CHINA DOESN'T WANT UNIPOLAR ASIA, RESPECTS INDIA'S ROLE IN REGION: WANG YI

China does not want unipolar Asia and respects India's traditional role in the region, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi told National Security Advisor Ajit Doval during their meeting in Delhi, according to the Chinese Foreign Ministry.

Wang conveyed to Doval that China is open to 'plus one' projects in South Asia, and both countries should cooperate multilaterally, the Chinese Foreign Ministry stated.

Wang is in Delhi for two days. He landed in the national capital on Thursday evening.

China and India have a thousand-year history of cultural exchanges, and friendly cooperation has always been the mainstream, Wang said.

The realisation of national rejuvenation between China and India will have a significant and far-reaching impact on Asia and the world at large, the Minister said.

"Both sides should adhere to the strategic judgment of the leaders of the two countries that 'China and India do not pose a threat to each other, but provide opportunities for each other's development', place differences on the border issue in the proper position of bilateral relations, and adhere to the correct development direction of bilateral relations," Wang said during the meeting with Doval, and extended invitation to him to visit China.

Replying to the invitation, Doval said he could visit after immediate issues are resolved successfully, sources said.

COULD VISIT CHINA AFTER BORDER DISPUTE RESOLVED: NSA DOVAL

New Delhi: In response to Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi's invite to visit Beijing, National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval said on Friday that he could embark on a trip to the neighbouring nation after the border issues were resolved, according to sources. Earlier on Friday, Wang met Doval in the latter's office in South Block.

engaged in border disputes for the last two years in Eastern Ladakh.

Doval discussed the need to take forward early and complete disengagement in remaining areas and remove impediments to allow the bilateral relationship to take its natural course.

He also conveyed to Wang that restoration of peace and tranquility will help build mutual trust and create an enabling environment for progress in relations.

The Chinese foreign minister met the National Security Advisor at his office here in the South Block.

It is the first high-level Chinese visit to India in over two years of border dispute between the two countries in Eastern Ladakh. So far, 15 rounds of military talks have taken place between both countries to resolve the issue.

BORDER DISENGAGEMENT HAPPENING AT SLOWER PACE: JAISHANKAR TELLS WANG

New Delhi: External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar said on Friday that during his meeting with visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi, he told the latter that the disengagement of troops at the LAC in Eastern Ladakh is a "work in progress", but is happening at a "slower pace" than desired.

Addressing the media after the meeting, Jaishankar said: "My talks with Foreign Minister Wang Yi have just concluded. We met for about three hours and addressed a broad and substantive agenda in an open and candid manner. We discussed our bilateral relations that have been disturbed as a result of Chinese actions in April 2020."

"So long as there are very large deployments, the border situation is not normal. We still have ongoing friction areas and have made progress in resolving some friction areas, including Pangong Tso. Our discussion today was how to take this forward. There have been 15 rounds of talks."

"If you ask me if our relationship today is normal, then my answer is no, it is not normal. Our effort today is to sort out the issue in its entirety."

Calcutta HC orders CBI probe into Birbhum violence

The court said: "The CBI will not only be handed over the case papers but also the accused and suspects who were arrested in the matter and in custody. Hence, we direct the CBI to forthwith take over the investigation in the case and submit the progress report before us on the next date of hearing." According to the judges, the incident has "shaken the conscience of the society" and has "a nationwide ramification".

The division bench of Calcutta High Court on Friday ordered a CBI probe into the Rampurhat carnage in West Bengal's Birbhum district where ten people including six women and two children were burnt to death following the murder of a Trinamool gram panchayat leader.

The court in its order said that the probe was ordered in the "interest of justice", "fair investigation" and to "instill confidence in the society". The state govern-

ment will not be carrying out any further investigation on the matter, and the CBI will have to submit a progress report before the court on April 7.

The Division Bench comprising Chief Justice Prakash Shrivastava and Justice Rajarshi Bharadwaj observed: "...We are of the opinion that facts and circumstances of the case demand that in the interest of justice and to instill confidence in the society and to have fair investigation to dig out the truth it is necessary to hand over the investiga-

tion to the CBI. Accordingly, we direct the state government to forthwith hand over the investigation of the case to CBI. Ten people, including two children, were charred to death as nearly a dozen houses were set ablaze in Bogtui in Birbhum's Rampurhat block early Tuesday in a suspected fallout over the murder of a Trinamool Congress (TMC) deputy panchayat pradhan Bhadu Sheikh. The SIT has so far arrested 22 people, including the TMC's Rampurhat I block president Anarul Hossain.

Petrol, diesel prices raised again

State-owned oil marketing companies (OMC) on Friday raised petrol and diesel prices for the third time this week.

These prices were revised for the very first time on Tuesday after a gap of more than four months.

Accordingly, the increase in the selling price, which includes state levies, central excise and cess amongst others, came days after crude oil rates saw an astronomical rise due to the Russian-Ukrainian crisis.

In New Delhi, the price of petrol and diesel were increased again by 80 paise per litre.

As per pump prices, petrol now costs Rs 97.01 per litre and diesel Rs 88.27 per litre in the national capital.



On Wednesday, petrol prices were increased to Rs 97.81 per litre and diesel Rs 89.07 per litre in Delhi.

In the financial capital Mumbai, prices were hiked to Rs 112.51 per litre for petrol and diesel to Rs 96.70 per litre.

Besides, the prices of both the transport fuels were raised in Kolkata. The petrol prices rose to Rs 107.18 and diesel to Rs 92.22 per litre.

In Chennai too, they were increased. Petrol there now costs Rs 103.67, while diesel is Rs 93.71 per litre.

Till Tuesday, fuel prices were steady since early November when the Centre reduced excise duty on petrol and diesel by Rs 5 and Rs 10 per litre, respectively.

The OMCs revise the transportation fuel cost based on various factors such as rupee to the US dollar exchange rate, cost of crude oil and demand of fuel amongst others.

Resultantly, the final price includes excise duty, value added tax and dealer's commission.

It was widely expected that the OMCs will revise the current prices due to high crude oil cost. The crude oil price range is a cause of concern for India as it may ultimately add Rs 15-Rs 25 in petrol and diesel selling prices.

At present, India imports nearly 85 per cent of its crude oil requirements.

405 POSTS OF HIGH COURT JUDGES VACANT ACROSS THE COUNTRY

New Delhi: Out of the sanctioned strength of 1,104 judges in high courts across the country, there are 699 judges, while 405 posts are vacant, the Parliament was told on Friday.

"Against 405 vacancies, at present, 175 proposals are at various stages of processing between the government and the Supreme Court Collegium. Further recommendations from High Court Collegiums are yet to be received in respect of 230 vacancies in high courts," Law Minister Kiren Rijiju told the Lok Sabha in a reply to a question.


He said that filling up vacancies in the high courts is a continuous, integrated and collaborative process between the executive and the judiciary.

HEALTH RESEARCH BUDGET INSUFFICIENT TO MEET EXISTING, FUTURE CHALLENGES: PARLIAMENTARY PANEL

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health and Family Welfare in its report has said that the increase in the health research budget year on year is very meagre and is not commensurate with the tasks DHR-ICMR are entrusted to deal with. The allocated budget is grossly insufficient to meet the existing and future health-care challenges, said the Committee.

"The Committee feels that higher budgetary allocation for health research will result in more research based findings which in turn would help in devising more informed affordable and practical plans, methodologies for diagnosis



and treatment of both communicable and non-communicable diseases. Higher allocation for health research would also make the country better prepared for tackling any future out-

breaks and health exigencies" said the committee in its report which was tabled in Parliament on Thursday. The Committee has also recommended considering global standards with

respect to investment in health research adding that the Government must invest at least 0.1 per cent of the GDP in the next five years.

