Manipur tribal body rejects any dialogue with CM Biren Singh

THE REBELLION DEEPENED

The North East Students Organisation (NESO), an apex body of eight students' associations of seven northeastern states, would hold candlelight vigils in all state capitals of the northeast on June 28 in solidarity with the people of Manipur. While condemning the ongoing violence in Manipur following a meeting in Guwahati, NESO chairman said that candlelight vigils would be held in all state capitals of the northeastern states on June 28 to express solidarity with the distressed people of Manipur.

In a major setback to the peace efforts of the governments, an influential tribal organisation -- Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF), which has been demanding imposition of President's rule in Manipur, on Monday rejected any offer of dialogue with Chief Minister N. Biren Singh or his government. The ITLF spokesman Ginza Vualzong said that the Chief Minister's intention of reaching out to stakeholders following a meeting with Home Minister Amit Shah comes too late after the loss of so many innocent lives and properties and the untold hardships faced by the Kuki-Zo tribals, there is no point in talking about peace without a political solution. He said that around 106 tribals have been killed, 201 villages burnt, over 5,000 houses burnt and 355 churches destroyed, while 41,425 tribals have been displaced by the conflict. "We have reached a point where the Kuki-Zo community can no longer live together with the



Meiteis. N. Biren Singh, the perpetrator of the current ethnic violence whose hatred for the Kuki-Zo community resulted in the genocide of the Kuki-Zo community, cannot be the harbinger of peace," Vualzong told the media. Returning from New Delhi, where he met Union Home Minister Amit Shah and discussed the prevailing situation in the state, Singh on Sunday evening said that efforts to restore peace would be further intensified involving all.



"Restoration of peace and normalcy in the strife-torn state is the first priority of both the Central and state governments. In the peace process, Civil Society Organisations (CSO) of all communities, leaders of churches, varied communities and other concerned stakeholders would be involved. No stone would be unturned to restore peace and normalcy at the earliest," he told the media in Imphal. Biren Singh, who holds the home portfolio, said that the security forces have given maximum efforts in 47 vulnerable areas in different districts. The ITLF, which along with 10 tribal MLA (seven of them belonging to the ruling BJP), has been demanding a separate administration (equivalent to separate state) for the tribals, in a statement said that all tribals and a large section of his (Biren Singh) own Meitei community have lost faith in

his leadership and his government. The ITLF has held talks with various dignitaries including Union Home Minister Amit Shah, where Kuki-Zo tribals have voiced their demands including their political aspiration of total separation from Manipur, the statement said. Violence erupted in the state on May 3 claiming over 100 lives and forcing thousands to take refuge in relief camps.

CONGRESS DEMANDS REMOVAL OF CM BIREN SINGH

New Delhi: Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Monday took a swipe at Union Home Minister Amit Shah, saying that it seems he has finally spoken to the Prime Minister on the Manipur crisis, and demanded immediate sacking of Chief Minister N. Biren Singh. Taking to Twitter, Kharge said, "Reports indicate that finally the Home Minister has spoken to Prime Minister Modi on Manipur. For the last 55 days, Modi ji did not say a word on Manipur. Every Indian is waiting for him to speak. If Modi ji is really concerned about Manipur, then the first thing he should do is to sack his chief Minister."

Monsoon fury hits Maha, 6 killed in Mumbai in 24 hours

Delayed by over a fortnight, monsoon finally hit Maharashtra with full fury, claiming at least six lives in the past 24 hours in the financial capital Mumbai. The IMD has forecast heavy rains in Mumbai over the next 48 hours with an orange alert for Tuesday.

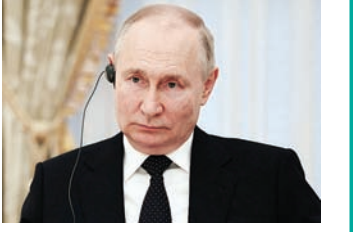


Several districts like Palghar, Thane, Raigad, Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg have also been issued rainfall warnings of varying alerts till June 30. Late on Saturday, two contract workers fell into a manhole while cleaning up a rain-soaked road at Govandi in north-east Mumbai. They are identified as Ram Krishan, 30 and Sudhir Dhas, 35. Early on Sunday morning, a senior couple Priscilla Misquitta, 65 and her husband Robi Misquitta, 70, were killed after a two-storied building crashed in Vile Parle goathan area in the western

suburbs. Barely hours later, a tenement crashed in Ramabai Ambedkar Nagar in Ghatkopar east, trapping several persons of whom two were killed, and four others were injured. They were identified as Alka Palande, 94 and her son Naresh Palande, 56, whose bodies were recovered from the debris on Monday morning. A senior citizen, Vasumathi Nair, 75, fell and suffered minor injuries when floodwaters from the adjoining road seeped into their ground floor flat in Badal Society, Bhandup west - ironically, after the BMC carried out road repairs to prevent water seepage, said her daughter Mini P. Menon. Heavy rains or showers continued to lash Mumbai and the coastal Konkan region all through Monday, though there was no major disruption of rail, road or air traffic. Waterlogging was reported from some areas in the city and suburbs including water seeping into ground floor homes, some low-lying roads and subways, putting people on alert.

PUTIN MAKES FIRST VIDEO APPEARANCE POST WAGNER GROUP'S UPRISING

Moscow: Russian President Vladimir Putin on Monday appeared in a Kremlin video address, speaking for the first time since the aborted mutiny of a mercenary chief this weekend. Putin addressed a youth forum dubbed the "Engineers of the future" where he praised companies for ensuring "the stable operation" of the country's industry "in the face of severe external challenges".



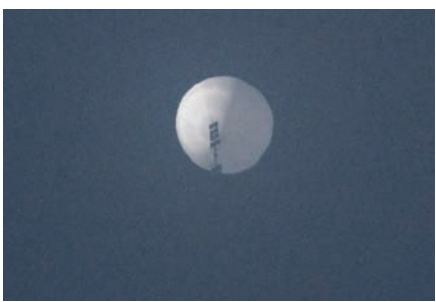
MANIPUR LIKELY IN FOCUS IN CABINET MEETING

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday chaired a high level meeting, with a likely focus on the prevailing situation in Manipur, with Union Ministers Amit Shah, Nirmala Sitharaman and Hardeep Puri in attendance. Sources in the Prime Minister's Office have refused to comment on the meeting, however it is being speculated that Shah has briefed Modi about the Manipur situation as well as on the all-party meeting convened on June 24. The meeting took place within 12 hours of the Prime Minister returning to India after his state visits to the US and Egypt.

New images show Chinese 'spy' balloons over Asia

New evidence of China's 'spy' balloon programme - including flights over Japan and Taiwan has been uncovered, media reports said. Japan has confirmed balloons have flown over its territory and said it's prepared to shoot them down in future, BBC reported. US-China relations were thrown into turmoil earlier this year, when an alleged Chinese spy balloon was shot down off the US coast. China claimed the balloon seen over north-western US in late January was a civilian airship, used for scientific research such as meteorology - and that it was an unintended and isolated event. John Culver - a former East Asia analyst for the CIA - told BBC Panorama that this "had been not just a one-off, but a continuing effort dating back at least five years." He said the Chinese balloons were "specialty designed for these long-range missions"



and some had "apparently circumnavigated the globe". Working with Synthetica, an artificial intelligence company which sifted through huge amounts of data captured by satellites, the BBC has found multiple images of balloons crossing East Asia. The company's founder, Corey Jaskolski, found evidence of one balloon crossing northern Japan in early September 2021. These images have not been published before.

BJP NATIONAL PRESIDENT JP NADDA'S SURPRISE VISIT IN BHOPAL

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Kailash Vijayvargiya, BJP State President VD Sharma and Medical Education Minister Vishwas Sarang welcomed him at the State Hangar located at Rajabhoj Airport. During this, many other leaders and workers of Madhya Pradesh BJP including Urban Administration Minister Bhupendra Singh participated. After this JP Nadda left for Hotel Jahanuma.

Two BRS rebels decide to join Congress after meeting Rahul Gandhi, more to follow

In a big boost to the opposition Congress in Telangana ahead of Assembly elections, K Chandrasekhar Rao's Bharat Rashtra Samithi in Telangana is bracing for a blow as 35 of its key leaders are said to be set to join the Congress ahead of the state elections due later this year. The group, led by former BRS leader Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy and the state's former minister Jupally Krishna Rao, have met Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi in Delhi on Monday. Sources in the Congress said more leaders from the ruling BRS and some from the BJP will join the party at the event. They announced their decision after meeting Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and MP Rahul Gandhi in the national capital.



