SC on a plea for postponing NEET-PG exam

'WILL BE MENTAL TORTURE FOR STUDENTS WAITING FOR THE EXAM'

The National Board of Examinations (NBE) on Friday told the Supreme Court that around 2.09 lakh candidates have registered for NEET-PG exam 2023, scheduled on March 5, and if the exam were to be postponed, then no alternative date may be available in the near future.

A bench comprising Justices S R Bhat and Dipankar Datta orally observed that postponing the exam would be a mental torture for those who are waiting for the exam, and added that it will not pass any order either way.

The bench asked Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, representing the NBE, to bring a solution on the issue raised by the petitioners in connection with National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET)-PG exam.

The bench noted: "When we postpone a judicial exam, there is agony for the candidates who are preparing for it. The whole dynamics change."

The top court was hearing two petitions seeking postponement of the NEET-PG exam saying that counselling has to be conducted after August 11 since the cut-off date for internship has been extended to that date.

Sharing the information in connection with the exam, Bhati said around



2.09 lakh candidates have registered for the exam and all preparations have been made to conduct the test, which involved engaging a technology partner to conduct the test.

Opposing the postponement of the exam, she contended that no alternate test date may be available in the near future as the technology partner may not be available and authorities are trying to follow the schedule affirmed by the top court earlier.

Senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan, appearing for the petitioners, told the bench that

though 13 petitioners have come before the court, the issue raised by them affects nearly 45,000 candidates. He added that when one would go to the counselling, the person would need to carry the internship certificate and since the date has been extended to August 11, therefore the counselling should happen after this date. Sankaranarayanan contended that internship is for 12 hours a day and for these students there is not much time to prepare for the examination.

The bench noted that students

preparing for months would have to wait.

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, who also appeared for the petitioners, submitted that different states have different schedules for internship and the issue has arisen due to this.

After hearing arguments, the bench told Bhati: "We are not indicating that it will be postponed... we are not passing any order either way. We are keeping it open. You come with the figures". The top court has scheduled the matter for further hearing on February 27.

'Bullet train is national project', SC declines to entertain Godrej's plea for higher compensation

The Supreme Court on Friday refused to entertain a plea by Godrej and Boyce Manufacturing Co Ltd for higher compensation for its 9.69 acres of land for the Mumbai-Ahmedabad Bullet train project. The apex court said the project is of national importance.

A bench headed by Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud and comprising Justices P.S. Narasimha and J.B. Pardiwala told senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, representing Godrej and Boyce Manufacturing Co Ltd, that the court is not willing to entertain the petition.

The bench said, "Much water has flown, possession has been taken over of the land...and the construction has already commenced."

Rohatgi repeatedly questioned the validity of the order. The bench replied that it will not entertain the company's petition.

The Chief Justice told Rohatgi, "Your compensation should not be Rs 264 crore, it should be Rs 572 crore... you have all the remedies now", and it would be like putting a gun to pay the compensation.

The bench further told Rohatgi, "it is only a question of money. It is a national project..."



After hearing arguments, the top court said if any application for enhancement of compensation is filed, it should be decided within six weeks.

The top court also granted liberty to the company to seek legal recourse for enhancement of the compensation.

The company's plea challenged validity of the Bombay High Court judgment passed earlier this month, dismissing a petition filed by the Godrej and Boyce Manufacturing Co Ltd challenging the Maharashtra government's grant of Rs 264 crore in compensation for the land.

The Godrej Group had challenged the award and compensation of Rs 264 crore by the Deputy Collector on September 15, 2022, for acquiring 39,252 sq m (9.69 acres). The company said initially Rs 572

crore was offered and filed the writ petition, also challenging the provisions of the law.

However, the high court, in decision on February 9, described the bullet train project as "of national importance and public interest" and dismissed the petition. The high court said it did not find any illegality in the award or in the "decision taken by the appropriate government in granting extension to make an award by exercising powers under first proviso to Section 25 of the Fair Compensation Act."

The Mumbai-Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail (MAHSR) is the pet project of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the project, which passes through Gujarat, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, and Maharashtra, is being executed by the National High-Speed Rail Corporation Ltd (NHSRCL).

Buffalo milk price to shoot up by Rs 5/litre from March 1

Hitting the consumers hard, the Mumbai Milk Producers Association (MMPA) has announced a steep price hike of Rs 5/litre of buffalo milk in the city from March 1, an official said on Friday.

