UNION BUDGET 2024: FM UNVEILS ROAD MAP FOR 'VIKSIT BHARAT'

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday presented her seventh straight Budget that would lay a roadmap for 'Viksit Bharat' by 2047, focusing on employment, skilling, agriculture and manufacturing. The first budget under Modi 3.0 seeks an economic vision that balances fiscal prudence. This is Prime Minister Narendra Modi government's 13th straight Budget since 2014, including two interim ones. The Union Budget focuses on supporting consumption via higher allocation for the rural economy, taxation reforms, infrastructure push, thrust on local manufacturing, job and skill creation and an increase in production-linked incentive (PLI) allocation to more labour-intensive sectors. In a major push to employment generation, the Finance Minister announced three schemes. "Government to set up three schemes for employment generation. Scheme for first-timers to provide one-month wage to all persons newly entering the workforce in all sectors. First-time employment scheme to benefit 2.1 crore lakh youths," said the FM. While presenting the Budget in the Lok Sabha, she said, "People of India have reposed their faith in the government led by PM Modi and re-elected it for a historic third term." She said the PM Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana was extended by five years, benefiting more than 80 crore people in the country. As the Modi government's focus is the farming community, the Finance Minister said, "New 109 high-yielding, climate-resilient varieties to be released to farmers. One crore farmers are to be initiated into natural farming over two years."

"This is a Budget that will take the country's villages, poor and farmers on the path of prosperity. In the last 10 years, 25 crore people have come out of poverty. This Budget is also a Budget for the continuation of the empowerment of the newly emerged Neo Middle Class."

Other highlights are:

- 10,000 need-based bio-input centres to be established
- Large-scale clusters for vegetable production are to be developed closer to consumption centres.
- Digital crop survey for Kharif to be taken up in 400 districts in FY25
- Rs 1.52 lakh crore will be set aside for agriculture, and allied sectors in FY25

What becomes cheaper?

- The government on Tuesday announced to reduce the basic customs duty (BCD) on mobile phones, printed circuit board assembly (PCBA) and mobile chargers to 15 per cent from the current 20 per cent.
- Products that are set to become cheaper include mobile phones, imported gold, silver, leather goods and seafood.
- The reduction in duties on gold and silver by 6 per cent will significantly give a fillip to the retail demand.
- FM Sitharaman also proposed a reduction in customs duties on platinum by 6.5 per cent and 5 per cent cut on seafood which includes shrimps and fish feed.

Income tax sops for 4 crore salaried individuals

The tax rate structure is to be revised as follows;

- 0-3 lakh rupee - Zero
- 3-7 lakh - 5 per cent
- 7-10 lakh - 10 per cent
- 10-12 lakh - 15 per cent
- 12-15 lakh - 20 per cent
- 15 lakh and above - 30 per cent

First, the standard deduction for salaried employees is proposed to be increased from Rs 50,000 to Rs 75,000.

Similarly, the deduction on family pension for pensioners is proposed to be enhanced from Rs 15,000 to Rs 25,000/-. This will provide relief to about four crore salaried individuals and pensioners.

Angel tax abolished on startups to boost local innovation

New Delhi: In a major relief for the startup ecosystem, the government on Tuesday announced to abolish angel tax to further boost local talent and innovation.

The industry had sought rationalisation of Angel Tax by removing Section 56(2)(viib) in order to further nurture innovation among startups, saying scrapping this section would "greatly aid in capital formation" for the startup sector. Under Section 56(2)(viib) of the Income Tax Act, to become eligible for angel tax exemption, a startup must meet certain conditions which the industry claims are cumbersome and come in the way of attracting more investments. Startups registered with the DPIIT were exempted from the new norms. The government highlighted that the exemption will benefit over 80,000 startups.

Over Rs 3 lakh crore for schemes benefiting women & girls

New Delhi: Focussing on women-led development, the government on Tuesday announced more than Rs 3 lakh crore for schemes benefiting women and girls.

"This will be facilitated by setting up hostels and creating partnerships to organise women-specific skilling programmes and promotion of market access for women Self Help Group enterprises," FM said. Further, the allocation for women's welfare and empowerment saw a 218.8 per cent jump from FY14 to FY25.

Major push to job creation with focus on youth, women & farmers

New Delhi: Finance Minister aimed at giving a major push to job creation with a focus on the country's youth, empowering women and improving the incomes of farmers. She announced a package of five schemes aimed at facilitating employment and skilling, with an allocation of Rs 2 lakh crore.

The budget has allocated as much as Rs 3 lakh crore in programmes that will enable more women to enter the workforce and contribute to the country's inclusive development aligned with the Viksit Bharat goal, the Finance Minister said. Similarly, a robust allocation of Rs 5.2 lakh crore has been made for the agriculture and allied sectors to enhance the earnings of farmers. The Finance Minister said that the government will undertake a comprehensive review of the agricultural research setup to increase productivity and develop climate-resilient varieties. Domain experts will oversee the conduct of this research to ensure its effectiveness and relevance. The PM Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana was extended for five years, benefiting more than 80 crore people. She said that job creation in the manufacturing sector will be incentivised through a scheme linked to the employment of first-time employees. The government will reimburse employers up to Rs 3,000 per month for two years towards EPFO contributions for each additional employee. This initiative aims to incentivise the additional employment of 50 lakh people.

First-timers will receive one month's wage upon entering the workforce in all formal sectors. A direct benefit transfer (DBT) of one month's salary, up to Rs 15,000, will be provided in three instalments. The eligibility limit for this benefit will be a salary of Rs 1 lakh per month, and it is expected to benefit 2.1 lakh youths.

