Congress's family is in danger, not the Constitution: Mohan Yadav

CRUTCH FOR ELECTION

According to the EAC-PM, the share of the majority Hindu population declined by 7.82 per cent from 84.68 per cent to 78.06 per cent between 1950 and 2015 while that of Muslim population rose by 43.15 per cent to 14.09 per cent from 9.84 per cent during the period.

The paper said the Christian population share rose 5.38 per cent from 2.24 per cent to 2.36 per cent during the period.

The share of Sikh population increased by 6.58 per cent from 1.24 per cent in 1950 to 1.85 per cent in 2015.

Even the share of the Buddhist population witnessed a noticeable increase from 0.05 per cent to 0.81 per cent.



Union Minister and firebrand BJP leader Giriraj Singh said that the drastic rise in the Muslim population was a matter of concern and if not addressed timely, will have serious ramifications. Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya blamed the Congress for unhindered growth of one community at the cost of other.

BJP national spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi told correspondent that in 1950s, the population of Muslims was comparatively less while the number of learned Muslims was higher. Congress leader Udit Raj, replying to query on the EAC-PM report, slammed the current dispensation for not conducting Census in 2021. "Census is due for long. This government is deliberately delaying it. Unless, there is a detailed survey, we won't get to know the real demography," he said. Former Congress veteran Acharya Pramod Krishnam hit out at the INDIA bloc for plunging numbers of Hindus. He said that the Opposition wants to divide the majority, so that it succeeds in pushing its dangerous agenda. Manu Gaur, the TAXAB president also raised concerns over the changing demography and said that an effective population policy was the need to time to arrest this disparity.

"The rise in their population resulted in their degradation. Muslim community should introspect into this rather than reacting with anger over findings."

Air India Express row: 85 flights cancelled as cabin crew members continue strike

Over 80 flights were cancelled on Thursday following the mass sick leave taken by the cabin crew members of Air India Express, said an official.

"We will be operating 283 flights today. We have mobilised all resources and Air India will support us by operating on 20 of our routes. However, 85 of our flights stand cancelled and we urge our guests booked to fly with us to check if their flight is affected by the disruption before heading to the airport," said the Air India Express spokesperson.

"If their flight is cancelled, or delayed beyond 3 hours, they may opt for a full refund or reschedule to a later date without any fees on Tia on WhatsApp (+91 6360012345) or airindiaexpress.com," the spokesperson added.

Since Tuesday, over 300 cabin crew members have gone on mass sick leave alleging that despite assur-



ances of job security, salary preservation, and recognition of seniority and expertise, there has been a visible departure from these commitments during the transition from AirAsia to Air India Express. In 2023, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) gave its go-ahead to the Tata Group's initiative to merge the budget airline AIX Connect (previously known as AirAsia India) with Air India Express.

"Since last (Tuesday) evening, over 100 of our cabin crew colleagues have reported sick prior to their rostered flight duty, at the last minute, severely disrupting our operations. Because this action was mostly by colleagues assigned L1 role, the impact was disproportionate, disrupting 90+ flights even though other colleagues reported for duty", read the letter by CEO Alok Singh on Wednesday.

EIGHT KILLED IN BLAST AT FIREWORKS FACTORY IN TN'S SIVAKASI

Chennai: Eight people, including two women, were killed in a blast at a fireworks factory in Sivakasi in Tamil Nadu's Virudhanagar district on Thursday, while several others were injured, officials said.

Police and fire personnel reached the spot for rescue operations and the injured, which include two in serious condition, were being taken to the Virudhanagar government medical college and hospital.

Further details were awaited. Sivakasi is the "fireworks capital" of India with an annual turnover of Rs 6,000 crore and employing more than 1 lakh people directly and around two and half lakh people indirectly.

US trying to 'complicate' Lok Sabha elections: Russia

Targeting the US for interfering in India's internal affairs, Russia has said that Washington is trying to "complicate" the ongoing Lok Sabha elections, including by making "regular unfounded accusations" on threats to religious freedom in the country.

Reacting strongly to the recent report released by the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF), Russian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Maria Zakharova said Washington not only "groundlessly" accuses India, but also many other states.

"Regular unfounded accusations by the United States against New Delhi - we see that they groundlessly accuse not only India, but also many other states - of violating religious freedoms are a reflection of the United States' misunderstanding of the national mentality, the historical context of the development of the Indian state and disrespect for India as a state," Zakharova told mediapersons in Moscow on Wednesday.



"I am sure that this also comes from the neocolonial mentality, the mentality of the colonial period, the period of the slave trade, and imperialism... This does not only apply to India. The reason is the desire to unbalance the internal political situation in India in order to

complicate the general parliamentary elections taking place in the country. Of course, this is part of interference in India's internal affairs," added the Russian MFA spokesperson.

During the regular media briefing, Zakharova was also asked about a report published in a US newspaper that accused an Indian official of a "foiled assassination" plot on foreign soil.

"According to the information we have, Washington has not yet provided any reliable evidence of the involvement of Indian citizens in the preparation of the murder of a certain G.S. Pannun. Speculation on this topic in the absence of evidence is unacceptable," stated Zakharova.

Last week, India slammed the USCIRF report, saying that the agency's efforts to interfere in India's ongoing elections will never succeed.

'Right to campaign not fundamental'

A day before the Supreme Court is set to pronounce its order on the interim bail plea moved by incarcerated Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the excise policy case, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Thursday opposed the grant of interim relief saying that a politician can claim no "special status" higher than that of an ordinary citizen and is as much liable to be arrested and detained for committing offences as any other citizen.

The affidavit filed by ED's Deputy Director stated that there is no principle that justifies giving differential treatment to a politician for campaigning over a farmer or a businessman who wishes to pursue his vocation.

"If the right to campaign is treated as a basis for grant of interim bail, it would breach



the principles of Article 14 for the reason that harvesting for a farmer would be an equally important factor for seeking interim bail as would a board meeting or an annual general meeting for a director of a company who commits a crime, as these are their respective vocations or professions," read the affidavit.

The agency said that the right to campaign for elections is neither a fundamental right nor a constitutional right and not even a legal right.