MMPA President C.K. Singh said that the price of buffalo milk which is sold by over 3,000 retailers in the city - will be increased from Rs 80 per litre to Rs 85 per litre, and will remain in force till August 31.



This is the second steep hike coming after September 2022, when buffalo milk price was hiked from Rs 75 a litre to Rs 80 per litre, making the domestic budget of the poor and middle-class families go haywire. Singh said that the unanimous decision was taken at the MMPA general body meeting late on Thursday. All the members felt

that since the price of milch animals as well their food items like dana, tuvar, chuni, chana-chuni etc. have gone up by 15-25 per cent, besides steep hike in the rates of grass, hay, pinda etc., the rate of milk should also be increased. Mumbai consumes over 50 lakh litres of buffalo milk daily, of which more than seven lakh is supplied by the MMPA through its chain of dairies and neighbourhood retailers, through their farms spread in and around the country's commercial capital.

Civilian injured by militants in J&K's Bijbehara

at a civilian identified as Asif Ali Ganai in Hassanpora area of Bijbehara.

"He was shifted to hospital in Bijbehara town for treatment. The area has been surrounded for searches," police said.

Traffic Cop Saves Man Who Suffered Heart Attack, Collapsed On Road

A traffic police officer's swift action saved the life of a man after he collapsed on the road due to a heart attack in Telangana's Hyderabad.

A video of the police officer, Rajasekhhar, performing a CPR has been shared widely on social media.

CPR, short for cardiopulmonary resuscitation, is a lifesaving technique useful in emergencies such as a heart attack or near drowning.

In the video, which was also tweeted by Telangana Health Minister Harish Rao Thanneeru, the police officer presses on the man's chest with some force till he responds to the intervention.

The Cyberabad Police said the man was taken to a hospital. The Health Minister, thanking the police officer for saving the man's life, said the state government will

train frontline health employees and workers in CPR as such cases have been rising.

"Highly appreciate traffic police Rajasekhhar of Rajendranagar PS (police station) for doing a commendable job in saving precious life by immediately doing CPR. Telangana government will conduct CPR training to all frontline employees and workers next week in view of increasing reports of such incidents," Mr Thanneeru tweeted. In the social media age, videos of people collapsing due to heart attacks in public places like gyms and at events have surfaced often.

This has led to debates among medical professionals and speculation on public forums whether heart attacks are increasingly becoming common even among young adults.

Over 3.4mn lives saved by India's Covid vax strategy: Mandaviya

The Covid-19 vaccine strategy adopted by India during the deadly pandemic saved more than 3.4 million lives as well as had a positive impact on the country's economy, said Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya on Friday.

In a virtual address of the 'The India Dialog' session on the Economic Impact of Vaccination & Related Matters, he said that for the effective management of Covid-19, the country "adopted a 'whole of government' and 'whole of society' approach in a proactive, preemptive and graded manner thus adopting a holistic response strategy".

He also released a working paper by Stanford University and Institute for Competitiveness titled "Healing the Economy: Estimating the Economic Impact on India's vaccination and related issues".

The paper highlighted that India was able to save more than 3.4 million lives by undertaking the nationwide Covid vaccination campaign at an unprecedented scale. The campaign also yielded a positive economic impact by preventing loss of \$18.3 billion to India's economy. A net benefit of \$15.42 billion occurred for the nation after taking into consideration the cost of the vaccination campaign.



The paper discussed the role of containment as a measure to prevent the spread of the virus. A strict lockdown in the initial period was announced, after which three more lockdown phases followed in succession. A containment strategy followed this in the unlock phases which was decentralised gradually, with specific regions gaining more control over its implementation.

The Stanford report noted that robust measures at the ground level, like contact tracing, mass test-

ing, home quarantine, distribution of essential medical equipment, revamping healthcare infrastructure, and constant coordination among stakeholders at the centre, state, and district levels, not only helped contain the spread of the virus but also in augmenting the health infrastructure.

It elaborates that three measures -- containment, relief package, and vaccine administration -- were critical in saving lives and ensuring economic activity by containing the

spread of the Covid, sustaining livelihoods, and developing immunity against the virus.

Mandaviya also credited a large part of the success to the citizens who cooperated with the government and other stakeholders in the fight against Covid.

