

Why this new Covid strain 'B.1.1.529' is more lethal than Delta

THE REASON

 As the world reopens after 18-20 months of the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdowns, a new variant of the coronavirus -- called B.1.1.529 -- has been identified in South Africa that has left the scientific community worried, as they fear that this new strain could fuel outbreaks in several countries and cripple health systems once again.

Over 100 cases have been detected in South Africa, where the new strain is slowly becoming the dominant one. Here are five things you should know about this deadly super Covid variant that has forced a number of coun-



tries, including the UK, Israel, Italy and Singapore, to restrict travel from South Africa and other countries in the region.

Global travel bans increase over fear of new Covid variant

London: Amid warnings over a new coronavirus variant, a number of countries, including the UK, Israel, Italy and Singapore have moved to restrict travel from South Africa and other countries in the region. In the past, governments have taken days, weeks or months to issue travel restrictions in response to new variants, The New York Times reported on Friday. This time, restrictions came within hours after the South African authorities identified a concerning new coronavirus variant with mutations -- and hours before health officials from the country were scheduled to discuss the variant with the World Health Organisation (WHO), it added. The UK and Israel announced bans on flights from South Africa and several neighbouring countries on Thursday, citing the threat of the new variant. The UK's flight ban applies to six countries -- South Africa, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Namibia and Zimbabwe -- and begins on Friday.

- According to South African health officials, the 'B.1.1.529' variant has many more mutations than scientists expected, especially after a severe third wave, which was driven by the Delta variant. Many of the mutations are of concern for immune evasion and transmissibility.
- B.1.1.529 carries a high number of mutations in its spike protein, which plays a key role in the virus' entry into cells in the human body. The B.1.1.529 variant has 50 mutations overall, including more than 30 on the spike protein alone which is the target of most current Covid vaccines.
- The World Health Organisation (WHO) has said it will take a few weeks to understand the impact of the new variant. Scientists have said it is the most heavily mutated version yet, which means vaccines, which were designed using the original strain from Wuhan in China, may not be as effective. The WHO has called a meeting to discuss B.1.1.529 and decide if it will be officially designated a variant of concern.
- First identified in South Africa this week, the strain has spread to nearby countries, including Botswana. Israel has identified a case of a Covid-19 variant with a large number of mutations "in a person who returned from Malawi". Two cases have been detected in Hong Kong. India has called for rigorous screening of passengers from South Africa, Botswana, and Hong Kong.
- There are still speculations floating around the variant's origin. According to Francois Balloux, Director of the London-based UCL Genetics Institute, the new strain "likely evolved during a chronic infection of an immunocompromised person, possibly in an untreated HIV/AIDS patient".

Chief Justice of India NV. 
In his address at the Constitution Day celebration organised by the Supreme Court registry at the Vigyan Bhawan, he said: "An area of grave concern for the judiciary is the increasing attacks on judges. Physical attacks on judicial officers are on the rise. Then, there are attacks on the judiciary in the media, particularly social media. These attacks appear to be sponsored and synchronised. The law enforcing agencies, particularly the Central agencies, need to deal with such malicious attacks effectively."

tively. The Governments are expected to create a secure environment so that the judges and judicial officers can function fearlessly."



The CJI also said that his experience as a legal professional in different roles is what prompted him to call for "Indianisation of the Judiciary". "The judicial system, as it exists in our country today, is essentially still colonial in nature. It takes no account of the social realities or the local conditions. The procedures followed, the language of arguments and judgments, and the high costs involved are all contributing to alienating the common man from the judicial system. People should feel confident in approaching the courts," he added. He emphasised that only when litigants get a chance to directly participate, their faith in the process and outcome will be reinforced.

UP ISSUES ALERT OVER 'BOTSWANA' VARIANT

Lucknow: The Uttar Pradesh government has sounded an alert against the new variant of Covid-19 virus, which has been reported in Botswana (three cases), South Africa (six cases) and Hong Kong (one case). An official note on the matter issued by additional chief secretary, health and family welfare, said that the Covid-19 variant B.1.1.529 (commonly being referred to as 'Botswana' variant) is reported to have significantly high number of mutations and thus has a serious public health implication for the country in view of the recently relaxed visa restrictions and opening up of international travel. Citing recommendations from the Union health ministry, the officials dubbed the variant as a major threat to public health in the state and advised screening of all international travellers for the pandemic virus. In addition to this, the health officials have been asked to undertake regular genome sequencing of the samples collected from the foreign returnees. Meanwhile, the health officials also urged people of the state to adhere to the Covid-19 prevention protocol and get vaccinated at the earliest.

Snapchat, Tiktok may up depression in adults

Using social media platforms including Snapchat, Facebook or TikTok is likely to be associated with a greater likelihood of a subsequent increase in depressive symptoms, finds a new study.

The researchers, including Roy H. Perlis from Harvard Medical School, Boston, found that in adjusted regression models Snapchat, Facebook and TikTok use at first survey were significantly associated with a greater risk of increase in self-reported depressive symptoms.

"In this survey study, 5,395 individuals with minimal depressive symptoms on initial survey who reported use of Snapchat, Facebook or TikTok were more likely to report increased levels of depressive symptoms on a later survey," the researchers said. "These results suggest that certain social media use preceded worsening of depressive symptoms," they added. For the study, published in the journal JAMA Network Open, the team included data from 13 waves of a non-probability internet survey conducted approximately monthly between May 2020 and May 2021 among individuals aged 18 years and older in the US.

