- Heavy rain and hailstorms will prevail over Tamil Nadu, Kerala, South Karnataka, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Rajasthan, Western Himalayan Region and Madhya Pradesh till May 3, said the India Meteorological Department (IMD).
- India logged its hottest February this year since record-keeping began in 1901, according to the IMD. However, above-normal rainfall due to seven western disturbances, including five strong ones, kept temperatures in check in March.
- The prolonged spell of pre-monsoon rain, thunderstorms, hailstorms and lightning strikes damaged crops in many parts of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and other states.
- Climate change is increasing global temperatures and worsening the frequency and intensity of extreme weather events.

## IMD predicts rain, hailstorms in India over next few days

The weather office has predicted heavy rain and hailstorms in most parts of the country over the next few days. Rain has brought temperature down in various states by several notches below normal, officials said, adding that no heatwave conditions are likely to develop anywhere for the next four days. The wet spell across the country will continue over the next couple of days before it gradually starts subsiding from May 5, it added. The IMD has also predicted thunderstorms and strong winds in several states till



Wednesday after which it will witness a reduction. "The thunderstorm activity over most parts of the country is likely to continue till May 3 and reduce significantly thereafter from May 4," the IMD said. "Since we are seeing an active western disturbance, northwest India will be affected," said Nareish Kumar, scientist at IMD. Last month, the weather office in its annual forecast had predicted a normal rainfall pattern during the monsoon season. There is a 67-per cent probability of normal to above-normal rainfall, the IMD had said.

## CARE & CAUTION NEEDED

### SUPREME COURT ON GRANTING DIVORCE ON IRRETRIEVABLE BREAKDOWN

The Supreme Court on Monday ruled that it can use its extraordinary powers under Article 142 (1) of the Constitution to dissolve a marriage, which is irretrievably broken down by doing away with procedure and a waiting period under the Hindu Marriage Act. It, however, stressed that grant of divorce on the ground of irretrievable breakdown of marriage by it is not a matter of right, "but a discretion which is to be exercised with great care and caution", and elaborated on factors which are worthy of consideration to dissolve the marriage.

A five-judge bench comprising Justices S.K. Kaul, Sanjiv Khanna, Abhay S. Oka, Vikram Nath, and J. K. Maheshwari said: "We wish to clearly state that grant of divorce on the ground of irretrievable breakdown of marriage by this court is not a matter of right, but a discretion which is to be exercised with great care and caution, keeping in mind several factors ensuring that 'complete justice' is done to both parties".

It noted that the apex court should be fully convinced and satisfied that the marriage is totally unworkable, emotionally dead and beyond salvation and, therefore, dissolution of marriage is the right solution and the only way forward and the marriage has irretrievably broken down to be factually determined and firmly established.

It said the period of separation should be sufficiently long, and anything above six years or more will be a relevant factor, but these facts have to be evaluated keeping in view the economic and social status of the parties, including their educational qualifications, whether the parties have any children, their age, educational qualification, and so on.



"And whether the other spouse and children are dependent, in which event how and in what manner the party seeking divorce intends to take care and provide for the spouse or the children. Question of custody and

welfare of minor children, provision for fair and adequate alimony for the wife, and economic rights of the children... We would not like to codify the factors so as to curtail exercise of jurisdiction under Article 142(1) of the Constitution, which is situation specific. Some of the factors mentioned can be taken as illustrative, and worthy of consideration", it said. The bench said public interest

demands that the marriage status should, as far as possible, be maintained, but where the marriage has been wrecked beyond the hope of salvage, public interest lies in recognising the real fact. No spouse can be compelled to resume life with a consort, and as such, nothing is gained by keeping the parties tied forever to a marriage which has, in fact, ceased to exist, it said.

Concluding the 62-page judgment, Justice Khanna said: "This Court, in exercise of power under Article 142(1) of the Constitution of India, has the discretion to dissolve the marriage on the ground of its irretrievable breakdown. This discretionary power is to be exercised to do 'complete justice' to the parties, wherein this court is satisfied that the facts established show that the marriage has completely failed and there is no possibility that the parties will cohabit together, and continuation of the formal legal relationship is unjustified. The court, as a court of equity, is required to also balance the circumstances and the background in which the party opposing the dissolution is placed."

## 'The elections are not about you', Rahul tells Modi

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday launched a scathing attack against Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his high-voltage campaign in poll-bound Karnataka, saying that "Modi ji, these elections are not about you".

Addressing a large gathering in Turuvekere, Rahul Gandhi said, "Modi ji, you don't talk about Karnataka's issues when you come here to campaign for the elections. You only talk about yourself. You should tell the people what you did for Karnataka in the last three years.

"You should also tell what you are going to do in the next five years for the state's youth, education, health, and for eradicating corruption." "Modi ji, the elections



are not about you, they are about Karnataka's people and its future. You say that Congress attacked you 91 times, but you never speak about what you did for Karnataka. In your next speech, do tell the people of Karnataka what you did for the state in the last three years and what you intend to do in the next five years," the Congress leader said.

The Congress leader also said it is not that the Prime Minister is not aware of the corruption in Karnataka.

The Congress leader also said that a BJP MLA told the media that Karnataka CM's post is up for sale for Rs 2,500 crore.

## Afzal Ansari disqualified as Lok Sabha MP



New Delhi: Bahujan Samaj Party MP Afzal Ansari, brother of gangster-politician Mukhtar Ansari, was disqualified from Lok Sabha on Monday following his conviction in a 2007 Gangsters Act case.

According to a Lok Sabha Secretariat notification issued on Monday, Ansari stands disqualified as MP from Lok Sabha from Ghazipur, with effect from April 29, the date of his conviction.

The Ghazipur MP-MLA court had last week sentenced Ansari to four years of prison and also imposed a fine of Rs 1 lakh on him.

The court had also convicted Mukhtar Ansari in the same case and sentenced him to 10 years of imprisonment, while imposing a penalty of Rs 5 lakh on him.

## Chhattisgarh: Jolt to BJP as Nand Kumar Sai joins Congress

Raipur: A day after resigning from the BJP, senior Chhattisgarh tribal leader and former MP, Nand Kumar Sai, joined the Congress on Monday, in a major setback to the saffron party. Sai took the membership of Congress in the presence of Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, State President Mohan Markam during a programme organised at the state office of Congress, Rajiv Bhawan. On the occasion, Sai filled the Congress membership form and the Chief Minister garlanded him with cotton. Other prominent leaders of the Congress were also present. Sai was elected to Lok Sabha in 1989 and 1996 from Raigarh when it was in Madhya Pradesh. In 2004, he was elected MP from Surguja constituency of Chhattisgarh.

## 'Grave truth': Viral picture of padlock on grave from Hyderabad, not Pakistan

Photographs of a grave with padlock, going viral on social media during the last two days, is from the Indian city of Hyderabad and not from Pakistan, as was reported, a local man claimed.

A section of media ran the story on Saturday that parents in Pakistan are securing their daughters' graves with padlocks to "safeguard them from being raped".

However, the truth came out on Sunday when the person who had seen the grave with padlock at the graveyard in Madannapet area of the old city of Hyderabad last year visited the same place to post pictures and photographs on social

media.

The person in the video revealed that it was the grave of his friend's mother. The old lady had passed away last year and after she was buried there, her family members had put the padlock to prevent burial of any other deceased at the same place.

