AS PARLIAMENT DISCUSSES MANIPUR, BOTH TRIBALS AND MEITEI LEADERS LOBBYING IN DELHI ON DEMANDS

While the Lok Sabha debates on the Manipur issue, leaders of both tribals and Meitei community are lobbying in New Delhi and holding meetings with Home Ministry officials.

A meeting between Home Minister Amit Shah and leaders of Manipur's Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF) was scheduled to take place on Tuesday but was not held as the Minister was busy with the Parliament session.

Senior ITLF leader and spokesman Ginza Vualzong said that the meeting with the Union Home Minister would now be held on Wednesday and they held meetings with the Home Ministry officials on Tuesday.

On the other hand, leaders of the Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCOMI), an umbrella body of the Meitei community, also held meetings with Central government officials in Delhi.

COCOMI spokesman Khuraijam Athouba said that his organisation vehemently opposed the Union Government's intention to "engage in talks with the self-proclaimed ITLF".

"This group is at the forefront of individuals directly involved in the ongoing violence in Manipur. Their



members are known to be leaders of the immigrant Chin-Kuki Naro-Terrorist organisations, coercing innocent Kuki civilians into participating in violent activities. The Manipuri populace has been exposed to numerous video footage and images depicting these members brandishing sophisticated sniper rifles and operating drone cameras from hilltop locations within Manipur," the COCOMI alleged in a statement, issued from Delhi.

Accusing Mizoram Chief Minister Zoramthanga of supporting ITLF's

activities, the COCOMI spokesman said that various instances have emerged where the Chief Minister of Manipur has vehemently protested against the unwarranted interference in the state's internal affairs.

The COCOMI has been strongly opposing the ITLF and other tribal organisations' demands for separate administrations (equivalent to separate state) for the tribals in Manipur.

Meanwhile, a four member delegation of the ITLF went to Delhi on Monday to meet the Union Home Minister to press for its demands,

which include a separate state for the tribals. The other demands of the ITLF include state police and commando forces should not be deployed in the hill areas of Manipur, inmates lodged in the jails in Imphal should be shifted to other states of the country, and legalisation of a site for mass burial of tribals killed during the ethnic violence.

"We will press for early solutions to our demands as the Manipur situation, due to the misgovernance of the Chief Minister N. Biren Singh-led government, has been deteriorating fast. Tribals are victims due to the state government's anti-tribal governance," Vualzong, who is also a member of the ITLF delegation, told IANS over phone.

Meanwhile in Manipur, security has been further tightened ahead of Wednesday's mass rally, to be organised by the United Naga Council (UNC), the apex body of the Nagas in Manipur. The UNC would hold a mass rally in the Naga areas of the state for resolving the decades-old Naga political issue based on the Framework Agreement, signed on August 3, 2015.

The apex Kuki tribal body Kuki Inpi Manipur (KIM) has announced to support the UNC's mass rally in four Naga-dominated districts -- Tamenglong, Chandel, Ukhrul, and Senapati.

Assam: College principals, professors joining ABVP sparks row

Even as there is no bar for the teachers of colleges to join the student organisation Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP), the sudden upsurge in the numbers of joiners that include a few college principals in Assam has sparked a row in the state.

The principals of a few prominent colleges like North Lakhimpur College, J.B. College in Jorhat, and Gurucharan College in Silchar -- have joined ABVP.

A large number of professors also joined the right-wing student organization recently.

Although, the ABVP had a base in Assam even before the BJP came to power, and a few school and college teachers were part of the organisation, the numbers witnessed a huge boost in the last few years.

More importantly, this is probably the first time that college principals have also joined the ABVP.

All Assam Students Union (AASU), a prominent student's body in Assam, criticised this development and alleged that since the elections in a number of colleges are due in the upcoming September month, this move can be seen as a 'tactic' to capture the students' bodies in most of the colleges in the state.

"If the principal of any college joins the ABVP, there will be a big question about the impartial conduct of the student elections," AASU president Utpal Bora said.

"These things are happening for the first time in the colleges of Assam."

He further alleged that recently a college principal was suspended as he joined a protest to oppose the ongoing delimitation



exercise in Assam. "The teachers and principals in large numbers may be joining ABVP to avert any such situation," Bora claimed.

The state president of the National Students' Union of India (NSUI), Krishanu Baruah, has demanded that at least the principals of the colleges leave ABVP immediately to maintain the sanctity of the educational institutions. Senior Congress leader Debabrata Saikia said: "Our party was in power for several years in the state. But no teacher or principal was forced to join any Congress-affiliated organisations. Unfortunately, the BJP has been involved in doing this to undermine the stature of educational institutions."

However, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma refuted the claims made by Saikia and others.

He said: "ABVP is a social organization, and it is not the BJP's wing. As long as the normal classes are not hampered in the institutions, the teachers can join the students' bodies."

Manipur police file FIR against Assam Rifles; state BJP urges PM to replace force

Manipur Police have registered an FIR accusing the personnel of the ninth battalion of Assam Rifles of blocking their movement in Bishnupur district.

A police officer in Imphal said that Assam Rifles jawans, led by their officers, had last week blocked police vehicles on the Kwakta Gothol road while the police were going to undertake operations against militants.

The Assam Rifles officers, however, said the para-military troops were undertaking their task assigned by the command headquarters to ensure security of the people and to prevent clashes between Kuki and Meitei cadres.

Meanwhile, after various Meitei organisations, includ-



ing the Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCOMI) and Meira Paibi, the ruling BJP in the state also urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday to replace Assam Rifles with any other central paramilitary force in the state.

A letter jointly signed by state BJP President A. Sharda Devi and Vice-President Chidananda said, "The role of Assam Rifles with regard to the ethnic unrest and in maintaining peace and tranquility in the state has been

under considerable criticism and public outrage."

Since the outbreak of the ethnic violence on May 3, the Assam Rifles troopers completely failed to maintain their impartial role to restore peace and normalcy in the state, the letter said.

The Manipur government, by an order issued on Monday, replaced Assam Rifles by the state police and the CRPF at the check-gate in Moirang Lamkhai in Bishnupur district after fresh violence erupted there last week. The notification, issued by Additional Director General of Police (Law and Order) L. Kailun, said "The check-point at Moirang Lamkhai on the road from Bishnupur to Kangvai shall be manned by the civil police and 128 Bn CRPF in place of Assam Rifles."

Rahul likely to participate in no-confidence motion discussion in LS on Wednesday

► CONGRESS MP RAHUL GANDHI IS LIKELY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NO-CONFIDENCE MOTION DISCUSSION IN THE LOK SABHA ON WEDNESDAY. ACCORDING TO A PARTY SOURCE, THE FORMER CONGRESS PRESIDENT WOULD MOST PROBABLY TAKE PART IN THE DEBATE DURING THE FIRST HOUR OF THE DEBATE, AS HE HAS TO PARTICIPATE AT A RALLY IN RAJASTHAN, LATER IN THE DAY.

Congress sources said that Rahul Gandhi is scheduled to leave for Rajasthan on Wednesday afternoon to address a rally in the poll-bound state after participating in the discussion on the motion.



As the rally is scheduled for around 3 p.m., Gandhi is likely to participate in the no-confidence motion discussion during the initial part of the day, sources said.

The discussion is expected to continue till August 10 and Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to reply to the motion on the same day.

On Tuesday, Congress' deputy leader in Lok Sabha Gaurav Gogoi initiated the discussion after moving the motion, a move which surprised the treasury benches.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi was seen asking why Rahul Gandhi wasn't initiating the discussion as the Congress had conveyed to the Speaker in the morning about the former Congress president initiating the discussion.

Party sources had said that Gandhi's last minute withdrawal was part of a strategy, as it was decided that he would speak after some big leaders from the BJP had spoken.

Congress sources said that this decision was taken as part of a strategy of not exposing Gandhi to all the attacks, which he might have faced if he had spoken first.

