'TIGER STATE' EXTENDS SAFETY NET, ADDS 7000 HA OF FORESTS TO 'PROTECTED' LIST

o showcase India's tiger conservation success globally, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and chief forest officials of the states, will release the latest tiger census data, besides setting a new vision for tiger conservation during 'Amrit Kaal' and a commemorative coin during the event. Bearing the tag of 'tiger state' since 2018, Madhya Pradesh, which has the highest population of tigers (estimated up 700) as well as the highest forest covered landscape, has a crucial role like it played in the past in conservation of tigers and all other wild-animals. Principal Chief Conservator of Forests of Madhya

Pradesh, J.S. Chouhan claimed in the past 10-15 years, the state has witnessed tremendous increase in protected areas for wild animals.

"Growth of tigers in Madhya Pradesh has been remarkable in the past few years and it could happen because of the efforts of all stakeholders, especially from the administrative part. At least 7,000 hectares of land of the state forest was recovered. In other words, around 200 villages falling under dense forest zones were encroached free. It helped us to increase the protection area, prey base and core areas for wild animals at all tiger reserves and the national parks in Madhya Pradesh," he told correspondent.

He claimed that the implementation of new technology and fragmentation of forest areas have made the

tigers' lives easier in comparison to previous eras. Roads and canals are being developed and some other steps are being taken to ensure the peaceful scenario for tigers and all

other wild animals. "Various steps have been taken to maintain peace in the forest zones, for instance, a sound proof system has been implemented on Seoni-Nagpur highway. The implementation of the radio collar system has increased the monitoring level of tigers. Madhya Pradesh has established one of the biggest forces to protest wild animals, which is called State Tiger Strike Force," he added.

"See, we have to understand that around 40-45 per cent tigers ferry outside the protected areas, due to which human-wildlife conflicts have also increased. On an average 35-40

The state has been witnessina the highest mortality rate of tigers since the last few years and most of the tigers were reported to have died unnaturally. However, the officials ruled out the possibility of any organised nexus of animal poachers in the state.

As per the official claim, at present, Madhya Pradesh has around 700 tigers, highest in the country and the officials are of the view that the state will retain its - 'tiger state' tag for years to come.

tigers are dying every year in Madhya Pradesh, while the birth rate has increased up to 100 per cent. It means the protection system has increased. Chouhan told correspondent.

President Murmu takes historic sortie in Sukhoi 30 MKI fighter aircraft in Assam

resident Droupadi Murmu took a historic sortie in a Sukhoi 30 MKI fighter aircraft at the Tezpur Air Force Station in Assam on Saturday.

She is now the third President and second woman President to undertake such a sortie. As the Supreme Commander of the Indian Armed Forces, the President, who is on a three-day visit to Assam, flew for approximately 30 minutes covering the Brahmaputra and Tezpur Valley with a view of Himalayas

before returning to the Air Force Station. An official statement mentioned that the aircraft was flown by Group Captain Naveen Kumar, Commanding Officer of the 106 Squadron. The aircraft flew at a height of about 2 kilometers above sea level and at a speed of about 800 km per hour.

Later in the visitor's book, she expressed her feelings by writing a brief note.

She wrote: "It was an exhilarating experience for me to fly in the mighty Sukhoi-30 MKI fighter aircraft of the Indian Air Force. It is a matter of pride that India's defence capabilities have expanded immensely to cover all the frontiers of land, air and sea. I congratulate the Indian Air Force and the entire team of Air Force Station Tezpur for organising this sortie."The President was also briefed on the operational capabilities of the aircraft and the

Same-sex couples also faced higher intimate partner violence during Covid

Tot just opposite sex and heterosexua couples but lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) people also experienced episodes of heightened intimate partner violence during the Covid-19 pandemic, a study has shown. Nearly one in five LGBTO people reported intimate partner violence in their current romantic or sexual relationship, which increased following the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, according to the study published in the Journal of Gay and Lesbian Social Services.