Healing the relief packages for citizens, Mandaviya said it "not only helped mitigate the adverse effects of Covid-19 but also provided an impetus to the economic activities."

The relief package by the government catered to the welfare needs of the vulnerable groups, old age population, farmers, Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), women entrepreneurs amongst others and also ensuring support for their livelihoods.

The paper also highlighted the food security programmes during pandemic like the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana (PMGKAY). The programmes ensured free food grains were distributed to 800 million people which resulted in an economic impact of approximately \$26.24 billion. In addition, the PM Garib Kalyan Rozgar Abhiyan helped in providing immediate employment and livelihood opportunities to migrant workers. Through the scheme 4 million beneficiaries were provided employment which resulted in an overall economic impact of \$4.81 billion.

BLAST IN MEERUT LEAVES SEVERAL TRAPPED

Meerut (UP): An explosion in the compressor of a cold storage in UP's Meerut city on Friday, has left several injured after a shaft collapsed, officials said.

While some reports said that five labourers had died, there was no confirmation. The incident took place in Daurala police circle and officials have reached the spot.

Several workers are suspected to be trapped under the shaft of the unit which plunged due to the jolt of the explosion and the pressure of the burst. Visuals show workers being taken out of the rubble and debris all around the cold storage unit. Locals assisted the labourers on site.

WITNESS IN RAJU PAL MURDER CASE SHOT AT IN UP

Prayagraj (UP): Umesh Pal, the main witness in the murder of then BSP MLA, Raju Pal, was shot at while entering his house on Friday evening.

The assailants fired several rounds at him and then fled. Two gunners engaged in the security of Umesh Pal are also said to be seriously injured in the firing.

Raju Pal was shot dead in Prayagraj in January 2005 and the prime accused in the case was Ashraf Ahmad, brother of Ateeq Ahmad. Raju Pal's widow Puja Pal is now Samajwadi Party MLA.

Insurance Corp employee caught red-handed for taking bribe

She said that her Rs 50,000 for maternity leave were pending. She accused that Shubham Gupta, who works as an Upper division clerk (UDC) at State Employees Insurance Corporation allegedly demanded Rs 5000 in exchange of releasing her payment, told DSP Rishishwar.

Interestingly, Lokayukta police had taped



this conversation. Later, the police laid a trap to catch him red-hand. They gave the lady currency notes thinly-layered with a special chemical and sent her to the Shubham's office located in Falka Bazar. As the woman gave the chemical-laced note to the accused employee, his fingerprints were recorded and the Lokayukta team arrested him red-handed.

11 NEW MEASLES CASES FOUND IN FIVE NEW AREAS OF INDORE

Over 400 unvaccinated children found in survey

There is no relief to the city from measles' outbreak. Eleven new patients were identified taking the tally of such cases to 31 in last two weeks. Moreover, the patients were found in three new areas. As samples are still pending, officials are apprehensive of a few of them returning positive.

"As many as 11 new patients found positive are of between the age of nine months and 19 years. Out of these eleven patients, three are from Chandan Nagar, two each from Juna Risala and Madina Nagar, and one each from Bambai Bazaar, Janki Nagar, and Khajrana," District



Immunization Officer Dr Tarun Gupta said.

He said that most of these patients were recovering well and none of them was fully vaccinated. The team of the health department has intensified the door-to-door survey in these areas and the vaccination drive.

"We have surveyed more than 5,000 houses in the affected areas and found 400 children who hadn't taken the vaccine yet. Our team has vaccinated 375 of them so far and the rest will be vaccinated soon," Dr Gupta added.

The team has given Vitamin A tablets to over 800 children while a survey has been launched in areas from where new patients were found.

Drunk, man throws rocks at friend over non-payment of dues

A drunk man allegedly started throwing rocks at his friend in Shivpuri, after he suddenly remembered that his friend owed him money. The video went viral on social media on Friday. The young man has been admitted to the hospital in critical condition. According to the reports, the viral video is said to be a few days old from Madha Ganeshkheda of Rannaud police station area. The accused Khalakh Singh (48) and the victim Dilip Lodhi (26) both are the residents of the same village.



After drinking together, Khalakh Singh remembered he had loaned some money to Dilip Lodhi. When he asked for the repayment, his friend refused and this sparked the fight. The duo got into the heated argument and started hurling abuses at each other.

