

## 'Not concerned who belongs to BJP or Congress': SC on pleas against ED Director's extension

Team Absolute New Delhi

he Supreme Court on Tuesday orally observed that it is not concerned with the political affiliations of the petitioners, who have challenged the third extension given to ED Director S.K. Mishra and also the CVC Amendment Act

During the hearing, a bench of Justices B.R. Gavai and Vikram Nath orally observed: "We are not concerned with who belongs to Bharatiya Janata Party and who belongs to Congress.

The bench made this observation after the amicus curiae, senior advocate KV

Viswanathan submitted that his submissions will be purely on the law and he is not concerned with the politics of the petitioners or the individual cases

In the previous hearing in the matter on Monday, Viswanathan told the Supreme Court that the extension was illegal, citing the apex court's decisions in Vineet Narain & others v. Union of India and Common Cause v. Union of India to support his contention. He further added that the issue was not about the incumbent director at all, rather it was

about the principle. On Tuesday, the top court was informed that Solicitor



General Tushar Mehta was not available to argue the matter. The bench expressed its discontent with unavailability of Mehta and adjourned the hearing to Thursday, while noting it had clearly stated during the last hearing that this matter would start at the time speci-

The bench added that the SG had assured that the matter would not be adjourned and this is not fair to the court.

The Centre has told the Supreme Court that the PIL challenging the extension of tenure of the Director of Enforcement Directorate (ED) Sanjay Kumar Mishra has been filed with the intention of protecting Congress leaders who are facing money laundering

Listing the petitioners Randeep Singh Surjewala, Jaya Thakur (both Congress), Saket Gokhale and Mahua Moitra (both Trinamool Congress), the affidavit said the eminent leaders of these parties are under investigation of ED.

"It is respectfully submitted that certain leaders of the aforesaid political parties are under investigation of the Directorate. The investigation is strictly going on in accordance with law which is reflected from the fact that in most of the cases, either the competent courts have taken cognizance of the offence of constitutional courts have refused to grant any relief to such leaders of the above political parties," said the affidavit, filed by the Centre in the

#### **ELECTORAL BONDS CASE NEEDS TO BE HEARD BY A CONSTITUTION BENCH!**

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Tuesday agreed to take up the petitions challenging the electoral bonds scheme on April 11 to examine whether the matter should be heard by a constitution bench.

Advocate Shadan Farasat, representing a petitioner, contended before a bench headed by Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud that the aspect in this matter deals with core of the finances of political parties and this issue requires an authoritative pronouncement. Pointing at the questions framed by him for the consideration of the court, Farasat said the court may consider this matter having been heard by a constitution bench. Senior advocate Dushyant Dave, also representing one of the petitioners, said, "we will only benefit, if it is a constitution bench. It will not harm anybody. Yes, this issue goes to the core of our democratic existence. Rs 12,000 till now and the largest party gets more than two-third".

The bench, also comprising justice P.S. Narasimha, asked the Centre's counsel, whether she is ready to argue on the aspect of referring the matter to a constitution bench. The counsel replied that the Attorney General R. Venkataramani, who was not present in the courtroom during the hearing, would have to argue whether a reference should be made to the constitution bench or not. After hearing submissions, the top court scheduled the matter for hearing on April 11, to examine whether petitions should be referred to a constitution bench.

#### Video of people feasting on chinkara meat triggers outrage in Jodhpur

purported video has gone viral on social media which shows a gazelle) hanging from a tree in Jodhpur district with around 10-12 people cooking and consuming its meat. The video has left the entire Bishnoi community enraged, sparking protests across Rajasthan.

As per officials, there were over 10 hunters who first killed the chinkara and then cut it into pieces by hanging it upside down from a tree. They then cooked the meat and consumed it. The group even filmed the entire act and shared it on social media. The clip is believed to be from a farm at

Pannesingh Nagar in Luni. The video has enraged the Bishnoi community, which is known for protecting and preserving flora and fauna in the Thar Desert region for

The Bishnoi Tiger Force has now submitted a memorandum along with 'evi-

#### bottom': Kejriwal on Delhi Budget row Team Absolute New Delhi

ddressing the ongoing Delhi assembly session over the budget row, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday said that there is a bunch of illiterate people from top to bottom".

He said, "Yesterday, the news was going on that the budget for advertisement was more than that of infrastructure. While the budget of infrastructure is Rs 20,000 crore and that of advertisement is Rs 550 crore. There is a bunch of illiterate people from top to bottom."

"Today the budget of Delhi was to be presented in the House. But the Centre put a hold on that and we couldn't present the budget today (Tuesday). This is not only a constitutional crisis, it is an attack on the constitution," CM Kejriwal said.

He said that it is against the basic structure of the Constitution that the budget of Delhi is being sent to the Centre. However, we follow this tradi tion, but for the first time such an intervention has come to the fore.

Kejriwal further said, "We had the option to go to the court on the issue but we replied their four observa-



tions. Finally, the Centre has approved the budget."

On the observation noted down by Lt Governor V.K. Saxena, Kejriwal said, "As per the constitution, LG has no such right to make any observations. The Constitution and the order of the Supreme Court say that except in three cases, the LG will approve all the files, he has no right to write on

Accusing Centre for delaying in budget approval, the CM claimed, "The officers are all scared of the

Centre. They got an order from the MHA to stop the budget file for three days. Our minister called repeatedly and then file was sent at six in the evening. What did they get...this is what made Kejriwal bow down. This was done only to satisfy the ego."