Portable toilets for women to be must at all rallies in Maharashtra

In a significant initiative, the Maharashtra government plans to make portable toilets for women compulsory at the venues of all rallies and events in the state, ahead of the Lok Sabha and state Assembly elections in 2024.

Women & Child Welfare Minister Aditi Tatkare has given a written assurance to a social group campaigning for #HerRightToPee by activist Tirtha Samant through her petition on Change.Org.

Tatkare said that she was in agreement with the suggestion and she would request Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Deputy CMs Devendra Fadnis and Ajit Pawar to issue relevant directions to all



District Collectors, Police Commissioners, Superintendents of Police and others concerned.

They would be asked to ensure the facility of arranging for clean, portable toilets for women before granting permission for political rallies or events which attract huge crowds, including many women. The petition, signed by over 2,000, has also urged

the heads of women's wings of all political parties like Bharatiya Janata Party, Congress, Shiv Sena, Shiv Sena-UBT, Nationalist Congress Party factions, Maharashtra Navnirman Sena and others to ensure portable public toilets for women during their political events, especially the forthcoming parliament and assembly elections.

THREE HELD FOR SETTING MAZAR ON FIRE IN GURUGRAM

Gurugram: The police have arrested three out of the five suspects who reportedly set a mazar at Khandsa village on fire on the intervening night of August 5-6, an official statement said on Tuesday.

The arrested accused have been identified as Gulshan (shopkeeper), Vijay (auto driver), and Lalit (pharmacy delivery boy). The police have also managed to identify the remaining two suspects, who are currently on the run.

Assistant Commissioner of Police (Crime), Varun Dahiya, said that the five men committed the act after being influenced by social media content related to the communal clashes that erupted in nearby Nuh district.

These clashes subsequently spread to various parts of Gurugram and its vicinity in the past week.

"The group devised the plan after consuming alcohol and being exposed to multiple social media posts about the Nuh violence. In an intoxicated state, the accused set fire to the mazar before fleeing from the scene. We have apprehended three of them and there interrogation is underway," Dahiya said at a media briefing.

Incidentally, Section 144 of the CrPc was clamped in Gurugram at the time of the incident, which prohibits gatherings of five or more individuals.

According to the FIR accessed by reporter, which was filed by Ghasite Ram, the caretaker of the mazar, people from different religious backgrounds used to frequent the place for worship.

Delhi HC restrains 22 rogue websites from airing upcoming Asia Cup cricket tournament

The Delhi High Court has issued an order restraining 22 rogue websites from unauthorised broadcasting of cricketing events or highlights related to the upcoming Asia Cup tournament.

A bench of Justice Prathiba M Singh, hearing a lawsuit filed by Star India Pvt Ltd and Novi Digital Entertainment Pvt Ltd against the unauthorised dissemination of Asia Cup cricket matches and content, has restrained the listed websites from hosting, streaming, broadcasting, rebroadcasting, or otherwise communicating any cricketing events, extracts, excerpts, or highlights associated with the Asia Cup.

The court was convinced that the defendant websites as "rogue websites" are primarily involved in distributing pirated content.

The plaintiffs, who broadcast several TV channels in multiple languages, possess



the exclusive media rights for various sporting events, including the Asia Cup tournaments from 2018 to 2023.

Novi Digital Entertainment operates the online video streaming platform Hotstar.

They contended that the 22 websites might illegally stream and telecast the Asia Cup cricket events, similar to how they had illegally streamed past events like the ICC T20 Men's World Cup Qualifier, 2023.

The court observed that the documents indicated that the rogue websites extended their activities beyond streaming Star Sports channels, covering a variety of other channels, including sports events like the 'France Ligue' and 'LALIGA Football'.

Given the plaintiffs' substantial investment in media rights, the court said that the potential impact of illegal broadcasting will be severe on their financial interests and the value of such sporting events' rights. It ordered domain name registrars to immediately block the domain names, maintain status quo, and disclose complete details of the offending sites.

It also directed both the Central government and internet service providers to block these rogue websites. In case other similar websites are discovered, the plaintiffs can file an affidavit to have those new sites blocked as well, the court said.

The court will take up the matter next on December 19.



MP SHARES 13 PERCENT FORESTS OF THE COUNTRY: CM SHIVRAJ SINGH CHOUHAN

Unlike 2018, Shivraj not to solely lead BJP's 'Jan AshirwadYatras' in MP this time

The BJP high command has decided to take out five 'Jan AshirwadYatras' in the poll-bound Madhya Pradesh, during which five prominent leaders of the party will lead the campaign to seek support from people across all 230 assembly constituencies in the state.

The party's decision to deploy five leaders to lead the campaign is seen as a major blow to Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, who solely led the Yatra in 2018.

According to sources, the BJP has decided to take out five yatras from different parts of the state. These yatras will be started in September.

Apart from Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Union Minister JyotiradityaScindia, Union Minister and Convenor of Madhya Pradesh Election Management Committee Narendra Singh Tomar, BJP National General Secretary KailashVijayvargiya and state BJP President V.D. Sharma



will be the faces of the yatras. Besides these five leaders, the party will also deploy several Union Ministers and veteran state leaders during the campaign.

According to sources, each 'yatra' will cover around 46 assembly seats in the state. Thus, these 'yatras' together will cover all the 230 assembly constituencies of the state. The campaign will conclude in the presence of Prime Minister NarendraModi in the state capital Bhopal.

Sources said that Prime Minister Modi will also address a "KaryakartasMahakumbh" in Bhopal on September 25.

The decision regarding the Jan AshirwadYatra, according to sources, was taken in the meeting held at Union Home Minister Amit Shah's residence in New Delhi on Sunday late night.

Chouhan had also raised the issue of the programme and leadership of this yatra during the meeting, but the party high command, in a way, rejecting his suggestion, decided that it would not make any leader of the state its face this time, sources added.

With this decision, the BJP high command has given a clear indication it will contest Madhya Pradesh elections under collective leadership.

Goa Chief Minister PramodSawant on Tuesday said that the government has dropped the plan of compensatory afforestation in Madhya Pradesh, instead it will be done in the state itself.

Replying to a question raised by Goa Forward MLA VijaiSardesai during the ongoing Assembly session, Chief Minister PramodSawant said that after reviewing the situation, the government has taken a decision to afforest in Goa itself.

"Review of afforestation has been taken and will be done in Goa itself. We have cancelled the plan of afforestation in Madhya Pradesh. It will be done in vacant land of forest areas of the state. We have dropped plan for Madhya Pradesh," he reiterated.

Sources informed that the compensatory afforestation was advised by the Central Empowered Committee after thousands of trees were cut for highway and power projects



in the state. Last year, Goa BJP government had come under attack from the Opposition for deciding to afforest in Madhya Pradesh, which is now dropped.

NO REASONS TO DISBELIEVE CENTRE, SAYS SC ON PROJECT CHEETAH

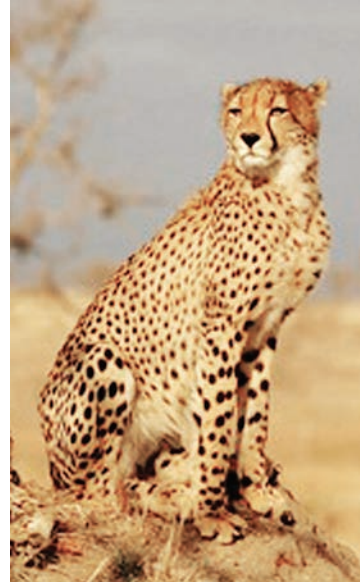

The Supreme Court on Monday said that it has no reasons to disbelieve that the Union government is taking all steps in accordance with the scientific Action Plan for introduction of cheetahs in India.

A bench of Justices B.R. Gavai, P.S. Narasimha, and Prashant Kumar Mishra said the inclusion of an expert on Steering Committee of Project Cheetah is the exclusive domain of the Central government and the court cannot thrust any expert in the panel as the court itself is not an expert in the matter.

