AT SECOND CONGRESS G23 MEET, REBEL CAMP WANTS CHANGE IN STATUS QUO, SPLIT RULED OUT

DON'T HAVE FAITH IN 'RAGA'

Sources said it had to be impressed upon the Gandhis that things have to change. The G23 also reiterated the fact that it did not want a split in the party, sources added. Only a few members of the G23 met at senior leader Ghulam Nabi Azad's residence. Hooda and former minister Kapil Sibal were spotted arriving at Azad's home. Earlier, the G23 had said it "did not have faith" in Rahul Gandhi, while staying firm in its demand for a change in leadership.

meeting, the G23 stressed on the fact that it did not want a split in the party, but said it had to be impressed upon the Gandhis that "things have to change". The meeting comes after Rahul Gandhi reached out to the party's "rebel" group through former Haryana CM Bhupinder Singh Hooda, who is a member. According to sources, senior members of the group will reach out to "likeminded"



Congress leaders across the country and attempt to build up support. After a meeting on Wednesday, which was held to deliberate on the party's poll debacle in five states, the G23 had said the only way forward for the Congress was to adopt a model of "collective and inclusive leadership and decision making". Shankar Singh Vaghela, a G23 member who was present at Wednesday's meeting, called for a revamp in the organisational structure, and said the group did not have faith in Rahul Gandhi. Earlier, Rahul met Hooda and sources privy to the happenings in the G23 faction said the two-time CM conveyed to the Congress scion that they were not in favour of splitting the party. The G23 leaders have long demanded an organisational overhaul and change in the party's leadership. A joint statement by G23 read, "We the following members of the Congress Party met to deliberate on the demoralising outcome of the recent results of the assembly elections and the constant exodus of both our workers and leaders."

"Was offered Pegasus Spyware for Rs 25 crores, rejected it": Mamata

Mamata Banerjee today said her government had turned down an offer to buy Israeli spyware Pegasus a few years ago. The use of the spyware to snoop on political rivals is "not acceptable", the Bengal Chief Minister told reporters. "They came to our police department to sell their machines. They demanded Rs 25 crore for it, five years back. It came to me, I said no we don't want to buy such machines," Mamata Banerjee said. "If it was for anti-national activities and for security, it could have been a different thing. But it is used for political reasons, it's used against officials and judges, which is not acceptable," she added. A political cataclysm followed allegations that the Pegasus spyware - sold only to governments - was allegedly used to target opposition leaders, journalists and others in India. In 2019, a media consortium, including The Wire, revealed that 300 phones from India were on the list of potential targets on the leaked database of NSO, which supplies the Pegasus spyware. It is not established, however, that all the phones were hacked. Her Pegasus claims come days after a BJP leader, Anirban Ganguly, alleged that Mamata Banerjee had been using the spyware since she came to power in 2016.

TDP GOVERNMENT ALSO REJECTED PEGASUS

Amaravati: Telugu Desam Party (TDP) General Secretary Nara Lokesh on Thursday revealed that the his party's previous government in Andhra Pradesh had rejected the offer of Pegasus to sell its spyware to the state. Lokesh, who was Information Technology Minister in the TDP cabinet headed by his father N. Chandrababu Naidu, clarified that the TDP government did not purchase any spyware. "Yes, Pegasus offered to sell its spyware to the AP government as well but we rejected it," he told reporters. He was reacting to West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's purported claim that the Chandrababu Naidu government purchased the Pegasus Spyware. "She was misinformed. If we had resorted to such things, Jagan Mohan Reddy would not have come to power in 2019," he said.

BARC RESUMES RATINGS FOR TV CHANNELS

Mumbai: Nearly 17 months after the mega TRP manipulation scam erupted in Mumbai, the Broadcast Audience Research Council (BARC) of India has resumed the ratings for individual news channels, an official said here on Thursday. The BARC released data for Week 10 for the current year (2022) on Thursday as per its new 'Augmented Data Reporting Standards for News & Special Interest Genres' after conducting a nationwide consultative process with all the stakeholders. As per the revised approved standards, audience estimates for these genres will only be released every week based on a four-week rolling average, said the official. The BARC said that a level playing field has been ensured for all channels within the ecosystem with a single YUMI login access to the audience estimates.

