

INDIA'S GDP NUMBERS HIGHER THAN EXPECTED'

ndia's gross domestic product (GDP) growth for FY23 is estimated at 7.2 per cent, the National Statistical Office (NSO) announced on Wednesday.

According to NSO, which comes under the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, the growth in real GDP during 2022-23 is estimated at 7.2 per cent as compared to 9.1 per cent in 2021-22.

The GDP growth during the fourth quarter of 2022-23 was at 6.1 per cent, NSO said. However, economists were of the view that the numbers were higher than what was expected earlier. The NSO said the GDP in the year 2022-23 is estimated to attain a level of Rs 160.06 lakh crore, as against the First Revised Estimates of GDP for the year 2021-22 of Rs 149.26 lakh crore. The growth in real GDP during 2022-23 is estimated at 7.2 per cent as compared to 9.1 per cent in 2021-22.

Similarly, the GDP in Q4 2022-23 is estimated at Rs 43.62 lakh crore, as against Rs 41.12 lakh crore in O4 2021-22, showing a growth of 6.1 per cent, the NSO said. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das, at the recent annual conference of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), had said there are chances of India's gross domestic product (GDP) for FY23 crossing the estimated 7 per cent growth going by the trends. GDP forecast of 6.5% for current fiscal looks possible, says government

New Delhi: With the growth rate for 2022-23 estimated to be 7.2 per cent, the government on Wednesday said that the risks to the GDP forecast of 6.5 per cent for the current fiscal (2023-24) are now evenly balanced than a few months ago.

"We are now prepared to say that risks to our GDP growth forecast of 6.5 per cent for 2023-24 are now more evenly balanced than a few months ago when downside risks to the forecast were greater," Chief Economic Adviser (CEA) V. Anantha Nageswaran told reporters after GDP data for the fourth quarter of 2022-23 and for the entire fiscal was released

According to official data, India posted a GDP growth of 6.1 per cent in the January-March period of 2022-23 as against 4.4 per cent in the preceding quarter. For the entire 2022-23, the growth rate was estimated at 7.2 per cent, which is higher than the advanced estimates of 7 per cent, but lower compared to 9.1 per cent recorded in 2021-22.

6.5 per cent. GDP growth at 7.2 per cent for fiscal 2023 indicates the economy has done better than expected. Importantly, this growth

comes on a higher base - due to upward revision of fiscal 2022 data, said Dharmakirti Joshi, Chief Economist, CRISIL. "We expect the

Govt's fiscal deficit moderates to 6.4%

New Delhi: The government's fiscal deficit moderated slightly to 6.4 per cent of the GDP in 2022-23 from 6.71 per cent in the corresponding period, according to the revenueexpenditure data released on Wednesday.

The Controller General of Accounts (CGA) said that the fiscal deficit in absolute terms was Rs 17,33,131 crore (provisional), which was marginally down from the amount projected in the revised estimates (RE) in the budget.

The CGA added that the government received Rs 24.56 lakh crore (101 per cent of corresponding RE 2022-23 of total receipts) during 2022-23. This comprised Rs 20.97 lakh crore tax revenue (Net to Centre), Rs 2.86 lakh crore of non-tax revenue and Rs 72,187 crore of non-debt capital receipts.

he Madhya Pradesh government has ordered a probe after a controversy erupted over the uniform of a private school in Damoh district, with some claiming that a part of it resembles 'hijab' (headscarf worn by Muslim women), officials said on Wednesday.

Earlier, it was alleged that a poster of Ganga Jamuna Higher Secondary School in Damoh showed girls, including Hindu students, wearing headscarves that looked like hijab.

Asked about the row, state home minister Narottam Mishra told reporters in Bhopal that the matter was first investigated by the district education officer. "No complaint was received in this regard. In view of the seriousness of the issue, the superintendent of police has been instructed to thoroughly investigate it," he said.

Meanwhile, Hindu outfits staged a protest at the district collector's office and submitted a memorandum demanding cancellation of the school's registration. They alleged that the school is forcing Hindu girl students to wear a hijab.

