Madhya Pradesh Four of a family, including a recently married couple, were burnt alive in Madhya Pradesh after their car crashed into a tree on Wednesday, police said. Videos show the totaled car engulfed in flames, smashed into a tree by the road.

Police said they were informed of the crash early this morning. When they reached the spot with the fire brigade, the car had already been badly burnt.

"Three men and one woman were burnt alive after the car sped into a tree in Harda district. They were returning from a wedding," a police official said. He added that a couple killed in the tragedy had been married six months ago. Police added that further investigation is underway.

Last week, four people were killed and 15 others injured when a sleeper bus collided with a trolley in Shajapur. The bus, en route to Ahmedabad, was carrying passengers when the deadly collision took place

Docs from Gandhi Medical College, NHM meet to address Thalassemia

National Health Mission (NHM) Madhya Pradesh and Gandhi Medical College in collaboration with ECHO India, launched a capacity-building programme focused on the prevention and control of Beta Thalassemia and Hemoglobinopathies.

An initial batch of 50 doctors from various districts of Madhya Pradesh attended the first session of their capacity-building programme, which is aimed at improving their skills in the screening, early diagnosis, treatment, and overall management of genetic blood disorders. There is a need for awareness and screening of this disease, particularly in Madhya Pradesh, so that it can be identified, and possible treatment can be initiated in a timely manner. It is also necessary to improve the care of patients with Beta Thalassemia by utilizing the latest medical and scientific techniques.

Under the National Health Mission's Hemoglobinopathy Mission, a special action plan has been developed and implemented for genetic blood disorders such as Sickle Cell Anemia,

Thalassemia, and Hemophilia. Sickle Cell Anemia is prevalent in the tribal districts of the state, and Thalassemia is also widespread in other districts of Madhya Pradesh. Both diseases result in a decrease in the patient's lifespan due to blood deficiency and associated complications. Screening for Sickle Cell Anemia is already being conducted in the tribal districts of Madhya Pradesh. The "World Thalassemia Day" is celebrated annually on May 8. This year, in commemoration of National Thalassemia Day, special training modules have been prepared by experts. Madhya Pradesh will be the first to implement these modules in collaboration with ECHO India, providing training to specialists and doctors working in health institutions across districts. A well-equipped telemonitoring hub has been established at the Gandhi Medical College (GMC) Bhopal, which will be used to conduct a wide range of capacity-building initiatives as part of this program. Post Graduate Institute of Child Health (PGICH) Noida serves as the national hub for this three-years long program, with NHM MP as one of the three regional knowledge hubs.

CM Shivraj Singh Chouhan lays foundation stone of Devi Lok at Salkanpur

Madhya Pradesh CM Shivraj Singh Chouhan laid the foundation stone for Devi Lok at Vijayvan Devi temple in Sehore, following the development of Mahakal Lok in Ujjain. Costing over Rs 200 crore, the project will educate devotees on the nine forms of the goddess and will establish 64 murals of Yogini. Chouhan said such development would promote religion and culture, and inspire the youth towards religion. An action plan of over Rs 211 crore has been prepared for the construction of Devi Lok. The project is estimated to cost over Rs 200 crore. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led state government has announced to develop at least half a dozen religious places in Madhya Pradesh. In a first, Mahakal Lok has been developed at Mahakaleshwar Temple, one of the Jyotirlinga of Lord Shiva, in Ujjain. It was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in December 2022.

At the programme, Chouhan said, "The decision of developing Devi Lok was taken as Goddess inspired me to



do so. It will be one of its kind where devotees will learn everything about Goddesses. Nine forms of Goddess will be established with 64 murals of Yogini." Commenting on the promotion of religion and culture, the CM said many people feel that the work of the government is only to build roads, bridges, hospitals, and make arrangements for water. "Why did Shivraj start building the temple? Is it the job of the government or not? To

promote our religion and our culture... grand temples should be built and may the goddess bless everyone. If the temple is built then the youth will be inclined towards religion," he said. In Devi Lok, all the stories of goddesses will be described in the scriptures. An action plan of more than Rs 211 crore has been prepared for the construction of Devi Lok. Along with this, development and construction works are being done

for the convenience of the devotees coming here. The CM said if requires more funds will be released for the Devi Lok. Requesting anonymity, an officer of the tourism and culture department said, "The cost of the project will increase as we will not install murals made of Fibre Reinforced Plastic (FRP) after recent controversy over tumbling of the FRP statues due to gusty wind at Mahakal Lok."