The muezzin at Masjid-e-Salar Mulk, where the graveyard is located, said that they noticed some people burying their dead in old graves. To prevent any such thing, the relatives of the deceased installed the iron grill and locked it. He said the grill was also installed over the grave as it is very close to the entrance and the family members of the deceased wanted to make sure that visitors don't step on it.

## Why is Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh not being arrested despite POCSO Act charges: Sidhu

Coming out in support of protesting wrestlers and saying the fight is for honour and dignity of every woman, senior Congress leader Navjot Sidhu on Monday questioned that why accused Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) President Brij Sharan Singh wasn't arrested despite a case was registered against him under the "non-bailable POCSO Act".

Also he sought the BJP MP's custodial interrogation. Two first information reports (FIRs) were registered against him after the intervention of

the Supreme Court.

"To know what is right and not to do it is the worst cowardice. Why was the FIR delayed? Not making the FIR public reflects that the FIR is mild and not corroborative to the complainant's complaint," he told the media after meeting the protesting wrestlers at Jantar Mantar here. Sidhu also questioned the "motive" behind protecting Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh.

"Intent is questionable and motive is to protect the accused. Are things being swept under the carpet? Why is the officer who delayed the FIR not being tried under Section 166 of the

IPC as he was duty bound to register an FIR which is mandatory in case of a cognizable offence?"

The first FIR against Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh pertains to allegations levelled by a minor, which has been registered under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act along with relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code concerning outraging modesty.

The second FIR has been registered for carrying out comprehensive investigations into the complaints by adult complainants under relevant IPC sections pertaining to outraging of modesty.

## Southern Western Ghats, a museum and cradle for diversity

Researchers find that the evolutionary diversity is unevenly distributed across the Western Ghats, driven by past climatic and geographic processes and also by current climate. In addition, they have also seen the effects of niche conservatism for wet sites, wherein lineages tend to remain in the niche where they have evolved and continue to persist and even form a new species.

The Western Ghats of India is a global biodiversity hotspot with many woody plants, birds, mammals, reptiles, fishes and insects, among other life forms. Many of them are endemic, meaning they occur only in this area and nowhere else.

Studying what factors influence the species diversity and distribution patterns in a given area fascinates and has kept ecologists and evolutionary biologists busy over the last two centuries. Tools using information on how species are related to one another based on their DNA, have become important in examining the role of past climate on the community or species diversity patterns in the last two decades.

A new study in Dr Jahnvi Joshi's group at the CSIR-Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, in collab-



oration with national and international institutions, sheds light on the evolution of plants in the Western Ghats region of India. The recent study has been published in the Proceedings of the Royal Society B.

"This study complements several taxonomic studies in the region, which show the Western Ghats have a high diversity of woody plants,

with over 60 per cent being endemic. Examination of the evolutionary diversity shows that southern Western Ghats serves as a "museum" and "cradle" of evolutionary diversity, which means it has both old and young (on evolutionary timescales in millions of years) species. These species also have restricted distribution in the southern Western Ghats, and interest-

ingly this region has six times higher number of species than the northern Western Ghats," said Abhishek Gopal, the first author of the study.

"Large scale studies like this which span a huge geographic area, looking at timescales in millions of years and includes hundreds of species are helpful as they help us understand if there are any generalities in how diversity is generated and maintained. We show that the Western Ghats hold tremendous evolutionary diversity. We highlight the global value of the Western Ghats, demonstrating, in particular, the importance of protecting the southern Western Ghats - an engine of plant diversification and persistence. The results of this study can also be used to augment the existing protected areas in the landscape, which are facing severe anthropogenic stress," said Jahnvi Joshi, the senior author of this study.





# PEOPLE WILL TEACH A LESSON TO THOSE WHO TERMED MODI 'USELESS': BOMMAI

Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai on Monday said that the Congress leaders are indulging in cheap talk due to the fear of losing the assembly election. He said Congress MLA Priyank Kharge termed Modi as 'useless'. Bommai appealed to the people to vote for the Bharatiya Janata Party to teach a lesson to the Congress.

Speaking at a rally in favour of Krishnaraja BJP candidate Srivatsa here on Monday, he said Mysuru is a historic, heritage, and world-famous city and the BJP has been strong in the last three decades.

"The people have voted for the MLAs and MPs. The turnout of the people clearly indicates that Srivatsa will get elected by a big margin. We are trying to get positive votes through the programs of the double-engine government. But the opposition parties, out of frustration, are making cheap remarks and doing



negative campaigning. People will vote only for those who have worked for them," he said.

The CM said both the state and Union governments have implemented several schemes such as the Kisan

Samman for farmers, Ayushman Bharat for public healthcare, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana in both the urban and rural areas to build houses and the Vidyanidhi scheme for the children of farmers and agricultural

labourers.

Mysuru has been developed under the Smart City project. Prime Minister Narendra Modi loves Mysuru and its citizens. The PM selected Mysuru for celebrating Yoga Day. Those who love Modi must vote for Srivatsa, he said.

"As the CM, I have given grants of over Rs 250 crore for the celebration of Dasara along with an additional Rs 5 crore and implemented the Mysuru Tourism Circuit. Mysuru has been an international tourism destination.

"Work is in progress and next year the number of tourists visiting the city will double. Rs 80 crore has been given to rebuild a hospital and impetus given to women's programs," he said.

Out of frustration, the Congress is giving the guarantee of 10 kilograms of free rice but it was given during the regime of former BJP CM Yediyurappa. The Congress government reduced the quantity to five kg. The Congress leaders are deceiving the voters just for the sake of votes, Bommai stated.

# Criminal, involved in 200 incidents of chain snatching, arrested

A 40-year-old man, involved in around 200 snatching incidents, has been arrested, a senior Delhi Police official said on Monday.

The accused, identified as Ranjeet Singh alias Billa, was held from west Delhi. Police said that he has been previously arrested in more than 40 cases including 22 cases of robbery and snatching.

The official said that Singh was active in west Delhi's Tilak Nagar, Hari Nagar and Janakpuri areas.

According to Deputy Commissioner of Police, West, Akshat Kaushal, on April 26, the police received a tip-off about the accused and arrested him in Raghbir Nagar, where he had arrived on a stolen bike to commit snatching.

During interrogation, the accused named Singh admitted to the police that he had committed nearly 200 incidents of snatching so far.

"Singh disclosed that he worked alone and had become proficient in snatching chains with his left hand while riding a bike. To avoid being identified, he always wore a helmet and used high-end bikes stolen from parking lots during snatching," said



Kaushal.

He only targeted the west district, as he was familiar with the escape routes.

According to the police, Singh was released on bail during the Covid-19 pandemic in May 2020 from Tihar jail. After his release, he moved to his hometown in Rajasthan's Alwar, but later came back to Delhi and resumed snatching.

# Yogi Adityanath biggest Rajput leader in the country: Sushil Modi

Bharatiya Janata Party Rajya Sabha MP Sushil Kumar Modi reacted sharply to Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and the release of Anand Mohan Singh, saying that Uttar Pradesh CM Yogi Adityanath is the biggest Rajput leader in the country.

Modi's statement came at a time when the Bihar government has amended a prison law and released gangster-turned-politician Anand Mohan Singh on April 27. Modi claimed that Nitish Kumar is aiming to attract Rajput votes through a murderer.

"Nitish Kumar is aiming to take Rajput votes by releasing the murderer of Dalit District Magistrate G Krishnaiah but he does not know that Yogi Adityanath is the biggest Rajput leader of the country. Yogi is trying to destroy criminals and Nitish Kumar is trying to take votes in the name of criminals," Modi said.