Teen's body with slit throat found; minor held

Delhi Police has apprehended a 17-year-old teenager, in connection with the case of murder of a minor boy whose body was recovered from the national capital's Mangolpuri area on Friday morning, an official said.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Sameer Sharma said a 17-year-old boy's body, stuffed inside a travel bag, was found earlier in the day in Mangolpuri.

According to the official, a PCR call was received around 7 a.m. at Mangolpuri police station after which the police team immediately rushed to the spot near Peer Baba Mazar main road.

According to sources, a civil defence volunteer was the first to spot the bag. A foot of the deceased was visible as well.

"As the police reached the spot, they found a traveller bag in which an unknown body of male, with throat slit injuries, was stuffed," the police officer said, adding the teen was wearing a white kurta pyjama.

The police then registered a case under section 302 of the Indian Penal

Code (IPC) and initiated an investigation.

"Several teams were formed for the identification of the deceased, for checking the CCTV footage of the adjoining areas and for developing intelligence with regard to this incident," the DCP said, after which the deceased was identified.

The 17-year-old went missing on Thursday night following which a complaint was lodged at the south Rohini police station.

"An FIR was found already registered under section 363 (punishment for kidnapping) of the IPC," said the official.

Several police teams were formed to investigate the case.

"The call detail records of the concerned persons were obtained and analysed. After getting some leads about a person, an extensive search was carried out and the accused juvenile (a resident of Sector 2, Rohini) was apprehended," Sharma said.

The police are yet to speak on details about the motive of the murder. Further probe is underway.

Even as countries are increasingly lowering their guard on Covid norms, the BA.2 sub-variant also referred to as "stealth" Omicron, has emerged as the dominant strain around the

world, the World Health Organisation has said. Globally, BA.2 made up about 86 per cent of cases reported as updated on the open access database GISAID between February 16 and March 17, the agency said in a report this week.

In the US, about a third of new coronavirus cases are BA.2, Dr Rochelle Walensky, the director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, said at a White House briefing on Wednesday.

US health officials, including the top infectious disease expert Dr. Anthony Fauci, expect the US to soon see an uptick in cases due to the BA.2 subvariant of Omicron.

Even though Omicron has shown immunity escaping properties, the existing Covid vaccines have proved effective.

The agency now said that it had named the three variants - two versions of Deltacron and one that combined BA.1 and BA.2 - XD, XE and XF. There was no evidence that these recombinant variants are more transmissible or cause "more severe outcomes," the report said.



YOGI SWORN IN FOR 2ND TERM; UP GOVT GETS A NEW COMPLEXION

Yogi Adityanath was sworn in as the 33rd chief minister of Uttar Pradesh on Friday in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union ministers and a galaxy of chief ministers.

Adityanath was administered the oath of office by Uttar Pradesh Governor Anandiben Patel at the Ekana stadium here, with over 75,000 people from different walks of life, cheering him on.

Two deputy chief ministers were also sworn in along with the chief minister. They include Keshav Maurya -- who recently lost the election, and Brajesh Pathak.

Deputy chief minister Dinesh Sharma in the previous government, has been dropped this time. Sources said that he would now be given an organisational post.

The new ministry sworn in on Friday includes 52 ministers, including 18 in cabinet rank, and the gov-



ernment now has a new complexion.

Five women ministers have been included. They are -- Baby Rani Maurya, Gulab Devi, Pratibha Shukla, Rajni Tiwari and Vijay Laxmi Gautam.

Uttar Pradesh Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) president Swatantra Dev

Singh has been inducted into the ministry while some senior leaders including Shrikant Sharma, Siddhartha Nath Singh, Ashutosh Tandon, Mahendra Singh, Jai Pratap Singh, Satish Mahana and Mohsin Raza have been dropped.

A much-awaited inclusion was that of former IAS officer Arvind

Sharma who had quit his job in the PMO last year and was made MLC in Uttar Pradesh.

Asheesh Patel of Apna Dal and Sanjay Nishad of Nishad Party have also found a berth in the council of ministers as cabinet ministers.

Daya Shankar Singh, husband of former minister Swati Singh, has also been made minister of state.

Former IPS officer Aseem Arun, who quit his job in January to join politics, has also been made minister. However, former ED official Rajeshwar Singh, who won the election after quitting his job, has not been made minister.

Among the surprise omissions in the government formation are rebel Congress MLA Aditi Singh who had contested the elections on a BJP ticket from Rae Bareilly.

Aparna Yadav, younger daughter-in-law of Mulayam Singh Yadav, who was also tipped to become a minister, was not on the list.

SC reserves verdict on plea for enhancing Sidhu's sentence in 1988 road rage case

The Supreme Court on Friday reserved its verdict on a review petition seeking a direction to enhance the sentence of Congress' former Punjab unit chief Navjot Singh Sidhu in the 1988 road rage case, where he was let off with a mere Rs 1,000 fine.

Senior advocate A.M. Singhvi, representing Sidhu, submitted before a bench headed by Justice A.M. Khanwilkar that sentence was a discretion of court and no interference, could be done, except in cases of death penalty, given in rarest of the rare cases, and in the present case, there is no need to have a relook at the 2018 judgment.

"Appeal on adequacy of sentence should not be entertained. The state is not in appeal against the sentence and the victim cannot challenge the adequacy," he submitted.



He further added that there has been no allegation of lack of cooperation on the part of his client.

The bench, also comprising Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul, noted that the issue before it is only whether despite the court having issued limited notice on point of sentence, the provision under which sentence has been imposed needs to be looked at. "Whether the sentence which was restricted to fine needs to be enhanced with the actual sentence also?" it said.

Pointing to the 34-year-old incident, Singhvi said it is an

extraordinary case which does not merit consideration.

The bench reserved the judgment after hearing detailed arguments in the matter. The plea was filed by the kin of the deceased, Gurnam Singh seeking a relook on the 2018 judgment.

Senior advocate Sidharth Luthra, representing the victim's family, submitted the death due to cardiac arrest is not correct, and a blow was delivered on the victim. Singhvi vehemently argued that it is extremely doubtful that an injury, caused by a fist blow, could have led to the death. Luthra argued that the 2018 judgment failed to consider the previous decision in the case of Richhpal Singh Meena vs Ghazi (2014). He added that, in this case, the top court was of the view that when there is death of a human being, it may either be culpable homicide (amounting or not amounting to murder) or not culpable homicide.

Punjab CM receives complaint on corruption helpline

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Friday said he has received a complaint on the newly-launched anti-corruption helpline.

In a tweet, he said: "I received a complaint on our anti-corruption action helpline. Directed the authorities for immediate investigation, those caught asking for bribes will face severe consequences. Corruption won't be tolerated in Punjab now."

The anti-bribery helpline 9501 200 200 has received around 20,000 complaints so far. However, a majority of these do not have an audio or video proof to support their claim.

Asking strong cognizance of the complaints received on the helpline number, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government has issued orders to register a case against a clerk of tehsil office in Jalandhar.

AAP spokesperson Malwinder Singh Kang and state Joint Secretary Sunny Ahluwalia told the media the government is continuously taking public-friendly decisions and the Chief

Bihar Panchayat official faces probe over 'liquor party' in office

The Patna district administration has launched an enquiry against the Secretary of a Panchayat for allegedly organising a liquor party in a government office, an official said on Friday.

Block Development Officer, Bihta, Vishal Anand, has written a letter to the Panchayati Raj Ministry for action against accused Panchayat Secretary Bhim Kumar.