Krishna Rao, Srinivas Reddy, along with their followers and some other leaders, will join the Congress at a public meeting to be addressed by Gandhi in Khammam district on July 2. After the meeting, Srinivas Reddy told a news conference that after detailed discussions with followers and well-wishers and examining all aspects during the last six months, they decided to join the Congress. Srinivas Reddy said they got several surveys conducted which reveal that 80 per cent of people are against the BRS government. He said they received offers from several parties including the BJP and the Congress and also smaller parties. They also discussed the proposal of floating a new regional party to counter the BRS but realised that such a move would split anti-KCR (as Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao is popularly known) votes.

Wrestlers move Delhi court seeking copy of charge sheet against WFI chief

The protesting female wrestlers on Monday moved a Delhi court seeking a copy of the charge sheet filed by the police against outgoing Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh on charges of sexual harassment. The Delhi Police's charge sheet running over 1,000 pages was filed before Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Mahima Rai of the Rouse Avenue Courts for offences under Sections 354 (assault or criminal force to woman with intent to outrage her modesty), 354A (making sexually coloured remarks), and 354D (stalking) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) against accused Singh. The charge sheet also mentions offences under Sections 109 (offer a bribe), 354, 354A, 506 (criminal intimidation) of the IPC against former WFI Assistant Secretary Vinod Tomar.



Reportedly, the charge sheet contains statements of around 200 witnesses. Last week, the CMM transferred the alleged sexual harassment case to the court of Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (ACMM) Harjeet Singh Jaspal, who deals with cases of MPs and MLAs, and is scheduled to take up the charge sheet for consideration on Tuesday. Jaspal directed the complainants' lawyer to apply for a certified copy at the court's copying agency.

MONSOON HAS COVERED 80% OF INDIA, NEW PATTERN THIS YEAR

- Several cities in the country are witnessing heavy rainfall and a flood-like situation after the southwest monsoon brought showers over the past couple of days.
- The weather office has predicted heavy rain, thunderstorms and gusty winds in Punjab and Haryana. Light to moderate showers are likely to continue for the next two days.

This year's monsoon has reached 80 per cent of India so far, India Meteorological Department's senior scientist Dr Naresh Kumar told NDTV on advancement of southwest monsoon in the country. Monsoon reached different

parts of the country rapidly due to a low pressure area occurring in the Bay of Bengal yesterday, he said. Monsoon arrived in Delhi and Mumbai on the same day on Sunday. This has happened after 62 years, Dr Kumar said. The usual date for monsoon to reach Mumbai is June 11 and June 27 in Delhi, but reached the two metro cities on the same day. However, this can't directly be linked to climate

change as it takes data from 30 to 40 years to determine that, Dr Naresh Kumar said. Monsoon has reached different parts of the country in a new pattern this year. "Generally, monsoon is activated by a low pressure zone. High speed winds caused by the low pressure zone led to monsoon rapidly reached various parts of the country which saw rainfall," he said, and explained that western winds

from the Arabian Sea that push monsoon further up coincided with the formation of the low pressure zone in the Bay of Bengal when it was over Maharashtra. This resulted in rainfall in Maharashtra, including in Mumbai, and at the same time the low pressure zone pushed winds towards north-western India, including to Delhi, covering both regions at the same time, Dr Kumar said.

KERALA HC RECOMMENDS INCLUSION OF SEX EDUCATION IN CURRICULUM

Kochi: The Kerala High Court has urged the state government to look into the need for including safe sex education in the curriculum of schools and colleges. The Court made the observation while disposing of a petition filed by a man to medically terminate the pregnancy of his minor daughter who was impregnated by her own brother. "Nobody can blame the parents. But we the society are responsible for this. Sibling incest may occur in a family system that does not provide a safe environment for its members. But it may also happen because of the lack of knowledge about safe sex. I am of the considered opinion that the Government should seriously think about the necessity of proper 'sex education' in schools and colleges ... A good family atmosphere is necessary for the society. To attain this, every citizen of this country should join together without pelting stones at such unfortunate people," read the judgment and asked to see that a copy of the judgment be send to the Chief Secretary of the state. The Court has called for the constitution of a committee, if necessary, to study the issue of including "safe sex education" in the curriculum of schools and colleges.



PAKISTAN-OCCUPIED-KASHMIR IS A PART OF INDIA: RAJNATH SINGH

People living in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir will raise a demand to go with India. Pakistan does not have a locus standi there as it has illegally occupied the area. The Indian Parliament has unanimously passed at least three resolutions which state that PoK is a part of India," Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said this on Monday.

National security is the Government's top-most priority and it is committed to protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of the country. This was stated by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh while addressing a National Security Conclave on June 26.

Rajnath Singh added that the network of terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir has substantially weakened in the last few years as strict and consistent action is being taken. "Terror funding has been curbed. Supply of arms and drugs to terrorists has been stopped. Along with elimination of terrorists, work is being done to dismantle the network of underground



workers," he said.

On the abrogation of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir, he stated that the decision has connected the people of the Union Territory with the country's mainstream and helped them to usher in a new era of peace and progress. He asserted that India

has witnessed a paradigm shift in its security scenario in the last nine years. He pointed out that India's image in 2013-14 was that of a weak nation which allowed its adversaries to create problems, but today the country has the ability to overcome every threat.

Rajnath Singh stated that no stone is being left unturned to equip the military with latest weaponry and modern technology, assuring the nation that the armed forces are fully capable of protecting the borders and the seas. "Our goal is to bring our armed forces in the frontline of modern militaries," he said.

"For a long time, Pakistan has tried to destabilise peace and harmony in the country through cross-border terrorism. However, when we came to power, we launched effective action against terrorism. We showed the world the meaning of 'zero tolerance against terrorism'. The bold and first-of-its-kind moves to eliminate terrorists following the Uri and Pulwama incidents are proof of India's 'zero tolerance against terrorism' policy and the unmatched valour of the armed forces. Today, most of the countries are united against terrorism. The joint statement issued after the Prime Minister's meeting with US President Joe Biden is an indication of how India has changed the mindset of the world on the issue of terrorism," the Defence Minister said.

Caste has no role to play in appointment of temple priests, rules Madras HC

The Madras High Court on Monday made it clear that pedigree based on caste will not have any role to play in the appointment of an 'archaka' (temple priest) if the person selected for the post satisfies the requirements such as proper training, being well-versed in knowledge required, and qualified to perform pujas and other rituals as per the requirements of Agama Sastra applicable to the temple concerned.

Justice N Anand Venkatesh made the ruling while disposing of the petition filed by Muthu Subramania Gurukul in 2018 challenging a notification issued by the



Executive Officer of the Sri Sugavaneswarar Swamy temple in Salem during that year calling up applications for filling up the post of archakar/sthanigar. The petitioner had

appealed that appointments must be made only on the base of Agama Sastra followed by the temple.

The Madras High Court constituted a committee headed by its retired judge, Justice M. Chockalingam to identify Agamic and non-Agamic temples in Tamil Nadu. As questions were asked whether the appointments of priests in temples should be deferred until the committee submitted its report, the court said that there would be no impediment for temple trustees and fit persons appointed by the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments Department to appoint the priests even before the submission of the report.

Daylight armed robbery in Delhi raises concerns about security, video goes viral

The daylight robbery inside the Pragati Maidan tunnel by four armed assailants on two bikes, the CCTV footage of which has gone viral, has raised concern about safety, security and the presence of Delhi Police personnel in the national Capital.

On Saturday afternoon (June 24), a delivery agent and his associate were robbed of around Rs two lakh cash at gunpoint inside Delhi's Pragati Maidan tunnel.

Interestingly, the tunnel is located near the Supreme Court, High Court, NIA office, old Delhi Police Headquarters and among others.

The footage, authenticated by the Delhi Police, reveals the shocking sequence of events as four men on two motorcycles intercepted the vehicle and swiftly executed their plan.

As per the CCTV footage, on Saturday afternoon when the cab (white colour Swift Dzire) was making its way through the busy tunnel, two bikes



abruptly came in the car's path, forcing it to come to a halt. Within moments, two of the assailants disembark and menacingly point their firearms at the frightened occupants of the vehicle, instilling a sense of fear and helplessness.

