"Our world is plagued by a perfect storm on a number of fronts," said UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, who called for urgent action on a number of interconnected challenges, including the global economic crisis, climate, income and gender inequality, US-China relations, Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the lingering effects of the Covid-19 pandemic. "Now more than ever, it is time to forge the pathways to cooperation in our fragmented world." World leaders expressed solidarity with Ukraine.

With more than 50 high-impact initiatives were launched or profiled, world leaders gathered at the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting 2023 in the first major international gathering of the year to address ongoing economic, energy and food crises laid the groundwork for a more sustainable, resilient world. While many economists forecast recessionary risks in 2023 and see geopolitical tensions continuing to shape the global economy, there are glimmers of hope that pressures on food, energy and inflation may be peaking. Cooperation is becoming more virtual and the Forum's Global Collaboration Village showed how the metaverse can be harnessed for inclusive and effective international action. With the golden age of artificial intelligence under way, technology will provide more ways to bring people together. As crises converge, so too must the solutions. The annual meeting emphasized connections across big systemic challenges. With over 480 sessions, more than 2,700 leaders -- including over 350 public figures government leaders and



47 heads of state -- came together at the annual meeting to address the world's most pressing challenges. The Forum launched a new network of online regulators from the United Kingdom, Australia, Ireland and Fiji, which aims to create synergies across geographies and protect end users. The Global Risks Report 2023 ranks the cost-of-living crisis as the most severe short-term global risk, while the failure of climate mitigation and climate adaptation are the biggest long-term concerns for humanity. The risks community identified three prior-

ities for its mandate: risk foresight, strengthening the quantification of global risks; and linking foresight and preparedness. On growth, investment, trade and infrastructure, the Forum and the government of the United Arab Emirates signed a collaboration agreement on the TradeTech initiative to use technology to overcome trade impediments across sectors and geographies. They also signed an agreement to host the annual meeting of the Forum's Global Future Council 2023 in Dubai on October 16-17. More than 50 countries launched a Coalition of Trade

Ministers on Climate to drive inclusive cooperation among trade ministers in the global response to the climate crisis, trade and sustainable development. The US announced new resources for the Global Alliance for Trade Facilitation to advance work in bright spot countries making tough reforms. A Forum initiative is supporting the WTO's Draft Investment Facilitation for Development Agreement, which is expected to be completed by the first half of 2023. Nine leading industrial clusters in China, Indonesia, Japan,

Spain and the US have joined the Forum's Transitioning Industrial Clusters towards Net Zero initiative to help industries reduce emissions. Eight manufacturing companies committed to join forces and mobilize resources to further scale the Global Lighthouse Network initiative to accelerate digitalization, sustainability and inclusive workforce engagement at scale. On health, the Forum launched its first thematic centre on healthcare and life sciences in Telangana, India, in collaboration with the state government. On climate, energy, nature and sustainability, a new initiative, Giving to Amplify Earth Action (GAEA), will leverage philanthropic capital to help generate the \$3 trillion needed each year from public and private sources to tackle the climate crisis and nature loss. The Global Battery Alliance launched a proof of concept for its Battery Passport to help facilitate the rapid scaling of sustainable, circular and responsible battery value chains to meet the targets of the Paris Agreement through electrification of the transport and power sectors. The president of Tanzania and NITI Aayog CEO committed to joining the Food Action Alliance.

21-YR-OLD SONU BREAKS FREE FROM BONDS OF CHILD MARRIAGE AFTER 17 YEARS

Sonu (21), who was married at the age of four, became free from the curse of child marriage after a court in Jodhpur district annulled her wedding which took place 17 years back. Sonu had pleaded for annulment of her marriage after being encouraged by Saarthi Trust's managing trustee and rehabilitation psychologist Kriti Bharti. Accordingly, judge Pukhraj Gehlot sent out a strong message to the society by annulling Sonu's child marriage. The daughter of a daily wage labourer at Pithawas village in Jodhpur district, Sonu was married about 17 years ago to a youth from Luni tehsil under community pressure. Sonu suffered the agony of

child marriage for about 17 years. The somehow she got the information about a campaign against child marriage. After being encouraged by Bharti, Sonu filed a case for annulment of her marriage in the family court. Her family members and even Bharti had to face many threats due to this. After the jurisdiction of the court was expanded, the case was transferred to the ADJ (additional charge family court) in Bilara. At the court, Bharti advocated the cause for annulling Sonu's marriage, after submitting all age related proofs and other documents. Judge Pukhraj Gehlot then gave a historic decision to annul Sonu's marriage. This was the first child marriage that was annulled in the Bilara court.

