Class 12 Exams: SC quashes CBSE policy to consider marks scored in later test, Directs

FOR "BETTER OF TWO" OPTION

The Supreme Court on Friday struck down a condition specified in a clause in the CBSE's evaluation policy of June last year which stated that marks obtained in the later examination will be considered as final for assessing Class 12 students. A bench of Justices said the CBSE shall provide an option to the candidate to accept the better of the two marks obtained in the subject for final declaration of his or her results for the last academic year.

As per a press statement of CBSE, 34,317 regular students had appeared in the offline examinations for the purpose of improvement of their marks, it said. On June 17 last year, the top court had approved the assessment schemes of the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE) and the CBSE, which had adopted the 30:30:40 formula for evaluation of marks for students of 12th standard based on results of Class 10, 11 and 12 respectively.

It observed that the CBSE has not

given any justification for such a departure. Last year, the CBSE class 12 board examination was cancelled due to the pandemic. The bench, which disposed of the plea, said the policy was required to be adopted because of the challenging situation faced by the students and this itself justifies making a provision which is more favourable to the students.

GATE admit cards not released, exams likely to be postponed

New Delhi: The Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) admit cards, which were scheduled to be released on Friday, were postponed and the examination dates have been marked as tentative on the website, signalling that it can be delayed. Earlier, GATE 2022 examinations were scheduled to be held on February 5, 6, 12 and 13, as per the official website. The admit cards for GATE 2022 were scheduled to be issued on January 4, which was later extended till January 7. Now, the site has put the admit card download on hold and no new date has been mentioned. After qualifying the GATE examination, a candidate becomes eligible for recruitment in Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs).

No immediate plan to implement Uniform Civil Code: Centre

New Delhi: The Centre, in an affidavit, has told the Delhi High Court that it would examine a detailed report of the 21st Law Commission which undertook detailed research on the Uniform Civil Code after receiving several representations from various stakeholders. As and when the report of Law Commission is received, the Government would examine the same in consultation with the various stakeholders involved in the matter, the Centre added.

There were no commissions in the matter after the 21st Law Commission in 2018 as the Centre did not reconstitute one.

In its submission, the Centre said that in view of the importance of the subject matter and sensitivity involved, it is required that an in-depth study of the provisions of various personal laws governing different communities be conducted.

The chief minister also asked the Prime Minister to increase the medical seats in the state and urged the Centre to sanction more IAS and IPS officers for the state.



"We will welcome them if they show respect to Sanatan dharma," he said. The poster adds that "it is not a request but a warning". A large number of foreign tourists come to Varanasi and spend hours at the ghats, interacting with local people. Right-wing activists had earlier objected to smoking by these tourists. The activists had also staged demonstrations and recited the Hanuman Chalisa in front of a church in Chandmari area on New Year's Eve.

WEEKEND LOCKDOWN: DELHI POLICE ANSWER QUERIES ON SOCIAL MEDIA

The Delhi Police took to social media to answer various queries of the people regarding the weekend lockdown that is set to kick-in from Friday night. To curb further spread of Covid-19, the national capital will remain under a stringent curfew from 10 p.m. Friday to 5 a.m. Monday. People posted several questions on Delhi Police's official Twitter handle regarding the night curfew. Though the police responded to few of them, many queries went unanswered.

Responding to one of the questions posed by a Twitter user, the Delhi Police said that industries with on-site labour will run as



usual, following all Covid appropriate behaviour. The police further requested the residents of the

national capital to adhere to the weekend curfew guidelines and follow all the Covid protocols.

Maha daily Covid cases cross 40K, no Omicron case reported

Mumbai: Maharashtra's single-day Covid-19 caseload shot above the 40,000-mark on Friday though no new case of the Omicron variant was reported for the day, taking the state's overall Covid tally past the 68 lakh-mark, health officials said. For the 11th consecutive day, the state reported a massive spike in Covid-19 infections and suspect cases whose samples have been sent for genome sequencing. The state's Covid-19 count shot up from 36,265 on Thursday to 40,925 on Friday, while fatalities increased from 13 a day earlier to 20 now with a mortality rate of 2.07 per cent. After recording 79 Omicron infections on Thursday, the state logged no fresh cases of the variant on Friday, as its tally stood at 876, with Mumbai leading the list.

India, China 14th round military talks likely next week

New Delhi: India and China military delegates are likely to hold talks on January 12 to deliberate over ways to de-escalate the border dispute between the two nations. It would be the 14th round of India and China Corps Commander level military talks focusing on disengagement in the remaining friction areas like Delsang, Hot Springs and others. The talks are happening when China has implemented new border laws from January 1 and has also started construction of a bridge on Pangong Lake to which India has objected.

On Thursday, India had strongly objected to China's illegal construction of a bridge on a part of the Pangong Lake and had stated that the government is monitoring the situation.



CALCUTTA HC ALLOWS GANGASAGAR MELA WITH COVID RESTRICTIONS

Kolkata: After much deliberation, the Calcutta High Court on Friday allowed the state government to organise the Gangasagar Mela amid the fresh surge in Covid-19 cases. However, the court has imposed certain restrictions and asked the state government to act upon it immediately. The division bench comprising Chief Justice Prakash Srivastava and Kesang Doma Bhutia in their order asked the state government to issue a notification declaring Gangasagar Island as a "notified area" within 24 hours from the pronouncement of the judgment. The court order also asked the West Bengal Home Secretary to ensure that restrictions imposed by the state government are implemented without any lapse in Gangasagar Island during the Mela period.

India's COVID deaths figure maybe six to seven times higher than officially reported: study

Two government data sources found that, when compared to pre-pandemic periods, all-cause mortality or death from any cause - was 27 percent higher in 0.2 million health facilities and 26 percent higher in civil registration deaths in 10 states. Both increases occurred mostly in 2021, the researchers said.

An international team of researchers led by Prabhat Jha, a professor at the University of Toronto in Canada, found that COVID-19 constituted 29 percent of deaths from June 2020 to July 2021, corresponding to 3.2 million (32 lakh) deaths, of which 2.7 million (27 lakh) occurred in April-July 2021.

A sub-survey of 57,000 adults showed similar increases in mortality with COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 deaths peaking similarly, they said.

About 3.2 million people could have died from COVID in India by September last year, six to seven times higher than reported officially, according to a study based on one independent and two government data sources.

The research, published in the Journal Science on 6 January, 2022, used an independent nationally representative survey of 137,289 adults in all states and union territories interviewed from March 2020 to July 2021.

The analyses find that India's cumulative COVID deaths by September 2021 were six to seven times higher than reported official-

ly, the authors of the study said. The first study is mortality reported in a nationally representative telephone survey conducted by CVoter, an independent private polling agency.

