FOOD SYSTEMS ACCOUNT FOR 21-37% OF GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS, SAYS CSE REPORT

It may come as a surprise to many who think of plants as carbon sinks. But the food practices of 7.8 billion people account for 21-37 per cent of the greenhouse gases (GHGs) emitted every year in the world due to all human activities, which means that food systems emit more than transport, energy use and comparable to industry, the Centre for Science & Environment said.


Our food systems, the complete process ranging from food production and consumption to its distribution and disposal, emit more than transportation (14 per cent of global GHG emissions) and energy use in buildings (16 per cent), and almost as much as industry (21 per cent) and electricity production (25 per cent). In fact, in a scenario where emissions from all other sources are halted, emissions from the global food system alone will contribute enough GHGs to heat up the planet above the 1.5 degrees Celsius target.

The report was released here at CSE's 2022 Anil Agarwal Dialogue by Union Environment, Forest and Climate Change Minister Bhupender Yadav. The statistics about food and GHGs has been put together recently by a group of researchers from the UK and the US. Vibha Varshney of Down To Earth said, while it is true that plants remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere through photosynthesis, they also release large amounts of the gas when decomposing. Food systems also contribute to emissions through other direct and indirect ways. For example, felling of trees to make way for farms and pasture removes a major carbon sink. Operation of farm machinery using fossil fuels, or manufacture of agrochemicals and fertilisers too emit GHGs.

She added: "The EAT-Lancet Commission on Food, Planet and Health - a gathering of 37 scientists from 16 nations - has set global targets for food systems that are environmentally sustainable and benefit human health. The commission has proposed a Planetary



Health Diet that could reduce urban emissions by 60 per cent in 10 years."

The CSE-Down To Earth report refers to a September 2020 assessment by UNEP which says reducing land-use change and conversion of natural habitat alone could lower emissions by 4.6 gigatonne of carbon dioxide equivalent (GtCO₂e).

Varshney added: "A dramatic transformation of dietary practices is recommended to decarbonise the food sector. But it is easier said than done. The pathways to achieve that goal are not as clear as they are for, say, generation of electricity. Carbon emissions are integral to the biological system. Besides, one cannot stop eating." There are also financial considerations at play. The most affordable of the EAT-Lancet Commission's 'planetary health diet' exceeds the household per capita income of 1.58 billion people," said Richard Mahapatra, managing editor of Down To Earth.

Additionally, business interests that have played a role in shaping modern industrial food can make the transition difficult as well. There are also fears that this focus on plant-based diets might prompt other emitters to shirk responsibility and put the onus of reducing emissions on the individual.

UP doctor sets record with 107 eye surgeries in 16 hrs

Dr S.P. Singh, Director of the Regional Institute of Ophthalmology and principal of the MLN Medical College (MLNMC) in Prayagraj, has set a new record by conducting 107 phacoemulsification surgeries with intraocular lens (IOL) implant free of cost within a span of 16-and-a-half-hours. The surgeries were performed between 6 a.m and 10.30 p.m. continuously for 16-and-a-half hours on February 25. All the patients are doing fine now after a week of observation," he told reporters. "I am happy at having performed so many surgeries at one go and hope that this would inspire more younger surgeons to work for excellence and public welfare." The doctor has



written to the Limca Book of Records, intimating them about the achievement along with the requisite proofs as required. Earlier, then Brigadier (Dr) J.K.S Parihar of the Army Hospital Research and Referral in New Delhi, had performed 34 phacoemulsi-

fication surgeries in October 2011 in eastern Ladakh and made a place for himself in the Limca Book of Records. On March 5, 2001, Singh had set a record, which was registered in the Limca Book of Records, by performing 81 operations in 11 hours at one go.

OVER 3 CRORE TEENAGERS FULLY VACCINATED AGAINST COVID

New Delhi: India has administered both doses of Covid-19 vaccines to over 3 crore youngsters of 15 to 18 age group so far. The vaccination drive for teenagers started on January 3. India has administered 5,52,63,296 first vaccine doses and 3,01,57,910 second vaccine doses to persons of 15 to 18 age bracket till Saturday morning. "What a great feat by our young warriors! Over 3 crore youngsters between 15-18 age group are now fully vaccinated against Covid-19. Young India is taking the world's largest vaccination drive to the next level", said Union Health Ministry in a tweet on Saturday. The country has also administered over 2 crore precaution doses among the eligible beneficiaries. Additionally, over 97 per cent of India's adult population has also received their first dose of vaccine against Covid-19.

Archaeologists find over 6,500-yr-old pearl bead in Qatar grave

Located a few kilometres south of Al Zubarah on Qatar's northwest coastline, Wadi Al Debaian has yielded several important archaeological finds over the years with pottery originating from the Ubaid period (ca. 6500 to 3800 BCE) of South Mesopotamia (modern Iraq), obsidian from Anatolia (modern Turkey) and further burial sites among the ancient remnants. The recently discovered grave points to the earliest known evidence of Qatar's antique pearl diving industry, which over centuries formed the centre of trade and economic influx to the country. It also offers new insights into the early civilizations occupying the peninsula, including prevalent social structures and wealth distribution.

The discovery of the oldest known natural pearl bead in Qatar has yet again shone the spotlight on the pearl-diving history of the peninsula country that is on its toes as the host of the upcoming FIFA 2022 World

Cup to be played about eight months later. A local excavation mission led by Ferhan Sakal, Head of Excavation and Site Management at Qatar Museums, dug out the oldest known natural pearl bead in Qatar, corresponding to the earliest human settlements on the peninsula.


Dated to 4600 BCE, the bead was found within a grave at Wadi Al Debaian, one of country's oldest Neolithic sites. Until oil was discovered on the peninsula close to 1940, fishing for pearls was the mainstay of the local population. People went on

months-long voyages on wooden boats known as 'dhow's' and would dive into the sea without oxygen tanks or diving suits to bring up oysters that would be later opened up to yield natural pearls. One might have to open scores or even hundreds of oysters to find one which has a pearl. "Our team has unearthed a find of considerable historic and sociological importance, pointing us to the first traceable origins of Qatar's human settlements and their use of the locally-occurring pearl enclaves," Faisal Abdulla Al-Naimi, Director of Archaeology at Qatar Museums, said. "With each new remnant of Qatar's past that comes to light, we gain a clearer understanding of and appreciation for our religious history and identity, which ultimately inform our aspirations for a sustainable future."