Data was analysed in July and August 2021.

Logistic regression was applied without reweighting, with a 5 point or greater increase in 9-item Patient Health Questionnaire (PHQ-9) score as outcome and participant sociodemographic features, baseline PHQ-9 and use of each social media platform as independent



variables. They were asked, "Do you ever use any of the following social media sites or apps?" such as Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, Pinterest, TikTok, Twitter, Snapchat and YouTube. They were asked to identify any sources of Covid-19 related news they consumed in the past 24 hours, which they used as a proxy for news sources more generally while examining web-based vs television-based news separately; several social supports available "to talk to if you had a problem, felt sad, or depressed"; and face-to-face meetings with non-household members in the prior 24 hours. Among survey respondents who did not report depressive symptoms initially, social media use was associated with a greater likelihood of a subsequent increase in depressive symptoms after adjustment for sociodemographic features and news sources, the team said.

itself, which will add to availability and lead to fall in prices. In December, arrival is expected to be at par with last year," the Food and Consumer Affairs Ministry said in a statement.

Arrivals in November this year were only 19.62 lakh tonne compared to 21.32 lakh tonne in the year-ago period, it said. Explaining the reasons for the spike in tomato prices, the ministry said retail tomato prices have risen from September-end due to unseasonal rains in Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh which led to crop damage and delay in arrival from these states.

Delayed arrivals from north Indian states was followed by heavy rains in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka, which disrupted the supply and also resulted in crop damage, it said in a statement.

senior citizens and transgenders. In most countries and territories, voting rights were granted to women in a piecemeal manner, he observed. The United States took 144 years to give equal voting rights to women, he

HEAVY RAINS IN TN FOR NEXT 4-5 DAYS: IMD**CHENNAI | Agencies**

Tamil Nadu witnessed heavy to very heavy rainfall on Friday, leaving areas in several districts inundated.

Prime Minister Modi was speaking at the Constitution Day celebrations in the Central Hall of Parliament, which was boycotted by 14 opposition parties, including the Congress.

Pointing out that the country is heading towards a crisis, he said, "In the form of family-based parties, India is heading towards a kind of a crisis, which is a matter of concern for the people devoted to the Constitution, a matter of concern for those who believe in democracy."

"More than one person from a family joining the party on the basis of merit does not make the party dynastic. Problems arise when a party is run by the same family, generation after generation," the Prime Minister said.



FOUR SCHOOL STUDENTS DROWNED IN ODISHA, BODIES RECOVERED

Bhubaneswar: Bodies of all four school students who drowned in the Mahanadi river in Odisha's Cuttack have been recovered, police said on Friday. The deceased were identified as Chandan Behera, Ajinkya Bahalha, Subham Sethi, and Om Prakash Behera, all aged 13 to 14. According to locals, the four went to the river on Thursday afternoon on two cycles. In the evening, people saw that the cycles lying abandoned on the river bank near Bhadimul ghat, and raised an alarm. A search operation was then launched to trace the boys, who were classmates. While one body was recovered last evening, the bodies of three others were recovered on Friday by fire services personnel. All the four belonged to Potapokhari in the Nayabazar area under Chauliaganj Police station of Cuttack city.

Delhi's air quality again falls to 'very poor' category

After a day of recording satisfactory to moderate level of PM 2.5 and PM 10 pollutants in the air, Delhi-NCR on Friday registered an overall Air Quality Index (AQI) of 380 with both the pollutants again falling to the 'very poor' category, according to System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting And Research (SAFAR) estimates.

"The air quality over Delhi-NCT is likely to remain in the upper end of 'Very Poor' category on November 26 and may reach in the lower end of 'Severe' category. Mostly calm or slow winds during night are unfavourable for effective dispersion of pollutants. The air quality is likely to improve marginally but remain in the upper end of 'Very Poor' category on November 27 and November 28," bulletin issued by Air Quality Early Warning System for Delhi (Ministry of Earth Sciences) read.

The air quality is likely to remain in the 'very poor' category. Gradual improvement is likely from November 27 till November 30 and PM2.5 is to be the predominant pollutant.



COP SHOT AT BY MISCREANTS IN NOIDA

Noida: Two miscreants opened fire at a police officer in Greater Noida on Friday afternoon.

The policeman suffered injuries below his knee and was admitted to the Yatharth Hospital in Greater Noida, where his condition is stated to be stable.

The incident occurred when Ankur Chaudhary, posted as the in-charge of Bilaspur police station in Greater Noida, was out on routine inspection in his area.

When the police team was patrolling the area, they spotted two bike-borne criminals and signalled them to stop, but the miscreants did not pay heed to their calls.

As they tried to flee, the police team began chasing them. "Shortly after the chase began, the miscreants opened fire, wounding the said policeman below the knee," a police officer said.

"He is out of danger now," he added. The police have initiated a combing operation in the area to nab the miscreants.

An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', then 401 and between 500 is considered 'severe'. The predominant surface wind is likely to be coming from the Southeast/East direction of Delhi with wind speed of 6 kmph, mainly clear sky and shallow fog in the morning on November 28. Winds are likely to be relatively strong during November 29 and 30," the bulletin added. India Meteorological Department (IMD) predicted a main-

ly clear sky with a misty morning on Friday. The maximum temperature for the day has been pegged at 28 degrees Celsius and minimum at 11 degree Celsius. On Thursday, the maximum temperature was recorded at 27.8 degrees Celsius and minimum at 11 degrees Celsius. The relative humidity at 8.30 a.m. was recorded at 95 per cent.

