


OMICRON TO 'SOON' REPLACE DELTA AS DOMINANT GLOBAL STRAIN

SURGE OF COVID WITH CONFUSION

Amid the surge of Covid-19 cases and new variant 'Omicron', different studies creating more confusion. The World Health Organization (WHO) has cautioned that the more transmissible Omicron together with the currently circulating Delta variants might lead to "a tsunami of cases," putting immense pressure on health systems. Meanwhile, According to John Bell, regius professor of medicine at the Oxford University, the fast-spreading Omicron variant is "not the same disease we were seeing a year ago" and high Covid death rates in the UK are "now history". Bell, who is also the government's life sciences adviser, said that although hospital admissions had increased in recent weeks as Omicron spreads through the population, the disease "appears to be less severe and many people spend a relatively short time in hospital". On the other hand, US-based doctor claims that Omicron variant is "nothing more than a seasonal cold virus" and there is little we can do to stop this virus from infecting people. Afshine Emrani, MD, who holds a Fellowship in the American College of Cardiology (FACC) from the US, said that people who are vaccinated have a much lower chance of dying or getting hospitalised. But there is little it can be done to stop this virus from infecting over 80 per cent of the population, he said. "Masks, vaccine card mandates will make no difference."

China renames 15 places of Arunachal Pradesh in its map

Two days ahead of China implementing new border law, the Chinese government renames 15 places of Arunachal Pradesh in its map.

China's Ministry of Civil Affairs issued a statement stating that they have 'standardised' names for 15 places in Arunachal Pradesh, to be used on Chinese maps.

This is the second time China has renamed the names of the places of Arunachal Pradesh. Way back in 2017, China had changed names of six places. Renaming of names comes just two days ahead of implementing new border law.

On October 23, the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, China's top legislative body, passed a new law citing "protection and exploitation of the country's land border areas". The committee had stated that the new law will come into effect from January 1.

The law is not meant specifically for the border with India. China shares its 22,457 km land boundary with 14 countries including India, the third longest after the borders with Mongolia and Russia.

INDIA CLAIMS THAT CHINA IS ILLEGALLY OCCUPYING ABOUT 38,000 SQ KM OF INDIA'S TERRITORY IN AKSAI CHIN, WHICH BORDERS EASTERN LADAKH. PAKISTAN CEDED TO CHINA ABOUT 5,180 SQ KM IN 1963 FROM THE INDIAN TERRITORY ILLEGALLY OCCUPIED BY IT.

The new border law has 62 articles and seven chapters. As per the law, People's Republic of China shall set up boundary markers on all its land borders to clearly mark the border. The law prohibits any party from indulging in any activity in the border area which would "endanger national security or affect China's friendly relations with neighbouring countries". It includes construction of any permanent buildings by any person without authorisation from the concerned authority.

The fast-spreading Omicron variant is likely to soon replace the Delta strain globally, experts in Singapore have warned, as countries after countries have reported a record surge in Covid cases. "From current data, it looks like Delta will go down over time relative to Omicron," Dr Sebastian Maurer-Stroh, executive director of the Agency for Science, Technology and Research Bioinformatics Institute in Singapore, told The Straits Times on Wednesday. Professor Dale Fisher, a senior consultant at the National University Hospital's Division of Infectious Diseases, said that Omicron is already dominant in Australia, India, Russia, South Africa and the UK. "We are seeing a global transition from Delta to Omicron because with a greater transmissibility,

MAHA SEES FIRST OMICRON DEATH AMID HUGE SURGE IN COVID-19 CASES

Mumbai: Maharashtra on Thursday saw its first death of an Omicron patient, while it continued to report a massive spike in Covid-19 cases for the second consecutive day, leading to prohibitory orders clamped in Mumbai till January 7 and appeals to people to avoid New Year parties. The state notched a staggering 198 new cases of Omicron, taking up the state tally from 252 to 450, with Mumbai accounting for the highest number, at 190, health officials said. The others are from Thane (4), Pune (2) and Satara and Nanded (1 each). A 52-year-old chronic diabetic man, who had recently arrived from Nigeria, passed away following a heart attack, at the Y.B. Chavan Hospital, in Pimpri Chinchwad (Pune) on Tuesday and his reports on Thursday confirmed he was afflicted by Omicron.

DELHI SEES 1,313 NEW COVID CASES, INFECTION RATE RISES TO 1.73%

New Delhi: Delhi on Thursday reported 1,313 fresh Covid cases, the highest single-day number since May 26 when the tally was 1,491, but no death was reported, as per the Health Department bulletin. Meanwhile, the Covid infection in the city has crossed 1 per cent and currently stands at 1.73 per cent, the highest in last seven months. According to the Delhi Health department, the city had recorded 1.93 per cent positivity rate on May 26. With the new cases, the cumulative total has risen to 14,46,415, while the death toll remains at 25,107. The number of active Covid cases have crossed the 3,000 mark and stands at 3,081, highest since June 14 when there were 3,226 active cases. The capital has, so far, detected 263 cases of new Covid variant Omicron. Of these, 57 have been discharged from the hospital.

the virus is fitter and has a reproductive advantage," Fisher was quoted as saying. A Covid-19 tracker, developed by UK's University of Cambridge, has predicted that India

may soon see an intense but short-lived virus wave "within days", even as the highly transmissible Omicron variant of Covid is spreading like wildfire in the country.

CENTRE WRITES TO 8 STATES, UTS FOR PREVENTIVE MEASURES

New Delhi: The Centre on Thursday wrote letters to eight states and union territories (UTs) over the rise in number of new Covid cases. The letter has been addressed to those states reporting increased numbers of Covid and Omicron variant cases. The letter has been written to the health secretaries of Haryana, Delhi, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Karnataka, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra. These states have been told to enhance testing, strengthen hospital-level preparedness, increase pace and coverage of vaccination.

Rs 197.49 cr seized from Peeyush Jain is case property, not turnover: DGGI

The Directorate General of GST Intelligence (DGGI) on Thursday said that total cash recovered from the two premises of Kanpur Businessman Peeyush Jain was Rs 197.49 crore and it is a case property and not the turnover of his company. "Investigations are being carried out in a most professional manner based on specific intelligence. Cash in the ongoing case from the residential and factory premises of Peeyush Jain has been kept as case property in the safe custody of the State Bank of India and further investigation is pending. No deposit of tax dues has been made by Odochem Industries from the seized money to dis-



charge their tax liabilities and their tax liabilities are yet to be determined," said a DGGI official.

Earlier, it was reported that the DGGI had decided to treat the cash recovered from the premises of Peeyush Jain as the turnover of his company. It was also stated that after admitting his liability, Peeyush Jain has, with the approval of the DGGI, will

deposit a total amount of Rs 52 crore as tax dues and will be freed from all allegations. It was also learnt that the DGGI department has agreed with the deposition of Peeyush Jain and finalised the tax liability accordingly.

However, on Thursday the DGGI made it clear that there was nothing going like that. The DGGI refuted all the claims.

PM WANTED BJP-NCP TIE-UP FOR MAHA GOVT, I REJECTED OFFER: PAWAR

A fresh political row erupted after Nationalist Congress Party President Sharad Pawar reiterated that Prime Minister Narendra Modi was keen for an NCP-Bharatiya Janata Party alliance government in Maharashtra after the October 2019 Assembly polls threw up a fractured verdict. Pawar referred to his meeting with the PM on November 20, 2019. At that time, Pawar had confirmed how Modi wanted NCP-BJP to "work together" and even offered a central Cabinet berth to his daughter and Baramati MP Supriya Sule. "There was a discussion about an alliance... I had told the PM right in his office that it was not possible... I would not like to keep them in the dark," Pawar recalled the incident. NCP National Spokesperson and Minority Affairs Minister Nawab Malik endorsed the statement saying it happened in Parliament House and he was also present then.



