SUPREME COURT'S BCCI VERDICT & IT'S LIKELY IMPACT ON INDIAN CRICKET

DECODED

According to the BCCI constitution, an office-bearer who has held any post for two consecutive terms (three years per term), at a state association or in the BCCI or a combination of the two, shall not be eligible to contest an election without completing a cooling-off period of three years. During the cooling-off period, the person cannot serve in any capacity at either the BCCI or at the state level.

- ▶ AS PER THE NEW ORDER/CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT, THE COOLING-OFF PERIOD FOR OFFICE-BEARERS WILL KICK IN AFTER TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS AT EITHER THE BCCI OR AT THE STATE ASSOCIATION LEVEL.
- ▶ SO THE OFFICE-BEARERS CAN NOW HAVE A MAXIMUM OF 12 YEARS AT ONE GO.
- ▶ TWO THREE-YEAR TERMS AT THE STATE ASSOCIATION LEVEL AND TWO THREE-YEAR TERMS AT THE BCCI, AND AFTER THIS, THE COOLING-OFF PERIOD WILL BE APPLICABLE.



The 'cooling-off period'

The 'cooling-off period' was a major recommendation made by the Justice RM Lodha Committee to reform cricket administration in the country. As per Lodha, the idea was to have impartial cricket administrators and ensure that there is no monopoly. The problem with the sports administrators in India is, once they occupy the top post, they don't want to leave it. The BCCI might have only few with that issue, but other sports in India have seen many administrators, who have occupied the chair for a long duration and did very little for the welfare of the game. Even the courts have intervened to remove them from their posts for the better functioning of that sports body.

Supreme Court -- Justices DY Chandrachud and Hima Kohli -- accepted a majority of those amendments, thus rolling back to a large extent the reforms

recommended by the RM Lodha Committee in 2016, which were meant to revamp the BCCI's functioning and structure.

The recent Supreme Court judgement which allowed BCCI to make amendments in its constitution to relax the mandatory three-year cooling-off period and in implementation of other key reforms, could have the long-lasting effect -- good or bad -- on cricket administration in India. Notably, in December 2019, the BCCI had approached the Supreme Court to modify its own judgement of 2018, which asked for several amendments to the cricket board's constitution. Politicians get a breather

There is no certainty whether a good sportsperson will become a good administrator. Likewise, a politician can also become a good or ordinary administrator -- at least the previous regimes have shown us that.

While implementing the Lodha Committee recommendations in 2016, the Supreme Court had ruled that no minister and public servant can become a member in the BCCI. The reference to public servants meant MPs and MLAs.

The directive to bar ministers from holding a post still stands, but the Court in the recent hearing agreed to change the clause which now allows MPs and MLAs to be part of state associations and the BCCI. In the current scenario, this amendment would be seen as a big relief for office-bearers like Rajeev Shukla, the vice-president of the BCCI, who recently became a member of the Rajya Sabha.

The entry of MPs and MLAs in the state associations and BCCI can change the whole ball game. For example, if a sportsperson wants to contest elections for a post in a sports body, he will face a serious challenge from a politician candidate to garner votes and win. Eventually, it will lead to less representation of sports personalities in the administration.

ALL ASSOCIATIONS TO HAVE A VOTE

The Lodha Committee had recommended that each state should have just one vote even if some had more than one cricket association. This led to a problem because even entities like Railways and Services lost their right to vote at BCCI AGMs.

Earlier, due to the Lodha Committee recommendations, cricket units like Vidarbha and Mumbai (both part of Maharashtra state, which also has the Maharashtra Cricket Association), and Baroda and Saurashtra (both part of Gujarat, which also has the Gujarat Cricket Association) were suffering, as each state had only one vote. That meant the vote was rotated among the three associations of these states.

Punjab MMS Scandal: Prime accused held in Shimla

There were reports that the accused girl student had made nude videos of some women students and sent those to a youth in Shimla, who allegedly uploaded them on social media.

The prime accused in the Chandigarh University video leak row was arrested from the Himachal Pradesh capital on Sunday, police said. Chandigarh University in Punjab's Mohali district has been witnessing strong student protests since Saturday night after it was reported that a woman student leaked obscene videos of several occupants of the girl's hostel online. Donning black T-shirts, students of Chandigarh University in Punjab's Mohali district continued to protest demanding justice over the alleged 'leaked

objectionable videos' on Sunday. Following protests by the students on Saturday night, a female MBA student of the private university was arrested by the police on Sunday morning on charges of making an objectionable video. She has also been accused of filming her fellow hostellers and making the videos viral. As the matter drew angry political reactions, the university authorities clarified that "no videos were found of any student which are objectionable, except a personal video shot by a girl which she shared with her boyfriend".

Also dismissing reports of suicide attempt by some students who were allegedly filmed, the authorities said "there are rumours that seven girls have committed suicide whereas the fact is that no girl has taken any such step". Senior Superintendent of Police Vivek Soni, who is leading the investigation team, categorically told the media that no attempt to suicide was reported after the incident came to light. Also, he said, so far there is no evidence of the video going viral. Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Sunday ordered a high-level probe into the incident.

27 KILLED, 20 INJURED IN CHINA BUS ACCIDENT



Beijing: Twenty-seven people were killed and 20 others injured after a bus turned on its side in China's Guizhou Province early Sunday morning. The bus with 47 people on board was running on a highway section in Sandu Shui Autonomous County when the accident happened, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the county's public security bureau.