In an audacious move, one of the robbers swiftly opens the rear left door of the cab and snatches a black bag, presumably containing valuable belongings. The entire ordeal unfolded within a

matter of seconds, leaving the victims shocked and vulnerable.

According to police, the victim identified as Patel Sajan Kumar, working as a delivery agent at Omiya Enterprises in Chandni Chowk, came to Tilak Marg police station and submitted a written complaint regarding this incident.

Kumar told the police that he, along with his friend Jigar Patel, was going to Gurugram to deliver the bag of cash. "They hired an Ola cab from Lal Qila, and while on the way to Gurgaon on the Ring Road, when they entered the tunnel, four people on two motorcycles intercepted their cab and robbed his bag containing Rs 1.5 lakh to 2 lakh at gunpoint," said the police.

The official stated that based on his complaint, they have lodged an FIR under sections 397 and 34 of the IPC.

The officials said that police teams were scanning CCTV cameras in the area to identify the assailants. "We are tracing the route they took after committing the crime," the official added.

Jain temples in Prayagraj impose dress code

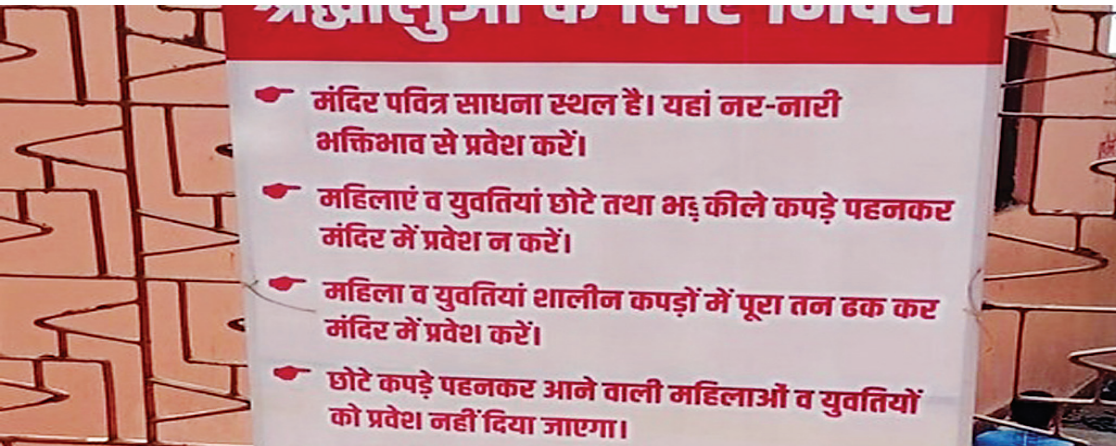

Following the trend of Hindu temples enforcing a 'dress code' for devotees in Uttar Pradesh, the Digambar Jain temples of Prayagraj have also adopted a similar rule.

Umbrella body, 'Sakal Jain Samaj', has banned devotees coming to Shri Digambar Jain Panchayat Mandir at Zero Road, Rishabhdev Taposthali, in Andawa besides temples in Katra and Beniganj localities, from wearing jeans, half-pants, frocks, distressed clothes as well as gaudy or revealing dresses.

Women and girls have been specifically requested to enter the temple with their heads covered. Only those who come wearing modest and decent clothes will be allowed entry.

Notice boards have also been installed in these temples in this regard. Secretary, Digambar Jain Samaj, Rajesh Jain confirmed the development and said that hence-



forth one should enter the temples only in decent clothes and with this in mind the dress code had been implemented.

"Devotees coming to the temple should try to have darshan with their heads covered and avoid entering wearing full black clothes. Let us try to set a good example by leading a

civilised and well-educated society," he said. Secretary, Parshvanath Digambar Jain Temple, Katra, Akhilesh Chandra Jain said renowned seer of the community Acharya Vidyasagar Maharaj had also given instructions to ensure the entry of devotees wearing decent clothes.

"Information related to the dress code has been put up at the temple while information has also been sent to the members of the community through WhatsApp groups," he said.

President of the society Dinesh Jain along with prominent members of the community, have requested devotees to come in decent clothes.

Mamata 'cautions' BSF of FIRs in case of firing at the border

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday, without naming the Border Security Force (BSF), warned that FIRs will be registered against those resorting to firing at villages located near the India-Bangladesh border districts like Cooch Behar.

"I love Cooch Behar so much. Your children are killed here in firing at the borders. I have told the police to keep watch and take action after registering FIRs in case of any such firing at the bordering villages. The state government will take action. No one has the right to shoot people to death," she said while addressing a campaign rally for Cooch Behar for the forthcoming panchayat polls.

Stressing that law & order come under the jurisdiction of the state government, the Chief Minister said that if anyone engages in any intimidation or attempts to create fear, the matter should be immediately reported to the local police.

She also said that she and her government are committed to protect the people of Cooch



Behar from any kind of atrocities.

Banerjee also launched a scathing attack against Union Minister of State for Home Nisith Pramanik, who is the MP from Cooch Behar, without directly naming him.

UP woman undergoes heart surgery, delivers twins via c-section

A 32-year-old woman underwent a heart surgery and also a c-section operation to deliver her twins.

Doctors at the city-based Medanta Hospital successfully conducted the two operations.

The woman, who complained of breathlessness, was pregnant with twins through IVF.

The patient had an obstruction in the right ventricular outflow. In view of her condition, she was referred from Varanasi to Medanta Lucknow.

"The right (side) heart that pumps blood into the lungs effortlessly had a severe obstruction. The woman was taken to the cardiothoracic operating theatre. Firstly, the gynaecology department team conducted the delivery and then the heart surgery was performed," said Gaurang Mazumdar, the head of the cardiothoracic



vascular surgery department.

Due to the obstruction, blood was not reaching her lungs properly. It was a tricky case that required a multi-specialty focus.

Counselling of the family was also done regarding the risk and procedure being adopted. Akash Pandita, head of the neonatology department, said: "Babies born were 1,200 and 1,300 grams in weight (respectively) and had breathing prob-

lems initially. However, this was solved without the use of a ventilator.

"As the mother was not in the condition to breastfeed her twins, she was shown the two newborns via a video call. The woman has been discharged now. Her babies are healthy."

According to doctors, such patients fall into a special group where pregnancy is accompanied by features of heart failure.

Harrowing time for motorists travelling to Kullu-Manali after landslides

Hundreds of tourists travelling towards the Kullu-Manali destination in Himachal Pradesh were inconvenienced on Monday after the closure of roads due to landslides triggered by rains, hampered the plying of vehicles. Most of the motorists had to spend the night in vehicles.

Incessant monsoon rainfall in the region over the past two days triggered massive landslides that blocked the Mandi and Pandoh highways.

"Work is on to reopen the road and it is likely to be reopened by evening," an official told reporter.

The highway has been blocked since Sunday evening. As a result, long queues of tourist vehicles were witnessed.

Due to the blockade, scores of domestic tourists were stranded at hotels in Manali and Kullu areas -- considered the gateway to the Keylong-Leh segment.

The picturesque Kullu and Manali Valleys are frequently visited by



tourists.

A meteorological department official here said the state witnessed moderate to heavy rainfall in the past 24 hours. Nearly 100 metres of the national highway was badly damaged

in the landslide that occurred near Pandoh in Mandi district. Hundreds of vehicles remained stranded on both sides of the affected area.

A day earlier, the traffic on the highway was hampered near Aut

owing to swollen river that inundated the highway.

The police have stopped vehicular traffic beyond Mandi toward Kullu and from Kullu towards Mandi.

Official sources said the supply of milk, bread, newspaper and other household items was impacted with the closure of the highway, the lifeline of Kullu-Manali segment.

The alternate road link between Mandi and Kullu via Kataula has been hampered by the massive landslide near Kamad since Sunday night, official sources said.

The district administration of Mandi and Kullu districts have advised visitors to suspend their journey on the Mandi-Kullu route until the restoration of highway. It is expected that the highway will be restored by this evening.

In the state, two people drowned over the past 48 hours while several vehicles and houses were damaged as the monsoon rains intensified.

Mandi district is the worst affected that saw flash floods, landslides and cloudbursts.