Illegal firm run by Chinese nationals busted in B'luru, 2 held

Karnataka police have busted a racket allegedly run by Chinese nationals, who gave loans at exorbitant rates and harassed and humiliated the customers for violation of laws, Joint Commissioner of Police (Crime), Sandeep Patil, said on Friday.

The investigation revealed that these Chinese nationals opened bank accounts in the name of Indian nationals, carried out fraudulent transactions and transferred crores of rupees from these accounts to China.

The arrested persons have been identified as Kamaraj More (25), an HR executive, and Darshan Chouhan (21), a team lead. A hunt is on to nab the Chinese nationals, who ran the racket in the name of Licorise Technology Pvt Ltd, located at Marathahalli in Bengaluru.

According to the police, the financial firm allegedly run by the Chinese nationals gave loans to the public and later harassed them by charging exorbitant processing fees and interests.

The accused allegedly insulted the borrowers by sharing their loan details with their friends.

The office was raided on Wednesday, and further investiga-



tions revealed that Chinese nationals were running the firm, which had developed money lending mobile applications such as 'Cash Master' and 'Krazy Rupees'.

The firm had entered into an agreement with non-banking finance companies and was lending money to people through the apps. They charged an exorbitant pro-

Assam to give financial aid for inter-caste marriage

To promote social harmony, the Assam government will give financial assistance under an inter-caste marriage scheme to undertake a business or income generation venture, officials said on Friday.

An official of the Welfare of Scheduled Castes Department said that under the recently launched inter-caste marriage scheme, Rs 10,000 to Rs 5 lakh would be given to undertake any kind of business or to start any income generation project.

According to the official, the beneficiary of the scheme

has to be married between April 2019 and March 2021 and the annual income of the couple should not exceed Rs 5 lakh.

Another condition for being a beneficiary of the scheme is that one spouse must belong to the Scheduled Caste and the other to a general caste.

He said that on many occasions, it was witnessed that families reject inter-caste marriages leading to numerous problems, including suicides. This scheme would encourage a sense of harmony, positive mindset and societal balance in the state, he added.



BJP WILL RETURN TO POWER IN MAHARASHTRA BY MARCH: RANE

MVA leaders dismissed Narayan Rane's predictions as baseless even as the Union Minister said he can't divulge more details on the matter at the moment

Union Minister for MSMEs Narayan Rane on Friday predicted that the BJP will return to power in Maharashtra by March next year. Rane, who is in Rajasthan on a two-day official visit, said he can't reveal more on the matter at the moment.

"Maharashtra will see a change. It will happen in March," the senior BJP leader said. "The strategy has to be kept under wraps. It cannot be made public. It will not go well with our top leadership if all details are out. Moreover, if things become public, it may delay the process of change in the state," he explained.

"The Chief Minister is unwell and hospitalised. At such a time, I wouldn't like to take his name. There is clear instruction from our state party president Chandrakant Patil not to speak against the Maharashtra CM," he said. "The Maha Vikas Aghadi government, which is a coalition of three parties, Congress, NCP and Shiv Sena, has failed. It has not lived up to people's



expectations... In such a scenario, the return of BJP is evident. Whether the government will fall or some parties will break away from the coalition is part of details which cannot be discussed," he said.

Rane's remarks have invited sharp criticism from MVA leaders. Congress president Nana Patole said, "We have been hearing such predictions for the

last two years. But now it is clear that BJP leaders are lying. There is no substance in their prediction. The MVA government is strong and will complete its full five-year tenure."

NCP minister and spokesperson Nawab Malik dismissed Rane's remarks as baseless. "After the MVA was voted to power, we often saw Opposition leader Devendra Fadnavis speaking with assertion on the change of guard in Maharashtra. He realised it is not going to happen, so he is quiet. Then we saw state BJP chief Chandrakant Patil stating the same, but nothing happened. He seems to be frustrated and tired. So Rane has come to the forefront, announcing the change of guard in the state. But it is just wishful thinking. In reality, there is no way the BJP can replace the MVA in the near future," he said. Transport Minister and Shiv Sena leader Anil Parab too ridiculed Rane's statement. "I don't take these predictions seriously. Rane is speaking without any substance," he said.

MGL HIKES GAS PRICES FOR 3RD TIME IN SIX WEEKS



Mumbai: For the third time in barely six weeks, the Mahanagar Gas Ltd has hiked the prices of CNG and PNG with effect from Friday midnight (November 26/27), an official said.

The basic prices of CNG is increased by Rs 3.06/kg and domestic PNG by Rs 2.26/SCM for the Mumbai Metropolitan Region. Accordingly, the revised all-inclusive prices of CNG used by vehicles will go up from Rs 57.54/kg to Rs 61.50/kg, and the home use PNG shall be Rs 36.50/SCM, in a single slab. The fresh hike - in just six weeks after October 14 - will hit the budgets of around 1.60 million PNG consumers and over 800,000 CNG customers using gas-powered vehicles.

