TWO-FINGER TEST ON RAPE SURVIVORS PATRIARCHAL & RE-TRAUMATISES THE WOMEN

'Affront to dignity, patriarchal, sexist'

Justice Chandrachud, who authored the judgment on behalf of the bench, said the probative value of a woman's testimony does not depend upon her sexual history. "It is patriarchal and sexist to suggest that a woman cannot be believed when she states that she was raped, merely for the reason that she is sexually active," he said.

"This so-called test has no scientific basis and neither proves nor disproves allegations of rape. It instead re-victimises and re-traumatises women who may have been sexually assaulted, and is an affront to their dignity. The 'two-finger test' or pre vaginum test must not be conducted."

ELECTORAL ROLL WITH AADHAAR LINKING WILL BE EXAMINED

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Monday agreed to examine a petition against the Central government's decision to enable linking of electoral roll data with the Aadhaar ecosystem. Senior advocate Shyam Divan, representing the petitioner, contended that the right to vote cannot be denied on the ground of not having an Aadhaar card.

The bench said the so-called test has no scientific basis and it re-victimises and re-traumatises the women. "The test is based on an incorrect assumption that a sexually active woman cannot be raped. Nothing can be further from the truth," the bench added.

The bench queried Divan that his argument seems that for one who does not have Aadhaar, voting should not be denied to that person, or even on having Aadhaar, it should not be compulsory. At this, counsel replied that the right to vote is one of the most sacred rights. It scheduled the matter for further hearing in mid of December.

The bench added that it is regrettable that "two finger test" -- the invasive procedure adopted to determine sexual history -- continues to be conducted even today. The top court directed the central government to ensure the test was not conducted on rape survivors and the copy of its

HEARING ON PETITIONS CHALLENGING CAA ON DECEMBER 6

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Monday scheduled, for December 6, the hearing on over 200 petitions challenging the validity of the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), 2019.

The bench granted time to Solicitor General Tushar Mehta to file response on behalf of Tripura and Assam in the matter. It also nominated two advocates Pallavi Pratap, representing one of the petitioners, and Kanu Agrawal, representing the Centre, to make a common compilation of documents to facilitate smooth hearing in the matters arising out of more than 230 petitions.

A battery of senior advocates appeared on behalf of the petitioners. The top court said all counsel should share written submissions not exceeding three pages. "Nodal counsel can designate one or two other matters as lead matters," it added.

The apex court's judgment came on an appeal challenging the Telangana High Court judgment, which overturned the conviction by a trial court in a rape case, and it restored the conviction in the matter.

Morbi bridge tragedy: Nine arrested so far

A total of nine persons have been arrested so far in connection with cable bridge collapse in Gujarat's Morbi on Sunday evening, in which 141 persons have lost their lives, including 56 children, and 76 adults, police said on Monday.

► A day after the Morbi bridge collapse, the West Bengal Public Works Department (PWD) on Monday sought a detailed report on the condition of all the cable bridges in the state. These cable bridges are mainly scattered in the jungles of the Terai and Dooars regions and the hills of Darjeeling in North Bengal.

► Following bridge mishap in Morbi, Odisha government woke up and closed down suspension bridge over Mahanadi river in Dhabaleswar in Cuttack district for one day (Tuesday) to carry out repair works.



Massive rescue and search operation was carried out in Macchhu river where suspension bridge collapsed on Sunday causing several lives.

Inspector General of Police, Rajkot Range, Ashok Yadav informed media persons that two managers of Ajanta Manufacturing Company, 2 booking clerks, a father-son duo of the repair workers and three security guards have been arrested so far.

The managers were identified as Dipak Parekh, Dinesh Dave, and others are Mansukh Topiya, Mahadevbhai Solanki, Prakash Parmar and his son

Devang, Alpesh Gohil, Dilip Gohil, and Mukesh Chauhan.

Police will produce them before the court and seek their remand, the IG said.

On Sunday night, a criminal complaint was registered with the Morbi B-Division police station against the repair, renovation, maintenance and management agency, its managers, and others. Police had, however, not mentioned the company name in the complaint.

Ajanta Manufacturing Company has signed a lease for renovation, maintenance, and management of the cable bridge for 35 years.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be visiting Morbi cable bridge collapse site and also meet the victims on Tuesday afternoon. His all other public functions for Tuesday are cancelled, the media was informed.

Congress spokesman Pawan Khera has alleged that Ajanta has little experience in construction and renovation of such specialised bridges, and on the contrary, the company is into quartz watches, and CFL and LED bulbs manufacturing.

Khera has demanded that Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel should take moral responsibility for the tragic incident and resign.

RBI'S BOARD REVIEWS ECONOMIC SCENARIO

New Delhi: Even as the RBI's monetary policy committee (MPC) is scheduled to meet on November 3 to discuss its report to the government as inflation continues to remain beyond its comfort zone, the central bank's board on Monday reviewed the current economic scenario.

With retail inflation remaining above its 2 per cent to 6 per cent tolerance limit for the past nine months, the RBI's MPC will meet on November 3 to deliberate upon the issue.

Compulsory car seat-belts for all regime from Nov 1, but Mumbai not 'fully ready'

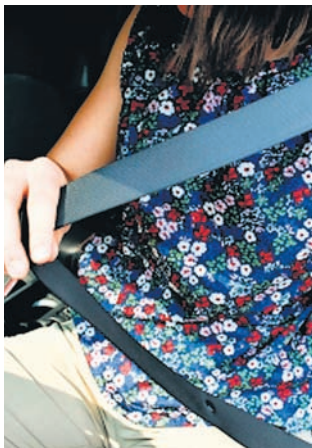
From November 1, the Mumbai Traffic Police will implement the rule making it compulsory for all drivers and passengers of motor vehicles to wear seat-belts, officials said, even as a top automobile expert feels the city is still "not fully prepared" for it.

The Mumbai Traffic Police had given time to all vehicle owners who do not have seat-belt facility for all to install them by the deadline of October 31.

The order was issued on October 14 following the amendment to the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Act's Section 194(b)(1), which has mandated that any person driving without a seat belt or carries passengers not wearing the same shall be liable for punishment.

