

With a view to address the issues related to gaps or loss of learning among students, during and after the lockdown, National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has developed bridge course modules for out-of-school children including various activities which are helpful for bridging the

learning gaps.

Different States have also been requested to prepare and implement School Readiness Module Bridge Course in classrooms for initial one or two months for each grade. The information was given by Minister of State for Education, Annpurna Devi in a written reply in the Lok Sabha on Monday.

NCERT has also prepared 'Alternative Academic Calendar' which is a week-wise learning plan for grades 1 to 12.

A National Mission on Foundational Literacy and Numeracy called 'National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy (NIPUN Bharat)' has also been launched by the Ministry of Education (MoE) on July 5, 2021 under the aegis of Samagra Shiksha, the minister said.

The National Mission lays down priorities and actionable agendas for States to achieve the goal of

proficiency in foundational literacy and numeracy for every child by grade 3. Vidya Pravesh module has been launched for class 1 students. This is a play based on 3 months of school preparation program for children entering in Class I. According to the ministry of education, in addition, a comprehensive initiative called PM eVIDYA has been initiated which unifies all efforts related to digital, online, on-air education to enable multi-mode access to education.

### MISSILE SHOT DOWN IN KIEV, WRECKAGE DESTROYS RESIDENTIAL BUILDING

# DEVASTATING DEFENCE

Ukraine anti-aircraft defence shot down a missile in Kiev and its wreckage fell onto a residential neighbourhood destroying a five-storey building.

Vitalii Klitschko, Mayor of Kiev said that missile wreckage fell onto the road. One person was killed and six were injured, with two taken away by ambulance.

An empty tram was completely destroyed. Windows were shattered, the balconies of the nearest houses and commercial premises on the ground floors were damaged, Ukrayinska Pravda reported.

Earlier reports said Russia does not rule out taking 'full control' of Ukraine's major cities, the Kremlin said.

Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said, "The Russian armed

### MOVE UN HQ FROM US TO NEUTRAL COUNTRY: RUSSIA

New Delhi: Russia has called for the possibility of moving the UN Headquarters from the US to a neutral country. Director of the Department of International Organizations of the Russian Foreign Ministry Pyotr Ilyichev said: "We are positive about the idea of moving the UN headquarters to a neutral state. Such a step would make it possible to remove unnecessary tension from the complex process of searching for collective answers to the global challenges of our time. "In addition, our work would become much less politicized than it is now."



### MPS DEMAND TO WAIVE EDUCATION LOANS FOR UKRAINE STUDENTS

New Delhi: As the second part of the budget session resumed on Monday, the parliamentarians demanded a policy for students evacuated from Ukraine so that they can continue their studies in India. Congress Member of Parliament from Kerala, Kodikunnil Suresh demanded to waive education loans taken by students pursuing education in Ukraine by invoking the clause of 'act of war' to save them from falling in a debt trap. He said that the evacuated students face an uncertain future due to their inability to complete their education. Suggesting to set up a student welfare wing in every embassy as a policy intervention to help students, Kodikunnil Suresh demanded government to extend specialised help to students to overcome the mental trauma faced in the war zone. Another Congress member Rajmohan Unnithan claimed that thousands of students from Kerala were still stranded in Sumy in Ukraine and demanded that the government take urgent steps to bring them to safety.

## SKM announces next phase of movement to demand MSP guarantee

The Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM), a coalition of over 40 farmers' unions, on Monday announced the next phase of its nationwide agitation. The SKM will observe April 11- April 17 as MSP Legal Guarantee Week.

The SKM also planned a nationwide protest on March 21 regarding the role of the government in the Lakhimpur Kheri incident, wherein four farmers among others, were mowed down by a vehicle allegedly belonging to MoS Home Ajay Misra Teni.

In a meeting of all the organisations associated with the SKM at Gandhi Peace Foundation in Delhi, it was unanimously decided that during this week (April-11-17), all the constituent organisations associated with the Samyukt Kisan Morcha will organise dharnas, demonstrations, seminars, demanding legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (C2+50 per cent) as recommended by the Swaminathan Commission,

to all farmers on all their agricultural produce. After reviewing the legal process in the Lakhimpur Kheri case, concerns were expressed that the police administration and the prosecutors together are trying to protect the criminals and implicate the innocent farmers. "It is a matter of surprise that in such a serious case, the son of the Union Minister got bail so soon while the farmers implicated in the same case are still in jail," the Samyukt Kisan Morcha said and expressed serious concern at the news that a key witness in the case has been attacked after Monu Mishra's release.

The SKM decided that there would be no relaxation in the legal battle in this matter, and full legal help would be given by the Morcha to the families of the farmers, a statement after the meeting said.

The Morcha reiterated that the SKM supports the call for Bharat Bandh by trade unions on March 28 and 29, and that farmers across the country will actively participate in it.

## Centre accepts Justice Pushpa Ganediwala's resignation

The Centre on Monday issued a notification confirming the resignation of Bombay High Court's Additional Judge, Justice Pushpa V. Ganediwala, who quit her post last month after some controversial judgements delivered last year. The Ministry of Law & Justice said that Justice Ganediwala's resignation has been accepted with effect from February 11, 2022 - a day before her tenure was due to expire - as the Supreme Court collegium did not recommend extending her term or elevating her.



Justice Ganediwala, of the Nagpur Bench of Bombay HC, shot to headlines for two verdicts in child sex abuse cases delivered in January-February 2021 that generated immense controversy, and were later overruled by the Supreme Court.

