Messi, England, Djokovic eye history on blockbuster Sunday

CLASH OF TITANS

Sunday, July 11, is a day of blockbusters as sports fans will find little time off their screens while witnessing what could turn out to be important events in sporting history.

EURO 2020 FINAL: ENGLAND VS ITALY

While the Copa final will start the day, the Euro 2020 final between England and Italy will wind up the day as England will look for their first ever major international trophy in football since the 1966 World Cup. They face Italy at the iconic Wembley Stadium in London in front of their home crowd. In fact, this will be their first-ever final at a major football tournament since 1966. England's best at the Euros have been semi-final finishes in 1968 and 1996, when they hosted the event. English fans have been mentioning "It's coming home" on social media since the last three years. They were in the running to win the 2018 World Cup. But they lost the 2018 World Cup semi-final to Croatia. Their opponents Italy have won the Euro in 1968 and finished runner-up twice, in 2000 and 2012. They've also been world champions as recently as 2006.

COPA AMERICA FINAL: ARGENTINA VS BRAZIL

Argentina's Lionel Messi, who has earned honours at Barcelona to become one of the two best footballers of this era alongside Cristiano Ronaldo, is yet to win a major trophy in national colours. On Sunday morning, he will lead Albiceleste in the Copa America final against arch-rivals Brazil in Rio de Janeiro's iconic Maracana Stadium. Despite his legendary status, Messi has had near-misses with Argentina team and has often fallen at the last hurdle. He lost the Copa final in 2007, 2015, 2016 as well as the World Cup final in 2014. In fact, the 2016 Copa America final loss was too tough to bear for Messi, who announced his retirement after missing a penalty in the shoot-out in the final against Chile. But this is the chance to redeem himself. His closest rival at international stage, Ronaldo, has won European Championships with Portugal as well as club trophies to stay a step ahead of him.

Karnataka farmer files plaint

Well, find the well

In a rarest of rare event, a farmer had to lodge a complaint to various authorities, including the police, to search out a sanctioned well in his agricultural land, which apparently "very much exists" on paper but is nowhere to be seen. Mallappa Ramappa Kalagude, a resident of Maavinhonda village in Rayabagh taluk of north Karnataka has alleged in his

complaint lodged on July 3, that officers have even sanctioned a bill amount of Rs 77,000 for the construction of the well under the NAREGA scheme in his farmland. After collecting details and fake bills on the construction of the well, Mallappa has complained about it to Raibagh police, ZP CEO, Taluk Panchayat CEO and Ombudsman officer. In his complaint, he has urged them to find out the well constructed by the govern-

ment. Mallappa explained that the bill was raised in his name to construct the well and the money was taken between April 0, 2020, and May 13, 2021. "There is only one well which exists for 40 years in my land. The officers have to find out the well which they constructed now," he adds. When contacted PDO Sadashiva said that he assumed charge only a week back and this incident was not in his knowledge.

SAAD THE NEW 'GHATAK' OF BENGALI CINEMA

Abdullah Mohammed Saad is billed as the new enfant terrible of Bengali cinema, whose films can leave viewers unsettled emotionally and madly appreciative in admiration. He resembles the great Ritwick Ghatak whose Partition themed films would make Bengalis across generations cry and weep, even react violently and leave all with deeply unsettling questions. Saad's "Rehana Maryam Noor", a 107-minutes emotional drama and a woman's emotional turmoil received huge ovation at 74th Cannes Film Festival on July 7. Khadi secures trademark registrations in Bhutan, UAE, Mexico

Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) has secured trademark registrations in Bhutan, UAE and Mexico -- a big stride towards protecting the identity of brand "Khadi" globally, the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises said on Saturday. Besides, the KVIC's trademark applications are pending in 40 countries across the world that include the US,

While KVIC obtained the latest trademark registration in Bhutan on Friday, trademark registration was grant-

ed in UAE on June 28. With this, KVIC has succeeded in securing trademark registration for the first time in a Gulf country. Earlier, KVIC got the trademark registration for "Khadi" in Mexico in

December 2020. The development assumes great significance as there have been instances of some private local entities in countries like Mexico and Germany seeking trademark registration for brand name "Khadi" in their respective countries. In Mexico, KVIC challenged the trademark application of "One Foundation Oaxaca Ac" which had applied for the "Khadi" logo. However, the firm did not challenge KVIC's objections and trademark registration for the word "Khadi" and

Surge in optimism as tourist arrivals rise in Kashmir

For the first time since the beginning of the year, tourist footfalls have started going up in Kashmir, raising hopes all over again in the local hospitality industry. Tourists can be seen lining up at the ticketing counters of the historic gardens of Srinagar -- Mughal, Nishat, Shalimar and Chasmashahi. Elsewhere, too, the hospitality industry had reasons to celebrate. "It now takes over an hour to cross the Wayil Bridge on the Srinagar-Leh highway in the evenings," said Jan Mohammad, who runs a restaurant near this famous bridge. "Vehicles returning with tourists from Sonamarg are lined up on the northern side of



this narrow bridge waiting for their turn to cross over," he said. Shikarawallahs, who earn their livelihood taking visitors across Dal Lake on joy rides, have started getting their first customers this year. "There has been a gradual increase in the number of tourists coming to visit Dal Lake," confirmed Abdul Salam, a shikarawallah in the Gagribal area of the lake. Reports are equally encouraging from hoteliers and tour operators in Pahalgam and Gulmarg.

A Mile stone

In these countries, KVIC has got registrations in various classes that pertain to Khadi fabric, Khadi readymade garments and village industry products like Khadi soaps, Khadi cosmetics, Khadi incense sticks among others.