E-rickshaw bursts into flames after short circuit in charging point at New Market

Bhopal: An e-rickshaw burst into flames triggered by a short-circuit in the charging point at New Market on Wednesday early morning. Fortunately, the e-rickshaw was vacant at the time of the incident and nobody was hurt.

Timely action by the firefighters prevented the flames to spread over a dozen vehicles parked around the e-rickshaw. The fire, which started around 5:00 AM, was quickly noticed by the on-site fire personnel who jump into action. They managed to prevent the fire, ensuring the safety of the surrounding vehicles.

Firefighter Ayaz explained that the fire originated from a short circuit in the charging point of the electric rickshaw, gradually covering the entire vehicle.

Will reprise case of Digvijaya-era 'irregularities' surrounding Indore mall, says BJP chief

The BJP leader did not elaborate about whose orders the case would be reopened. Hearing a petition, the Indore Bench of the Madhya Pradesh High Court had in 2012

directed the CBI to probe into alleged irregularities in the construction of the shopping mall.

It was alleged that in 2002, at the behest of the then CM Digvijaya Singh, the proposal for the construction of this commer-

cial centre was approved by the State government in contravention of rules. In its final status report submitted to the district court in 2014, the CBI had said that ex-CM Singh, then Chief Secretary A.V. Singh and former housing and Environment Minister Chaudhary Rakesh Singh had not had any role in this case.

The Congress recently accused the ruling BJP of indulging in corruption after six idols installed on the 'Shri Mahakal Lok' corridor in temple town Ujjain fell and broke due to gusty winds. Sharma targeted former Congress CMs Kamal Nath and Singh, claiming that the State Secretariat Vallabh Bhavan had been made a centre of corruption under their charge. The BJP leader said the

idols at the Mahakal Lok Corridor fell "due to a natural calamity", asserting that the State government was "sensitive" to the importance of the matter and would take appropriate steps.

Reacting to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's statements in the U.S., Sharma said, "He will talk as much as he has intelligence. But Prime Minister Modi's leadership is being appreciated across the world. Rahul likes only America and Britain because the same genes which are symbols of slavery are still in his blood."

Sharma, who represents the Khajuraho constituency in the Lok Sabha, alleged that Gandhi stood by people working against the integrity of India, hence he was denigrating the PM.

