15 KILLED IN AMARNATH CLOUDBURST TRAGEDY, SEVERAL DEVOTEES MISSING

t least 15 yatris were killed, five others injured and around three dozen missing after a cloudburst near the Amarnath cave shrine on Friday evening caused flash floods, officials said.

J&K DGP Dilbag Singh said 15 pilgrims were killed in the cloudburst that hit the area around 5.30 p.m.

At least three langars (community kitchens) and many Yatri tents were washed away in flash floods caused



by the cloudburst. Aources said that around three dozen people are missing in this tragedy and efforts are on to locate them. Rescue teams were immediately rushed to the spot, some using helicopter services. The rescue operation is still going on and the authorities are trying to ascertain the exact casualties or damage caused by the calamity. However, as darkness has engulfed the area, rescue operation are being impeded.

Inspector General of Police, Kashmir, Vijay Kumar had earlier told reporters that rescue operations by various agencies is underway, the situation is under control and the injured are being airlifted for treatment.Officials said that following the cloudburst, water surged above/the sides of the cave after heavy rains at the upper reaches. Earlier on Friday, the strategic Jammu-Srinagar national highway was blocked by landslides and mud slush triggered by rain at many places, affecting passage of pilgrims to the two base camps in the Kashmir Valley. HEAVY RAINS CLAIM 12 LIVES IN K'TAKA

Bengaluru: Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai on Friday chaired a meeting to discuss the flood situation in various parts of the state and gave instructions for rescue and relief operations. He was apprised that 12 people have been killed so far and 13 districts, 17 taluks, and 37 villages have been affected by floods. As many as 495 persons are affected and authorities have rescued 90 persons and opened 4 care centres. Deaths of livestock are numbered at 65.

HEAVY RAINFALL LASHES AHMEDABAD

Ahmedabad: Heavy rainfall lashed Ahmedabad on Friday with the city receiving four inches of rain in a span of three hours, the Met Office said. The Met Department has forecast heavy to very heavy rains in many places of the state for the next five days. According to the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation, from 6 a.m. till 4 p.m., some areas of the city such as Usmanpura. Vadaj, Ashram, and Naranpura received 9 inch rainfall, whereas in eastern Ahmedabad, Rakhial and Gomtipur received 6 inch rainfall while Odhay, Viratnagar and Ramol got five and a half inch rains.

Ex-Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe assassinated

ormer Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe passed away on Friday, hours after being shot while addressing an election rally in the city of Nara, according to state

A doctor attending on Abe in Nara Medical University Hospital said that the leader died at 08:03 GMT, BBC reported.

"During four and a half hour treatment, medics tried to stop the bleeding and carried out a blood transfusion, using more than 100 units of blood," the doctor said.

Abe sustained two wounds, believed to be bullet injuries, but medics could not find bullets during surgery, the doctor added.

Abe, 67, immediately collapsed after being shot and was seen bleeding before he was

taken to hospital. According to state broadcaster NHK, the attack took place at around 11.30 a.m. (local time) near the Yamatosaidaiji Station in Nara

city while Abe was making a speech during a Liberal Democratic Party candidate's election campaign. The suspect, identified as 41-yearold Yamagami Tetsuya, a resident of Nara city, has been arrested. According to the police, the accused told

investigators that he was dissatisfied with the former Prime Minister and intended to kill



him. Investigative sources told NHK a gun seized at the scene appeared to be handmade. Japan is slated to hold parliamentary election this Sunday.

Abe's visit was only confirmed late last night, so how the suspect managed to find out about this and carry out the attack remains an open question, said the BBC.

Abe became Japan's longest-serving Prime Minister after serving from 2006 to 2007 and again from 2012 to 2020.

He stepped down in 2020 citing health reasons. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced a day-long national mourning for Shinzo Abe.

Rishi Sunak bids to be UK's Prime Minister

He tweeted: "I'm standing to be the next leader of the Conservative Party and your prime minister." He added: "Let's restore trust, rebuild the economy and reunite the country." He also launched a website ready4rishi.com



Sunak shot from relative obscurity to fame when the just-ousted Prime Minister Boris Johnson fast-tracked him to the powerful post of Chancellor in 2020. He had been a Member of

Parliament for less than five years. He became quite popular within months by providing financial support during the Covid pandemic, including furloughs to employees and soft loans to employers.

It will not be surprising if his opponents in the upcoming competition cite his wife's matter and the Green Card issue against him.

The son of a medical practitioner is, however, still one of the favourites in the contest, with probably Ben Wallace, the Defence Secretary, the current favourite.

On June 7, communications to all states from AWBI mentioned that a large number of animals are likely to be slaughtered during the Eid.

50K WILD SPECIES MEET NEEDS OF BILLIONS WORLDWIDE: REPORT

A new report by the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) on Friday offered insights, analysis and tools to establish more sustainable use of wild species of plants, animals, fungi and algae around the world. Sustainable use is when biodiversity and ecosystem functioning are maintained while contributing to human wellbeing.