CONTINGENT OF IAF WILL BE LED BY WOMEN OFFICER SQN LDR SINDHU REDDY

New Delhi: Marching contingent of IAF for the Republic Day parade will be led by a woman officer of the Indian Air Force, Sqn Ldr Sindhu Reddy. Comprising four officers and 144 air warriors marching in a box formation, the contingent will be led by Sqn Ldr Reddy, along with three supernumerary officers -- Flt Lt Ayush Agarwal, Flt Lt Tanuj Maik and Flt Lt Pradhan Nikhil. According to the Indian Air Force on Wednesday, the fly-past will comprise 45 IAF aircraft, including 9 Rafal Jets and four helicopters from the IA. The IL 38 Jet of the Indian Air Force will take part for the last time in the parade. The fly past would comprise formations of Dhawaj, Rudra, Baaz, Tiranaga Garuda Bheem Amrit Thriul and Vijay. The IAF had won the Best Marching Contingent trophy in the years 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2020. The award of the Best Marching Contingent in the popular choice category in 2022 was also won by it.



Adoration in India hasn't spoiled Sachin Tendulkar and that's amazing: Andy Flower

UIDAI deliberates on focus areas like resident centricity, 'Ease of Living'

The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) on Friday deliberated on and decided to work on core areas to provide continued support to people in their daily lives, further enhance data security, and play a stellar role in furthering the cause of good governance. The five core areas are resident-centricity, expanding the usage of Aadhaar, security and privacy, continuous technology upgradation, and collaboration with global economies and support them in their aspiration to achieve SDG 16.9 (provide legal identity for all). These five focus areas were deliberated in a daylong brainstorming session at Gujarat's Kevadia. UIDAI CEO Saurabh Garg maintained that there is and will always be a continuous focus on how to support residents in improving ease of living, and better their experience in availing services.



Officials said that the Authority is constantly exploring and adopting ways to expand the use of Aadhaar for both ease of living as well as ease of doing business. Its sandbox environment will allow startups, professionals, and companies to explore and test innovative applications for increasing the use of Aadhaar. From expanding e-KYC adoption to popularising

offline verification for better service delivery to residents, UIDAI will strive to expand use of Aadhaar in multiple ways. The UIDAI will be at the forefront of technology up-gradation to further enhance data security and privacy, seamless service delivery, and proactively address new-age cyber security risks, officials said.

Bihar village dumps overhead electric lines, diverts road route for the sake of garudas

Local wildlife conservationist Arvind Mishra saw a Greater Adjutant Stork for the first time during his visit to the wetlands of Kadwa Diyara in Bhagalpur district of Bihar in October 2006. That was the beginning of his long-term association with the migratory bird. Around 100 of them could be seen across four to five districts of Bihar until 2007. Their main breeding spot was Kadwa Diyara, located 250 km from State capital Patna. "But just as in other Asian countries, their numbers started to dwindle, which set alarm bells ringing for us," noted Mishra, also the state coordinator of the Indian Bird Conservation Network. He launched conservation efforts through his Mandar Nature Club, but ensuring community participation

was key to his success. That was quite a challenging aspect as the bird, commonly known as garuda in the region, was not popular among the people. The bird's above-five-foot frame, its grunt, balding looks, the enormous amounts of poop it generated, and the damage it caused to the crops worked against it. Moreover, it was an easy target for hunters due to its big size. With consistent efforts, the number of Greater Adjutants in Bihar has increased to nearly 700 in 2019 from just 75-80 in 2006, according to Mishra. The latest numbers will be known in February 2023. Apart from Kadwa Diyara panchayat, Ashram Tola, Kasimpur, Lakhminiya, Bagri Tola and Pratapnagar in neighbouring Khairpur panchayat have a sizeable population of garudas. Its smaller species are found in other areas.

Kadwa Diyara native and veterinarian Nagina Rai attested to the villagers' zeal for conservation. "Until two years ago, deaths of garudas after coming into contact with high voltage cables were common. However, public protests forced authorities to adopt underground cables." She credits the contribution of Dipak Kumar Singh, the then-Principal Secretary of the Environment, Forest, and Climate Change Department, who worked very hard to make this happen. In 2018, when a four-lane road construction began, the villagers opposed cutting down banyan trees, a favourite nesting spot of garudas. The course of the road was changed to protect the trees. Rai informed 101Reporters that villagers also protect burflower trees, another popular nesting place of garudas. "Most of the people here are

farmers. Though they collect wood from their 'bageechas' for personal use, they cut the trees down only under compelling circumstances because they want to ensure that garudas do not face an issue in building their nests." What is more, the villagers these days do not hesitate to give first aid to the birds in distress as they have received training in this regard. The Greater Adjutant has transformed Kadwa Diyara in many ways. "People initially complained that the large bird dirtied the area with its droppings and damaged their crops. Hence, they destroyed garuda nests by cutting down trees. Later, they learnt that garudas could protect their crops from rats. They also noticed that incidents of snakebites have come down, as garudas eat snakes, all of which gave the bird a new identity," Dr Kumar said.