One pertained to the proposition that direct 'skin-to-skin' contact was necessary for constituting an offence of sexual assault under the POCSO Act, and another of holding a minor girl's hand to open the zip of the man's pant did not constitute an offence under POCSO but under the IPC.

Following widespread reactions to the verdict, the apex court collegium revoked its recommendation of January 20 to make her a permanent judge of Bombay HC, and in February 2021, it recommended extending her term as an Additional Judge by one year.

### SIKHS EMPLOYED ALLOWED TO CARRY SMALL 'KIRPAN' IN AIRPORT

New Delhi: The Centre has allowed Sikhs working in the aviation sector to continue carrying small sized 'kirpan' within the airport premises.

In Sikh religion, 'kirpan' or a dagger is considered a holy object.

The Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) amended its order issued on March 4 by deleting the para restricting the entry of Sikh employees inside the airport carrying 'kirpan' of specified size. The new order issued on March 12 restored the position prior to March 4.

As per the order, the length of the kirpan's blade should not be more than six inches, and its total length should not exceed nine inches.

In its earlier circular, Sikh travellers on domestic flights were allowed to carry the specified length 'kirpan' on their body.

## 13 major river rejuvenation through forestry interventions

The Ministry is aiming that the forestry interventions will increase overall health of the rivers and recharge groundwater from the increased cumulative forest cover by 7,417.36 sq kms across these 13 riverscapes.

The Detailed Project Report (DPRs) on rejuvenation through forestry interventions were released for rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi, Beas, Sutlej, Yamuna, Brahmaputra, Narmada, Godavari, Mahanadi, Krishna, Cauvery, and Luni.

These 13 rivers collectively cover a total basin area of 16,11,149 sq km that represents 49.01 per cent of the geographical area of the country. The length of 13 rivers, including all of their tributaries (202 in all) within the delineated riverscapes is 42,830 km.

Modelled on the lines of the work done as part of the Clean Ganga Mission for the river and acknowledging that the growing water crisis is on account of degradation of river ecosystems, the Environment, Forest and Climate Change Ministry on Monday launched an ambitious river rejuvenation plan through forestry intervention for 13 major rivers and their tributaries across India.

The proposed interventions will also help to sequester 50.21 million tonnes CO2 equivalent in 10-year-old plantations and 74.76 million tonnes CO2 equivalent in 20-year-old plantations, it hopes. These DPRs are funded by National Afforestation & Eco-development Board, under the Ministry, and prepared by the Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Dehradun. Environment, Forest and Climate Change Minister Bhupendra Yadav explained how the DPRs envisage convergence of budgets from multiple



line ministries and will be part of Green India Mission II.

Termining the whole exercise as a "much needed initiative", Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat said: "We are custodians of the jal (water), jungle and zameen (land) and we are duty-bound to hand it over to the future generation as we got it or even better."

The proposed cumulative budget outlay of 13 DPRs is Rs 19,342.62 crore. These DPRs are expected to be executed through the state Forest Departments as nodal departments and with convergence of schemes of other line departments in the states towards the activities proposed in the DPRs and funding support from the Centre.

### TATA SONS CHIEF CHANDRASEKARAN APPOINTED AS AIR INDIA CHAIRMAN

New Delhi/Mumbai: Tata Sons Chairman N. Chandrasekaran has been appointed as Air India Chairman, a group spokesperson said. The development comes as the Tata Group scouts for a new Air India CEO-MD.

Earlier this month, ex-Turkish Airlines head Mehmet Ilker Ayci, who was named as the new Air India CEO-MD, declined the position. No reason was given for Ayci's decision.

Last month, the Tata Group-led Air India announced the appointment of Ayci as the new Chief Executive Officer and Managing Director of the airline. At that time, Ayci while accepting the position said he is "delighted and honoured to accept the privilege of leading an iconic airline and to join the Tata Group".



# 'NEVER VISUALISED': SC HINTS AT CAG PROBE IN FAKE COVID DEATH CLAIMS

The Supreme Court on Monday reiterated its concern regarding fake claims for Covid death compensation and that it may direct a probe by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) in this matter.

It suggested that inquiry into alleged fake death claims could be entrusted to the government auditor's office.

A bench of Justices M.R. Shah and B.V. Nagarathna said: "We never visualised that this kind of fake claims could come. It's a pious word. We never thought this scheme could be misused."

The bench added that if some officers are also involved in it, then it is "very serious".

As advocate Gaurav Kumar Bansal pointed out at the Section 52 in the Disaster Management Act, which addresses such concerns, Justice Shah said: "We need somebody to file a complaint."

Counsel suggested a random examination of the compensation claims by the state legal services authorities. During the hearing, the top court said its earlier order regarding ex-gratia of Rs 50,000 to the family members of those who succumbed to Covid is "very clear" and the payment is to be made for each death. The bench made this observation while dealing with an application filed by the Assam government, seeking clarification



tion whether each of the children of the deceased parents would be paid compensation, in case there is more than one child.

The bench clarified that ex-gratia payment of Rs 50,000, ordered by it, is to be paid for each death due to Covid-19 and not to each child of the affected family. In January, the top court had directed all the state governments to reach out to

those children, who have lost their parents to the viral disease, and pay them compensation. On March 7, the Supreme Court expressed concern at doctors issuing fake medical certificates to people for claiming ex-gratia compensation for Covid deaths, and added that it might order a probe into the matter. The Centre had submitted that an outer limit may be fixed for submitting Covid death related claims, otherwise the process will become endless, and added that some state governments have come across fake medical certificates issued by doctors. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta also pointed out that the apex court's order on ex-gratia compensation, through a doctor's certificate, has been misused in certain cases.