Letter war between BJP, Congress ahead of PM Modi's MP visit

Mishra said Kamal Nath claimed to have set up several cowsheds during his 15-month Congress government in Madhya Pradesh, and on the other side, a minister of the Congress-led Karnataka government was "promoting cow slaughter" and pressuring police to put cow protectors into jail. "Soon after coming to power, the Congress led Karnataka government scrapped anti-conversion

law. The anti-conversion law was established to protect the rights of Hindu women. Now, a Congress minister is promoting cow slaughter in Karnataka. In my letter, I have asked MP president Kamal Nath to clear his view on this issue," Mishra said. Senior Congress leader and the Leader of Opposition (LoP) Govind Singh, who is MLA from Lahar Assembly constituency in Bhind district, wrote a letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and has sought a meeting with him during his visit to Bhopal on Tuesday. In his letter, Singh has highlighted the incident of

MahakalLok corridor issue, where six Saptarshi idols fell on ground due to a thunderstorm last month. "PM Modi is coming to Bhopal on Tuesday, therefore, I have requested him to allow me to meet him. I want to tell him something secret about the MahakalLok corridor issue," Singh said. Interestingly, the letter war ahead of PM Modi's arrival to poll-bound Madhya Pradesh began from both ruling and opposition sides. Notably, the assembly constituencies of both these political rivals - Mishra and Singh -- share borders and also they are considered good friends.

After Roadshow, PM Modi's Shahdol Visit Cancelled Due To Heavy Rain Alert

Bhopal: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Shahdol visit has been postponed due to heavy rain alert in the district, said CM Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Monday. Teens targeted by 'sextortion' schemes on social media

Nearly two out of every three teenagers have been targeted by sextortion schemes on social media apps, a new study has shown. According to Snap (the parent company of Snapchat), sextortionists primarily target young men for money on social media apps such as Snapchat, Instagram, Tumblr, Twitter, and Facebook, though girls are also targeted for explicit images and photos, reports Fox Business. "For young males who have experienced a sextortion incident -- and the majority are males -- they regularly tell us that when they share the situation with their parents, they feel relieved. We advise them to report to hotlines and helplines, to report to the platforms and to tell their parents, a friend or a trusted adult," Arda Gerkens, president of Offlimits, the Dutch child abuse hotline formerly known as EOKM, was quoted as saying. The survey included 760 teens in the US. According to the study, about 65 per cent of teens on Snapchat and other apps said they or their friends were victims of sextortion in which they were either "catfished" -- tricked into speaking with people lying about their identity online -- or hacked for private information, including explicit photos, that were then used against them. About 51 per cent said they or their friends fell victim to catfishing, and 47 per cent said they were hacked. Nearly one out of three teens who became targets of these scams shared explicit or private images, the study said. Moreover, around 56 per cent said they turned to friends, parents or other trusted adults after being threatened online, while 50 per cent said they reported the incident to the platform they were using. About 40 per cent blocked the perpetrator and 30 per cent updated their account security settings.

A NON-FILM CRITIC'S CRITIQUE: 'ADIPURUSH' IS A MINEFILED OF MISADVENTURES

Within a week of its release, the Ramayana-inspired 'Adipurush' has had the interest of the audience crash and nearly die down for a number of reasons. To begin with, those who grew up following Hindu culture, whether or not they explicitly identify with the Ramayana-oriented belief system, are bound to raise eyebrows at this Om Raut misadventure touted to be an adaptation of the epic. And those who are not from the community, but wish to know a thing or two about 'Hindu culture' by way of casually watching a movie, will be comically misguided if they go by what they see. Poor dialogues are only the tip of the iceberg. Ravana was a great demon king -- yes, great, because even though he was a demon, his merit was incontestable and even the gods acknowledged it. His kingdom was situated in the tropical region of the Indian subcontinent and notwithstanding the vagaries of climate change, the Lanka of Ramayana would have been much greener than we can imagine -- not black! The details in the film, which could have been a mark of great cinematic finesse, are but a displeasing imitation of some iconic details from Hollywood films: the Harry Potteresque death eaters that float about Lord Ram (Raghav); the Game Of Thrones-style gait of Ravana (who has uncharacteristically neatly cropped and gelled hair) and his dragon-like bat for a vehicle; a charcoal-finished Lanka looking like the evil twin of Thor's Asgard, the Planet of the Apes-replica 'vanar sena', inclusive of a King Kong here and there; and costumes and hairdo of the villains that are just not Indian by any stretch of imagination. These striking details were lifted



without much effort to customise them to fit the context of Ramayan, which is not just an object of fancy but a deeply revered cultural heritage. Even Hollywood would have had exotic goblets, instead of those gold-streaked black wine glasses, knowing that it is a story from ancient times. This Rs 500-crore film could have been otherwise justified for its visual effects, which were impressive but terribly misplaced in an incredibly wrong storyline that just rushed to conclude. This amounts to a mockery and an insult to our cultural heritage. As far as common filmmaking goes, there may be no limit to imagination, but with regard to depict-

ing an established piece of work, especially one that has religious sentiments attached to it, it becomes an obligation to accomplish such an undertaking much a sense of responsibility. The inept recitation of a part of the Tandav Stotra by Ravana before Sita, when he says that he will climb on to Ram's chest and do the Tandav, only betrays the embarrassing lack of research by the makers -- Tandav is a dance form (the divine dance performed by Lord Shiva), and Tandav Stotra is a hymn composed by Ravana in praise of the god -- it is not a victory jingle! Even if a handful of research scholars and artists struggling for stable employment were hired for

just Rs 500 a day, they would have furnished better research and illustrations that would have guided the filmmakers to represent the details of the age (the architecture and the artifacts) with some semblance of authenticity. The series of blunders and misrepresentations simply don't end. Several depictions are factually incorrect, apart from being exaggerated. Ravana, instead of immortality, earned the boon of invincibility and immunity from all gods, demons, heavenly spirits, serpents, and wild beasts from Brahma. So, he died at the hands of a human -- Lord Ram. But the film mixes up mythological characters from across scriptures and depicts Ravana enjoying the death-evading boon, which was actually granted to Hiranyakashyap, the demon king from the Pauranic texts, who was killed by Lord Vishnu in his Narasimha (half man, half lion) form. Further, the occultist warrior prince Meghnad is nearly fictionalised with that 'swarna jheel' innovation. Treating Lakshman with what looked like a shallow neon Sanjeevani juice bath in the middle of a war at its turning point was going overboard without any care for common sense. Even the very name of the film, 'Adipurush', is incorrect and utterly mindless. The word, literally meaning 'the first man', has no significance in the context of Ramayan. Adidev is a term that means 'the first god'. Among several Ramayan-associated actors who have come forth with their criticism, Arun Govil, who portrayed Lord Ram in Ramanand Sagar's 'Ramayan' (the 1987 TV series), made a valid point when he said that the Lord and Ramayan are beyond "modernisation" and that there is no need to attempt that and disrespect people's devotion. Nonetheless, it remains the filmmaker's responsibility to be

mindful and respect the line between creative liberty and distortion. It is said that in 1987, in villages and small towns, where a TV set was not a common possession, people gathered at a common place before one to watch Ramanand Sagar's 'Ramayan' and when Ram appeared, they held their hands together and bowed in devotion. This is just a snippet of the audience's sentiments associated with the epic and its popular depiction. Away from the screens, various Hindu religious outfits and political parties have joined the chorus to ban the film. It is important to recall here that last October, monks from Ayodhya had raised objections to the "distortions" seen in the film's trailer. The head priest of Ram Janmabhoomi, Acharya Satyendra Das, said that despite protests, the filmmakers misrepresented the characters of Ramayana and "distorted" Hindu deities. Mani Ram Das Chhavi Peeth, the most powerful body of Ayodhya saints, has also backed the demand that the film be banned. No doubt, 'Adipurush' is a thoroughly disappointing misadventure, but one might wonder what is the point of such a film at all. Also, how did the Censor Board not feel the need to "regulate" its content? When 'Adipurush' was not even released, there came the news of a 'Ramayana' being made by Nitesh Tiwari, starring Alia Bhatt and Ranbir Kapoor as Sita and Ram. So, does the Indian audience not know Ramayana enough to be educated about it (or entertained) through commercial cinema? Or does it serve some other purpose by keeping people engaged in a circular discourse and have them enforce their Hindu identity on the pretext of Ramayana for reasons that warrant another discussion? Let us wait and watch!

