Climate litigation more than doubles in five years: Report

According to the report, most ongoing climate litigation falls into one or more of six categories: First, cases relying on human rights enshrined in international law and national constitutions; Second, challenges to domestic non-enforcement of climate-related laws and policies; Third, litigants seeking to keep fossil fuels in the ground; Fourth, advocates for greater climate disclosures and an end to greenwashing; Fifth, claims addressing corporate liability and responsibility for climate harms; and Sixth, claims addressing failures to adapt to the impacts of climate change.

The report demonstrates how courts are finding strong human rights linkages to climate change. This is leading to greater protections for the most vulnerable groups in society, as well as increased accountability, transparency and justice, compelling governments and corporations to pursue more ambitious climate change mitigation and adaptation goals.

In the future, the report predicts a rise in the number of cases dealing with climate migration, cases brought by Indigenous peoples, local communities and other groups disproportionately affected by climate change, and cases addressing liability following extreme weather events.

The report also anticipates challenges in applying the science of climate attribution as well as a rise in "backlash" cases against litigants which aim to dismantle regulations that promote climate action.

The total number of climate change court cases has more than doubled since 2017 and is growing worldwide, a new report has revealed.

The report, Global Climate Litigation Report: 2023 Status Review, published by the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) and the Sabin Center for Climate Change Law at Columbia University, show that climate litigation is becoming an integral part of securing climate action and justice.

It is based on a review of cases focused on climate change law, policy or science collected up to December 31, 2022 by the Sabin Center's US and Global Climate Change Litigation Databases.

It was published a day ahead of the first anniversary of the UN General Assembly's declaration of access to a clean and healthy environment as a universal human right. The report provides an overview of key climate litigation cases from the past two years, including historic breakthroughs. As climate litigation increases in frequency and volume, the body of legal precedent grows, forming an increasingly well-defined field of law.

The total number of climate change cases has more than doubled since a first report on the issue, from 884 in 2017 to 2,180 in 2022.

While most cases have been brought in the US, climate litigation is taking root all over the world, with about 17 per cent of cases now being reported in developing countries, including Small Island Developing States. These legal actions were brought in 65 bodies worldwide: in international, regional, and national courts, tribunals, quasi-judicial bodies, and other adjudicatory bodies, including special procedures of the UN



and arbitration tribunals. The report demonstrates how the voices of vulnerable groups are being heard globally: 34 cases have been brought by and on behalf of children and youth under 25 years old, including by girls as young as seven and nine years of age in Pakistan and India respectively, while in Switzerland, plaintiffs are making their case based on the disproportionate impact of climate change on senior women.

Notable cases have challenged government decisions based on a project's inconsistency with the goals of the Paris Agreement or a country's net-zero commitments. Growing awareness of climate change in recent years has also spurred action against corporations -- these include cases seeking to hold fossil fuel companies and other greenhouse gas emitters responsible for climate harm.

BHAYANDER WOMAN UNDERGOES SUCCESSFUL DOUBLE SURGERY FOR RARE 'DUAL CANCER'

A team of doctors at a hospital in Thane's Mira Road have successfully performed a double surgery on a 58-year-old woman who suffered from cancers of the breast and uterus, a hospital official said here on Wednesday.

The woman, Pooja Desai (name changed on request) was under the care of a team of Wockhardt Hospitals doctors comprising Dr. Tirathram Kaushik, Dr. Rajashri Bhasale, Dr. Atul Narayanankar, Dr. Ravi Maneik and Dr. Pratik Tibdeval.

"Dual cancer is seen in barely one-two per cent of the people owing to a genetic mutation in the MMR gene. A multidisciplinary treatment comprising surgery and radiation therapy was used to treat this patient," said Dr Kaushik.

The woman, a resident of Bhayander, panicked when she suddenly experienced post-menopausal bleeding and came in an emergency to the Wockhardt Hospitals here for which she was given radiation therapy treatment.

Her ultrasonography revealed thickening of the endometrium and a biopsy confirmed the worst

fears and a subsequent whole-body PET-CT Scan and pelvic MRI revealed a 5-mm lesion in the left breast, said Dr. Bhasale. After the two cancers were confirmed, the patient was counselled and prepared for the double surgery. She underwent a laparoscopic surgery for uterine cancer and oncoplastic breast preserving operation and was discharged in three days, according to Dr. Kaushik.

A genetic test revealed that she was having a MMR Gene Mutation, or Lynch Syndrome, which is hereditary and the most common cause of colorectal cancer. "The patient faces a greater risk of colon cancer in the near future, but now two surgeries were performed and she is much better now. After the total three-month long treatment, we have discharged her with precautions like lifestyle modifications, proper diet and exercises," said Dr. Bhasale. The patient later recounted how she had experienced a rude shock when she was diagnosed with dual cancers simultaneously.



Indian national in Dubai to get over Rs 5.5 lakh per month for next 25 years

A 38-year-old Indian architect will get Rs 5.5 lakh per month for the next 25 years after he was named the first winner of the UAE's mega prize draw.

Mohammed Adil Khan from Azamgarh, Uttar Pradesh, who has been working at a real estate company in Dubai since five years, participated in the Emirates Draw's FAST5 game for the first time and became the lucky winner, The Khaleej Times reported.

Khan said he was shocked to get a congratulatory email informing him about his windfall.

The initial shock turned into excitement when I received the mail. When I received a call from the organisers, I was way too overwhelmed. I couldn't believe it and feel like I can retire and my future is secure. I feel I have retired early," Khan, who has a family of eight back home



dependent on him, told The Khaleej Times.

A CLINIC FOR ISSUES RELATED TO INTERSEX PEOPLE

First of its kind trans-health clinic in Lucknow is instilling confidence among intersex people to search for their own identity.