K'TAKA SEX SCANDAL NCW says three men claiming to be cops forced one 'victim' to lodge false complaint

In a twist to the sex video scandal in Karnataka involving Prajwal Revanna -- the sitting JD-S MP who has been renominated from Hassan -- the National Commission for Women (NCW) said on Thursday that one of the woman complainants in the case has claimed that she was forced by a group of people to lodge a false complaint after being threatened with harassment.

The NCW said in a statement, "One woman complainant came to the Commission to register a complaint against three individuals dressed in civil uniform, allegedly introducing themselves as Karnataka Police officials and forcing her to give a false complaint in this case.



"The woman claimed that she received calls from random numbers threatening her to lodge a complaint. It has come to light that this complainant was forced by a group of individuals to file a complaint under the threat of potential harassment and false implications."

The complainant has sought protection for her family, underscoring the seriousness of the situation, the NCW said, adding that it has asked Karnataka DGP Alok Mohan to provide appropriate security to the woman.

Prajwal Revanna is the grandson of former Prime Minister H.D. Deve Gowda, and son of JD-S MLA H.D. Revanna, who has been arrested for his alleged role in the kidnapping of a victim of the sex scandal involving his

son.

The NCW statement added, "In a separate development, it has been noted that the 700 women who submitted online complaints are affiliated with a social activist group and have no direct involvement or association with the primary complainant in the case."

"The NCW stands firm in its condemnation of any form of violence or sexual abuse perpetrated against women. The recent developments surrounding the Prajwal Revanna case have prompted the NCW to take swift and decisive action."

In response to the distressing reports circulating in the media, the NCW initiated suo motu action, demonstrating its commitment to upholding the rights and dignity of women, the statement said.

People with two wives will get two lakh rupees annually: Kantilal Bhuria

SC ISSUES CONTEMPT NOTICE AGAINST CPWD, DDA OFFICIALS FOR FELLING OF TREES IN DELHI'S RIDGE AREA

The Supreme Court on Thursday set in motion contempt proceedings against the officials of the Central

Public Works Department (CPWD) and the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) for felling of trees in Delhi's Ridge area in violation of its orders.

Issuing notice in the contempt petitions, a bench, headed by Justice Abhay S. Oka summoned the Director General of the CPWD and DDA Vice Chairperson, in person, on the

next date of listing.

"We direct that the respondents shall not indulge in any further tree felling and status quo as of today shall be maintained in respect of the property subject matter of these contempt petitions," the bench, also comprising Justice Ujjal Bhuyan, ordered.

The contempt petitions alleged that a large number of trees in the ridge had been felled there by the DDA to construct an approach road between the Chhattarpur Road and the SAARC University near Maidan Garhi.

In an earlier order, the top court had said that other areas having morphological ridges were required to be protected and no permission for construction should be given there. Further, it had directed the Ministry of Environment and Forest to set up a committee to work out modalities to identify areas of the Ridge which are not notified but also have the same ridge-like features.

PM losing confidence, MVA to get 30-35 LS seats in Maha: Sharad Pawar

Claiming that the country wants a "change", Nationalist Congress Party-SP President Sharad Pawar on Thursday predicted that the INDIA-Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance candidates will bag between 30-35 seats of the 48 Lok Sabha constituencies in Maharashtra. Addressing media persons here, Pawar said that in the 2019 LS elections, the

Opposition parties had got just 6 seats, but this time the figures would be at least five to six times higher, touching 30-35. "The first three phases of polling in the country seem to have unnerved Prime Minister Narendra Modi. That's why after the second phase, he changed his political strategy by directly naming the Muslim community. He apparently feels that now something can be done by invoking such religious

issues...," he claimed. In his assessment, the octogenarian leader pointed out that as the elections progress, PM Modi's supporters are apprehensive that his position (as PM) is under threat. He reiterated that the alliance of NCP-SP, the Congress, and the Shiv Sena-UBT is expected to get a good response as the people of the state support their policies and are desirous of a "change" in power in the country.

Neha Sharma murder case

Allahabad HC grants bail to accused, cites lengthy detention period

The Allahabad High Court has granted bail to Uday Sarup, accused of murdering 23-year-old PhD student Neha Sharma in the zoology lab of the Dayalbagh Educational Institute, Agra, in March 2013.

Without going into the merits of the case, Justice Sanjay Kumar Singh cited the long incarceration period of the accused for granting bail.

"This court is also of the view that though detailed discussion on merit is not required but at least, order rejecting or granting bail must reflect basic reason for the same."

Sarup was arrested a month after the incident and charged under Sections 302 (murder), 376 (rape), and 511 (attempting to commit offences punishable with imprisonment for life) of the IPC.

After police filed a charge sheet, the case was transferred to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

In 2014, the court granted bail to the accused under the aforementioned sections. However, after the CBI filed a supplementary charge sheet in 2015 under Sections 302, 376 and 201 (causing disappearance of evidence



of offence), Sarup was again taken into custody in 2016.

Meanwhile, the father of the victim had moved the Supreme Court against the court order granting bail to the accused. The plea was disposed of in 2019 since the accused had been taken into custody again.

The CBI alleged that Sarup, whose advances had previously been rebuffed by the victim, meticulously orchestrated the murder. In its charge sheet, it said that Sarup had raped and killed the young woman after finding her alone in the lab.

Molestation Case

CCTV footage of Raj Bhavan shown to 'common people', Governor not spotted in single frame

Amid allegations of molestation against West Bengal Governor C.V. Ananda Bose, the Governor's House on Thursday showed 69-minute CCTV footage of the Raj Bhavan premises dated May 2 to around 100 'common people'.

On May 2, a temporary female staff at the Raj Bhavan filed a police complaint accusing the Governor of 'outraging her modesty', triggering a political storm in the state.

Denying the charge vehemently from the beginning, the Governor on Wednesday announced that the CCTV footage of the Raj Bhavan will be screened at the Governor's House for the common people, barring Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee and members of the police force, on Thursday.

In the CCTV footage screened in three parts, the Governor could not



be seen in any frame. The footage from May 2 showed

recordings of two CCTV cameras installed in the North Gate of the Raj

Bhavan from 5.32 p.m. to 6.41 p.m. The screening event was titled 'Sach Ka Samna'.

Although the Governor was not spotted in the footage, the complainant was seen twice -- once entering the police post inside the Raj Bhavan premises, and then coming out of it and entering an adjacent room.

Heavy deployment of police was seen in the footage on account of the arrival of Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Raj Bhavan on the night of May 2.

