Global stocks hit two-year lows on Friday and bonds faced an eighth weekly loss, as investors digested the prospect of a far more aggressive rise in US interest rates.

Asian and European equities headed for deep weekly losses as rising interest rates across the globe threaten to sharply curtail economic growth, weighing on risk appetite and as surveys showed the downturn in business activity across the euro zone and Britain deepened this month.

Goldman Sachs Group Inc. slashed its year-end target for the



DOW ALSO TUMBLES

New York: US stocks fell sharply on Friday as investors continued to worry about even more rate hikes from the Federal Reserve that could land the US economy in a recession, the media reported.

The Dow was down 289 points, or 1 per cent, at the market open. The S&P 500 fell 1.1 per cent and The Nasdaq composite was 1.1 per cent lower, CNN reported.

The Dow opened below 30,000 points, a level it briefly breached Thursday. If the Dow ends the day below 30,000, it would be the first time it closed below that barrier since June 17. And a somewhat more sizable plunge could land the index at on a two-year low on Friday. Investors do not have many places to make money at the moment: In addition to sinking stocks, the bond market is also selling off, sending US Treasury yields soaring to 11-year highs in recent days.

S&P 500 Index to 3,600 from 4,300, citing a higher interest-rate path from the Federal Reserve, while strategists gave up on a year-end rally for European stocks as privatesector activity in the region contin-

ued to contract.

After remaining resilient against the global weakness in equities, Nifty gave in over the past three sessions. Nifty fell sharply for the second consecutive week (down 1.16 per cent), breaking some key technical levels on the way.

RUPEE SLIPS FIRST TIME BELOW 81-**MARK AGAINST USD**

Indian rupee on Friday ended 13 paise down against the US dollar, at 80.99,

after hitting record lows during the morning trade.

At close, the rupee ended at 80.99 as against 80.86 on the previous trading session.

In the morning trade, the rupee hit 81-mark against the US dollar for the first time, because of uncertainty created after the uptick in dollar index, increase in policy rate by the US Fed and Bank of England, and escalation in geopolitical tensions between Russia and Ukraine.

Moreover, the negative trends in the domestic equities also weighed on sentiments.

fter meeting Rahul Gandhi in Kerala, Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Friday said that he will be filing the nomination for the post of Congress president, and added that Sonia Gandhi and general secretary in-charge Ajay Maken will decide on the CM face.

Gehlot said, "In the meeting, Rahul Gandhi clearly said that this time only non-Gandhi will become the president. This is the final decision, the president will not be made from the Gandhi family."

On the question of leaving the post of CM, Gehlot said that whoever becomes the Congress president, and till date whoever has become the Congress president, that person has not been the Chief Minister. "If I get a chance, I will work as the Congress President only." On the question of the next face if the CM post falls vacant in Rajasthan, Gehlot said that Sonia Gandhi will decide about the next process. "Sonia Gandhi and general secretary in-charge Ajay Maken will decide together," he said.

NOT IN RACE FOR CONG PRESIDENT POST: DIGVIJAYA SINGH

Bhopal: Congress' Rajya Sabha MP Digvijaya Singh on Friday said he is not in the race for the post of the party president. "I have already said... and I am reiterating that I am not interested in becoming the party's national president," the former Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister told reporters. The senior Congress leader made the remarks while interacting with the mediapersons during his visit to Jabalpur. Singh's statement has come a day after he visited the party headquarters in Delhi.

Meanwhile, the party top brass has asked Sachin Pilot to stay put in Jaipur and meet MLAs till a final decision is taken. Pilot reportedly flew to Jaipur on Friday after being in Bharat Jodo Yatra and is waiting for the decision. However, it is not clear yet whether Gehlot will first step down as Chief Minister and contest, or resign after the election.

He said Bhagwat's meeting with Ilyasi was part of the Sangh's initiative to hold a dialogue with the minority communities, which began more than 20 years ago under the leadership of the outfit's former chief, KS Sudershan.