"The number of deaths is not low given the fact that 20 cheetahs were translocated. But the general public is concerned about what is being done about the deaths," remarked the bench as nine cheetahs have died so far at Kuno National Park.

The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) said that the chee-



tahs are showing signs of adapting well in Indian conditions and a dedicated team of forest officials, experts,

and veterinarians are undertaking 24x7 monitoring of cheetahs. It further added that in terms of the Action Plan, 12-14 cheetahs per year will be introduced from African countries over the next 5 years, subject to their availability.

The Union government informed the Supreme Court that the Steering Committee will decide feasibility and implementation of the suggestions received from the experts in the best interests of augmenting the objectives of Project Cheetah. It has maintained before the Supreme Court that none of the cheetahs in Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park had died due to unnatural reasons such as poaching, snaring, poisoning, road hits, electrocution, etc. The affidavit filed by the Ministry of Environment Forest & Climate Change said that "cheetahs in general have very low survival rates, i.e., less than 50 per cent in adults in non-introduced populations". The reply said in the case of

introduced population, the survival rates may lead to about 10 per cent survival in cubs. The Union government submitted that the veterinary care, day to day management and monitoring and other aspects relating to ecology and behaviour of cheetahs is being done by the NTCA in consultation with international experienced experts. The bench had suggested the government to consider if cheetahs could be relocated to other locations, like in Jawai National Park in Rajasthan.

The NTCA told the Supreme Court, after consulting experts, that the Mukundra Tiger Reserve, Rajasthan is not suited to accommodate cheetahs as there were five tiger deaths/disappearances in 2020 within a very short span of time. The tiger reserve has a large number of feral cattle carrying a significant amount of parasitic load which can be detrimental to the survival chances to the cheetahs, it added.

Two Minors Gang-raped In Rewa; 5 Held

Rewa Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Anil Sonkar said, "A minor girl along with her cousin sister

had gone to the forest to graze goats. During this, there were some boys of

the same village who were roaming in the forest and they raped both the

girls."

After that, the accused had threatened the victims that they had made a video of the incident and would make the video viral if they dare to tell anything to anyone. As a result of which the victims did not register a complaint out of fear in the matter, the officer said. "After the video of the incident went viral, the Hanumana police investigated, reached out to the victims and talked to them. The victims accepted that such an incident occurred after that a case was registered into the matter. It was also found that seven accused had raped the girls on incident day, out of which the police arrested five accused and two escaped," Additional SP said.

Following which two police teams have been searching separately to nab the remaining two accused. They will be arrested soon, he added.

Rahul Gandhi: Main target of BJP

As opposition parties are upbeat after the Supreme Court stayed conviction of Rahul Gandhi in the 'Modi surname' defamation case, BJP is also gearing up to shift its strategy to attack Rahul Gandhi with a view to counter the opposition. A top BJP leader said that this question will be asked to Rahul Gandhi, who is excited only by the stay on conviction, that what is his thinking now on the independence of the judiciary and other constitutional institutions of the country and his continuous derogatory statements about democracy in India. It is being said that from Monday, in the last week of the monsoon session of the Parliament, the BJP leaders will start cornering Rahul Gandhi and the Congress in both the Houses - Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, regarding this double standard. According to sources, the BJP has included MPs from more than 12 states in the list of leaders supporting the party in the House during the discussion on the no-confidence motion. The list of leaders includes BJP MPs and ministers from poll-bound states like Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Telangana as well as from West Bengal, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and northeastern states. As per sources, MPs who will speak in Lok Sabha on behalf of BJP, are also preparing to attack Rahul Gandhi regarding his old statements and the statement given after the Supreme Court's decision on Friday. BJP will not only target Rahul Gandhi on his statements but will also attack states ruled by the Congress and its allies on increasing atrocities against women in Rajasthan, scams in Chhattisgarh, violence during West Bengal panchayat elections, situation in Bihar, 'corruption' of Kejriwal government. It will also target the opposition-led alliance INDIA on the condition of the states ruled by its allies.

FOR TRIPURA'S TRIBAL PARTIES, ASSERTION OF ETHNIC IDENTITY A POLL-TIME RITUAL

In the past over five and a half decades, tribal-based parties in Tripura raised tribal-centric demands including creation of the tribal autonomous body, Roman script for tribal Kokborok language, adopting traditional customary laws, wearing traditional attire, but on their own, they achieved little being short-lived in the absence of a serious ideology. Since 1967, more than a dozen tribal-based parties in Tripura emerged and they have tried to play a crucial role in the state's electoral politics, but due to their issue-based politics sans any ideology, they became non-existent after their issues were resolved or when they raised irrelevant demands. Of Tripura's four million populations, tribals, with 19 communities, constitute one third and out of 60 assembly seats, twenty reserved for the tribals, who belong to both Hindu and Christian faiths. Of the state's two Lok Sabha seats, one - Tripura East -- is reserved for the tribals, who in terms of economic status are better than the tribals of other states in the northeast region and other parts of the country. In June 1967, the Tripura Upajati Juba Samity (TUJS) was formed as the first major tribal party, raising some tribal-centric demands including creation of the tribal autonomous body. After continuous agitations by the CPI-M led Left parties, the TUJS and a section of Congress leaders, the Tripura Tribal Areas Autonomous District Council (TTAADC) was formed in 1985 under Sixth Schedule of the Constitution to protect and safeguard the political, economic and cultural interests of the tribals. The TTAADC, which has a jurisdiction on over two-thirds of Tripura's 10,491 sq km area and is home to over 12,16,000 people, of which around 84 per cent are tribals, is, in terms of its political signif-



icance, second to the Tripura Assembly. Tribal parties, including the Tripra Motha Party (TMP) and Indigenous People's Front of Tripura (IPFT), along with the Left parties, are now demanding more constitutional power and more funds for the TTAADC. The TMP, led by former royal scion Pradyot Bikram Manikya Deb Barman, has been governing the TTAADC since April 2021 while the IPFT is an ally of the ruling BJP. Both the TMP and the IPFT, to capitalise the tribal vote bank, raise tribal-centric demands like upgradation of the TTAADC as a separate for the tribals even though they fully aware that such demand would never be fulfilled due to obvious reasons. The TMP, before and after capturing the TTAADC, has been demanding elevation of the areas of the autonomous body by granting a 'Greater Tipraland State' or a separate state status under Articles 2 and 3 of the Constitution. Both TMP and the IPFT in support of their separate state like demands organised agitations both in the state and in the national capital Delhi. The ruling BJP, CPI-M led Left parties, Congress and the Trinamool Congress have been strongly opposing the demands of both the IPFT and the TMP. The TMP, in its maiden electoral battle, fielded 42 candidates, including 20 on tribal reserved seats, in February Assembly polls, and bagged 13 seats and 19.69 per cent votes as it highlighted its demand for 'Greater Tipraland State' or a separate state. However, after the announcement of the results of the February 16 assembly polls on March 2, the TMP gradually shifted its stand on the demand. Now the party is demanding the adoption of the Roman script for the tribal Kokborok language, the second official language in Tripura. TMP chief Deb Barman said that his party would continue to fight for the all round development of the tribals, who, according to him, were deprived by the mainstream and national parties. Deb Barman, who was a close friend of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, was the President of Tripura Congress but quit the party in September 2019 over the Citizenship (Amendment) Act and the National Register of Citizens (NRC) issues. Political commentator and writer Satyabrata Chakraborty said that the tribal parties, raising sentimental and tribal-centric demands, achieved electoral gains but after the elections, they remained

indifferent over their demands and are even though not even serious over the basic problems of tribals. "Roads, electricity supply, health services, educational facilities and various other infrastructures are not good in the tribal areas. The tribal-based parties are only focusing on the sensitive, ethnic and emotional issues to get the electoral mileage, forgetting the tribals' day to day issues and problems," Chakraborty told correspondent. Political analyst and author Sekhar Datta termed Deb Barman's politics as "most opportunistic". "What is the meaning and structure of Greater Tipraland State? He is yet to convince the people of Tripura about his demand. He is misleading the people, especially the tribals. "The TMP somehow won 13 tribal reserved seats in the recent polls, but the party's success and survival in future is gripped with deep uncertainty as more than a dozen tribal-based parties have vanished in the past six decades in Tripura," Datta told correspondent. Before merger with the Indian union on October 15, 1949, the erstwhile princely state of Tripura was an independent kingdom under the tribal dynasty with about 185 kings ruled the kingdom for several hundred years. However, many of the former kings have promoted Bengali culture and maintained close relations with many top personalities including Nobel laureate poet Rabindranath Tagore and Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose. Tagore's close relations with the princely state of Tripura and its four successive tribal kings form an important chapter in the state's history. This relationship prompted the world famous bard to visit the state as many as seven times between 1899 and 1926.

