FIRST COVID, NOW LAYOFFS

INDIAN PROFESSIONALS UNDERGO TREMENDOUS STRESS, ANXIETY

About 3,000 tech professionals are losing their jobs on an average daily in the month of January, including thousands in India. According to health experts, the last 2-3 years of Covid lockdowns, deaths, and fear of re-infection, and now massive layoffs, have resulted in extreme stress for Indian professionals.

Amid the growing layoffs, there has been a surge in the number of patients coming from various companies -- both office-goers and those working from home -- with panic anxiety attacks and depression as they fear losing control over their immediate future plans, mental health experts said on Monday.

Dr Saumya Mudgal, Senior Consultant, Psychiatry, Max Hospital in Gurugram, said that there has been a drastic increase in the number of patients coming from MNCs.

"These patients are usually presented with the issues of panic anxiety and panic disorder with agoraphobia and there is quite an increase in such patients. Some of them are already taking medications and the requirement of medication has gone up and the severity of symptoms has gone up," Dr Mudgal said. According to her, there are a lot of people coming with fresh or recent onset symptoms of anxiety and adjustment issues pertaining to anxiety or mixed anxiety.



Layoffs and loss of employment are very stressful experiences for most people. It is a time filled with uncertainties, economic challenges and loss of control over your future.

Dr Arti Anand, a senior clinical psychologist at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital in Delhi, said that the pandemic and massive layoffs both knocked out the

working class without any warning. "This leads to fear and stress. The way to deal with it is to be able to use your available resources, not to panic and stop thinking negatively about the future," she advised. Health experts said that to cope in these uncertain times is by maintaining supportive relationships with friends and

family, exercising regularly and practicing mindfulness.

Keep a positive attitude and outlook. Stay away from generalising negative thoughts like "I will never have a job again or I will never enjoy my work again etc," said Dr Gautam.

Divya Mohindroo, Founder, Embrace Imperfections and a counselling psychologist, said that those impacted in the current layoffs need to deal with it practically, rather than emotionally. "Start making a list of potential employers, research about available opportunities and companies, look for avenues to up skill and even diversify into other sectors, if required," she advised. "Approach employers while being mentally prepared to describe their situation while pitching their candidature. It is also important to network - with friends, ex-bosses and colleagues," she said.

All professionals should share their work responsibilities with colleagues at work and family members at home, which will help them not only be accountable but also feel light about their life and tasks in hand," Mohindroo noted.

Plea withdrawn against wrestlers alleging sexual harassment by WFI chief

Hours after a plea was moved in the Delhi High Court on Monday against the sexual assault allegations on Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh by multiple wrestlers, it was withdrawn.

Talking to reporter, Lawyer Shrikant Prasad said that Vicky, who was the petitioner, has asked us to withdraw the plea as the matter has been highlighted a lot.

The lawyer further said that the motive to file the plea was about the misuse of law by women on sexual harassment and resorting to protests and there should be some guidelines set up in this context.

In the plea, it is said that Phogat, who is also the first respondent in the plea, started blackmailing Bhushan for resigning from the post of WFI president on the pretext of protest against the sexual harassment of the wrestlers.

It is said that the media thinks of itself as Janata Adalat and has started intervening in the proceedings of the court, the plea said.

It is contended that wrestlers, instead of moving to court, have approached the media to show their concern, said the petitioner.

In the petition, it has been argued that respondents (wrestlers) have crossed all their limits to approach the issue and that his reputation and dignity was being tarnished.

It further claimed that sexual harass-



ment laws were being misused and an extortion was being done on him. This writ petition is filed against the complete misuse of sexual harassment laws by the wrestler women, the petition read. It is in the petition that wrestlers are trying to get their own benefits out of this issue.

A huge protest by the wrestlers at Delhi's Jantar Mantar was called off following assurances from the Centre that grievances would be addressed and Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh was asked to step aside for four weeks.

INS Vagir commissioned, adds teeth and stealth to Indian Navy

The fifth submarine in the Kalvari Class, INS Vagir, built by the Mazagaon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd., was commissioned into the Indian Navy here on Monday in the presence of Chief of Naval Staff, Admiral R. Hari Kumar, a defence official said.

Adding to the Navy's fighting prowess, the INS Vagir -- literally meaning a sand shark symbolising stealth and fearlessness -- has been indigenously built with technology transfer from France. Officials said it will further boost the Navy's capabilities to further Indian maritime interests in deterring enemies, for Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance to provide a decisive blow in times of cri-



sis. INS Vagir -- the third submarine to be commissioned into the Indian Navy in two years -- comes with a sophisticated weapons package, the best of the sensors in the world, mine-laying, wire-guided torpedoes, sub-surface to surface missiles capable of neutralising a large enemy fleet.

It can also launch marine commandos for special ops,

has a state-of-the-art torpedo decoy system and its powerful diesel engines can quickly charge batteries for stealth missions, said the officials. INS Vagir comes with a glorious legacy with a submarine of the same name commissioned in November 1973 which was decommissioned in January 2001 after three decades of valorous service to the nation.

BODIES OF 3 OF THE 4 UP YOUTHS KILLED IN NEPAL PLANE CRASH IDENTIFIED

Ghazipur: Bodies of three of the four youths from Uttar Pradesh's Ghazipur district who died in the January 15 plane crash in Pokhara, Nepal, have been identified.

Ghazipur District Magistrate Aryaka Akhauri said the bodies of Abhishek Kushwaha, Anil Rajbhar and Vishal Sharma had been identified and handed over to family members present in Kathmandu. Efforts are on to ascertain identity of fourth youth, Sonu Jaiswal, she added. After the process of identification is over, the bodies will be brought to Ghazipur. On January 16, family members of the four youths were sent to Kathmandu by road with head of Chak Jainab village Vijay Jaiswal, nayab tehsildar and a revenue inspector to claim and bring back the bodies.

LOVE ACROSS BORDERS LANDS COUPLE IN TROUBLE

A Pakistani girl fell in love with a boy from Uttar Pradesh

It was a case of love across the borders that led to drama across the states. A 19-year-old Pakistani girl was arrested in Bengaluru on Friday for allegedly forging her identity to stay in India illegally.

According to the police, the girl, named Iqra Jeevani, met a 25-year-old security guard, Mulayam Singh Yadav from Uttar Pradesh while playing Ludo online. The two fell in love and Iqra entered India through Nepal border where Yadav met her.

The two came to Birganj in Bihar and then Patna. The couple then moved to Bengaluru and stayed in a rented house near the Ayyappa temple in Junnasandra where the security guard started working in September 2022.

Yadav, even got an Aadhaar card made for Iqra after changing her name to Rava Yadav and applied for an Indian passport. The case came to light when the Central intelligence agencies came across Iqra who was trying to contact her family members back in Pakistan and alerted the state intelligence.

