BOMBAY HIGH COURT QUESTIONS CENTRE ON NEW IT RULES

WHAT WAS THE NEED?

ADVOCATE KHAMBATA, WHO APPEARED FOR LEAFLET, AND ADVOCATE ABHAY NEVAGI, WHO APPEARED FOR WAGLE, FURTHER ARGUED THAT THE UNION GOVERNMENT HAD BROUGHT IN THE NEW RULES, WITH MORE DRASTIC CHECKS ON PUBLISHING CONTENT ONLINE, BY WAY OF A DELEGATED LEGISLATION. HOWEVER, THE RULES, IN EFFECT, WOULD ACT LIKE A SUBSTANTIVE LAW.

HE SHOWED THE BENCH A PORTION OF THE CENTRE'S AFFIDAVIT, FILED IN THE CASE ON THURSDAY, WHICH STATED THAT THE PROTECTION TO AN INTERMEDIARY UNDER SECTION 79 CAN BE TAKEN AWAY IF THERE IS NON-COMPLIANCE WITH THE NEW RULES.

THE HC SAID THIS WAS 'VERY SERIOUS' AND ASKED HOW COULD THE RULES TAKE AWAY PROTECTION GRANTED BY A LAW.

UNDER 69A (1) (II) OF THE IT ACT, THE 2009 RULES HAVE BEEN FRAMED. WHAT WAS THE NECESSITY FOR THE UNION GOVERNMENT TO BRING IN SUBSEQUENT RULES WITHOUT SUPERSEDING THE PRIOR RULES AND CREATE A SUBSTANTIVE LAW THROUGH THE RULES? THE HC FURTHER ASKED.

The Bombay high court on Friday asked the Union government what was the need to introduce the recently notified Information Technology Rules, 2021 without superseding the existing IT Rules that came into effect in 2009. A bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice GS Kulkarni reserved its order on two petitions seeking an interim stay on the implementation of the new Rules. On Friday, the bench said orally that it was inclined to grant limited relief to both petitioners over serial number nine of the new Rules that related to adherence to a code of ethics.

TWITTER INDIA HEAD TRANSFERRED OUT OF COUNTRY

New Delhi: Twitter on Friday said its India MD Manish Maheshwari has moved to a bigger role at the company's headquarters in the US, as the micro-blogging platform faces a political storm over blocking Congress and its leaders' accounts. Maheshwari joined Twitter in April 2019 as Managing Director for the country operations, is moving into a new role based in San Francisco as Senior Director, Revenue Strategy and Operations focused on 'New Market Entry'. Twitter was yet to announce a new India head. The departure of Maheshwari comes as Twitter has blocked accounts of Rahul Gandhi and many Congress leaders for violating their policy.

Mixing of two vaccine doses is "Very Wrong": Poonawala

Dr Cyrus Poonawalla, Serum Institute of India (SII) chairman, today said that he was not in favour of administering two different Covid-19 vaccines for better efficacy. Mixing doses of two Covid-19 vaccines is "very wrong", the SII chairman said. Poonawalla, whose firm makes the Covishield vaccine, was speaking to reporters after receiving the Lokmanya Tilak National Award in Pune. "I am against the mixing of two different vaccines. There is no need to mix two different vaccines," Poonawalla said, when asked about a recent ICMR study that a cocktail of Covishield and Covaxin could generate

better immunity. "If cocktail vaccines are administered and if the result is not good, then SII may say that another vaccine was not good, vice versa, the other company might say that since you mixed Serum's vaccine, it did not give desired results," Poonawalla said. This comment comes days after the Drugs Controller General of India approved a proposal to conduct a study on mixing Covaxin and Covishield vaccines in India. The study, involving 300 health individuals, will be carried out by Christian Medical College, Vellore. The efficacy of this approach has not been proven in field trials involving thousands of participants, he added.

Bharat Biotech's intranasal vaccine gets nod for Phase 2/3 trials

New Delhi: India's first intranasal vaccine, being developed by Bharat Biotech in collaboration with the Department of Biotechnology and its PSU, the Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC), on Friday got regulatory approval for Phase 2/3 trials. "Bharat Biotech's intranasal vaccine is the first nasal vaccine that has received the regulatory approval for Phase 2/3 trials. This is the first of its kind Covid-19 jab to undergo human clinical trials in India. BBV154 is an intranasal replication-deficient chimpanzee adenovirus SARS-CoV-2 vectored vaccine. BBIL has in-licensed technology from Washington University in St Louis, USA," a Ministry of Science & Technology statement said.

Plastic plates, cups, cutlery banned from July 1, 2022



Non-woven plastic carry bags should not be less than 60 gram per square metre (GSM) with effect from September 30, 2021, the notification said. "The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of following single-use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited with effect from July 1, 2022: ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene (thermo-col) for decoration; plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straw, trays; wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100 micron, stirrers," it read.