"I appeal to Prime Minister Narendra Modi that we do not need to fight. Where there is a fight in the house, state and the country, they get destroyed. If we work together we will progress," Kejriwal said in his address to the House. After the address of the

adjourned for Wednesday. Delhi now present the budget on Wednesday.Meanwhile, Delhi BJP Working President Virendra Sachdeva and Leader of Opposition Ramvir Singh Bidhuri in a joint press conference on Tuesday alleged that Kejriwal is again intentionally telling lies to defame the central government.

## H3N2 virus: How to protect children?

mid the rising number of flu infections caused by H3N2 virus, children have been particularly affected, said doctors on Tuesday.

Doctors have reported a disturbing rise in H3N2 cases among children, especially those below the age of 5 years. According to media reports, infants and preschoolers have also been admitted in ICUs in Delhi and Pune.

Classic symptoms of H3N2 infection include cough, cold, body ache, diarrhoea, vomiting and

But when "it gets complicated it can lead to ear infections, pneumonia and in severest of the cases it can even lead to severe respiratory distress requiring oxygen and ventilator at times," Dr. Saurabh

Khanna, Lead Consultant, Paediatrics & Neonatology, CK Birla Hospital, Gurugram, told

"Amongst children, those with asthma and other comorbid illnesses such as obesity, lung disease, neurological problems, and heart diseases are at an increased risk," said Dr. Amita Kaul, HOD & Senior Consultant Paediatrics, Surva Mother & Child Super Speciality Hospital, Pune.

Fever in some cases could go as high as 104-105 F, vomiting, loose motion, cough/cold and in extreme cases convulsions and drowsiness. Symptoms usually last for 5-7 days. A persistent cough can also be seen in some patients last-

ing for a longer period. 'If the cough is there for more than a week, it is advised to consult your paediatrician. Don't overuse



the counter medication for cough for children less than 6 years," Kaul

"The primary reason for the

spike is due to lowered immunity. We had far less exposure to H3N2 during the last two winters due to

Covid-19. Another reason for the

spike is the lack of adequate flu vaccination," Dr Rajesh Bharadwaj, ENT Specialist, consultant on Practo, told IANS.

Kaul said getting sufficient rest, increasing fluid intake, and diversifying their diet to include micronutrients can help children fight the

"Parents must judiciously use fever medicines, do not overuse as it can affect kidney function, practise tepid sponging in case of fever and provide children with a high protein diet. When stepping outside, it is important they avoid crowded areas and if they do they must wear a mask." Kaul said.

The doctors also advised people to get regular flu vaccines every year, use masks, wash hands regularly and stay away from crowded places which act as medium of super spread of the virus.

Minister Ma Subramanian also told media persons that Omicron continued to be the dominant variant in Covid positive cases in Tamil Nadu.

The Omicron and its sub variants have been present in the Covid samples since December 2021 since the third wave of Covid. It has been dominating the other samples like Alpha, Beta, Gamma, and Delta variants.

### **SEPARATE STATE DEMAND: MHA PANEL TO HOLD TALK WITH NAGA BODY**

he Union Home Ministryappointed panel is likely to hold talks with the Eastern Nagaland People's Organisation (ENPO), which has been demanding a separate 'Frontier Nagaland' state, on Wednesday

Top officials said that both the state and Central governments would not agree to the separate state demand and instead, various financial and administrative autonomy measures are likely to be accorded.

ENPO sources said that the 3member panel headed by MHA adviser, northeast A.K Mishra would discuss the demand with the leaders of the ENPO in Kohima on Wednesday

The ENPO and its associated organisations, in support of its separate state demand, earlier given a call to boycott the February 27 Nagaland assembly polls but subsequently withdrew the boycott call following the assurance from Union Home



Minister Amit Shah. The Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party (NDPP) and BJP alliance was voted back to power. Shah, addressing election rallies in

Nagaland, had said that all the issues of ENPO have been discussed and an agreement would be signed after the polls. "Due to the model code of con-

ment could not be signed. After the February 27 assembly polls, an agreement would be signed by the Union Home Ministry ensuring the Naga people's rights and development," he had said. "I had a meeting with them and assured them that all their problems will be solved. Be it budgetary provisions, more power to council and equitable development of the state, we will discuss everything. The Government of India will solve the problem," Shah had said.

The ENPO, the apex tribal organisation of eastern Nagaland, to press its demand had boycotted the annual Hornbill festival last year.

Claiming that the six districts --Mon, Tuensang, Kiphire, Longleng, Noklak and Shamator -- have been neglected for years, the ENPO has been demanding a separate 'Frontier Nagaland' state since 2010.

Seven tribes of eastern Nagaland, Chang, Khiamniungan, Konyak, Phom, Tikhir, Sangtam, and Yimkhiung are spread across these six

In a letter written to the Speaker on March 18, he said Parliament like any other institution is bound by the rules of natural justice contained in Articles 14 and 21 of the

"They are a guarantee against administrative arbitrariness and ensure that every person has a right to be heard in a cause with which they are concerned. Surely, you would agree that Parliament of all institutions cannot abdicate the responsibility to respect this right when it doesn't suit the ruling regime." the

He also cited Ravi Shankar Prasad's case which invoked the rule to give an explanation regarding comments made by Jyotiraditya Scindia in relation to him in Parliament.