With about 50,000 wild species used through different practices, including more than 10,000 wild species harvested directly for human food, rural people in developing countries are most at risk from unsustainable use, with lack of complementary alternatives often forcing them to further exploit wild species already at risk."

illions of people, in developed and developing nations, benefit daily from the use of wild species for food, energy, materials, medicine, recreation, inspiration and many other vital contributions to human well-being.

The accelerating global biodiversity crisis, with a million species of plants and animals facing extinction, threatens these contributions to people.

The IPBES Assessment Report on the Sustainable Use of Wild Species is the result of four years of work by 85 leading experts from the natural and social sciences, and holders of indigenous and local knowledge, as well as 200 contributing authors, drawing on more than 6,200 sources.

The summary of the report was approved this week by representatives of the 139 member states of IPBES in Bonn in Germany.



The use of wild species is an important source of income for millions of people worldwide. Wild tree species account for two thirds of global industrial roundwood; trade in wild

plants, algae and fungi is a billion-dollar indus-

try; and even non-extractive uses of wild species are big business.

Tourism, based on observing wild species, is one of the main reasons that, prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, protected areas globally received eight billion visitors and generated \$600 billion every year.

The report identifies five broad categories of 'practices' in the use of wild species: fishing; gathering; logging; terrestrial animal harvesting (including hunting); and non-extractive practices, such as observing.

For each practice, it then examines specific auses' such as for food and feed; materials; medicine, energy; recreation; ceremony; learning and decoration --providing a detailed analysis of the trends in each, over the past 20 years.

In most cases, use of wild species has increased, but sustainability of use has varied, such as in gathering for medicine and logging for materials and energy

I-T FINDS PHARMACEUTICAL MANUFACTURERS INVOLVED IN HAWALA TRANSACTIONS

The Income Tax Department on Friday confirmed that it carried out search and seizure operations on June 29 on a group engaged in the business of manufacturing and distribution of pharmaceutical medicines and real estate development.

The raids were conducted at 25 premises in Delhi-NCR and Haryana.

The I-T officials said that a large number of incriminating documents in the form of loose sheets and digital data were seized which revealed that the group was involved in huge unaccounted sales of pharmaceutical medicines in cash.

Large amounts of purchases, payments of wages and other expenses made in cash were also found. "This modus-operandi of unaccounted cash sales of pharmaceutical medicines, including cash receipts through hawala for sale of medicines to Afghanistan, has been admitted by a key person involved in such transactions. The preliminary analysis of the seized data indicates that such hawala cash receipts amount to Rs 25 crore. In the case of one pharmaceutical concern dealing in Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (API), surplus stock valued at Rs 94 crore has been found," said the I-T official.

The official said that the cash generated through unaccounted cash sales was invest-



ed in the purchase of immovable properties, and in expansion of manufacturing facilities of pharmaceutical medicines. The real estate entities of the group were found to be engaged in out-of-books sale and purchase

of properties in cash.

The group has also been booking bogus
Long Term, Short Term Capital Losses in the
securities market to offset the capital gains
earned on such property transactions.

"The amount of such bogus losses is estimated to be around Rs 20 crore. The search action has revealed that the group has also floated benami entities to purchase immovable properties in the state of Himachal Pradesh," the official said.

So far, unaccounted cash of Rs 4.2 crore and jewellery, bullion worth Rs 4 crore have been seized. Further investigations in the matter is on.

CBI recovers paintings, sculptures worth Rs 40 cr in DHFL bank fraud case

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Friday conducted searches in connection with the Rs 36,615 crore loan fraud case involving DHFL and its top officials, which led to the recovery of a large number of valuable paintings and sculptures estimated to be worth around Rs 40 crore.

"The premises of Rebecca Dewan and Ajay Ramesh Nawandar in Mumbai and Mahabaleshwar, respectively, were raided by our team," said a CBI official.

A CBI source said that a person named Vipin Kumar Shukla, DGM and head of Union Bank of India's Nariman Point branch, had lodged an FIR in this connection.

It was alleged that Dewan Housing Finance Corporation Ltd (DHFL), its former CMD Kapil Wadhawan, ex-Director Dheeraj Wadhawan, and other accused persons entered into a criminal conspiracy to cheat a consortium of 17 banks led by the Union Bank of India.



"The Wadhawans and others induced the consortium banks to sanction huge loans aggregating to Rs 42,871.42 crore and siphoned off and misappropriated a significant portion of the said funds by falsifying

the books of the DHFL and dishonestly defaulted on repayment of the legitimate dues of the said consortium banks. They caused a wrongful loss of Rs 34,615.00 crore to the consortium lenders," said the CBI.

The FIR was lodged against DHFL, the Wadhwan brothers, present Director Sudhkar Shetty, Amaryllis Realtors LLP (ARLLP), Gulmarg Realtors LLP (GRLLP), Skylark Buildcon Pvt Ltd, Darshan Developers Pvt Ltd, Sigtia Constructions Pvt Ltd, Creator Builders Pvt Ltd, Township Developers Pvt Ltd, Shishir Reality Pvt Ltd, Sunblink Real Estate and other unknown persons, including public servants.

The official said that it was found that the promoters had allegedly diverted the funds and made investments in various entities.

It was also alleged that the promoters had acquired expensive paintings and sculptures worth about Rs 55 crore using the diverted funds.

