foreign Ministry claimed to have reports indicating troop deployments by Tajikistan and Afghanistan along the two countries' shared border amid tensions with the Taliban, DW reported.

"We observe with concern growing tensions in Tajik-Afghan relations against the background of mutual harsh statements by the leaders of the two countries. Reports have appeared about the deployment of armed forces by both sides to the common border. According to information from the Taliban, tens of thousands of special forces units have been deployed in the bordering (northern) Afghan province Takhar alone," said Foreign Ministry spokesman Alexei Zaitsev.

Moscow, said Zaitsev, calls on Dushanbe and Kabul "to search for mutually acceptable solutions" to de-escalate the current situation.



Tajik President Emomali Rahmon has refused to recognize the Taliban government, accusing the group of human rights abuses, the report said. The Taliban leadership has harshly rejected such sentiments, demanding that Tajikistan stay out of Afghanistan's domestic affairs. On Thursday, long-time Tajik ruler Rahmon presided over a military parade

near the border. The show of force followed a similar parade near another section of the border a day earlier.

Tajikistan is the only neighbouring country of Afghanistan which is emerging as the toughest critic of the Taliban.

Earlier, Tajik authorities have taken a different position and that has raised questions about why Rahmon and his government continue to make clear their strong opposition to a Taliban government in Afghanistan, Bruce Pannier wrote in the Qishloq Ovozi blog.

Pakistan, a long backer of the Taliban, clearly welcomed the group's success in Afghanistan.

China, Iran, Uzbekistan, and Turkmenistan all conceded there was nothing they could do about Afghan internal politics and held out hope that some form of cooperation with the Taliban might be possible, he adds.

Tajikistan's government is no doubt saying what many governments are thinking.

JAPAN LIFTS COVID STATE OF EMERGENCY AS SCHEDULED

Tokyo: Japan on Friday fully lifted the Covid-19 state of emergency covering Tokyo and another 18 prefectures, as well as the quasi-state of emergency in other regions as scheduled.

It is the first time since April 4 that none of Japan's 47 prefectures is under either a state of emergency or a quasi-state of emergency, reports Xinhua news agency. The Japanese government plans to ease restrictions in phases to resume social and economic activities while preventing another wave of coronavirus infections. With the state of emergency being gradually lifted, the tourism sector saw a rise in reservations for domestic tours, and businesses such as restaurants and theme parks were preparing for an expected increase in customers.

N.Korea test-fires new anti-aircraft missile

Seoul | Agencies

North Korea said on Friday that it has test-fired a new type of anti-aircraft missile capable of downing air targets at longer distances with enhanced accuracy.

The North's Academy of Defence Science carried out the test aimed at "confirming the practicality of operation of the launcher, radar and comprehensive battle command vehicle as well as the comprehensive combat performance of the missile", Pyongyang's official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) said.

The Academy verified the "remarkable" combat performance of the new missile that features rapid response and guided accuracy with a missile control system as it introduced new technologies that included "twin-rudder control technology" and a "double-impulse flight engine", Yonhap News Agency quoted KCNA as saying. The North has also been successful in substantially increasing the effective range of the missile, it added.

The twin-rudder control technology appears to be aimed at increasing mobility by



attaching variable wings to the warhead and the middle of the missile.

Pak Jong-chon, a member of the Presidium of the Politburo of the ruling Workers' Party, guided the launch, while leader Kim Jong-un did not attend the firing, according to the KCNA. South Korea's Unification Ministry said it will continue efforts to restart inter-Korean talks while keeping a close watch on the North's next move. North Korea has recently ratcheted up tensions by conducting its first test-launch of a hypersonic missile earlier this week, just two weeks after test-firing two short-range ballistic missiles into the East Sea.

Global Covid-19 caseload tops 233.7 mn Flu pandemic still more deadly to humans than Covid

The global coronavirus caseload has topped 233.7 million, while the deaths have surged to more than 4.78 million and vaccinations soared to over 6.22 billion, according to the Johns Hopkins University.