147 PEOPLE DEAD IN US DUE TO EXTREME HEAT

A total of 147 people have died in the US states of Arizona, Nevada and Texas this month as a result of the excruciating summer heat wave that has swept major parts of the country. The three states have been the most-affected by the worst of this summer's extreme heat, reports CNN. Of the 147 fatalities, Arizona's Pima and Maricopa counties accounted for 64 and 39, respectively; while 26 deaths occurred in Clark county, Nevada; and 11 and seven in Texas's Webb and Harris counties. Several heat-related deaths were also reported in California, parts of the South and the Midwest, though the tolls have not been as high as those in the five counties mentioned above. Maricopa county, which is home to the city of Phoenix and has officially tallied at least 39 heat-related deaths, has 312 more fatalities still under investigation. The fatalities came as temperatures soared to record-breaking levels at the end of June, and continued to bake much of the South and Southwest through July, reports CNN. Phoenix logged the hottest month of any US city on record, with 31 consecutive days at or above 43 degrees Celsius from June into July. The death toll from extreme heat to-date is far higher than tornadoes and flooding combined.



22 UKRAINIAN POWS RELEASED FROM RUSSIA

Kiev | Russian authorities have released 22 Ukrainian servicemen after they were held as prisoners of war, a top official in Kiev announced. In a post on Telegram, Andriy Yermak, head of the Office of the President, said on Monday: "Today, 22 more Ukrainian soldiers were returned home from captivity. Among them are two officers, privates and non-commissioned officers of the Ukrainian Armed Forces. "They participated in battles in different areas, and there are wounded among the released." According to the official, the oldest of the soldiers is 54-years-old and the youngest is 23-years-old, CNN reported. "Each of the liberated soldiers will undergo physical and psychological rehabilitation, reintegration and be provided with the necessary treatment with the support of medical specialists," he said. Yermak thanked the Coordination Headquarters for the Treatment of Prisoners of War and their team for assisting. "We have to fulfill the President's task and return all of our people," CNN quoted Yermak as saying. Without providing additional details, Dmytro Lubinets, the Human Rights Commissioner in the Ukrainian Parliament, said some of the released soldiers were injured. Since the war began in February 2022, a total of 2,598 Ukrainians have been released from Russian captivity.

Fierce clashes break out between Sudanese army, RSF

Violent clashes have erupted between the Sudanese army and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in Omdurman city, north of the Sudanese capital Khartoum. Witnesses reported heavy artillery bombardments in the old neighbourhoods of Omdurman, leading civilians to flee the area, Xinhua news agency reported. The Sudanese army bombarded the RSF stations in the old neighbourhoods such as Bait Al-Mal, Al-Shuhada, and Al-Mulazemin, while the RSF responded with anti-aircraft missiles, leading to casualties among civilians and the destruction of houses. Local medics reported that the RSF randomly bombarded the area, resulting in the death of five people in the al-Sharifaiya neighbourhood. The Resistance Committees of Omdurman's Abu Rouf neighbourhood stated that both the Sudanese army and RSF ordered residents to evacuate their homes, declaring the area an operation zone. Also on Monday, the Sudanese army shared videos on its Facebook page showcasing the deployment of its forces in various areas of Omdurman. "Today, August 7, the heroes of the special forces carrying out combing operations starting from the Al-Imtidat area to Ombada neighbourhoods (in Omdurman)," the army said. Meanwhile, Deputy Chairman of Sudan's Transitional Sovereign Council Malik Agar revealed a government-proposed roadmap on his Facebook page to end the conflict. The roadmap includes separating the warring forces, expediting humanitarian aid delivery, protecting civilians, and initiating a political process based on state establishment. Since April 15, Sudan has experienced deadly clashes between the Sudanese army and the RSF in Khartoum and other regions, resulting in over 3,000 deaths and more than 6,000 injuries, as reported by the Sudanese Health Ministry. Negotiations between the Sudanese warring parties have been taking place in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, under the auspices of Saudi Arabia and the United States since May 6. Multiple truces have been reached and violated, with both sides accusing each other of breaches. UN estimates indicate that more than 3 million people have been displaced within and outside Sudan.

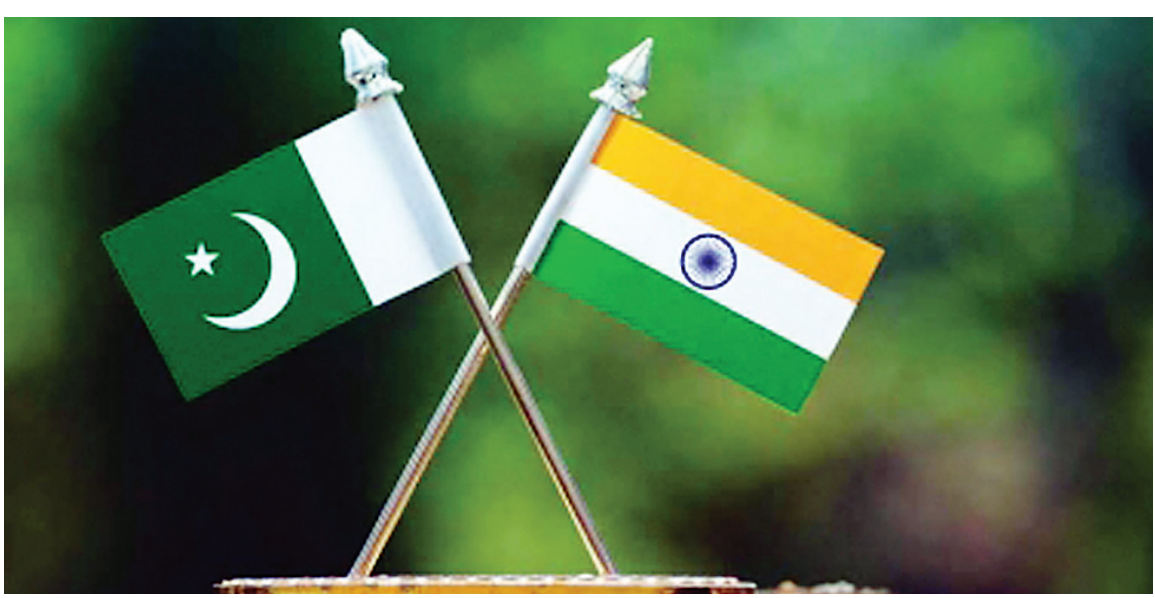
17 KILLED IN TWO TERRORIST ATTACKS IN MALI

Bamako | A total of 17 people were killed and two others injured in two terrorist attacks over the weekend in central Mali, local authorities have said. The first attack took place on Saturday in Bodio village in Bandiagara region, leaving 15 people dead and two injured, according to a statement of the Bandiagara governorate. And two people were killed in another attack on Sunday at a mine between Bodio village and Anakanda village, Xinhua news agency reported. "Operations are underway to track down the perpetrators of this despicable act which will in no way discourage us from our eternal fight for the preservation of our country," the statement issued on Monday said. The attacks occurred one day after the handover of the Ogoosagou camp, a military base in Bandiagara, to the Malian government from the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali.