In addition, the researchers studied the Government of India's administrative data on national facility-based deaths and civil registration system (CRS) deaths in 10 states. As of 1 January, 2022, India has reported over 35 million cases of SARS-CoV-2, second only to the US, while its official cumulative Covid death count stands at 0.48 million (4.8 lakh). In order to better estimate India's COVID deaths, alternative approaches to model-based estimates are needed, the authors said.



The researchers noted that India's reported COVID-19 death totals are widely believed to be under-reported because of factors like incomplete certification of COVID deaths and misattribution





PM SECURITY BREACH: SC DIRECTS PUNJAB HC REGISTRAR GENERAL TO PRESERVE ALL RECORDS

The Supreme Court on Friday directed the registrar general of Punjab and Haryana High Court to secure and preserve all records in connection with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Punjab, and also asked the state and Central committees to refrain from conducting inquiries till Monday, when it will take up the matter again. A bench headed by Chief Justice N.V. Ramana and comprising Justices Surya Kant and Hima Kohli said: "We direct Punjab, police authorities, SPG, central and state agencies to cooperate and provide necessary assistance to seal the entire record." The bench added the registrar general of Punjab and Haryana High Court will secure and preserve all records in connection with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Punjab.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, submitted that some NIA officer should assist the



court's officer in collecting and securing the evidence, which includes wireless messages in connection with PM's movement in the state. Mehta added that the court officer may find it difficult to pin down sources, from which information is required. Mehta termed the incident "rarest of the rare issue".

The Supreme Court on Thursday agreed to examine a plea raising the

issue of alleged breach of security to Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Punjab. Senior advocate Maninder Singh mentioned the plea in the top court. The plea filed by Delhi-based Lawyer's Voice alleged the state government and the police were complicit in jeopardising the security of the holder of the high constitutional office in the country. "The security lapse, as per reliable reports in the print and the

electronic media, and as per the Press Information Bureau report of Central government, was clearly intentional and raises a serious question as to national security and the role played by the present political dispensation in the State of Punjab," said the plea.

The plea sought an independent probe into the PM's security breach in Punjab. The plea sought a direction to the District Judge Bathinda to collect, preserve and present all material pertaining to the movement and deployment of Punjab Police in connection with the visit of the Prime Minister, fix responsibility of the DGP and the Chief Secretary, Punjab.

The petition claimed it sought to highlight the said incident and raise an important question as if the Prime Minister of the country can face such a situation, then the fundamental rights of citizens which has been guaranteed to them under Article 19(1) (d), 19(1) (g), and 21 of the Constitution, are in serious jeopardy in Punjab and beyond.

JAGANNATH TEMPLE TO REMAIN CLOSED FOR DEVOTEES FROM JAN 10

Bhubaneswar: With the steep rise in Covid-19 cases in Odisha, the Jagannath temple in Puri will remain closed for devotees from January 10 (Monday) to January 31, it was decided on Friday. This decision was taken at the Chatisa



Nijog meeting held virtually under the chairmanship of Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) chief administrator Krishan Kumar this evening. After taking opinions from all stakeholders, it was decided to close down the temple for the devotees as thousands of the people from various states including hotspots are coming to the temple, Puri Collector Samarth Verma said. However, the daily rituals at the temple will be continued as per tradition by the servitors, he said. This decision was taken by the Chatisa Nijog after some servitors and temple administration staff have tested Covid positive in past few days, sources said. The temple will effectively remain open for only on Saturday as on Sunday it remains closed for sanitisation of its premises.

SC clears the deck for appointment of 3K sub-inspectors of police in UP

In relief for over 3,000 candidates, who in 2019 cracked the entrance exam for Sub-Inspector in Uttar Pradesh, but could not join due to pending litigation, the Supreme Court on Friday cleared decks for their appointment. In an 81-page judgment, a bench headed by Justice U.U. Lalit said: "The decisions made by expert bodies, including the Public Services Commissions, should not be lightly interfered with, unless instances of arbitrary and mala fide exercise of power are made out." In 2016, the UP Police Recruitment and Promotion Board had issued an advertisement for the recruitment of over 3,000 sub-inspectors, platoon commanders (PAC) and fire officers based on an online written examination.

According to the rule, each candidate had not only to score 50 per cent



in each of the sections, but also required to score at least 50 per cent after the normalisation. The top court allowed the state government to appoint the candidates, as per the result, declared in 2019, which was

earlier quashed by Allahabad High Court on a clutch of petitions claiming that the board adopted the wrong process. The petitioners had alleged that call letters were issued to those candidates who had not obtained more than 50 per cent raw marks but secured more than 50 per cent normalised score.

The Uttar Pradesh government moved the top court challenging the high court order. The top court set aside the high court order and directed the state government to implement the result declared in 2019. "We have, therefore, no hesitation in accepting the challenge raised on behalf of the state and allowing these appeals and setting aside the judgment and order passed by the High Court presently under challenge. The results declared by the Board on 28th February 2019 shall now be given effect as early as possible," it said.

3 TERRORISTS KILLED, ARMY OFFICER INJURED IN KASHMIR ENCOUNTER

Three terrorists were killed and one army officer was injured in an encounter with security forces at Zolwa Kralpora Chadoora in central Kashmir's Budgam district, officials said on Friday.

The police said that based on specific inputs regarding the presence of terrorists in Zolwa Chadoora village area of Budgam, a joint cordon and search operation was launched on Thursday evening by the police and the army. During the search operation, the terrorists fired indiscriminately upon the joint search party, which was retaliated leading to an encounter. Later on, the CRPF also joined the operation.

"The joint team first evacuated all the civilians trapped around the encounter site to safer places. Besides, to avoid any collateral damage due to darkness, the operation was suspended during night hours and in the wee hours it resumed again, resulting in the



elimination of three terrorists linked with proscribed terror outfit Jaish-e-Mohammed. During the encounter, one army officer received minor splinter injury," the

police said. One of the killed terrorists has been identified as Waseem Mir, a resident of Nowgam Srinagar, who was active since December 2020. "As per reliable sources and

documents recovered, the other two killed terrorists appear to be foreign militants. Further identifications are being ascertained," the police said. "As per police records, the slain terrorist, Waseem, was a categorised militant and part of a group involved in several terror crime cases, including attacks on security forces and civilian atrocities. Several terror crime cases were registered against him. "Waseem was involved in the killing of Inspector Parvaiz Ahmad in June last year. He was also involved in the grenade attack on a CRPF bunker near Aali Masjid Chowk at Eidgah Srinagar in which one civilian and one police personnel were injured. He was also involved in brainwashing and motivating the youth of Central Kashmir to join terror folds," the police said. Incriminating materials, arms and ammunition, including three AK-56 rifles, were recovered from the site of the encounter. All the recovered materials have been taken into case records for further investigation.