'Stop threatening media', Kejriwal to PM's media advisor

Addressing Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) first Rashtriya Janpratinidhi Sammelan here on Sunday, Delhi Chief Minister and AAP convener Arvind Kejriwal accused the Prime Minister's media advisor of threatening the media. "There's one gentleman named Hiren Joshi who works in the Prime Minister's Office. He is the media advisor to the Prime Minister. Editors and owners of big news channels have shown me the vulgar abuses and threatening notes he sends them," the AAP chief claimed. Kejriwal alleged that Joshi sends messages saying "if you show Kejriwal on your channel, we will do this or that", there is no need to cover



AAP, you are misusing your channel" etc. "Is this how you'll run the country, by threatening people," the Delhi CM asked. "Today, I want to tell Hiren Joshi that if someone leaks the screenshots of the messages you have sent to these editors on social media, you and the Prime Minister won't

be able to show your faces in this country," Kejriwal said. For the first time, all the elected representatives of AAP from across the nation met at the Rashtriya Janpratinidhi Sammelan on Sunday. The meeting was called to discuss ways to strengthen the party organisation.

ACB raids Waqf Board in corruption case

Delhi Police have apprehended four people who allegedly obstructed the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) officials while they were conducting a raid in the Waqf Board corruption case, an official said Sunday. The accused were identified as Afsar (20) and Anwar (31), both residents of Batla House, Shakeel Ahmad (45), a resident of Jakir Nagar and Sikander (45), a resident of Jogabai Extension. Earlier on Saturday, the police had arrested Aam Aadmi Party MLA Amanatullah Khan's close aide Hamid Ali in the Arms Act case and also lodged three separate FIRs. "One illegal weapon and some live cartridges were recovered from Hamid Ali's house. He was arrested in this case," Deputy Commissioner of Police (southeast) Esha Pandey said. The second FIR was registered against Kaushar Imam Siddique alias Laddan, a resident of Jogabai



Extension in Arms Act. A country-made pistol and three live rounds were recovered from his place. As per latest update, the accused Kaushar Imam Siddique is still at large in one case of arms act. The third FIR was lodged for obstructing the raiding party of ACB in discharge of government work for which now four people have been apprehended. Meanwhile, a video of MLA Khan's supporters assaulting and manhandling the ACB officials surfaced on Sunday and has gone viral on social media.

GROSS DIRECT TAX COLLECTIONS RISE 30% IN 2022-23, NET DIRECT TAX COLLECTIONS UP 23%

New Delhi: Gross direct tax collections till 2022-23 as on September 17 stood at Rs 8.36 lakh crore, witnessing a growth of 30 per cent over collections of corresponding period of last year. Net direct tax collections stood at Rs 7.01 lakh crore for the current fiscal till September 17, showing a 23 per cent rise over the corresponding period of last year. Cumulative advance tax collections were at Rs 2.95 lakh crore till September 17 in 2022-23, a growth of 17 per cent over the corresponding period of last year, according to the data released by the Finance Ministry. Refunds amounting to Rs 1,35,556 crore were issued up to September 17, up by 83 per cent over last year. Fast processing of income tax returns (ITRs), with almost 93 per cent of duly verified ITRs were processed till Saturday. Faster issue of refunds were initiated, which saw an almost 468 per cent increase in the number of refunds issued in 2022-23, the statement said.

TN BJP IT cell head tweets old image of Rahul Gandhi with misleading claims

An old image of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi sitting with his niece Miraya Vadra is being shared on social media with captions falsely linking it to Congress 'Bharat Jodo Yatra'. The image, showing Gandhi touching Miraya Vadra's palm affectionately, has been tweeted by Bharatiya Janata Party leader CTR Nirmal Kumar, who heads BJP Tamil Nadu unit's social media. The tweet, which has since been deleted, was captioned in Tamil as, "Pappu is playing with children by putting mehendi on them. Feeling sad for the 10 members who're taking him to the yatra" Kumar also posted the image on his Facebook account with the same caption.



The image has been widely shared on Facebook with the same claim. Fact Check BOOM ran the viral image through a reverse image search on Google which led to several images uploaded on Getty Images showing Gandhi and Miraya Vadra, wearing the same attire. Miraya Vadra

is Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and Robert Vadra's daughter. The title of the image on Getty reads, "Tributes Paid To Former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi On His 71st Birth Anniversary". In the original image, former Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh and Robert Vadra can be seen seated along with them. The caption further reads, "Congress Vice President Rahul Gandhi with his niece Miraya Vadra during a remembrance ceremony for the 71st birth anniversary of the former Indian Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi at Veer Bhumi on August 20, 2015 in New Delhi, India. The same image was also documented in a Deccan Chronicle photo story titled "Priyanka Vadra's daughter Miraya makes rare public appearance", which was published on August 21, 2015.



BJP BETE NOIRE 'BABY PENGUIN' ADITYA THACKERAY BUSY BONDING WITH PEOPLE

Nearly three months after the collapse of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government, Shiv Sena's ex-minister Aditya Thackeray is on a "mass-connect" campaign through a series of rallies and public meetings over the past several weeks.

Much to the chagrin of the ruling combine ally Bharatiya Janata Party - which had uncharitably nicknamed him "Baby Penguin" - Aditya, unlike the flightless bird from the chilly southern hemisphere, has sprouted

not only political wings, but also claws and fangs, to menacingly soar like a political "Garuda".

His rallies-meetings, mostly in the rebels' constituencies, are well attended by exuberant crowds who welcome him more as a "conqueror" rather than a trounced "Mavala" - the trusted warrior tribe of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's dreaded armies.

After the Shiv Sena-Nationalist Congress Party-Congress MVA government led by ex-Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray was toppled, Aditya hit the ground running, going from one district to another, deliver-

ing "guerilla-style" hits at Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, his band of rebels, or at times, even the BJP and its Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis.

Preparing the ground for his father's political tour starting end-September, Aditya targets Shinde and his group of 40 Sena rebels, plus 10 others -- who quit the MVA regime and ensured its fall on June 29 -- expectedly raising the political temperatures and evoking bitter reactions from the ruling front.

