ADB cuts India's growth forecast, expects erratic rains to hit farm output

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) on Wednesday lowered its growth forecast for India's economy to 6.3 per cent for 2023-24 from 6.4 per cent estimated earlier, citing the adverse impact of slowing exports and erratic rainfall that could hit farm output.

Women's reservation bill passed by 454 votes against 2 in Lok Sabha

The historic Nari Shakti Vandana Adhiniyam or the women's reservation bill was passed by the Lok Sabha on Wednesday, by an overwhelming 454 votes, after a day-long discussion, with only AIMIM members Asaduddin Owaisi and his colleague Imtiaz Jaleel voting against it. The 128th Constitutional Amendment Bill was passed after voting, where 454 members voted in favour of the bill, while two AIMIM members voted against it.

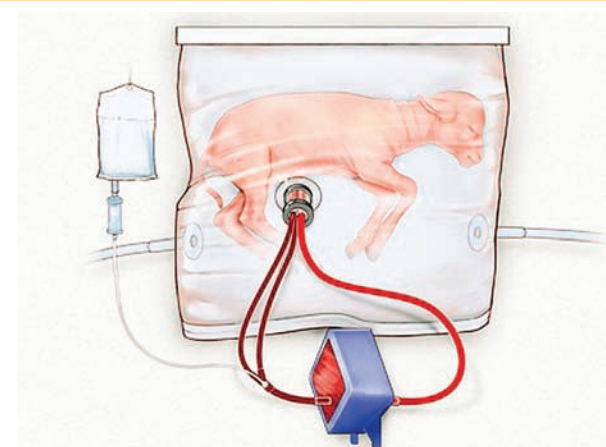

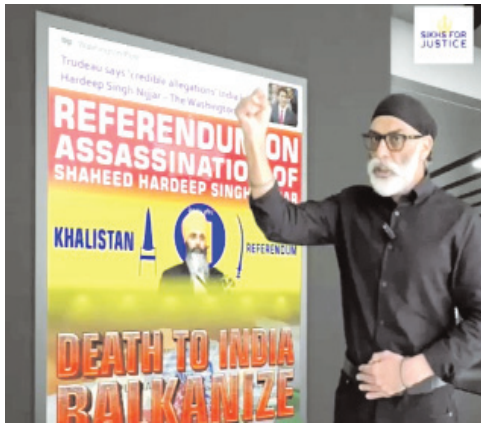

Biden trails Haley, leads Ramaswamy in 2024 race: Poll

Indian-American former UN Ambassador Nikki Haley leads President Joe Biden in hypothetical 2024 head-to-head matchups, according to a new poll. The Harvard CAPS-Harris Poll released this week found the US president trailing behind GOP candidates, Donald Trump, Haley and Tim Scott but ahead of Indian-American entrepreneur Vivek Ramaswamy and Florida Governor Ron DeSantis.



President Joe Biden is showing lagging national poll numbers and that now multiple GOP candidates are ahead of him. This is a new development as (non-Trump) potential opponents like Haley get exposure," Mark Penn, the co-director of the Harvard CAPS/Harris Poll, told The Hill. The poll shared with The Hill found that 44 per cent of respondents said they would vote for Trump, while 40 per cent said they would back Biden. A separate 15 per cent said they were

Biden received 39 per cent. The octogenarian also did well against former Vice President Mike Pence and DeSantis but a slew of negative polls point to his age as an issue for the president. America's oldest ever president, Biden had recently said that a lot of people seem focused on his age. "I get it, believe me, I know it more than anyone. I'm running because democracy is at stake, because in 2024 democracy is on the ballot once again. And let there be no question: Donald Trump and his MAGA Republicans are determined to destroy American democracy".



SELENA GOMEZ WILL NEVER WATCH HER MENTAL HEALTH DOCUMENTARY AGAIN

Popstar-actress Selena Gomez has said that she will never revisit her mental health documentary 'My Mind and Me' because it's 'so hard' to watch.

The 31-year-old laid bare her personal and professional struggles in the candid film for Apple TV Plus which touched on her 2016 breakdown and stint in a treatment centre as well as her diagnosis of bipolar disorder and later battles with mental health issues - and she has now revealed she was reluctant to make the film over fears it would jeopardise her career, reports femalefirst.co.uk.