"To date, most programmes on intimate partner violence focus on opposite sex and heterosexual couples," said Perry N Halkitis, dean of the Rutgers University's School of Public Health and senior study author."However, same-sex couples are different in terms of partner dynamics, and thus interventions need to address these differences," Halkitis added. The study also found those in the southern US were more likely to



report an increase in intimate partner violence frequency and that intimate partner violence was associated with greater severity of depressive symptoms.

The findings support calls for increased intimate partner violence-related resources available for and tailored to the needs of LGBTQ people, particularly during times of national crisis."Intimate partner violence interventions need to address that LGBTQ people are not monolithic in terms of many factors, including environments in which they

WHATSAPP'S NEW FEATURE TO ALLOW USERS **SHARE STATUS UPDATES TO FB STORIES**

San Francisco: Meta-owned WhatsApp is reportedly developing a new feature, which will allow users to share their status updates to Facebook stories without leaving WhatsApp. Earlier, users could share status updates to stories, but they had to go through the extra st manually sharing the update each time they posted something new, according to WABetaInfo. But now, due to this new feature, the process may be automatic for certain status updates users choose, when the option is enabled. In the Status Privacy setting on WhatsApp, users will find a new option "share my status updates across my accounts", where they can add their Facebook account, according to the report. Moreover, the report mentioned that this option will be optional and disabled by default. Users will be able to enable this option within the Status Privacy settings if they want certain status updates to be shared to Facebook stories without leaving WhatsApp. Furthermore, the report stated this feature will allow users to save time and effort when they manually share their status updates with Facebook Stories without leaving WhatsApp. Meanwhile, WhatsApp is reportedly working on a new feature called "audio chats", which will be available within conversations in a future update of the application on Android. A new waveforms icon will be added to the chat header, allowing users to initiate audio chats, plus users will see a red button for ending ongoing calls.

Why suicidal deaths spike during the full moon week

- The biomarkers for suicidality that are predictive of death by suicide during full moon, peak hour of day and peak month of the year compared to outside of those periods appear to be genes that regulate the body's own internal clock, so called 'circadian clock'.
- The effect of ambient light and body clocks in suicide needs to be studied more closely, along with how people sleep and their exposure to light.
- "Changes in light can affect vulnerable people, in conjunction with other risk factors," said the study.
- The peak of suicides from 3 to 4 p.m. could be related to stressors throughout the day as well as a decrease in light beginning to occur that day, causing a lower expression of circadian clock genes and cortisol.

For centuries, people have suspected a full moon in the sky to cause mysterious changes in people. Now, psychiatrists at Indiana University's School of Medicine in the US have found deaths by suicide increase during the full moon.

ccording to researchers, the increased light from the full moon could be what leads to the increase in suicides during that period.Ambient light plays a major role in the body's circadian rhythm, which is the natural 24-hour cycle our bodies follow to regulate when we are asleep and when we are awake.

Moonlight could be impacting people at a time when it should be darker.

The team looked at data in the state of Indiana about suicides that took place from 2012-2016. They found deaths by suicide significantly increased during the week of the full moon, with people over age 55 showing an even higher increase.

They also looked at the

time of day and months that suicides took place, finding 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. and the month of September to be peak times

for suicides. "We wanted to analyse the hypothesis that suicides are increased during the period around full moons and determine if high-risk patients should be followed more closely during those times," said study author Alexander Niculescu in a paper published in the journal Discover Mental Health. Niculescu and his team

previously developed blood biomarker tests for other mental health conditions (anxiety, depression, and post-traumatic stress disorder) and for pain.

Using blood samples previously taken by the coroner from some of the people, the team was able to see which biomarkers were present.

India march into AFC Women's Olympic Qualifiers Round 2 in style

he Indian women's team capped off their second victory in a row in a span of four days, defeating hosts Kyrgyz Republic 4-0 at the Dolen Omurzakov Stadium, here to seal qualification for Round 2 of the 2024 AFC Women's Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

Having defeated the hosts 5-0 in their first match earlier this week, India, despite being down to 10 players in the first half itself, exerted their dominance over the Kyrgyz Republic, with Sandhiya Ranganathan netting a brace, and Anju Tamang and substitute Renu scoring a goal each.