Allahabad HC rejects Muslim sides' plea in Gyanvapi case

he Allahabad High Court on Wednesday dismissed the plea of the Anjuman Intezamia Committee, which represents the Muslim side in the Gyanvapi Shrinagar Gauri case, challenging the maintainability of the Hindu side's case. The Hindu worshippers requested permission for daily worship of Hindu deities in the Gyanvapi mosque.

The high court has rejected the mosque committee's challenge to the 5 Hindu women worshippers' suit pending before the Varanasi court.Last year in December, the bench of Justice J.J. Munir reserved its judgment after hearing counsel for both parties at length.

With this, the court has upheld the September 12, 2022 order of the Varanasi court, holding the said suit to be maintainable.

The Masjid Committee had moved the High Court in October



2022, days after the Varanasi court dismissed its plea (filed under Order 7 Rule 11 CPC) challenging the maintainability of a suit filed by five Hindu women (plaintiffs) seeking worshipping rights in the Gyanvapi compound.

In the order, Varanasi District Judge Ajay Krishna Vishwesha had observed that the suit of the plaintiffs is not barred by the Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, 1991, The Waqf Act 1995, and the U.P. Shri Kashi Vishwanath Temple Act, 1983 as was being claimed by the Anjuman Masjid Committee (which manages Gyanvapi Masjid).


Fastest Indian train of British-era, Punjab Mail completes 111 years

he popular and reliable 'Punjab Mail' -- the fastest train to zip across the subcontinent from Bombay (now, Mumbai) to Peshawar (now in Pakistan), completed 111 years on Wednesday and will step into its 112th year of operations on Thursday, Central Railway officials said here.

Sixteen years 'senior' to the more glamorous Frontier Mail (now, Golden Temple Mail) plying almost on a similar route via the Western Railway, the Punjab Mail was originally known as 'Punjab Limited' and steamed out in a cloud of smoke from the erstwhile Ballar Pier Mole station in south Mumbai for its long journey to Peshawar in the north.

CR officials say that though the exact origins of the Punjab Limited are unclear, based on a Cost Estimate Paper of 1911 and a passenger complaint of October 12, 1912 about its few minutes 'late arrival' at



Delhi station, it has been concluded that the train made her maiden run on June 1, 1912.For the northern destinations it was mostly the Punjab Mail running on fixed days from Bombay to Peshawar via the GIP route, traversing the 2,496 km distance in 47 hours.

The train was immortalised in a Bollywood film, "Punjab Mail" (1939), with scenes shot in "Jab We Met" (2007), among many others in different languages.

Siddaramaiah asks Shinde to release water for drinking needs

arnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Wednesday wrote to his Maharashtra counterpart Eknath Shinde asking him to release water from Warna/Kovna reservoir to Krishna River and from Ujjani reservoir to Bhima River for drinking water needs in his state.

"The north Karnataka districts of Belagavi, Vijayapura, Bagalkot, Kalaburgi, Yadgir and Raichur are facing acute shortage of drinking water due to severe summer

since March 2023. The earlier request of Government of Karnataka during this summer season, for release of 3 TMC of water from Warna/Koyna reservoir to Krishna river and 3 TMC of water from Ujjani Reservoir to Bhima River to meet the drinking water needs of human beings and livestock has been considered by the Government of Maharashtra and 1 TMC of water has been released to Krishna river in the first fortnight of May 2023. I hereby convey my sincere thanks to the Government of Maharashtra," he said in the letter.

"The severe summer situation in the northern districts of Karnataka is still prevailing and the humans and livestock are in need of water for domestic use. The monsoon in north Karnataka region is yet to commence. In view of the above, I request you to direct the concerned authorities to immediately release 2 TMC of water from Warna/Koyna reservoir to Krishna River and 3 TMC of water from Ujjani Reservoir to Bhima River to meet the drinking water needs of both humans and livestock of northern Karnataka," he wrote.