Shyamsundar gave a glimpse into how the village flourished after it became associated with the bird. Bhagalpur Divisional Forest Officer Bharat Chintapalli told 101Reporters that the conservation efforts have earned Kadwa Diyara the tag of 'other effective area-based conservation measures' (OECM), which classifies areas known to promote biodiversity. "The OECM tag helps improve bird conservation efforts in a particular area. We are continuously working to develop garuda nesting spots in areas adjacent to Kadwa Diyara," Chintapalli added. 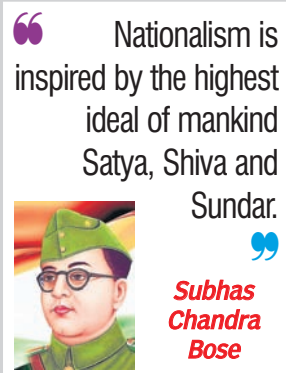
CAMERON RAJAMOULI TO COLLABORATE FOR FILM!

Los Angeles: Hollywood filmmaker James Cameron, who spoke to Indian filmmaker S.S. Rajamouli, at length, was all praise for his vision, his genius storytelling and the emotions that drive his characters. In his conversation with S.S. Rajamouli, Cameron said: "It's just such a feeling to watch your characters, and your setup, the fire, water, story, reveal after reveal, then moving on the backstory of why he's doing what he's doing, the twists and turns and friendship." "It's just so powerful. And I love the fact that you just threw the whole thing out, it's just the full show. I love that. I can only imagine the pride and power your country and your home audience feels you must feel on top of the world." Apart from speaking highly about the film, which Cameron's wife revealed he watched not once but twice, the 'Avatar' and 'Titanic' director also extended an invitation to collaborate with Rajamouli on an international film. James Cameron said while the two iconic directors parted ways: "And one thing, if you ever want to make a movie over here, let's talk." Rajamouli's 'RRR' also won India its first Golden Globe award for 'Best Original Song'. The historic film also won the 'Best Foreign Language Film' and 'Best Song' at the 28th Critics Choice Awards.

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"Netaji Was Leftist; BJP And RSS Don't Reflect His Attitude": Daughter

RSS's ideology and the nationalist leader's ideas of secularism and inclusiveness are "poles apart and do not coincide. As far as ideology is concerned, the Congress has a lot more in common with Netaji than any other party in the country, Bose-Pfaff said.

- "From what I hear about the RSS ideology, I would agree that it and Netaji's ideology are poles apart. The two value systems do not coincide. It will certainly be good if the RSS felt it wanted to embrace Netaji's ideals and ideas. Many different groups want to celebrate Netaji's birthday in different ways, and a number of them necessarily agree with his ideas."
- "I don't know any quote (of Netaji) which I can give you. He may have made critical statements about RSS members. I know what his (Netaji's) views are and about RSS. The two value systems do not coincide. RSS and Netaji's ideology of secularism do not coincide with each other."
- "This has two aspects. After Independence, the official Congress stand on Netaji was reserved and not shared by all Congressmen. It wanted to keep the narrative that it was only the civil disobedience movement that led to the country's freedom. But after Netaji files were declassified, we came to know that Indian National Army (INA) played a very key role in it."
- "The BJP has made a lot of effort to honour Netaji. With any politician, you have first to allow them to look at his/her interest. If Netaji was alive today and held a different view from that of the government, then the BJP would not have honoured him. So (in this case) it is their interest that is served."

was a devout Hindu but believed in respecting other faiths. He was in favour of a productive cooperation between members of different religions, she said. She agreed that the fanfare over the celebration of her father's birth anniversary is to "partially exploit his legacy". Speaking on the recent pomp and fanfare over Netaji's birth anniversary celebrations, she lauded the BJP-led government at the Centre for taking a "lot of initiatives" to honour him. On the second aspect, Pfaff wondered whether BJP would have honoured Netaji if he had held divergent views from that of the present-day government.

"RSS and BJP do not necessarily reflect his attitude... If you want to put a simple label, they are rightists, and Netaji was a leftist," Anita Bose-Pfaff told over phone from Germany, NDTV reported, quoting PTI.

had locked horns to appropriate Netaji's legacy on his 125th birth anniversary ahead of the assembly polls in 2021. In 2015, the West Bengal government released 64 files on the leader held by the home department. The Narendra Modi government at the Centre released 100 files on him the next year. After Independence, the Centre had formed three inquiry commissions to unravel the mystery of Netaji's disappearance. Two of them -- the Shah Nawaz Commission, and the Khosla Commission -- were formed by the Congress governments and concluded that Bose died in an air crash on August 18, 1945, soon after taking off from Taihoku airport in Taiwan. The third one -- the Mukherjee Commission formed by the BJP-led NDA government -- said he did not