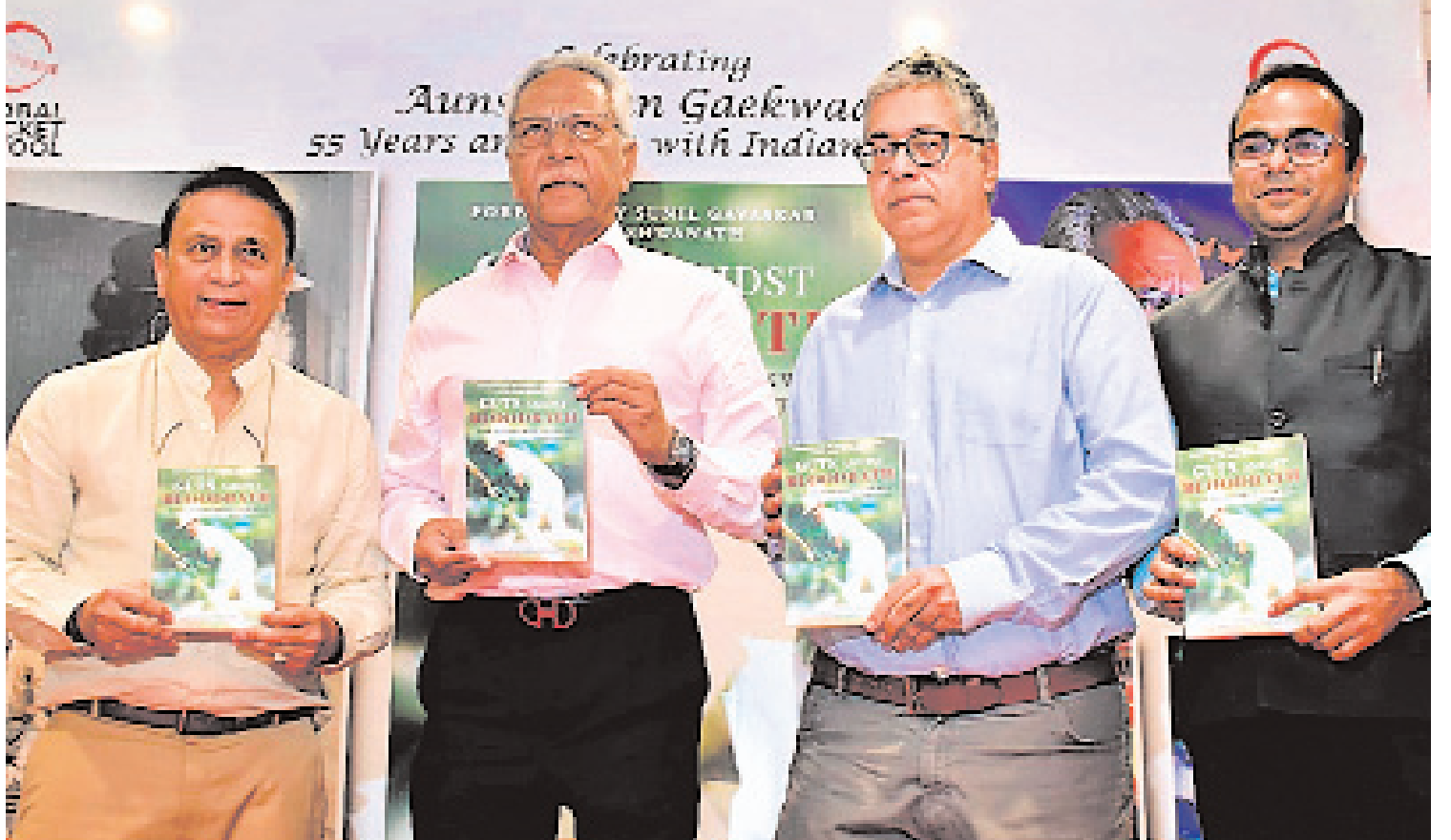

A survey by Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute here has revealed that Class 10 pass students were the highest in numbers among the consumers of tobacco products. The institute stated on Wednesday that it had received a total of 71,39,473 IVR calls this year until April 30, based on which this conclusion was reached. On Wednesday, the institute observed World No Tobacco Day and presented this data. "Out of the total number of IVR calls received by this center this year until April 30, 20,43,227 calls were counselled, including 9,96,302 inbound calls, 26,80,657 outbound calls, and 3,91,160 registered by the call center. A total of 1,56,644 individuals have successfully given up tobacco use," it said. The institute further stated that the statistics revealed that most of these calls originated from Uttar Pradesh, with a total of 1,23,508 calls. The data also indicates that males make up the highest percentage at 98 per cent, followed by transgender individuals at 5 per cent of the total population, while females comprise the lowest percentage. Among the consumers of tobacco, the highest number is 1,74,097 individuals who have passed their Class 10 exam. The National Tobacco Cessation Service (NTQLS) was initially established in a single room with six counselor stations, and it was expanded in 2020 by then Union Minister of State for Health, Ashwini Kumar Choubey.

CRICKET HAS TRULY MELLOWED FOR THE BETTER

A week ago at the launch of Aunshuman Gaekwad's book made one truly understand how cricket has mellowed over the years. The biography is titled "Guts amidst Bloodbath", referring to an occurrence that many cricketers had to face to play the game in the past. "Stand up and be a man" was a comforting retort when one got hit by the hard red cherry, the cricket ball. India's first Test captain, C.K.Nayudu, had a few of his teeth broken by a fast delivery while batting in an important match and after gargling, he continued to play his innings. He was an Army man, who believed in never giving in even an inch to his opponents or showing discomfort. This was considered to be the epitome of behaviour that one displayed if one wanted to play the game. Similarly, Aunshuman Gaekwad, when hit by a short delivery off Michael Holding directly on his ear while batting on 81 runs at Kingston, Jamaica in 1976, was coaxed to retire hurt, even though like a brave Maratha soldier he refused to leave. The hit on his ear was the final blow, culminating in a barrage of short bowling by the West Indian pace attack, making its mark on several parts of his body. The brave Indian opener still suffers from the aftereffects of the blow but looks at the bloodbath then as a part and parcel of the game. The history of cricket has many such incidents and bravery of players who have withstood pain, and broken bones and yet stood up to conquer it all through sheer willpower. Guts were what one required then to play cricket without the protection that the present-day cricketers are privileged to have. The game of cricket has gone through a major change since those days, it was not a game for the faint-hearted. Looking back, one may call the battle between the bat and the ball a tussle of foolishness. The reason was that the batter was risking his life playing a sport that did not necessarily need him to get maimed or marred or lose his life. Life is precious and fortunately, the new laws of cricket have taken a serious view on making the sport as safe as possible. The adrenaline that flows through one's veins in one's youth somehow overpowers any negative thoughts and calamities which may arise while playing a sport. A person is willing to do daredevil feats at that age. Recollecting my experience at fielding at forward short-leg without any protection in my cricket playing days, the hits that I encountered at the suicidal position, make me shudder to think as to how I came through it all alive. This takes one