The Blue Tigresses got off to a good start, and it did not take them long to get the lead as Sandhiya scored in the 18th minute, beating two defenders before tucking her shot past the rival goalkeeper.

A few minutes later, India suffered a setback when Karthika Angamuthu was sent off for an off-the-ball challenge on Kyrgyz captain Aizhan Boronbekova.

However, that did not deter their resolve as Anju Tamang slammed it home on a half-volley, to double India's



lead in the 24th minute.

Thomas Dennerby, looking to strengthen the middle of the park after the red card, brought on holding midfielder Sangita Basfore in place of winger Soumya Guguloth, just a minute after the goal.

Anju and Sandhiya kept leading a flurry of attacks for India, coming close to scoring on a couple of occasions, but the score remained 2-0 as the teams headed inside for the breather.

India picked up where they left off in the second half, and Sandhiya soon scored her second of the night. Midfielder Indumathi Kathiresan

surged upfield on the left and sent in a low cross that Sandhiya blasted into the top corner, to make it 3-0 in India's

Kyrgyz Republic, enjoying the oneplayer advantage, were looking to stretch the Indian defence wide, a move Dennerby soon countered by bringing on speedy full-back Ranjana Chanu in place of Manisa Panna.

Another host of changes were introduced by Dennerby with 10 minutes of regulation time left, as Renu, Michel Castanha, and Dangmei Grace replaced Indumathi, Sangita, and Sandhiya.

That substitution made an instant impact as Renu headed in a corner by Dalima Chhibber, looping it over the opposition goalkeeper's head, to make

Grace looked lively on the left flank after being brought on, and made a couple of penetrating runs. On the first occasion, she cut inside from the left, tucked past two defenders, before running into a cul-de-sac. The second time, she was played in behind the Kyrgyz defence on the left flank, and looked to cut back from the goal line, but her cross lacked pace and petered out of play.

COUNTRY IS WITNESSING A REVOLUTION IN INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS: MODI

rime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said the government's work culture, vision, speed and scale has resulted in a revolution in the infrastructure projects in the country.

Without naming the earlier Congress governments, Modi said from the days of delays, now the infrastructure projects are being delivered even before time, and added that Tamil Nadu had got a good number of core sector projects.

Inaugurating and laying the foundation stone for several infrastructure projects - airport, rail and road projects - worth about Rs 5,200 crore here, Modi said the country is witnessing a revolution in infrastructure projects driven by speed and scale.

Pointing to Rs 10 lakh crore allocation in the budget for infrastructure projects, Modi said it was five times more than what was allocated in

He said prior to 2014 only 600 route railway kilometres per year



route kms per annum. In the case of airport, before 2014 there were only 74 airports and after that year - after BJP came to power at the Centre under his stewardship - the number has more than doubled to 150.

Modi said the speed and scale is not only restricted to delivery of core sector projects but also in social sec-

tor works and said the number of medical colleges in the country has gone up to 660 from 380 in 2014 and the number of AIIMS hospitals has tripled.

He said six lakh km of optic fibre cables have been laid to connect two lakh village panchayats resulting in rural India having more Internet

Adding further, Modi said his government sees infrastructure projects not merely a mixture of concrete but having human face - as it would give the economy a boost and uplift several families. Stating that the development of Tamil Nadu is a great priority for his government, Modi added that the state got an allocation of Rs 6,000crore for railway projects this year while the average amount allocated between 2009-2014 was less than Rs 900 crore per annum.

Similarly, between 2004-2014 the state had a National Highway of 800 km while post 2014, the length has gone up to nearly 2,000 km, Modi added. He also said the allocation for National Highway projects in Tamil Nadu has gone up six times to Rs 8,200 crore in 2022-23 as compared to

Continuing further, Modi said Tamil Nadu has seen several new infrastructure projects like the Defence Industrial Corridor, Mega Textile Park, Chennai-Bangalore Expressway and others furthering the

'Histories' circulated on WhatsApp: **Historians on NCERT Textbook move**

group of historians has raised concerns over the NCERT's move to delete certain topics from history books for CBSE students. În a statement on Friday, they said they were "appalled" by the NCERT's decision to delete the topics, particularly for Class 12, and called the move "a matter of deep concern".