It is for the first time in the history of KVIC that sustained efforts have been made in the last five years to protect the brand "Khadi" which was given to us by none other than Mahatma Gandhi.

"Khadi" logo was granted in favour of KVIC. Similarly, in Germany, KVIC challenged a local company - Best Natural Products GmbH ("BNP"), which in 2011 already got prior rights in the mark "KHADI" and related marks in EU and other countries in different classes. After long legal battle and negotiations through the diplomatic channel with the help of the Ministry of External Affairs, BNP has expressed its willingness to settle the trademark disputes amicably with KVIC.



AMID INFIGHTING IN BENGAL BJP, NADDHA CALLS DILIP GHOSH

In the midst of inter-personal rivalry and differences within the BJPs West Bengal unit, the saffron party's national President J.P. Naddha has called state BJP chief Dilip Ghosh for a meeting in the national capital, which is likely to take place on Sunday morning. Though Ghosh was not ready to speak on the matter, a source in the state BJP said that he is likely to fly to Delhi on Saturday night. After the debacle in the Assembly polls earlier this year, voices of dissent have become louder within the saffron party in the state.

It is not only true in the case of Mukul Roy who left the party and returned to Trinamool Congress, but there have been several instances when many party leaders, mainly those who jumped ship to the BJP from the



Trinamool, have spoken openly against the party line.

Ghosh's visit to Delhi at this juncture is considered to be significant. Though Ghosh denied to

speak about the meeting, sources within the party indicated that the meeting is an indication that there might be several changes in the organisational set-up of the state BJP.

The BJP has information about the leaders who have spoken openly against the party line and it is expected that

Naddha will be willing to hear it from the state president, a senior BJP leader said. Recently leaders like Soumitra Khan, Rajib Banerjee and even Babul Supriyo

have expressed dissatisfaction over the party's decisions, which has not gone down well with the party's central leadership.

Soumitra Khan recently resigned from his post of Yuva Morcha President and openly criticised Ghosh and Leader of the Opposition Suvidha Adhikari. Though he withdrew his resignation later, according to some leaders, it hurt the image of the party. "The way he criticised Adhikari and Ghosh was unprecedented. It never happens in BJP. It is understandable that the MP from Bishnupur was frustrated because he was not among the four who got a ministerial berth in the reshuffled Narendra Modi Cabinet. You might not be happy with the decisions of the central leadership but you cannot criticise them openly," a senior BJP leader said.

3 terrorists killed in Anantnag encounter

Three terrorists were killed in a joint operation by the army, police and CRPF in south Kashmir's Anantnag district on Saturday, officials said. The army said that on receiving specific intelligence inputs about the presence of three terrorists in the built-up area of Kwarigam Ranipora in Anantnag district, Ladkipura-based Rashtriya Rifles along with Jammu and Kashmir Police and CRPF launched a cordon and search operation at 1 pm on Saturday. "On seeing the movement of security forces, at around 3.50 pm the terrorists tried to escape through a nallah. The troops immediately repositioned and readjusted the cordon and asked the terrorists to surrender. However, the terrorists resorted to heavy firing on the secu-



rity forces which led to a fire fight," the army said. During the exchange of fire, three terrorists -- Arif Ahmad Hajjam of Lashkar-e-Taiba, Basit Gani of Hizbul Mujahideen and Sohail Ahmad Bhat -- were neutralised. Two of the slain terrorists belonged to Anantnag district while the third was from Pulwama. "One

DJB warns of water crisis in Delhi; SC, govt offices may face supply woes

Amid the scorching summer heat, the residents of Delhi may face water crisis, Delhi Jal Board (DJB) Vice Chairman Raghav Chaddha warned on Saturday.

Chaddha, the AAP MLA from Rajinder Nagar, accused the Haryana government of supplying 120 MGT less water to Delhi through Yamuna, which is resulting in a severe water crisis in the national capital. "The Haryana government is taking away the legal right of the people of Delhi as directed by the Supreme Court. The three major water treatment plants in Delhi are producing less water per day because they (Haryana government) have reduced water supply in Yamuna," Chaddha claimed.

A DJB official said that the Chandrabad treatment plant's production capacity



has reduced to 55 MGD water from its earlier 90 MGD, whereas the Wazirabad treatment plant is producing 80 MGD compared to 135 MGD before. The Okhla water treatment plant is supplying 15 MGD water instead of its earlier quota of 20 MGD.

Chaddha said the DJB has written a dozen letters to the

ministries and residences of Central ministers, Chaddha claimed that the highest water production capacity had increased by 945 MGD water per day, but now it is witnessing a decline of 100 MGD.

The DJB needs around 1,100 MGD water per day to cater to the demand of Delhi during the peak of summer.

Bengaluru police swoop down on criminals, detain more than 400

The Bengaluru city police launched a crackdown on notorious rowdies across the city during the intervening night of Friday and Saturday. In a surprise raid and search operation, the police teams from all eight divisions headed by respective division heads conducted raids and search operations on the houses of rowdies across Bengaluru. These teams so far have raided as many as 800 houses and around 400 rowdies have been picked up for questioning. The raids and questioning will be continued till afternoon, the police said. During these raids, several lethal weapons - Daggers, knives, swords and machetes were seized besides recovering huge cache of documents pertaining to their illegal activities. "Rowdies are being questioned and they would be booked under the stringent Goonda Act or



Karnataka Control of Organised Crime Act (KCOCA) if required," a senior official who is part of the raid in central division, told reporter. "We are also verifying the seized documents, and cases pertaining to some of them will be referred to the Income Tax department or the Directorate of Enforcement," he added. The raid and search operations began at 11 p.m. on Friday and it is still continuing. As part of the opera-

tions, the rowdies were taken to respective police stations where senior officers gave them stern warning. "Most of the rowdies lend money to the public at exorbitant interest rates and get their property documents as security. All those documents are being verified and property owners will be summoned for enquiry if required," a senior police officer from another division told reporter.