Trial courts not to direct foreigners be sent to detention centre while granting bail: Delhi HC

he Delhi High Court has said that the trial courts cannot direct foreign nationals be sent to a detention centre while granting them bail in cases lodged against them here



The court noted the petitioner has already been in de facto custody for two years, when the maximum punishment under the Excise Act nav extend to three years and under the Foreigners Act for five years, and directed his release from the detention centre on a personal bond and surety bond of Rs 1 lakh each. A bench of Justice Anish Dayal was hearing a plea submitted by a Nigerian man, who was sent to a detention facility by a magistrate's court even while being granted bail in a criminal case brought under the Delhi Excise Act and the Foreigners Act in April 2021 as his visa had expired.

A sessions court then directed his release from the detention facility on the condition that he comply with a number of requirements, but the petitioner argued before the high court that he hadn't yet been released.

Justice Dayal said: "The petitioner once being enlarged on bail cannot be detained without due process of law. The fact that he is facing trial for offences under the Excise Act and the Foreigners Act cannot be held against him, considering he still is to be proved guilty post trial. Right now, is the issue of his freedom.'

"A Magistrates Court or a Sessions Court cannot, as part of enlarging a foreign national on bail, can also direct the said person to be sent to a detention centre. The Court is not competent to pass such a direction when granting bail as has been conclusively held in various decisions. Detention centres are not for judicial custody but a place where a foreign national is detained on an executive order and is the prerogative of the competent authority under the Foreigners Act," he added.

The court said that while issuing such individuals a special permit, visa, or travel document would not legitimise the earlier offence of having overstayed in violation of the provisions of the Foreigners Act but would ensure they are not confined in a detention centre at state expense.

NIA raids 25 locations in 3 states, seizes incriminating material in PFI related case

he National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Wednesday raided 25 locations in three states in connection with the Popular Front of India (PFI) conspiracy to radicalise and train its cadres and members for carrying out acts of terror and violence.

A NIA official said that searches were conducted at the premises of suspects in Katihar district of Bihar; Dakshina Kannada, and Shimoga districts of Karnataka; and Kasaragod, Malappuram, Kozhikode and Thiruvananthapuram districts of Kerala

"A slew of digital devices, including mobile phones, hard disk, SIM cards, pen-drives, data cards, incriminating documents and materials related to the banned organisation were seized during the raids. Indian currency of the face value of Rs 17,50,100 has also been seized," said the official.

The NIA said that so far 85 locations have been raided during investigation in the case.

"Acting on a tip-off, the Bihar police had carried out a raid at the rented



premises of one Athar Parvez on July 11, 2022, and had seized incriminating articles related to PFI including a document titled "India 2047 Towards Rule of Islamic India, Internal

Document: Not for circulation". Athar Parvez was arrested along with Md. Jalaluddin Khan, Arman Malick alias Imtevaz Anwer and Nooruddin Zangi alias Advocate Nooruddin," said the

official. The official said that a chargesheet

was filed by the NIA against all the accused on January 7, 2023. Later, ten more accused were

arrested for promoting the unlawful and anti-national activities of the PFI and channelising illegal funds from abroad to the PFI members/accused persons.

The NIA also found that multiple channels were being operated on popular video platforms by persons suspected to be associated with the PFI. These channels were distributing content aimed at inciting communal violence and terror in India. The suspects, having international links, were also indulging in propagation of PFI ideology using the social media.

local organisation in Meghalaya has demanded 4 per cent reservations in government jobs for the members of the Muslim community.