From Tuesday, all motor vehicle drivers and commuters in such vehicles on Mumbai roads must compulsorily wear the seatbelts or



face punitive action under the laws. Western India Automobile

Association (WIAA) Chairman Emeritus and ex-Member of Parliament, Y.P. Trivedi lauded the move as "very positive from the safety aspect" but feels enough time was not given to the vehicle-owners to implement it.

He suggested that the police and transport authorities should adopt a lenient attitude with the offenders at least till December 31, and thereafter clamp down as per laws on the violators as many of the old vehicles still don't have seat-belts in the rear seats.

Last month, Union Minister for Road Transport Nitin Gadkari had declared that henceforth wearing seat-belts would be mandatory for all passengers in a car failing which penalty would be imposed.

'US MARKET IMPACT FOR SENSEX TO CROSS 60K'

Mumbai: The BSE Sensex on Monday closed at 60,746.59 points, up by 786.74 points, mainly due to the US factors, said a senior official of Geojit Financial Services.

According to Dr. V K Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Financial Services, the US market rally, in turn, has been triggered by the strong US Q3 gross domestic product (GDP) data which surprised on the upside with a 2.6 per cent growth.

The market, which had discounted an immediate recession, is now discounting a possibility of a soft landing for the US economy, that is, the Fed might succeed in taming inflation without pushing the economy into recession, Vijayakumar said. He said in India, foreign portfolio investors (FPI) turning buyers is another positive for markets.

Every third crime against children relates to sexual offences: NCRB

The NCRB data revealed a disturbing picture as 140 children were raped and murdered in 2021, while another 1,402 were also murdered. The maximum number of incidents of crime against children were reported in Uttar Pradesh, one of the largest states in India.

The spurt in incidents of crime against children across India has raised serious concern with 53,874 cases registered in 2021 alone under the POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) Act, according to data released by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB). According to the NCRB, overall a total of 1,49,404 cases relating to crime against children were registered in 2021 against 1,28,531 cases in 2020, a rise of 16.2 per cent. If statistics of the NCRB are an indication, every third crime against a child was



registered under the POCSO Act. In 2021, a total of 33,348 inci-

dents were registered under Sections 4 and 6 (punishment for

penetrative sexual assault and aggravated penetrative sexual assault) of the POCSO Act and in these cases 33,036 were girls while 312 were boys.

However, cases of kidnapping of children were more with 67,245 registered, posing a challenge for the police forces across the country. Delhi topped the list among the Union Territories with 7,783 crimes against children registered in 2021, while Nagaland registered the lowest number of crimes against children.

The total crimes against children rate went up from 28.9 per cent in 2020 to 33.6 per cent in 2021.

WOMAN FOUND LYING UNCONSCIOUS ON BHOPAL ROAD, ALLEGES ATTEMPTED RAPE

A 18-year-old woman was found lying unconscious on the roadside in a posh area of the Madhya Pradesh capital on Monday, and claimed an attempt by two men to rape her, police said. Admitted to the AIIMS for treatment, the woman, in her statement to police later, claimed she became unconscious during a fight with two unidentified men, who overpowered her when she was on her way home, and sought to molest her, but she resisted their attempts. The incident was reported in Katara Hills area. "The woman said she was on her way to home, two men molested her and attempted to rape her. But, she fought against them, during which she lost consciousness. She was admitted at AIIMS and has recovered now. On the basis of her statement, a case has been registered and search for the preparators has been initiated," a policeman at the Katara Hill Police station said.

PM MODI SLAMS CONGRESS FOR 'INSULTING' SARDAR PATEL

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday mocked Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' without naming it, and said that the party has ignored Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on his birth anniversary.

Citing Congress' advertisements in local newspapers in Gujarat on Monday, Modi said after laying the foundation stone for projects worth Rs 8,000 crore here, "Though today is Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's birth anniversary, none of Congress' ads carries his photo or his name. Sardar Patel was such a tall Congress leader and a minister in Jawaharlal Nehru's Cabinet. You can't unite over Sardar Patel, and now you are out to connect India. Why is the Congress insulting Sardar Patel? Gujarat will never tolerate this insult."



The Prime Minister added, "Life in Gujarat is full of struggle. Every decade we have faced droughts, the devastating earthquake had also tested us, but we, the courageous Gujaratis, could never be defeated by tough times. We have always confronted adverse situations with whatever resources we had at our disposal. Banaskantha district is an example of this."

Recollecting his old days in

north Gujarat, Modi said, "Don't you remember there were very few surface water sources here? North Gujarat was dependent on underground fluoride water, which had side-effects on our health. But since you gave me an opportunity to serve you, we worked on water harvesting by constructing check dams on rivers and deepening the traditional lakes, which helped the region meet its water needs."

HAD PATEL BEEN PM, INDIA WOULD BE FREE FROM MOST OF ITS PROBLEMS: AMIT SHAH

New Delhi: Union Home Minister Amit Shah attended a programme organised at Sardar Patel School in Delhi on the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. Addressing the students, he said that there is a general opinion in the country that had Sardar Patel been India's first Prime Minister, India would not have faced most of the problems it is facing today.

In view of the Morbi tragedy in Gujarat, the programme was cut short and it began after observing a minute's silence. Shah told children that Sardar Patel got maximum votes in the Congress Working Committee. He could have become the Prime Minister but he chose otherwise.

Shah added that Patel was the force behind India's cooperative movement in the form of AMUL. The map of India would not be like it is today without Sardar Patel's efforts. It would be incomplete. If Jammu & Kashmir is the country's crown, that is also because of him. The Home Minister also mentioned that India is the fifth largest economy in the world, surpassing Britain. "The country has left behind the ones who ruled it for 150 years."

"Sardar Patel has also gave us mature democracy. It was he who gave the task of drafting the Constitution to Ambedkar and also intervened to balance it," Shah added.

Don't want to politicise Gujarat bridge tragedy: Rahul Gandhi

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday declined to blame anybody for bridge collapse tragedy in Gujarat, saying he doesn't want to politicise it.

