THE SUPREME COURT OF INDIA PUTS SEDITION LAW ON HOLD TILL REVIEW, SAYING

Cognisant of civil liberties of citizens

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said it is cognisant of the integrity of the state on one hand, and the civil liberties of citizens on the other, as it put on hold the colonial-era penal provision of sedition. It also asked the Centre and state governments to refrain from registering any FIRs under the sedition provision, Section 124A of the Indian Penal Code, till review of the law by Centre is complete.

▶ THE UNION MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS, IN AN AFFIDAVIT, HAD SAID THE TOP COURT MAY NOT INVEST TIME EXAMINING THE VALIDITY OF SECTION 124A ONCE AGAIN, AND RATHER WAIT FOR THE EXERCISE OF RECONSIDERATION TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE GOVERNMENT BEFORE AN APPROPRIATE FORUM WHERE SUCH RECONSIDERATION IS CONSTITUTIONALLY PERMITTED.

▶ THE BENCH NOTED THAT IT IS COGNIZANT OF SECURITY INTERESTS AND INTEGRITY OF THE STATE ON ONE HAND, AND THE CIVIL LIBERTIES OF CITIZENS ON THE OTHER. "THERE IS A REQUIREMENT TO BALANCE BOTH SETS OF CONSIDERATIONS, WHICH IS A DIFFICULT EXERCISE. THEREFORE, WE EXPECT THAT, TILL THE RE-EXAMINATION OF THE PROVISION IS COMPLETE, IT WILL BE APPROPRIATE NOT TO CONTINUE THE USAGE OF THE AFORESAID PROVISION OF LAW BY THE GOVERNMENTS."



law dates back to 1898, and pre-dates the Constitution itself, and is being misused. It also considered Attorney General K.K. Venugopal's submissions citing glaring misuse of this provision, like in the case of recital of the Hanuman Chalisa (by Rana couple in Maharashtra). The bench said that all pending trials, appeals and proceedings with respect to the charge framed under Section 124A of IPC be kept in abeyance. "Adjudication with respect to other sections, if any, could proceed if the courts are of the opinion that no prejudice would be caused to the accused," it added. In the interest of justice, the

bench said: "We hope and expect that the state and Central governments will refrain from registering any FIR, continuing any investigation or taking any coercive measures by invoking Section 124A of IPC while the aforesaid provision of law is under consideration." It added that if any fresh case is registered under Section 124A of IPC, the affected parties are at liberty to approach the courts concerned for appropriate relief. "The courts are requested to examine the reliefs sought, taking into account the present order passed as well as the clear stand taken by the Union of India," said the bench. MP CONG TO GIVE 27% TICKETS TO OBC CANDIDATES IN LOCAL BODY POLLS: KAMAL NATH

The Madhya Pradesh unit of Congress on Wednesday announced that the party will give 27 per cent tickets to OBC candidates for the local body elections in the state. The decision was announced by state Congress President Kamal Nath after a meeting with other party leaders on Tuesday.

The politics in the state over the OBC reservation issue has heated up again after the Supreme Court ordered the state election body to conduct local body elections without OBC reservation.

Notably, both the Congress and the BJP in December last year had passed a unanimous resolution in the Assembly that the local body elections would not be held without OBC reservation. However, complying with the SC's direction, the Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission (SEC) has started preparations for the polls.

On Wednesday, the SEC held a meeting and decided that the notification regarding the elections would be issued by May 24. Officials in the SEC said that district administrations have also been directed to prepare for the elections.

Ever since the SC's order was pronounced on Tuesday, the Congress has been blaming the Shivraj Singh Chouhan-led government for the present situation. It has alleged that the

Next round of 8-9 airports to be leased shortly: Scindia

Of the humongous Rs 62,000 crore debt on the books of Air India when it was handed over to the Tatas, the Government of India has closed its part of Rs 47,000 crore by paying off all the banks involved. Scindia brimming with ideas for the avia-

tion sector is thinking of new policies which make the system more organised and equally more dynamic. For instance, immediate on his agenda is leasing of at least 8-9 more airports.

As he said, "Let me categorically insist as I did in the Parliament the other day that these airports are not being privatised, they are being leased for a 50-year period. Not only are they going to generate revenue for the government this way, but they will guarantee upgrading of these airports. I think this is the best model going forward. You will hear of us calling for bids in the next round shortly. On charges of privatisation, let me tell you that leasing will actually garner revenues of Rs 904 crore per year for AAI as lease fee for the first round of six airports, and as much as Rs 2,322 crore has already reached government accounts in this case. We expect a similar windfall when we do the next round of leasing."

On the same lines, he is excited with the response he has got on his call for reducing VAT on ATF (aviation turbine fuel).

JHARKHAND IAS OFFICER POOJA SINGHAL ARRESTED BY ED

New Delhi: IAS officer and Jharkhand Mines Secretary Pooja Singhal arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) after her second day of questioning in connection with the ongoing probe of Prevention of Money Laundering case pertaining to alleged embezzlement of MNREGS funds.



Singhal on Wednesday she again joined the probe after being grilled for 9 hours on Tuesday. The ED, after collecting enough evidence against her, placed her under arrest. The ED sources said that they would scan her transactions of the last three years, to check the suspicious money trail, if any. The agency is also scanning details of all her properties. A source said that total of four cars of her husband have been seized. Cash amounting to around Rs 19 crore which was recovered in the raids by the ED. It is said that it was Singhal's money.

Pakistan decides to resume trade with India

The Pakistan government under Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has decided to resume trade with India, designating a trade minister for the task.

Though the decision is being seen as a major development in terms of country's dire economic condition, it is also being seen as a major compromise by Islamabad and a back step from its previous stance against India after August 5, 2019.

In a federal cabinet meeting, it was decided that Pakistan will be working towards reopening of trade with India. Moreover, similar trade officers and ministers are being designated in at least 15 countries, to enhance trade relations and agreements with their respective countries. The decision to resume trade with



India is a difficult decision that Shehbaz Sharif has taken because the former Prime Minister Imran Khan had halted trade with India after the Modi government abrogated Article 370 of its constitution and changed the special status of Jammu and Kashmir.

Pakistan's economic condition is moving towards a meltdown, which is coupled with the strict demands from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for the revival of its loan facility of \$6 billion.