Kalicharan sent to 2-day police remand, charged with sedition

Religious leader Kalicharan Maharaj, who was arrested on Thursday and charged with sedition for allegedly abusing Mahatma Gandhi, has been sent to police remand for two days by a court. The self-proclaimed godman was arrested from Madhya Pradesh by the Chhattisgarh police in the early hours of Thursday. He was later brought to Raipur, and presented at a local court. Kalicharan had used abusive language against Mahatma Gandhi while praising his assassin Nathuram Godse at a religious event -- "Dharma Sansad", on December 25-26, in Raipur. He made the derogatory remarks



Khajuraho in Madhya Pradesh and brought him to Raipur by road. The arrest, however, has sparked a political row.

against Mahatma Gandhi at the event in which leaders of both the Congress and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) were invited.

Kalicharan's remarks against the Father of the Nation had irked Chhattisgarh's ruling Congress party, and Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel instructed the police team to arrest the godman.

An FIR was lodged against him at Raipur's Tikrapara police station. After days of intense search, Raipur police finally picked him on Thursday from Bageshwar Dham, about 25 km from

ALL PARTIES IN UP WANT POLLS ON TIME: CEC

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Sushil Chandra on Thursday said that representatives of all political parties who met him during his visit to Lucknow, have said that the Assembly elections should be conducted on time following all Covid-19 proto-

cols. This is an indication that there will be no postponement of the elections in the poll-bound states.

Addressing the media at the end of his three-day visit, the CEC said that Uttar Pradesh now has 52.08 lakh new voters who will exercise their franchise in the upcoming assembly elections.

The CEC said that some political parties said that the number of rallies should be limited in view of the pandemic and some wanted deployment of paramilitary forces. "We received some complaints about officers being biased and we have noted all complaints and suggestions," he said.

Rajasthan police conduct identification parade of 'Chintu, Pintu and Kalu' as 70 donkeys go missing

In a bizarre case reported from Hanumangarh district of Rajasthan, police have had to conduct an identification parade of donkeys at a police station after 70 donkeys went missing and their owners lodged complaints of theft in the district in Khuiyan town area.

In the meantime, police found 17 donkeys and conducted their identification parade. However, their owners said they were lookalikes of their animals and refused



to take them.

Earlier, soon after the complaints were registered, the police allegedly preferred to sit on them.

However, a protest staged by the owners and CPI(M) workers at the police station on Tuesday evening forced the police to go in search of the missing donkeys.

The owners staging a sit-in asked the police to leave the donkeys from where they had brought them and again asked them to get their own animals.

They said that the donkeys are their means of liveli-

hood. They informed that the price of a donkey is about Rs 20,000 and 70 stolen donkeys means it is a theft of Rs 14 lakh. The owners said that the donkeys carry loads and their means of livelihood ended after their donkeys were stolen.

Khuiyan police station SHO Vijendra Sharma told the media, "We have formed teams to trace these animals." CPI (M) leader Manoj Choudhary said that the reason they have to stage a sit-in is that complaints of missing animals are rising by the day.



CLOTH MARKETS SHUT IN DELHI TO PROTEST GST HIKE ON TEXTILES

Cloth markets in the national capital were shut on Thursday in protest against the Goods and Services Tax (GST) hike on textiles. Cloth markets of Chandni Chowk, Karol Bagh, Pitampura, Lajpat Nagar, among others, were shut.

Besides Delhi, markets in Uttar Pradesh and Maharashtra were also shut. Though some markets were shut for two hours only, others were closed for the entire day.

The traders have threatened that if the government does not roll back the hike, they will go on an indefinite strike.

Disappointed with the hike in GST, the Chamber of Trade and Industry (CTI) and other associations of cloth traders called for the closure of textile and garment markets on Thursday.

The Delhi Mercantile Association said: "From January 1, 2022, the GST on textiles will be 12 per cent. The Union government increased the GST from five to 12 per cent. Everybody knows that



traders have not been faring well during the past two years due to the corona pandemic."

On Wednesday, various traders' organisations led by the CTI, staged a protest at Connaught Place.

The traders said that if 12 per cent

GST is implemented, then they will not have capital due to which all small workshops will face closure and many people will evade tax.

In such circumstances, it would be very difficult to compete with China and Bangladesh, the traders added.

BIHAR DGP ASKS GIRLS TO GO FOR ARRANGED MARRIAGE

Patna: Bihar DGP S.K. Singhal on Thursday suggested girls to marry with the consents of their parents.

He also said that love marriages have bigger consequences for girls in the society. Addressing a gathering as part of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's 'Samaj Sudhar Abhiyan' (social reforms campaign) in Samastipur, Singhal said: "The daughters should go for arranged marriage with the consent and blessings of their parents. We have witnessed a large number of cases where girls took decisions for marriage on their own, leading to unpleasant consequences."

"We have seen cases where girls went for love marriage and then got killed, while many were also forced into flesh trade. It is the parents who have pay the price for such decisions," Singhal said.

Heavy to extremely heavy rainfall warning for Chennai, surroundings

Several places across Chennai and three surrounding Tamil Nadu districts witnessed over 100 mm of rainfall through the day on Thursday and are expected to receive similar heavy to extremely heavy rainfall for next three days.

Apart from Chennai, Tiruvallur, Kanchipuram, and Chengalpattu districts received heavy to extremely heavy rains, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said, adding, from 8.30 a.m. till 7.45 p.m., the MRC Nagar, Chennai received 198 mm, Chennai Nungambakkam AWS saw 159.5 mm, YMCA Nandanam 152 mm, Anna University 121 mm, ACS Medical college (Kanchipuram district) - 108.5, Meenambakkam ISRO AWS 108 mm, Satyabhama University 58.5 mm, and Tirur KVK



(Tiruvallur district) 46.5 mm.

"Isolated heavy to very rainfall activity is likely to continue over north coastal Tamil Nadu and adjoining areas of south coastal Andhra Pradesh during next three days and decrease thereafter," the IMD said. "There will be increased

rainfall activity over south-east peninsular India during next three days and decrease thereafter. There will be isolated heavy rainfall over coastal Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and Karaikal on Friday and Saturday and over south coastal Andhra Pradesh till January 1," the forecast added.

Unable to bear insult, college student ends life in Chennai

First-year student of M.A. at Presidency College, Chennai, M. Kumar ended his life by jumping before a double-decker train after sending an audio message to his friends and family, stating that he did not want to live a life given as alms by the students of Pachiyappa's college who used to insult him.

Police said that there were regular clashes between students of the colleges during travel by train and bus and recently, students of Presidency College, Chennai staged a rail roko near Avadi and Hindu College railway

stations as Railway Protection Force personnel detained a student after a passenger pulled the chain for celebrating his birthday on the train by cutting cake.

According to police, Kumar, 21, had sent an audio message to his family and friends stating that he was unable to bear the insult meted out by the students of Pachiyappa's college, Chennai and that he did not want to live a life given as alms by the rival students.