The signatories of the statement include Romila Thapar, Jayati Gosh, Mridula Mukherjee, Apoorvanada, Irfan Habib and Upinder Singh, among others.

"Using the period of the pandemic-cumlockdowns to argue that there was a need to lighten the load of the curriculum, the NCERT initiated a contentious process of dropping topics like the history of the Mughal courts, the 2002 communal riots in Gujarat, the Emergency... from social science, history and political science textbooks of classes 6 to 12," the historians said in the statement.

"The new editions of these NCERT books have simply made the deletions the norm even when we are in a post-pandemic context in which school education has limped back to normalcy and is no longer in the online mode," they said.

"By reducing the study of history to such monolithic accounts, the ground is being



prepared for pseudo-histories, especially of a communal and casteist variety, to hold sway. In any case, such 'histories' are widely circulated today through WhatsApp and other social media applications," the historians said, alluding to an alleged attempt to insert politics in education. The NCERT has denied allegations to suppress historical facts. The top advisory body for the centre and state on school education has said it's a professional exercise meant to help students hit by the pandemic and has no ulterior political motive."As we explained last year as well, there has been a lot of learning loss due to the Covid pandemic and the students underwent a lot of trauma. To help stressed students, and as a responsibility to society and the nation, it was felt that the content load in textbooks should be reduced," Dinesh Prasad Saklani, Director of NCERT, told

aharashtra Opposition leader Ajit Pawar, who belongs to Nationalist *Congress Party, on Saturday said Electronic Voting Machines (EVM) are trustworthy and the system cannot be manipulated by a single person.

He also said political parties that lose elections often blame EVMs for their performance but they should understand that electoral defeat is the mandate of the people.

The senior NCP leader's 'clean chit' to EVMs comes days after he credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's charisma for the BJP's victory in 2014 polls and said inflation and jobs for youth are more important issues in the country than the PM's academic degree.

"I trust EVMs. A single person cannot manipulate EVMs. It's a big system and multiple checks are involved. However, the party which faces defeat in polls blames the voting machine but one should understand that the poll outcome is the mandate of the people," Ajit Pawar told reporters.

Notably, the NCP leader was responding to a



query on an editorial published in Saturday's edition of Shiv Sena (UBT) mouthpiece 'Saamana' which claimed the BJP wins elections by "hacking" EVMs and congratulated Bangladesh poll body for "doing away with EVMs and deciding to use ballot papers for the next elections". "Had EVMs been defective, opposition parties couldn't have formed governments in various states including Chattisgarh, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Punjab, Kerala, Tamil Nadu etc. A single person can't manipulate EVMs in a huge country like India. If somehow it is proved that voting machines are rigged, there will be big chaos in the coun-



ICICI-Videocon loan fraud case: CBI chargesheets against Kochhar, Dhoot

he Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has filed a charge sheet against former ICICI Bank MD and chairman Chanda Kochhar, her husband Deepak Kochhar and Videocon Group Chairman Venugopal Dhoot in connection with the ICICI-Videocon loan case.

As of now, the court has not taken cognisance of

The case was first registered on 22.1.2019 against Videocon International Electronics Limited Videocon Industries Limited, Venugopal Nandlal Dhoot, Chanda Kochhar, Deepak Virendra Kochhar, NuPower Renewables Limited, Supreme Energy Private Limited and Unknown public servants under sections 120-B read with 420 IPC and Section 7 read with section 13(2) read with 13(1)(d) of the PC Act.

On August 26, 2009, a Sanctioning Committee headed by Chanda Kochhar, MD sanctioned Rupee Term Loan of Rs 300 crore to Videocon International Electronics Limited (VIEL) in contravention of rules and policies of the bank in criminal conspiracies with the co-accused persons dishonestly by abusing her official position as public ser-



The loan was disbursed on September 7, 2009 and on very next date September 8, 2009, Dhoot, (MD Videocon Group) transferred Rs 64 crore to NRL managed by Deepak Kochhar from Videocon Industries Limited through his company Supreme

Energy Pvt. Ltd. (SEPL).