2022-23. Reduction of number of credit hours in the range of 120-132 for 3 years and 160-176 for four years will not only devalue degrees but also lead to massive erosion of workload and teaching jobs. Reportedly students will be studying 'common courses' from humanities, social sciences, mathematics and vocational education for first 3 semesters and then decide what major, minor they want to choose, professor Dhusiya said. According to him, "this methodology is a big waste and will ensure that students will not get sufficient time to pursue their area of specialization. On top of that, if they are allowed to pursue PhD straight after 4 years of undergraduate course, it will lead to the devaluation of the PhD degree itself."

44,167 FAMILIES REGISTERED AS MIGRANTS WITH J&K GOVERNMENT

New Delhi: As the Kashmir Files reignites the horrors of the genocide of the Kashmiri Pandits, information has surfaced that 44,167 families are registered as migrants with the J&K government. In an RTI reply, the Home Ministry said that a separate Security Related Expenditure (SRE) scheme in J&K namely SRE Relief and Rehabilitation was introduced in 1989-90 which includes financial assistance in the form of administrative, socio-economic, health, security related assistance to Kashmiri migrants including Kashmiri Pandits. The scheme includes relief to migrants from Kashmir and Jammu settled in J&K and Delhi in the form of cash or kind. It also includes expenditure towards providing employment to Kashmiri migrants from time to time under special packages. It also includes financing rehabilitation activities related to migrants like construction of transit accommodations, housing facilities, scholarship, providing employment, waiving of interest loans, assistance to farmers. In addition, cash assistance of Rs 3,250 per month with a ceiling of Rs 13,000 per month per family, and 9 kg rice, 2 kg atta and 1 kg of sugar per family is also being given to Kashmiri migrants. Also, construction of 6,000 transit accommodations for 6,000 Kashmiri migrant employees in Kashmir Valley was approved in 2015.

21 dead as Russian shelling hits school, cultural centre in Ukraine

Washington: For the first time since Moscow waged its war on Kiev on February 24, US President Joe Biden called his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin a "war criminal" as the latter is "inflicting appalling devastation and horror on Ukraine". When the reporter asked the President if he was ready to call Putin a "war criminal", Biden responded by saying: "Did you ask me whether I would tell? Oh, I think he is a war criminal."

Moscow: Moscow considers "inadmissible and unforgivable" the words of US President Joe Biden, who called Russia President Vladimir Putin a "war criminal", said Dmitry Peskov, Kremlin Press Secretary. Peskov also said that hundreds of thousands of people around the world have been killed by US bombs. The words of Biden, who called Putin a "war criminal", are "absolutely inadmissible, unacceptable, unforgivable", said Peskov, RT reported.

CLIMATE CHANGE TO BE PART OF SCHOOL CURRICULUM

New Delhi: The concept of climate change has been incorporated in the curriculum and in the textbooks developed by the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT). This curriculum is a part for the subjects like Social Sciences and Geography for classes 7 and 11. Topics on climate change have also been incorporated in the NCERT's Science Textbooks for classes 8 and 9 and Biology Textbook for class 12. Minister of State for Education, Annpurna Devi said, "NCERT has been organizing in-service teachers' capacity building programmes in Geography as well as in Social Sciences where teachers are sensitized over the issues related to climate change."

Heat Wave warning in 9 Madhya Pradesh districts, Yellow alert issued

The heat wave condition is likely to prevail at few places in Narmadapuram, Ratlam, Shajapur, Khargone, Dhar, Khandwa, Damoh, Chhattarpur and Rajgarh districts, for the next two days. The maximum (day) temperature touched 39 degrees Celsius, 4 degrees above normal, while the minimum (night) temperature hovered at 18 degrees Celsius, which was normal, in Bhopal, the official said.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Thursday issued a yellow alert warning of heat wave conditions in nine districts of Madhya Pradesh for the next two days. Severe heat wave conditions prevailed in Narmadapuram, with mercury rising to 43 degrees Celsius, the highest maximum temperature in Madhya Pradesh, on Thursday, senior meteorologist PK Saha of IMD Bhopal said. Similar conditions were witnessed in Rajgarh, Dhar, Ratlam and Khargone districts during the day, he said. The maximum and minimum temperatures were 38.4 degrees Celsius, three above normal, and 22.6 degrees Celsius, five above normal, respectively in Indore, Saha said. The maximum and minimum temperatures were at 37.9 degrees Celsius and 20.8 degrees Celsius respectively in Jabalpur, while in Gwalior, they were at 37 degrees Celsius and 17.9 degrees Celsius respectively, he added. Citing the cause for the weather condition, Saha said that the dry westerly winds from neighbouring Rajasthan were blowing into the central state.