"A video of a Panchayat secretary surfaced before district administration on Friday where he was consuming liquor and a semi-nude girl was also present there. Based on this video, we have written a complaint to the Panchayati Raj Ministry to investigate this matter and take action against the accused.

"The district administration has also initiated a separate inquiry into



the matter. We will take legal action based on the investigation report,"

Anand said. As per the video uploaded on

social media, and not authenticated by IANS, Bhim Kumar is seen consuming liquor along with other people including a girl in a semi-nude position at his office-cum-residence, allocated to him by the state government. Meanwhile, Bhim Kumar claimed that the video was doctored and someone is trying to malign his image. He said that he was never involved in organising a liquor party in his office or any other place.

In another incident, Excise Department officials arrested a CEO of a software company for procuring liquor. "We have conducted a raid at flat number 505 of Mundeshwari apartment located at Rajiv Nagar locality and arrested a person named Abhishek Kumar in a drunken stage on Thursday night. We have also recovered a liquor bottle from the flat," Assistant Commissioner Kishore Kumar Shah said.

INX media case: Delhi HC notice to Chidambaram, son on ED plea against trial court order

The Delhi High Court on Friday issued notice to former Union Minister P Chidambaram, his son Karti Chidambaram and others on a petition filed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) against an earlier trial court order which permitted them to access copies of unrelayed documents related to the INX money laundering case.

Issuing notice in the matter, a bench of Justice Yogesh Khanna slated the matter for further hearing on April 20.

Earlier on January 25, 2020, a Special Judge of Rouse Avenue Courts passed an order allowing Chidambarams to check the copies of all the unrelayed documents from 'Malkhana' -- the room to store case-related materials in court.

The Delhi High Court had, on November 10, 2021, rejected a similar petition filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) challenging the trial court order. The CBI has approached the High court opposing the inspection of



documents by the accused persons on the grounds that allowing them inside the 'Malkhana' may lead to the tampering of evidence in the ongoing high-profile money laundering case.

As per the probe agency, while the accused had a right to a fair trial, the collective interest of society cannot impinge. On March 14, the Delhi High Court's Justice Chandra Dhari Singh had recused himself from hearing the ED's

plea challenging an order that allowed accused persons in INX Media Pvt Ltd, including Chidambarams, to inspect the documents seized during the investigation. In another case related to Chidambarams, on March 23, a Delhi Court had granted them regular bail in a case alleging irregularities in the grant of Foreign Investment Promotion Board approval in the Aircel-Maxis deal, filed against them by the CBI and the ED.

WOMAN GANG-RAPED IN DELHI'S GHAZIPUR

New Delhi: A 36-year-old woman was allegedly raped by two men in east Delhi and is currently undergoing treatment in a hospital, police said on Friday.

According to a police official, the incident took place on Wednesday in the Ghazipur area and came to light the next day when a PCR call about presence of some "unclaimed person" was received.

Based on the victim's statement, a case under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code was registered by the police.

"The victim has now been shifted to Safdarjung Hospital for better medical treatment," said the official, adding her condition is now said to be stable. Police has formed five teams to nab the accused at the earliest.

Female CISF constable suspended for strip-searching elderly woman

Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) female constable was suspended after a complaint that a wheel-chair bound elderly woman passenger, who had undergone a hip implant, was reportedly strip-searched at the Guwahati international airport during a security check, officials said on Friday.

According to CISF sources, the woman constable has been suspended and an inquiry into the incident is underway.

On Thursday, taking to Twitter, the daughter of the 80-year-old Delhi-bound woman, Dolly Kikon, complained that her disabled mother was made to strip at the CISF security check at the

Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International (LGBI) Airport here. The security personnel wanted "proof" of her titanium hip implant and forced her to undress, said Dolly.

The CISF also tweeted: "Security and dignity of needy pax (passenger) go hand in hand. CISF has already started enquiry in connection with the unfortunate incident at Guwahati airport. The concerned personnel has been suspended. Deputy Inspector General (DIG) CISF has spoken with the passenger." In another tweet, Dolly said: "Met with Guwahati airport authorities and CISF officials to follow up. The DIG CISF also reached out over the phone. They have assured me that the matter will be taken up. Thank you for promising to

look into the case." As per CISF sources, the woman constable had asked the female passenger to remove the clothing from her lower body as the metal detector beeped indicating metal on her body.

"As the metal detector beeped, the CISF constable requested the woman passenger to undergo thorough checking and show her the hip implant area to confirm the passenger's claim of having undergone a hip implant," a CISF officer said. In October last year, the Adani Guwahati International Airport Limited (AGIAL) had taken over the management, development and operation of the LGBI airport in Guwahati, the second international airport in the northeast after Imphal.

Cargo ship sinks in Bihar's Katihar 500 kg heroin smuggling by Pak through Gujarat, NIA files supplementary chargesheet

A cargo ship carrying 18 trucks sank in the river Ganga in Bihar's Katihar district.

The incident happened on Thursday night. The ship was on its way from Jharkhand's Sahibganj to Manihari in Katihar district.

Ansar Ali, one of the employees of the cargo ship, managed to swim out from the river after the accident. He said that there were 18 trucks containing stone chips (used as construction material).

"As the trucks were carrying a huge weight, the balance of one of the trucks was lost and it rolled into the Ganga river. Due to that truck, the ship lost its balance and other trucks also rolled into the river. Soon

the entire ship overturned and submerged into the river," Ali said.

"I was sitting in one corner of the ramp. When the ship lost its unbalance, I jumped into the water and swam to the bank. A number of passengers including drivers, helpers and employees of the ship were on board. I don't know whether they have survived or not," he added.

Manihari circle officer Rajesh Kumar confirmed the mishap, adding that a rescue operation was currently underway.

However, there was no information on the total number of people who were onboard. Further details were awaited.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Thursday said it has filed a supplementary

chargesheet against an accused in connection with a 500-kg heroin smuggling case by people based in Dubai. The drug was smuggled through Pakistan-India sea route.

Earlier, 10 accused persons have been chargesheeted in the case. The chargesheet was issued a Special Court in Ahmedabad.

The case was initially registered by the Gujarat Anti-Terrorism Squad in 2018.

The case pertains to a criminal conspiracy hatched by the accused based in Dubai and Pakistan for smuggling and distribution of 500 kg of illegal narcotic heroin from Pakistan to Gujarat through the sea route.

This heroin was brought by Pakistani nationals in a Pakistani fishing vessel and was delivered in the Indian territorial waters near Jakkhau Port in Kutch.

The NIA had re-registered the case on July 2, 2020.

The accused Shahid Kasam Surma was a close associate of earlier accused persons -- Arshad Razak Sota and Rafiq Adam Surma -- who have been absconding since committing the crime.

Surma had stored, transported and delivered 495 kg of the 500 kg of drugs received from Pakistan to Amritsar, Punjab, through his associates.

A red corner notice was issued against him by the Interpol. He was later deported from Dubai and arrested in this case.

Gold, asset devaluation pulls India's forex reserve down by \$2.597 bn

Devaluation of gold and other asset classes pulled India's foreign exchange reserves lower by \$2.597 billion during the week that ended on March 18.

Reserve Bank of India data showed that India's forex reserves fell to \$619.678 billion from \$622.275 billion reported for the previous week. The country's forex reserves consist of foreign currency assets (FCAs), gold reserves, SDRs, and the country's reserve position with the IMF. On a weekly basis, FCAs, the largest component of the forex reserves, edged lower by \$703 million

to \$553.656 billion. Similarly, the value of the country's gold reserves decreased by \$1.831 billion to \$42.011 billion, while the SDR value fell by \$62 million to \$18.865 billion. On the other hand, the country's reserve position with the IMF remained flat at \$5.146 billion.