With vastly improved oratory and enhanced confidence, some of the brickbats he aims at the Shinde group

include the '50 Khoke' (boxes, implying Rs 50 crore) tirade and 'Gaddar' (traitors), which particularly stung the red-faced rebels, leaving them swearing or threatening or just hopping mad...After the debacle of Vedanta Group-Foxconn choosing Gujarat for its Rs 2.06 crore mega plant, Aditya came up with the latest jibe -- inspired by the 1993 blockbuster "Baazigar" -- "Jeet ke haarne walon ko Khoka Sarkar kehte hain", as the rebels fumed. Aditya, 32, is an easy-mannered bearded, bespectacled, bunny-faced bachelor, usually clad in full-sleeved shirts and trousers or kurta-jeans, and shuns expensive tastes or T-shirts.

But he does not hesitate to dive into the political muck or throw down the gauntlet - and accept those hurled by the rebels - vociferously demanding that the rebels should quit their Assembly seats and face the electorate, accusing them of not just a "political betrayal" but also "human betrayal". The Shinde group dared, "first you quit" - and Aditya accepted the dare - "If you all quit, I will also resign... all of us can fight the elections..." Now, "election" has suddenly become a scary word, giving nightmares to the rebels, who tout themselves as the protectors of Shiv Sena founder the late Balasaheb Thackeray's Hindutva, while accusing Uddhav Thackeray of ditching and diluting it by joining hands with the NCP-Congress to become the chief minister in November 2019.

Maoist-hit village in Maha sings national anthem everyday

With an aim to generate positive atmosphere, the people of Mulchera village in the Maoist-affected Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra have been singing the national anthem every day since August 15 this year after police and villagers took up the initiative together.

Gadchiroli police said that residents of Mulchera village in Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra start their day by singing the national anthem every day. Every day the villagers, along with shopkeepers and other small traders, gather in the village at 8.45 a.m. and sing the national anthem. This meaningful initiative has been started from August 15 this year.

Speaking to IANS, Gadchiroli Superintendent of Police, Ankit Goel said that this is a good initiative. The villagers feel the collective patriotism everyday by singing the national anthem. It has been started by the police and villagers on the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. He stated that if its result is good, then it will be started in other Maoist-affected areas as well in collaboration with the villagers.

As part of this initiative, police officers of Gadchiroli play patriotic songs on loudspeakers for a minute in Mulchera village every day, Mulchera API Ashok Bhapkar told IANS. This informs the villagers that the national anthem is about to begin. After this, all the villagers gather in one place to sing national anthem.

According to the information, after Nalgonda village of Telangana and Bhilwadi village of Sangli district of Maharashtra, this is the third village in the country and the second village in Maharashtra, where this kind of collective national anthem is performed. Gadchiroli Police is continuously campaigning against the Maoists and the support of the villagers is most important for this.

Mulchera village, which is about 900 km from Mumbai, has a population of around 2,500. Significantly, this village has been considered a Maoist-affected village for years. Incidents of Maoist violence have been witnessed here many times. But now the national anthem has been started to erase this identity.

Sharad Pawar's "North India Mentality" remark on women quota in Parliament

Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) president Sharad Pawar has said the "mentality" of north India and Parliament seems not conducive yet to giving reservation to women in the Lok Sabha and legislative assemblies.

The former Union minister made the remarks on Saturday at a programme organised by the Pune Doctors' Association where he and his daughter and Lok Sabha member Supriya Sule were interviewed.

He was replying to a question on the Women's Reservation Bill, which aims to reserve 33 per cent seats in the Lok Sabha and all state legislative assemblies for women which is yet to be passed,



and whether this shows the country is still not mentally ready to accept the women leadership.

Pawar said he had been speaking on this issue in Parliament since he was a Congress Lok Sabha member. "The 'mansikta' (mentality) of

Parliament, especially of north India, has not been conducive (on this issue). I can recall that when I was the Congress Lok Sabha member, I used to talk about the issue of reservation for women in Parliament. Once after completing my speech, I turned back and saw that majority of MPs from my party got up and left. This means even for people from my party, it was not digestible," he said.

The NCP chief said all (parties) should keep trying to get the bill passed.

"When I was the chief minister of Maharashtra, reservation for women was introduced in local bodies like the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti. It was opposed initially but later people accepted it," he added.

WOMAN JUMPS OFF BUILDING WITH 6-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTER IN MUMBAI, BOTH DIE: COPS

Mumbai: A 28-year-old woman allegedly died by suicide by jumping off the terrace of a building along with her 6-year-old daughter in Mumbai's Mira Road, police said on Saturday.

The Kashmiria Police reached the spot, after being informed about the incident. An Accidental Death Report (ADR) was registered in the case and the bodies were sent for post-mortem. The police informed that the dead named Rekha Devasi took her 6-year-old daughter Ankita to the terrace and committed suicide after jumping off. The woman used to live with her husband and two children in the same building. The police said that they have not recovered any suicide note.

A case of accidental death has been registered and the investigation into the case is on.

Institution like Niti Aayog would be set up in Maharashtra: Fadnavis

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Sunday announced that an institution on the lines of Niti Aayog would be set up in the state for comprehensive data analysis and to make studied decisions on various sectors.

Speaking to reporters here, Fadnavis said, "A delegation led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde met the chief executive officer and other officials of the Niti Aayog.

It was proposed that an institute of transformation on the lines of Niti Aayog would be set up to make studied decisions on various sectors. CM Shinde has given an in-



principle nod to this suggestion."

The topics discussed during the meeting between the chief minister and the NITI Aayog officials ranged from monetisation of assets, blockchain in agriculture, transportation taking to alternative fuel or EV policy, non-conventional energy, drone in healthcare and agriculture, among others, he said.