Since the announcement of the screening on Wednesday, the Governor's office received hundreds of applications from the common people seeking to attend the event.

The CCTV cameras inside the Governor's House are maintained by the Public Works Department, while the monitoring is done by the Kolkata Police.

Chautala seeks floor test after Independents withdraw support to Haryana's Saini govt

J.P. leader and Former Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala on Thursday asked Governor Bandaru Dattatreya to order a floor test after three Independent MLAs withdrew support to the BJP government, while the Congress demanded that it should resign on moral grounds as it was now "in the minority".

Chautala, in a letter to the Governor, sought his intervention under Article 174 as the Nayab Singh Saini government does not command a majority.

"The Nayab Saini government was formed with the support of six Independents. While three have withdrawn support, one Independent MLA resigned from the House and his resignation was accepted on April 30. The government no longer has the numbers, necessitating a floor test," it read.

The Congress demanded the President's rule in the state and sought time to meet the Governor on Friday. Leader of Opposition and two-time



Chief Minister Bhupinder Hooda said the government should resign on moral grounds as "it's in the minority".

Talking to the media in Bhiwani town, Hooda said the Congress delegation of 30 legislators would be reaching Chandigarh. He said 45 of the 88 legisla-

tors in the Assembly - 30 of the Congress, 10 of the JJP, three Independent legislators, who have switched sides to the Congress, Independent MLA from Meham, Balraj Kundu, and INLD MLA Abhey Chautala were against the government.

FOUR DIE WHILE CLEANING SEPTIC TANK IN UP

Chandauli: At least four people, including three labourers, died after inhaling toxic gas while cleaning a 15-year-old septic tank in the New Mahal area of Chandauli district on Thursday.

SDM Viraj Pandey said, "The cleaning of sewer was ongoing at the residence of one Bharat Jaiswal."

"Three labourers and the house owner's son died. District administration will provide Rs 4 lakh ex-gratia to each of the deceased." Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath also took cognisance of the incident and expressed his condolences to the bereaved families.

He has directed officials to expedite relief measures.

Rajasthan teen freed from shackles of child marriage on Akshaya Tithiya eve

On the eve of Akshaya Tithiya, which is also associated with child marriage in Rajasthan, a 17-year-old girl was freed from the shackles of the evil practice as her child marriage was annulled before she attained adulthood on Thursday. Sugandha (name changed) was married at the tender age of 10 and sent to her in-law's place at 16, before being freed from the bondage at the age of 17.

Daughter of a daily wageer at a village in Jodhpur district, she bore the brunt of child marriage for seven long years.

Under societal pressure, her 'Gauna' -- a custom in North India associated with the consummation of marriage -- was performed fol-



lowing which she was sent to her in-law's house at the age of 16, where her husband and in-laws reportedly subjected her to verbal abuse.

The family court in Jodhpur has now finally annulled the child marriage of Sugandha and freed her from the shackles of the evil practice.

Sugandha got information from the women's police station about the campaign against child marriage run by Kriti Bharti, Managing Trustee of Jodhpur's Saarthi Trust, who is also a rehabilitation psychologist and child & women's rights advocate.

After she met Bharti and narrated her ordeal, the latter filed a case about five months ago for the annulment of Sugandha's child marriage.

Annulling Sugandha's child marriage, the judge of Family Court No. 2, Pradeep Kumar Modi, said that everyone must take responsibility for eradicating this evil practice from the society.

Islam does not permit live-in relationship for a married Muslim: Allahabad HC

The Lucknow bench of Allahabad High Court has said that a follower of Islam cannot be in a live-in relationship, particularly if the spouse is alive.

"The Islamic tenets do not permit live-in relationships during the subsisting marriage. The position may be different if the two persons are unmarried and the parties being adults choose to lead their lives in a way of their own," said the bench on Wednesday. With this observation, a bench of Justice A.R. Masoodi and Justice A.K. Srivastava refused to provide police protection to petitioners Sneha Devi and Mohd Shadab Khan, both natives of Bahraich district. The petitioners claimed they were in a live-in relationship but the woman's parents lodged an FIR against Khan for kidnapping and inducing their daughter to marry him.



The petitioners sought police protection saying they are adults and as per a Supreme Court order, they were free to stay in a live-in relationship. On enquiry, the bench found that Khan was already married (to one Farida Khatoun in 2020) and even had a daughter. Considering this fact, the court declined to provide him police protection on the grounds of the SC verdict which permits a live-in relationship. The bench instead said that Islam does not permit such a relationship, especially under the circumstances of the present case.

Kedarnath shrine adorned with 20 quintals of flowers, portals to open on Friday

In this case, serious questions arise about the role of the presiding officer and other officers engaged in election duty.

2 accused arrested for hunting and smuggling of rare wild animal Pangolin, absconding for two years

State Tiger Strike Force Madhya Pradesh Regional Unit Jabalpur, Forest Division South Seoni, Forest Division South Balaghat and Police Station Lanji jointly cordoned off and arrested Aamir Hussain, resident of Silchar District Cachar Assam and Amulya Mandal District Cooch Behar West Bengal from Kachari Chowk Seoni.

A case was registered against the said accused under various sections of Wildlife (Protection) Act 1972 in Forest Division South Balaghat, Forest Crime Case No. 11614/20 dated 20 September 2014, in relation to hunting of wild animal pangolin and smuggling of its parts. The said accused were absconding for the last 2 years and a permanent arrest warrant was issued against them by the Honorable Judicial Magistrate First Class Lanji District Balaghat. Continuous efforts were being made to catch them by the State Tiger Strike Force. State Tiger Strike Force Madhya Pradesh received information from the informer on 8 May 2014 that the above two accused had



come to Madhya Pradesh around Seoni.

The joint team cordoned off the area near Kachari Chowk and as per

the above description, the suspicious person was stopped and interrogated. He revealed his name as Aamir Hussain and Amulya Mandal, who were arrested and handed over to the local police. The accused will be produced before the Honorable Judicial Magistrate First Class, Lanji, District Balaghat.

Pangolin scales are purchased by these smugglers mainly from Orissa, Chhattisgarh, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and sold to traders from Assam, Mizoram, Meghalaya, where the traders send them to China via Myanmar (Burma).

STSF has exposed an inter-state and international gang involved in smuggling of parts of rare species of wild animal, Pangolin. In this, 197 accused have been arrested from 15 states of the country.