SC REFUSES PLEA FOR WARNING LABELS ON BOTTLES

he Supreme Court on Friday declined to entertain a plea seeking regulation on the production, distribution, and consumption of intoxicating drinks and drugs in the national capital and also health warning stickers on liquor bottles alike cigarette packets. The plea filed by advocate Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay sought a direction to the government to publish health warnings on liquor bottles similar to the criteria adopted for warning signs on cigarette packets -- and the same should be advertised through electronic, print, and social media. The bench, also comprising Justices S. Ravindra Bhat and Indira Banerjee, said that there are thoughts and counter thoughts, and some people say liquor taken in small quantities is good for health and nowhere similar things are said about cigarettes. The bench expressed its disinclination in entertaining the petition. "Either you withdraw this or we will dismiss it. This is a policy matter," said the bench.

Private security agency personnel to be deployed at 60 airports

n line with the decision of the Centre, a total of 1,924 Private Security Agency (PSA) personnel will be deployed at 60 airports, in place of Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), at noncore duty posts.

As per the Airport Authority of India, the decision will reduce the security expenditure and these CISF personnel can be deployed at other airports which will further strengthen the security set-up. This will further help in operationalisation of new domestic and international



airports. The AAI has appointed 581 security personnel from Directorate General

Resettlement-sponsored security agencies for noncore posts at 45 Airports.

These Security personnel will be deployed after completion of Aviation Security (AVSEC) training programme at selected airports. As on date, 161 DGR personnel for 16 airports are attending AVSEC training programs and they will be deployed after completion of training from

September 24. At Kolkata Airport, already 74 DGR security personnel have been deployed from September 9 after attending the AVSEC training programme. Deployment process of the remaining security personnel is under process.

RAPE ACCUSED IN **UP GETS LIFE TERM AFTER 10-DAY TRIAL**

Pratapgarh: A POCSO court in Uttar Pradesh's Pratapgarh district completed a trial in ten days by convicting the accused in a rape case and awarding life sentence to

The court of additional district judge (POCSO Act), Pankaj Kumar Srivastava, on Thursday, pronounced life sentence for Bhupendra and imposed a penalty of Rs 20,000.

Pratapgarh Superintendent of Police Satpal Antil, who led the probe in the case, said that the minor girl was raped under Kotwali police station area on August 13.

The forensic investigation confirmed rape of the girl. Later, the chargesheet was filed on September 3 under the charges of rape, kidnapping, abduction or inducing woman to compel her marriage along with the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012, said the officer.

The court began the trial of the case on September 12.

The greater the child's exposure before age five, the greater the brain structure alteration observed in preadolescence, according to the team led by the Barcelona Institute for Global

the study

Health (ISGlobal). "The novel aspect of the present study is that it identified periods of susceptibility to air pollution. We measured exposure using a finer time

scale by analysing the data on a month-by-month basis, unlike previous studies in which data was analysed for trimesters of pregnancy or childhood years," said AnneClaire Binter, ISGlobal researcher and first author of

In this study, "we analysed the children's exposure to air pollution from conception to 8.5 years of age on a monthly basis", Binter added.

In addition to the association between air pollution and white matter microstructure, the study also found a link between specific exposure to fine particulate matter (PM2.5) and the volume of the "putamen", a brain structure involved in motor function, learning processes and many other functions.

Kerala Police register 53 cases, 127 PFI activists arrested for violence

n one of the worst ever damages inflicted in a day long shutdown in Kerala, angry Popular Front of India (PFI) created mayhem and at the end of the day, 70 KSRTC buses was damaged, besides damaging other vehicles and properties.

PFI activists called for a dawn-to-dusk shutdown to protest the arrest of 19 fellow activists including their leaders, as part of an early morning joint operation by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Thursday.

MEA issues advisory for Indians in Canada amid rising hate crimes

he Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Friday issued an advisory for Indian nationals in Canada in the wake of a "sharp increase in incidents of hate crimes, sectarian violence and anti-India activities in Canada".