"I don't want to politicise this incident. People have died and it is disrespectful to them to politicise it," he said in reply to a question at a press conference in Rangareddy district near Hyderabad during Bharat Jodo Yatra. The Congress MP was asked who he would blame for the bridge collapse at Morbi which claimed more than 130 lives.

Replying to queries about Gujarat elections, he exuded confidence that the Congress will emerge victorious. He also claimed that there is strong anti-incumbency in Gujarat.

"Congress is fighting effectively. It will win. There is strong anti-incumbency," he said.

He did not agree that Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has any presence on the ground.

"AAP is only in air. It's not there on ground," he said adding that a false impression is being created about AAP's strength.

The Congress leader said Party president Mallikarjun Kharge will decide his role in the elections in Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh. "Kharge Ji will decide how I am going to be utilised," he said.

On Gujarat not being covered by his Yatra, he said the route was decided from



Kanyakumari to Kashmir and it's not possible to cover every state. "We are covering as many states possibly we can."

Gandhi alleged that lot of damage has been done to institutional framework of the country under the BJP rule. "There has been systematic attack on different institutions. You know how press is controlled, pressurised, and threatened. It's not just media. Judiciary, bureaucracy and all others are under attack. This is extremely damaging to the country," he said. "When Congress comes back to power, we are going to make sure that these institutions are freed from the grasp of RSS and certain independence is maintained in these institutions. That is our record and that is what we will do very aggressively," he added. Replying to another query, he said those who damaged the institutions would have to pay a price.

TN police to provide conditional permission for RSS march on Nov 6

Tamil Nadu police will provide conditional permission for the proposed route march of Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) across the state on November 6. Tamil Nadu Director General of Police, C. Sylendrababu, in a communique to all the district superintendents/commissioners of police said that the permission is being granted taking into account the safety of the public, participants in the march, traffic scenario, and the prevailing law and order situation in the areas to covered by the march.

Tamil Nadu police had earlier filed a petition in the Madras High Court seeking to review the permission it had granted to conduct the march on September 22. The petition was based on the National Investigation Agency (NIA) raids and arrests of leaders of Popular Front of India (PFI) and the subsequent ban on the organisation.

The police had said that the situation was not conducive for conducting a march and the subsequent public programme, given the communally sensitive nature in many parts of the state.



The high court had accepted the police report which presented seven intelligence reports that indicated possible communal tension in the wake of raids at PFI centres. The court then directed the police to grant permission for the route march on November 6.

Heavy rain in Chennai, adjoining districts till Wednesday: IMD

The Regional Centre of the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has warned of heavy rain in Chennai and the adjoining districts of Kancheepuram, Tiruvallur and Chengalapatu till Wednesday.

After the northeast monsoon hit Tamil Nadu on October 29, several areas of the state has been witnessing rain followed by thunderstorms.

A yellow alert has been issued for Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur, where heavy to very heavy rain are predicted for the next two days.

The heavy downpour is due to the likely movement of a trough in easterlies across Tamil Nadu.



The weather department has also warned of heavy to very heavy rain in Villupuram, Tirupattur, Kallakurichi, Pudukkottai, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur and Mylathurai districts. In many places of

Chennai, Erode, Salem, and Kancheepuram, the stormwater drain work is yet to be completed.

Heavy water logging had resulted in inundation of homes in Chennai and Kancheepuram.

SONIA, KHARGE PAY TRIBUTES TO INDIRA GANDHI ON HER DEATH ANNIVERSARY



New Delhi: Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and Congress Parliamentary party (CPP) Chairperson Sonia Gandhi on Monday offered their homage to former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi on her death anniversary. Indira Gandhi was assassinated by her bodyguards on this day in 1984 at her residence in Safdarjung Road.

Later, Kharge and Sonia Gandhi paid tributes at the Indira Gandhi memorial also. Indira Gandhi was prime Minister of the country from 1966 to 1977 and then from 1980 till her death in 1984.

Telangana weavers send thousands of postcards to PM

In a novel protest, thousands of handloom weavers from Telangana on Monday sent postcards to Prime Minister Narendra Modi demanding rollback of Goods and Service Tax (GST) on handlooms.

Thousands of postcards were deposited at the General Post Office (GPO). Weavers and handloom supporters gathered at Nizam College Grounds and marched to GPO in a rally.

The participants were carrying pictures of Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao and state Handlooms and Textiles Minister K. T. Rama Rao as well as placards with the demand to roll back the GST. The wavers demanded the Centre to immediately roll back five percent GST on handlooms products and its raw materials.

The weavers wrote the post cards responding to the call given by Rama Rao who launched the cam-



paign on October 22 demanding GST rollback. The campaign received massive response from weavers spread across the state.

Addressing people gathered at the college grounds, Ramana demanded that the GST should be rolled back. He has also demanded the union government to restore the schemes for weavers which were

scrapped, including ICICI Lombard Health Scheme and Mahatma Gandhi Bunker Bima Yojana. Ramana said that Chief Minister Chandrasekhar Rao took several measures to protect the handlooms sector. Some of them are Nethanna Ku Bima, Chenetha Mithra, Nethannaku Cheyutha and loan waiver to weavers.

In the second significant operation in less than a week, Assam Rifles has seized a large cache of Myanmar-bound tactical and war-like stores, including explosive materials, from Mizorams Siaha district and apprehended four persons in connection with the case, officials said on Monday.

Defence spokesman Lt. Col. Mahendra Rawat said that acting on a tip-off, a joint team of Assam Rifles and Mizoram Police launched the operation at Tuipang village in Siaha district on Sunday night and seized Myanmar-bound arms, ammunition and explosives.

"The team had specific information about the movement of tactical and war-like stores for insurgents based in



Myanmar. The security personnel intercepted and searched one Kenbo bike (Chinese made) and one Yodha pickup vehicle and recovered arms and ammunition from them," he said. Rawat said that the stores

recovered were of military grade and hence the same being used for anti-national activities by insurgents based in Myanmar cannot be ruled out.

