INDIA NEEDS 30 MN DIGITALLY SKILLED PROFESSIONALS BY 2026, SAYS REPORT

THE WORK FORCE

Currently, India has about 500 million people of working age, and industry data suggests that only 49 per cent of total youth (age group of 22-25 years) in the country is employable, according to employment services provider TeamLease. According to the World Economic Forum, investing in upskilling could boost India's economy by \$570 billion by creating 2.3 million new jobs by 2030, the report said.

“Our own survey have indicated that 75 per cent of companies face a skill gap in the industry. Even among people, who can stay in their current jobs, 40 per cent of fundamental abilities are likely to change and thus re-aligning the skill strategy will be crucial for companies.”

India will need 30 million digitally skilled professionals by 2026, and about 50 per cent of the current workforce would require to re-skill themselves in areas of emerging technologies, a new report said on Friday. Moreover, the report suggests that developing a skills matrix, conducting skill audits to target specific learning journeys and intermingling upskilling within the company culture; a comprehensive skill development strategy will lead to a more sustainable future of work. The proposed suggestion



also includes having an effective outcome-focused learning approach with structured impact evaluation metrics.

“Over 2 million jobs in AI, Cyber Security, and blockchain are expected to remain unfilled in 2023. Additionally, the workplace is evolving so rapidly that 76 per cent of the global work-

force is not equipped with the requisite skills to function in the new digitally focused workplaces,” mentioned Chakraborty. “The long-term goal of all skill development programs must focus on the creation of a future-ready and future-proof workforce for that is the only way we can tackle the fluctuations in the world of work and infuse a sense of greater stability. The adoption of sustainable skill development thereby creating a healthy talent pipeline in any country is the only way to address the vagaries of talent inequity.”

The Herbal Way

Extracts from 2 wild plants can block Covid-19 virus. In laboratory dish tests, extracts from the flowers of tall goldenrod (*Solidago altissima*) and the rhizomes of the eagle fern (*Pteridium aquilinum*) each blocked SARS-CoV-2 from entering human cells. The active compounds are only present in minuscule quantities in the plants.

Two common wild plants contain extracts that inhibit the ability of the virus that causes Covid-19 to infect living cells, a US study has discovered.

It would be ineffective, and potentially dangerous, for people to attempt to treat themselves with them, the researchers from Emory University in the state of Georgia stressed. In fact, the eagle fern is known to be toxic, they

warned.

Given that Covid-19 is a newly emerged disease, the researchers took a broader approach. They devised a method to rapidly test more than 1,800 extracts and 18 compounds from the Quave Natural Product Library for activity against SARS-CoV-2.

Additional experiments showed that the protective power of the plant extracts worked across four variants of SARS-CoV-2: Alpha, theta, delta and gamma.

Two rare bird species spotted in Sunderbans this winter

- Sunderbans area is scattered over North 24 Parganas and South 24 Parganas districts of West Bengal.
- Forest officials have sighted 145 different bird species in the current winter season in the Sunderbans region, out of which two were from extremely rare and almost extinct species.
- The two bird species are Lesser Sand Plover and Eurasian Curlew, said S. Justin Jones, the deputy field director of Sunderban Tiger Reserve.



The two-day bird festival which ended on Friday was conducted by the Sunderbans Tiger Reserve of West Bengal Forest Department.

Eurasian Curlew is a migratory range of bird species mainly wintering in South Asia, South Europe and Africa and Lesser Sand Plover mainly above the tree-line in the Himalayas and occasionally in the coastal plains of north-eastern Siberia.

Jones said that while the forest department initially estimated that around 100 species of birds will be spotted in the region, the actual findings was higher than the expectation at 145.

“Of the bird species, 128 were spotted in the buffer zone, Kalas-2

region sighted the maximum number of species,” he added. Meanwhile, a state forest department official said that they are taking some steps to attract more migratory species of birds in the Sunderbans from the next winter season.

“The fact that the maximum number of species have been detected in the buffer zones is also a cause of concern. So, we have decided to start awareness campaign drive among the villagers residing near the islands favourable for the migratory species. We will make the villagers aware on how to make these islands an ideal destination for these migratory species of birds,” he said.

Indian dentist wins top literary award in Singapore



Singapore: Vrushali Junnarkar, an Indian national living in Singapore, has won the 2023 Epigram Books Fiction Prize for her debut novel on a group of Indian women learning to swim in a condominium.

Titled, The Campbell Gardens Ladies' Swimming Class, Junnarkar's unpublished work beat 56 other submissions from Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Brunei, Indonesia, and the Philippines, The Straits Times reported.

The panel of judges, which included top Malaysian actress Michelle Yeoh, selected the winner from among four finalists, whittled down from a larger pool by a group of readers.

Junnarkar, who is a dentist by profession, was not in Singapore to receive the award. Her manuscript will be published in the second half of 2023 by Epigram Books. The award was initiated to promote contemporary creative writing and reward excellence in Singapore literature. Since 2020, it has been open to writers from Southeast Asia.

2022 FIFA BEST MEN'S PLAYER



Messi, Mbappe and Benzema nominated

Geneva: Lionel Messi, Kylian Mbappe and Karim Benzema have been named as the finalists for The FIFA Best Men's Football Player Award in 2022, soccer's world governing body FIFA announced on Friday.

Messi captained Argentina to lift the FIFA World Cup trophy in Qatar last year, beating France in a dramatic final. Messi won the tournament's Golden Ball, while his Paris Saint-Germain teammate Mbappe secured the Golden Boot with eight goals. Mbappe's compatriot Benzema won last year's Ballon d'Or for winning UEFA Champions League and La Liga titles with Real Madrid but missed the World Cup due to injury, reports news agency Xinhua.

Spain's Alexia Putellas, England forward Beth Mead and Alex Morgan of the United States were nominated for the Best Women's Player Award. The winners of the best men's and women's players, the best male and female coaches, the best men's and women's goalkeepers, and the Puskas Award for the best goal of 2022, will be unveiled on February 27 in Paris.

AFGHAN WOMEN'S RIGHTS CAMPAIGNER SHORTLISTED FOR NOBEL PEACE PRIZE

When the Taliban seized power in August 2021, hundreds of women's rights activists fled Afghanistan, fearing reprisals from the militant group. But Mahbouba Seraj, one of the most prominent rights campaigners in the country, refused to leave, even though she holds a US passport, the media reported.

Despite intimidation from the Taliban, the 75-year-old has continued to advocate for the rights of women and girls and operate a network of shelters for women fleeing domestic abuse, Radio Free Europe (RFE)/Radio Liberty (RL) reported.

Seraj's work and courage were recognised when she was shortlisted for the Nobel Peace Prize earlier this month. She was nominated jointly with Narges Mohammadi, the jailed Iranian human rights activist and lawyer. The winner is expected to be announced in October.