"There are several examples available on the Lok Sabha Digital Library which show that



this right isn't restricted to responding to statements made within Parliament but extends to allegations made in the public domain as well," he said. Rahul Gandhi has insisted on speaking in the Lok Sabha as he is a member of the House. However, the BJP is demanding an apology from him but Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Tuesday said in Rajya Sabha that the question of apology does not arise.

### Excise policy case: Destruction of evidence constant practice, CBI tells Delhi court

Delhi court on Tuesday listed, for March 25, former Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia's bail matter in connection with the now-scrapped excise policy case being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Special Judge M.K. Nagpal of the Rouse Avenue Court asked the probe agency to file written submissions and relevant judgments.

During the hearing, one of Sisodia's counsel said that nothing exceptional has been stated by the CBI which would warrant continued custody.

"Nothing on record to show that Sisodia will be threatening the witnesses," counsel said, arguing Sisodia has cooperated with the CBI investigation and none of the searches have revealed any incriminating material against him.

"It goes without doubt that Manish Sisodia has deep roots in society. He has appeared every time he was called before the CBI. I am a public servant. There have been two public servants in this case, allegations far graver than mine. But they are sent without arrest," Sisodia's lawver said.

"There is no real substantial evidence of tamper-



ing with witness or threatening witnesses, etc. I request you to kindly grant me bail," counsel added. Appearing for CBI, Special Public Prosecutor D.P. Singh said: "It's not only the mobile phones, files were also destroyed."

"I am very serious that destruction of evidence was a constant practice," he added. The CBI opposed Sisodia's bail plea, saying that this will compromise and scuttle their investigation.

Sisodia on Tuesday also moved a bail plea in a court in the same case being being probed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED). The court while issuing notice to the central agency, listed the matter for the next hearing on March 25.

On March 17, the court had extended the AAP leader's ED custody in the same case till March 22. The court had, on Monday, sent Sisodia to judicial custody till April 3, in the same case by the

Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). After the CBI arrested the AAP leader on February 26, the ED also arrested him in the same case on March 9. During the last hearing in the ED case, the court was apprised by the ED that impor-

### Cattle scam: Anubrata to be lodged in Tihar jail, Trinamool says 'petty matter'

**T**ith the Rouse Avenue Courts in the national capital on Tuesday sending Trinamool Congress strongman Anubrata Mondal, the prime accused in the multi-crore cattle smuggling scam in West Bengal, to judicial custody till April 3, the once 'Tiger of Birbhum' seems to have become a 'petty matter' for his own party.

Speaking to mediapersons on the latest development, West Bengal minister Sashi Panja clearly said that the issue involving a district president of Trinamool is a "petty matter". Mondal is Trinamool's Birbhum district president.

Panja also referred to how the party had stripped former Education Minister Partha Chatetrjee of all his ministerial and party posts within a week after his arrest by the ED in connection with the multicrore teacher recruitment scam.

"Trinamool Congress had promptly taken acation against a very important member of the state Cabinet after he was arrested. In comparison to



leadership never asked anyone to indulge in corrupt practices. Even after that if charges of corruption are levelled against any person, he will have to take the responsibility for that. The party will not take the responsibility of corrupt practices," Panja

Chatetrjee, Mondal will also be removed from the chair of district president and be suspended.

Her statements came as a study in contrast to the earlier developments where unlike Chatterjee, Mondal received the full backing of his party, including from Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, since his arrest in August last year.

At a public meeting then, Banerjee had said that it is the responsibility of the party to ensure that Mondal is brought out from behind the bars with a hero's reputation.

State minister and Kolkata Mayor Firhad Hakim had described Mondal as the 'Tiger of Birbhum' and said that "once the tiger is out of the prison, all the jackals will hide".

BJP's national vice-president and Lok Sabha member Dilip Ghosh said that it is the tradition of Trinamool to distance itself from anyone after utilising him. "Let this be an eye-opener for Mondal, who should reveal all the secrets to the central

#### Honour killing: Man strangles daughter to death

In an apparent case of honour killing, a man strangled his minor daughter to death using a data cable in the presence of his

He had sent his wife to her maternal home before committing the crime. The son informed his mother about the incident and she, in turn, alerted the police. A forensic team reached the spot and launched an investigation. The police have arrested the girl's father for questioning.

Rawatpur police station in-charge Neeraj Ojha said, "Shyam Bahadur, a resident of Radha Puram, had come to know about the affair of his 16-year-old daughter Archana, and he had reprimanded her and even thrashed her on several occasions for this. He also used to quarrel with his wife Sangeeta over the issue. Due to frequent fights, Shyam Bahadur had sent Sangeeta to her maternal

home a few days ago." "On Monday evening, Shyam reached



home in an inebriated state and on seeing his daughter talking to someone on the phone, thrashed her severely. He got so angry that he strangled her with a data cable of her mobile phone in front of his son," said Ojha

"The accused, who has confessed to his crime, has been arrested from the spot itself. Along with this, sufficient evidence of murder has been collected during the investigation from the spot. The forensic team has also recovered the data cable that was used to strangle the girl to death," he added.