The police verified the details before swooping down on the house and arresting the couple. A background check is underway to see whether she is part of an espionage ring.

Iqra was later handed over to the FRRO officials, who later remanded her to a state home for women till further investigations are carried out.



TN AIRPORTS ON HIGH ALERT OVER SMUGGLING OF EXOTIC SPECIES INTO COUNTRY

Security at the four international airports in Tamil Nadu has been heightened to curb the possibility of smuggling exotic species of wild animals into the country through them, officials said on Monday.

A few weeks ago, security officials at the Chennai and Tiruchi airports seized exotic species of coir snakes, ball pythons, pygmy marmosets, and star tortoises that were brought into the country from Thailand and Cambodia.

In Chennai, the exotic species were found to be in possession of a passenger, but in Tiruchi, the animals were found abandoned in the airport.

Sources in the air intelligence unit said that they have received a tip-off that more such species are being sought to brought into the country through Chennai, Coimbatore, and Madurai airports and these are used by people as domestic animals. In rare cases, some of these exotic species are smuggled to China where they are used as medicines.

Customs had made 11 seizures of exotic species from the Tamil Nadu airports in 2022. The seized species include albino porcupines, de braz-



za's monkeys, ball pythons, king snakes, and star tortoises. Five people were arrested and on questioning, admitted to a major racket behind the smuggling of exotic species into Tamil Nadu.

Police sources said that there is a thriving illegal pet trade in many parts of Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Kerala, and Andhra Pradesh and these exotic species are being

brought in for such markets. A senior Greater Chennai Police official said: "The exotic species is a new trade which is slowly catching up in several south Indian states. The airports of Tamil Nadu are becoming the hot spots for smuggling in of exotic species. Central agencies have also provided inputs regarding the smuggling of exotic species into Tamil Nadu airports."

Karnataka couple's attempt to sell infant in Goa

The Railway Protection Force (RPF) at Margao Railway station has foiled an attempt of a couple from Karnataka's Dharwad to allegedly sell their seven-month-old boy to a couple in Goa, an official said on Monday.

RPF Inspector Vinod Mishra said that an offence has been registered against the couple and three woman mediators (agents), who had done a deal of Rs 3 lakh with a Panaji-based couple to purchase the baby.

"On Sunday, the Panaji-based couple had come to Margao railway station to buy this baby and a couple from Dharwad, who wanted to sell

their first baby, had also come here. They were having an argument with each other, which was noticed by our staff and they were taken to our office. After interrogating them, the matter was clear that they were dealing to buy and sell a baby. Then the three mediators were detained," he said.

He said that initial interrogation revealed that the seller couple is working as labourer and the buyer has two kids. "Buyer said he was interested in buying this baby boy as he loves kids," Mishra said. Goa Police said that the father of the baby boy was arrested, after the case was handed over to them and they are undertaking further investigations.



FULL DRESS REHEARSAL OF REPUBLIC DAY PARADE HELD

The full dress rehearsal of the Republic Day Parade was held at Kartavya Path in Delhi, in which personnel from the Army, Air Force, Navy and the Paramilitary forces participated on Monday. Twenty three tableaux from 17 states and various departments of the government took part in the rehearsal which started at 10.30 a.m.

Six tableaux of the Central ministries and departments became part of the rehearsal. The country's rich cultural heritage, economic and social progress and internal and external security was depicted in these tableaux.

According to the Ministry of Defence, various successes in different fields will be displayed during the Republic Day Parade this year, reflecting the country's geographical and rich cultural diversity.

Seventeen tableaux from states and UTs like Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Tripura, West Bengal, Jammu and



Kashmir, Ladakh, Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu, Gujarat, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Kerala will present a glimpse of historical heritage.

The marching contingent of the

Indian Air Force for the parade will be led by Squadron Leader Sindhu Reddy, a woman officer. The four officers and 144 air warriors in the contingent will march in a box formation.

According to the Indian Air Force, 45 aircraft including 9 Rafale jets and four helicopters will be included in

the fly-past at the celebrations.

The IL-38 plane of the Indian Air Force will take part in the Republic Day parade for the first and perhaps the last time. Formations of the flag, Rudra, eagle, Tiranga, Garuda, Bhima, Amrit, and Vijay among others will be made in flypast.

Six tableaux from the Ministry of Culture, Central Armed Police Forces, Narcotics Control Bureau, Central Public Works Department, Indian Council of Agricultural Research will show the work and achievements of the last few years.

Generally, around 15 tableaux are selected from the States/UTs depending on the proportional size of each region. In the selection process, an expert committee examined the tableaux proposals of various States and Union Territories.

Apart from this, several rounds of discussions were held by the committee members with the representatives of the states on the theme, presentation, artistic performance and technical aspects of the tableau.

SC junks plea against UP CM Yogi Adityanath

The Supreme Court declined to entertain a plea seeking direction for registration of a case against Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in connection with an objectionable speech allegedly made in 2018 during an election campaign in Alwar, Rajasthan.

A bench headed by Justice B.R. Gavai told the petitioner's counsel that such litigations are meant for page 1 of newspapers.

The petition was filed by Naval Kishor Sharma of Mau district. The petitioner moved the apex court challenging the Allahabad High Court order, which dismissed his plea and also imposed a cost of Rs 5,000.

Declining to entertain the plea, the bench, also comprising Justice Vikram Nath, said "dismissed..."

The petitioner had claimed that Adityanath in November 2018, in an election speech in Alwar hurt his religious sentiments. Initially, the petitioner had filed a complaint against the speech before the district court of Mau, which was rejected.

Later, he moved the high court, which too dismissed the plea. The high court said the court at Mau had no territorial jurisdiction to entertain the said complaint and its dismissal



with order dated March 11, 2022, under Section 203 Cr.P.C. is just and proper.

Dismissing the plea, the high court added that the dismissal of the revision vide judgment and order dated April 26, 2022 (wherein the order dated March 11, 2022 was challenged) is also without any illegality, irregularity and perversity.

According to the petitioner on November 28, 2018, Adityanath addressed a public meeting with regards to general Vidhan Sabha elections in Malakheda, Alwar (Rajasthan) in which he stated certain words for Lord Bajrangbali due to which the religious sentiments of public who are followers of Sri Bajrangbali have been hurt.

Passenger on Spice Jet's Delhi-Hyderabad flight misbehaves with cabin crew

Another incident of an unruly passenger behavior has come out, this time on SpiceJet. The airline said that a passenger, on its SG-8133 Delhi-Hyderabad flight on Monday, behaved in an unruly and inappropriate manner, harassing and causing disturbance to the cabin crew.



On January 23, 2023, SpiceJet wet-leased Corendon aircraft was scheduled to operate SG-8133 (Delhi-Hyderabad). During boarding at Delhi, one passenger behaved in an unruly and inappropriate manner, harassing and causing disturbance to cabin crew," a SpiceJet spokesperson said.