In its latest update on Friday morning, the University's Center for Systems Science and Engineering (CSSE) revealed that the current global caseload and death toll stood at 233,703,468 and 4,782,043 respectively, while the total vaccine doses administered were 6,227,425,133.

The US continues to be the world's highest number of cases and deaths at 43,459,200 and 697,840 respectively, according to the CSSE.

In terms of infections, India follows in the second place with 33,739,980 cases.



The other worst countries with over 3 million cases are Brazil (21,427,073), the UK (7,843,887), Russia (7,401,104), France (7,106,028), Turkey (7,124,654), Iran (5,587,040), Argentina (5,256,902), Colombia (4,957,277), Spain (4,959,091), Italy (4,672,355), Indonesia (4,215,104), Germany (4,239,773) and

Mexico (3,655,395), the CSSE figures showed. Nations with a death toll of over 100,000 are Brazil (596,749), India (448,062), Mexico (276,973), Peru (199,367), Russia (203,549), Indonesia (141,939), the UK (137,043), Italy (130,921), Colombia (126,299), Iran (120,428), France (117,474) and Argentina (115,179).

A global flu outbreak continues to be a "serious and real" risk to human beings more than the ongoing Covid-19, according to infectious disease experts.

According to Professor Michael Osterholm, director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy at the University of Minnesota, a global influenza outbreak could be far worse than the Covid pandemic, with models suggesting that it could kill up to 33 million people in the first six months, The Telegraph reported.

"Prior to Covid-19, influenza pandemics were the number one biological risk to humans and this hasn't changed," Osterholm was quoted as saying.

"During the 100 years between 1918 and 2018, we had four influenza pandemics. This clearly illustrates that the risk of pandemic influenza is a serious and real threat. The question is not if we will have another influenza pandemic, but when," he said.

Osterholm was speaking at the launch of a roadmap to develop vaccines against both seasonal flu -- expected to rise this year -- as well as pandemic influenza, by the World



Health Organisation along with several other organisations.

Influenza kills 290,000 to 650,000 people per year, disproportionately affecting those in lower- and middle-income countries. The world has historically experienced an influenza pandemic once every 25 years.

The roadmap sets out what is needed for the development of new vaccines from better understanding of the immune response to flu to

ensuring sustainable funding.

According to the experts, current flu vaccines are based on technology first developed in the 1940s and need to be formulated every year depending on what strains of the disease are circulating.

While there has been "incremental" improvement in vaccine development in the last 10 years, "we still do not have a vaccine that protects against stronger strains for a longer

amount of time", Dr Martin Friede, vaccines expert at the WHO, was quoted as saying.


The ultimate goal is for a universal flu vaccine that would not have to be administered every year, was effective against many different strains and could be used in low and middle income countries. There is also an urgent need for vaccines against pandemic influenza and experts hope that the lessons of the Covid.

Alliance with BJP did not let Sena expand base in Maha: Sanjay Raut

Shiv Sena's 25-year long alliance with the Bharatiya Janata Party in Maharashtra did not allow it to expand its base in the state, its Rajya Sabha member and national spokesperson Sanjay Raut said on Friday.

Addressing a press conference here, he also said that the party would contest between 22-25 seats in the Goa Assembly polls which are scheduled to be held in early 2022. "All this while, we focussed on alliances. In Maharashtra, our leader and Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray had to concede that we could not expand our base because of the alliance for 25 years," he said. Raut, who is in-charge of party affairs in Goa, is here to oversee the Sena's election campaign for the 2022 polls. "Even in Goa, we used to opt for alliances... that is why we could not expand. That is why we have decided that we will contest 22 to 25 seats in Goa on our own strength," he said. The Sena has contested Assembly elections in the past, but performed poorly. In 2017, it contested on three seats in



alliance with the Maharashtrawadi Gomantak Party and the Goa Suraksha Manch, but lost all three. Asked about the resurgent Aam Aadmi Party and the re-entry of West Bengal-based Trinamool Congress in Goa ahead of the polls, Raut said that Goa was in the midst of a "political carnival". "There is a political carnival in Goa. Goa has become a laboratory for everyone. Someone comes from West Bengal, others come from Delhi to contest elections. Anyone can contest elections in Goa. But Goa and Maharashtra have an emotional relationship. It has always been that way," Raut said.