Punjab Police unearth MP based illicit weapons supply network

In a major interstate operation, Punjab Police on Saturday busted another Madhya Pradesh-based illicit weapon supply network with the arrest of its main supplier, Baljit Singh, alias Sweety Singh. Singh, a resident of Barwani of district in Madhya Pradesh, has been found indulging in manufacturing and supply of high-quality illicit weapons to Punjab and other states of northern India, said Director General of Police (DGP) Dinkar Gupta.

Kapurthala Police have also recovered three .32 bore pistols, along with three magazines from his possession, he added. Notably, this is the third such MP-based illegal weapon manufacturing and supply module busted by Punjab Police in the past eight months.

Earlier, Amritsar Rural Police had unearthed two such modules, including one illicit small arms manufacturing unit in MP, with the arrest of weapon smugglers, who were supplying weapons to gangsters, criminals and radicals in Punjab. Sharing details, Gupta said the development came 10 days after Kapurthala Police in the follow-up operations led by SSP Harkamalpreet Singh Khakh had



arrested four robbers after recovering 10 pistols and one rifle, along with ammunition, from their possession. He said the arrested robbers revealed they were getting the supply of weapons from Sweety Singh and were hatching a conspiracy to carry out robberies, snatch money from petrol pumps as well as farmers. The DGP said following these inputs, the police procured arrest warrants of Sweety Singh and a special police team from Kapurthala was despatched to Barwani district to arrest him after coordinating the operations with the local police. The DGP also thanked Madhya Pradesh Police for their enormous support to Punjab Police in unearthing these illicit weapon manufacturing and supply units and modules.

NOTICE TO UP GOVT OVER BRUTAL ASSAULT ON DALIT YOUTH

New Delhi: The National Commission for Scheduled Castes has sent a notice to the Uttar Pradesh government, taking into cognizance an incident in which a Dalit youth was brutally beaten up after being tied to a tree. The incident has been reported from Akbarpur area of Kanpur Dehat district. The youth, said to be in a relation with a girl, was beaten up by her relatives and other villagers when he had come to meet her. It's being said that he was also hit on his private parts with a stick. He was tied to a tree with a towel and then beaten up. The video of the incident went viral on the social media. The NCSC has issued notice to the Uttar Pradesh Chief Secretary, DGP, and DM and SSP of Kanpur Dehat.

TTD recites Sri Rama Mula Mantram 30 lakh times



Tight security arrangement in place for Rath Yatra in Puri

To ensure smooth conduct of the annual Rath Yatra in Puri scheduled for July 12, the Odisha government has deployed 65 platoons of force along with senior officers to look after the security arrangements for the festival, the police said on Saturday. "All preparations for the festival have been made. Arrangement from police administration has also been done. A detailed plan to ensure foolproof security has been chalked out," Additional Director General (law and order), R.K. Sharma, said on Saturday. The entire city has been divided into 12 zones. Along with the 65 platoons, 10 senior officers of additional SP rank have been

deployed for the festival, Sharma said after reviewing the security arrangements in Puri.

The police force will not only provide security, but also ensure proper enforcement of Covid-19 guidelines like social distancing and wearing masks, sources said. A source said that all entry points (8 check points) of the district will be sealed to restrict the movement of people from other parts of the state and elsewhere to Puri during the Rath Yatra festival.

Like last year, the revered festival of Lord Jagannath in the pilgrim town of Puri will be held without the participation of devotees in view of the Covid-19 situation. RT-PCR tests of the servitors are being

carried out. The sevayats (servitors) testing negative for Covid-19 and who have been fully vaccinated would be allowed to participate in the pulling of the chariots.


Meanwhile, all hotels, dhamashalas and guest houses on the Grand Road have been asked not to allow any tourist or devotee. They have been directed to vacate all boarders and guests by Saturday evening.

The district administration has also relaxed the shutdown on Saturday. However, Section 144 of CrPC will be clamped from 8 pm on Sunday and no shop or essential activity will be allowed on Grand Road. Only those with duty passes for Rath Yatra will be allowed, officials said.

Treatment for non-Covid patients hit amidst focus on Covid

The findings, published in the Indian Journal of Medical Sciences, showed that attendance of both new and follow-up cases dropped by 57.65 per cent. The outpatient cases attendance saw a significant reduction of 89.2 per cent, followed by a reduction of 80.75 per cent in surgical work. The doctors urged that those who were neglected must be given medical attention at the earliest.

The Covid-19 pandemic had a significant effect on most spheres of clinical practice, including the outpatient attendance and elective surgeries, revealed a study by a team at Indraprastha Apollo Hospital here on Friday. The team conducted an observational study on 6,77,237 cases (599,281 outpatient and 77,956 hospital admissions) and the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on various medical and surgical specialties for the entire duration, since the onset of the pandemic, and compared it with the preceding pre-pandemic period (June 1, 2019–March 31, 2020).



Further, Covid-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on both the hospital's major

medical and surgical specialties. Bariatric surgery (87.5 per cent) and ophthalmology (65.45 per cent) were affected the

most and general surgery (32.28 per cent), and neurosurgery the least.

"The only medical specialty that saw more patients has respiratory medicine with a significant increase of 314.04 per cent, in admissions because of Covid-19," Apollo Hospitals Group Medical Director, and Senior Consultant, Paediatric Gastroenterology Indraprastha Apollo Hospitals, Anupam Sibal, said.