Interpol has named the pangolin the most trafficked mammal in the world. Parts of the wild animal pangolin are smuggled from many countries in Asia and Africa. Its demand is mainly in countries like China, Myanmar, Thailand, Malaysia, Hong Kong and Vietnam etc.

4 thousand 555 complaints of violation received on "C-Vigil App"

Chief Electoral Officer Anupam Rajan has said that the Model Code of Conduct is in force from March 16 for the Lok Sabha elections 2024 in the state. Complaints of violation of Model Code of Conduct are being received from citizens on "C-Vigil App". From March 16 to May 9, 4 thousand 555 complaints of violation of the code of conduct have been received on the C-Vigil app. All these complaints have been resolved promptly.

Rajan said that mostly 525 complaints have been received in Gwalior, 349 in Sagar, 306 in Damoh, 273 in Ujjain, 239 in Morena, 198 in Rajgarh, 211 in Indore, 168 in Rewa, 152 in Katni, 127 in Kargone, 120 in Sehore, 135 in

Bhopal, 114 in Chhatarpur, 110 in Narsinghpur, and 105 complaints have been received in Satna district. Similar complaints have been received from other districts of the state also.

Rajan has urged the citizens of the state that if they want to make any direct complaint related to violation of Model Code of Conduct in elections, then they can do so through "C-Vigil App". For this, the concerned citizen will have to go to Google Play Store and download "C-Vigil App".

Action will be taken within 100 minutes

Shri Rajan said that if a citizen has information about any incident related to violation of the code of conduct, he will have to upload the photo or video on the "C-Vigil App". On receiving the complaint,

action will be taken within the next 100 minutes.

It is noteworthy that "C-Vigil App" has been prepared by the Election Commission of India for redressal of complaints regarding violation of Model Code of Conduct. Through this app, people can prevent political parties or candidates from distributing money, goods, clothes, jewellery, etc. in any way to vote voters, threatening voters to vote in their favour, transporting voters in their own vehicle and can make other types of complaints including pasting or putting up election campaign material on the building or walls or premises of any building owner or getting election advertisements written on the walls without the permission of the building owner.

RGPV: NEW REVELATION IN THE SCAM OF RS 19.50 CRORE

1.34 crore distributed among traders and 9.50 crore transferred to the account of Dalit Sangh

A new revelation has come to light in the Rajiv Gandhi Technological University (RGTV) scam case. Out of the Rs 9.50 crore transferred from the account of RGTV to the account of Dalit Sangh Sohagpur, about Rs 1.25 crore was distributed to the traders. Dalit Sangh Secretary Ratan Umre has delivered this amount to the traders.

This disclosure has been made by the Gandhinagar Police of Bhopal, which is investigating the case of transfer of Rs 9.50 crore from the account of RGTV to the account of Dalit Sangh. Also, the police have made union secretary Ratan Umre and treasurer Ashok Chaurasia accused in this case. It is noteworthy that this amount was deposited by the students in the university account as fees for examination, enrolment, registration and other processes.

According to the investigation report of Gandhinagar Police, Rs 9 crore 50 lakh was transferred from the account of the University to the account of Dalit Sangh Sohagpur on January 23, 2023. A few hours after the money was credited to the account, Dalit Sangh Secretary Ratan Umre withdrew Rs 3 crore 20 lakh. Whereas Rs 55 lakh 73 thousand 500 were withdrawn through cheque. Apart from this, Secretary Ratan Umre had transferred Rs 25 lakh 65 thousand to his own State Bank



of India account.

Out of Rs 9.50 crore deposited from the account of RGTV to the account of Dalit Sangh, Rs 3 crore 75 lakh were withdrawn through separate checks by Secretary Ratan Umre and Treasurer Ashok

Chaurasia. This has been confirmed by Pipariya-based branch manager of ICICI Bank Sumit Jharia and Axis Bank manager Vinay Verma in their statements given to Gandhi Nagar Police. Ratan Umre transferred a huge amount to his own account.

Loyalties, like the fragrance of Ittar, last long in Kannauj

'Ittar', a non-alcohol based perfume, is known for being long-lasting and loyalties in Kannauj, the nation's Ittar hub, also last long. People here develop loyalties with leaders and parties and do not change them every five years. For the SP and BJP candidates in Kannauj, this is a major advantage. The Lok Sabha elections in Kannauj that goes to polls on May 13, turned high profile after SP President Akhilesh Yadav threw his hat into the ring here. Former Uttar Pradesh (UP) CM, Akhilesh Yadav is contesting against Subrat Pathak, the sitting BJP MP, who defeated Dimple Yadav in 2019. He is confident that the work done by the double engine governments will ensure a smooth victory for the BJP. SP chief Akhilesh's presence in the fray, meanwhile, has enthused the party cadres. The SP office in Sadar area is buzzing with activity as motorcycles whizz in and out. The constituency has over 19 lakh voters, with Muslims accounting for around 3 lakh and Brahmins and Yadavs being slightly more than 2.5 lakh each. Dalits, who constitute the biggest chunk with a population of over 4 lakh, may play a decisive role. Rajputs, Vaishyas, Lodhs, and Kurmis are also present in significant numbers. The winners from this constituency include Dr Ram Manohar Lohia in 1967, Sheila Dikshit in 1984 and Mulayam Singh Yadav in 1999. The biggest problem in Kannauj relates to unemployment. Though the district has more than 100 cold storages and over 400 small 'ittar' manufacturing units, besides 23 private distilleries, there are many who find it tough to make ends meet. Most Muslims and Dalits work as daily wagers, who may not find work for months together. The ittar industry, however, has learnt to sustain itself over the years and remains unaffected by political churning.

Why don't general masses' woes become Election Issue?