Earlier on June 22, searches were conducted at 12 locations in Mumbai at the premises of the accused persons which led to the recovery of incriminating documents

Mahua dares BJP to prove wine, meat are not offered to worship Maa Kali

Reacting to the controversies triggered by her recent comments on worshipping Goddess Kali, Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra said on Friday that the BJP leaders filing FIRs against her for her comments should file affidavits and claim that alcohol and meat are not offered to Goddess Kali during her worship.

She also drew references to three popular temples in India -- Maa Tara temple at Tarapith in West Bengal, Shaktipeeth Temple at Ujjain in Madhya Pradesh and Kamkhya Temple in Guwahati.According to Moitra, in BJP-ruled Madhya Pradesh and Assam, the Chief Ministers should inform through affidavits that 'karanbari' (alcohol) and meat are not offered there for worship.



Reacting to a section of the media, she also said that since she herself is a devotee of Goddess Kali, she is aware of the forms of worship and cannot even think of making any statement that will hurt the sentiments of the Kali worshippers. Stating that some of her well-wishers are also questioning as to why she drew this reference, Moitra said if the educated class avoids debates, the BJP

will force its own idea of Hinduism on people.

"These days people are scared to join debates on religion and the BJP is taking advantage of that. Hinduism is my religion as well, and I know what I have said is not incorrect and so I will not deviate from my stand," Moira said.Commenting on her party Trinamool Congress not endorsing her views in this matter, she said that Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee is her supreme leader and the matter will surely be discussed in the proper forum within the party.The state BJP leadership, however, has rubbished her comments and claimed that as an elected MP, Moitra is not supposed to give lectures on styles and rituals of worship. They also demanded an unconditional apology

TRANSFER AND POSTING OF 149 BIHAR OFFICERS CANCELLED

Patna: Bihar Governor Phagu Chauhan on Friday cancelled the transfer and posting of 149 officers of the Land Reforms and Revenue Departments, on the recommendation of the Chef Minister. Chief Minister Nitish Kumar found something fishy in the transfer and posting of 149 circle officers, settlement officers, and consolidation officers of these two departments, and recommended the cancellation.

The Land Reforms and Revenue Departments are under the charge of Ram Surat Rai, of the BJP, and he had issued four notifications for the transfer and postings of 149 officers on June 30. Following the Governor's direction, his Joint Secretary Kanchan Kapoor issued the fresh notification about the cancellation of the transfer and posting of 149 officers.

Fresh landslide kills woman in Manipur, June 30 toll rises to 49

woman was killed and 10 others injured in a landslide in Manipur's Churachandpur district on Friday while some body parts were recovered on Friday, the ninth day after the devastating landslide at a railway construction site in Noney district, where 49 bodies have been unearthed so far, officials said.

A Churachandpur district official said that a 49-year-old woman was killed and 10 others, including five women, were seriously injured when a passenger vehicle with 12 persons on board came under the landslide.

The incident took place at the Tipaimukh road along the National Highway-150 between Santing and Saihuan village, around 80 km from the district headquarters.

The injured were shifted to the hospital.

Meanwhile, Noney district officials said that 12 people, including Territorial Army soldiers, are still



missing after the catastrophic June 30 landslides at Tupul.
As many as 49 bodies, including 32

Territorial Army soldiers and remaining of local people and railway workers, were recovered and search operations were underway despite inclement weather to locate the missing. Officials also said that infrequent rock falls along the National Highway. 37 between Tupul and Noney district headquarters (near Namduanjang) has been occurring during the past four days, posing danger to life and properties for those vehicles plying

along the NH-37."Due to the uncer-

tain road conditions, the NH-37 between Tupul and Namduanjang villages was closed by the Deputy Commissioner for all vehicles, except those carrying emergency supplies," a district official said. Defence and district officials said that despite fresh landslides and continuous hostile weather conditions, the intensive search operations by the Indian Army, the Assam Rifles, the Territorial Army, and the National and State Disaster Response Forces continued at the incident site at Tupul. Efforts to search for the remaining missing Territorial Army personnel and civilians would continue till the last individual is found, a defence spokesman said.

The Territorial Army soldiers were deployed at Tupul for security to the railway works, part of the Rs 14,320 crore broad gauge Jiribam-Imphal railway project, being executed by the Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR), to connect the Manipur capital on the rail network by 2024.

80-yr-old Delhi woman found murdered at home

New Delhi: An 80-year-old woman was found with her throat slit at her residence in the national capital on Friday, police said.

According to police, a PCR call was received at Shalimar Bagh police station around 11 a.m. regarding murder of an old woman in her house in BS block. A police team reached at the spot and found the woman lying dead on bed with her throat partially slit.

"No other injuries were apparently visible. Her ornaments were intact. Other household articles were also found intact," Deputy Commissioner of Police, Northwest, Usha Rangnani said, adding prima facie, it seemed that that the murderer was someone known to the victim as there were no signs of forced entry. Police registered a case under Section



302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code and launched investigations.

Rangnani said that CCTV footage is being analysed and four teams have been constituted to solve this case.