To facilitate term loans for MSMEs for the purchase of machinery and equipment without collateral and guarantee, a new scheme will be introduced. This guarantee fund will provide guarantees of up to Rs 100 crore.

The Finance Minister further stated that under PM Awas Yojana, Urban 2.0, the housing needs of the urban poor and middle class will be addressed with an investment of Rs 10 lakh crore.

Defence allocation increased by 4.79 pc to Rs 6.22 lakh crore

New Delhi: The Union Budget 2024-25 has allocated Rs 6.22 lakh crore for the Ministry of Defence (MoD), the highest among all the ministries.

The allocation aims to promote 'Aatmanirbharta' in defence technology and manufacturing, and equip the armed forces with modern weapons/platforms along with the creation of job opportunities for the youth. The scheme enables the Defence Ministry to engage with startups/MSMEs and innovators to develop Def-Tech solutions and supply the Indian military with innovative and indigenous technological solutions. A grant of up to 50 per cent of Product Development Budget with an enhanced limit (maximum) of Rs 25 crore per applicant will be awarded as per the extant iDEX guidelines. The allocation to the MoD for FY 2024-25 is higher by approximately Rs 1 lakh crore (18.43 per cent) over the allocation for FY 2022-23 and 4.79 per cent more than the allocation for FY 2023-24.

8-point booster for MSMEs

New Delhi: In a booster for micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), the government on Tuesday formulated a detailed package that covers financing, regulatory changes and technology support for them to grow and also compete globally.

Among the measures are a credit guarantee scheme for facilitating term loans to MSMEs for purchase of machinery and equipment without collateral or third-party guarantee. The scheme will operate on pooling of credit risks of such MSMEs.

Giving more details, the Finance Minister said that a separately constituted self-financing guarantee fund will provide, to each applicant, a guarantee cover up to Rs 100 crore, while the loan amount may be larger.

The borrower will have to provide an upfront guarantee fee and an annual guarantee fee on the reducing loan balance.

The Finance Minister proposed that public sector banks (PSBs) will build their in-house capability to assess MSMEs for credit, instead of relying on external assessment. They will also take the lead in developing or getting developed a new credit assessment model, based on the scoring of digital footprints of MSMEs in the economy.

The Finance Minister proposed to enhance the limit of Mudra loans to Rs 20 lakh from the current Rs 10 lakh for those entrepreneurs who have availed and successfully repaid previous loans under the 'Tarun' category.

For facilitating MSMEs to unlock their working capital by converting their trade receivables into cash, FM Sitharaman proposed to reduce the turnover threshold of buyers for mandatory onboarding on the 'TReDS' platform from Rs 500 crore to Rs 250 crore.

FM gifts 2 Expressways to Bihar, allots Rs 15,000 cr for Andhra

New Delhi: Finance Minister announced landmark projects and also fund allocations in Bihar and Andhra Pradesh, the states whose ruling parties are allies with the BJP at the Centre.

The announcement is crucial because of both states' demand for special category status and special packages, post their bifurcation.

Also, Bihar's JD(U) and Andhra's TDP-Janaseena are BJP's ally partners at the Centre.

FM Sitharaman announced two major Expressways for Bihar, namely Patna-Purnia Expressway and Buxar-Bhagalpur Expressway.

Moreover, two land bridges over Ganga River will come up in Buxar District.

These projects, with a total cost of Rs 26,000 crore will give Bihar's road infrastructure a major facelift and open new avenues for growth.

FM Sitharaman also announced that new airports, medical colleges and sports infrastructure will be constructed in Bihar. Addressing the monetary concerns of Andhra Pradesh, she said that the government had made concerted efforts in recognising the state's need for capital, as per the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act.

To facilitate special financial support through multi-lateral developmental agencies a sum of Rs 15,000 crore will be arranged in the current fiscal, with additional outlays in future years.

Union Budget 2024: Govt to exempt three more cancer drugs from customs duty

New Delhi: In a big relief to cancer patients, Finance Minister exempted customs duty on three cancer drugs. The three drugs are Trastuzumab deruxtecan, Osimertinib and Durvalumab. The reduction in customs duty may help reduce the financial burden on those battling the deadly disease.

In her seventh budget speech, the Union Minister also called for exemptions in custom duties on X-ray tubes and flat panel detectors. According to the recent 4th edition of Apollo Hospitals' Health of Nation Report, cancer cases are skyrocketing across the country. He report dubbed India the "cancer capital of the world".

GST REDUCED TAX INCIDENCE ON COMMON MAN, TO BE EXPANDED TO REMAINING SECTORS

New Delhi: The Goods and Services Tax (GST) has decreased tax incidence on the common man, reduced compliance burden and logistics cost for trade and industry, and enhanced revenues of the Central and state governments. The Union Budget 2024-25 indicated that GST will be expanded to the remaining sectors. All the major taxpayer services under GST and most services under Customs and Income Tax have been digitised. India's gross GST collection rose to Rs 1.74 lakh crore in June this year representing a 7.7 per cent increase over the same month last year, according to sources. This takes the total GST mop-up for the first three months of the current financial year to Rs 5.57 lakh crore. In April 2023, GST collection had soared to a record high of Rs 1.87 lakh crore. According to experts, the GST reforms, which have eased compliance and reduced tax burdens, have been instrumental in driving economic growth.