Permissible action will be taken against Param Bir Singh: Patil

Days after Supreme Court granted former Mumbai Police commissioner Param Bir Singh interim protection from arrest, Maharashtra Home Minister Dilip Walse Patil on Friday said that permissible action will be taken against him as per the police services rules.

"Permissible action will be taken as per the police service rules. Further decisions will be taken after speaking to the chief mibuster," said Patil.

Meanwhile, the Thane police commissioner has formed a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe an extortion case registered against former Mumbai Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh, said police.

A Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) level officer is investigating the case.

Former Mumbai police commissioner also submitted his statement regarding a complaint registered against him by Sonu Jalan at



a police station in Thane.

Singh had also filed an application for the cancellation of a court proclamation order against him in Esplanade Magistrate's court, which declared him "absconding."

The court will hear the matter on November 29.

Singh, who has been declared "absconding" by a Mumbai court, had arrived at Crime Branch unit 11 office in Kandivali to join the investigation of the Goregaon extortion case.

Six cases of corruption

and extortion were filed against Singh after he wrote a letter to Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray levelling corruption and misconduct against the then Home Minister and senior NCP leader Anil Deshmukh.

Singh, a 1988-batch IPS officer, was removed from the post of Mumbai Police Commissioner on March 17 and was made the General Commander of Maharashtra State Home Guard after he levelled allegations against Deshmukh.

Maha BJP corporator joins Cong, to take on rich BJP ex-minister in MLC polls

The December 10 contest for Member of Legislative Council (MLC) from local bodies constituency in Nagpur has grown interesting with the Congress-led alliance springing a surprise by fielding a four-term BJP corporator with a RSS background against the BJP candidate.

The BJP nominee is Chandrashekhar Bawankule, who rose from a party worker to Energy Minister in the Devendra Fadnavis government, while his assets saw a phenomenal growth of 375 per cent since 2014. In 2014, his affidavit, filed with his nomination, showed his assets amounted to Rs 7,60,240, including moveable assets of Rs 66,27,740, but they have now risen to Rs 37,73,96,296 in 2021, according to his affidavit filed along with nomination papers. Ravindra 'Chotu' Bhojar, a staunch swayamsevak for over three decades, a four-term BJP Corporator and former Deputy Mayor, is the Congress candidate.

On the last day of withdrawal on Friday, Congress dummy candidate Praful Guddhe Patil and Independent candidate Suresh Revatkar withdrew their nominations while another Independent Umesh Deshmukh remained in the fray, leaving Bawankule and Bhojar as the main contenders. The move by



Bhojar to ditch them and join Congress has taken the Sangh Parivar by surprise.

Bawankule, who was denied an Assembly ticket at the eleventh hour in the 2019 polls, is eyeing a comeback to the legislature. Close to both Union Minister Nitin Gadkari and Fadnavis, Bawankule is an OBC face and even though rejected ticket has been on forefront on OBC reservation. Belonging to a dedicated RSS family, Bhojar is a practising homeopath while his maternal uncle Dr Vilas Dangre is close to RSS hierarchy. He was reportedly annoyed with BJP leadership over lack of opportunity for growth in the cadre. His total assets are valued at over Rs 4 crore.

Maharashtra Congress leaders including state chief Nana Patole, and Ministers Sunil Kedar and Nitin Raut are understood to have played a key role in convincing Bhojar to switch over to the Congress.

26/11 13TH ANNIV: MUMBAI PAYS HOMAGE TO BRAVEHEARTS, VICTIMS

Mumbai on Friday remembered the bravehearts and victims felled by bullets and others who saved lives on the 13th anniversary of the dastardly terror strikes by ten Pakistani terrorist who paralysed the city on November 26-29 2008.

Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari led the state by solemnly laying wreaths at the Martyrs' Memorial erected inside the Mumbai Police Commissionerate premises near Crawford Market in south Mumbai.

Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, currently convalescing, saluted those who lost their lives during the terror strikes and expressed his gratitude to those who fought the terrorists, terming the attack "a cowardly act".

He recalled the services of the police and security forces and the people of Mumbai for warding off the assault on the country's commercial capital and recovering from its effects.

Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar, Home Minister Dilip Walse-Patil, Tourism Minister, Director-General



of Police Sanjay Pandey, Police Commissioner Hemant Nagrare and other dignitaries also paid their respects at the martyrs' memorial.

A large number of police personnel turned up to pay homage to their colleagues who lost their lives while



fighting the terrorists who struck at key locations in south Mumbai, with special memories for Tukaram G. Omble who sacrificed his life while pinning down Ajmal Amir Kasab, the sole terrorist nabbed alive in the early hours of November 27, 2008.

The still-grieving family members, relatives of the martyrs and several bravehearts, as also ordinary people paid homage to the departed souls with folded hands, bowed heads, lighting candles, offering flowers or wreaths, at the Martyrs' Memorial and other locations in the city.

They included the widows, mothers, sons, daughters, brothers or sisters, who stepped upto the memorial and offered their own personal tributes with flowers or tears for their departed near and beloved ones.

Similar in memoriam were held at some of the worst-hit targets like the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus, Hotel Taj Mahal Palace, Hotel Oberoi, the Chabad House, the Cama Hospital, and the Leopold Cafe, which bore the brunt of attackers leaving around 175 dead and over 300 injured.

The traditional and social media featured several remembrance ads, glowing and touching tributes and messages of the 60-hours that shook the world before the security forces won over the terrorists - eliminating 9 and taking one (Kasab) alive - to face the Indian law in an unprecedented 'open trial'.