Sushil Kumar Modi, while addressing the Chandravanshi community during the Jarasandh birth anniversary in Patna, said that



the way the Bihar government has released the murderer of a Dalit DM is an injustice to the entire Dalit community. Nitish Kumar changed the prison manual only to garner the votes of one caste. "The BJP has Yogi Adityanath, Rajnath Singh and RK Singh. The Rajput community will not go with criminals. They will go with the leaders," Modi said. "The release of Anand Mohan has reached the Supreme Court and it is extremely difficult to give a clarification on changing the jail manual there," he said.

# 1 KILLED, 4 INJURED IN BIHAR'S MOTIHARI; GANG WAR SUSPECTED

Patna: One person was killed while four others were injured after three unidentified assailants opened fire on them at Motihari town in Bihar's East Champaran district on Monday, the police said.

The deceased has been identified as Prince Kumar, a native of Muzaffarpur district. He came into the firing range when the assailants targeted the gang members of Dev Kumar, who along with his associates were having refreshments at the same tea stall where Prince was consuming cold drinks.

Dev Kumar was involved in around six looting and dacoity cases. The police said that the injured individuals were associated with the gang of Dev Kumar.

Following the incident, East Champaran Superintendent of Police Kantesh Kumar Mishra along with a large number of police personnel went to the spot. Around 3.30 p.m., Dev Kumar and his gang members were drinking cold drinks at a tea stall located at Mathia village on the Dhaka-Motihari road.

# Night curfew continues in violence-hit Manipur dist

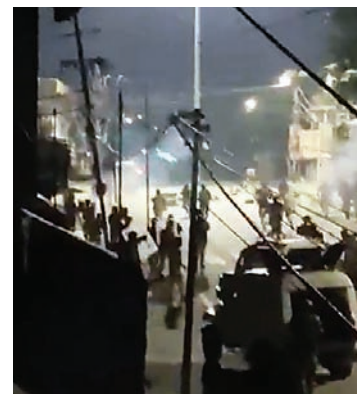

The night curfew continued for the third consecutive day on Monday in Manipur's Churachandpur district even as no fresh incident of violence has been reported in the mountainous district in the last 48 hours.

A police officer said that as a precautionary measure, the district administration decided to continue the night curfew until further orders.

The incidents of violence, including vandalising government properties, were triggered after the tribals launched fresh protests against the state government's action against the illegal poppy cultivators and destroying poppy fields in the forest land, especially in the reserve and protected forests in the hilly areas.

The district administration on



Saturday imposed a night curfew in Churachandpur district from 5 p.m. to 5 a.m.

However, with the reopening of shops, business establishments and markets, normal activities have been witnessed in the daytime since

Sunday.

Unidentified miscreants set fire to a government building on Friday, damaging properties and destroying the documents.

After Thursday's incidents of violence, Manipur Chief Minister N. Biren Singh cancelled his Friday's visit to Churachandpur district.

The CM was scheduled to address a public gathering at Sadbhavana Mandap in New Lamka Town in Churachandpur on Friday and inaugurate an open gym at PT Sports complex.

The miscreants also burnt down the open gym, chairs and other materials gathered in view of the Chief Minister's visit.

Police claimed that the Myanmarese, who illegally entered the state, were also involved in the arson.

# IT professional installs hidden cameras in rented flat of girls, held

Police have arrested one Rajendra Soni, who installed hidden cameras in his flat rented to three girls, and used to watch them from his house. He was produced in court on Monday.

The accused is the owner of the flat.

Police officials said that the victims came to know about the hidden cameras installed in their flat after a short circuit. When the electrician came in, many cameras were found installed in the bedrooms and bathrooms. Police arrested Rajendra on April 27. He was produced in the court on Monday, from where he has been sent to judicial custody till May 15.

When grilled, the accused said that



he does the business of CCTV cameras and computers. He rented the

flat to the girl students who came from other cities to study in Udaipur.

When the girl students went to their homes during the holidays, he opened the flat with a duplicate key and installed three cameras.

A router was installed in the name of providing free Wi-Fi to the girl students. The accused told during interrogation that he had got the CCTV cameras installed just out of hobby to watch the videos of the girls. Police have recovered spy cameras, internet router and duplicate keys of the flat from the accused.

According to the police, the accused is an IT expert. He has a degree in Master of Computer Application. He technically had a prior understanding of spy cameras and how to install them. The girls had taken the flat on rent 8 months ago.

# Delhi HC orders removal of online news of man 'trying to extort money over obscene video'

The Delhi High Court on Monday ordered several media houses to remove or disable links to news articles about a man who booked by police for allegedly trying to extort Rs 10 lakh from a friend by threatening to leak an offensive video.

Justice Prathiba M. Singh passed the order after observing that the First Information Report (FIR) filed in the case has been annulled and that the occurrence was a "immature prank".

The petitioner had gone before the court claiming that even after the FIR was dismissed pursuant to the court's orders, his employer discovered the news reports and suspended him, claiming that he wouldn't be reinstated unless those pieces were taken down.

After considering the case, the bench ordered the publishers to remove the links within 48 hours. The Court also directed Google to block access to those links. "Considering that the entire career of the peti-



tioner as a young executive is likely to be jeopardised due to continued publication of the articles and keeping in mind the future of the petitioner and his mental and physical health, it is deemed appropriate to direct all the publisher to remove links to the articles," Justice Singh ordered.

The man was arrested by the Delhi Police in September 2021 for reportedly threatening to release his friend's obscene film and demanding Rs 10 lakh from him. Based on a settlement from earlier this year, the FIR was dismissed. It was claimed that the complainant and the accused were friends and longtime acquaintances. This was described as a prank gone wrong as well.

# Raj CM Gehlot's hoarding 'stolen', 6 cops catch 'thief' in 24 hours

A team of six policemen caught a 'thief' who stole a hoarding featuring Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot.

A theft complaint about the missing hoarding was registered at the police station here on Saturday. The police immediately swung into action and raided different places throughout the night.

Hard efforts paid results and the policemen caught the "thief" who had stolen the hoarding in 24 hours.

Actually, May 3 is the birthday of Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot. On this occasion, a blood donation camp will be organised at Mahatma Jyotiba Phule National Institute, Vishwakarma. This hoarding was put up on the Sikar Road near VKI. When the hoarding was found missing on April 29, a report was lodged.

District President of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule National Institute Sitaram Saini registered a case against an unknown person. CCTV footage was found from a



nearby hotel in which a person was seen removing the hoarding.

Vishwakarma Police Station officers said that a 40x8 feet hoarding was put up on Sikar Road to wish Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot. On April 29, when Sitaram Saini saw the hoarding removed, he informed the police. Police investigation revealed that the hoarding was stolen by an unknown person. On this, a complaint was given on behalf of Sitaram Saini in the Vishwakarma police station about the theft of hoarding of Chief Minister Ashok

Gehlot.

On investigation, it was found that the 'thief' is an employee of the hoarding company, and had reportedly removed it after the company did not get the due payment. The cost of the hoarding is Rs 4,000.

Sitaram Saini said, "Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot is the chief patron of the institute. On this occasion, a blood donation camp is organised on his birthday. Posters were being put up in the area from 25th. On April 29, the hoarding was not found between 8.20 a.m. to 8.45 a.m.

# Heavy rainfall causes chaos, traffic jams reported in several areas of Delhi

Delhi and some contiguous NCR areas were lashed by a heavy downpour on Monday, causing chaos on the roads as commuters sought shelter and water-logging was reported from various places.