The crew informed the pilot-in-command (PIC) and security staff of the same. The said passenger and a co-passenger, who were travelling

together, were offloaded and handed over to the security team, added the spokesperson.

Aviation regulator DGCA said that it is looking into the matter. There have been many incidents of unruly passengers on flights in the last couple of months. Apart from peeing incident in Air India, two incidents of passenger misbehaviour occurring on Air India flight AI-142 on December 6, 2022 from Paris to New Delhi, came to the

notice of the DGCA.

One passenger was caught smoking in the lavatory, was drunk and not listening to the crew. Another passenger allegedly relieved himself on a vacant seat and blanket of a fellow female passenger when she went to the lavatory. Earlier, a high pitched argument between an air-passenger and one of the crew members of an IndiGo flight went viral on social media. The argument started on the airline's Istanbul-Delhi flight over food.

WOMAN PUSHES HER TWO CHILDREN INTO GODAVARI, KILLS SELF

Hyderabad: A woman pushed her two children into the Godavari river in Telangana on Monday before jumping into to die by suicide.

The shocking incident occurred in the Basar town of Nirmal district. The police pulled out all three bodies with the help of swimmers.

The woman, identified as Manasa (27) pushed her son Baladitya (8) and daughter Navasri (7) into the river near the ghat where devotees offer Ganga Harathi.

Police found school bags and empty tiffin boxes near the ghat. The woman is believed to have served food to the children before killing them.

She along with the children arrived from Nizamabad. After alighting from a bus at Godavari bridge, they reached the river bank.

Police registered a case and took up investigation. They suspect that the woman may have killed the children and committed suicide due to family problems.

Telangana official suspended for trespassing woman Indian Administrative Service officer's house

The Telangana government on Monday suspended a Deputy Tahsildar after he was arrested for intruding into the house of senior Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer and chief minister's secretary Smita Sabharwal here.

Taking a serious note of the incident, the government suspended Anand Kumar Reddy.

Medchal Malkajgiri district collector issued orders suspending the Deputy Tahsildar. Officials of the revenue department will serve the orders on Anand Kumar Reddy in Chanchalguda Central Jail where he is currently lodged.

The incident reportedly took place on the night of January 19 but came to light on Sunday.

Smita, who is secretary to Telangana chief minister, raised an alarm when the Deputy Tahsildar approached her around 11.30 a.m. in her villa in IAS officers' quarters in Jubilee Hills. The security staff apprehended him and handed over to

police. He was booked for criminal trespass.

Anand Reddy's friend K. Babu, who was waiting in the car outside the house, was also caught and handed over to the police. The official took to Twitter on Sunday to reveal the incident.

"Had this most harrowing experience, a night back when an intruder broke into my house. I had the presence of mind to deal and save my life. Lessons: no matter how secure you think you are- always check the doors/ locks personally," she tweeted and advised people to dial 100 in an emergency.

Anand Reddy (48) entered the high-security quarters saying he was going to B-17 villa but instead tres-

passed into the woman IAS official's villa (B-11).

He reportedly told police that he had gone to the IAS officer to discuss the issue related to his promotion.

The Deputy Tahsildar also reportedly tweeted to the IAS officer that he is at her doorstep.

Both Anand Reddy and Babu were produced before a magistrate, who remanded them to judicial custody for 14 days. Police have launched a high-level probe into the incident.

Smita Sabharwal was staying in the house with her two children. Her husband Akun Sabharwal, an IPS officer, is on Central deputation serving an intelligence agency.

Cases of cruelty to dogs on the rise in UP

Incidents of cruelty to dogs are on the rise. A female dog and two pups were put in a cardboard box and abandoned near a petrol pump in the Tedhi Bagiya area in Agra.

A passer-by saw the box and opened it. The female dog was unconscious while the pups were yelping.

The passer-by informed an NGO Casper's Home that took the female dog to a veterinarian. The vet said that the dog had been given anaesthesia injection before being abandoned in the box.

The vet, Dr Dilip Kumar, said that the condition of the dog was critical, probably because of anaesthesia overdose. The two pups are being looked after at the NGO's shelter home.

Vineet Arora of Casper's home said, "It appears that the owner did not wish to take care of the female dog and her pups but it is absolutely inhuman to throw them by the roadside in a sealed box."

Meanwhile, in another instance of cruelty to



animals in neighbouring Mathura district, a young man poured petrol on a stray dog and set it on fire. The man was reportedly upset at the dog that was

barking at him.

The incident took place in the Sadar Bazaar area of Mathura.

A milkman, Mukesh Kumar, however, saved the dog by dousing the flames with his jacket. He also took the dog to a local veterinarian and ensured the necessary treatment.

Later, he along with a local resident, Ravindra Bharadwaj, filed a police complaint against the culprit, Devesh Agarwal.

SHO of Sadar, Ajay Kishore, said, "An FIR has been registered against the accused under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act and he has been arrested."

The SHO said, "Initial questioning of the accused revealed that he was annoyed with the female dog, who had recently delivered puppies in the neighbourhood. He claimed that the animal used to bark at him often and attacked him once. CCTV footage is being examined and the matter is being investigated."

Mukesh Kumar, the milkman, said, "The dog is critical and will take time to fully recover. We are taking care of the puppies."

ED attaches assets worth Rs 7.90 cr in 2 NDPS cases

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday said that they have attached assets worth Rs 7.90 crore in connection with two NDPS cases pertaining to Gurdeep Singh Rano and others, and Rajesh Kumar and others.

The attached assets include 16 immovable properties consisting of land and building in Punjab pertaining to Gurdeep Singh Rano and his family members and 11 immovable properties consisting of land in Punjab pertaining to Rajesh Kumar and his family members.

The assets attached also included movable properties, balance in bank accounts, cash and gold ornaments.

The ED initiated money laundering investigation on the basis of the FIR registered by Special Task force, Punjab Police under various sections of the NDPS Act, IPC and Arms Act. An official said that Rano had links with other suspected illicit drug smugglers, namely Simranjit Singh and Tanvir Bedi, who are residing abroad. The ED initiated money laundering investigation against Rajesh Kumar on the basis of the FIR registered by



Punjab Police at Police Station City Faridkot, under NDPS Act. Kumar was selling intoxicant drugs in the guise of medical store run by him.

"ED investigation revealed that in both PMLA cases, most of the immovable properties were bought in cash wherein the accused were not able to produce any documentary evidences in support of source of cash.

Investigation further revealed that in some cases, cash was deposited in the bank accounts of known persons to layer the Proceeds of Crime for purchasing immovable properties," the official said.

The state Political Affairs Committee (PAC) includes MP Congress head Kamal Nath, Rajya Sabha MP Digvijaya Singh, LoP Govind Singh, and former ministers such as Kanti Lal Bhuria, Suresh Pachori, Rajya Sabha MP Vivek Tankha, Jitu Patwari, Kamal Nath's son



and Chhindwara MP Nakul Nath, Shoba Ozha and others.