In announcing the nominees on February 1, the Peace Research Institute Oslo said both women have shone “a spotlight on the non-violent struggle for human rights” and are “highly deserving nominees to share the prize, based on their tireless efforts to improve women's rights in Iran and Afghanistan,” RFE/RL reported.

Seraj said that winning the prize would be a



“great honour for me and for Afghanistan”.

Many Afghan women have praised Seraj for standing up to the Taliban and fighting for the rights of women and girls, RFE/RL reported.

“Women who work in these difficult circumstances inside Afghanistan deserve to be acknowledged,” Samira, a Kabul-based rights activist who did not want to reveal her full name for fear of retribution said.

Seraj has been outspoken in her criticism of the Taliban's policies on women in her appearances in international media and forums, which Kazem said has energised “resistance by women in Afghanistan and mobilised support abroad”, RFE/RL reported.

Donald Trump calls Rihanna 'nothing' ahead of Super Bowl

Former U.S. President Donald Trump has attacked Grammy-winner Rihanna, calling her “nothing” and claimed that she has “no talent.”

The 76-year-old got riled up after Texas congressman Ronny Jackson called on the NFL to remove the Barbadian songstress from the halftime show after “badmouthing America.” In his post on Truth Social account, he also pointed out that Rihanna is anti-Trump, reports aceshowbiz.com.

“Rihanna spray painted ‘F*** Donald Trump’ on a car at the Cadillac Ranch in Amarillo, Texas. She's made a career of spewing degenerate filth while badmouthing America every chance she gets,” Jackson, who is Trump's former White House doctor, wrote on Friday.

“Why is the NFL showcasing this crap? Rihanna SHOULD NOT be the half-



time performer!” Responding to Ronny's remarks, Trump wrote: “Without her ‘Stylist’ she'd be NOTHING.” He added: “Bad everything, and NO TALENT!”

Trump didn't seem to hate Rihanna that much before as his team used her song ‘Don't Stop the Music’ for a campaign rally during the mid-terms. She, however, sent a cease and desist to

prevent them from using her music in the future. She added that she wouldn't be seen at one of the “tragic rallies.”

Rihanna has been a vocal critic of the 45th POTUS. She criticised his stance on immigration, sharing a photo of herself holding a T-shirt that read “Immigrants” around the time he ordered the delay of ICE deportations.



'BEWARE OF TWIN SWORDS OF CONGRESS-LEFT', PM NARENDRA MODI TELLS TRIPURA VOTERS

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while addressing an election rally in southern Tripura on Saturday, launched a scathing attack on the Congress and the CPI-M and asked people to remain alert of the twin swords of the two parties.

In his second election rally at Udaipur in Gomati district on Saturday, Modi said that in Kerala, the Left and the Congress are fighting against each other, but in Tripura they are fighting the elections together.

"The Congress and the Left always want the poor to remain poor. They always promote 'goondas' and corruption," the Prime Minister said.

In the February 16 elections to the 60-member Tripura Assembly, the CPI-M led Left Front and the Congress are contesting under a seat sharing deal by fielding 47 and 13 nominees, respectively.

Highlighting the development of Tripura, the Prime Minister said that if people see the Agartala airport, they would realise how much development has taken place in the state under the BJP rule.

Modi also said that mobile and internet connectivity has reached all parts of Tripura and now 4G services are being expanded as well.

Urging people to cast their votes in favour of the lotus symbol to ensure prosperity for all, Modi said that during Congress and CPI-M rule, lives of people from all sections, including businessmen, were shattered.



Tripura is now supplying electricity to Bangladesh, the Prime Minister said, adding that the BJP government has provided free electricity to 3.50 lakh families while four lakh households are getting piped water.

Alleging that the CPI-M workers looted the ration of the poor people, the Prime Minister said that the Central government had provided funds, but the then Left government in the state was not sincere enough to construct pucca houses for the poor.

After the BJP government came to power in Tripura, construction of concrete houses for the poor people started, Modi said, adding that the

BJP-led government has increased the social pension of people to Rs 2,000. Highlighting his government's mission for the all-round development of the tribal people, the Prime Minister said the previous government at the Centre had allocated Rs 25,000 crore in the Budget for tribals' development, which the present government increased to Rs 1 lakh crore.

Tribals' development has been emphasised in the BJP manifesto for the Tripura elections as well, Modi said.

He added that as the BJP always thinks about tribals' welfare, in the recent Assembly elections in Gujarat,

100 per cent tribal reserve seats were won by his party.

In Tripura, natural rubber cultivation areas are being expanded by the Rubber Board so that rubber industries can be set up in the state to meet the huge demand for natural rubber in the country, the Prime Minister said. Earlier on Saturday, Modi had addressed his first election rally at Ambassa, the headquarters of Dhalai district. BJP sources said that the Prime Minister is likely to address another election rally in Agartala on Monday (February 13), a day before the end of the campaign for the February 16 Assembly polls.

L-G has no right to overturn decisions of CM, cabinet of elected govt: Manish Sisodia

After Delhi Lieutenant Governor V. K. Saxena on Saturday removed Aam Aadmi Party spokesperson Jasmine Shah and AAP MP ND Gupta's son, Naveen ND Gupta from the position of 'Government Nominees' on the Board of Private DISCOMS, Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia slammed the Governor for "illegally overturning" a decision of the elected government.

Sisodia said, "The L-G has once again defied the Constitution and the Supreme Court and illegally overturned a decision of the elected government of Delhi. The L-G illegally exercised the power of 'difference of opinion' and overturned the decision of the cabinet of the Delhi Government regarding the appointment of professional directors in power DISCOMS four years ago. The L-G has no right to overturn the decisions of the Chief Minister and the cabinet of the elected government."

He said that L-G can use the 'difference of opinion' power only in special circumstances, but keeping all rules and regulations aside, the L-G is using it to overturn every decision of the government. The L-G believes that the orders of the Supreme Court do not apply to him. The L-G should understand that he is a resident of India only and has been appointed as per the Constitution; he will have to obey the constitution and also obey the orders of the Supreme Court, Sisodia said.

While addressing a press briefing, he said, "Ever since L-G has joined his office, he has ensured to pass an order every day that is 'unconstitutional' and against a Supreme Court's judgements. With each order that he passes, he aims to prove that he does not follow the Constitution and that the Supreme Court orders do not apply to him. To do the same, he overturned an order of the elected



Government today, which was previously passed by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and his Cabinet four years ago. This is despite the fact that the L-G has no right to overturn the order passed by the Chief Minister and the cabinet of the state government."

Defining the procedure for application of 'difference of opinion', he highlighted that it is written in the laws that if L-G has a different opinion on any matter decided by the concerned Minister, the L-G must call the Minister and discuss the matter and ask him to discuss the same within the Cabinet. Then if the Cabinet is also not ready to change its decision, L-G can write to the Centre that there is a 'difference of opinion' between the government and the L-G. Before following this procedure, he does not have the power to mention a 'difference of opinion' in any case. He is implementing his orders illegally by threatening the officials, and not following the Constitution and Supreme Court judgements."