'Sabrang', the clinic, claims to be the only one of its kind in north India.

Ayush Kumar Agnihotri, the clinic manager, says, "Every month we get people confused about what they look like and what they feel from inside. Experts working with us find a solution."

Transgender is an umbrella term that encompasses people who have a gender identity or gender expression, which differs from their sex assigned at birth. Being independent of sexual orientation, they have often been classified as the "third sex."

Dr Heeralal, additional director, National Health Mission, said, "Based on



various socio-cultural traditions and beliefs, they are frequently discriminated against and stigmatised. This has led to their limited social inclusion and participation."

"The average footfall at the clinic is up to 30 every month. All of them go for counselling and other services," said Ayush. For transgender population, the current standard under the National AIDS Control Programme is to deliver

HIV services through targeted interventions (TI) which are implemented by NGO/CBOs for prevention services.

The current HIV prevalence among the transgender population in India is 3.14 per cent as per the 2017 data.

Given that the transgender population has broader health care needs beyond HIV, offering comprehensive services will most likely increase access to and adherence to STI/HIV

prevention and treatment and increase overall health and well-being.

In many health care settings, transgender and gender non-conforming individuals experience discrimination and mistreatment.

In all, 438 transgender persons were registered at the clinic and 32 district representatives are active in 17 districts. So far, 3 webinars have been organized under the chairmanship of Dr Heera Lal.

UP botanists discover new plant species from Sikkim

Botanists from the Botanical Survey of India (BSI) in Prayagraj have discovered a new hemiparasitic plant species, Pedicularis Revealiana, in the state of Sikkim.

Along with making its own food, it has the ability to gather nutrients from the roots of trees and plants located nearby.

The research was published in the July issue of International Nordic Journal of Botany.

"The new species Pedicularis revealiana, is described from Katao in Sikkim Himalaya and it possesses a combination of characters which makes it unique among all Pedicularis species. It is stout and has woody stems, bears minute flowers of pinkish-purple colour," says the scientist from BSI, Arti Garg who along with Achutanand Shukla had spotted this new species of Pedicularis group in September 2019 while on



way from Lachung to Katao of Sikkim Himalayan region.

After the discovery of this new species, scientists have now recommended finding out the medicinal properties of this plant.

Sikkim is known for its biodiversity as this state alone accounts for 45 per cent of the total plant diversity of the Indian Himalayan region, said Shukla, who now works with Ministry of Environment Forest and Climatic Changes, New Delhi. "We have named this in honour of the eminent botanist James Lauritz Reveal of the University of Maryland, who was globally renowned for his botanical contributions and work on supra-generic names," said Garg.



HEAVY RAINFALL TO CONTINUE OVER EAST, NORTHEAST, AND EAST CENTRAL INDIA: IMD

Heavy to very heavy rainfall activity is likely to continue over east, northeast and east central India during the next 4-5 days, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Saturday.

In its bulletin, the weather agency predicted that in northwest India, there will be light to moderate fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy rainfall expected in Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, west Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, and east Rajasthan on Saturday and August 2. Additionally, west Uttar Pradesh will experience this rainfall on August 1 and 2, while Uttarakhand will have it till August 2. East Uttar Pradesh is likely to witness rainfall till August 1.

In Central India, light to moderate fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy rainfall is very likely in east Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh till July 31, west Madhya Pradesh on August 1 and 2, and Vidarbha on August 2.



"Chhattisgarh will also experience isolated very heavy rainfall on Saturday, August 1 and 2, while east Madhya Pradesh will have it on August 1 and 2, and Vidarbha on August 1," said the IMD.

The IMD predicted that in west India, there will be light to moderate fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy rainfall continuing in Konkan, Goa and central Maharashtra on Saturday and

August 1, and over Gujarat on Saturday. "Isolated very heavy rainfall is expected in Konkan, Goa and Madhya Maharashtra on August 2," said the IMD.

In south India, light to moderate fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy rainfall is very likely over coastal Karnataka during Saturday to August 2, Telangana on August 1 and 2, and south interior Karnataka on August 2.

"East India is expected to have light to moderate fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy rainfall in West Bengal and Sikkim on Saturday and Sunday, Jharkhand till August 1, and Bihar during July 31 to August 2," said the IMD.

Finally, in Northeast India, there will be light to moderate fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy rainfall across the region for the next five days. "Additionally, isolated very heavy rainfall is likely in Arunachal Pradesh on Saturday, and in Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, and Tripura on August 1 and 2," it added.

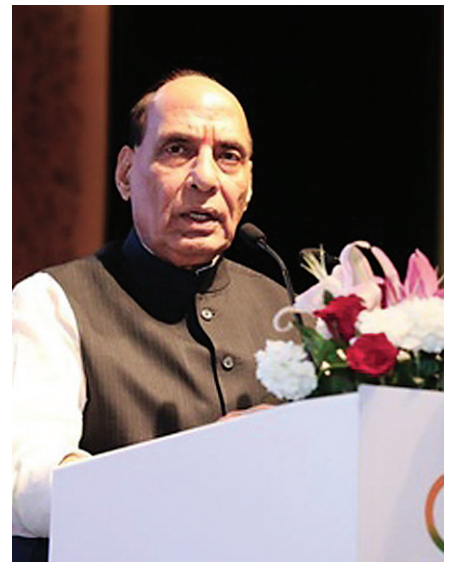
Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Saturday said that a robust and enlightened civil society is essential for functioning of democracy.

Over 400 Chinese manjha rolls seized in Delhi; 1 held

Delhi Police have arrested a 42-year-old man and seized over 400 rolls of banned and deadly Chinese manjha (kite strings), an official said on Saturday.

The arrested individual has been identified as Nizam, a resident of Janta Colony in the Welcome area.