Nagpur deprived of Winter Session; shifts to Mumbai

The much awaited annual political affair for the people of Vidarbha, the staging of Winter Session of Maharashtra Legislature which was scheduled to be held in the first week in December, has been finally shifted to state capital, Mumbai, commencing from December 22 to 29.

The state cabinet took the decision on Thursday in Mumbai after days of uncertainty.

The second capital of Maharashtra, Nagpur, which lost the status of Capital of then Madhya Pradesh after the formation of Maharashtra with



merger of Bombay State, Madhya Pradesh and Hyderabad State in 1953, was bestowed upon the honour of holding one session of newly created

ed Maharashtra state every year. A historic Nagpur Agreement was signed on September 28, 1953 by the then leaders and protagonist of Vidarbha who had submitted their demand for Vidarbha State before the State Reorganisation Commission (SRC) headed by Justice Fazal Ali which suggested an alternative of giving importance to Nagpur and Vidarbha region and holding Assembly Session here.

The Winter Session of Legislature thus not being held in two successive years in 2020 and 2021. In short, the MVA government has not visited Nagpur for holding Winter Session of State Assembly.

Maharashtra Winter assembly session expected to be stormy

The winter session of the Maharashtra Legislature will be held in Mumbai and not in Nagpur from December 22 to 29 due to the possibility of a third wave of Covid-19.

The final decision will be taken in the Business Advisory Committees (BAC) of the state assembly and council slated for November 29. The session is expected to

be stormy as the Maha Vikas Aghadi partners - Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress - are engaged in war of words with BJP over a couple of issues including the alleged misuse of central probe agencies, criminalisation of politics, delays in the clearance of GST compensation from the Centre, involvement of various ministers in scams and BJP's new deadlines for the collapse of the government.

The recent violence in Amravati, Nanded and Malegaon is expected to

dominate the proceedings. NCP leader Nawab Malik has already announced that he will reveal alleged nexus between BJP and underworld and also expose collusion with the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB).

The BJP-led opposition is likely to target the MVA government over the delays in release of aid to the people affected by natural calamities and also lapses in the handling of the coronavirus pandemic.

Won't make public statements against Wankhede family till Dec 9: Nawab Malik to HC



A division bench of Justice S J Kathawalla and Justice M N Jadhav posted the hearing for December 9 on the appeal by Dhyandev challenging the single-judge bench order, which had refused to grant an interim injunction against Malik.

On November 22, a single-judge bench of Justice Madhav J Jamdar had refused to grant a blanket injunction restraining Malik but directed him to conduct "reasonable verification" of facts before posting any material on social media or speaking with the media against Sameer Wankhede and his family. The appeal filed through advocate Diwakar Rai had sought that while the court in its order observed Malik's posts on his social media handles "are actuated by malice or personal animosity" since the minister's son-in-law was arrested by the NCB, Malik ought to have been restrained from making further comments.

Maharashtra cabinet minister and NCP leader Nawab Malik on Thursday assured the Bombay High Court that he will not tweet or make public statements against Dhyandev Wankhede, father of NCB Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede, and his family members "directly or indirectly through any means of publicity" till the next hearing in the case. Following this, a division bench of Justices S J Kathawalla and M N Jadhav posted the hearing for December 9 on an appeal by

Dhyandev Wankhede challenging the single-judge bench order that had refused to grant an interim injunction against Malik.

Advocate Karl Tamboly for Malik said the minister had produced additional documents before the single-judge bench only after the court had said that there were interpolations in Sameer's alleged birth certificate tweeted by him.

After the bench asked if Malik had filed a complaint about the issue pertaining to the caste certificate, Tamboly responded in the negative and said a vigilance

As many as 95 per cent of births in Maharashtra in the last five years took place in a health facility, and only 5 per cent at home, the fifth round of the National Family Health Survey (2019-20) has revealed. The percentage of births

in health facilities, mostly public facilities, in Maharashtra was seven per cent higher than the national rate of 88.6 per cent. The percentage of births in a health facility in the state has increased by 5 per cent in the last five years, from 90 per cent in 2015-16 to 95 per cent in 2019-20. Institutional births are more common among women who have received an antenatal check, women with 12 or more years of schooling, women who are having their first birth, and urban women, according to the survey.

Among the 36 districts in the state, almost all saw an uptick in the number of births in a health facility. In Sindhudurg, Bhandara, Nagpur, Chandrapur and Mumbai, 100 per cent of all births were in a health facility while in 18 other districts, the percentage of births in a health facility was higher than the state average of 95 per cent. The most remarkable difference was observed in the district of



Nandurbar, where the percentage of children born in a health facility jumped from 56 per cent in 2015-16 to 76 per cent in 2019-20. The NFHS-5 fieldwork for Maharashtra was conducted from June 19, 2019, to December 30, 2019, by the Indian Institute of Health Management Research and TRIOS Development Support Ltd. Information was gathered from 31,643 households, and from among 33,755 women and 5,497 men. However, not all survey results showed a positive trend in the state, especially in home births. The use of a clean blade to cut the umbilical cord for home births, as recommended, saw a dip from 94 per cent to 87 per cent in 2019-20. The use of disposable delivery kits remained stagnant, at 44 per cent, between 2015 and 2020.