Shane Warne changed the landscape of cricket, says ICC

The International Cricket Council (ICC) chief executive Geoff Allardice has said that Shane Warne changed the landscape of cricket by reviving the art of leg-spin, adding that the legendary spinner's larger-than-life personality and immense cricketing intellect ensured "fans were glued to their seats whenever he was involved in a game". Warne died of a suspected heart attack, at the age of 52 on Friday in Koh Samui, Thailand. In a statement, Allardice expressed shock and sadness at Warne's passing and said his impact on and off the field would be remembered for generations. Warne made his Test debut in 1992 against India at the Sydney Cricket Ground, going on to become the most successful leg-spinner of all time. He played 145 Tests, finishing with 708 wickets that included 37 five-wicket hauls and 10 10-wicket match hauls. In 194 ODI appearances, Warne snared 293 scalps. Warne was inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame in 2013 and named as one of Wisden's Five Cricketers of the Century for his unparalleled achievements in an illustrious 15-year career that ended in 2007. He helped Australia win the ICC Men's



Cricket World Cup in 1999 and took more wickets than any other bowler in Ashes cricket, with a tally that stood at 195. After retiring from international cricket, Warne doubled up as captain and coach of the IPL Franchise team Rajasthan Royals, guiding them to the title in the league's inaugural edition. A flamboyant personality both on and off the field, Warne also found success as a commentator and was considered one of the sharpest analysts of the game.



MANIPUR POLLS: 77% TURNOUT IN FINAL PHASE; 2 KILLED IN SEPARATE INCIDENTS

At least two persons were killed and few others were injured in Manipur as over 77 per cent of the 8,38,730 voters exercised their franchise in 22 of the 60 constituencies that went to the polls in the second and final phase Assembly elections on Saturday, officials said.

The voter turnout in 2017 Assembly elections was 86.36 per cent, while it was 82.78 per cent in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls. The police said that one person was killed while another was injured in police firing at Karong in Senapati district, while a BJP activist succumbed to his injuries in Thoubal district. An officer said that the police had to open fire at Karong after some people tried to snatch an EVM from a polling station after thrashing the polling staff.

In another incident in Thoubal district, some BJP workers went to the residence of a rival party worker late on Friday night. After an altercation, the rival party worker reportedly fired at the BJP activists, injuring few of them who were shifted to the hospital, where one person succumbed to his injuries on Saturday.



Officials said that workers of different political parties clashed in Mao, Moreh and other places, halting the polling there briefly.

Manipur Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Rajesh Agrawal said that in the hill districts, 12 incidents of damage to EVMs by miscreants were reported, and FIRs have been registered in each case. Political parties have accused each other of disturbing free and fair

elections in many places. Earlier on Saturday, men, women and first-time voters in large numbers queued up in front of the polling stations before the voting started at 7 a.m. in six electoral districts.

According to officials, more than 20,000 Central paramilitary force troopers were deployed for the second phase of polling in six districts -- Thoubal, Jiribam, Chandel, Ukhrul,

Senapati and Tamenglong.

While Thoubal district falls in the valley area, the other five districts are in the mountainous regions bordering Assam and Nagaland, as well as Myanmar.

Agrawal said that in all, 8,38,730 voters, including 4,28,679 females and 31 transgender, were eligible to exercise their franchise in the second phase to decide the fate of 92 candidates, including two females.

The electoral fortunes of three-time Chief Minister and veteran Congress leader Okram Ibobi Singh (74), as well as several BJP ministers and sitting MLAs, have been sealed in the EVMs in Saturday's polling. Singh is contesting from the Thoubal Assembly seat.

Meanwhile, re-polling was also held on Saturday at 12 booths in two districts -- Imphal East and Churachandpur.

The re-polling was conducted after miscreants damaged EVMs during and after the first phase of polling on February 28.

The first phase of polling was held in 38 seats on February 28, when 88.63 per cent of 12,09,439 voters exercised their franchise.

Counting of votes will be taken up on March 10.

NMC allows foreign medical students to complete internship in India with conditions

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has allowed foreign medical students with incomplete internship due to the ongoing situations, including the Covid-19 pandemic and the Ukraine crisis, to apply and finish their apprenticeship requirement in India but with conditions. However, the Commission has said that the candidates must complete their Foreign Medical Graduates Exam (FMGE) before applying for internships in India.

"It has been observed that there also some foreign medical graduates (FMG) with incomplete internship due to such compelling situations like Covid-19 and the war. Considering the agony and stress faced by these foreign medical graduates, their application to complete the remaining part of their internship in India is considered eligible," the NMC said in a notice.

"Accordingly the same may be processed by the State Medical Councils provided that the candidates have cleared FMGE before applying for the completion

of their internship in India."

The Commission is expected to issue the guidelines for State Medical Councils soon in this regard.

"The Commission decided to issue the detailed guidelines, process which is required to be followed by State Medical Councils for grant of registration of FMGs till further instructions from the commission or implementation of NEET exam whichever occurs earlier."

The Commission further directed the State Medical Councils to follow these conditions while processing for registration of FMGs.

'There is a limit to patience of Hindus', says K'taka Minister

Karnataka Minister for Rural Development and Panchayat Raj K.S. Eshwarappa on Saturday once again stirred a controversy by stating that there is a limit to patience of Hindus.

After meeting BJP worker Venkatesh at the Meggan hospital, who was attacked by miscreants on Thursday, Eshwarappa said that there is a limit to patience of the Hindu community. If the limits are crossed, it could lead to a real split in the society. "I am saying this as a minister," he underlined.

"After the murder of Bajrang Dal activist Harsha, the state government has taken necessary measures and arrested all the accused persons. However, the



goonda mindset of certain community members has not yet gone," he stated.

Eshwarappa further said, "our worker Venkatesh had been attacked by goondas of a particular community. Two of them have already been arrested. Because of a few, the image of the whole community is tarnished. Community leaders should initiate action on these persons."

All people of the community are not bad, only a few goondas are indulging in such activities. The community leaders must give attention to them, he said.

Shivamogga, after seven days of curfew has returned to normal, but the situation became tense after a gang attacked Venkatesh on Thursday. The police are on high alert and is investigating the case.