"I would like to request the L-G that he must follow the Constitution and the judgements of the Supreme Court. All the rulings of the Supreme Court apply to him as well and he must follow the procedures. It is not wrong to appoint professionals on the boards; this is clearly mentioned in the laws. There must be professionals on every board," he said.

Cong, JD(S) supporters of Tipu, K'taka safe only under BJP: Amit Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday launched a scathing attack on the Congress and the JD(S), stating that both the opposition parties in Karnataka are supporters of Tipu Sultan (erstwhile ruler of Mysuru).

Shah, who is also the Union Co-operation Minister, was addressing a large gathering after inaugurating the golden jubilee celebrations of Central Arecanut and Cocoa Marketing and Processing Co-operative Limited (Campko) at Puttur in Dakshina Kannada district.

"You must decide whether you should vote for the JD(S) and the Congress which are supporters of Tipu Sultan, or your votes should go to the believers of Rani Abbakka (local queen who fought the Portuguese)," he said.

Shah said that only the BJP can work for the development of Karnataka, something the



JD(S) or the Congress can never do.

"The Congress had released 1,700 workers of the Popular Front of India (PFI), while Prime Minister Narendra Modi has banned the outfit. Congress' appeasement policies have damaged national integration and security," Shah stated.

He added that only the BJP under the able leadership of Prime Minister Modi can keep the state safe.

Kerala govt faces quandary as trans-father who delivered baby wants to be named father

The Kerala government will have to make a tough call on the request from a transgender couple, who has been blessed with a baby recently, and have now asked the hospital authorities to consider the trans father who delivered the child as the father in the birth records.

On Wednesday, 23-year-old Sahad wrote "himself" into record books by becoming the country's first transman to have become a father when "he" delivered a boy at the state run Medical College hospital at Kozhikode. Sahad and 21-year-old Ziya Paval are a transgender couple in Kozhikode and for several months were gearing up to embrace parent-



hood after Sahad, a trans man, halted his transitioning process to get pregnant. The couple have now

approached the hospital authorities with the request that Sahad be recorded as the father and Ziya as the moth-

er in the birth records of their newly-born baby. The hospital authorities will forward the requests to the state government who will have to take the call. Sahad is an accountant by profession, while Ziya is a dance teacher. They both have undergone hormone therapy as part of their transitioning process. Incidentally it was after long discussions and deliberations, the couple, who have been living together for the past three years, decided to go for a child.

Sahad decided to become a man after the baby is delivered, and that process began when 'her' breasts were removed some time back and after the delivery, they are sourcing breast milk from the breast milk bank attached to the hospital.

2019 JAMIA VIOLENCE: JUDGE RECUSES HIMSELF FOR 'PERSONAL REASONS'

Delhi court judge has recused himself from hearing a matter related to 2019 Jamia Nagar violence case citing "personal reasons".

"Due to personal reasons, the undersigned hereby recuses from hearing the matter. Accordingly, let the present matter be put up before the principal district and sessions judge, southeast district, Saket court, for February 13 at 12 pm with a request to transfer the matter," said Additional Sessions Judge Arul Verma, who had recently discharged 11 accused, including Sharjeel Imam and Asif Iqbal Tanha, in the same case.

The accused in the present case include Meeran Haider, Ashu Khan, Qasim Usmani, Mohammad Hassan, Mohd Jamal, Mohd Sahil Muddassar,



Faheem Hasme, Sameer Ahmad, Mohd Umar, Mohd Adil, Roohul Ameer, Chandan Kumar, and Saqib Khan.

On February 4, when ASJ Verma had discharged 11 accused, he had pulled up the police, saying that they were unable to apprehend the actual perpetrators behind the commission

of the offence, but surely managed to rope in these 11 accused as 'scapegoats'. The violence had erupted after a clash between the police and people protesting against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) in December 2019. The ASJ had said that the protesters were surely there in large numbers and it cannot be denied that

some anti-social elements within the crowd created an environment of disruption. However, the moot question remains as to whether the accused persons herein were even prima facie complicit in taking part in that mayhem, he had asked.

"The answer is an unequivocal 'no'. Marshalling the facts as brought forth from a perusal of the charge sheet and three supplementary charge sheets, this court cannot but arrive at the conclusion that the police were unable to apprehend the actual perpetrators behind the commission of the offence, but surely managed to rope in the persons herein as scapegoats," he had said.

He had said that to allow the persons charge-sheeted to undergo the rigmarole of a long-drawn trial does not augur well for the criminal justice system of our country.

Three arrested for carrying 'fake' RBI documents at Delhi Airport

Three passengers have been arrested for carrying "fake" RBI documents at Delhi Airport, an official said on Saturday.

"During security check at domestic terminal of the IGI airport at 6.20 p.m. on Friday, some suspicious images were noticed in a hand bag and during physical check, fake RBI documents embossed with the Indian state emblem of the Lion capital of Asoka, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) logo and bond papers valued at Rs 88,000 crore," the official added.



Rahul along with two co-passengers Abdul Irfan and Arpudharaj were supposed to travel to Chennai by another flight, said the official.

When questioned, the passengers also offered the CISF official a bribe of Rs three lakh to let them go along with the detected documents.

"Assistant Sub Inspector Hari Kishan rejected the offer,

apprehended the erring passengers and immediately informed the matter to the senior officers of CISF," said the official.

Later, the matter was informed to Income tax officials, who reached at the location and after inquiry, they were handed over to Delhi Police for further investigation, the official added.

BJYM Delhi Prez expelled, days after kidnapping of daughter

Vasu Rukhar, the Delhi President of the BJP's youth wing, was expelled from the organisation following a controversy over the alleged kidnapping of his daughter.

Delhi BJP released an official statement, saying, "In view of your behaviour and activities, Vasu Rukhar is immediately relieved of your primary membership and immediately expelled from the party."

The daughter of the Delhi President of the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) was allegedly abducted from Jhandewalan in central Delhi on Wednesday and abandoned near a temple in Maurice Nagar, police had said.

According to a BJP source, "Rukhar's wife was forced to abandon her one-and-a-half-year-old child as she was being harassed over having



three daughters".

A senior police officer said the probe revealed that the mother of the infant girl had "purposely" abandoned the child and later made the PCR call.

"We suspect that she must have done this to get rid of the girl child but we are still probing the reason behind her action," he added.

The Delhi Commission for Women had also issued a notice to the police in connection with the alleged kidnapping of Rukhar's daughter.

DDA's anti-encroachment drive continues in Mehrauli for 2nd day

For a second consecutive day, the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) on Saturday continued an anti-encroachment drive in the Mehrauli area amid protests by locals.

A large number of security personnel have been deployed on the spot with gears. Residents of the area said that the DDA had demolished two three-storeyed buildings near the Aulia Masjid at Andheria Mor along with shanties.

On Friday, several three- and four-storeyed structures that had come up illegally on the agency's land in the Aam Bagh, Brijwasi colony area of Mehrauli were demolished.