Insiders said that the state leadership wanted a "compact" committee from state to district level. Sources also said that many who were holding posts in MPCC were excluded from the new list, and therefore, a modification will be done in the fresh list.

Explaining further about MPCC members, a senior Congress leader said the compact in the sense that a proper designated team. "For instance, if there are so many members appointed as secretaries or any

other designated post in the organisation, it may create confusion.

Therefore, the state leadership wants a compact team at every step of the organisation, so that everyone can freely execute the role assigned," Congress leader said on condition of anonymity.

AICC general secretary K. C. Venugopal in a release on Monday said Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge has approved the proposal for the appointment of office-bearers and presidents of various district committees in Madhya Pradesh.

CONGRESS TO RELEASE SEPARATE MANIFESTO FOR WOMAN IN MP POLLS

Bhopal: The Madhya Pradesh Congress will release a separate manifesto for women in the Assembly polls, likely to be held later this year, a party functionary said on Monday.

ARMY OFFICER DIES BY SUICIDE AT TRAINING CENTRE

Jabalpur: A 43-year-old Indian Army colonel allegedly died by suicide by hanging at a training centre in Madhya Pradesh's Jabalpur city, police said on Monday. The body of Colonel Nishith Khanna, posted as Commanding Officer in the 1-Technical Training Regiment (TTR), was found hanging from a ceiling fan in a room of the officers' mess in the One Signal Training Centre at around 10.30 pm on Sunday, City Superintendent of Police (CSP) Priyanka Shukla said. Police found a suicide note purportedly written by the dead Army officer stating he was "sorry". The preliminary investigation suggested a family dispute could be the reason behind Colonel Khanna taking the extreme step, the CSP said. The Army officer was staying away from his family, which included his wife, son and daughter, since October 25, 2022, she said.

Shivraj Chouhan vs Kantilal Bhuria on government staff supporting RSS

The ruling Bharatiya Janata Party and the Congress in Madhya Pradesh were engaged in a verbal tussle on Monday after a leader from the opposition party allegedly threatened to prepare a list of government staffers who attend Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh shakhas so as to "fix them".

After former Union leader and Congress veteran Kantilal Bhuria issued the threat, Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan hit back, saying "Several persons who have had this wish have



come and gone".

Bhuria, speaking to reporters on Sunday, said a list of employees who work for the government during the day and attend RSS shakhas at night will be prepared. "It is wrong to do so when you are a government

official or staffer. You (media) too should expose such people so that we can fix (take action) them," Bhuria said.

Asked about the statement, Chief Minister Chouhan said, "Kantilal, several people with this wish have come and gone. The RSS is an organisa-

tion of patriots. Such a process of personality building has started through this organisation that lakhs of volunteers are ready to live and die for the country." Slamming the use of terms like "fix them", Chouhan said those being threatened in this way are also human beings and must not be insulted.

"The public will give a befitting reply to such persons (who issue threats). The Congress' frustration is not understandable," he asserted. Assembly polls are likely to be held at the end of this year.

FARMERS RAISE HONEY BEE ARMIES TO WARD OFF WILD ELEPHANTS

In an attempt to prevent incidents of human-elephant conflict, the Madhya Pradesh government has decided to pit tiny honey bees against wild elephants that stray into farms and destroy crops in the border districts of the state.

Intoxicated on mahua flowers, elephants wander into the border districts and leave a trail of destruction before they are driven away or return to neighbouring Chhattisgarh.

In a circular issued last week, the state government listed a standard operating procedure (SOP) with a host of do's and don'ts for people in the eastern part of the state, officials said.

As one of the measures, people have been advised to install bee boxes in the affected areas to ward off elephants, they said. Elephants have a natural fear of bees, as they dislike being stung on their trunks and eyes.

Beekeeping will be promoted in the villages of Sidhi, Singrauli, Shahdol, Anuppur, Umaria, Dindori and Mandla districts that have a significant indigenous population, officials said.

The latest step will not only protect crops and property, but it will also provide livelihood to



indigenous population in the districts bordering Chhattisgarh, officials said.

According to officials, the Khadi and Village Industries Commission, through its flagship "Honey Mission" program, had distributed 100 bee boxes to 10 beneficiaries in Morena district

last year. The state forest department has roped in NGOs to spread awareness among local communities about tricks to tame and drive away tuskers, they said. "We have asked NGOs that have experience of working in areas affected by wild elephants to impart training and share their

experiences with the local communities," principal chief conservator of forests (wildlife) J S Chauhan said.

With a little bit of understanding about the animal and by exercising restraint, people can avoid damage to life and property to a great extent, he said. Solar fencing will be put up in sensitive areas to keep elephants at bay, he said. Locals will be told not to hurl stones at elephants or confront them, as it may agitate the animals, the official added. As per official data, more than eight people were killed last year by wild elephants that wandered into the state from Chhattisgarh.

According to wildlife experts, elephants move towards human settlements in search of water and fodder in summers, as the water bodies in forests dry up and run thin.

As per official data, Madhya Pradesh had just seven elephants in 2017.

"This number has now touched the 60 mark. At least 60 wild elephants from Chhattisgarh have settled in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve (BTR) and Sanjay Dubri Tiger Reserve (SDTR) besides other animals straying occasionally," Chauhan said.

NATIONAL SEMINAR ON HOMEOPATHY SYSTEM OF MEDICINE AND COURSE IN BHOPAL

Bhopal: A two-day national seminar of principals and doctors of homeopathy colleges across the country on homeopathic system of and course is going to be held in Bhopal on January 24 and 25. Polls ahead, prospects of populist budget appear bleak

The scope for a blatant populist budget looks bleak amid moderating tax revenue, high committed reves, and market loans, Emkay Global Financial Services said in a report. On the revenue side, lower tax buoyancy could be partly countered by higher RBI dividend and still-healthy assumption of divestment proceeds. "We watch for possible changes to capital gains tax structure and new personal tax regime, extension of concessional 15% tax rate for new manufacturing units, and higher import tariffs on PLI-related products," the report said. On the revenue front, gross tax/GDP ratio is expected to moderate to 10.9 per cent after a robust tax-buoyant FY23 across segments. "We will watch for possible changes to the capital gains tax structure to bring uniformity among tax rates/holding periods of various asset classes and some tinkering around the new concessional tax regime and an extension of concessional 15 per cent corporate tax rate for new manufacturing units and marginally higher customs duties on PLI-related products," the report said. Separately, higher non-tax revenue would be led by bumper RBI dividends amid FX sales. The upcoming budget faces acute policy trade-offs between nurturing a nascent growth recovery and diminishing fiscal space with challenging debt dynamics. The FY24 Union Budget will be presented against the backdrop of renewed uncertainties around global and domestic growth, tighter financial conditions, and the Union elections in CY24, the report said. However, even as additional support to some vulnerable segments of the economy is warranted, a delicate balance needs to be maintained, ensuring the fiscal impulse is maximized to boost potential growth, even as policy adherence to medium-term fiscal sustainability is signaled.