Budget will steer India towards sustainable path: Experts

The Union Budget 2024-25 presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday included several key initiatives like energy transition pathways, climate finance, improving water resources management, and measures related to irrigation and flood management that will boost India's fight against impacts of climate change, say climate and energy experts.

While the budget lacked details on crucial announcements related to carbon pricing, the use of nuclear power or even how its plan the PM Awas Yojana Urban 2.0 will help build heat-resilient cities, they say.

It has focused on building capacity for each aspect of climate change: mitigation, adaptation and loss and damage.

With barely four months to go before the United Nations Climate Change Conference, commonly known as COP, will be held in Baku, Azerbaijan, here's a look at how the world's fifth-largest economy has prioritised in its national budget.

Under the mitigation category, the Budget introduces the Critical Mineral Mission to enhance domestic production,



recycling, and overseas acquisition of critical minerals necessary for various strategic sectors.

This mission will focus on technology development, workforce training, extended producer responsibility, and establishing financing mechanisms.

PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana: This initiative aims to install rooftop solar plants for one crore households, providing free electricity up to 300 units per month. The program, which has been allocated Rs 6,250 crore is expected to reduce reliance on non-renewable energy sources and promote renewable energy adoption.

Pumped storage projects: The government plans to promote pumped storage projects to facilitate electricity storage and manage the variable nature of renewable energy, ensuring a more stable integration into the power grid.

Nuclear energy development: The budget outlines plans to partner with the private sector in developing Bharat Small Reactors and Bharat Small Modular Reactors. It also includes research and development for new nuclear technologies, supported by government funding.



BUDGET WILL GIVE AMPLE OPPORTUNITY FOR PARALLEL GROWTH OF MP: CM

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav hailed Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman for the Budget on Tuesday.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented her seventh consecutive Union Budget on Tuesday.

She introduced increased standard deduction and revised tax rates for salaried individuals under the new tax regime and cut on customs duty on gold, silver, mobile phones and other goods were announced.

The Budget has the provision for employment-linked incentives, including one month's wage support for first-time employees, which has become the need of the hour.

Women-specific skillings programs and increased workforce participation, MSME and manufacturing support and some others are key points of the annual Budget.

MP gave 29 LS seats to BJP but got nothing in Budget: Congress

Madhya Pradesh Congress Chief Jitendra Patwari on Tuesday criticised the BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saying that the state gave all its 29 seats to the party but in return, they have failed its people.

"People in MP gave all 29 Lok Sabha seats to BJP but today when the annual Budget was announced, they feel betrayed," Jitendra Patwari said while addressing a press conference at party headquarters in Bhopal.

He said that during the elections (Assembly and Lok Sabha), to gain public support, the BJP gave a slogan - 'MP Ke Man Men Modi - Modi Ke Man Men MP', but there is nothing for the people of MP in the annual Budget presented by the Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman.

He also hit at Union Ministers Shivraj Singh Chouhan and Jyotiraditya Scindia, saying that despite being the top leaders of the state in PM Modi's government, they couldn't provide anything fruitful from the Budget for Madhya Pradesh.

He also alleged that the BJP tried to copy promises of the Congress' election manifesto. "They (BJP) tried to copy of Congress' manifesto, which is clearly visible in the Budget



announcement," Patwari said.

However, the MP BJP said that the annual Budget has a lot for the state which will help the growth of Madhya Pradesh, especially, the fund allocation for education, health, tourism and for tribals.

MP BJP Chief V. D. Sharma said that the state is the hub of tourism, which has got a lot in the budget. "State also has a step for regional industrialisation and the Centre's budget and policies will help to make it happen," he said.

Notably, the BJP won all 29 Lok Sabha seats in Madhya Pradesh on June 4 six months after it returned to power in the state by winning 163 out of 230 assembly seats in November last year.

An elderly man committed suicide by shooting himself with a licensed gun in Indore

Late last night in Indore, Madhya Pradesh, an elderly man committed suicide by shooting himself with his licensed gun. The reason for suicide has not been revealed. The police is investigating the case.

According to information received from the police, Vijay Shukla (65), resident of Vijayanagar police station area, committed suicide by shooting himself with his licensed gun late on Monday night. The old man shot himself with a 12 bore rifle while lying on his bed.

This incident happened at around 1 o'clock in the night. The old man died on the spot as soon as he was shot. The police took the body into custody and sent it for post-mortem.



Vijayanagar police is investigating the matter. However, the reason behind the suicide is not yet known. Before shooting himself, Vijay Shukla had also sent a message to his daughter on her mobile. There has been no official confirmation of sending the message.

It is being told that Vijay Shukla used to run a security

agency some time ago. His wife passed away about six years ago. He has two sons and four daughters. Elderly Vijay Shukla lived with the family of one of his sons. After hearing the sound of the bullet, everyone reached his room. His condition was very serious. However, he died just then. The police is investigating the matter.

Railway administration has decided to add four permanent coaches of third AC category in Lucknow-Bhopal-Lucknow and Lucknow-Raipur-Lucknow-Garibath Express with the aim of clearing additional passenger traffic and waiting list.

Four third air-conditioned permanent class coaches will be added to train number 12593 Lucknow-Bhopal-Garibath Express from 27 July 2024 and to train number 12594 Bhopal-Lucknow-Garibath Express from 28 July 2024. These trains operate via Vidisha and Bina.