Red alert for Kashmir, heavy to very heavy snowfall likely

Changing its alert from "orange" to "red", the India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Friday evening forecast heavy to very heavy snowfall in J&K with possibility of avalanches in vulnerable areas.

A statement issued by the IMD office said: "Weather warming for J&K for January 7: Currently it is snowing at most places of Kashmir and hilly areas of Jammu and rain at a few places of Jammu region."

"Forecast: Expect further increase in rain/snow intensity as the day progresses with main intensity of heavy to very heavy rain/Snow during 7th (night) and 8th."

"Gradual improvement from 9th morning onwards in J&K."

It also warned that the present weather may affect



surface transport on January 7 and 8 and air transportation on 8th."

The IMD also warned of avalanche/landslide in vulnerable spots.

"People are once again requested NOT to venture in avalanche-prone areas (Our data shows that most avalanches triggered

during intense heavy snowfall). Follow traffic advisory seriously. Maintain proper ventilation of your rooms."

Reports from hill stations of Gulmarg, Pahalgam, and Sonamarg said heavy snowfall has already started there while moderate snowfall has started in Srinagar city.

Major lapse of national security at borders: Rahul

After reports of construction of a bridge at Pangong Tso lake by the Chinese forces emanated, the Congress has questioned the government about the status at the borders.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday in a tweet said, "What has been happening at our borders is a major lapse of national security. Will the PM ever talk about it?"

The government and the Congress are at loggerheads

on the security breach of the Prime Minister, but Rahul questioned the PM on his 'silence' over the border issue. As per reports a few days back, a new satellite image came into light which showed bridge construction on both the sides of pangong lake in eastern Ladakh sector. This area is on the Chinese side, about 40 km away from LAC (Line of Actual Control). As per the military experts this bridge will ensure Chinese army PLA's swift movement in the area.

Headmistress stripping girl for carrying mobile: Education dept initiates action

Deputy Director for Public Instruction Javare Gowda who conducted an inquiry into the case of a headmistress punishing a girl student making her strip before classmates in her office chamber and then assaulting her with a stick for carrying a cellphone to school, recommended her suspension on Friday.

The incident took place in the Government High School in Gananguru village in Srirangapattana taluk of Mandya district last week. The girl, studying in the 8th standard was allegedly beaten ruthlessly with a stick and asked to strip before her classmates. Headmistress Snehalatha V forced her to remain in that state without clothes for hours.

Javare Gowda said that he had recommended the Commissioner of the Education Department that the headmistress be suspended for her cruel and indecent behaviour with a school student. Earlier, the Tehsildar and the School Development Management Committee (SDMC) had also recommended disciplinary action against the headmistress, he informed. "Even I had visited the school on an earlier occasion and



warned the headmistress about such behaviour. But since she has continued with it, it has become inevitable to initiate action," he said. Complaints have been filed by the student as well as her parents, he added.

The girl had said that the headmistress was furious after she came to know that she had brought a mobile to class. During lunch hour, the teacher asked the students whether they have brought mobiles to class and to give them to her. The headmistress also warned the girls that if

they don't give the mobiles themselves, she would get them stripped and ask the boys to check them.

Later, the headmistress had sent all the boys outside the class and started hitting the victim. The girl said that the headmistress stripped her before her classmates and she was made to sit on the ground.

The girl said that even when she pleaded that she was feeling cold and wanted to drink water, the headmistress did not relent. Finally she was let go in the evening.

Nitin Gadkari's Strong Message Against Haridwar Hate Assembly

Union Minister Nitin Gadkari has said the recent hate speeches - as happened at religious conclaves in Haridwar and Delhi -- should be "negated and given no importance". In such cases, the law should be allowed to take its course, he told to News channel in an exclusive interview.

Only five people have been named so far in the Haridwar hate speech case, where calls to arms against Muslims and genocide were issued openly.

"In my view, Swami Vivekananda said it all at the religious conclave in Chicago -- that our religion is based on tolerance, simplicity, inclusiveness... Our kings never broke anyone's place of worship. We are not expansionists. We want the good of everyone -- of the

world, of every living creature. This is our heritage and our viewpoint," Gadkari said.

"So anyone who goes against it is not our viewpoint. It should be negated and given no importance," he added. Asked whether action should be taken in such cases, where efforts are made to create rift and communal tension, he said the law should take its course.

"We should remain tolerant, respectful towards all religions, should not hurt anyone's sentiments and take everyone forward," he added, invoking Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "Sabka Saath" slogan.

Asked about his views on the Bulli Bai app, used to 'auction' Muslim women, he said "Actions of some individuals should not be taken as a reflection of a society. The law will take its own course".

Several parts of Madhya Pradesh have received moderate to heavy rainfall with thunderstorms and lightning over the past couple of days owing to the formation of a western disturbance caused by an upper cyclone.

The rain was received in many districts since Thursday morning

with a heavy shower in the capital city Bhopal early on Friday.

As per the India Meteorological Department (IMD), Bhopal recorded 40 mm precipitation over the last 24 hours, Tikamgarh received 37 mm rainfall, Naugaon recorded 31.2 mm, Gwalior 27.8 mm, Sagar 20 mm, Raisen 16.2 mm, Indore 11.4 mm, Guna 7.8 mm.

Rain and hailstorm damaged

Orange Alert Issued

The IMD has issued an orange alert for some cities along with the Gwalior and Chambal divisions and a yellow alert for districts such as Rewa, Sagar, Indore and Ujjain. Carelessness is dangerous

IAs the third wave of Covid grips India, a survey reveals shocking levels of carelessness and nonchalance by Indians. The snap poll had a sample size of 1,942. To a question if people were generally wearing masks and taking precautions, only 21.8 per cent of the respondents agreed that people were indeed wearing masks and taking precautions. In sharp contrast, 41.5 per cent said wearing of masks and other precautions were being followed "only sometimes" while another 33.8 per cent said they were mostly not being followed. In effect, 3 out of every four Indian are still not taking the basic preventive steps against Corona despite repeated warnings, exhortations and threats by the government, scientists and doctors. This is happening at a time when there is virtual unanimity that the third wave of Covid led this time by the super spreading Omicron variant has already arrived in India and is heading rapidly towards a peak. A recent study by IIT Kanpur suggests that the peak of the third wave would be reached anytime between the first and second week of February this year. It has also been established unequivocally that the Omicron variant breaches through the defences of people who have already taken two doses of the vaccine. There has been a massive increase in the number of infections in major metro cities, particularly Mumbai and Delhi. Authorities, hospitals and doctors will find it difficult to manage yet another surge unless ordinary Indian citizens realise the true gravity of the situation and come out of the comfort zone of thinking that the Omicron variant is very mild. It could mutate into something far more deadly without any warning as it happened with the Delta variant during the second wave.