Expressing concern on fake medical certificates, the bench said: "What is worrying is the fake certificate given by doctors... it is a very serious thing."

It also agreed with Mehta's submissions that there should be a time limit for registering Covid death claims. "There must be some time limit, otherwise the process will go endlessly..."

The top court was hearing a plea filed by Bansal in connection with the disbursement of ex-gratia compensation by state governments to the families of Covid victims. It is monitoring the disbursement of Rs 50,000 ex-gratia for Covid-19 deaths by various state governments.

# 4 killed, 14 injured in scrap shop blaze in Jammu city

Four persons were killed and 14 others injured on Monday in a massive blaze inside a scrap shop and surrounding 'jhuggies' (shanties) in Jammu city, police said.

Locals said the fire broke out in the evening initially in the scrap shop and engulfed the surrounding 'jhuggies' in the Residency Road area. SSP, Jammu, Chandan

Kohli, also said that the fire broke out in the scrap shop located in the Residency Road area this evening and some gas cylinders also exploded, spreading the blaze to the surrounding shanties.

"Electric short circuit is suspected to be the cause of fire as per preliminary reports," he said.

Police, fire and emergency services, and the locals worked hard to rescue the

injured. Police said 4 persons died in this blaze and 14 are injured. The injured were being treated in the hospital.

Lt Governor, Manoj Sinha has sanctioned ex-gratia relief of Rs 5 lakh each for the families of the killed persons.

A sum of Rs 1 lakh each has been sanctioned to the families of those severely injured while those with minor injuries will get Rs 25,000 each.

# Several trapped after building collapses in Delhi's Kashmere Gate

As many as eight people were reportedly trapped after a building collapsed in North Delhi's Kashmere Gate area on Monday evening.

The fire department received the information about the incident at around 5:25 pm.

"A call was received regarding the building collapse at Nicholson Road in Kashmere Gate. We sent five tenders to the site for the rescue operation. Many people were trapped. We have rescued two labourers. The rescue operation is still going on," said a fire official.

The official said that a team of NDRF was also called for the help. The local police and CATS ambulance were also pressed into service.

The official said that they were facing trouble in the rescue operation due to narrow lanes.

The two persons, who were rescued from the debris, were admitted to a nearby government hospital. Their condition is stated to be critical. The police and fire officials have cordoned off the area to avoid more casualties.

Further rescue operation is underway.



# DELHI RIOTS: FORMER CONGRESS COUNCILLOR ISHRAT JAHAN GETS BAIL

New Delhi: A court here on Monday granted bail to former Congress councillor Ishrat Jahan in a case related to the alleged larger conspiracy in the 2022 Delhi riots.

Ishrat Jahan was allowed bail by Additional Sessions Judge Amitabh Rawat, who have reserved his order last month after hearing the submissions.

She was arrested by Delhi Police Special Cell on February 26, 2020, and was charged under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Indian Penal Code, the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act, and the Arms Act.

During the last hearing, advocate Pradeep Teotia appeared for Ishrat Jahan and Special Public Prosecutor Amit Prasad appeared for the government. Ishrat Jahan's counsel, in the last hearing, had argued that she has been a lawyer and a young political person.

"She has a brilliant acumen. I was victorious from a ward where Muslims were less in number. Both the sects had given the vote to her. No Muslim had even won from the said ward," Teotia argued. Further, he argued that she was a popular lady, saying they have no "single iota of evidence" regarding her involvement in the conspiracy. As per the prosecution, Ishrat Jahan was in touch with other accused with whom she had no connection and the same was only to further the object of conspiracy to commit riots.

# Chitra Ramkrishna sent to 14 days judicial custody

Chitra Ramkrishna, the ex MD and CEO of the National Stock Exchange (NSE), who was arrested by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in connection with the NSE co-location case, was on Monday remanded to fourteen days judicial custody by Delhi's Rouse Avenue court.

Ramkrishna was produced before the special court after the expiry of her custodial remand. After Monday's hearing, the court remanded her to 14-day judicial custody. She will be lodged at Tihar Jail.

The CBI had on March 6 arrested Chitra Ramkrishna, accused of grave lapses at India's



largest stock market including sharing confidential information with an individual. She was produced before the court on March 7 after her anticipatory bail plea was rejected by the court a day earlier.

Anand Subramanian, the ex Group Operating Officer, was also arrested by the CBI. He was interrogated at length during the custodial period. He is also currently in judicial custody.

# Govt looking for alternative market for fuel purchase: Puri

Union Minister for Petroleum Hardeep Singh Puri on Monday informed the Rajya Sabha that the government is looking for an alternate market for fuel purchase amid the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict.

