

Several anti-cancer drugs, antibiotics and vaccines will now become more affordable as they are among 34 new additions to the National List of Essential Medicines, with the government saying this will reduce "patients' out-of-pocket expenditure".

► ANTI-INFECTIVES LIKE IVERMECTIN, MUPIROCIIN AND MEROPENEM HAVE ALSO BEEN ADDED TO THE LIST, TAKING THE TOTAL DRUGS UNDER IT TO 384. IN THE REVISED LIST, ENDOCRINE MEDICINES AND CONTRACEPTIVES FLUDROCORTISONE, ORMELOXIFENE, INSULIN GLARGINE AND TENELIGLITIN HAVE BEEN ADDED. MONTELUKAST, WHICH ACTS ON THE RESPIRATORY TRACK, AND OPHTHALMOLOGICAL DRUG LATANOPROST ALSO FIGURE IN THE LIST.

► FOUR MAJOR ANTI-CANCER DRUGS - BENDAMUSTINE HYDROCHLORIDE, IRINOTECAN HCl TRIHYDRATE, LENALIDOMIDE AND LEUPROLIDE ACETATE WHICH ARE EFFECTIVE IN VARIOUS TYPES OF CANCERS - AND PSYCHOTHERAPEUTIC MEDICINES - NICOTINE REPLACEMENT THERAPY AND BUPRENORPHINE - HAVE BEEN ADDED TO THE LIST.

categories. Several antibiotics, vaccines, anti-cancer drugs and many other important drugs will become more affordable & reduce patients' out-of-pocket expenditure." Speaking on the occasion, he said his ministry is taking various steps under the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi towards "Sabko Dawai, Sasti Dawai". "In this direction, National List of Essential Medicines (NLEM) plays an important role in ensuring accessibility of affordable quality medicines at all levels of healthcare. This will give boost to cost-effective, quality medicines and contribute towards reduction in Out of Pocket Expenditure on healthcare for the citizens," he said. The primary purpose of NLEM is to promote

rational use of medicines considering the three important aspects -- cost, safety and efficacy, Mandaviya said. He said the NLEM is a dynamic document and is revised on a regular basis considering the changing public health priorities as well as advancement in pharmaceutical knowledge. The NLEM was formulated in 1996 and it was revised thrice earlier in 2003, 2011, and 2015. Revision of NLEM 2022 has been done after constant consultation with stakeholders spanning from academia, industrialists and public policy experts etc., and crucial documents like WHO EML 2021. A revised list of 399 formulations was submitted by an expert committee under the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) last year.

Pitched battles between BJP workers and police in Kolkata

The streets of Kolkata turned into a virtual battlefield on Tuesday afternoon as BJP activists, marching to the West Bengal Secretariat to protest corruption issues, clashed with police. A police vehicle was torched, while a BJP councillor of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation, an Assistant Commissioner of Police and several others, including both BJP supporters and police personnel, were injured.



At around 3 p.m., an group of BJP supporters led by party's national Vice President, Dilip Ghosh and the party's state General Secretary, Jagannath Chattopadhyay, started moving towards the state secretariat, Nabanna from BJP's state headquarters at Muralidhar Sen Lane. As they reached central Kolkata, they came to know that Leader of Opposition in Assembly, Suwendu Adhikari had been arrested and taken to the Kolkata Police headquarters at Lalbazar. At this, a section of BJP supporters from the arms, led by Chattopadhyay started marching towards the police headquarters and were able to reach its gates after breaking through the barricades.

Although the police were initially pushed back, soon a huge contingent of security personnel, led by senior officials of Kolkata Police, stopped the BJP supporters, following which clashes broke out there. Violence also spread to the adjacent Mahatma Gandhi Road, where a police PCR van was allegedly set on fire by BJP supporters. An ACP and BJP councillor Meena Devi Purohit, along with several others, were injured. Mahatma Gandhi Road, being a trading hub, has a number of shops with many storing inflammable items. The burning PCR van created panic in the locality and the traders quickly pulled down the shutters of their shops. However, the fire tenders quick-

CALCUTTA HC SEEKS REPORT FROM CHIEF SECY

Kolkata: The Calcutta High Court on Tuesday sought a report from the West Bengal government on the alleged police atrocities on the leaders and workers of BJP during the latter's march to state Secretariat against corruption issues. The state government counsel argued that the police was forced to take action since the situation on Tuesday afternoon was going out of control, with a police vehicle being torched, a police kiosk vandalised and over 50 police personnel injured. After hearing both sides, the bench ordered the state Chief Secretary to submit a report. Observing that no one can be arrested with any reason, it also said that it is necessary for the state administration to ensure that the public property is protected.

ly rushed to the spot and extinguished the fire before it could spread further. A police kiosk there was also vandalised by the BJP supporters. However, BJP state President Sukanta Majumdar alleged that the PCR van was set on fire by the police only and blame put on his party supporters. Senior city officials rubbished his claims.

DMK LEADER A. RAJA SPEAKS AGAINST HINDU RELIGION

Chennai: DMK leader and former Union Minister, A. Raja spoke against the Hindu religion while addressing a public gathering, triggering a strong response from the BJP. While addressing the gathering organised by the Dravidar Kazhagam, Raja asked: "Who is a Hindu? We should have the right to assert... We don't wish to be a Hindu, why are you keeping me as a Hindu?" "I haven't seen any religion like this. Lingayats in Karnataka are petitioning the Supreme Court saying that their way of worship and religious principles are different. They are asking themselves not to be declared Hindu. But what is the Supreme Court saying? The Supreme Court is saying that if you aren't a Christian, Muslim, or Persian, you have to be a Hindu. Is there any other country having such cruelty?" "You are a shudra till you remain a Hindu. You're the son of a prostitute till you remain a shudra. You are a Panchaman (Dalit) till you remain a Hindu. You're an untouchable till you remain a Hindu. How many of you wish to stay as children of prostitutes? How many of you wish to remain untouchables? Only if we are vocal about these questions, it will become elemental in breaking Sanathana (Sanatana Dharma)."

Pvt Companies required to deduct tax at source while issuing bonus or rights shares

As per the circular, now bank and financial institutions need not deduct tax at source in respect of benefits provided to its borrowers by waiver of loan or advance by way of one-time settlement.

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) on Tuesday issued another circular to further clarify issues arising on deduction of tax at source under the newly-inserted Section 194-R in respect of benefits or perquisites provided to residents in cash or in kind in the course of business or profession. Similarly, a company in which the public is substantially interested need not deduct tax at source while issuing bonus or rights



shares. The implication of this clarification will be that a company in which public is not substantially interested will be required to deduct tax at source while issuing bonus or rights shares despite such receipt of bonus or right shares being not taxable in

the hands of the shareholders. The reasoning given in this circular for exempting a company in which the public is substantially interested from deduction of tax at source while issuing bonus or rights shares equally applies to a private company in which the public is not substantially interested, experts said. Experts say this circular may be fishing in troubled waters as it is differentiating between taxpayers. Experts also wonder if by doing that the legislative intent is being bypassed by such circulars.