A lot has happened in the bilateral relations between India and Maldives during the last 10 years. The relations which were once described as one of the most vibrant and dynamic, have turned into one in which India has been painted as a villain. Though the genesis started 10 years back, yet it gathered further momentum during the last three years particularly, resulting in 'India Out' campaign on the social media.

The movement got a boost when the Maldives Supreme Court overruled former President Abdulla Yameen's conviction in a money-laundering and embezzlement case in November 2021. The development allowed him to make a return to politics.

A political campaign

Ties between India and the Maldives had hit a low during the tenure of Yameen, who was considered to be pro-China rather than pro-India. Yameen's half-brother, former president and currently Maldives Reform Movement party leader (MRM) Mamoon Abdul Ghayum, is among those who have opposed the campaign, even in 2013 when Yameen became the President.

India-Maldives bilateral relations deteriorated during the Peoples Party of Maldives' (PPM) five-year rule beginning in 2013, then led by Yameen and the anti-India sentiment was apparent even back then, observers say. Paradoxically though the Yameen government and its predecessor, the Waheed government, were considered "anti-India", and though the Yameen government's tilt in favour of China was clear, yet it had also openly discussed an 'India-First' policy for the Maldives.

Other political parties in the Maldives too have opposed the anti-India campaign, saying the former president is irresponsibly inciting hatred among the people towards India.

The PPM brushing aside the charges against it, in its defence says that the current Ibrahim Solih government has opted at times to keep the relationship, particularly that under the defence sector under wraps from where the criticism basically stems from.

The Adhaalath Party, a coalition partner of President Solih, in a statement condemned efforts to "incite hatred in the people's hearts towards neighbouring and global partners", and expressed concern at the "reckless acts led by former president Yameen to incite hatred towards neighbouring India amongst the civilians".

The Jumhooree Party, another coalition partner of the Solih government, also said in a statement that it doesn't support any activi-



ties, which compromise the independence and sovereignty of the Maldives, and the Jumhooree Party does not believe that there is any legal ground to decide the existence of any Indian military presence in the country.

Out-India campaign

There are specific issues, which have fuelled the anti-India sentiments and rhetoric on the social media during the last three years. The first is the long-standing controversy over the two Advanced Light Helicopters (ALH) that were given by India to the Maldives in 2010 and in 2015, both of which were used for ocean search-and-rescue operations, maritime weather surveillance and for airlifting patients between islands.

These helicopters were meant to be deployed for humanitarian purposes only, but some in the anti-India constituency, particularly Yameen's party PPM, tried to portray that by gifting these helicopters, India was creating military presence in the country because they were military choppers.

Secondly, the two countries signed bilateral agreements according to which Indian officers were to train the Maldives National Defence Force, under whose command these helicopters operate.

Thirdly, after the Solih government came to power, in 2019, local Maldivian media speculated that the UTTH Harbour Project agreement signed between India and the Maldives in 2016, during the Yameen government, would be turned into an Indian naval base. Under the project India was to develop and maintain a coastguard harbour and dockyard at Uthuru Thilafalhu, a strategically located atoll near

the capital Malé, and develop road connectivity to Male and decongest the Male harbour.

Back then, Maldivian chief of defence forces, Major-General Abdulla Shamaal had said that while the Indian government had indicated that it would provide grant assistance for this project, there were no plans of any Indian naval base in the country. Fourthly, in 2016, an Action Plan between India and the Maldives was signed for 'defence cooperation' to enhance 'shared strategic and security interests of the two countries in the Indian Ocean region'.

In 2016 when anti-India sentiments were at their peak and the bilateral relations were at their worst against the perceived military presence of Indian forces in Maldives, the Yameen government had asked India to take back these helicopters and refused to extend the term of the agreement that would extend their stay and use in the country.

Observers say that one of the main reasons behind the 'India Out' campaign was rooted in this controversy surrounding the ALH choppers and India's reported refusal to take them back. During the Yameen-era, India had looked on in concern as the Maldives began to develop stronger ties with China and its Belt and Road Initiative.

By 2018 when Ibrahim Mohamed Solih assumed office, he immediately renegotiated these agreements, extending the stay and use of these choppers in the country. The Solih government's visibly warm relations with India have only served to fuel anti-India sentiment in the country.

However, among the many grievances in social media posts by prominent members of 'India Out' campaign, a recurring complaint is the lack of transparency in agreements being signed between the Solih government and India.

It is a fact that that much of the criticism levelled by the Maldivian opposition and the 'India Out' campaign wouldn't have arisen had these bilateral agreements been publicly discussed in the Maldivian Parliament. But the ruling government and the defence ministry describing these agreements as confidential has led to agitation in political circles that percolated down to ordinary Maldivian nationals and has taken the form of a wave of criticism, inflammatory rhetoric and unverified allegations, especially on social media platforms.

Fundamentally, the issue is not so complex though it involves bilateral relations, geopolitical and economic interests for both countries. However, both the governments have acted in a mature manner in this regard. Both of them are aware of the increasing defence importance of Maldives in the Indian Ocean, due to the increased US interest in the Indo-Pacific and Maldives' strategic position. In addition to the Maldivian need to have India on its side to guard its defence and commercial interests.

DUBAI FIRM OFFERS \$100MN FOR WORLD'S LARGEST SAPPHIRE FOUND IN SRI LANKAN

The Sri Lankan government announced that it was in talks with a Dubai-based company which has offered \$100 million for the world's largest natural corundum blue sapphire named the "Queen of Asia", which was found in the island nation.

State Minister of Gem and Jewellery Related Industries Loham Ratwatte was quoted in the local Daily Mirror as saying that there has been no final decision taken by the government on the company's offer to sell the "Queen of Asia", but talks were ongoing between the company and the stone owner on its sale for a high price, reports Xinhua news agency.

Discussions were also underway on whether to auction the corundum blue sapphire at an even higher price, Ratwatte said.

The owner of the stone recently said that one of the French gem scientists had valued the corundum sapphire at more than \$200 million. Officials last month said the stone



had also attracted interest from potential buyers in China and the US.

The single crystal blue sapphire, which weighs around 310 kg, was unveiled in December 2021 about three months after it was found from a private land in Ratnapura, which is known as the "city of gems".

The sapphire is presently stored in a laboratory owned by Sri Lanka's National Gem and Jewelry Authority.

HEAVY SNOWFALL KILLS 11, INJURES 23 ACROSS AFGHANISTAN

Kabul: Heavy snow, that started falling across Afghanistan earlier this week triggering avalanches and floods, have so far claimed the lives of 11 people, while injuring 23 others, the media reported.