NEARLY 200 RUSSIAN SOLDIERS KILLED IN A DAY: UKRAINE

The Ukrainian military has claimed that nearly 200 Russian soldiers were killed and a variety of equipment had also been destroyed in the past one day. Although the claim was not officially verified, the military went on to say that in the last 48 hours, the frontlines across the war-torn nation witnessed heavy combat, with more than 20 engagements occurring in areas in the Donetsk region -- chiefly Lyman, Marinka and Bakhmut, CNN reported. In its latest update, the General Staff said the Russians also carried out 25 air strikes on Sunday. There had been heavy Russian artillery and mortar fire in the Kupiansk area of



Kharkiv, where the Russians have been trying to break through for over a month, the military added. The General Staff insisted all Russian efforts to take territory had been foiled. Across the Donetsk frontlines, the fighting was characterised by exchanges of indirect fire, but with little

movement. However, the Ukrainians say they are on the front foot around Bakhmut. "(Troops) hold the initiative, continue assault operations and push the enemy back. Over the last day, the Ukrainian forces advanced 600 to 1,000 meters on the southern and northern

flanks around Bakhmut," CNN quoted Serhii Cherevatyi, a spokesperson for the Eastern Grouping of the Armed Forces, as saying. In the south, where Ukrainian forces have attempted to break through Russian lines, the General Staff said a Russian effort to regain lost positions in the area of Novodarivka had also failed. Russian artillery continued to strike about 30 settlements along the frontlines in the Zaporizhzhia region, it added. In Kherson, Nataliya Humenyuk, a spokesperson for Ukrainian forces in the south, said the Russians struggled to regain positions on the east bank of the river Dnipro, which was flooded by the June 6 damage to the dam at Nova Kakhovka.

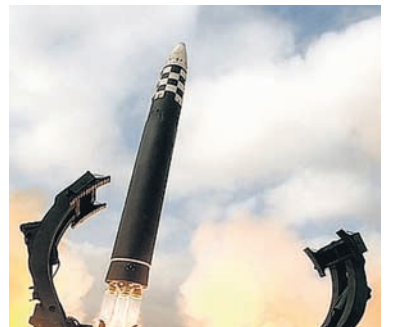
Erdogan urges Sweden to end PKK protests for its NATO membership

Ankara: Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has urged Sweden to prevent the demonstrations by supporters of the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) in Stockholm in exchange for a green light on its NATO bid. In a phone conversation with NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg on Sunday, Erdogan said his country continues its "constructive attitude" toward Sweden's joining the alliance, according to a statement from his office. But Erdogan said the Nordic country's change on terror laws does not meet the expectation of Ankara as long as the PKK can demonstrate in the country "freely", reports Xinhua news agency. Turkey has long been saying that Ankara will only admit Sweden's NATO bid in the upcoming Vilnius summit if the latter takes concrete steps to prevent anti-Türkiye "terror" activities in the country, the statement said. The latest developments in Russia were also discussed during the phone call, it added.

N.Korea warns Korean Peninsula close to 'brink of nuclear war'

North Korea's Foreign Ministry on Monday accused Seoul and Washington of pushing tensions to "the brink of a nuclear war" akin to the 1950-53 Korean War, saying it will continue to bolster its self-defensive capabilities. In a research report released by the Ministry's Institute for American Studies, North Korea likened the current military tensions in the region to the night before the outbreak of the Korean War as it slammed the US and South Korea for their "delusional anti-communist military confrontation" and "rhetorical threats", reports Yonhap News Agency. "Such bellicose moves of the US have pushed the military tensions on the Korean peninsula and in Northeast Asia already plunged into an extremely unstable situation closer to the brink of a nuclear war," the Ministry said in a report released by the official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA). The North argued that the US is "resorting to the worrying hostile acts of wantonly encroaching upon the sovereignty and security" of Pyongyang more



persistently this year than ever before and has reached a threshold that can no longer be tolerated. It then warned that a war on the peninsula would "rapidly expand into a world war and a thermonuclear war unprecedented in the world", causing "the most catastrophic and irreversible consequences" to peace and security in the region and the rest of the world. Pyongyang will continue to further accelerate its efforts to bolster "its self-defensive capabilities for safeguarding its sovereignty" unless the US withdraws its "anachronistic hostile policy" and persistent military threat against the North, the report said.

Lightning strike kills 10 in Pakistan

Islamabad: At least 10 people were killed and six others injured after lightning struck several parts of Pakistan's Punjab province, officials said on Monday. The fatalities were reported in the Sheikhupura and Narowal districts, where the lightning struck several houses after heavy rainfall, Xinhua news agency reported. The injured people were shifted nearby, whereas the rescue teams have been put on high alert across the province to meet any untoward situation. In a tweet, Minister for Climate Change Sherry Rehman said that pre-monsoon rains are forecast across the country till June 30, during which strong winds, thunder, and heavy rain are expected in various cities of Punjab. She mentioned that the heavy rainfall has sparked concerns about flooding in urban areas and potential floods and landslides in mountainous regions. "All concerned and local institutions have been instructed to be alert and tourists to be cautious. Citizens are requested to stay away from vulnerable infrastructure, power poles, and rivers during strong winds and rains to avoid any untoward incident," Rehman added.

Ottawa air quality rising to 'very high risk' again due to forest fires

The air quality in the Canadian capital of Ottawa started out bad and got worse during the weekend, rising to "very high risk" on the federal air quality index's highest level. "High levels of air pollution have developed due to smoke from forest fires. Smoke plumes from forest fires in Quebec have moved into the area, resulting in deteriorated air quality," Environment Canada said in an official statement. In response, organisers of two out of the four major festivals in Ottawa have made the decision to cancel events, while the city of Ottawa has taken the step to cancel its outdoor programs and close wading pools and outdoor pools. The Summer Solstice Indigenous Festival on West Hunt Club ended a day earlier than scheduled due to concerns over air quality. The organisers assured attendees who were worried about the air quality



ty and chose not to participate in the activities that they would be reimbursed. The Ottawa Dragon Boat Festival, which in its final day, cancelled all paddling events. The City of Gatineau announced it was closing beaches on Sunday morn-

ing, while other measures could also become necessary. Air quality readings are expected to drop to a level 7 on Monday, which is still a high risk, returning to a moderate risk at night. Current weather conditions could worsen forest fires in Quebec and spark new ones, the Minister of Public Security announced. According to a statement from the ministry, several parts of the province are currently experiencing a flammability index ranging from "very high" to "extreme" indicating a significant risk of burning. The heightened risk is attributed to decreased levels of precipitation and rising temperatures, which have intensified the threat of forest fires. Several regions are currently under close surveillance including Abitibi-Temiscamingue, the North Shore, northern Quebec and Saguenay-Lac-Saint-Jean. SOPFEU, Quebec's forest fire agency, is actively engaged in combating 81 fires across the province, with

25 of them being classified as out of control. Presently, the agency has prioritized its resources towards managing 43 fires. Several municipalities have had to evacuate in the last few days, including some parts of the northwestern city of Senneterre. On June 23, authorities issued an evacuation order of 60 cottages in a rural area, around 30 km north of the city centre. Later in the day, evacuation orders were also issued for certain sectors of Beaucanton, Val-Paradis and Lac Pajegasque in the northwestern parts of the province. According to the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre, there were five new wildfires burning in Canada on Sunday, bringing the total across the country this year to 2,880. Wildfires have so far devoured about 74,000 square km of land in Canada, making 2023 one of the worst years for wildfires on record, according to the center.



MVA SLAMS KCR'S 'PILGRIMAGE' TO MAHA AS POLITICAL STUNT WITH DOUBTFUL MOTIVES

As Bharat Rashtia Samithi President and Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao reached Osmanabad for his pilgrimage to the temple town of Pandharpur on Tuesday, the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) questioned his 'intentions' behind the garb of expanding his party's influence in Maharashtra, here on Monday.



'Telangana Pattern' is as deceptive as the 'Gujarat Pattern'.

"He is only making big announcements through the media... People who work don't need to advertise... He has done nothing for the people of Telangana in the past 9 years. He is coming here to take political advantage from the Pandharpur pilgrimage which attracts over a million devotees from all over Maharashtra," said Patole. Raut questioned the "inten-

tions behind KCR's trip" and asked the Telangana CM to first decide whose side he's on. "KCR's intentions don't appear to be honourable... He's trying to divide the Opposition votes in Maharashtra," said Raut, adding that it won't work here.