"Healthcare providers must factor in the impact of fear which results in patients ignoring their healthcare needs which can be detrimental," Indraprastha Apollo Hospitals, New Delhi, Managing Director M.P. Shivakumar said.

It was observed that the decline of the second wave is at variable stages in the different states or Union Territories (UTs) in the country, and that while the overall case positivity rate may be declining, the case positivity rate in certain districts of Rajasthan, Kerala, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh is over 10 per cent, which is a cause for concern.

States were also asked to follow the five-fold strategy of Test-Track-Treat-Vaccinate and Covid appropriate behaviour, as has been laid out in Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) order dated June 29 this year, said the Home Ministry.





India is opening up too fast and too soon is the majority view as the government expresses concern over crowds at hill stations, as per the IANS CVoter Live Tracker. The tacker had a sample size of

1,314. 53.31 per cent of the respondents of the IANS CVoter Live Tracker said 'yes', while 34.34 per cent said that India is not opening up too fast but people are becoming careless. Compared to other states, the Covid-19 cases in Kerala are not decreasing rapidly. To a question if

Kerala could become the epicentre of the third Covid wave in India, 45.97 per cent said 'yes' and 35.91 per cent said 'no'. The CVoter NewsTracker Surveys in India are based on a national representative random probability sample as used in the globally standardized RDD CATI methodology, covering all geographic and demographic segments across all states. This daily live tracker survey is based on interviews of adult (18+) respondents across all socio-economic segments. The data is weighted to the known Census profile. The standard margin of error is +/- 3 per cent at national trends and +/- 5 per cent at regional/zonal trends with 95 per cent confidence level. An overwhelming majority is still wearing masks as 75.06 per cent said they wear masks when they go out while 18.31 per cent said they don't wear a mask.

GOVERNMENT CAUTIONS EIGHT STATES



Sounding a note of caution, Union Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla on Saturday asked eight states having tourist destinations and hill stations to follow strict Covid appropriate behaviour to avoid spread of the virus. During the meeting, the overall management of Covid-19 situation and the vaccination status in respect of the states of Goa, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, and West Bengal was discussed. The Home Secretary sounded a note of caution in view of

INDIA ADDS 42,766 NEW COVID CASES, 1,206 DEATHS IN 24 HRS

India recorded 42,766 new Covid-19 cases in the past 24 hours and 1,206 deaths, said the Union Health and Family Welfare Ministry on Saturday. This is the 32nd consecutive day when India reported less than one lakh new coronavirus cases. The active cases have now come down below 5 lakh. The country has 4,55,033 active cases presently and has witnessed a total of 4,07,145 deaths so far.



SEC 144 IN NOIDA TILL AUG 30 AHEAD OF SHIVRATRI, BAKRI-EID

Noida: To further curb the spread of Covid-19 ahead of the upcoming festivals, the Uttar Pradesh government has decided to implement tough measures such as imposing Section 144 in Gautam Budh Nagar district from July 10 till August 30. Fearing the possibility of a threat to peace and law and order by anti-social elements during the upcoming festivals such as Shivratri, Raksha Bandhan, Bakri-Eid, Janmashtami, Muhamarram, the state government has imposed Section 144 in the district. More than 50 people will not be allowed entry into any religious place at the same time. Activities concerned with social, political, sports, entertainment, academic and cultural festivals and other gatherings won't be allowed without prior permission from the district administration. All other activities will remain banned except medical and essential services in every containment zone in the district.

Meanwhile, 56 Taliban militants were killed, 10 others wounded and 23 captured in Afghanistan's northern region, as security forces continued fighting to prevent the group from advancing, the military said on Saturday. Forty-five militants were killed and 10 others wounded in attacks by security forces supported by Afghan Air Force targeting militants' positions in the outskirts of Shiberghan city, capital of Jawzjan province, the Army's 209th Shaheen Corps said in a statement.

FUEL PRICE RISE CONTINUES

New Delhi: Global cues pushed fuel prices to increase again across the country on Saturday adding more misery for the common man already grappling with rising food prices amidst shrinking income. The retail prices of petrol and diesel rose by a sharp 35 paise and 26 paise per litre on Saturday to touch new high of Rs 100.91 and Rs 89.88 per litre respectively in Delhi. In the city of Mumbai, where petrol prices crossed Rs 100 mark for the first time ever on May 29, the fuel price reached new high of Rs 106.93 per litre on Saturday. Diesel prices also increased in the city to reach Rs 97.44 a litre, the highest among metros.

11 J&K GOVT EMPLOYEES SACRED FOR 'ANTI-NATIONAL' ACTIVITIES

Eleven employees of Jammu and Kashmir government were sacked on Saturday for alleged militant links, including two teachers from Anantnag district who were found to be involved in "anti-national activities", and two police constables who allegedly provided inside information to the militants. Of the 11 government employees sacked

on Saturday, four are from Anantnag district, three from Budgam, and one each from Barumula, Srinagar, Pulwama and Kupwara districts.

Of these, four are working in the education department, two in J&K Police and one each in agriculture, skill development, power, Sher-e-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (SKIMS) and health departments. J&K Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha had last

year amended the J&K Service Regulation rules and assumed power to sack any government servant without prior notice if there is evidence of such an employee having indulged in anti-national or pro-militant activities.

Furthermore, CID verification of the antecedents of any person employed with the government has been made a compulsory precondition before such an employee can join government service.

Indian Muslim women 'up for sale' on app: Report

► The app pretended to offer users the chance to buy a "Sulli" - a derogatory slang term used by right-wing Hindu trolls for Muslim women. There was no real auction of any kind - the purpose of the app was just to degrade and humiliate.