Citing officials of the Taliban-led Afghan government, Bakhtar News Agency said that 90 per cent of the country's territory witnessed snow or rainfall that led to financial loss besides the deaths and injuries, reports Khaama Press. The casualties have been reported in Helmand, Nimroz, Farah, Nangarhar, Kandahar, Jawzjan, Takhar and Kabul. Officials of the Ministry of Disaster Management said that they have rescued several people who were stranded due to the floods. The recent heavy snow and rainfall have also clogged several highways and flights to Kabul International Airport have also been disrupted.



N. Korean nuke, missile programs pose ongoing threat: Blinken

North Korea's nuclear and missile programs pose an ongoing threat to the region and the international community, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said.

Blinken made the remarks on Thursday during annual security consultative talks with his Japanese counterpart, Yoshimasa Hayashi, that also involved US Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin and Japanese Defense Minister Nobuo Kishi, reports Yonhap News Agency. "Meanwhile, the DPRK's unlawful nuclear, missile programs pose an ongoing threat. And we saw that again this week with the most recent launch," Blinken said on Thursday, referring to North Korea's test launch of a self-claimed hypersonic missile on Wednesday.

DPRK stands for the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the North's official name.

Blinken noted threats facing the allies included what he called China's "provocative actions" in the region and Russia's military

build-up along the Ukraine border.

"So, to address these evolving threats, our alliance must not only strengthen the tools we have but also develop new ones," he told the virtual meeting. "And I think that's really the focus of the discussions that are about to happen." On his part, Austin reiterated challenges posed by North Korea and others in the Indo-Pacific region.

"We're meeting against the backdrop of increased tensions and challenges to the free and stable and secure Indo-Pacific region that we both seek -- challenges posed by North Korea's nuclear ambitions and by the coercive and aggressive behaviour of the People's Republic of China. So together we are taking bold steps to improve our alliances, bolster our readiness and strengthen what I call integrated deterrence," he added.

This week's missile test marked North Korea's first missile launch since October 2021. Pyongyang has claimed to have successfully test launched its first hypersonic missile last September.

GLOBAL COVID CASELOAD TOPS 300 MN



Washington: Amid an ongoing resurgence across the world, the global coronavirus caseload has surpassed the grim milestone of 300 million, while the deaths have surged to more than 5.47 million and vaccinations to over 9.33 billion, according to Johns Hopkins University.

In its latest update on Friday morning, the University's Center for Systems Science and Engineering (CSSE) revealed that the current global caseload and the death toll stood at 300,095,481 and 5,472,039, respectively, while the total number of vaccine doses administered has increased to 9,336,622,344. The US continues to be the worst-hit country with the world's highest number of cases and deaths at 58,487,665 and 833,987, according to the CSSE.

The second worst hit country in terms of cases is India (35,109,288 infections and 482,876 deaths), followed by Brazil (22,328,252 infections and 619,654 deaths).

The other countries with over 5 million cases are the UK (14,100,303), France (11,288,704), Russia (10,420,863), Turkey (9,789,244), Germany (7,399,015), Italy (6,975,465), Spain (6,922,466), Iran (6,203,046), Argentina (6,025,303) and Colombia (5,242,672), the CSSE figures showed.

The nations with a death toll of over 100,000 are Russia (307,488), Mexico (299,842), Peru (202,904), the UK (149,993), Indonesia (144,116), Italy (138,474), Iran (131,802), Colombia (130,191), France (126,001), Argentina (117,386), Germany (113,446) and Ukraine (103,225).

DOZENS OF ATTACKERS 'ELIMINATED' IN KAZAKHSTAN UNREST

Dozens of attackers have been "eliminated" after they attempted to storm administrative buildings and the police department of the Kazakh city of Almaty amid the ongoing unrest across the country, a media report said.

In its report on Thursday, Russia's TASS news agency also said that total of 12 law enforcement officers have been killed and 353 others injured in the clashes with the rioters in Almaty. The "anti-terrorist" special operation continues in the city and police urged residents and visitors to refrain from leaving home for their own safety, Xinhua news agency quoted the TASS report citing Kazakhstan's Khabar-24 TV channel as saying.

Over 1,000 people were injured across Kazakhstan with almost 400 of them hospitalised as a result of the violent protests over the past days, said the report.

Meanwhile, the Interior Ministry has claimed that 2,298 protesters have also been detained.

The protests sparked by dissatisfaction over surging fuel prices escalated on Wednesday, with protesters storming the main government building in Almaty, setting police vehicles on fire, and attacking the regional branch of the ruling Nur Otan party.

The mounting unrest prompted the Kazakh government to seek help from



the Collective Security Treaty Organization (CSTO), which has decided to deploy peacekeeping forces to the country.

The CSTO comprises Russia, Kazakhstan, Belarus, Tajikistan and Armenia. President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev has blamed foreign-trained

"terrorists" for the unrest, without giving evidence.

He has also fired his cabinet aimed at curbing the demonstrations, including his predecessor, Nursultan Nazarbayev, who had held a national security role since stepping down as President.

Peru reports first 'flurona' death

Peru's Health Ministry has reported the country's first fatal case of "flurona" (a simultaneous infection of flu and Covid-19), involving an 87-year-old patient with comorbidities who was not vaccinated against the coronavirus. The deceased was one of three cases of flurona detected in northern Peru's Amazonas region, Xinhua news agency reported, citing Cesar Munayco, a researcher at the ministry's National Center for Epidemiology, Prevention and Control of Diseases. The other two cases included a minor and a 40-year-old person who was fully vaccinated against Covid-19,

influenza because that "reduces the risk of dying."

"It is important to take this into account, because we currently have a major outbreak of H3N2 influenza in the country's jungle, such as (the regions of) Loreto, San Martin, Amazonas and Ucayali," Munayco warned.

Peru announced its third wave of Covid-19 cases on Tuesday, accelerated by the arrival in December of the Omicron variant, which has already led to 309 confirmed cases in this South American nation.





NHRC CONCERNED OVER MUMBAI SLUM DWELLERS LIVING CONDITIONS

New Delhi | Mumbai

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has expressed concerns over the living conditions of slum dwellers in Mumbai and issued notices to the Maharashtra government and the Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs seeking their responses. Maharashtra responded, through its Chief Secretary, that several efforts have been made and schemes formulated to provide dwelling units to the slum dwellers for Economically Weaker Sections with the State and Central assistance under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna (Urban), PMAY (U). Shortage of funds has been cited as a constraint, NHRC said in a statement on Friday.