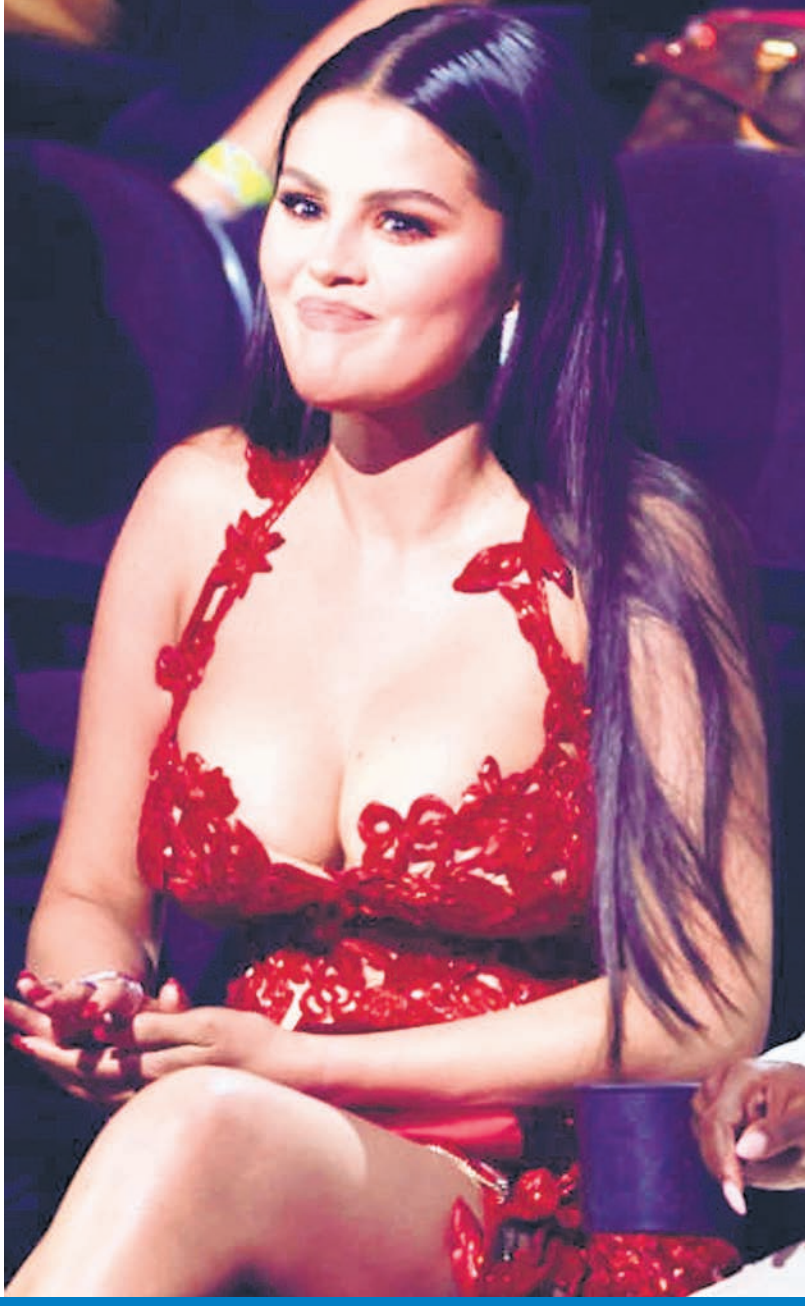
Speaking during an appearance at Thrive Global's Music and Health Conference in Los Angeles on Tuesday, she explained: "I was very against it. There was a very long period of time where I just didn't know if it was a good idea. I knew, eventually, one day I wanted to maybe just be an actress for a while, and I didn't know if it would jeopardise things in my life."

"I don't know what I'm doing, letting people into my life. And then the moment it was released... I had no choice at that point. And I was relieved. I felt like a huge weight was lifted."

However, she admitted she can't bring herself to watch it again.

Gomez added: "I felt like I got to say things that I've been keeping in for years. It's very hard for me to watch. I will never watch it again, but I'm very proud of it. I couldn't have been luckier to have the people that worked on it with me."

During the appearance, she also spoke about her relationship with social media - insisting she's not bothered about numbers of followers but feels the "heavy" responsibility of interacting with fans who are going through tough times.

Iwanyk admitted Reeves is like a "shell of himself" at the end of filming because he gives so much to the part.

He added: "The guy is just a shell of himself because he just goes off and goes for it. He was like, 'I wanna be definitively killed at the end of this movie.' We were like, 'You

know, we'll leave a 10 per cent little opening.'"

In May, it was revealed 'John Wick 5' is in the early stages of development. Lionsgate chairman Joe Drake revealed at the time that a fifth movie was already in the works, along with a host of other projects at the production studio.

During a recent financial call, he said, "We're now moving across that franchise, not just in the AAA video game space, but looking at what the regular cadence of spin-offs, television really growing that universe so that there is a steady cadence of a franchise that there's clear appetite by the audience."