He apologised to his mother and friends and the audio clip ended with the rumblings of a train. Kumar, who returned home after attending classes on Tuesday after-

noon, told his mother that he has to attend a wedding and will come back home late.

Initially, Kumar's family and friends dismissed the audio clip, but when he did not return home till Wednesday morning and search was conducted, police found his body on the railway track. Thiruninravur police, which is investigating the case said that Kumar jumped before the double-decker train around 8.40 p.m., a few metres from the Thiruninravur railway station. Police have detained some students of Pachiyappa's college and are investigating the reason for Kumar's death.

IMMUNITY POST COVID INFECTION PERSISTS FOR ABOUT 9 MONTHS: ICMR

The durability of immunity post the Covid infection persists for about 9 months, Indian Council of Medical Research Director General, Dr Balram Bhargava, said on Thursday.

The whole SARS CoV2 virus infects an individual in natural settings, and elicits three kinds of responses - antibody mediated, cell mediated immunity, and immunological memory, he said.

"Based on several global and Indian scientific researches, if you get an infection, you are generally protected for 9 months," he said at press briefing on the Covid situation.

Immunological memory to SARS CoV2 lasted for 8 months in the natural settings as per a study in the US, published in Journal Science. Another study from China says that antibody and cellular immune responses per-



sists more than 9 months after infection, while the longitudinal investigation in the US of multiple studies have shown that antibody responses persists for more than 13 months post infection, he added.

About three studies from India - two by the ICMR and one from

Bombay conducted on 284, 755 and 244 patients, respectively, Bhargava said that immunity persists for up to 8 months, 7 months, and 6 months respectively. "Most of the studies have shown that it persists for 8 to 13 months post infection and we have taken it as around 9 months," he

added. The ICMR chief also said that all Covid vaccines do not prevent infection and are primarily disease modifying.

"All Covid vaccines, whether they are from India, Israel, US, Europe, UK or China, are primarily disease-modifying. They do not prevent infection. The precautionary dose is primarily to mitigate the severity of infection, hospitalisation and death," he said.

Meanwhile, approximately 90 per cent of the adult population in India has been vaccinated against Covid-19 with the first dose, while 63.5 per cent of those eligible have been administered both doses of vaccines, Joint Secretary, Health, Lav Agarwal, said at the briefing.

He said that the weekly positivity rate of more than 10 per cent is being noted in 8 districts - six in Mizoram, one in Arunachal Pradesh, and Kolkata.

AFSPA EXTENDED IN NAGALAND FOR 6 MONTHS, DECLARED 'DISTURBED AREA'

Days after forming a committee to review the Armed Forces Special Power Act (AFSPA) in Nagaland, the Centre on Thursday extended it in the entire state till June 30 next year, declaring the entire state as 'disturbed area'.

According to the Gazette notification issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA): "Whereas the Central Government is of the opinion that the entire area comprising the whole of the state of Nagaland is in such a disturbed and dangerous condition that use of armed forces in aid of civil is necessary."

"Now, therefore, in exercise of the



powers conferred by Section 3 of the Armed Forces (Special Power) Act, 1958 (No. 28 of 1958), the Central Government hereby declares that whole of the State of Nagaland to be 'disturbed area' for a period of six months with effect from 30th December, 2021, for the purpose of the said Act," the notification reads further. The AFSPA empowers the



security forces to conduct operations and arrest anyone without any prior warrant. It also gives immunity to the forces if they shoot someone dead.

This comes amid the protests for the withdrawal of the AFSPA going on in several districts of Nagaland ever since an Army unit killed 14 civilians in Mon district earlier this month, mistaking them as insur-

gents.

On December 23, Union Home Minister Amit Shah held a meeting to discuss the present scenario in Nagaland with the Chief Ministers of Nagaland, Assam and other officials of the states and the Ministry and decided to form a committee to look into the withdrawal of AFSPA in Nagaland and the committee was to submit its report in 45 days. The Nagaland Assembly has recently passed an unanimous resolution to remove this Act and it was expected that the Centre might limit the jurisdiction of the AFSPA to the border areas, viewing the huge resentment among the locals masses.

EDIBLE OIL PRICES DECLINED: FOOD SECRETARY

▶ DESPITE HIGH INTERNATIONAL PRICES, THE GOVERNMENT INTERVENTIONS AIDED BY INCREASED OIL SEEDS PRODUCTION HAS HELPED BRING DOWN EDIBLE OIL PRICES IN RECENT MONTHS, THE FOOD SECRETARY SAID ON THURSDAY.

Earlier in October, the Food Secretary had dashed off a letter to several states mentioning that the respective state governments had to ensure that full benefit of duty reduction made by the Centre is passed on to the consumers in order to provide immediate relief from the prevailing high prices of edible oils, especially during the ensuing festival season.

On Thursday, Pandey, during a media interac-

tion, made a presentation where he showed how prices of different edible oil brands have come down after December 24. Ruchi Soya Industries has reduced retail prices on various oils by Rs 15-30 per litre, Rs 30 for soybean while for kachi Ghani mustard oil, it is less by Rs 20. Adani Wilmar's Fortune Soya oil price came down to Rs 155 per litre and Bunge India's oil prices came down by Rs 15-20 per litre.

PASSENGERS IN DELHI METRO LIMITED TO 200 PER 8-COACH TRAIN

To limit the number of sitting passengers to 50 per cent of its original capacity, the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) announced on Thursday that the number of passengers per 8-coach train will be capped at 200 from the usual 2,400.

The Delhi Metro is currently operating at 50 per cent of its seating capacity after the Delhi government issued 'Yellow Alert' to check the spread of the Covid virus.

An 8-coach train can generally carry about 2,400 passengers, which comprise approximately 50 seating passengers and 250 standing passengers per coach.

With present restrictions of 50 per cent seating and no standing, each coach can now accommodate only about 25 passengers, DMRC said in a release, adding, "Therefore, an 8-coach train can now accommodate approximately 200 passengers only."



It is less than 10 per cent of a train's normal carrying capacity.

"Therefore, travel only if absolutely essential. Also, keep extra time in your commute by the Metro as entry has to

be regulated to ensure compliance with the guidelines, which is resulting in queue's outside the stations," it added.

The move came after long queues were seen outside different Metro sta-

Government notifies sale of electoral bonds through SBI

In a significant notification ahead of the Assembly elections in Uttar Pradesh, Goa, Punjab, Manipur and Uttarakhand scheduled early next year, the Finance Ministry said on Thursday that the State Bank of India (SBI) has been assigned to issue and encash electoral bonds through its 29 authorised branches from January 1-10 next year.

The electoral bonds shall be valid for 15 calendar days from the date of issue and no payment shall be made to any payee political party if

the bond is deposited after the expiry of the validity period, according to an official statement.

"The electoral bond deposited by an eligible political party in its account shall be credited on the same day," it read.

The Centre had notified the Electoral Bond Scheme in 2018.

As per the provisions of the scheme, electoral bonds may be purchased by a person who is a citizen of India or incorporated or established in India. A person being an individual can buy electoral bonds, either singly

or jointly with other individuals.

"Only the political parties registered under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 (43 of 1951) and which secured not less than 1 per cent of the votes polled in the last general elections to the House of the People or the Legislative Assembly of the state, shall be eligible to receive the electoral bonds," the Finance Ministry statement said.

The electoral bonds shall be encashed by an eligible political party only through a bank account with the authorised bank.