The Ministry and the High Commission/Consulates General in Canada have "taken up these incidents with the Canadian authorities and requested them to investigate the said crimes and take appropriate action", the advisory said.

"The perpetrators of these crimes have not been brought to justice so far in Canada," it added.

In view of the increasing incidences of the said crimes, "Indian nationals and students from India in Canada and those proceeding to Canada for travel/education are advised to exercise due caution and remain vigilant". The advisory went on to mention that Indian nationals



and students from India in Canada may also register with the High Commission in Ottawa or Consulates Generalin Toronto and Vancouver through their respective websites, or

the MADAD portal madad.gov.in. "Registration would enable the High Commission and the Consulates General to better connect event of any requirement or emergency," it added

One of two SC judges has RSS connections, says SGPC

lleging that the Supreme Court's judgment regarding the Harvana Sikh Gurdwara (Management) (HSGMC) Act, 2014, was influenced by Rashtriya Sawayamsevak Sangh (RSS) ideology, Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) president Harjinder Singh Dhami on Friday alleged that one of the two apex court judges who delivered the judgment was associated with the RSS.

Talking to mediapersons after holding the SGPC's Executive Committee meeting, Dhami alleged: "The Supreme Court judgment given by two judges regarding separate HSGMC Act is purely politically motivated and one judge among them has a direct association with the RSS. Therefore, this judg-



cal interests, in place of being the one of the Supreme Court's."The SGPC president said that he had evidence" of one judge having an association with RSS and soon, his name would be publicised.

The Executive Committee of SGPC also rejected the Supreme Court's judgment of upholding the validity of the Haryana Sikh Gurdwara (Management) (HSGMC) Act, 2014, terming it politically motivated.

The meeting was held at

Chandigarh on Friday. The resolution clearly stated that the Gurdwara Act passed by the state government cannot affect the jurisdiction of SGPC, while The Sikh Gurdwaras Act, 1925 is in force.

SC stays probe against former Karnataka CM Yedi yurappa

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Friday stayed the investigation in an FIR lodged by the Lokayukta police against former Karnataka Chief Minister B.S. Yediyurappa in a corruption case in connection with the award of a Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) contract. Senior advocates Mukul Rohatgi and Siddharth Dave, representing Yediyurappa, contended before a bench headed by Justice D.Y. Chandrachud that the Karnataka High Court ignored the fact that it was mandatory to obtain prior sanction before issuing an order to register an FIR. The counsel, representing complainant activist T.J. Abraham, argued that prior sanction requirements had been dispensed with the latest amendment in law in connection with cases, which arise out of complaints filed under Section 156(3) of the Criminal Procedure Code.

Gurugram | Agencies

he incessant spell of light to moderate rain, which continued on the second day on Friday lead to heavy waterlogging in several areas of Gurugram, leading to massive traffic snarls at many places.

According to the district administration, Gurugram tehsil recorded 114 mm and Wazirabad tehsil recorded 130 mm of rainfall in two days till 7.30 a.m.

Rainwater entered the houses in Sheetla Colony, Palam Vihar, Surat Nagar, Prem Nahar, Sector-14, Chakkarpur village, Natupur, DLF-3, Rajiv Nagar, Sanjay Gram and several other loca-

Multiple city roads, including state highways and the Delhi-Jaipur, were submerged in an average of three feet of water.

However, the district administration claimed that the rainwater has been flushed out from several locations but the traffic movement on the Delhi-Jaipur was severely hit due to rain.