The residents claimed that they were not given any prior notice by the agency.

A joint team of DDA officials on Friday had bulldozed an illegal structure in the



Ghousiya slum colony and then demolished shanties near a local mosque.

The DDA also demolished one building and partially removed others in Brijwasi

Colony and C-block.

These areas are located close to the Mehrauli Archaeological Park. Some of the land here belongs to DDA, while few

other stretches on which buildings and shanties have come up over the last decade are owned by the Archaeological Survey of India and the Waqf Board.

Heads of 2 youths tonsured for misbehaving with woman, 7 held in K'taka

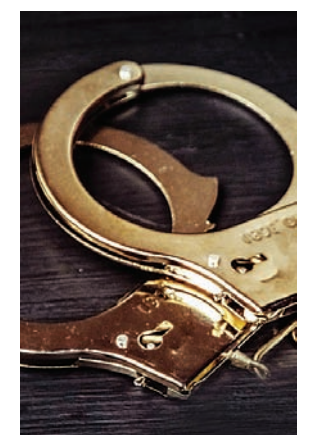

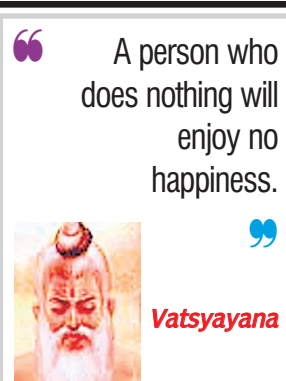
The woman had complained about the misbehaviour of the youths from her place to her parents and family. The elders of the community called the youths who misbehaved with the woman to their village from Mumbai.

ANTARCTIC SEA ICE FALLS TO RECORD LOW: STUDY

- ❑ The sea ice of the Southern Ocean had shrunk to a new record minimum of 2.2 million square km by early February, the study found on Friday.
- ❑ This year, the ice is receding even more quickly than in the previous record year of 2022. According to the study, the sea ice in the Antarctic is expected to continue to melt during the second half of February, Xinhua news agency reported.
- ❑ One possible reason for the strong melting of the ice cover was the above-average warm air temperatures in the western and eastern parts of the Antarctic Peninsula, which were around 1.5 degrees Celsius above the long-term average, according to AWI.



changed at all in the 35 years before," Christian Haas, head of the Sea Ice Physics Section at AWI, said in a statement. "It is still unclear whether what we are seeing is the beginning of a rapid end to summer sea ice in the Antarctic, or if it is merely the beginning of a new phase characterised by low but still stable sea ice cover in the summer," Haas added. The crew of the research vessel Polarstern reports "almost ice-free conditions" in their current research area, the Bellingshausen Sea.

Historical records also show "tremendous changes" in sea ice conditions, the AWI added. In 1899, the Belgian research vessel Belgica was stuck for more than a year in massive pack ice in exactly the same area where Polarstern can now operate completely free of ice. PAK FOREIGN MINISTRY DATA ALLEGEDLY HACKED BY INDIAN HACKERS, CLAIMS REPORT

In what appears to be the latest in a series of cyber attacks, Indian hackers have reportedly managed to extract data from Pakistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) office, Samaa TV reported. The hackers gained unauthorised access to the ministry's systems and were able to extract a significant amount of data. Based on a LinkedIn post shared by Zaki Khalid, an intelligence analyst, there has been a potential data leak of Pakistan's MoFA, Samaa TV reported. The Sidewinder group, allegedly based out of India, has released sample datasets of a total of 7.5 TB that is believed to have been breached through the ministry's systems, the report said. The leaked files also



include WhatsApp conversations between the members of the Pakistan Consulate in Barcelona. The authenticity of the data samples has not been confirmed, but Zaki Khalid suggested that the matter warrants a thorough technical audit of MoFA's systems and networks, including the likelihood of certain officers' smartphones being compromised. The sample datasets

have been released on one of the group's Telegram channels. The timing of this potential data leak is notable, as India's Ministry of External Affairs was recently reported to have faced a similar breach by an unidentified hacker. This breach could be a tit-for-tat response, which may have been perceived as originating from Pakistan, said Zaki Khalid, Samaa TV reported.

Mob breaks into police station, lynches man accused of blasphemy

Nankana Sahib: A 35-year-old man, who was arrested on blasphemy charges, was lynched on Saturday in Pakistan Punjab's Nankana Sahib district after a mob broke into the police station where the victim was being held, media reports said. According to reports, the victim was accused of desecrating the Holy Quran while the locals claimed he was involved in 'witchcraft', The Express Tribune reported. Following the accusation, he was handed over to the local police. However, a mob later gathered at the police station soon after news of the incident spread in the area, the report said. The mob demanded the police to hand over the accused.

Govt can't act as robber of citizens' land: Karnataka HC

In a setback to the ruling BJP, the Karnataka High Court on Saturday stated that the government can't act as "a robber of citizens' land". A bench headed by Justice Krishna S. Dixit made these observations while partly allowing the petition filed by M.V. Guruprasad, Nandini M. Guruprasad and residents of J.P. Nagar locality of Bengaluru. The court also objected to the conduct of Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board (KIADB) and its officers fell short of the fairness standard expected from them as it took severe objection to the fact of non-payment of



compensation to land owners even 15 years after acquisition of their lands for setting up industries in 2007. It maintained that the conduct of KIADB reinforces the shackles of a feudalistic attitude from which the transformative character of our Constitution seeks to liberate. The petitioners filed a peti-

tion in 2016, questioning the land acquisition and non-payment of compensation by KIADB. In return, the government agency had filed its statement in this regard making a casual intimation to the court that there is delay in payment of compensation, and it would be made soon.

REGULATORS ARE EXPERTS IN THEIR DOMAIN: FM ON ADANI ROW

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday said that regulators in India are quite experienced and experts in their domain. She said this when asked to react to Supreme Court's observation on the Hindenburg-Adani group controversy. The Supreme Court on Friday heard a petition seeking its intervention in the Adani row. Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, while hearing the matter on Friday, said that "Do we intervene and have a mechanism to ensure this doesn't happen again? We do not want to get into policy matters. That is for the government." Reacting further on issue, the finance minister said that "regulators are always on their toes, and not just now. So I will leave it there." "You are obviously not expecting me to tell you what I would tell in the court," the finance minister said further. The finance minister said this while addressing a press conference after the customary post-budget address to RBI's board.