"India's FX reserves decreased by \$2.60 billion to \$619.68 billion in the week ending 18th March largely due to valuation effects in gold by \$1.8 billion and \$0.7 billion in foreign currency," said Sajal Gupta, Head Fx & Rates, Edelweiss.

"The week prior to that, the FX reserves had decreased by \$9.65 billion to \$622.27 billion."



NSEL FRAUD: ED ATTACHES SHIV SENA MLA'S ASSETS WORTH RS 11.35 CR

Enforcement Directorate (ED) provisionally attached properties belonging to Shiv Sena MLA Pratap Sarnaik worth Rs 11.35 crore in an alleged money-laundering case related to the NSEL investors frauds, here on Friday. Commenting on the developments, Sarnaik said he would soon move the court to clarify his position in the matter and would fully cooperate with the ED as he had done in the past. "This has been going on ever since I moved against (actress) Kangana Ranaut and journalist Anub Goswami last year. I have full faith in the judiciary," Sarnaik told mediapersons. The ED has slapped attachment on two flats in Hiranandani

Complex and a plot of land in Thane, with a combined value of Rs 11.35 crore, under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act in the NSEL fraud related case. The NSEL has been under the scanner after the Mumbai Police's Economic Offences Wing registered a complaint in September 2013, on the basis of which the ED launched its probe. The case involves NSEL, its directors and top officials, 25 defaulters and others who are accused of hatching a criminal conspiracy to defraud some 15,000 investors. They are charged with luring them to trade on the NSEL platform, creating forged documents, bogus warehouse receipts,

fake accounts, and thereby committing a criminal breach of trust cheating the investors of Rs 5,600 crore. The ED probe unearthed that the investors' monies were diverted by borrowers/trading members of NSEL for other activities like investment into real estate, repayment of outstanding debts and other activities. It also revealed that the Aastha Group, linked with Sarnaik, and consisting one of the defaulting members of NSEL, has a liability of Rs 242.66 crore towards NSEL. The Aastha Group diverted Rs 21.74 crore of Vihang Aastha Housing Projects LLP during the period 2012-13, out of which Rs 11.35 crore was transferred to Vihang Enterprises and Vihang Infrastructure Private Limited, both firms controlled by Sarnaik and his family, according to the ED. On the basis of the money trail, scrutiny and identification, the ED has provisionally attached Sarnaik's assets. The remaining amount of Rs 10.50 crore originating from Aastha Group was paid to one Yogesh Deshmukh, attached under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002 (PMLA) and confirmed by the PMLA Adjudicating Authority.

Furnishing details, Deputy Commissioner of Police Sagar Singh Kalsi said on March 20, an information was received through sources that one proclaimed offender, namely Piyush Tiwari, who was carrying a reward of Rs 50,000 was residing somewhere in Nashik,

Maharashtra. Acting on the information, a police team was constituted which further developed the information and found that the accused was residing in Nashik and was in the foodchain business. The team conducted a raid and apprehended the accused. During interrogation, he disclosed that he had started his business as a builder in 2011 and created eight companies along with 15-20 shell companies till 2018. In 2016, an income tax raid was conducted at his house and about Rs 120 crore was seized, the official said. "After this, accused Piyush's business as a builder collapsed and in order to

stand in the market, he started cheating people on the pretext of selling one flat to multiple buyers," the DCP said. As several cases were registered against the accused in this regard, he fled from Delhi and shifted his base to South India on a fake name and entered into various businesses. The accused has been arrested under sections 406 (Punishment for criminal breach of trust), 409 (Criminal breach of trust by public servant, or by banker, merchant or agent), 420 (Cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property), 120B (Punishment of criminal conspiracy) and further probe is on, the official added.

founder as 'Balasaheb Thackeray Nagar', the cluster on N.M. Joshi Marg shall be henceforth known as 'Rajiv Gandhi Nagar', and the third one in Naigaon has been rechristened as 'Sharad Pawar Nagar' after the Nationalist Congress President supremo, said Housing Minister Jitendra Awhad. The three major erstwhile BDD chawls complexes - where once Mahatma Gandhi spent a night among the Mehtar Samaj (sweepers) in 1937 - are currently undergoing what is billed as Asia's biggest redevelopment project worth Rs 20,000 crore, started in August 2021. Built between 1921-1924, there are a total of 207 ground-plus-three-storey buildings, each with identical 160-sq. feet 'face-to-face' chawls, a 20-foot wide centre passage, common water supply, bathing and toilet areas, housing around 17,000 families and spread across 93 acres of the

most prime chunks of land in south Mumbai. Awhad said that the work on the complexes is progressing well and all the residents shall get their new homes over the next five years in the upcoming 32 swank towers with 500-sq. feet 2-BHK ultra-modern flats and other top amenities, bringing a sea-change to their lives. Being built by Tatas, L&T and Shapoorji Pallonji for different projects, the well-planned new complexes will have 40-storied and 28-floor tall towers with floors for parking, wide roads, at least 4 four schools, welfare centres, mini-hospitals, gardens, playgrounds, markets and shopping plazas. Besides Mahatma Gandhi, a regular visitor there was the Chief Architect of Indian Constitution, Bharat Ratna Dr. B.R. Ambedkar who had planted a 'Peepal' sapling which has now bloomed into a gigantic

shady tree. Months before his assassination (May 1991), the former Prime Minister and Bharat Ratna Rajiv Gandhi - then the Leader of Opposition - was delayed for an evening rally in the Gandhi Maidan here, but finally turned up early the next morning around 3.30 a.m., but the venue was full of enthusiastic, though groggy-eyed people still waiting to hear him out! In her resignation letter, Battull Hammid, who served as the principal of Viva College of Law in Virar, claimed she was quitting the post as she was feeling uncomfortable and suffocated. Battull Hammid claimed wearing the hijab had never been an issue before, but it became a matter only after the row in Karnataka. Battull Hammid has alleged that college management had instructed the other staff members not to cooperate with her and

even her personal assistant was not helping her with routine work. The college management, however, has dismissed the allegations, citing that several students from the Dawoodi Bohra community wore hijab and they had never objected to the same. It may be recalled that a few months ago two teachers of a school in Bhiwandi in neighbouring Thane district were prevented from coming to work in hijab. However, the issue was resolved following the intervention of local leaders and elected representatives who spoke to the state education minister and senior police officials.

BJP MLA OPPOSES RENAMING NAIGAON AFTER PAWAR

"I know Awhad respects Sharad Pawar because Pawar saheb has made him Minister so he wants to show his affection. However, I will oppose the proposal in the house today as I have the right to do so" concluded Kolambkar. The Maharashtra Assembly Budget session was underway in Mumbai on Thursday where MLA Jitendra Awhad while speaking on Mumbai's issues announced that a 'chawl' in Worli will be renamed 'Balasaheb Thackeray Nagar' after the Shiv Sena founder and the cluster on N.M. Joshi Marg shall be known as Rajiv Gandhi Nagar and Naigaon would be renamed as Sharad Pawar Nagar.

Disha Salian parents' plea to Prez, PM, CM: NARAYAN RANE & SON ARE 'LIARS', DRIVING US TO SUICIDE

In a shocking development, the aged parents of former Bollywood-linked entrepreneur Disha Salian, have knocked the doors of Rashtrapati Bhavan complaining how Union MSME Minister Narayan Rane and his MLA son Nitesh Rane are "liars" and virtually driving them to suicide. In a stinging 5-pager, Satish Salian and his wife Vasanti Salian have targeted the Rane father-son duo and some private television channels for running a 'false narrative' on television and social media on their deceased daughter Disha - who had fallen from a building or committed suicide on June 8, 2020. Drawing parallels with the Nirbhaya rape-cum-murder case of Delhi a decade ago, the Salians pointed out that till now, that victim's identity has not been revealed, but here "Rane is blatantly taking my daughter's name" repeatedly and saying that she was raped.