The seized items include one shotgun, 2,483 rounds

ammunition, 169 Gelatin sticks, 1,500 Cal 4.5 mm and 0.177 mm pellets. Four detained smugglers and the seized items have been handed over to the Siaha police station for further investigation and legal proceedings.

7 KILLED IN TWO ROAD ACCIDENTS IN TELANGANA

Hyderabad: Seven people were killed and 10 injured in two separate road accidents in Telangana on Monday, police said.

Four people, including a woman, died when the car in which they were travelling rammed into a container truck in Adilabad district in the early hours of the day.

The accident occurred on National Highway 44 near Sitagondi in Gudihathnoor mandal.

The car with five persons was on its way from Hyderabad to Adilabad town. The deceased include three members of the same family and driver.

They were identified as Syed Rafatullah Hashmi, Wajah Hashmi, Sabiha and driver Shamshu. Another young woman, who was injured, was shifted to Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS), Adilabad. The car was badly mangled in the collision and the police had to use a crane to separate it from the container truck and retrieve the bodies.

In the second accident, three persons were killed and nine injured in Medchal Malkajgiri district near Hyderabad. The accident occurred when a tempo in which they were travelling collided with a truck near Kandlakoya.

The injured were shifted to Yashoda hospital Secunderabad where the condition of two of them is stated to be critical. The victims were returning after darshan at Srisailem temple in neighboring Andhra Pradesh.

HIMACHAL POLLS: ILLICIT LIQUOR, CASH AND JEWELLERY WORTH RS 18 CRORE SEIZED

Shimla: Illicit liquor, cash and jewellery worth Rs 18 crore have been seized by the police, and the Excise and Mining departments since the model conduct came into force for the Assembly election in Himachal Pradesh, an official said on Monday.

In the past 24 hours, cash amounting to Rs 31,80,800 and 2,109 litres of illicit liquor, worth Rs 6,16,832, was seized, a spokesperson for the Election Department said. Besides, the police seized charas and heroin of Rs 9,29,950.

The spokesman said that during the inspection by the Income Tax Department, Rs 16,00,000 cash and gold valued at Rs 1,56,345 was also seized. The Excise Department also seized 2,046.175 litres of illicit liquor, worth Rs 12,05,605.

A total of 148 cases of illegal mining with a fine of Rs 5,80,600 were imposed by the Mining Department since the model code of conduct came into force.

HC EXPUNGES WORD 'KIND' FROM RAPE CASE JUDGEMENT

The MP high court modified one of its own judgements that reduced punishment of a rape convict from life imprisonment to 20 years in jail, saying that certain inadvertent mistake had crept in the order. The Madhya Pradesh high court has expunged the words "kind enough to leave the prosecutrix (girl) alive" and modified the order of reducing punishment of a rape culprit from life imprisonment to 20 years in jail by saying that certain inadvertent mistake had crept in the judgment.

In a new order given on October 27, a division bench of justices Subodh Abhyankar and Satyendra Kumar Singh said, "It is brought to the notice of this court that certain inadvertent mistake has crept in the judgment delivered by this court on October 18 where in the word kind has been used to refer to appellant who stands convicted of rape."

On October 18, the court said "The court does not find any error in appreciation of evidence by the trial court and considering the demonic act of the appellant who appears to have no respect for the dignity of a woman and has the propensity to commit sexual offence even with a girl child aged 4 years, this Court does not find it to be a fit case where the sentence can be reduced to the sentence already undergone by him,



however, considering the fact that he was kind enough to leave the prosecutrix (girl) alive, this court is of the opinion that the life imprisonment can be reduced to 20 years' rigorous imprisonment."

The criminal appeal is partly allowed and the appellant be made to suffer the period

of 20 years in accordance with law, said the order. The court said on October 27 that it is apparent that the aforesaid mistake is obviously inadvertent in the context, as this court has already held the act of the appellant as demonic. In such circumstance, while exercising our powers as conferred

under Section 362 of CrPC, the aforesaid paragraph is modified and replaced as under.

"However, considering the fact that he didn't cause any other physical injury to the victim, this court is of the opinion that the life imprisonment can be reduced to 20 years' rigorous imprisonment," the order said in the modified judgment. However, the father of the rape survivor, who is unable to challenge the verdict, said, "Only my family and my daughter know how much we faced. She faced both physical and mental trauma for years and it will continue till death but the culprit will get rid of it in the next five years as he already spent 15 years in jail."

"I appealed to the government to move to the Supreme Court against this judgment and ensure capital punishment for the heinous act with my four-year-old daughter," he added.

A resident of Dabra town of Gwalior district, Ram Singh, 45, raped the four-year-old girl in Indore in 2007 and the session court sentenced a punishment of life imprisonment to him in 2009. He appealed before the court that he has been falsely implicated in the case as barring eyewitnesses there is no cogent evidence available on record to connect him with the offence as even the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) report is not brought on record in support of the case of the prosecution.

Abhijit Agarwal is a 2010 batch IAS officer. At the same time, Suresh Kumar, an IAS officer of 2010 batch, has been posted as the secretary of the Revenue Division, Gwalior. Suresh Kumar is still the Managing Director of Gwalior Industrial Center Development Corporation. In the same order, Deputy Secretary, Government of Madhya Pradesh and 2016 batch IAS officer Anshul Gupta has been made the Managing Director of State Wide Area Network (SWAN).