DELHI CIVIC POLLS: AAP MOVES SC FOR FREE, FAIR, TIMELY ELECTIONS

Delhi's ruling Aam Aadmi Party has moved the Supreme Court challenging the State Election Commission's (SEC) decision to postpone the municipal elections without any reasonable ground.

The plea contended that the decision has been taken solely on the basis of unofficial communication by the Central government. "The brazen influence of the Government of India over the State Election Commission and its flagrant meddling with the conduct of municipal elections forms the subject matter of this writ petition," said the plea.

The plea sought a direction to the SEC to conduct the municipal elections in Delhi, according to the initially conceived schedule, before the expiry of the tenure of the Municipal Corporations of Delhi, in May 2022, in a free and fair manner.

The petition contended that the SEC, on March 9, issued a press note



for holding the polls in April.

"However, precisely half an hour later, by way of a press note, it conveyed that it had received some communication from the Lt. Governor of Delhi, conveying that the Government of India was intending to pass a legislation to merge the trifurcated Municipal Corporations of Delhi. In light of this communication, the press conference to declare the election schedule was indefinitely postponed; the municipal elections consequently being deferred," said the plea. The plea added that no formal state communication has

been issued to this effect yet. Even in the ongoing Budget Session, no agenda has been declared regarding the tabling of a Bill to this effect, it added.

"As no subsequent formal notification, agenda or communication regarding the merger of the Corporations has come from the state, it clearly showed the delaying tactics to hamper the free and fair conduct of elections beyond the constitutionally mandated period of five years, as per Article 243U of the Constitution," it said.

The plea questioned whether the

SEC can be influenced by an unofficial communication sent by the Centre to defer municipal elections, which the poll body was prepared to conduct. "The timing of this communication, right before the declaration of the schedule also leaves much to be desired. The conduct of the government makes evident its attempt to interfere with the free and fair conduct of elections. Instead of stopping the government from doing so and protecting its independence, the respondent commission has given in and deferred the elections", added the plea.

The plea contended that the sole influence of the government in deferring the municipal elections is a clear infringement of the independence of the State Election Commission and an evident obstruction to the impartial conduct of elections.

"Issue a writ of mandamus, directing Respondent Commission to expeditiously conduct the municipal elections in Delhi as per their initial proposal, in a free and fair manner," said the plea.

Dry colours more harmful than liquid ones: Experts

On the eve of Holi, doctors here have warned that dry colours may cause more harm to the eye as compared to liquid colours.

According to Shantanu Mukherji, a senior consultant with the Sharp Sight Eye Hospitals, "Synthetic colours contain harmful agents like industrial dyes and alkalis, which are incredibly toxic for the human skin, especially the eyes. Their use can also cause symptoms like irritation, redness, allergies and even permanent loss of vision in case of severe chemical injury to the eye."

"The other thing that causes eye problems is poor hygiene. If one tries to remove colour by rubbing the eye with dirty fingers, it may expose one to the risk of infective conjunctivitis," he added. Talking about



skin problems after Holi, dermatologist Amit Bangia advised applying oil on exposed skin before playing Holi. "Use colours made from natural ingredients as much as possible like rose petal, marigold flowers, turmeric, beet root etc. Remove colour with mild face wash and moisturise


the skin after cleaning the color," he said. Bangia also said that the festival of Holi involves close proximity in large gatherings, which is a perfect recipe for the spread of Covid. Children who are not vaccinated and the elderly who are susceptible to complications should avoid playing Holi, he added.

Cyclone Asani: Suspension of fishing from March 19-22 at A&N Islands advised

The Andaman and Nicobar Islands will bear the maximum impact due to a low pressure area (LPA) in the south-east of Bay of Bengal, which is likely to intensify into a cyclonic storm by March 21.

The system is likely to be a well-marked low pressure area by March 19 morning over southeast Bay of Bengal and adjoining south Andaman Sea and turn into a depression by the morning of March 20 to ultimately become a cyclonic storm - now identified as Asani - on March 21. The system will initially move east-north-eastwards till March 19, then move northwards along and off Andaman and Nicobar Islands till March 20, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said. Then it will move north-north-eastwards and reach near Bangladesh-north Myanmar coasts around the morning of March 22. This is the first time that the IMD has introduced the pre-genesis track and intensity forecast experi-



mentally at the stage of LPA over southeast Bay of Bengal. The IMD said it is the first centre to initiate pre-genesis forecast worldwide. According to climatology of cyclones in March based on data from 1891-2020, a cyclone at this time is not a rare phenomenon. There have been eight cyclonic disturbances in March (two in Arabian Sea and six in Bay of Bengal) earlier. Of this, six dissipated over sea, one crossed over to Tamil Nadu coast as a cyclonic storm in 1926 and the other towards Sri Lanka in 1907, the IMD data said.