NRL was incorporated on December 24, 2008. Dhoot and his relative Saurabh Dhoot resigned from the directorship of NRL on January 15,2009. Before resigning. V N Dhoot allotted 1997500 warrants (convertible into equity) to Deepak Kochhar.

On June 5, 2009 shares of NRL held by V N Dhoot and Deepak Kochhar were transferred to Supreme

Energy Private Limited (SEPL). SEPL was incorporated on July 3, 2008 with its directors as V.N. Dhoot and his associate Vasant

Dhoot resigned from the directorship of SEPL on January 15, 2009 by transferring his shares to Pinnacle Energy Trust managed by Deepak

Between June 2009 and October 2011, ICICI Bank sanctioned Rupee Term Loan of Rs 1875 crore to six companies of Videocon Group for the purpose of enabling them to repay the unsecured loan availed by these companies from Videocon

Industries Limited. All these loans were sanctioned after Chanda Kochhar took over the charge of ICICI Bank as MD & CEO. Of the six loans, Chanda Kochhar was one of the

committee members in two loans i.e. RTL of Rs 300 crore to VIEL and RTL of Rs 750 crore to VIL

INDIA TO WITNESS RISE IN TEMPERATURE IN NEXT 5 DAYS: WEATHER OFFICE

ost parts of the country are likely to witness a gradual rise in temperature by 2 to 4 degrees Celsius over the next five days, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said today.

"Gradual rise in maximum temperature by 2-4 degrees Celsius over most parts of the country during next 5 days," the IMD said in its advisory.

The weather office has also predicted thunderstorms and strong winds over Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh during the next two days.



'Thunderstorms with gusty winds likely over Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh during next 2 days and decrease thereafter," the advisory said.

Earlier this month, the weather department had said that several parts of country, barring parts of northwest and peninsular region, are expected to experience above-normal maximum temperatures from April to June.

"A significantly higher number of heatwave days are predicted over parts of Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Odisha, West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Punjab and Haryana," IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mahapatra said.

Climate change is increasing global temperatures and worsening the frequency and intensity of extreme weather events.

India logged its hottest February this year since record-keeping began in 1901, according to the IMD. However, above-normal rainfall due to seven western disturbances, including five strong ones, kept temperatures in check in March.

The prolonged spell of pre-monsoon rain, thunderstorms, hailstorms and lightning strikes damaged crops in many parts of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and other

'Govt Has Given Itself Absolute Power': Editors **Guild 'Deeply Disturbed' by IT Amendment Rules**

The Editors Guild of India has noted that it is deeply disturbed by the new IT Amendment Rules which have been notified by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology on April 6, 2023. These amendments, the Editors Guild says, will have deeply adverse implications for press freedom in the country. The new Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Amendment Rules, 2023, deal with information online and the government's powers to take them down.

ditors Guild says in its statement released on April 7 that through the new Rules, the Union government has given itself the power to constitute a "fact checking unit", which will have sweeping powers to determine what is "fake or false or misleading", with respect to "any business of the Central Government", and with instructions to 'intermediaries' (including social media intermediaries, Internet Service Providers, and other service providers), to not host such content.

The statement is signed by president Seema Mustafa, general secretary Anant Nath, and treasurer

"In effect, the government has given itself absolute power to deternine what is fake or not, in respect of its own work, and order take down. The so called 'fact checking unit' can be constituted by the Ministry, by a simple "notification published in the



Official Gazette"," the statement says. The note observes that there is no mention of what the governing mechanism for such a fact checking unit will be. Nor does it have provisions for judicial oversight, the right to appeal, or how it proposes to adhere

to the guidelines laid down by the

Supreme Court of India in Shreya

Singhal v Union of India case, with

respect to the taking down of content or the blocking of social media handles. "All this is against principles of natural justice, and akin to censorship," the Guild says.

The statement also co calls "surprising" the fact that the Ministry notified this amendment "without any meaningful consultation that it had promised" after it with-

drew the earlier draft amendments it had put out in January 2023.

These proposals, on which The Wire too had reported, had given sweeping powers to the Press Information Bureau (PIB), in a move that was criticised by media organisations across the country, including the Editors Guild.