After CM's green flag, Mumbai Metro train trials to start early 2022

After Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray gave the go ahead, the Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation Ltd (MMRCL) on Friday said it plans to start trial runs for the Mumbai Metro 3 line by early 2022.

The state government has permitted the MMRCL to create a temporary facility - a train delivery and testing track area for the technical trials of the prototype 8-coach trains due to arrive here by December, said MMRCL Managing Director Ranjit Singh Deol.

After a two-week period to assemble the train coaches, by January 2022, the trials for the Colaba-Bandra-SEEPZ fully-underground Mumbai Metro 3 corridors shall start, he added. The trials will be conducted from the mouth of a ramp on the west of the Marol-Maroshi Road in Andheri east, in an area vacated by diversion of the road to an upcoming underpass. The ramp - which connects the underground part of the Metro line with the surface -



coming up here is around 225 metres long.

Presently, two metro trains of 8-cars each are ready, a third is being manufactured and for the testing programme of the prototype train, the parking will be at the temporary facility at Marol-Maroshi Road, said Deol. The development comes amid apprehensions that a Centre-State tug-of-war for the car-shed depot may delay the project by two

years while an alternative site is being acquired for the prestigious Mumbai Metro Line 3.

Thackeray has also directed the MMRCL not to chop a single tree in the Aarey Colony area - which was rejected as the original proposed site for the car-shed - and instead build the ramp in Marol-Maroshi Road for conducting the train trials.

The manufacturer, Alstom, has already conducted technical trials of the 8-car trains in Sri City, Andhra Pradesh, and now the trains will be coming to Mumbai for rigorous trials of 10,000-kms before the Mumbai Metro 3 operations begin with 31 trains. Currently, 97 per cent of the tunnel work and around 70 per cent of the civil works for the Line 3 is ready and the technical trials of the prototype train would mark a major milestone, said Deol.

Incidentally, through a NITI Aayog delegation which visited the state recently, Thackeray again appealed to Prime Minister Narendra Modi to intervene and end the tussle of the Kanjurmarg site selected for the Mumbai Metro carshed, which is stuck in a legal dispute.

NCB seizes Australia-bound drugs hidden in mattresses from Mumbai

The Narcotic Control Bureau has busted yet another international narcotic smuggling racket, seizing a drugs consignment from Hyderabad bound for Australia via Mumbai, a top official said on Friday.

"The contraband has been seized in Andheri... around 4.60 kg of ephedrine, which was sourced from Hyderabad. It was intended to be smuggled to Australia via Mumbai," NCB Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede said. Following a tipoff, the NCB teams found the contraband hidden inside three mattresses, packed in a carton, in the form of a parcel. All the mattresses were taken out and after a thorough check, the NCB sleuths recovered the ephedrine



concealed in them, he added.

Further investigations are on to trace and arrest the consignor and the consignee and discern the links of the international drug mafia in Mumbai and their connections in other countries, etc.

According to the NCB, ephedrine has a chemical structure similar to amphetamines and it can be used to create methamphetamine, which makes it a highly sought-after chemical precursor in the illicit manufacture of methamphetamine.

In India, ephedrine falls under the Section 9A of the NDPS Act, 1985 and is a Table-I precursor under the United Nations Convention Against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances, making it an illegal narcotic drug.

Suspected 'marauder' leopard trapped in Aarey Colony

Maharashtra Forest Department has managed to trap a leopard in a cage in the Aarey Colony after over half a dozen attacks by the spotted big cats in the Sanjay Gandhi National Park and its periphery, officials said on Friday.