Free LPG cylinders twice a year but not on Holi, Diwali

The distribution of free LPG cylinders under the Centre's flagship Ujjwala Scheme will not carry any religious connotation of being distributed only on popular festivals of the Hindu community, such as Holi and Diwali.

The UP government has, instead, decided to fix two duration bands, January to March and October to December, when the sop will be given to over 1.65 crore beneficiaries in the state.

The development came amid the state government's plan to extend the scheme entailing free



ration distribution to nearly 15 crore economically weak people

after March. Additional Commissioner, Food and Civil

Supplies Department, Anil Kumar Dubey, said that the free gas cylinder distribution scheme is not related to any festival of a particular community or religion.

"Executing the scheme over a stipulated period will ensure its effective implementation and a wider outreach," Dubey told reporters. He also confirmed that the free ration scheme is being actively considered for being extended after March.

Free distribution of gas cylinders during Holi and Diwali was one of the key poll promises, the BJP had made in the recently concluded UP elections.

NO PATIENT IN DELHI'S DEDICATED COVID HOSPITAL FOR FIRST TIME SINCE MARCH 2020

New Delhi: For the first time since the beginning of the pandemic in March 2020, Delhi's dedicated Covid Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Hospital does not have even a single patient of coronavirus, it was announced on Thursday.

All the Covid-19 patients have been discharged from the hospital and no new patient has been admitted, Delhi Health Minister Satyendar Jain said. "All the COVID patients of third wave have been successfully treated & discharged from LNJP Hospital. For the first time since March 2020, zero patients of COVID-19 are admitted in the hospital. Salute to the entire medical fraternity for their dedicated service," he said in a tweet.

Meanwhile, the national capital continues to report downward trends in fresh Covid cases, at 148 new infections and one death in last 24 hours. The active cases in the city stand at 610.



5 yr jail term to ex-PNB manager in loan fraud case

A Special CBI Court in Uttarakhand has awarded jail terms to seven persons including an ex-Punjab National Bank manager in connection with a loan fraud case of Rs 1.34 crore.

The court awarded five years jail term to Ashok Bhardwaj, the then Branch Manager, PNBank, Manglaur Branch and also imposed a fine of Rs four lakh on him for committing the offence.

It awarded three years jail term to Sudha Pandit, Sushil Kumar Sharma, Mukesh



Kumar Sharma, Nishant Kumar Sharma, Roshan Ali and Vipin Kumar Verma. The court also imposed different penalties on all of them.

The CBI registered a case in 2006 against Bhardwaj and other accused on the allegations of causing loss to the tune of Rs 1.34 crore to the bank in the matter of

releasing loan for establishing Small Scale Unit under KVIC Scheme of Govt of India to five firms, CC Limit to two firms and regular loan to one firm.

It was further alleged that Public Servant in conspiracy with the borrowers of different non-existent firms had cheated the Bank and the loans were sanctioned on different dates and at different point of time to different borrowers. The quotations and bills of the suppliers were allegedly forged. It was also alleged that the properties kept as collateral securities were already sold.

RAPE ACCUSED OPENS FIRE AT COPS IN DELHI, HELD

New Delhi: A rape accused on Thursday opened fire at the police party in Outer North Delhi's Khera Prahladpur road after he was asked to surrender. The police launched a counter attack in which he suffered a gun wound in his left leg's knee and was caught. Brijendra Kumar Yadav, DCP, Outer North Delhi, said that the accused was identified as Mohammed Akhtar. A pistol, empty cartridges and a stolen cell phone was recovered from him. A senior police official said that the victim went missing on March 9 at around 7 p.m. Her family told the police that she was playing outside the house when she went missing. The police lodged an FIR for kidnapping and started a probe. A day after the incident, on March 10, the girl was brought to her home by a neighbour who said that he found her nearby. The medical examination which was done the same day found nothing adverse and no sexual assault was mentioned in the medical report. "Girl's statement under 164 CrPc were recorded before magistrate the same day and nothing related to sexual assault was stated in her statement. Parents also agreed," said the police. On March 12, the girl started having some medical problems and was taken to a hospital, which upon examination said the girl's hymen was torn indicating sexual assault. The police then added sections of sexual assault and other relevant sections of POCSO.