8 KILLED IN HYDERABAD E-BIKE SHOWROOM FIRE

Hyderabad: The owners of a hotel and e-bike showroom, where a fire claimed eight lives on Monday night, have been booked for culpable homicide not amounting to murder.



A major fire broke out at the Ruby Pride Luxury Hotel, following an explosion in an e-bike showroom located in the basement of the five-storied building near the Passport Office. Eight persons were killed and nine injured in the fire that broke out around 9.30 p.m. According to police, the fire spread to the hotel on the upper floors. The hotel comprised 28 rooms. There were 25 occupants in the hotel when the blaze engulfed the building. Police suspect that either an e-bike or a generator in the showroom exploded leading to fire. The police booked Rajender Singh Bugga, Sumeet Singh and others who were illegally running an e-bike showroom for one year in the cellar of the same building.

Undertrial prisoners comprise 77 per cent of the prison population - up from 76 per cent nationally. Their numbers have nearly doubled since 2010 from 2.4 lakh to 4.3 lakh in 2021. With the exception of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram and Tripura, the undertrial population of all other states exceed 60 per cent.

As many as nine out of ten inmates in prisons of Delhi are awaiting the completion of their trial which is a whopping 91 per cent of undertrials in the national

prisons and their inmates, published by the National Crime Records Bureau. The analysis shows prisoners' visits to courts came up from 15.5 lakhs in 2020 to 20.9 lakh in 2021. Inmates' access to health services, with the

number of visits made by prisoners for medical attendance, rose from 3.6 lakh visits in 2020 to 4.4 lakh. Nationally, overall occupancy of prisons increased from 118 per cent to 130 per cent. With the onset of the second wave of the pandemic, and fresh directions to limit arrests and decongest prisons, only 93,526 inmates were released in 17 states/UTs between March and July 2021. Yet, as of December 2021, nineteen out of thirty-six states and Union Territories had overcrowding ranging from 185 per cent in Uttarakhand - the highest, to 100.2 per cent in Rajasthan. Among the Union Territories, Dadra and Nagar Haveli & Daman and Diu, Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir had over 100 per cent occupancy rates.

EC DECLARES 253 REGISTERED UNRECOGNISED POLITICAL PARTIES AS 'INACTIVE'

As part of its action for ensuring due compliance by Registered Unrecognised Political Parties (RUPPs), the Election Commission of India (ECI) led by Chief Election Commissioner, Rajiv Kumar, has delisted 86 non-existent RUPPs and declared another 253 as 'Inactive RUPPs'. The action against 339 non-compliant RUPPs takes the tally to 537 defaulting RUPPs since May 25, 2022. The ECI said that as per statutory requirements under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, every political party has to communicate any change in its name, head office, office-bearers, address,

PAN etc. to the Commission without delay. A total of 86 RUPPs have been found to be non-existent either after a physical verification carried out by the respective chief electoral officers of concerned states/UTs or based on report of undelivered letters/notices from the postal authority sent to the registered address of the concerned RUPP. It may be recalled that the ECI had delisted 87 and 111 RUPPs through orders dated May 25 and June 20, respectively. The latest decision against 253 non-compliant RUPPs has been taken based on reports received from chief electoral officers of seven states -- Bihar, Delhi, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Uttar Pradesh. These 253 RUPPs have been declared inactive, as they have not responded to the letter/notice delivered to them and have not contested a single election, be it Assembly polls or Parliamentary elections of 2014 and 2019. These RUPPs have failed to comply with the statutory requirements for more than 16 compliance steps since 2015 and are continuing to default, said a senior EC official.



CREATE CLEAR FRAMEWORK OF VACCINE LIABILITY FOR MANUFACTURER: PARL PANEL TELLS HEALTH MINISTRY

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health has recommended the Health Ministry create a clear framework of vaccine liability for the manufacturer in case of Adverse Effect Following Immunisation (AEFI).

"The Committee also notes that Covid-19 vaccination is voluntary and presently, there is no mechanism of compensation to beneficiaries or liability of vaccine manufacturer in case of any Adverse Event Following Immunisation. The Committee, therefore, strongly recommends the Ministry to create a clear framework of vaccine liability for manufacturer in case of AEFI so that adequate compensation can be provided to the aggrieved individuals," said the panel in its report.

Observing the under-reporting and poor quality data collection a reason behind reporting of such less number of AEFI, the Committee has taken note of the unusual peak on July 10 where 743 such cases were reported.

"The Committee would like to be apprised of the reason behind this sudden rise in the cases and the



vaccines that caused the adverse reaction," it said.

The report noted that mild side effects after administering of the vaccines are usually reported as the

body requires time to adjust to the vaccination dose. "However, the Committee feels that the Ministry must ensure that possible adverse effects are communicated to the

people followed by timely treatment. Attention of the Committee is also brought to the death of a patient post Covid-19 vaccination," the panel said in the report.

It also said "that in the concerned case, the AEFI Committee released its assessment Report after almost seven months.

The Committee strongly recommends the Ministry to ensure that appropriate investigation must be done and AEFI Committee must expedite its examination of each adverse cases".

Stressing that there is a need to monitor and conduct surveillance of post-Covid complications, the Committee has also recommended the Ministry frame a treatment protocol and make specific guidelines for managing post-Covid complications and related health problems arising due to the initial infection.

The Ministry must also work towards sensitising the Indian public health system to deal with such cases of long Covid, it said, adding that it further recommends the Ministry to ensure medical support for long Covid sufferers and train the healthcare workers for managing patients with long Covid.

Demolition drive continues in B'uru to clear encroachment

Continuing its drive against encroachment, the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP), the civic agency, carried out a ruthless demolition drive at 18 locations in Bengaluru on Tuesday, the second day.

The official note from BBMP stated that the demolition drive has been carried out in the Mahadevapura zone and Yelahanka zones. In Mahadevapura zone, demolition drives were carried out at Shantiniketan Layout, Papaiah Reddy Layout and Challaghatta localities. These areas were inundated and saw major water-logging problems during heavy rains. The team of engineers, revenue officers, marshals and police personnel were present during the drive in which two Hitachi and eight JCB machines were used.

Nalpad Academy in Challaghatta has encroached upon 2.5 meters of width, and 150.5 meters of storm water drain has been encroached. Fifty meters of encroachment has been cleared and the drive will continue.

In Shantiniketan Layout, seven buildings and four compound walls have been cleared. Meanwhile, owners of flats and buildings complained that they have purchased from builders and banks have also given loans for them. Now, BBMP is demolishing without any notice and they don't know where to go.

Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai has informed the session that Rs 600 crore has already been released to build infrastructure



across the state. He also announced that he would give Rs 1,800 crore for development of storm water drains in Bengaluru. The work would be finished within a set time-frame.

Krishna Bhairagowda, Congress MLA, stated in the session that brand Bengaluru is affected globally and the government must ensure that all storm water drains in Bengaluru must be developed.

Hoax bomb call triggers panic at Leela Ambience hotel in Gurugram

The Leela Ambience, a five-star hotel, in Gurugram on Tuesday received a bomb threat call, triggering panic in the premises, police said. However, it later turned out to be a hoax.