Dozens of Muslim women in India found they had been put up for sale online, BBC reported. Hana Khan, a commercial pilot whose name was on the list, told the BBC last Sunday, she was alerted to it when a friend sent her a tweet. The tweet took her to "Sulli Deals", an app and website that had taken publicly available pictures of women and created profiles, describing the women as "deals of the day". BBC said the app's landing page had a photo of an unknown woman. On the next two pages Khan saw photos of her friends. Khan said she had been targeted because of her religion. BBC said GitHub - the web platform that hosted the open source app - shut it down quickly following complaints. "We suspended user accounts following the investigation of reports of such activity, all of which violate our policies," the company said.


► This is not the first time, Amin said, that Muslim women have been targeted in this manner.

► The people who made the app used fake identities, but Hasiba Amin, a social media coordinator for the opposition Congress party, blamed several accounts which regularly attack Muslims, especially Muslim women, and claim to support right-wing politics.

But the experience has left women scarred. Those who featured on the app were all vocal Muslims, including journalists, activists, artists or researchers. A few have since deleted their social media accounts and many others said they were afraid of further harassment. The report said prominent citizens, activists and leaders have also spoken out against the harassment. The police said they had opened an investigation but refused to say who could be behind the app.

“ I counted 83 names. There could be more. They'd taken my photo from Twitter and it had my user name. This app was running for 20 days and we didn't even know about it. It sent chills down my spine. I'm a Muslim woman who's seen and heard and they want to silence us. People were bidding five rupees (67 cents; 48 pence) and 10 rupees, they were rating women based on their body parts and describing sexual acts and threatening rape. ”

MAHARASHTRA TO REOPEN SCHOOLS FOR CLASSES 8 TO 12 FROM JULY 15

As Maharashtra plans to reopen physical classes, schools are instructed to strictly abide by the Covid-19 safety guidelines and protocols laid down by the state government before re-opening the schools.

The Maharashtra government has announced to reopen the schools in areas where no COVID-19 cases have been reported over the last month. Minister of School Education Department Varsha Gaikwad has announced that the schools in those areas have been allowed to resume offline classes for students of Class 8 to 12 from July 15 onwards.

Sharing a video message on her official video handle, she wrote that while the state government continues to promote remote learning and online education, they have also been working towards a safe resumption of schools in corona-free villages. She added that it has become a need of the hour to have a blended approach to education to reach out to the maximum number of students across the state.

She also asserted that all teachers and school staff must be vaccinated on priority before the resumption of offline classes. She wrote, "The government is sensitive to the possibility of a



third wave. Hence, no laxity will be permitted". The schools are instructed to strictly abide by the Covid-19 safety guidelines and protocols laid down by the state government before re-opening the schools. Gaikwad also gave an update on the measures and steps taken for COVID-19 prevention at the village level. As per the statement, an eight-members committee headed by the village Sarpanch will be formed to monitor the implementation of Covid-19 safety guidelines.

While the Chief Executive Officer of the local Zilla Parishad will supervise the operations and will review the situation regularly. The committee will also comprise collectors, school principals, and health officials. The schools will also have to follow all COVID standard operating procedures (SOP) and conduct timely temperature checks of students inside the campus.

Schools are also instructed to monitor the proper implementation of special distancing norms inside the campus. A maximum of fifteen to twenty students is allowed to sit in a classroom at once.

"Show Big Heart," Slash Taxes On Fuel: Pawar To Centre

Terming BJP leader Devendra Fadnavis's claim about the state government levying "tax on tax, a complete lie, Ajit Pawar who also holds the finance portfolio, said the Maha Vikas Aghadi government has not increased state taxes on petrol and diesel after coming to power in November 2019.

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar on Friday said the Centre should show a "big heart" and reduce taxes on fuel to provide relief to common citizens who are reeling under high prices of petrol and diesel.

Pawar, who also holds the finance portfolio, said the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government has not increased state taxes on petrol and diesel after coming to power in November 2019.

He was talking to reporters after a review meeting. Speaking about BJP leader Devendra Fadnavis's claim about the state government levying "tax on tax," which has led to petrol retailing at around Rs 105 per litre in Maharashtra, Pawar said it was a complete lie.



"We did not increase any taxes in consecutive budgets. Whatever taxes are there, they are from their (BJP's) tenure. The Centre takes a big share (of revenue) in the form of taxes, so the Centre should show a big heart and reduce the taxes...it (reducing levies) is not in our hands," he said.

Asked why the MVA government is not reducing state-level taxes on fuel, he said in the current situation, when Maharashtra is fighting the COVID-19 pandemic, it has incurred income loss of Rs 1.25 lakh crore."

"The income of the state in the form of tax has been reduced by Rs 1.25 lakh crore. On the other hand, we have to fund health, food and other sectors in the current times and if we reduce taxes (on fuel), it will impact all these departments," Pawar said.

"The relaxations could be on a case-by-case basis and in phases. The districts with TPR below 5% for consecutive two weeks, vaccine cover of more than 70% may get



relaxations. We have a long way to achieve 70% vaccination, the mandatory public health yardstick."People who will visit Maharashtra and have got vaccinated with both the doses of covid-19 vaccines may be allowed to enter the state and no requirement for mandatory covid-19 tests.

People may have to wait for few more weeks for the opening up of local train services for the general public. The opening up of trains led to initiation of the second wave which hit Mumbai in the second week of March, six weeks after the decision of allowing general people from the first week of February. It was the time gap required for the spread of the virus. The opening up of trains has direct correlation with the wave and thus we have

to be very careful while allowing activities," said Dr Joshi. Ratnagiri, Sindhudurg, Sangli, Satara, Raigad, Palghar, Kolhapur, Rural Pune - have been reporting high TPR of more than 5% which is cause of worry for the state administration.