Data showed that 81 per cent of home births followed the recommendation that the baby be immediately wiped dry and then wrapped without being bathed first, which was 4 per cent less than 2015-16.

Cong, AAP are non players for BJP in UP polls!

Even as the opposition parties like the Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party rollout sops after sops for the upcoming Assembly elections in Uttar Pradesh, the ruling BJP in the state is not responding to their promises and is confident of its own agenda. The Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party are making tall promises even before releasing their manifestos officially. The Congress leads the list by promising 40 per cent reservation in tickets to women, smartphones and electric scooty to girl students, three free gas cylinders every year to women, free bus travel for women, Rs 1000 pension for widows, Rs 10,000 for anganwadi and ASHA workers, and 75 schools named after women warriors. The Aam Aadmi Party, on the other hand, is trying to make inroads into the middle class vote base by promising free electricity up to 300 units and massive upgradation of educational and health facilities on their Delhi model. The Yogi Adityanath government has conveniently turned a blind eye to the promises made by two parties. According to BJP, these parties are promising because neither of them are even in the race to form the next government. They are far away from the majority figure and non-players in the political arena. The BJP is confident that the work done by the Modi and Yogi governments, along with a liberal topping of Hindutva, will take it comfortably beyond the majority mark. Interestingly, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has constantly refused to respond to the demands raised by Congress General Secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra. Whether it was the demand for removal of district magistrate after the Hathras incident or a CBI inquiry into the custodial death of a Dalit or withdrawal of cases against anti-CAA protesters -- the BJP government has refused to accept any demand of the Congress.

UNLIMITED FREEBIES THREAT TO DEMOCRACY

In view of the upcoming assembly elections in Punjab, Aam Aadmi Party leader and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is putting all his might, making many announcements to cherish the voters, these days one such announcement remains the subject of discussion in which he announced. It has been said that if his party forms the government, then every month Rs 1,000 will be deposited in the account of all women above 18 years of age in the state. Elderly women will get this amount in addition to old age pension. He may have linked this scheme with women empowerment, but it is a public-popular announcement that directly tempts the women of Punjab to vote in his favour.

Arvind Kejriwal, who has tried his luck in Indian politics by sounding the bugle against corruption, has become famous by distributing charities and announcing free facilities. By the way, the culture of distributing freebies is increasing in every party. In a democracy, such absurd and exaggerated declarations and assurances pollute politics, which is not only fatal but also indicates a great anomaly. Any ruling party is given the responsibility not to loot the hard-earned money of the people, but to use it in public interest and developmental works. Only by discharging this responsibility properly, any ruling party or its leader can remain capable of power.

This announcement of Kejriwal raises many questions. Does such a declaration constitute any kind of fundamental development? Isn't this a violation of the basic spirit of democracy? Is such a declaration expected in a prosperous province like Punjab? How many such women are really in need of such an amount? The question is also why the 18-year limit? Why should girls in the age group of one to 18 years be discriminated against in any public welfare scheme? Because they don't have the right to vote? How long will the trend of distributing such unnecessary rewards in election manifestos last? It has become necessary to find answers to these questions because forgetting development, all political parties are now engaged in dis-



tributing such rewards and cultivating free culture.

What kind of democratic framework is being created in which parties have gone beyond their limits to make populist promises, it cannot be said in any way in public interest. Unaccountable populist announcements and unfulfilled assurances may bring immediate benefits to the parties, but are also likely to adversely affect the long-term social and economic condition of the country. This has led to the crippling of development plans and the mentality of freebies has started spreading among the people. The question is, how can political parties and politicians be so irresponsible and selfish under the influence of power?

The question is whether public resources should be made available to anyone absolutely free of cost? Do governments have the right to spend public money as they please? When governments are not in a financially comfortable position. This trend is not only motivated by political gain, but also covers institutional failure, and cannot be confined to a single party or government. Some governments, by running a campaign, spend crores of rupees of the hard-earned money of the common man in telling how they have made the country shine. The educated unemployed consider this kind of bigotry and free culture as an insult. Many times governments do not have enough

resources to save their people from calamities like lack of people, hunger, unemployment, pollution. But when they do not have money to solve these basic public problems, how do they distribute the facilities for free? Why do crores and billions of rupees are spent in their promotion?

In South India, especially from Tamil Nadu, this free distribution tradition now dominates almost the entire nation. Keeping the economy and the financial condition of the state at bay, almost all the parties and governments have distributed or promised to distribute from ornaments, laptops, mangal sutras, TVs, smartphones to rice, milk, ghee. This is the height of freebies. Free medicine, free test, almost free ration, free education, free marriage, free land lease, free house building money, child birth money, no child birth (sterilization), free school food, free Electricity Rs 200 a month, free pilgrimage, free water. Everything is free from birth till death. There is a competition to distribute freebies, then why would anyone work? How will the country develop with the culture of free distribution? From the last ten years to the next twenty years, such a whole generation is being created or our leaders are creating a generation which will completely depend on free culture. If you ask them to work, they will abuse and say, what is the government doing? The limits of irony and inconsistency are being crossed. No party gives these freebies and donations from its own funds. They use taxpayers' money. We are creating 'parasites not citizens'. How long will the taxpayer minority of the country take care of the majority society for free? When this economic equation will spread, then this free culture generation will be twenty thirty years old. One who has never eaten hard-earned bread in life, he will always eat it for free. If not found, this generation will become Naxalite, become extremist, but will not be able to work. What kind of society are they creating? What kind of anomalous politics is this? There is a need to think seriously.