The Anti-Corruption League (ACL), representing the 'Desi' Muslims inhabiting the plains of Garo Hills region, has written to Chief Minister Conrad K. Sangma demanding 4 per cent reservations in government jobs for Muslims in the state, which is dominated by Christians. The ACL letter was sent to the Chief Minister on Tuesday, the day when the Meghalaya government reconstituted a committee to chalk out a plan to implement the reservation roster system and the state reservation policy. A spokesman of ACL said on Wednesday that in the letter, it was mentioned that the state's non-tribal population was 20 per cent when Meghalaya was carved out of Assam in 1972. "Despite being a part of Assam and the Assamese culture for centuries, the Desi' Muslims extended their support for a separate hill state with high hopes that their rights and socio-economic aspirations will be protected and accommodated in the new state," the ACL said. The letter added "It was also promised that our rights and aspirations, our growth and development will be given equal priority and importance as that of the tribal people of Meghalaya. But the assurances were never fulfilled."

According to the 2011 Census, Christians constitute 74.59 per cent of Meghalaya's 29.67 lakh populations, while Muslims and Hindus constitute 4.40 per cent and 11.53 per cent, respectively.

Meghalaya's 51-year-old job reservation policy entails 80 per cent quota for three matrilineal communities - Garo, Khasi, and Jaintia. The quota is divided equally between the Garos and the Khasi-Jaintia people together. Another 5 per cent is reserved for other minor tribes', while 15 per cent is reserved for people in the unreserved categories. The Garo tribals are educationally more backward and numerically lower than the Khasi-Jaintia people, and they have hardly been able to get the full benefit of the reservation of 40 per cent.

A person named Z.R. Marak had earlier approached the Meghalaya High Court claiming that other communities were using up the quota meant for the Garo people in violation of the relevant laws.

A local organisation in Meghalaya has demanded 4 per cent reservations in government jobs for the members of the Muslim community. The Anti-Corruption League (ACL), representing the 'Desi' Muslims inhabiting the plains of Garo Hills region, has written to Chief Minister Conrad K. Sangma demanding 4 per cent reservations in government jobs for Muslims in the state, which is dominated by Christians.

CRICKET HAS TRULY MELLOWED FOR THE BETTER



The institute stated on Wednesday that it had received a total of 71,39,473 IVR calls this year until April 30, based on which this conclusion was reached. Among the consumers of tobacco, the highest number is 1,74,097 individuals who have passed their Class 10 exam. The National Tobacco Cessation Service (NTQLS) was initially established in a single room with sic counsellor stations, and it was expanded in 2020 by then Union Minister of State for Health, Ashwini Kumar Choubey.

week ago at the launch A of Aunshuman Gaekwad's book made of Aunshuman one truly understand how cricket has mellowed over the years. The biography is titled "Guts amidst Bloodbath", referring to an occurrence that many cricketers had to face to play the game in the past. "Stand up and be a man" was a comforting retort when one got hit by the hard red cherry, the cricket ball. India's first Test captain,

C.K.Nayudu, had a few of his teeth broken by a fast delivery while batting in an important match and after gargling, he continued to play his innings. He was an Army man, who believed in never giving in even an inch to his opponents or showing discomfort. This was considered to be the epitome of behaviour that one displayed if one wanted to play the game. Similarly, Aunshuman Gaekwad, when hit by a short delivery off Michael Holding directly on his ear while batting on 81 runs at Kingston, Jamaica in 1976, was coaxed to retire hurt, even though like a brave

Maratha soldier he refused to leave. The hit on his ear was the final blow, culminating in a barrage of short bowling by the West Indian pace attack, making its mark on several parts of his body. The brave Indian opener still suffers from the aftereffects of the blow but looks at the bloodbath then as a part and parcel of the game. The history of cricket has many such incidents and bravery of players who have withstood pain, and broken bones and yet stood up to conquer it all through sheer willpower. Guts were what one required then to play cricket without the protection that the present-day cricketers are privileged to have. The game of cricket has gone through a major change since those days, it was not a game for the faint-hearted. Looking back, one may call the battle between the bat and the ball a tussle of foolishness. The reason was that the batter was risking his life playing a sport that did not necessarily need him to get maimed or marred or lose his life. Life is precious and fortunately, the new laws of cricket have taken a serious view on making the sport as safe as possible. The adrenalin that flows through one's veins in one's youth somehow overpowers any negative thoughts and calamities which may arise while playing a sport. A person is willing to do daredevil feats at that age. Recollecting my experience at fielding at forward short-leg without any protection in my cricket playing days, the hits that I encountered at the suicidal position, make me shudder to think as to how I came through it all alive. This takes one