SL PREZ TO APPOINT NEW PM, GOVERNMENT

To end the ongoing political crisis, Sri Lanka President Gotabaya Rajapaksa on Wednesday announced that a new government with a new Prime Minister, who can command the majority in the Parliament, would be appointed this week. Addressing the nation, President Rajapaksa also agreed to bring constitutional changes in line with the 19th Amendment, which was introduced by the last government and seeks that the Parliament be given more powers while curtailing executive (presidential) powers. He also assured that as demanded by various sections of the society, he would make ways to abolish the Presidential system.

PRESIDENT'S LETTERHEAD FORGED TO PROMOTE UNIVERSITY, FIR LODGED

While monitoring social media, the Special Cell of Delhi Police has found out that a man allegedly forged the letterhead of the President of India in a bid to promote his university. "It is submitted that during social media monitoring, it was found that a person named Amardeep Singh used the letterhead of the Hon'ble President of India under his own signature to inform people that the Vikramshila University is going to be inaugurated shortly," read the FIR.

The FIR was registered under Sections 465 (Punishment for forgery), 468 (Forgery for purpose of cheating) and 471 (Using as genuine a forged docu-

ment) of the Indian Penal Code at the Special Cell police station.

The police also found two phone numbers, a website link -- www.vikramshilauniversity.com -- and address mentioned in the letterhead. As per the FIR, a notice has been sent seeking registration details of the above mentioned website.

The website -- www.vikramshilauniversity.com -- claims that the institute is India's first digital varsity and also has a message from its founder and CEO, Amardeep Singh.

The university claims to offer courses like nuclear science & technology, nanotechnology, geo informatics, remote sensing etc. under its graduate programme.

China could see 1.6 mn Covid deaths if curbs are lifted

The lifting of zero-Covid policies in China would see a "tsunami" of infections and almost 1.6 million deaths, a study claims, citing in part China's low vaccination rate among elderly residents. The Guardian reported. China's government remains committed to a zero-Covid policy, employing resource intensive mass testing and case surveillance, and enforcing lockdowns, strict quarantine and isolation. A speech last week by the president Xi Jinping reaffirmed the commitment, despite the challenge posed by the Omicron variant which has already overwhelmed other



countries' zero-Covid policies. However it also said that with access to vaccines and antivirals and "maintaining implementation of non-pharmaceutical interventions", authorities could prevent the health system being overwhelmed. It suggested these factors could be more of a focus in future policies. Health experts agree, but China analysts are also concerned the authorities have backed themselves into a corner with no political exit ramp for the policy without admitting failure, The Guardian reported.

WHO CHIEF CENSORED IN CHINA AFTER QUESTIONING ZERO-COVID POLICY

The head of the World Health Organization (WHO) is being censored on China's internet after questioning the sustainability of the country's zero-Covid policy, CNN reported. The censorship on Weibo and WeChat, China's two largest social media platforms, targets WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus' comments that expressed rare disagreement with Beijing's policy. "When we talk about the zero-Covid strategy, we don't think that it is sustainable, considering the behavior of the virus now and what we anticipate in the future," Tedros told a media briefing Tuesday, citing the increased transmissibility of Omicron, CNN reported.

"We have discussed this issue with Chinese experts and we indicated that the approach will not be sustainable... I think a shift will be very important," he said. The United Nation's official press account on China's Twitter-like Weibo posted Tedros' comments early on Wednesday morning, drawing a wave of sarcastic comments from Chinese users.





SC MOVED AGAINST LIC IPO, SEEKS SCRAPPING OF PROCESS

The Supreme Court on Wednesday admitted a writ petition against the initial public offering (IPO) of Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) that got over early this week.

The writ petition was filed by policyholders, said Thomas Franco Rajendra Dev, Joint Convenor of NGO People First and the case is listed for Thursday.

The petitioners have filed the case in the apex court to issue a writ of mandamus, to declare Section 5 of the Life Insurance Corporation Act, 1956 (as amended by the Life Insurance Corporation (Amendment) Act, 2011) to be void and inoperative to the extent the capital of the corporation is characterised as 'equity capital', and to declare Sections 130, 131, 134, and 140 of the Finance Act, 2021 and Sections 4, 5, 24 and 28 of the Life Insurance Corporation Act, 1956 (as amended by the Finance Act, 2021) to be void and inoperative for being ultra vires Articles 14 read with Article 300A of the Constitution.

They also sought that Part III of the Chapter VI of the Finance Act, 2021 be declared void ab initio for the certification of the Finance Bill, 2021 as a Money Bill to be in violation of and ultra vires Article 110 of the Constitution.



Among other, it sought that the respondents - the Union of India and the LIC - not to take any steps on the basis of or in furtherance of the amended Sections 4, 5, 24 and 28 of the Life Insurance Corporation Act, 1956 including the ongoing initial public offering of the LIC. It also sought that both the Centre and the LIC to immediately issue all necessary communications to authorities including the SEBI, IRDAI

and the general public that the ongoing initial public offering of the LIC is rescinded in view of the orders of the apex court. Queried about the delay in filing the case as LIC's IPO process has ended and listing of the shares is to happen soon, Rajendra Dev told IANS: "Earlier some cases were filed but didn't succeed. It was only later that details about the valuation of LIC and the issue price were available."

MISCREANTS HOIST SAFFRON FLAG ON MOSQUE IN K'TAKA

Belagavi : Tense situation prevailed after some miscreants hoisted a saffron flag on a mosque in a village in Karnataka's Belagavi district on Wednesday.

According to police, the miscreants climbed to the mosque tower and hoisted the flag in the wee hours. The incident came to light in the morning, causing tension in the region.

The incident took place in the Sattigeri Maddi mosque in Mudalagi taluk of the district. The police rushed to the spot and controlled the situation. The police held a meeting of the leaders of both the Hindu and Muslim communities and removed the saffron flag.

Though the police controlled the situation, security has been beefed up in all sensitive areas of the district to avoid any untoward incident.

The incident caused panic and raised concerns all over the state as the state has been witnessing agitations by the Hindu organisations on the loud-speaker row. The government has announced guidelines and stated that they would be implemented. Hindu organisations have said that they would like to see the guidelines implemented as soon as possible.



Gujarat court imprisons BJP MLA, 25 others in gambling case

A court at Halol in Gujarat's Panchmahal district on Wednesday sentenced a sitting BJP MLA and 25 others to two years' imprisonment in a gambling case.

It also imposed a fine of Rs 3,000 on each convict. The court ordered to cancel the licence of the resort, where the accused were caught gambling.