Lajpat Nagar, ITO, Lodhi Road, New Delhi, and Noida were among the areas that experienced heavy rains.

Waterlogging in certain places caused traffic to come to a standstill in areas such as Noida and Delhi, as well as ITO and other stretches.

According to traffic police, they received 31 calls at their control room regarding the traffic issue, including three calls of waterlogging.

Delhi Traffic Police said that traffic problems were observed in various locations such as Jhandewalan Mandir, Paschim Vihar, Rohini, and south Delhi.

"Traffic is heavy on Aurobindo Marg in the carriageway from IIT towards Adhchini due to waterlogging near Adhchini. Kindly avoid the stretch," said traffic police in a tweet. Numerous commuters took to



Twitter to share updates about the traffic situation caused by heavy rainfall. They reported traffic jams under the flyover towards August Kranti Marg from Panchsheel Park and heavy traffic on Rohtak Road between Pargarhi and Nangloi. A Twitter user mentioned that the

Barapullah flyover was completely congested, and there was waterlogging in various areas.

Traffic was also affected near Civic Centre, on Pusa Road near Hanuman Mandir, near Max Hospital in Saket, and on the Dwarka flyover, according to other Twitter users.

On Sunday too, Delhi experienced light rain, which brought the maximum temperature down to 28.7 degrees Celsius, 10 degrees below the season's average, and the lowest temperature for the month since April 4, 2015, as reported by the India Meteorological Department.

In Bhopal, the temperature dropped by 2.4 degrees in a single night. The temperature here was recorded at 17.6 degrees. The temperature was 18.9 in Indore,



19.1 in Gwalior, 18.4 degrees in Jabalpur. Pachmarhi recorded the lowest temperature of 14.6 degrees. The highest night temperature was recorded in Sidhi at 21.6 degrees. In Narsinghpur, Naugaon, Satna, Tikamgarh, the mercury remained above 20 degrees.

Not only is it raining heavily in

Madhya Pradesh due to inclement weather, but hail is also falling in many districts. At the same time, the speed of the storm has reached 70 km per hour. It rained heavily across the state on Sunday. It rained like a monsoon in Vaishakh. Lightning also fell at many places. The weather pattern is expected to remain the same on the

first day of May as well. The Meteorological Department has also issued an alert for heavy rains in Jabalpur, Mandla, Dindori, Balaghat and Katni for the first time in summer. Meteorologist HS Pandey told that the activity of Western Disturbance is spread across the state and it is very strong. Because of this, there is rain, thunderstorm and hailstorm in the state. The weather pattern is likely to remain the same for the next few days.

There is a possibility of rain in most of the districts of Bhopal, Jabalpur, Shahdol, Gwalior, Chambal, Sagar and Rewa divisions. It may rain at some places in Indore, Ujjain and Narmadapuram divisions.

Alert of strong thunderstorm with heavy rain has been issued for Jabalpur, Mandla, Dindori, Balaghat and Katni districts.

Along with Narmadapuram-Chambal division, hailstorm is expected in Guna, Bhopal, Datia, Dhar, Indore, Gwalior, Shivpuri, Ujjain, Sagar and Shajapur.

## MAN TRIES TO EXTORT RS 1 CRORE FROM TRADER, ARRESTED

Indore: A middleman working with a vegetable trader in Madhya Pradesh's Indore was arrested today for allegedly threatening to abduct the latter's family members and attempting to extort Rs 1 crore from him, police said.

The accused worked as a middleman for trader Kallu Bagri at Devi Ahilyabai Holkar Fruit-Vegetable Market in the city, deputy commissioner of police (DCP) Aditya Mishra told reporters.

The accused allegedly sent anonymous letters to Bagri in April demanding Rs 25 lakh, then Rs 40 lakh and later Rs 1 crore, he said.

The letters also contained threats that if the amount was not paid, the trader's children, son-in-law and grandson would be kidnapped, the official said. Based on statements of about 100 people and details of phone calls, the police zeroed in on the accused, he said. During interrogation, the accused informed that he had been in debt and had to repay Rs 15 lakh, the official said.

"The accused has claimed that he had approached the trader for a loan, but the latter flatly refused to lend to him at the behest of one of his employees," Mishra said. The police had deployed armed personnel in plain clothes around the trader's house and shop for security considering the threatening letters, he said.

## Stray dogs raise their heads in Lucknow municipal polls

The ongoing municipal elections in Lucknow have thrown up unexpected issues, catching the contestants unaware. While the contestants go around campaigning and promising voters of better civic amenities, cleaner streets and well-lit roads, they are being questioned about the increasing stray dog menace in the state capital. Party candidates admit that at various places, people have been reminding them about the issue, some even announcing a poll boycott in protest against the alleged indifferent approach of the local administration and municipal corporation on the matter. The residents of Shrishti Apartments in Jankipuram have announced boycott of the civic polls following several cases of dog bites in their area and inaction of the authorities to solve the problem. In Shri Guru Govind Singh ward in Alambagh, the residents of Patel Nagar and Adarsh Nagar too cited 'dog bite' incidents before candidates of various parties. They told the candidates that they will only vote for the party which will solve the problem. "It may seem trivial to many but for us, it is a serious problem. Elderly citizens and children are being attacked by stray dogs, and the municipal officials are completely unconcerned about it. We do not care about BJP, SP, BSP, or Congress - we will vote for the candidate who comes up with a solution to the problem," said Raj Narain Jauhari, a resident of Jankipuram. BJP MLA Yogesh Shukla along with local candidates met the residents and assured them that the problem will be taken care of. BJP candidate Deepak Lodhi said, "It is true that along with roads, sewer, drains and street lights, this time people are also asking us to address the problem of street dogs and stray animals. The issue is bigger than what we thought it to be."

# INDIA TALKS TOUGH AT SCO MEET

Last week at the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's (SCO) Defence Ministers' meeting, India adopted a very tough stand to deal with its immediate neighbour China, which has been the founding father of the bloc.

Relations between two Asian neighbours have not been very cordial in the recent past, on the issue of border transgressions by China in the Indian territory.

## India's Tough Posture

China's Defence Minister, Li Shangfu, in his first visit to India by a Chinese defence minister since 2020, when 20 Indian and four Chinese soldiers died in clashes along the Himalayan border in Ladakh and the two sides came the closest to war for almost 70 years, was indeed not expecting such a dressing down by the Indians.

In his meeting with Li Shangfu, Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh accused China of border aggressions that have "eroded the entire basis" of bilateral relationship, as negotiations over the line of actual control (LAC) remain deadlocked.

Border transgressions from China have continued despite strong condemnation from India. In December last year, more than 20 Indian soldiers were injured in a clash with Chinese troops in the eastern state of Arunachal Pradesh, in what India described as a Chinese attempt to "transgress the border".

In March, China announced plans to "rename" 11 places in Arunachal Pradesh, which it claims as part of Tibet. When the Indian home minister visited the border region that same week to assert the Indian territorial claim, Beijing hit back, calling the visit a violation of its territorial sovereignty.

## Border Issue

While in the recent past, there has been disengagement in some areas, Indian army officers and defence experts say about 1,500 sq. km. in Ladakh taken over by the PLA in 2020 remains under Chinese control. Two main areas of contention in Ladakh are Demchok and Dapsang, which were previously patrolled by Indian troops but are now occupied by PLA soldiers. Both areas remain tactically important for India, but in spite of many rounds of talks, there is no move forward and there also does not seem any inclination from China to resolve the issue.