The leopard was trapped in one of three cages placed at strategic locations in the Aarey Colony, but the officials are not certain if it the same suspected of creating havoc here in the past few days.

The female sub-adult was taken to the Leopard Rescue Centre in the park, Borivali, for treatment and observation, after it found inside the trap around 5 a.m.

The SGNP and Maharashtra Forest Department, which have accessed the CCTV footages of a couple of incidents recently and camera-trap images of the leopards, will match them with other evidence to ascertain if the same leopard has walked into the trap. The SGNP, spread across around 103



square km, is the only national park in the world to be located with a metropolitan city limits, and had the highest leopard density with around four dozen spotted cats flourishing here. Roaming inside the SGNP and its larger periphery, hugging three large and heavily populated areas of Mumbai Suburban District, Thane and Palghar, the leopards' hunt for food and prey often leads inside the human settlements, buildings, bungalow, slums, resulting in man-animal conflicts, with tragedies on both sides.

'Mission Women Olympic Climbing Medal Hunt' is a dream very close to the heart for Tashi and Nungshi Malik, the first female twins to climb Mount Everest (in 2013) and the first siblings and twins to climb the Seven Summits and reach the North and South Poles and complete the Adventurers Grand Slam and Three Poles Challenge.

As part of their pet project, the twins want to select very young girls from across India through

They are hoping to soon arrange funds through sponsorships to launch this programme as part of their foundation The twins, winners of India's highest adventure honour 'Tenzing Norgay National Adventure Award'

"It is always better to get into sports climbing when you are young so that you develop and strengthen the required set of muscles early on. In India, we still have a long way to go to be considered serious contenders for this honour," they told correspondent in an interview.

Tashi and Nungshi also want to launch a few adventure-reality shows in India and annually lead all women Everest and Kanchenjunga base camp leadership treks for women. They want to produce and anchor a video series called Invisible Mountains to showcase how subtle and often invisible socio-cultural practices based on gender

'Bingo Hell' is an off-beat film that blends horror and satire in a relatively unique way. Set in a distant locality named Oak Springs, the narrative follows Lupita (Adriana Barraza), an elderly, loud-mouthed busybody who fiercely protects her neighbourhood from gentrification.

Oak Springs had seen fabulous days, but now, with every other house in town up for sale and long-term businesses closing down, Lupita and her peers are fed up with the constant home-purchase offers from developers.

Lupita's peers include her hairstylist Yolanda (Bertila Damas), handyman Morris (Clayton Landey), auto mechanic Clarence (Grover Coulson), the recently widowed Mario (David Jensen), and her best friend Dolores (L. Scott Caldwell).

When Mr Big (Richard Brake) an ill-defined, mysterious supernatural stranger, comes into Oak Springs with his big paying bingo hall, Lupita finds that her long-time neighbours and residents of the town dying under grisly circumstances, and she suddenly discovers that gentrification is the least of her problems.

She takes the bulls by the horns



when she realises that Mario, who is already conspicuous in his absence all day, has sold his place, and when she goes over to his house finds him dead in mysterious circumstances.

The scares set in after a mysterious limousine makes its first appearance, but by then the audience is already pulled into the narrative just like Lupita's investigation of the uncanny events in town. The horror in the film perfectly alludes to the '80s with slime and cinematography that captures psychedelic lighting.

Adriana Barraza as Lupita is a likeable character. With her blabber-mouth and into everybody's business demeanour, she is the typical, good-hearted neighbourhood lady. Much like the neighbourhood she loves, there is a quality about her that will make you accept her.

L. Scott Caldwell as Dolores, who is

stuck housing an absent son's trashy, ungrateful wife (Kelly Murtagh) and a grandson (Joshua Caleb Johnson) who is drifting towards delinquency and all the others in supporting roles have their moments of on-screen glory.