Pak puts onus on India for conducive environment for talks

In response to a recent statement from India's Ministry of External Affairs holding Pakistan responsible for failing to create an environment free of terror and hostility for talks, Islamabad has now put the onus on New Delhi to create a favourable atmosphere for dialogue and peace in the region. Pakistan Foreign Office (FO) spokesperson Mumtaz Zahra Baloch Mumtaz Zahra Baloch stated that "dialogue was important between Pakistan and India in an environment, which is free of coercion and free of belligerence that India continues to demonstrate in the region". The FO's statement comes in response to the Indian Ministry's recent comments on Prime Minister's Shehbaz Sharif's speech, in which he said that Pakistan was ready to talk to its neighbour "provided that the neighbour is serious to talk on serious matters, because war is not an option". "Pakistan believed in a peaceful



neighborhood and wanted peace with all its neighbours on mutual and in conformity with international law," said Mumtaz Baloch. "The comments of the prime minister reaffirm this position. We also believe dialogue is important between Pakistan and India in an environment which is free of coercion and free of belligerence that India continues to demonstrate in the region. We believe the ball is in India's court to create an environment for peace and dialogue." Pakistan and India have been engaged in cross accusations against

each other, blaming one another for failing to meet the requirement and prerequisites for the peace talks. Experts say both sides have gained their respective political mileages in the past and want to continue doing so in the future as well. "Be it India or Pakistan, both sides and their respective governments have gained major mileage in their political standings in front of their supporters and votes in the past," senior political analyst Javed Siddique said. "The hatred among the two countries has overpowered any hope and wish for peace or any similar initiative undertaken through a considerate decision by both parties. This is why foreign external intervention, to pressure both sides to sit across the table becomes part of a foreign policy campaign." Sadly, the counter statements from both sides has been an ongoing practice for years, which now, for many has gained a reputation of being rhetoric and of symbolic value, limited to statements only.

Heavy demand and sky-rocketing prices of tomatoes have prompted a farmer from Maharashtra to install a CCTV camera on his farm to keep an eye on his plantation of the kitchen staple.

The red berries are being sold between Rs 100 and Rs 200 across the country. The grower said he embraced digi-

tal surveillance for his farm at Shahpur Banjar, about 20 km from Aurangabad, after tomato thieves struck there.

Sharad Rawte said that he cannot afford to lose more tomatoes, the most in-demand vegetable today. He said a crate of 22-25 kg of tomatoes is now being sold for Rs 3,000. Mr Rawte said his farm is spread across 5 acres and he has grown tomatoes on 1.5 acres, which could

easily fetch him Rs 6-7 lakh. "Around 10 days ago, 20-25 kilos of tomatoes were stolen from my farm in Gangapur taluka. To protect the remaining crop that is yet to ripen, I've installed a CCTV camera worth Rs 22,000," he said.

The farmer said the camera runs on solar energy so he doesn't have to worry about its power supply. "I can also check the visuals anywhere on my phone," he said.

Woman fights sexual assault, thrown off Udayan Express in Mumbai

As Parliament debates no-confidence motion, Ambedkar pops up 7 questions to Rahul

In a shocker, a 29-year-old woman was pushed out of a running train by a man after she fought off his attempts to rob and sexually molest her on the Udayan Express here, officials said here on Tuesday.

The accused was arrested later.

The incident occurred on Sunday night on the Bengaluru-CSMT Mumbai train around 8.30 p.m. as it was moving out of Dadar station before terminating at CSMT. Just then, a man barged into the unreserved ladies' compartment with very few passengers, targeted the woman, molested and attempted to snatch her bag containing cash and valuables. As she screamed and



fought off his attempts, the accused pushed her out of the train and fled from there. On Monday, the victim approached the Government Railway Police to lodge a complaint and the accused was nabbed within a short time, said an official. The GRP scanned through CCTV footage and based on statements of eyewitnesses, man-

aged to identify and track the accused.

A team was deployed which launched a manhunt and managed to nab him from near the CSMT station. He has been booked for molestation, attempt to murder, causing hurt, robbery and other charges and further investigations are on.

On a day when the Congress and other Opposition parties were debating a no-confidence motion against the BJP-led government at the Centre in the Lok Sabha, the Vanchit Bahujan Aghadi (VBA) came up with seven questions to embarrass the grand old party, here on Tuesday.

"Since the Congress was busy celebrating Rahul Gandhi's reinstatement as an MP in the LS yesterday, allow me to divert Congress' and their allies' attention to very legitimate issues and questions as a former 2-time MP," said VBA President Prakash Ambedkar, the grandson of the Chief Architect of Indian Constitution, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar.

Shooting off his queries, Ambedkar asked when with the Congress an allies raise the real affairs and issues of the Dalits, Adivasis, Muslims and OBCs rather than taking a token half-hearted stand, as their reactions in both the Manipur violence and Nuh incidents were terribly late and reeked of political correctness.

Ambedkar asked the Congress and allies when they would raise the real questions on the Manipur



crisis -- like why was the ST status given to the Hindu Meites, which party initiated the process, and what is their stand now.

Ambedkar demanded to know why the Congress didn't participate in the debates on the draconian Data Protection Bill, which the government passed in the LS faster than an order is delivered from a food delivery App. "When is the Congress going to corner the government on its recent policy to ban import of laptops, which directly helps a particular manufacturing enterprise whose shares have soared since the ban?" said Ambedkar's next dart.

He wanted to know what is the Congress' stand on the 'seed of corruption' -- the electoral bonds -- in India.

The VBA chief asked the Congress allies whether it was in agreement with the government's data and replies, time and again reiterated in both Houses of Parliament, that the practice of manual scavenging has ceased to exist in India.

Ambedkar sought the Congress' explanation on the Karnataka government's move to divert SC sub-plan and ST sub-plan funds for its guarantee schemes.

In another arrow, Ambedkar wondered how different is the Congress from the BJP if its ex-CM Kamal Nath is hosting Bageshwar Baba -- who routinely raises demands for a Hindu Rashtra? "Dear Rahul Gandhi, you were 'silenced'. But was the whole Congress and the I.N.D.I.A. alliance silenced too, all this time? Jawab Dena Hoga!" concluded Ambedkar.

The VBA has been making attempts to join the Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance in Maharashtra, hoping to fight the upcoming civic, Parliament and Assembly elections jointly, but has got a cold response so far.

SEVEN MONTHS AFTER SURGERY, INDIAN SAMBAR AGAIN FROLICHS IN THE WILD

Alongside Rahul's BJI 2.0, Maha Congress to take out padayatras, bus yatra

In a heartwarming recovery, a seriously injured young Indian Sambar -- which underwent surgery -- nearly seven months ago, has fully recovered, and was recently released back into the wild in Thane forests, officials said here on Tuesday.

The wounded, bleeding and shocked female Sambar was found in the Tokawade Forest Range in Thane by the Maharashtra Forest Department rangers in January this year.

Seeing the creature, around nine months old, in a critical condition and in deep pain, the team of Pradeep Roundhal, RFO, rushed it to the veterinary experts of the Wildlife SOS (WSOS) for treatment.

The veterinarian team found that her body was covered with multiple wounds presumably due to dog bites or other predators, plus she had suffered a fracture on the right forelimb possibly due to a collision or a fall.

Seeing the critical condition, the vets decided to go all out to give her a



second chance at life in the wild and made untiring efforts, at times almost round-the-clock to treat the Sambar.

First she underwent treatment at the Manikdoh Leopard Rescue Centre in Junnar (Pune), according to

Dr. Chandan Sawane, Veterinary Officer, WSOS.