Punjab CM announces launch of phone number to expose corrupt

A day after taking oath of office, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday announced to launch a

mobile phone number on March 23, the martyrdom day of Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh, exclusively for the public to upload videos of officials demanding bribe for day-to-day work or indulging in malpractices.

Exhorting the top brass of civil and police administration to discharge duties as a public servant in the letter and spirit, thus respecting the massive mandate got by the AAP in the recently concluded assembly polls, the Chief Minister said the people who have given "us an opportunity to serve the state are the real rulers in the democracy having the power to make the leaders to rule or show them the door". Taking a cue from the performance of Indian cricket team, Mann said, "Matches are won or lost but it is the team spirit which matters". Therefore, he urged the officers to display team spirit immaculately to make Punjab as the frontrunner state. He further said, "Our prime concern should be to make our state as real Punjab not London, California or Paris". Furthermore, the Chief Minister said his government would not indulge in political vendetta and asked the entire administration to discharge their duties fearlessly without any political pressure, unlike earlier regimes, with utmost dedication, sincerity and honesty to cherish the aspirations of the Punjabis who have voted to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) to power with unprecedented verdict.

INDIA RELEASES ITS ARCTIC POLICY

Joining an elite group of countries working on various aspects of Arctic, India on Thursday released its Arctic policy "India and the Arctic: building a partnership for sustainable development".

"India's Arctic policy would play an essential role in preparing the country for a future where humankind's biggest challenges, such as climate change, can be addressed through collective will and effort. India's Arctic policy shall be implemented through an action plan, and an effective governance and review mechanism involving the interministerial Empowered Arctic Policy Group," Union Science and Technology and Earth Sciences Minister Jitendra Singh said while releasing the Policy document.

Implementing India's Arctic policy will involve multiple stakeholders, including academia, the research community, business, and industry, he said. India's engagement with the Arctic dates back to a century when the Svalbard Treaty was signed in February 1920 in Paris. India is already undertaking several scientific studies and



research in the Arctic region. "Indian researchers are monitoring Arctic glaciers for their mass balance and comparing them with glaciers in the Himalayan region. India has also been actively involved in studies related to the Arctic oceanography, atmosphere, pollution and

microbiology," Singh said. Over 25 institutes and universities in India are currently involved in Arctic research and about a 100 peer-reviewed papers have been published on Arctic issues since 2007, a release from Ministry of Earth Sciences said. In 2014 and 2016,

India's first multi-sensor moored observatory in Kongsfjorden and the northernmost atmospheric laboratory in Gruevbadet, Ny Alesund, were launched in the Arctic region. Until 2022, India has successfully conducted 13 expeditions to the Arctic, the release added.

Meetings of peace committees should be organised at the police station and district level as well as at the mohalla level. A campaign will be launched to identify illegal migrants from other countries in the state. Chouhan directed to take special precautions and keep an eye on



social media for upcoming festivals including Holi and said that misleading information coming on social media should be refuted immediately.

Chief Minister was taking a meeting with senior officers at his residence office today regarding the law and order situation. Chief Secretary Iqbal Singh Bains, Additional Chief Secretary Home Rajesh Rajoura, Director General of Police Sudhir Saxena and other senior officers

were present in the meeting.

Chouhan said that women, children, dalits, poor and everyone should feel safe, such a system is necessary. Maintaining law and order is the top priority of the state government. Prompt action has been taken in the crimes against women and children in the state. The state has to be made a model state in law and order.

To say save water on Holi is 'cultural terrorism': Sarang

This year, 'Holika Dahan' is being observed on Thursday, and 'Dhulivandan' - during which people apply colours to each other - will be celebrated on Friday.

Requested To Extend the Duration of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban) till 2024

The tasks of the mission will be completed within the stipulated time frame. For this, full cooperation of local public representatives should be taken. 