ILLEGAL COAL MINING MAY PUSH WB'S RANIGANJ TOWARDS JOSHIMATH-LIKE CRISIS

Is Raniganj, the coal belt in West Burdwan district of West Bengal, heading towards a crisis similar to that of Joshimath in Uttarakhand where land subsidence has affected hundreds of houses, shops and other establishments? For several reasons, experts do not rule out Raniganj facing a Joshimath-like situation in the coming days unless all necessary steps are taken to arrest the man-made irregularities that are making the area increasingly subsidence-prone.

A caution on this count has been flagged off by the West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee last week as she claimed that a Joshimath-like tragedy in Raniganj will affect the lives and livelihood of over 20,000 people in the region.

She had blamed the Central government for not providing adequate funds for rehabilitation of the people of Raniganj.

Trinamool Congress MLA from Raniganj assembly constituency, Tapas Bandyopadhyay claimed that Asansol-Durgapur Development Authority (ADDA), the implementing authority for rehabilitation of the people of the affected people in the area, has received just Rs 150 crore as against the Centre-announced rehabilitation package of Rs 2,600 crore.

Local BJP leader and former mayor of Asansol Municipal Corporation Jitendra Tiwari has claimed that rampant corruption by ADDA in utilisation of the Central funds is pushing Raniganj towards this inevitable crisis.

While a political slugfest in the matter is going on, we made an attempt to get into the technical details on why this region has become so vulnerable to land-subsidence -- somewhat like Joshimath.

According to a civil engineer Pradipta Mitra, after a mine is abandoned by the official coal excavating authority like Coal India Limited the abandoned mines need to be filled up with a mixture of sand, soil and water.

"But often, there is grave negligence in this filling up process, which creates a vacuum there in the abandoned mines area. And after new constructions are made over these vacuum spots, the soils there are often unable to bear the weight and pressure of the new con-



structions and as a result frequent subsidence takes place in these areas," Mitra pointed out.

However, he added, that there will be a difference in the land-subsidence nature in Raniganj that of Joshimath.

"In case of Joshimath the entire area is highly prone to land-subsidence. However, in the case of Raniganj, those areas are prone to land subsidence where there are constructions over such abandoned mines which have not been properly filled up. So, the land-subsidence nature in Raniganj area will be in a scattered manner unlike Joshimath. Still the apprehension of loss of life and property is there," Mitra explained.

Columnist and a veteran observer of the coal sector, Sunil Mukhopadhyay, said that since the abandoned mines of Coal India Limited in the Raniganj area are not filled up with the mixture of sand-soil-water adequately, such abandoned mines become the easy target for the smugglers for illegal coal mining.

"When regular mining takes place, the coal

is excavated leaving pillars of coal blocks, which act as the support for the land over the undergrounds. Now it is the duty of the coal excavating entity to fill up the gaps between the pillars after abandoning the mines with that sand-soil-water mixture, so that the illegal miners are unable to target those coal-block pillars for illegal excavation.

"Now since there is blatant negligence in that filling up process, the smugglers target those pillars and start cutting and excavating coal from those pillars. Naturally, in this process the pillars become weak and the land-subsidence happens. And why does this negligence in filling up happens? The guess is easy... it is a nexus between the officials of the coal mining entity and the coal smugglers," Mukhopadhyay added.

According to the two-time former CPI-M Lok Sabha member from Asansol, Bansa Gopal Chowdhury, there was a verdict of the Supreme Court in 2004 which said that the coal excavating entity will also have to take the responsibility of filling up the

abandoned mines.

"ADDA was made the implementing authority for the Raniganj masterplan for which the Union government sanctioned Rs 2,600 crore. As the local MP, when I was the chairman of ADDA, the work started for identification of subsidence prone lands in Raniganj, Jamuria areas. However, later that process stopped totally and the crisis deepened," Chowdhury said.

At the same time, an ADDA official said that there is yet another problem that is halting the progress of rehabilitation in the region.

"Many of the residents in the region are reluctant to vacate their existing places and move to alternative places. They want the government authorities to take steps to arrest land subsidence without displacing them. But that is often not possible for technical reasons," the official said.

Not a single foreign mountain expedition in Gilgit-Baltistan amid political chaos

Mounting political uncertainty in Pakistan and visa delays have poured frigid water on foreign adventurers plans to visit Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) this winter and attempt to scale some of the world's highest mountains, and not a single foreign mountain expedition has arrived this season. High permit fees and the US, Australia and Saudi Arabia cautioning their citizens against travelling to Pakistan also added insult to injury, Dawn reported. According to the GB tourism department, no foreign expedition or trekking group has been issued a permit this winter expedition season, which usually lasts from November to February. And the fact the season is set to end after a little over a month, no adventure group is expected as they usually need



at least two months to prepare for expeditions.

Only two foreign expedition groups applied for a visa to summit Nanga Parbat this winter, but visa delays compelled them to cancel their plans. This stands in stark contrast to previous years when hundreds of foreign mountaineers visited Pakistan in winter to attempt to summit the mighty mountains like K2 and Nanga Parbat, Dawn reported.

Besides, last summer was

the first time when more than 1,600 international climbers visited GB. Karar Haidri, secretary to the Alpine Club of Pakistan, said that prevailing political uncertainty in the country was the main factor behind the decline, as many adventure tourists cancelled their visits to the region.

However, Asghar Ali Porik, a tour operator from GB said the visa policy was main cause, as it resulted in delayed issuance of visas, Dawn reported.

16 KILLED AFTER BUILDING COLLAPSES IN SYRIA



Damascus: A total of 16 civilians were killed, and four others wounded when their residential building collapsed in the northern Syrian province of Aleppo.

The five-storey building, which the Interior Ministry said had housed seven families in the predominantly Kurdish neighborhood of Sheikh Maksoud, collapsed on Sunday due to a water leakage affecting its basis, SANA news agency reported. Rescuers are still working on finding survivors, Xinhua news agency reported, citing SANA.

Thailand saw jump in tourist numbers last yr, but below pre-Covid level

Thailand saw 11.81 million tourists in 2022, up from just 400,000 the previous year, but the figure was still lower than the record 39.8 million people that visited the Southeast Asian country in 2019.

The figures were released by the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) on Monday and predicted that 2022's number will double to 25 million this year, reports the BBC.

The country is set to start charging overseas visitors 300 baht (\$9.20) each from the start of June and now it has a target to increase tourist numbers to 80 million a year by 2027.

Tourism revenue accounted for more than 10 per cent of the country's gross domestic product (GDP) in 2019, says the TAT. In 2021, it was just 1 per cent.