Responding to a question during 'Question Hour', he said that the government has been exploring all options such as currency to facilitate purchase, supply of oil in markets, insurance and freight. In response to Congress lawmaker Shakti Singh Gohil's question whether the government intends to reduce diesel rates, the Minister said that the prices of diesel were



deregulated. "Whenever we felt that the common man needed more relief, we went ahead and reduced the price. In November 2021, we brought down the fuel prices by Rs 10," Puri said in the

House. Congress MP K.C. Venugopal said that petrol prices have increased 63 times and diesel 61 times. He also said that since November, the government has not hiked the price and

asked whether the price will remain the same or will be a hike or not. The Petroleum Minister also informed that Venezuela is a country which was subjected to sanctions by another country. He further said that there was hope and expectation that oil from other sanctioned countries would become available, the Organisation of Oil Exporting Countries (OPEC) countries would increase their oil production and there would be persuasion by the international community in this regard. Puri also said that neither the union government nor the oil companies are going to float oil bonds. "All legitimate steps would be taken to maintain prices of oil," he said.

# INTERNATIONAL KABADDI PLAYER SHOT DEAD IN PUNJAB

Chandigarh: International kabaddi player Sandeep Singh from Nangal Ambian village was shot dead by assailants during a match at Malian village in Jalandhar district on Monday. At least 20 bullets were pumped into his head and chest. The disturbing video of the crime went viral.

A former captain of the Indian kabaddi team, Sandeep hailed from Nangal Ambian village in Shahkot. He is survived by his wife and two sons, who are currently in England, where he was settled.

# Gandhis responsible for Congress's rout: Capt Amarinder Singh

Holding the Gandhis solely responsible for the complete rout of the Congress in all the recent Assembly polls, PLC chief Capt Amarinder Singh on Monday slammed the Congress Working Committee (CWC) for blaming him for the defeat in Punjab instead of gracefully admitting their own blunders.

"The Congress has not only lost in Punjab but also in UP, Uttarakhand, Goa and Manipur and the Gandhis are entirely to be blamed for the party's shameful defeat," he said, adding that the fact was that the people, across the country, had lost faith in the leadership of the Gandhis. Pointing out that many



senior leaders within the party were outrightly blaming the infighting in the Punjab Congress and the 'anti-party' statements of Navjot Sidhu for the abysmal performance in Punjab, the former chief minister said the Congress was comfortably placed in the state till he was sacked to

favour certain sycophants. The party had dug its own grave in the border state the day they decided to back an "unstable" and "pompous" person like Sidhu, and naming a corrupt minister like Charanjit Singh Channi as chief minister just months before the polls, he said.

# RLD dissolves all party units, MLAs to meet on March 21

Rashtriya Lok Dal (RLD) chief Jayant Chaudhary has dissolved all the units and fronts of the party in Uttar Pradesh with immediate effect.

"As per the orders passed by RLD chief Jayant Chaudhary, party's state, regional, and district units and fronts in Uttar Pradesh have been dissolved effective immediately," the RLD tweeted. The RLD will also hold its

first meeting of its UP legislators in Lucknow on March 21. The RLD had contested the recently-concluded Uttar Pradesh assembly elections in alliance with the Samajwadi Party (SP).

The party, which was reduced to a single seat in the 2017 state elections, fought on 33 seats this time and won eight of them, while the SP bagged 111 seats, a significant improvement from 2017 polls when it won only 47 seats.

# Heat wave warning in western Rajasthan for next two days

As the advent of early summers in Rajasthan have led to the temperatures rising in the middle of March, the Meteorological Department has warned of heat wave in the next two days in different parts of the state.

As per the department, the heat may wreak havoc in western Rajasthan this summer.

On March 15 and 16, heat waves are likely in Barmer and Jaisalmer districts and the Meteorological Department has issued a heat wave warning and a 'yellow alert'.

Meteorological Department Director Radheshyam Sharma said that heat waves can push the temperatures high in Barmer and Jaisalmer, as well as in other districts too. According to the Meteorological



Department, heatwave may continue in the western areas of the desert state for the next few days. On Tuesday, heat wave is likely to prevail in Barmer, Jodhpur, and Jaisalmer in western Rajasthan, and on Wednesday in Bikaner, Barmer, Jodhpur, Jaisalmer, and Jalore districts.

Winters had also wreaked havoc this season and smashed all records. At the same time, rains, hailstorm, and winds lashed the state a few days back. Now, the heat wave warning in the middle of March has driven people inside as the temperature is soaring each day.

# CENTRE TO BEGIN COVID VACCINATION FOR 12-14 AGE GROUP FROM MARCH 16

New Delhi: The Union Government after deliberations with scientific bodies decided on Monday to start Covid vaccination for 12-14 year age group from March 16. Those teenagers born in 2008, 2009 and 2010 or those who are already above 12 years of age of population will be administered Covid vaccines from March 16. The Covid-19 vaccine to be administered would be Corbevax manufactured by Hyderabad based Biological E, said the Union Health Ministry.

The government has also decided that the condition of co-morbidity for Covid-19 precaution dose for population over 60 years of age will be removed forthwith. The ministry said that the population above 14 years of age is already being administered vaccine under the ongoing vaccination drive. "Hence, from 16th March 2022 onwards, the entire population above 60 years of age will be eligible for Precaution Dose of COVID19 vaccine", said the ministry.

# Vigilance Raid: Ducati, Harley-Davidson bikes seized from Odisha engineer

Three imported Ducati and Harley-Davidson bikes along with several plots and buildings were seized from the possession of a civil engineer in Odisha during a vigilance raid, officials said on Monday.

The vigilance sleuths conducted raids on the properties of Ajaya Kumar Mishra, Assistant Executive Engineer, Roads & Buildings Division-IV, Bhubaneswar, at six places in three districts, after allegations were levelled that he had assets disproportionate to his known sources of income.