"We first took help of fibreglass plaster but did not get the desired result. So we performed a minor surgery on the Sambar and then kept her

under postoperative observation for a few months to assess whether she could walk properly or not," said Dr. Sawane.

After months of extensive treatment, observation and loving care, the Sambar finally made a miraculous recovery, she got back on her feet and was back to freedom in the forests, said a delighted CEO and Co-Founder of WSOS Kartick Satyanarayan.

"This is the third treatment and release in Maharashtra this year... Earlier we helped and treated an injured Shikra bird and a Chinkara before sending them back into the wild habitat," said Satyanarayan.

Forest department officers lauded the WSOS efforts, saying it proves how dedicated their veterinary teams are and all were thrilled to see the Sambar regain her health and go back to the wild.

The charitable WSOS was formed in 1998 to rescue and rehabilitate wild animals in distress all over the country, promote conservation, combat poaching, illegal wildlife trading, etc.

Maharashtra Congress on Tuesday said that the party will launch a state-wide series of padayatras and a bus-yatra to coincide with the upcoming Bharat Jodo Yatra (BJY) 2.0 to be taken out from West to East of India by party MP Rahul Gandhi.

State Congress President Nana Patole said that while Rahul Gandhi will launch his BJI 2.0 from Gujarat in the West to East India, the Maharashtra Congress will simultaneously launch a foot-and-bus yatra to expose the "corruption of Bharatiya Janata Party" before the masses in the state.

While district and regional leaders will organise 'padayatras' in six different domains, after which there will be a bus yatra that will cover the entire

state, and cover some of the remotest areas to reach out to the masses there.

The regional padayatras shall be led by Patole (Nagpur), Leader of Opposition Vijay Wadettiwar (Amravati), Congress Legislative Party Leader Balasaheb Thorat (North Maharashtra), ex-CM Ashok Chavan (Marathwada), ex-CM Prithviraj Chavan and President of Mumbai Congress Prof. Varsha Gaikwad (Mumbai), and then all leaders will converge in a padayatra in the Konkan region. "The BJP government has misled the people of the country with their false promises, farmers, labourers, working class, the youth and women are all facing severe problems and uncertain futures... It has failed the masses on burning fronts like inflation, unemployment, law

and order, etc," said Patole.

"Instead, the BJP is only creating divisions in the name of caste and religion, working for the interests of its few industrialist friends and leaving all the others to fend for themselves... We shall expose all these issues through the padayatra and the bus yatra," Patole added.

Kickstarting the ground-work for the Lok Sabha elections, the party has appointed observers in all 48 parliamentary constituencies to prepare detailed study reports for each seat.

The observers shall review each constituency critically, assess the local political situation, the strength of the Congress vis-à-vis allies and the Opposition, the prospects and proposed strategies and submit a report to the state party leadership by Aug. 15, said Patole.

MAN DIES BY SUICIDE AFTER WIFE ASKS FOR DIVORCE IN NAGPUR

Nagpur: A 26-year-old man allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself at his house in Maharashtra's Nagpur city, after his wife sought to divorce him, police said on Tuesday.

The incident occurred at Ramteke Nagar under Ajni police station area on Monday afternoon, an official said.

Mohit Sukhchand Choudhary, a native of Balaghat district of neighbouring Madhya Pradesh, hanged himself from the ceiling at his rented accommodation, he said.

The victim, who worked as a painter, got married last month. But the couple fought and argued frequently, and his wife returned to her parents' house, the official said.

Choudhary's wife eventually sought a divorce from him, he said.

The police recovered a suicide note from the spot, in which Choudhary cited his wife's intention to divorce him as the reason for the extreme step, the official said, adding that a case of accidental death has been registered.

WHO raises red flag on contaminated India-made syrup in Iraq

The World Health Organization (WHO) said on Monday that contaminated common cold syrup found in Iraq last month was manufactured by an Indian pharmaceutical company based in Maharashtra.

The contaminated batch was manufactured by Fourts (India) Laboratories Pvt. Ltd for Dabilife Pharma Pvt Ltd, according to a WHO statement.

The cold medication made in India named 'Cold Out', found on sale in Iraq, contains toxic chemicals, reports had claimed last month.

The tests showed the cold medication is contaminated with ethylene glycol, a toxic industrial solvent.

The new WHO product alert "refers to one batch of substandard (contaminated) COLD OUT syrup (Paracetamol and Chlorpheniramine Maleate) identified in the Republic of Iraq and reported to the



WHO on July 10, 2023 by a third party", said the global health agency.

A sample of the Cold Out Syrup was obtained from one location in Iraq and submitted for laboratory analysis.

"The sample was found to contain unacceptable amounts of diethylene glycol (0.25%) and ethylene glycol (2.1%) as contaminants. The acceptable safety limit for both ethylene glycol and diethylene glycol is no more than 0.10%," the WHO said in a statement.

Diethylene glycol and ethylene glycol are toxic to humans when consumed and can prove fatal. "To date, the stated manufacturer and the marketer have not provided guarantees to WHO on the safety and quality of the product," it added.

The compound is lethal to humans in small amounts and allegedly played a role in mass child deaths caused by Indian-made cough syrups in Gambia and Uzbekistan last year, according to earlier reports.

MUMBAI POLICE ARREST 61-YEAR-OLD MAN FOR MAKING THREAT CALL TO MANTRALAYA

Mumbai: Mumbai Police on Tuesday arrested a 61-year-old man for making a threat call to Maharashtra Mantralaya, stating that a "terror attack" would take place in a day or two.

The man arrested is Prakash Kishanchand Khemani.

"Kandivai Police arrested a 61-year-old man, Prakash Kishanchand Khemani for making a threat call to Maharashtra Mantralaya last night, stating that there will be a terror attack in a day or two," Mumbai Police said.

The Mantralaya Control officer informed that they received a threat over the phone at 10 pm from an unidentified caller after which the police started to trace the caller and arrested the man Monday night.

In an interview with Variety, Schnapp opened up about how having his 'Stranger Things' character Will Byers embrace his sexuality in the series also allowed him to do the same. The 18-year-old actor said he kept putting off posting a video announcement he had shot on his phone.

His closest friends kept texting him: "When are you going to post it? I want to see the world's reaction!" Schnapp kept replying: "No, I'm not ready. I'm not ready. I'm not ready."

But on January 5, after his family dropped off his twin sister, Chloe, at college in Boston, he felt ready. As they started the hours-long drive back to their home in Westchester, N.Y., he posted the eight-second video to more than 31 million followers on TikTok. "When I finally told my friends and family I was gay after being scared in the closet for 18 years and all they said was 'we know'."

"Once I did fully embrace that Will was gay, it was just an exponential speed towards accepting it for myself," said Schnapp. "I would be in a completely different place if I didn't have Will to portray, and to embrace and help me accept myself."

Schnapp, founder of TBH, a hazelnut spread, admitted: "I think if I never played that character, I probably would still be closeted."

Though Schnapp initially was hesitant to confront his sexuality and address it with the world, publicly confirming that his character was gay helped shift his perspective.

"It kind of blew up in the press, and everyone was like, 'Oh, Will's gay! Hooray!'" he recalled. "I saw all these comments on Instagram and TikTok. There was not one bad thing about him being gay. I was like, 'If he has all this support, then why should I worry about anything?'"

Since sharing his truth, Schnapp was able to celebrate his first Pride Month in New York City. He shared a glimpse of his celebrations on Instagram, including photos of him rocking a rainbow-coloured "Straight Out of the Closet" T-shirt.

