Kids in Maha's Aurangabad 'row to school' in thermocol boats, HC cracks whip on govt

Taking strong cognisance of media reports of children forced to row to school in thermocol rafts, the Bombay High Court's Aurangabad Bench has ordered the Collector to provide proper facilities to the kids within 12 hours.

A division bench of Justice Ravindra Ghuge and Justice Y. G. Khobragade on Monday has asked the Collector to provide at least two boats for the children on the Jaykavadi Dam backwaters with a specialised operator, life-jackets and rescue air tubes to ferry the pupils to and from school safely.

The court said that the boat or a motorboat if possible, should be operated in multiple shifts to enable not only serve the students during their school timings, but also provide a round-the-clock transportation for the people in the area.

The court's directives came in a suo moto PIL after it took cognisance of a media report on August 27, highlighting the plight of the children of Bhiv Dhanora village living around the dam.

The students were forced to use makeshift rafts from thermocol sheets and bamboo sticks, called locally as 'chappus', and used square pieces cut out as paddles with which they rowed across the dam to and from school daily.

The village is barely five kms away from the busy Pune-Aurangabad national highway, but is surrounded by the Jaykavadi dam's backwaters and two local rivers, Lahuri and Shivana.



The court also appointed advocate Pushkar Shendurnikar as the Amicus Curiae for the case and lauded the grit of the students, girls and boys, some below 10 years, who fought all odds to get education.

"We have no words to express our appreciation for the girl and male students coming from farmers' families... who have shown their grit and determination in pursuing their education by travelling to school from the backwaters and returning back," noted the judges.

The court also said the children deserve compliments for undertaking such a journey twice daily for the pat over a year though its an everyday threat to life, with snakes and other creatures lurking around.

Besides, pregnant women, elderly or ill persons needing medical attention have also been relying on these 'chappus' to travel to the nearest health care centres.

Govt building DPI to skill young Indians for jobs of the future: MoS IT

Minister of State for Electronics and IT, Rajeev Chandrasekhar, on Wednesday said that digital skilling is the key and the government is building Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) towards that goal to prepare millions of young Indians for the tech-driven jobs of the future.

Addressing the Skill India Digital event, where the government launched the Skill India Digital portal to benefit every citizen of the country, especially the students and youth above 15 years of age, the minister said that after the global recognition of DPIs during the G20 Summit, the government is now building DPIs in digital skilling for young Indians.

"This DPI is at the intersection of two of the most important components of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision -- Skill India and Digital India," he said.

"In this post-Covid world, there is tremendous awareness about the importance of digital skilling. This DPI is aimed at developing skills for both entrepreneurship and jobs,"



Chandrasekhar told the gathering.

At the event, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, along with Chandrasekhar, launched Skill India Digital -- a state-of-the-art digital platform to bring all skilling initiatives together.

Last week, Chandrasekhar said that the whole world is discovering the extraordinary strides India has made in technology, as G20 nations pledged to build a global DPI based on the country's model.

The global recognition of India's DPI -- like the unified payments interface (UPI) and Aadhaar -- has demolished the old norms.

"Today, the whole world is discovering the extraordinary strides we've made in technology, using Digital Public Infrastructure to transform governance and lives of citizens," he said. The G20 leaders have committed to adopt, build and maintain Global Digital Public Infrastructure and also agreed to foster a wholesome and safe digital ecosystem, and a resilient global digital economy.

IMA writes to Mandaviya over NEET PG 2023

The Indian Medical Association (IMA) on Wednesday wrote to Minister for Health and Family Welfare Mansukh Mandaviya urging to reduce the NEET PG 2023 cut off.

In its letter addressed to the Minister, the IMA while recalling the contribution of doctors in Covid pandemic wrote: "We should not forget that during previous Covid waves, when the country was in the state of emergency and people were dying, the doctors left their homes and served the nation fervently. The time has come for the administration to recognize them for their selfless service by reducing the cut off marks for NEET-PG 2023."

"This will ensure that a significant number of aspiring



doctors can enroll for post-graduate programs in various medical colleges across the country and not a single postgraduate seat goes

vacant," the association said. "As a result of high cut off scores, aspiring medical students will not only be prevented from entering Post

Graduation but will also be compelled to travel overseas to pursue their dream field, further depleting the medical manpower pool in India. We urge the concerned authorities to look into this matter as early as possible and take immediate steps to resolve it and help the country acquire more specialist doctors.

"By making the right decision, the administration can make the lives of many aspiring and hardworking doctors worthwhile, which will ultimately benefit the nation in the long run.

"We request you to reduce the NEET PG 2023 cut off percentile up to 30 per cent so that most of the seats are filled in both clinical and non-clinical branches," the association wrote to Mandaviya.

SC refuses to relax blanket ban on bursting of crackers in Delhi

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said that it will not relax the blanket ban imposed on sale and use of firecrackers in the national capital. A bench of Justices A.S. Bopanna and M.M. Sundresh also sought response from the Delhi Police on enforcing the ban on bursting of crackers.

Along with other matters, the bench was considering the plea filed by BJP leader Manoj Tiwari to protect the interests of the public at large who are being "harassed" for celebrating Diwali which is deemed to be one of the most important festivals of the Hindus against the blanket ban on firecrackers in Delhi. Last year, the Supreme Court had refused to urgently



hear Tiwari's plea and told him to spend his "money on sweets". The plea said that the Delhi government's decision to put a blanket ban on storage, sale, and use of all types of firecrackers infringes freedom of conscience and free profession, practice and propagation of religion of people at large guaranteed under Article 25 of the Constitution.