According to the police, to curb the unfortunate incidents in which some residents of Delhi lost their lives due to Chinese manjha, a police team was tasked to trace active dealers of 'Chinese manjha' in the area of northeast district.

"In pursuance, on Friday, one Imran a.k.a. Harun was arrested and 33 rolls of Chinese manjha were recovered from his possession," Deputy Commissioner of Police, Joy Tirkey said.



On questioning, he revealed the name of Nizam, who was his source of supply. "On Imran's instance,

Nizam was arrested and 422 rolls of deadly Chinese manjha were recovered from his possession. Nizam's further source of supply of Chinese manjha is being ascertained," said the official.

Raje, Raman Singh, ex-Aligarh Univ VC Tariq Mansoor appointed BJP's national V-P

BJP President Jagat Prakash Nadda on Saturday announced the names of party's national office-bearers with two former chief ministers -- Raman Singh and Vasundhara Raje -- from the poll-bound states of Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan being appointed as national vice-presidents.

There are 13 vice-presidents, nine general secretaries, including B L Santhosh as the in-charge of the organisation, and 13 secretaries in the list.

The BJP also appointed party MLC and former Aligarh Muslim University vice-chancellor Tariq Mansoor, a Pasmanda Muslim as BJP vice-president, while Anil Antony, son of veteran Congress leader AK Antony, who switched to the BJP, has been appointed as national secretary of the party.

The fresh appointments in the



BJP comes ahead of the crucial assembly elections in states of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh scheduled later this year, and the 2024 Lok Sabha elections scheduled next year.

According to an official communique issued by the BJP, besides Raje and Singh, former Jharkhand chief minister Raghubar Das, senior party leader Baijayant Panda and Rekha Verma have also been named as vice-presidents of the party.

In view of the assembly polls, party leaders from Chhattisgarh

Saroj Pandey and Lata Usendi, Telangana party leader DK Aruna, Madhya Pradesh leader Soudan Singh have also been included in the national vice-president list.

Meanwhile, senior party leaders Arun Singh, Kailash Vijayvargiya, Dushyanth Kumar Gautam and Tarun Chugh are among the names of national general secretaries appointed. The party has also included former Telangana state unit chief Sanjay Bandi in the national general secretaries list of the party.

As per the release, other office-bearers appointed by Nadda include the party's national secretary.

Besides Anil Antony, Pankaja Munde and Rituraj Sinha are among the national secretaries announced by the BJP.

However, several people like Dilip Ghosh, CT Ravi, Dilip Saikia, Harish Dwivedi, Sunil Deodhar and Vinod Sonkar have been removed as national office bearers of the BJP. Former Union minister Radha Mohan Singh, a Lok Sabha MP from Bihar, has also been dropped as a party vice-president.

Earlier this week, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had assured that India will be among the top three economies of the world in his third term, in an apparent reference that his government will return to power again in 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

The BJP has exuded confidence that it will return to power again in 2024 general elections.

Fake currency printing machine seized in Assam, one arrested

Assam Police on Saturday said that it busted a racket involving Fake Indian Currency Notes (FICN) in Nagaon district.

A senior police officer told reporter that a fake currency printing machine was also seized during the operation.

"Based on earlier information, we conducted an operation in the Uzanmari area of Nagaon and arrested a person identified as Sahidul



Islam. A fake currency printing machine was recovered from his house," the officer added.

According to police, fake Indian currency

notes of total Rs 1.62 lakhs were found in Islam's house.

Police have seized the notes.

Further investigation in

the matter is underway.

Earlier, Guwahati police confiscated about Rs 2 lakh in fake Indian currency notes on Thursday, and one individual was taken into custody.

The seizure, according to police, was made in the Garchuk area of the city during an operation based on specific input from informants.

The police claimed to have earlier information about Babul Hussain, who was supposedly in possession of the fake Indian currencies.

MINOR GIRL GANG-RAPED IN BIHAR; 2 ARRESTED

Patna: A 17-year-old minor girl has been gang-raped by two people in Bihar's Araria district.

The victim and her mother had gone for a Tazia event organised during Muharram when the girl suddenly disappeared.

After people searched for the victim, she was found naked in a jute agricultural field. The people got hold of the two accused near the agriculture field who have been identified as Mohammad Asfaq and Mohammad Mumtaz.

The accused are residents of Moti Tappu ward number 14 of Pathraha Panchayat under Narpatganj police station. The accused had gone to victim's village, which falls under Forbesganj in Araria, and gang-raped the victim.

"We have arrested the accused under the POCSO Act following the complaint filed by the victim's mother.

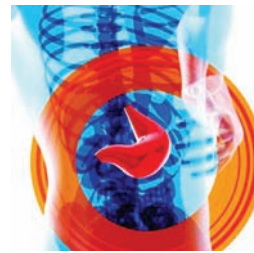
Rare liver transplant saves lives of two Uzbek nationals

A team of doctors at a hospital here has successfully performed a rare two-way liver transplant, granting a new life to two foreign nationals hailing from Uzbekistan.

Overcoming the challenges of ABO incompatibility, the medical team, devised an innovative solution where willing donors exchanged organs to match the blood groups of the recipients.

The medical team conducted four simultaneous surgeries on June 9, saving the lives of both 41-year-old Gulyam and 51-year-old Matlubakhon. The



intricacy of the situation stemmed from the challenging ABO incompatibility between the patients and their designated donors.

While Gulyam's blood group was B, his son, who volunteered to donate, had blood group A. Similarly, Matlubakhon, who also

required an urgent transplant, had blood group A, while her sister's blood group was B. ABO-incompatible transplants, where the blood type of the donor and recipient are not compatible have a high rate of rejection by the recipient's body, and this apparent mismatch of blood groups poses a significant obstacle to the success of liver transplants.