The third phase of Lok Sabha elections has been completed; as the elections are progressing, the layers of tainted character of politicians and poll candidates are being exposed, in the process. There was a time when people used to follow the conduct of country's leaders in public life. Leaders were also concerned about their image and reputation in the society. But in recent years, leaders of many satraps' families have also entered the politics, who in their pursuit of power, kept aside all the morals and decorum. Recently, the serious allegations made against Prajwal Revanna, MP of Janata Dal (Secular) from Hassan seat in Karnataka, of misconduct with hundreds of women, have shown the nadir point of degradation in politics. Moreover, the Enforcement Department, which is investigating an old case in Ranchi, has recovered Rs 39 crore in cash from the house of a servant working at the house of private secretary of Jharkhand government minister Alamgir Alam. This election involving leaders and tainted candidates tainted with sexual harassment, misconduct, corruption and treason is a serious question on democracy. Our politics is becoming a tragedy. The politicians started doing everything for power and in this race they forgot the ideals of politics, this is why the poison of inequalities and inconsistencies is mixed in the atmosphere of the country, and there is no hope of light from anywhere. We are afraid of the politically corrupt, of those who glorify crime, of those who misuse power, of those who put the unity and integrity of the country at stake, and of those who tear down women's dignity through sexual harassment and misconduct.

The country is faced with a complex mix of sorrow, pain and insensitivity; problems are scary and horrifying in new masks. A lot has changed in the society, including - values, thoughts, life-style, architecture, and a lot more. The election process is increasingly becoming very expensive. Being honest is a vice in today's politics. Taking action against crime has become a sin. Taking interest in religion and spirituality has come to be considered communal. Exposing any irregularity is considered prejudice. Speaking the truth falls into the category of ego-feeding. Candor is impractical. Not supporting corruption is not recognizing the time. It is necessary to discuss these and such basic questions in the context of elections. After all, for how long will these new definitions being coined in the name of political interests continue to push the



society and nation in deplorable directions? How long will our country and our society remain forgotten in the name of the strong storm of evolution? In this grand show of elections, the talk of reform, morality, values and principles is not being heard anywhere? There is no light visible anywhere. It is a very dark and dense night. There is neither self-confidence, nor moral strength.

This great sacrifice of elections organized for building a great and strong India is today becoming 'Mahabharata'. How this undertaking of establishing values and standards is becoming a medium to hollow out democracy is a matter of deep concern and contemplation. A naked dance of character devaluation, economic anomalies and giving support to disparities has started taking place in the elections and every party is displaying its strength in it with great enthusiasm. It is not only about election donations, but also about donations received from foreign countries. Today the question is very big, and that is how to protect Indian politics from direct foreign influence. The allegations against Aam Aadmi Party of taking huge sums of money from alleged anti-India foreign powers are a challenge to our entire electoral system.

Have the people associated with the ruling party, or the opposition parties, or the newly emerging political contenders, and those who talk about ideals, ever given any feeling through their actions that they should be considered as politicians who have risen above limited vested interests? Here the names of the leaders are not that important, nor is the political party important, what is important is the fact that this kind of

Kupmandu leadership can overall make the politics of the country shallow. The kind of moral integrity that is required for positive politics and the kind of maturity that is required from politicians for this, the lack of it in the entire opposition parties is creating a painful situation. And we are the ones who are engaged in creating such leaders!

Elections are considered the beginning of the democratic process, but today elections have become a mockery of democracy. The methods adopted in elections are contrary to the basic idea of democracy. Faced with these conditions, Indian democracy, which is said to be the world's best, is today at the crossroads of anarchy; where no path leading from here appears to be safe. The fault of putting it at the crossroads lies much more with the political parties and leaders than with the public, who have weakened it greatly by making it a medium to fulfill personal and party interests. Today these parties, these people have lost the ability to take it out of the current quagmire. Only Kauravas and Pandavas were not affected in the battle of Mahabharata. The sparks of that war had reached far and wide. It is clearly visible that even in this Mahabharata, the so-called anarchist political and economic forces are trying to show their influence, which will have far-reaching consequences. In these circumstances, such an effort is now necessary in which intentions of those who wrote the new story of 'Mahabharata' in the name of 'Great India' are identified. India needs leaders with Arjun's concentration. If neces-

sary, it is not wrong to attack the top leadership for wrong conduct.

It is true that today there is no dearth of such parties in the country, which are formed not on the basis of policy, but on the sick ambitions of the individual, but such parties also talk about policies. The discrepancy between words and actions should be a matter of concern for a democratic system. Although, in reaching the golden age of independence, our political parties have not presented such examples of policies and ideals which indicate that the democratic system is strong and healthy, yet there has always been an expectation that policies and morality will be there somewhere near; will play any role in deciding the direction of our politics. Even though it was a misunderstanding, it was true. Now there doesn't even seem to be a chance to maintain such a happy understanding. But today is the opportunity to ask the question: when will policies become the basis of our politics? It is also important to ask - when will opportunism be considered a crime in politics? It is an irony in itself that talking about politics based on principles and policies seems strange today. It is true that a person's thoughts can change at any time, but on what basis can it be said that changing thoughts like clothes every day is right? The truth is that today in our politics the very definition of right and wrong has changed - everything that serves political interests becomes right and everything that is related to the interests of the common man becomes wrong. What kind of democracy is being created in which the 'people' themselves are disappearing?

Narsi Mehta's bhajan "Vaishnav Jan to Tene Kahiye, Je Peer Parai Jaane Re" had become the life thread of Gandhiji, but why does it not become the life thread of today's leaders? Why don't today's politicians accept someone else's pain and sorrow as their own? Why not connect your thoughts with the pain and feelings of the people? Any person, event or opportunity is important if it makes the nation hopeful even for a day. But here one day's ignorance is a preparation to hand over five years i.e. eighteen hundred and twenty-five days to darkness. What kind of responsibility are we fulfilling as voters and what kind of political leadership is being created?

30 killed during Israel's continuing ground assault in Rafah

Israel's army has announced that it is continuing its ground assault on Gaza's Rafah, reporting approximately 30 casualties since the offensive began on Monday night. According to an army statement issued on Wednesday, the 30 casualties were mili-

attacked about 100 "targets" in the region, including militant infrastructure and "suspicious buildings" from which Hamas fighters fired at Israeli soldiers, the army said. Israel launched the ground assault on Rafah overnight between Monday and Tuesday, citing its aim to eliminate four Hamas battalions that remain in the southern city. Troops gained "operational control" over the Gaza side of the Rafah crossing on Tuesday, a key entry point for humanitarian aid from Egypt to the famine-stricken Gaza, and shut it down.