Meanwhile, Maharashtra reported 8,992 new coronavirus cases and 200 fatalities on Friday while 10,458 patients recovered from the infection, a state health department official said.

The official said with this, the tally of COVID-19 cases in the state surged to 61,40,968, while the total fatalities rose to 1,25,034. Gokul hikes procurement price of milk to help dairy farmers

The Board of Kolhapur District Co-Operative Milk Producers Union, which owns the largest selling milk brand Gokul, on Saturday announced a hike in the procurement price for buffalo milk by Rs 2 per litre and cow milk by Re 1 per litre from July 11.

The decision was taken by the Maharashtra Minister of State for Home, Kolhapur's guardian minister and leader of Gokul, Satej Patil, Rural Development Minister Hasan Mushrif and other leaders from Gokul. "As assured during the election to the Kolhapur District Co-Operative Milk Producers Union, we have decided to increase the procurement price for buffalo milk by Rs 2 per litre and cow milk by Re 1 per litre. We collect 12 lakh litres of milk every day from across the state and thus the decision will be of benefit to the farmers. Except for Kolhapur, Sangli and Konkan division, there will be rise in the selling price of the milk as well," said Satej

Patil. Gokul has set the target of increasing the daily collection of the milk to 20 lakh litres in next few years from the current collection of 8 lakh.

It will be done in phases by increasing the collection by 2 lakh every year. The hike in procurement price was necessitated following a drop in milk rates during the pandemic, resulting in lower income of dairy farmers.

Across the state, the average procurement price of milk came down from Rs 25 to 30 per litre earlier to Rs 15 to Rs 17 per litre during the lockdown.

After the new board came to the power, Gokul signed a memorandum of understanding with Mahanand for selling in Mumbai, leading to the drop in packing expenditure by 12 paise per litre. This would save Rs 18.80 lakh per year.

GOVT SANCTIONS FUNDS TO TACKLE NATURAL CALAMITIES

Mumbai: The Maharashtra government Friday sanctioned a Rs 3,635-crore fund to tackle natural calamities in the coastal Konkan region in Maharashtra. The amount will be spent on multi-disaster management projects in the region, officials said.

At a meeting of Maharashtra State Disaster Management Authority, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray said, "In the wake of changing climatic conditions, leading to natural disasters the authority should decide their priorities in taking up projects. The focus should be to minimise the loss of human lives.. All infrastructure to override the impact of natural calamities, which is a recurring phenomenon in the coastal belt of Konkan, should be dealt with to bring relief to residents."

Thackeray also urged the authorities to install projects to avoid power disruptions and smaller watershed projects in the region.

Minister for Relief and Rehabilitation Vijay Wadettiwar, state secretary Sitaram Kunte and other senior officials were also present at the meeting, held through video conference.

While reflecting on the Covid-19 pandemic, the chief minister said there is already a provision of Rs 1,700 crore contingency funds to tackle the Covid-19 pandemic.

"Now, they are talking of a third wave and new variants. We have to be prepared to take new challenges thrown by the Covid-19 pandemic," he said. There are several districts that are still reeling under the pandemic which is a "cause of concern. At the same time, there is demand from some quarters to relax the Covid guidelines. The state government is holding discussions with industries and other sectors. After carefully assessing the situation, we will make a decision," the CM said.

PETROL INCHES TO RS 110 IN BHOPAL AND INDORE, DIESEL CLOSER TO RS 99

Petrol prices in Bhopal and Indore neared Rs 110 a litre while diesel reached almost Rs 99 after fuel prices were raised yet again.

Overall, petrol prices crossed Rs 110 a litre and diesel at Rs 100 in several districts of the State. Petrol price was hiked by 35 paise per litre and diesel by 26 paise, according to a price notification of state-owned fuel retailers.

Petrol prices on Saturday in Bhopal stand at Rs 109.30 a litre and diesel at Rs 98.73 a litre. In some parts of the state, the prices are around Rs 111 per litre and diesel crossed Rs 100 for a litre, Ajay Singh, President, Petrol Pump Dealers Association said on Saturday.

On the other hand, the prices of petrol and diesel in Indore, the biggest city of the state, reached 109.32 and Rs 96.76 per litre respectively.

Singh said that the prices of these oil products in the State are higher than the neighbouring states. Petrol pump owners in the border districts are suffering the most due to higher prices in Madhya Pradesh.

"I know that several of these petrol pump owners near Uttar Pradesh borders themselves get the petrol and diesel from the neighbouring state for their own vehicles," he said.

Singh said that petrol is cheaper by Rs 12



and diesel by Rs 9 a litre in Uttar Pradesh.

He demanded that these products should be brought under the purview of the Goods and Service Tax (GST) for the uniformity of the prices across the country.

The oil companies issue a tender to purchase crude from the international market once every three months. This means the rate is fixed once for a period of three months. In such cases, the daily dynamic pricing for the people is not understandable, Singh said. The people are also facing problems with higher prices of the petroleum products. "Petrol is becoming expensive day by day, ruining my budget. The government should give relief to the common man from inflation by reducing the tax on this fuel," said one Irfan Ali Bahadur,

who was refilling petrol for his bike at a pump in Indore.

Federation of Madhya Pradesh Motors and Goods Transport Association President Parvindar Singh Bhatia said that the transport business was already sluggish due to COVID-19 outbreak.

Now, this business is being affected by 40 percent due to the impact of expensive diesel. He said that there is a decrease in the bookings of goods of general need especially those sent from central India to South India due to rising freight rates.

Earlier on Friday, State's Home Minister Narottam Mishra had blamed the previous Congress government in the state for the inflation of petrol and diesel.