back to the critics and connoisseurs of the game of cricket. debating, questioning and arguing or comparing cricketers and their performances over the years. Foolish thoughts, especially when the conditions, regulations and attitudes have altered over the years. The barrage of bouncers and beamers that were faced by Sunil Gavaskar, Aunshuman Gaekwad and the other batters of the 1976 Indian team at Kingston, will never be understood by the youngsters of today. When the Indian team returned after this savage display of aggressive bowling, the diaspora saw them as players who lacked the skill and the heart to tackle it. England, thereafter, faced the same medicine of short balls and all hell broke loose. England under Douglas Jardine in 1932 employed the same strategy against Australia. The famous Bodyline series as it was called brought in restrictions of only two fielders who were allowed behind the popping crease on the leg-side. The bruised and battered English side of 1976, 44 years later, pleaded for restricting the number of shortpitch deliveries and succeeded in doing so. The beamer became unacceptable and the root of caring about the safety of the batter came to roost. The most interesting outcome, when players encounter the fierce and fiery, was that cricketers even after their furious tussles, respected each other and remained friends. The banter and laughter, thereafter, made one love the game even more. Unlike the cricketers of the past, cricket and cricketers of the present have mellowed

on the field. One can see such camaraderie amongst not only the Indian players but also amongst their international counterparts. The Indian Premier League (IPL) has been a great platform for bringing players together. The IPL'23 has moved to the home stretch with Chennai Super Kings, under the astute leadership of Mahendra Singh Dhoni, having already consolidated their place in the final. Mumbai Indians and Gujarat Titans will play against each other for one of them to take the other spot. Predicting a winner is still difficult, with each of these teams playing superlatively to be there. The IPL'23 is already a resounding success. India have unearthed some exciting young talented cricketers. The international players have had the opportunity to play on the Indian tracks and experience the Indian conditions. This will benefit them when they come in October to play the World Cup which is being held in India. Cricket is becoming a far more pleasant game. There seems to be an air of friendship and bonhomie that never existed before. With protection and rules to safeguard a player, the words such as "Guts" and "Bloodbath" have gradually become obsolete. Cricket has mellowed for the better. "The land that is being confiscated by the Chinese government is farmland, which is the livelihood of Tibetans," said the source, adding. "The authorities have warned the Tibetans not to show any kind of condemnation." Rebgong, called Tongren in Chinese, is in Malho, or Huangnan, Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture, a Tibetan

On Monday, Saudi Arabia and the US announced in a joint statement that the Sudanese warring parties agreed to a fiveday extension of the ceasefire agreement signed by the two sides on May 20. The extension will provide a lull for humanitarian assistance, restoration of essential services, and discussion of a

potential longer-term extension, the statement said. Sudan has been witnessing deadly armed clashes between the Sudanese Army and the RSF in the capital Khartoum and other areas since April 15. orth Korea fired what it. claims to be a "space launch vehicle" son Wednesday, but it fell into the Yellow Sea after an "abnormal" flight, the South Korean military said, in a botched launch that defied international criticism and warnings. The North confirmed the failure, saying its new "Chollima-1" rocket carrying a military reconnaissance satellite, "Malligyong-1", fell into the


sea due to the "abnormal starting of the second-stage engine". according to its official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA). It plans to conduct a second launch as soon as possible, Yonhap News Agency quoted the KCNA as saying. Seoul's Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said it detected the launch from Tongchang-ri on the North's west coast at 6.29 a.m. and the projectile fell into waters some 200 km west of the South's southwestern island of Eocheong fol-



lowing its flight over the waters far west of the border island of Baengnyeong. The South Korean military identified an apparent part of the North's vehicle and retrieved it, the JCS added. The North notified Japan and the International Maritime Organization of its plan earlier this week to launch a satellite between May 31 and June 11 despite criticism that it would violate UN Security Council resolutions banning any launch using ballistic missile technology. The