Certainly the poor women of Punjab will benefit from such a scheme, but the question is, are all the poor women in

Punjab? Then what is Kejriwal trying to convey by providing such assistance to rich and prosperous women? As the promise of free electricity and 20 thousand litres of water to every family in Delhi every month up to 200 units has stalled the development of Delhi? Roads are broken; no new development plan has come out. Despite such conditions, the Aam Aadmi Party has achieved resounding success in two consecutive elections. But he has also started such a tradition that inspired by it, political parties of those states have started competing to promise free facilities to a ridiculous level, which are economically counted diseased states. In the present era, the spark of lust for power has been ignited so much, politics are crippling the people and the system is going on for the taste of power. The primary responsibilities of social reform, employment, creation of new enterprises, promotion of agriculture, revival of rural life have been absent from the books of political parties, all political parties have gathered in the effort to make their hands yellow without applying mehndi. Instead of saving the public from the addiction of freebies, they are trying to straighten their political desires by catching them. In a democracy, making people negative, lazy, greedy, indolent, lungi, is it an example of political doers? Has your own interest and selfishness become omnipresent? In fact, through free means, we will give birth to a society which will be dependent and dormant without becoming productive and this will have a direct impact on both the ecology and progress of the country. The question arises that how long will we continue to support this immoral politics? The first responsibility to curb this is on us people. In a healthy and ideal democracy, the first responsibility of governments is to implement such schemes, which can lead to all-round development. 43 people dead, 46 villages burned, looted in Darfur

At least 43 people were killed and 46 villages were burned and looted during a conflict between Arab nomads and farmers from the Misseriya



Jebel tribe in West Darfur's Jebel Moon locality, the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs in Sudan (OCHA) said.

According to the OCHA, the conflict broke out on November 17, reports Xinhua news agency. Initial reports indicate that at least 43 people have been killed, 46 villages have been burned and looted, and an unknown number of people were injured due to ongoing fighting. "Several people are reportedly missing, including children," the Office noted. Sudan's Darfur region has witnessed a civil war

since 2003 during the rule of former President Omar al-Bashir, who was ousted on April 11, 2019. The transitional government in Sudan sought to end the armed conflict in the Darfur region through an agreement reached on October 3, 2020, but some armed groups are yet to sign the agreement.

An estimated 66,500 people live in Jebel Moon locality, and more than 43,000 are people in need of humanitarian assistance, according

MACRON, DRAGHI MEET TO DISCUSS TREATY AIMED AT BOOSTING EU TIES

French President Emmanuel Macron and Italian Prime Minister Mario Draghi met to work toward finalising the "Quirinale Treaty". Italian officials have said the Treaty will not only strengthen ties

between the two long-time allies, but also more widely in the European Union (EU), reports Xinhua news agency.

The Rome bilateral talks focused on several main areas: strengthening the EU, commitment to the Mediterranean and Africa, the transition

toward the digital economy, better environmental policies, security, culture and education, economic and industrial cooperation, cooperation on space exploration.

More details about the Treaty were expected to be released Friday. Relations between Italy and France have sometimes been tense in recent years, after clashes on migration and Libya.



Ethiopian govt urges US to stop spreading false information

The Ethiopian government has urged the US and some organisations to stop spreading false information regarding the country's current situation.

The Ethiopian government has warned the US Embassy in Addis Ababa and other organisations against their continued practice of spreading false information, state media quoted Minister of Communication Service, Kebede Desisa as saying. This came a day after the US Embassy in Ethiopia issued a caution to its citizens residing in Ethiopia over possible terror attacks in the Ethiopian capital Addis Ababa, Xinhua news agency reported. Earlier, the US government repeatedly warned its citizens to leave the east African country over the expanding conflict there.



The conflict, which erupted in November 2020 in Ethiopia's northernmost Tigray region between the Tigray People's Liberation Front (TPLF) and the Ethiopian National Defense Forces, has over the past months spread across neighbouring Amhara and Afar regions as forces loyal to the TPLF have advanced southward. This prompted huge popular mobilisation in the regions as well as other states in the country to fight back the TPLF's expansion. Earlier in December, the Ethiopian House of People's Representatives ratified a six-month state of emergency rule to contain the TPLF's advancement and ensure the country's peace and security.

Soaring prices prompt concerns amid currency drop in Turkey

Turkish citizens are having increasing difficulties coping with the rising prices of almost every item amid high inflation and the national currency depreciation. Turkish currency lira has lost about 40 per cent of its value this year against the US dollar, while the annual inflation hit almost 20 per cent in October. The currency tumbled to a fresh historic low against the greenback on Tuesday, and one dollar was traded at 13.50 liras. Grocery stores, shops and supermarkets in Turkey's biggest city Istanbul have been continuously reflecting the losing value of the lira to the prices, partly with psychological motives, Xinhua news agency reported. "The other day, I walked in a store that sells underwear products. The price of one pair of underpants went up to 50 liras (\$4) from 25 in less than two weeks," Filiz Ertekin, a 77-year-old retired Istanbul

resident living in the Asian side Kadikoy district, told Xinhua. The seller said she should not delay her purchase and that the price of the same product would be even more expensive next week. "Turkey is experiencing a problem of changing the price tags due to the increase in costs mostly brought about by the increase in gasoline prices," Mustafa Sonmez, an economy writer, told Xinhua. Turkey raised the gasoline prices on Wednesday midnight for over 1 lira per litre. In Sonmez's view, some parts of the price increases are "psychological" as everyone is trying to protect themselves. "It's a chain reaction with sellers trying to boost the price of goods and services used in everyday life by saying that the price of everything is increasing somehow," he said. Meanwhile, some quotas have been imposed on the sales of some products, such as sunflower seed oil, sugar and Turkish coffee.