Police in a statement said, "A hoax call was made to a private hotel in Gurugram on Tuesday. Police reached the hotel, evacuated it and started an investigation. The caller was found to be a 24-year-old mentally ill person. He was found to be suffering from autism and he is undergoing treatment in a private hospital in Gurugram."

According to the report, more than a hundred guests were staying in the hotel.



However, after 90 minutes of search operation, it was found a hoax call. An unidentified person had called the hotel's reception desk at around 11.55 a.m. "It was a male voice that said a bomb will explode in the (Ambience) mall," the sources said. The police were immediately alerted after which a dog squad and

Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad (BDDS) rushed to the spot and evacuated people from the hotel.

The BDDS checked the entire hotel and its surroundings and a search operation is currently underway, the police said. The hotel also increased the number of security staff after receiving the call.

Nursery girl raped allegedly by Bus driver, woman attendant watched in Bhopal

A three-and-a-half-year-old nursery student was raped allegedly by her school bus driver inside the vehicle in Madhya Pradesh capital Bhopal, a police official said.

The police have arrested the bus driver and a woman attendant who, according to the child's parents, was present inside the vehicle when the incident took place last Thursday, the official said.

Asked if the school management allegedly tried to cover-up the matter, Madhya Pradesh Home Minister Narottam Mishra said the role of the school administration will be investigated and action will be taken accordingly.

The child, studying in a leading private school in the city, was returning home in the bus when the offence took place.

After the girl returned home, her mother noticed that someone had changed the child's clothes with the spare set kept in her bag, the official said.

The mother then enquired with her daughter's class teacher and also the school principal, but both of them denied having changed the child's clothes.

The child later complained of pain in her genitals. Her parents took her into confidence and counselled her, following which she informed them that the bus driver sexually abused her and also changed her clothes, the police official said.

The parents went to the school the next day to complain to the authorities and the child identified the driver, the official said.

The girl's parents filed a police complaint on Monday following which a probe was launched into the incident, Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) Nidhi Saxena said.

At the time of the incident, a woman attendant was present inside the bus, as per the complaint filed by the child's parents, the police said.

The bus driver and the woman attendant have been arrested, the senior police officer said.

Madhya Pradesh Home Minister Narottam Mishra told reporters that,

"The role of the school administration will also be investigated. People from the school management will be questioned. I also believe the school management tried to cover-up the matter."

Meanwhile, Authorities on Tuesday demolished the house of a school bus driver who has been arrested for allegedly raping a three-and-a-half-year-old nursery student in Madhya Pradesh's Bhopal.

The demolition in Bhopal's Shahpura area took place under the supervision of police. Illegal construction was the official reason given by the authorities for carrying out the demolition.

Armed with a hammer, the men destroyed the house located in a tiny lane as officials kept watch.

Mukul Rohatgi to return as Attorney General

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi is set to become the Attorney General for India again. He is scheduled to begin his second stint as the top law officer of the country from October 1.

According to sources familiar with the development, the term of incumbent Attorney General K.K. Venugopal is ending on September 30, and he has refused to continue beyond his term, citing his advanced age.

Venugopal, 91, was appointed as the country's top law officer on June 30, 2017, and he was given several extensions.



Sources said Rohatgi, who is one of the top court lawyers in the country, gave his consent for assuming the top post.

He was first appointed as the Attorney General in 2014 for a three-year term.

BIHAR MINISTER REMAINS FIRM ON HIS 'CHIEF OF THIEVES' STATEMENT

Bihar agriculture minister Sudhakar Singh said on Tuesday that he stands by his statement of "Chief of thieves". With his statement, Singh opened a front against his own government and made the situation uncomfortable for Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and Deputy CM Tejashwi Yadav.

Sudhakar Singh is the son of Rashtriya Janata Dal state president Jagadanand Singh. He said at a public meeting that there are many thieves in his department and as he is the minister of the department, he becomes the chief of thieves.

While interacting with media persons in Patna, Singh said that he stands by his statement and will not amend it or complain that the statement was twisted by the media.

"I spoke the truth and I will not withdraw or clarify it. A large amount of cor-



ruption is taking place inside the agriculture department. Everyone is looting the ministry. I asked the government to stop the allocation of budget funds to

my department," Singh said.

"The farmers want to do paddy farming but the Bihar Rajya Beej Nigam does not provide them adequate seeds. The funds allocated for the purpose, Rs 150 crore, are not reaching the farmers. The officials are involved in this scam. When farmers reached the district magistrates, they refused to interact with them and refused to address their grievances. This is the actual status of Bihar," Singh said. Singh, while addressing a gathering of farmers in his home constituency Ramgarh in Kaimur district on Sunday claimed: "There are many thieves in my department and they are stealing money. As I am the in-charge minister of the department, I become their chief. There are many other chiefs above me. This government is old and its style of work is also old. It's up to the common people to alert the government," Singh said.

Delhi court orders probe into Rs 800 cr alleged bank scam

Delhi court on Tuesday ordered a court-monitored investigation into the over Rs 800 crore scam of public sector banks, including the State Bank of India (SBI), allegedly involving an infrastructure company director.

The FIR in this regard was registered by the Delhi Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW).

Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Shivani Chauhan, of Saket District Court, was hearing an application filed by complainant Vaibhav Jalan against Gaurav Jalan, Director of JKM Infra Projects Ltd.

The petitioner's counsel argued that the accused allegedly created fictitious invoices and transferred the money from the company accounts to shell companies' accounts, but no effective investigation

has been carried out by the Investigating Officer and the complainant was not called for purpose of the probe in the last ten months.

Taking note of the submissions, the court directed the EOW to file a status report seeking the investigation carried out by it in the last 10 months and what investigation has been conducted on the discrepancies highlighted by a forensic audit of the company.

It also noted the apprehension that the accused may flee the country to evade the process of law.

Vaibhav Jalan was represented by advocate Sandeep Kapur, Senior Partner, Karanjawala & Co with advocates G.G. Kashyap and Gurmukh Choudhri.

The matter will be further heard on November 11.

CONGRESS TO STEP UP BHARAT JODO YATRA IN OTHER STATES FROM SEP 16



New Delhi: Senior Congress leaders Digvijaya Singh and Jairam Ramesh will visit the states through which the party's ongoing 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' will not pass to mobilise the state units to participate in the yatra. Party General Secretary Jairam Ramesh said, "Me and Digvijaya Singh will visit Assam, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar and Odisha from September 16 onwards. Our effort would be to mobilise the state units to join the Bharat Jodo Yatra." The Congress wants all the state units to participate in the Bharat Jodo Yatra, starting the exercise from the block level.

Ramesh had earlier said that the yatra will strengthen the party and spread its ideology, adding that "the elephant has woken up which has surprised BJP".

FICCI to adopt one lakh TB patients under 'TB Mukht Bharat Abhiyaan'

The Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) on Tuesday announced the commitment of adopting one lakh TB patients under the 'Tuberculosis (TB) Mukht Bharat Abhiyaan'.

The FICCI has committed to adopt one lakh TB patients through the collective capability of FICCI members and support the government by becoming Ni-kshay Mitras. This was announced after a meeting between Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya and the FICCI Health Services Leadership.