INDIAN LEDS PROVIDE BETTER WIRELESS COMMUNICATION

The replacement of Chinese Light Emitting Diodes (LEDs) with Indian made ones during the festive season led to a marked improvement in Very High Frequency (VHF) radio communication this year. A senior officer of the West Bengal Police noted how communications between the control room and personnel on the ground used to be a big challenge due to severe interference during Durga Puja, Kali Puja and Jagaddhatri Puja in previous years. Millions of LED chains are used to decorate Puja pandals and surrounding areas during the festive season in the state. Even government agencies use LED chains to decorate structures in public places like parks and gardens during the festival. "This used to be a big problem as our personnel involved in law-and-order duties and crowd control during the festivals remained cut-off from the control room. Their handheld radios were practically useless. This was a major threat to the security. We didn't know the reason till amateur radio operators from the West Bengal Radio Club (WBRC) carried out their own research," the officer said. Ambarish Nag Biswas, secretary, WBRC, said that they detected the phenomenon while carrying out tests on their VHF sets. Such tests are carried out for sometime daily to check signal strength. It took a bit of doing to get to the bottom of the interference. According to Prof. Pashumati Mondal, a physicist associated with WBRC, Chinese LEDs have three prongs or legs and are made of inferior quality material. "Chinese LEDs use tin while Indian ones use metals like copper. All this interference has to do with photon particles that are key to emission of light by the diodes. Whenever the cheap Chinese LEDs are used, a noise is emitted that travels along the radio waves, causing interference. As a result, the receiver can't hear any voice. "

Diwali and discounts fail to draw viewers

A yet-to-be-released film comes up with a display ad offering a 25 per cent discount on admission rates. Has that ever happened before? Now, in the multiplex era, or in the single screen era? It has not. Ajay Devgn's 'Drishyam 2' opens on November 18, but the advance booking has already commenced and for those who booked opening-day tickets on October 24 and 25 were offered a discount of 25 per cent! Does it make business sense to lure viewers to book tickets for a film due three weeks later on the day when they have two new releases in the cinemas - 'Ram Setu' and 'Thank God', both fresh Diwali offerings. If cinemas are not drawing footfalls for new films, can one expect viewers for a forthcoming film? What is strange is that no such offer was made for another Ajay Devgn film, 'Thank God', released on October 25. It is all happening now. Cinema viewing is being marketed like most consumer products. Buy one, get one free. Weekly discounted ticket days, flat Rs 400 weekdays, and so on. The cinemas were gradually losing their ground. The footfalls were thinning. But the admission rates remained high, unaffordable and impractical. I think there was something called cost accountancy and all manufacturing companies had these cost accountants. To qualify as one, you needed a university degree. The cost accountant's job was to determine a product's selling price according to its merit, quality and cost of manufacturing. But when it came to our multiplexes, whatever the film, the admission rates did not adjust to other factors such as face value (which draws the audience)



or the merit of the film. They seemed to follow the story one had heard in one's childhood about Andher Nagari. The story went thus: 'Andher nagari aur chau-pat raja; takke ser bhaji takke ser khaja'. It seems the multiplexes were under the wrong impression that films pulled crowds and succeeded because of the attraction of their property and not the film they screened. These cinemas may be run by some marketing genius, but they could have done well to study and research the exhibition trade as it was practised in India. The cinemas sustained because of films and once the multiplexes came, they were starved of films and started perishing. There were cinemas in Mumbai such as Roxy, Opera House, Swastik and Imperial that offered no luxury and no food courts. But these cinemas had a reputation of sustaining a film for silver and golden jubilees. One needs to visit the Imperial cinema in Mumbai. It is in the same condition now as it was when Amitabh Bachchan's first blockbuster, 'Zanjeer', released here. The film ran for 50 weeks at this cinema. A good film had that power. There were times when filmmakers such as Manoj Kumar and Shakti Samanta and distributors like Shankar BC waited for weeks to release their film at one of these cinemas while the film running there completed its run. A film and the cinema house complemented each other's reputation. Is there any cinema anywhere, especially of the multiplex kind, which can claim to draw an audience unless the film or the star had that drawing power? These multiplexes were compelled to screen films such as 'Suraj Pe Mangal Bhari' on the maker's terms to get footfalls. Now that these cinemas are facing tough times, various schemes are being introduced to lure viewers. They screened huge Hollywood classic hits such as 'Star Wars', 'ET: The Extra-terrestrial', and so on. Then there was an Amitabh Bachchan

retrospective, to coincide with his 80th birthday, which was a huge success. And finally came the Indian Cinema Day, when tickets were sold at the flat rate of Rs 75. That was also a success. Through their own experiments, the cinemas have proved that if the admission rates are affordable, viewers will come to watch even a 40-year-old 'ET' and 47-year-old Bachchan film, 'Deewaar'. At the prevailing rates, they don't even venture out to see a new film. It made sense that all the single-screen cinemas in India accommodated almost 70 per cent of its viewers in the stalls, which had varied rate slabs, and the few who came with families and could afford it in the balcony class. That was a fair division considering the buying power of film lovers. A cinema had a seat for all. At these single-screen cinemas, one had the option of buying a pack of

wafers or samosa and wash it down with a glass of water. None of that was costlier than the rates charged outside the theatre. One also had the option to walk out and buy vada pav. I often watch a film at the mass generating G7 Complex in Bandra, Mumbai, and can enjoy the same facilities. But you can't leave a multiplex in the interval and come back to continue watching the film! To prove the point, cinemas had a great run when Shah Rukh Khan, Salman Khan, Aamir Khan, Akshay Kumar and Hrithik Roshan continued to deliver hits, drawing the crowds. Now they don't. Exhibitors lost the plot somewhere along the line. More so after the Covid-19 lockdown. OTT platforms replaced cinema entertainment. At the same time, the actors were gradually losing their following by indulging in things they should not. Social media has also been spelling doom for a lot many stars. Otherwise, what explains that despite Diwali holidays and the popular interval in Lord Ram and Ayodhya for both reasons of faith and the debates surrounding the two topics, 'Ram Setu' could not bring in the audience and still needs to give out inflated figures? After all, Akshay Kumar is known to further the issues of national and social interest! The other release, 'Thank God', has also not made much of the Diwali festival. I think between cinema managements and filmmakers, they would do well to introduce more schemes to bring the audience back to the cinemas. In the past, films brought in the crowds. Now that they don't, so let us see if your cola and popcorn help if made affordable.