Richard Brake as Mr Big is truly a frightening figure. His clownish get-up and mannerisms are terrifying. As the narrative progresses, he becomes more monstrous in appearance and develops like a classic horror film villain.

Overall, while the characters and the setting provide a comforting sense to those who have grown up in small towns or similar surroundings, the comic and macabre aspect of the screenplay appears undernourished and murky. Moreover, the film ends on a feel-good factor which reveals, "As long as we are together, it does not matter where we go."

RAHUL 67 HELPS PUNJAB BEAT KOLKATA BY FIVE WICKETS

Skipper KL Rahul struck a well-paced half-century to help Punjab Kings beat Kolkata Knight Riders by five wickets in a thrilling encounter in the IPL 2021 here on Friday, moving to fifth position and maintaining their chances of making it to the knockout rounds. Both teams needed a win -- the KKR more so as it would have pushed them to 12 points from 12 games and closer to a place in the top four. But it was not to be as Punjab (10) won the match and reached the fifth position, moving ahead of Mumbai Indian (10) on better Net Run Rate. This win means that the Delhi Capitals are assured of a place in the knockouts with Punjab, KKR, and Mumbai Indian on 10 points and fighting for the final qualifying spot.

Punjab restricted KKR for 165/7 in their 20 overs despite a superb 67 by opener Venkatesh Iyer and a quick 31 off 18 deliveries by Nitish Rana, with some good bowling in the middle overs, and came back to reach 168/5 in 19.3 overs capitalising on a few dropped catches by their opponents. Punjab too lost their way a bit in the middle overs on a slow track but Rahul managed the innings well and helped them keep their noses



ahead. Punjab were also helped by a debatable decision on a diving catch by Rahul Tripathi by the third umpire. A wicket at that time would have made things very difficult for Punjab. Rahul was eventually out, caught by Shivam Mavi off Iyer with Punjab needing four runs to win off as many deliveries. Shahruxh Khan (22 off 9 balls) blasted the next ball over the rope and Punjab won the match.

Rahul and his opening partner Mayank Agarwal gave the team a great start -- with Agarwal capitalising on an early life -- as Punjab chased down the target after asking

KKR to bat first. Rahul anchored the innings while Agarwal went for his shots as they raised 70 runs for the opening stand. Agarwal, who struck three big sixes after being put down by Eoin Morgan when he had not yet scored a run, was caught by Morgan, incidentally, off Varun Chakravarthy. Punjab lost a couple of wickets, Nicolas Pooran (12), Aiden Markram (18), and Deepak Hooda (3) getting out early but Rahul found a good partner in the big-hitting Shahruxh Khan and they pushed Punjab Kings across the line.

Earlier, after his partner Shubman Gill was out early, Venkatesh Iyer (67) hit some powerful shots to post

his highest score in IPL in his fifth match but just when KKR, asked to bat first, were looking to dominate the match, Punjab Kings came back to claim some quick wickets in the middle overs to halt their progress. Nitish Rana struck some good blows in making 31 off 18 balls that proved crucial for KKR. Arshdeep Singh was the most successful Punjab bowler as he claimed 3/32 while Ravi Bishnoi picked 2/22 in his four overs as Punjab did well in the middle overs to restrict KKR which were looking for a score around 180.

KKR did their chances lot of harm by picking only four bowlers in order to get an extra batsman -- hoping that Venkatesh Iyer and Nitish Rana, who did well for them with the bat, will make good of the four overs. But the two batting-allrounder cost them 37 runs in 3.3 overs which in the end thwarted them.

It's something that we all respect a lot: Mandhana on Raut walking out

Indian opener Smriti Mandhana said that her team respects the decision of Punam Raut walking out despite the umpire Phillip Gillespie shaking his head on day two of the one-off Test against Australia in Metricon Stadium on Friday. On a day when Smriti made her first Test century, the cricketing world was abuzz with varied opinions on Punams decision to walk off.