The immune system recognises the transplanted organ as foreign and launches an immune response which leads to a potential rejection of the liver and endangers the life of the recipient.

'EX-BENGAL CM BUDDHADEB RESPONDING TO TREATMENT'

Kolkata: Former West Bengal chief minister Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee has been kept on continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) support at the ICU unit of a private hospital in Kolkata after he was admitted on Saturday after his oxygen saturation level started dropping.

A medical board, which includes the personal physician of the former West Bengal chief minister, has been formed for his treatment.

"He has started responding to the treatment as informed by the doctors treating him, with the oxygen saturation level going up," said CPI(M) central committee member Robin Deb.

Governor C.V. Ananda Bose also rushed to the private hospital in South Kolkata after getting news of hospitalisation of the former chief minister.

"He is under medication under a team of able doctors. I wish him speedy recovery," the Governor told media persons at the hospital premises on Saturday.

Punjab Police arrest 5 operatives of foreign-based Khalistan Liberation Force

In a major breakthrough, Punjab Police have arrested five operatives of foreign-based Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF) and foiled a conspiracy of Pakistan's ISI to disrupt the peace and harmony of the border state ahead of the Independence Day, Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav said on Saturday.

Following inputs that some terrorist elements based in abroad have organised a terror module by recruiting foot soldiers through criminals lodged in jails and have been hatching a conspiracy to target minority leaders, police officials, and other prominent persons to disturb the peace and harmony, the State Special Operating Cell (SSOC) of Mohali had registered a case and started a special operation.

"Around two-week long operation, which involved meticulous intelligence gathering, technical analysis, and swift action led to the apprehension of five operatives of this terrorist module involved in the nefarious plot," said DGP Yadav. He said investigations have revealed that the links of this new



module have been established with the same foreign-based handler that had targeted Rajeev Mahajan in Batala on June 24 and they were controlling this separate module through these operatives to carry out different target killings in the state.

He said that the investigations have also revealed that operatives

of the KLF by using the name of Ranjodh Singh, which is a fake name, have been doing talent spotting in India and recruiting foot soldiers through people based in jail.

He said that then using fake narratives over social media to influence impressionable youth and transfer money into their bank

accounts to motivate them to carry out target killings in Punjab.

The DGP reiterated that Punjab Police under the leadership of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is fully committed to maintaining peace and communal harmony in the state and the nefarious designs of anti-national elements will not be allowed to succeed.

Find a match for Rahul: Sonia to women farmers from Haryana

The video shows a light-hearted chat between the women and Sonia Gandhi on the marriage of Rahul Gandhi.

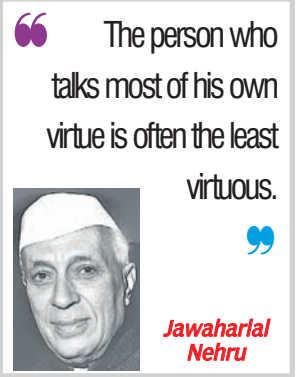

INDIA bloc MPs reach Manipur to assess ground situation

Imphal: A delegation of 21 MPs from 16 parties of the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) arrived in Imphal on Saturday on a two-day visit to assess the ground situation in the violence-hit Manipur. The ethnic violence in Manipur which broke out on May 3 has so far killed over 160 people and injured more than 600 others.

The delegation will visit the valley and hill districts and talk to the affected people.

Trinamool Congress Rajya Sabha member Sushmita Dev said that they will also likely meet Governor Anusuiya Uikey.

The Congress and other opposition parties are demanding the imposition of the President's rule in Manipur and discussions in the Parliament.

The organisers of the rally led by COCOMI decided to submit a memorandum to Prime Minister Narendra Modi to restore peace and normalcy at the earliest. The participants of the rally claimed

CBI files FIR in Manipur viral video case

New Delhi: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) announced on Saturday that they have filed an FIR in connection to the viral video of two young tribal women being paraded naked by a mob in Manipur.

A senior CBI official told reporter that the case was registered late Friday night.

The Manipur government and the Union Ministry of Home Affairs had transferred the case to the CBI for further investigation.

In connection to the incident, the Manipur Police have arrested seven suspects.

Although the incident took place on May 4, a day after the widespread ethnic violence broke out in Manipur, the video went viral this month.

"I am sure that those who are in the chair and responsible for taking actions due to be taken are doing their best. We should avoid second guess. The person on the ground knows best what is to be done," the former Army Chief said.

Andhra's tomato farmer earns Rs 4 cr in 45 days

A tomato farmer in Andhra Pradesh's Chittoor district has literally hit the jackpot by earning a whopping Rs 4 crore in 45 days. With the prices of tomatoes skyrocketing, Murali's fortunes took a dramatic turn.

The 48-year-old sold his produce not only in the tomato market in Madanapalle but also transported to neighbouring Karnataka as it fetched a higher price there.

Murali and his wife cultivated tomatoes on 22-acre land in Karakamandla village in April. During last 45 days, they sold 40,000 boxes of tomatoes.

The farmer said the huge earning helped them clear debts of Rs 1.5 crore, which they had incurred while cultivating the same vegetable in the past.

According to Murali, this time the yield was good due to improvement in power supply. However, the steep hike in prices of tomatoes came as the biggest turnaround. "I had never imagined that toma-

atoes will yield such a huge income," said a beaming Murali.

He plans to invest a part of the profit to expand horticulture activities.

Murali is the second farmer to reap such a huge income.

A farmer in Telangana's Medak district had whopping Rs 2 crore by selling tomatoes during the last one month while another crop worth Rs 1 crore is ready for harvest.

Bansuvada Mahipal Reddy of Mohammed Nagar in Kaudipalli mandal of Medak district became a millionaire overnight due to the skyrocketing price of tomatoes.