reclusive regime last launched a rocket carrying what it called a "Kwangmyongsong-4" satellite in February 2016. On Tuesday, Ri Pyong-chol, vice chairman of the Central Military Commission of the North's ruling Workers' Party of Korea, had made the launch plan official, defending its pursuit of the satellite and other reconnaissance means as "indispensable" to cope with "dangerous military acts of the US and South Korea". The rocket launch

marks the North's first such provocation since it fired what it claimed to be a Hwasong-18 intercontinental ballistic missile on April 13. The North previously launched what it called a satellite-carrying rocket five times -- one each in 1998, 2009 and 2016, and twice in 2012. The country claimed to have put a satellite into orbit after its launch in December 2012 and 2016. But it remains unknown whether they have been functioning normally.

MVA predicts joint polls for Maha Assembly-parliament in 2024

he Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) has predicted simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha and Maharashtra Assembly with the likelihood of a "coalition government at the Centre" in 2024. Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) President Javant Patil and Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut both pointed to the probability of a combined elections in the state, while the Congress President Nana Patole and Leader of Opposition Ajit Pawar have said that in such an eventuality, the MVA is "fully geared" to fight the polls unitedly. Raut went a step further to forecast that post-2024, the country will witness a return to the coalition-era politics, and challenged the ruling Shiv Sena-Bharatiya Janata Party regime to immediately announce the pending polls to various civic bodies in the state. "I challenge them to conduct the elections to 14 major civic bodies including Mumbai, Thane, Pune, Aurangabad, Nagpur and othersa it will make clear the claims of the ruling alliance on their strengtha" dared Raut. Reiterating that NCP President Sharad Pawar and Sena (UBT)'s former Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray will be attending the meeting of all major non-BJP Opposition parties in Patna on



June 12, Raut said that the endeavour would be to field single candidates against the BJP in at least 400 seats in the next Lok Sabha polls, as proposed by Congress leader P. Chidambaram. Patil and Raut also feel that given the current political scenario in the state there is a strong likelihood of the Lok Sabha and Maharashtra Assembly polls -- due in October 2024 -- being held simultaneously. To the Sena (UBT)'s demand for holding the civic polls, ruling Shiv Sena leader Sanjay Shirsat threw the



gauntlet back at Raut, challenging him to contest and win any election in the state. However, the leaders of the ruling alliance have dismissed the MVA contentions saving it is too early to speak on these things and ultimately all this (joint polls) will be decided by the Election Commission of India. Despite the continuous bickering among theAthree partners, the MVA leaders have reiterated that they will fight all the future elections together to save democracy and the Constitution.

Maha CM: Ahmednagar to be renamed as 'Ahilyadevi Holkar Nagar'

n a major announcement, Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde said on Wednesday that the name of Ahmednagar district shall be changed to 'Ahilyadevi Holkar Nagar' in memory of the great queen of Malwa state who ruled from 1767-1795. The

announcement came on her 298 birth anniversary celebrations at Chaundi, the village where Ahilyadevi was born on May 31, 1725, which was attended by Shinde and Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis. "We have taken a decision to change the name of Ahmednagar after Ahilyadevi Holkar... It's the desire of all the people here," Shinde said, as the large crowd roared its approval. Shinde said he was fortunate to earlier change the name of Aurangabad to 'Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar' and Osmanabad as 'Dharashiv', and now Ahmednagar will



become 'Ahilyadevi Holkar Nagar' on the birth anniversary of the great queen. Shinde said that Ahilyadevi's name is as tall as the Himalayas, and she did a lot for the farmers and workers of her kingdom, adding that this would be a fitting honour on her birth anniversary celebrations. A ruler of the

Maratha Empire, Queen Ahilyadevi Holkar ascended the Malwa state throne after the deaths of her husband Khanderao Holkar, her father-in-law Malharrao Holkar and her son Malerao Holkar, aged barely 22. During her 28-year long reign (1767-1795) - considered as the golden period of the Maratha Empire - she did a lot for the tillers and ordinary folks, built or restored temples, defended the state, its people, even led battles against the Mughals with her trusted team headed by her nephew Tukoji Holkar, to carved her own niche in history.