Asking "whether the law of the land is not applicable to the Union Minister", the Salians said even after registering a (police) against them, the "liars" Rane duo have not stopped maligning the family's name. When contacted, the Salian couple said that it has been two days since they wrote to President Ram Nath Kovind, but there has been no response so far. "We have also made the same appeal to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, Bharatiya Janata

Party Leader of Opposition Devendra Fadnavis and Chief Justice of Bombay High Court, to stop a few politicians from maligning our daughter's name," Salian told IANS. They pointed out how whenever the Union Minister took their daughter's name, it became national news and wondered how should the police deal with the case against "rich and powerful politicians like Rane", and what could the common citizens do to stop these people. Urging for sensitising the judiciary on such issues instead of taking side of powerful politi-

cians who are accused in such cases, they referred to the Sessions Court Judge's observation in the Ranes' bail order that the "investigation machinery is not expected to act as a tool in the hands of the government" but how it is acting in an unprecedented manner in dealing with the alleged crime. They recalled how after four hours of questioning by the investigators, Rane came out and claimed that he called up the Union Home Minister after which he was allowed to step out from the Malvani Police Station. "If this is true, then on whom can we trust to get justice... when our dignity is assaulted by such unscrupulous elements...", the Salians said. On top of that, after securing anticipatory bail, Nitesh Rane termed it as a 'historic' win' and promised to get justice for Disha Salian. "Who are they to get justice for our daughter? Such statements and allegations are making us disgusted and frustrated," said the Salians, reiterating that "the Mumbai Police found no foul play with respect to (Disha), her fiancé and friends" that fateful night. Challenging the Ranes' claims that they had no faith in (Mumbai) Police and they would submit the proof to the CBI, the Salians said after listening carefully to the court proceedings, they are convinced the Rane father-son are "liars". "They have no proof whatsoever... The facts are in our personal knowledge... and we are well aware that both of them cannot give any proof since they are liars... They are giving false excuses of giving the proof to the CBI and not the police," they said sharply.

YOGI 2.0 TO FOCUS RELIGIOUS

In its second term, the Yogi Adityanath government will be taking forward its vision to establish Uttar Pradesh as the 'religious tourism hub' of the country. The Yogi Adityanath government has several reforms in store which will provide immense employment opportunities to the people in the state. According to a spokesperson for the state government, concerned authorities have been working for the past five years for developing religious sites and increasing facilities for the devotees. The Yogi government, in its first term itself, gave priority to the development of the religious sector, accelerating the development of places including Ayodhya, Kashi and Mathura. The construction work of Ram temple in Ayodhya is going on in full swing. At the same time, the infrastructure development in Ayodhya is also going on a rapid pace. More than 17 projects worth Rs 138 crore have been completed in Ayodhya. Work is going on a war-footing on 54 projects at a cost of Rs 3,126 crore. The pilgrimage centres falling on the 84 Kosi Parikrama Marg are being developed. The government also plans to develop Ayodhya as a Vedic City under which roads are being constructed for Panchkosi, 14 Kosi and 84 Kosi Parikrama. In these religious places, airports are being constructed, roads are being widened and markets are being organised so that tourism can be facilitated. Varanasi, despite being a big centre of religious faith, could not achieve the position that it should have in terms of tourism due to meagre facilities. Shri Kashi Vishwanath Dham was constructed at a cost of more than Rs 600 crore within five years of the BJP government. Continuing with its policy of promoting religious tourism in the state, the state gave priority to maintaining the purity of the Braj region.

NO HEROES IN KASHMIR, ONLY VILLAINS



The downfall of the administrative and political set up in Kashmir in the late 1980s and early 1990s had a direct bearing on the rise of militancy, which was fully aided and abetted by Pakistan and took a totally communal colour. Veteran journalist Brij Bhardwaj, who covered Kashmir for over 50 years and is a witness to one of the tumultuous chapters of the state's and nation's history, says: "The continued political bungling by the Centre and state governments gave the space to those elements who always wanted to whip an anti-India wave in Kashmir. In the 1950s and 1960s and a big part of the 1970s, there was a leadership which could take decisions and largely kept the separatist and pro-Pakistan elements in check."

Official patronage of militancy
In the late 1980s when Farooq Abdullah was the Chief Minister in Jammu and Kashmir, and Mufti Mohd Sayeed the Union Home Minister, thousands of people were going to Pakistan Occupied Kashmir (PoK) for training. "Buses were running to LoC, hundreds were crossing over and coming back after getting training. Didn't the Chief Minister know this or what was the Army or BSF doing at the LoC? They are all guilty. That is why I say there was official patronage. Being in Kashmir, and talking to all, whether the locals or leaders or the security officers, I could assess that the system was rotting... and they were all in it. All those big central officers posted in Kashmir that time made huge fortunes. "So when there is official backing, nothing can prevent the situation from going downhill. And that is what happened in Kashmir. First it was the JKLF, then many other groups cropped up. There was no stopping them and they went full throttle. They resorted to targeted killings of Kashmiri Pandits and attacked those Muslims who were perceived to be pro-India. "The Kashmiri Pandit community was seen as pro-India. So to make them fall in line, targeted killings were done and an atmosphere of fear was created for them to either join the militant movement or leave or get killed. JKLF had the total support in our Kashmir as well as in PoK. But other groups didn't have," Bhardwaj told correspondent. The veteran journalist says the kidnapping of Rubaiya Sayeed on December 9, 1989, was a real one. "Mufti was the Home Minister and there were inputs that his son would be kidnapped, but no one could have thought the daughter, a girl, would be kidnapped. Farooq Abdullah was against releasing the terrorists, but then they were set free."



No Control
Anti-India elements have always been in Kashmir, but it was the leadership that knew how to control them. In 1947 and 1965, infiltration happened, Pakistani militants entered homes in the valley but the locals did not support them. The locals gave them away, thus blowing up the Pakistan agenda. In 1965, it was the Gujjars who first gave the information about the infiltrators. "A Gujjar who gave the information to an Army officer was slapped by him, saying 'what you think we are fooling around?' and then when firing happened in Batmaloo (Srinagar), all hell broke loose. In 1971, the India-Pakistan war happened, but there was no trouble within Kashmir. "In the 1980's this was not so. All had changed because there was no leadership to control the situation. The Rajiv-Farooq accord was there, but there was no trust. There was no political strength, no state administration and the Centre was weak. So things went out of hand," says Bhardwaj. "Without people like Late P.N. Haksar (former Principal Secretary to then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi) in Delhi, Late D.P. Dhar (former Advisor to Indira Gandhi) and old Kashmir hands like Late Vishnu Sahay (Secretary for Kashmir Affairs in the Ministry of External Affairs and later Union cabinet Secretary in 1958-1960 and 1961-1962), and late Bhagwan Sahai (Jammu and Kashmir Governor May 15, 1966- July 3, 1967), the Centre was clueless about handling the Kashmir issue. "Then B.K. Nehru in April, 1984 was suddenly recalled after differences arose with Indira Gandhi over the dismissal of the Farooq Abdullah government, and the appointment of G.M. Shah, who led a faction of the NC, as the Chief Minister with support from the Congress without the floor test. Nehru was