With the price of tomatoes soaring to Rs 150 per kg in the market and lack of adequate supply from Andhra Pradesh and other places, Mahipal Reddy catered to the demand in Hyderabad market.

He sold the produce for Rs 100 per kg in the wholesale market. During the last one month, he sold about 8,000 boxes of tomatoes, each over 25 kg. The 40-year-old farmer, a school dropout, has emerged as a role model for all.

Lakshman, who is an accused in a case related to cheating along with tainted businessman Monson Mavunkal, has been asked to appear before the Vigilance wing of the Kerala Police on July 31.



The IPS officer said that "this invincible and powerful person was mediating in many financial deals".

He also told the court "this person was involved in framing him in the case related to the financial fraud of Monson Mavunkal".

IG Lakshman was suspended from service for 15 months in the case involving Monson Mavunkal. He has been reinstated recently.

Meanwhile, a source said that such a "direct charge" by a top police officer against the CMO left baffled the Left Front government baffled.

I-T Dept conducts raids on 3 premises of Chinese-firm Haier

New Delhi: The Income Tax Department has conducted raids at various locations in three states on the premises belonging to Chinese home appliance firm Haier in connection with a tax evasion case, a source said on Saturday.

As of now, the Income Tax Department has not issued any official statement on the matter.

According to the source, the search operations were carried out in Mumbai, Pune, and Noida.

The searches, which began early in Friday morning, went on till late in the night.

The firm allegedly hid its income, and there were some discrepancies in royalty payments. The I-T teams reportedly checked the accounts and invoices of the last three years.

The company has also not made any statement on the matter as of now.

9 killed in TN firecracker unit explosion

Chennai | Agencies

Nine people have been killed while eleven others sustained injuries following an explosion at a firecracker godown in Krishnagiri district of Tamil Nadu on Saturday.

The owner of the godown along with his wife and two children have also died in the explosion. They have been identified as Ravi (42), the owner of the godown, his wife Jayasree (40), daughter Rithika (19), son Rutheesh (21).

The other deceased have been identified as Rajeswari (45) -- owner of a eatery, two others -- Ibrahim (21) and Imran (8). Two more bodies are yet to be identified.

Police said that the blast occurred due to the explosion of a gas cylinder at an eatery adjacent to the godown. The explosion resulted in a massive fire which engulfed the godown, house, welding unit,



and a restaurant.

Police said that few bodies are still trapped under the cement rubble. They said that the fire and rescue services along with the police are trying their best to remove the rubble to reach to the bodies.

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin has paid condolences and announced a compensation of Rs 3 lakhs for the deceased families.

The government also announced compensation of Rs 1 lakh to those who have sustained serious injuries and

are undergoing treatment. An amount of Rs 50,000 has also been announced for those who have suffered minor injuries.

The Chief Minister Stalin has instructed Civil Supplies Minister R. Sakkarpani to oversee the rescue operations.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah has also expressed condolences over the tragedy and said that he was deeply saddened to know about the tragic fire accident in a crackers factory in Krishnagiri (Tamil Nadu).

Clash erupts between police and mob over Muharram procession route in Delhi

New Delhi: Clashes erupted between the police and mob during a Tazia procession on Saturday evening near the Surajmal Stadium in Delhi's Nangloi area, a Delhi Police official said.

The Deputy Commissioner of Police (Outer) Harendra Singh said that around 8,000 to 10,000 people were carrying out the procession peacefully, however, the organisers of Tazia procession wanted to deviate from the designated route.

This led to a heated argument, escalating into a dispute.

"The situation further worsened when the mob engaged in a scuffle with the police officers started pelting stones towards police. In response, the police resorted to baton charges to disperse the unruly mob," said the DCP.

Around 8 to 10 police officials sustained minor injuries, and police vehicles were also damaged. Mob also pelted stones on private vehicles and public buses.

"We have not arrested anyone yet but legal action will be initiated," said the official.

However, to restore law and order situation in the area, police have temporarily closed all the markets, and additional police personnel have been deployed.

"The situation is being closely monitored to prevent any further escalation of tension," said another police official. More details are awaited.

Over the past half-century, Project Tiger has achieved success, with significant strides made in tiger conservation.

Initially covering nine tiger reserves across 18,278 square km,



the project now encompasses 53 reserves spread over 75,796 square km, effectively covering 2.3 per cent of India's total land area.

India currently boasts almost 75 per cent of the world's wild tiger population, reflecting the project's significant impact on tiger preservation.

In response, the government initiated the second phase in 2005, adopting a landscape-level approach, involving local communities, implementing strict law enforcement, and utilising modern technology for scientific monitoring.

Pakistan-bound teenager caught at Jaipur airport without legal documents

In yet another incident of cross-border love in Rajasthan, a 17-year-old teenager heading to Pakistan to meet her lover was caught at the Jaipur airport without any legal documents to travel to the neighbouring country.

On Friday, the girl from Shrimadhapur in Sikar was taken into custody by CISF personnel and handed her to the airport police.

During interrogation, it was revealed that the girl was going to meet her lover in Lahore.

DCP East Gyanchand Yadav said that at 2 p.m. on Friday afternoon, the girl reached the airport with two boys.

"When she asked for a ticket to Pakistan, the airport staff first thought it was a joke, but then the girl told them that she was

Pakistani and had come to India three years back with her aunt. She was living in Srimadhapur of Sikar."

The girl also said that a few days ago, she had a fight with her aunt following which she took a bus and reached Jaipur on Friday morning.

"The two boys met the girl in the bus and came to drop her at the airport. During interrogation, the boys revealed that they spoke to her and came to drop her at the airport," the DCP added.