The Centre has notified the Plastic Waste Management Amendment Rules, 2021, prohibiting manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of identified single-use plastic (SUP) items, including candy sticks, plates, cups and cutlery, from July 1, 2022.

The thickness of plastic carry bags will be increased from 50 microns to 75 microns from September 30, 2021, and to 120 microns from December 31, 2022, according to the notification dated August 12. This will also allow the plastic carry bags to be reused, it stated.

The provisions will not apply to commodities made of compostable plastic, the notification said.

Assam Rifles thwarts NSCN (KYA) attack on villagers in Nagaland

The Assam Rifles personnel have thwarted a banned National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN (KYA) attack on local people in Nagaland's Chenloiso area. The security force stated that on August 10, the Chairman of Chenloiso approached Assam Rifles at the contingency operating base at Chenloiso for help in clearing a landslide from the track of the Chenloiso-Hydro project. "The Assam Rifles company commander immediately gave confirmation for support to the village chairman," said a senior officer. On August 11, a team of security personnel carried out the assessment of the landslide areas along with the village Chairman. A JCB was also arranged by Assam Rifles to expedite the clearance work.

TRANS-HIMALAYA LANDSLIDES IN HIMACHAL BLOCK RIVER

A major landslide in trans-Himalayas of Himachal Pradesh on Friday blocked the flow of the glacial-fed Chandrabagha river, raising flood fears in downstream villages in Udaipur tehsil, officials said. However, the river made its natural course over the landslide after several hours of the lake formation.

The disaster-hit spot is located some 30 km from district headquarters Keylong in Lahaul-Spiti district. "The river was blocked due to the heavy landslide in the morning. Villages were evacuated and a helicopter aerial survey and the NDRF team deployment planned," State Disaster Management Director Sudesh Kumar Mokhta told reporter here. He said after

some hours the Chandrabagha water flow has started over the landslide blockade. "Things are under control and all downstream villages have been evacuated as a preventive measure," Mokhta added. The dramatic pictures and videos of the river being blocked by a huge landslide in Lahaul gone viral on the social media. The natural calamities are happening so often these days in the hill state.

MAJOR RELIEF IN TN AS FUEL PRICES SLASHED IN STATE BUDGET

Chennai: Braving a loss of Rs 1,160 crore a year revenue, Tamil Nadu Finance Minister Palanivel Thiaga Rajan on Friday announced his decision to cut the effective rate of tax on petrol by Rs 3 per litre, thereby providing major relief to the toiling working class people in the State.



Contrary to the 'once in a generation reforms a must' statement made in the White Paper on the state finances, Rajan presented a relatively populist budget by not just reducing taxes on petrol, but also waiver of cooperative loans to self help groups, and tax amnesty scheme among others.

Fuel prices have been going up across the country and has touched Rs 100/litre. The DMK had promised to reduce petrol price by Rs 5/litre if voted to power. Now with the Rs 3 cut per litre, some relief will be offered to the consumer.

Taliban capture Kandahar in crushing blow for Afghan govt

The Taliban on Friday captured Kandahar, Afghanistan's second largest city, delivering a crushing blow for the government in Kabul and a major win for the militants.

The city was once the Taliban's stronghold, and is strategically important as a leading trade hub, the BBC reported. Kandahar is the latest provincial capital to fall, after Herat and Ghazni on Thursday.

Meanwhile, the US said it is sending nearly 3,000 troops back into Afghanistan to help evacuate staff from the American embassy. The US said it was sending troops to the airport in Kabul to help evacuate a "significant" number of embassy



staff on special flights. The UK said it was also deploying about 600 troops on a short-term basis to provide support to British nationals leaving the country. The insurgents have moved quickly, seizing new territories as the US and other foreign troops withdraw after 20 years of

military operations. Within hours of each other on Thursday some of Afghanistan's most important cities were captured - Herat, Ghazni and Qala-I-Naw came under Taliban control. A Taliban spokesman also announced that "Kandahar is completely conquered".

US EXIT FROM AFGHANISTAN COULD BE 'SEQUEL' TO VIETNAM HUMILIATION



Washington: US Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell has warned that America's retreat from Afghanistan risks a replay of the nations humiliating withdrawal from Saigon at the end of the Vietnam conflict in 1975. As thousands of American soldiers were ordered back to Kabul to evacuate the Embassy staff amid a rapid advance by the Taliban, McConnell said the US is "careening toward a massive, predictable, and preventable disaster", The Guardian reported.

The remark came as officials confirmed on Friday that the Taliban had captured Afghanistan's second biggest city, Kandahar, as well as Lashkar Gah in the south. The Taliban also claimed that they have captured the western city of Herat, the country's third-largest city, and Qala-e-Naw in the north-west.