Directions were sought to issue fresh guidelines in respect to selling, purchasing or bursting permissible firecrackers. The Supreme Court had issued earlier directions

pertaining to the regulation of firecrackers, saying that it is not averse to celebrations but not at the cost of life of other citizens. In its report submitted earlier to the court, the CBI had found that banned harmful chemicals were used by manufacturers in several crackers and they did not disclose the correct ingredients on the labels of the product. In a recent decision, the Delhi government again issued orders banning manufacturing, sale, storage and use of firecrackers as part of its action plan to curb pollution in winters.

Gurugram: Six arrested for cheating share market trader

The crime branch unit of the Gurugram Police have arrested six people for allegedly cheating a share market trader of Rs 35 lakh by offering to give him jewellery at discounted prices, police said.

Complainant Manmohan Chauhan told the police that one of the key accused, who introduced himself as Narendra Rathore from Rajasthan, befriended him two months ago.

Rathore said he worked at a prominent jewellery store, located on MG Road, and owned by his friend "Sharma".

"Rathore said Sharma's business had suffered huge losses and he wanted to sell jewellery at cheap prices. I was offered to buy it at a lower price and promised a bill," Chauhan said in his complaint. Rathore later introduced Chauhan to Sharma and another accused -- Mathur -- in Chandni Chowk. On August 26, the four of them met at



the Surya Hotel in Delhi's New Friends Colony and agreed on the deal.

"On August 31, Rathore came to my house and I took Rs 35 lakh from my house and went to Sahara Mall on MG Road. Where Sharma and Mathur joined us there, and I handed them the cash. Sharma and Rathore went with the bag to count the money and returned with another bag that they said had jewellery worth Rs 40 lakh in it," Chauhan alleged.

The complainant said he left with Rathore to go to Sharma's shop nearby, but on the way, four men intercepted them and threatened them to hand over the bag. They even threatened him to run away from there, Chauhan got scared and ran away from there. Later it came to light that Narendra and his associates conspired together and duped him of Rs 35 lakh by creating a story of getting cheap gold from him.

No need to make six airbags mandatory for cars, says Gadkari

Minister for Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari on Wednesday said his Ministry doesn't want to make six airbags mandatory for cars.

"Now people are cautious and whatever the economic model they have six airbags, people will prefer to take that car. Everyone is making it, there is no need to make it mandatory," he said in response to a question regarding the proposal mandating six airbags in cars from October 1, at the 63rd ACMA (Automotive Component Manufacturers Association of India) Annual Session here.

"Those (carmakers) who don't want to do it are facing problems in their selling. If they want to make a good competition they have to make six airbags. We don't want to make it mandatory."

In response to a question on road accidents, the Minister said: "Every year we have five lakh accidents and 1.50 lakh accident related deaths. Sixty per cent of the deaths are related to the young population of our country from the age group of 18 to



34. It's very unfortunate. We have taken all preventive measures as far as road engineering and automobile engineering is concerned."

"We have passed the road safety law. In the future we will take the accident victims immediately to the hospital.

We are trying to develop hospitals near highways but education is important. The most important thing is human behavior is a big problem. We are trying our level best to educate the people," Gadkari said.

On automobile sector, the Minister said: "The growth is really a pride for India. Total size of the automobile industry is Rs 12.50 lakh crore. Only one thing which I feel that is a challenge for the industry is that import is Rs 1.63 lakh crore.

We need to reduce this import and use the best technology and make the product of international standard that used to be challenged with the industry."

"The size of the automobile industry when I took charge as the minister was Rs 4.50 lakh crore and



CM SHIVRAJ TO UNVEIL 108-FEET TALL STATUE OF 'ADI SHANKARACHARYA' IN OMKARESHWAR ON SEP 18

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chauhan will unveil a 108-foot-tall statue of 'Adi Shankaracharya' in Omkareshwar on September 18.

Chief Minister Chauhan on Tuesday evening reviewed the work for the statue named "Eakmta Ki Pratima" (Statue of Oneness).

The Madhya Pradesh cabinet had approved over Rs 2,141 crore for the construction of the Statue of Oneness project. The towering structure is dedicated to the 8th century philosopher, an influential and revered figure in Hinduism 'Adi Shankaracharya' Omkareshwar, located about 80km from Indore on the Narmada river banks, is a global centre of the Advaita Vedanta philosophy promoted by Adi Shankaracharya. The construction of the statue on the Mandhata mountain in the temple town is part of the first phase of the development project, an official release said.

The multi-metal statue depicts Adi Shankaracharya as a 12-year-old boy. The video of the under-developed project was released by the state government on Wednesday. According to religious beliefs, Adi Shankaracharya left Omkareshwar at the age of 12 and travelled across the country spreading the Advaita Vedanta philosophy and explaining its tenets to people. He is believed to have reached Omkareshwar



after becoming a 'sanyasi' (monk) at a very young age, where he met his guru Govind Bhagwadpad and stayed in the religious city for four years and attained education.

The state government informed that along with the establishment of a museum named "Advaita Lok" in Omkareshwar and an international Vedanta institute, an "Advaita Forest" is also being devel-

oped across 36 hectares in the town. "All required works have been completed near the statue site. Priority has also been given to complete the work expeditiously for the establishment of a special museum focused on unity and the Advaita Vedanta Institute," the government said. The statue is being unveiled just months ahead of the year-end assembly elections in the state.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh on September 14 and lay the foundation stone and dedicate several projects in the poll-bound states.

During his visit in Madhya Pradesh's Bina, the Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone of projects worth over Rs 50,700 crore including 'Petrochemical Complex at Bina Refinery' and 10 new industrial projects across the state, as per the communiqué issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) on Wednesday.

"The state of the art Petrochemical Complex at



Bina Refinery of Bharat Petroleum Corporation will be developed at a cost of about Rs 49,000 crore, and will produce about 1200 KTPA (Kilo-Tonnes Per Annum) of ethylene and propylene, which are a vital component for various sectors like textiles, packaging, pharma, among others. "This will reduce the country's import dependence and

will be a step towards fulfilling the Prime Minister's vision of 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' (self-reliant India). The mega project will also create employment opportunities and spur the development of downstream industries in the petroleum sector," it said.