"Our government has not increased any

tax on petrol and diesel since the past 15 months while this was done by the previous Kamal Nath led Congress government," he said and added that the opposition party had promised to give relief on fuel prices in their manifesto.

On the other hand, Congress MLA from Bhopal Madhya Assembly constituency Arif Masood asked what has been stopping the ruling regime from giving relief by reducing the prices of diesel and petrol.

"This government is still so scared of then chief minister Kamal Nath that it remembers him in every statement," he said.

Masood also held a massive demonstration against the price hike and growing inflation in the state capital last days.

The objective of RTE is to provide free and compulsory education for children between the six and 14 years age group.

During the 2021-22 academic year, parents do not need to pay any fee, except for the tuition fee, and schools cannot increase their fees until further orders, an official statement said.

The Land Revenue Code 1959 was amended in 2018 in this connection. Now the land shown in the master plan can be changed by applying online.

online system till October 23, 2020. To simplify this process for contractors for works and services, the government has included this process under Public Service Guarantee Act to simplify the process of registration of contractors for works and services in Madhya Pradesh. Also, the time limit for providing registration certificate has also been increased to 15 days. This will enable the contractors to manually apply for registration and help them get rid of frequent visits to the office to track the status of the application, deposit the FDR as security, visit the office or bank to pay the fees and then collect the final registration certificate. In the new e-registration, the contractors already registered in categories A, B and C will be registered by default in the centralized single registration system under the Centralized Single Registration System for contractors by the Public Works Department. Also, it will be mandatory for all the registered contractors to renew their registration after completing the

tenure of 5 years. The registered contractors will have to pay Rs. 25000 as registration fee for the renewal process, which will be valid for next 10 years. The contractors who are going to register themselves in 'Mukhyamantri Yuva Thekedar Yojana', can apply online by depositing Rs 2000.

With the implementation of this system, the contractors are getting direct benefits. Like the complete process of application can be seen on the online portal now and fee payment can also be made online. Also, contractors can submit their documents online and then track their status. Even the applicant contractors can easily download the final certificate from the online portal. The online land allotment system has been implemented to bring transparency in the land allotment procedures for industries. To further facilitate the investors, Madhya Pradesh has also made amendments in the system to simplify its land allotment process. Madhya Pradesh Industrial Development Corporation (MPIDC) has developed and implemented Single Window Portal. The portal provides 43 services which are integrated with the respective departments in a consolidated manner.

If any investment exceeds Rs.10 crore, now a letter of intent (LOI) will be issued to the investor immediately upon confirmation of payment. In case of investment less than Rs.10 crore, LOI will be issued within 7 days. If LOI is not provided within 7 days, it will be taken as accepted.

With the introduction of online land allotment system in Madhya Pradesh, now investors can easily track the availability of industrial land and track the application file for the same. Also necessary approvals can also be obtained online. Apart from this, the applicant can also pay the fee online.



The first ODI will now be played on July 18 instead of July 13 and the final match of the series, the third T20I will be played on July 29, two days after the original schedule.

"The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) and Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) on Saturday announced the revised itinerary of India's upcoming tour of Sri Lanka, 2021," said a statement from the BCCI.

"The decision to revise the itinerary was taken on the basis of health advisory after the Sri Lankan contingent detected two COVID positive cases," it added.

"The tour comprising 3 ODIs and as many T20Is will now start from July 18th, 2021," the statement said further.



Copa America: Diaz helps Colombia clinch third place

Luis Diaz scored a superb second-half brace as Colombia came from behind to secure a last-gasp 3-2 win over Peru in their Copa America third-place playoff here.

The Porto winger struck in the 66th and 94th minutes to take his personal tally for the tournament to four goals, leaving him as the joint top scorer alongside Lionel Messi on Friday, reports Xinhua. "We've been able to come together as a team and show great unity all throughout the tournament," Diaz said after the match. "It makes me very proud to be a part of this team and achieve what we have." Yoshimar Yotun opened the scoring for Peru just before halftime when he received Christian Cueva's slide-rule pass and slotted a low shot past goalkeeper Camilo Vargas. Juan Cuadrado equalised just after the restart, bending a low free-kick from the edge of the box around the wall and inside the near post.



Diaz continued his impressive run of form by latching onto Vargas's 60-yard goal-kick before a surging run and low drive into the bottom right corner from just inside the 18-yard box.

Peru did not relent and they were back on level terms when Gianluca Lapadula headed home from Raziel Garcia corner, eight minutes from time. But Colombia were jolted

into action again as Peru were pushed deep into their own half in the final minutes.

Diaz prompted wild celebrations in the fourth minute of stoppage time with his second bid for goal of the tournament in as many games, lashing a wicked long-range effort into the top right corner after Luis Muriel released him with a backheel.

England look to end 55 year wait in Euro final

Facing Italy on Sunday evening in the Euro 2020 final, England looks to end Italy's 33-game unbeaten run and its 55-year wait for a major international football title. Wembley was the venue when England won the 1966 World Cup, beating Germany 4-2. England's 2-1 win over Denmark on July 7 ended a run of semi-final defeats in the World Cup in 1990 and 2018 and in the 1996 European Championships, reports Xinhua. England coach Gareth Southgate has developed a young side since 2018, working on showing his players to develop and grow into a major tournament and England have done just that.

They began their campaign with solid, if unspectacular performances in the group stage, built on being tough to score against, but with players such as Raheem Sterling and Mason Mount and Harry Kane able to produce a moment of magic in attack. Southgate was pragmatic as they beat Germany 2-0 in the last 16 showing he can adapt his system from a three-man defence to one with three central defenders and two wing-backs. England showed they can attack with a 4-0 quarter-final thrashing of Ukraine.