#### **NIA MAKES FIRST ARREST IN NGO** TERROR-FUNDING CASE

New Delhi: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested one Irfan Mehraj from Srinagar (Jammu and Kashmir) in connection with the NGO Terror funding case, an official said on Tuesday.

The arrest follows comprehensive investigations into the case registered in October 2020. "Irfan Mehraj was a close associate of Khurram Parvez and was working with his organisation, Jammu and Kashmir Coalition of Civil Societies (JKCCS). Investigation revealed that the JKCCS was funding terror activities in the valley and had also been in the propagation of a secessionist agenda in the Valley under the garb of protection of human rights," the official said.

Involvement of some Valley-based NGOs, Trusts and Societies in funding of terror-related activities were being probed in this case, the investigation agency said. Some NGOs, both registered as well as unregistered, were noticed collecting funds domestically and abroad under the cover of doing charity and various welfare activities including public health, education etc.

But some of these organisations have developed links with proscribed terrorist outfits, such as Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT), Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) etc, the official

# 3-day-old girl found in garbage from two juice cartons flung bin in Delhi's Nangloi into Rohini Jail

three-day-old girl was found lying abandoned in a 'garbage bin in Outer Delhi's Nangloi area on Tuesday morning, an official said.

According to police, a PCR call was received on Tuesday around at 10:44 a.m. regarding an abandoned child lying in a garbage bin near Nangloi Surajmal Metro Station following which a police team rushed to the spot.

"On spot, the police team found one newly-born unknown baby girl about three days old. One tag was found on her hand wherein Afarin was written and the child had been born on March 19 at 3:15 p.m," said Harendra K Singh, Deputy Commissioner of Police

The newly-born baby was immediately admitted in Sanjay Gandhi Memorial Hospital through CAT ambulance.



"A case under relevant section of the IPC has been registered at Nangloi police station and investigation was taken up. Efforts are being made to nab the accused persons," said the DCP.

Meanwhile, the Delhi

Commission for Women said that after receiving information on its 181 Women Helpline from a person regarding a child lying in a dump yard, the Commission immediately informed Delhi Police and helped in recovering

DCW Chief Swati Maliwal has also issued a notice to Delhi Police and has sought an action taken report in the matter.

The DCW has sought a copy of the FIR along with details of the accused arrested in the matter. The Commission has also sought details of the family of the child and a copy of the order passed by the Child Welfare Committee in the matter," a DCW official said.

"A three-day-old girl child has been found abandoned in a dump yard in Delhi. Fortunately, a man saw her lying there and immediately called our 181 helpline. We along with police rescued the girl and she is admitted in a hospital in Delhi. We are there with the child. The incident is extremely shocking. I have issued a notice to the police. FIR needs to be registered and the persons responsible for abandoning the girl child should be arrested," said Maliwal.

adhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivra Singh Chouhan today announced that farmers would be given a relief amount of Rs 32,000 a hectare for crops loss of over 50 percent due to hailstorm and untimely rains in the state.

CM Chouhan further said that the amount of crop insurance scheme would be given separately to the farmers. He also instructed the officials to include horticulture crops in the survey as well. The Chief Minister made the remark after talking to the farmers during his visit to take stock of the crops damaged due to hailstorm in Patwari Khedi, Ghurda Madi village of Vidisha district on Tuesday.

He said, "The farmer should not have to worry. I am the Chief Minister for worrying and I will take the farmer out of all kinds of

He added that the farmers should not worry, the survey of each affected farm would be done with humane approach and generosity so that full relief could be given to the farmers. The survey work was going on in the hailstorm-affected districts across the state.

The CM instructed the officers to survey the damage in a transparent manner. The survey list would be displayed at the Panchayat Bhawan and if there were any objections, it would also be resolved, he

CM Chouhan told the farmers that compensation amount of Rs 32,000 a hectare for the crop loss of over 50 percent, Rs 37,000 on the loss of cow-buffalo, Rs 4,000 on the loss of sheep and goat, Rs 2000 for calf-heifer and Rs

100 for the loss of each chicken-hen would be given. Assistance would also be given on damage to houses.

The farmer should not worry at all, the date of recovery of the loan of the victim farmers will be extended, the interest will also be paid by the government. Loans will be provided to farmers at zero percent interest for the next crop as well, he added.

The Chief Minister further said that the date for purchase on the Minimum Support Price (MSP) would also be extended. The daughter of such families would also get married under the Mukhyamantri Kanya Vivah Yojana by providing an amount of Rs 56,000.

The team of Revenue, Agriculture and Panchayat department are surveying. It is the responsibility of the Collector and Commissioner to complete the proceedings on time so that the farmers can be given a quick relief amount, Chouhan added.

### Lawyers to protest on Mar 25 against CJ's Text material of different languages will he included in the new education nolice. order to dispose of cases pending for yrs



awyers practising in all district courts of Madhya Pradesh will stage a protest in Bhopal on March 25 demanding to withdraw the High Court order that mandatorily asks judges to dispose of at least 25 pending cases (cases that were pending for years), in three months, senior advocate and president of district bar association, Bhopal, P.C Kothari informed.