IVF donor held for kidnapping toddler in Delhi

The police have rescued a two-year-old child who was kidnapped from the western part of the national capital eight days ago by an IVF donor and her associates, an official said here on Thursday.

Four people, including a 20-year-old woman, were apprehended for the crime. The accused have been identified as Tanu, Vipin, Md. Salman and a minor.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (West District) Urvija Goel said on December 22, a PCR call was received at the Rajouri Garden police station about the kidnapping of a boy from a flyover near Rajdhani College, Raja Garden Delhi.

Based on the complaint, the police registered a case under section 363 of the Indian Penal



Code at Rajouri Garden police station. On receiving the information, a police team was constituted which rushed to the spot.

"The team analysed the CCTV footage of the area to collect clues about the culprits," the DCP said.

In a CCTV footage, police found two suspicious boys on a motorcycle wandering near a boy. Later, one suspect was identified and apprehended from Subzi Mandi, Azadpur area. On interrogation, he disclosed the conspiracy based on which three more accused, including the mastermind Tanu, were nabbed.

The kidnapped baby was recovered from Tanu's shanty at Jahangir Puri.

For the past three years, the accused woman had been working as an egg donor in Avaya IVF Hospital, Rajouri Garden, Delhi.

KALICHARAN HELD FROM KHAJURAHO OVER REMARKS AGAINST MAHATMA GANDHI

Hindu religious leader Kalicharan was arrested from Khajuraho on Thursday for allegedly making remarks against the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi.

Kalicharan made controversial speech at a 'dharma sansad' or religious gathering held in Raipur on December 26.

Kalicharan's derogatory remarks against Mahatma Gandhi prompted chief patron Mahant Ramsundar Das to disown the event and walk out.

Later, Congress leader Pramod Dubey filed a police complaint against Kalicharan, accusing him of promoting enmity between communities.

As per police, Kalicharan booked a guest house in Khajuraho but did not stay there, instead went to a rented house, some 25 km from Khajuraho. To evade arrest, all his close aides had also switched off their mobile phones, sources said.

On Thursday morning, a team of 10 policemen tracked him down, arrested him and took him back to Chhattisgarh's capital Raipur. "Kalicharan has been arrested from Khajuraho area and taken to Raipur," said a



senior police official from Chhattisgarh on condition of anonymity.

The police official also said that Kalicharan will be produced before a court by Thursday evening.

In a video clip that was widely circulated on social media, Kalicharan declared that "the aim of Islam is to capture the nation through politics." "Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi destroyed the country. Salutations to Nathuram Godse, who killed him," he added. During his speech, Kalicharan was also heard urging people to elect a staunch Hindu leader to protect Hinduism.

HEAT OF DECEMBER CONTINUES

This is the third December in a row that the government is facing protests in the country specially in the national capital with resident doctors on strike over the issue of NEET PG counselling. The doctors strike comes at a time when the threat of a third wave of Covid-19, especially the Omicron variant, looms over the country. In 2020 it was the farmers' agitation which had made the government uneasy and in 2019 it was the countrywide agitation over NRC-CAA in which Delhi's Shaheen Bagh became the epicentre of the protest. The government this year resolved the farmers' protest by withdrawing the contentious farm laws but now it has to tackle the resident doctors' protest over NEET. The Health Minister and the Resident Doctors Association could not reach a consensus on Tuesday over the issue. The resident doctors have been protesting for the past 13 days over the delay in NEET-PG 2021 counselling. The government did not focus on the issue initially and now the agitation has spread from Delhi to other parts of the country. The 15-month-long farmers agitation started against the three contentious farm laws after they were passed in 2020. The agitation petered off after the three laws -- the Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill, 2020, Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill, 2020 and the Essential Commodities (Amendment) Bill 2020 -- were repealed by Parliament. The Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019 (CAA) was notified on December 12, 2019 and came into force on January 10, 2020. The persons covered under the CAA may apply for citizenship after the rules are notified under the CAA. There were huge protests in several parts of the country following the government's announcement that the nationwide NRC will be done in late 2019 and early 2020.

Big response but bigger challenges before Akhilesh Yadav in 2022

Swelling crowds, enthused cadres, increasing ground support and a cleverly stitched up alliance may seem a perfect recipe for elections for the Samajwadi Party, but this picture perfect cannot hide the challenges that Akhilesh Yadav faces in the 2022 polls. For the first time in his two-decade long political career, Akhilesh is leading a campaign single-handedly with almost no back-up mechanism in the party. Party patriarch Mulayam Singh Yadav is conspicuous by his absence from the campaign and his health issues may not permit him to address more than one or two meetings. In 2012, when Akhilesh led his party to a comfortable majority, he was firmly backed by his father, while he travelled across the state. Mulayam would carefully chart his programme, identify leaders who would accompany him and also decide on issues that had to be addressed in different regions. This time, Akhilesh is the sole campaigner and star attraction of his party and this naturally adds to the challenge and the burden. Since he took over as the party president in 2017, Akhilesh has not allowed second rung leadership in the party to develop and, today, he runs a one-man army with not even his cousins taking part in the political exercise. The Samajwadi Party also lacks mature leaders who can deal with situations in the absence of Akhilesh. Party veterans have either passed away -- like Beni Prasad Varma, Bhagwati Singh -- or are completely side-lined. The BJP, on the other hand, has a



galaxy of campaigners that simultaneously hold fort. On any given day -- as elections draw close -- there are, at least, six BJP leaders addressing meetings in the state. Another challenge that Akhilesh faces is to rein in overzealous party workers. Buoyed up by the people's response in Akhilesh's rallies, the untamed cadres often go overboard leading to major embarrassments for the party. For instance, a group of party workers in Kanpur were arrested on Wednesday for attempting to create ruckus during the Prime Minister's visit on Tuesday. As the BJP underlined the incident as an example of 'SP's goondaism', Akhilesh was compelled to expel the five party workers. Akhilesh also faces the challenge of striking a perfect balance between his Muslim and Hindu supporters. The BJP has forced him to abandon the policy of Muslim

appeasement -- or at least, not be vocal about it -- and peddle soft Hindutva. As Akhilesh cautiously moves ahead, trying to balance the two ideologies, his Muslim leaders tend to act as irritants. For instance, the recent statements made by SP MPs Shafiqur -- Rehman Barq and S.T. Hasan, embarrassed the SP to such an extent that Akhilesh was forced to disassociate himself from his own MPs. Meanwhile, as the time for ticket distribution draws near, Akhilesh will also face a situation when he will have to handle discontent within his own party. Seats that are given away to multiple allies, will leave the SP workers on these seats simmering with anger. The party could face internal sabotage and it will be testing time for Akhilesh to deal with the situation because the SP leaders have been working for five years in their respective constituencies to contest elections. Akhilesh has never dabbled in coalition politics and his new allies like Om Prakash Rajbhar, are known to drive a hard bargain in politics. How he keeps all his allies in good humour, remains to be seen. Another problem that Akhilesh has is his inaccessibility. He mostly remains unavailable to party workers and also the media and no one in the party is authorised to take a call on his behalf. Unlike Akhilesh, Mulayam Singh Yadav -- despite his advancing years, still picks up the phone on random basis and talks to senior journalists and party workers, especially old timers. It is this that keeps still Mulayam clued into ground realities and also tuned in to emerging situations.