Another song says: "Sab gundon ko uttar dena gundon ki hi boli mein keval bhagwa rang udana abki bari holi mein." Sung and written by Arjun Suryavanshi, the song goes: "Bhagwa rang mein rangi hai UP. Phir bhagwa lahrao rangon se bhar bhar ke pichkari ham toh aaj chalayenge. aai hai Holi kesariya ham mil ke aaj manayenge." There are also other songs hailing Yogi, such as: "Bulldozer ki sarkar bani phir UP mein. Yogi ki jai jaikar hui phir UP mein." HOLI SPREADS COLOURS OF JOY IN BRAJ MANDAL TO DISPEL COVID GLOOM

It's festive mood in Sri Krishna land. Ahead of Holi on March 18, temples in Braj mandal have begun to celebrate Holi in a big way, after two years of the Covid-19 pandemic despair. The election results too have buoyed the spirits of the Braj Mandal 'Huriyars' after a clean sweep by BJP candidates in nine assembly seats in Agra and five in Mathura. In Vrindavan, hundreds of widows in shelter homes, carrying forward the social revolutionary spirit, defied the age-old restrictive norms, played Holi with gusto at the historic Gopinath Temple on Tuesday. Fighting the Covid-19 gloom, the widows this time gathered at Vrindavan's famous Temple to celebrate Holi with full gaiety. Till a few years ago, this was simply unthinkable, but breaking the barriers, eminent social reformer and founder of Sulabh International, Bindeshwar Pathak initiated efforts to mobilise widows of Vrindavan to celebrate Holi. A resident said, "Vrindavan's Holi celebrations in recent years have become memorable occasions for the thousands of widows who till in recent past used to face humiliation." The life which was such a dreary drag for most widows, changed for the better at the intervention of the Supreme Court some years ago, when Sulabh was asked to provide support and care to this hapless segment of the society. Since early morning on Tuesday large numbers of widows



living in various shelter homes started gathering at the Gopinath Mandir where they threw heaps of rose and gajendra flower petals on the people assembled there. The Holi celebrations began with much fanfare amid song and dance performances. The widows who wear only white sarees smeared colours and threw gulaal on one another to celebrate the festival, breaking away from years of social stigma attached to women who had lost their husbands. Large amount of 'gulaal' (dry colour powder) of different colours were arranged by the organisers. Widows who mostly hail from West Bengal splashed colour powders and threw flower petals on each other. They danced and chanted Krinsha bhajans and Holi songs. Widows also shared sweets with each other and enjoyed food. "Their participation in Holi symbolises a break from tradition which forbids a widow from wearing coloured saree, among many other things," said Bindeshwar Pathak, mentor of Sulabh Movement in a statement. This special celebration is set to add a new colour to the Holi festivities in 'Braj', popular among both Indian and foreign tourists. While expressing joy, Gaurvani Dasi termed this celebration as "Holi of Hope" for thousands of widows living in Vrindavan and Varanasi. Chabi Maa and Vimla Dasi expressed great pleasure in celebrating Holi with other mothers. The US based Celebrity Master Chef Vikas Khanna also supported the Holi celebrations.

Bollywood swallowed up pop: Remo Fernandes

For someone whose introduction to rock music was at the age of seven, when a cousin brought the album 'Rock Around the Clock' from abroad, Goa and Portuguese-based singer and musician Remo Fernandes admits that unlike many of sensations that disappeared in a year or two from public memory, he has somehow remained in people's consciousness. "I do not even try and analyse the how and why of it, of course, I remain eternally grateful. Maybe it is to do with the fact that I have stayed true to my art and rooted in my beliefs, and the audience can sense a truth in my songs. Remember, I was not doing disco just because it was fashionable or ghazals for the reason that they were in trend," he tells correspondents. Talk to him about how the vibrant pop scene of the 80s and 90s in India suddenly crashed, and Fernandes, who brought an Indian element to his music with sitar/guitar

and taught himself to play the Indian flute, says it happened when Bollywood decided to borrow talent from pop culture. "And the pop world happily relaunched itself. There are so many pop and rock singers whose songs you'll find in films but that doesn't mean they become music directors -- and it's here I think that spelt the death of the pop scene as everyone went into the Hindi film industry. Bollywood is like a huge monster capturing art forms and letting them out as films," says the musician whose work is a fusion of many different cultures and styles. Never inclined to work in Bollywood, Fernandes says that the one song he did, just fell into his lap. "I never shifted to Bollywood. Frankly, I did not even attend the premiere of