Freedom of speech neither in parliament, nor outside: Mallikarjun Kharge

Hitting out at the BJP-led government at the Centre, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Saturday alleged there was no freedom of speech in the country. Addressing a rally in Jharkhand's Sahebganj district, Kharge expressed anguish, claiming that parts of his speech in Parliament were expunged. "There is neither freedom of speech inside Parliament, nor outside. If someone speaks the truth, writes about it, shows it then they (BJP) send him or her behind the bars," he alleged while speaking at Gumani Ground in Pakur after launching the party's 60-day 'Haath Se Haath Jodo' mass outreach



programme in the state. BJP state president Deepak Prakash, however, termed the Congress' programme as "drama." Kharge said, "I did not use any unparliamentary word or language to describe the prime minister... Atal Bihari Vajpayee had used the same expression for former PM PV

Narasimha Rao and the BJP used it for former PM Manmohan Singh." "BJP induces many MLAs who face ED, IT, CBI cases... Prime Minister Modi and Amit Shah have bought a washing machine in which they wash the blemishes of such MLAs who then come out clean," he said.

SUSPECTED AL QAEDA TERRORIST ARRESTED IN BENGALURU

A suspected terrorist with links to Al Qaeda has been arrested on Saturday from Thanisandra in Bengaluru in a joint operation by central probe agency and Internal Security Division (ISD). The arrested, identified as Arif, was acting as per instructions of the terror outfit, according to police. The police suspected that Arif has links with Al Qaeda since past two years and carried out operations from his residence. The accused, who works in a software company in Bengaluru and had taken the work from home option, got in touch with the terror outfit through social media. Sources said the accused was active on Telegram and darknet and spreading messages of the terror outfit. The authorities stated that he was preparing to reach Syria through Iraq in March. He was also planning to reach Afghanistan if not able to go to Syria. The authorities are grilling him at an undisclosed location.



INDIGENOUS AIRCRAFT ALH MK III TO PARTICIPATE IN AERO INDIA

indigenous technology demonstrator fighter (lead in for the Twin Engine Deck Based Fighter) onboard the indigenous aircraft carrier INS Vikrant. The aircraft was flown by an Indian naval test pilot. This niche capability is the result of the Indian Navy's long term vision of AatmaNirbharBharat. Officials said that during Aero India 2023, the Indian Navy will be participating in a number of activities. The indigenous aircraft, ALH Mk III and MR aircraft P8I would participate in the fly past and static display respectively during the event.

DCGI SENDS NOTICE TO E-PHARMACIES FOR SELLING DRUGS WITHOUT LICENCE

New Delhi: The Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) has issued a showcause notice to online pharmacies, seeking an explanation on why action should not be taken against them for selling and distributing drugs in contravention of provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940. The notice was issued to online pharmacies including -- Tata 1mg, Amazon, and Flipkart on Friday. "The office has received various representations from time to time raising concerns regarding the sale of drugs through online, the internet or other electronic platforms, including various mobile applications, in contravention to the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 & Rules there under," the DCGI notice to the e-pharmacies read. "Such sale includes drugs specified in Schedule H, H1 and X which are only allowed to be sold under a valid prescription of a registered medical practitioner and supplied under the supervision of a registered pharmacist," the notice read. "In this regard, it may be mentioned that import, manufacture for sale or for distribution, or sale, or stock or exhibit or offer for sale or distribution of any drug are regulated under the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 & Drugs Rules 1945 made there," it stated. The DCGI in the notice further said that for sale, or stock or exhibit or offer for sale or distribution of any drug, a license is required to be obtained from the concerned state licensing authority and conditions of license are required to be complied by the licensee. "There are cases in various courts in this regard requesting to prohibit the online sale of drugs," it said.



At 41,075, number of inmates in Maharashtra jails exceeds capacity

- ❑ The statistical report for the period ending December 2021 has indicated a steady excess occupancy in jails over years. The combined capacity of 60 jails in the state is 24,722.
- ❑ The number of inmates in 18 out of the total of 60 jails in the state is double or more than twice the capacity as on January 31, 2023, it said.
- ❑ These jails include Mumbai Central Jail (446% occupancy rate), Thane Central Jail (389%), and Buldhana District Jail (387%) among others.

The number of inmates in 60 jails in Maharashtra stood at 41,075 as on January 31, 2023, while the total capacity is 24,722, as per the Prison Department statistics. At 5,966, Yerawada Central Jail in Pune had the highest number of inmates as of December 31, 2021, followed by Thane Central Jail at 4,471, Mumbai Central Jail at 3,424, and Talaja Jail at 2,819. The report stated the jail occupancy in the state was 136.19% in 2017, 148.93% in 2018, 152.72% in 2019, 128.70% in 2020 and 148.80 in 2021. In 2021, Maharashtra stood

seventh in the country in terms of occupancy rate. The average number of inmates in the total 60 jails in 2021 was 34,818, of which 96% were men and 4% were women. As on January 31, 2023, the number of inmates in all jails was 41,075 of which 39,504 were men, 1,556 were women, and 15 were trans-genders. Of them, 7,949 were convicts, 32,917 undertrials, and 209 detainees. There were also a total of 606 foreign inmates in the jails, it said. During 2021-22, the factory industry in jails earned Rs 11.10 crore and Rs 2.36 crore through agricultural produce.



MAHARASHTRA ORDERS SIT PROBE INTO SCRIBE'S 'KILLING', CONGRESS DEMANDS JUDICIAL PROBE

Under flak from various quarters for the "killing" of a Ratnagiri journalist Shashikant Warishe, the Maharashtra government will on Saturday set up a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe the case.

Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, who holds the home portfolio, ordered the police to form the SIT and investigate Warishe's killing even as the Opposition Congress demanded a judicial probe panel.

Fadnavis has directed the police department to set up the SIT headed by a senior officer and conduct the investigations into the case which has grabbed national attention.

On the other hand, Congress Chief Spokesperson Atul Londhe has sought an inquiry commission headed by a sitting or retired Bombay High Court judge to carry out the case probe, plus the report must be handed over to the court and not the state government. "It must be noted that Fadnavis had in the past declared that



the Barsu refinery complex (originally due to come up at Nanar) will come up no matter what and nothing can stop it..." Londhe pointed out, demanding the judicial probe to ascertain Warishe's killing and a possible conspiracy behind it.

On Monday, Warishe, 46, was knocked down and dragged on his bike by a SUV allegedly driven by a

local realty agent, Pandharinath Amberkar, 42.

While the scribe succumbed to his serious injuries on Tuesday, following a massive hue and cry, Amberkar was arrested and charged with murder, as the incident reverberated nationally.

Major media organisations, rights and social groups, NGOs, and almost all major political parties like

Congress, Nationalist Congress Party, Shiv Sena (UBT), CPI, and others have rallied together to condemn Warishe's killing, and unravel the plot behind it.

Warishe had run a series of articles opposing the Barsu refinery-cum-chemicals complex - billed as the world's biggest - coming up at a cost of Rs 3.50 lakh-crore, with foreign collaboration in Ratnagiri.

Earlier, following protests by locals, the erstwhile Maha Vikas Aghadi government had scrapped the Nanar location and the next regime has finalised Barsu as its new location, which is also facing huge opposition.

Warishe had been running a campaign against the upcoming refinery and petrochemicals complex coming up in the region, while Amberkar was a supporter of the mega-project.