Similarly, four third air-conditioned permanent class



coaches will be added to train number 12535 Lucknow-Raipur-Garibath Express from 29 July 2024 and train number 12536 Raipur-Lucknow-Garibath Express from 30 July 2024. These trains will reach their destination via Katni and Satna. After the change in coach

composition, both trains will have a total of 16 coaches including 14 air-conditioned third class coaches and 2 generator cars. Passengers are advised to obtain information at railway stations, Rail Madad 139 or online to avail this additional facility.

Bhopal: GRP police station Bina exposed blind murder and arrested two accused

GRP police station Bina has revealed the blind murder in a short time and arrested two accused. A written memo was presented at the police station by Deputy Station Master Beena, in which the body of an unidentified person was found near the railway line.

The police team that reached the spot examined the body and found that the deceased had serious injuries on his head and face. Blood stained soil, concrete stone and a piece of iron from the railway line were recovered from the spot.

The deceased was identified as Buddha alias Asaram Ahirwar. His family members told that due to old rivalry, Shaukat Ali's family members killed Buddha. Police started investigating the case and found that the deceased died due to injury on his head with a solid object.

During investigation, information was received from the



informer that murder accused Azhar and Deepak Raikwar were hiding on Kurwai Road. The police team reached the spot and arrested both the accused. During interrogation, both of them confessed to the mur-

der and the ax used in the murder was recovered.

In this action, station in-charge Babita Katheria and her team played a commendable role. The accused were presented in the Honorable Court.

Approval for amendment in IT/ITES/ESDM Investment Promotion Policy-2023

The State Cabinet, which met here today under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav at Mantralaya gave approval for amendment in Madhya Pradesh IT, ITES, and ESDM Investment Promotion Policy-2023 to encourage investment in the IT/ITES/ESDM data sector.

The amendment will enable investors units to get the benefits of Madhya Pradesh IT, ITES, and ESDM Investment Promotion Policy-2023. Eligible investor units will be able to get single window clearance, assistance in capital expenditure and rent, land at affordable rates, exemption in stamp duty and registry, and assistance in marketing and quality control. Guidelines have been issued for the implementation of the policy. Paragraph 17 has been amended to provide the benefits of the policy to eligible units. The Cabinet has approved five temporary posts for the



Local Election Office in District Niwari for the period from March 1, 2024, to February 28, 2025. These posts include Deputy District President (Local Elections), Assistant Superintendent (Local Elections), Accountant cum Upper Division Clerk (Local Elections), Lower Division Clerk (Local Elections) and Data Entry Operator (Contract).

In order to follow social distancing and other precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (Corona virus),

the Council of Ministers will provide three months of free food grains from April 2021 to June 2021 to the eligible beneficiaries covered under the National Food Security Act 2013. The distribution instructions and expenditure amount of Rs 75 crore 93 lakh 53 thousand 830 were ratified.

The Cabinet has approved the creation of new tehsil Dhundhka in Mandsaur district. A total of 26 Patwari Halke will be included in the P.H. N 31 to 40, 42 and 47 to 61 of the

present tehsil Mandsaur (Rural) in the new tehsil Dhundhka. After the formation of Tehsil Dhundhka, the remaining P.H.N 01 to 30, 41 and 43 to 46 totalling 35 Patwari Halkas will be included. For the smooth operation of the new Tehsil Dhundhka, one Tehsildar, 2 Naib Tehsildars, two Assistant Grade 2, 04 Assistant Grade 3, 3 Assistant Grade-3 (Producer), 1 Jamadar/Daftari/Bastawardar, 1 driver, 6 of peons, thus a total of 20 posts have been sanctioned.

Strengthening of 7 regional offices of the Higher Education Department approved The Cabinet has approved an additional 91 posts and Rs 7 crore 46 lakh for strengthening 7 regional offices run under the Higher Education Department. In this, approval was given for the annual recurring expenditure of Rs 6 crore 41 lakh and non-recurring expenditure of Rs 1 crore 5 lakh on the scheme including resources and vehicle arrangements.

Union Budget 2024-25: At a glance

Due to the upcoming general elections in 2024, a full Union Budget wasn't presented. Instead, an Interim Budget was delivered in February 2024 by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. This Interim Budget focused on maintaining economic stability and providing some key benefits in the lead-up to the elections. The phrasing likely emphasized the government's commitment to ongoing programs and initiatives, highlighting their achievements in the previous year. Populist Measures: benefits for specific demographics, like farmers, small businesses, or students. Considering global economic uncertainties, the phrasing might have balanced these social welfare measures with a commitment to fiscal responsibility. The budget speech could have outlined plans for continued investment in infrastructure development projects to boost long-term economic growth. Vision for the Future: While focused on the immediate needs of the pre-election year, the phrasing might have hinted at the government's broader economic vision for the coming term. Overall, the phraseology of the Union Budget 2024 would likely strike a balance between short-term social welfare and long-term economic goals, keeping the upcoming elections in mind. Congress party leaders have alleged Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman plagiarised the apprenticeship scheme from the party's general election manifesto. Taking a swipe at the announcement, Congress leader and former Union Finance Minister P Chidambaram in a post on X said he wished the Finance Minister "had copied some other ideas from the Congress manifesto."