MP to have paperless budget session; MLAs will be given tablets to view budget statement

She goes on to say how she was offered to try 56 food items and added: "I was offered the chance to taste fifty-six food items by the shop-



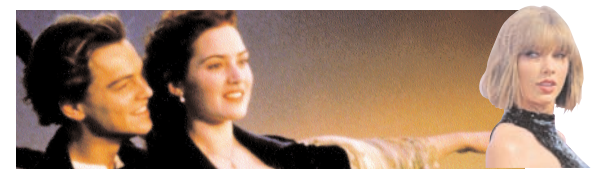

Actress Amanda Seyfried says Blake Lively almost lost playing the iconic character Karen Smith in 2004's 'Mean Girls'. During a video interview with Vanity Fair published Wednesday, Seyfried, 37, said that she believes she was cast in the role because she "played that person in high school in order to stay out of the drama" before recalling the specifics of her audition, reports people.com.

"I'd first auditioned for Regina, and I'd flown out to L.A. for the first time with my mother. It was very exciting," Seyfried, who was 17 at the time, said of her first film role. "I met (Gretchen Wieners actress) Lacey Chabert for the first time, and Lindsay Lohan was in the room and Blake Lively was playing Karen, and then I was Regina." "I flew home, and they were like, 'You know what, let's - we think you're more correct for Karen,' so I was like, 'Oh, God, okay, sure,'" she added of the casting process. 'Mean Girls' casting director Marci Liroff once told Cosmopolitan UK that while the production initially wanted Lively, who had not yet rose to fame for 2005's 'Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants', to play Karen, producer Lorne Michaels ultimately suggested casting Seyfried in the role.

"(Lively) came down to the final tests but, at some point, some of the filmmakers said to keep looking," Liroff said during a 2019 interview with the outlet. "Amanda Seyfried had read for Regina and we really liked her but then Lorne suggested, 'Why don't we make her Karen?'"

No filmmakers have been attached to the projects as yet, but in a statement to Variety, Jackson and his main 'Lord of the Rings' collaborators Fran Walsh and Philippa Boyens said Warner Bros. and Embracer "have kept us in the loop every step of the way."

"We look forward to speaking with them further to hear their vision for the



franchise moving forward," Jackson, Walsh and Boyens said.

Freemode, a division of Embracer Group, made the adaptive rights deal for books including 'The Lord of the Rings' and 'The Hobbit'.

The pact will be billed under the name Middle-earth Enterprises.

Notably, De Luca and Abdy left MGM last year to take the helm of Warner Bros. Their exit followed the acquisition of MGM by Amazon - the tech giant owns the TV rights to 'Lord of the Rings' and produced a single season of television at the gut-busting price of over \$450 million in 2022.

When she dives further, though, her digital investigation raises more questions than answers.

Review : The film is touted as a prequel to the 2018 film Searching and follows a similar theme. The entire film is shot in an unusual style, with the majority of the time spent on face time and showcasing the screen. The film opens with the introduction of a happy family consisting of June, Grace, and her husband. Grace takes her daughter to another



city after her husband's death, where she finds love again. Upset with her mother's decision, June distances herself from her mother, but when Grace goes missing, June begins searching for her, and each question adds suspense to the picture. Will June be able to locate her mother? What does the

mystery have in store for June? It is up to you to figure it out.

Nicholas D. Johnson and Will Merrick provide a brilliantly filmed, simple, and direct mystery that has the potential to blow your mind. The filmmaker has maintained the spirit of 'searching' in mind throughout the

filming process. The narrative is sharp, and the short timeframe keeps the viewer engaged throughout. You never feel like losing interest since each scene adds to the drama. A film with no amazing landscape or stunning scenery manages to offer you a "wow" moment; kudos to the editing team.

The lack of songs in the film perfectly meets the condition, since the background soundtrack is enough. When it comes to star performances, Storm Reid is the film's backbone. What a brilliant talent she is; her performance is so flawless that she gets to transmit the exact feeling only by using expressions.

Moving on to Nia Long, the actress plays Grace in the film and performs wonderfully. Aside from these two characters, Tim Griffin, Rainn Wilson, and Megan Suri also have significant parts and have contributed significantly to the film's success.