People living near the border in Ladakh allege that in the disengagement negotiations, New Delhi has ceded land to Beijing by agreeing to the creation of buffer zones -- where neither side can patrol -- in land that was previously claimed by India, specifically in the disputed Pangong Tso and Chushul areas. Thus, the real loser in the case has been India.

In reality, this happened due to the fact that India couldn't see the hegemonic Chinese designs for the area. China has been building new highways, railway lines, bridges, air strips and sophisticated military bases, modern housing and 5G towers in the disputed area, while India -- which historically avoided developing areas near the Chinese border in order to prevent any provocation -- has been left behind, with many of its border areas still impoverished.

In the recent past India has doubled its focus on infrastructure near the border with China, to correct its earlier miscalculations. January 2023 saw the Indian Defence Minister inaugurating 27 infrastructure projects aimed at strengthening the border infrastructure, in addition India is speeding up the construction of 37,500 miles of roads, 350 miles of bridges, 19 airfields and a few tunnels in border areas or nearby.

The scale and speed of this Indian infrastructure push is evident in the construction

of ambitious 8-mile tunnel in the Himalayan range, at an altitude of about 3,000 metres, to provide all-weather connectivity to Ladakh. India is trying hard to get the \$1.4 billion Zojila tunnel completed at the earliest.

## SCO Summit

Though the SCO is not a platform for bilateral issues, the Defence Ministers' meeting highlighted policy priorities, while India focussed on terrorism. Russia reiterated its criticism of the West's Indo-Pacific concept and creation of regional groups like the Quad.

Addressing the summit, Rajnath Singh underlined that any form of terrorist act or support towards it was a heinous crime against humanity. Though the issue of terrorism may have been pointed towards Pakistan, India also reiterated that a "robust" framework of regional cooperation should respect the "the sovereignty and territorial integrity of all member states by taking care of their legitimate interests".

Meanwhile, the Chinese Defence Minister harped on President Xi Jinping's 'Global Security Initiative', and said that Beijing was willing to work with other SCO members to implement the Global Security Initiative.

On his part, the Russian

Defence Minister General Sergei Shoigu took a blunt aim at the West for attempting to integrate the emerging security architecture in the Indian Ocean with NATO. Russia has always opposed the Indo-Pacific policy, advocated by the West and supported by India, describing it as an attempt to encircle China. The Russian minister expressed his belief that the SCO's "independent policies" towards global and regional security challenges could serve as a blueprint for the international community.

He emphasised the need to strengthen SCO's role as a key pillar of the emerging multipolar international system, one that promotes inter-state relations based on principles of equality, mutual respect, and compliance with international law.

Additionally, the General stated that NATO countries should bear the primary responsibility for post-war reconstruction in Afghanistan and Taliban should not be blamed for the current situation in the country.

Besides a virtual participation by Pakistan, defence ministers of eight SCO member states attended the meeting in New Delhi.

# Hindus, Muslims, Sikhs feature on Royal Mail stamp marking King's coronation

A stamp depicting Sikhs, Hindus, Muslims and their places of worship feature on one of the four stamps issued by the Royal Mail to mark the coronation of King Charles III on May 6. Captioned "Diversity and Community", the stamp reflects a multi-faith community and the cultural diversity of contemporary British society, a news release stated.

The stamp features figures representing the Jewish, Islamic, Christian, Sikh, Hindu and Buddhist religions and is representative of all faiths and none.

"The background shows aspects of both rural and urban Britain and includes some of the many different places of worship that are found around the United Kingdom," the release noted.

Presented in a miniature sheet, the stamps illustrate the Coronation ceremony and the traditional street party, as well as some of the causes His Majesty has dedicated his years of public service to. This includes cultural diversity and community, the global ties of the



Commonwealth, which he now leads, and sustainability and biodiversity.

This is only the third time in history that Royal Mail has issued stamps to mark a Coronation. The previous two occasions were for King George VI in 1937 and Queen Elizabeth II in 1953.

"Royal Mail is proud to issue this set of commemorative stamps which celebrate the Coronation, and some of the causes which His Majesty has championed throughout his many years of public service," Simon Thompson, Chief

Executive of Royal Mail, said. "This is only the third time we have issued Coronation stamps and I am delighted that they mark the start of a new reign and a new chapter in our history," Thompson added. The stamps were designed by Atelier Works and feature newly commissioned wood engravings by British artist Andrew Davidson.

Royal Mail will also be applying a special postmark to stamped mail to mark the event. The postmark will run from April 28 until May 10.

## Dam collapse kills 4 in Yemen

Sanaa: Four people were killed in Yemen after the collapse of a water dam in the Al Mahwit governorate, about 111 km west of the capital Sanaa.

Local authorities on Sunday confirmed that the Al-Aqabi Dam in the Hafash district of Al Mahwit governorate had collapsed, causing a flood that swept away a mosque with four people inside, killing all of them.

The flood also damaged nearby houses.

The governorate has been under the control of the Houthis group since 2014, Xinhua news agency reported.

Adel Issa, an official appointed by the Houthis in the governorate, attributed the dam's collapse to heavy rains and torrential flows.

Two rescue and ambulance vehicles were dispatched to the scene by authorities in Sanaa, he added. Yemen's National Centre of Meteorology issued a warning to citizens in several governorates, including Al Mahwit, about heavy rains and advised them to avoid travelling through torrential passages, valleys, and reefs during and after the rainfall.

## EVACUATION ORDERS LIFTED FOR PARTS OF VILLAGE NEAR JAPAN'S FUKUSHIMA NUKE PLANT

The Japanese government on Monday lifted an evacuation order for parts of litate village near the disaster-hit Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant.

The move means there are no entry restrictions currently in place for any designated reconstruction base in the area comprising six municipalities, reports Xinhua news agency.

Similar orders have already been issued by the government for five other municipalities, namely Futaba, Namie, Tomioka, Okuma and Katsurao.

In the wake of the March 2011 disaster at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant, the government imposed a "difficult-to-return" zone spanning a 337 sq.km area of Fukushima, comprising seven municipalities.

A "difficult-to-return" zone was deemed by the government inaccessible to humans due to dangerously high levels of radiation. Iitate village's southern district of Nagadoro remained a "difficult-to-return" zone and 17 per cent was designated as a "reconstruction and revitalisation" base.

At these inner bases, government-fund-



ed work was carried out to decontaminate the area and rebuild infrastructure and, reportedly, pave the way for evacuees to return.

The village of Iitate had been listed as one of the bases, with the lifting of the evacuation order on Monday also being applied to a neighbouring park, owing largely to the fact that nobody lived there.

As of April 1, 62 households with 197 people were listed as residents of Nagadoro, according to local statistics, but a mere three households comprising just seven people in total had applied for overnight stays.

Such applications beginning in September were supposed to be the first step toward households returning to the disaster-hit area permanently.

## SEVERAL FLIGHTS CANCELLED AS POWER OUTAGE HITS MANILA AIRPORT

A power outage at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport in Manila on Monday resulted in the cancellation of several domestic flights, Filipino authorities said.

The Manila International Airport Authority (MIAA) said the power outage at Terminal 3 struck shortly after 1 a.m., reports Xinhua news agency.

"Standby power is now supplying electricity to critical facilities enabling computer systems of airlines and immigration to function partially and enable processing of both inbound and outbound passengers," the MIAA said in a statement.

"As a result, delayed flights shall be expected," it added.

The MIAA said that operations personnel are now continuing to do the rounds of Terminal 3 to assist passengers. Transportation Secretary Jaime Bautista said the Terminal 3 generator system is used to supply power while the MIAA engineering team is looking into the cause of the power failure.