The incident took place in the 81st over of India's innings when Punam, batting on 36 off 165 balls, decided to walk off after believing to have nicked left-arm Sophie Molineux behind to wicketkeeper Alyssa Healy. Punam stretched forward to block the delivery but the ball spun away and went behind to Alyssa. The Australians didn't appeal whole-heartedly but Punam had walked away by then.

"First we reacted, like, 'Oh, why did she do that?' But, then, of course, it's something that we all respect a lot. I think she has earned a lot of respect from all the team-mates that she actually walked



out. And I don't know how many people would actually do that in cricket at the moment - men's or women's," said Smriti to reporters after the day's

play was brought to a close due to rain.

"Nowadays people walk out because there is DRS. But when there is no DRS and to walk out, I don't know. So, definitely she has earned a lot of respect from us, but, yeah, the first reaction was, 'Oh, was it actually an edge or why did she walk?' That was our first reaction," added Smriti.

When the Punam walk-off question was put to Australian all-rounder Ellyse Perry, she said, "Yeah, there seem to be a really faint edge. That's very much at her discretion whether or not she wanted to walk. And she did so, I suppose so from our point of view it's just acknowledging that. Besides that, there wasn't too much conversation about it."

When batter Beth Mooney was asked by the commentators whether she would have walked, she instantly replied, "Nup, no chance."

Punam was playing her first game of the tour to Australia. She didn't feature in the ODI series at Mackay and isn't a part of the squad of the T20I series in Gold Coast coming after the pink-ball Test.

Bagnaia and Quartararo set for key battle in America

Ahead of a crucial weekend which could heavily influence where the 2021 MotoGP World Championship trophy heads to, current standings leader Fabio Quartararo of Yamaha MotoGP was confident of his chances in the battle against main rival Francesco Bagnaia of Ducati in the Grand Prix of the Americas this weekend.

With four races to go, the title race is hotting up between the Frenchman and the Italian and both will be hoping for a victory at the Circuit of the Americas.

Quartararo and Bagnaia discussed the Round 15 of the season on Friday at the pre-event Press Conference alongside Marc Marquez (Honda Team).

Just 48 points split Quartararo and Bagnaia in the Championship with just four races to go. To say this weekend is vital in the title race is probably an understatement, and heading into the weekend at Circuit of the Americas (COTA), both riders are in a buoyant mood. It's going to be incredibly interesting to see how Quartararo goes about his business with his healthy points advantage, and it's a topic he touched upon.



Quartararo: "Yes honestly in Misano, behind Jack, I had some moments. But as soon as I overtook Jack and I saw Pecco in front, I needed to try. Second is ok for the championship and in the end that's the position we finish'd but it's the race I had more fun in this year."

"It's a shame' we didn't get that place at the end, but the race was going super fast and I want more of this at the end. Of' course, I'm in a tricky situation, I will not push over my limit but if I can achieve something like Misano or something better, I will go for it," he was quoted as saying in a release on Friday. On the other hand, Pecco can't afford to make any mistakes and has to go all-out attack. Four races, 48 points - by no means impossible, but

it's certainly difficult. A Ducati rider has never won at COTA, however, Bagnaia is confident he can be very competitive this weekend.

Bagnaia said, "This year we were fast at tracks that we struggled at in the past years. I think our bike suits better in all the conditions in all the situations of tracks. This first sector is very similar to Silverstone, maybe more difficult but similar, and we were fast there so I think we can also be very competitive here. We need a chance to stay in front so we have to be competitive."

Can Marc Marquez reclaim his COTA crown? That's the question on a lot of people's minds going into this weekend. Marc Marquez is a six-time winner in Austin, but 2021 is different. While admitting the approach to this GP is certainly different from somewhere like Misano, Marquez is aware that COTA's heavy braking zones and fast changes of direction might take their toll slightly. The eight-time World Champion's goal? Enjoy himself. Marc Marquez said, "Yeah of course I mean the approach of the weekend, for example, compared to Misano and Austin is a bit different because I know that normally in this track I enjoy a lot and this year I will try to enjoy it because if we take this season I'm suffering more than enjoying."