A wish for transforming healthcare in India

Most health care in India is presently provided by the private sector, principally funded via out-of-pocket payments. The once upon a time ubiquitous 'Family doctor' concept in the country has almost disappeared and has become extinct. Most 'worried well' who are asymptomatic, and equally, those with minor common ailments rush to hospitals. It may be pertinent to point out here that it is all the more important that patients with simple non urgent ailments are kept away from hospitals, which until recently, were stretched to their limits & overwhelmed with managing Covid suspect/Covid positive patients. According to a report published by the Medical Council of India in 2020, around 44,000 Postgraduate seats are available for 55,000 doctors who graduate every year. In other words, the vast majority will become Specialists. Although "Family Medicine" DNB Courses conducted by the National Board of Examinations are available, there are very few applicants because the number of centres

accredited to train doctors wishing to pursue a career as a Family Physician, are few and far between. The concept of visiting the 'Family doctor' before a patient sees a Specialist is the standard practice in the UK. In Britain, the General Practitioner (GP) is the principal treating doctor who is able to manage most minor issues sensibly based on evidence and refer patients to Specialist Centres only when needed. The NHS model of providing universal primary health care through public-private partnership (PPP) may be appropriate for adaptation in the Indian context. The three primary elements of primary care that have a bearing on improving healthcare outcomes are:

- Preventive care (such as vaccination, Screening, measuring blood pressure)
- Care of chronic disease (Most of the chronic illness can be managed effectively outside hospital)

 Diagnostic triage and control of hospital referral (effective primary care sorts the serious from the non-serious by speedy and accurate diagnosis, directs hospital referrals to

the most appropriate speciality and ensures that expensive hospital resources are expended on those who will benefit most). India has about 8,00,000 medical doctors of which about 6,00,000 are GPs. But more than three quarters of these are in urban centers which make up only about 20 per cent of India's population. Access to a doctor in urban India is about the same as it would be on average in the US. However, the ratio of GPs to patients outside these metro areas is about 1 GP for every 7,500 patients on average and as low as 1 for every 25,000 people in more remote areas. General Practitioners must be "gatekeepers" of our healthcare system. They should be the first point of contact for patients for any sickness or preventive visit. India must invest in training GPs in addition to popularising and sensitising young impressionable students who have joined MBBS Course about the Family Medicine concept. Furthermore, Primary Healthcare infrastructure in rural India (where more than 70 per cent of our population resides) must be strengthened so that more

patients are served locally by GPs, thus obviating the arduous & time consuming task of travelling long distances for assessment / treatment. It is my heartfelt desire that the Government of India and powers that be initiate concrete and implementable measures to ensure that the 'Family Doctor' concept is revived. We, as a country, must switch from the doctrine of practising the more aggressive "Americanised Medicine" to "British Medicine", which is far more conservative and evidence-based. An important component of the Hippocratic oath is to "keep the good of the patient as the highest priority" and this landmark step would pave the path in this direction by ensuring well controlled uniform effective healthcare to the citizenry. PROTESTERS SET FIRE TO AUSTRALIA'S OLD PARLIAMENT HOUSE

Protesters on Thursday set fire to the Old Parliament House in Australia's capital city of Canberra, which badly damaged the front entrance of the building. Firefighters were called to the site at about 11.30 a.m. (local time), reports Xinhua news agency. Video footage by local media showed protesters at the front of the building. The Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) reported that the Old Parliament House, which now houses the Museum of Australian Democracy, was forced to close last week when protesters started a fire at the door, which was later believed to be a ceremonial blaze. ABC reported that crowds began gathering last week as the Aboriginal Tent Embassy, a site on the lawns outside the Old Parliament House for the political rights of the indigenous Australians, is to celebrate its 50th anniversary. The Old Parliament House was used for parliamentary purpose from 1927 to 1988, when a new building was inaugurated. Ben Morton, special minister of state and

public service minister, who is responsible for Old Parliament House, condemned the damage in a statement on his official website. "Today's actions at Old Parliament House were not peaceful. The resulting damage undermines the message that peaceful protesters seek to deliver. It is the government's expectation that all illegal activity should be dealt with by the police and the courts to the full extent possible," he said. The Minister noted that damage to the building will be fully restored back to its original condition. Meanwhile, the ACT Policing confirmed Thursday's incident as continuation of a series of recent protests. "Old Parliament House was evacuated earlier today after protesters started a fire at the front doors of the building - this was quickly extinguished by ACT Fire and Rescue," 7 News Australia quoted a spokesperson said. "There has been ongoing protest activity at the front of Old Parliament House throughout the past fortnight." Reacting to the incident, Deputy Prime Minister Barnaby Joyce said it was "an absolute disgrace".

US TO APPOINT 2 FEMALE DIPLOMATS TO REPRESENT WASHINGTON IN KABUL

The deteriorating situation in reference to the rights for women in Afghanistan under the Taliban rule has prompted US President Joe Biden's administration to appoint two senior female diplomats, assigned to represent Washington in Kabul. In a release on Wednesday, the State Department said that Special Envoy Rina Amiri and Senior Advisor Stephenie Foster "bring decades of public policy, diplomatic, and advocacy experience to the Department". While, Amiri had previously served as a US special envoy for Afghanistan and Pakistan during former President Barack Obama's administration, Foster has earlier worked for the State Department. "I welcome Rina Amiri back to the Department as the Special Envoy for Afghan Women, Girls, and Human Rights, with her breadth and depth of expertise and strong track record advising governments, the US, peacebuilding organisations, and think tanks," Secretary of State Antony Blinken was quoted as saying in the release. Blinken said that Amiri will "work on issues of critical importance to me, this administration, and US national security: the human rights and fundamental freedoms of women, girls, and other at-risk populations in all of their diversity." "We desire a peaceful, stable, and secure Afghanistan, where all Afghans can live and thrive in political, economic, and social inclusivity.



Special Envoy Amiri will work closely with me toward that goal," he added. Regarding Foster, the Secretary of State said her "diverse public and private sector experiences, including at the Department, and her passion for advancing women and girls' safety and equality will help advance around-the-clock relocation and resettlement efforts on behalf of our Afghan allies and their families." Afghanistan is currently in the midst of severe economic and humanitarian challenges which have further deteriorated since the fall of the country to the Taliban on August 15. According to the UN, Afghan women and girls are paying an especially high price for the ongoing poverty and hunger in the country. Following the political change, secondary girls' schools have remained closed in most of the coun-

try's provinces, including Kabul. Earlier this week, the Taliban-led government's Ministry of Virtue and Vice issued a new directive that orders women who are travelling long distances by road should be accompanied by a male relative, and they should wear a hijab, to cover their head and face. The directive also banned playing music in the vehicles. It also ordered shops not to show the heads of female mannequins as it is against the Islamic Sharia law. Many human rights activists have condemned the rigid laws imposed by the Taliban. On Tuesday, Kabul also witnessed women led rally to protest against the latest travel ban imposed by the Taliban, demanding and calling on the global community to come to their rescue. "I want to tell the world, tell the Taliban to stop killing. We want freedom, we want justice, we want human rights," said Nayera Koahistani as she along with dozens of other women protest on the streets of Kabul. The Biden administration has been criticised for not prioritising the safe passage for women, rights activists and others who had been targeted by the Taliban in the past. Even though, Biden maintained that his decision to exit Afghanistan was the right thing to do; concerns over women rights and an inclusive government in Afghanistan would remain as part of Washington's demands with the Taliban, if the latter wants global recognition.