India International Science fest begins in Bhopal

the presence of hundreds of scientists from across the country. Somanath, CMD of Bharat Biotech Krishna Ella along with many scientists will attend the event. Union Minister of State for Science and Technology

Jitendra Singh is also likely to participate. CM Chouhan said that the Indian International Science Festival being held in Bhopal should be used to develop the scientific attitude of the students of the state. "This event will help in understanding scientific concepts and attracting youth towards new trends in science. The effort should be that the students get inspiration and guidance from this event. India's ancient scientific contribution and outlook should also be presented in the festival," Chouhan said. He also asserted that the achievements made by the youths of Madhya Pradesh in the field of Science should be publicised using social media. All science colleges, engineering colleges, polytechnics, ITIs etc. of the state should be linked virtually with the various activities to be held in the festival.

JOSHIMATH CRISIS: BADRINATH NATIONAL HIGHWAY DEVELOPS CRACKS

Joshimath: Cracks of one to two metre long have developed on the Badrinath National Highway in Joshimath, which is the only road that leads to Badrinath, a place of faith for millions of Hindus. Disaster Management Secretary Ranjit Sinha said that the administration has been keeping a close watch on the land subsidence of the highway. Sinha stated that the concerned agencies have been instructed to repair the road. He said it would be completely repaired before the Char Dham yatra. Repairing the road before the yatra would pose as a big challenge for the government. Significantly, the number of structures that have developed cracks in the holy city has increased to 863. In view of the cracks, along with the obstruction of the road to Badrinath Dham, the contact of the Indian Army with the China border may also be cut off. Geologist Prof M.P.S. Bisht, after visiting the area, said that the pattern of the cracks is parallel. Apart from this, sinking of the huge stones on the side of the road is also becoming a cause of concern for the government.

It's His "Right": Haryana's CM on rape convict Ram Rahim's parole

Videos on BBC documentary critical of Modi & Tweets sharing its links blocked

New Delhi: The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has issued directions for blocking multiple YouTube videos which published the first episode of the BBC Documentary "India: The Modi Question". As per informed sources, orders were also issued to Twitter for blocking of over 50 tweets containing the links of the concerned YouTube videos. The directions were reportedly issued by Secretary, Information and Broadcasting on Friday using the emergency powers under the IT Rules, 2021. Both YouTube and Twitter have complied with the directions, the sources said. The documentary produced by British Broadcasting Corporation, UK's Public Broadcaster, has been earlier called by External Affairs Ministry as a "propaganda piece" that lacks objectivity and reflects colonial mindset. While it was not made available in India, some YouTube channels appear to have uploaded it to promote an anti-India agenda.



It is reported that YouTube has also been instructed to block the video if it is again uploaded on its platform. Twitter has also been directed to identify and block the tweets containing the link to the video on other platforms. Reliable sources have confirmed that senior officials of multiple Ministries, including MEA, MHA and MIB, examined the documentary and found it to be an attempt to cast aspersions on the

authority and credibility of the Supreme Court of India, sow divisions among various Indian communities, and make unsubstantiated allegations regarding actions of foreign Governments in India. The documentary was accordingly found to be undermining sovereignty and integrity of India, and having the potential to adversely impact India's friendly relations with foreign States as also public order within the country.

RAPIDO FLAYS MAHARASHTRA BAN ON BIKE AGGREGATORS

Mumbai: Bengaluru-based bike aggregator Rapido has slammed the Maharashtra government's decision to ban such private aggregators and ride-pooling vehicles from plying, and said it will examine legal remedies, here on Saturday. Referring to the state government's notification of Thursday (January 19), a Rapido spokesperson said that this could adversely impact livelihoods and opportunities of over 200,000 bike captains. Besides, the company claimed the 'arbitrary decision' will deprive millions of citizens from availing a reliable and efficient mode of local transport, and throw them at the mercy of poor transport facilities and lack of urban infrastructure which doesn't provide a low-cost last-mile connectivity. Rapido said it is planning a legal challenge for the rejection of its licence ostensibly as the government lacks the will to formulate a policy in this regard.

JAIPUR LITERATURE FESTIVAL 2023 Day 3 features a gamut of ideas

The third day of the multi-faceted and exuberant Jaipur Literature Festival began with a soulful performance by the Indian classical ensemble, The Anirudh Varma Collective. The Quintet performed Vansanthi raga, which was led by pianist, composer, and producer, Anirudh Varma. Anirudh Varma was on the keyboard, Madhur Chaudhary on the bass, Abhay Nayamally on Carnatic guitar, Sowmya Gurucharan on Carnatic voice, and Varun Rajasecharan on ghatam. The third day of the Festival featured Sri Lankan author Shehan Karunatilaka in conversation with writer Nandini Nair. In the context of the novel's inspiration from demons, bhoot-pret and rebirth, Karunatilaka said, "...and then I thought...what if I write from the ghost's point of view and it took me to this idea of what if Sri Lanka's dead could speak..."