'Jalwa'. It was never really my thing. For me, it has always been about writing my own songs and in the language, I know. Of course, it is a handicap not knowing Hindi to reach out to the masses." Fernandes, who was at the recently-concluded Jaipur Literature Festival (JLF) for 'Remo: The Autobiography of Remo Fernandes', which encompasses his school days in Goa, times spent in an architecture college in Mumbai, hitchhiking in Europe and Africa, and anecdotes as a professional musician; says that he has always enjoyed reading autobiographies. "But that is not the reason why I wrote mine. I felt that I had some interesting stories to tell. I started writing about the Goa I grew up in because I read books that were written about the olden times there and none of them rang true to me except

one. Many famous Goans did not want to be known from that state as they felt embarrassed. And then, suddenly when Goa became fashionable, everyone wanted to be known as hailing from there. I was born there and I thought that if I do not write about it, who will?" Lamenting that the Goa he grew up in does not exist anymore, he says: "It is heartbreaking. The changes are not for the better. It is tough to look at how nature has been systematically crushed. The place I grew up in didn't know the existence of iron grills on windows. And now there is a rape or a murder almost every day there. That is the reason that I spend half my year in Portugal and the other half in Goa." Though not planning to write another book anytime soon, he adds: "I am not a professional writer, but if a subject touches me deeply, then maybe..."

IN A FIRST, INDIAN CARGO EXPORTED TO UZBEKISTAN VIA PAKISTAN

In a first, Pakistan has allowed a private Indian trader to export commercial goods to Uzbekistan as part of the trade activity between New Delhi, Islamabad, Kabul and Tashkent. According to details, at least 140 tonnes of cargo, mostly Indian sugar, crossed over into Pakistan and travelled to Afghanistan through the Torkham border. The shipment was sent ahead towards Uzbekistan's capital Tashkent on Wednesday. Maulana Zaheer, spokesperson of Afghanistan's Ministry of Industry and Commerce, said that a special ceremony was organised to facilitate the transit of Indian goods in Kabul. "The shipment arrived in Kabul a day earlier from Pakistan via Torkham border crossing. The ministry organized a ceremony to facilitate the transit of Indian goods, "This is a major step towards turning Afghanistan into a key trade link between Central and South Asia," he added. The cargo had originated from Mumbai and had travelled through the Karachi seaport earlier this month, where the Uzbek importer received it.



The cargo was then loaded into trucks from Karachi and sent towards the Torkham border into Afghanistan after which it would travel to Uzbekistan. "This was done as under the recently inked bilateral transit trade agreement between Pakistan and Uzbekistan," said a Pakistani official. The agreement was signed during the recent visit of Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev,

during which, several bilateral trade agreements were mutually agreed and materialized. "The Uzbekistan-bound Indian commercial consignment was a privately arranged activity under the agreement and had no government involvement from any of the four countries," stated the Pakistani official. "It will not become a regular activity, and Uzbekistan will be able to import goods from anywhere through Pakistani seaports." The official also revealed that the Taliban-led government in Afghanistan is bound to facilitate trade activity and Uzbekistan also has the right to access Pakistani ports for international trade, having the same right that is facilitated for Afghanistan. Pakistan has allowed Afghanistan to use its ports and air routes to carry out its trade activities from other countries. This facilitation is provided as part of the Afghanistan-Pakistan Transit Trade Agreement (APTTA), which allows Afghan traders to export their goods to India via Pakistan's land, air and sea routes. However, the Afghan traders can only import through Pakistan's seaports because of the tense relations between the two countries.

Pak confident to get positive nod during 7th review of IMF

Pakistan government is confident that its progress in terms of economic reforms and strategies will help it get a positive nod from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) during its 7th review. The IMF mission had raised reservations over the budget allocation in the Prime Minister's Relief Package on various commodities, including petrol, diesel, electricity prices and tax amnesty for industrial sector during the last review. However, this time, Pakistan Finance Minister Shaukat Tareen is confident that all concerns have been explained in detail and would not cause any further discrepancies. "Now the IMF team will come back with final assessment on Friday for holding virtual talks," said



Tarin. "The pending 7th review of the IMF was almost done because there was no difference of opinion on macroeconomic figures till December 2021," he added. While Tarin seems confident that the IMF review will go smoothly, other government sources say it may be difficult to strike a staff level agreement with the IMF, especially when political instability in the country is looming over the ruling government led by Prime Minister Imran Khan.

"Political crisis in the country is looming over the ongoing staff-level review talks and a decision on the next loan tranche is likely after an outcome on the no-confidence move due later this month," said an official. The other challenge for the Pakistani authorities with the IMF will be to convince them and justify Islamabad's breach of commitment of raising petroleum levy by Rs 4 per month. Pakistani officials are hopeful that the IMF would look into this matter and review it with leniency, keeping in view the unprecedented rise in global crude oil prices. Pakistan has so far detailed to the IMF that the amnesty package is not only a relief package, but is more of an industrial package, entailing five-year tax holidays on projects with investment by Pakistani expatriates in Pakistan.