AUSTRALIA JOLTED BY INDONESIA EARTHQUAKE


Canberra: Parts of northern Australia was jolted by a 7.4-magnitude earthquake that hit off the coast of Indonesia on Thursday, with no immediate reports of damage or injuries. The tremor was felt at about 3.55 a.m. in Darwin, capital of Northern Territory, Xinhua news agency quoted the local media reports as saying. There was no tsunami threat, said the Australian Bureau of Meteorology on Twitter. Many local residents were waken up by the shake. "I woke up at about 4 a.m. at the strong quake, which then lasted for another 20 seconds," Ben, a Darwin resident, told Xinhua. "I could hear dogs barking and my neighbours getting up as well." Some people took to social media to talk about the quake. "The ground just shook for a full minute in Darwin," Zizi Averill tweeted. "Nothing like a possible 4m earthquake to remind you 2021 isn't done with us yet." "It was a long earthquake and quite strong, too, but for some reason, not many people in our building fled to the lobby," said Jacinth Tome. The Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) said no damage or injuries were reported yet. The ABC quoted Geoscience Australia senior seismologist Hadi Ghasemi as saying that their modelling and first reports all suggested a "moderate to light level of ground shaking". "We don't expect any damage to well-built structures," said Ghasemi.

Punjab-origin realtor, scientist honoured with Order of Canada

The two are among 39 persons who have been honoured with the Order of Canada by Governor General Mary Simon. The award citation says Dhillon has been awarded for "his achievements in business, and for his unwavering commitment to philanthropy and higher education", and Lakshmanan for "his philanthropy and for his expertise in hydrometallurgy and business, which have greatly benefited his profession, community and Canada-India relations". Dhillon, who founded the real estate group Mainstream Equity, is the biggest landlord in Canada in the mid-segment rental market today.



His group owns more than 15,000 units across the country. One of the richest Indo-Canadians, Dhillon comes from a family from Tallewal village near Barnala in Punjab. Lakshmanan is an internationally renowned clean energy scientist and innovator in sustainable development. Born in Chennai, he went to the UK for higher studies and came



to Canada in 1974. He founded Process Research ORTECH which is a global leader in sustainable process technologies. It runs its laboratory and pilot plant in Mississauga on the outskirts of Toronto. He is currently the CEO of the company. Another Indo-Canadian, Pradeep Merchant of Greely in Ontario, has been appointed Member of the Order of Canada "for his long-standing contributions to his community, including his philanthropy and his leadership in the promotion of bilateral ties between Canada and India". The Order of Canada is one of the highest civilian awards in Canada, recognising outstanding achievement, dedication to the community and service to the nation.

PAK HINDU COUNCIL INVITES PILGRIMS TO ENCOURAGE 'FAITH TOURISM'

New Delhi: The Pakistan Hindu Council (PHC) has invited a group of 250 pilgrims, including from India, to visit the country in an attempt to encourage "faith tourism", Dawn news reported. The group will visit the shrine of Paramhans Ji Maharaaj, a saint who had died at Teri village, in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Karak district in 1919. "A number of Hindu pilgrims from India, the United Arab Emirates and the US will arrive in Peshawar on Jan 1 to visit the Samadhi at Teri," PHC patron Ramesh Kumar Vankwani told Dawn news. The Hindu Council has arranged the programme in collaboration with Pakistan International Airlines. "This is the second time that the council has invited Hindu pilgrims from other countries so that they can see for themselves the existence of a tolerant and pluralistic society in Pakistan," Vankwani added. Fifty-four Hindus from India, Canada, Singapore, Australia and Spain had visited the country last month. The group was led by Shri Satguru Ji Maharaaj Ji, the fifth successor of Paramhans Ji Maharaaj, Chief Justice of Pakistan Gulzar Ahmad had celebrated Diwali at Teri temple last month to express solidarity with local members of the Hindu community and to welcome pilgrims from other parts of the country. According to Vankwani, the PHC invited the Chief Justice only to give a message to "hate-mongers that the state is determined to foil their nefarious designs". In his speech at the temple, he had assured the Hindu community that they enjoyed the same rights as other Pakistanis.





MUMBAI ON HIGH ALERT AFTER INTEL OF KHALISTANI ATTACK ON NEW YEAR'S EVE

- Central agencies alerted Mumbai of Khalistani attack on New Year's eve

Mumbai Police on Thursday issued high alert after it said information was received that Khalistani elements could carry out terrorist attacks in the city. Giving details to news agency ANI, Mumbai Police said all the police holidays and weekly holidays have been cancelled for Friday and every policeman posted in Mumbai will be on duty.

Mumbai Police has cancelled all holidays or weekly offs for December 31 over security concerns in the city. The decision was taken after an alert was received from central agencies over Khalistani elements planning to target Mumbai on New Year's eve.



As per reports, extremely high security is expected to be witnessed especially in the congested area of Mumbai on December 31.

Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) is already in place in Mumbai, though it's in view of Covid.

In addition to this, the police order prohibits all New Year celebrations, programmes, functions and gatherings in any closed or open space, including

hotels, restaurants, banquet halls, bars, pubs, orchestras, resorts, clubs and rooftops. Quaiser Khalid, Commissioner of Police, Mumbai Railway, said in view of the alert in Mumbai, tight security has been deployed at the major stations of Mumbai, Dadar, Bandra Churchgate, CSMT, Kurla and other stations.

He also added that more than 3000 railway officers will be deployed on Friday at various sensitive places.

NO BAIL FOR UNION MINISTER NARAYAN RANE'S MLA SON

Sindudurg: In a huge setback for BJP lawmaker and Union Minister Narayan Rane's son, Nitesh Rane, a local court in Maharashtra's Sindudurg on Thursday rejected his anticipatory bail application. His lawyer Sangram Desai said that since the bail application has been declined, they would move the Bombay High Court soon after getting the copy of the court orders. Along with Nitesh Rane - who is currently "missing", the bail plea of one of his associates and co-accused was also rejected in the assault case against them. The court order came after a tough legal battle between the prosecution lawyers and the defence team before the judge since Tuesday. However, advocate Desai said it was wrong to term Nitesh Rane as an "absconder" even as the Maharashtra Police are now likely to step up efforts to arrest him.

3,671 New Covid Cases In Mumbai on Thursday, 46% Higher Than Wednesday

India Covid Cases: Delhi, Gurgaon, Kolkata, and Bengaluru are among the other big cities that have witnessed an uptick in infections over the last week.

Mumbai saw a massive surge in fresh coronavirus cases yet again today with 3,671 infections - 46% higher compared to yesterday - amid concerns over Omicron, the new variant which has been labeled as "highly infectious" by experts and has sparked worry over a third wave in the country. India's financial capital has seen a five-fold increase over the last week in the daily surge in Covid cases - the city logged 683 infections last Friday. Fearing a fresh coronavirus wave, the city's civic body - the Brihanmumbai Municipal

Corporation - has reactivated its ward-level war rooms to tackle the increasing number of cases. These war rooms are set up in all 24 wards to manage hospital admissions, oxygen and medicine requirements and vaccination as well.

The war rooms - that follow the "test, trace and treat" strategy - also keep a track of patients isolated at their homes. While cases have been rising, the Mumbai civic body has said, more than 90 per cent of the cases are asymptomatic.

This afternoon, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray met the state's Covid task force. One of the key discussions at the high-level meet-

ing was on the new variant that is believed to be driving up the infections in the state, which has the highest overall cases in the country (66,65,386).

In Mumbai, despite a ban on large gatherings ahead of the New Year's celebrations, the streets are still witnessing huge crowds.