Sehwag recalls incident when Dhoni scolded Ashwin for on-field behaviour

Former Indian opener Virender Sehwag recalled an incident when CSK captain MS Dhoni scolded Ravichandran Ashwin for giving an animated send-off to Glenn Maxwell during an IPL match between the Chennai Super Kings and Punjab Kings (Kings XI Punjab). Though Sehwag did not mention when the match happened, but it is certain that the incident happened during 2014 IPL.

"Even when I was playing for Punjab, Ashwin dismissed Maxwell, picked up some dust and blew it off (in celebration). I didn't like that scene either but I didn't come out publicly to say that he should not have done that or it was against the spirit of the game,



although MS Dhoni was very angry about it and scolded him a lot too," Sehwag was quoted as saying by Cricbuzz while sharing his views on the 'spirit of the game' debate after the Ashwin-Morgan verbal blows in IPL 2021 on Tuesday.

Sehwag, who was at the non-striker's end when the incident happened in 2014, mentioned that he did not like the celebration but he didn't speak about it to not start a 'spirit of cricket' debate. He

also believed that things happening inside should remain inside.

"But it was Ashwin's wish to do that and if someone had come out talking about it in the media or social media it might have caused an uproar too. This is the player's responsibility, right? What happens inside should remain inside. If more things from the inside start coming out, I can guarantee every match will have something like this that will cause an uproar. The spirit of the game also says that players should leave what happens inside the ground as is and move on." On Thursday, Ashwin explained through a series of tweets that he had not seen the ball hitting the non-striker and Delhi captain Rishabh Pant.

INDIA MEN WIN TEAM BRONZE IN ASIAN TT, WOMEN FINISH FIFTH

Doha (Qatar): The Indian men's table tennis team comprising Achantha Sharath Kamal, Sathiyam Gnanasekaran, and Harmeet Desai enhanced its reputation with a bronze medal in the Asian Table Tennis Championships here on Friday. The Indian women's team playing without Manika Batra, who was left out as she did not attend the camp, finished fifth after a 3-1 win against Thailand.

India had won the men's team bronze at the Asian Games in Jakarta in 2018 and Friday's bronze in the Asian Championships cements their reputation among the top three in the Continent. On Friday, the Indian team lost 0-3 to top seeds South Korea in the semi-finals. They were already assured of a medal as both losing semi-finalists get bronze medals just like at the Asian Games. Though the scoreline may show that the Koreans won it easily, the Indians did put up a fight. Sathiyam lost to World No 12 Jang Woo-jin but took a game off the higher-ranked player in the 3-1 (11-5, 10-12, 11-8, 11-5) defeat. Four-time Olympian Achantha Sharath Kamal could not capitalise on a 2-1 lead as he went down to World No. 22 Lee Sang-Su 3-2 (7-11, 15-13, 8-11, 11-6, 11-9). Harmeet Desai too came back strongly after losing the first game to win the next two but eventually went down 3-2 (11-4, 9-11, 8-11, 11-6, 13-11), losing in extra points in the deciding game.

FORMER ENGLAND CAPTAIN CONNOR TAKES CHARGE AS MCC'S FIRST FEMALE PRESIDENT

Former England captain Clare Connor took charge as the president of the Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) on Friday. She also becomes the first woman ever to hold the post in the 234-year-old history of the club.

Her nomination was announced by her predecessor, former Sri Lanka captain Kumar Sangakkara at the Annual General Meeting in 2020. Clare now takes over from Sangakkara after his term was extended to two years because of Covid-19 pandemic. Clare, who is currently the ECB's Managing Director of Women's Cricket, was made an Honorary Life Member of MCC in 2009.