"FICCI commits to adopt one lakh TB patients through the collective capability of its members and support the Govt in The Tuberculosis Mukht Bharat Abhiyaan. This has been announced after a meeting with Dr @mansukhmandaviya, Minister @MoHFW_INDIA with FICCI Health Services Leadership," the federation said in a tweet.



The Pradhan Mantri TB Mukht Bharat Abhiyaan was launched by President Droupadi Murmu on September 9 to reinvigorate the mission of TB elimination from the country by 2025.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave the clarion call to end TB in the country five years ahead of the SDG target of 2030 at the End TB Summit in March 2018. The TB Mukht Bharat Abhiyaan has been envisioned to bring together all community stakeholders to support those on TB treatment and accelerate the country's progress towards TB

elimination.

The President also launched the Ni-kshay Mitra initiative which forms a vital component of the Abhiyaan. The Ni-kshay Mitra portal provides a platform for donors to provide various forms of support to those undergoing TB treatment. The three-pronged support includes nutritional, additional diagnostic, and vocational support. The donors, called Ni-kshay Mitras, could be a wide range of stakeholders, including corporate houses and industry representatives.

DELHI COURT ORDERS PROBE INTO RS 800 CR ALLEGED BANK SCAM

New Delhi: A Delhi court on Tuesday ordered a court-monitored investigation into the over Rs 800 crore scam of public sector banks, including the State Bank of India (SBI), allegedly involving an infrastructure company director.

The FIR in this regard was registered by the Delhi Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW).

Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Shivani Chauhan, of Saket District Court, was hearing an application filed by complainant Vaibhav Jalan against Gaurav Jalan, Director of JKM Infra Projects Ltd. The petitioner's counsel argued that the accused allegedly created fictitious invoices and transferred the money from the company accounts to shell companies' accounts, but no effective investigation has been carried out by the Investigating Officer and the complainant was not called for purpose of the probe in the last ten months.

Taking note of the submissions, the court directed the EOW to file a status report seeking the investigation carried out by it in the last 10 months and what investigation has been conducted on the discrepancies highlighted by a forensic audit of the company.

It also noted the apprehension that the accused may flee the country to evade the process of law.

Congress MLAs protest with garlic on the first day of assembly session

Congress legislators dumped loads of garlic at a gate of the Madhya Pradesh Assembly on Tuesday, accusing the state BJP government of being apathetic towards farmers who were not getting adequate prices for their crops. Some videos surfaced in the last few days on social media showing farmers throwing sacks full of garlic into different water bodies in Madhya Pradesh, apparently after getting low prices for their produce. One of the farmers had claimed they were being offered just Re 1 per kg for their garlic produce. Expressing solidarity with the farmers, Congress MLAs Sachin Yadav, Jitu Patwari, and others threw garlic in front of gate number 3 of the Madhya Pradesh Assembly, where



the five-day monsoon session began on Tuesday. The opposition legislators raised slogans, alleging the ruling BJP "bought" legislators but was apathetic towards farmers and did not have money to buy the garlic cultivated by them. Two years ago, 22 MP Congress MLAs had resigned, which led to the

fall of the Kamal Nath-led Congress government in Madhya Pradesh. The BJP later came to power in the state under the leadership of Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. Recently, a number of videos emerged in which farmers were seen dumping garlic into various water bodies in the state.

One such farmer, Vikas Sisodia, had claimed he was getting just Re 1 per kg for his garlic crop in the Indore market, and hence, he considered it appropriate to dump the produce in a drain near his village. Sisodia had claimed he suffered a loss of ₹ 3 lakh in cultivating garlic this year.

Injured man carried to hospital in JCB shovel as Ambulance unavailable

A man injured in a road accident had to be carried to the hospital in a bulldozer in Madhya Pradesh -- a BJP-ruled state which has a sizeable health budget. The incident took place in Katni. The locals said they had informed the authorities and waited more than half-an-hour for an ambulance. Finally seeing the man was losing too much blood, they had to improvise. Mahesh Burman, a resident of nearby Gairtalai, was injured after his bike collided with another two-wheeler. When an ambulance failed to arrive even after 30 minutes,

Pushendra Vishwakarma, who drove the construction machine, volunteered to take him to the hospital. The accident had taken place outside his shop, he said. Burman has fractured a leg. After first aid, he was referred to the district hospital. This is not an isolated incident in Madhya Pradesh. Earlier, videos from various parts of the state showed people being taken to hospital in push carts, cycles and even physically carried by other people. Last month, the authorities started an investigation after a video emerged from Damoh district showing a man carrying his pregnant wife to hospital in a push cart.

Kailash Ahirwal said he had called the "Dial 108" government ambulance service after his wife started having labour pains. But no ambulance came for over two hours. He also alleged that when they reached the government-run Arogya Kendra after the two-km journey, they found no doctor or nurse. Later, his wife was shifted to Hatta by a government ambulance. But in absence of proper facilities there, she had to be taken to the Damoh district hospital. The problem in ambulance access persists despite the government's announcements about an increase in the number of vehicles.

In April, Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, at a function, announced the number has gone up from 1,445 to 2,052. The number of Advanced Life Support Vehicles was also increased from 75 to 167. Basic Life Support Ambulances, whose number was 531, was increased to 835. In March, researchers at the Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Good Governance and Policy Analysis of the state government, said the Dial 108 ambulance service -- on which government spends ₹ 220 crore a year -- is unable to serve as many as 53 cases daily in each district. The number of patients who have to resort to private ambulances is 10 lakh a year.

The police had in October 2021 arrested Karan Morwal, who was running, after a woman lodged a rape complaint against him on April 2 last year at women's police station in Indore, according to police officials.

In an effort to increase green cover, Coimbatore forest division has planted 14 lakh saplings in the past nine years. According to Coimbatore Forest Division officials, 14.33 lakh saplings were planted under the division between 2012 to 2021. The saplings were planted under the Tamil Nadu Biodiversity and Conservation Greening Projects and Tree Cultivation on Private Lands. A senior officer with the Coimbatore forest division said, "We have replanted tree saplings in 95 villages in three districts and have planted 14.33 lakh saplings since 2012 to 2021." He said that long rotation saplings and short rotation saplings were planted, and added that long rotation plantations were done up to 2021 while short rotation plantings were done up to 2013-14. The short rotation plantations can be harvested in seven to eight years. The officials said that short rotation plantings were harvested by farmers since the past one year and have fetched good returns.

Forest department officials said that farmers are sending the Malaivembu trees directly to paper making companies and earning good revenue. The Coimbatore forest division is planning to raise more saplings from the three nurseries in Coimbatore and distribute among the farmers for the second phase of the project. According to forest department official that on an average a farmer is selling 10 to 15 tonnes of Malaivembu trees to paper factories and getting good returns. Several farmers have requested the forest department to plant Swakumar tree saplings also as they fetch good money for them.

CHINESE BRI: A SUCCESS OR A FAILURE?

The recent economic upheaval followed by the political disruption in Sri Lanka, has once again made China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) the focus of debate whether it is beneficial or insensitive to the participating countries besides being a success or a failure.