EX-BRAZILIAN PREZ LULA DEFEATS BOLSONARO IN RUNOFF POLLS

Former Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva defeated sitting President Jair Bolsonaro in the second round of the presidential elections, paving the way for his third four-year term beginning January 1, 2023. Figures released by the Superior Electoral Tribunal (TSE) showed that Lula of the Workers' Party (PT) obtained more than 60 million votes, or 50.89 per cent of the ballots, cast on Sunday, surpassing Bolsonaro of the Liberal Party, who received over 58 million votes, or 49.11 per cent, reports Xinhua news agency. This is the smallest margin in a second-round presidential election in Brazil's history. In the first round held on October 2, Lula garnered 48.3 per cent of the vote, compared to 43.2 per cent for Bolsonaro. Lula, 77, served as the President



for two terms between 2003 and 2010. This is a comeback for the former President who could not run in the 2018 election because he was in jail and banned from standing for office. He had been found guilty of receiving a bribe from a Brazilian construction firm in return for contracts with Brazil's state oil company

Petrobras. Lula spent 580 days in jail before his conviction was annulled and he returned to the political fray. In this year's presidential elections, his strength lay particularly in voters from the impoverished northeast of Brazil. He focused his campaign on social issues, making pledges including minimum wage increases, strengthening of state-owned companies, and efforts against hunger and poverty. "The first measures of our government will be to free 33 million people from hunger and more than 100 million Brazilians from poverty," Lula had said in an open letter last week. Proposing an economic policy featuring both state actions and private initiatives, he said, "it is possible to combine fiscal responsibility, social responsibility, and sustainable development, and that is what we are going to do, following the trends of the world's main economies".

"We will initiate the digital transition ... with an industrial policy that supports innovation, stimulates public-private cooperation, strengthens science and technology, and guarantees access to financing at adequate costs." Lula also pledged to expand trade and technological cooperation between Brazil and other countries, help enhance regional integration, and promote "fairer and more democratic relations between countries". Meanwhile in his victory speech on Sunday, Lula said he would govern for all Brazilians and not just those who voted for him. "This country needs peace and unity. This population doesn't want to fight anymore," he was quoted as saying. Bolsonaro however, is yet to concede. Just a day before the runoff, he had said: "There is not the slightest doubt. Whoever has more votes, takes it (the election). That's what democracy is about."

Russia launches massive missile strikes across Ukraine

Russia on Monday launched massive missile strikes across Ukraine, including the capital Kiev, causing power and water outages, according to officials in the war-torn country. At least two blasts were reported in Kiev, while strikes also hit the central Vinnytsia region, as well as Dnipropetrovsk and Zaporizhzhia in the south-east, and Lviv in the west, the BBC reported citing the officials as saying. In the north-eastern city of Kharkiv, critical infrastructure facilities were hit, the local authorities said. The strikes come after Russia blamed Ukraine for a drone attack on its Black Sea Fleet in the annexed Crimea. Ukraine's Air Force



spokesman Yuriy Ihnat told local media that Russia had used its strategic bombers to carry out the attack. Andriy Yermak, the head of President Volodymyr Zelensky's office, said that "Russian losers are continuing to fight against peaceful objects", the BBC reported. On Saturday, one Russian warship was damaged in the port city of Sevastopol in a drone attack, the Russian Defence Ministry said. It also accused British specialists of having trained the Ukrainian soldiers who then carried out the strikes in Crimea, Ukraine's southern peninsula, annexed by Russia in 2014. Moscow however, provided no evidence to back its claims. Ukraine has not commented on the issue, while the UK Defence Ministry said Russia was "peddling false claims on an epic scale".

RECENT TRIBAL CONFLICT IN SUDAN KILLS 287 PEOPLE

Khartoum: At least 287 people have been killed and 239 others injured in the recent tribal conflict in Sudan's south-eastern Blue Nile State, a local official confirmed. Expecting the number of victims to continue to rise, Health Minister of Blue Nile State Jamal Nasir said in a statement that a new survey began on Sunday, reports Xinhua news agency. Forensic medicine teams would determine the causes of deaths of a number of burnt bodies to see whether they had suffered weapon attack or beatings, he noted. On October 19 and 20, fighting broke out between the Hausa and Berta tribes in the state, reportedly because of disputes over land ownership. On October 21, Blue Nile State Governor Ahmed El Omda Badi issued a decision to form a fact-finding committee to investigate the tribal fighting in the state. The Governor also issued a decree declaring a state of emergency in all parts of the Blue Nile region for 30 days.

4 killed in Colorado house shooting

Denver | Agencies

Four people were killed in a shooting at a house in Aurora, a city in the US state of Colorado, with the suspect still at large, local police said. In a statement on Sunday, the Aurora Police Department (APD) said it received a report of a shooting at the house downtown at roughly 2 a.m., reports Xinhua news agency. Officers found four adults, three men and one woman, dead from gunshot wounds when they arrived three minutes later. The suspect was identified as Joseph Castorena, 21, supposedly the domestic partner of the woman killed in the house. A relative of the dead woman told local MSNBC 9 news chan-



nel that it was an ambushed shooting. The suspect hid in the house and opened fire when the victims returned from a party. Shortly after the shooting, a reverse 911 alert was issued in a one-mile radius for all residences to shelter in place, while officers searched the neighbourhood in the dark. The APD classified this investigation as a homicide case but warned the suspect was dangerous and may have a gun.

S.KOREA, US KICK OFF COMBINED AIR DRILLS AFTER 5 YRS

Seoul | Agencies

South Korea and the US have kicked off their first large-scale joint air drills in nearly five years, with more than 240 aircraft mobilised, including their advanced stealth jets, as the allies strive to bolster deterrence against evolving North Korean threats, according to officials here. The Vigilant Storm exercise will run through Friday over the sky of the Korean Peninsula amid concerns that Pyongyang could may soon carry out a nuclear test. The North may also try to show its own firepower with the firing of ballistic missiles or artillery shells in response to the allies' drills. The South is deploying some 140 planes, including F-35A stealth fighters, and F-15K and KF-16 jets, while the US is dispatching about 100 assets, including F-35B stealth fighters based in Okinawa, Japan, and EA-18 electronic warfare aircraft,



as well as KC-135 tankers and the U-2 high-altitude reconnaissance aircraft. The allies plan to perform a total of more than 1,600 sorties during the drills, with the Korean Air and Space Operations Centre operating the forces to enhance operational capabilities. The Australian Air Force is taking part in the practice as well, with a KC-30A multi-role tanker transport. South Korea and the US launched such a major combined air training program in 2015 under the name of Vigilant ACE, but it had been held every year until late 2017, when the

then Moon Jae-in administration staged a proactive campaign for inter-Korean reconciliation. This year's exercise comes after a series of provocations by Pyongyang in recent weeks, including its firing of two short-range ballistic missiles into the East Sea on October 28.