back to the critics and connoisseurs of the game of cricket, debating, questioning and arguing or comparing cricketers and their performances over the years. Foolish thoughts, especially when the conditions, regulations and attitudes have altered over the years. The barrage of bouncers and batters that were faced by Sunil Gavaskar, Aunshuman Gaekwad and the other batters of the 1976 Indian team at Kingston, will never be understood by the youngsters of today. When the Indian team returned after this savage display of aggressive bowling, the diaspora saw them as players who lacked the skill and the heart to tackle it. England, thereafter, faced the same medicine of short balls and all hell broke loose. England under Douglas Jardine in 1932 employed the same strategy against Australia. The famous Bodyline series as it was called brought in restrictions of only two fielders who were allowed behind the popping crease on the leg-side. The bruised and battered English side of 1976, 44 years later, pleaded for restricting the number of short-pitch deliveries and succeeded in doing so. The beamer became unacceptable and the root of caring about the safety of the batter came to roost. The most interesting outcome, when players encounter the fierce and fiery, was that cricketers even after their furious tussles, respected each other and remained friends. The banter and laughter, thereafter, made one love the game even more. Unlike the cricketers of the past, cricket and cricketers of the present have mellowed

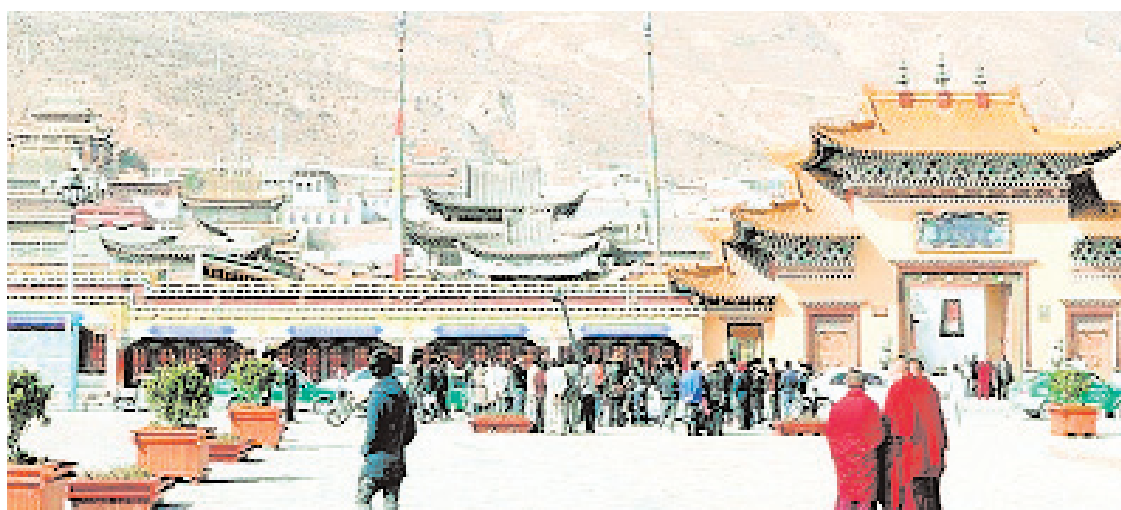
on the field. One can see such camaraderie amongst not only the Indian players but also amongst their international counterparts. The Indian Premier League (IPL) has been a great platform for bringing players together. The IPL'23 has moved to the home stretch with Chennai Super Kings, under the astute leadership of Mahendra Singh Dhoni, having already consolidated their place in the final. Mumbai Indians and Gujarat Titans will play against each other for one of them to take the other spot. Predicting a winner is still difficult, with each of these teams playing superlatively to be there. The IPL'23 is already a resounding success. India have unearthed some exciting young talented cricketers. The international players have had the opportunity to play on the Indian tracks and experience the Indian conditions. This will benefit them when they come in October to play the World Cup which is being held in India. Cricket is becoming a far more pleasant game. There seems to be an air of friendship and bonhomie that never existed before. With protection and rules to safeguard a player, the words such as "Guts" and "Bloodbath" have gradually become obsolete. Cricket has mellowed for the better. TIBETANS IN WESTERN CHINA ORDERED TO VACATE LAND FOR DAM CONSTRUCTION