The raids were launched at around 5 a.m. and they were continuing till the filing of this report.

The vigilance teams found one Ducati motorcycle worth Rs 8 lakh, one Harley-Davidson bike worth Rs 7 lakh, one Roster-1200 Harley-Davidson bike worth Rs 5.45 lakh, two scooters



worth nearly Rs 1.5 lakh, one Hyundai i10 (Rs 8 lakh) car along with jewellery, cash and bank deposits over Rs 40 lakh. Besides, three multi-story buildings and seven plots at important locations registered in the name of Mishra's wife and son have also been found during the raid, whose valuation has not been done so far, the vigilance officials informed. Two tribal women were sexually assaulted by a group of men in a village in Madhya Pradesh' tribal Alirajpur district, police said on Sunday, adding that two accused have been arrested in connection with the crime.

The incident came to light after a shocking video surfaced on social media, showing the two women, standing beside a vehicle on a busy road in Alirajpur, nearly 400 km away from Bhopal, being forcibly sexually assaulted by a group of men on broad day light, while some others were seen capturing the incident on their mobile phones.

After verifying viral video, local police said the incident occurred during a popular tribal festival.

The clip shows one of the women appearing to hide behind a vehicle parked on the roadside when a man,

passing the spot, grabbed and assaulted her. She gets rescued by a passer-by, who pulled the man away.

However, in the meantime, another man grabbed another woman standing at the same spot and molested her. "A case has been registered against a group of persons. Two persons involved involved the case has been arrested. A search for another accused is underway," Alirajpur's Superintendent of Police, Manoj Kumar Singh, said.

On Sunday, the Congress Working Committee unanimously decided that Sonia Gandhi will continue to be the chief till the organisational polls are held. 51% MLAs with criminal cases UP Assembly

Out of the 403 newly elected legislators in Uttar Pradesh, 205 (nearly 51 per cent) have declared criminal cases against themselves. Of these 143 (36 per cent) MLAs have made the declarations in their affidavits. According to an analysis report released by Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), 158 (39 per cent) winning candidates have declared serious criminal cases, including cases related to murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, crimes against women, etc. There are five winning candidates who have declared cases related to murder (IPC Section-302) against themselves. Winning candidates with cases related to attempt to murder are 29 while six winning candidates have declared cases related to crimes against women - one of whom has a case related to rape. According to ADR analysis, there are 111 (44 per cent) out of 255 winning candidates from the BJP who have criminal antecedents, 71 out of 111 winning candidates are from SP, 7 out of 8 winning candidates from RLD, 4 out of 6 winning candidates from Suheldev Bhartiya Samaj Party, 4 out of 6 winning candidates from Nishad Part, 3 out of 12 winning candidates from Apna Dal, 2 from Jansatta Dal Loktantrik, 2 from Congress and 1 from the BSP. Nearly 233 out of 255 newly elected legislators from the BJP, 100 out of 111 from SP, 9 out of 12 from Apna Dal, 7 out of 8 from RLD, 6 from Suheldev Bhartiya Samaj Party, 6 from Nishad party, 2 from Jansatta Dal Loktantrik, 2 from INC and 1 BSP winning candidates have declared assets worth more than Rs 1 crore.

AFGHAN MINERAL WEALTH ATTRACTS COMPETITORS

Even when the American occupation of Afghanistan was in full steam and apart from the fighting there were mainly reports of the on-going fighting, yet there were secret reports, which spoke of the vast mineral wealth which Afghanistan possesses. There were further reports, which reported questioningly the Americans taking plane-loads of soil from various regions of Afghanistan to get them analysed in their country. Yet, few believed those reports.

But now new findings are emerging which say that those reports might be true to a certain extent. Afghanistan, which is one of the world's poorest countries at present, contains huge riches in the shape of mineral deposits of gold, precious stones, coal, oil and gas, lithium, and rare-earth minerals.

Afghanistan's mineral wealth

A decade back some US geologists had calculated the mineral reserves in Afghanistan to be in excess of \$1 trillion, which must have increased many fold by now, as it comprises many rare earth elements. Technological advances in the West and China both depend to a large extent on possessing these rare earth minerals as many new energy alternatives are based on their steady supply.

China already controls most of the world's rare-earth minerals, which are used to manufacture a variety of technologies, including components in electric vehicles and smartphone touch screens.

Now China has plunged in the troubled waters of Afghanistan, after the US withdrawal. In the recent past China has courted the Taliban administration with much fanfare. Its embassy in Kabul kept functioning when Western missions fled after the Taliban takeover.

Reportedly, even Iran, which has facilitated several round of talks for restoring the new government in Afghanistan has jumped into the fray and has tried to foster good ties with the top Taliban honchos.

As per a report in the Wall Street Journal, China is negotiating with Taliban authorities to start mining in the Logar province, a two-hour drive from the capital, reportedly containing one of the world's biggest untapped reserves of copper, called Mes Aynak.

Beijing is also in talks to begin work on oil-and-gas reserves in the north of the country, Amu Darya. Both projects were on hold for years because of the war, which ended when the Taliban seized power in August.

Obviously the US officials are concerned that China will fill the vacuum left by the American withdrawal from Afghanistan.

Taliban's Minister for Minerals and



Petroleum, Shahabuddin Dilawar bemoans the fact that his country was engaged in war for past 43 years and thus could not mine these resources for Afghanistan's development.