"Police have rounded up a few suspects and the accused will be arrested soon," she

WOMAN IN BIHAR'S BHAGALPUR CHARGED WITH RAPE, POCSO ACT

Patna: Police in Bihar's Bhagalpur have charge sheeted a woman under the POCSO Act, as well for rape, kidnapping, and criminal conspiracy in a October 2021 case. The incident came to light when the charge sheet came before special POCS (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) court judge Lavkush Kumar, and he directed the investigating officer to appear before the court and clarify the matter. The incident is related to kidnapping and rape of a 17-year-old girl by Chotu Tanti on October 10, 2021 in Kahgaon village of the district. Following the police investigation, an FIR was registered against main accused Tanti, as well as his sister and sister inlaw.In the charge sheet, district police accused Tanti's sister of rape, kidnapping, criminal conspiracy under the Indian Penal Code as well as sections of the POCSO Act while Tanti was accused of criminal conspiracy and kidnapping under the IPC.

The special court judge has asked the investigating officer and SHO Niti Kumari of the women police station to appear before the court and explain.

Fake call centre racket targeting US citizens busted

he Karnataka Police have busted a call centre racket operating out of Bengaluru that used to target US citizens. The fraud call centre's activities involved cheating gullible people in the US by obtaining their bank details and siphoning off the money.

At least 72 employees of the call centre racket, including the kingpin were taken into custody in the operations conducted by teams from the Whitefield and Mahadevapura police stations.

A joint team of Whitefield

stations conducted simultaneous search operations on late Thursday evening at two locations after receiving information on a fake call cyber being operated from there.

Delhi: Four, including three minors, drown in Yamuna river

Pour people, including three minors, drowned to death while taking bath in the Yamuna river in the national capital, an official said on

Deputy Commissioner of Police (north), Sagar Singh Kalsi, said they received a call at 1.20 a.m. stating that four persons have gone missing.

They were identified as Wasim (15), Kamal (17), Iliyas (20) and Sameer (17), all residents of Loni, Ghaziabad. One motorcycle was found on the Yamuna bank along with some clothes.

"During inquiry, it was found that around noon on Thursday, these four persons had come from Loni to take a bath in Yamuna at Thokar No. 7, Sonia Pushta, Burari, and accidentally drowned in the river," Kalsi said. Subsequently, around dawn on Friday, a search and rescue operation was started.

"The divers have so far recovered three bodies," the officer said, adding that the search operation is still underway to find the fourth person.

Kalsi said the statements of the family members and other witnesses have been recorded and no foul play is suspected in their deaths.

The ED had initiated the money laundering probe on the basis of an FIR registered by the CBI in 2017 under Section 13(2) read with 13(1)(e) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, against Jain, his wife Poonam Jain, Ajit Prasad Jain, Sunil Kumar Jain, Vaibhav Jain and Ankush

Jain.
A charge-sheet was filed by the CBI on December 3, 2018 against Jain, Poonam



Jain and other accused persons. It was alleged that Jain, while holding office as a minister in the Delhi government between February 14, 2015 and May 31, 2017, had acquired assets which were disproportionate to his

known sources of income.

The CBI had accused Jain, his wife and other accused persons of offences under the Prevention of Corruption Act.On March 31 this year, the ED had provisionally attached immovable proper-

ties worth Rs 4.81 crore belonging to companies beneficially owned or controlled by Jain.

Jain was placed under arrest on May 30 by the ED under Section 19 of the PMLA.

As part of the measures taken to ensure free and fair polls, the administration not only carried a flag march of bulldozers but bulldozers were parked at several police stations, especially those considered highly sensitive areas in the district. During the flag march, the administration also gave clear instruction that anyone found creating disturbance in election will be punished and bulldozer will be run over on houses.

"After violence at several polling centres during the first phase of election, people are worried. Flag march of bulldozers was carried out to send a message to miscreants that they will bear harsh punishment if they try to create violence this time. This step will encourage people to step out to vote for their favorable candidates," an official said on condition of anonymity. Notably, during the first phase of panchayat elections on June 25, violence had occurred in several polling centres in Morena district. For instance, a group of armed miscreants had attacked poll duty officers at a polling booth in Madanvar village and snatched away two ballot boxes and burnt ballot papers in the forest area.

Following which, Bada Malhara police had registered a case against all the persons involved in the crime and arrested eight accused. While the vote counting was underway at the polling station, miscreants carrying sticks forcefully entered the polling booth and beat up the polling party with sticks.

They took away two ballot boxes while ballot papers were set on fire in the forest. As soon as the information was received, SDM Vikas Kumar Anand, Returning Officer and Tehsildar Kamlesh Kumar Kushwaha, SDOP RR Sahu, station incharge reached with heavy police force and made a Panchnama of the burnt ballot papers.

special campaign 'Mission Sehat' will be conducted for better care and maintenance of buildings of all health institutions from Primary Health Center to Civil and District Hospital. In this, the heads of the institution will have to get the general and special repair works done by the end of September. While entrusting the heads of the institutions to get the work done the allocation of amount for expenditure on repairs is being ensured as well. Commissioner-cum-Secretary Health Sudam Khade has issued guidelines regarding the work to be done in the mission.