Chinese President Xi Jinping launched the BRI with much fanfare and high promises and grandiose plans for the participating countries in 2013. It was considered to be a centrepiece of the Chinese foreign and trade policy.

Basically, the BRI earlier also referred to, as One Belt One Road or OBOR for short, is a global infrastructure development strategy to invest in nearly 150 countries and international organisations, around the globe.

The BRI formed a central component of Xi's "Major Country Diplomacy" strategy, which calls for China to assume a greater leadership role for global affairs in accordance with its rising power and status.

As of August, 149 countries were listed as having signed up to the BRI.

Xi originally announced the strategy as the "Silk Road Economic Belt" during an official visit to Kazakhstan in September 2013, referring to the proposed overland routes for road and rail transportation through landlocked Central Asia along the famed historical trade routes of the Western Regions; in addition to the "21st Century Maritime Silk Road", referring to the Indo-Pacific sea routes through Southeast Asia to South Asia, the Middle East and Africa.

In fact the BRI was also considered a grandiose plan to challenge the American hegemony over the global trade and diplomacy.

However, the recent events in Sri Lanka, with similar echoes being heard from Bangladesh, Nepal and Pakistan has led some China watchers to conclude that this is an indicator of the hit that the Chinese economy has taken during the Covid pandemic and the BRI appears to be under reevaluation with recipient countries wary of the debt trap and its economic feasibility.

Let's take a closer look at the original intent of the BRI, its expansion and its long and short-term impacts on the aid recipient countries and whether it has been a success or a failure and how the US could have countered it in a much better manner.

In his report in 2020, Rafiq Dossani, Director, RAND Centre for Asia Pacific



Policy, opined that China's strongest motive behind the BRI was its long-term economic security. The maritime routes of the BRI would have helped the relatively underdeveloped, landlocked areas of China such as Yunnan and Xinjiang provinces by linking them with ports in the more rapidly growing areas of Asia.

At the same time, the emerging land routes of the BRI were marked as an alternative to the South China Sea, through which most of China's trade currently passes and which is becoming a zone of contestation between the US and China.

Dossani further explaining the reasons for the initial welcome of BRI opined that traditionally, many countries prefer to work with the World Bank and other multilateral lenders, which provide borrowers with good practices, while making significant funding available on a meritocratic rather than political basis.

But, he says further that from a developing country's viewpoint, accessing the world's spare capital has been difficult because of the risk entailed in many such investments. The Asian Development Bank estimates that Asian countries face an infrastructure investment gap of \$459 billion a year.

This logic also explains the sentiments, which in the initial stages of the launch of the BRI seemed to be the main attractive reason for the BRI projects and Chinese funding. But nine years after its launch BRI seems to have lost its sheen, due to the economic meltdown in several countries, which borrowed heavily from China under the garb of infrastructure development, progress and prosperity. Bangladesh Finance Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal has publicly blamed economically unviable Chinese BRI projects for exacerbating economic crisis in Sri Lanka. He says that developing countries must think twice about taking more loans through BRI as global inflation and slowing growth add to the strains on indebted emerging markets.

In fact Bangladesh has made it clear that it will not accept any further loans but only grants from Beijing. Nepal has also taken the same stand. Pakistan with some \$53 billion being spent by Beijing under the aegis of BRI also faces the same fate.

China has also invested some \$44 billion in Indonesia, \$41 billion in Singapore, \$39 billion in Russia, \$33 billion in Saudi Arabia and \$30 billion in Malaysia. The cry against

Chinese BRI is not limited only to Indian sub-continent as its reverberations can be heard in the stalled \$4.7 billion railway project in Kenya, also. Five years since its launch, the project ends abruptly in an empty field, 200 miles from its destination in Uganda.

As conflicts between the United States and China appear to mount, some experts have questioned the intentions of China's BRI. It has been viewed as a debt trap for impoverished states and a means for China to expand its territorial control, but is it a reality? Is the US missing an opportunity to participate-in or initiate parallel activities?

BRI has been repeatedly labelled a debt trap and a power grab, and perhaps this seemed like a possible scenario. However, this concept has been debunked by recent research. Deborah Brautigam, director of the China Africa Research Initiative at Johns Hopkins University, found no evidence that Chinese banks over-lend or invest in loss-making projects to obtain a foothold in those countries, in one of her studies on Chinese lending to Africa.

There is further evidence that China is not engaging in debt trap diplomacy. Brautigam has noted that in some countries the IMF has been labelled as being vulnerable. Also Chinese loans were not responsible for pushing indebted countries above IMF debt sustainability limits.

Furthermore, it should be noted that not just impoverished nations, but East Asian and Europe countries have also been smitten by the BRI. Over 18 European Union countries have joined the BRI.

In fact, rather than decrying China, the US should engage in infrastructure lending to poor countries, and/or make it easier for multilateral banks to lend for such projects, reducing bureaucratic requirements. It should also initiate similar activities in under-developed or developing countries.

To better its image, China should improve transparency around BRI deals.

The World Bank and other bodies have also called for increased transparency. This would go a long way in improving US and other countries' understanding of Chinese intentions about the BRI.

NEPAL, CHINA SIGN 6-POINT AGREEMENT UNDER BRI

Nepal and China have signed a six-point agreement under Beijing's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) to increase the countries' engagements and exchanges on governance, legislative and supervisory practices. Parliament Speaker Agni Prasad Sapkota and Li Zhanshu, Chairman of the Standing Committee of China's NPC, signed the agreement at an event held on Monday evening at the Federal Parliament Building in Kathmandu. According to the agreement, the two sides will exchange information on each other's legislative, supervisory and governance practices. Li is in Kathmandu on a four-day official visit at the invitation of Sapkota. As soon as he landed in Kathmandu leading a 67-member delegation, Sapkota and Li held delegation-level talks followed by the signing of the agreement. The MoU between the two Parliaments also mentions the BRI, an ambitious project promoted by China. Nepal and China had signed the BRI



in 2017 but no substantive progress has been made in the last five years. According to the agreement, the two governments would accord priority and facilitate promotion of relationship, mutual benefits and commitments between the two countries, including through the BRI, the fifth point of the MoU read. During the talks, the two dignitaries while expressing happiness over the excel-

lent state of bilateral relations and cooperation subsisting between Nepal and China, held discussions on different matters of mutual interests, said the Foreign Ministry in Kathmandu. In the meeting, Sapkota reiterated Nepal's commitment to 'One China' Policy and not to allow any activity against Beijing in Nepali territory. Li expressed China's continued support for Nepal's sovereignty, independ-

ence, and territorial integrity, the Foreign Ministry added. Sapkota appreciated the people and the Chinese government for their generous support and cooperation to the Himalayan nation's development endeavour and expressed hope for an enhanced level of support from Beijing for post-pandemic recovery and other development priorities. He added that the people and government of Nepal are grateful to the Chinese government for with a substantial amount of medical supplies, equipment and vaccines during the pandemic. "During the meeting, both sides agreed to further strengthen inter-parliamentary exchanges and cooperation. They also underscored the role of Parliamentary Friendship Group in each other's parliament in further promoting goodwill and understanding between the two legislatures," said the Ministry statement. Li also promised to provide assistance to the Nepali Parliament as per its need and requirement at the institutional level.