While pronouncing the order, Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Prem Hansraj Singh held BJP MLA from Matar Assembly constituency, Kesarisinh Solanki, and 25 others guilty and awarded them two years' imprisonment.

It observed that the prosecution has proved the case beyond doubt based on documentary evidence, CCTV footage seized

from the resort, and statements of the witnesses. It has been proven that Solanki and 25 others were gambling for their financial benefits.

The police seized Rs 3.89 lakh in cash from the accused, 25 mobile phones, one laptop, plastic coins used as token currency, and eight four-wheelers. Even play cards were seized.

During the trial, 96 witnesses were cross-examined and 13 documentary evidences were produced before the court, including CCTV footage from the resort.

The Panchmahal police had received information that a large number of people were being facilitated for gambling at the Jimira resort near Shivrajpur in Halol. The police raided the resort on July 1, 2021 and found 26 persons, including six women, gambling.

Bulldozers again roll in Delhi, Left protests

The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) on Wednesday continued its drive to demolish illegal encroachments in several parts of the national capital, while left parties protested against the government accusing them of spreading a communal atmosphere.

The places where the demolition is being carried out are Tilak Nagar, Dwarka, Lodhi Road, Najafgarh, Aya Nagar, among several other areas. Meanwhile, demolition will not be carried out in New Seelampur as an adequate number of police force could not be provided.

However, the places where illegal encroachments are being removed, the police force along with para-military personnel were deployed in adequate num-



bers to handle any untoward situation. As per latest reports, JCB bulldozers are demolishing some illegally constructed structures across an Air Force land in the city's Arya Nagar area. Rajpal Singh, Chairman, Central Zone, said they had already identified illegal encroachments on Lodhi Road. "We do not want to harass anyone

but there are some places where even a van or bus cannot pass. So we will continue with the process of demolition until and unless all the encroachments are removed," he said. At several congested places, police personnel could also be seen at the buildings to monitor the situation.

NOW COMMON ENTRANCE TEST FOR GOVT JOBS IN RAJASTHAN

Jipur: The Rajasthan government has announced a common eligibility test for recruitment in various government jobs.

The state government will conduct the eligibility test on the lines of Staff Selection Commission (SSC). For the recruitment to the government posts such as Village Development Officer, Patwari (Village Accountant), Ministerial Staff, etc., now there will be one common eligibility test conducted instead of a separate examination.

The state Cabinet has also decided to scrap the process of interviews completely in some direct recruitment examinations except in Rajasthan Administrative Service (RAS) examination. The Rajasthan State and Subordinate Services (Direct Recruitment by Combined Competitive Examination) Rules, 1999, (RAS Recruitment) and other service rules will be modified to do away with the provision of interviews. The decision was taken in the cabinet meeting held late on Tuesday evening, which was chaired by Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and his Council of Ministers.

The Rajasthan government has decided to give land to companies for solar projects. A 2000 MW solar park will be built on 6,000 hectare of government land in Jaisalmer district and is being built by Adani Renewable Energy Park Rajasthan Limited, a joint venture company of Rajasthan Renewable Energy Corporation Limited and Adani Group.

At the same time, the state cabinet has also made big announcements for the Paralympic medal winners in the cabinet meeting. According to the state Cabinet, Paralympic medal winners, who are residents of Rajasthan, will also be allotted 25 bighas of land free of cost in the Indra Gandhi Canal Project area. This decision was announced in the state Budget.

Delhi Class 10 student raped, forced to undergo abortion

A 14-year-old girl was allegedly raped in the national capital following which she got pregnant and was forced to undergo illegal abortion by the accused, an official said on Wednesday.

The accused, who committed the heinous crime, has been arrested. He was identified as Dharamender alias Raj (23). Three others, identified as Babita Devi (a Quack working at a clinic) and the accused's two friends -- Dilip Kumar Singh and Manish -- have also been arrested.

Furnishing details, Deputy Commissioner of Police (outer district) Sameer Sharma said the victim girl, a Class 10 student, on April 22 alleged that in October, 2021 she went to a mobile repair shop where accused Dharamender secretly took

her mobile number from her phone and started chasing her. Thereafter, he befriended the victim and repeatedly made physical relations with her at his friend Manish's rented room in Nangloi and due to which she got pregnant.

"The accused told her not to disclose this in-front of anyone. The accused further hatched a conspiracy with his parents and a quack and some lab technicians," the DCP said.

On April 1, the parents and the brother of the accused took the victim woman to Aditi Clinic in Narela, where a female 'doctor' (a Quack) made a phone call to the mother of the victim and persuaded her that she is her class teacher and is talking the victim for a school tour.

Then the 'doctor' gave some abortion pills to the victim and on the next day she delivered a dead infant.

The dead infant was buried by the alleged persons.

Thereafter, she returned home but after a few days her health deteriorated due to excessive bleeding and then she was admitted to the SGM Hospital Mangolpuri for medical treatment. It is at this time, her statement was recorded and a case under sections 376 (punishment for rape), 313, 315, 318, 328, 201 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code and section 6 and 21 of the POCSO Act was registered at Police Station Nangloi.

The police after this constituted a team which raided the house of the accused Dharamender and arrested him. During sustained interrogation, the accused disclosed how he conspired with his parents and one of his friends namely, Dilip Kumar Singh decided to kill the baby in womb.

Newly-infiltrated terrorist killed in encounter at J&K's Bandipora

A terrorist was killed in an ongoing encounter between terrorists and security forces in a forested area in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipora on Wednesday and has been identified as newly-infiltrated operative, police said.

"Killed terrorist identified as Gulzar Ahmad Ganai, resident of Wussan Pattan, Baramulla. He infiltrated in 2018 and remained there for 3 years and 6 months before infiltrating back in the last week of April," police said.

"The killed terrorist was a part of newly infiltrated terrorist group. Search for other two terrorists is in progress," the police said in a tweet, quoting Inspector General of Police, Kashmir, Vijay Kumar.

Earlier, police said one ter-



rorist was killed and a AK rifle and three magazines were recovered. The firefight between in Salinder forest area took place after a joint team of security forces cordoned off the area and launched a search operation on the basis of specific information about presence of terrorists.

As the security forces zeroed in on the spot where terrorists were hiding, they came under a heavy volume of fire that triggered the encounter.

MAN BOOKED FOR TRYING TO PROVOKE CROWD IN JAHANGIRPURI

Delhi Police on Wednesday took preventive action against a 48-year-old man who was found provoking the crowd against one specific community in Jahangirpuri, which recently witnessed communal violence.