Journalists and other organisations took out silent protest marches in Mumbai on Friday and in Rajapur on Saturday demanding justice for Warishe's family and ensuring stringent punishment to the prime accused Amberkar.

Searches in Mumbai, Bengaluru against suspects linked to ISIS, Al-Qaeda

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Saturday carried out searches at multiple locations in Mumbai and Bengaluru against some suspects having links with global terror outfit ISIS and Al-Qaeda, sources said.

The raids are learnt to have links with the case related to the conspiracy hatched by the accused to spread terror activities of the Islamic State (IS), a banned terrorist organisation, and to endanger the unity, security, and sovereignty of the country.

During the searches, digital devices and incriminating documents were seized from the houses of the suspects, said sources, adding that some of the suspects have been picked up for questioning.

Last month, the NIA also carried out searches at six locations across Karnataka,



and arrested two persons in connection with the Shivamogga Islamic State conspiracy case. The searches were conducted at Dakshina Kannada, Shivamogga, Davangere, and Bengaluru.

The arrested persons were identified as Reshaan Thajuddin Sheikh from Varamballi in Brahmavar, Udipi, and Huzair Farhan Baig from Shivamogga in Karnataka. The investigations in the case revealed that one Maaz Muneer radicalised his close associate and college

mate Reshaan Thajuddin, and both the accused persons had received funds from their ISIS handler through crypto-wallets. As a part of their larger violent and disruptionist designs, they also indulged in arson and targeting of vehicles and other establishments, such as liquor shops, godowns, and power transformers, the probe agency had said earlier. He case was initially registered on September 19, 2022, at Shivamogga Rural Police Station, but was later re-registered by the NIA on November 15, 2022.

PM to inaugurate 246 km section of Delhi-Mumbai Expressway

First completed section of the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway, Delhi-Dausa-Lalsot, will be dedicated to the nation by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on February 12.

The 246 km Delhi-Dausa-Lalsot section of the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway has been developed at a cost of more than Rs 12,150 crore. The operationalisation of this section will reduce the travel time from Delhi to Jaipur from 5 hours to around 3.5 hours and provide a major boost to economic development of the entire region.

Delhi-Mumbai Expressway will be India's longest expressway with length of 1,386 km. It will



reduce travel distance between Delhi and Mumbai by 12 per cent from 1,424 km to 1,242 km and travel time by 50 per cent from 24 hours to 12 hours. It will pass through six states of Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat and Maharashtra and connect major cities like Kota, Indore, Jaipur, Bhopal, Vadodara and Surat.

The Expressway will also serve 93 PM Gati Shakti

Economic Nodes, 13 ports, eight major airports and eight multi-modal logistics parks (MMLPs) along with spurs to new upcoming greenfield airports such as Jewar Airport, Navi Mumbai Airport and JNPT port. The Expressway will have a catalytic impact in the developmental trajectory of all adjoining regions, thus contributing in a major way in the economic transformation of the country.

MAN ACQUITTED 6 YEARS AFTER WIFE COMMITTED SUICIDE ALLEGING HARASSMENT

Thane: A couple and their son have been acquitted in an abetment of suicide case in Maharashtra's Thane district.

Laxmi, the wife of Yakasami Pyarala (28), ended her life on January 16, 2017 allegedly due to harassment at her marital home in Kalwa, including threats of dire consequences if she gave birth to a girl child, as per the prosecution.

Pyarala, father Mastan Narsinha and mother Mangalamma, were charged with abetting the suicide of Laxmi and other offences, including criminal intimidation.

In her order of February 1, the details of which were made available on Saturday, Sessions Judge Rachna R Tehra acquitted the three saying the prosecution had failed to prove the charges.



Gold teeth help Mumbai cops arrest fugitive missing for 15 years

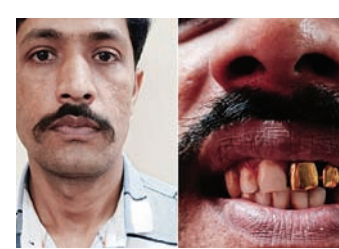

Mumbai Police on Saturday arrested 38-year-old Pravin Ashubha Jadeja, missing for 15 years, with two gold-plated teeth in his mouth posing as an LIC agent.

He worked as a salesman in a clothing store & duped a shop owner of Rs 40,000 in 2007.

The accused has changed his identity and shifted to Kutch in Gujarat to avoid being caught. "He has been identified as Pravin Ashubha Jadeja aka Pravin Singh aka Pradeep Singh Ashubha Jadeja," a police official said.

"The accused was charged with cheating and misleading the police. Although after a few days of arrest, the accused got



bail from the court. Later, after the hearing, the accused absconded from Mumbai and didn't appear in court again. Hence the court declared him a fugitive," the police official said. "Pravin used to work as a salesman in a cloth shop in 2007. His owner once asked him to collect Rs 40,000 from another merchant. Instead of giving the money to his owner, Pravin misled the police and the owner by telling them that someone has stolen his bag full of money from

the toilet," the police official added.

After the investigation, it was revealed that Pravin kept the money with himself and misled the police, the Mumbai police said in a statement.

"The accused was arrested but he absconded after getting bail from the court." Talking about their latest search for the accused, Mumbai police said, "A few days ago, the search investigation was resumed by the police in which they interrogated the former associates of the accused and came to know that Pravin is hiding in Sabhravi village of Mandvi Taluka in Kachchh District of Gujarat. The police acted as LIC agents and called Pravin to Mumbai. After confirmation, the accused was arrested."

No charge sheet against Eknath Khadse till March: Bombay HC

The Bombay High Court on Friday directed the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) of Pune police not to file its charge sheet against former Maharashtra revenue minister and Nationalist Congress Party's (NCP) Eknath Khadse in connection with a 2016 Pune land deal case till March.

A division bench of Justice Revati Mohite Dere and Justice P K Chavan gave directions while hearing Khadse's petition

claiming that the ACB had in April 2018 filed a closure report in the case, saying that no substance was found in allegations against him.

However, after the change in government in the state in June 2022, the anti-graft agency sought to reopen the matter. Khadse faced allegations that he misused his power as a minister and purchased land in Pune's Bhosari area, owned by MIDC, in the name of his wife and son-in-law for Rs 3.75 crore against the market price of Rs 40 crore.



WOMAN ARRESTED FOR OPERATING SEX RACKET

Mumbai: A 24-year-old woman was arrested for allegedly running a sex racket in Thane, a police official said on Saturday.

The woman is a resident of Andheri in Mumbai and she has been charged under the Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, the Kalwa police station official said.

She was held on Thursday from Kalwa Naka after a tip off about the flesh trade was confirmed by a decoy customer, he added.

Man stabbed to death over Rs 500 payment to repair phone

A 25-year-old man was stabbed to death allegedly by two brothers over non-payment of Rs 500 to get a damaged mobile phone repaired, at suburban Bandra, police said on Friday.