International Booker Prize winner Geetanjali Shree, well-known Rajasthani and Hindi writer Nand Bhardwaj, Sahitya Akademi Award recipient and novelist Anamika, Managing Director and CEO of Bank of Baroda Sanjiv Chadha and author-translator and columnist Pushpesh Pant focused on the diversity of Hindi and the difficulty of 'purifying' it. They discussed how the different variants of Hindi across India get embedded in languages across the subcontinent, resulting in a Kolkata Hindi, a Mumbai Hindi, and so on. Sharing her thoughts, Shree noted, "I feel that language can never have a strict boundary, and it never should. The people who are drawing such strict boundaries are, in the name of purifying them, segregating them." At another book launch, celebrated poet, author, music and cinema scholar Yatindra Mishra and one of India's most respected scriptwriters, directors, and leading poets Gulzar, were in conversation with celebrated author and screenwriter Anu

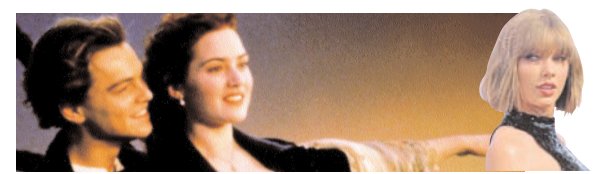
Singh Choudhary which focused on Mishra's new book, Lata Mangeshkar: A Life in Music. This panel of speakers discussed the making of the book and the limitations of using English as the sole language of writing it. The decision to write the book in Hindi and then translate it to English was also informed by the different readerships that both languages attract. Speaking about his interactions Gulzar said, "If there are two creative minds, they can't be parallel lines, they have to cross each other". Anti-caste activist, poet, novelist, and translator Meena Kandasamy was in conversation with award-winning writer Manasi Subramaniam, discussing the two-thousand-year-old text, Tirukkural. During the session, Kandasamy also spoke about the importance of Tirukkural in Tamil culture and also about its anti-caste identity that counters the Manusmriti. The discussion was centred around the significance of female intervention in the translation of ancient texts.

US citizen with Chinese satellite phone held at Bagdogra airport

The CISF on Saturday arrested a US citizen with a Chinese satellite phone while he was attempting to board a Delhi-bound flight at the Bagdogra airport near Siliguri in West Bengal. The arrested person has been identified Thomas Esroh Seitz (45). According to Bagdogra airport sources, three US citizens, including Seitz, arrived at the airport on Saturday afternoon to board a Delhi-bound flight. However, Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) jawans, while checking the luggage of Seitz, detected a Chinese satellite phone. Airport sources said that there are several restrictions on carrying satellite phones in aircraft in India. As per the rules of the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS), barring satellite phones provided by Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL), no other satellite phones or any other similar devices are allowed to be carried in an

aircraft. Also, for carrying a satellite phone in an aircraft, one needs to obtain authorisation and documents stating the reasons for the same. However, when questioned by the CISF personnel and the security staff, Seitz was unable to furnish any such document justifying him carrying the device. Thereafter, the CISF arrested him and later handed him over to the local police. Seitz told the police that he and two other US citizens were representatives of Shield AI, a US-based company, and they were in India for drone surveillance training at an Indian Army base at Lachung in Sikkim. He claimed that he arrived in India on January 12 and received the satellite device through Air Cargo on January 16. He also said that he was going back after completing the drone surveillance training. The police have contacted the Indian Army to authenticate the claims made by Seitz.

MILEY CYRUS' 'FLOWERS' HAS BROKEN SPOTIFY'S ALL-TIME ONE-WEEK RECORD

Singer Miley Cyrus' "Flowers" has broken Spotify's all-time one-week record with 100 million streams in a single week.

The service announced Friday morning that, as of Thursday, "Flowers" had become the most-streamed song in a seven-day period in Spotify history, reports "Variety".

As of Friday morning, the latest update for Cyrus' "Flowers" streams on the site showed that it had racked up 101,838,799 stream since coming out late in the day on January 12. On Thursday, it reached the 100 million points faster than any other song ever has to date on Spotify.

Rather than seeing massive streams on day one that decline throughout the week, each day since release has been bigger than the one before. Miley is back, and with her album "Endless Summer Vacation" coming out in a few months this is just the beginning.

The giant results for "Flowers" on Spotify bode extremely well for the odds of "Flowers" coming out on top of the Billboard Hot 100 when that chart's top 10 is announced on Monday. "Flowers" has been seen as in hot competition with SZA's multi-week riser "Kill Bill" to claim the Hot 100's No. 1 spot away from the current leader, Taylor Swift's "Anti-Hero."