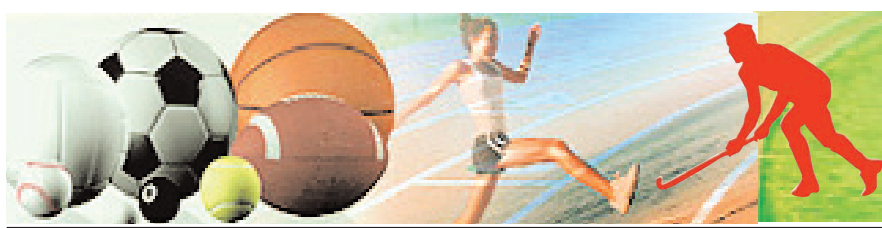

SMITH TO LEAD AUSTRALIA IN THIRD TEST IN ABSENCE OF CUMMINS



CAMERON GREEN SAYS HE IS '100 PERCENT READY' FOR INDORE TEST

New Delhi Australian all-rounder Cameron Green has said that he is '100 percent ready to go' for the third Test of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy after missing the first two games with a fractured finger.

"I was so, so close last game but I think probably having an extra week has helped a lot, so I'm 100 percent ready to go," Green stated.

"I reckon it's just a few instances in the nets where I'd maybe go for a sweep and just jarred (the injured finger) on my bat. I went for a sweep to a pretty new ball, just caught the very end of it and had a bit of pain at the back of my finger, but apart from that it's been really sweet the last two weeks, I've got a lot of confidence in it," he added. With Mitchell Starc also firming for a return in Indore and that pair could end up being the side's only two selected pacemen with Cummins ruled out for the third Test. "My bowling is actually going really well, I think we probably thought the ball on the back of the finger rolling off might be painful but that's been completely fine. I had my first hit probably four or five days ago against the pace bowlers and felt completely fine," he said.

Team Absolute | New Delhi

Seasoned batter Steven Smith will lead Australia in the third Test of the ongoing Border-Gavaskar Trophy against India in Indore as regular skipper Pat Cummins will miss the game to remain home in Sydney due to a family illness.

Cummins flew home following Australia's defeat in the second Test in Delhi last week, explaining in a statement that his mother "is ill and in palliative care".

With a nine-day break between Tests following the three-day finish in the second game, it had been hoped the 29-year-old would return to India for the third Test beginning Wednesday. But Australia confirmed on Friday that Cummins would miss the Indore Test.

They are keeping the door open for him to return for the fourth Test in Ahmedabad, but Smith could end up captaining in both the remaining matches. "I have decided against returning to India at this time. I feel I am best being here with my family. I appreciate the overwhelming support I have received from Cricket Australia and my teammates. Thanks for your understanding," said a statement from Cummins. It will be the third time Smith has led the Test side since his reinstatement as vice-captain in late 2021 when Cummins took over from Tim Paine. Smith has filled in as skipper for two Tests -- in December, 2022 when Cummins had been ruled out due to injury and in the Ashes Test of 2021 when there were Covid-related concerns.

South Africa beat England by six runs

England were cruising in the chase until the last three overs of the innings in which South Africa roared back and made it through to the final.

England are known as good chasers and that status is going to be put to test as they have been presented with a 165-run target to reach the final.

South Africa made a slow start in the powerplay but have since sped up and England are now dealing with a rather strong opening stand. It ended with Laura Wolvaardt scoring a half century and her opening stand with Tazmin Brits produced 96 runs. Brits then took over and scored her second consecutive half century and South Africa, who have not managed to reach 140 before in this tournament, looked primed to reach 170.

Sophie Ecclestone then bowled a stunning 19th over in which she took two wickets but the 20th over then went for 18 to take South Africa to a total of 164/4. England and South Africa have met three times in World Cup tournaments - at the 2014 T20 World Cup and 2017 and 2022 fifty-over World Cup. All three times, England has emerged triumphant from a final four meeting against South Africa and there's no doubt they have the historical upper hand.

The player of the match is Tazmin Brits, The woman with the velcro hands,



who played a clever and aggressive innings with the bat said, "As a cricketer you dream of showing up at such moments. Thank you to the crowd, without them it wouldn't have been possible. Nice to have backing from your country. We tried to accelerate at the

beginning but got a measure of it as the game went on. 140 was a minimum but we got 160. I wrote it down on paper. "I still cannot believe [the catch]. I am impressed and happy with it. We need to praise and glory to God for giving us this opportunity."