It came to light on Monday that a judge in Bhopal district court stepped out of the courtroom to ensure that the order issued by his court in connection with a case should be implemented

The judge was forced to step out because a group of lawyers were stopping their other colleagues to abstain from work. However, protesting lawyers left the place soon after the judge came out of his courtroom and asked them - 'not to do it in his court'. Meanwhile, the judge was also heard saying that - 'comply with his order'.

Such things started happening (particularly in Bhopal district court) from February 22 as the lawyers have been protesting against the order



issued by the Chief Justice of Madhya Pradesh High Court mandating judges to dispose of at least 25 pending cases (cases that were pending for years), in three months.

While talking to reporter, P.C Kothari claimed mandating for disposal of year-old pending cases has affected their clients a lot and therefore were protesting against this order since February 22. "This an administrative order issued by the reg-

istrar of MP HC on the direction of the Chief Justice. If it was an executive order, we could have appealed before the Supreme Court. Since this order was issued, we have made several appeals to HC to take its decision back. Now, we are left with no option but to abstain from work and not attend hearings in the courts. We have decided to hold a major protest in Bhopal on March 25, wherein advocates practising in all district courts of Madhya Pradesh will join us.

On the other hand, some court employees in Bhopal claimed the step taken by Chief Justice R.V. Malimath needs to be welcomed as it helps to reduce the burden of pending cases.

"It is an experimental step taken by Chief Justice R.V. Malimath. The same step was taken by Justice Malimath when he was serving as acting Chief Justice in Himachal Pradesh and the results were positive. Therefore, lawyers should work to reduce the burden of the courts. Suppose, if 1000 cases are pending before one particular court and 350 of them are disposed of in three months, then why not work on it," a court employee who supports the move said on the condition of anonymity.

## CO-INFECTION WITH 'SUPERBUG' SPIKES COVID VIRUS REPLICATION BY 15-FOLD

Researchers have identified a protein found in superbugs that enhances SARS-CoV-2 replication by 10- to 15-fold. Global data shows nearly 10 per cent of severe Covid-19 cases involve a secondary bacterial co-infection -- with Staphylococcus aureus, also known as staph A, being the most common organism responsible for co-existing infections with SARS-CoV-2. The study, published in the journal iScience, revealed that the addition of a "superbug" -- methicillinresistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) -- into the mix could make the Covid-19 outcome even more deadly. While the mystery of how and why the combination of these two pathogens contributes to the severity of the disease remained unsolved, the researchers identified a protein --*IsdA* -- found in all strains of staph A which boosts SARS-CoV-2 replication by 10- to 15-fold. The findings of this study are significant and could help inform the development of new therapeutic approaches for Covid-19 patients with bacterial co-infections. Interestingly, the study also showed that SARS-CoV-2 did not affect the bacteria's growth. This was contrary to what the researchers had initially expected. "We started with an assumption that SARS-CoV-2 and hospitalisation due to Covid-19 possibly caused patients to be more susceptible to bacterial infections which eventually resulted in worse outcomes," said Mariya Goncheva, Professor of biochemistry and microbiology at the University of Victoria. "Bacterial infections are one of the most significant complications of respiratory viral infections such as Covid-19 and Influenza A. Despite the use of antibiotics, 25 per cent of patients co-infected with SARS-CoV-2 and bacteria, die as a result. This is especially true for patients who are hospitalised, and even more so for those in intensive care units. We were interested in finding why this happens," said Goncheva, who conducted the study while at University of Western Ontario.

## Efforts to Control Gun Culture in America

There is always a fear of some major untoward happening due to the whims of a crazy person in the life of the common people, their beliefs and loyalties have been so wounded that there is no protective shield like trust between man and man. It is difficult to say who hides such an ugly and insane mind within the clean faces. America's arms race and technological race is pushing the entire human race into a corner from which it has become difficult to return. Now, along with the world, America itself is a victim of these weapons and violent

The entire humanity is moaning and suffering because of the bad culture that America has spread in the world to establish supremacy over the world and to flourish its arms business. America has talked about the New World Order, it has talked about open-



ness, it seems that the "world man" is suffocating and wants to come out of the suffocation. See the irony that America is the most powerful and secure country in the world but its citizens are the most insecure and feared citizens. There are more prisoners in the jails there than in any other country in the world. There have been many such incidents that suddenly some madman started firing at a restaurant, hotel or gathering and a large number of people were killed. In 2014, guns were used in 68 percent of the total 14,000 murder cases registered in the US. A study commissioned by the government itself revealed the fact that about 1300 children under the age of 17 are injured by guns in America every year. The US administration will have to curb not only the 'gun culture' but also the weapon culture, now it will have to change its mindset to make the world liv-

The United States has seen at close quarters the consequences of petty quarrels or unnecessary paranoia after carrying a deadly weapon, where it kills hundreds of people every year. Any sensitive society should see and understand this situation as a serious problem. It is not without reason that in America, where most families have had different types of guns; voices have started rising against this weapon culture. It was very important to raise this voice, according to the saying that sooner or later, America's eyes are open, and then a message of peace and nonviolence will go to the world with America. Certainly, it was absolutely necessary to control this culture of violence in America.