CEASEFIRE ANNOUNCEMENT RAISES HOPES TO BRING NAVEEN'S MORTAL REMAINS: K'TAKA CM BASAVARAJ

Bengaluru: Karnataka Chief minister Basavaraj Bommai on Saturday said that the ceasefire announcement by Russia has raised hopes to bring the mortal remains of Naveen Gyangoudar, who was killed in shelling in the city of Kharkiv.

Bommai visited the family of Naveen Gyangoudar, at his village in Haveri district. Naveen, a medical student, is the first casualty of the war between Russia and Ukraine.

The Chief Minister paid his respects to the deceased, and spent time with the family and consoled them. He also handed over a cheque of Rs 25 lakh to Naveen's father. The Chief Minister reiterated that the state government is making all efforts to bring back Naveen's mortal remains from Ukraine.

Over 1,200 fell ill after having meal at wedding of Guj Cong leader's son

Over 1,200 people fell sick to food poisoning after having a meal at the wedding ceremony of Congress leader Vazirkhan Pathan's son Shahrukh Khan in Mehsana, Gujarat. State Health Minister Hrishikesh Patel rushed to the place after the news broke.

Many of the invitees, including locals of Savala village, attending the marriage reception, were affected by the food poisoning at the dinner function, with the symptoms of vomiting and diarrhoea. According to available information, around 1,225 people were admitted



to the hospitals of 6 cities and villages namely Visnagar, Mehsana, Unjha, Kheratu, Vadnagar and Gandhinagar. Health Minister Hrishikesh Patel, and health officials, reached Visnagar at 3.30 a.m.

in the morning after learning about the incident. Mehsana District Collector Udit Agarwal and SP also reached the hospital on Friday night. A total 1,225 patients were registered on

record. After treatment, 95 per cent of patients were discharged.

"Most of the affected people had to be treated for food poisoning after consuming 'Lauki Halwa'. We had ordered the food from one of the most reputed caterers, 'Delhi Darbar' and they had procured the 'Khoya' for the Halwa from Ahmedabad's Hasmukhbhai. Almost all of the affected people are well now and we helped them get treated. MLA Hrishikesh Patel was a great help. We received help from all the political leaders of Visnagar and they showed an exemplary unity," said Vazir Khan.

Auditor finds 'questionable' land deals in Ahmedabad-Gandhinagar Metro Rail project

The Gujarat government on Friday put on record the details of the Ahmedabad-Gandhinagar Metro Rail project, where it was found by the internal auditor that land admeasuring around 20 hectares for the project was "questionable" in nature.

During the ongoing Budget session of the Gujarat Assembly, the Urban Development Department tabled the Gujarat Metro Rail Corporation (GMRC) Limited's annual report for the year 2020-21.

According to the independent auditor's report, "It was observed that the GMRC did not have valid documents of the title deeds of a freehold land situated at Survey No. 525 at Kathwada, Vastral in Ahmedabad, admeasuring 18,000 sq mt that is around two hectares, whose market



value as on March 2021 was over Rs 16.82 crore."

Other than that, the auditor also noted that land situated at final plot No. 56 and 285 at Ahmedabad Apperal Park (SEZ), admeasuring

17.62 hectares, was allotted by the Gujarat Industrial Development Corporation (GIDC) to the Metro company for the construction of a depot, "however the mode of transfer of this land from GIDC to the compa-

ny has not been decided by the Gujarat government and according to the auditor, the land transfer is questionable".

The Ahmedabad-Gandhinagar Metro was a dream project of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the then Gujarat Chief Minister. The project was conceptualised initially in 2003 and it was put on a paper in 2005. After 16 years and umpteen number of route changes, the Corporation has been able to run it on only a 6 km stretch. The 39.26 km stretch of Ahmedabad Metro Phase-1 project comprises two lines and 32 stations. It is being constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 10,773 crore.

GMRC is reportedly planning to commence trial lines in all sections of Line-2 by August, coinciding with 75 years of India's Independence, and just ahead of the state elections scheduled to be held in December.

IT DEPT SEIZES RS 4.5 CR IN CASH AFTER RAIDING UP BUSINESSMAN

The Income Tax Department is conducting raids at multiple locations in NCR, Kanpur and Lucknow belonging to businessman Devender Pal Singh, a director-level officer in the Entrepreneurship Development Institute located in Kanpur. Singh was detained on Friday night from Kanpur after a chase by IT officials from Lucknow wing along with the local police.

The raids are underway at Shahdara and Ghaziabad. A source said that the raids started on Friday night and are still going on.

4.25 crore has been seized. The IT officials questioned Singh regarding the cash recovered in the raids, but he failed to give any satisfactory answer.

"Singh was detained in Kanpur following a tip-off when he was going somewhere in his car. The IT officials with the help of Kanpur police chased him and intercepted his car. During a search, cash to the tune of Rs 1 crore was recovered from his car," said a source.



SIX KILLED IN TELANGANA ROAD ACCIDENT

Hyderabad: Six people were killed and two others injured in a road accident in Telangana's Mulugu district on Saturday, police said.

A speeding van hit a stationary auto-rickshaw at Errigattamma village, killing six people and injuring two others seated in the three-wheeler. Four people died on the spot while two others succumbed at government-run MGM Hospital in Warangal. The injured were undergoing treatment at the same hospital.

According to police, except for the auto-rickshaw driver, the deceased were members of the same family. They were returning home after visiting Annaram Shareef dargah in Warangal district. All hailed from Komatipally village in Mangapet mandal of the same district. Ajay (12), Kiran (16), Kausalya (60) and auto driver Jani (23) died on the spot. Vansanta and Vennela succumbed at the hospital. A case has been registered and investigation initiated.

5 KILLED IN J&K ROAD ACCIDENT

Jammu: At least five persons were killed and one was injured after a vehicle they were travelling in went out of control and fell into a deep gorge in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district on Saturday, police said.

According to the police, the vehicle was travelling from Samba to Srinagar and the accident took place in the district's Jamoda area.

"The vehicle carrying six passengers fell into a deep gorge. Five occupants of the vehicle died on the spot while the driver was injured.

"The car bearing registration number JK01U-2233 was carrying passengers from Anantnag district of the valley," the police added.

86 DISTRICTS IN ANDHRA, 52 IN MP AFFECTED BY FLUORIDE

There are as many as 86 fluoride-affected habitations in Andhra Pradesh and 52 in Madhya Pradesh, while the eastern districts of Karnataka face water contamination due to uranium, it was mentioned during a regional review meeting of the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and Swachh Bharat Mission-Rural (SBM) on Saturday.