US won't supply Israel with weapons for Rafah offensive: Biden

US President Joe Biden has threatened Israel with further restrictions on the supply of military equipment were Israel to carry out a major military offensive in the southern Gaza city of Rafah. "I made it clear that if they (Israel) go into Rafah... I'm not supplying the weapons that have been used historically to deal with Rafah, to deal with the cities - that deal with that problem," Biden told broadcaster CNN in an interview, stressing "they haven't gone in Rafah yet". On Wednesday, the US said it paused a large shipment of weapons to Israel amid ongoing concerns in Washington about military operations in the southern Gaza city. State Department spokesman Matthew Miller said it had been clearly communicated to Israel that the US government did not support Israel's long-threatened all-out offensive in Rafah, the southern city in the Gaza Strip that is seen as the last place of refuge for civilians in the territory.

Deadly storms claim 100 lives, damage 100,000 homes in Brazil

At least 100 people have died and nearly 100,000 homes have been destroyed or significantly damaged from more than a week of record rainfall and flooding in south Brazil's Rio Grande do Sul state, local authorities have said.

The National Confederation of Municipalities said in an update on Wednesday that overflowing rivers and floods in the state have affected around 1.45 million people and forced some 200,000 residents to flee their homes, Xinhua news agency reported.

Based on data from the Civil Defense agency, some 99,800 residences of all types have sustained either total or partial damage since the state's worst weather-related disaster hit on April 29, according to the confederation.

As many as 414 of 497 towns in the state, a top agricultural and livestock producer that borders Argentina and Uruguay, have suffered from the storms and declared emergencies.

The confederation estimates the economic losses at 4.6 billion reais (about \$904 million), taking into account the damage to housing and public infrastructure, as well as agriculture, livestock, industry, commerce and services.

In just one week, Rio Grande do Sul saw five months' worth of rain, sparking unprecedented flooding.

Israeli police raid Al Jazeera offices in Nazareth

Israeli police have raided the offices of broadcaster Al Jazeera in the city of Nazareth, confiscating equipment belonging to the Arabic-language TV channel. The raid comes several days after the Israeli government banned Al Jazeera, both blocking access to Al Jazeera's content in Israel and banning the broadcaster from operating. Israel's communications minister signed a closure order for the broadcaster on Sunday, and Al Jazeera's office in the Ambassador Hotel in East Jerusalem was raided that same day. Israel accuses the channel of biased reporting in the Gaza war. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu had already announced his intention to close the TV network's facilities operating in Israel more than a month ago.

Israel's parliament had previously approved a measure widely known as the Al Jazeera law that enables the government to shut down and ban foreign broadcasters if they are classified as a risk to state security. The broadcaster has categorically rejected the Israeli accusations and described the ban as a "criminal act" that violated human rights and the fundamental right of access to information. Al Jazeera said it would take all possible action against the move and defend the rights of the broadcaster and its employees.

New dispute looms between Rome and German NGOs helping migrants

A new dispute is brewing between Italy and private German aid organisations over the handling of boat refugees in the Mediterranean. Despite a ban by the right-wing government of Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, the German non-governmental organisation (NGO) Sea-Watch said it was continuing its flights to spot refugee boats.

A video posted by Sea-Watch showed a small private plane taking off from the island of Lampedusa towards the central Mediterranean, one of the most important routes for refugees from Africa to Europe.

At the beginning of this week, Italy's aviation authority, which reports to the transport ministry of right-wing Prime Minister Matteo Salvini, issued several decrees.

Accordingly, no more flights of this kind are allowed to take off from Lampedusa and three other airports in the south. This is also justified on the grounds that it would jeopardise the safety of migrants. Violations could result in the confiscation of aircraft and heavy fines.

Sea-Watch has said that it intends to defy the ban. "The flight ban is politically motivated and legally untenable," a spokesman said.

"In the middle of the European election campaign, Italy is trying to get rid of the last witnesses to European crimes in the Mediterranean. We will not be intimidated by this."



There has been a dispute between the aid organisations and Rome for many years. Salvini - formerly Italy's interior minister - has already suffered several defeats in court.

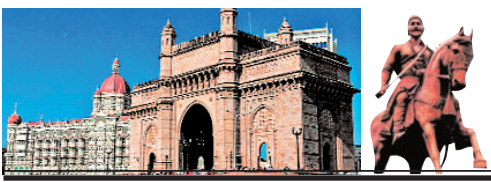
Seven killed in terrorist attack in Pakistan: Police

Gunmen in southwestern Pakistan executed at least seven people in their sleep, in what police on Thursday said was the second incident of ethnic terrorism in the same region within a month. The attack occurred in the volatile coastal town of Gwadar where Pakistan's political ally China is building a deep-sea port, a project opposed by the West and locals alike. The victims were from the central province of Punjab and were running a barber shop in the town, local police

saying the agents of spy agencies were targeted. No group has so far claimed responsibility for Thursday's attack, but police said they suspect the BLA. Much of the violence in the region is seen against the Chinese projects to connect its Muslim-dominated region of Xinjiang with the Arabian Sea through Pakistan to reach markets in the Middle East, Europe, Africa and beyond. Baloch militant and political groups accuse China of stealing their land and resources including several hundred kilometres of shores.

Kirtikar -- son of Gajanan Kirtikar, who belongs to Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena. This has attracted strong reactions and comments accusing the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA)



candidates of supporting terrorists who killed Mumbaikars, and hence, "this (electoral) battle is not only a fight between nationalist forces and divisive gangs but also between

India-Pakistan". Taking strong umbrage at the alleged developments, ruling MahaYuti ally Shiv Sena spokesperson Raju Waghmare said "seeing all

this would have tormented the heart of Hindu Friday Samrat Balasaheb Thackeray" and warned that the people of Mumbai will teach a lesson to those who hobnob with traitors.

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Andheri MLA Ameet Satam also flayed the development contending that the terror accused had campaigned for Kirtikar in Andheri West on Wednesday evening.

Ibrahim Musa was arrested, found guilty and was convicted for supplying weapons to Bollywood actor Sanjay Dutt during the December 1992-January 1993 Mumbai riots and the subsequent terror blasts of March 12, 1993. The SS (UBT) has not yet reacted to the serious accusations and allegations on social media and in rival political circles.

Yoga teacher duped of Rs 3.36 lakh by man she met on tinder

A 46-year-old yoga teacher from Mumbai has allegedly been duped of Rs 3.36 lakh by a man whom she met on a dating app, police said.