Across India, so far 961 Omicron cases have been logged so far, the government said today, stressing the country is prepared to tackle the spike and there is "no need to panic".

Delhi, Gurgaon, Kolkata, and Bengaluru are among the other big cities that have witnessed an uptick in infections over the last week.

MALEGAON 2008 CASE: END THREATS, ENTICEMENT OF WITNESSES, URGES CONGRESS

In a significant development, the Maharashtra Congress on Thursday urged the Maha Vikas Aghadi government to ensure that the witnesses in the sensitive Malegaon 2008 blasts case "are not pressurised, threatened or enticed".

In a letter to Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and Home Minister Dilip Walse-Patil, Congress state Working President Arif Naseem Khan said the terror case has prominent names as prime accused, including Bharatiya Janata Party MP Sadhvi Pragya Singh Thakur, Col. P.S. Purohit, retired Major Ramesh Upadhyay, Dayanand Pandey and several others.

"I have learnt that in order to save all these accused in the Malegaon 2008 bomb blast case, some organisations and individuals are threatening, pressurising and luring the witnesses to make them 'hostile' before the court," Khan said.

The blast occurred in Malegaon on September 29, 2008, near a mosque when Muslims were offering prayers,



and left at least nine dead and another more than 80 injured, and the subsequent probe revealed the involvement of what was called 'saffron terror groups'.

Khan urged Thackeray and Walse-Patil that such groups or persons should be investigated by a high-level committee and stringent action must be initiated against them for influencing or harassing the witnesses.

The case was probed by the Maharashtra Anti Terrorist Squad and later taken over by the National Investigation Agency (NIA), and has a total of 495 witnesses.

From these, 220 witnesses have already testified, out of which 15 have already been declared 'hostile', with the likelihood of more witnesses going against the probe agency

owing to pressures exerted by some organisations and persons, Khan pointed out. The Congress leader said that Walse-Patil had assured he would do the needful in the matter in order to ensure a free and fair trial at the day-to-day hearing before a Special Court. Khan's letter assumes significance, coming a day after a witness in the case made a shocking claim that he was allegedly detained for a week by the ATS in 2008 and then compelled to name five RSS leaders, including Yogi Adityanath, who is now Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh. The witness, who is one of the trustees of Abhinav Bharat, a right-wing group, also contended that the ATS did not record his statement though the agency had attached his purported five-page statement in its charge sheet filed in 2009. During the cross-examination, the witness named Adityanath, Swami Aseemanand, Indresh Kumar, a Prof. Deodhar and one Kakaji, whose names he was allegedly forced to take by one police official Chavan, DCP Shrirao and an IPS officer Param Bir Singh.

Maha police team in Chhattisgarh to seek custody of Kalicharan

The Pune Police has rushed a team to Chhattisgarh to seek custody of the arrested preacher, Kalicharan Maharaj who is accused of making objectionable remarks against Mahatma Gandhi, official sources said here on Thursday.

Last weekend, at a two-day religious congregation (Dharam Sansad) held in Chhattisgarh, Kalicharan Maharaj had allegedly made certain derogatory statements against the Father of the Nation and also eulogised his assassin Nathuram Godse, which kicked off a major political row in different parts of India.

Multiple police complaints have been lodged against him in Maharashtra in Pune, Akola, including



one by Nationalist Congress Party Dr Jitendra Awhad in Thane, seeking to book Kalicharan Maharaj - who hails from Akola in Maharashtra - for his utterances. The police arrested him from Khajuraho on Thursday morning, even as Maharashtra Police waits to book him under various charges, as descendants of

Gandhi have also flayed him. The matter also figured in the Maharashtra Legislature Assembly which ended on December 28, when the ruling Maha Vikas Aghadi and Opposition Bharatiya Janata Party leaders had slammed Kalicharan Maharaj for his statements, and had demanded stringent action against him.

Expect 150% more cases in third wave compared to second in Maharashtra: Centre

Alarmed by a massive surge in Covid-19 cases in more than half a dozen districts across the state, more stringent norms are on the cards to tackle the pandemic.

Chief minister Uddhav Thackeray is expected to take a task force meeting in a day or two and declare measures.

The state feels the situation in Mumbai, Thane, Nashik, Pune, Solapur, Sangli and Satara is disturbing owing to a lack of discipline and non-adherence to norms. The number of active cases increased from 6,481 on December 14 to 11,492 on December 28 in the state. In Mumbai, active cases increased from 1,769 to 5,803 during the same period. According to the Centre, dur-



ing the third wave, there will be 150% more cases compared to the second wave in the state. "Under such circumstances, we have no option but to tackle the situation on a war footing. We will have to enforce Covid norms. The Centre has asked us to make preparations," a senior public health official said.

The official said a provi-

sion of Rs 4,235 crore has been made for providing medicines and infrastructure. Out of this, the state will contribute Rs 1,100 crore, Centre Rs 1,185 crore, and SDRF and DPDC Rs 2,000 crore. The fund will be at the disposal of the public health department. "We have taken note of the shortcomings during the first and second wave. We are sure we will

not face that problem now. We have adequate funds and manpower to tackle the situation," he said.

During the peak of the second wave, total cases in the state stood at 8.63 lakh. As per estimates for the third wave, total cases in the state may cross 13 lakh. Of this, eight lakh are expected to be home-quarantined and five lakh hospitalized.

Four including auto-rickshaw driver arrested for stealing Rs 2.5 lakh from commuter

An auto-rickshaw driver and three others were arrested for allegedly stealing Rs 2.50 lakh from a commuter in Mumbai. The accused had used a fake number plate to avoid getting caught.

On December 12, the complainant, who works as a real estate developer in Andheri, left for work from his home in Santacruz with a bag containing Rs 2.50 lakh. He had returned to India from Italy just a week ago.

One of the arrested accused Muzzamil Mansuri, 34, a rickshaw driver offered to drop him to Andheri in his share rickshaw for Rs 10. Two other accused were already seated in the rickshaw.

The complainant sat in the rickshaw and at some distance, the fourth accused came and sat on the front seat with the driver. At some distance, Mansuri asked him to go and sit at the back as cops may catch them at the traffic signal. The accused told the complainant to keep his bag in the rear as there was no space for them.

As the complainant kept the bag behind, one of the accused kept his shoulder around it and another replaced the money in the



bag with sandals. The complainant realised he was duped after he got down from the rickshaw.

Based on CCTV cameras, modus operandi and informers, the Santacruz police traced the accused and recovered some of the stolen money from them. All four accused are residents of areas between Kurla (west) and Andheri (east) and three of them have a previous criminal record.

Top Maharashtra leaders who attended Assembly, weddings test positive for Covid-19

The leaders who attended the winter session of the Maharashtra Legislature Assembly and weddings have tested positive for Covid-19.

Many top Maharashtra leaders, including ministers, have tested positive for Covid-19 in the last couple of days.