The regional meeting was held in Bengaluru for stock taking of the JJM and SBM schemes for Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and the UTs of Puducherry and Lakshadweep.

Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, addressed the meeting that was attended by ministers and top bureaucrats of these states and UTs, a release from the Jal Shakti Ministry said.

"It has come to our notice that there are 86 fluoride-affected habitations in Andhra Pradesh and 52 in Madhya Pradesh which deserve



immediate remedial action. Similarly, there is information that in the eastern districts of Karnataka, water contamination is reported due to uranium. "The Ministry is committed to

provide drinking water of a prescribed quality to every rural household. It will provide all funds and technical assistance to address these problems," Shekhawat said. A total of 19 out of 117 aspira-

tional districts fall in the participating states. As on March 1, Telangana has provided tap water connection to all its three aspirational districts while in other states, the coverage ranges between 19 per cent and 52

per cent. "There is a need to pick up speed so that people living in the region soon get access to clean drinking water," Shekhawat said.

So far under the programme, 92,366 village water and sanitation committees have been constituted and 82,646 village action plans have been developed in the participating states and the UT of Puducherry.

There are 588 water testing laboratories, of which 136 are NABL accredited. These laboratories are open for public where they can carry water samples and get them tested at nominal rates.

In these participating six states and two UTs, more than 2.40 lakh women have been trained on how to perform water quality test using field test kits. These women are part of the five-women surveillance committee, which is assigned the task to frequently check the sources and delivery points and report in case any contamination is found so that immediate remedial action can be initiated, the ministry release said.

Fueling Inflation: Petrol, diesel prices set to rise

- ❑ The geo-political crisis-led global hike in crude oil prices is expected to push India's domestic prices of petrol and diesel by Rs 15-22 per litre.
- ❑ It is widely expected that the OMCs will revise the current prices on or after March 7, which is the last day of voting in the ongoing state assembly elections.
- ❑ However, an excise duty cut may dampen the impact on petrol and diesel prices to an extent, but not entirely.

Hostilities between Russia and Ukraine, along with sustained demand, is expected to keep global crude oil prices in the range of \$95-to-\$125 per barrel in the short term.

At present, India imports 85 per cent of its crude oil needs.

Besides, the cascading effect of higher fuel cost will trigger a general inflationary trend.

Already, India's main inflation gauge



-- Consumer Price Index (CPI) -- which denotes retail inflation, has crossed the target range of the Reserve Bank of India in January.

The rise was blamed on high commodities costs.

As per industry calculations, a 10 per cent rise in crude oil prices adds nearly about 10 basis points in CPI inflation.

Lately, the crisis as well as fears of lower supplies have pushed Brent crude oil price to 10-year-high level of nearly \$120 per barrel.

On Friday, the Brent-indexed crude

oil stood at \$113.76 per barrel from a 10-year high of \$119.84 per barrel a day before.

Currently, Russia is the third largest producer of crude oil in the world.

It is feared that sanctions against Russia will curtail global supplies and stifle growth.

Tapan Patel, Senior Analyst (Commodities), HDFC Securities says, "The higher oil prices has raised market expectations that govt of India may hike fuel prices post UP elections, expecting rise by Rs 10-15 per litre."

RUSSIA DECLARES CEASEFIRE FOR CIVILIANS' EVACUATION, THEN ENDS BLAMING UKRAINE

Russia on Saturday declared a temporary ceasefire in the two southern Ukrainian cities of Mariupol and Volnovakha to facilitate the evacuation of civilians via humanitarian corridors, the Defence Ministry in Moscow announced. The ceasefire went into effect from 10 a.m. (about 1.30 p.m. IST), reports Xinhua news agency.



'Stay Inside, Avoid Unnecessary Risks'

Today is the tenth day of war. We have come to know that Russia has announced ceasefire to open corridor of border of two cities, one of them is Mariupol which is 600 km from here. Since morning we are hearing sounds of airjets, bombing and street fights. We have waited for long and can't wait any more. We are risking our lives, we are moving towards borders, if anything happens to us, the government should be held accountable.

Several Indian students stranded in Sumy who decided to walk to the Russian border amid intense fighting in the region are now "confused" whether to continue their journey after the Ministry of External Affairs urged them to avoid taking unnecessary risks. As evacuation from the shelling-battered city remains a challenge for Indian authorities, the students said they could no longer cope with the nail-biting cold, depleting food supplies and having to melt snow to get drinking water.

Around 700 Indian students are still stuck in the war-hit region, their evacuation hampered by the continuous fighting in the area. The students said they have run out of food and water. The students have released several desperate videos on social media, saying they have decided to undertake the potentially fatal journey to the Russian border, some 50km from where they are, sending shockwaves in New Delhi. They said they hope they would be picked up by Indian authorities from the Russian border. In another video, students are seen filling up buckets with ice as they ran out of drinking water.

India on Saturday said it is "deeply concerned" about the Indian students stranded in eastern Ukraine's Sumy city amid the conflict and appealed to them to remain inside their shelters to avoid any untoward situation. Arindam Bagchi, the spokesperson of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), said New Delhi has strongly asked both Russia and Ukraine through multiple channels for an immediate ceasefire for their safe exit from the conflict zone.

RUSSIA WISHES TO CONTINUE DIALOGUE WITH UKRAINE: PUTIN

Moscow/Kiev: Russian President Vladimir Putin said that his country wishes to continue a dialogue with Ukraine and wants peace, provided that all of Moscow's security demands are met amid the war on Kiev. Putin made the remarks on Friday during a phone call with German Chancellor Olaf. The President also expressed hope that Kiev will take a "reasonable and constructive stance" during a third round of talks between Russia and Ukraine.



PUTIN DENIES TO DECLARE MARTIAL LAW

New Delhi: President Vladimir Putin on Saturday denied rumours that Russia was going to declare a state of emergency or martial law due to the ongoing military operation in Ukraine and Western sanctions against Moscow. "Martial law is declared in a country... in case of a foreign aggression, including in particular places where hostilities take place. We don't have a case like this. There is no need for it today."