The Centre on its part responded that out of 2.24 lakh houses in



Maharashtra, 2 lakh were sanctioned for Mumbai alone, out of which 58,225 have been grounded. The Commission has sought a response from the Secretary, Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs to give

a comprehensive report.

He has been given four weeks' time, the Commission added.

The Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs in its communication dated December 3, 2021, sub-


mited that the Land and Colonization are State subjects. The Centre is augmenting the efforts of the State to meet the housing needs of economically weaker sections in urban areas through Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna-Urban (PMAY-U).

Earlier in June last year, while dealing with a plea filed by human rights activist Adv Radhakanta Tripathy, the NHRC had sought response from the secretaries of various central ministries including Home, Health and Housing, and Urban Poverty Alleviation, over the plight of millions of homeless people and children during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Millions of homeless people, including lakhs of children on the street have been suffering immensely for a long time due to the virus and subsequent lockdown measures, the activist's plea contended.

Public holiday not fundamental right, time to reduce them: Bombay High Court

According to report, the Bombay High Court has held that nobody can claim public holidays as fundamental right and they are a matter of government policy.

A Divison Bench of Justices Gautam Patel and Madhav Jamdar rejected a petition to declare August 2 as a public holiday as it marks the liberation or Independence Day of Dadar & Nagar Haveli. The court observed, "There is no legally enforceable right that can be said to have been infringed. Nobody has a fundamental right to a public holiday. As it is, we have far too many public holidays in

this country. Perhaps the time has come to reduce, not increase, the number of public holidays."

The petitioner argued that August 2 was given the public holiday status from 1954 to 2020 before it was discontinued on July 29, 2021. The petition also compared August 2 to August 15 and questioned that if August 15 could be a public holiday for being the national Independence Day, why not August 2.



could be the reason for dragging Rashmi Bhabhi, whom we know as Balasaheb Thackeray's daughter-in-law, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray's wife and Aditya Thackeray's mother," she added. "Balasaheb Thackeray himself raised BJP party by holding its hand and

made it big in politics. And today they are saying abusive words against his daughter-in-law only. Where did they get so much pride from? I challenge that whatever it is, if this Gajaria comes in front of us, the Mahila Aghadi of Shiv Sena will see him," she stated. Earlier on Thursday, social media convenor of Bharatiya Janata Party in Maharashtra Jiten Gajaria was summoned for questioning by Mumbai Police Crime Branch's Cyber Cell on Thursday for his alleged tweet on Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray's wife Rashmi Thackeray. Jiten Gajaria was seen present at BKC Cyber Police Station to record his statement after being summoned by police over his tweets. Reportedly, Mr Gajaria had on January 4 posted a photo of Rashmi Thackeray with the caption "Marathi Rabri Devi". After the uproar, Jiten Gajaria deleted the Twitter post.

Murder convict Dies In Attack By Inmates In Kolhapur Jail: Officials

A 49-year-old murder convict lodged in a jail in Maharashtra's Kolhapur district died allegedly after he was assaulted by other inmates, officials said on Friday.

The victim, who was serving a life sentence, became violent and harmed a fellow inmate which triggered the assault on him on Thursday evening, they said. The incident took place at Kalamba jail in Kolhapur, around 230km from Pune, when inmates were watching television in a section of the prison.

According to the jail authorities, the deceased, Nishikant Kamble, was on medication for a mental ailment. "On Thursday, when inmates were watch-

ing television in one of the sections of the jail, Kamble allegedly attacked a fellow inmate with a tile after they had a verbal spat. The other inmates

intervened and restrained Kamble," said Chandramani Indulkar, jail superintendent. "A group of inmates took Kamble aside. However, when he tried to attack them also and became violent, the other inmates pinned him to the ground and kicked and punched him," he said.

The official said no jail personnel was present when the incident took place.

"After Kamble was found unconscious, jail staffers presumed he could be suffering from chest pain and blood pressure, and took him to hospital where he died during treatment at around 10.45 pm," Indulkar said.

Kamble was awarded life imprisonment for murdering his friend in 2003 in Kolhapur, he added.

AD-MAN, ACTOR, ACTIVIST GERSON DA CUNHA PASSES AWAY

Gerson da Cunha, the legendary advertising professional, actor and activist passed away here, a family friend said. He was 92.

After graduating in BSc from University of Bombay, da Cunha became a journalist working with the PTI news agency before diverting to advertising.

In his long career spanning 25 years, he worked with Hindustan Unilever and later headed the Lintas ad agency, among the biggest in the media industry in those days and he launched the famed 'Dalta' brand ads, a household name at one point. Simultaneously, he

worked on theatre and Bollywood films like "Electric Moon", "Cotton Mary", "Asoka", "Water", and others, and subsequently, post-retirement took to the social field.

He was associated with UNICEF, worked with it in the US and South America, and after returning to India, was involved with NGOs like the AGNI, Mumbai First, and helped the Mumbai affected by the 1992-1993 communal riots.

Over the years, da Cunha also served as an advisor to the Central Health and Tourism ministries for their public projects, besides other private, semi-government and social institutions in different capacities.

Cotton import duty cut may help Pak-China, spur Indian farmers' suicides: Maha panel

In a dark warning, a Maharashtra government appointed panel has warned that any move by the Centre to slash or withdraw import duty on cotton could benefit Pakistan-China and prove detrimental to the Indian agro-economy by spurring farmland suicides. The Vasantrao Naik Shetki Swavalamban Mission (VNSSM) President Kishore Tiwari has sent a memorandum to the Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the issue, requesting that before taking any decision to revoke import duty on cotton, the plight of the Indian cotton farmers should be borne in mind. The VNNSM chief's grouse stems from the recent lobbying by the Southern India Mills Association (SIMA) and the powerful textile-garment industry bigwigs who are trying to influence the Centre to slash or withdraw the import duty on cotton and cotton waste. Tiwari - accorded a MoS status - said that in this year's Union Budget, the government had announced a 1 per cent duty specifically to protect the interests of the Indian cotton farmers, spread

largely in Maharashtra, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu. "Now, compared with the MSP on cotton at around Rs 6,000/quintal, the current market rate is in the range of Rs 8,000-11,000/quintal which has brought some relief to the peasantry reeling under the pandemic since the past two years," said Tiwari. However, the cotton and textile-garment industries keen to import cheaper cotton from Pakistan-China and dump it in the Indian markets, which will again plummet the prices below Rs 4000/quintal, not only spelling doom for the local farmers but also fueling a fresh crisis in the farmlands, he explained. "We have requested the PM not to succumb to the pressures by the SIMA, the textile-garment industries and other vested interests by reducing or removing the cotton import duty at this critical stage... In order to ensure justice to Indian farmers, the VNNSM demands that the import duty be further hiked to 18 per cent to make it on par with the global markets," a grim Tiwari told correspondent. He referred to the recent meetings of SIMA and textile-gar-

ment industries' representatives with some Central ministers and officials, where they claimed that their imports account for only 4 or 5 per cent of superior quality cotton required by the industry that is not available here, or they have to pay a premium on it. Tiwari countered these contentions saying for 2021-2022 cotton has kicked off with a comfortable opening stock of 75-lakh bales and an estimated production of over 360-lakh bales with positive prices at the start of the season due to the unprecedented volatility in international cotton prices. "Any move to remove or slash import duties will not only directly benefit the economies of both Pakistan and China, but prove extremely disastrous to Indian farmers who could be left with no other options but to kill themselves," cautioned Tiwari. While the cotton and garment industries have already approached Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Commerce & Textiles Minister Piyush Goyal and other top officials for relief, other sections are also busy building up indirect pressures by agitations like a strike on January 17-18.