The accused has been identified as Shiv Kumar, a resident of Jahangirpuri in northwest Delhi.

Deputy Commissioner of Police, Usha Rangani, said a PCR call was received at 6.15 a.m. on Wednesday at the Mahendra Park police station, in which the caller, Shiv Kumar, reported shattering of window panes of vehicles by some Muslim boys.

Sensing the sensitivity of the situation, the police rushed to the spot, where they found a crowd gathered around two cars with their rear windscreens shattered.

"Shiv Kumar was found targeting one specific community without verification of facts, and trying to give a religious tone to the incident, provoking the crowd gathered there,"



Rangani said.

CCTV footage showed three minor boys (all non-Muslims) shattering the windscreens, and action under the relevant section of the IPC has been initiated against them.

"In view of the sensitive situation

owing to the recent incident in Jahangirpuri and the boisterous behaviour of the caller which could have affected peace and tranquility in the area, preventive action under Section 107/151 of CrPc has been initiated against Shiv Kumar," the officer

'CLAMOUR' FOR RAHUL GANDHI'S RETURN AS PRESIDENT LIKELY AT CHINTAN SHIVIR

The Congress's three-day 'Chintan Shivir' in Rajasthan's Udaipur from May 13 is meant to brainstorm on a roadmap for the revival of the party's fortunes, but could see a clamour for return of Rahul Gandhi as party chief grow and some sections are likely to raise the demand, sources said.

The demand was formally raised recently at a CWC meeting but it was said that organizational polls have already been announced.

The most vocal voices in the party for Rahul Gandhi's return are its two Chief Ministers Ashok Gehlot (Rajasthan) and Bhupesh Baghel (Chhattisgarh), apart from Randeep Surjewala, K.C. Venugopal and other Rahul loyalists.

In the Chintan Shivir, Rahul Gandhi will speak as a second last speaker just ahead of party chief Sonia Gandhi, and the party hopes to get a new path of revival from there to reverse its electoral losses.

Rahul Gandhi had quit the post after the party's second successive massive defeat in the 2019 elections and in his resignation, sought that someone from outside the Gandhi



family should be appointed as party chief but the CWC appointed Sonia Gandhi as interim President. However, soon a section of leaders, the G-23, wrote a letter for sweeping reforms in the party and election from the block to the CWC level.

However when Sonia Gandhi called some of the members of the dissident group for discussions, they said that there was no question on the leadership but fixing responsibility on those responsible for party's defeat in the recent spell of Assembly elections.

Party leader and former Union Minister Jairam Ramesh had on Monday asserted that the Chintan Shivir is not a destination of the Congress, but a milestone.

He said the Shivir is being held not to draft a manifesto, but to prepare an action plan to revive and strengthen the Congress so that it can deal with the present-day political and organisational challenges.

The heads of various departments of Congress, office bearers, former Union ministers and MPs would all participate in the Chintan Shivir. A total of 422 members will be present in the Shivir, of which 30-35 per cent will be youth and 21 per cent women.

CM CANCELS FOREIGN TOUR AFTER SC'S ORDER ON OBC RESERVATION

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Wednesday cancelled his foreign trip, scheduled from May 14, for inviting business houses to invest in the state, saying his priority is to present the state government's side in the Supreme Court and safeguard the interest of other backward classes (OBCs).

The decision came a day after the Supreme Court directed the State Election Commission (SEC) to conduct local body (gram, nagar and zila panchayat) elections without OBC reservation.

"I was scheduled to travel abroad from May 14 to attract investment in Madhya Pradesh, but at this time it is my priority to present my case again in the court and protect the interests of the backward classes. Therefore I am cancelling my proposed foreign trip. My government is fully committed to the socio-economic and political empowerment of other backward classes," Chouhan added.

Chouhan asserted that the Supreme Court's judgement would affect the OBC's reservation in local bodies and that's why the state government decided to file a review petition.

The chief minister's office (CMO) told IANS that Chouhan's foreign trip to the US, UK, Switzerland, Germany and Davos was scheduled from May 14 to 24. The proposed visit was part of the state government's plan to host a global investors summit in November this year. In its judgement pronounced on Tuesday, the court had strictly directed the SEC to issue notification regarding the same within a



period of two weeks. After the Supreme Court judgment, both the political parties - BJP and the Congress started levelling allegations at each other and maintained that the local body elections should not be held without OBC reservation.

Veteran Congress leader and former Chief Minister Kamal Nath blamed Shivraj Singh Chouhan for the present situation on this matter.

"OBC class would have got the benefit of their increased reservation, but the Shivraj government did not want it, so it did not make any serious efforts regarding this, but the Congress is still determined that the OBC class should get the benefit of the increased reservation in any case, and without OBC reservation, urban body elections should not

cent village. No suicide note was recovered from the spot, police said.

Police said preliminary investigation suggested that she had committed suicide by hanging from the ceiling fan in her room. However, the actual reason would be known after the post-mortem.

After the incident, police personnel have been deployed at the minister's residence and the investigation was underway, police said. Police told mediapersons that Savita had gone to her parental house in Hadlay village and returned a day prior to the incident.

"The body has been sent for post-mortem. We are also interrogating the family members of both the sides," said a senior police official in Shajaur district.

made of asphalt. Maintenance of the expansion joint will also be done. Apart from this, a new surface is proposed to be made by removing the paving blocks on the pavement. Work order has been issued for this work.

Other characters in the second line such as Citurano, Queen Kajal, Pithoro, Valan or Indiraja can be distinguished by their characteristic appearance or gestures such as smoking a hookah or holding a bird. SC's order to conduct local body polls without OBC reservation put BJP, Cong in dilemma

The Supreme Court (SC) has directed the Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission (MPSEC) to start the process for conducting the local body polls in the state. However, the hurdles for the three-layer panchayat elections in the state continue to persist as both the ruling (BJP) and the Opposition (Congress) have already expressed unanimously that "elections should not be held without Other Backward Classes (OBC) reservation".



cent to 27 per cent - the step which is seen as a move to lure the OBC voters.

Interestingly, as per the 2011 Census, OBCs constitute 50.09 per cent of the state's population, and both the political parties want to get support from the community in the next Assembly polls. The BJP, which seemed to be on the back foot on this issue, responded soon after the apex court gave directions to the MPSEC, saying that the government will file a review petition against the verdict. Responding to queries, Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said, "We are yet to study the judgement in detail but we will file a review petition hoping that the panchayat elections be held with OBC reservation."