US GOVT PAYS \$127MN TO SETTLE 2018 PARKLAND SCHOOL SHOOTING CIVIL CASES

Washington: The US Department of Justice (DOJ) said that it had settled the 40 civil cases that arose following the 2018 school shooting in Parkland, Florida, for \$127.5 million. "The settlement does not amount to an admission of fault by the US," Xinhua news agency quoted the DOJ as saying in a statement. "The parties have been in litigation since late 2018, when the survivors of the shooting, and the families of 16 people killed, sued the government for damages," it added. The families of 16 victims, as well as several survivors, sued the US government after learning that the Federal Bureau of Investigation had received a tip about the shooter five weeks before the shooting. On February 14, 2018, armed with a rifle, Nikolas Cruz walked into Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School and opened fire with his semi-automatic weapon, killing 17 and injuring 17 others. This was the deadliest high school shooting in US history. In October 2021, Cruz, a former student who had been expelled from the school in 2017 for documented disturbing and violent behaviour, pleaded guilty to 17 counts of premeditated first-degree murder and 17 counts of attempted first-degree murder. The case was handled by the DOJ's Civil Division and the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Florida.

TALIBAN FORMS COMMISSION TO HELP MIGRANTS RETURN HOME

The Taliban-led government in Afghanistan on Thursday said it has formed a commission to help the people who left the country after the fall of Kabul in August 2021, to return to their homeland.

Chelsea come from behind to beat Lille, reach quarters

But for a long period on Wednesday night, it looked like England would have only two clubs remaining in the Champions League as Chelsea went behind. The scoreline may look comfortable but it was not so easy as Chelsea had their credentials checked in northern France, especially after Burak Yilmaz fired Lille ahead from the penalty spot in the 38th minute. But Chelsea were soon rocking as they levelled the score and went on to script victory. The draw for the quarter-finals and semi-finals will be made on Friday.



'LUCKY' VILLARREAL STUN JUVENTUS

Turin: Spanish club Villarreal rode on some help from the woodwork and a brilliant performance by their goalkeeper Gerónimo Rulli to stun former winner Juventus 3-0 and march into the Champions League quarter-finals for only the third time ever. In a match played on Wednesday night, Villarreal were forced to sit deep for extended periods before unleashing a stunning three-goal counter-punch in the closing 12 minutes at the Juventus Stadium here. To many experts, the 3-0 defeat would look a bit harsh on Juventus, especially considering the Bianconeri were arguably the better team for more than 75 minutes and had plenty of chances to take the lead. Villarreal, however, were rewarded for a rock-solid defence that stood firm even when forced deep for extended periods.

Pakistan hold Australia India to host Netherlands Women's Hockey team on April 8-9 to draw in 2nd Test

Devine's 101-ball innings included 12 fours and one massive six, as her partnerships of 81 with Amelia Kerr (42) and 80 with Maddy Green (30) formed the backbone of the New Zealand innings. But Devine's dismissal in the 41st over led to a late

collapse, with the tournament hosts losing their final six wickets for just 30 runs to be all out inside 48 overs.

Despite losing the services of another pacer Masabata Klass to a shoulder injury and Ismail's foot causing her discomfort, South Africa ensured that New Zealand never got the finishing flourish they aimed for, which proved to be decisive in the end for a nail-biting win.

Vidya as a steely nerved and determined journalist proves yet again that she can pull off any role with grace delivering a phenomenal performance.

Talking about Shefali Shah, after see-



ing her in dominant roles in Humans and Delhi Crime, it might take a while to feel comfortable with the idea of Shefali playing a househelp. But by the end of the film you will find yourself rooting for her as she makes an impact as a brave mother Rukhsana, who is in no mood to judge her daughter for being out late at night. After watching Rukhsana in Jalsa, every girl in Indian society will for sure yearn for a mother like her. There is a third pivotal female character in Jalsa, played by Vidhatri Bandi, who is determined to unearth the layers of corruption that divide the bitter truth from numbing wealth.

Since the female leads occupy the centre stage, it doesn't leave much room to shine for actors Mohammed Iqbal Khan and Manav Kaul. The child essaying the role of Vidya Balan's disabled child Ayush puts out a fine per-

formance and his bitter-sweet moments with Rukhsana and his Nani (Rohini Hattangadi) are some of the memorable parts of the film.

Talking about the technical aspects, Camera work of the film is great and the screenplay is fantastic.