India's Anirudh-Prashanth storm into doubles final

Indian pair of Anirudh Chandrasekhar and N. Vijay Sundar Prashanth extended their excellent form at the Bengaluru Open 2023 to enter the doubles final after beating the fourth-seeded Arjun Kadhe and Max Neuchrist 7-6(1), 4-6, 10-2 at the KSLTA Stadium.

Anirudh and Prashanth are the only Indians remaining in the tournament as the country's campaign ended in the singles with the exit of Sumit Nagal on Thursday. The duo registered a hard-



fought win in an exciting three-setter semi-final against the Indo-Austrian pair and will play the final on Saturday.

In the singles quarterfinals, Hamad Medjedovic of Serbia topped No. 1 seed Chun-Hsin Tseng of Taipei. Medjedovic employed his power-packed serve and ground shots to telling effect to carve a 6-1, 6-2 win over

his fancied opponent. The extent of Medjedovic's dominance was evident from the fact that he managed to effect five breaks in the match.

Medjedovic will face Max Purcell in the semi-finals on Saturday. Purcell, the defending doubles champion in Wimbledon, outperformed Luca Nardi of Italy 6-2, 6-0.

Earlier, second-seeded James Duckworth of Australia, who was once ranked No. 46 in the world, also entered the Last-4 with a clinical 6-4, 6-1 win over Dimitar Kuzmanov of Bulgaria.

A magnificent 184 not out from the Harry Brook put England in control on day one of the second and final Test against New Zealand.

Brook was well on course for his maiden double ton but showers in the final session brought an early end to the day with the 24-year-old unbeaten on 184 off just 169 balls - including 24 fours and 5 sixes, driving England to 315-3 at stumps.

At the other end, he had Joe Root for company, who notched up his 29th Test hundred (101 not out). The pair added an undefeated stand worth 294 for the fourth wicket to snatch the momentum away from the



home side.

England were 21-3 after being asked to bat on a green pitch at the Basin Reserve with Zak Crawley, Ben Duckett and Ollie Pope all falling

cheaply in the first hour but from there, it was all downhill for the hosts as Brook and Root took over.

Brook, who has now scored four centuries in his past five Tests, batted

with all the style, certainty and confidence. His 169-ball effort was laced with some sublime strokes and moved him to 807 Test runs in total, the most after nine innings for any player in history.

On the other hand, Root, who survived a review for lbw from his first ball and then again on 31, was the perfect foil. The Root and Brook stand has left England in the perfect position to push for their seventh successive Test win and a series triumph that would be New Zealand's first home defeat in six years.

UNION BERLIN UPSET AJAX IN UEFA EUROPA LEAGUE

Robin Knoche stepped up and kept his cool from the spot after beating Ajax goalkeeper Geronimo Rulli with the assistance of the inside post, a Xinhua report said. Ajax had to wait until the 40th minute to create danger in front of



the target, but for all that, Mohammed Kudus pulled wide from five meters with all time and space. The Dutch visitors could have opened their scoring three minutes later, but Kudus' equalizer was flagged offside.

At the other end of the pitch, Josip Juranovic's curl shot caught Rulli flat-footed, making it 2-0 just before the

break. Ajax came out with its guns blazing after the restart and halved the deficit early in the second half when Kudus latched onto Steven Bergwijn's cross in the 47th minute.

Union remained unimpressed, though and restored its two-goal lead three minutes later through Dutchman Daniilho Doekhi, who hammered Juranovic's whipped corner to the back post into the roof of the net from close range. Ajax's resistance was broken, whereas Union's Seraldo Becker left two presentable chances unused in the closing stages. Frustrated, Ajax had to complete the match with ten men as Edson Alvarez received his marching orders for unsportsmanlike conduct in the dying minutes of the game.