Bautista said the outage caused slight congestion at check-in counters inside the terminal.

President Ferdinand Marcos, now on an official visit to the US, has instructed Bautista to restore power "as soon as possible".

A power outage also hit the Manila airport in January, triggering a technical glitch that delayed and caused cancellations of domestic and international flights.

As part of the fellowship, she will work directly with the arts charity over the coming year to inspire and nurture aspir-

Alongside her MBE and CBE awards, Syal has brought her distinctive voice to the UK's creative arts across multiple artistic genres over four decades, with more than 140 credits and counting. Born to Punjabi parents from New Delhi, Syal's cross-cultural stories and performances have played an instrumental force in showcasing the positive representation of British-Asian stories and talent on screen, a BAFTA statement said.

Her work has scored multiple BAFTA nominations and wins, features on school and university syllabuses, and was said to be among Her Majesty the Queen's favourite TV programmes.

Syal has also received the Women In Film and TV Award for Creative Innovation, honorary doctorates from SOAS, Manchester and Birmingham Universities and was the Cameron Mackintosh Visiting Professor of

Contemporary Theatre at the Oxford University in 2012.

Born in Wolverhampton in the West Midlands and educated at Manchester University, Syal read English and Drama, gaining a Double First.

Her career began at the Royal Court, and alongside her many and continuing theatre roles, her talent saw her quickly graduate to screenwriting -- scripting 'Bhaji on the Beach' in 1993 and 'My Sister Wife' in 1994 -- as well as writing and performing in the pioneering comedy sketch-show 'The Real McCoy' (1991-1994). # MAHA CM KICKSTARTS CHHATRAPATI CORONATION CELEBRATIONS WITH WOMEN BIKE RALLY

Chief Minister Eknath Shinde flagged off an all-women motorcycle rally ahead of the 350th anniversary celebrations of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, coinciding with the 63rd Maharashtra Day festivities, here on Monday.

The rally comprised 350 women, who sped off from the August Kranti Maidan in Grant Road to the Swatantryaveer Savarkar Memorial in Dadar.

It was organised by the Maharashtra Tourism Department along with Amazing Namaste Foundation and women bikers, as many sporting the traditional Maharashtrian style saris joined the event.

The event marks the curtain-raiser for the 350th year of the coronation of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj held in Raigad, which will be celebrated in a grand manner with a series of major events in the state and other places across India linked with the Maratha warrior king.

Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj (February 19, 1630-April 3, 1680), was crowned at the Raigad Fort on June 6, 1674, from where he laid the foundations of the 'Hindavi Swaraj'.

On June 1 & 2, several major events will be held at the Raigad Fort besides social-cultural programmes across all districts, with other celebrations lined



up all through the year. Shinde said that the state government would also set up a Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Centre in Agra -- from where he and his son made the 'great escape' from the clutches of the Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb on August 17, 1666.

Previously known as Rairi, Shivaji Maharaj had seized it from the Jawli King Chandrarao More, a descendant of Chandragupta Maurya, in 1656.

Considered as impregnable by military standards, the Raigad Fort is one of the strongest, tallest and imposing forts in the Deccan Plateau, rising 1,356 metres above sea-level, often referred as the 'King of Forts' and now a major tourism attraction accessible by a rope-car and the traditional gruelling climb of several hours.

Flanked by two villages at its base, Pachad and Raigadwadi, it was renovated, repaired and enhanced for over

a decade before Shivaji Maharaj finally moved in, declared it as his capital, expanded and ruled the Maratha kingdom from here, and even his coronation ceremonies were held here. After the death of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj and the killing of his son Chhatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj in 1689, the Raigad Fort was captured by the Mughals under Aurangzeb, before it was targeted by the British East India Company in 1818.

# RRPL project only with locals' nod, says Maha Minister; protestors unimpressed

Maharashtra Education Minister Uday Samant on Monday reiterated that the proposed Ratnagiri Refinery & Petrochemicals Ltd project with Arab help will not go ahead without the consent of the local population.

Samant called on Nationalist Congress Party President Sharad Pawar, state chief Jayant Patil and senior leader Dr. Jitendra Ahwad under directions from Chief Minister Eknath Shinde.

"Yesterday, (April 30), representatives of the locals who are agitating against the RRPL met Pawar, and later CM Shinde also held discussions with him... I conveyed a clear message that the project will not be taken up without the cooperation of the local people," declared Samant.

However, one of the anti-RRPL activists, Sachin Chavan pointed out that already half a dozen villages in the affected region have passed resolutions that they don't want this project in that area.

"When the people of Barsu and other villages are strongly opposed to the project, then why is the government conducting the soil testing survey?" Chavan demanded, warning that if the testing work doesn't stop, the agitation will be revived.

The planned Rs 3 lakh crore project with collaboration from Saudi Arabia and Abu Dhabi got mired in a fresh controversy with an agitation launched from April 24, which resulted in police caning and teargas shelling on the protestors last weekend.

The protestors later suspended the agita-



tion for three days setting certain preconditions and seeking assurances from the state government on their apprehensions.

Samant said that presently only the soil-testing work has been taken up after which the RRPL promoters will decide whether the site in Barsu is suited for the mega-project or not.

"We shall clarify all the doubts and fears of the local people, especially the farmers, their lands, etc, and only thereafter the project shall be implemented," he said.

# Maha building crash toll climbs to 8

The death toll in the Bhiwandi building crash in Maharashtra's Thane district rose to eight with two more bodies recovered from the debris, officials said here on Monday.

The two bodies were retrieved nearly 48 hours after the tragedy struck. The work of clearing the debris continued for the third day, the officials said.

The ground plus three storied residential-commercial building housed several godowns on the ground and first floors and at least four families on the two upper floors.

Constructed in 2014, it suddenly collapsed around 1.45 p.m. on Saturday at Wardhaman Compound of the Mankoli area on the outskirts of the powerloom town. The officials also said that now nobody is missing in the tragedy in which another six were injured



and over a dozen rescued in the first major pre-monsoon building disaster in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region area.

Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has announced an ex-gratia of Rs 5 lakhs to the kin of each deceased and full free treatment for all the injured victims.

# NOW, A 'HEREDITARY CANCER CLINIC' AT MUMBAI'S AMBANI HOSPITAL

The Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital (KDAH) has launched a pioneering 'Hereditary Cancer Clinic' to provide personalised cancer care to patients with the latest precision oncology care, an official said here on Monday.

India reports an estimated 1.40 million new cancer cases annually and with such a high incidence, "precision oncology" has the potential to significantly reduce the burden of the disease by improving the effectiveness of cancer treatment.

Speaking at the launch late on Sunday, KDAH Chairperson Tina Anil

Precision Oncology profiles tumours at the molecular level and identifies alterations so that personalised treatment can be specifically designed and targeted to tackle the patient's unique form of cancer, and deliver the precision medicine to the right patient at the right time with the right dose.

KDAH CEO and Executive Director Dr. Santosh Shetty said that with this new facility, the hospital remains ahead and in line with the best global practices in cancer care with cutting-edge technology and research.

A spokesperson said that the KDAH's Hereditary Cancer Clinic is the first in a private hospital in Mumbai with a similar facility available in Tata Memorial Centre, Parel.

The KDAH also has cancer care centres in Akola, Gondia and Solapur and has introduced EDGE radio-surgery system, a True Beam equipment and other latest facilities to manage cancers and patients.