NCP MLC Amol Mitkari alleged that KCR and his team are eating mutton-chicken and coming to the holy pilgrim centre in Solapur. "They are consuming royal mut-

ton-chicken and now going to defile the sacred pilgrimage town of Pandharpur. They must think ten thousand times before coming there and playing with peoples' emotions," warned Mitkari.

In the past few months, KCR has come to Maharashtra several times and opened the BRS's first office in this state in Nagpur last week, aiming for a national party status with presence in multiple states.

Political sources indicated that the BRS may plunge into the upcoming civic, Parliament and Assembly elections in Maharashtra, rattling the Opposition parties here as it could spell a vote-split benefiting the ruling Shiv Sena-BJP alliance.

Earlier, the Hyderabad-based All India Majlis-E-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) fought and won several elections with representatives in Lok Sabha, Maharashtra Assembly and a few civic bodies in the past 7-8 years.

However, other outstation parties - barring Samajwadi Party - have not been embraced by the state electorate, and the political fights are restricted to the major state-level players.

Progressive Indian Muslims bat for a 'religion-neutral, gender-just' UCC

The Indian Muslims for Secular Democracy (IMSD) has supported the proposal for a Uniform Civil Code (UCC), terming it as consistent with the provisions of the Constitution, while demanding it should be 'religion-neutral and gender-just', here on Monday.

In a statement, the IMSD also urged the Indian secular political parties "not to fall in the trap of the Bharatiya Janata Party" or Muslim religious bodies like AIMPLB, JUEH, JeIH which oppose the UCC as being contrary to Articles 25 and 26 of the Constitution.

The IMSD Convenor Javed Anand and Co-Convenors A. J. Jawad, Arshad Alam, Feroze Mithiborwala, Irfan Engineer and Nasreen Contractor, also slammed the Muslim clergy for continuing to 'cling' to medieval, patriarchal notions of gender relations in the name of Islam, and contrary to their false claims, the Muslim Personal Law is not God-given but man-made. They said in recent



decades, many Muslim countries, including those which called themselves Islamic states, have reformed their family laws, while believing, practising Muslim are citizens of western democracies which do not have separate family laws for the community. It referred to the 21st Law Commission Report of 2018 which opined that UCC was "neither necessary nor desirable at this state" while the 22nd Law Commission re-ignited the issue by inviting views of the public and religious organisation on UCC, though it has "not offered any draft of its own for the people to respond to".

"The timing of the initiative, the absence of a draft and the fact that the next general elections are less than a year away

have understandably led to apprehensions that the motive of the Modi-led government is suspect. This notwithstanding IMSD calls upon secular political parties not to fall in the trap set by the BJP," it said.

The IMSD said that the Muslim Ulemas willfully ignore the fact that the Article 25 concerning the right to freedom of religion also states, "Nothing in this article shall... prevent the State from making any law "providing for social welfare and reform..."

"The personal laws of all religious communities that were inherited at independence were grossly discriminatory against women. In the decades since, there have been a number of enactments ushering in some reforms in the family laws concerning Hindus and Christians," said the IMSD.

However, the Muslim religious bodies have staunchly resisted any change and never taken a single step in reforming Muslim Personal Law many of whose provisions are blatantly unjust, anti-women, even un-Quranic.

Rights Body notice to Maha govt, Police Chief over 11 labourers kept chained

The NHRC has sent notices to the Maharashtra government and the state's police chief over 11 labourers allegedly being kept chained in Osmanabad district by a contractor to dig wells and prevent them from escaping, officials said on Monday.



grave violation of the human rights of the labourers, the commission said.

The NHRC has taken "suo motu cognisance of a media report that 11 labourers were kept chained by the contractor to dig wells and prevent them from escaping in the Osmanabad district of Maharashtra," it said in the statement on Monday.

The labourers were allegedly forced to work for 12 hours a day to dig a well without any wages. They got food once a day and were forced to answer nature's call inside the well itself. Reportedly, they were rescued on June 17 after one of them managed to sneak out, reached his village

in the state's Hingoli district and informed the police about the torture, the statement said. Mere rescue by the police and arrest of some of the accused in this case is "not going to serve the purpose", the rights panel observed. Accordingly, it has issued notices to the state's chief secretary and the director general of police, seeking a detailed report within four weeks. According to the June 21 media report, the labourers were deployed by the contractors two-three months ago to dig a well in Khamaswadi and Wakharwadi villages under the Dhoki police station limits in Osmanabad.

a slice of history to cover Shinde with a cloak of credibility.

Referring to the revolt of Shinde and others in June 2022, Fadnavis drew attention to a similar event in 1978 when Pawar, 38, had toppled the then CM Vasantao 'Dada' Patil to become the state's youngest CM - a record that he still retains. He went on to become the CM for three more times, an unbeaten achievement. Harking to this critical 45-year-old

piece of history, Fadnavis said Pawar had walked out of the late Patil's cabinet with 40 MLAs and formed the government with the help of the then Opposition Bharatiya Janata Party group and others, and his regime lasted some 18 months.

"What Pawar did was termed as political statesmanship, but when Shinde did the same, it's called 'beimaan' (dishonesty)... How can that be..." boomed Fadnavis,

attempting to push the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) into a corner.

When asked to comment on this, a relaxed and smiling Pawar said in Pune (on Monday) with a glint that when he had formed the government in 1978, "the then BJP was Jan Sangh" that came with him.

"Fadnavis may have been in primary school at that time. So has no knowledge of that period. He speaks such things out of ignorance, and should not be given much importance," said Pawar.

Compared with the onslaught, the 83-year-old Pawar's reply appeared on the dot - in 1978, Fadnavis, 53, was barely 8 years old and actually sitting on a primary school bench when Patil was dethroned..!

Emphasising Fadnavis' lack of historical knowledge, Pawar elaborated that: "I had formed the government with the support of everyone. The late Uttamrao Patil of the Jana Sangh was also a part of the government along with the late Hashu Advani and others. He (Fadnavis) may have been in primary school at that time so didn't know anything about that era..."

BJP GOVERNMENT WILL BE DISLODGED BY "INDIA'S WAGNER GROUP": TEAM UDDHAV

The Shiv Sena (UBT) on Monday claimed the "Wagner group" in India, a reference to opposition parties, will dislodge the Narendra Modi government through the ballot box by using the path of non-violence.

An editorial in the Sena (UBT) mouthpiece 'Saamana' drew a parallel between Wagner mercenary group's "revolt against Russian President Putin" and the meeting of opposition parties in Patna last week. Friday and resolved to take on the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) unilaterally in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

The editorial in Saamana said the "Wagner group" has shown dictatorship can be challenged.

"Be it PM Modi or Putin, they have to face rebellion. The government in India will be dislodged by a non-violent Wagner and that route will be through the ballot box," it claimed.

Like Putin, PM Modi has to go, but in a democratic manner, it said.

"The Wagner group came together in Patna as a protector of democracy," the Marathi daily said, referring to the conclave of the opposition parties in Bihar capital last week.

8 killed, 7 injured in truck collision in Maharashtra's Ratnagiri

At least eight persons were killed and seven others injured when a speeding truck collided with a passenger vehicle in Maharashtra's Ratnagiri district, police said on Monday.

The accident occurred at Asud on the Dapoli-Harnai Road when a truck heading towards Dapoli from Harnai being driven on the wrong side of the road rammed into a three-wheeler vehicle, carrying 15 passengers on Sunday afternoon, an official



said. Five passengers were killed on the spot and three others succumbed to their injuries at a hospital, the official said, adding that seven persons were injured.

In a tweet, Maharashtra

Chief Minister Eknath Shinde expressed grief and announced voluntary funds of Rs 5 lakh to the family of each killed which will be paid from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

Man stabs friend to death in Thane over argument

A 25-year-old man allegedly stabbed his friend to death in an inebriated state during a quarrel in Maharashtra's Thane district, police said on Monday.

The incident took place in Pisavali area of Dombivili town on Sunday night, an official said.

The two men were consuming alcohol, when they entered into a heated argument and the accused whipped out a knife and stabbed the victim Shailesh Shilvant (28) multiple times, inspector Suresh Madne of Manpada police station said.

The victim managed to escape from the scene, but fell some distance away. People in the vicinity rushed



him to a hospital, where doctors declared him dead, he said.