The NITI Aayog has also carried an extensive study on similar issues and developed a tool, where inter-related data from various departments is collectively analysed for a better decision-making process, Fadnavis added.

LEOPARD FOUND DEAD INSIDE FILM CITY

Mumbai: A leopard was found dead inside the Film City in Sunday today morning, a forest official said.

There was no injury mark on the carcass which was sent for an autopsy, he said.

The forest control room got a call around 10.30 am about the male leopard lying dead inside the Film City located in suburban Goregaon, the official said.

The Sanjay Gandhi National Park, which is home to a number of leopards, is located nearby.

A forest department team went to the spot and sent the carcass for the autopsy which will help them ascertain the exact cause of the feline's death, the official said. Forest officials have informed local police about the death of the leopard, he added.

OVER 100 CATTLE DEAD, 25 DISTRICTS AFFECTED BY LUMPY SKIN DISEASE

The state's animal husbandry department on Saturday said that as many as 126 cattle have died and 25 districts have been affected by lumpy skin disease in Maharashtra.

"A total of 126 infected animals have died including 47 in Jalgaon district, 21 in Ahmednagar District, 2 in Dhule, 18 in Akola, 14 in Pune, two in Latur, six in Satara, five in Buldhana, seven in Amravati, one in Sangli, one in Washim, one in Jalna and one in Nagpur District," a release from the state's animal husbandry department stated, reported a news agency.

The state's animal husbandry department further informed that although lumpy skin disease (LSD) is rapidly spreading, it is not transmitted to human beings either from animals or through cow milk.

"Lumpy skin disease (LSD) has been rapidly spreading all throughout the Maharashtra state. It is a cutaneous viral disease of the bovines. This disease is not transmitted to human beings either from animals or through cow milk," the animal husbandry department release stated.

In the release, IAS officer, Sachindra Pratap Singh appealed on behalf of the government, "Although the



disease has been spreading, the spread is limited to cows and bullocks and is not zoonotic. Strict action will be undertaken in case of spreading rumours on

social media," reported news agency ANI. According to the animal husbandry department, a fund of Rs one crore per district has been made avail-

able through DPC for the purchase of medicines needed in the treatment of the disease. An honorarium of Rs 3 per vaccination has also been admissible to the vaccinators and interns of the Maharashtra Animal and Fisheries Sciences University (MAFSU).

"The Government veterinary officers and private practitioners should carry out treatment as the MAFSU Treatment protocol. It is also requested to all farmers to avail free treatment for their affected cattle at their doorstep by intimating to nearby Government Veterinary Dispensaries / Livestock Development Officers about any symptoms of LSD," the release further said.

Commissioner of the Animal Husbandry said, "According to Section 4(1) of Prevention and Control of Infectious and Communicable Diseases in Animals Act, 2009, every person, non-governmental organization, concerned local self-government body is obliged to report the said information to the nearest veterinary institution if symptoms of this disease are found in animals." The release by Maharashtra's animal husbandry department further advised the Gram-panchayats to carry out spraying of insecticides as a disease is spreading through flies, mosquitoes, ticks etc.

Ladakh decks up to welcome 2K sprinters for 5th Sarhad Kargil Int'l Marathon

The stark hills and dales of Ladakh are all set to welcome over 2,000 sprinters from all over India and some other countries who will participate in the '5th Sarhad Kargil International Marathon' (SKIM), scheduled on Monday (September 19), in Kargil with a theme, 'Run For Apricot', the organisers said here.

The Chief of Army Staff, Gen. Manoj Pande will flag off the 5th SKIM in a virtual ceremony in the presence of top officials, while Lt. Governor Radha Krishna Mathur, Ladakh Police chief ADG Satish Khandhare shall attend the event, said Sarhad Founder Sanjay Nahar in Pune.

"The SKIM is organised in collaboration with Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council Kargil and District Administration Kargil since 2017. The marathon was not held in 2019 and 2020 for various reasons," Nahar told correspondent.

Speaking from site as the early winter chill flits in, Nahar said that the LAHDC CEC Feroz Ahmed Khan and Union Territory of Ladakh CEO Santosh Sukhadeve have reviewed the final preparations for the mega-event in the sparse-oxygen region where first-timers gasp for breath and need to acclimatise for some days.

They will be awarded certificates from EkIndia and a gold-silver-diamond ring designed and donated by Pune-based jewellers Sanket and his brother Sandesh Bijyani.

"The ring is unique, infused with the soil collected from all over India, with 'Bharat' embossed on it signifying the country's ancient identity as a 'sone ki chidiya', a real diamond with the words - 'You Are The Diamond' - engraved on it," said Nahar. Badaun mosque the newest in the eye of a simmering storm

After Varanasi and Mathura, it is now a mosque in Badaun that has attracted controversy with right-wing activists claiming it to be a Neel Kanth Mahadeva temple. A local court in Badaun has issued notices to the parties concerned on a petition filed by one Mukesh Patel who claims to be the state convener of the All India Hindu Mahasabha. The petitioner has claimed that the Jama Masjid complex in Badaun was once a fort of the Hindu king Mahipal. The mosque, according to the petition, was built by demolishing an ancient temple of Neel Kanth Mahadeva by Muslim ruler Shamsuddin Altamash. Recorded history says that the Badaun Jama Masjid was built by Altamash, also called Iluttmish, on his daughter Razia Sultana's birthday. The mosque is called Azimushan Jama Masjid. It is an 800-year-old Masjid, one of the largest and oldest mosques in India. The construction of this mosque started in 1210 AD and was completed in 1223 AD. Senior Division Civil Judge Vijay Kumar Gupta, who admitted the petition, issued notices to the Jama Masjid Vitranaya Samiti, Sunni Waqf Board, Archaeology Department of the Central and UP governments, Badaun District Magistrate, and principal secretary to the UP government, and asked them to file their replies before or on September 15 in this regard. The court has admitted the petition despite the Places of Worship Act 1991 prohibiting the hearing in such cases. According to the 1991 Act, the status of a religious place as it existed on August 15, 1947, cannot be altered. The only exception was the Babri Masjid because a court case was going on in the matter since the British days.