The Prime Minister will also lay the foundation stone of ten projects namely 'Power and Renewable Energy Manufacturing Zone' in Narmadapuram district, two IT parks in Indore, a Mega Industrial Park in Ratlam, and six new industrial areas across the state.

Notably, Assembly elections in Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh are scheduled to be held later this year.

CONGRESS HOLDS SCREENING COMMITTEE MEETING FOR 2ND STRAIGHT DAY IN DELHI FOR ASSEMBLY POLLS

Head of the Assembly polls, a second round of meeting of the Congress Screening Committee for Madhya Pradesh is underway at its war room in the national capital on Wednesday.

The meeting is being held for the second consecutive day to finalise the candidates.

Screening Committee chairman Jitendra Singh, former chief ministers Kamal Nath, Digvijaya Singh, state in charge Randeep Surjewala are also present along with other senior leaders of the party to decide on the candidates. Party sources related to



development said that in the meeting, a list of 66 Assembly seats will be discussed, on which the party has not won or is weak and or has won occasionally.

Party state in charge Randeep Singh Surjewala said that no candidates had been finalised as of now.

"We will contest the election under the leadership of Kamal Nath, who is the

party's state Congress committee head. He was the Chief Minister when BJP stole the people's mandate. The BJP should be ready to be punished by the people of Madhya Pradesh," Surjewala said after the meeting of the Screening Committee.

He said that the party has been discussing the seats and how many people have applied for the seats.

"No seats have been finalised yet and this screening committee meeting will go on for next few days."

There are a total of 230 Assembly seats in Madhya Pradesh for which the BJP has already announced the names of 39 candidates.

Group of men beat up Dalit, urinate on him in Bhopal

A group of people allegedly beat up a Dalit man and urinated on him in Madhya Pradesh capital Bhopal. The man told the police that when he regained consciousness, he found himself in a hospital.

The victim identified as Ramswaroop Ahirwar lodged a FIR at Sukhi Sevania police station alleging that four persons -- Seru Meena, Tushar Meena, Lekhray Meena and Abhisek Meena -- kidnapped him and beat him until he lost consciousness. The victim, who works as a kotwal, claimed the patwari (revenue official) of the area had asked him to undertake an inspection as there was a report that some people were



encroaching on government land. Ahirwar said when he reached the spot (Choupdakala village), he found some people were putting up fencing

on government land. "I objected to their fencing work. In the meantime, Seru Meena, who is the husband of the village sarpanch, also came and

started abusing me. Tushar Meena, Lekhray Meena and Abhisek Meena also reached there," the FIR copy available with reporter reads.

"The tied my hands and put me in Suru Meena's Scorpio and took me near a drain. Suru was driving his Scorpio, while Lekhray, Abhisek and Tushar were beating me on the way and hurling abusive language. They all kept beating me and when I started losing consciousness, Seru Meena urinated on me," the victim said in his complaint.

Later, some people took him to Bhopal's Hamidia hospital. Police said the accused have been booked under relevant sections of the IPC and an investigation has been launched into the matter.

AIIMS organised Cervical Cancer Screening Camp in rural areas to spread awareness

All India Institute of Medical Sciences Bhopal has organised Cervical Cancer Screening camp as outreach activity at Chiklod under guidance of Dr. Vaishali Walke (Prof and Head of department) in collaboration with team of Dr. Rajkumar Patil, (Community and family medicine) and with team of Dr Shweta (Obstetrics and gynaecology) on 13th Sep 2023.

A cervical cancer screening camp was held on 13th Sept 2023, at PHC Chiklod, Bhopal (M.P.). This campaign was led by Dr. Hemlata Panwar (Associate Professor, Pathology) and she created the awareness among twenty females regarding early detection and prevention of cervical cancer. They have also been made aware about cause and risk factors of cancer cervix. Consent for cervical cancer screening was obtained. Pap smear samples were obtained from 16 females. Clinical his-

tory was taken and screened by Dr. Deepthi Soni (Senior Resident, Pathology) and procedure was done by Dr. Naina Gautam (Senior Resident, Obstetrics and Gynaecology). Dr Sudhir (Senior Resident, Department of community and family medicine) and his team created awareness about the camp among the villagers. Pap smears reports will be communicated to CFM department and the appropriate management will also be done by Gynaecology department.

TEACHER STRIPPED AND BEATEN IN INDORE

Indore: On Wednesday, some people beat up coaching teacher Shailendra fiercely on charges of molesting a student preparing for NEET in Indore. People even took off his clothes and beat him in the middle of the market, the crowd then took him towards the police station to beat him, the teacher also ran without clothes to escape from the crowd after seeing the police and entered the police station and took the chair there under police protection. The student is a resident of Khargone district. Police have registered a case of molestation against the accused teacher and his fellow teacher. Accused teacher Shailendra Akash teaches in Byju Coaching. This coaching is near Geeta Bhawan. It is alleged that the accused teacher had molested the student in the coaching institute. On this, the victim student had made a video of the accused teacher and sent it to the family. After this the family members came from Khargone and interrogated the teacher. When he started shouting, he was beaten. The angry family members stripped the teacher, paraded him on the road, beat him and took him to the police station. The accused teacher has been handed over to the police, while the other fellow teacher Vivek is absconding. Police have registered a case of molestation against both of them.

Clash between 2 groups in Datia, 5 killed, 8 injured

Five people were killed and eight others seriously injured after two groups opened fire at each other over grazing of domestic animals in Madhya Pradesh's Datia district on Wednesday, a police official said.

The shootout between members of the Dangi and Pal communities took place around 9 am at Renda village in the district, which is the home turf of state home minister Narottam Mishra.