Chinese authorities have ordered Tibetans living in Rebgong county in western China to vacate their land for the construction of a hydropower dam, forcing them off the farmlands they need to make a living, media reports said. Authorities in Lingya village, about an hour's drive from Rebgong, issued the order on May 23, requiring residents of seven villages in the region to move so that the Chinese government can begin the first phase of construction 10 days after the notice's issue date, said a Tibetan from Rebgong who now lives in exile, RFA reported. "The land that is being confiscated by the Chinese government is farmland, which is the livelihood of Tibetans," said the source, adding, "The authorities have warned the Tibetans not to show any kind of condemnation." Rebgong, called Tongren in Chinese, is in Malho, or Huangnan, Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture, a Tibetan-



populated area in China's Qinghai province, RFA reported. Chinese authorities tightly control the residents of the restive Tibet Autonomous Region and Tibetan-populated regions of western China, restricting their political activities and peaceful expression of cultural

and religious identity. Chinese infrastructure and development projects in these areas have led to frequent stand-offs with Tibetans who accuse Chinese firms and local officials of improperly seizing land and disrupting the lives of local people. Many result in violent suppression, the

detention of protest organisers and intense pressure on the local population to comply with the government's wishes, RFA reported. Another Tibetan living in exile said authorities have begun confiscating land, but they have not discussed compensation for residents forced to move.

Sudanese Army chief threatens to use 'full lethal force' against rival RSF

Amidst an ongoing ceasefire, Sudanese Army chief Abdel Fattah Al-Burhan warned that he would use "full lethal force" against the warring rival, the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) if the latter does not respond to the voice of reason. Al-Burhan made the remarks while inspecting some of the Sudanese army units on Tuesday, according to a statement released by the Military Media. "The army is fighting this battle on behalf of the people and has not yet used its full lethal force," Al-Burhan said, adding it will be forced to do so if the RSF does not obey or respond to the voice of reason, reports Xinhua news agency. "All army areas and divisions still maintain all their forces after they took control of all parts of the country," Al-Burhan was quoted as saying. He stressed that the armed



forces would remain ready to fight until victory. Meanwhile, Al-Burhan confirmed that the Sudanese army agreed to extend the ceasefire agreement to facilitate the flow of services for the citizens. On Monday, Saudi Arabia and the US announced in a joint statement that the Sudanese warring parties agreed to a five-day extension of the ceasefire agreement signed by the two sides on May 20. The extension will provide a lull for humanitarian assistance, restoration of essential services, and discussion of a

potential longer-term extension, the statement said. Sudan has been witnessing deadly armed clashes between the Sudanese Army and the RSF in the capital Khartoum and other areas since April 15. More than 800 people have been killed, and nearly 1.4 million people have been forced to leave their homes since the conflict began, with over one million people internally displaced and about 345,000 people crossing into neighbouring countries, said the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs.

SL SEEKS RAJINIKANTH'S SUPPORT TO BOOST TOURISM



Colombo: Sri Lanka has invited Tamil superstar Rajinikanth to visit the island nation in an effort to boost tourism. Sri Lanka's Deputy High Commissioner, Dr. D. Venkateshwaran met the world renowned actor at the latter's residence in Chennai invited him to visit the island nation "as his presence will enhance cinema-induced tourism as well as spiritual and wellness tourism". The envoy extended an invitation for Rajinikanth to explore the newly-arranged 'Ramayana Trail' that is exclusive to Sri Lanka and also other unique Buddhist sites in India's southern neighbour.

Trump vows to end birthright citizenship if he wins in 2024

Former US President Donald Trump has vowed to end birthright citizenship for children of unauthorised immigrants if he wins the 2024 election. The 14th Amendment of the Constitution, adopted following the Civil War, declares that all "persons born or naturalized in the United States" are "citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside", reports CBS News. In a video message on Tuesday, Trump said that he would issue an executive order during his first day back at the White House in January 2025 instructing the federal government to deny citizenship to children with parents who are not



American citizens or legal permanent residents. "My policy will choke off a major incentive for continued illegal immigration, deter more migrants from coming and encourage many of the aliens Joe Biden has unlawfully let into our country to go back to their home countries. They must go back," the former President said. Besides the US, Canada and Mexico also offer birthright citizenship. Trump had also brought up the issue while he was in

office. In a 2018 interview with Axios magazine, he had said that he would end birthright citizenship through an executive order, although he did not provide a timeline for doing so, reports CNN. Again in 2019, Trump had said he was "seriously" considering ending birthright citizenship despite the fact that such a move would face immediate legal challenge and is at odds with Supreme Court precedent.