The incident took place on Thursday night below a foot-over bridge of Bandra railway station and the man was identified as Nazim Iftikar Khan, an official said, adding the two accused were known to him and were later arrested by the police.

According to the official, Khan and the two accused resided at Garib Nagar in Bandra (East). Khan's

mobile phone was damaged by one of the accused persons, for which he demanded Rs 1,000 from him to get it repaired.

The duo gave Rs 500 to Khan's wife and assured the remaining money will be paid before 12 am. However, Khan demanded the remaining amount on the spot, which led to a scuffle between them, he said.

During fighting over the pending payment, one of the accused pulled out a knife and stabbed Khan in his chest, leaving him seriously injured, the official said.

The victim was rushed to a hospital where he was declared dead before admission, he said.

SHIV SENA (UBT) LEADER ARRESTED FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT: POLICE

Mumbai: Thane police have arrested Naresh Manera of Shiv Sena's Uddhava faction for allegedly sexually assaulting a woman, officials said on Saturday.

"Naresh Manera was arrested by Thane's Kasarvadavali police. He was produced before the court on Saturday," an official familiar with the matter said. "A First Information Report under Indian Penal Code (IPC) section 354 (assault or criminal force to a woman with intent to outrage her modesty) and others has been lodged against Manera in Kasarvadavali police station," police said. More details are awaited.

Maha Congress hits choppy waters, but it's likely to sail through unscathed

In its 138-year long chequered history, the Congress is no stranger to political upheavals or crises, especially in Maharashtra -- where it was born in December 1885.

For the past month, the state unit has once again run into another such rough weather with many prophets of doom darkly predicting it's the end game for the grand old party.

Curiously, the Congress lands itself in some or the other mess around elections -- whether Parliamentary, Assembly, biennials or bypolls -- pushing it to the brink, much to the glee of political detractors, both within and outside.

The latest unrest brewed up ahead of the crucial All India Congress Committee (AICC) Session coming up in Raipur (February 26/27), where a decision is likely to be taken to conduct organisational polls at the state-level, including Pradesh Congress Committee chiefs.

It was in the run-up to the recent biennial MLC polls that resulted in the latest intra-party fracas that erupted into an open war of words between state Congress President Nana Patole and Congress Legislature Party (CLP) leader Balasaheb Thorat.

The latest point of friction was the Nashik MLC seat in which certain machinations saw the official Congress nominee Sudhir Tambe dropping off at the last-minute in favour of his son Satyajet Tambe, who happens to be Thorat's nephew.

Amid allegations hurled from all sides, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) promptly 'threw its doors open' to welcome anybody willing to switch sides, as many had done in the past.

State Congress Vice-President Ratnakar Mahajan, however, says that



the developments regarding the Patole-Thorat fracas are "unfortunate and avoidable" -- especially when the party is bracing for two major elections in 2024 -- Lok Sabha and state Assembly, besides other civic polls.

Brushing aside apprehensions that the party is again tottering in the bastion state -- where it has ruled 52 years directly, indirectly or with allies and 'avatars' -- a veteran general secretary said that the Congress is poised to make "another comeback" after the Bharat Jodo Yatra (BJY).

"Is it the first time? The Congress has been tackling such delicate situations for over a century, starting with the rebellion of Lokmanya Tilak (1906). But after each internal onslaught, the party has emerged stronger... It will pass through this sticky patch soon," he countered the prophets of doom.

This time while the Maha Vikas Aghadi ally Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) has kept aloof, the Shiv Sena (UBT) peeped inside and aired its views publicly, virtually blaming Patole even for the fall of the MVA government in June 2022.

Viewing it as an affront, Congress Chief Spokesperson Atul Londhe hit back to defend Patole, the party and its policies, while advising Sena (UBT) to follow the 'alliance-dharma' and not poke its nose into others' affairs. At the grassroots level, Mumbai Congress' North Indian Cell Vice-President V.P. Singh feels that given the present state political scenario, senior leaders must shed their egos, iron out differences through indoor negotiations, ensure that the ordinary workers are not demoralised and the party can encash the BJD goodwill.

A central leader dismissed comparisons of the current ongoings with Sharad Pawar's thunderous exit from Congress in 1999, and feels that the possibility of Thorat or Tambe joining the BJP appear 'miniscule'.

On Sunday, AICC In-Charge of Maharashtra H.K. Patil is reaching Mumbai to douse the political fire before it spreads further or scalds the state Congress and MVA.

Most senior leaders at the state and central level are optimistic that an amicable settlement will emerge after Patil's visit and the Raipur AICC Session, and the resilient party will be battle-ready once again -- as in the past 138 years.

12 Cheetahs from South Africa likely to arrive on Feb 18: Official

A second batch of 12 cheetahs is expected to arrive in Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park (KNP) from South Africa on February 18, six months after eight of the spotted cats were released into the reserve, a senior forest official said on Saturday.

According to current plans, 12 more cheetahs are being brought to KNP on February 18, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (wildlife) J S Chouhan told a News Agency.

He said the felines will be flown from South Africa to Gwalior before being transported to Kuno. The official said he was unaware of the number of male and female cheetahs in the batch of 12.

The cheetahs will be kept under one-month quarantine as per the norms, he said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had released the first batch of eight cheetahs - five females and three males -



from Namibia into a quarantine enclosure at KNP on his 72nd birthday on September 17. The first batch of cheetahs is currently in hunting enclosures at the park before their full release into the wild.

Cheetahs are being reintroduced nearly seven decades after the species became extinct in India. The last cheetah died in the country in 1947 in the Korea district in present-day Chhattisgarh, and the species was declared

extinct from India in 1952.

In January, India and South Africa signed a Memorandum of Understanding on the reintroduction of cheetahs in the Asian country. As per the MoU, an initial batch of 12 cheetahs will be flown from South Africa to India.

An official of KNP had earlier said that the park has set up 10 quarantine "bomas" (enclosures) for the new guests.

MINOR GIRL RAPED, MURDERED IN SHIVPURI

Shivpuri: A six-year-old girl was allegedly raped and murdered in Madhya Pradesh's Shivpuri district, police said on Saturday.

The incident took place in Badora village under Karera police station limits on Friday night. Police station in-charge Satish Chouhan said the girl's mother had taken her to a temple where a religious programme was underway.

The girl got separated and her mother thought she must have returned home. But when she was found to be missing, a police complaint was filed. Her body was found behind the village's government school on Saturday morning with a piece of cloth stuffed into her mouth. A case of rape and relevant offences under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO) was registered and probe is on, the official said.

Projection of Kamal Nath as Cong's CM face dampens Yatra-time bonhomie

Though the Congress united like never before for Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Yatra, an undercurrent of tension has gripped the party's Madhya Pradesh unit over the projection of Kamal Nath as the chief ministerial candidate.

While the party succeeded in putting up a united front when passing through the Hindi heartland, the issue of the next Chief Minister's appointment created a lot of strain within.

Voices of dissent erupted after hoardings depicting state President Kamal Nath as the future Chief Minister were put up in the state on the occasion of New Year.