ousted and Jagmohan was brought in. Farooq Abdullah was miffed. Though he was friends with Rajiv Gandhi, who became the Prime Minister after Indira Gandhi was assassinated, the relations were not smooth. Farooq was dismissed as CM and later brought again and removed again. This political mistrust cost the state and the country a lot. The state had gone weak." **The Exodus**
"By 1989, everything was like haywire in the valley. There was no administration. People were getting killed, kidnappings were happening, many Pandit women were abducted, brutally gang-raped and killed, firings ad cross-firings were happening almost every day... The militants had automatic guns, latest pistols. They were fully armed. Thousands of people would gather on the roads chanting 'azadi' and other slogans. Over 70 hardcore terrorists were released. Finally Farooq, before he could be sacked, resigned on January 18, 1990 and later left the country. Jagmohan had taken the charge a second time a day later in Jammu (January 19, 1990- May 26, 1990). "What happened on January 19, 1990, was unprecedented. The Kashmiri Pandits were targeted and many of the community leaders, professionals and young men and women were brutally killed. This was not an all of a sudden event. There had been a systematic brainwashing of the locals towards the minorities. The Kashmiri Pandits were the most educated community in the state. They had the maximum number of central and state government jobs. So there was a kind of animosity against them. This suited those who were championing the separatist agenda," says Bhardwaj. He, however, said that Jagmohan could have prevented the fleeing of the minorities, if he had taken the

decision of getting the police into strong action and the army on the roads immediately. "If the political leadership was strong, this could have been prevented. But the right people were not there at the helm. A whole lot of non Kashmiri Maulvis had been touring the valley and inciting the youth to join the 'jihad'. All these were from different parts of the country. There were intelligence reports. Why were these people allowed to move freely and incite communal passions? "I was in Kashmir in the mid 1990s on a tour. I was staying in a houseboat in Nagin Lake. The owner told me that a non-Kashmiri Maulvi had asked a group of young boys, including his son, to go to Pakistan. The house boat owner, instead of reprimanding his son which could have proven counter-productive, asked his son to ask the Maulvi to accompany them. But when the boy asked the same to the Maulvi, he detracted and left after a few days. 'I could convince my son and he saw the reason', the house boat owner told me. So, not all Kashmiri Muslims were supporting the so-called 'jihad'. What was needed was strong leadership to control the grave situation and stop the youth from falling down the precipice." For politics, power and greed, Kashmir has been destroyed. Its people have been wrecked. Each Kashmiri has lost someone and the Pandits cannot go back. They have lost their homes and they are suffering because of a weak governance. "Kashmir is a tragedy where there are no heroes, but everyone has been a villain," signs off the doyen, who saw Kashmir as a child in 1953, as a college student in 1956, as a journalist in 1971 and then as an expert.

'At least 300 people killed in Drama Theatre bombing in Mariupol'

London | Agencies

Local officials in the besieged Ukrainian city of Mariupol have said that at least 300 people are known to have been killed in the bombing on March 16 at the Drama Theatre, The Guardian reported. About 1,300 were believed to have been sheltering in the building, with just 150 survivors having staggered out of the rubble immediately after the attack. Sources said the bulk of those in the theatre had been hiding from the shelling under the stage and that rubble was blocking their exit. There are no emergency services operating in Mariupol and the intense fighting and shelling near the theatre has prevented rescue attempts. The theatre was bombed by plane despite the word 'children' having been painted on the ground in



white, The Guardian reported. In a statement on Friday morning, a spokesman for the city council said they were able to share a new death toll from the tragedy. The statement said:

"Unfortunately, we start this day with bad news. From eyewitnesses, information appears that about 300 people died in the Drama Theatre of Mariupol as a result of the bombardment by a Russian aircraft. Until the last, I do not want to believe in this horror. Until the last, I want to believe that everyone managed to escape. But the words of those who were inside the building at the time of this terrorist act say otherwise. "The Drama Theatre in the heart of Mariupol has always been the hallmark of the city. A place of meetings, dates, a point of reference. 'Where are you? I'm on Drama'. How many times have we heard or said this phrase: 'On the Drama'. "Now there is no more Drama. In its place, a new point of pain for Mariupol residents appeared, ruins that became the last refuge for hundreds of innocent people."

RUSSIAN GENERAL BRANDED AS 'BUTCHER OF MARIUPOL' HAD ALSO DEVISED SIEGE OF ALEPPO

The Russian general dubbed as the 'Butcher of Mariupol' has been heard berating a junior officer for not cutting off the ears of a private who had been caught not wearing his uniform properly, according to a chilling intercepted phone call, Daily Mail reported. Colonel-General Mikhail Mizintsev, who is overseeing the siege of the Ukrainian city of Mariupol, appeared to call for the private to have his "face messed up" and called for others to beat him with a bottle after he wore the wrong uniform. Olexander Scherba, Ukraine's ex-Austrian Ambassador, this week branded Mizintsev as the 'Butcher of Mariupol', while Oleksandra Matviichuk, head of Ukraine's Centre for Civil



Liberties, called on him to face war crime charges. And it would not be the first time he has given such grim commands. In his role as defence chief, Mizintsev was also likely to have helped devise Russia's military strategy in Syria including the bloody siege of Aleppo, which has chilling parallels with the horror being inflicted in Mariupol, Daily Mail reported. In the audio clip, Mizintsev berated the junior officer for not disciplining the soldier and asked why the private was not "limping by now", the

report said. "Look at that scum standing there, frowning with his bovine eyes, showing me his unhappy face, his stinking mug," Mizintsev can be heard saying in the audio shared by Scherba, Daily Mail reported. "Why is he still serving? And why should I have to waste my time with your scum? If you're the head of a unit, then step up to the plate. "Why is his face not mutilated yet? Why hasn't anyone cut off his ears? Why isn't this moron limping yet," Mizintsev can be heard saying. The release of the audio clip comes as Mizintsev was identified as the commander overseeing the operation in Mariupol, which has deprived the city of food, water and power for a month during merciless bombardments that killed thousands of civilians, the report said.

Yoon urges Xi to cooperate closely for N.Korean denuclearization

South Korean President-elect Yoon Suk-yeol on Friday called on Chinese President Xi Jinping to cooperate closely for North Korea's denuclearization and the stable management of the political situation on the Korean Peninsula. Yoon made the call during a 25-minute phone conversation with Xi a day after North Korea test-launched an intercontinental ballistic missile for the first time since 2017, reports Yonhap News Agency. "Regarding North Korea's ICBM-class missile launch yesterday, President-elect Yoon Suk-yeol stressed that the people are greatly concerned over the rapid escalation of tensions on the Korean Peninsula and in the region caused by North Korea's serious provocation," Yoon's spokesperson Kim Eun-hye said. "Yoon called for the two countries to cooperate closely to realise the complete denuclearization of North



Korea and for the stable management of the political situation on the Korean Peninsula." Yoon and Xi agreed to communicate closely to set up a meeting between them at an early date after the President-elect's inauguration in May, she added. North Korea earlier confirmed it successfully test-fired a new ICBM, called the Hwasong-17, on Thursday at the direct order of its leader Kim Jong-un, scrapping a self-imposed moratorium on long-range missile testing that had been in place since late 2017. China is North Korea's main ally and economic benefactor, and its cooperation is key to getting Pyongyang to dismantle its missile and nuclear weapons programs.

RUSSIA IS PREPARING TO ATTACK POLAND: ENVOY

Aggression by Russia against Poland or another European Union (EU) country is possible in the near future, said Andrii Deshchytsia, the Ambassador of Kiev in Warsaw.