The Health Commissioner said that while making additional provisions in the present arrangement for maintenance of government buildings of the Health Department, funds are being provided to all health institutions for repairs from their Rogi Kalyan Samitis. Under this, the work of both general and special repair of the buildings of health institutions is to be undertaken. General repairs include painting, repairing of doors and windows, replacement of broken glass, patch work of plaster, repair of water supply system, electrical repair, building floor repair and installation of signage at key locations of the hospital. The in-charge of the concerned health institution has been author-

ized to carry out general repair works. Incharge/Medical Officer of Primary Health Centres, Block Medical Officer in Community Health Centres, Hospital Superintendent in Civil Hospitals and Civil Surgeon-cum-Chief Hospital Superintendent in District Hospitals shall be the building in-charge for the repair work of each building under their administrative control. The head of the institution can constitute a supervisory committee at the office or hospital building level as per the guidelines issued at state level for the maintenance and repair work of the buildings operated under him. District wise budget is being allocated on the basis of the amount of repair works from the state level and the bank account information of the Rogi Kalyan Samiti of the respective hospitals. For the execution of general repair works, the authorized officer of administrative and financial sanction will be the head of the institution. On the recommendation of the constituted committee, the building in-charge will get the works up to Rs. 5 lakh done by the agency giving the lowest rate after receiving the tender as per rules. After the work is done, the photographs of the repairs will also be collected. The building in-charge of all the institutions will ensure that all repair works are done compulsorily by 30 September 2022. Special repair works include roof water proofing and repair

work, floor refurbishment of building, sanitary fittings, construction/repair of drainage system and major repairs other than simple repairs. According to the proposal received from the districts for special repairs, administrative approval will be issued for all the works from the competent level of the department following technical approval after obtaining detailed estimates from the departmental/divisional executive engineers. For special repair works, the prevailing rate schedule of PIU of Public Works Department will be applicable. For special repair works costing less than Rs 5 lakh, committee will be constituted by the in-charge of the building. On the recommendation of the constituted committee, the agency which will submit the lowest rate after receiving the tender as per rules, will be selected and will get the work done. For special repair works costing more than Rs 5 lakh, the technical staff of the Health Department will prepare an estimate of the work and a proposal for technical approval etc. After the issuance of administrative approval, the departmental/divisional executive engineer will issue a tender for all the special repairs of the concerned department for works costing more than Rs.5 lakh and the eligible tenderer who submits a minimum rate for each division will be selected. One tenderer will not be selected for 2 divisions. Special

repair works will also have to be completed by November 30. General and special repair works will be included through Google Sheet/Link prepared by the department with the repair photographs showing the pre-work condition and post-completion status. Along with this, the responsibility of entry of other necessary documents will also be with the building incharge / head of office / head of the institution. General and special repair works will also be constantly supervised. Departmental officers will be responsible for reviewing the construction works to be done in the districts. Block Medical Officer and Assistant Engineer will supervise the repair works conducted in their block. The Chief Medical and Health Officer and the Divisional Executive Engineer will supervise the construction works of civil hospitals and community health centers in their district. All Regional Directors and Divisional Executive Engineers will supervise the repair works of district hospitals operating under their iurisdiction. Updated information will be obtained from all the departmental officers by the state level from time to time after reviewing the repair works. The concerned institution incharge will be responsible for upgrading the buildings of all government health centers as best institutions within the prescribed time limit of September 30.

Air pollution: A major concern

ata from 10 cities across India has shown that monthly PM2.5 and PM10 levels during the summer months breached the annual CPCB safe limits of 40 micrograms per cubic metre and 60 micrograms per cubic metre, respectively, during these months. Ten non-attainment cities - Agra, Bengaluru, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Kolkata, Jodhpur, Mumbai, Lucknow, and Patna were selected and average PM2.5, PM10 and NO2 levels were analysed for the months of March, April, May, and June. These cities are all part of the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) by the Environment, Forest and Climate Change Ministry. The analysis by Climate Trends, an advocacy think tank working on the issues related to air pollution and climate change, showed that in March this year, except Chennai, all other cities recorded PM2.5 levels above safe limits while 10 cities recorded PM10 levels above safe limits. In April, except Kolkata, all other cities recorded PM2.5 levels above safe limits while in case of PM10, except Chennai, all other cities recorded levels above safe limits. Northwest Indian plains have witnessed repeated heat waves since March this year. This resulted in an increased power demand, approximately 75 per cent of which came from coal-powered thermal power plants. The westerly winds from Balochistan, central Pakistan, and Thar desert also carried dust, adding to the PM10 levels. Locally, the prolonged dry spells during the summer months also mean more dust suspension in the air. *The NCAP Tracker - a joint project by* Climate Trends and Respirer Living Sciences - showed that in April 2022, Delhi did not have a single day when it met the CPCB's 24-hour safe limit of 60 microgram per cubic metre while for Mumbai, there were only nine days when PM2.5 concentration did not breach the safe limits.