"At the outset, determination of fake news cannot be in the sole hands of the government and will result in the censorship of the press," the Guild had said in January this year, following the release of the proposal.

As early as 2020, the website Newslaundry had highlighted several instances in which the PIB's factchecking unit had not actually been on the side of facts, but instead stuck to the government's line.

"The Ministry's notification of such draconian rules is therefore regrettable The Guild again urges the Ministry to withdraw this notification and conduct consultations with media organisations and press bod-

The committee was asked to give the report in two months.

India records over 6,000 new Covid cases for second straight day

New Delhi: India today recorded 6,155 fresh COVID-19 infections, while the number of active cases increased to 31,194, according to Union health ministry data.

India's COVID-19 tally now stands at 4.47 crore (4,47,51,259). The death count climbed to 5,30,954 with 11 deaths, including two reconciled by Kerala, the data updated at 8 am stated.At 31,194, the active cases comprise 0.07 per cent of the total infections. The national COVID-19 recovery rate stands at 98.74 per cent, according to the health ministry website. The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,41,89,111, while the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.19 per cent.

According to the ministry's website, 220.66 crore doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been administered so far under the nationwide vaccination drive.

Ukraine minister to visit India on April 9, likely to seek humanitarian aid

"India shares warm and friendly relations and multifaceted cooperation with Ukraine. Over the last 30 years of establishing diplomatic relations, bilateral cooperation between the two countries has made significant progress in the areas of trade, education, culture and defence. The visit will be an occasion to further mutual understanding and interests," an official statement said.

Scientists find rare earth elements reserve in Andhra Pradesh: Report

cientists at the CSIR-National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI) in Hyderabad have found the presence of Light Rare Earth Elements (REE), key components in many electronic devices and various industrial applications, including medical technology, aerospace and defence, in Ananthapur district of Andhra Pradesh.The Light Rare Earth Element minerals include Lanthanum, Cerium, Praseodymium, Neodymium, Yttrium, Hafnium, Tantalum, Niobium, Zirconium, and Scandium."We found strong anomalous (enriched) Light Rare Earth Elements (La, Ce, Pr, Nd, Y, Nb and Ta) in whole rock analy-



ses, confirming the minerals hosting these REE," senior principal scientist in NGRI PV Sunder Raju told Press Trust of India.

Rare earth elements (REE) are 15 elements referred to as the

lanthanide and Actinide series in the periodic table of elements, together with scandium and yttrium.REEs are key components in many electronic devices we use daily (like cell phones) and variincluding medical technology, clean energy, aerospace, automotive and defence.

He said manufacturing permanent magnets is the largest and most important end use for REEs.Permanent magnets are essential to modern electronics used in cell phones, televisions, computers, automobiles, wind turbines, jet aircraft and many other products. Because of their luminescent and catalytic properties, REEs are widely used in high technology and "green" products."To reach net zero, Europe will require up to 26 times the amount of rare earth metals in 2050 compared to present demand. Demand is also increasing because of digitalisation," he said. The discovery of the REEs

Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR-India) under a project called SHORE (Shallow subsurface imaging Of India for Resource Exploration).

Sunder Raju said the scientists had a multi-disciplinary

approach to the SHORE project. "Under this project umbrella, our focussed objective was 'Detailed understanding of RM (Rare Metals)-REE metallogeny, assessment of resources and identifying economically potential sites, especially from the carbonatite-syenite complexes of Andhra Pradesh'," he said.

Following the discovery of the REEs, deep drilling for more than at least one km will ascertain the consistency of REE presence in depth, he added.