Citing the initial investigation, Datia Superintendent of Police (SP) Pradeep Sharma said there was an altercation between one Prakash Dangi and Preetam Pal over the grazing of domestic animals three days ago.

During the heated argument, Prakash slapped Preetam following which cross-complaints were filed and FIRs registered against both communities, the SP



said. Members of the two communities once again faced off on Wednesday morning and engaged in a shootout, which left five dead and eight grievously injured, he said. Prakash Dangi, Ram

Naresh Dangi, Surendra Dangi, Rajendra Pal and Raghvendra Pal died in the exchange of fire, he said. All the deceased were above 30. The injured persons have been admitted to the district hospital.

Poster war erupts again in Capital; Now 'Monster Of Corruption' after '50% Commission'

Jawan. Also, the captions 'Corruption Ka Haiwan' and 'A Corruption Nath Film' are written in the poster. These posters are put up at main places of Bhopal. Karpshnath's posters are put up at places like New Market, Number 10 Market, Peer Gate, in front of DB Mall, MP

Nagar, Pragati Petrol Pump, Bittan Market, Nadra Bus Stand and Congress Office. Vice President of Congress Media Department Abbas Hafeez, along with Congress workers, has torn down the signs at various places. Taking aim at BJP, he said that this is an act done in

panic by the distraught Bharatiya Janata Party. This clearly shows that BJP is losing this election. Madhya Pradesh had never seen such level of politics. It will be costly for the BJP to spread false propaganda about a leader who has served Madhya Pradesh for 45 years and has given gifts to Madhya Pradesh.

Multi-year housing cycle in offing on supply side consolidation and demand revival

The combination of supply side consolidation, demand revival and calibrated price hikes will lead to a multi-year housing cycle, as per a report by JM Financial Institutional Securities. The year 2022 was an exceptional year for Indian residential real estate, but there have been concerns on the possible impact of rising interest rates and property prices derailing the residential momentum. However, on the demand front, Mumbai registration data for August 2023 (10,902 registrations; +27 per cent YoY) continues to indicate strong momentum across a high ticket size market most susceptible to interest rate hikes/price inflation and also impacted by higher stamp duties, the report said. The supply situation also continues to be extremely favourable with steadily declining and decadal low unsold inventory, 674msf across top seven cities, as per Propequity. All markets (Bengaluru, Chennai, MMR, Delhi-NCR, Pune and Kolkata) barring Hyderabad have shown a declining trend in inventory. MMR, Pune and Hyderabad remain some of the best-performing markets with high absorption, and residential demand in the Delhi-NCR region is largely driven by the Rs 15 million+ ticket size or the luxury segment, the report said. The top seven cities are on track to surpass 2022's performance. The year 2022 was exceptional which saw 569msf of absorption (2016-21 average: 343msf; decadal high), and 2023 is also at a similar run rate (387msf in 7MCY23, annualised run rate: 663msf; 17 per cent YoY growth) led by cities like MMR (Mumbai Metropolitan Region), Pune and Hyderabad. Moreover, launches continued to slightly lag absorption (366msf launched in 7MCY23) resulting in inventory reduction and possible price hikes in 2HFY24, the report said.

FUNDAMENTALS OF SECURITY MANAGEMENT THAT STOOD THE TEST OF TIME

The concept of security whether it concerns the nation, an establishment of strategic importance or even a business corporation, revolves around some basic principles that brooked no compromise.

We live in an insecure world where the issues of security are knocking at everyone's doors - the State has to protect its own integrity amidst threats, external or domestic, but it is also supremely responsible for the security of its citizens as well. In a democratic dispensation, this can not happen unless people themselves show an awareness about security which makes them a conscious contributor to national security at large. This more than anything else, validates the first principle of security in our times about the 'mainstreaming' of this function. Security of an enterprise is no more a matter of outsourcing it to a set of guards and their supervisors - it has to be built into the policy framework of the organisation, be based on planning and budgeting and above all, has to be in a position to act on the authority of the top man of the enterprise.

The head of the organisation is deemed to be the ultimate repository of the security function though he or she would normally assign this responsibility to one of the Deputies. This stands to reason for in the event of a senior member being suspected of violating mandatory security regulations, there would be a reluctance to bell the cat if the security set-up did not have confidence that it had the attention of the person at the very top. In strategically sensitive establishments handling secret projects of the State, arrangements exist for taking prompt notice of any member exhibiting 'vulnerability' by way of falling for an 'addiction', living beyond means or befriending an 'outsider' in an unnatural fashion and confidentially checking out if there were grounds for any further suspicion. The point is that security is a comprehensive call that can not be fulfilled without the notional involve-

ment of the organisational leadership. Security clearly is a 'mainstream' task that embraces the length and breadth of the organisation. The second fundamental principle of security is that it is an INTEGRAL concept. The establishment is either secure or insecure - there is nothing like a house being half-secure or half of it being secure.

Security basically is protection against 'cover' attacks of the enemy - an open or visible offensive against the nation will have to be countered by the defence forces of the country and if the target is an organisation, by the state law and order machinery responding to that attack. The unseen adversary tries to damage the three 'assets' of the nation or the targeted organisation as the case may be - physical resources, manpower and protected information - and this is what was professionally called Sabotage, Subversion and Espionage respectively. These are security concerns. In sensitive organisations, subversion basically meant changing the loyalty of a member away from the organisation to serve the cause of the 'new master', which can obviously be used for sabotage and espionage too. Arrangements are accordingly made by the security establishment to ensure physical security, 'personnel' security and Information security - all put together through well-defined steps. Anticipated risks are assessed for planning total security measures and apart from a certain standardised framework of security built on the risk assessment, special arrangements are made to deal with any specific threat that Intelligence might have indicated for the targeted entity. Intelligence is information about the secret plans of the adversary and this is always difficult to come by. Large competing business corporates would like to know what the rivals were up to and they make substantial investments in creating a team that was engaged the whole time in studying the market and the competitors to produce the so-called 'Business Intelligence'. In these days of 'knowledge-based' decision-making, this function has acquired a newfound