AN UPHILL BATTLE TO SAVE **BOKARO'S PRECIOUS GREEN PATCH**

ribal activist Yogo Purti's face lights up every time he surveys Satanpur hill, located behind his modest dwelling at Jaipal Nagar in Sector 12 of Bokaro district in Jharkhand. The 47-year-old, who runs the Asas School that offers free classes to the underprivileged, has fought off threats from the land mafia, the mistrust of villagers and official inertia in Jharkhand to restore greenery on what was just a denuded

landscape in his teens. Purti's environmental activism took shape in 2000, when he successfully mobilised the youth of Satanpur panchayat for a sapling plantation drive on the Satanpur and Bandhgora hills, adjacent to the district's Chas block, known for its steel plant. With time, the villagers began to watch out for encroachments funnelled by real estate and land mafias and passed on the gathered information to the district administration and the forest and police departments.

The system worked well to stop encroachers in their tracks, and with it, sakhua, khair, jamun, palash and other varieties of trees bloomed and spread shade. The water level increased and much of the wildlife and birds that hadn't been seen here since before the 80s were thriving once again

Along with Ramkumar Manjhi, Ramdayal Singh, Shyam Lal Bauri, Ruplal Manjhi and Shrinath Marandi, Purti and the other villagers thus transformed the hills into a buffer zone to protect their habitat from the onslaught of urbanisation.

"Many low-altitude hills around this place were levelled and sold. These two survived only due to our spirited involvement and vigil," he told 101Reporters. "We used to organise van mahotsavs to plant saplings at the foot of the hills. At times, rallies were held to spread awareness about tree conservation. We also bonded over freshly-prepared khichdi served on the

Prakash Mishra, a local journalist involved in the campaign, remembers how the hills were left with just tree stumps when industrialisation triggered deforestation in Bokaro.

"Alarmed by the sheer volume of environmental damage, we held a meeting with the villagers and decided enough is enough. With our sustained care, the stumps grew back to life. We planted more saplings at the foot of the hills, too," he added. The local residents here understand that a thriving hill means a thriving life. They have witnessed how thousands of villages in the state migrated due to rampant mineral ore mining in the region. The real breakthrough, however, came in 2006, when the then Dhanbad divisional forest officer (DFO), Sanjeev Kumar, organised a meeting with the villagers of Satanpur. He played a pivotal role in constituting forest defence committees, which would go on to look out for encroachments and inform the departments concerned to prompt swift action. Simultaneously, Purti received support from an NGO, Sahyogini, for the plantation drive. The lands around the hills - the Garga, a tributary of the Damodar river,



were part of the swathes acquired and transferred to Bokaro Steel Limited (BSL) for building the plant. Additionally, forest lands were given to BSL - incorporated as a limited company first and later merged with the Steel Authority of India - to conduct a massive afforestation drive. However, BSL did not utilise the land as required and encroachments soared

The sticking points

Over the years, several colonies emerged around the Satanpur and Bandhgora hills. Purti and his team alleged that the adjacent plots fell into the wrong hands, who then fabricated documents by posing as peasants. The encroachers later sold them to builders. During his tour of the area, this correspondent also noticed rapid construction and levelling of land.

According to activists, the presence of colonies has heightened the risk of encroachment on the hills. They cited an incident from August 2014, wherein the forest department booked four office-bearers of Adarsh Cooperative Society, one of the many builders around the region, on charges of clearing two acres on Satanpur hill.

A forest officer who retired from Bokaro division last year said, on condition of anonymity, that the hill was given to BSL decades ago. "Our department had made repeated correspondence with the public sector enterprise during my tenure to get the land back, but in vain," he added.

On the issue, BSL Communication Officer Manikant Dhan claimed he was "not aware of the Satanpur hill land being under BSL's control". However, he did accept that many colonies had cropped up in the area.

Forest Range Officer Niranjan Tiwari said that only the DFO could provide information on the subject. When this correspondent managed to reach Bokaro DFO AK Singh after several attempts, they were officially asked to file a Right to

On the other hand, Bandhgora's ownership status is as clear as can be. A few years ago, Purti had filed an RTI application with the Bokaro divisional forest office in this regard. The reply clarified that the forest department fully owned the hill, citing the plot number and details of the entire forest area in the township. The activist further said that the administration had taken action several times on the complaints local residents raised, but they still have to constantly write to the departments concerned, file RTI pleas and create awareness to save the hills. After he once wrote to the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, it directed Jharkhand's Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF), in August 2015, to stop the felling of trees and illegal encroach-

The environmentalists find solace in the fact that one portion of Satanpur's greenery is protected by the presence of the Jharkhand Armed Police's firing range. Set up almost 15 years ago at the foot of the hill, it significantly helped curb encroach ments on that side, besides preventing the extraction of murram soil used for filling land during construction work.

Testing times

"We saved both the hills by preventing forest erosion and encroachments, but our forest defence committees have been dormant for four to five years," rued Ramkumar Manjhi, a member of Purti's green brigade from Santaldih. "Real estate and land mafias lure residents to clear forests on their behalf. which is more difficult for us to stop as it leads to fights in the village and creates personal enmity."Ramdayal Singh, who contested the recent election to head Satanpur panchayat, nodded in approval: "These local agents hamper our work."Purti and Manjhi claimed that the committees became inactive primarily due to the issue of local agents. Department-level negligence, too, has affected them, especially as forest officers play key roles in their formation and operation. Sanjeev Kumar, who is still remembered by the villagers for his unflinching support for their campaign, is now the additional PCCF of the forest department's CAMPA Project.