AFTER ROW, SHARAD PAWAR 'CLARIFIES' ON JPC PROBE REMARKS, BATS FOR SC PANEL

A day after his sensational remarks expressing doubts over a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) probe into the Hindenburg Research report against the Adani Group, Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) President Sharad Pawar on Saturday claimed that he was in favour of a Supreme Court-monitored investigation.

he senior leader also frowned at the manner in which the names of industrialists like Ambani-Adani were being tossed around to target the BJP government at the Centre instead of bigger issues like inflation, unemployment and

Clarifying his stance after the ruckus following his comments to a TV channel on Friday, Pawar said he was not opposed to the JPC probe, but if the Committee comprises 21 members, then 15 would be from the ruling side and the remaining six from

In view of the imbalance, coupled with the government's majority in both Houses of Parliament, the NCP supremo opined that the JPC report would only "endorse the government's stand on the Adani

"I feel that instead of a JPC, a Supreme Courtappointed commission is more reliable and independent," said Pawar, adding that he had no knowl-



edge of the Rs 20,000-crore raised by Congress leader Rahul Gandhi.

He also attempted to delink the question of a united Opposition front vis-a-vis the demand for a JPC and said the two are not connected though his utterances sent shockwaves among the Opposition

"I don't think the demand for JPC has anything to do with Opposition unity. We have also made the same plea but it would be commanded by the ruling party, so I spoke about a SC-named panel," declared Pawar.

Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut said in Mumbai that "there's nothing new in what Pawar has said", and his statement would have no impact on the Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance in the state as speculated in some sections of the media.

The Congress has yet to respond in the matter after Pawar's interview to a news channel questioning the demand for a JPC probe, the credence to be given to a report by a foreign institution.

BOOKIE ACCUSED OF BLACKMAILING AMRUTA FADNAVIS ARRI

he Enforcement Directorate has arrested suspected bookie Anil Jaisinghani in a money laundering case linked to an under probe Indian Premier League (IPL) 'betting racket', officials said Saturday.

Jaisinghani and his daughter Aniksha were recently arrested by the Mumbai Police for allegedly hatching a conspiracy to bribe and blackmail Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis's wife Amruta Fadnavis and using private messages, purportedly hers, to extort money from her when she refused to save Jaisinghani (Anil) from several FIRs lodged against him.

The Ahmedabad office of the ED took his custody on Friday approaching a Mumbai court with a production warrant and seeking his custody under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

The ED was acting upon an open non-bailable warrant issued in the past against Jaisinghani by an



with the 2015 money laundering case linked to alleged betting in the IPL matches being probed by

the federal agency. The agency is understood to be recording

Jaisinghani's statement in this case having obtained his custody on Friday.

Jaisinghani was recently also taken into custody by the Madhya Pradesh Police in a case of alleged bootlegging. The father-daughter pair is alleged to have hatched a conspiracy as part of which Aniksha developed friendly relations with Amruta Fadnavis and then requested her to "save her father from the several criminal cases pending against him as the husband of the complainant (Amruta Fadnavis) is a public servant." Aniksha tried to offer a bribe of Rs 1 crore to Amruta Fadnavis.

The Malabar Hill Police Station in south Mumbai on February 20 registered an FIR against Anil Jaisinghani and Aniksha for allegedly threatening to make public certain audio and video clips that purportedly show Amruta Fadnavis accepting favours

Aniksha, who was arrested on March 17, was granted bail in the case on March 27 by the court. Anil Jaisinghani, who was arrested by the

Mumbai Police from Gujarat, is currently in judicial custody after the court rejected his bail plea.

'HEED PAWAR': MAHA CM EKNATH SHINDE ADVISES NATIONAL

Pawar had said. Speaking to the media after a property exhibition in Kalyan on Friday night, CM Shinde said, "The Congress started an agitation seeking explanation of Rs 20,000

crore in the Adani group. tinuously spoke on this issue. Now Pawar has commented and those who are protesting should heed these com-

ments.' Pawar is a very senior politician and must have spoken on the Adani issue after much study, and, therefore, those protesting should clarify their stand, the CM said in a swipe at the Congress and Shiv Sena (UBT), which are allies with the NCP in the Maha Vikas Aghadi.

Messages sent to IAS officer against tree cutting at Aarey not offensive: Bombay High court


essages sent to an IAS officer opposing the cutting of trees in Mumbai's Aarey Colony for the construction of a Metro Rail car shed were not offensive, but were assertion of a democratic right of a citizen of this country to put forth his view to object and protest, the Bombay High Court has said.