Because America is today the biggest hub of crime in the world and today it is a victim of the culture of violence it spread in the world. It is obvious that the incidents of firing there have been taking the lives of hundreds of people, which were not incidents of Islamic terrorism, and then what was it? It is a question that exposes American civilization. Is this a product of America's materialistic and violent culture? Realizing the mental trauma and other difficulties of the victims US President Joe Biden on Tuesday took a meaningful initiative towards curbing gun abuse. Under this, the 'background check' done during the sale of guns will be improved. Through this, Biden has directed the cabinet to create a better government system to support communities struggling with gun violence. It is not hidden that the kind of mental trauma and other difficulties that those who lose a loved one in unprovoked firing have to deal with.

The mentality of 'do what you want' thrives where the values of human relationships have ended, where children grow up independent in an individualistic system. In the situation of 'not in a good mood', an event is just an event, it neither gives happiness nor sorrow. In such a situation man dwarfs his infinite powers. This is a stereotypical way of expressing inner turmoil. Such people do not have a decent and non-violent way of living right. There is no recognition of time. In such people, there is no special concern for dignity, etiquette, intimacy of relations, peaceful co-existence

etc. Material comforts become the ultimate goal of life. Such isolation among American citizens is fueling deep frustration, intense resentment, and venomous vindictiveness. They become mentally ill and commit murder using dangerous and deadly guns available with them. Actually, the psychology associated with having a weapon in hand works behind firing a gun in a fit of rage on trivial matters.

Even so, much of the distortion and brutality in the nature of violence depends on the availability of weapons. Such incidents of murder usually happen because a man in a frenzy who could not control his anger or frustrations had a gun available when he was angry. Such cases are common, in which even after reaching the peak of anger and excitement in a mutual debate, two people or parties are reconciled, because they did not have weapons at the time of the dispute.

America is becoming a cultureless country - this nation is riding on physical development and weapon culture. The citizens there can keep as many arms as they want. In some places even a license for arms is not required. There are very few homes in America that do not have a gun or pistol. This weapon culture of America is connected with its birth. It has become prosperous on this weapon culture and has ruled the world. Today the same violent weapon culture is taking a heavy toll on its own.

## RUSSIA OPEN FOR NEGOTIATION: PUTIN TELLS XI ON UKRAINE PEACE PLAN

Russian President Vladimir Putin, during a meeting with his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping at the Kremlin, has said his country is "always open for a negotiation process". Putin made the remarks on Monday in response to China's "plan settle

The plan aimed to "end the Russia-Ukraine war" was released by China in February. However, the US has warned it could be a "stalling tactic", the BBC reported.

"The world should not be fooled by any tactical move by Russia, supported by China or any other country, to freeze the war on its own terms," US Secretary of State Antony Blinken was quoted as saying by the British broadcaster.

"Calling for a ceasefire that does not include the removal of Russian forces from Ukrainian territory would effectively be supporting the ratification of Russian conquest," Blinken added.

Talks between the two leaders lasted

four and a half hours on Monday, according to Russian state news agency RIA Novosti. Further formal meetings are expected to follow on Tuesday.

Xi, who called Putin his "dear friend," praised his Russian counterpart, saying the country's development had "significantly improved", CNN reported.

"Both sides exchanged in-depth views on the Ukraine issue," reported Xinhua news agency, describing the leaders' meeting as "in-depth and candid."

### OMICRON SUBVARIANT XBB.1.5 ACCOUNTS FOR OVER 90% NEW COVID CASES IN US

Los Angeles: The highly transmissible Omicron subvariant XBB.1.5 now accounts for over 90 per cent of new Covid-19 cases reported in the US, according to the latest estimates by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

XBB.1.5 was estimated to account for 90.2 per cent of all Covid-19 cases in the country in the latest week ending March 18, Xinhua news agency reported.

It was up from 88.8 per cent a week before and 86.3 per cent two weeks prior, CDC data showed. The prevalence of XBB.1.5 has kept increasing since late 2022.

The second most prevalent strain BQ.1.1 only accounted for 3.5 per cent in the latest week.

The CDC first started tracking XBB.1.5 in November 2022, when it accounted for less than 1 per cent of cases nationwide. Since then, the strain is spreading quickly in the

While XBB.1.5 is spreading easier, scientists said it does not seem to cause more severe disease.

## Low birth rates problematic for ageing EU population: Expert


The average age of the European population has gone up by 2.5 years in the past decade, according to Eurostat data published recently.

In Spain, the average age has climbed by 4.3 years, the highest rise in the EU behind Portugal (4.7 years).

However, a Spanish expert told Xinhua news agency on Monday that although half of Europeans are now over 44.4 years old, the main concern is the lack of children being born.

"We are one of the places in the world where people live longest, and this fact that we die later makes the average age go up," said Albert Esteve, director of the Center for Demographic Studies (CED) in Barcelona.

Half the population in Spain is over 45 years old (46.2 for women), according to Eurostat, but the average age is highest in Italy (48 years), followed by



"Where we're starting to see the effects is in schools with fewer pupils, and in communities where much fewer children will be born, which means many of the major effects will be noted at the bottom rather than the top of the population pyramid," Esteve said. The low birth rates driving the rise in the average age of the European population are widespread, but particularly pronounced in Southern countries such as Spain, Portugal and Italy.