PURPORTED N.KOREAN 'SPACE LAUNCH VEHICLE' FALLS INTO YELLOW SEA AFTER 'ABNORMAL' FLIGHT

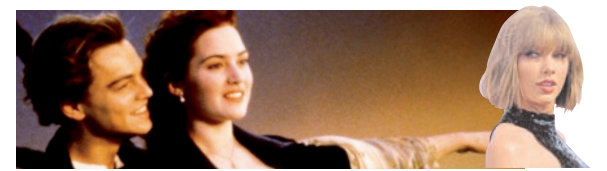

North Korea fired what it claims to be a "space launch vehicle" son Wednesday, but it fell into the Yellow Sea after an "abnormal" flight, the South Korean military said, in a botched launch that defied international criticism and warnings. The North confirmed the failure, saying its new "Chollima-1" rocket carrying a military reconnaissance satellite, "Malligyong-1", fell into the sea due to the "abnormal starting of the second-stage engine", according to its official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA). It plans to conduct a second launch as soon as possible, Yonhap News Agency quoted the KCNA as saying. Seoul's Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said it detected the launch from Tongchang-ri on the North's west coast at 6.29 a.m. and the projectile fell into waters some 200 km west of the South's southwestern island of Eocheong fol-



lowing its flight over the waters far west of the border island of Baengnyeong. The South Korean military identified an apparent part of the North's vehicle and retrieved it, the JCS added. The North notified Japan and the International Maritime Organization of its plan earlier this week to launch a satellite between May 31 and June 11 despite criticism that it would violate UN Security Council resolutions banning any launch using ballistic missile technology. The

reclusive regime last launched a rocket carrying what it called a "Kwangmyongsong-4" satellite in February 2016. On Tuesday, Ri Pyong-chol, vice chairman of the Central Military Commission of the North's ruling Workers' Party of Korea, had made the launch plan official, defending its pursuit of the satellite and other reconnaissance means as "indispensable" to cope with "dangerous military acts of the US and South Korea". The rocket launch marks the North's first such provocation since it fired what it claimed to be a Hwasong-18 intercontinental ballistic missile on April 13. The North previously launched what it called a satellite-carrying rocket five times -- one each in 1998, 2009 and 2016, and twice in 2012. The country claimed to have put a satellite into orbit after its launch in December 2012 and 2016. But it remains unknown whether they have been functioning normally.

Singer Sia Furler, who tied the knot with her boyfriend Dan Bernard earlier this month, says she is in "recovery" after she discovered she is "on the spectrum" and also reveals she is now sober.

"I'm on the spectrum, and I'm in recovery and whatever - there are a lot of things. For 45 years, I was like... I've got to go put my human suit on." And only in the last two years have I become fully, fully myself," she said during a conversation with 'Survivor' season 44 finalist Carolyn Wiger, 36, on 44-year-old former 'Survivor' contestant Rob Cesternino's 'Rob has a Podcast', reports aceshowbiz.com.

"Nobody can ever know and love you when you're filled with secrets and... living in shame, and when we finally sit in a room full of strangers and tell them our deepest, darkest, most shameful secrets, and everybody laughs along with us, and we don't feel like pieces of trash for the first time in our lives, and we feel seen for the first time in our lives for who we actually are, and then we can start going out into the world and just operating as humans and human beings with hearts and not pretending to be anything."

Sia did not disclose exactly when she was diagnosed with developmental condition autism, which can cause social anxiety and difficulty empathising with other people.

The singer - born Sia Kate Isobelle Furler - was criticised two years ago for casting Maddie Ziegler, 20, who is neurotypical, as a nonverbal autistic girl in her movie 'Music'. Several actors with autism spoke out against the film, condemning Sia's decision to cast a neurotypical actress in the lead role as well as the way 'Music' depicted autism.

The singer tweeted amid the backlash at the time that her "heart has always been in the right place" and urged her critics to "watch my film before you judge it."

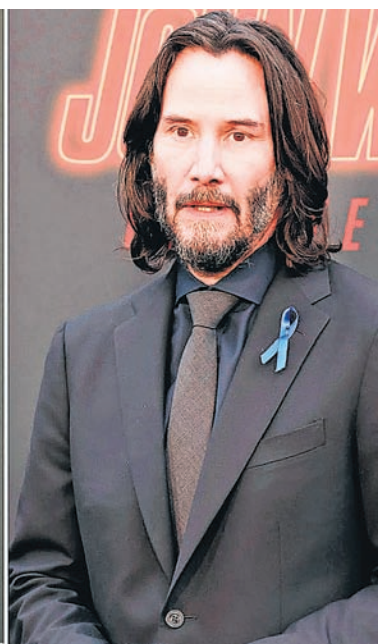
As per 'Female First UK', Sydney admitted that it was meeting the real 'Reality' that truly unlocked the project for her.