During interrogation, it was also revealed about a year ago, the girl had befriended Aslam Lahori, a man from Lahore, on Instagram.

The girl also revealed Aslam was friends with other female students of her school as well.

Her mobile has been seized by authorities and the police have informed her family, who were unaware of her actions.



AFTER 'TERROR RECCE', SECURITY TIGHTENED AT MUMBAI'S CHABAD HOUSE

In the wake of a 'terror recce' of the Chabad House in Colaba, the Mumbai Police have beefed up security at this Jewish community centre which was targeted during the 26/11, 2008 terror strikes.

The action follows the Pune Police nabbing two terror suspects of Rajasthan from Pune when they were caught stealing motorcycles 10 days ago.

They were identified as Mohammed Yunus Khan, 23 and Yunus Yakub Saki, 24, both hailing from Ratlam in Madhya Pradesh, and carrying a reward of Rs 500,000 on their heads.

After an initial case was lodged against them in Chittorgarh, Rajasthan, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) entered the probe and filed its chargesheet against them in MP in April 2022, naming Khan-Sakhi and 10 others as accused in the matter.



The Pune Police subsequently handed them over to the NIA which revealed that they were the wanted absconders with suspected

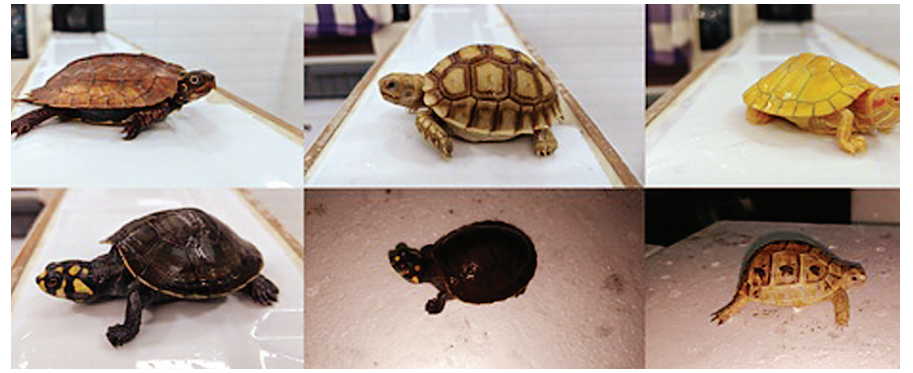
links to an extremist group Al-Sufa and had been holed up in Pune for over a year in a rented location.

Later, the Pune Anti Terrorism Squad nabbed two more suspects including Abdul Qadir and one more associate apprehended from Ratnagiri on Saturday, both said to be linked with the Khan-Saki duo arrested earlier.

Further interrogation and investigations have revealed a map and images of Chabad House and other locations of Mumbai where they reportedly carried out 'surveillance', besides seizing laptops, computers, pen-drives, hard disks and mobiles from them.

They were produced before a Special Court and are currently in police custody till August 5, while further probe is going on into their local Pune contacts or associates, the sources of their findings, the motives for their stay here, the modules of the Al-Sufa network that may be active in different parts of the state, and related angles.

Mumbai DRI seizes 306 exotic live animals smuggled from Thailand

In a major catch, the DRI Mumbai Zonal Unit has seized 306 live exotic animals that were smuggled here from Thailand via the Air Cargo Complex, Sahar, an official said on Saturday.

The consignment, originally declared as 'live ornamental fishes' was intercepted by the DRI sleuths early on Friday and examined. It revealed a total of 100 turtles, 62 tortoises, 110

snails, 30 juvenile crabs and 4 sting rays that were hidden in the consignment disguised as live ornamental fishes.

The seizure includes several rare or endangered species like Greek Tortoise, Red-Footed Tortoise, Asian Spurred Tortoise, Yellow Spotted Albino Red Ear Slider Turtle, Asian/Chinese Leaf Turtle, Red Bellied Short Head Turtle. The consignment seized has violated the Convention of International

Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), said the DRI.

Now, further under the wildlife laws for the rehabilitation of the exotic animals will be initiated in consultation with the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau and the Chief Wildlife Warden of Maharashtra.

The grey market value of the seized live animals, the consignor or consignee details, etc are not yet revealed.

6 Amarnath returnees killed as buses collide on Buldhana highway

At least six pilgrims returning from the Amarnath Yatra were killed and another 21 injured when two private luxury buses collided near Malkapur in Maharashtra's Buldhana on Saturday, officials said.

The accident occurred when the pilgrims were returning home to Hingoli and other places when their buses rammmed into an Akola-bound bus.

The six victims died on the spot and of the 21 injured, two were said to be in serious condition. The other 32 passengers have been shifted to a gurdwara in Malkapur for temporary lodging and boarding till arrangements are made to enable them go home. Chief Minister Eknath Shinde expressed grief over the tragedy and announced a



compensation of Rs 5 lakhs to the kin of each deceased persons and treatment at government expenses to all the injured victims at the Buldhana Civil Hospital.

A police official said that the two buses collided at around 2.30 a.m. on the NH 6 on a railway over-bridge near Malkapur, which is on the Akola-Jalgaon highway.

One of the buses had

around 50 pilgrims returning to Hingoli after an 18-day pilgrimage to Amarnath, and the other bus of Royal Travels bound from Nagpur to Nashik with inter-district passengers. As per initial investigations, the Nashik-bound bus attempted to overtake a truck ahead when the Hingoli-bound bus came in front and led to the accident.

Nitish is PM Modi's friend, should return to NDA: Ramdas Athawle

The source also added that by sharing

Gangster Chhota Shakeel's shooter arrested after 25 Years: Mumbai Police

A shooter of fugitive gangster Chhota Shakeel has been arrested after 25 years in connection with a murder case, a Mumbai Police official said.