RUSSIA, UKRAINE TRADE CHARGES OF FIRING

New Delhi: The Russian military has claimed that it was fired upon from Mariupol and Volnovakha after the ceasefire came into force. The head of the DPR, Denis Pushilin, said that the Azov detachment fighters staged an explosion in Mariupol in a house on Meotida Boulevard, RT reported. As a result of the explosion, the house collapsed, leaving up to 200 people under the rubble in the basement, most of them women and children. The nationalist battalions do not allow the civilian population of Ukraine to go out along the humanitarian corridors towards Russia, stated Mizintsev, who's the head of the National Defense Control Centre of Russia. Ukraine officials halted the planned evacuation of civilians from the Ukrainian-controlled Azov Sea port city Mariupol on Saturday, accusing Russia of continued shelling despite a promise to provide safe passage, RT reported.

London: Both the BBC and CNN reconfirmed on Saturday that Indians in Ukraine attempting to cross over into Poland have been facing racial abuse from Ukrainian security forces. There have been persistent reports of this nature for over a week now. Amit Lath, vice-president of the Indo-Polish Chamber of Commerce, claimed that even women have been beaten up, either held up for days or not permitted to leave Ukraine at the border posts. While the US Secretary of State, Antony Blinkin, toured the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) countries in eastern Europe on Saturday, Russian President Vladimir Putin's spokesman disclosed that the two nations were talking through certain channels.

TALIBAN'S SIRAJUDDIN HAQQANI SHOWS FACE FOR THE FIRST TIME

New Delhi: Sirajuddin Haqqani, the acting minister of the Taliban-led government in Afghanistan and a longtime leader of the so-called Haqqani network with a US terrorist bounty on his head, has appeared in front of the media for the first time, RFE/RL reported. Haqqani, nicknamed Khalifa, attended a graduation ceremony in Kabul for hundreds of newly-trained Afghan police on Saturday. He also addressed the gathering, saying the fundamentalist militant group is committed to the Doha agreement signed with the United States in 2020 that paved the way to a pullout of US-led international troops that culminated in late August last year. Haqqani told the graduating cadets that the world faces no threat from Afghanistan, the report said.

Delhi' most wanted vehicle thief lands in police net after 25 years

After being on the run for the past 25 years, the most wanted vehicle thief in Delhi-NCR has finally been arrested by the Delhi Police, an official said here on Saturday.

The accused, identified as Intezar (42), a resident of Meerut, was arrested along with his accomplice Aasif (37).

Furnishing details, DCP Shweta Chauhan said that Intezar was earlier caught once in 2014 after which was never arrested. "In November 2020, Intezar deliberately hit police barricades to avoid his arrest in



the New Friend's Colony area. A case was registered but he managed to get anticipatory bail from the court due to the Covid-19 pandemic," the DCP said.

His associate Aasif is an expert in hacking any car key programming system and can make a duplicate key of any car.

The DCP said that in view of the recent incidents of car theft in Delhi-NCR, a team was constituted which took eight months to identify their hideout and their car which was being used by them to commit theft.

On February 26, a tip-off was received about the presence of the both the accused, after which the police laid a trap and nabbed them from the specified spot. "Two loaded country-made pistols along with four live cartridges were recovered from their possession," said the DCP.

Successful evacuation from Ukraine to have positive impact on polls: Shah

WET SPELL OVER WESTERN HIMALAYAS, NW INDIA



Sharad Pawar dismissed the demands raised by Opposition seeking the resignation of Nawab Malik who was arrested last month in a money-laundering probe.

Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) chief Sharad Pawar on Saturday said that the arrest of party leader and Maharashtra minister Nawab Malik is "politically motivated" and attempts were made to connect him to fugitive Underworld don Dawood Ibrahim because he is a Muslim. He also dismissed the demands raised by the Opposition seeking the resignation of Malik. Malik was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate on February 23 in a money-laundering probe linked to the activities of Dawood Ibrahim and his aides. "Malik's arrest is a political-

ly motivated one. He is being linked to Dawood Ibrahim because he is a Muslim. Malik and his family members are being deliberately harassed but we will fight back," the NCP chief said. When asked about the opposition BJP's demand for Mr Malik's resignation as a minister, Mr Pawar said different yardsticks are being applied to Union minister Narayan Rane, who belongs to BJP, and Malik. "I don't remember our (Congress) former party worker Narayan Rane had to resign after his arrest recently. omor-

row, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is coming to Pune. He may explain more about it. Applying one yardstick for Malik and another for Rane shows that all this was politically motivated," he claimed. Rane was arrested last August by the police at Sangameshwar in the Ratnagiri district of Maharashtra for his statement that he would have slapped state Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray for forgetting the year India got freedom during his Independence Day speech. Speaking about the alleged

tapping of phones of select politicians when BJP was in power in Maharashtra, Mr Pawar said, "I have seen the record of phone tapping of various leaders. It was done during the tenure of the Devendra Fadnis government. Officials merely followed the orders and are now facing the consequences. I have never seen such a situation in the country before." Pawar also took a swipe at BJP and Maharashtra governor BS Koshiyari, who has not approved the names of 12 MLCs sent to him by the Maharashtra cabinet for more than a year ago for their nomination to the Legislative Council. "Maharashtra has the legacy of governors like PC Alexander among others. I should not talk about what the present governor is doing. The Central government is doing whatever it can do and Maharashtra is the latest example," he said. "Getting nominated to the Vidhan Parishad is one's democratic right. But a year has passed and nothing is being done. If someone has decided not to maintain the prestige of the Constitutional post then what's the need to comment," Pawar said.

PM to unveil RK Laxman museum, launch Pune Metro on Sunday

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Pune on Sunday to inaugurate an art gallery-museum dedicated to the legendary cartoonist R.K. Laxman and also inaugurate the new Pune Metro Rail Project as part of his packed schedule, officials said here on Saturday. He will throw open the completed 12-km stretch of the total 32.20 km long Metro Rail project providing world-class urban mobility infrastructure to Pune, and inaugurate an exhibition at Garware Metro Station. The Pune Metro Rail - for which Modi laid the foundation stone in December 2016 - is being built at a cost of over Rs 11,400 crore, and he will go on a ride from Garware to Anandnagar stations. The PM will also unveil a 9.5 feet tall statue of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, made of 1,850 kg gun metal, in the



Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) complex. In the afternoon, Modi will lay the foundation stone of rejuvenation and pollution abatement projects of the Mula-Mutha river on a 9 km stretch slated to cost Rs 1,080 crore. The works involve river edge protection, interception sewage network, public amenities, boating, etc on the Mula-Mutha river on the concept of 'One City, One Operator' costing Rs 1,470-crore. The Prime Minister will inaugurate the 'R.K. Laxman Art

Gallery-Museum' at Balewadi, dedicated to the legendary cartoonist who passed away in January 2015. The museum highlight is a miniature model based on the fictional village of Malgudi which will be made alive through the audio-visual effect. Cartoons with the famed 'You Said It' logo, drawn by Laxman will be showcased here. Modi will launch the Golden Jubilee celebrations of Symbiosis University and 100 e-buses and an e-bus depot at Baner.