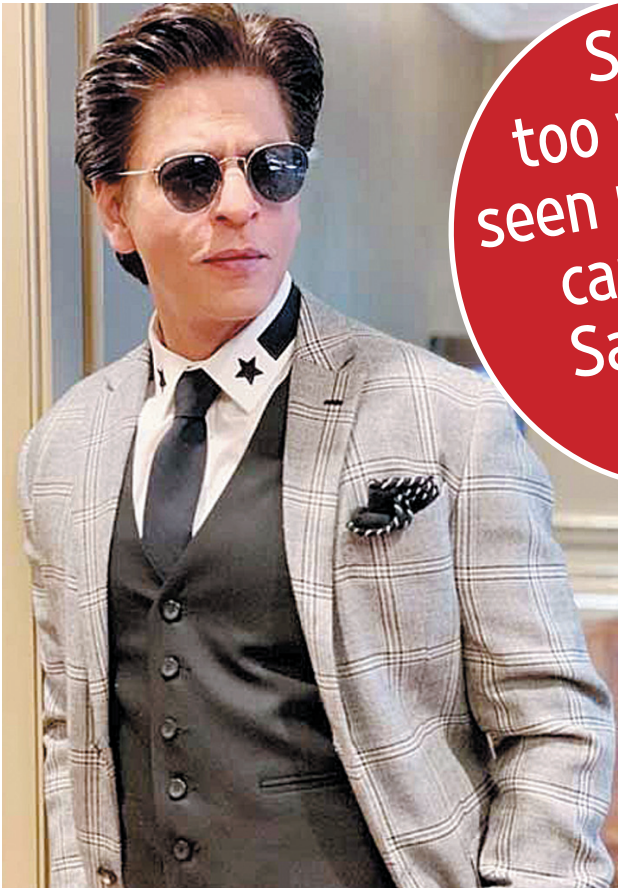
Top seed at the Rio Open, the 19-year-old is bidding to become the first repeat Rio champion in the tourna-

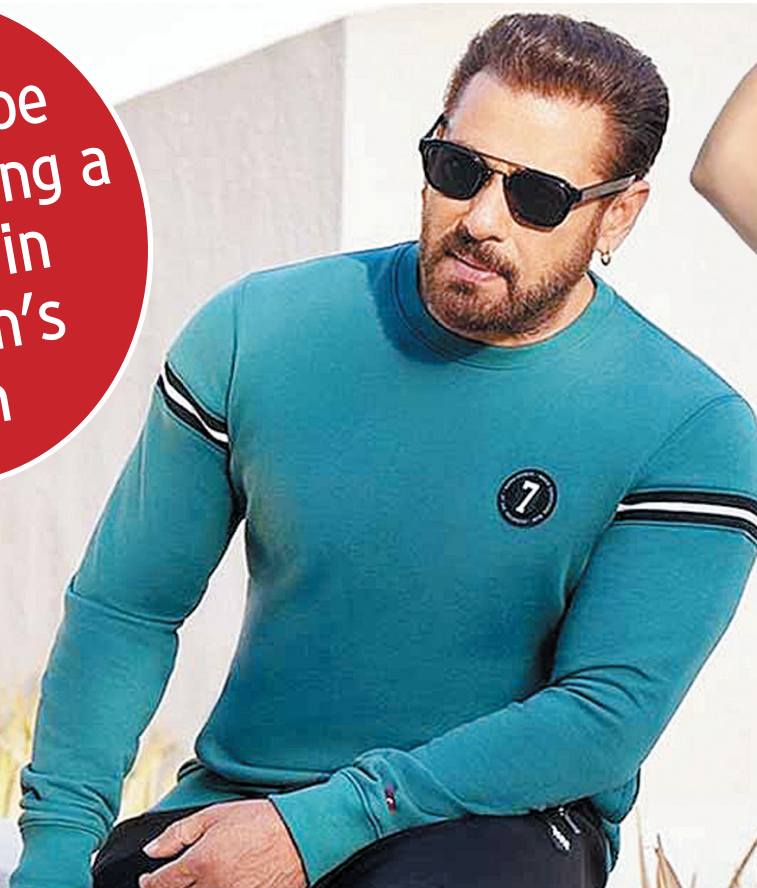
Fognini, who won all five of his break points, was seeking his first win in his past 14 attempts against Top 10 opponents.