The arrested accused has been identified as 50-year-old Laik Ahmed Fida Hussain Sheikh.

"Laik Ahmed Fida Hussain Sheikh (50), shooter of the Chhota Shakeel gang arrested by Pydhonie Police from near Thane railway station on July 28. Sheikh is accused in the murder of a member of the arrested underworld don Chhota Rajan gang," the official said on Friday.

The accused, along with his accomplices, had shot dead Munna Dhari, a member of the arrested underworld don Chhota Rajan gang, on the evening of April 2, 1997. At that time, the police arrested Sheikh by registering a case against the accused under Section 302, 34 of the IPC and Section 3, 25 of the Arms Act, the offi-



cial said. "After this, the accused was released on bail by a court in the year 1998," the police official added.

The official said that since 1998, the accused Sheikh went underground and did not appear in any court hearing, after which he was declared an absconder.

Police received information from secret sources that the accused Sheikh lived in Mumbai. After which they reached the address but he was not found, nor did anyone recognize him. Police also received information that the accused worked as a taxi driver at the Thane campus. The police traced the location of Sheikh and arrested him on Friday by setting a trap near Thane railway station, the official added.



MADHYA PRADESH RETAINS TOP POSITION IN TIGER COUNT

The number of tigers in Madhya Pradesh rose to 785 in 2022 from 526 in 2018, Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said on July 29 as he greeted the State's people on International Tiger Day. Union Minister for Environment, Forest & Climate Change Bhupender Yadav also congratulated Madhya Pradesh for retaining its status as the "Leading Tiger State of India."



As per the report 'Status of Tigers: Co-predators & Prey in India-2022', released by the National Tiger Conservation Authority and Wildlife Institute of India, Madhya Pradesh has the highest number of tigers in the country, followed by Karnataka (563) and Uttarakhand (560). Madhya Pradesh forests added 259 tigers in a span of four years, as per the survey. "It is a matter of great pleasure that as a result of cooperation of the people of our State and untiring efforts of the Forest Department, the number of tigers in our State has increased to 785 from 526

in four years," Chouhan said in a tweet.

Congratulating the people of the State for this success, he further said, "Let us all together take a pledge to conserve nature for future generations on the occasion of International Tiger Day."

The tiger count in the State was 300 in 2006, but in 2010 the State slipped from its number one position as the tiger population declined to 257 against 300 in Karnataka. In 2014, Karnataka recorded 406 tigers while M.P. recorded 300 big cats.

But the tiger population in Madhya Pradesh rose there-

after as it reclaimed the top position in 2018 with 526 big cats recorded against 524 in Karnataka. Madhya Pradesh has six tiger reserves: Kanha, Bandhavgarh, Panna, Pench, Satpura and Sanjay-Dubri Tiger Reserve.

Union Minister Yadav also took to Twitter to congratulate Madhya Pradesh for the achievement.

doiskopakdo, chaku mar kebghagrahahai.' After chasing for few meters, the cop managed to overpower the minor boy, who was still holding a knife in his hand.

"The accused is minor. He has been detained. Victim's family has lodged an FIR and we are investigation the matter. The FIR says that victim had made a video of the accused and had shown to a school teacher. We will visit the school for inquiry," the police said.

Bhopal: A day after an 11-year-old girl was brutally gang-raped in Madhya Pradesh's Satna, the district administration bulldozed the houses of the two accused on Saturday morning. 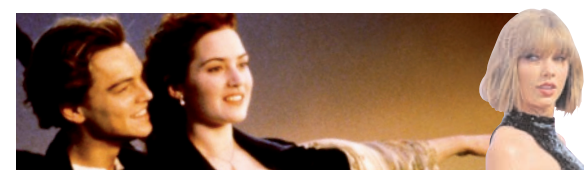

"Everyone has been informed that there will be a two-month hiatus now. Conversations about when to start up again are ongoing but it's likely it will be in November when they will be going to Las Vegas to shoot some scenes. It all depends on the strike however."

It is also reported that the strike decision will likely have a significant financial impact on the production of the film.

Men's T20 World Cup 2024 to be played from June 4 to 30: Report

- As far as the format for the 2024 World Cup, it will be different to the last two editions (2020-21 in the UAE and 2022 in Australia), where the first round was followed by Super 12s.
- Next year, the 20 teams will be divided into four groups of five each for the first round, with the top two teams from each group qualifying for the Super 8s. The Super 8 teams will be split into two groups of four each, with the top two in each group reaching the semi-finals.

The 2024 Men's T20 World Cup is set to be played from June 4 to 30 next year in the Caribbean and the USA, across 10 venues.

According to an ESPNcricinfo report, an ICC team this week inspected some shortlisted venues in the USA, which will be hosting an international global cricket event for the first time.

The venues include Lauderhill in Florida, which has hosted international matches already (and is set to host West Indies vs India in the coming fortnight), Morrisville, Dallas and New York, for tournament matches and warm-ups.

Morrisville and Dallas are currently hosting the inaugural edition of Major League Cricket in the USA. On the other hand, the grounds in Dallas (Grand Prairie Stadium), Morrisville (Church Street Park) and New York (Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx) are yet to get international venue status, which is mandatory as per ICC rules.

The report added that the final decision on the venues will be taken by the ICC together with Cricket West Indies (CWI) and USA Cricket (USAC) in the next few months.

Twelve teams had already qualified for the tournament before the regional qualifiers, including hosts West Indies and USA, and the top eight teams at the 2022 T20 World Cup -- Australia, England, India, Netherlands, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa and Sri Lanka. Afghanistan and Bangladesh qualified by virtue of their spots in the T20I rankings, completing the 20-team roster.