ZOE TERALES RESPONDS TO KUWAIT'S BAN ON 'TALK TO ME'

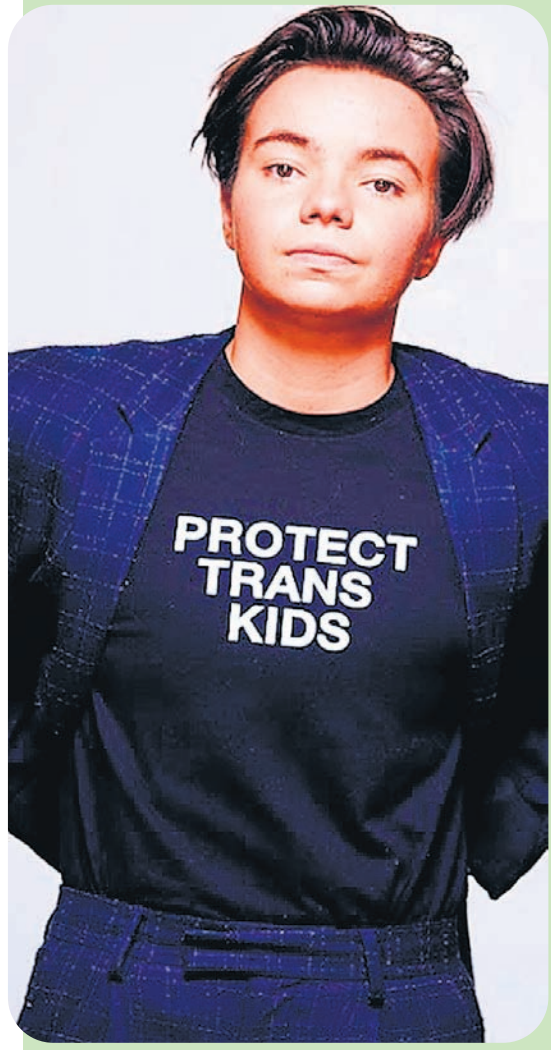
In a statement on X, Terakes talking about the ban said: "Our film doesn't have queer themes. I am a trans actor who happened to get the role. I'm not a theme. I'm a person."

They added, "Kuwait has banned this film due to my identity alone. It is a targeted and dehumanising means to harm me."

In a post back in August 4, the actor further said: "As much as it is very sad to be on the receiving end of this, what is even more heartbreaking is what this precedent means for the queer and trans people of Kuwait."

"Eliminating trans actors on screens will not eliminate trans people (as much as the government of Kuwait wishes it would) but it will eliminate a lot of hope. And hope is such a large part of how we live as marginalised people. It's how we learn to move through the hatred and the mistreatment and the violence," they further mentioned.

This is nothing new as Kuwait is one of the strictest countries not just in Middle East, but in the whole world when it comes to pro-LGBTQ and pro-Left content, leading to a ban on many films, the latest example being 'Barbie', despite it being greenlit for release in both Saudi Arabia and the UAE. What made the ban surprising is that this ban was caused entirely due to someone's identity, which is new for the country.



ADAM DEVINE SAYS MARVEL HAS 'RUINED' GENRE OF HOLLYWOOD COMEDY MOVIES

Actor Adam Devine has shared his theory that Marvel movies and other superhero films killed the traditional Hollywood comedy.

The 'Workaholics' and 'Pitch Perfect' actor recently appeared on Theo Von's 'This Past Weekend' podcast during his press tour for Netflix's 'The Out-Laws' and shared his theory, reports Variety.

The actor noted that because Marvel movies rely so much on humour they ended up becoming Hollywood's new de facto comedy films.

"You watch comedies nowadays and you're like, this is not a f***** comedy," Devine said.

"Where are the jokes? Where are the bits? There are still good (comedy) shows, but movie comedy, it's hard. My theory: I think Marvel ruined it. I feel like superhero movies ruined comedies because you go to the theatre and you expect to watch something that cost \$200 million to make, and comedy movies aren't that."

He further mentioned, quoted by Variety, "So you're like, 'Why would I spend the same amount of money to go watch a little comedy in the theatre if I can spend that and watch something that is worth \$200 million?' And they still make those movies kind of funny, like, 'Oh my god, is that raccoon talking?' This is hilarious! Which it is, but it's not a real comedy."

"Every studio used to put out several comedies a year," Devine noted. "And there were like 45 comedies in the theatre per year. So every week or so, there's a new comedy in the theatres. Now, last year, there were like 6 or 7. It's crazy."

'The Out-Laws', produced by Adam Sandler's Happy Madison company, is more akin to the Hollywood comedies that used to exist, Devine argued. The movie puts an action spin on 'Meet the Parents' and includes Pierce Brosnan, Nina Dobrev and Ellen Barkin.

Jennifer Aniston turns off Insta comments amid Jamie Foxx's controversy

Hollywood actress Jennifer Aniston has turned off comments on her Instagram account amid the controversy over Jamie Foxx's anti-Semitic comments. Jamie came under fire last week after he posted a message on Instagram that read: "They killed this dude called Jesus...what do you think they'll do to you?????" and used the hashtags #fakefriends and #fakelove.

Many people took this as an anti-Semitic post, as some believe that the Jewish people are to blame for the death of Jesus.

The message appeared to have been

liked by an account using the name Jennifer Aniston. There are various accounts on the social media app that use the name 'Jennifer Aniston' in their bio.

The 'Friends' star quickly denounced the post and denied any connection to it in her Instagram Stories.

She clarified her stance earlier, saying: "This really makes me sick. I did not 'like' this post on purpose or by accident. And more importantly, I want to be clear to my friends and anyone hurt by this showing up in their feeds - I do NOT support any form of anti-Semitism. And I truly don't tolerate HATE of any kind. Period."

Jamie deleted the offending post, and wrote a statement clarifying that he did not have the Jewish community in mind when he uploaded the note.

He clarified that he was "betrayed by a fake friend" and that's who he was calling out with the post, "not anything more". Celebrities like Winnie Harlow supported Jamie by saying, "I'm so confused...it's so clear what you were saying."

Rapper WakaFlocka spoke out supporting Jamie Foxx saying it was clear that he wasn't trying to be antisemitic.

Other X users agreed, with one writing: "Any black person growing up in the south will tell you that Jamie Foxx wasn't referring to Jewish people."

COLOMBIA MAKE FOOTBALL HISTORY BY MOVING INTO LAST 8

Colombia made football history in FIFA Women's World Cup as they built on the momentum to reach the quarterfinals by knocking out Jamaica 1-0 in a Round of 16 match here on Tuesday.

Colombia moved to the knockout phase for the second time by winning Group H having previously achieved the feat at the finals in 2015. Their last appearance in the round of 16 saw them go down 2-0 to the U.S., reports Xinhua.

Jamaica have earned an unexpected last-16 spot after eliminating Brazil in Group F and qualified for the knockouts for the first time, becoming the third team from CONCACAF to achieve that in the history of the competition after U.S. and Canada. They are one of three teams that did not concede a single goal in the group stage.

It was fairly a tedious first half, as both sides failed to create genuine chances. Jamaica saw their two attempts wide of the framework while Colombia only managed one



of five shots on target. The tempo accelerated straight after the break as Colombia tipped the balance of the tie in the 51st minute, when Ana Guzman spread the play down the right, Deneisha Blackwood's error allowed Catalina Usme to beat goalkeeper Rebecca Spencer one-

on-one. Jody Brown was close to equalising for Jamaica just three minutes later, but her header from a close range was cleared off the line.

Jamaica created another huge chance in the 82nd minute, but Drew Spence saw her towering header inches

wide, while on the other end, Leicy Santos steered her header onto the upright.

Despite Jamaica's bid for an equaliser, Colombia's solid defense left them no chance until the final whistle. Colombia will now face England in the quarterfinal on Saturday.

IND vs WI T20I

India beat WI by 7 wickets to keep series alive

Under fire for his recent failures in ODI matches and first two T20Is, Suryakumar Yadav bounced back with an explosive knock of 83 off 44 balls while Tilak Varma struck an unbeaten 49 as India beat West Indies by seven wickets in the third T20I at Providence Stadium, here on Tuesday.

This triumph keeps India alive in the five-match series as they reduced to margin to 2-1.