As per the preliminary information, these children were being brought from Bihar and sent to Sangli, the official said, adding that the five accused were booked under the anti-human trafficking laws. NCP seeks police action against websites for 'slur' on Savitribai Phule

high-level delegation of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) n Wednesday called on Mumbai Commissioner of Police Vivek Phansalkar demanding stringent action against two websites for publishing 'derogatory' articles on the legendary social reformer and India's pioneering woman teacher, Savitribai Phule. The delegation, comprising state NCP President Jayant Patil, Leader of Opposition Ajit Pawar, senior leader Chhagan Bhujbal, MP Sunil Tatkare and others submitted a two-page memorandum to Phansalkar, listing the names of the websites and their offensive remarks. The memorandum said that a person claiming to be 'Bharadwaj' had made the objectionable remarks against Savitribai (1831-1897) -- considered the pioneer of women's education from the mid-1850s -- who is revered in the state and country. "The comments are so low that I can't mention them and feel embarrassed even to talk about ita We have requested the police to immediately book the two websites, the authors and



also remove the article from all media platforms," an irate Pawar said. Earlier, Bhujbal said he had shot off a letter to Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and the Phansalkar bringing to their notice the derogatory language used against Savitribai in its January 2022 articles, among other things, questioning her credentials as a teacher. Bhujbal pointed out that the NCP sought action and given enough time to the government and police but no action has been taken

yet. He said that the attempts to malign the legendary educator was "highly condemnable, outrageous and painful", with the websites seeking to rearrange and destroy Indian history. The articles have also stirred a raging debate on social media with many slamming the authors for the vituperative references and outrageous insinuations against the iconic social reformer, and questioning her historical contributions as an academic trail-blazer.





WTC FINAL Indian batters will have to work on bat speed, says Gavaskar

Batting great Sunil Gavaskar feels that the Indian batters will have to work on their bat speed control in order to make that transition from the fast-paced T20 format to the Test cricket as they are going to face Australia in the upcoming World Test Championship final from June 7 at The Oval. Gavaskar emphasised the need for batters to play as late as possible in English conditions, allowing for swing and avoiding the mistake of reaching out for the ball. "I think they are going to look at their bat speed. Coming from T20 where the bat speed is very fast to test cricket where the bat speeds have to be a lot more controlled,

that is something they'll need to do. They'll need to play in England as late as possible to allow for the swing to do its bit, not to reach out for the ball which often a lot of people make the mistake of having played on good pitches," said Gavaskar on Star Sports' 'Follow the Blues'. "Wherever you play on good pitches, you tend to play through the line, not necessarily half volleys, but in England those deliveries can move just that little bit. So, I think those are the things that as a batter you need to watch out for. As a bowling unit also you'll need to bowl a much fuller length for your new ball, for the bowlers to be able to get the movement in the air as well as after pitching," he added.

Days after IPL 2023 final, Gujarat Titans pacer Mohit Sharma has opened up on his heartbreaking last over, where star allrounder Ravindra Jadeja hit him for a six and boundary in the last two balls for a thrilling Chennai Super Kings victory,

saying that he couldn't sleep and kept thinking what different could have been done.

"My mind was very clear about what I wanted to do. In the nets, I had practiced such situations and I have been in such scenarios before too. So I said let me bowl all balls yorkers and was backing my instinct," Mohit told Indian Express.

"They wanted to know what will be his plan of action. I said I will again try to bowl yorker. People are now saying this and that but frankly it has no meaning. I knew what I wanted to do," Mohit revealed. "I ran and tried to bowl (yorker)



again. I just wanted to be focussed and back myself. Whole IPL I have done that. The ball landed where it shouldn't have and Jadeja got his bat. I tried, I tried my best, " said Mohit.