A Trump-Vance Team Is A Nightmare For Europe

President Joe Biden's decision to drop out of the presidential race on Sunday has left everyone guessing who his replacement will be. He has backed his Vice-President, half-Indian Kamala Harris. But it's unclear at this stage whether she will indeed be the party's nominee. The Democratic Party convention next month in Chicago (August 19-22) is going to be a tumultuous one. But it is believed the party delegates might just endorse Harris before that. The endorsement at the convention will become a mere formality by then. Not since Lyndon Baines Johnson in 1968 has any Presidential candidate dropped out of a re-election campaign. The Democratic Party appears to be in disarray. If Harris becomes the party's presidential nominee, will she be able to take on Donald Trump, who is riding on a sympathy wave since his brush with death last week? Many say the selection of Harris will be music to Trump's ear. Two days after the assassination attempt, the latter announced that J.D. Vance would be his running mate. The Trump-Vance team will be too hot to handle for any Democratic Party candidate, who will have no time on his or her side to give a tough fight to the duo. This might make Europe even more despondent because the last thing the Europeans want to see is the return of Trump, and his deputy becoming the Vice President. In his poem The Second Coming, William Butler Yeats questions whether humanity is on the brink of a revelation or heading towards further devastation. His angst is reflected in these famous words: "Things fall apart, the centre cannot hold; mere anarchy is loosed upon the world..." They captured the dark mood prevailing across a war-torn Europe, symbolised by the ominous image of a "rough beast slouching towards Bethlehem to be born". Yeats's Europe was reeling from the aftermath of the First World War. Today's Europe is gripped by a similar sense of unease and chaos as the Russian onslaught in Ukraine continues to rage with no peace deal in sight. On top of that, Europe's anxiety and fear over Trump's potential return to power, especially with Vance, appears to be at its peak. The parallels between the post-war disarray that inspired Yeats to write The Second Coming and the current commotions in Europe cannot be overstated. The prospect of a second coming of Trump was already troubling Europe's globalised, liberal world order. But the entry of Vance, a 39-year-old first-term senator from Ohio, has pushed Europeans to the edge. The possibility

ty of Vance becoming the US Vice-President and potentially succeeding Trump as President later has raised huge concerns in Europe. Vance shot to fame in 2016 with his memoir, Hillbilly Elegy, which depicted his upbringing in a struggling working-class family in the 'Rust Belt'. The book, which was later adapted as a Netflix drama, is both a personal story and a sociological analysis of the white working-class experience in America. Vance's narrative resonated with many Americans, particularly those who felt left behind by globalisation and economic change. Vance is married to Usha Chilukuri, who is of Indian descent and a practising Hindu. They met at Yale Law School and got married in 2014. He is believed to have been influenced by his wife's Hindu faith, but not enough to prevent him from converting to Catholicism in 2019. In his early years as a politician, Vance called Trump "America's Hitler". But later, he completely surrendered to Trumpism. Vance, with a working-class background, is from Ohio and has considerable influence in the "Rust Belt" states that were once industrialised and manufacturing hubs. Trump has said in one of his social media posts that his running mate "will be strongly focused on the people he fought so brilliantly for, the American workers and farmers in Pennsylvania, Michigan, Wisconsin, Ohio, Minnesota, and far beyond". But Vance's influence in the "Rust Belt" region was not the only reason he was picked. His views on globalisation, immigration, NATO, and China complement those of Trump. He is being seen more as an heir apparent to Trump, considering he is not even 40. Indians may like to see Harris win the nomination, because of her Indian connection. But Europe will certainly pin all its hope on her and pray that she comes out victorious in the November election. After winning the election nearly four years ago, one of the first things President Biden did was declare to the world that "America is back". Biden was referring to the US reasserting its leadership role on the global stage, particularly after the decline of US influence during the Trump administration. If the Trump-Vance team wins the election - which now seems likely - Europe fears that the US would once again abandon its global leadership role. Trump has previously advocated for a more isolationist and nationalist approach, prioritising American interests over international cooperation and multilateral agreements. In Hillbilly Elegy, Vance has echoed similar views on these issues.

A reduced role for the US leader on the global stage could mean less engagement in international institutions and agreements, more focus on bilateral deals and transactions, reduced commitment to global issues such as climate change and human rights, increased emphasis on national sovereignty and border control, and potential withdrawal from or renegotiation of international agreements. Europe believes that the Trump-Vance administration will pursue a peace deal with Russia, which could have significant implications for the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. Vance's views on Ukraine suggest he may prioritise a peace deal over supporting Ukraine's territorial integrity. Specifically, he has stated that Ukraine should abandon its claims over the land captured by Putin, which could be seen as a concession to Russia. He said in a 2022 interview with an American portal, "The Ukrainians have to make some hard decisions about what they're willing to give up in order to get a peace deal. And if that means giving up some territory, that's what they're going to have to do." However, Europeans were aghast to hear his views, and now that he is Trump's running mate, they appear to be more alarmed. They vehemently argue that such concessions would embolden the Russians to invade other European countries, such as Poland. Trump, too, openly said during the first presidential debate that the war was draining out the US economy, that Putin was his friend, and that he would end the war soon after assuming office. Europe is apprehensive that a Trump-Vance team could further this agenda, potentially weakening the alliance and reducing American influence in global security matters. Vance, like Trump, is also against foreign aid. It is likely their administration might cut foreign aid and reduce participation in international development programmes, and that is bound to impact global stability and humanitarian efforts. Both Trump and Vance have expressed strong support for protectionist economic policies. This could lead to higher tariffs on imported goods, renegotiation or withdrawal from international trade agreements, and a general reduction in global trade. Vance in his book laid huge emphasis on domestic production. He has held on to his views and they appear to be more than just rhetoric. His focus on boosting domestic production and reducing dependency on foreign manufacturing aligns with the broader nationalist agenda that Trump pursues. This could lead to a