"I didn't feel it was appropriate to go delving around in my undercarriage with all of us in the back of the car so I just quietly panicked."

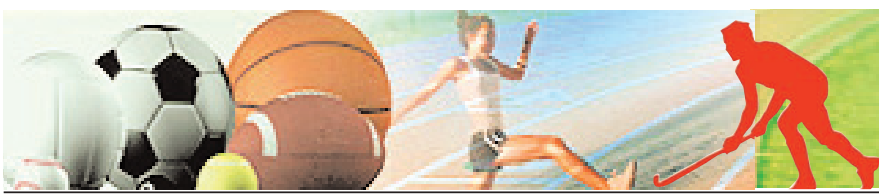
Beckinsale continued, "I walked out onto the biggest red carpet of my

Meanwhile, in the men's singles qualifiers, Sameer Verma defeated Yeoh Seng Zoe of Malaysia 21-12, 21-17 to progress to the main draw after receiving walkovers against Indonesia's Christian Adinata and Spain's Luis Enrique Penalver in the opening couple of rounds. The 28-year-old will face Magnus Johannesen of Denmark in round 1 of the main draw.

B Sai Praneeth and Mithun Manjunath, who were scheduled to play in the qualifiers, were handed direct entry into the men's singles main draw, where they will join compatriots Kidambi Srikanth and Lakshya Sen.

In the women's doubles qualifiers, the Indian pair of Palak Arora and Unnati Hooda were ousted in the first round. Indian top shuttlers PV Sindhu and Saina Nehwal will also be in action in the main draw of the Bangkok meet, later in the day.

WTC FINAL

Indian batters will have to work on bat speed, says Gavaskar

Batting great Sunil Gavaskar feels that the Indian batters will have to work on their bat speed control in order to make that transition from the fast-paced T20 format to the Test cricket as they are going to face Australia in the upcoming World Test Championship final from June 7 at The Oval. Gavaskar emphasised the need for batters to play as late as possible in English conditions, allowing for swing and avoiding the mistake of reaching out for the ball. "I think they are going to look at their bat speed. Coming from T20 where the bat speed is very fast to test cricket where the bat speeds have to be a lot more controlled,

that is something they'll need to do. They'll need to play in England as late as possible to allow for the swing to do its bit, not to reach out for the ball which often a lot of people make the mistake of having played on good pitches," said Gavaskar on Star Sports' 'Follow the Blues'. "Wherever you play on good pitches, you tend to play through the line, not necessarily half volleys, but in England those deliveries can move just that little bit. So, I think those are the things that as a batter you need to watch out for. As a bowling unit also you'll need to bowl a much fuller length for your new ball, for the bowlers to be able to get the movement in the air as well as after pitching," he added.

'I COULDN'T SLEEP': MOHIT SHARMA ON HEARTBREAKING LAST OVER AGAINST CSK

Days after IPL 2023 final, Gujarat Titans pacer Mohit Sharma has opened up on his heartbreaking last over, where star all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja hit him for a six and boundary in the last two balls for a thrilling Chennai Super Kings victory, saying that he couldn't sleep and kept thinking what different could have been done.



"My mind was very clear about what I wanted to do. In the nets, I had practiced such situations and I have been in such scenarios before too. So I said let me bowl all balls yorkers and was backing my instinct," Mohit told Indian Express.

"They wanted to know what will be his plan of action. I said I will again try to bowl yorker. People are now saying this and that but frankly it has no meaning. I knew what I wanted to do," Mohit revealed.

"I ran and tried to bowl (yorker)

again. I just wanted to be focussed and back myself. Whole IPL I have done that. The ball landed where it shouldn't have and Jadeja got his bat. I tried, I tried my best," said Mohit.

"I couldn't sleep. Sochta raha kya alag karta joh match jeet jaate. What if I could have bowled this ball or that ball? It's not a nice feeling now. Somewhere something is missing but I'm trying to move on," he added.

Overall, Mohit had an outstanding IPL 2023 season, finishing with 27 wickets in 14 matches for runners-up Gujarat Titans.

FRENCH OPEN

Medvedev suffers shocking first-round defeat, Swiatek battles through

World No. 2 Daniil Medvedev, experienced a shocking defeat in the opening round at the French Open this year as the highest-ranked player to be eliminated so early when he fell to Brazilian qualifier Thiago Seyboth Wild, 7-6(5), 6-7(6), 2-6, 6-3, 6-4.