THE IRONY OF CHOICES

Between the young stage in life when career options were conditioned by the pulls of 'social recognition' and the ripe years much later when one had the resources to follow an 'interest-linked' agenda, lies the story of how man-made considerations often impeded the freedom of will and pursuit bestowed by nature on humans.

A welcome socio-economic trend is the legitimisation of options young people today have of exploring career paths outside of the known 'Medical-Engineering-Management' framework, linked to their personal interest in music, photography, filmmaking, research and fashion - and considered by them important enough to justify even raising of personal loans for supporting a startup in the chosen area.

The irony of options that earlier played out in people's lives is somewhere getting resolved in a way that signifies progress and advancement of man's freedom. Opportunities have opened up outside of the traditional thought processes and they measure up to the norms of success in terms of both earnings as well as the personal satisfaction one got of doing things that might not have been socially 'prized' earlier.

Of course, the luxury of options was always available to those who had education and a certain degree of financial backing and was thus a marker of the 'unequal' Indian society. However, the phenomenal growth of the middle and lower middle classes in the post-Covid economic recovery - thanks to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's perceptive call of 'vocal for local' - has widened the area of options even for the ordinary people. In a way, the freedom of choice of work and avocation is returning to everybody in a substantive manner and becoming a transformative feature of the times we live in.

Opting for a meaningful course of life is helped by an understanding set of parents, teachers and well-wishing friends - and the new-age thinking fortunately is traversing across these groups now.

In a real life case, an ordinary middle class family of a widowed mother and three children - a son and two daughters - doesn't mind the son after graduation opting for a two-year special course on helping the growth of handicapped children. The son is satisfied with this profession becoming his source of livelihood.

The work relating to 'special' children chosen by the young man shows a certain human



sensitivity in him but there is also in general a welcome trend noticed in India, of people not making a distinction of 'high' and 'low' in the work that gives them sustainable income.

This is a feature of the developed West where a young man would take up part time work at a patrol pump to supplement his income. A welcome trend in India again is the new determination of boys and girls of humble backgrounds to complete their education and then plunge into an honest attempt to join in the superior civil services - availing of the great equality of opportunity offered by the nation for achieving success through sheer merit. This is helping to make the country's administration more people-oriented and democratic in its ethos. It is somewhere mollifying the ill-effect of extreme class disparities and creating an environ of equitability - all of this becoming possible because of the diversification of options perceived by a free and forward looking society.

Unemployment no doubt had added to the spectacle of poverty but even then the rise of freedom of choice and equality of opportunity has helped alleviate the harsh impact of the latter on social development.

In his last Independence Day address from the Red Fort, Prime Minister Modi perceptively noted that Indian youth have become aspirational in the sense that they show determination to improve on their current placing - whatever it is - and not rest content with status quo. The youth wish to push ahead with their skills and special interests - not bound in the traditional notions of socially recognised 'careers' of distinction - and have already

acquired a global outreach to information of entrepreneurship and trade for thinking of new initiatives. Desire to become part of a chain for product development and delivery has emerged as a great pull that knowledge economy is exercising on active people everywhere.

If the canvas of options is large the youth will be optimistic even in a situation of personal difficulties - Prime Minister Modi fully realised the importance of 'diversity' in the growth story of a developing economy like India's and emphasised this angle in his speech.

An extremely powerful indicator of how things are shaping up in India in recent years in favour of universal growth is the emergence of young Indian women in all spheres of national life - from defence services to business enterprises and from science and technology to holding top Ambassadorial assignments. Complete gender equality is the hallmark of economic growth just as equal participation of women in electoral process benchmarked the state of democracy in the country.

In the Modi regime, the irony of options being restricted earlier by considerations of caste, class and gender has largely been set right. Economic liberalism, emphasis on 'ease of doing business' to attract investment and encouragement to domestic 'startups' and globalisation have enabled India to overcome the handicap of a Covid-affected fiscal system and pull the country out of a dump.

The credit for this largely goes to the strategy laid down by a Prime Minister who knows all about economy and trade and who can see the importance of global outreach

on one hand and the localised measures taken for the benefit of the common man on the other. The single largest reason for inadequate socio-economic development of India after Independence was the rapid rise of corruption in all spheres of the government because of the nexus between politicians, bureaucrats and criminals. The preponderance of corrupt politicians fostered nepotism, weakened law enforcement and destroyed merit based processes. The advent of new rule at the Centre in 2014 was attributable to the trust people reposed in the leadership of Prime Minister Modi that promised personal integrity at the top and governance with a firm hand.

The deep gains of governance at the Centre are visible and opportunities are multiplying even though unemployment and disparities are still to be eliminated. Prime Minister Modi remains the most popular leader of the masses because his endeavours to bring about an improvement are not doubted.

India's youth is optimistic and despite odds remain engaged in creating innovative ways of doing business, starting new 'services' and acquiring new skills.

More and more Indian youth with required education and necessary financial backing are opening into the global economy on the strength of their merit and brilliance and bringing laurels to India and inspiration to the boys and girls here.

Many global digital giants are headed by Indians - Satya Nadella of Microsoft, Sundar Pichai of Alphabet, Shantanu Narayan of Adobe, Parag Agrawal of Twitter and Arvind Krishna of IBM are the leading examples.

The rise of India as an influencer of geopolitics and world economy is giving Indians a new sense of national identity and adding to their determination to forge ahead with their economic pursuits.