OPERATION GANGA MERCY FLIGHT BRINGS BACK 183 FROM UKRAINE

Mumbai: Another 183 Indians, mostly students, arrived from war-torn Ukraine by an Air India Express flight from Budapest via Kuwait at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA), an official said here on Saturday. The flight IX-1603 includes a maximum of 40 persons from Kerala, besides 36 from Andhra Pradesh, 30 from Telangana, 28 from Tamil Nadu, and 11 from Maharashtra.



There are 8 persons from Bihar, 7 from Punjab, 5 each from West Bengal and Haryana, 3 each from Uttar Pradesh and Karnataka, 2 each from Rajasthan and Odisha, and one each from Uttarakhand, Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh. The CSMIA authorities had deployed special measures for the speedy exit and luggage clearance of the Ukraine evacuees, and following the Covid-19 protocols. Representatives of various states later took charge of their people to help them with their lodging-boarding or onward journey plans by trains or flights.

Sanjay Raut claims phones of non-BJP leaders in Goa being tapped

Two days after Goa Congress president Girish Chodankar accused the outgoing BJP-led coalition government of using a private agency to tap phones of its leaders, Shiv Sena MP Sanjay Raut on Saturday claimed that phones of other leading politicians in Goa, were also under the scanner.

"Maharashtra phone tapping pattern being followed in Goa. Sudin Dhavalikar, Vijay Sardesai, Digambar Kamat, Girish Chodankar's phones are being tapped. Who is the Rashmi Shukla of Goa," Raut tweeted on Saturday. Raut is the Shiv Sena's in-charge of Goa. Sudin Dhavalikar, a former



deputy Chief Minister, is a Maharashtrawadi Gomantak Party, Vijai Sardesai, also a

former deputy CM heads the Goa Forward party, both of whom have contested against the ruling BJP. Rashmi Shukla, whom Raut refers to in his tweet, is an Indian Police Service officer in Maharashtra who was in-charge of the State Intelligence Department, who has now been accused of tapping phones of leaders of the Maha Vikas Aghadi, an anti-BJP coalition in Maharashtra. On Thursday, Chodankar told a press conference in Panaji that the phones of top Congress leaders including Kamat and former Ports Minister Michael Lobo were being tapped ahead of March 10, when votes polled on February 14 are scheduled to be counted.

Thane businessman sent to 14-day judicial custody for issuing fake bills

The Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST) department has arrested a Thane-based footwear businessman for issuing fake invoices to the tune of Rs 85 crore to evade tax. After being produced in court, the accused was sent to 14-day judicial custody. On the basis of an input, the CGST department initiated an inquiry against Corvette Tradelink

Pvt Ltd, a Mumbai-based firm. In the preliminary inquiry, the CGST officials found that the firm was allegedly involved in tax evasion by issuing fake bills. A source said the firm issued bills in the name of a fake Delhi-based firm. "We arrested the director of the firm on Thursday who was produced before a concerned court, which remanded him to 14-day judicial custody," said a GST official.

COVID-19: Maharashtra cumulative vaccination tally crosses 15.63 crore

In the ongoing vaccination drive, Maharashtra on March 4 has inoculated 15,63,26,393 people.

As per the state government data, 4,87,32,847 individuals aged between 18 and 44 years received their first vaccine dose and 3,63,90,260 received their second dose since the inoculation drive for this age group began on May 1.

Similarly, 1,32,91,866 individuals above 60 years have received the first vaccine dose while 1,06,87,739 received their second dose. 9,35,945 of them received their precaution dose. Meanwhile, 36,21,995 individuals aged between 15-18 years have received the first vaccine dose, while 19,44,501 have received their second.

So far, 12,95,102 health care workers have been administered the first dose of the vaccine, while 11,85,181 of them have got their second dose. 3,02,652 health care workers have received their precaution dose so far.

Similarly, 21,49,243 front line workers in the state have till now received their first vaccine dose and of them, 19,89,949 got their second dose. 3,16,653 front line workers have received their precaution dose so far.



Maharashtra on Friday recorded 525 new coronavirus cases and nine pandemic-related deaths, the health department said. The new cases included 206 Omicron variant infections, all reported from

Pune city.

On Thursday, Maharashtra had reported 467 new coronavirus cases and 12 deaths. The state's COVID-19 case tally rose to 78,67,916, and death toll reached 1,43,727. So far, a total of 5,211 Omicron cases have been reported in the state. Of these, 4,629 patients have fully recovered, the health department said. There are now 4,476 active coronavirus patients in Maharashtra. As many as 992 patients were discharged since Thursday evening, taking the total of recoveries to 77, 15,711. The recovery rate is 98.07 per cent. Of eight administrative circles in the state (each comprising several districts), Pune circle reported 206 new COVID-19 cases, followed by Mumbai (131), Nashik (71), Nagpur (42), Kolhapur (30), Aurangabad (18), Akola (14) and Latur circle (13). Pune circle reported three deaths, Nashik and Akola recorded two deaths each and Latur and Mumbai circles one death each.

As many as 72,213 tests were conducted in the last 24 hours, taking the tally of samples tested so far to 7,81,38,182. Currently 28,878 people are in home quarantine and 595 are in institutional quarantine.

micro enterprises still have a long way to go. A micro enterprise is an enterprise where investment in plant and machinery does not exceed Rs 25 lakh. Of the 14.90 lakh units in Pune region (Pune, Satara, Sangli, Kolhapur and Solapur), 13.10 lakh units are classified as micro enterprises. The scheme aimed to provide 100 per cent guarantee coverage to banks and Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) to enable them to help MSMEs tide over Covid-19 emergencies. Till September 30, 2021 banks in Maharashtra had

received 5.22 lakh applications under ECLGS, of which only 3.22 lakh were sanctioned. Of the Rs 31,157.08 crore sanctioned, Rs 22,148.36 crore was disbursed. "ECLGS was for units which already are in the net of institutional credit. Many units in the manufacturing or services sector are part of the informal sector and their recovery is delayed. Vendor consolidation - a strategy where companies reduce supplier base and consolidate their operations - is another reason which has impacted micro enterprises.