Traffic movement on the Delhi-Jaipur-Mumbai highway was majorly hit due to waterlogging. The worst-hit areas are the Delhi-Jaipur



Expressway (NH-48) service lane near Hero Honda Chowk, IffCO Chowk, Jharsa Chowk, Sector-31, Narsinghpur, Sohna Road, Basai Chowk, Sohna Chowk, Sector 4-7-9, Hanuman Chowk, Atlas Chowk, Artemis Road, Kanhai Chowk, Golf Course Road, Vatika Chowk, Subhash Chowk, Baghtawar Chowk, Atul Kataria

Chowk, Kapashera border, Udyog Vihar, Jocbpura, Sadar Bazar, Mahavir Chowk, Dundahera near Medanta underpass and Jawala


Apart from these areas, Sheetla Mata Road, Sector-12 market Road, Sanjay Gram Road, Old Delhi Road, Palam Vihar Road, Kartepuri Chowk, Sector-4 Road, Udyog Vihar and Signature Tower Chowk were also badly affected by the waterlogging.Both vehicular traffic and pedestrian movement were disrupted due to waterlogging on multiple stretches.

Despite the administration's work from home advisory, the traffic was badly affected and the police struggled to keep the vehicles moving. The policemen were seen standing in knee-deep water while struggling to keep the traffic going.

People also took to Twitter to post pictures and videos of their areas.

The rainwater has not only submerged in the city's main stretches, bus stand and connecting roads but also accumulated on the internal sector roads. The traffic police were quick to issue online alerts via Twitter about severely affected areas and deploy staff to clear the jams.

NHSRCL invited bids to construct India's First Undersea Tunnel for bullet train

ational High Speed Railway Corporation Limited or NHSR-CL has invited bids for the construction of a 21-km-long tunnel, seven km of which will be under the sea, for the Mumbai-Ahmedabad High Speed Rail Corridor.

As per sources, the work on the bullet train corridor has gained momentum after the change in government in Maharashtra, with tenders, which were previously floated and withdrawn, being renewed again.

Considered the highlight of the project, the tunnel will be built between the underground station at Bandra-Kurla Complex and Shilphata in Thane district of Maharashtra.



The tunnel will be built using tunnel boring machine and the New Austrian Tunneling Method (NATM), according to the tender document. The sevenkm undersea tunnel at Thane Creek will be the first undersea tunnel to come up in the country.

In November last year, NHSRCL had invited bids for underground tunnelling works for the project. But it was cancelled this year with officials citing "administrative reasons". In 2019, NHSRCL had first invited tenders for the project but didn't attract any bidder. It again floated tenders in November 2021. Land acquisition for the project in Maharashtra, including at Bandra-Kurla Complex, had been a festering issue during the previous state government, sources informed.

Meanwhile, another accused, Mahesh Raut, also moved an application for medical treatment. The court directed the jail superintendent to provide necessary medical aid and to refer the accused to a government hospital if required. The court also received a letter from Taloja Central Prison in neighboring Navi Mumbai regarding misbehav-

iour of accused Sagar Gorkhe. The case relates to alleged inflammatory speeches made at the Elgar Parishad conclave held in Pune on December 31, 2017, which the police claimed triggered violence the next day near the Koregaon Bhima war memorial on the outskirts of the western Maharashtra city Pune police had claimed the conclave

was organised by people with Maoist links and had lodged a case on January 8, 2018 under various sections of Indian Penal Code and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

"I will not back out from any responsibility and will serve the party wherever and in whichever capacity I am required in this hour of crisis," he said. However, Gehlot also said that the party wants Rahul Gandhi to take over as the next Congress President. Gehlot also dropped hint that he can manage the posts of both the party chief and Chief Minister of Rajasthan simultaneously. The Rajasthan Chief Minister said he is not aspiring for any post, but wants to work towards ousting the 'fascist' BJP government. NUKE-POWERED US AIRCRAFT CARRIER ARRIVES IN S.KOREA

Seoul | New York

nuclear-powered US aircraft carrier arrived in South Korea on Friday for its first combined drills after five years, as Washington and Seoul are striving to reinforce deterrence against evolving North Korean military

The USS Ronald Reagan docked at ROK Fleet Command in Busan, 390 km south of Seoul, amid worries about the possibility of the North staging a nuclear test or other provocations, reports Yonhap News Agency.