The irony of options accepted not for reasons of personal choice but for their social 'prize' is finally getting resolved in favour of new openings in a wide spectrum of opportunities that a nation on the trajectory of growth and international importance is creating. A decisive outcome of the national strategy adopted by the Modi regime will be in evidence in the next few years.

6.9-magnitude quake hits Taiwan



Beijing: A 6.9-magnitude earthquake hit eastern Taiwan's Hualien County at 2:44 p.m. Sunday Beijing Time, according to the China Earthquake Networks Center (CENC).

The epicenter was monitored at 23.15 degrees north latitude and 121.30 degrees east longitude, at a depth of 10 km, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the CENC.

Strong tremor was felt across the island. A three-storey building in Hualien, whose ground floor was a convenience store, collapsed, trapping some people, according to local media. A train carriage was turned over by a fallen rain shed in a railway station in Hualien, but all passengers left safe. A bridge fracture left two people injured. The rescue work is underway, according to local media.

RCEP contributes to region's post-pandemic recovery efforts: ASEAN joint statement

The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) free trade agreement could be a contributor to the region's post-COVID-19 pandemic recovery efforts, according to an ASEAN joint statement released on Sunday.

The statement was issued after the inaugural RCEP Ministers' Meeting held in northwest Cambodia's Siem Reap province, on the sidelines of the 54th ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) Economic Ministers' Meeting.

The meeting welcomed the entry into force of the RCEP agreement on January 1, 2022 and looked forward to its ratification by all signatory states, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the statement.

The mega-regional trade pact comprises 15 Asia-Pacific countries including 10 ASEAN member states - Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam, and their five trading partners, namely China, Japan, South Korea, Australia and New Zealand.

"The meeting shared the view that the RCEP could contribute to the region's post-pandemic recovery efforts and to creating a more resilient supply chain," the statement said. "In this regard, the meeting highlighted the need to promote greater utilisation of the RCEP agreement to deepen regional



economic integration." The meeting also noted the progress of the work of the RCEP Joint Committee and welcomed the establishment of subsidiary bodies under the joint committee's supervision, it said.

"The meeting encouraged officials to work to expand the utilization of the RCEP agreement and to monitor and review the implementation of the RCEP agreement to improve business environment in the region," the statement said. Also, the meeting looked forward to the expeditious establishment of the RCEP Secretariat, on terms to be agreed by the parties, to provide secretariat and technical sup-

port to the RCEP Joint Committee and its subsidiary bodies, it added. "The RCEP trade deal is an important instrument to boost the post-pandemic economic recovery in the region," Cambodian Ministry of Commerce's Undersecretary of State and Spokesman Penn Sovicheat said during a press conference after the meeting.

"For Cambodia, the RCEP has injected new momentum into our foreign trade growth, and we have seen a remarkable rise in our export to the RCEP member countries in the first half of this year," he added.

Sovicheat said Cambodia's total export to the RCEP member countries had increased to 3.28 billion US dollars during the January-June period of 2022, up 10 percent from the same period last year.

Thong Mengdaiv, a research fellow at the Phnom Penh-based Asian Vision Institute, said the RCEP established the biggest trade bloc in the world's history, covering nearly a third of the global population, around 30 percent of the global gross domestic product (GDP), and 28 percent of global trade.

"With free flow of products and more relaxing trade barriers among the 15 member states, RCEP provides various benefits and opportunities for the bloc to diversify their markets and enhance the production capability," he told Xinhua.

Over 1,500 killed, 12,000 injured in Pakistan's monsoon rains, floods

The total death toll in Pakistan from this season's monsoon rains and floods since mid-June has risen to around 1,545, along with 12,860 injured, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) said.

According to a report released by the NDMA on Saturday evening, 552 children and 315 women were among those who lost their lives in separate rain or flood-related accidents in the country.

The country's southern Sindh province was the worst-hit region where 678 people were killed, followed by northwest Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and southwest

Balochistan provinces which reported 306 and 299 deaths, respectively, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the NDMA.

Moreover, 1,943,978 houses were destroyed and 9,43,909 livestock perished in different parts of Pakistan, the report said.

It added that 12,735 km-long roads and 375 bridges have been damaged throughout the season.

Additionally, 81 districts and an estimated 33,046,329 people have been affected by the floods, according to statistics published by the NDMA. Rescue and relief operations by the NDMA, other government organizations, volunteers and non-government organizations were underway in the flood-hit area.

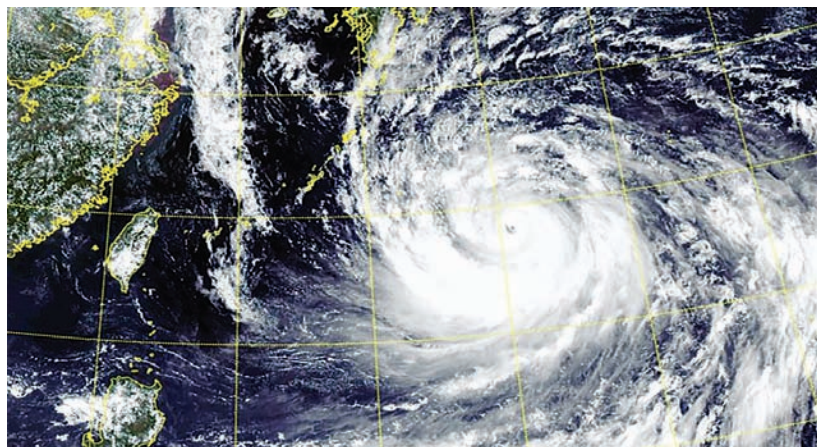
Japan's Kyushu region braces for possibility of powerful typhoon landing

Japan's southwestern region of Kyushu on Sunday braced for the possibility of a large and powerful typhoon landing, with the weather agency warning of unprecedented winds and waves.