S President Joe Biden has signed a bill to declassify intelligence information on the origins of the Covid pandemic, which has so far claimed more than seven million lives globally.

"Today, I am pleased to sign into law, the 'Covid-19 Origin Act of 2023'," Biden said in a statement on Monday.

"We need to get to the bottom of Covid-19's origins to help ensure we can better prevent future pandemics. In implementing this legislation, my administration will declassify and share as much of that information as possible, consistent with my constitutional authority to protect against the disclosure of information that would harm national security," he said.

Under the new legislation, Director of National Intelligence Avril Haines has 90 days to declassify all information on possible links between the Wuhan Institute of Virology and the origins of

The Wuhan Institute of Virology has been a major centre of coronavirus



research, CNBC.com reported.

The push to make public classified information on the origins of the pandemic comes after the US Energy Department, last month, concluded with "low confidence" that the Covid-19 virus leaked out of a laboratory in China.

In 2021, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) also agreed to the lab leak claim with "moderate confidence". Earlier this month, FBI director Christopher Wray told Fox News that the

pandemic likely began with a lab inci-

dent in Wuhan, China.

"The FBI has for quite some time now assessed that the origins of the pandemic are most likely a potential lab incident in Wuhan," Wray was quoted as saying. "Here you are talking about a potential leak from a Chinese government-controlled lab."

In 2021, Biden had directed the Intelligence Community to use every tool at its disposal to investigate the origin of Covid-19 in 90 days.

In the report, the intel agencies concluded that the coronavirus had not been developed as a biological weapon, but could not determine if it had infected humans as a result of contact with animals or from a laboratory accident.

It added that, without new information, intelligence agencies would not be able to offer a better judgement on whether the virus emerged via animalto-human transmission or a lab leak.

Biden in his statement said that the "work is ongoing".

"My administration will continue to review all classified information relating to Covid-19's origins, including potential links to the Wuhan Institute of Virology," ne added.

More than two years after the pandemic, the origins of Covid-19 remain unclear.

It has been a political and scientific debate with scientists and politicians globally contending that the coronavirus jumped into people from bats, or have been leaked from a laboratory.


A recent analysis conducted by international scientists found the deadly pandemic may have originated in raccoon dogs from the Wuhan market in China.

They found genetic material from racoon dogs in samples from the Huanan Seafood Wholesale Market that tested positive for Covid.

While the analysis didn't prove the racoon dogs were infected with the virus, it provides some additional data that is consistent with a possible virus spillover from animals to people.

The study was based on samples from GISAID -- an international database, however, soon after the samples disappeared from that database.

The World Health Organization has called on Beijing to release those samples.

## MAHA LOSES TEXTILE COMMISSIONERATE, Veteran bureaucrat Praveen OPPN SLAMS SHIFT FROM MUMBAI TO DELHI Pardeshi is new BNHS chief

The Centre has decided to move the 80-year-old office of Textile Commissioner, along with other key officers from Mumbai to New Delhi, by April 5, as per an official order.

This is the second major department after the autonomous 'Dattopant Thengadi National Board for Workers Education & Development (DTNBWED)', which was shifted from Nagpur to New Delhi in 2021.

The latest measure has sparked a fresh furore among the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) leaders who slammed the BJP government for the decision.

As per an order from Jayashree Sivakumar, Under Secretary, Ministry of Textiles to Textile Commissioner Mumbai Roop Rashi, the move is part of measures to "restructure the office of Textile Commissioner and Textile Committee in order to enhance effectiveness and achieve optimal use of resources".

For this, the Textile Commissioner and few key officials would be relocated to the MoT to strengthen the technical arm of the ministry, deploy/depute officers/staff from the head office to the TC and field offices.

Besides the Textile Commissioner, a Joint Textile Commissioner, two Deputy Secretaries (Director rank) and two Deputy Director level officers would be going to New Delhi as part of the restructure/merger exercise.

political party is recognised as a "national party" if it is 'recognised' in four or more states or got at least 6 per cent votes in at least four states. Else, it should win at least 2 per cent seats in the Lok Sabha from three states or have at least four MPs in the last Lok Sabha polls.

The national party status for any party comes with a host of advantages. They get a common party symbol across states, space for a party office in New Delhi, and free airtime during elections on public broadcasters.

The NCP, along with Mayawati's BSP and CPI, stood to lose their national party status after the 2014 parliamentary poll. But the Election Commission had agreed at the time to take a lenient view and decided to review their status after

two poll cycles

The national party status of NCP again came up for review before the poll commission after the 2019 general election, along with that of CPI and Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress. But the commission again decided to retain status quo in view of a string of assembly elections that were coming up.

Under the Symbols Order 1968, a party, on losing the national status, does not have the right to contest elections using a common symbol across the country. In case NCP's representation is not accepted, the party will be able to use its election symbol only in states where it is recognised as a state party.