The man, Amit Kumar, claimed to be a doctor staying in Manchester, England, an official said on Wednesday.

The woman, resident of Churchgate area in south Mumbai, got acquainted with the man on the dating app Tinder recently and interacted with him, he said.

After being in touch for a couple of days, both of them exchanged phone numbers and started chatting on



WhatsApp.

On April 25, the man told the victim that he has sent her a gift which she has to collect, the official said.

After some days, a woman claiming to be from a courier company in Delhi called the victim and said there was a gift for her from Manchester.

The caller demanded money from the victim to complete formalities for sending her the gift, the official said.

The victim allegedly deposited Rs 3.36 lakh into various accounts specified by the caller, he said.

She later realised that she was being cheated, following which she approached the Marine Drive police on Tuesday and filed a complaint.

Based on the complaint, a case was registered against the man and the caller under relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code and the Information Technology Act and a probe was on into it, the official said.

Ajit Pawar campaigns in Shirur, urges voters elect person who can actually work

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar has slammed NCP-Sharadchandra Pawar nominee Amol Kolhe for "wasting five years as an MP" and urged voters to support Shivajirao Adhalrao, the MahaYuti candidate for Shirur Lok Sabha seat, to ensure progress.

cart racing for the last 25-30 years. I took on three cases, fought cases in the High Court and Supreme Court, spent money, and eventually won... What did the incumbent MP do?" he said.

Kolhe and Adhalrao are pitted against each other once again after the 2019 elections. It was Kolhe as the nominee of NCP (united) who had defeated Adhalrao, who contested as the Shiv Sena (united) candidate in the last elections. Adhalrao had won from the Shirur constituency as the Shiv Sena (united) nominee in the 2004, 2009 and 2014 elections.

SS (UBT) MP cites film scene to poke Maha CM, his son in Mumbai poll rally

Police register FIR against 3 persons over video on Hemant Karkare

The Navi Mumbai police have registered an FIR against three persons on charges of promoting enmity between different groups through a video on former Maharashtra ATS chief Hemant Karkare, an official said on Thursday, reported news agency.

The complainant, Suresh Rama Gaikwad (49) from Turbhe in Navi Mumbai, told the police that the accused made the video, 'Salute to Hemant Karkare (Based on true Event)', and posted it on YouTube which he saw on April 22.

The accused presented the video as if it was a true story while it was allegedly based on wrong information and showed that Brahmins resort to terrorist attacks and involve Muslims in false cases, the official from Turbhe police station said quoting the complaint filed on Wednesday.

Based on the complaint, the FIR was registered on Wednesday against three persons and their unnamed team members.

The case was registered under Indian Penal Code sections 153-A (promoting enmity between different groups), 295-A (deliberate and malicious acts, intended to outrage religious feelings of any class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs), 298 (uttering, words, etc, with deliberate intent to wound the religious feelings of any person) and 34 (acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention), the Navi Mumbai police police said.

Karkare was killed during the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks.

Parts of South Mumbai to face an 8-hour water cut on May 11

The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) announced on Friday that certain areas in South Mumbai will experience a water cut on Saturday, May 11. "Repair of a 1200 mm diameter water channel on Jeevan Bima Road in A Ward is scheduled for Saturday, May 11, 2024, from 3:30 PM to 11:30 PM. During the eight-hour repair period, water supply to Colaba, Koliwada, and the Naval area will be temporarily interrupted," said the civic body.

As per the BMC, a 1200 mm diameter main water line has developed a leak during the ongoing Metro 3 work on Jeevan Bima Road, Churchgate in the A Ward. Repair of this water channel is slated for Saturday, May 11, 2024, from 3:30 PM to 11:30 PM. Consequently, the water supply to Colaba, Koliwada, and the Naval area will be interrupted during this period. "Night supply to the Naval area will be delayed due to the repair work. We kindly request the cooperation of residents in the affected areas," stated the civic body.

"The 1200 mm diameter water pipe, utilised from Cross Maidan Tunnel to supply water to A Ward of the BMC, underwent inspection following reports of low pressure and reduced quantity of supply. It was discovered that the water channel had developed a leak during Metro 3 construction work near the Mantralaya Building on Jeevan Bima Road. The BMC's emergency repair department promptly assessed the situation. Immediate repair of the leak is necessary to prevent water wastage and potential road flooding. The repair work is estimated to take approximately 7 to 8 hours," added the BMC.

The civic body further stated that recognising the significance of the Mantralaya and Marine Drive areas, the BMC has collaborated with the Marine Drive Traffic Police and secured necessary permissions to



minimise traffic disruptions. "The Marine Drive Traffic Police has approved the repair of the water channel on Saturday. The Emergency Repair Department (ERC) will commence repair works from 9:00 AM, with excavation starting at that time. Following the pumping out of water from the channel, the actual repair work will begin at 3:30 PM. Water supply will resume during the morning and afternoon sessions for the respective areas," said the civic body.

"During the repair period from 3:30 PM to 11:30 PM, regular water supply to Colaba (4:30 PM to 6:30 PM), additional special water supply to Koliwada (6:30 PM to 6:45 PM), and extra special water supply to the Naval area will be completely suspended from 6:50 PM to 7:05 PM," added the civic body. The BMC has advised residents of Colaba, Koliwada, and the Naval area to store sufficient water in anticipation of the interrup-

In women's skeet, Raiza Dhillon (27th) was best placed Indian with a score of 114. Maheshwari Chauhan (20th) shot 113 while



Ganemat Sekhon (25th) was further back with a score of 111.

'Anything's possible in Paris Olympics': Neeraj Chopra expects three Indians to be in medal contention in javelin

The defending champion in Olympic Games javelin throw competition, Neeraj Chopra anticipates that three Indians will be in contention for medals in the upcoming Paris 2024. He emphasized the need for India to carry forward the belief from the World Championships in Budapest, where Indian throwers held three out of the top six in the final.

India's javelin stars will kick off the outdoor season in the Doha leg of the Diamond League season on May 10. Leading the challenge will be reigning world champion Chopra and his comrade-in-arm, Kishore Jena.

The events, including the Federation Cup in Bhubaneswar on May 14-15, leading to Paris 2024 will also evaluate the returns from some intense overseas training under top coaches.