"I am truly honoured to be MCC President and would like to thank Kumar Sangakkara for putting his faith in me to deliver this enormously important role, for the good of the sport I have loved all my life. I will try to bring my range of experiences from the dressing room and the boardroom to support, influence and work alongside the Club's leadership and committees over the next 12 months. I am really looking forward to being part of the MCC team," said Clare in a statement by the MCC.

Clare made her England debut in 1995 as a 19-year-old. She



took over the captaincy of England in 2000, leading England at Lord's against Australia a year later. An all-rounder who bowled left-arm spin, Connor led England women's team to

their first Ashes triumph in 42 years, overseeing a 1-0 series win in 2005. After retiring from the game shortly after winning the Ashes, Clare moved towards developing the women's and girls' game. As the ECB's Managing Director of Women's Cricket she oversaw the introduction of central contracts for England women's players in 2014, the ICC World Cup win in front of a full house at Lord's in 2017 and the introduction of professional contracts for female domestic cricketers in 2020.

Apart from Clare, Bruce Carnegie-Brown has taken charge as the sixth Chairman of the MCC. Carnegie-Brown has been a full member of the MCC since 1997 and joined the Club's Finance committee in October 2019.

"It is a privilege to be MCC's next Chairman and to increase my involvement with such a special Club. I look forward to working with the Club's Members to ensure that the Home of Cricket continues to provide a world class venue and warm welcome to players and visitors from around the country and internationally. On behalf of the Club's membership, I would like to express my gratitude to my predecessor, Gerald Corbett who did an outstanding job of leading the Club through the pandemic, while also overseeing the construction of the fabulous new Compton and Edrich stands, which opened this summer."



If love stories don't touch an emotional chord, they are not worth it, if you are a sucker for romantic tales, especially the frothy ones.

Director Kunal Deshmukh's 'Shiddat', tugs at your heart twice over, once with Joginder Dhillon's saga and then with that of Gautam. While Gautam's love story is light and trite, Joginder's tale is heavyweight and intense. Both stories have arcs that make your heart ache. The narrative tells us how their paths

cross and about crossing borders, both literally and metaphorically. And like most love stories, 'Shiddat' does not offer anything that you aren't aware of. But what makes the film stand out is the striking cinematography, crisp editing, reasonably endearing direction, and most of all, the performances of its cast especially, Sunny Kaushal and Mohit Raina. There is sincerity and passion in what they offer to their audiences.

Sunny Kaushal with his charismatic smile

and demeanour has a unique blend, that reminds you of Shahid Kapoor and Shah Rukh Khan. He effortlessly displays the 'junoon', craziness that these actors are known for. He plays Joginder Dhillon, "the madly in love youth" with elan. He is the love-struck guy who "suffers from perpetual happiness" and attempts to cross the seven seas for his dream girl, Kartika, even, if it means stopping her wedding.

It is easy to copy Shah Rukh Khan, but

Sunny Kaushal has his take on that, especially when he is at the dress store buying a dress for his love, Kartika. Sunny Kaushal has put his heart and soul into his character and delivers a fab performance, making it inevitable for you to recognise his potential at the marquee.

On the other hand, is Mohit Raina playing Gautam, an Officer in the Indian Foreign Service. He is a romantic yet pragmatic lover who after a while feels, "kismet, fate, destiny is all rubbish..."

While we see his love story crumbling, how his attitude changes to help Jogi reach his destination makes your heart go out for him. With his intense disposition, he delivers a compelling, compassionate, and complex character with ease.

Radhika Madan and Diana Penty are competitive and brilliant actresses. The film is studiously mounted, with splendid production values. While there is nothing in common, 'Shiddat' reminds you of DDLJ and other romantic films from the Yashraj stable. The writing may be frothy but the dialogues are significant, contemporary, and racy.

Overall, 'Shiddat' is not an overtly melodramatic film. The narrative holds itself in good stead till the climax, but its weak and oft-seen dénouement fails to leave an impact at the end.