Although downloads are not nearly as big of a factor in the Hot 100 as streaming and radio, digital sales for

"Flowers" have also been unusually high, with the tune not budging from the top spot on the iTunes song sales chart since it came out eight days ago.

If "Flowers" does prevail in debuting at No. 1, it will be Cyrus' first song to top the Hot 100 since "Wrecking Ball" a decade ago; that smash remains her lone topper on that chart to date.

However big "Flowers" becomes, it will still have a way to go in becoming her most-streamed song ever.



I'LL ALWAYS BE AQUAMAN: JASON MOMOA ON DC MEETING JAMES GUNN

Momoa concluded, "I'll always be Aquaman. Ain't anyone coming in there and taking shit. There might be some other characters, too. I can play other things, too. I can be funny and savage and charming."

"Listen, I never thought in a million years that people would be using my voice," Momoa said. "It's wonderful and I just want to shine a light on films like this."

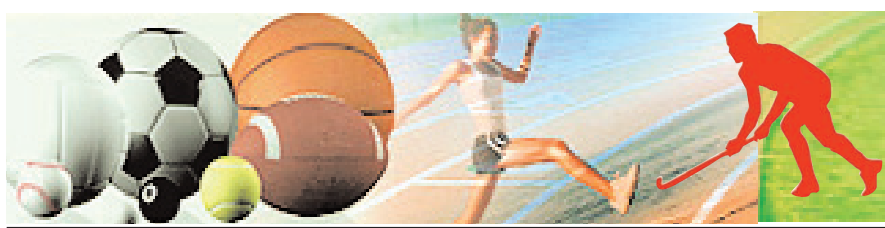
CATE BLANCHETT'S HUSBAND WARNED HER THAT HER FILM CAREER WOULD LAST ONLY FIVE YEARS

IMPRESSIVE BOWLERS, ROHIT'S FIFTY LEAD INDIA TO SERIES WIN

Captain Rohit Sharma smashed an eye-catching fifty while Shubman Gill remained unbeaten on 40 to guide India to a comprehensive eight-wicket victory over New Zealand in the second ODI at the Shaheed Veer Narayan Singh Cricket Stadium.

New Zealand 108 all out in 34.3 overs (Glenn Phillips 36, Mitchell Santner 27; Mohammed Shami 3/18, Washington Sundar 2/7) lost to India 111/2 in 20.1 overs (Rohit Sharma 51, Shubman Gill 40 not out; Mitchell Santner 1/28, Henry Shipley 1/29) by eight wickets.

THE BOWLERS DELIVERED: ROHIT SHARMA

Raipur| India skipper Rohit Sharma showered praise on the bowlers, saying they have delivered every time they were asked to live up to a particular challenge.

"I thought these last five games, the bowlers have really stepped up. Whatever we have asked of them, they have delivered. Especially doing this in India. You can expect these performances away from India, but they have real skills," said Rohit in the post-match presentation ceremony.

"When we trained here yesterday in the night, it moved around, there was good carry. Which is why we wanted that challenge: 250 would have been quite challenging," he said.

"Shami and Siraj did want to go on for longer spells, but I told them a big Test series is coming up (against Australia in February). I had to step in and say, boss there are other bowlers as well," he added. "I am happy with my batting. I have kept my approach quite similar. I try to take the bowlers on. It is important to do that: to try to get the pressure back. I know a big score hasn't come, but I am happy with how I am going. I know a big score is around the corner." With an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series, India will be aiming to make it 3-0 in the third and final ODI at Indore on Tuesday.

In reply, Rohit made 51 and led the way for the total to be chased down in 20.1 overs. The victory also means that India have taken an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series, which is also their second ODI series victory of the year at home.

New Zealand bowlers, barring Lockie Ferguson, were unable to extract the same amount of movement which the Indian bowlers were able to do in the first ten overs. That allowed Rohit

and Gill to tee off with ease.

While Rohit pulled and slashed off Henry Shipley's short balls with ease, Gill started off with an uppish square drive over backward square leg to make it two fours in the 17th over. Though Kohli was stumped off Santner for 11, Ishan Kishan hit two boundaries off spinners before Gill hit the winning runs by dancing down the pitch and lofting over mid-on off Santner to seal a crushing victory for India.

Hockey World Cup

Hardik-less India take on New Zealand in must-win Crossover match

Having finished second in their group, India take on New Zealand in a must-win Crossover stage match in the FIH Odisha Hockey Men's World Cup here on Sunday with a place in the quarterfinals on the line.