As a contestant, I would urge my fans to go to the 'Lock Upp' game and support me, or any other contestant that they like."




SAFAI MITRAS WILL GET MONTHLY RISK ALLOWANCE OF RS. 150: CM

NGT concerned over dumping of bio-medical waste in water bodies in MP

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) came down heavily on the negligence by state authorities over an issue of dumping of biomedical and other waste and discharge of untreated sewage into the water bodies and Bhoj Wetland - a Ramsar site in Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh.

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) came down heavily on the negligence by state authorities over an issue of dumping of biomedical and other waste and discharge of untreated sewage into the water bodies and Bhoj Wetland - a Ramsar site in Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh. The NGT bench headed by Justice Adarsh Kumar Goel was dealing pleas related to the issue of damage to the Nawab Siddique Hasan Khan Talab and adjoining water bodies - Motia Talab and Munshi Hasan Talab in MP.

The case of the applicant is that there is an indiscriminate flow of solid waste and bio-medical waste into the lakes in question. The Bio-Medical waste is discharged by the Hospitals and Medical Facilities in the vicinity.

"We find the situation to be extremely unsatisfactory. There appears to be utter neglect of constitutional obligation by the State Authorities, to the prejudice of environment and public health. Dumping of bio-medical and other waste and discharge of untreated



sewage into the water bodies is a great hazard to public health and crime under the law of the land. Such water may be consumed by humans or other living beings and also used for irrigation, affecting food safety, apart from damaging the flora and fauna in the area, including the aquatic life. Discharge of sewage is also blatant contempt of Supreme Court directions," read a recent order passed by the green court. The order further said the lawlessness prevailing, as depicted from undisputed documents and findings in the reports of the statutory authorities need to be remedied on a war footing by stringent action with the involvement of higher authorities of the State so as to enforce rule of law and restore the environment and protect public health. Also, the bench asked a joint

Committee to ensure compliance with rule of law in the issue. Wherever found necessary, CCTV cameras to be installed. Water quality of water bodies be restored by preventing dumping of waste and discharge of effluents/sewage. Water quality monitoring has to be on regular basis, exploring possibility to keep water bodies aerobic for maintenance of oxygen and for at least Class 'C' Water Quality criteria, it has been directed. "We are also disappointed with the attitude so far adopted by the State Pollution Control Board in not levying realistic compensation as per the law laid. Further, the NGT directed the Chief Secretary, Madhya Pradesh to file a consolidated action taken report mentioning the steps taken by various authorities within three months.

Fortunately, the baby bear did not sustain any injuries and was fit to return to the wild. The mother bear was sighted in the vicinity so the team released the cub back in the same area, so she could reunite with her mother.

Animals such as wild boar, nilgai and sloth bear often venture out to the villages bordering the forest in search of fruits and berries. The villagers, to prevent the animals from consuming and damaging their crops, often install barbed wire fences around their plantations.

'THE BATMAN': PULPY, STYLISED, FORMULAIC SERIAL KILLER DRAMA

Intriguingly designed and far from a modern comic book adaptation, this film is not Batman's origin story, but instead, two years of Bruce Wayne being Batman. Clocking at nearly three hours, the film comes across like a modern-day police procedural crossed with a 1970s-style neo-noir action thriller. The film begins in a poetic tone telling us how corrupt Gotham City has turned. It tells us



how hidden in the chaos are the elements waiting to strike like the snakes, and taking up the mantle of the vigilante is the Batman (Robert Pattinson), whose name has become synonymous with the word "vengeance," and every time he strikes, he sends the hardened criminals into pits of fiery damnation. But when the city is on the verge of a new mayoral election, there is a spate of killing sprees beginning with the brutal killing of Mayor Don Mitchell Jr. (Rupert Penry-Jones). A masked man identifying himself as the Riddler (Paul

Dano) is targeting the elites of the city, and he attaches cryptic notes on his victim, addressed specifically towards Batman to decipher. Needless to say, the Riddler is a sparkplug, overflowing in rage toward a corrupt political status quo and the citizenry at large, who he feels have been negligent in doing anything to change this. He says, "I'm nobody, just here to unmask the truth."

While Lt. James Gordon (Jeffrey Wright) is open to getting assistance from the vigilante, others in his department aren't happy with

his decision of allowing Batman the freedom to investigate freely.

The key to Riddler's riddles ends up being Selena Kyle (Zoe Kravitz), a waitress at Gotham's grungy club that also happens to be a popular hang-out for the big crime bosses. How Batman enlists the help of Selena to put together the clues to predict the Riddler's next target and uncover decades of corruption infesting the city, and unravel some personal home-truths, forms the crux of the narrative.

Existing in its specific cinematic universe, 'The Batman' is a pulpy,

stylised film, very methodical in taking its sweet time dwelling in the decrepit details. The plot is very formulaic of the detective procedural serial killer genre: Finding that first alarming murder and clue which leads to the next, where you learn more from each additional target, then try and discern a pattern of connectivity, and finally learning that the grand scheme goes deeper than imagined, and is usually personal.

The introduction scene of Batman is intense and dramatic, and Pattinson impresses, delivering pain by bashing his opponents with abandon. Delivering a performance dripping in grimy, unwashed vindictiveness, Paul Dano is menacing and effortlessly creep as Riddler.

Among others, Zoe Kravitz as Selena is impressive. Colin Farrell as Oz, The Penguin, is nearly unrecognisable.

Overall, 'The Batman' is a dark and serious film, but it does not feel too chocking. You can enjoy the film, on its terms, and be satisfied from the building momentum, seeing how its world incorporates familiar faces and Batman elements, deepening the lore of the city's complicated history.

Based on their current ICC rankings, India (4th) are favourites or expected to win against Pakistan (8). However, the sharpness of their performance in their tournament opener will give the idea of how the mega event could turn out for them.

In the last edition of the 2017 Women's World Cup, India lost to England narrowly in the final. And this time, India will be eager to go one



step ahead and claim the title that has eluded them, especially for skipper Mithali Raj and veteran pacer Jhulan

Goswami, who will be playing their last World Cup.