Before the clay-court major, Seyboth Wild had only competed in one Grand Slam tournament - the 2020 US Open - and hadn't yet claimed a main draw victory at a Tour-level event, reports Xinhua.

The 23-year-old made 69 winners and, after losing two set points in the second set tie-break, elevated his game in the final two sets to record the most significant victory of his career.

Medvedev arrived in Paris freshly triumphant, having secured his first clay-tournament title just a week prior in Rome, but his second Grand Slam title hopes were dashed at the outset.

The 27-year-old, who claimed the US Open championship in 2021, had won five titles this season, including two ATP



Masters tournaments, surpassing any other player on the Tour. In women's play, top seed Iga Swiatek

was initially challenged in the opening set against Cristina Bucsa. However, she swiftly found her momentum, dispatch-

ing the Spaniard 6-4, 6-0, setting up a second-round clash against American No. 102 Claire Liu.

American sixth seed Coco Gauff, the 2022 Roland Garros finalist, rallied from a set down to overcome Spain's Rebeka Masarova 3-6, 6-1, 6-2, avoiding an early exit. Wimbledon champion Elena Rybakina of Kazakhstan triumphed 6-4, 6-2 over Brenda Fruhvirtova of the Czech Republic.

Earlier in the day, last year's men's finalist Casper Ruud returned to Paris in winning style. The Norwegian advanced to the clay-court major's second round for the sixth successive season, defeating Swedish qualifier Elias Ymer in straight sets, 6-4, 6-3, 6-2.

The fourth seed struck 28 winners against 17 from his No. 155-ranked opponent, concluding the victory in two hours and seven minutes on Court Suzanne-Lenglen.

The 24-year-old is aiming for his maiden Grand Slam title after two consecutive final appearances last year, one at Roland Garros and another at the US Open where he was narrowly defeated by Spaniard Carlos Alcaraz.

Hazlewood reveals insights into Kohli's success ahead of WTC Final

Ahead of the World Test Championship Final, Australian pacer Josh Hazlewood, who has played alongside Virat Kohli on more occasions than against him in recent times, revealed what makes the India star so good at his craft.

Hazlewood has spent the past two years with Kohli by his side at Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) in the IPL and the experienced Australia quick has seen up close just why the India great continues to be rated as one of the best batters in world cricket.

While Hazlewood -- if selected -- will be doing everything he can to take the key wicket of Kohli and lead Australia to glory in the ICC World Test Championship Final, the pacer has spent the last



two years watching the India star closely and trying to work out why he is so good.

The 32-year old Australian feels it is Kohli's

strong work ethic that puts the India batter ahead of the rest and allows him to remain one of the most prized scapals in Test cricket.

"I think it's probably how hard he works (that stands out). His fitness first of all -- and then his skill work and batting and fielding in particular," Hazlewood told the ICC.

"He is always out there (training) first and leaves last and the intensity he trains at all the time is at such a high level it drags everyone else along for the ride. That can lean on to the other players and improve them as well," he added.

Kohli isn't the only World Test Championship rival that has impressed Hazlewood at RCB, with in-form seamer Mohammed Siraj another one of the Australian's IPL teammates that he will be out to beat in the one-off Test at The Oval from June 7.

KIUG: WORKING HARD TO BREAK NATIONAL RECORD, SAYS 1500M RECORD HOLDER YOONUS SHAH

cally told my designer that I won't be wearing any suit or Tuxedo as that is not me. I wanted to take a bit of Hindustan with me."

Talking about how he sees awards and recognition as a source of validation, the actor said, "I come from a lower-middle-class background. And so we are conditioned in a way that validation is the most important thing. But validation means nothing to me. So even though I know the futility of it, at the same time it also excites me when I get an award or someone praises me."

Abhilash also shared his thoughts on what he feels about people speaking about numerous Indian celebrities heading to Cannes for fashion and not films. He also opined whether the credibility of such a prestigious festival deters. He said, "I feel rather than a festival, the credibility of the individual using it for their sake gets deterred. If you are making sure that a social media influencer trends over Martin Scorsese, it shows what one is interested in. Also, there is no problem in decking up and putting your best fashion foot forward. But you go there to watch films. I had heard that celebs walk the red carpet and then leave without watching the film. They are disrespecting films. I would like to be known for my work rather than what I wear."

He further stated that the prestigious event had a dress code. He said, "They do have a dress code and people adhere to it because they respect that cinema. It's not for the red carpet. Sadly, even the media is not talking about films. It's our responsibility to talk about the films screened at the festival rather than the looks. But unfortunately, we are busy talking about the looks and who graced the red carpet."