A senior Iranian diplomat has urged the US to lift sanctions in an "effective and verifiable manner", as the remaining parties to the 2015 nuclear deal are preparing to attend a meeting on the revival of the accord next week. Mohammad Reza Ghaebi, the acting head of Iran's mission in Vienna, said that in order to end the current deadlock over the implementation of the 2015 nuclear deal, formally known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), the US government should "stop violating its obligations under the agreement without any delay and precondition", reports Xinhua news agency. Making the remarks before the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), Ghaebi cited "the US violations of the agreement" and "the European countries' unwillingness to clearly condemn the illegal withdrawal



from the JCPOA and the re-imposition of sanctions against Iran" as the root causes for the current impasse regarding the historic agreement. Referring to the upcoming Vienna nuclear meeting, he noted "it is important that the outcome of these efforts ensures that all sanctions will be lifted in an effective and verifiable manner". It is "not reasonable" to expect more forbearance from Iran as long as the sanctions remain in place, he stressed. The US government under former President Donald Trump withdrew from the 2015 agreement in May 2018 and unilaterally reimposed sanctions on Iran. In response, Iran gradually stopped implementing parts of its commitments to the deal in May 2019.

Kabul says to resume Taliban-US talks in Doha

Taliban spokesman, Zabihullah Mujahid has said talks between Taliban and the US would resume in Qatar's capital Doha. "The officials of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan would resume talks and continue the talks with US representatives in line with the Doha agreement and the talks could be helpful," Afghan state-run media agency quoted Mujahid as saying. The talks would help renew commitments, remove concerns and efforts would continue for the release of Afghanistan's frozen money, he added. In the meantime, Afghanistan Foreign Ministry spokesman Abdul Qahar Balkhi said a ranking Kabul delegation led by acting Foreign Minister Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi will stay in Doha from November 27 to 29 with the US delegation, Xinhua news agency reported. Matters pertaining mutual interests, including releasing frozen assets, humanitarian assistance, reopening the US embassy in Afghanistan, would be discussed in the talks, local media reported.

NOW MADHYA PRADESH WILL LEAD IN SOLAR ENERGY STORAGE: CM

A new solar power plant is also being set up in Morena. world. One of the Amrit in this Panchamrit is that of environment and energy conservation. INDIA V NEW ZEALAND 1ST CRICKET TEST MATCH

SOUTHEE AND OPENERS HELP NZ SIT ON TOP AT END OF DAY TWO

Shreyas Iyer struck a hundred on debut to prop up India but a five-wicket haul by Tim Southee followed by half-centuries by openers Will Young and Tom Latham helped New Zealand sit on top at the end of day two of the first Test at the Green Park Stadium here on Friday. After India were bowled out for 345, New Zealand were 129/0 in 57 overs at stumps, trailing the hosts by 216 runs.

When India resumed the day at 258/4, many wouldn't have given a chance to Southee becoming the wrecker-in-chief, especially after he had walked off the field in the second session on Day One due to a groin complaint. But Southee shined in a magnificent bowling display of 11 overs to steal the thunder from Iyer's maiden Test hundred.

Southee broke the 121-run stand between Iyer and



Jadeja as the latter chopped onto his stumps with no feet movement, departing without adding to his overnight score. Iyer, on the other hand, began where he left off on Day One, caressing two boundaries off Kyle Jamieson's first over of the day.

Iyer scores maiden Test century on debut

Shreyas Iyer scored his maiden Test century on debut during the second day of the first Test against New Zealand at Green Park Stadium here on Friday. Iyer reached the milestone with two runs through point off pacer Kyle Jamieson. Before Iyer, his fellow Mumbaiya Prithvi Shaw was the last India batter to register a century on Test debut in 2018, scoring 134 against West Indies in Rajkot. Iyer reached his Test century in 157 balls, including 12 fours and two sixes, adding 25 runs to his overnight score of 75 off 138 balls. Iyer is the second Indian batter after Gundappa Viswanath (against Australia in 1969) to score a Test hundred on debut in Kanpur.



Iyer continued to do well against Jamieson, getting boundaries through a thick edge between slip and wide gully fielder followed by an elegant cover drive. Southee continued to run through the Indian batting order; as Wriddhiman Saha nicked behind to keeper Tom Blundell in the 93rd over. Ravichandran Ashwin stalled his rhythm briefly by taking consecutive boundaries off him. Post drinks break, Southee had his third wicket of the day as Iyer chipped a drive away from the body to cover. He then completed his second five-wicket haul in India by getting one to seam away from Axar Patel, drawing him into a poke and nicked behind to the keeper. Ashwin continued his counter-attack, taking a boundary off each of Southee and Jamieson. He, along with Umesh Yadav, ensured that India didn't lose any more wickets before lunch. 