importance. The impact of climate change is another area of study now for security - across the spectrum of local to global concerns. Incidentally, it is rightly said that 'you have to buy security' and that 'security does not come cheap'. This is, however, compensated by another principle of security that emphasises that 'cost-effective security was the best security'. The logic of this is easy to understand. If two men can do what a team of three was assigned to do or where an operation could be completed in three steps instead of four, reduction would not only 'lower' the cost but also make the effort more efficient. A simple definition of 'efficiency' is the 'productivity per unit of resource' - the resource here is not only the money and manpower but 'time' as well. This concept is fully practised by our national Intelligence agencies even though they had a reasonable assurance that resources would not be allowed to come in the way of their mission. A security set-up is relatively free of bureaucratic impediments - decision-making is delegated subject to the healthy practice of seniors being kept informed. Also, the importance of work produced is often dis-linked from 'rank' and this was reflected in credit sharing as well. Further, the 'boss' was free to do 'tasking' but he or she was also obliged to provide 'guidance' where it was asked for. A senior given to 'escapism' in regard to this responsibility would have no future in an Intelligence organisation or in fact anywhere else.

domestic front.

In the era of globalisation and knowledge economy, a rival can spring up from anywhere in the world and a smaller player could take an established business by surprise through 'smarter' ways of working. Technology makes a human process 'smart' and now we have Artificial Intelligence (AI) that smartens up Information Technology itself. In the digital world, a lot is happening to upgrade life but for security, newer challenges are also emerging - ranging from Cyber Warfare to misuse of social media as 'an instrument of combat'. Proxy wars have expanded to include 'information warfare' and influencing the narrative to pull down a target country or enterprise. AI is opening up new frontiers of data analytics, robotics and identity emulation and pushing product development and business applications to new heights but it has multiplied security concerns as well.

It is feared that the security risks accruing from automation - of military offensives in particular - could outweigh the likely positives produced by AI for human advancement. Change is the only constant now and the entire challenge of security has assumed unforeseen proportions. As it is, a Cyberattack is detected only after it materialised making the mitigation effort so much more difficult. AI, however, would theoretically make it possible to consider 'preventive' measures for security on the basis of study of the modus operandi of the adversary carried out through its power of analysis.

Security definitely was running into new challenges in a situation rightly described by VUCA (volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous) which made knowledge-based decision-making so much more difficult. A new threat scenario marked by the rise of covert warfare in newer forms because of the use of cyber or digital space is opening up a new vista of challenge for security. Man-made

security concern in this context. Finally, it is the security domain that is putting leadership to new tests. In matters of security, the top man of the organisation will have to be decisive and capable of making decisions not out of notions of personal 'charisma' or of being 'born' a leader but on the strength of knowledge of what was happening externally and within the organisation. The leader has to seek facts that make a difference between a decision and a guess and consequently has to make arrangements that ensure the flow of relevant information to him or her. In the realm of security, the leader has to have the ability to communicate the organisational advice down the line with clarity, precision and unambiguity. The ethical code of the organisation should also be framed in a manner that covers the requirements of security. For employees handling confidential information of a sensitive nature, there had to be an arrangement of internal vigilance that occasionally checked out the conduct of a member outside of the workplace. There is so much exposure of society to unscrupulous acts of the hidden enemy on social media, websites and other digital distractions that the classical mandate for ensuring 'personnel security' in all its nuances has to be understood well by the leadership. Security set-up of a large corporate body would now have to have enough knowledge of the environment around and this would enable it to contribute to even advising the leadership on how to take the business forward. A smart leader of the organisation would find ways of garnering that knowledge for corporate progress. Security in fact is an important instrument of grooming for the potential leader of the enterprise - this is the biggest proof that security was in all situations a 'mainstream' function today.

PM Modi 'doing the right thing' by promoting Make in India: Putin

Russian President Vladimir Putin has once again lauded the 'Make in India' initiative and said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi is "doing the right thing" by promoting the policy. In his address to the plenary session of the 8th Eastern Economic Forum (EEF) in Vladivostok on Tuesday, Putin gave India's example while responding to a query about Russian-manufacture automobiles.



He went on to say that it is "absolutely fine" to use Russian-made automobiles. "This will not lead to any infringements of our WTO obligations, absolutely not. It will concern state purchases. We must create a certain chain regarding what cars different classes of officials can drive, so that they will use domestically-made cars. You probably know about the proposals to continue buying these cars. It would be easy to do, because the logistics are streamlined," Putin added. In June while addressing an economic forum in Moscow, Putin had called Modi "a great friend of

Russia" and praised the 'Make in India' initiative. "Our friends in India and our big friend, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, launched the 'Make in India' initiative several years ago. It has had a truly impressive effect on the Indian economy. It would do no harm to emulate what is working well, even if it was not us but our friends who created it," the President had said. The 'Make in India' initiative was launched by Prime Minister Modi in 2014 aimed to create and encourage companies to develop, manufacture and assemble products made in the country and incentivise dedicated investments into manufacturing. Putin and Modi last met on the sidelines of a regional security bloc summit in Uzbekistan in September 2022. The President did not attend the G20 Summit held in New Delhi on September 9-10. He was represented by Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov.