SL declares holiday, day of mourning on Queen Elizabeth's funeral

serving monarch, Queen Elizabeth II who died at the age of 96 on September 8, after reigning for 70 years was Sri Lanka's head of state until 1972, the year the island nation became a republic, fully freed from the British sovereignty. The late queen visited Sri Lanka in 1954 and 1981 and later she was represented by the then Prince of Wales, now King Charles III, when he visited the island nation in 1998, 2004 and 2013. President Ranil

Wickremesinghe visited the British High Commission in Colombo to sign the book of condolence. "She was a symbol of stability and endurance, and she will be greatly missed. My heartfelt condolences to the Royal Family and the people of the UK and the Commonwealth," President Wickremesinghe said in a tweet. Britain, which conquered the island nation from the Dutch and took over the entire country in 1815 ruled until February 4, 1948.

Ex-Czech PM Andrej Babis on trial over EU subsidy fraud

Former Czech Prime Minister Andrej Babis stood trial here over his alleged involvement in the European Union (EU) subsidy fraud. At issue in the case is whether Babis and his former advisor Jana Nagyova unlawfully received about 50 million Czech crowns (\$2 million) in EU subsidies over a decade ago to build a conference centre, known as the Stork's Nest, near Prague, reports news agency. During the hearing in Prague's Municipal Court, Babis denied any wrongdoing and said that the money in question was returned to the EU. He further explained that the criminal proceed-

ings arose after he entered politics, arguing that the allegations against him were "politically motivated". The trial that began on Monday follows a long-standing criminal investigation in which the defendants are accused of receiving EU funds earmarked for small and medium-sized businesses. Local media reported that prosecutors had asked for suspended sentences and fines for Babis and Nagyova. Babis is still a sitting parliamentarian. His party, the populist ANO (Action of Dissatisfied Citizens), holds a majority in the Chamber of Deputies (lower house of Parliament). Babis is widely expected to formally announce his candidacy for president in 2023.

50 million people worldwide in modern slavery: ILO

In its latest report, the Geneva-based International Labour Organization (ILO) said that 50 million people were living in modern slavery in 2021. According to the latest report by the UN agency titled, 'Global Estimates of Modern Slavery', 28 million of these people were in forced labour and 22 million were trapped in forced marriage. The number of people in modern slavery has risen significantly in the last five years 10 million more people were in modern slavery in 2021 compared to 2016 global estimates. Women and children remain disproportionately vulnerable, says the report. Modern slavery occurs in almost every country in the world, and cuts across ethnic, cultural and religious lines. More than half (52

per cent) of all forced labour and a quarter of all forced marriages can be found in upper-middle income or high-income countries. Regarding forced labour, most cases (86 per cent) are found in the private sector. According to the report, forced labour in sectors other than commercial sexual exploitation accounts for 63 per cent of all forced labour, while forced commercial sexual exploitation represents 23 per cent of all forced labour. Almost four out of five of those in forced commercial sexual exploitation are women or girls. State-imposed forced labour accounts for 14 per cent of people in forced labour. Almost one in eight of all those in forced labour are children (3.3 million). More than half of these are in commercial sexual exploitation. The report says that an estimated 22 million people were living

in forced marriage on any given day in 2021 an increase of 6.6 million since the 2016 global estimates. "It is shocking that the situation of modern slavery is not improving. Nothing can justify the persistence of this fundamental abuse of human rights," said ILO Director-General, Guy Ryder. Antonio Vitorino, IOM Director-General, said: "This report underscores the urgency of ensuring that all migration is safe, orderly, and regular. Reducing the vulnerability of migrants to forced labour and trafficking in persons depends first and foremost on national policy and legal frameworks that respect, protect, and fulfil the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all migrants, and potential migrants, at all stages of the migration process, regardless of their migration status."

Imran proposes to extend tenure of Pak Army chief till next polls

Former Pakistan Prime Minister and PTI chief, Imran Khan has proposed to extend the tenure of Chief of the Army Staff (COAS) General Qamar Javed Bajwa till the next elections. In an interview, Khan said that the appointment of an army chief should be deferred until the government is elected, which should then choose the new military head, News reported. Khan has been making headlines since his ouster in April because of his constant remarks regarding the army chief. Earlier this month, while speaking during a public rally in Faisalabad, the PTI

chairman had called out the government, saying that it was delaying the elections to appoint an army chief of its own and that if a "patriotic chief of army staff comes in, he will not spare the incumbent rulers", News reported. However, in a change of stance, the former premier said that he was ready to hold talks with the coalition government regarding snap polls. Regarding the Islamabad High Court's (IHC) decision to indict him in a contempt of court case on September 22, Khan said that if the five-member bench hearing the case would have allowed him to say something, he would have apologized.



VEDANTA-FOXCONN GOES TO GUJARAT, FADNAVIS GOES TO RUSSIA, MVA GOES LIVID

Barely six weeks after Maharashtra claimed to have beaten at least 5 states to win the Vedanta Group-Foxconn's stupendous Rs 2.06 lakh crore investment proposal, the project has gone to Gujarat.

The development on Tuesday left Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's team rendered speechless, even as Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis left for Russia, and the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) went livid at the state's loss.

The Vedanta Group-Foxconn partnership in the sunrise semiconductors chips and display fabrications sector in Pune would have created over 200,000 direct and indirect jobs for the state.

The MoU for the deal, the single biggest investment of its kind in Maharashtra -- coveted by Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Telangana and Himachal Pradesh -- was signed in the presence of Shinde and Fadnavis in mid-July.

MVA leaders like Nationalist Congress Party state President Jayant



Patil, Shiv Sena's ex-Minister Aditya Thackeray and Congress' chief spokesperson Atul Londhe slammed the Shinde-Fadnavis duo for the loss of the prestigious project.

Patil said that once again, Gujarat has taken away a major project from Maharashtra right from the mouths of Shinde-Fadnavis government who are busy holding political rallies.

Thackeray and Londhe said that this is part of the series of steps taken by the BJP to take away all industries

or employment generation project from Maharashtra to Gujarat.

Londhe said that first the BJP took away the International Finance Centre, then the diamond hub, while several other Central government organisations also shifted, at the cost of Maharashtra, where they were nurtured for long.

"Now, only Mumbai is left... This will also happen soon, and that's why the Shinde-Fadnavis government has come to power here. He Ram,"

lamented Londhe. With Shinde keeping mum and Fadnavis departing to Moscow, it was left to the Industry Minister Uday Samant to respond and he merely said that "we shall find out how this has happened".

Slamming the Shinde-Fadnavis duo for its failure, Thackeray asked that "considering the overall scenario, whether there is a government in Maharashtra or not?"

Picking up a dialogue from the Bollywood superhit "Baazigar" (1993) - "Haar ke Jeetne walon ko Baazigar kehete hain" - Thackeray took a jibe at the Shinde-Fadnavis regime saying: "Now, it is 'Jeet ke haarne walon ko Khokhe Sarkar kehete hain'."

Mumbai-based mining giant Vedanta Group had partnered with the Hon Hai Precision Industry (Foxconn) to invest \$15 billion in phases over the next 5-10 years for manufacturing semiconductor chips and displays in India.