"The southern part of the Kyushu region may see the sort of violent wind, high waves and high tides that have never been experienced before," the Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA) said Sunday, urging residents to exercise "the highest caution possible."

A level 5 alert, the highest on Japan's disaster warning scale, was issued to more than 110,000 people in about 55,000 households in Kagoshima and Miyazaki Prefectures, with level 4 evacuation orders in place in cities such as Kagoshima, Miyazaki and Amakusa, Xinhua news agency reported quoting



public broadcaster NHK reported on Sunday.

According to the JMA, the eye of Typhoon Nanmadol is south of Kyushu as of Sunday morning. It is slowly making its way in a north-northwesterly direction over the sea 30 km south-east of Yakushima island and packing gusts up to 252 km per hour.

Nanmadol, the 14th of the year, is forecast to make landfall in Kyushu on Sunday evening, before curving northeast and traveling across Japan's largest island, Honshu, through early Wednesday.

The weather agency issued a special typhoon warning for Kagoshima Prefecture on Saturday night, an alert that is issued only when it forecasts dangerous conditions seen once in several decades, marking the first time the agency has issued a such warning for an area apart from Okinawa Prefecture.

Weather officials also warned that rain and winds could intensify even in areas far from the typhoon. Heavy precipitation is expected in western and some parts of eastern Japan through Monday.

3 killed in mid-air plane collision in US Colorado

Three people were killed after two small planes collided in mid-air in the US state of Colorado, authorities said.

The collision was first reported at 8:54 a.m. local time (1454 GMT) on Saturday, according to the Boulder County Sheriff's Office.

The US National Transportation Safety Board confirmed in a tweet that it is investigating the mid-air collision of a Cessna 172 and a Sonex Xenos aircraft near Longmont, Colorado.

First responders discovered two separate crash sites, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the Sheriff's Office.

"The first crashed aircraft was found in the 10,000 block of Niwot Rd on the south side. At this time there are two confirmed occupants in the aircraft, both of whom were deceased upon first responders arriving on scene," said the sheriff's office in a statement.

"The second crashed aircraft was found in the 9,700 block of Niwot Rd on the north side," and the one confirmed occupant in it was also deceased before responders' arrival, the sheriff's office said.



AJIVIKA SCHEME TURNING WOMEN LABOURERS INTO SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS

The 'Ajivika Mission' in Madhya Pradesh that aims to transform the lives of poor and weaker sections is writing a new success story.

The self-help groups (SHGs), constituted under the Madhya Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission (MPSRLM), have given opportunity to many women in the state to become small business owners from labourers. They are not just living a happy life, but are also showing a new path to their colleagues.

More than 45 lakh women, associated with over 3.86 lakh women SHGs, are working under MPSRLM or the state Ajivika Mission.

These groups are involved in vegetable production, milk production, incense sticks, hand wash, soap making, agriculture and animal husbandry based livelihood activities and operation of livelihood nutrition 'vatika'.

One of these SHGs is being run by Sunita Adivasi of Sheopur. Earlier, she used to earn a daily wage of Rs



30 to 50 as a labourer but today she became an owner. She joined a SHG and took a loan of Rs 70,000 to set up a flour mill.

The flour mill ran in such a way that she started earning over Rs 30,000 every month from it and repaid the loan amount.

Later, she took another loan of Rs 50,000 for farming related activities and got a tubewell installed. Not only

this, she planted guava in 2.5 bigha of land, apart from this she has bought a four wheeler, which she calls 'Ajivika vahan' (livelihood vehicle). Sunita Adivasi, while remembering her old days, recalls that once she had to worry for wages, but today she has become an owner and is earning more than Rs 70,000 every month. Her annual income is more than 10 lakhs.

Similar is the story of Kalia Bai Kushwaha of Sheopur's Karahal, who is associated with Radha SHG.

She says that when she joined the SHG, her life started transforming. Kushwaha recalls that in the past, on several occasions they (she and her family) could barely arrange meals in a day. Together she and her husband used to earn hardly Rs 150 per day.

Today the situation has changed. She took a loan and then bought a hand cart on which she started selling ice cream. Along with that she also bought a sewing machine. Gradually the situation changed and today she has become an owner.

Kushwaha says that about 450 women are associated with the SHG, out of which 300 were such women who used to go out in search of work, but today their conditions have changed. Women have also been given training in fish farming and are earning handsome money.

Overall, the status of women associated with SHGs working under MPSRLM is constantly transforming, making them owners from labourers and servants.

NAGAL WINS AFTER YUKI/SAKETH LOSE AS INDIA GO DOWN 1-3 VS NORWAY

Lillehammer (Norway) | Agencies

Former Junior Wimbledon winner Sumit Nagal restored some pride for India by winning a rubber as Norway won 3-1 in the Davis Cup World Group First Round match here on Saturday.

With Norway taking an unassailable 3-0 lead, Nagal defeated Lukas Hllum Lilleengen in straight games, winning in one hour and 22 minutes in the inconsequential rubber of the five-match tie. Nagal, the 25-year-old from Jaitpur, Haryana, won 6-2, 6-1.

Nagal's victory came after India had lost the World Group First Round encounter to Norway after Yuki Bhambri and Saketh Myneni put up a strong fight but lost to US Open finalists Casper Ruud and Viktor Durasovic.

Bhambri and Myneni came back strongly after losing the first set to win the second but down in the third to lose 3-6, 6-3, 3-6 in a two-hour encounter at the Hakans Hall in Lillehammer.