NCSC panel summons Mumbai police Commissioner in Wankhede case

The National Commission for Scheduled Castes (NCSC) has asked Mumbai Commissioner of Police Hemant Nagale to appear in person before Chairman Vijay Sampla on January 31 regarding the Narcotics Control Bureau's (NCB) Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede harassment case.

It also asked the petitioner to remain present in the commission on the day of the hearing. While issuing written summons to the police Commissioner, NCSC Director Kaushal Kumar on Thursday said: "Chairman Vijay Sampla has fixed a meeting with you, in person, on January 31 at 11 am in his chamber at Loknayak Bhawan, New Delhi." Accordingly, you are to appear in person, along with an updated action taken report and all relevant documents, including the relevant files, case diaries, to facilitate the hearing." The NCSC further recommended the state government not to take final decision in the matter till the investigation is pending with it. "No final decision in the matter is to be taken by the state government till the pendency of the investigation of the case in the commission. This is as

per commission's Rules of Procedure clause 7.2," the NCSC director said in an official letter. Wankhede, NCB's Mumbai Zonal Director, has been in the limelight in connection with the Aryan Khan case and was recently accused by Maharashtra minister Nawab Malik of faking his caste certificate. The NCSC is, however, examining the complaint of Wankhede that he was being implicated in a false case. Wankhede had written to the commission alleging harassment following "disclosures" made by NCP minister Malik. The minister had alleged that Wankhede was a Muslim and had secured a job claiming to be from the Scheduled Caste. Malik had alleged that Wankhede's father's name was Dawood and not Dyandev. Wankhede has denied all allegations.

SECURITY BEEFED UP AROUND RSS INSTALLATIONS IN NAGPUR

Maharashtra's Nagpur have registered an offence under unlawful activities and ordered a probe following intelligence inputs that a terror organisation has carried out reconnaissance of the RSS headquarters very recently.

Commissioner of Police, Amritesh Kumar said the RSS headquarters in Mahal in eastern part of city and Smuriti Bhawan in Reshimbagh in south-eastern part of Nagpur are constantly been provided with full-fledged security. All vehicles and persons around the installations are checked throughout round the clock. Three alleged terrorists from Jaish-e-Mohammad were gunned down by security forces when they tried to attack the RSS headquarters in the pre-dawn hours on June 1, 2006.

Airtel not to issue equity in lieu of spectrum charges, AGR

ICC INTRODUCES IN-MATCH PENALTIES FOR SLOW OVER-RATES, OPTIONAL DRINKS BREAK IN T20Is

The International Cricket Council (ICC) on Friday introduced in-match penalties for slow-over rates across men's and women's T20 International matches. It also said that optional drinks break in the midpoint of an innings will be a part of the updated playing conditions.

The first men's match to be played under the new playing conditions will be the one-off tie between the West Indies and Ireland at the Sabina Park in Jamaica on January 16 while the first T20I of the three-match series between South Africa and the West Indies in Centurion on January 18 will be the first women's match played under the new playing conditions. The in-match penalty for slow over rate means the fielding side will be penalised for it.



"The over rate regulations are captured in clause 13.8 of the playing conditions, which stipulate that a fielding side must be in position to bowl the first ball of the final over of the innings by the scheduled or rescheduled time for the end of the

over rate outlined in Article 2.22 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel," added the ICC. The global cricket governing body said the in-match penalty for slow-over rates was included after seeing its efficacy in the Hundred competition in England in 2021. "The change was recommended by the ICC Cricket Committee, which regularly discusses ways to improve the pace of play in all formats, after considering reports on the effectiveness of a similar regulation that was included in the playing conditions for the Hundred competition conducted by the ECB."

"In another change, an optional drinks break of two minutes and thirty seconds may be taken at the mid-point of each innings subject to agreement between Members at the start of each series," concluded the ICC.

'DJOKOVIC CAN PLAY IN FRENCH OPEN EVEN IF UNVACCINATED'

World No. 1 tennis player Novak Djokovic will be allowed to play in the French Open even if he is not vaccinated against Covid-19, France's sports minister Roxane Maracineanu said on Friday.

France does not bar unvaccinated people from entering its territory but imposes tougher restrictions than on those who have had the shot.

Sports minister Maracineanu said International Tennis Federation (ITF) protocols at major events meant an unvaccinated player would be entitled to enter France and participate in Roland Garros, which begins in May.

"Djokovic would not follow the same organisational arrangements as those who are vaccinated," Maracineanu told FranceInfo radio. "But he will nonetheless be able to compete [at Roland Garros] because the protocols, the health bubble, allows it."

Australia's decision to revoke a visa Djokovic had been granted based on a medical exemption ahead of the Australian Open in Melbourne has stirred furore and it has the potential of turning into a diplomatic crisis between Australia and Serbia.



ISL 2021-22: Confident Chennaiyin target win against FC Goa

"Sajid was training with the team for a long time and was impressive during that period. He did well




against JFC and helped the team [win]. But now he needs to try and repeat the same performance in the upcoming matches," he added.

While Hazlewood has been all but ruled out of the final Ashes Test, Boland's competition for the Hobart game would be with Jhye Richardson and Michael Neser. But with Boland giving another commanding bowling performance on Friday, dismissing Joe Root for a duck and opener Zak Crawley for 18 to return figures of 2/25 from 12 overs, the Indigenous player looks set to play his third consecutive Ashes game. Meanwhile, there was an injury scare to Boland after a fall and he was taken for scans. But Cricket Australia (CA) later tweeted that the pace bowler was fit to take the field on Saturday, the fourth day of the SCG Test.