Of the current Taliban administration, its Mining Ministry is apparently engaged in a lot of activities. However, Dilawar is reported to be exercising a cautious and pragmatic approach to decide which country to allow mining these resources for Afghanistan.

Reportedly he wants American and other Western companies to also come to Afghanistan now that the American military presence is gone. And would prefer American mining companies due to their expertise.

With commodities in a bullish cycle that could keep prices buoyant for years and the end to fighting between U.S. forces and the Taliban, the time might be right for mining in Afghanistan, according to analysts.

Archaeological issues

However, what queers the way forward for Chinese companies is that these copper deposits sits under the ruins of a vast ancient city, Mes Aynak, dating back about 2,000 years. Mes Aynak was a grand outpost of a Buddhist civilisation that thrived in Afghanistan and what is now north-western Pakistan centuries before Islam rose.

Countering the deeds of the past Taliban administration, which blasted the two Bamian statues in 2001, this time Dilawar tries to assure by saying that these antiquities

would be protected but how it hasn't been decided. His preference would be to move the whole city to somewhere nearby and reconstruct it. Many prize artefacts have been shifted to the Kabul Museum.

Mes Aynak flourished between the first and seventh centuries. Reportedly there are Buddhist monasteries, stupas, graveyards and wall paintings beneath the mountain. Its eastern flank is covered with antique structures that formed the city.

Archaeologists say that excavation of the site was about 70 per cent complete after a decade of work on it, and no mining should be done until the excavation is completed.

Experts say if the Chinese were prepared to mine underground through tunnels, which would enable the city ruins to remain where they are, it would take at least three more years of archaeological excavation before mining could begin.

Further, if the Chinese plan to do open-pit mining, seven to 10 years would be needed to document and move the ancient remains.

Further, more than half of the antiquities might be lost and the archaeological integrity of the site, as it is not possible to relocate everything. At present talks with Chinese companies are struck as what the Taliban want them to deliver and what they are ready to deliver, differ. The mining minister said the 2007 contract required China to build a power plant that would supply

energy to the site, surrounding area and Kabul; process the copper in Afghanistan; construct a railway to the Pakistani border at Torkham; transfer the antiquities; and buy land from villagers. He categorically said that Chinese were given two projects earlier, and we may not give them a third until we see practical actions in those two. China's state-owned mining company Metallurgical Corp. of China, which was awarded the contract for Mes Aynak in 2007 by the then-US-backed government in Kabul, never started the work because of the scale of the antiquities discovered, the war and disagreements over terms with the Afghan government. There are reports that MCC is trying to back-off earlier obligations. Apparently, mining looks to be the best bet for Taliban, as after their takeover they immediately came under international sanctions, asset freeze and slowing business activities leading to an economic collapse. To raise revenues fast, mining seems to be best option for them, but they'll have to tread cautiously in choosing their partners besides ensuring measures to preserve the archaeological treasures of the country.

The trio denounced the North's recent spate of ballistic missile launches as violations of UN Security Council resolu-

tions and urged it to return to dialogue at an early date, the ministry said in a release. They also agreed to closely monitor Pyongyang's moves and remain in close cooperation to respond to its acts, it added. South Korea and the US accused Pyongyang on March 11 of having tested a new ICBM system on February 27 and March 5 ahead of a full-range missile test. Seoul and Washington have detected signs that North Korea is preparing to conduct another ICBM firing as early as this week, according to informed sources. Concerns have persisted that the North could engage in more provocative acts as it made a veiled threat in January to lift its years-long self-imposed moratorium on nuclear and ICBM tests.

"The freezing of currency accounts of the Bank of Russia and the Russian government can be regarded as a desire of a number of foreign countries to organize an artificial default that has no real economic grounds," RT News quoted the Minister as saying. Earlier, Siluanov said that the Ministry of Finance would try to pay for eurobonds in the currency of their issue, provided that the currency accounts of



the Central Bank and the government were unfrozen. Russia has denied statements that it cannot fulfil its obligations under the public debt. He stressed that the country has the necessary amount of funds. "Statements that Russia cannot fulfil its obligations under the public debt do not correspond to reality. We

have the necessary amount of funds to service our obligations," the Ministry's press service quoted Siluanov as saying. Russia is also ready to make payments in rubles at the exchange rate of the Bank of Russia on the date of payment, he noted. "Moreover, for issues of Eurobonds issued since 2018, such an opportunity was laid down directly in the issuance documents," Siluanov recalled referring to payment in ruble. The Ministry of Finance will additionally inform about the fulfilment of their obligations by agent banks under the terms of Eurobond issues. Earlier in the day, Siluanov told local media that nearly half of the country's roughly \$640 billion of gold and foreign currency reserves have been frozen in the wake of Moscow's ongoing war on Ukraine. The Russian authorities will closely monitor inflation and the state of the country's pensions, Siluanov noted. "Of course, we have enough money to ensure the production of vital goods. The Central Bank will provide the necessary liquidity to the financial system," he said. Since Russia started the war on February 24, there has been an onslaught of Western economic sanctions, including asset freezes, in response.

TURKISH PREZ, GREEK PM VOW TO BOOST COOPERATION 'DESPITE DISAGREEMENTS'

Istanbul: Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis pledged to boost mutual cooperation "despite their disagreements". Erdogan and Mitsotakis met in Istanbul behind closed doors on Sunday, Turkey's presidential office said in a statement, adding the main agenda of the discussions was bilateral and international relations, including the Russia-Ukraine conflict, reports Xinhua news agency. Erdogan and Mitsotakis agreed to keep communication channels open and improve bilateral relations despite some disagreements between the two countries, said the statement.