# "Cops pointed finger, asked to stop": AR Rahman's aide on Pune concert

Police stopped a concert of Oscar-winning musician A R Rahman in Maharashtra's Pune city as it went on after the 10 pm deadline, an official said on Monday.

After the concert was held here on Sunday, a video went viral on social media platforms in which a police officer was seen walking on the stage and asking Rahman, other artists and organisers to stop the music show as it was already past 10 o'clock.

A huge crowd had gathered to attend music maestro Rahman's live concert held at Raja Bahadur Mills in Pune.

"As the deadline of 10 pm had passed, we asked him (Rahman) and other artists to stop the show. They followed the instructions and stopped the show," said Bundgarden police station's inspector



Santosh Patil, who was seen in the video asking Rahman and other artists playing music to stop by indicating at his watch. No case has been registered in this connection, a senior police official said.

In a Twitter on Monday, Rahman, 56, thanked Pune for "all the love and euphoria" during "a roller coaster concert" but did not address the incident. "Pune! Thank you for all the love and euphoria last night! Was such a roller coaster concert! No wonder Pune is home to so much classical music! We shall be back soon to sing with you all again!", the Oscar-winner said in a tweet.

An aide close to Rahman, however, said the police could have talked to the organisers instead of pointing fingers at Rahman, a Padma Bhushan awardee known world over for his music.

"10pm was the curfew time but they've said it's the last song and only a minute left. The police official went to stage and asked ARR directly to stop, pointing finger at him. Police should have talked to the organisers or other control booth," the aide said.

# How 4 AM breakfast orders helped Mumbai cops bust fake call centre

Mumbai police said Monday that they managed to bust a fake call centre because of what the workers were having for breakfast.

The centre, located in a house along Rajodi Beach, housed dozens of employees who were not allowed to leave the building to prevent them from interacting with outsiders.

But police got a tip-off that someone was repeatedly ordering dozens of breakfasts from a nearby eatery -- and at 4:00 am.

"The beach resort is full of tourists on weekends and

almost deserted on other days. So the 50 to 60 tea and breakfast orders so early every morning for many days raised our suspicion and we started secretly monitoring the place," police officer Suhas Bavche told AFP.

Police finally raided the house, which had a floor with 60 workstations, on the night of April 11 and arrested the owner and 47 employees.

They have been charged with impersonation, cheating and fraud under Information Technology Act. Authorities had also commenced a forensic examination of the computers.

The investigation so far

has revealed that young employees were trained to receive calls from unsuspecting bank customers from Australia, Bavche said.

They allegedly extracted sensitive personal details and security information -- including one-time passwords -- from them and passed the information on to managers over email, the officer said.

"This could be the tip of the iceberg. We are investigating international connections for the racket," he added. "Such fake call centres operating from one place for a couple of months at a time are regularly busted across India."

# SHIRT TAG HELPS POLICE IDENTIFY MAN'S BODY, FIND FAMILY

Thane: A tag of a tailoring shop helped the Government Railway Police (GRP) trace the family of a 57-year-old man who died of natural causes on a local train in Maharashtra's Thane district last month, an official said on Monday.

A passenger, who had boarded a local train in Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus, died during the journey on April 23, senior inspector Archana Dusana of Dombivili GRP said.

A case of accidental death was registered and the body was sent for post-mortem, she said. While trying to ascertain the dead man's identity, the police came across a tag of a tailoring shop on his shirt and traced it to an establishment in Vangani, she said.

The dead was identified as Mehboob Nasir Shaikh, the official said, adding that his family was traced and his last rites were conducted on Sunday.



# It is a matter of the heart: Kangana on same-sex marriage

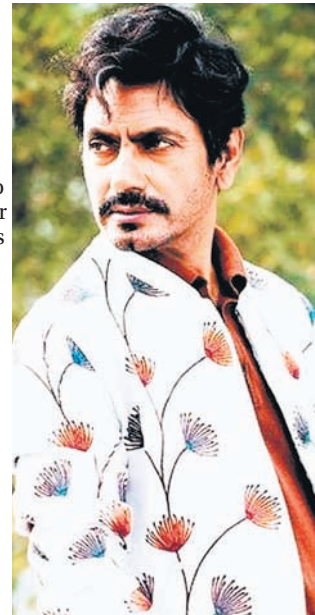
## Nawaz would rather 'shoot' himself than being a superstar

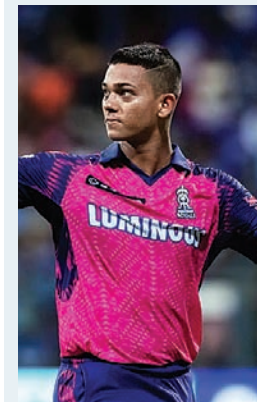

Hussamuddin, the two-time Commonwealth Games medallist, got the better of Alen Rustemovski of Macedonia in the opening round of the 57kg category, winning a unanimous 5-0 verdict in the Uzbekistan capital on Monday.

Boxing from the Red corner, Hussamuddin dominated the bout against Rustemovski in the first round and was the choice of all the judges as he won a unanimous verdict.

In the next round, Hussamuddin will take on the winner of the Lyu Pengyuan of China and Amzolele Dyeyi of South Africa.

In Monday's other matches, India's Varinder Singh will



go up against Mujibillo Tursunov of Uzbekistan in the 60kg preliminary round.

In all 13 boxers are representing India in this event, the biggest of this season.

Top boxers from all over the world are in the fray in the IBA Men's World Boxing Championships 2023. The gold medallists will walk away with a prize money of USD 200,000. The silver medallists are to be given USD 100,000, and both bronze-medallists will be awarded USD 50,000 each.

## Long jumper Murali Sreeshankar wins gold at Chula Vista athletics meet

Indian long jumper Murali Sreeshankar bagged the gold medal at the MVA High Performance 1 athletics meet held in Chula Vista, USA.

Sreeshankar recorded his best jump at Chula Vista to win the gold. The 24-year-old's jump was over the World Athletics Championships 2023 qualifying standard for men's long jump set at 8.25m.

Unfortunately, the effort didn't make him qualify for the Worlds in Budapest because the tailwinds recorded at +3.1m/s during his jump. Notably, jumps with over +2.0m/s wind



assistance are not logged as official records or qualifying timings in long jump.

Sreeshankar, who has been training in Texas Tech University, Lubbock, started his 2023 season at the Indian Grand Prix 3 in Bengaluru

last month, where he won the gold medal with a 7.94m effort.

The meet in the US was his second competition of the year and the first piece of competitive action on foreign soil for 2023.

## Man city go top, Liverpool edge Spurs in thriller

Manchester City moved to the top of the Premier League after a hard-fought 2-1 win away at Fulham.

Newcastle United remained third, with a nine-point cushion over fifth, after coming back from 1-0 down at home to bottom-of-the-table Southampton.

Stuart Armstrong stunned St James' Park in the 41st minute of the game, but Callum Wilson leveled in the 54th minute as Newcastle took the initiative. It wasn't until the 79th minute that Theo Walcott sliced a clearance into his own net to put them ahead.

Liverpool took advantage of Villa's defeat to move up to fifth after a crazy 4-3 win at home against Tottenham, who came back from 3-0 down to lose the match in the fourth minute of injury time. It seemed to be game over after just 15 minutes as Curtis Jones, a fit-again Luis Diaz, and Mohamed Salah's penalty put Liverpool 3-0 up. Nottingham Forest suffered late heartbreak as Ivan Toney and Josh Dasilva scored late goals to cancel



out Danilo's goal at the end of the first half and give Brentford a 2-1 win.