The accused was taken into custody following a probe, the official added.

2 Bodies recovered from debris of building that collapsed due to rain

A 94-year-old woman and a man aged 56 were found dead on Monday in the debris of a ground-plus-three storey building which collapsed in Ghatkopar area of Mumbai the previous day, a civic official said.

A portion of the building located in Chittaranjan Nagar of Rajawadi Colony in suburban Ghatkopar collapsed at around 9.30 am on Sunday.

Later, three persons were safely rescued and efforts were underway to bring out two persons trapped there, the official said. While removing the debris, fire personnel found two persons on Monday. They were rushed to a hospital where doctors declared them "brought dead," he said.

The dead have been identified as Alka Mahadev Palande (94) and



Nareesh Palande (56), the official said. After the incident on Sunday, fire brigade, police, civic personnel and a team of the National Disaster

Response Force (NDRF) had rushed to the spot to carry out rescue work.

In another incident on Sunday, a 70-year-old man and a 65-year-old

woman died and two persons were injured after a part of the balcony of a building collapsed in Vile Parle area here.

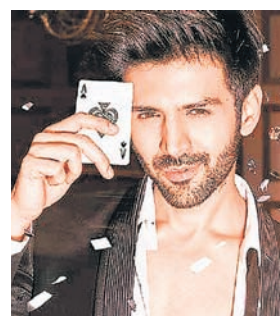
Kartik Aryan flies economy class

INDIAN CONTINGENT CREATE HISTORY IN BERLIN, WON RECORD 202 MEDALS

The Special Olympics World Games 2023 came to close here on Monday, after an evocative, emotional and triumphant closing ceremony at the Brandenburg gate in the centre of the city.

The gate had served as a restricted zone when the city was divided by the Wall, and has, ever since been a beacon of unity - a fitting parable for a sporting event that celebrates unity, diversity and special skills.

India finished the final day of the Games by taking their medal tally to 202 medals (76 gold, 75 silver and 51 bronze), with the last of the medals coming from the athletics track. Indian athletes notched six medals from the track events (2 gold, 3 silver and 1 bronze).

The headlines would undoubtedly go to the gold medallists Aanchal Goyal (400m, Level B Female) and Ravimathi Arumugam (400m, Level C Female) who blew away their competition to take the top of the podium.



And yet, it is important to note that the colour of the medal is not in itself a judge of the performance. Saket Kundu, who had earlier grabbed a silver medal in the mini javelin Level B, also won a bronze in the Level B 400m, a rare double act in the track and field. Speaking about the Indian contingent's performance at the Berlin Games, Chairperson Special Olympics Bharat, Dr Mallika Nada was keen to highlight not just their

performance but also the need for inclusion and acceptance of these athletes by the mainstream.

"A huge number of our athletes have faced social discrimination of various forms, and are regarded as non functioning members of society in various quarters. It is an obsolete thought, and an inaccurate one too. Their performance in the sporting arena prove that they are capable of great feats, or strength, speed, concentration and discipline. And I hope this opens the eyes of those on the outside and proves that we need to expand this movement further and make it more inclusive."

The Games ended with an evening gathering at the Brandenburg gate, with members of every contingent invited up on a stage to represent the spirit of unity and bring to the fore the importance of the Special Olympics movement.

At the press conference to conclude the event, earlier in the day, the conversations circled around how the Berlin Games had been a groundbreaking event, with over 330,000 people attending the World Games live. Many others watched on television and through other media.

"I feel very humbled to be in this city. The city of Berlin has welcomed us," said Hanna Joy Atkinson, Sargent Shriver International Global Messenger. "This was my first World Games ever and I had the chance to do so many things as an athlete leader.

Jhulan Goswami, Heather Knight, Eoin Morgan join MCC World Cricket Committee

Legendary India fast bowler Jhulan Goswami, England women's captain Heather Knight and 2019 Men's ODI World Cup winning captain Eoin Morgan have joined the MCC World Cricket Committee, said the Marylebone Cricket Club on Monday.

Jhulan, a Padma Shri, and Arjuna Awardee, is often regarded as one of the fastest bowlers in the women's game. She represented India in 12 Tests, 204 ODIs and 68 T20Is from 2002 to 2022, picking 355 wickets across formats, the most by any bowler in women's international cricket.

She also won the ICC Women's Player of the Year award in 2007 and rose to number one in the ICC Women's ODI bowling rankings in January 2016. Jhulan was also the captain of the Indian women's cricket team from 2008 to 2011.

In ODIs, she picked 255 wickets, a record in women's



international cricket. Jhulan played for India in five Women's ODI World Cups - 2005, 2009, 2013, 2017 and 2022. She remains the leading wicket-taker in the history of the Women's Cricket World Cups with 43 scalps and was made an Honorary Life Member of MCC in April this year.

Heather has captained England since 2016 and lifted the Women's ODI World Cup at Lord's only a year after taking on the role. The all-rounder has been one of the trailblazers for the women's

game in England, scoring over 5,000 international runs in white-ball cricket, and 705 runs in her ten Test matches.

Morgan captained England in both men's ODI and T20 cricket with distinction and became one of the most respected and successful international skippers in the modern era. He also lifted the Men's ODI World Cup trophy at the end of an unforgettable final against New Zealand in 2019, and was made an Honorary Life Member of MCC earlier this year.

Alcaraz clinches first title on grass at Queen's Club

World No. 2 Carlos Alcaraz clinched his first title on grass as the Spaniard defeated Alex de Minaur of Australia 6-4, 6-4 at Queen's Club here on Sunday.

This victory also means that the 20-year-old will overtake Novak Djokovic to be the men's World No. 1, and will play at the upcoming grass-court Wimbledon Championships as the top seed, reports Xinhua.

Alcaraz battled hard in the first round at Queen's Club as he came from one set down to edge lucky loser Arthur Rinderknech on Tuesday. But the 2022 U.S. Open champion adapted his game well on grass, winning the following four matches all in straight sets.

Alcaraz reached the round of last 16 at last year's Wimbledon and said he believed he has many weapons on grass.

"I try to hit big shots all the time. I think I have improved my serves a lot. And with the forehand, I try to dominate all the time," he said.



Women's Ashes

Ashleigh Gardner claims 8/66 as Australia beat England by 89 runs

Off-spinner Ashleigh Gardner starred with the ball, claiming a brilliant 8/66 in the second innings as England were bowled out for 178 before lunch on day five of the one-off Women's Ashes Test, handing Australia an easy 89-run victory, here on Monday.

Ashleigh's effort means she finishes the one-off Test with an astonishing 12 wickets, after previously picking four wickets in the first innings, with her haul being an Australian record. For England, debutant Danni Wyatt top-scored with 54 before she was trapped lbw by Ashleigh as Australia wrapped up the match within 21 overs on final day's play.

Ashleigh also became the second bowler to take eight wickets in an innings in women's Tests, after India's Neetu David took 8/53 against England in 1995. Her overall match figures of 12/165 are second-best figures in women's Tests after Pakistan's Shaiza Khan took 13/226- against West Indies in 2004. The result means Australia will need to win only two of the six white-ball matches to retain the



Ashes in the multi-format, with the first of the three T20Is starting from July 1 in Birmingham.

England resumed day five from 116/5, chasing a record target of 268, after losing five wickets in quick succession on day four left them requiring

152 more runs to get an improbable win.

Danni and Kate Cross added 25 runs for the sixth wicket before the latter was caught behind for 13 off Ashleigh, who spun a vicious web around the England batters to outclass them with ridiculous ease. Despite Danni hanging around for some resistance, she couldn't find support from the other end. Amy Jones was stumped by Alyssa Healy, Sophie Ecclestone was trapped lbw and Lauren Filer was castled for a duck, before Danni finally fell to give Australia four points.

For England, they had their moments with Tammy Beaumont scoring 208 in first innings, and Sophie Ecclestone taking a 10-wicket haul in the match, recording five wickets in both innings. But it was ultimately overshadowed by Ashleigh's stunning efforts.

Ravi Bishnoi moves to Gujarat from Rajasthan ahead of 2023/24 domestic cricket season

India leg-spinner Ravi Bishnoi has decided to move on from Rajasthan and join the Gujarat team ahead of the upcoming 2023/24 season of Indian domestic cricket.

On Monday, Bishnoi posted a story on his Instagram account, wearing the Gujarat practice jersey with the association logo and captioned the post with 'new beginning'.