Russia is preparing to attack Poland. "Diplomatic missions, including the Russian Embassy in Warsaw, probably have this information. And they are covering their tracks," European Pravda quoted the envoy as saying. The Ambassador referred to the smoke over the Russian embassy in Warsaw. A similar smoke over the Kiev Embassy in Russia was noticed on the eve of the invasion. "It is clear why they are doing this. If there had been information and documentation that would not have caused Poland any harm, they would not even burn it, even if they had to leave the embassy. But if the docu-



ments or archives at the Embassy contain evidence of any subversive activities of Russian diplomats in Poland, this is a serious accusation and a serious argument that can be used later in an international criminal court against Russia," said Deshchytsia. He believes that Russia is now trying to create a pretext for the use of weapons. "Russia needed at least some excuse to invade Ukraine. But in order to enter Poland, which is a member of the EU and NATO, it is necessary to prepare much more seriously. Russia needs to have serious arguments as to why it intends to interfere in Poland's internal life and attack Poland," he said. The destruction of the Russian Embassy building could be such a reason, European Pravda reported. "Then, under this pretext, Russia would send spetsnaz (special forces) to protect it. During such an operation, there is provocation, a Russian soldier is killed, and then Russia has a reason to send in its troops," Deshchytsia added.

Seoul approves upgrade of missile defence after N Korea's ICBM launch

South Korea on Friday approved a project to upgrade its key surface-to-air missile interceptors after North Korea test-fired an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) for the first time since 2017, the state arms procurement agency said. The Defense Project Promotion Committee endorsed the project worth 720 billion won (\$591 million) to upgrade the Cheolmae II interceptors from next year through 2029, Yonhap News Agency reported. The project seeks to upgrade the missiles to enable them to intercept both aircraft and ballistic missiles at altitudes below 20 km. The existing interceptors to be upgraded can only shoot down aircraft. The committee also approved a 690 billion won project to develop and man-

ufacture ship-to-air guided missiles from next year through 2036 and a 230 billion scheme to develop long-range air-to-ground weapons for precision strikes by 2028. In addition, the committee endorsed a 710 billion won project to purchase foreign-made transport planes by 2026. For this project, the European aircraft maker Airbus' A400M, the Brazilian company Embraer's C390 and the US defence firm Lockheed Martin's C130J are expected to compete. Thursday's launch was Pyongyang's 12th show of force this year, ending its self-imposed moratorium on nuclear and long-range missile testing. In April 2018, Pyongyang declared a moratorium on nuclear and ICBM tests amid Seoul-brokered diplomacy that led to the first-ever summit between the US and the North in Singapore in June of the same year.

members, several teams of Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) have been in search of some more suspects in different states, including Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal.

As per the information, six persons have so far been arrested in the case, which is being monitored by National Investigation Agency. According to sources, those who interrogated the six have unearthed crucial information regarding JMB's terror plans.

The first four suspects were arrested on March 13 after a day long search operation by MP police and the Centre agencies was carried out in several locations in Bhopal. Of them, three were arrested from one residential building, while the fourth one was arrested later from a different location.

Those arrested are - Fazhar Ali, Mohammad Aqeel, Zahooruddin, and Fazhar

Zainul Abdeen. Three of them are Bangladeshi nationals and one is from Bihar. On March 14, Bhopal district court had remanded them in police custody for 14 days. They have been booked under UAPA and Foreigners Act.

The 14-day police remand of main three suspects will be end on March 27 and by then the some more suspects are likely to be arrested, sources in MP police told IANS.

A large amount of jihadi literature, laptops and mobile phones were confiscated from them. Initial investigations suggest that the terror accused were in touch with their handlers, mostly Bangladesh-based, via social media and an app. Their mobile phone call lists have foreign numbers, an officer who is part of the probe team said, a senior police official had told the press on March 13.



After Reeves participation in the Tibet Benefit concert was announced, Chinese nationalists took to social media in

protest of the actor. China rejects claims of Tibetan independence and has long blackballed artists who have expressed support for Tibet and/or the Dalai Lama. Reeves support for the Tibet benefit went public just as 'The Matrix Resurrections' was opening in China, but the action sequel was boycotted by nationalists and underwhelmed at the box office. Following the Tibet House benefit this month, dozens of Reeves movies have now been scrubbed off streaming platforms in China. As reported by the Los Angeles Times, at least 19 movies were pulled from Tencent Video. Every Reeves movie save for his voice role in 'Toy Story 3' was pulled off top streamers Youku and Migu Video. Other platforms such as Bilibili and Xigua Video also reportedly saw Reeves movies scrubbed. Although 'Toy Story 3' remains on streaming, its credits feature the local dubbing cast when mentioning voice talent, and thus Reeves is not credited. A search for Reeves on the platform iQiyi reportedly gives users the following message: "Sorry, no results related to 'Keanu Reeves' were found. Due to relevant laws, regulations and policies, some results are not shown."

'THE BATMAN' DIRECTOR RELEASES DELETED JOKER SCENE

'The Batman' director Matt Reeves released a deleted scene from his superhero film featuring Robert Pattinson's Caped Crusader facing off against his classic nemesis, the Joker, played by Barry Keoghan.

The scene is available after visiting a website that mimics the word puzzles posed by the Riddler (Paul Dano) in the movie, reports 'Variety'.

As Reeves explained to 'Variety' in an interview in February, the scene follows Batman's discovery that the Riddler has killed the Gotham City police commissioner, leaving behind another of his cryptic notes addressed to Batman.

Unnerved by the Riddler's interest in him, Batman decides to seek out insight into what makes the Riddler tick. "I thought he would be really insecure about this and he'd probably want to find some way to get into the (Riddler's) mindset, like in 'Manhunter' or 'Mindhunter' -- this idea of profiling somebody, so you can predict his next move," Reeves said. The filmmaker liked the idea of suggesting to the audience that Gotham is rife with villains just on the edge of the story, and that Keoghan's Joker is one of the first enemies Batman captures. "Almost our anniversary, isn't it?" Joker tells Batman in the scene.

Reeves shared: "You realise that they have a relationship, and that this guy obviously did something, and Batman somehow got him into Arkham."

Batman pushes Joker for reasons why Riddler is doing what he's doing, and why he's leaving notes for Batman at all of his crimes.

Tom Cruise eyes 'Mission: Impossible 8' as final film Of the franchise



BCCI to launch six-team women's IPL next year

Responding to the growing demand for a franchise-based T20 league for women players in the country, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has decided to launch a six-team women's Indian Premier League (IPL) next year.

The decision was taken at a meeting of the IPL Governing Council in Mumbai on Friday. The meeting decided that all efforts will be made to start a six-

team annual Twenty20 tournament for the women's cricketers, with the first preference being given to the existing IPL franchises, according to a report by cricbuzz. According to sources, three existing IPL franchises have shown interest in setting up women's teams. BCCI president Sourav Ganguly said the IPL Governing Council's decision has to be approved by the BCCI AGM and added that hopefully, it will happen soon and the league will start next year. For this season, there will be the normal Women's Twenty20

Challenge, IPL Chairman Brijesh Patel said, adding that there will be four matches involving three teams around the time of the playoffs.

With leagues for women like Women's Big Bash League (WBBL) and the Women's Hundred gaining ground, there has been a demand for a women's T20 league in India on the lines of the IPL with many Indian women's players leading the demand. The women's cricket has also gained lot of ground since the Indian National Team did well in the last World Cup.

Italy knocked out of World Cup play-offs after 0-1 defeat to North Macedonia

European champions Italy will not play in the 2022 World Cup after being stunned by North Macedonia in their play-off in Palermo on Thursday.