Accordingly, Vedanta-Foxconn planned to invest Rs 166,800 crore and Rs 40,000 crore from other sources for its 1,000-acre proposed manufacturing facility at Talegaon near Pune.

90% of Shinde Group MLAs will lose in next Maha elections: NCP

Making a dark prediction, the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) on Tuesday said that 45 out of the 50 MLAs of the Shiv Sena rebel group led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde "will be vanquished in the next elections".

The NCP said that the Chief Minister is making futile attempts to explain how his revolt in early-June was justified and based on certain issues, but the people of the state are not convinced and do not support his views.

Claiming that the regime of Shinde and Bharatiya Janata Party Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis is "unconstitutional", the NCP also said that "its benchmark is far below the earlier Maha Vikas Aghadi government of Sena-NCP-Congress" which fell on June 29.

In a stinging statement, NCP Chief Spokesperson



Mahesh Tapase slammed Shinde for continuing to justify his rebellion against the ex-CM and Sena President Uddhav Thackeray that toppled the MVA government.

However, Shinde has not said a single word for his vision of Maharashtra, 10 weeks after he took the oath, Tapase pointed out.

"The Shinde-Fadnavis government is yet to get Constitutional validation from the Supreme Court and we shall continue to call it an unconstitutional alliance regime till then," Tapase said sharply.

He said that the Shinde Group is also worried about the criticism levelled by NCP state President Jayant Patil, Leader of Opposition Ajit Pawar and MP Supriya Sule as his rule

has fallen far short of expectations compared with the erstwhile MVA government.

"Moreover, the Shinde Group does not have a disciplined cadre and hence they are spending money to hire people for their meetings. The same crowds were seen looting boxes of 'laddoo' and 'pedhas' (sweetmeats)," Tapase said, hitting at Shinde's rally in Aurangabad's Paithan on Monday where the chaos was witnessed.

Accordingly, the electorate will reject at least 45 of the 50 MLAs - who have thrown their lot with Shinde - in the next Assembly elections, predicted Tapase.

In recent weeks, the Opposition MVA has stepped up attacks on the Shinde-Fadnavis government on a variety of issues including the delays in naming district Guardian Ministers, timely aid to the flood-ravaged farmers in Vidarbha and Marathwada regions and other aspects.

Heavy rain in Mumbai, "Orange Alert" issued for adjoining districts

Heavy rain lashed Mumbai and neighbouring areas this morning and the India Meteorological Department or IMD has predicted more showers in the city.

The weather department (IMD) has also issued an 'orange alert' for Raigad, Ratnagiri and Satara, predicting heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places in the three districts.

The weather department's Santacruz observatory in Mumbai, representative of suburbs, recorded 93.4 mm rainfall in the 24-hour period till 8.30 am on Tuesday, marking another spell of heavy downpour here in the current monsoon season.

The Colaba observatory, representative of the island city, recorded 59.2 mm rain-



fall during the same period, an IMD official said. The IMD has predicted moderate showers in Mumbai today and high intensity rains in neighbouring Raigad. The weather department issues four colour-coded predic-

tions based on the prevailing weather systems.

The green colour indicates no warning, yellow is to keep a watch, orange is to stay alert, while red means a warning and that action needs to be taken.

Cow urine sprinkled by Thackeray supporters after CM Shinde's event

As the factional feud within Shiv Sena spills onto the streets in the form of clashes, supporters of Uddhav Thackeray today went around sprinkling cow urine at the venue of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's event in Maharashtra's Aurangabad.

A video from Bidkin is doing the rounds on social media. It shows a group of men using lemon leaves to sprinkle cow urine. They are heard raising the slogan, "50 khokhe, ekdom ok" -- a swipe at the MLAs in Shinde camp, who have been accused by Thackeray supporters of joining the rebellion against the party leadership after each of them was offered Rs 50 crore. The Shinde camp is yet to respond to this protest.

This protest comes against the backdrop of frequent clashes between the two Sena factions. The



two sides have been targeting each other since the rebellion led by Mr Shinde brought down the Uddhav

Thackeray-led government of Sena, Sharad Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party and the Congress.

Supporters of the two camps clashed during a Ganesh idol immersion Saturday night in Mumbai's Dadar. Both sides accused each other of starting the fight.

The two sides first clashed in Prabhadevi and later outside the Dadar police station. Sena MLA Sada Sarvankar, from the Shinde camp, has been charged with opening fire during the clash in Dadar. The Mahim legislator has denied the charge and said he will cooperate if police called him in for questioning.

Five Sena workers from the Thackeray camp were arrested in connection with the clashes, but later released on bail.

Cases have been registered against at least 10 people from both side, police said.

The factions led by Thackeray and Shinde are fighting a legal battle in Supreme Court for the control of Shiv Sena.

CM Naveen Patnaik coming to 'sell' Odisha to Maha investors

Ahead of the upcoming 3rd 'Make in Odisha' conclave at Bhubaneswar in November-December, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik will meet captains of Indian industry here to solicit investments for his state, officials said here on Tuesday.

Patnaik, along with a high-level delegation of senior officials, is expected to be in Mumbai over the next couple of days and meet top leaders of India Inc. as part of the Odisha Investors Meet, in the country's commercial capital.

In Mumbai, the Odisha government will lay emphasis on attracting investments in areas like chemicals, petrochemicals, metals, textiles, electronics system design, manufacturing



and tourism.

Since Mumbai is the country's financial hub, the Odisha government

will attempt to lure more investments for fintech, investment and commercial banks, financial agencies, stock

markets, etc, besides the traditional sectors, said Odisha Industries Department Principal Secretary Hemant Sharma earlier this week.

Top names from various leading corporate houses like Ambanis, Adani, Tata, Godrej, Mahindras and others are expected to join the Mumbai meet with Patnaik.

Patnaik, who met ambassadors from over two dozen countries and top businessmen in New Delhi in August, will host the 3rd 'Make in Odisha' conclave at Bhubaneswar from November 3-December 4 this year.

Earlier, the Odisha CM has held similar meets for industrialists in Ahmedabad, New Delhi, and Dubai. After Mumbai, there is a possibility of similar investor meetings in Bengaluru and Hyderabad later.

MNS worker arrested on rape allegations

Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) office bearer was arrested by police over allegations of raping a party worker on pretext of giving ticket to contest BMC elections.

According to complaint, the accused had assured the victim to give a key post in the party and then a ticket.

On Monday, a 47-year-old woman, lodged complaint in VP Road police station and said that her own party offi-

cer bearer Vrushant Wadke was raping her since September 2021 till August 2022. The accused would call the woman on pretext of meeting at different places and would take advantage of her. As per the woman, the accused raped her several times. The woman had met sen-

ior party leaders of MNS and narrated the incident. She was asked to register a complaint with the police. On September 7, Vrushant had resigned from party sighting personal reasons. Vrushant Wadke was appointed as the President of Malabar Hill Assembly Division of MNS few months ago.

CM SHINDE HALTS AT HIGHWAY TO HELP MAN IN PROBLEM

Mumbai: A car caught fire on the Western Express Highway in Mumbai last night which caught the attention of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde who was passing through at the same time.