Whereas, the state Congress unit has once again sharpened its attack on the Chief Minister and held him responsible for the present situation. The Congress accused the BJP of "not presenting detailed data regarding the OBC reservation before the court and hiding facts on the matter".

Congress MLA and former state cabinet minister Kamleshwar Patel, who is considered one of the key OBC leaders in the party, while speaking to IANS claimed that the BJP's "hidden agenda has brought this situation".

"The manner in which the BJP government presented the case before the court is a clear indication that they (BJP) have some agenda behind it. They (BJP) do not want to give benefit of reservation to OBC and that is why Shivraj government had passed a resolution to conduct local body polls without providing reservation to the community. The resolution was taken back because of relentless opposition from the Congress."

Patel further said that the Kamal Nath led Congress government had proposed to increase OBC reservation quota from 14 per cent to 27 per cent, but the Shivraj Singh Chouhan led BJP government "intentionally tampered with the set of constitutional rules for its political gain."

"This is not only about OBC reservation but about ST/SC also. Because of the BJP's wrong policies and tampering with constitutional rules, promotion of state employees falling under ST/SC categories and others are pending since long. Several employees have retired without getting benefit of their constitutional rights. BJP has destroyed the entire system just for its political gain and left the people of all communities to suffer," Patel added.

Replying to whether the Congress will agree with the SC's decision to conduct elections without OBC reservation, Patel said, "Congress party would welcome the apex court's direction and will contest elections. We will tell the people about the hidden face of the BJP on the reservation issue."

The SC on Tuesday directed the states to follow the triple test it laid down in 2021 for reservation to OBC in local body elections. The triple test involves the appointment of panels, gathering empirical data quantifying the extent and backwardness local body-wise, and ensuring the reservation does not exceed the 50 per cent ceiling.

UP Assembly will have more members

The number of seats for members of the Uttar Pradesh state Assembly has been increased to 415 for the first Budget Session that will begin on May 23. The strength of the house is 403 and one seat is reserved for the advocate general. The additional seats are for ministers who are members of the Vidhan Parishad but participate in the Assembly proceedings. According to Speaker Satish Mahana, the state Assembly had only 379 seats for 425 members in undivided Uttar Pradesh. The state Assembly's strength was brought down to 404 (including a nominated member) following the division of Uttar Pradesh for the creation of Uttarakhand in the year 2000. The Uttar Pradesh Assembly has no nominated member now and the strength is now 403. In another new step, the members will now find tablet devices fixed on their respective desks when the 18th Uttar Pradesh Vidhan Sabha (state Assembly) meets for the first time for the forthcoming Budget Session. This is a major initiative to implement e-Vidhan and make the functioning of the legislature in the state paperless. Devices on the seats of the chief minister, the leader of opposition, minister for parliamentary affairs and the speaker will be bigger. The names of the members speaking in the House will be displayed. As implementation of e-Vidhan will pave the way for paperless proceedings in the House, Governor Anandiben Patel is also likely to read out her address using a device. The Central government is implementing e-Vidhan aimed at connecting all state Assemblies and bringing them on a common digital platform. A data depository is being set up to make the state legislatures paperless. The state Assembly has since then stopped using extension rod microphones. Instead, microphones have been fixed to the desks.

WHY BELGIUM'S ELECTIONS WILL BE A TEST FOR EUROPEAN VALUES

The upcoming elections in Belgium have given rise to a political party of Muslims who have acquired citizenship over the years and have grown in numbers fast enough to be able to launch a political party to de-Europeanise Europe culturally.

European nations share an intrinsic but unexpressed cultural identity based on Christianity. This identity made the Renaissance possible, with freedom of thought leading to an unimagined creativity, which gave birth to the 'modern' world with every aspect of life progressing towards better standards of living.

The 'absolutist paradigm' of intolerance and violence of unicentric dogmas, which have arisen in theistic tribal formations, will ravage all advances in pure sciences and applied technology, if Europe does not act fast.

A country is not just a 'polity' but also an 'identity' based on a long span of 'time' and even more on 'ethnicity' with its subtle nuances and definitive creativity. Belgium is European, it should remain so, and no outsiders have the right to alter it.

Several European countries embraced Muslim refugees with open arms, welcomed them in their country, gave them shelter, food and jobs to settle down (no OIC countries, by the way, gave them these facilities). But after these people settle down in Belgium and other European countries, or in any country for that matter, they start flaunting their religion/faith and want the Sharia Law to be introduced, undermining the law of the land and the dominant religion of the host country. It is a ploy of the radicals to spread Islam at any cost. Several countries have efficiently

outlawed the deculturisation of the polity. In Pakistan's constitution, no non-Muslim can become the President (Article 41) or the Prime Minister (Article 91). Several states in India have criminalised marriages between Hindus and Muslims by legislation. The constitution of Italy provides that no naturalised citizen can be the Prime Minister or President of the country.

The question of power being vested in the son of the soil ('bhumi-putra') goes back to the third century BCE. Emperor Ashoka exiled his minister Yashas to Khotan, as he had blinded his dear son Kunala. Yashas clashed with the Chinese who were controlling Khotan, an area located on the Silk Road branch that ran along the southern edge of the Taklamakan Desert.

To end the stalemate, Yashas suggested that the King of Khotan should be a son of the soil. The Chinese agreed to this principle and a Khotanese 'son of the soil' founded a dynasty that ruled until 1001 CE.

Korea and Japan did not accept Chinese matrimony. King Kim Suro, who founded the State of Korea, got a princess from far-off Ayodhya as his queen. She landed in Korea in 48 CE. The dynasty lasted till 532 CE and ensured Korea's independent identity.

Members of the Kim families are all descendants of the princess of Ayodhya. They travel to Ayodhya every year to pay their respects to her. Japan got Buddhism from Korea and it, in turn, defined its national persona. Prince Shotoku, inspired by the Sutra of the Golden Light, named his country Nippon, or Land of the Rising Sun. The Golden Light represents the Rising Sun.

Prince Shotoku also drew up a 'Seventeen Article Constitution' with Buddhism as one of its articles



for the well-being of the people. It was consecrated with a Sanskrit hymn on the Goddess of Supreme Victory, Ushnisavijaya, a well-known Buddhist divinity in Nepal, Tibet and Mongolia. It is the epitome of the Buddha's longevity. And in spite of the panoramic Sinocentric layering of their cultures, Korea and Japan have sustained their distinctive identities.