N.Korea will work together with Russia to fight imperialism: Kim tells Putin

During their rare summit at the remote Vostochny spaceport in Russia's Far Eastern Amur Region, North Korean leader Kim Jong-un on Wednesday told President Vladimir Putin that Pyongyang will work together with Moscow to "fight imperialism". The meeting between Kim and Putin comes amid concerns that they might advance an arms negotiation and bolster military cooperation, reports Yonhap News Agency. With the participation of delegations, Kim and Putin began talks at the spaceport, according to Russian news agencies. Hours earlier, they shook hands and briefly exchanged conversation as Putin welcomed Kim ahead



of their first talks in more than four years. "(North Korea's) relations with Russia are the top priority of Pyongyang," Kim was quoted as saying at the start of the talks. Kim told Putin his country will work together with Russia to "fight against imperialism," adding that he is supportive of "all decisions" made by the President,

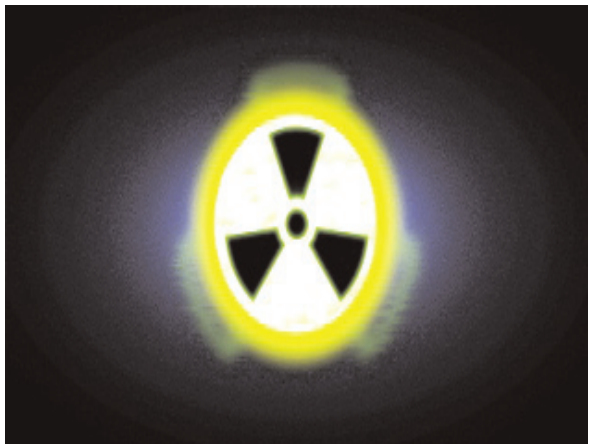
according to Russian media outlets. After departing from Pyongyang on board his bulletproof, luxury armoured train on Sunday, the North Korean leader arrived at the rocket launch facility on Wednesday morning, traveling more than 1,000 km north of the eastern Russian city of Vladivostok, where he

met Putin in 2019. Military cooperation likely topped the agenda, as Russia apparently needs North Korea's supplies of artillery shells and ammunition for its war with Ukraine, while the North wants high-tech weapons technology from Russia. On whether he plans to discuss military and technical cooperation with Kim during their talks, Putin was quoted as saying earlier in the day that "all issues" will be discussed, according to Russian news agencies. Russia's PrimaMedia reported that the North Korean leader will be shown how the Angara launch vehicle is being assembled and also inspect the launch complex for the Soyuz-2 launch vehicle.

Radioactive material leaks detected at Japan's nuke fuel research facility

The Japan Atomic Energy Agency (JAEA) has confirmed the detection of radioactive material leaks in one of its nuclear fuel research facilities but reported no adverse effects on the health of the staff or the surrounding environment, local media reported on Wednesday.



In its report, Kyodo News citing the JAEA said that the leaks were detected within the Plutonium Fuel Development Room No. 3 at the JAEA's Nuclear Fuel Cycle Engineering Laboratories, located in Tokai village, Ibaraki prefecture, reports Xinhua news agency.

On September 8, the Plutonium Fuel Development Room No. 3 identified pollution caused by radioactive materials at four locations within the facility.

The pollution was discovered during a routine inspection of the glovebox equip-

ment, which is designed to be airtight. The contamination was found both above and below the glovebox, with the highest level of radioactive activity measuring approximately 33 becquerels. Although the glovebox contained nuclear fuel materials, it had not been in recent use and was solely undergoing a biennial routine inspection, said the JAEA. The JAEA has reassured

the public that the leak of nuclear material has not had any negative consequences for the health of the facility's four staff members or the surrounding environment.

At present, the cause of the radioactive material leak is under investigation.

Authorities at the laboratories suspected that the radioactive materials may have seeped out of the equipment.

Death toll from floods in Libya surpasses 3,000

The death toll from the devastating floods that struck Libya's eastern city of Derna on Sunday has risen to 3,060, while 5,200 others remain missing, according to the eastern-based Interior Ministry. "The authorities have buried 2,800 bodies after their families identified them, while 260 unidentified bodies remain in the city's hospital," the ministry spokesman Tareq al-Kharraz told Xinhua news agency on Tuesday. Al-Kharraz said 5,200 people have gone missing, stressing that the actual death toll might be considerably higher, given that search and rescue operations are ongoing, and additional bodies continue to be recovered from various locations within the city. According to media reports, assistance and rescue efforts started to reach Derna on Tuesday, more than 36 hours



after the disaster hit the coastal city. The floods had either severely damaged or completely destroyed numerous access roads leading to the city, which is home to approximately 89,000 residents. Meanwhile, Tamer Ramadan, Libyan envoy representing the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies told a UN meeting on Tuesday that he believed there were still at least 10,000 people unaccounted for in the flood-hit areas.

The catastrophic event was triggered by a Mediterranean storm that made landfall in eastern Libya on Sunday, resulting in widespread flooding and causing extensive damage to infrastructure along its path. President of the Libyan Presidency Council Mohamed Menfi on Monday called for international assistance to help with the aftermath of the floods, declaring the cities of Derna, Al-Bayda, and Shahhat as areas in dire need of assistance.

Dozens dead, over 50 injured in Hanoi apartment fire

At least a dozen people were dead and more than 50 others injured due to a fire that erupted at a nine-storey apartment building in Hanoi, officials in the Vietnamese capital said on Wednesday. According to preliminary statistics, as of 5 a.m. on Wednesday, authorities had rescued some 70 people and sent 54 others to hospital, the Vietnam News Agency reported. The fire broke out first at the first storey of the block with a floor area of over 200 square meters, where some 150 people live, in Khuong Dinh ward, Thanh Xuan district, reports Xinhua news agency. In the first eight months of this year, Vietnam saw 1,286 fires and explosions which killed 69 people, injured 64 others, and caused property losses of nearly 200.7 billion Vietnamese dong (\$8 million), the country's General Statistics Office said.