The Election Commission had revised the rules for review of "national party" status in 2016, under which a review comes up every 10 years instead of five



#### AIR INDIA CONFIDENT ON FUNDING FOR WORLD'S BIGGEST AIRCRAFT DEAL: CEO

A ir India Ltd. is in talks with banks to help fund its recently announced record aircraft order, benefitting from the support of new owner Tata Sons Ltd., the carrier's chief executive officer said

"We have the backing of Tata Sons, so there is financing available for these aircraft," CEO Campbell Wilson said in an interview with Bloomberg News on the sidelines of the CAPA India Aviation Summit in New Delhi on Monday. "We have already made some downpayments for these aircraft from our internal funds."

Air India has placed an order of 470 aircraft from both Boeing Co. and Airbus SE, with deliveries due to start from the end of this year. Discounts are common for such large purchases.

The formerly state-run carrier will use cash, shareholder equity, and sale and leaseback of aircraft to help fund the order, Wilson said last month. With the fleet expansion, Air India is seeking to take on the likes of Emirates and Qatar Airways, which dominate lucrative routes from India to the US and



Europe through their hubs in Doha and Dubai.
Wilson didn't say which banks Air India is talking
to. India has been quicker than most other nations
to get back to pre-Covid levels of air traffic, aided by
a strong local market and growing middle class.
Domestic air traffic is expected to rise 20% to 160
million passengers in the year through March 2024,
and the nation's carriers may operate a fleet of

1,400 jets by 2030, according to Sydney-based CAPA Centre for Aviation. India plans to spend about 980 billion rupees (\$12 billion) over the next two years on airports, including new terminals and the renovation of existing facilities to meet surging demand. A lot of that growth may come from smaller cities where air travel penetration is low.

"India over the last few decades has been punching below its weight," said Subhas Menon, director general of the Association of Asia Pacific Airlines.
"The government is doing what is natural, to build up potential as an aviation hub."

Air India is preparing to integrate Vistara, a joint venture between Singapore Airlines Ltd. and Tata Group, to form a single, full-service carrier. The airline is spending \$400 million to upgrade its widebody planes, replacing all seats and in-flight entertainment systems with new products.

India's largest conglomerate Tata bought Air India for \$2.4 billion from the government in 2021. The high-profile privatization under Prime Minister Narendra Modi ended decades of attempts to sell the money-losing, debt-laden carrier, which had been kept alive on years of taxpayer bailouts.

#### Police custody of man accused of blackmailing Amruta Devendra Fadnavis extended

March 16 arrested Aniksha Anil Jaisinghani, a designer, after Amruta Fadnavis accused her of offering a bribe for intervening in a criminal case in which Anil Jaisinghani was involved, and also threatening her. Aniksha was produced before the court on Tuesday at the end of her initial remand. The court extended her custody as police said it was necessary for further probe. The father-daughter duo have been charged under Indian Penal Code sections related to criminal conspiracy and extortion and also under the Prevention of Corruption Act.

At least 17 cases are pending against Anil Jaisinghani, police had said earlier."He tried to kill me many times... this is not the first time he tried to kill me... According to the police, the accused, Dattatray Joshi, made certain references to Gadkari in the posts which were circulated on WhatsApp.

On learning about this, Gadkari's office, through Twitter, urged the cyber police to register a case.

A senior BJP leader's office representative in Nagpur later filed a complaint with the police and demanded strict action against the person who made the posts viral.

Accordingly, a case was registered under relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code and the Information Technology Act against the accused, the police added.


## MAHARASHTRA SEES 82 PER CENT INCREASE IN H3N2 CASES IN FIVE DAYS

Team Absolute Mumbai

n the last five days, Maharashtra recorded an 82 per cent rise in H3N2 cases in the state. While from January 1 to March 15, the state reported 119 H3N2 cases, the public health department's data shows the number of cases increased to 217 by March 19.

On Monday, the state's public health department released data that stated that since January 1, Maharashtra reported over 200 cases of H3N2 on March 19 (the highest number of cases since the data was made public by the state). This year, the state reported one suspected death due to H3N2, the data further revealed.

According to the doctors, there has been a significant rise in the number of cases in a week. Speaking about the rise in H3N2 cases in Mumbai, Dr Abhishek Subhash, Consultant, Internal Medicine at Bhatia Hospital, "The increase in H3N2 cases is significant for a week, though it has been going on for a month. The contributing factors are fluctuating temperature which was unusually hot in February and rain in March. This causes the influenza virus to thrive more."



Out of 10 patients around six to seven of them have flu symptoms. This amounts to almost 60 per cent of the cases. In the past 2-3 weeks many pregnant women have been coming with flu

symptoms, said Dr Subhash.

Talking about the precautionary measures, he added, "People who have the flu symptoms should wear a mask to avoid spreading it to others. People especially those who have autoimmune disorders, diabetes, heart problem, underlying lung problems especially asthmatic, COPD, chronic kidney disease and people undergoing chemotherapy, transplant patients, and pregnant women should wear masks. Elderly people and those with comorbid conditions should take the Influenza vaccination and keep their disease under control through regular checks with their physicians."

The data also revealed that 407 cases of H1N1 (swine flu) and three deaths were reported in the state this year till March 19. Interestingly, the National Centre for Communicable Disease (NCDC) data shows that Maharashtra reported 170 cases of H1N1 till February 28 and two deaths. The swine flu cases in Maharashtra increased in the month of March.

The tournament was held from March 13-19 and featured some of the best junior players from around the world.