By aiming to more than double the number of people who visited before the pandemic, the Thai government hopes to see tourism spending rise above \$150 billion. "This target, once achieved, could raise the country's tourism revenue to 5 trillion baht in 2027," the BBC quoted the government's Public



Relations Department as saying in a Facebook post.

The announcement also said Thailand plans to upgrade "tourism safety standards in order to accommodate the influx of visitors".

Like much of Southeast Asia, Thailand is expected to see a jump in tourist numbers from China, which dropped the strict border controls it put in place during the pandemic.

In December 2022, China's immigration administration said passport appli-

cations for its citizens wishing to travel internationally would resume from January 8.

The announcement brought to an end almost three years of strict quarantine rules for arrivals and prompted a rush of people booking overseas trips, with travel sites reporting a spike in traffic. Before the pandemic, China was Thailand's biggest source of tourists, with almost 11 million visitors in 2019.

This year the country is expecting at least five million Chinese tourists.

Addressing plunging birthrate top priority for Japan's govt: PM

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida on Monday warned that the country is on the "edge of losing its social function" owing to its plunging birthrate and addressing this will be the government's top priority.

Kishida's remarks were made during his policy speech on the first day of a 150-day regular parliamentary session, reports Xinhua news agency.

The Japanese leader highlighted that births last year are estimated to have fallen below the 800,000 mark for the first time since the government data available. As a result of the rapidly declining birthrate, coupled with Japan's ever-aging population, the workforce is quickly being hollowed out and social welfare costs are ballooning.

Kishida said in his policy speech that the government will try to implement unprecedented countermeasures to

boost the number of births, pledging to "create a children-first economy and society to reverse the country's plummeting birthrate that is hampering longer-term productivity growth".

He said he intends to devise steps and seek stable financial sources to achieve this goal. Kishida mentioned the Children and Families Agency will be launched in April and a plan actualized by June to increase by 50 per cent an allocation of funds connected to child-rearing looking ahead. The Japanese leader also touched on the country's poor fiscal health, calling on politicians to put Japan on a "new growth track" in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Kishida said rising wages is the way to establish a "virtuous cycle" of ensuring increased profits from companies find their way into workers' pockets and in turn consumption, which has been stifled by inflation peaking to more than 40-year highs, would be stimulated.

Wage expansion should outpace current inflation, the Prime Minister said, which in December rose 4.0 percent from a year earlier, to hit its highest level since 1981, amid soaring food and energy prices, the latest core consumer price index data showed.

On foreign diplomacy, Kishida reiterated his keenness to establish "constructive and stable relations with China" and "communicate closely" with South Korea. In terms of the approval rating for his Cabinet tanking recently over a controversial defence spending plan and a number of ministerial dismissals, Kishida said the government will do its best from allowing similar problems to happen again. With specific reference to some Cabinet ministers resigning last year over political funds scandals and ties to a dubious religious group, Kishida said all steps would be taken so that there will not be a recurrence of such scandals.

N.Korea received \$2.3 mn in humanitarian aid last year

North Korea saw a significant decline in humanitarian assistance from the international community last year amid prolonged border closures due to the coronavirus pandemic, new data revealed.

The financial tracking service of the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) revealed that assistance to Pyongyang from international organisations and other agencies in 2022 reached around \$2.3 million, down sharply from \$14

million the previous year, reports Yonhap News Agency.

Switzerland's provision for the reclusive country last year through the Unicef and the Swiss Development Cooperation had accounted for 69.5 per cent of the total funding, or \$1.6 million.

Sweden provided \$513,927 to the North last year via the Swedish Red Cross, while the Norwegian Red Cross in Oslo contributed \$199,601.

Data showed that several countries, including Canada, Finland, France and Germany, had offered contributions to the North in 2021 but did not provide any last year.

Switzerland will contribute another \$1.2 million through Unicef this year for "essential nutrition services" in the impoverished country, according to the data as of January 4 shown on the OCHA website.

12 shot in US nightclub


Washington: Twelve people were shot and injured at a nightclub in Baton Rouge, capital city of the US state of Louisiana.

Three of the injured were in critical condition and were rushed to the hospital, Xinhua news agency quoted local media reports as saying. On Sunday evening, police spokesman L'Jean McNeely Jr. said all the injured were in stable condition.

The shooting occurred at the Dior Bar and Lounge around 1.30 a.m., said McNeely. No arrest has been made so far, and the motive of the shooting remains unknown. The Baton Rouge incident comes a day after at least 10 people were killed during a mass shooting in Monterey Park, California, deemed as one of the deadliest in the US state's recent history.

The incident on Saturday night took place at the Star Ballroom Dance Studio, a popular dance hall, as thousands gathered Asian-American majority city to mark the Lunar New Year state holiday.

According to police, the suspected gunman identified as 72-year-old Huu Can Tran shot and killed himself inside a white van that officers had surrounded earlier on Sunday.

SC junk CBI's plea against bail granted to Anil Deshmukh

The Supreme Court on Monday declined to entertain a plea by CBI challenging bail granted by the Bombay High Court to former Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh regarding a corruption case in connection with alleged illegal gratification sought from bar owners and corruption in police transfers and postings in Maharashtra.



Anil Deshmukh in a money laundering case. The high court had allowed Deshmukh's bail plea in the money laundering case being probed by the ED. It had noted that dismissed cop Sachin Waze, who was co-accused in the case before he turned into an approver, statements lacked certainty. Waze had made a statement that an amount of Rs 1.71 crores was transferred during the months of February and March, 2021 allegedly extorted from the bar owners and handed over to Deshmukh's personal assistant.

Bombay High Court issued directions for an inquiry in response to a petition filed by Param Bir Singh, former Commissioner of Mumbai Police. The ED initiated a case of money laundering against Deshmukh and arrested him. Singh had accused him of trying to extort money from bar owners in the city via some police officials, including Waze. Also, claimed that he took money for transfers and postings of police officers. In a letter written to then chief minister Uddhav Thackeray, Singh alleged Deshmukh had instructed certain cops, including Waze, to collect Rs 100 crore every month from owners of bars in Mumbai.


MAN ARRESTED FOR RAPING 20-MONTH-OLD BABY

Bombay HC refuses bail to ex-cop Pradeep Sharma in Antilia case

The Bombay High Court on Monday declined to give bail to former cop Pradeep Sharma who was arrested in connection with the planting of an SUV laden with gelatin sticks outside the residence of billionaire industrialist Mukesh Ambani, and the subsequent murder of the vehicle owner and Thane businessman Mansukh Hiran. A division bench of Justices Revati Mohite-Dere and R. N. Laddha dismissed Sharma's appeal challenging a Special NIA Court order which had rejected his bail plea of



February 2022. The SUV laden with gelatin with a printed death threat to the Ambani family was found

found dead in the Thane Creek. The National Investigation Agency (NIA) which took over the probe from Maharashtra Police and arrested Sharma in June 2021, contended that he allegedly conspired with another sacked policeman Sachin Vaze to finish off Hiran, considered a 'weak link' in the entire conspiracy to terrorise the Ambanis. The NIA said that Hiran was in the know of the entire plot and the accused Sharma-Vaze were worried that he would spill the beans on them, so they plotted to eliminate him.