India had started their campaign with a 2-0 win against Spain, held fifth-ranked England to a draw and managed to prevail 4-2 over minnows Wales to finish unbeaten in Pool D, tied on seven points with England but with an inferior goal difference. New Zealand, on the other hand, finished third in Pool C after suffering a shock 2-3 defeat against Malaysia. The Black Sticks had also lost 0-4 to the Netherlands, managing to score only five goals and conceding eight -- their lone win coming against Chile. India too has struggled to score goals and have a tally of six goals from three matches. They have also conceded two goals against Wales in two minutes of sustained pressure that saw the Indian defence crumble.

They have to iron out a few of these issues against New Zealand as they meet in the Crossover encounter. But they will have to do that without key midfielder Hardik Singh, who had to withdraw from the tournament because of a hamstring injury he suffered towards the end of the match against England. India also missed a creative spark in the midfield and forward line against a team that packs the defence and looks to capitalise on counter-attack -- something New Zealand is also expected to do.

Leipzig holds front runners Bayern Munich to 1-1 draw

Former European champions Bayern Munich shared the spoils with resilient Leipzig in a match that could be considered the curtain raiser of the second half of the Bundesliga season.

Marcel Halstenberg's goal in the second half cancelled out Bayern striker Eric Maxim Choupo-Moting's first-half opener as the two teams came out tied 1-1 on Friday night.

The Bavarians took the reins from the kick-off and almost opened the scoring with eight minutes played when Serge Gnabry rattled the woodwork with a shot from the edge of the box.

Bayern enjoyed more possession of the ball, but Leipzig looked quick and dangerous on counterattacks as the match progressed. Emil Forsberg forced Yann Sommer into action in the

22nd minute, but his effort was denied comfortably by Bayern's new goalie, reports Xinhua.

Andre Silva had a lot of space ahead but couldn't get through as Dayot Upamecano dispossessed Silva inside the box in the last nick of time in the 35th minute.

Clinical Bayern eventually broke the deadlock with 37 minutes played as Gnabry whipped a pinpoint cross allowing Choupo-Moting to slot home his seventh goal of the season.

Leipzig started powerfully into the second half and got rewarded in the 52nd minute when Bayern failed to clear the ball before Halstenberg poked home a cross from very close range to restore parity.

The Red Bulls pressed frenetically for the decider, but Bayern's defense stood firm to secure a point on the road.

Australian Open

SABALENKA, BENCIC WIN TO SET UP INTRIGUING FOURTH-ROUND CLASH

Fifth seed Aryna Sabalenka and No.12 seed Belinda Bencic continued their winning streaks as they won their respective women's singles third-round matches on Saturday to set up a blockbuster Round-of-16 encounter in the Australian Open.

Bencic of Switzerland continued her excellent start to the season, claiming a 6-2, 7-5 victory over Italy's Camila Giorgi to reach the fourth round. She was followed into the second week by Sabalenka, who maintained her undefeated run of 2023 by easing past her former doubles partner, No.26 seed Elise Mertens, 6-2, 6-3.

Bencic and Giorgi have not met since 2019 but the Tokyo Olympic Games gold medallist enjoyed a 3-2 head-to-head advantage going into their sixth clash. She is also on an unbeaten run in January, having begun the 2023 season with a bang, defeating players like Garbine Muguruza, Caroline Garcia and Daria Kasatkina en route to the Adelaide International title.

But Giorgi has a reputation for slaying seeds and that set the scene for an intriguing clash in the Round of 32 at Melbourne Park on Saturday.

Giorgi broke Bencic's serve in the 10th



game to make it 5-5 but the Swiss star broke right back in the 11th game and

then held her serve to seal the set 6-4 and victory in one hour and 40 minutes.

DE MINAUR OVERCOMES BONZI, SHELTON CONTINUES HIS DREAM DEBUT

Melbourne| Home favourite Alex de Minaur equalled his best result at the Australian Open on Saturday when he cruised past Frenchman Benjamin Bonzi 7-6(0), 6-2, 6-1 to reach the fourth round for a second consecutive year.

After winning a tight first set, in which he twice squandered break advantages, the Australian pulled away, committing just 12 unforced errors in the second and third sets combined to seal victory after two hours and 10 minutes.

The player's best result at a major came at the US Open in 2020, when he advanced to the quarter-finals. Meanwhile, Ben Shelton continued his dream debut at the Australian Open after he advanced to the fourth with a win over home favourite Alexei Popyrin 6-3, 7-6(4), 6-4.

The player saved all four break points he faced to become the fifth man to reach the Round of 16 on his Australian Open debut in the past 10 years. The fourth player to accomplish the feat, J.J. Wolf did so earlier in the day and will also be Shelton's next opponent.

Shelton cracked the Top 100 for the first time in November 2022, and is now No. 65 in the ATP Live Rankings. His next opponent, Wolf, defeated countryman Michael Mmoh 6-4, 6-1, 6-2 earlier in the day.