The constitution of Malaysia clearly defines that all industries are to be headed by a 'Bumiputra', a natural citizen and not a naturalised citizen. The all-pervasive Chinese industries have to be and are presided over by Bumiputras. In Indonesia, no Chinese can have a controlling political position, though they have extensive economic interests.

In the UAE and the Arab world, too, it is only the sons of the soil,

who head and lead all companies though they employ several professionals from outside. But no outsider can ever head an organisation, no matter how efficient or competent he or she may be.

Belgium has to legislate that only a son (or daughter) of the soil can be the President or Prime Minister. It must bar any political party formed by naturalised citizens, such as the Muslim refugees who have been granted citizenship. It has to ensure that the Belgian identity based on Christian values, their ethnic perceptions chiselled into fine shape across centuries, and the value they give to free thought are all nurtured to enable 'open' social and material advances.

Belgium is not an isolated case. Europe stands at a critical

uncture. It has to preserve its cultural and civilizational, social and political, economic and scientific selfhood. It has to stop the creeping 'religious aggression' by enacting appropriate legislation.

Europe distinguished an alien as a 'denizen', as opposed to a citizen. An alien admitted to residence in a country, and favoured with all or a part of the rights of citizenship, was called a denizen. An alien thus admitted was incapable of holding any public office.

JAPAN ENACTS INTO LAW BILL AIMED AT BOLSTERING ECONOMIC SECURITY

Tokyo | Agencies

Japan's upper house of Parliament on Wednesday enacted into law a bill purported to help bolster the country's economic security.

The new bill comprises four pillars that span fortifying supply chains so that semiconductors, along with other vital products, can be regularly imported amid a global chip crunch, reports Xinhua news agency.

In addition, the bill references the development of artificial intelligence in twine with public entities as well as forwarding other next-generation technologies, they added.

Patents related to sensitive technologies will be made non-public under the new law, sources close to the mat-



ter said. In addition, equipment used in sensitive areas such as telecommunication and transportation will be screened by the government in a bid to combat cyber and other security threats, and the measures will be launched next spring.

Some goods such as chips, pharmaceutical products and rare minerals will be catego-

rized as "critical items" and will be closely monitored.

Suppliers who can offer Japan a stable supply of said goods will be fiscally supported, local accounts said.

Those who leak protected patents will be subjected to a prison sentence of up to two years or face a maximum fine of 1 million yen (\$7,670), they said.

POLLS LIKELY IN PAKISTAN BEFORE APPOINTMENT OF NEW ARMY CHIEF

London | Agencies

The Defence Minister of Pakistan, Khawaja Asif, on Wednesday revealed the possibility of general elections in November, prior to the appointment of the new army chief, Geo News reported.

In an interview with BBC, Asif said that there is a possibility that the caretaker government will leave before November and a new government will come into power.

Regarding the extension of Chief of Army Staff General Qamar Javed Bajwa's tenure, he said the army chief had announced that he wasn't seeking an extension.

"I welcome his decision as it has closed the door on speculations," he added.

Meanwhile, Express Tribune reported that Nawaz Sharif has summoned an "emergency meeting" of the party leaders in London to discuss matters related to the economy and the prevailing political situation in Pakistan.

According to sources, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif along with his delegation reached London on Wednesday morning for the meeting in which some "big decisions" are likely to be made.



Mahinda Rajapaksa to remain in naval base until normalcy returns

Former Sri Lankan Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa and his family will remain at the Trincomalee naval base until normalcy returns to the island nation following widespread violence that caused him to flee Colombo, Defence Secretary Kamal Gunaratne announced on Wednesday. Addressing the media, Gunaratne said that Rajapaksa will be moved to a location he wishes, once the situation in the country returns to normalcy, reports Xinhua news agency.

The Defence Secretary said that the military will provide security to Rajapaksa as long as it takes because as a former Prime Minister he is entitled to security for life.

Rajapaksa, his wife Shiranthi, and their youngest son Rohitha and his family, left the Prime Minister's official residence, Temple Trees, early Tuesday morning on board an Air Force helicopter.

Violence erupted in the country after he resigned on Monday.

A number of violent incidents have taken place in the country after pro-government groups clashed with anti-government pro-

testers on Monday, leaving eight people, including an MP, dead and over 200 others injured.

A nationwide curfew has been extended until Thursday morning.

The island nation, hit by the most severe economic crisis since gaining independence in 1948, is currently without a government.

With a severe financial crisis due to dollar crunch and inflation, protests that started on March 31 have been continuing throughout the country demanding the Rajapaksa to resign.

In the wake of the protests, the cabinet resigned but Mahinda Rajapaksa formed a new cabinet under his leadership.

With the lack of fuel and gas and hours-long power cuts, people took to the streets and demanded that the immediate resignation of the government.

Meanwhile, President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has urged the opposition to form an all-party government, but the latter has refused to do so until he steps down.

The state-owned Ceylon Petroleum Corporation on Wednesday announced that fuel distribution has been temporarily suspended due to the current security situation.

AL-JAZEERA JOURNALIST KILLED IN WEST BANK

Ramallah: Shireen Abu Akleh, a journalist with the Qatar-based Al Jazeera broadcaster, was killed in the West Bank on Wednesday amid an Israeli raid.

Taking to Twitter, the broadcaster said: "Israeli forces have shot and killed veteran Al Jazeera reporter Shireen Abu Akleh in the occupied West Bank."

The Palestinian Health Ministry said in a statement that the reporter was shot while covering the Israeli military raid and died shortly after, reports Xinhua news agency.

The Ministry also claimed that another Palestinian reporter was shot.

In a statement, the Israeli Army said it has launched an investigation into the incident and was looking into the possibility that the journalists were hit by "armed Palestinians."

The raid triggered clashes with armed residents, and "massive fire was shot toward Israeli forces by tens of armed Palestinian gunmen", said the statement, adding that the soldiers "responded with fire toward the sources of the fire and explosive devices. Hits were identified".

Meanwhile, Israeli Foreign Minister Yair Lapid tweeted that the Jewish state offered to carry out with the Palestinians "a joint pathological investigation into the sad death" of the journalist.

"Journalists must be protected in conflict zones and we all have a responsibility to get to the truth," Lapid said.

EX-BRAZILIAN PRESIDENT LULA LEADS ELECTION POLLS

Former Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva has taken the lead in several polls ahead of the general elections in October.