Even though the batting unit was able to put 250+ scores several times against New Zealand, the likes of Harmanpreet Kaur and Shafali Verma have not been consistent enough and far away from their best. The other concern is that India may or may not have zeroed in on their best XI. Yastika Bhatia was seen as the No. 3 before Deepti Sharma moved up to take the spot in New Zealand.

On the other hand, Pakistan have built a settled bowling line-up and if the batters can follow the bowlers' example, the team can give tough competition to the Mithali Raj-led side. Notably, Pakistan have gone winless at the last two ODI World Cups, and go into this tournament far from being the favourites. Both teams haven't faced each other in the format since the 2017 World Cup when India won by 95 runs.

1st Test: India extends stronghold as Sri Lanka finish day two at 108/4

India extended their stronghold on day two of the first Test at the IS Bindra PCA Stadium as Sri Lanka ended the day at 108/4 in 43 overs. After declaring at 574/8 in 129.2 overs, India picked four Sri Lankan wickets in the final session to put the visitors on the backfoot while enjoying a lead of 466 runs.

Sri Lanka got off to a steady start as Dimuth Karunaratne and Lahiru Thirimanne got 48 runs in the first 18 overs. India used four bowlers within the first ten overs but didn't get much help from the pitch. Ravichandran Ashwin's introduction made things tough for Thirimanne and eventually, the off-spinner enticed him in defending forward and beating the inner edge to trap the batter plumb lbw. Karunaratne managed to survive testing



over from Mohammed Shami. But Ravindra Jadeja, who got some turn and created chances for lbw shouts, struck with his second ball of the day, trapping Karunaratne with a spin-

ning-in delivery and hit him on pads plumb in front of stumps while trying to sweep.

Ashwin then came back for another spell and was rewarded with the wicket of Dhananjaya de Silva on the very first ball. Jadeja had beaten Charith Asalanka on the inside edge and was successful in lbw appeal. Asalanka and Nissanka then ensured that Sri Lanka reached stumps with no further loss of wickets.

Inter Milan finally shattered the curse as they ended their winless run by defeating Salernitana 5-0 at San Siro, with Lautaro Martinez breaking the goal drought with a sensational hat-trick.

Inter were in a poor form before Friday's game, as they only managed one win in the past seven games on three fronts, and hadn't tasted victory since mid February.

The Nerazzurri went ahead in the 21st minute, when Lautaro, who failed to find the net since the January, sprung the offside trap to finish with a low strike, Xinhua reports.



Lautaro doubled the lead in the 39th minute after collecting the ball from Nicolo Barella, resisting a shoulder-to-shoulder challenge and sending the ball into the net. The Argentinean completed his hat-trick straight after the beak when Edin Dzeko rolled across from the left, and Lautaro went in front

of his marker to drill home. Dzeko also found the net in the 63rd minute on January arrival Robin Gosens' assist, before he put the icing on Inter's cake to seal the game 5-0 five minutes later. With the win, Inter restored the lead on the table with 58 points, one ahead of Napoli and AC Milan.

Davis Cup: India defeat Denmark 4-0, stay in World Group I

Indian pair of Rohan Bopanna and Divij Sharan saved three match points to register a hard-fought win against the Denmark's Frederik Nielsen and Mikael Torpegaard 6-7 (3-7), 6-4, 7-6 (7-4) in an intense doubles match of the Davis Cup World Group 1 Playoff at the Delhi Gymkhana Club here on Saturday.

In the inconsequential fourth match, India's ace tennis player Ramkumar Ramanathan, came back strongly after conceding the first set against the lowly-ranked Johannes Ingildsen, notching up a well deserved 5-7, 7-5, 10-7 victory to make it 4-0 in favour of the hosts.

On March 4, Ramkumar Ramanathan and Yuki Bhambri had given the hosts a comprehensive 2-0 lead defeating Christian Sigsgaard



and Mikael Torpegaard, respectively. The 4-0 comprehensive win ensured India a place in the World Group I for the 2022 season, while Denmark will now again go back to World Group II. World No. 32 in doubles Bopanna showed why he is the best doubles player in the country. He rose to the occasion when it mattered the most, grabbing crucial points with his drop shots on the net. However, world No. 142 in doubles, Divij looked a little shaky in the beginning but later got into the rhythm inspired by his partner. The 35-year-old Divij played well in the third set and took the attack to the opposition.

Nielsen, the senior-most player in the Denmark side, made double faulted at 1-2 and then made a back-hand into the net. It gave India a 4-1 lead which proved enough for hosts to seal the set and match.

Asian Youth & Junior Boxing: Nivedita, Tamanna power into semis

Earlier on Friday night, Jackson Singh Laishram (70kg), Dev Pratap Singh

(75kg), Rishabh Singh Shikharwar (80kg) and Gaurav Mhaske (+81kg) progressed to the junior boys' semi-finals following comfortable wins in their respective last-eight round matches. Jackson and Dev outclassed Iran's Amir Khazaeipou Jordan's Abdel Jaradat respectively by unanimous margins. On the other hand,

Rishabh and Gaurav secured themselves medals with victories by Referee Stops Contest verdict against their respective opponents, United Arab Emirates' Mohammed Albarout and Raiymkulov Ermek. However, Harish Saini (63kg) exited after suffering a close 1-4 defeat against Kazakhstan's Akhmet Ussein.

Mumbai: Indian F1 hopeful Jehan Daruvala set the second-fastest overall time at the Formula 2 pre-season test session in Bahrain.

Driving for reigning champions Prema this year, the 23-year-old's best time over the three days was one minute, 42.074 seconds, which put him at the top of the timesheets on the opening day of running. It also stood as the second quickest time of the whole test session, behind only Liam Lawson's Day 2 pace-setting time of one minute, 41.623 seconds. The third and final day of the test had to be abandoned after limited running due to a sandstorm. Times in testing are notoriously difficult to read as teams run their own individual programmes. But they do offer an indication of form. Jehan, who is also part of the Red Bull Junior Team, consistently ran among the front-runners throughout the test, further boosting his prospects of becoming the first Indian to win the Formula 2 championship. He also ran trouble-free during the three days, chalking up a total of 153 laps around the Sakhir International Circuit. The Bahrain test was held from March 2-4.


Actress Saiyami Kher shares how she is managing to do multiple projects and juggling her time between the sets of movies 'Ghoomer' and 'Faadu'.