Pradyot Singh Rathore, Bishnoi's coach alongside Shahrukh Pathan at the Spartans Cricket Academy in his hometown Jodhpur, said to reporter, "Yes I know, he will be playing for them (Gujarat) now."

IANs also reached out to Bishnoi, the Rajasthan as well as Gujarat Cricket Associations for further information. At the time of publishing the



story, it is still awaiting those responses. Bishnoi has featured in 10 T20Is since his debut in February 2022, picking 16 wickets at an economy rate

of 7.08. He also has one scalp from a solitary ODI appearance against South Africa at Lucknow last year. The Jodhpur-based leg-spinner

claimed 16 wickets for Lucknow Super Giants in IPL 2023, as the side reached the playoffs for second straight time before crashing out of the competition by losing to Mumbai Indians in the eliminator in Chennai.

Bishnoi first shot into limelight by being a part of the India U19 team becoming runners-up in 2020 Men's Cricket World Cup, after losing to Bangladesh in the final, where he finished as the leading wicket-taker with 17 scalps. Though Bishnoi has made regular appearances for Rajasthan in white-ball games in domestic matches, he played just one first-class match for the side in last season's Ranji Trophy. For the upcoming domestic season, Gujarat will be coached by former India spinner Ramesh Powar, who was also the head coach of the national women's team.

Italy take gold at European Athletics Team Championships

Italy won the gold medal at the 2023 European Athletics Team Championships in Chorzow, Poland, followed by Poland and Germany.

Sunday was the last day of the championships, which form part of the 2023 European Games currently being held in Poland, reports Xinhua.

Italy, who were leading the general classification after Saturday's competition, handled the pressure to claim the title with 426.5 points. Second-placed Poland earned 402.5 points, while Germany took bronze medals with 387.5 points. Italy's Zane Weir led the way in the men's shot put, with a best throw of 21.59 meters. Britain's Scott Lincoln took second place, while Poland's Michal Haratyk completed the top three. Italy captain Gianmarco Tamberi also met expectations to win the men's high jump. He jumped 2.29, the same as Thomas Carmoy of Belgium, who needed two efforts to clear the bar and was



relegated to second place as a result. Thierry Ndikumenyayo made a dream debut on his first appearance for Spain, taking victory in the men's 5,000m with a time of 13:25.48. Andreas Almgren of Sweden finished second, 22 seconds adrift. In one of the final competitions of the day, fans at the Silesia Stadium were treated to a thrilling finish in the women's 1,500m as Spain's Esther Guerrero beat Martyna Galant of Poland by just 0.01 seconds, with 4:11.77 on the scoreboard.

Himanshu, Sift and Esha register wins in shooting trials

Himanshu Talan of Indian Army stunned a quality field to win the sixth (T6) men's 10m air rifle national selection trials at the Dr Karni Singh Shooting Range, here on Monday.

Sift Kaur Samra in the women's 50m rifle 3 positions (3P) and Esha Singh in the women's 25m pistol also emerged winners in their respective events.

The national selection trials 5 and 6 for Group A rifle and pistol shooters, currently underway at the DKSSR, assume greater significance as the Indian teams for the World Championships and the Asian Games are set to be selected right after the ongoing event.

Himanshu denied reigning air rifle world champion Rudranksh Patil, who had otherwise been shooting brilliantly to reach two finals in two days and finished fourth and second respectively. The Army man finished with a total of 252.9 after the 24-shot final, 0.9 ahead of the world champion. He did not shoot a single nine throughout and recorded four scores of 10.8, including his 24th shot, and five scores of 10.7. The other form shooter Hriday Hazarika of Assam, finished third on



the day to go with a second in the T5 on Monday. Hriday would be happy though that he topped qualification with a score of 632, a second successive day he has matched that score. Meanwhile, Punjab's Sift Kaur Samra looked a different league in the women's 3P. She shot a 592 first in qualification to top it, which was a repeat of the T5 trial qualification performance on Sunday. Then she won the 45-shot final, a huge four points ahead of second placed Manini Kaushik of Rajasthan. Sift had opened up a huge gap over the field after the first 15 kneeling shots itself and never looked back. State-mate Anjum Moudgil was third, which along with her qualification score of 589 to finish second, will surely boost the confidence of the former world championship silver medalist.

ODI WC Qualifier SEAN WILLIAMS' 174 LEADS ZIMBABWE TO MAMMOTH 304-RUN WIN OVER USA

Stand-in captain Sean Williams slammed a majestic 174 off 101 balls to lead Zimbabwe to a mammoth 304-run victory over USA in their Group A match of Men's ODI World Cup Qualifiers at the Harare Sports Club, here on Monday.

Apart from Williams, opener Joylord Gumbie's 78, as well as whirlwind knocks of 48 and 47 from Sikandar Raza and Ryan Burl respectively propelled Zimbabwe to their highest ODI total of a mammoth 408/6 in 50 overs.

The hosts then bowled out USA for just 104 in 25.1 overs to seal their fourth straight win in the group, also the second biggest winning margin in terms of runs in the history of ODIs. Raza and Richard Ngarava took two wickets each as only three USA batters could reach double figures in an innings which also had three run outs.

Zimbabwe 408/6 in 50 overs (Sean Williams 174, Joylord Gumbie 78; Abhishek Paradar 3/78, Jessy Singh 2/97) beat USA 104 in 25.1 overs (Abhishek Paradar 24, Jessy Singh 21; Sikandar Raza 2/15, Richard Ngarava 2/25) by 304 runs.

Pushed into batting first, Gumbie and Innocent Kaia added 56 runs

for the first wicket. Kaia eventually fell to Jessy Singh while going for a loft in the leg-side. It brought the inform Williams to the crease, who showed signs of aggression by hitting 6,4,4 off Nisarg Patel's bowling in the 15th over.

Despite the loss of Gumbie, Williams marched forward and found an able ally in Raza as they brought up their fifty-run stand in merely 27 balls to pile on the pain on USA bowlers.

By the time Raza fell for 48, the tournament hosts had already crossed the 300-run mark in the 43rd over.

Burl then lifted Zimbabwe even further in their innings with a quickfire 47 off 16 balls, and Williams went on to score freely before falling for 174 in the 49th over. Tadiwanashe Marumani Jessy Singh for 19 runs in the final over, including two fours and a six to take Zimbabwe past 400, effectively batting USA out of the game.

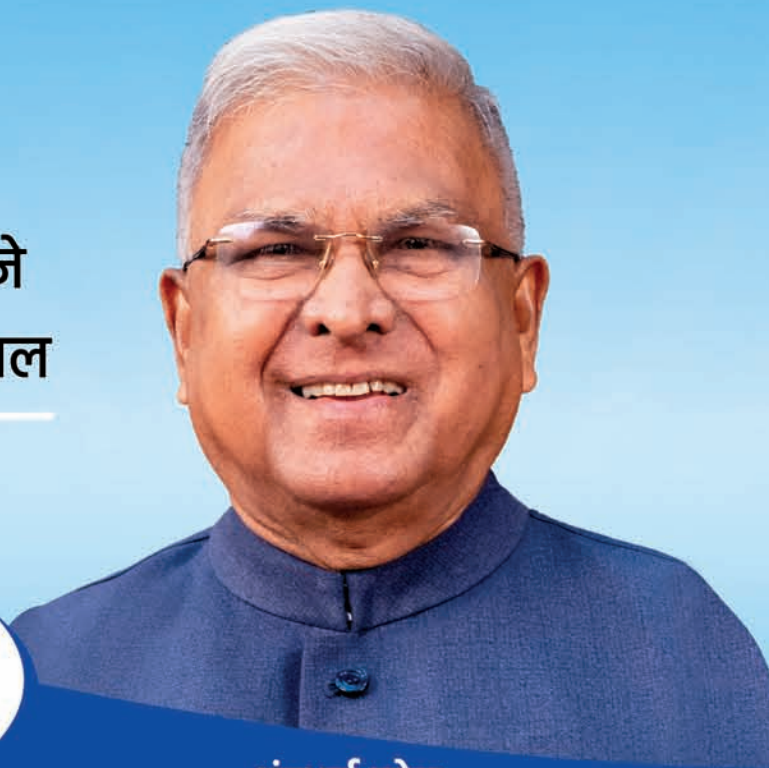