Lula garnered 40.6 per cent of voters' support, followed by current President Jair Bolsonaro with 32 per cent, Xinhua news agency.

The result, which was made by the MDA Institute and released by the National Transport Confederation (CNT), showed that the gap between the two top candidates was narrowing.

In a prior poll in February, Lula, the candidate of the Workers' Party (PT), has 42.2 per cent of the support, compared with 28 per cent for Bolsonaro of the Liberal Party (PL).

Trailing far behind in the

third place was Ciro Gomes of the Democratic Labor Party (PDT), with 7.1 per cent of voters' support, followed by Joao Doria of the Brazilian Social Democracy Party (PSDB), with 3.1 per cent.

On May 7, Lula announced his candidacy and unveiled the seven-party alliance, Let's Go Together for Brazil Movement, alongside his proposed Vice President, former Sao Paulo Governor Geraldo Alckmin.

The 76-year-old has run for president several times before: he was defeated three times before triumphs in 2002 and 2006.

In 2018, he ran for a sixth time but was disqualified a month before the election after conviction of corruption, a charge ultimately overturned by the Federal Supreme Court in 2021.

Lebanese President vows to hold transparent, free polls

Lebanese President Michel Aoun vowed to hold that the May 15 parliamentary polls will be conducted in a transparent and free manner.

Aoun made remarks during his meeting with a delegation from the International Organization of La Francophonie (OIF) at the Baabda Palace, reports Xinhua news agency.

"All measures have been taken to conduct the electoral process in an atmosphere of transparency, freedom and democratic competition," Aoun was quoted as saying.

Lebanon is a member of the OIF, a Paris-based organization established to facilitate cooperation among its members, most of which were French-speaking



countries or regions. Aoun said that the OIF delegation's visit is a proof of the organisation's firm belief in Lebanon's respect for democracy. Alda Greoli, head of the OIF delegation, thanked Aoun for the country's cooperation in facilitating the delegation's mission, which will remain in

Lebanon for 10 days to monitor the elections and write a report on the event.

Ahead of the May 15 polls, the first round of voting for the Lebanese expats took place on May 6 in nine Arab countries and Iran, and the second phase began on May 8 in 49 countries across Asia, Africa and Europe.

Parliamentary elections are held in Lebanon every four years.

A total of 718 candidates, including 118 females, are in the fray for the polls to the 128-seat Parliament.

Lebanon's sectarian power-sharing system allocates seats for its mosaic of religious sects in its Parliament, including Sunni and Shia Muslims, various Christian denominations, and the Druze.

The president must always be a Maronite Christian, the Prime Minister a Sunni and the Speaker of Parliament a Shia.

The elections come amid an unprecedented economic crisis that emerged about three years ago, leading to the currency to lose more than 90 per cent of its value since 2019, while also plunging over 70 per cent of the population into poverty.



Sharing what appealed the most to him about this character, he said, "The quality of this character that really appealed to me was the depth of his empathy which requires a great deal of humility. He's not afraid to go wrong. In fact, the way he runs the bridge is very fascinating. Despite his powers, he is never afraid to experiment and that really intrigues me and inspires me in a way."

DELHI REGISTERS EIGHT-WICKET WIN OVER RAJASTHAN

Mitchell Marsh and David Warner put up a stand of 144 runs for the second wicket to power Delhi Capitals to a much-needed eight-wicket win over Rajasthan Royals at the DY Patil Stadium on Wednesday.

After Marsh along with Chetan Sakariya and Anrich Nortje took two wickets each in restricting Rajasthan to 160/6, he came out to lead the chase with a 62-ball 89 while Warner hanged around to play the anchor, remaining unbeaten on 52 off 41 balls.

Rajasthan drew first blood when KS Bharat departed for duck on the second ball, going for the pull but edged behind to keeper off Trent Boult. Prasadh Krishna backed it up with a maiden over while finding some swing. Warner and Marsh were initially cautious but started to open up when the latter hit Ravichandran Ashwin for a six over long-off. The duo took a four each off Boult before Marsh brought out an excellent pick-up shot off Krishna to clear backward square leg fence. Post power-play, he welcomed Kuldeep Sen with sixes over corner and down the ground.



Warner had three slices of luck in ninth over off Yuzvendra Chahal - a pulled six just cleared deep square leg, a miscued loft fell short of sliding long-off at 19 and on last ball, ball brushed past leg-break with bails lighting up but weren't separated.

After flicking Sen through square leg, Marsh reached his

fifty in 38 balls with a loft down the ground off Chahal. He continued to make merry against pacers, slamming for back-to-back fours through backward point and backward square leg to keep Delhi in driver's seat.

Warner milked Sen through extra cover; then he skipped down the pitch but got down

late to sweep Chahal through backward square leg. The duo went on to feast on short balls from Ashwin, with Warner pulling over long-on and Marsh playing the same shot over square leg to take 15 runs off the off-spinner's final over.

After Ashwin, Boult came under thrashing from Marsh and Warner, who collected two fours and a six via the pull, with the former bludgeoning one over deep mid-wicket for a 102m six. In an attempt to get his eighth six, Marsh top-edged a slog-sweep to keeper off Chahal, falling 11 short of what would have been his first hundred in IPL. Rishabh Pant carted Chahal for two sixes over long-off and deep extra cover while Warner finished off the chase with a pull through deep mid-wicket, taking Delhi to victory with 11 balls to spare.

WOMEN'S WORLD BOXING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Dominant Parveen advances to second round

India's Parveen pulled off a powerful performance to enter the second round at the 12th edition of the IBA Women's World Boxing Championships after thrashing Mariia Bova by unanimous decision in Istanbul on Wednesday.

The boxer from Rohtak completely dominated the 63kg opening round bout as she attacked from the very beginning. Not just she timed her punches to perfection but also impressed in defence.

Showcasing sharp reflexes, Parveen landed some clear punches and her relentless attack unsettled her Ukrainian opponent quite a few times as she completed a comfortable win. After an impressive start to her campaign, Parveen will be up against the former Youth Olympics champion Jajaira Gonzalez of USA in the pre-quarter finals on Sunday. Later tonight, three other Indian pugilists, including Nikhat Zareen, are also set to begin their challenge at the prestigious tournament, which has been witnessing high voltage competition in presence of record 310 boxers from 73 countries across the world.

This year's event, which marks the 20th anniversary of the IBA Women's World Championships,



will be played till May 20.