FIR AGAINST DMK'S UDHAYANIDHI STALIN IN MUMBAI OVER HIS 'SANATAN' REMARK

Team Absolute | Mumbai An FIR has been registered against DMK leader and Tamil Nadu Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin over his 'Sanatan Dharma' remark.

Mumbai's Mira Road police have registered the case under sections 153 A and 295 A of IPC.

A BJP delegation in Tamil Nadu on Tuesday handed over a memorandum to the state police demanding registration of an FIR against Udhayanidhi Stalin for his remarks against 'Sanatana Dharma'. Speaking at a conference earlier in Chennai, Udhayanidhi, the minister for Sports and Youth Affairs in the Tamil Nadu government, railed against Sanatan Dharma, equating it with "dengue, malaria, fever, and corona". He added that Sanatan Dharma shouldn't be merely opposed but eradicated. Earlier this month, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, chairing a meeting of the Council of Ministers, weighed in on the furore



around Udhayanidhi's remarks, and, according to sources, asked his ministers to aggressively counter the attack on Sanatan Dharma. He advised his ministers to counter the Opposition's narrative on the Sanatan Dharma with facts. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin said that it was unfair for Prime Minister Narendra Modi to "make comments without knowing what Udhayanidhi spoke" on the 'Sanatana Dharma'

The storm created by "Sanatana Dharma" created a political slugfest in the country. The political rival NDA and INDIA alliance are taking a potshot at each other after the DMK leader equated 'Sanatana Dharma' with "mosquitoes, dengue, malaria, fever and corona".

The Congress, Trinamool Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT) and Aam Aadmi Party, which are part of the Opposition INDIA bloc, distanced themselves from the DMK leader.

Married man, accused of rape by "lover", dies by suicide on facebook live

Team Absolute | Nagpur A man reportedly died by suicide during a Facebook Live after being blackmailed by his alleged girlfriend and her family members in Maharashtra's Nagpur, the police said. On September 10, 38-year-old man Manish, in his Facebook Live, said he was being threatened with charges of rape by a 19-year-old woman, Kajal, who was allegedly his girlfriend, and her family members.

The man claimed that the woman and her family members demanded Rs 5 lakh during Facebook Live and threatened to press charges against him if he failed to give them the money, the police said. On September 6, the woman was missing from her house, and her family members alleged that she eloped with Manish. The 38-year-old man, who is married and is a father to three children, jumped into a river in Nagpur after harassment from her family. The man denied claims of any physical



relationship with the woman and named her and her family members and a photo studio operator responsible during his Facebook Live before dying by suicide. A search operation was launched by

the police after the Facebook Live video surfaced. The man's body was recovered from the river, and the Kalamana police in Nagpur arrested four people in the case.

TV PERSONALITY KIRTI VERMA CHARGED IN RS 263 CR ILLEGAL TDS REFUND CASE

Team Absolute | Mumbai Kirti Verma, an Income Tax official-turned TV personality known for her appearances on 'Roadies' and 'Big Boss Season 12', as been chargesheeted by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) for allegedly receiving the proceeds of crime from an illegal Rs 263 crore Tax Deducted at Source (TDS) refund case.

Fourteen others, including entities, have also been named in the charge sheet, which was filed in a Mumbai court on Tuesday.

Former Income Tax Inspector Tanaji Mandal Adhikari, Bhushan Anant Patil, Rajesh Shetty, and others have also been implicated in the charge sheet.

Verma is accused of having a close relationship with one individual who illegally received a tax refund.

"The ED has discovered that Verma sold a property in Gurugram, acquired in 2021, using proceeds of crime amounting to Rs 1.02 crore, and received the sale proceeds in her bank accounts."

In January, the ED had attached assets worth Rs 69 crore, including land, flats, and luxury cars, which were purchased in the names of Verma and other accused individuals, Patil and Shetty.

The ED's case is based on the CBI's FIR against Adhikari and Patil.

The CBI case concerns the fraudulent issuance of tax refunds by the accused, with



allegations that they received illegal income tax refunds from 2007 to 2009.

It was alleged that Adhikari, while working as a Senior Tax Assistant, had access to RSA Tokens and login credentials of his supervisory authorities.

He allegedly orchestrated the fraud in collusion with others, fraudulently generating TDS refunds exceeding Rs 263 crore and transferring them to various bank accounts, including the bank

account of SB Enterprises, which is a proprietary concern of Patil.

The CBI also filed charge sheets against Adhikari, Patil, Shetty, and others for committing offences punishable under Sections 7 & 13(2) read with 13(1)(a) of the PC Act and Section 66 of the IT Act.

During the investigation, the ED learned that between November 15, 2019, and November 4, 2020, a total of 12 illegal TDS refunds totalling Rs 263.95,31,870 were

Mumbai man befriends divorcee on social media, cheats her of Rs 45 lakh

A Mumbai businessman allegedly befriended a divorced woman on a social media platform and then cheated her of cash and jewellery amounting to around Rs 45 lakh, a police official said on Wednesday. The accused from Colaba in south Mumbai, was identified as Tulsidas Jadhav, 42, and he has been arrested in another case by Bhandup Police Station, said Navi Mumbai's Sanpada Police Station Senior Police Inspector Pramod Bhosale. According to a complaint lodged by the 55-year-old victim and resident of Sanpada, Jadhav and she became friends on a social media platform and then he started visiting her home in Navi Mumbai. The woman, who has a son from her previous marriage, subsequently tied the knot with Jadhav,



unaware that he was already married. Later, Jadhav started abusing and beating her, demanded money or threatened to kill her son and allegedly extorted over Rs 35 lakh in cash and the rest in gold jewellery from her. "We have registered a case against Jadhav. He has not yet been arrested, but we have learnt that he was earlier nabbed by the Bhandup Police (Mumbai) and we are investigating further," Sr. PI Bhosale told reporter. Jadhav has been charged under various IPC sections pertaining to criminal intimidation, breach of trust, causing hurt, marrying again during the lifetime of a husband/wife, etc.