SCHOOL IN VILLAGE OF 150 PEOPLE HAS ONLY 1 STUDENT

Ganeshpur: Kishore Mankar who is teaching at a Zila Parishad Primary School in Maharashtra's Ganeshpur village says the school has had only one student in the last two years. Located 22 kilometers from Maharashtra's Washim District, Mankar further stated that the population of Ganeshpur is only 150. Kishore Mankar said he has been teaching at this school for the last two years. "I'm the only teacher in school," said Kishore Mankar, a school teacher who has been showing up every day on his bike for two years to teach just one student. "There is only one teacher in the school for the last two years. I have been teaching during this period," Mankar added. "From 10:30 am to 12 pm, I follow all the rules and regulations including singing the national anthem," Mankar stated. "I teach him all the subjects. All the facilities given by the government including mid-day meal are being provided to the student," Mankar added.

Rakhi Sawant gets relief till tomorrow in obscene video case

The Bombay High Court on Monday directed the city police to not take any action against actor Rakhi Sawant till Tuesday in connection with a case lodged against her by a model for allegedly circulating and displaying her obscene and objectionable video. Ms Sawant moved the High Court seeking pre-arrest bail in the case. Her lawyer on Monday told a single bench of Justice M S Karnik that Ms Sawant had been cooperating with the police in its probe since the FIR was lodged in November 2022. Justice Karnik posted the



matter for hearing on Tuesday and directed the police to not take any action against her until then. The bench was informed by the additional public prosecutor that Ms Sawant had



appeared before the police last week for questioning but before handing over her phone she deleted the said video. The police would now also charge Ms Sawant with the destruction of evidence, he said.

Justice Karnik asked Sawant's lawyer to take instructions on this. Based on the model's complaint, the suburban Amboli police had booked Ms Sawant and her lawyer Falguni Brahmabhatt on November 8, 2022, under sections 354A (sexual harassment), 500 (defamation), 504 (intentional insult) and 509 (insulting modesty of woman by act, word or gesture) of the Indian Penal Code and section 67 (transmission of obscene content in electronic form) of the Information Technology Act. Ms Sawant approached the court after a sessions court last week rejected her anticipatory bail application.

ACTOR NAWAZUDDIN SIDDIQUI'S WIFE CHARGED ON HIS MOTHER'S ASSAULT COMPLAINT

Mumbai: The wife of actor Nawazuddin Siddiqui was booked for alleged trespass and voluntarily causing hurt on the complaint of his mother, a Mumbai police official said on Monday. The FIR against the actor's wife Zainab was registered on Sunday, the Versova police station official said. "The complainant Mehrunisa Siddiqui, who is the actor's mother, has alleged Zainab trespassed into her home and assaulted her after picking up an argument. Zainab has been questioned in the case," he said. A case under Indian Penal Code sections 452 (house-trespass after preparation for hurt, assault or wrongful restraint), 323 (voluntary causing hurt) and other offences has been registered against Zainab Siddiqui, he said. No arrest has been made in the case and further probe is underway, he added. Police sources, meanwhile, said the incident may be the fallout of a property dispute between the actor, his wife and his mother.



MINOR GIRL KILLED BY FALLING DEBRIS OF UNDER-CONSTRUCTION TOWER

In a freak incident, a seven-year-old girl was killed by the falling plaster from an under-construction residential high-rise here in the early hours of Monday. According to the BMC Disaster Control, the incident occurred around 8 p.m. on Sunday near Chandanwadi in south Mumbai. As per initial reports from the V.P. Patel Road Police Station, the falling debris from the 24-storied structure, Shripati Jewels building, crashed on the girl below, injuring Krishna Patel seriously. The Patel family lives in

the 7th floor of the same partly-built building where construction work is going on above the 15th till the 24th floors. Krishna was rushed to the Reliance Foundation Hospital nearby and died early this morning, around 1.30 am, during treatment, said the BMC official. Treating it as a case of 'negligence,' the V. P. Road Police Station has booked the building developer Rajendra Chaturvedi and a site supervisor Raghav Parmar. The police and fire brigade have cordoned off the building premises and surrounding as a precaution and further investigation is underway.

"Decision Is Hers Alone To Make": Court Allows 32-Week Pregnancy Termination

A woman has the right to choose whether to continue her pregnancy or not and the decision is hers and hers alone to make, the Bombay High Court said while allowing a married woman to terminate her 32-week pregnancy after the fetus was detected with severe abnormalities. A division bench of Justices Gautam Patel and S G Dige, in its judgment of January 20, a copy of which was made available on Monday, refused to accept the medical board's view that the even though the fetus has serious abnormalities it should not be terminated as the pregnancy is almost at its

end. The woman had approached High Court seeking to terminate her pregnancy after a sonography revealed the fetus had severe abnormalities and that the baby would be born with physical and mental disabilities. "Given a severe fetal abnormality, the length of the pregnancy does not matter. The petitioner has taken an informed decision. It is not an easy one. But that decision is hers, and hers alone to make. The right to choose is of the petitioner's. It is not the right of the Medical Board," the court said in its order. Refusing termination of pregnancy only on grounds of delay would not only be condemning the fetus to a less than optimal life but would also be condemning the mother to a



future that will almost certainly rob her of every positive attribute of parenthood, the High Court said. "It would be a denial of her right to dignity, and her reproductive and decisional autonomy. The mother knows today there is no possibility

of having a normal healthy baby at the end of this delivery," the court said. The petitioner's fetus is detected with both microcephaly and lissencephaly, and this is what the future portends, the bench said. Asserting that the rights of the woman should never be compromised in the "blind application of a statute", the court said, "Justice may have to be blindfolded; it can never be allowed to be blindsided. We are agnostic about the relative positions of parties. We can never be agnostic about where justice needs to be delivered." It said cases such as this often raise profound moral questions and dilemmas, but it is immutable that the "arc of the moral universe always bends

towards justice". The bench said the existence of the fetal anomaly, as well as its severity, was certain as also the fact that it was detected late. The bench noted the medical board did not take into account the social and economic position of the couple. "It ignores their milieu entirely. It does not even attempt to envision the kind of life, one with no equality at all to speak of, that the petitioner must endure for an indefinite future if the Board's recommendation is to be followed," the court said. "The Board really does only one thing: because late, therefore no. And that is plainly wrong, as we have seen," the court said while allowing the pregnancy to be terminated.