ZHANG CHARGES INTO LAST 16



Melbourne| China's highest-ranked player Zhang Shuai brushed aside American qualifier Katie Volynets 6-3, 6-2 on Saturday to storm into the women's singles fourth round of the Australian Open.

The 23rd-seeded Zhang gained a crucial break in the sixth game of the second set and then ran away with a one-sided victory in 63 minutes.

She had 20 winners in a polished performance on her 34th birthday to overwhelm Volynets, who had caused a major boilover in the second round by beating the ninth seed Veronika Kudermetova 6-4, 2-6, 6-2.

Zhang is getting closer to matching her fairytale quarterfinal runs at the Australian Open in 2016 and at Wimbledon in 2019, reports the news agency Xinhua.

To do that she will need to defeat former world No. 1 Karolina Pliskova, who beat Russian Varvara Gracheva 6-4, 6-2.

In the last 16, Zhang joins her compatriot Zhu Lin, who knocked out the sixth seed Maria Sakkari 7-6(3), 1-6, 6-4 in the biggest win of her career.

Arsenal strengthen title bid by signing Trossard from Brighton

Premier League leaders Arsenal on Friday strengthened their bid to win this season's title by signing attacking midfielder Leandro Trossard from Brighton.

The Belgian international joins Arsenal for an initial fee of 20 million pounds (24.7 million U.S. dollars), with a further seven million pounds in possible 'add-ons'.

He could make his debut when Arsenal play Manchester United on Sunday, reports news agency Xinhua.

"They told me they really like me as a player, that I would really suit the system and how they want to play," commented Trossard on the

Arsenal website.

"It helps me that I'm versatile and that I can play in different positions. They're looking forward to working with me and vice versa. I'm really excited to work with them and I think Mikel (Arteta) is a top coach," he added.

The Belgian scored 25 goals in 116 league appearances for Brighton, with seven of those coming in 16 games this season.

"This has been my best season in the Premier League until now. We did a great job at Brighton and my form has been really good. Obviously, I haven't played much since the World Cup, but I'm so excited to start at Arsenal and show myself at a top club to help the team," added Trossard.

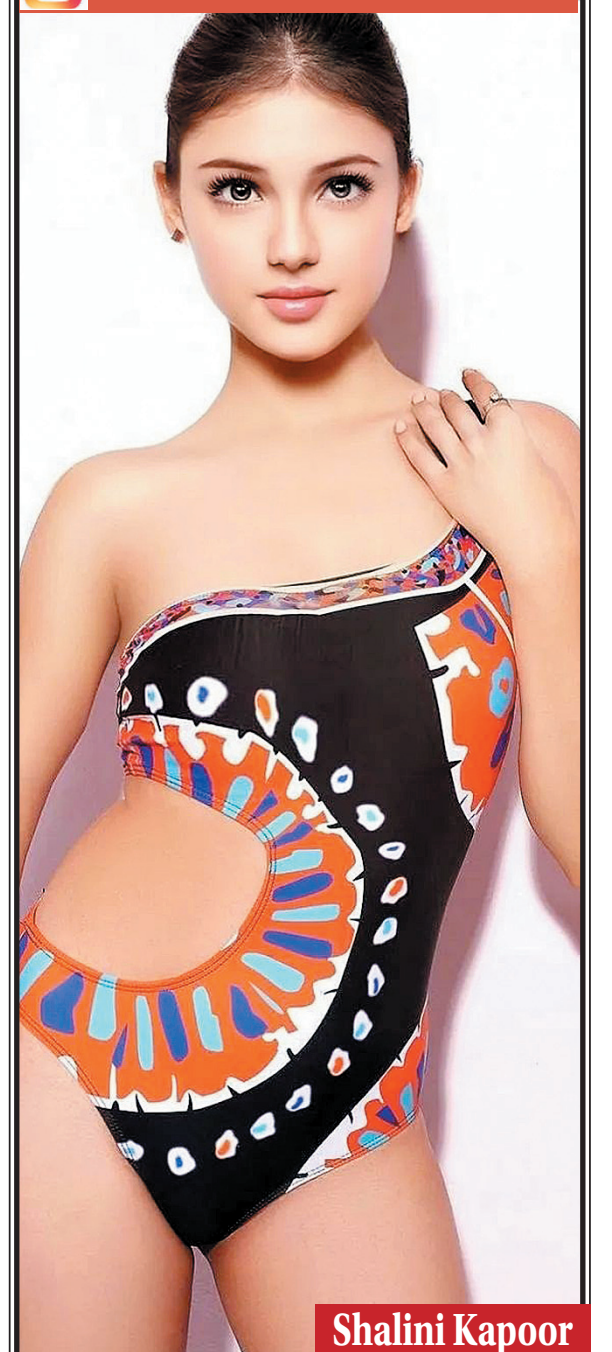