"I couldn't sleep. Sochta raha kya alag karta joh match jeet jaate. What if I could have bowled this ball or that ball? It's not a nice feeling now. Somewhere something is missing but I'm trying to move on," he added

FRENCH OPEN Medvedev suffers shocking firstround defeat, Swiatek battles through

World No. 2 Daniil Medvedev, experienced a shocking defeat in the opening round at the French Open this year as the highestranked player to be eliminated so early when he fell to Brazilian qualifier Thiago Seyboth Wild, 7-6(5), 6-7(6), 2-6, 6-3, 6-

Before the clay-court major, Seyboth Wild had only competed in one Grand Slam tournament - the 2020 US Open and hadn't yet claimed a main draw victory at a Tour-level event, reports Xinhua.

The 23-year-old made 69 winners and, after losing two set points in the second set tie-break, elevated his game in the final two sets to record the most significant victory of his career.

Medvedev arrived in Paris freshly triumphant, having secured his first claytournament title just a week prior in Rome, but his second Grand Slam title



ing the Spaniard 6-4, 6-0, setting up a second-round clash against American No. 102 Claire Liu.

American sixth seed Coco Gauff, the 2022 Roland Garros finalist, rallied from a set down to overcome Spain's Rebeka Masarova 3-6, 6-1, 6-2, avoiding an early exit.Wimbledon champion Elena Rybakina of Kazakhstan triumphed 6-4, 6-2 over Brenda Fruhvirtova of the Czech Republic.

Earlier in the day, last year's men's finalist Casper Ruud returned to Paris in winning style. The Norwegian advanced to the clay-court major's second round for the sixth successive season, defeating Swedish qualifier Elias Ymer in straight sets, 6-4, 6-3, 6-2.

The fourth seed struck 28 winners against 17 from his No. 155-ranked opponent, concluding the victory in two hours and seven minutes on Court Suzanne-Lenglen.

Overall, Mohit had an outstanding IPL 2023 season, finishing with 27 wickets in 14 matches for runnersup Gujarat Titans. hopes were dashed at the outset.

The 27-year-old, who claimed the US Open championship in 2021, had won five titles this season, including two ATP

Masters tournaments, surpassing any

other player on the Tour. In women's play, top seed Iga Swiatek swiftly found he

was initially challenged in the opening set against Cristina Bucsa. However, she swiftly found her momentum, dispatchsecutive final appearances last year, one at Roland Garros and another at the US Open where he was narrowly defeated by Spaniard Carlos Alcaraz.

Hazlewood reveals insights into Kohli's success ahead of WTC Final

A head of the World Test Championship Final, Australian pacer Josh Hazlewood, who has played alongside Virat Kohli on more occasions than against him in recent times, revealed what makes the India star so good at his craft.

Hazlewood has spent the past two years with Kohli by his side at Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) in the IPL and the experienced Australia quick has seen up close just why the India great continues to be rated as one of the best batters in world cricket.

While Hazlewood -- if selected -- will be doing everything he can to take the key wicket of Kohli and lead Australia to glory in the ICC World Test Championship Final, the pacer has spent the last



two years watching the India star closely and trying to work out why he is so good. The 32-year old Australian feels it is Kohli's

strong work ethic that puts the India batter ahead of the rest and allows him to remain one of the most prized scalps in Test cricket.

"I think it's probably how hard he works (that stands out). His fitness first of all -- and then his skill work and batting and fielding in particular," Hazlewood told the ICC.

"He is always out there (training) first and leaves last and the intensity he trains at all the time is at such a high level it drags everyone else along for the ride. That can leak on to the other players and improve them as well," he added.

Kohli isn't the only World Test Championship rival that has impressed Hazlewood at RCB, with in-form seamer Mohammed Siraj another one of the Australian's IPL teammates that he will be out to beat in the one-off Test at The Oval from June 7.