PAMELA ANDERSON SAYS TIM ALLEN FLASHED HIS PRIVATES AT HER WHEN SHE WAS 23



Bruyne's cross and netted his second from the penalty spot four minutes after the break. The Norwegian then scored his 25th league goal of the campaign after good work from Riyad Mahrez to round off the afternoon. Leeds United controlled their match at home to Brentford and never looked in danger of losing as Brentford failed to have a shot on target, but despite five shots on target, they failed to really test Brentford keeper David Raya.

KOHLI, SURYAKUMAR, HARDIK NAMED IN ICC MEN'S T20I TEAM OF THE YEAR 2022

Talismanic India batters Virat Kohli, Suryakumar Yadav, and fast-bowling all-rounder Hardik Pandya on Monday were named in the ICC Men's T20I team of the Year for 2022, which is captained by England's T20 World Cup winning skipper Jos Buttler.

Others who made the cut for the Men's T20I team of the Year 2022 include Pakistan opener Mohammad Rizwan and pacer Haris Rauf, New Zealand batter Glenn Phillips, Zimbabwe's off-spin all-rounder Sikandar Raza, England's Sam Curran, who was Player of the Tournament at T20 World Cup, Sri Lanka's leg-spinner Wanindu Hasaranga and Ireland's left-arm pacer Josh Little.

The latter half of 2022 saw Kohli showing glimpses of his vintage run-



making self. He took the T20 Asia Cup in the UAE by storm, finishing as the second-highest run-getter with 276 runs in five games. He also brought an end to his century drought of close to three years with a magnificent career-best 122 off just 61 balls against Afghanistan in Super Four stage of the tournament,

laced with 12 fours and six sixes, at a strike-rate of 200. Suryakumar, nominated for ICC Men's T20I Cricketer of the Year 2022, had a sensational year in the shortest format of the game, becoming just the second batter to score more than 1000 runs in a year in the format with his 360-degree strokeplay.

SMRITI, DEEPTI, RICHA, RENUKA INCLUDED IN ICC WOMEN'S T20I TEAM OF THE YEAR FOR 2022

India's left-handed opener Smriti Mandhana, off-spin all-rounder Deepti Sharma, wicketkeeper-batter Richa, and right-arm fast-bowler Renuka Singh Thakur were included in the ICC Women's T20I team of the Year for 2022 captained by New Zealand all-rounder Sophie Devine, said cricket's global governing body.

Smriti, the India vice-captain who is also nominated for ICC Women's T20I Cricketer of the Year and ICC Women's Cricketer of the Year, had a terrific 2022 with the bat, making 594 runs at an average of 33 and a strike-rate of 133.48. She hit five half-centuries in 21 innings during the year, including one in the final of the Women's Asia Cup at Bangladesh in October against Sri Lanka.

Deepti took 29 wickets in the year, the joint-third-highest by any bowler in women's T20Is in 2022. Averaging 18.55 with the ball, Deepti also bowled at an economy rate of just over six, while making 370 runs in the year with the bat. Richa was a standout player for India in T20Is in 2022. In 18 matches, she amassed 259 runs, smashing 13 sixes and showcasing incredible flair in the lower middle-order. Her best came at Brabourne Stadium in a home series against Australia when she smashed an unbeaten 40 in just 19 balls, an effort which went in vain. Renuka, one of the nominees for the ICC Women's Emerging Cricketer of the Year award for 2022, picked 22 wickets at an average of 23.95 and an economy rate of 6.50. She was a thorn in the side of Australia's line-up in the seven T20I meetings across the year, taking eight wickets.



Australian Open

Magda Linette stuns Caroline Garcia to reach her first grand slam quarterfinal

Poland's Magda Linette stunned World No.4 Frenchwoman Caroline Garcia in straight sets to reach her first Grand Slam quarterfinal.

Playing in her 30th Grand Slam main draw, Linette registered a 7-6(3), 6-4 upset win over WTA Finals champion Garcia in 1 hour and 57 minutes. She will next face former World No.1 Karolina Pliskova of the Czech Republic.

The win over Garcia is Linette's fourth career top-10 victory, and all four of them have come at Grand Slams. Three of them have been over the top-5 opponents. On the other hand, Pliskova extended her head-to-head dominance over Zhang Shuai of China to advance to her 11th career



Grand Slam quarterfinal. The Czech's 6-0, 6-4 win in just 55 minutes improved her career record against Zhang to 8-0, and put her into the final eight of the Australian Open for the fourth time. The former No.1 came from 2-4 down in the second set but cruised against No.23 seed Zhang, who is a former Australian Open quarterfinalist. With the win, Pliskova improves to 11-3 in her career in Grand Slam fourth rounds, including 4-0 at the Australian Open.

Sania Mirza-Rohan Bopanna pair advances to mixed doubles quarterfinals

Ace Indian tennis players Sania Mirza and Rohan Bopanna sailed into the mixed doubles quarterfinals of the Australian Open. The Indian pair defeated Japan's Makoto Ninomiya and Uruguay's Ariel Behar 6-4, 7-6(11-9) in their second-round match to set up a quarterfinal clash with Latvian-Spanish duo Jelena Ostapenko and David Vega Hernandez. Sania and Bopanna, the Rio Olympic semi-finalists, had earlier beaten Australia's Jaimee Fourlis and Luke Saville in the first round. The Indian pair drew first blood and broke the Uruguay-Latvian pair in the third game but the Ninomiya-Behar responded immediately to level the score. But the Indians then make it 4-3 and quickly raced to a set lead. Both the pairs went toe-to-toe in the second as the hard-fought set ended with the Indian pair triumphing 11-9 in the tie-breaker, keeping the Indian challenge alive at the year's first Grand Slam. Sania is playing her last Grand Slam as the six-time Grand Slam champion earlier this month announced that she will retire from professional tennis at Dubai Tennis Championships, a WTA 1000 event, which begins on February 19.



Bundesliga: Dortmund overpower Augsburg

Dortmund continued offensively minded but needed some time to find the back of Augsburg's goal as Jamie Bynoe-Gittens finished off his solo run to make it 3-2 on the scoreboards in the 75th minute. Dortmund's lead lasted only two minutes as resilient Augsburg tied the scores for the third time in a row after substitute David Colina latched onto a loose ball inside the box. The hosts had the last laugh and snatched all three points on home soil in the 80th minute when Bellingham flicked on a long ball from Schlotterbeck, allowing Reyna to score the 4-3 winner with a half volley.

For Deepika, 'Pathaan' is a very special film in her filmography.



Talking about the solutions to deal with depression and mental illness, Anjali concluded, saying: "There is not a single solution for everyone, as everyone's life, struggles, surroundings, thinking, mental health, and problems are not the same."

"But one can surely keep their mind healthy and strong through meditation, by following a good diet, ignoring haters, and most importantly, by running far away from those people who are just good in front of them and not in the back. By following these steps, one can keep their mind healthy," she concluded.