Italy have failed to qualify for a second consecutive World Cup, ensuring the Azzurri will endure at least 12 years between appearances at football's showpiece event.

Italy were "destroyed and crushed" after again missing out on the World Cup finals following a 1-0 defeat at home by North Macedonia in Thursday's playoff semi-final, defender Giorgio Chiellini said after the match. Aleksandar Trajkovski of North Macedonia picked up the loose ball in the 92nd minute, drove forward and fired a sensational winner from outside the area. The goal sparked wild celebrations on the North Macedonia bench, while Italy's players and coaching staff dropped to their knees in front of their home fans. It is just eight months since Roberto Mancini's side celebrated one of their greatest triumphs - beating England at Wembley to win Euro 2020 having been considered outsiders going into the



tournament. But they have now paid the price for a disjointed - if previously unbeaten - World Cup qualification campaign during which they finished runners-up to Switzerland in their group, winning four and drawing four of their eight matches. Midfielder Marco Verratti said North Macedonia's goal in added time was a "real nightmare". Four-time World Cup winners Italy, who are ranked sixth in the world, will watch events in Qatar in November and December from afar.

IPL 2022: KKR, CSK RE-IGNITE RIVALRY UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP

In a repeat of last year's final, the Chennai Super Kings (CSK) and Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) with their new captains - Ravindra Jadeja and Shreyas Iyer, will lock horns in the opening match of the IPL 2022 and look to start their campaign on a winning note at the Wankhede Stadium, here on Saturday.

Ahead of the start of the IPL 2022, the 40-year-old M.S Dhoni on Thursday decided to hand over the captaincy of CSK to Jadeja. The star all-rounder, who has been an integral part of Chennai Super Kings (CSK) since 2012, will only be the third player to lead the Chennai-based franchise after Dhoni and Suresh Raina.

Notably, it will be the first time that Dhoni will play as a pure wicket-keeper batter and won't lead the side in an IPL match. The only time that the legendary cricketer has represented Super Kings strictly as a player was in 2012, in a dead-rubber Champions League T20 game against Yorkshire.



A decade later, CSK will be starting a new chapter under the leadership of Jadeja, who has been an integral part of the franchise since 2012, becoming only the third player to lead the Chennai-based franchise after Dhoni and Suresh Raina.

As a new skipper, star all-rounder's first challenge is to fill the big voids created by the absence of first-choice players Deepak Chahar (injured) and Moeen Ali (unavailable due to visa issues). Moeen reached India late due

to visa issues and he will only be available for CSK's second game, against Lucknow Super Giants on March 31, after undergoing quarantine for three days.

In the absence of England all-rounder, New Zealand batter Devon Conway is set to make his IPL debut. But it will be interesting to see, whether CSK plays him as an opener or use him as a floater in the middle-order to counter Knight Riders' mystery spinners Conway is technically

very sound against spin bowling. In all T20 cricket, Conway averages 61.63 and strikes at 134.65 against spin. Against pace, the average drops to 37.40 and strike rate to 126.15. Ravindra Jadeja is likely to play in the place of Deepak Chahar and the rest of the CSK side is mostly settled. On the other hand, new KKR skipper Shreyas Iyer will also have to find the opening partner of Venkatesh Iyer. KKR bought Alex Hales during the IPL auction but the England cricketer pulled out of the IPL 2020 and his replacement Aaron Finch, who is not available for the early part of the tournament. On the other hand, Kiwi pacer Tim Southee, who got married earlier this week and joined the IPL bubble late, will miss Saturday's game. In his absence, Knight Riders could bring in Sri Lanka's Chamika Karunaratne or pick an extra Indian seamer. Though KKR reached the final last season, they had a horror start to that season. And, Iyer will love to continue that attack-first approach of KKR.

Women's World Cup Australia beat Bangladesh by five-wicket

Six-time champions Australia maintained their unbeaten streak in the ICC Women's Cricket World Cup with a five-wicket win over Bangladesh in a rain-affected 43-over affair at the Basin Reserve.

The win was achieved mainly on the back of Beth Mooney making a fighting, unbeaten 66 and sharing an unbroken stand of 65 with Annabel Sutherland (26 not out) to chase down 136 in 32.1 overs.

The efforts of Mooney and Sutherland came after spinner Salma Khatun, with her three for 23, gave a huge scare to Australia by taking out Alyssa Healy, Rachael Haynes and captain Meg Lanning in quick succession.

Things went worse when Tahlia McGrath and Ashleigh Gardner fell too. But it wasn't enough as Mooney fought through wind, freezing cold and Bangladesh, with some support from Sutherland, to help Australia maintain their clean slate in the



league stage of the mega event. Earlier, after a delayed start due to rain, Lata Mondal top-scored for Bangladesh with an excellent 33 as Gardner and left-arm spinner Jess

Jonassen took four wickets between themselves to restrict them to 135/6. Murshida Khatun (12) and Sharmin Akhter (24) were able to safely negotiate an Australia seam

attack missing star all-rounder Ellyse Perry because of injury. The pair took the score along to 33 without too much trouble. But the introduction of Gardner (2/23) changed things for Australia as Khatun fell.

Fargana Hoque (8) was dismissed by Annabel Sutherland (1/22), before Akhter and skipper Nigar Sultana (7) fell to Jess Jonassen (2/13) in quick succession to leave Bangladesh in tatters at 62/4. Rumana Ahmed (15) combined with Mondal for a 33-run stand.

But their total was never going to be enough as Mooney scripted yet another rescue act to ensure Australia entered the knockout stages of the tournament with seven wins in as many matches.

No.22 seed Belinda Bencic opened her campaign with a strong performance, defeating Ukraine's Marta Kostyuk 6-3, 6-1. The victory snapped a three-match slide for the



reigning Olympic champion, with her last win coming in St. Petersburg.

Bencic will face Great Britain's Heather Watson in the third round. Watson

pulled off a dramatic comeback to notch her first Top 20 win in two years, saving match point to defeat No.20 Elina Svitolina 4-6, 6-3, 7-6(4).

Australia clinch Test series 1-0 against Pakistan

Australia have clinched the three-Test series against Pakistan 1-0 after a dramatic day five victory in Lahore on Friday.

For Australia, fast bowler Pat Cummins picked three crucial wickets while off-spinner Nathan Lyon picked up five wickets to wrap up Pakistan's innings at 235/10 in 92.1 overs.

Pakistan captain Babar Azam, who saved Pakistan from the jaws of defeat in the second Test in Karachi with a 196 in the second innings, also succumbed to pressure and got out. After Azam's wicket, none of the Pakistan's

batters were able to carry their innings.

Cummins dismissed Fawad Alam and wicket-keeper Mohammad Rizwan, who also struck an unbeaten 104 in the second innings of the drawn Karachi Test, in successive overs with both batters falling leg before wicket.

The first two Tests in the series - the first between the sides in Pakistan since 1998 - were drawn.

Later, Padhiyar and Shailesh Kumar produced a

leap of 1.84m each but the former was awarded the gold in the men's high jump T42 final. Thailand's Angkam Chanaboon took the bronze in the T47 category with a jump of 1.90m.

In women's events, Jayanti Behera ran the 100m women's final T46/47 in 13.16 seconds to take the bronze, behind USA's Brittni Mason (12.43s) and Tereza Jakschova of the Czech Republic (13.04s).

Earlier, Desai, Someswara Rao and Mohit have clinched gold medals for India.

But the third goal came shortly afterward when Philippe Coutinho converted from the spot after Bravo clattered into Antony. The result leaves Brazil unbeaten at the top of the 10-team South American group with 42 points from 16 matches.