Apart from mingling during the winter session of the Maharashtra Legislature, most of these leaders have attended the reception of NCP state president and minister Jayant Patil's son's marriage and BJP leader Harshavardhan Patil's daughter's marriage to Bal Thackeray's grandson. NCP leader Supriya Sule who attended both functions has tested positive along with husband Sadanand. Harshavardhan Patil has tested positive. Jayant Patil's nephew and minister Prajakt Tanpure has also been found infected with Covid-19. Other leaders who tested positive during the winter session include

Tribal Development Minister KC Padavi, Education Minister Varsha Gaikwad, BJP MLA Radhakrishna Vikhe Patil, BJP's Hingana MLA Sameer Meghe, and BJP MLA from Parvati, Pune, Madhuri Misal. Two staff members of Leader of Opposition Devendra Fadnis's office have also been infected with Covid-19 during the session. These leaders who have tested positive have attended the session and the functions. In the last week, there have been at least five VIP marriages in the state. Apart from Jayant Patil's son and Harshavardhan Patil's daughter, Shiv Sena MLC Ravindra Fatak's son Shiv Sena MLA from Kannad in Aurangabad Uday Singh Rajput's son, and Former BJP MLA Shivajirao Kardile's son got married. Shiv Sena leader Sanjay Raut who attended a marriage ceremony in Nashik on

Wednesday said that these marriages were decided long ago. "Covid numbers are doubling up and it's a cause for concern. CM has called for new restrictions during night these restrictions should not be extended to day time if it happens, it will bring the economic wheel of the state to a standstill. If this has to be avoided, everyone should take care."

Raut also blamed PM Modi for not wearing a mask and said that he also follows the PM in not wearing a mask. "The PM says use a mask, but he himself doesn't wear one. So, we will listen to the PM and follow him and hence I don't use a mask. The CM uses a mask, but the nation's leader doesn't use a mask. People haven't seen him wearing a mask. The PM should himself wear a mask in public functions." "State administration should take care. As far as marriages

are concerned, there will be a way out soon. Still, I have seen that people have followed rules. Supriya Sule attended marriages, I also attended a few, Prajakt Tanpure, Varsha Gaikwad have tested positive. Everyone should take care," Raut said. Meanwhile, Deputy CM Ajit Pawar while talking to reporters in Pune appealed to everyone to take care. "It is not only marriages of politicians, even when you have a marriage in your house, you invite us and tell us that Covid guidelines will be followed, but the actual picture there is different. If this keeps happening frequently, we will have to think about getting out. But if we as politicians don't venture out, then you (media) will only say that we are not going out. Covid rules should also be followed. We as rulers should not only be telling about it, but we also should follow them."

Rapper Kanye West is desperate to rekindle his romance with Kim Kardashian and he recently bought a \$4.5 million home on the same street as his estranged wife.



INDIA BREACH FORTRESS CENTURION WITH 113-RUN WIN OVER SOUTH AFRICA

India signed off 2021 with a 113-run win over South Africa in the first Test at SuperSport Park here on Thursday. The win is also India's first-ever Test victory at the venue, which is largely considered to be a fortress for South Africa. With this win, India have also taken a 1-0 lead in the three-match series. It took only two overs after lunch for India to wrap a memorable win. Marco Jansen began the second session by taking two boundaries off Mohammed Shami. But on the fifth ball, Shami had the last laugh as he drew Jansen to defend on the front foot but nicked behind to keeper Rishabh Pant. Ravichandran Ashwin took the first wicket by a spinner in the match, offering Kagiso Rabada flight outside the off-stump. Rabada reached out for a drive but the outer edge flew to Shami at backward point. On the very next ball, Ashwin sealed India's win in just 10 minutes of the second session as Lungi Ngidi inneredged to Cheteshwar Pujara at back-



ward short leg. Earlier, resuming from 94/4 under a clear bright sky, Bavuma and Dean Elgar struck crisply-timed boundaries to keep India frustrated. Shami dropped Elgar on 63 in a straightforward chance off his own bowling, further extending the wait of a breakthrough for the tourists.

Shami's dropped chance cost India only 14 runs as the 36-run partnership was brought to an end by Jasprit Bumrah trapping Elgar plumb lbw. The left-handed batter shuffled in an attempt to flick but missed the in-ducker from Bumrah which crashed to his pads. He went

for the review, but replays showed the ball hitting the stumps. Quinton de Kock smashed some boundaries while sharing a stand of 31 with Bavuma before chopping on to his stumps while trying to cut off Siraj. Shami struck in his second spell of the session, getting a length ball to straighten after pitching and take a faint outer edge of Wiaan Mulder's bat to Pant. Bavuma lost partners but continued to hit boundaries. Along with Jansen, Bavuma ensured that South Africa didn't lose any more wickets before lunch. But on resumption after the break, it took just 12 deliveries for India to breach another fortress after Gabba in the beginning of the year despite a day washed out due to rain.



ICC announces nominees for Women's T20I Player of the Year, Smriti Mandhana included

The International Cricket Council (ICC) on Thursday announced England cricketers Tammy Beaumont and Nat Sciver, Indian opener Smriti Mandhana and Ireland's Gaby Lewis as the nominees for the ICC Women's T20I Player of the Year. In a year that saw India win only two of the nine T20Is, opening batter Smriti Mandhana was one of their few bright spots. She played a major role in the first of the two wins, smashing 48 off just 28 balls against South Africa, chasing 113 in the final T20I. The win saved India the blushes, as they managed to avoid the sweep.

Mandhana was India's top run-scorer in the T20I series against England with 119 runs but didn't find enough support from the rest of the batters. She was India's top-scorer in both the matches that India lost, including a 51-ball 70 that went in vain in the final T20I. Overall, Smriti scored 255 runs in nine matches at an average of 31.87 with two half-centuries. Meanwhile, Ireland all-rounder Gaby Lewis also had a smashing 2021 in the shortest format of the game, finishing as the second-highest



run-scorer in T20Is this year. She scored 325 runs at 40.62 in 10 T20Is with a strike rate of 128.45, with one century and a half-century.

Twenty-year-old Lewis played a major role in Ireland's two series wins, bagging the Player of the Match award twice in Ireland's 3-1 series win over Scotland at home. She scripted history at the ICC Women's T20 World Cup Europe Qualifier in August, becoming the first female cricketer from Ireland to score a T20I hundred. On the other hand, opener Tammy Beaumont was England's highest run-getter in the year in T20Is and third-highest overall in the world. She scored 303 runs in nine matches at an average of 33.66 with three half-centuries. In a low-scoring series against New Zealand away from home, Beaumont was the top scorer and was awarded the Player of the Series for 102 runs in three matches. Her 53-ball 63 in the second match put England in a winning position after they lost two wickets in the powerplay. Another England cricketer Nat Sciver played a prominent role in all three of her team's series wins this year, finishing as their third-highest run-getter and wicket-taker in T20Is in 2021. Overall, Sciver scored 153 runs in nine matches at an average of 19.12 with one fifty; 10 wickets at an average of 20.20 and an economy rate of 6.51

NZ's Ross Taylor to quit Test cricket after Bangladesh series; ODIs later in summer

Ross Taylor, New Zealand's most successful Test batter, has announced he will retire from the longest format of the game following the upcoming series against Bangladesh.

Taylor on Thursday confirmed that the current summer will be his last for the BlackCaps, marking the end of a remarkable 16-year international career.

According to New Zealand Cricket (NZC), Taylor signalled his intentions on the eve of the Test series against Bangladesh, starting in Mount Maunganui on Saturday, confirming the two-match series would be his last in the red-ball cricket, before



bowing out in the ODIs against Australia and Netherlands later this summer. The 37-year-old has been a mainstay in the New Zealand batting since making his debut in 2006, setting a number of records and achievements including

becoming the highest run scorer (18,074) for New Zealand in international cricket and appearances (445) charts. Taylor acknowledged it wasn't an easy decision to make but felt the time was right.