more insular US economy, potentially sparking trade wars and reducing global economic integration. Protectionist policies could lead to retaliatory tariffs from other countries, sparking trade wars that harm the global economy. Efforts to bring manufacturing back to the US could disrupt global supply chains, leading to economic instability and higher prices for consumers. The Trump administration was known for its unilateral approach to foreign policy, often bypassing traditional diplomatic channels and international agreements. Biden's foreign policy, in contrast, is based on consensus politics. For example, Biden has worked on building coalition partners to counter China's rise. This has proven more effective than Trump's unilateral actions. The fear is that a Trump-Vance team might continue this trend, undermining multilateral institutions like the United Nations and the World Trade Organization. As President, Trump had withdrawn the US from the Paris Climate Agreement, arguing it was unfair to American workers. Although Biden rejoined the agreement, a Trump-Vance administration could once again ditch the pact, significantly weakening global efforts to combat climate change. I have never seen Europe so worried before. Many leaders are already gearing up for a four-year "disruption and chaos". A few governments are already reaching out to the Trump camp, while others are struck by inertia and have accepted their fate. There is, however, one notable exception to this brooding atmosphere. Hungary is the only European country, also a NATO member, which has openly welcomed Trump's second coming. The Hungarian Prime Minister, Viktor Orban, who is on a peace mission in Europe, said last week in a letter to European leaders that Donald Trump had a plan and he was prepared to immediately negotiate for peace in Ukraine if he won the election. But at what cost? That weighs heavily on everyone's mind here in Europe. (Syed Zubair Ahmed is a London-based senior Indian journalist with three decades of experience with the Western media. ANOTHER HINDU TEMPLE IN CANADA VANDALISED, MP CALLS FOR ACTION

Toronto | New York

A Hindu temple in Alberta's capital Edmonton was vandalised with "hateful graffiti" on Tuesday. This incident adds to the series of attacks that have happened recently on Hindu establishments in Canada. Canadian Member of Parliament Chandra Arya took to X to express his concern over BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir that was defaced. He wrote: "During the last few years, Hindu temples in Greater Toronto Area, British Columbia and other places in Canada are being vandalised with hateful graffiti." Drawing attention to the extremist elements instigating such incidents, the Liberal MP, known for his advocacy on multicultural issues, highlighted that "Gurpatwant Singh Pannun of Sikhs for Justice last year publicly called for Hindus to go back to India. Khalistan supporters publicly celebrated in Brampton and Vancouver the assassination of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi,



brandishing images of deadly weapons." "As I have always been saying, Khalistani extremists seem to get away with ease with their public rhetoric of hate and violence," he asserted, adding: "Again, let me put on record. Hindu-Canadians are legitimately concerned." With a picture of the defaced temple wall, he concluded his post by urging: "Like a broken record, I again call on Canadian law enforcement agencies to take this issue seriously before these rhetorics get translated into physical action against Hindu-Canadians." The vandalised temple wall reads: "PM Modi MP Arya Hindu Terrorists are Anti-Canada."

Last year in November, Canada-India Foundation, an advocacy body, had asked politicians in the country to break their silence and rein in radicals before it got too late. However, Canadian politicians and media ignored the threat. In response to the situation, they had expressed in an open letter: "We are even more disappointed that our political leaders have maintained a total silence on this grave issue. This selective approach to dealing with terrorism and threats will not make this world a safe place." In recent times, vandalised Hindu temples include Ram Mandir in Mississauga, Vishnu Mandir in Richmond Hill, BAPS Swaminarayan Temple in Toronto, Lakshmi Narayan Mandir in Surrey. These attacks are viewed as attacks on the freedom of religion and are perceived as a dangerous trend. The advocacy body also highlighted that the extremists have started to even target ordinary Hindus, telling them to leave Canada.

DEATH TOLL IN ETHIOPIAN LANDSLIDE RISES TO 157

Addis Ababa: A landslide in southern Ethiopia has claimed more than 157 lives, the local government said on Tuesday. The landslide occurred on Monday in southern Ethiopia's Geze Gofa district, Xinhua news agency reported. The local community is currently working to save the lives of the injured and provide shelter and food to the victims, the Gofa Zone Government Communication Affairs Department said in a statement. The death toll has increased due to additional accidents involving people who went to the area for life-saving work. Some teachers, health workers, and agriculture professionals who were present for the rescue work have become victims of the accident, the local government said. Ethiopian Red Cross Association and professionals from the neighbouring regions and zones are at the site helping the victims. The local government has called on all Ethiopians to provide support and attention needed to the zone for further rescue efforts.

Kamala Harris calls Biden's achievements 'unmatched' in first remarks

US President Joe Biden's legacy of achievements was "unmatched" in modern history, Vice-President Kamala Harris said Monday in her first public remarks after taking over the presidential ticket from him. Harris addressed student athlete champions from American colleges on the South Lawns of the White House, standing in for Biden who is recovering from a Covid-19 infection at one of his homes in Delaware. It was from there that he announced on Sunday that he was ending his bid for re-election and endorsing Harris, who has since taken over the ticket and is moving swiftly to lock the nomination. "Joe Biden's legacy of accomplishment over the past three years is unmatched in modern history," Harris said, adding, "In one term, he has already surpassed the legacy of most presidents who have served two terms in office." Harris recounted her own personal journey with President Biden, which started with her friendship with his late son Beau Biden. Harris got to know him

as Attorneys General for California and Delaware, respectively. "Back then, Beau would often tell me stories about his dad. He would talk about the kind of father and the kind of man that Joe Biden is. The qualities that he revered in his father, at the same qualities that I have seen every day in our President, his honesty, his integrity, his commitment to his faith and his family, his big heart, and his deep love of our country. And I am a first-hand witness to that every day. Our President Joe Biden fights for the American people and we are deeply grateful for his service to our nation," she said. Harris is running on the achievements of the three and half years of the Biden-Harris administration and although the President is out of the race, ousted by the party for his perceived inability to defeat his Republican rival, former President Donald Trump, triggered by his disastrous performance in the first presidential debate late June, she has embraced the administration's achievements. The Republicans will make sure they tie her up to its failures as they intend to.