The arrival of the carrier, a centrepiece of America's naval might, came after Presidents Yoon Suk-yeol and Joe Biden reaffirmed their commitment to deploy US strategic assets in a "timely and coordinated manner as necessary' during their summit in Seoul in May.

The deployment of the carrier here is designed to demonstrate the robustness of the South Korea-U.S. alliance, and deter North Korea's nuclear and missile threats," a Seoul official told Yonhap News Agency on condition of anonymity. Its carrier strike group consists of three vessels -- the Nimitz-class carrier; USS Chancellorsville, a Ticonderogaclass guided-missile cruiser; and USS



Barry, an Arleigh Burke-class guided missile destroyer.

The three warships plan to join the combined drills off South Korea's east coast later this month.

The nuclear-powered USS Annapolis submarine is also expected to take part. Commissioned in July 2003, the 97,000-tonne, 333-meter-long Ronald Reagan is America's only forwarddeployed aircraft carrier.

Since 2015, the super-carrier has been based in the Japanese city of Yokosuka,

which is home to the US 7th Fleet It can carry over 5,000 sailors as well as formidable on-board assets, including F/A-18E Super Hornets, and E-2D Hawkeye early warning and control air-

The strike group sails with 33 partners and allies for bilateral or multilateral maritime exercises and operations, according to the US Navy.

In 2021, the carrier was deployed to support the withdrawal of US troops and others from Afghanistan.

23 CHINESE **NATIONALS MISSING AFTER BOAT CAPSIZES** IN CAMBODIA

Phnom Penh: At least 23 Chinese nationals were missing after a boat capsized in Cambodia, Beijing's Embassy in Phnom Penh confirmed on

The Embassy said that it received a notification from the Cambodian Police Department on Thursday night, saying that the boat carried a total of 40 Chinese nationals on board, of which 18 were rescued following the accident, reports Xinhua news

Two Cambodian crew members involved have been arrested.

According to the rescued persons, the boat had departed from Guangzhou on September 11 and were in distress shortly after arriving in the waters of Preah Sihanouk province. The rescue and search operation is currently underway.

Regulation passed to protect Great Wall of China's oldest section

uthorities in China's Shandong province has the protection of the Great Wall of Qi, the oldest existing section of the Unesco World Heritage Site.

Lawmakers approved the regulation at the 38th session of the Standing Committee of the 13th Shandong Provincial People's Congress on Wednesday, and it will take

effect on January 1, 2023, reports Xinhua news agency

The Great Wall of Qi, with a total length of 641 km, was built during the Spring and Autumn Period (770 B.C.-476 B.C.) and the Warring States Period (475 B.C.-221 B.C.).

The new regulation specifies the responsibilities of various departments, and emphasizes regional cooperation on the protection and utilization of the Great Wall of Qi.

It states that local governments will establish a dynamic conservation system using remote sensing satellites, drones, information platforms and other technological means to monitor the Great Wall, its related infrastructures and the surrounding envi-

Tourism services featuring the Great Wall will be further standardised to balance protection and development, according to the



Great Wall of Qi faces many challenges, and therefore, it is necessary to provide a solid legal guarantee for its conservation efforts, said Qi Yan'an, an official with the provincial justice department.

According to the Unesco, the Great Wall was continuously built from the 3rd century B.C. to the 17th century A.D. on the northern border of the country as the great military defence project of successive Chinese Empires, with a total length of more than 20,000 km.

The Great Wall begins in the east at Shanhaiguan in Hebei province and ends at Jiayuguan in Gansu province to the west.

Its main body consists of walls, horse tracks, watch towers, and shelters on the wall, and includes fortresses and passes

"The number of flood rescues continue to rise with people being trapped in their vehicles. We are again reminding people to monitor road conditions and if you should come across flood-affected roads, make the safe decision, turn around and find an alternate route," York said.