The Turkish leader told the Greek Prime Minister that he maintains his belief in taking relations to a high level and making progress in issues that strained their relations. The relations between the two NATO allies have long been at odds over a series of issues, including maritime and energy issues in the Aegean Sea and the Mediterranean Sea. Meanwhile, addressing the Greek community at the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Istanbul earlier in the day, Mitsotakis called for an immediate ceasefire on all fronts in Ukraine so that new opportunities for dialogue, reconciliation, and peace might be present.

Hitting out at the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government in the Maharashtra assembly, Fadnavis recalled how his father had spent two years in prison without any charges during the Emergency. "I am not scared of jail. I will continue to expose the corruption," declared Fadnavis who was quizzed



by a Mumbai Cyber Police team for two hours at his residence on Sunday. The police team questioned him on the probe into the alleged illegal tapping of telephones of prominent personalities and leakage of confidential information pertaining to alleged corrupt practices in police department transfers/promotions

that erupted last year. Speaking on the issue, Home Minister Dilip Walse-Patil said that there is no immunity in criminal cases and Fadnavis had been duly served notices in the routine course. "The notice under CrPC Section 160 was sent to Fadnavis, not as an accused, but to record his statement. It's a rou-

tine exercise and not done deliberately," Walse-Patil said. The police have filed an FIR in the unauthorised phone tapping case and statements of 24 others have already been recorded, he added. Walse-Patil said that the police have asked the Union Home Secretary to share a copy of the pen-drive given by Fadnavis pertaining to the alleged irregularities and graft in police transfers/promotions. BJP Member Sudhir Mungantiwar, who raised the matter, said MLAs are given protection by privilege and cannot share their sources, and even the Supreme Court has upheld this. Fadnavis said that when he was sent the questionnaire recently, the questions asked then were meant for an 'eyewitness account', but the questioning at his home on Sunday (March 13) was for an accused, and said he knew "who changed the questions and why." He pointed out that he enjoyed protection as a whistle-blower under the Act and would continue to expose corruption in the government.

# Deshmukh's Bail Rejected In Money Laundering Case

A special PMLA court here on Monday refused bail to former Maharashtra home minister Anil Deshmukh in an alleged money laundering case. Anil Deshmukh, an NCP leader, was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on November 2, 2021. He is currently in judicial custody. Special judge RN Rokade rejected his bail plea on Monday.



There is "enough evidence" to prima facie hold that he was "involved" in the money laundering case, the judge said. There are contradictions in the witness statements, but that cannot be considered at this stage (of bail plea), he said.

This was Anil Deshmukh's first regular bail petition. Earlier, the special court had rejected his plea for default bail, filed on technical ground. In the regular plea filed in January this year, Anil Deshmukh contended that he is a victim of "gross persecution" by probe agencies.

The former minister had said "harassment was being meted out to him at the hands of certain unscrupulous vested interests for blatantly mala fide considerations."

He claimed the case reflects "shocking abuse of power and authority" by officials concerned who have virtually unleashed a reign of

terror by subverting the process of law.

If such adventurism, which has been indulged into in the instant case is allowed to go unchecked, it will spell a death knell to the fundamental rights as guaranteed in the Constitution," Anil Deshmukh said in his plea. The ED had opposed his plea, alleging that he was the "main conspirator" in the case. On his instructions, former policeman Sachin Waze, an accused in the case, had collected money from bar owners, the probe agency had said.

Anil Deshmukh was accused of corruption and bribery by former Mumbai police commissioner Param Bir Singh, after which the ED and the Central Bureau of

Investigation (CBI) registered cases against the former state home minister.

The ED's case is that while serving as Maharashtra's home minister, Anil Deshmukh allegedly misused his official position and through Sachin Waze collected Rs 4.70 crore from various bars in Mumbai.

The money was laundered to Nagpur-based Sai Shikshan Sansthan, an educational trust controlled by the Deshmukh family.

Sachin Waze was dismissed from police service after his arrest in the case of an explosives-laden vehicle found near the residence of industrialist Mukesh Ambani in Mumbai and killing of businessman Mansukh Hiran.

the HSC Class 12 Exam 2022. Multiple reports of paper leaks and mass cheating have been reported by students and teachers on social media. Students have expressed their troubles while appearing for the Maharashtra HSC Exams 2022 and have demanded that the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, MSBSHSE and State Education Minister Varsha Gaikwad, take appropriate action. MSBSHSE offered students one mark in compensation. Allegations regarding the mass cheating and unfair means of examination is yet to be confirmed by the state board of education and state officials.

# MEDICAL TEACHERS SUSPEND WORK: OPDS, OT TO BE HIT

The medical teachers want the government to meet their demands of pay hikes under the 7th pay commission and job security by regularising the temporary teachers and have been in protest.

Medical teachers in Maharashtra have been protesting for the last 45 days and now they have given an

ultimatum to the government and have withdrawn all patient-related work from today (14th March). Their demands of pay hikes and regularisation of temporary lecturers are not met by the government yet and the protest is likely to intensify more in the coming days.

There are more than 2500 medical teachers and nearly 1400 lecturers in Maharashtra. They have stopped taking lectures since 5th January. The teachers have also stopped all the administrative and official work. They are also boycotting the examination work too.