DISAPPOINTED AT NOT BEING A PART OF WORLD CUP SQUAD: PUNAM RAUT

India right-handed batter Punam Raut said she was 'extremely disappointed' on being left out of the 15-member squad for the ICC Women's World Cup 2022 to be in New Zealand from March 3 to April 4. The squad announced for the mega event will also feature in a five-match ODI series against New Zealand starting from February 11.

Milan register opening win in 2022, conquer nine-man Roma

AC Milan got its 2022 campaign off to a good start, as it dominated Roma 3-1 at San Siro. A slew of concurrent affairs had stripped AC Milan to barebones as it missed nearly 10 players due to COVID-19, injuries and Africa Cup of Nations duty, but it had Zlatan Ibrahimovic back into action. The home side took a dream start just minutes into the game as Tammy Abraham had a handball in the box. Olivier Giroud turned up to convert it on Thursday night.

Milan doubled its lead in the 17th minute, Giroud was involved again as the French hitman intercepted Roger Ibanez's wayward pass to hit



the post before Junior Messias followed to pounce on the rebound.

With the win, AC Milan still sits second, one point off city-rivals Inter Milan whose Thursday's game against Bologna was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Also on Thursday, Juventus shared the spoils at 1-1 with Napoli, Dries

Mertens gave the Partenopei a 1-0 lead, but Federico Chiesa's deflected strike helped the Bianconeri avoid a home defeat.

Elsewhere, Lazio fought back from 2-0 down to settle for a 3-3 tie against Empoli, Cagliari won Sampdoria 2-1 away, Hellas Verona beat Spezia 2-1, Sassuolo drew with Genoa 1-1.

ASHES, 4TH TEST

BAIRSTOW SLAMS CENTURY BUT ENGLAND STILL IN TROUBLE

A n unbeaten century by Jonny Bairstow (103 balls) on another rain-interrupted day saw England post 258/7 on Day 3 of the fourth Ashes Test, even as Australia strengthened their advantage with the ball, with Pat Cummins and Scott Boland taking two wickets apiece at the Sydney Cricket Ground on Friday. Middle-order batter Bairstow, playing his second Ashes game in the five-Test series, brought up the tourists' maiden century of the series, though will have work to do on Saturday, batting with the tail to close the 158-run first-innings deficit. Australia had scored 416/8 declared in the first innings. Despite a delayed start, Australia came out firing with pacer Mitchell Starc bowling Haseeb Hameed (6) in just the fifth over of the first session. Opener Zak Crawley and Dawid Malan survived the rest of the opening spell shared between Cummins and Starc, but they couldn't deal with what came next. In his second over of the innings, the hero of the Boxing Day Test, Scott Boland gave the Sydney crowd plenty to cheer about when he pegged Crawley's off stump, dismissing the England opener for 18. Three overs later, the Australian quick continued his remarkable form in his debut Ashes series, removing captain Joe Root for a duck. Root failed to manage Boland's



delivery outside off stump, edging the ball to second slip for an impressive catch from Steve Smith. With the lunch break in sight, things went from bad to worse for the visitors. Australia all-rounder Cameron Green claimed the scalp of Malan (3), who flicked the ball off his hip to Usman Khawaja at leg slip. Green's delivery was the last of the first session as England headed into lunch 36/4 with all the work to do. After 10 overs without scoring a run, including the loss of three wickets, England began their fightback with Ben Stokes and Jonny Bairstow at the crease. It seemed to be Stokes' lucky day as Cummins dropped the all-rounder on nine and he was fortunate not to walk three overs later. Green

steamed in to Stokes, clipping his off stump but only for the bails to remain intact. Australia's misfortune proved costly as the England duo brought up a 50-run partnership before Stokes notched up his 25th Test half-century off 70 balls. Stokes fell to Nathan Lyon lbw on 66 with the off-spinner firing into the stumps from around the wicket. New batter Jos Buttler suffered a nasty blow to his thumb from Cummins and fell two overs later to the Australian captain for a duck.

Bairstow found a valuable partner in Mark Wood, who hit three sixes and two fours in an entertaining evening knock. Those three sixes were hit off the bowling of Cummins, though it was the home captain who had the last laugh, with Wood edging onto his helmet and into the hands of Nathan Lyon. Bairstow moved into the nineties, and was accompanied by the resolute Jack Leach (4 not out). He became the first English player to reach triple figures in the series, slashing over the top of the slip cordon for a boundary.



Shweta Tripathi: I am a bit of a fiery person myself



Set in the royal land of Rajasthan, 'Kaun Banegi Shikharwati' is a hackneyed ten-episode dramedy where a father attempts to reunite his four estranged daughters to save the legacy they hold.

Naseeruddin Shah plays Raja Mritunjay, the erstwhile King of Shikharwati, who is bogged down with empty coffers and a huge debt to the Indian Government - in terms of property tax in arrears. To save himself from the situation he is in, with the help of his close confidant Mishraji, he feigns a strange illness and calls his four estranged daughters; Devyani, Gayatri, Kamini, and Uma to his palace with the assurance that he would decide an heir after the four of them compete in a competition.

The rules of the competition are simple. There would be nine rounds in the competition, and each round would be a task which the princesses would have to perform. In the end, the winner of the competition would be appointed the next 'King'. That is how the plot kicks in and thus begins the predictable misadventures of the quirky princesses who do their darndest to win.

Each episode is astutely crafted with art that seems insubstantial and meandering on the surface and thus may repulse some. But by the tenth episode, after you have had the patience of sitting through the earlier nine,



you'd get hooked to find the series end on a meaningful and heart-warming note.

As for the characters; Naseeruddin Shah as the idiosyncratic Raja with his fuzzy tuft looking as cosily rumpled as an unmade bed, making it clear that Raja Mritunjay is not a heartless, mean man and that he has the welfare of his daughters and his estate at heart, Lara Dutta as Devyani his oldest daughter with marital issues, Soha Ali Khan as his considerate second daughter Gayatri who is a single mom to her two children, Kritika

Kamra as his third unmarried daughter Kamini who is obsessed over her social media follower count and Anya Singh as Uma his allergy-prone, gamer daughter, Cyrus Sahukar as Devyani's husband Harsh Neotia, Raghbir Yadav as Mishraji, and the rest of the ilk, all appear stereotypical and oft-seen. Similarly, spare for a handful of inspired scenes, the rest of the series appear clichéd and unoriginal.

In lesser hands, 'Kaun Banegi Shikharwati' could have been indigestible pablum, but its

pitch-perfect cast won't let you soon forget the poignant bonding of the series. There is a natural performative quality to the actors' embodiment of their characters. They all seem to be living their parts effortlessly and are impressive in their marked roles, with them going big at all times with smirks, sighs, smiles, and tears. Overall, mounted with ace production values, the series appears staged with damaged individuals in search of connection and unity, who wind up tidy to a cheesy fault.