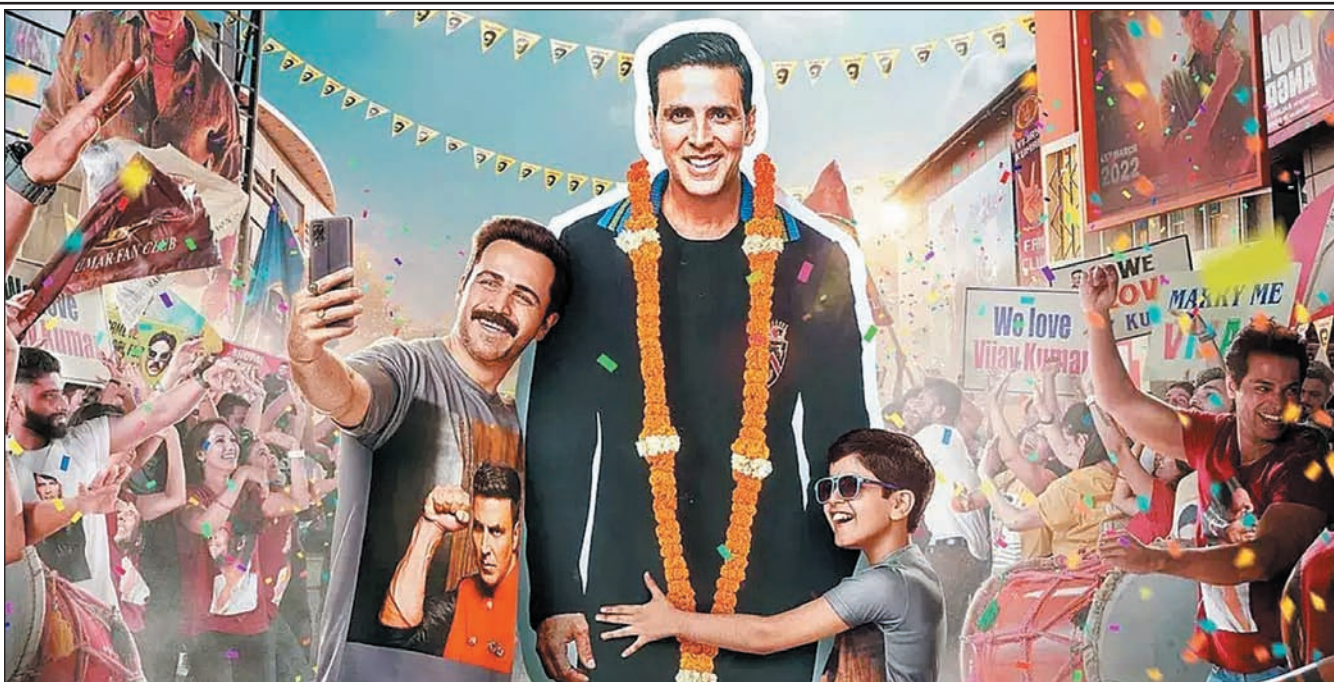

Synopsis : Vijay Kumar, the Bollywood celebrity, has to get a fresh driver's license from an RTO official. Unfortunately, a misunderstanding causes a battle of words between the two, which finally escalates into a quarrel in front of the entire country.

Review : The film opens with the introduction of Akshay Kumar's character as a megastar. Later in the film, the audience is introduced to Omprakash (Emraan), an RTO officer and devoted fan of superstar Vijay. The film takes a terrible turn when a miscommunication between Vijay and Om leads to a sequence of occurrences that become national news.

The film opens with a lighter tone and contains several laugh-out-loud moments. The first half of the film is a pleasant watch and makes you feel like it was a good idea to see it in a theater, but the second half of the film makes you reconsider your decisions. The scriptwriter has turned the second half of the movie into an extraneous gyaan that no one wants.

The film has several unnecessary episodes that do not contribute to the plot. For exam-



ple, people imitating journalists on TV have grown tedious.

To my surprise, Akshay's persona is not rude; instead, he is a kind star who adores his followers. The strangeness of the scenario is entirely due to misunderstanding.

When it comes to character portrayals, Diana Penty brings glamour. She portrays Akshay's wife and has little to do with the plot. Her appearance on the screen is entirely avoidable.

When it comes to Akshay Kumar, poor script choices are taking their toll. Another flick, another bad decision. Akshay appears to need to spend some time analyzing the script before working on it.

Emraan's character in the film is pretty well written, and seeing him on screen after such a long time is a welcome sight. Despite the slow pace of the plot, Emraan shines. Nushratt deserves special mention since she excels throughout the film. Her dialogue

delivery is spot-on, and it makes you chuckle. Abhimanyu Singh adds to the hilarity and makes the viewing experience enjoyable.

When it comes to background music and songs, while they aren't very memorable, they are tolerable. In terms of technicality, the script needs tighter editing. The film's second half is just 'BAD.'

Conclusion : You better take a selfie with your phone and watch it instead of paying for movie tickets to see this film.