The stir has escalated and teachers have now threatened the government to stop working in patients related work until their prime demands are met. Although the emergency ward and ICU ward would be operational, says MSMTA. Dr Sunanda Dhivare from JJ hospital says, "From last 31 years, I am into the practice but still as an associate professor. I joined the service in 1987 and completed my MDS in 1997. I waited for MPSC for long 20 years. Only in the year 2016, I became assistant professor through MPSC." She also added, If I go to a

private hospital, I will be easily absorbed. My motive to serve the government and people has made me survive. I am going to retire in two years, will I retire as an assistant professor? The administration should strengthen us. A young doctor, Dr Pradhnya Dev said, "On the contractual basis the vacancies are filled. For systematic promotions, we have to go through MPSC every year. "She is in the service for the last 7 years and urges the government to change the system and acknowledge the needs of government-run medical college teachers.



# INDIA BEAT SRI LANKA BY 238 RUNS TO WIN SERIES 2-0

Dimuth Karunaratne scored his 14th Test century on a difficult pitch but it was not enough to deny India a win by 238 runs on Day three of the second Test at M Chinnaswamy Stadium here on Monday.

With the huge win inside the first two sessions on Day three, the hosts have completed a 2-0 series sweep and pocketed 12 points as part of World Test Championship (WTC) tally. Karunaratne put up a defiant show against a relentless India bowling attack as Sri Lanka began day three on a positive note. The visitors showed some fight in the start of day's play as Karunaratne used his feet straightaway to take two boundaries off Ravindra Jadeja through the off-side. Runs began to flow for the visitors' as Kusal Mendis glanced and lofted Ravichandran Ashwin for boundaries. Sri Lanka's aggressive and positive play continued as Mendis swept Jadeja through deep square leg while Karunaratne was lucky in surviving an inner edge off Ashwin. The positivity and decisive attitude in play resulted in Mendis reaching his 12th Test half-century off



57 balls. The 97-run partnership, highest for Sri Lanka in this series, was broken by Ashwin as Mendis was foxed by drift and dip from round the wicket angle. Mendis danced down the pitch to counter the delivery but the ball went past the outer edge and was stumped from behind by Rishabh Pant. One brought two for India as Jadeja bowled a quicker delivery to hit Angelo Mathews stumps through the gate. Ashwin then claimed his second wicket of the session as Dhananjaya de Silva was caught at forward short leg, enabling the off-spinner to go past Dale Steyn in the list of leading wicket-takers in Test cricket. Amidst the wheels coming off Sri Lanka's resistance,

Karunaratne stood tall and brought up his fifty in 92 balls. He then welcomed Mohammed Shami with a four whipped through mid-wicket and danced down the pitch to flick Axar Patel through the same region. Supporting him was Niroshan Dickwella, who has managed to hold fort against a relentless India bowling attack. Karunaratne began the post-lunch session by using the pace of Patel to lap over leg slip. But Patel bounced back to get Dickwella stumped as the left-hander came down the pitch for a swing across the line but the ball went past outside edge and Pant behind did the rest. Patel took his second wicket of the day as Charith Asalanka flicked

straight to leg slip. After a reverse sweep off Patel took him into the 90s, Karunaratne then played a conventional sweep over square leg for four. He then raised his century by flicking through backward square leg off Jasprit Bumrah, becoming only the third Sri Lanka captain to score a Test hundred in India. Karunaratne followed it up by using Bumrah's pace to steer a short ball over the slip cordon. Karunaratne's resistance ended at 107 as Bumrah got one to come back in and went through his gate to crash into the stumps. In the next over, Ashwin beat Lasith Embuldeniya on the inside edge to trap him lbw in front of stumps. Bumrah then clean bowled Suranga Lakmal and Vishwa Fernando holed out to mid-off Ashwin to end Sri Lanka's innings at 210, their highest total in the two-match series.

After two days of determined batting, Jharkhand continued to pile the misery on a hapless Nagaland attack, finally folding for a massive 880 on the third day in Kolkata. Shahbaz Nadeem, who was on 123 overnight, finished on 177, while No. 11 Rahul Shukla remained unbeaten on 85, as the final-wicket stand yielded 191.

In reply, Nagaland were tottering at 130 for 4 with Chetan Bist batting on 46 with Abu Nchim on 13.

Jharkhand began Day 2 on 402 for 5 and resumed their process as Kushagra found his next able ally in Anukul Roy. Earlier, he had already added 175 runs for the fifth wicket with Virat Singh.

The Kushagra-Anukul pair added another stand in excess of 100, with Anukul getting a brisk half-century.



After Anukul, it was Shahbaz Nadeem who piled the misery on a hapless Nagaland attack, making 177 runs. He and Kushagra added 166 for the seventh wicket, taking the team total past 650.

It was a brief relief for Nagaland as Kushagra fell after a scintillating knock that involved 37 fours and 2 sixes. But at the other end Nadeem, who has one previous first-class hundred to his name added another to it in the company of the team's No. 11 Rahul Shukla.

By stumps, Nadeem reached 177 -- his best first-class score -- and Shukla had 85 to his name while Jharkhand amassed 880, their highest-ever total since featuring in the Ranji Trophy since 2005.




## SIKANDER KHER: 'AS ACTORS, WE CONSTANTLY GO THROUGH PHASES IN OUR CAREERS'