Former state President and former union minister Arun Yadav said that since Nath is the state president, the appointment of the CM would be the decision of the MLAs and the party chief. Ajay Singh -- the former Opposition leader -- also backed Yadav's statement.

Earlier, while Nath was being called the "future chief minister", he is now being referred to as the "inevitable CM".

The ruling party in the state has been attacking Nath constantly. Taking a jibe at Nath, Chief Minister



Shivraj Singh Chouhan said that while the "future CM" Nath says something, his IT Cell has an entirely different story to tell. A state of uneasiness prevails within the Congress.

Political analysts believe that unity in the party was apparent during the Bharat Jodo Yatra. They also say that factionalism within the party had majorly reduced when Nath became the state President in 2018.

However, tension has resurfaced regarding the CM's appointment and is clearly visible. Significantly, the Congress

formed government after winning in the 2018 Assembly elections, but the Nath-led government in the state collapsed after MLAs, including Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia switched sides.

The Legislative Assembly elections are to be held this year, and both the major national parties are engaged in making efforts to win the same.

Since the ongoing tussle within the party is taking place at a time when former CM Digvijaya Singh is less active in the state, it is difficult to predict what might be in store for the Congress.

IND vs AUS 1st Cricket Test Match

INDIA THRASHES AUSTRALIA BY INNINGS AND 132 RUNS

India capitalised on the fear of spin in the minds of the Australian batters on a spin-friendly wicket, to bowl them out for 91, their lowest total in India and second lowest ever, winning the first Test by an innings and 132 run defeat in the first Test at the Vidarbha Cricket Association Stadium.

India thus took a 1-0 lead in the four-match Border-Gavaskar Trophy series, setting them for the 3-0 win they need to comfortably seal their berth in the World Test Championships Final to be held later this year at the Oval in London.

Ravichandran Ashwin bowled a devastating spell of 12 overs to claim 5 wickets for 37 runs as India bowled out Australia within a session after Ravindra Jadeja, Axar Patel and Mohammed had helped the hosts reach 400 runs in their first innings, adding some quick runs in the morning session, giving India a lead of 223 runs.

However, Ravindra Jadeja was the star of India's memorable win as he shone both with the ball and bat to single-handedly put Australia under pressure. Jadeja, making a comeback from a knee injury after a five-month



break, claimed 5-47 in their first innings and then scored 70 runs, sharing crucial partnerships of 61 runs with skipper Rohit Sharma, who scored a majestic 120, and 84 runs for the eighth wicket with Axar Patel (84) as India handed Australia a comprehensive defeat.

India had added 79 runs in the morning session to set Australia the target of scoring a minimum of 224 runs to make them bat again. But the Australians, who were out for 177 in their first innings, fared even poorly in the second session as they succumbed too easily with their batters coming up with a spineless performance.

Australia were bowled out in less than a session, their innings lasting

32.3 overs and lasted just 131 minutes. Ashwin, who claimed his 450th wicket in the first innings, recorded his 31st five-for as the Australian batters failed to read his bowling and went back to the pavilion in a procession.

Ravindra Jadeja, who had claimed 5-47 in the first innings, bagged 2 for 34 while Mohammed Shami claimed 3-13 from five overs as he wiped out the tail. Brief scores: Australia 177 & 91 all out in 32.3 overs (Steve Smith 25 not out; R Ashwin 5-37, R Jadeja 2-34, M Shami 2-13) lost to India 400 all out in 139.3 overs (Rohit Sharma 120, Ravindra Jadeja 70, Axar Patel 84, Mohd Shami 37; Todd Murphy 7-124, Cummins 2-78) by innings and 132 runs.

JUGGLING THREE TOP-CLASS SPINNERS IS CHALLENGING: ROHIT

Nagpur | Test skippers all over the world may envy him for having the services of Ravichandran Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja and Axar Patel, especially when playing in India, but captain Rohit Sharma said handling the three spinners is a headache, albeit a pleasant one, and nag him all the time as they want to bowl all the time and are aware of approaching milestones.

"Yeah, it's a little tough, honestly, because they are all reaching their milestones. Jaddu was telling me he's 249 wickets. He's been telling me all day that Ashwin has four wickets. He's closer to five wickets. He's saying I want to bowl. But again, all three guys are quite quality spinners, I mean, so you know. Whichever end is more helpful; all three spinners want to bowl from that end, that's obvious." Rohit said.

Captain Chamari Athapaththu led from the front with a wonderful 68 from 50 balls, her nation's highest-ever individual score at the showpiece tournament.

Having set South Africa 130 to win, Athapaththu's spinners took control with guile and discipline to secure a first T20I victory over the Proteas since 2016. Now joined by 17-year-old Vishmi Gunaratne, Athapaththu didn't take a backward step and took De Klerk for five boundaries in nine balls. Vishmi took time to settle but matched her skipper's stroke play, lap-sweeping Mlaba to the rope and then hacking Shabnim Ismail for three fours in an over on her return to the attack. Athapaththu and Vishmi put on 86 for the sec-



ond wicket, Sri Lanka's highest partnership for any wicket at the T20 World Cup, but they departed abruptly in successive balls. Vishmi took a single to short cover that wasn't there, run out by Tazmin Brits for 35, before Athapaththu perished to long leg for a superb 68 to leave her side on 114 for three.

Ismail yorked Nilakshi de Silva in the penulti-

mate over to slow Sri Lanka right down and Marizanne Kapp conceded only five from the last as South Africa were set 130 to win.

Left-arm spinner Sugandika Kumari struck when Anneke Bosch dragged on, leaving South Africa in disarray at 72 for five. Proteas captain Sune Luus was left standing amid the wreckage and as the required rate climbed north of 10; she launched Ranasinghe over the long-on boundary. Two balls later De Klerk tried the same but could only find the grasp of that fielder De Silva again, the hosts with it all to do at 95 for six.

Bayern's Nagelsmann puzzling over tactics ahead of Paris duel

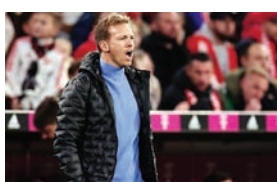

The message behind seems apparent: Bayern is working fully concentrated on how to beat the French giant next Tuesday evening despite the news the Paris cornerstones Kylian Mbappe and Lionel Messi might miss

the first leg due to injury. Bayern coach Nagelsmann is busy talking about tactical issues such as having to decide if a back-row of three might be a more promising choice than the traditional chain of four.

Considerations ground on the intention to include silverback Tomas Muller and upstart Jamal Musiala aside from spearhead Eric Maxim Choupo-Moting to the starting 11 and change the 4-2-3-1 system into a 3-1-4-1-1.

Despite many swan songs indicating the best times for the icon has passed, Muller's presence turned out to be a case of survival.

Therefore, the 33-year-old is said to cover the spot right behind former Paris player Choupo-Moting while Musiala is part of the mid-field four.