Ajit Pawar-led NCP's X handle 'suspended' for flouting rules

The X (formerly Twitter) handle of the break-away Nationalist Congress Party led by Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar and others has been suspended for over a fortnight, party leaders alleged here.

A notification is shown on X that the @ncpspeaks1 account has been suspended for violating its rules, though

details are not mentioned. The NCP, led by Sharad Pawar, with its official X account (@ncpspeaks) had reportedly complained that the splinter group's X account (@ncpspeaks1) was similar to its own official account. However, sources in the Ajit Pawar-led NCP claimed that the X account is likely to be restored on Wednesday.

Couple drives into civic body office, throws kerosene at clerk

Team Absolute | Panvel A couple allegedly barged into the Panvel Municipal Corporation premises in Navi Mumbai and threw kerosene on a civic clerk, an official said on Wednesday.

The incident took place on Tuesday following which a case was registered against accused the man and the woman, who are in their 40s, the official from Panvel Town police station said.

The accused had come at the civic body's gate in connection with an agitation, he said.

When a security guard prevented them from entering the corporation premises, the cou-



ple did not listen and entered the premises riding a motorbike, the official said. The woman allegedly threw kerosene on a civic clerk present there. The couple also abused the civic staff and the security guard, he said.

Following a complaint by the civic employee, the police registered an FIR against the accused under Indian Penal Code sections 353 (assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharge of duty), 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of peace) and 34 (common intention), and provisions of the Bombay Police Act, he said.

Man arrested for cheating Mumbai businessman of Rs 2.80 crore in bogus land deal

Team Absolute | Mumbai The Mumbai Police have arrested Delhi-based Nitin Vasant Mane on charges of duping a Mumbai businessman out of Rs 2.80 crore in a fraudulent land transaction.

Mane, along with an accomplice, enticed the victim with the promise of selling a piece of land in Mumbai's Borivali for business purposes.

The accused duo informed the businessman that the land was embroiled in a legal dispute involving an individual named Parvez Irani. To add credence to their scheme, they introduced a man posing as Irani, and convinced the victim to finalise the land purchase.

Mane and one of his accomplices were arrested and both the session court and the Bombay High Court have denied them bail. Both Mane and his accomplice face charges of forgery, criminal conspiracy, and under other sections of the Indian Penal Code.



According to the complainant, he learned of a 938 square metre plot owned by Naresh Patil, with Nagraj Devendra holding the power of attorney for the sale.

The victim was quoted a price of Rs 6 crore for the plot, with Rs 4 crore purportedly going to Irani, and the remaining Rs 2 crore to Patil's family.

Mane, an advocate, offered his assistance in handling the documentation and facilitating the land transfer for a fee

of Rs 45 lakh. Subsequent investigations revealed that Mane, in collaboration with three others - Rajkumar Singh, Ravi Kumar, and advocate Sunil Budhwant - had devised a fraudulent scheme to swindle the businessman.

On April 4, Mane introduced Singh as Irani, and duped the victim out of Rs 2.80 crore.

Authorities uncovered evidence of close communication between all the suspects via phone.

Woman leads Indian Navy's 'tribute' expedition to treacherous Mt Bhagirathi-II

Team Absolute | Mumbai Indian Navy Vice-Admiral Sanjay Bhalla flagged off an expedition to the challenging Mt. Bhagirathi-II peak, comprising 15 officers and sailors and led by a woman officer, here on Wednesday.

Receiving the expedition team here, Vice-Admiral Bhalla presented the ceremonial ice-axe to the leader, Commander Kokila Sajwan, at a ceremony late on Tuesday.

The team includes another woman officer, Commander Nandini Dam Roy, and the 21-day expedition will attempt to scale the 6,512 metre tall peak in the Garhwal Himalayas in Uttarakhand on September 30.

The team would unfurl the new Indian Navy ensign as a tribute to the five members of the naval expedition



which perished on Mt. Trishul two years ago on this day after getting trapped in an avalanche.

On September 30, 2021, five Indian Navy officers and a porter had been killed in a massive avalanche hit on Mt. Trishul-I, which stands 7,120 metres tall.

They were: Rajnikant Yadav, Yogesh Tiwari, Anand Kukreti, Hari Om, and others, who were barely 500 metres away from the summit when the tragedy

struck the 20-member team on the ascent.

Mt. Bhagirathi-II has a difficult gradient and a recognised expedition peak for 'technical climbing' which offers numerous challenges to the climbers.

While Commander Sajwan is posted at the Naval Ship Repair Yard in Karwar, Commander Roy serves as the Warship Overseeing Team in Kolkata.

Mt. Bhagirathi-II is part of the four imposing peaks, and the second tallest in the group, in the region.

It was first conquered by an Austrian team in 1933 and then summited first by an Indian team only after another 33 years, in 1966.

The peaks are named after King Bhagiratha, who is said to have brought the River Ganga to the earth from the heavens.

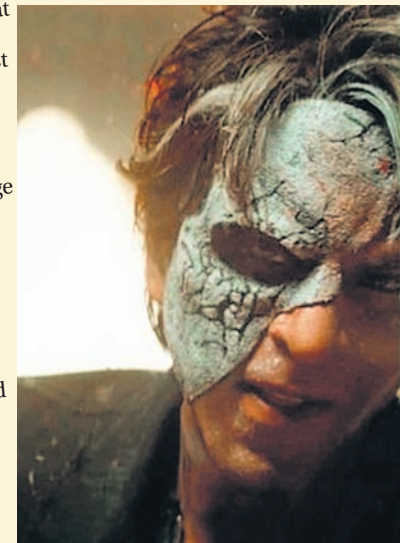