The 25-year-old boxer from Telangana, Nikhat will square off against Mexico's Herrera Alvarez in the 52kg opening round match. While Manisha (57kg), who received a bye in the opening round, and Saweety (75kg) will fight Nepal's Kala Thapa and England's Kerry Davis respectively.

2021 Asian Championships bronze medalist Jaismine, Anamika and Shiksha will kickstart their campaigns in the round-of-32

on Thursday. Jaismine will face challenge from the two-time Youth Asian Champion Pornnip Buapa of Thailand in the 60kg category while Anamika (50kg) will fight against Romania's Eugenia Anghel. Shiksha, who was handed a bye in the opening round, will play Argentina's Herrera Milagros Rosario in the 54kg match.

In the last edition of the tournament, held in Russia in 2019, Indian boxers secured one silver and three bronze medals.

Aubameyang at the double for Barca as Betis and Granada both win in Spain

FC Barcelona strengthened their grip on second place in La Liga with a comfortable 3-1 win at home to Celta Vigo.

Memphis Depay opened the scoring in the 30th minute after great work from Ousmane Dembele and then turned provider for Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang to double the lead four minutes before halftime on Tuesday night.

Aubameyang doubled his tally of the night four minutes after the break with another assist from Dembele.

Iago Aspas pulled a goal back for Celta in the 50th minute, but Celta's hopes of a fight-back suffered a setback when Jeison Murillo was sent off for a foul on Depay in the 58th minute. There was a worrying moment for Barca when Ronald Araujo had to be taken off the pitch in an ambulance after a clash of heads with Gavi just two minutes later, although reports said that he was conscious on his arrival at the hospital. Betis kept their slim hopes of finishing fourth alive (at least until Atletico Madrid's game on Wednesday) with a 3-0 win away to Valencia.

The game was a repeat of the final of the Copa del Rey, which Betis won on penalties just over a fortnight ago, but this wasn't anywhere near as close as Betis romped to a 3-0 win thanks to second-half goals from Willian



Jose, Sergio Canales and Borja Iglesias. It was Valencia's sixth defeat in their Mestalla Stadium this season as the team drifts rudderless towards the end of the campaign. Alex Collado took advantage of a bad mistake from Athletic Club Bilbao midfielder, Dani Garcia, to score the only goal of the game as Granada beat their Basque rivals 1-0 in the Estadio de Los Carmenes stadium. The win means Granada have taken eight points from 12 since Aitor Karanka took over as coach and leaves them close to assuring top-flight survival for another year while virtually ending Athletic's hopes of playing in Europe next season.

Thomas and Uber Cup

INDIAN MEN'S AND WOMEN'S TEAMS LOSE FINAL GROUP TIE

The Indian women's and men's badminton teams lost their final Thomas and Uber Cup 2022 group ties against South Korea and Chinese Taipei, respectively at the Impact Arena, here on Wednesday.

Both teams had already ensured their berths in the quarterfinals after winning their first two group ties but needed to win on Wednesday to top their respective groups. However, the Indian women's team lost 0-5 to South Korea while the men went down 2-3 against Chinese Taipei.

Having finished second in the Uber Cup Group D, the PV Sindhu-led women's team will go up against a strong Thailand team, which topped Group C in the top eight. On the other hand, the men's team are placed second in Thomas Cup Group C and their opponents in quarters will be decided later.

In the Uber Cup tie, double Olympic medalist PV Sindhu, ranked 7th in the

badminton world rankings, started off the proceedings against world No. 4 An Seyoung in the first singles rubber.

The narrative repeated once again in game 2 as the Indian squandered an early lead. Eventually, Seyoung beat Sindhu 21-15, 21-14 in 42 minutes. From there on, the Indian challenge collapsed as Shruti Mishra and Simran Singh lost 13-21, 12-21 to worlds silver medalists Lee Sohee and Shin Seungchan in the first doubles match before Aakarshi Kashyap went down 10-21, 10-21 against world No 19 Kim Ga Eun. Meanwhile, in the Thomas Cup Group C tie, the Indian men's team showed a little more resistance against Chinese Taipei but submitted 2-3 eventually. Lakshya Sen, India's highest-ranked singles player at world No 9, went down fighting against world No 4 and Asian Games silver medalist Chou Tien Chen. India's top doubles draw Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy then lost 11-21, 19-21 to reigning Olympics doubles champions and Wang Chi-lin.



Italian Open

Rafael Nadal beats John Isner to reach third round

Rafael Nadal maintained his perfect record of never losing back-to-back matches on clay, defeating the big-serving John Isner 6-3, 6-1 at the Italian Open here on Wednesday.

The Spaniard, beaten by Carlos Alcaraz in last week's Madrid Open quarterfinals, returned to his favourite surface with straight sets win over American Isner. Nadal has been untouchable at the Foro Italico for much of his career and he immediately looked settled in his return games against Isner, countering the American's huge serve with his trademark spinning groundstrokes.

Although the unseeded Isner competed well, he



struggled to recover any momentum after letting slip two break points at 3-3 in the opening set as Nadal dominated the second to move to a 69-7 match record in the Italian capital.

The win continued Nadal's comeback to competitive action after he reached the quarterfinals of the Madrid Open last

week following a six-week layoff due to a rib injury.

Having lost to eventual champion Carlos Alcaraz in Spain, the win over Isner ensured Nadal has still never lost consecutive matches on clay, with Wednesday's victory taking him to 44-0 in matches following a defeat on the surface.

ZVEREV ADVANCES TO THIRD ROUND AFTER BEATING BAEZ

Rome: World No 3 Alexander Zverev advanced to the third round of the Italian Open after beating in-form Sebastian Baez, here on Wednesday. The German struggled to find the form that carried him to a 10th Masters 1000 championship match appearance at the Madrid Open last week, but he found a sufficient level to outlast Estoril champion Baez and clinch a 7-6(6), 6-3 in an intriguing second-round encounter at the Foro Italico.

Despite a disappointing loss to Carlos Alcaraz in the Madrid final, the German looked back to his best at times in the Spanish capital after an inconsistent start to 2022 that has left the World No 3 still hunting a first title of the year. He will hope to use the victory over Baez as a foundation for another deep run in Rome, where he claimed his maiden Masters 1000 title as a 20-year-old in 2017. Baez came out with all the confidence of a man on a six-match winning streak. The Argentine won his first 21 points on serve as Zverev struggled to fire up his return game.

INDIA FINISH SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN WITH 14 MEDALS