A division bench of Justice Sunil Shukre and Justice Milind Sathaye noted that registering a first information report (FIR) for such an offence would amount to an invasion on the rights of citizens of this country.

The bench on April 5 quashed a January 2018 FIR registered at Bandra Kurla Complex (BKC) police station against Avijit Michael, a Bengaluru resident, for allegedly sending offensive messages to IAS officer Ashwini Bhide, who at the time was heading the Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation Ltd (MMRCL), and for allegedly obstructing her from discharging her public duties.

The court in its order said the intention of the sender of these messages appears to be to protect the forest, which he considers to be acting like lungs for Mumbai.

"These messages do not contain any offensive material or any obscenities. Rather, they appear to have been sent in assertion of a democratic right of a citizen of this country to put forth his view point, to object, to protest, to persuade, to urge, and so on," the court said. If anybody is booked for criminal offences such as those as have been registered against the petitioner, it may amount to an



invasion upon the rights of the citizens of this country, the court said.

The police upon receiving such a complaint, howsoever high he or she may be in position, must never book any ordinary citizen of the country under criminal law, it

"...and if it does, it would be like suppressing his voice against what he considers to be a wrongful thing," the court said.

The bench while quashing the FIR issued a warning to the police officer concerned. "The investigating officer, who registered the crime against the petitioner, is hereby cautioned to be careful in registering crimes in such matters in future," the court said.

Pawar's stand on Adani will not affect Oppn unity: Sanjay Raut

The Shiv Sena (UBT) on Saturday said Nationalist Congress Party president Sharad Pawar not favouring formation of a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) to probe allegations against the Adani group will not lead to cracks in opposition unity.

alking to reporters, Shiv Sena (UBT) Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Raut said Pawar has not given a clean chit but expressed his views of options on how to carry out the probe.

Raut added the opposition is firm on its demand for a JPC probe.

"Be it (West Bengal chief minister) Mamata Banerjee or NCP, there could be different opinions about Adani, but that will not lead to cracks in (opposition) unity in Maharashtra or in the country," asserted Raut, a key aide of former chief minister Uddhav Thackeray.

Earlier in the day, Pawar had said he favoured a Supreme Court committee to probe allegations against the Adani group, since the ruling party would have a majority in the



JPC based on numerical strength in Parliament and this would lead to doubts on such a probe.

"I am not completely opposed to the IPC there have been IPCs and I have been a chairman of some of the



AIIMS neurosurgeon Dr Adesh Shrivastava immediately started treatment by taking the patient to the ICU and started doing further tests.

Tejaswin Shankar breaches Asian **Games qualifying standards**

New Delhi| Tejaswin Shankar, who holds India's men's high jump national record, achieved a new personal best of 7,648 points to finish second in the decathlon competition at the Jim Click Shootout and Multis 2023 athletics meet in Arizona, USA, on Saturday

The Indian athlete was competing in only his second decathlon competition after his debut in the combined-event dis-

cipline at the Big 12 Conference held in Texas in May last year. There, Tejaswin Shankar logged an impressive score of 7,592 -- the highest by any Indian decathlon athlete in

At the Jim Click Shootout, Tejaswin improved his personal best to 7,648 -- just 10 points short of the Indian decathlon national record held by Bharatinder Singh since 2011.

The mark also saw the 24-year-old Shankar breach the Asian Games 2023 qualifying standard for the decathlon, set at 7,500 points by the Athletics Federation of India (AFI), an olympics.com report said.Notably, decathlon is a combined event which includes 10 different sports -- 100m sprint, long jump, high jump, shot put, discus throw, 110m hurdles, javelin throw, pole vault, 400m race and a 1500m race. Athletes earn points for their performance in each category and are ranked according to their total tally at the end of all

Tejaswin, a high jump bronze medallist at the Commonwealth Games 2022, led the field in the high jump and 400m events while finishing second in the long jump, shot put and 110m hurdles. His weakest showing came in the pole vault event, where he finished eighth. Till Steinforth, representing the University of Nebraska, topped the decathlon leaderboard at the Jim Click Shootout with 7,845 points. Emil Uhlin came in third with 7,440 points.