59 DETAINED FOR DRUG TRAFFICKING IN TURKEY; 1.2 TONNES NARCOTICS SEIZED

The police in Turkey have detained 59 suspects for manufacturing and trafficking drugs in operations across the country, Interior Minister Ali Yerlikaya said on Tuesday. The security forces seized more than 1.2 tonnes of narcotics, 13.6 million roots of hemp, and more than 2 million narcotic pills in raids across 16 provinces, Yerlikaya wrote on X, without specifying the time frame of the operations, Xinhua news agency reported. The police teams carried out the raids with the support of aerial vehicles and narcotic detector dogs, he added.



"We are determined to rid our country of poison dealers and street vendors," Yerlikaya said. Turkey, often used by illegal drug dealers as a transit hub, has ramped up its crackdown on drug smuggling since last year. In mid-July, Turkish police detained 396 suspects for manufacturing and trafficking drugs in operations across the country, seizing more than 1.7 tonnes of narcotics and 1.18 million narcotic pills in raids carried out across 57 provinces.

EVACUATION ORDERED FROM GAZA 'HUMANITARIAN ZONE': UN

A new evacuation order for parts of Gaza, including from parts of a "humanitarian zone," reportedly is forcing families into overcrowded, sparse shelter areas, UN humanitarian said. The UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) on Monday said it received initial reports that families are starting to flee toward Deir al Balah and western Khan Younis, following Israeli military evacuation orders. Both areas are already heavily overcrowded, with limited services and shelter spaces available, Xinhua news agency reported. OCHA said the latest evacuation order includes areas located in the eastern part of what had been designated by the Israeli military and described as a "humanitarian zone" in Khan Younis. OCHA said relentless hostilities and frequent evacuation orders are further devastating Gaza's health system, making it increasingly difficult for people repeatedly displaced to access essential services. In

the latest challenge for the health system, Nasser Medical Complex in Khan Younis has issued a new call for people to donate blood, with reports the facility received dozens of casualties on Monday. The UN Relief Agency for Palestinians, known as UNRWA, reported that Israeli forces shot at a UN convoy heading to Gaza City on Sunday. UNRWA Commissioner-General Philippe Lazzarini said there were no casualties, but UNRWA's teams, travelling in clearly marked UN armoured cars and wearing UN vests, had to take cover. He said one vehicle was severely damaged while waiting near the Israeli forces' checkpoint south of Wadi Gaza. That vehicle left the convoy. After the teams re-assembled, they were able to reach Gaza City. Lazzarini said the convoy's movement was coordinated with the Israeli authorities. He said those responsible for the incident must be held accountable. "It is extremely worrying," said Stephane Dujarric, chief spokesman for UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres. "We have seen an unprece-



dent number of colleagues have been killed in this operation. We have seen what happened to the World Central Kitchen (WCK). We need to get to the bottom of this, and this also comes within the context of some very harsh words by a number of Israeli officials regarding UNRWA." Israeli officials have repeatedly accused UNRWA employees of taking part in the deadly October 7 Hamas attack on Israelis.

Seven WCK employees were killed in an April Israeli drone attack on their convoy, previously cleared by authorities. "As always, wherever we operate, we operate under the protection of the authorities of where we work," Dujarric told correspondents at a regular briefing. The United Nations in Gaza is not armed. We do not have armed security with us. It is incumbent on all the parties in this conflict to ensure the protection of

the UN and all humanitarian workers." He said humanitarian operations in Gaza will continue. "Our humanitarian partners report that people in Gaza continue to face severe water shortages," OCHA said. "Between July 8-21, the daily average water supply was about 90,000 cubic meters, about a quarter of the amount produced before October of last year." Damage to infrastructure, the lack of electricity and shortages of fuel, spare parts and chlorine continue to hamper water production, purification and sewage pumping. This is despite some improvements, including the installation of a solar-powered desalination plant in Deir al Balah, with the support of the UN Children's Fund (UNICEF). The fund reported that, on average, one Palestinian child was killed every two days in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, since October. UNICEF Executive Director Catherine Russell said the situation has deteriorated significantly, coinciding with the escalation of hostilities inside Gaza.



Eminem grabs top spot on Billboard 200, Taylor Swift on 4th spot

Singer-songwriter Taylor Swift, who had been on the Number 1 spot on the Billboard 200 since the release of her album 'The Tortured Poets Department', has now been replaced by Rap icon Eminem for the top spot. Eminem has grabbed the top spot courtesy of his album 'The Death of Slim Shady (Coup de Grace)', reports Variety. 'The Death of Slim Shady' marks Eminem's 12th album, and opened at the top of the all-genre-inclusive chart with the equivalent of 281,000 album units in the United States. As per Variety, it also logs 220 million streams and 114,000 sales, the data is provided by Luminate. Eminem first announced the album during the NFL Draft in April, and later published an obituary in the Detroit Free Press bidding adieu to Slim Shady, his career-long alter ego that he's played as a character in his songs and in videos. The LP is Eminem's first record since 'Music to Be Murdered By,' a January 2020 release. 'The Death of Slim Shady (Coup de Grace)' is Eminem's eleventh album to reach the Number 1 spot, a figure that puts him in a tie with Bruce Springsteen, Barbra Streisand and Ye (Kanye West). Swift's 'The Tortured Poets Department,' meanwhile, slipped to Number 4 following a record-breaking 12-week streak at No. 1. It held the post with unrivalled availability in variants — multiple different vinyl, CD or cassette versions of an already-released album or EP — that were released across numerous weeks.