After the early dismissal of debutant opener Yashasvi Jaiswal, India swiftly regrouped with Suryakumar Yadav's classy performance as he built an impressive 87-run partnership for the third wicket with Tilak (49 not out).

Thanks to Surya and Tilak's impressive knocks, India chased down the 160-run target in 17.5 overs, revitalising their hopes in the series after facing defeats in the first two matches.

Chasing 160, India had a shocking start as they lost Jaiswal early in the first over. Then, Yadav came and quickly launched an attack with his big hits.

Gill once again fell cheaply as he threw his wicket in the fifth over when he looked to pull it away but got the top edge for Jonatan Charles to take a comfortable catch.



Varma, who was the top scorer in the last two games, continued with his fine form and started with back-to-back boundaries. Suryakumar and Varma went for three big hits to take the Power-play score to 60/2.

Soon, Yadav brought up his 14th T20 fifty off just 23 with a fine boundary. He maintained his aggressive approach, achieving a milestone of 100 international sixes by skillfully dispatching a slower ball for a spectacular maximum. Building on that achievement, he promptly struck a boundary. At the halfway point, India found themselves

in a dominant position at 97-2.

Surya's impressive innings concluded in the 13th over, as he directed Alzarri Joseph's full toss towards fine leg, where King remained stationary and completed the catch without any difficulty.

After Surya's dismissal, Tilak took centrestage and went for a few big hits but missed out on his second fifty as captain Hardik Pandya finished the chase with a maximum to keep India alive in the series.

Earlier, opting to bat first, West Indies got off to a decent start with openers Kyle Mayers and Brandon King stitched a 55-run opening stand. However, India made a comeback with Kuldeep Yadav taking two wickets in an over.

But the hosts got the rhythm through skipper Rovman Powell, who's unbeaten 19-ball 40 quickfire powered West Indies to 159/5 in 20 overs.

The funding will cover the team's training cost, plus boarding/lodging costs, air-fare, visa costs and Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA) among other expenditures, a media release from the Ministry said on Tuesday.

Out of 28 competing athletes, 13 are Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS) athletes and 15 would be competing at the World Championships for the very first time.

Former U20 World Athletics Championships silver medalist, Shaile Singh, is the youngest member of the contingent. The 19-year-old would be competing in her first senior World Championships this year.

Swimmer Shoan Ganguly bags silver at Youth Commonwealth Games

Indian swimmer Shoan Ganguly won silver at Youth Commonwealth Games in Trindago.

Ganguly claimed silver in the boys 400m individual medley swimming event. He came with the best Indian time of 4:25.47 to finish behind England's Reece Grady (4:24:16), while Scotland's Evan Davidson won the bronze with a swim of 4:25:68.

Anupriya threw the iron ball to a distance of 15.62m in her third attempt to claim the third spot, behind South Africa's



Alicia Eli Khunou (17.97) and Australia's Xylavene Beale (16.31) respectively.

In other results, Ridhima Kumar Veerendra (30.04) finished seventh in women's 50m backstroke.

A 24-member Indian contingent is competing at the Commonwealth Youth Games 2023, which which will conclude on August 11.

With a chance to earn a direct

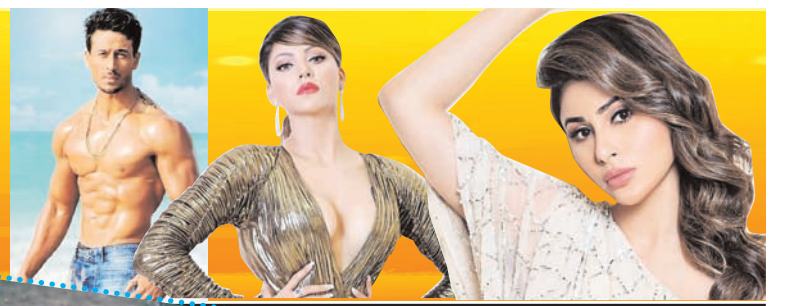


qualification to next year's Paris Olympic Games, the Indian men's hockey team will open its campaign against Uzbekistan on September 24.

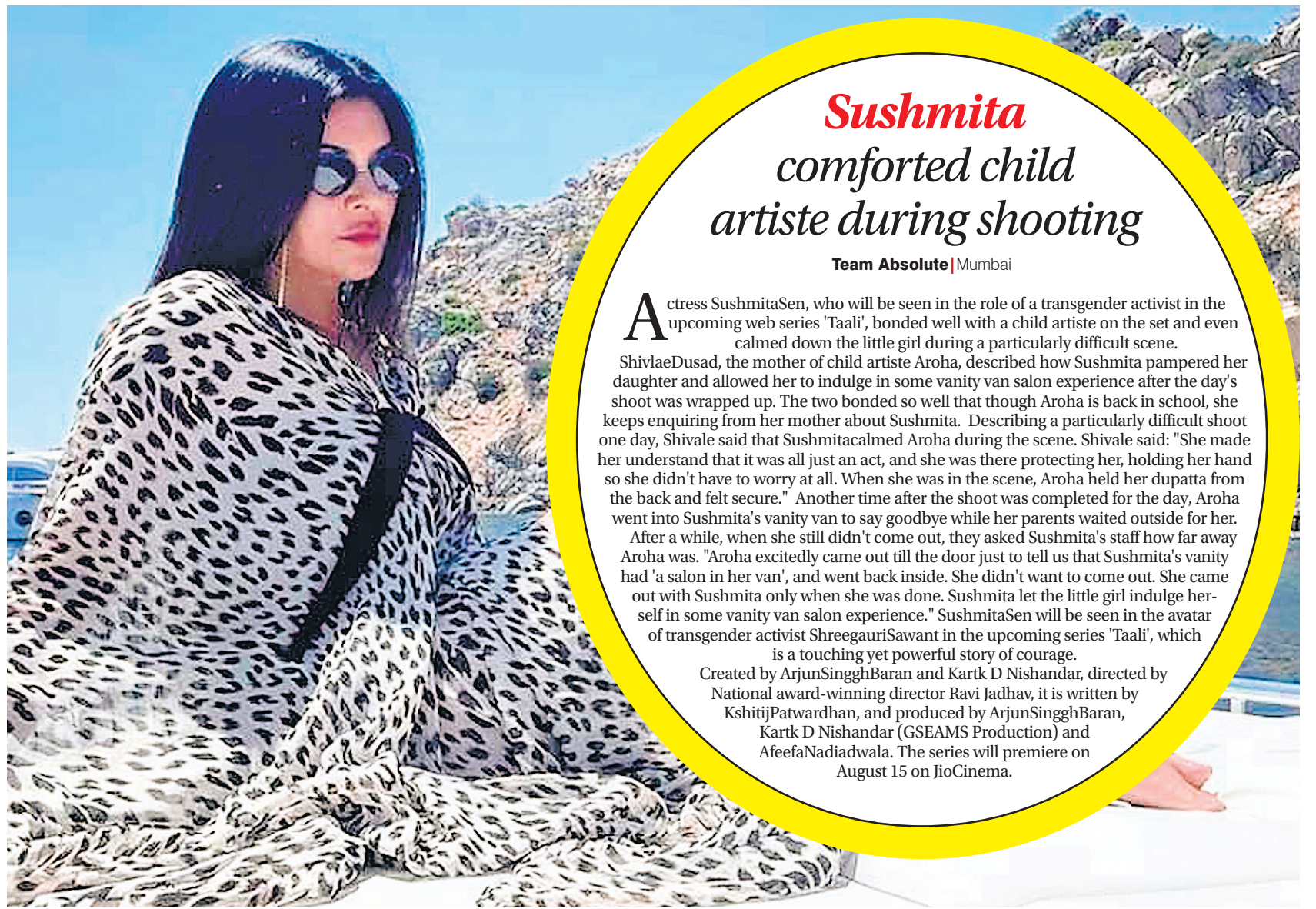