Seeing the burning car, the Chief Minister stopped his convoy and stepped out to meet the victims. He assured them the authorities will provide them with all help they need.

Visuals from the site showed Shinde speaking to the car's driver and others, accompanied by police and security officials. The burning car could be seen at a distance in the other lane.

MAHARASHTRA VILLAGE TAKES AFFORESTATION UP A NOTCH

The villagers of Hirpodi in Velhe taluka of Pune district are making steady progress in turning a barren hill into a forest with the help of contour trenches and drought-tolerant trees.

The hill covering about five acres along the slope now belongs to Ravindra and Sadhana Swar, who approached FORREST (Forest Regeneration and Environment Sustainability Trust) - an NGO dealing in biodiversity - to restore it in a way that would benefit the village that sits along its lower reaches.

Responding to 101Reporters by email, the villager said that they bought the land, sight unseen, to help the owner who was deep in debt. "The original purpose was to build an old age home. But when we finally visited the site ourselves, we found there was no proper access road or any facilities nearby. It was just a barren hill." And Sadhana Swar, having something of a green finger herself, decided to spend some money to develop this into a green zone, even a sanctuary for birds.

Located 60 km from Pune, Hirpodi is home to about 900 people. Singh and her team decided to work on two fronts - water



and forestry. "We planned to dig contour trenches and plant drought-tolerant native species on their bunds. The first step of marking trenches all over the hill began in July 2019," she tells 101Reporters.

Trenching is one of the major environmental engineering measures for conserving water and controlling soil erosion in non-arable lands. Areas with steep slopes are more prone to soil erosion, particularly if they lack vegetative cover.

"Velha gets good rainfall, but the water drains out very quickly due to the slope. Almost no water percolates in the soil.

Contour trenching solves this problem," explains Singh. "We found a part on the slope where soil erosion was much more pronounced. Hillsides are more prone to gullying (the process by which deep channels or gullies are created by flowing water) when they are cleared of vegetation through deforestation, overgrazing or forest fires. To arrest soil erosion, we covered a small patch with dense plantations."

The restoration plans began when the COVID-19 pandemic was at its peak. Holding meetings with villagers was not even a possibility then. So, her team tried different

methods to increase local participation.

The locals were paid in cash for all the materials and the strenuous work of walking uphill with tools, plants, compost, soil nutrients and bamboo. The joint team of volunteers and villagers built around 250 contour trenches and planted 530 trees over their bunds. Once the trenching and planting were done, 40 villagers collected thorny bushes from nearby hills and carried them to the site to build a fence that would protect the plants from free-grazing cattle. Only 300 of the total 530 trees remain, with the rest lost in forest fires. Rajiwade, a wrestler and rice cultivator, understands the importance of maintaining sources of irrigation. The Rajiwades have assumed the role of overseeing the maintenance of the young trees, which includes watering them at least four times a month during non-monsoon months with the help of the community. He and his family - comprising his wife and three college-going children - had motivated many to join the project in its early days. Sonawane, on her part, exhorted women to lend a helping hand.

MAHA RECORDS 730 NEW COVID-19 CASES, FOUR DEATHS

Mumbai: Maharashtra on Tuesday recorded 730 new Covid-19 cases and four fatalities, which took the tally to 81,11,976 and the toll to 1,48,293, according to the state health department.

According to the state health department's data, Mumbai accounted for 193 cases. The recovery count in Maharashtra rose by 1,075 in the last 24 hours and reached 79,58,170, leaving the state with an active caseload of 5,513.

State health department data showed the fatality rate was 1.82 per cent and the recovery rate was 98.10 per cent. It said 8,44,09,585 coronavirus tests have been conducted in the state so far.



Filmmaker Jean Luc Godard, dies at 91

Although there hadn't been an official confirmation till midday in Paris, French President Emmanuel Macron paid tribute to Godard on social media with a message describing the auteur as "the most iconoclastic of New Wave filmmakers, who had invented a resolutely modern, intensely free art." He added: "We are losing a national treasure, a look of genius." The prolific icon was not known to rest. Godard presented his last film 'The Image Book', a kaleidoscopic bulletin spanning 200 years of history, in competition at the Cannes Film Festival in 2018 and was celebrated with the Special Palme d'Or. Godard was also planning to adapt 'The Image Book' into an exhibit in Paris, Madrid, New York and Singapore before the pandemic hit, notes a website.

INDIA HEAD FOR MISSION AUSTRALIA WITH NO SURPRISES FULL-STRENGTH SQUAD

On Monday, India announced their squad for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2022 in Australia, starting from next month. Compared to last year's edition in the UAE and Oman, Rohit Sharma and Rahul Dravid will be captain and coach respectively.

The duo's return is a big boost for India, especially when the bowling attack lacked teeth in Asia Cup. India's trust over young left-arm pacer Arshdeep Singh was seen when he was retained in the 15-man squad, with Deepak Chahar and Mohammed Shami slotted in as reserve players.

Arshdeep had been superb with his yorkers in the death overs, as seen in IPL and in international matches since his debut in July. With Bumrah, Harshal, Arshdeep, Bhuvneshwar Kumar and all-rounder Hardik Pandya, Rohit



is yet to click in unison in T20Is this year. Suryakumar Yadav, with his 360-degree shots, has the ability to up the batting tempo. Then there is Deepak Hooda, who has grabbed his chances in the Indian jersey in whatever ways he's got them. Apart from his hard-hitting batting, he also provides part-time off-spin option, which is a necessity especially with Ravindra Jadeja unavailable after undergoing knee surgery.

But Hooda will be in competition with 'keeping duo of Dinesh Karthik and Rishabh Pant over the middle-order slots, considering the top four of Rohit, Rahul, Virat and Suryakumar with Pandya as all-rounder.

Since winning the inaugural Men's T20 World Cup in South Africa in 2007, India haven't won the trophy.

Moreover, since winning the 2013 Champions' Trophy in England, India haven't won an ICC trophy. Come October 2022, when India take the field against Pakistan in their first Super 12 match at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, the dream of doing an encore of 2007 will be expected from this full-strength, no surprises squad.

Minutes later, Sarkar doubled Bangladesh's lead, as she darted into the Indian box from the left flank and finished past the keeper.

India tried to attempt several long diagonals to catch the Bangladeshi highline off guard, but to no avail, as the first half soon came to an end with the latter taking a two-goal lead into the tunnel. Bangladesh top Group A with nine points, having won their three games and will face Bhutan in the semifinal on September 16.

TABLE TENNIS: WTT SINGAPORE SMASH TO RETURN NEXT MARCH

Beijing: World Table Tennis (WTT) on Tuesday announced plans for the 2023 edition of the WTT Singapore Smash, with a wider range of participants to compete in the event next March.

China's Fan Zhendong and Chen Meng were crowned the first Grand Smash champions in Singapore in March. According to the WTT, the inaugural event was broadcast in 196 countries and regions, reaching a cumulative audience of more than 160 million.

The main draw of the Singapore Smash 2023 will take place between March 11 and 19, and the singles qualifying competitions will be held from March 7 to 9.