Crystal Palace moved up to 40 points with a thrilling 4-3 win over West Ham, who still have work to do to avoid relegation.

Tomás Soucek put West Ham ahead in the ninth minute, but goals from Jordan Ayew, Wilfried Zaha, and Jeffrey Schlupp put Palace 3-1 up after 30 minutes. Michail Antonio scored for West Ham in the 35th minute, but a controversial 66th-minute penalty from Eberechi Eze put Palace two goals clear again. Although Nayef Aguerd made it 4-3, Palace held on for the points.

## ERLING HAALAND EQUALS RECORD FOR MOST GOALS IN A SEASON

London | Erling Haaland has hit yet another incredible landmark after scoring a goal for Manchester City in a 2-1 win against Fulham as he equalling the record for the most goals (34) in a single Premier League season.

His 34th goal of the campaign moved Haaland to level with the record of Alan Shearer and Andrew Cole set in 1993/94 and 1994/95 respectively. Impressively, Haaland reached the 34-goal mark in only his 30th appearance, while Cole needed 40 matches and Shearer 42. Haaland has reached the milestone in 44 games scoring 34 in the Premier League, 12 in the Champions League, three in the FA Cup and one in the Carabao Cup. Haaland is nine goals ahead of his nearest rival Harry Kane in the race for this season's Castrol Golden Boot award.



## BARCA, REAL MADRID BACK IN ACTION AS MATCH DAY 33 OFFERS NO REST

The 33rd round of La Liga matches kicks off today's night, with an intense end to the season as Copa del Rey finalists Osasuna and Real Madrid prepare for Saturday's final in Sevilla.

Osasuna travels to face league leader FC Barcelona, and Coach Jagoba Arrasate is unlikely to risk key players like Ante Budimir or Chimy Avila, who are expected to start next weekend. This could be good news for Barcelona as they aim to move closer to securing the title.

Barcelona holds an 11-point lead over Real Madrid and is nearly at full strength, with only Sergi Roberto sidelined due to injury, a Xinhua report said.

Ousmane Dembele continues his gradual return to fitness, and Camp

Real Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti plans to rotate his starting lineup for their match against Real Sociedad, but he knows this approach carries a risk against the team currently in fourth place. Today's third game features a crucial relegation battle as Almeria, two points above the bottom three, faces last-place Elche.

Almeria must win after their weekend defeat in Madrid, but even though Elche seems destined for relegation with just 16 points (which could be confirmed if they lose), their recent 4-0 victory over Rayo Vallecano demonstrates that this match might not be the straightforward win Almeria hopes for.

# Aditi Ashok becomes first Indian woman to finish joint-second in LPGA Tour

Indian professional golfer Aditi Ashok came away with her career-best result on the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) Tour, finishing tied-2 along with Chinese Xiyu Lin with 9 under at the LA Championship.

After seven years on the LPGA Tour, Aditi finally found her way into a playoff and for the first time ever she finished as runner-up while Australian golfer Hannah Green emerged victorious on Sunday.

It took a three-person playoff to determine the winner at Wilshire Country Club, where Ashok and Lin, each chasing a first win on the LPGA Tour, went to extra holes with Green, a two-time winner and major champion, who was searching for her first win in four years.

The trio returned to the par 3 18th holes, a hole they each birdied in regulation to force a playoff. Aditi was eliminated on the first extra hole when she failed to make birdie to match



Lin and Green, who comfortably advanced to the second playoff hole and returned once more to the 18th tee. On the second trip to the par 3, Lin's tee shot caught the greenside bunker to the right of the green and she left her second shot from the sand well short of the hole, while Green two-putted for par to capture her third career win on the LPGA Tour and first win since 2019.

# Bayern Munich down Hertha to recapture top spot

Bayern Munich returned to the top of the Bundesliga after overpowering a stubborn Hertha Berlin 2-0, with goals from Serge Gnabry and Kingsley Coman in the final match of the 30th round.

The Bavarians dominated possession from the outset, but they had to wait until the 37th minute before Coman provided the first clear-cut opportunity, testing Hertha goalkeeper Oliver Christensen with a shot on goal.

Hertha kept all its men behind the ball, while Bayern gained momentum as Christensen had to defuse an attempt from Gnabry and Sadio Mane headed over the target from a promising position just before the break.

The German giants increased the pressure after the restart and pinned the visitors back. Hertha defended well but was helpless in the 69th minute when Joshua Kimmich's chipped ball found Gnabry, who nodded home the opener from close range.

Hertha's resistance was broken when Coman made it two, finishing off Kimmich's perfectly timed through ball, a Xinhua report



said.

Berlin showed signs of life in the closing stages, but Lucas Tousart pulled wide from 16 meters. Bayern produced the last chance of the match through Muller, who couldn't beat Christensen in the dying seconds of the game.

Elswhere, Wolfsburg reaped crucial points for a top-six finish after Jonas Wind's first-half brace helped the Wolves secure a 3-0 victory over Mainz, who suffered their first defeat after 10 games.

# PSG stunned by Lorient at home, Marseille rally to overcome Auxerre

Paris Saint-Germain's lead in the French Ligue 1 was reduced to five points on Sunday night after a humiliating 3-1 home defeat to Lorient, while second-placed Marseille rallied to beat Auxerre 2-1 in a later match.

The French defending champions had to play with one man down for most of the match as Achraf Hakimi was sent off only 20 minutes into the game after receiving a second yellow card for a stamp on Darlin Yongwa. The Morocco right-back also got booked for a tackle on Romain Faivre in the fifth minute.

Faivre, the 24-year-old French midfielder, organized the attack well for Lorient, sending a brilliant cross from the right to help Enzo Le Fee open the scoring for the visitors in the 15th.

Although Kylian Mbappe equalized for PSG before the half-hour mark, Faivre contributed another sensational solo performance in the 40th, drilling from the right and strolling past Marco Verratti and Juan Bernat to set up for Yongwa's goal, a Xinhua report said.

It was the sixth domestic league defeat, nine in all competitions, for Galtier's side in 2023. The result also handed a chance to their nearest rivals



Marseille, who clinched a comeback 2-1 victory at Auxerre to move only five points behind PSG on the table, with five games left in the season. Captain Birama Toure took the relegation-threatened hosts ahead in the 33rd minute, but Marseille pushed hard for the equalizer.

Third-placed Lens will move to within six points of PSG if they win at Toulouse today, and a heavy-weight clash will be staged next Saturday when Lens host Marseille at Stade Bollaert-Delelis.

## BANGLADESH SCRAPS ONE TEST AGAINST AFGHANISTAN DUE TO TIGHT SCHEDULE



Dhaka | The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) have scrapped one Test from the upcoming home series against Afghanistan, scheduled in June.

According to the original itinerary, Bangladesh were scheduled to play two Tests, three ODIs and as many T20Is at home but they have decided to scrap one Test because of their very tight schedule, a Cricbuzz report said on Monday. BCB cricket operation chairman Jalal Yunus said that their schedule was very tight and that they want to concentrate more on white-ball cricket in preparation for the 50-over World Cup to be held in India later this year. BCB was also planning to organise a 10-day long skill camp in Bengaluru or the UAE but they haven't been able to finalise yet, with the schedule for the World Cup not yet announced. If the board cannot hold any skill camp abroad, they will prepare for the showpiece event at home. Bangladesh is next scheduled to play a three-match ODI series in Ireland on May 9, 12 and 14. This series is part of the World Cup Super League.