Chopra and Jena, who produced a historic gold-silver finish at the Hangzhou Asian Games, have both qualified for the upcoming Summer Olympics in July-August, but Chopra believes a third javelin thrower, DP Manu, should make the Paris cut as well. "There was a time when I was not even sure of qualifying for a World Championship but see how times have changed. In Budapest last year, we had three Indians (out of the top six) in the finals and that has made us believe we are no less than the Europeans who have dominated world javelin for so long. We have to take this Budapest belief forward and in Paris anything is possible," Chopra told SAI Media. Manu is in line to join Chopra and Jena in Paris 2024. Manu is yet to breach the qualifying standard of 85.50 metres but is placed comfortably in the 11th spot in the Road to Paris rankings. That should be enough to earn him a ticket to

Paris unless several others pass him and he is unable to improve his own distance.

At the Indian Grand Prix I in Bengaluru recently, Manu won the men's javelin throw competition with an effort of 81.91m, a drift of the Paris Olympics qualification mark of 85.50m and his personal best of 84.35. He had been training in Potchefstroom, South Africa with his coach Kashinath Naik, a former Commonwealth Games bronze medalist. Leading up to the new outdoor season and until the Olympics, proper and intense training has been a top priority for the javelin throwers and all three - Chopra, Jena and Manu - have benefited from the government's Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS) that funds athletes to prepare and peak at global events, especially the Summer Games.

In the current Paris Olympics cycle, Government has spent more than Rs



4.87 cr on these three javelin throwers with Chopra receiving close to Rs 4 cr alone. The major expenses include training and competition related, equipment, coach's salary and out-of-pocket allowances.

Real Madrid complete dramatic comeback over Bayern Munich to book 18th Champions League final

Real Madrid, the undisputed kings of Europe took a step towards their 15th Champions League trophy after reaching its 18th final after beating Bayern Munich in a game filled with drama, late goals and controversy.

Substitute Joselu's late double took Real Madrid into their 18th final with an aggregate 4-3 win over Bayern Munich.

The 14-time winners produced memorable semifinal turnaround at the Estadio Santiago Bernabeu to set up a final against Borussia Dortmund at Wembley on June 1.

Two years ago, Real beat Manchester City, thanks to two late goals by Rodrygo, in what many deemed to be the greatest CL semifinals of all time and the Los Blancos have only gone ahead and done it again.

Unlike the first leg at the Allianz Arena, Madrid were on the front foot from the starting whistle try-



ing to carve their way past a valiant Bayern Munich defense. Vinicius Jr was once again lighting up the Bernabeu, keeping Joshua Kimmich very busy. Real's first big chance of the game came near the 13th minute mark when Vinicius Jr's attempt was pushed onto the post by Neuer who made an excellent double save, denying the rebound attempt by Rodrygo. After a cagey first half that ended 0-0, Santiago Bernabeu came alive in the second half. The LaLiga winners put on a flurry of attacks not

giving the German giants any breathing space. It looked as if the first goal was imminent but it was Bayern Munich's Alphonso Davies, who added his name to the scoresheet in the 68th minute thanks to a brilliant curling effort from the edge of the box that nestled into the back of Lunin's net.

Madrid answered back almost instantly scoring a goal from a corner in the 72nd minute but the goal was disallowed after a VAR check as Nacho, who was involved in the goal, could be seen fouling Kimmich during the build up.

Real Madrid is a club of dreams and it was an unlikely hero in Joselu, who made all the difference on the night. The former Stoke City man was subbed on in the 81st minute in a desperate attempt by Carlo Ancelotti to try and regain control in the game. It was not until the 88th minute when Manuel Neuer, who was having a world class game up until this moment spilled a shot by Vinicius Jr with Joselu smashing the rebound in the back of the net.

WTT Saudi Smash: Manika Batra knocked out in quarterfinals

Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH) batting star Travis Head 'never expected' the way he and along with fellow opener Abhishek Sharma chased down the total of 166 in 9.4 overs in the IPL 2024 match against Lucknow Super Giants (SRH) on Wednesday night at Rajiv Gandhi International Stadium.

Head smashed a 16-ball half-century with some astonishing display of cricketing shots and remained unbeaten on 89 off just 33 deliveries to guide his team home. He along with his opening duo Abhishek Sharma stitched up 166 runs opening partnership and hammered 107 runs in the powerplay in comparison to LSG's 27.

"I don't think we could have ever expected chasing it like that," acknowledged Head at the post-match press conference. "It looked like a tough wicket in the first innings, it looked like it was holding and a slow pitch. I guess, knowing that as a batter, you know that the powerplay is important. (We were) trying to maximise that and we played beautifully, we were able to get ahead of the rate, which is nice. And once we got going in the first two or three overs, it was just about trying to maximise that as much as we can and I felt we picked our targets and played very well," he said.

SRH obliterated LSG's challenge by first stifling them with the new ball and then launching a sensational chase of 166 in just 9.4 overs, the highest 10-over score in any T20. In all T20 cricket, only seven times 100 or more been scored in the powerplay, SRH have the two top scores, both in IPL 2024.

"You always want to perform, you always want to be con-



sistent, you always want to try and be doing the job; it's not going to always happen in T20 cricket (but) I felt the way we have been playing is great. We're going to have ups and downs, we've had that. Nice to be able to chase a score tonight after being put under pressure by them batting (first).

"A couple of times we've chased throughout the season, we've been put under pressure. To be able to do the job tonight, and chasing, (it feels great). Looking forward to the next two games being at home as well," said Head.

Head and Abhishek have combined for three century stands in the IPL with two of the, coming in the powerplay. SRH is the only side with more than one century opening stand in the IPL 2024.

"It's nice to just come here and contribute. I wasn't sure if I was going to play. Nice to get a go, nice to be performing, and the partnership with Abhi has been fantastic. He's such an exciting talent for Indian cricket, he's exceptional. We complement each other well and he's very, very enjoyable to be around. He's so excited and thinks about the game, he's got loads of energy, so he's a great partnership to be involved in," Head said of the opening stand before he added that the middle order has also played a key role for SRH. "I guess the Kings game (against Punjab Kings) is a blueprint for us in the way we're able to go about the game. It's not always going to work at the top of the order, we are going to lose wickets, but we want to be brave through the whole middle. Nitish [Reddy] has played some unbelievable innings, obviously we've got Klassy (Heinrich Klaasen) and (Abdul) Samad tops it off for us..."