"When I convened the meeting to form forest defence committees, we vowed to ensure that it wouldn't die out as a onetime programme. Instead, it should set an example for others,' Kumar told 101Reporters.

Unfortunately, only the group led by Purti and team is presently active - basically on their own terms - and land mafias are not pleased. Yet, they yearn to persist to keep the villages green and sustainable.

While appreciating the humanitarian assistance of the international community, the Afghan central bank called for better relations with its partners in the finan-

cial and banking sectors. "Da Afghanistan Bank welcomes the admittance of currencies into the country through legal and principled ways and asks the international community to work together and cooperate with Afghanistan in other fields as well," the statement read. The cash-strapped nation has received more than \$980 million in cash assistance since the Taliban's takeover of Afghanistan in August last year, according to figures issued by the bank.

Massive crowd to march to Colombo demanding Sri Lankan Prez, govt to step-down

Sri Lanka's opposition parties, religious groups, civil rights activists have planned a massive march to capital Colombo on Saturday demanding President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and the government to step down amidst unprecedented economic crisis and virtual lockdown of the country.

arties representing farmers, fishermen, clergies, medical experts, civil rights groups, political groups and university dons are to march to Colombo and ride their bicycles as transportation has come to complete standstill with no fuel supply.

For two weeks, Sri Lanka is in a virtual lockdown with government offices barely functioning with limited staff and schools completely closed with no transport for children and teachers.

"Public protest sent Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa home on May 9, and his brother former Finance Minister Basil Rajapaksa was sent home on June 9. It's time for their brother Gotabaya Rajapaksa to go home on July 9," civil rights activist told media.

Claiming the rights to freedom of expression, courts have rejected orders sought by police to prevent protesters entering Colombo or marching towards President's house on July 8 and 9.

Inspector General of Police (IGP) C.D. Wickramaratne requested protesters to exercise the right to protest within the legal framework. In a public statement, the IGP said that the Police respect the right of the people to hold peaceful

protests and assemblies, but would not tolerate those who behave violently by damaging public property.

The Government has summoned thousands of military and police to capital Colombo and security is in place. Activists have warned that the government was "planning to create violence" on Saturday using the



military and police.

US Ambassador to Colombo, Julie Chung cautioned the security forces to ensure right to protest.

"Reminding military and police to grant peaceful protesters the space and security to do so. Chaos and force will not fix the economy or

bring the political stability that Sri Lankans need right now," the US Ambassador tweeted urging the protestors to not to resort to violence. "Violence is not an answer. If you are going to protest, please do so

Despite court orders, on Thursday, hundreds of Buddhist monks marched to Colombo and started a 'Satygraha' campaign demanding the resignation of President Rajapaksa and Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe. Several monks said if Gotabaya does not step down, they would launch a hunger strike until he is ousted. University teachers representing the Federation of University Teachers Association (FUTA) rode to Colombo in a bicycle parade calling an all-party government to resolve the current crisis in the country.

Burdened with economic crisis, people surrounded President Rajapaksa's house on March 31 and the protest ended with heavy violence by military. Subsequently, massive protest started on April 2 occupying President's office in Galle Face Green in Colombo which was later named 'Gota go village'.

On Saturday, thousands of protesters are asked to gather at the same

"The people are asking the same questions - why they (the rebels) behave like this even when the party gave them so many posts... did so

much for them. So many women activists had tears in their eyes yesterday. I thank the masses from the bottom of my heart," said the Sena chief. "Let there be elections. If we have

committed a mistake, the masses will not vote for us, we will accept their mandate and we shall sit back," he added, throwing the gauntlet at the new Shinde-Devendra Fadnavis government.Referring to the June 20 rebellion which saw the collapse of the 31-month-old Maha Vikas Aghadi government he headed, Thackeray said that whatever has taken place now could have happened even twoand-half-years ago, "with dignity and without spending thousands of crores

Thackeray admitted that even he had felt "bad" after the rebellion of 40 Shiv Sena MLAs that led to the Bharatiya Janata Party-supported government of Shinde-Fadnavis taking office on June 30.

'They (rebels) kept quiet against those who targeted the Thackerays, used perverse language against my family and myself.

But now, they have gone and sat in

those very peoples' lap," reiterated Thackeray at a media conference in his home 'Matoshri'. Dwelling upon the ongoing "leaks" plaguing the party, he said the 56-year-old Shiv Sena is still strong and recalled the days when it started with a single legislator, then slowly grew to form gov-



ernments in the state, giving opportunity to ordinary workers, and rewarding them with high posts.

Thackeray expressed gratitude to the people and also the 16 MLAs still supporting him as the party waits for the Supreme Court verdict on July 11.

Senior advocate Devadatt Kamat, representing Shiv Sena leader Subhash Desai, mentioned the matter before a bench of Justices Indira Banerjee and JK Maheshwari and said that they seek listing of the fresh plea along with other pending petitions which are scheduled for hearing on July 11. "We are challenging

the appointment of Eknath Shinde as chief minister," Kamat said.