Denmark were tough rivals in the semifinals and there is still controversy over the penalty that allowed Kane to



score the winning goal, but there is also no doubt that after a difficult first 45-minutes, England were the better side, with Denmark keeper Kasper Schmeichel, keeping his side in the game. Now comes the chance to make history

Brazil Vs Argentina: A new chapter in an old rivalry

Rio de Janeiro: As much as both managers tried not to discuss it, the recent tournament history of Copa America finalists Brazil and Argentina is a study in contrast.

Argentina will be aiming to win their first major title since the 1993 Copa America when they battle for glory at Rio de Janeiro's Maracana stadium on Sunday morning (IST). Since that time, Brazil have stood on the Copa America podium five times and won the World Cup twice, reports Xinhua. "That is history. Looking at the past is not a reference," Brazil head coach Tite told a virtual news conference on Friday. "We are undefeated in the last two Copa Americas and we have better numbers but I don't see that having much importance."

Likewise, Argentina boss Lionel Scaloni preferred to avoid answering questions about Argentina's trophy drought and denied that his players were under pressure to end it. "We have to take it easy and with caution," Scaloni said. "We have to do everything possible to win, without any anxiety. This pandemic has shown that football is important but not that important." The duel will not only pit what are clearly South America's two best teams against each other, but also the two best players. Brazil idol Neymar has lived up to expectations by scoring twice and providing three assists in a free-roaming attacking midfield role. Lionel Messi has been even more devastating for Argentina, leading the competition for both goals (four) and assists (five).

The six-time Ballon d'Or winner has made no secret of his desire to end Argentina's major tournament heartache and he has looked a man on a mission here.



WEST INDIES WIN FIRST T20I AFTER AUSTRALIA IMPLODE

West Indies registered an 18-run win in the opening match of the five-match T20I series against Australia at the Darren Sammy National Cricket Stadium here.

The hosts took advantage of a sensational batting collapse by Australia, who lost their last six wickets for just 19 runs on Friday.

After being sent in to bat, West Indies scored 145/6 in their 20 overs. Andre Russell's first fifty in T20Is led West Indies to the below-par total. Russell's knock of 51 off 28 balls, with five fours and three towering sixes, lifted West Indies out of trouble after they had been reduced to 66/4 in 12 overs. Apart from Russell, Lendl Simmons (27) and Shimron Hetmyer (20) were notable contributors in a bat-



ting order which missed regular captain Kieron Pollard due to a hamstring injury.

For Australia, Josh Hazlewood took three wickets for just 12 runs while Mitch Marsh took two wickets for 26 runs. Chasing a modest target of 145, the visitors posted 70 in the power-play for the loss of skipper Aaron Finch. By the 11th over, Australia were 108 for four with Marsh and Ben McDermott at the crease. Leg-spinner Hayden Walsh Jr, brought back for the over, took McDermott down with a goo-

gly and then took a return catch when Marsh drove straight to him in the next over.

With 29 runs away from the target, Australia's free-fall continued. Walsh Jr took another wicket while left-arm pacer Obed McCoy clinched the last three wickets to put an end to Australia's misery at 127 with four overs remaining.

The second T20I between the two teams will be played on Sunday.

Wimbledon: Ashleigh wins final in three sets to clinch title

World No. 1 Ashleigh Barty of Australia won the women's singles title at the Wimbledon Championships here on Saturday, beating eighth seed Karolina Pliskova of the Czech Republic in three sets 6-3, 6-7(4), 6-3 in one hour and 55 minutes.

Ashleigh, who had become the first world No. 1 in five years to reach the final at SW19, is the first Australian woman player in 41 years after vonne Goolagong Cawley (1980) to lift the Venus Rosewater Dish.

This is her second Grand Slam title after the 2019 French Open.

In what was the first Wimbledon women's final since 2012 to stretch to three sets, Ashleigh got off to a flying start, winning the first 14 points and four games in a row before clinching the first set 6-3. She also led 3-1 in the second set but Karolina fought back to take the set to tie-breaker and win it.

Ashleigh, at one point in time, was even serving for the second set. Karolina committed errors in the final set as Ashleigh won it with ease.

For Karolina, this is the second loss at a Grand Slam final. Her previous loss came



during the 2016 US Open final when she went down to Angelique Kerber of Germany, also in three sets.

DJOKOVIC EYES 20TH GRAND SLAM TITLE TO EQUAL NADAL, FEDERER



London: Serbia's world No. 1 tennis player Novak Djokovic will bid for his 20th Grand Slam title in the Wimbledon Championships final against Matteo Berrettini on Sunday, which will bring him level with Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal as players with most singles titles in Grand Slam tournaments.

"It would mean everything," Djokovic had said of another Wimbledon title on Friday night.

"That is why I am here. That is why I am playing. I imagined myself being in a position to fight for another Grand Slam trophy prior to coming to London. I put myself in a very good position," he added.

Djokovic, who is into his seventh final at the All England club, is only the second male player after Roger Federer to reach 30 Grand Slam finals. Federer has reached Grand Slam finals on 31 occasions.

It looks likely that the 34-year-old will upset both Federer and Nadal going forward as he looks fit enough to play on all kinds of surfaces. Interestingly, the Serbian has reached the final after losing only one set in the tournament. That loss came in the very first set of the tournament.

Prior to this, he has lost two sets en route to the Wimbledon final on three occasions - in 2013, 2015 and 2019. The veteran player, however, was cautious in his approach. "Anything is possible in the final. Obviously, experience is on my side. But Berrettini has been winning a lot of matches on grass courts this year, winning Queen's. He's in great form. He's serving big, playing big. So it's going to be a very tough match I think for both of us. But I'm looking forward to a great battle," added Djokovic.