Boeing to pay \$200mn to settle charges over misleading investors about 737 MAX tification process with respect

S aerospace major Boeing will pay \$200 million and its former CEO will pay \$1 millions to settle charges over misleading investors after the two deadly crashes involving 737 MAX planes, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC)

The crashes of Lion Air Flight 610 in October 2018 and Ethiopian Airlines Flight 302 in March 2019 involved the 737 MAX airplane and a flight control function called the Maneuvering Characteristics Augmentation System, reorts Xinhua news agency.



According to the SEC's orders, after the first crash, Boeing and then Chief **Executive Officer Dennis** Muilenburg knew that system posed an ongoing airplane safety issue, but nevertheless

assured the public that the 737 MAX plane was "as safe as any that has ever flown the skies".

Later, following the second crash, Boeing and Muilenburg assured the public that there were no slips or gaps in the certo the system, despite being aware of contrary information. "In times of crisis and

tragedy, it is especially important that public companies and executives provide full, fair, and truthful disclosures to the markets," SEC Chair Gary Gensler said in a statement.

'The Boeing Company and its former CEO, Dennis Muilenburg, failed in this most basic obligation," Gensler said. "They misled investors by providing assurances about the safety of the 737 MAX, despite knowing about serious safety concerns.'

"Boeing and Muilenburg put profits over people by mislead-

ing investors about the safety of the 737 MAX all in an effort to rehabilitate Boeing's image following two tragic accidents that resulted in the loss of 346 lives and incalculable grief to so many families," said Gurbir S. Grewal, director of the SEC's enforcement division.

The SEC's orders against Boeing and Muilenburg find that they negligently violated the anti-fraud provisions of federal securities laws.



he Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) is planning to organise the Indian Premier League (IPL) auction ahead of the 2023 season in mid-December this year.

A report in Cricbuzz says the date for IPL auction is likely to be December 16. It also added that the tentative schedule for 2023 IPL season has been discussed amongst franchises who were indicated of the same through informal conversations with authorities in BCCI and IPL.

"Understandably, it will be a mini-auction but the venue has not yet been finalised. Dates for the league are still not known but it is likely to start in the fourth week of March with the home and away format restored," said the report.

The report also said that the salary purse for the player auction will be Rs 95 crores, which is five crores more from last year's auction. "Which means each team will have reserves of at least Rs 5 crore to start with. The purse can further swell if a franchise releases its players or trades them," added the report.

In terms of personnel, with speculations rife about all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja and four-time champions Chennai Super Kings parting ways, there were reports that there might be a trade between the franchise and current champions Gujarat Titans for Jadeja and opener Shubman Gill, which both teams have denied.

There have also been trade requests from others, including 2020 IPL runners-up Delhi Capitals. But the report cited CSK management saying that it has no plans to part ways with Jadeja, who is recovering from right knee surgery and won't be a



part of India's squad for Men's T20 World Cup in Australia next month. The report added that the Titans got requests for trade of leg-spin all-rounder Rahul Tewatia and left-arm spinner R Sai Kishore, but they declined the offers. "The transfer/trade window will remain open till one week before the auction and will re-open after it," concluded the report.BCCI President Sourav Ganguly had recently written to state units that IPL 2023

will revert back to usual home and away format,

something which hadn't happened in last three editions due to Covid-19 pandemic. "The next season of men's IPL will also go back to the home and away format with all 10 teams playing their home matches at their designated venues.

On the women's IPL, scheduled to start next year, Ganguly said, "The BCCI is currently working on the much-awaited Women's IPL. We are expecting to start the first season early next year. More details on this will follow in due course

The victory is Zhang's 34th of the season more than double her 2021 tally of 15. She is the first Chinese player to advance to the Tokyo semifinals since Li Na in 2009.

Zhang will face Liudmila Samsonova for a spot in her third final of the season.

Though he was part of nine medal-winners that received their cash incentive during a ceremony held at the PM House recently, his amount was withheld by the PSB.