CHRIS BROWN SUED FOR \$50 MILLION OVER ALLEGED BACKSTAGE ASSAULT

Singer-songwriter Chris Brown has been slapped with a legal action for his alleged misdemeanor. He has been sued for \$50 million in connection with an incident that took place backstage at one of his concerts, reports Variety. Larry Parker, Joseph Lewis, Charles Bush and Da Marcus Powell filed the suit in Harris County, Texas, on Tuesday against Brown as well as his tour promoter Live Nation, Sinko Ceej, Hood Boss and Yella Beezy. In addition to the payment, the four plaintiffs are asking for a temporary restraining order against all defendants. According to the complaint, which was first reported by TMZ and accessed by Variety, Brown and his crew severely beat the plaintiffs following the singer's performance as part of his 11:11 Tour at Dickies Arena in Fort Worth, Texas. As per Variety, the four men were



invited backstage to meet Brown, who showed up 30 minutes later than anticipated. Before leaving, Bush approached Brown to congratulate him on the show, prompting a member of the singer's entourage to remind Brown that the two previously had issues. Brown allegedly said, "Oh yeah, we were. What's up, n****? I don't forget shit." The suit states that Brown and seven to 10 members of his entourage proceeded to assault Bush and punch him in the chest, and claims that Hood Boss picked up a chair and threw it at Bush's head.

Andy Murray to retire after Paris Olympics

Former World No. 1 Andy Murray confirmed he will retire from tennis after the 2024 Paris Olympics via a social media post on Tuesday.

The 37-year-old Scot, who made his first Olympic appearance in the Beijing Games in 2008, is planning to play in the singles and doubles in Paris, which will be his fifth Games.

"Arrived in Paris for my last ever tennis tournament," Murray wrote on X.

"Competing for Team GB has been by far the most memorable weeks of my career and I'm extremely proud to get to do it one final time!" he added.

The Briton bagged his first Olympic singles gold in the 2012 London Olympics, where he defeated Swiss legend Roger Federer in straight games.

In Rio 2016 Games, he



became the first male tennis player to win two Olympic singles gold medal, when he beat Argentina's Juan Martin del Potro.

The tennis action in Paris begins at Roland Garros on July 27 and concludes on August 4, with medal rounds being played from August 2.

Women's Asia Cup: Clinical India seal semis berth with commanding 82-run win over Nepal

Things turned from bad to worse



for Nepal in the 14th over as they lost Rubina Chetry (15) and Kabita Joshi (0) in the span of three balls off Deepthi Sharma. Nepal failed to recover in time and went on to lose wickets at regular intervals and finished their innings for 96/9 in 20 overs. For India, Deepthi returned with the figures of 3-13 in her four overs while Reddy and Radha bagged two scalps each.

Earlier, Shafali Verma's scintillating half-century (81 off 47 balls) coupled with Dayalan Hemalatha's 47 powered India to 178/3 after opting to bat first.

Shafali and Hemalatha showed no mercy from the beginning of the

match. The 20-year-old made her intentions clear in the first over by hitting two fours against Kabita Kumwar's first over. She continued the onslaught from the one end while Hemalatha held the other end strong.

Paris Olympics: Australian water polo player tests Covid-19 positive

An Australian water polo player has been isolated at the Paris Games following a positive Covid-19 test, as confirmed by the country's Olympic team chief, Anna Meares, on Tuesday. The athlete's name has not been disclosed, but close contacts are being closely monitored and tested to prevent any further spread of the virus. Despite this setback, the team continues its training as planned.

The Tokyo 2020 Olympics were delayed by a year due to the pandemic and were held with limited spectators. However, the current approach to managing Covid-19 is more measured.

"We were due to have two players from water polo with us; however, currently, we have had one athlete from their team isolating with COVID, which was detected last night," Meares stated during a news conference.

"As a precaution, they're not joining us this morning. I must emphasise that



we treat Covid no differently than other bugs like the flu. This is not Tokyo. The athlete is not particularly unwell and is still training but sleeping in a single room."

Meares also highlighted that the athlete's teammates would wear masks and adhere to social distancing measures to mitigate any risk of further spread.

"It was late last night when she presented with symptoms, and the good

thing is that having our own testing equipment means that we can get that information really quickly and intervene both in diagnosis and treatment," she added.

Regarding the athlete's participation in future competitions, Meares stated, "We will wait until she gets the all-clear and we get the information from our chief medical officer, Carolyn Broderick."

French Health Minister Frederic Valletoux has reassured the public that there is no significant risk of a major Covid cluster in France. "Of course, Covid is here. We've seen a small peak in cases," he told the Franceinfo broadcaster. "But we are far from what we saw in 2020, 2021, 2022."

Valletoux added that there is no current obligation to wear a mask, as the number of cases remains low. "Some precautions are being taken but, because the level at which Covid is spreading is very low, they depend on the organizers."