The top court said it will be listed before an appropriate bench on July 11. The plea said: "It is submitted that the action of the Governor dated June 30, 2022 in calling Respondent No. 4 to be the Chief Minister is completely arbitrary and unconstitutional.The president of Shiv Sena is Uddhav Thackeray. The last organisational elections were held in 2018 and the same was intimated to the Election Commission of India. There is no change to the organisational structure of the Shiv Sena and the leadership of Uddhav Thackeray is

undisputed and unchallenged." A rebellion by Shinde-led Shiv Sena MLAs resulted in the collapse of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government.

The plea submitted that the Governor cannot recognise rebel MLAs as a political party as that would ring a death knell on the working of a multi-party democracy.

The plea said there is no merger as envisaged under para 4 of the Tenth Schedule and the President of the Shiv Sena (Uddhav Thackeray) had publicly and admittedly not

aligned/supported the BJP. "These rebel MLAs have not merged in any other political party or formed a new political party, therefore even if it is assumed they formed 2/3rd strength of the Legislature party, para 4 of the Tenth Schedule is not at all attract-

ed," it added. The plea contended in these circumstances, the satisfaction of the Governor for the purpose of calling upon Shinde to be the Chief Minister as the head of 39 rebel MLAs of Shiv Sena (which is not endorsed by the Shiv Sena) is by itself ex facie unconstitutional. "The Constitution prohibits recognition of rebel MLAs of a political party under Tenth Schedule, and the action of the Governor legitimises what is expressly prohibited by the Constitution. The Governor has sought to recognise what the Constitution prohibits," said the plea. In these circumstances, the Governor in his ipsi dixit guided by his political masters acted malafide and in the teeth of the provisions of the Constitution granted de-facto recognition to the 39 rebel MLAs by inviting Respondent No. 4 to be the Chief Minister.'





The news comes as a huge blow for South Africa ahead of their women's ODI series against England, starting from July 11 in Northampton and most importantly, with the Commonwealth Games having the women's T20 event in Birmingham from July 29 to August 7.

Lizelle leaves the international cricket stage at pole place in the runs-scorer's list in women's T20I cricket for South Africa, while coming second to Mignon du Preez in women's ODIs. She was also the recipient of the ICC Women's ODI Cricketer of the Year 2021.

In women's ODIs, Lizelle amassed 3,315 runs in 100 matches, including 23 half-centuries and three centuries at an average of 36.42, with a career-best score of 132 not out against India in Lucknow in March 2021. In two Tests, last of which came against England in Taunton from June 27-30, she made 42 runs.

In women's T20Is, she played 82 games for the Proteas, scoring 1,896 runs, averaging 25.62, while notching up 13 fifties and one hundred against Thailand during Women's T20 World Cup in 2020, making her only the second South African woman to reach triple figures in T20Is.

enturies from Marnus Labuschagne (104) and Steve Smith (109 not out) put Australia in a strong position on the opening day of the second Test against Sri Lanka, here on Friday.

Australia were 298 for 5 at stumps on Day 1 with Smith and Alex Carey (16) unbeaten at the crease.

Earlier, Australia won the toss, opted to bat first and fielded the same side as the first Test but Sri Lanka were forced to make four changes after a Covid outbreak in their camp. All-rounder Kamindu Mendis and spin duo Prabath Jayasuriya and Maheesh Theekshana made their Test debuts for the hosts.

The hosts got off to a good start with Kasun Rajitha providing them with an early breakthrough when he knocked off David Warner's off stump in the fifth over of the day.

Pairing with Ramesh Mendis and debutant Prabath Jayasuriya, Rajitha kept the Australians in check with his probing line and length. Mendis dismissed Usman Khawaja in the 22nd over just when the second-wicket partnership had started to grow. At 70/2, the match seemed evenly balanced.

However, with no demons in the pitch, it was only a matter of time before the Australia batters took back control of the game. Leading the way was Marnus Labuschagne, who did not take long after the lunch break to bring up a wonderful fifty. He accelerated upon reaching the milestone, racing towards triple figures.

The second session was completely dominated by the visitors and Steve Smith proved to be the perfect partner for Labuschagne's antics. The latter



brought up his fourth Test century, his first outside of Australia with a gentle single to mid-wicket.

Niroshan Dickwella, who had missed a stumping chance to dismiss Labuschagne for 28 earlier in the day, made amends when he whipped off the bails of the advancing batter to give Prabath Jayasuriya his maiden Test wicket. Labuschagne departed for 104 (156) with Australia going to tea at 204/3. However, the wicket did little to dampen Steve Smith's spirits as the veteran batter dropped in anchor. The experienced batter kept Australia in control. Two brief partnerships with Travis Head and Cameron Green followed but with Smith in the picture, Sri Lanka could not wrest back control of

the game. Smith's patience was rewarded when he brought up his 28th Test hundred with a crunching cover drive in the final hour of the day. It was a long wait for the talented player, who last

reached triple figures in January 2021. Despite wickets falling at the other end, Smith and Alex Carey batted with great patience to ensure more wickets don't fall and took Australia to stumps at 298/5. The visitors will be looking at the 400-run mark in the first innings, a total that would take some effort to take down by Sri Lanka.