SHINDE-FADNAVIS ORDER CAG PROBE INTO BMC AFFAIRS

In a significant move ahead of the upcoming BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) elections, the Maharashtra government on Monday ordered the Comptroller & Auditor General (CAG) to inquire the civic body's affairs and certain decisions taken in the past couple of years, here on Monday.

The probe would cover the measures taken during the two pandemic years -- 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 -- and into the allegations of corruption and irregularities in awarding various contracts without tenders.

These included setting up several Covid Care facilities in the city and procurement for the Jumbo field hospitals erected during the pandemic years, according to an official statement from the CMO on Monday.

The probe comes in the wake of a clamour by several Bharatiya Janata



Party leaders alleging scams in the construction of and purchases for these Covid facilities and the Jumbo hospitals. Besides this, the BMC's land purchase deal in Dahisar-Eksar from Alpesh Ajmera of Nishalp Realities worth Rs 349 crore, which was reportedly bought by the builder

from the owner family for just Rs 2.55 crore.

Several top BMC officials, including Commissioners had raised objections to the land deal after which the builder moved the courts and demanded Rs 900-crore, and the state government feels it is one of the

biggest BMC scams that needs a thorough investigation.

"The investigation is not ordered out of vendetta... It's to get at the truth. Let the probe be completed and the real picture will emerge," Shinde told the mediapersons later.

Lauding the move, the Maharashtra Navnirman Sena Spokesperson Sandip Deshpande alleged that "the corruption in BMC had exceeded the lootings carried out by the banditry of K. M. Veerappan" -- the jungle criminal of south India who was shot dead in a police encounter in October 2004.

The state Congress President Nana Patole flayed the government's decision saying those who are facing 'Khokha' (slang for crore rupees) are now accusing the Opposition of corruption.

The BMC has been ruled for nearly three decades by the Shiv Sena (UBT) till its term expired in early-2022, and now the elections are awaited shortly.

He said that Yadav's demise earlier this month sent a wave of grief among people all over the country, especially the socialists and secularists, and the government should recognise his contributions by conferring him the Bharat Ratna posthumously.

The founder-President of the Samajwadi Party, Yadav was groomed by stalwarts like Ram Manohar Lohia, Jaiprakash Narain and others, was elected the UP CM in 1989, 1993 and then in 2003, besides serving as Defence Minister in 1996.

"Fake Narrative" that projects going out of Maharashtra: Devendra Fadnavis

suitable for business here in Maharashtra."

He added that, "Tata official said to me that they are going to Gujarat one year before."

On Safran project, the deputy chief minister said, "The project went to Hyderabad and they were doing a fake narrative about us."

The deputy chief minister said in two years, he would bring Maharashtra on No. 1 and added that investors were not coming to the state because of these fake narratives.

Fadnavis said "Some people are saying that all projects are going to Gujarat but this is not right. Projects and investments are going to other states, also."

The party has not revealed the nature of Pawar's illness, but an official said he had been experiencing weakness after his recent tour of some flood-hit regions of Pune district. All party leaders and activists have been requested not to crowd at the hospital, said the NCP.

WOMAN ATTEMPTS SUICIDE AFTER KILLING TWO CHILDREN

Mumbai: A 32-year-old woman allegedly killed her two minor children and then tried to commit suicide in Navi Mumbai township of Maharashtra's Thane district, police said on Monday.

The incident took place in Ghansoli area on Sunday and the reason behind it was yet to be ascertained, an official from Airoli police station said.

The woman's husband was out for work when she allegedly slit the throats of her four-year-old daughter and one-year-old son at their home, he said. When her husband returned at around 4 pm, he found the two children dead and his wife lying with her wrist slit, the official said.

The woman was admitted to a local hospital and the bodies were sent to a government hospital for post-mortem, he said. The family was planning to go to their native place in Uttar Pradesh in a few days, the official said.

The police have registered a case against the woman, who is still in the hospital, on the charge of murder and other relevant provisions, he said.

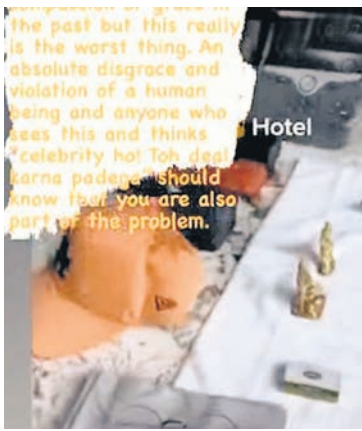
ANUSHKA SHARMA IS FUMING OVER LEAKED VIDEO OF KOHLI'S HOTEL SUITE

Another Leopard spotted at Aarey colony, SGNP rescue team in action

Even as a second leopard, a male, walked into the cage in Unit 15 early on Sunday, SGNP rescue team and Aarey locals reported seeing another big cat lurking around the same area throughout the day. Sources said that this wild cat could be a female.

"After a leopard was trapped and taken to the Sanjay Gandhi National Park (SGNP) on Sunday morning, the sighting of another leopard continued in the area in broad daylight," said a resident not willing to be named. The male leopard, second to be trapped within a week, was captured in the cage around 200-300 metres away from the spot where a girl was killed on Monday. The first



leopard was trapped around 1 km away from this spot, said sources.

G Mallikarjun, the chief conservator of forests and director of the SGNP, confirmed to mid-day, "A male leopard walked into the trap cage set at Unit 15 in Aarey Milk Colony in the wee hours of Sunday. The animal was taken to the leopard

rescue centre at the SGNP. We are investigating if it is the leopard suspected to be behind conflicts with humans. Based on the result, we will take further decisions. The camera trapping exercise will continue along with day and night patrolling."