2ND ODI: INDIA BOWLED OUT; WEST INDIES TO CHASE 181 RUNS

Bridgetown (Barbados) | Agencies

Ishan Kishan (55) struck his second successive half-century but India failed to capitalise on a good start on a difficult pitch that offered variable bounce to be all out for 181 in 40.5 overs in the second ODI against West Indies here on Saturday.

In a match that was twice interrupted by rain but did not lose any overs, India made a hash of things after the visitors were off to a good start thanks to opener Ishan Kishan, who struck a run-a-ball 55, his second after the 52 in the first match that India won.

Kishan and Shubman Gill raised 90 runs for the opening wicket but the West Indies capitalised on the juice offered by the wicket that was slow but offered bounce too. Romario Shepherd (3-37) and Gudakesh Motie (3-36) were the best West Indies bowlers while Alzerri Joseph claimed 2-35 in seven overs. The West Indies also fielded well, as they picked up some superb catches and did not allow the Indians many opportunities to make a comeback in the match.



Brief scores

India 181 all out in 40.5 overs (Ishan Kishan 55, Shubman Gill 34, Suryakumar Yadav 24; Romario Shepherd 3-37, Gudakesh Motie 3-36) against West Indies.

But disaster struck India just before the first rain interruption midway through their innings when the visitors lost two wickets off successive deliveries, slumping to 113/5 in the 25th over from 95/2 in the 18th over. The experiments India tried in this match did not work out and they fell short by at least 40 runs on a difficult wicket.

India had made a good start after West Indies skipper Shai Hope elected to bowl first, as the two openers Ishan Kishan and Shubman Gill (34) raised 90

runs for the first wicket. Ishan struck a run-a-ball 55, hitting six boundaries and one six. This is his second successive half-century after the 52 in the opening match of the series.

India lost two quick wickets again after a 30-minute rain interruption as Ravindra Jadeja (10) and Suryakumar Yadav (24) got out, after repairing the innings a bit by adding 33 runs for the sixth wicket. Jadeja was caught by Yannic Cariah off Romario Shepherd.

FIFA Women's World Cup

Sweden secure last-16 berth after crushing Italy

Sweden showed their commanding ability in aerial duels as they scored thrice through corners to beat Italy 5-0 in the FIFA Women's World Cup here on Saturday, sealing a last-16 place with one round to spare.

Sweden carved out a hard-fought win in the opening match as they turned around South Africa 2-1, while Italy beat Argentina 1-0 thanks to Cristiana Girelli's late winner. Italy were aggressive from the beginning as Sofia Cantore tested Zecira Musovic just under one minute into the game, before Lucia Di Guglielmo hit the side net, but Sweden managed to weather that early siege and built up their advantage soon, a Xinhua report said. The No. 3 in FIFA's ranking broke the deadlock in the 39th minute when Amanda Ilested headed a Jonna Andersson's corner into the net.

Sweden quickly rode the momentum as they added another five minutes later when another Andersson's corner fell for Fridolina Rolfö to find the net.



With the win, Sweden have already secured the berth for next stage, while Italy, South Africa and Argentina all kept their last-16 spot hopes alive.

Sweden will meet Argentina in the third round on next Wednesday, Italy take on South Africa.

RENARD'S LATE WINNER LIFTS FRANCE PAST BRAZIL

Brisbane (Australia):

Captain Wendie Renard scored an 83rd-minute winner to gift France a crucial 2-1 win over Brazil at the FIFA Women's World Cup here on Saturday.

With the win, France temporarily topped Group F with four points, ahead of the later game between Jamaica and Panama in Perth.

In front of a raucous 49,378 crowd at Brisbane Stadium, France entered under pressure after being held to a goalless draw by Jamaica in their opener, while Brazil made an early statement in a 4-0 thrashing of Panama, reports Xinhua. But France boasted six wins from their last seven matches against Brazil.



World University Games

Manu, Elavenil star as shooters bag three gold medals

Omori of Japan.

TOPS shooter Manu Bhaker claimed two golds when she led the Women's 10m Air Pistol Team to gold and then claimed gold in the Women's 10m Air Pistol (individual) event.

Fellow TOPS shooter Elavenil Valarivan claimed the gold medal in

the Women's 10m Air Rifle event with Mary Tucker of the USA winning silver and Hang Xing of China taking bronze. The Indian team of Abhidnya Patel, Yashaswini Deswal and Manu Bhaker shot an aggregate score of 1714 with 51 inner 10 scores to win the gold in the 10m Air Pistol Team competition.

Abhidnya had a series of 96,96, 95, 91, 94, and 95 while Yashaswini started with a 93 and then shot 97, 97, 98, 97 and 95 in the finals series. Manu too started with 93 and then came up with 97, 97, 94, 94 and 95 as the Indians dominated the proceedings.

China took the silver medal with a score of 1711 (42x) while Iran claimed the bronze medal with a score of 1707 (49x). Yashaswini Deswal and Manu Bhaker made it to the final in the Women's 10m Air Pistol, Yashaswini finished second with a score of 577 with 17 inner 10s out of a possible 600 while Manu was placed seventh in the Qualifying with a score of 570 as Hungary's Sara Fabian topped the stage with 579. Abhidnya, the third Indian in the fray, ended 13th in the qualifying stage with a score of 557.

Afghanistan batter Sediqullah Atal smashes seven sixes in a 48-run over

Zazai's figures read as one for 79 in four overs, thanks to him being hit for 48 runs by Atal. Hunters eventually made a massive 213 for six with Atal unbeaten on a 56-ball 118, laced with seven fours and ten sixes. Atal, the left-handed batter has one T20I appearance for Afghanistan, coming against Pakistan in March this year. In reply, Defenders were skittled for 121 in 18.3 overs as Hunters registered a thumping 92-run victory.