Trailing 0-2 after India's top singles player Prajesh Gunneswaran went down to Ruud, the World No. 2 in



ATP Rankings, in straight sets -- 6-1, 6-4 and then Ramkumar Ramanathan too slumped to the same scoreline (6-1, 6-4) against Viktor Durasovic.

India's hopes of making a fightback depended on the doubles combination of Bhambri and Myneni, which has won six titles in the last year or so.

With senior doubles player Rohan Bopanna unavailable due to an injury, India had to depend on the Bhambri and Myneni but the duo got off to a poor start as Ruud and Durasovic won the first set.

The Indian pair lost its serve in the second game, but broke back immediately and levelled the score 2-2. But

the Norwegians broke back again in the sixth game (4-2) and went on to win the set 6-3. The Indian pair had a lot of chances -- they had six break points but could convert only one -- but could not capitalise on them.

They won 80% of points on the first serve and were also ahead on points won on the second serve. The Norway pair converted two of the four break points while the Indians won one out of six.

The tables turned in the second set as the Norwegian pair failed to convert even one of the 14 break points they won while the Indians converted the lone break point to win the set 6-3.

Games went with serve till 3-2 in the second set before the Indians broke Ruud and Durasovic to go up 4-2.

In the decider, the Indians lost the plot after 1-1 as they lost their serve in the fourth game as they went down 3-1. The hosts then went ahead 4-1 and went on to win the third set 6-3 to seal the tie in Norway's favour.

India will now go back to qualifiers again and play against one of the winners of World Group 2 teams.

India - Australia T20I series

Shami ruled out due to Covid-19, Umesh named replacement

Senior India fast-bowler Mohammed Shami on Sunday has been ruled out of the upcoming T20I series against Australia after testing positive for Covid-19, said the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI).

The BCCI further said that pacer Umesh Yadav will replace Shami for the three-match series against Australia, starting from September 20 in Mohali. Notably, Umesh recently returned from his county stint with Middlesex in England, due to a quad muscle injury and was supposed to go for rehab.

"Fast bowler Mohd. Shami will not be able to take part in the upcoming three-day Mastercard T20I series against Australia after testing positive for COVID-19. The All-India Senior Selection Committee has named Umesh Yadav as his replacement," said the BCCI in an official release. Shami had not played any competitive cricket after playing in the ODI series against England in July 2022. He has not played a T20I for India since their campaign in the T20 World Cup ended at Super 12 stage in the UAE in November 2021.

But his vast experience, and his performance in the IPL 2022, where he picked 20 wickets in 16 matches for champions Gujarat Titans, including 11 wickets in power-play, were sufficient to get him as a standby for the T20 World Cup in Australia to be held next month. The T20Is against Australia, starting from first game in Mohali on Tuesday, followed by second game in Nagpur on September 23 and final match on September



25 in Hyderabad, and then another three-match T20I series against South Africa on September 28, October 2 and 4, had provided India to test Shami in terms of performance, fitness and preparation. For Umesh, who last played a T20I match for India in February 2019, it is a chance for him to play for the country in the shortest format of the game in almost two and a half years. In IPL 2022, Umesh picked 16 wickets for Kolkata Knight Riders at an average of 21.18 and economy rate of 7.06. In Middlesex's Royal London One-Day Cup campaign, he picked 16 wickets at an average of 20.25 and economy rate of 5.17.

Nwaneri has featured at Under-18 and Under-21 levels for Arsenal this season and the attacking midfielder earned a spot in Mikel Arteta's squad with the likes of Martin Odegaard and Emile Smith-Rowe unavailable due to injury.

The schoolboy was promoted to first-team training this week having made his Under-21



debut at the beginning of September. The attacking midfielder has recorded four goals and assists in four league games between the Under-18 and Under-21 this campaign. He caught the eyes of Arsenal fans when he scored on his Under-18 debut last year at the age of just 14, with many hoping that he would go on to be the next big thing.

INDIA A BEAT NEW ZEALAND A BY 113 RUNS, WIN SERIES 1-0

Augsburg defended well and almost finished off a counterattack, but Bayern custodian Manuel Neuer was equal to Florian Niederlechner's hammer from 20 metres in the 24th minute, reports Xinhua. The German giants started an onslaught on Augsburg's goal but neither Jamal Musiala nor Leon Goretzka was able to break the deadlock before the half time.

The "Fuggerstadter" eventually flabbergasted Bayern with the opener at the hour mark when



Berisha tapped home a loose ball from 11 meters following a free kick. Bayern pressed frenetically for the draw but Thomas Muller and Sane couldn't beat Gikiewicz from promising positions. Augsburg's goalkeeper remained in the thick of things as he defused a dangerous header from Neuer in the dying seconds of the game. The hosts' defence stood firm and ensured

Milos Veljkovic's late 1-1 equalizer helped newcomers Werder Bremen to share the spoils with Bayer Leverkusen and Jonas Hofmann's first-half brace secured Borussia Monchengladbach a 3-0 victory over Leipzig.

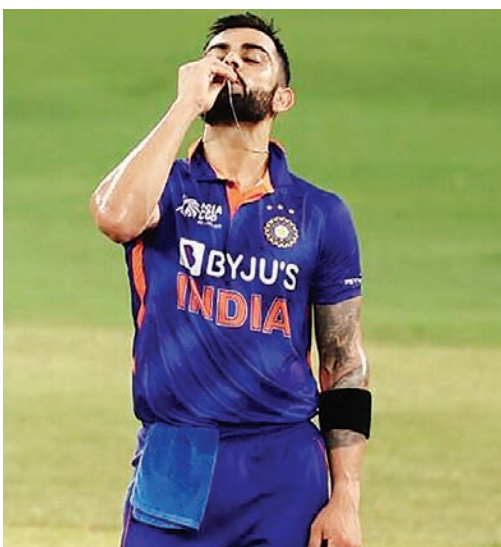