Locals in the area told mid-day that they spotted two leopards together close to where the male big cat was trapped on Sunday.

Vasim Athaniya, a member of Aarey camera trapping team, said, "Late last night, the dogs in our area were continuously barking in the direction of the forest. While heading home, I saw a leopard walking towards the forest and within a few seconds, I saw another one following the first. They could be either siblings or a mating pair." After the male leopard

was captured around 6 am on Sunday, at least 20-30 local residents claimed to have spotted a leopard lurking in the area. Stray dogs were constantly barking in the direction of the forest all day, too, said locals, adding that this is an indication that the wild cat was present in the area.

A forest department official said, "As multiple sightings continued in broad daylight on Sunday, our team was stationed in the area to prevent people from venturing into the forest." The team also conducted patrolling in the area.

The forest department has instructed the camera trapping team members to check the traps and go out in a group of three, considering the leopard is on the prowl in broad daylight.

Dinesh Karthik also misses out from the T20I squad and when queried about it, chairman of selectors Chetan Sharma during a virtual press conference, pointed towards workload management as the reason for his exclusion. Mohammed Shami, R Ashwin and Axar Patel are the other players in the T20 World Cup squad, who aren't part of the squad for the T20Is against New



Zealand.

Notably, Hardik had also led India earlier this year, during the two T20Is in Ireland, when Rohit was unavailable for the two T20Is in Ireland. Shikhar has also captained ODI sides at many occasions in recent times.

India will play three T20Is and three ODIs in New Zealand from November 18. The T20Is will be

played in Wellington (November 18), Mount Maunganui (November 20) and Napier (November 22), while the ODIs are in Auckland (November 25), Hamilton (November 27) and Christchurch (November 30).

India last toured New Zealand in 2020, when they won the T20I series 5-0, lost the ODIs 3-0, and suffered a 2-0 defeat in the Test series.

Meanwhile in the women's section, Woman Grandmasters Nandhidhaa PV and Priyanka Nutakki scored victories over Thi Kim Phung Vo of Vietnam and Soumya Swaminathan, respectively to become joint leaders with four-and-a-half points.

Verstappen records 14th victory of season; breaks Schumacher, Vettel record

Dutch Formula 1 driver Max Verstappen made history as he beat Mercedes' Lewis Hamilton to claim his 14th victory of the 2022 season in the Mexican Grand Prix after an intriguing strategic battle at the Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez here on Sunday.

Verstappen, who has already clinched the world title, finished ahead of former world champion and fiercest rival Hamilton and Red Bull team-mate Sergio Perez.

It secures another record for the young Dutchman, as he



now boasts the most wins in a single F1 campaign, moving one clear of the 13 achieved by Germany's Michael Schumacher (2004) and Sebastian Vettel (2013).

Verstappen, whose Red Bull team opted for a soft-medium tyre strategy, took the chequered flag some 15 seconds ahead of Hamilton, who was left to question why Mercedes swapped their starting set of mediums for hard tyres, according to formula1.com.

Verstappen has expressed his surprise at winning a record 14 races in a year, "I think quite early on, we figured that we could make it to the end. Another great race but also, it's just an incredible season for us as a team. I never thought I would be able to win 14 races in a year, but of course, incredibly proud."

T20 WORLD CUP

Australia produced a clinical all-round performance to hammer Ireland by 42 runs in a Super 12 game of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup at the Gabba, here on Monday.

With this win, Australia moved to the second spot in Group 1 standings with five points in four matches. On the other hand, Ireland are in fourth spot with three points.

Australia skipper Aaron Finch played an excellent knock of 63 from 44 deliveries to guide his team to a commanding total of 179/5 in 20 overs, after they were invited to bat first. Apart from Aaron, all-rounders Marcus Stoinis (35) and Mitchell Marsh (28) also made valuable contributions with the bat for the hosts.

Chasing a challenging total, Lorcan Tucker was the lone warrior for Ireland, who kept losing wickets at regular intervals. He looked in control, kept the scoreboard ticking and remained not out with his brilliant knock of 71 off 48. Tucker got some support from the lower order, but in the end he was



left with too much to do as Ireland were eventually bowled out for 137-10 in 18.1 overs, losing by 42 runs. The likes of Glenn Maxwell (2/14), Adam Zampa (2/19), Pat Cummins (2/28), Mitchell Starc (2/43) shared two wickets each for Australia.

Earlier, Australia got off to a slow start as the Ireland bowlers used the conditions well to keep hosts quiet. Barry McCarthy dismissed David Warner in the third over of the innings before Australia could get any sort of momentum going.

Finch and Mitchell Marsh tried their best but they could

take Australia to a score of 38/1 at the end of the powerplay.

Things changed soon, though. Marsh and Finch started taking on the bowlers after the powerplay and added the necessary impetus to the Australian innings. Finch was involved in two crucial partnerships of 52 and 70 with Marsh and Marcus Stoinis respectively, which helped Australia in getting to such a competitive total. It was Barry McCarthy who brought an end to Finch's knock while Stoinis also played a good innings of 35 from 25 deliveries. Matthew Wade and Tim David, who remained unbeaten on seven and 15 respectively, also added valuable runs towards the end.

Barry McCarthy (3/29) was the pick of the bowlers for Ireland, while left-arm pacer Josh Little (2/21) scalped two wickets.

The AFC President feels that India has a greater chance for success in the future. "It's a country of more than 1.3 billion, so there must be enough talent in India. They need all the support they can get from the stakeholders, the AIFF, the government, private sector, and all other parties for the game to succeed. I'm sure football has great potential to succeed in India," he said.

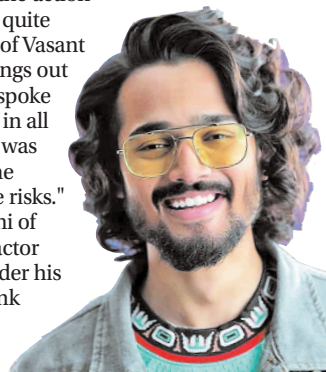


I am a perfectionist: Bhuvan