BHOJPURI ACTRESS TROLLED AFTER PRIVATE VIDEO GETS LEAKED

Patna: Popular Bhojpuri actress Trisha Kar Madhu is making headlines for all the wrong reasons after a private video of her was leaked online. Madhu was spending a private time with her so-called boyfriend. After the video got leaked, Madhu took to social media to warn the people who reportedly made the video go viral on social media. However, she did not clarify as to who shot the video, or how did it reach the social media platforms. Madhu also put out a Facebook post where she said: "God is watching everything. In a bid to defame me, some people made this video viral. I did not even imagine that some people of Bihar are having such low standards." After the video went viral, the actress was even trolled on social media, with many saying that she did this intentionally to get publicity. The 27-year-old actress is a native of West Bengal and made her screen debut with the Bhojpuri serial "Ham Hai Hindustani". She has also featured in many item songs with the leading actors of the Bhojpuri film industry.





BRAVERY OF GALLANT HEROES LIKE VIKRAM BATRA TO INSPIRE GENERATIONS: RAJNATH

Centre releases another instalment of ECRP-II package for states

The Centre on Friday released the second instalment of 35 per cent of the Emergency Covid Response Plan II funds of Rs 14,744.99 crore to all states to effectively combat the pandemic.

Earlier, Rs 1,827.80 crore was released to all states and UTs as 15 per cent advance to undertake preparatory activities to speed up the implementation of the ECRP-II.

With the latest disbursement, 50 per cent of the funds have been released so as to ensure implementation of critical activities at the state and district levels to prepare the public healthcare systems in response to the covid pandemic.

In view of the second wave and its spread into rural, peri-urban, and tribal areas and the evolving pandemic situation, the Union Cabinet had, on July 8, approved the India



Covid-19 Emergency Response & Health System Preparedness Package: Phase-II (ECRP-II package), amounting to Rs 23,123 crore.

To be implemented from July 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022, the scheme aims to accelerate health system preparedness for immediate responsiveness for early prevention, detection and management, with a focus on health infrastructure development, including

for paediatric care, and with measurable outcomes. Under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) components of the ECRP-II, states/UTs have been supported by way of approvals for Emergency Covid Response Plans (ECRP) to the tune of Rs 14,744.99 crore.

The ECRP-I for Rs 15,000 crore was released to all states/UTs in April 2021 to prevent, detect and respond to the threat posed by Covid-19.

AFTER VILLAGERS PROTEST, NAVY CANCELS I-DAY FLAG HOISTING ON GOA ISLAND

Panaji: Following public pressure, the Indian Navy on Friday cancelled a flag hoisting ceremony on St. Jacinto island in South Goa, amid accusations from local villagers and politicians who alleged a government plot for a 'takeover' of the island.



"As part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' to commemorate 75 years of Independence, (the) Ministry of Defence has planned unfurling of National Flag in Islands across the nation between 13 and 15 Aug, 21. A team from Goa Naval Area visited islands of Goa including Sao Jacinto Island as part of this pan India initiative," the Indian Navy said in a statement on Friday. "However, the plan at Jacinto Island had to be cancelled as the same was objected to by the residents. This initiative was taken nationwide to instill a sense of patriotism and celebrate the run up to the 75th year of independence," the statement said. Earlier on Friday, villagers, led by state Nationalist Congress Party president Jose Phillip D'Souza, gathered in the church square on the island to protest against the flag hoisting ceremony planned by the naval authorities.

Supreme Court allows auction of 9,600 unclaimed flats in Amrapali projects

The Supreme Court was informed on Friday that nearly 9,600 home buyers, in various Amrapali housing projects, have not come forward to claim their flats.

A bench comprising Justices U.U. Lalit and Ajay Rastogi allowed the plea of the court-appointed receiver to treat these flats as unsold inventory, and if nobody comes forward to claim them, then the next step should be the cancellation of their allotment and auctioning



them to raise money for construction of the remaining unfinished projects.

The top court was informed that senior advocate R. Venkataramani, the court-appointed receiver,

emerged that about 9,583 home buyers have neither registered so far in the customer data maintained by the office of the receiver, nor have made any payments, subsequent to the judgment of the court in July 2019".

The bench added that a final notice should be given to these home buyers and if they don't come forward to claim these flats within 15 days, then the receiver can proceed to cancel the allotment. According to the court-appointed forensic audit report, these flats could be benami or bogus bookings.

INDIA COMMITTED TO PROVIDE GLOBAL STANDARDS OF SAFETY AND QUALITY TO CITIZENS: MODI

Launching the national vehicle scrapping policy, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said that the BJP government was committed to provide the people with global standards of safety and quality. The PM was virtually participating in the Investors Summit where seven pacts were inked between the government and industrial stakeholders regarding scrapping of vehicles. The Prime Minister requested youths and start-ups to join the programme.

The PM said, "India is committed to provide global standards to its citizens as far as safety and quality is concerned. The direct transition from BS-4 to BS-6 is a part of the very same thought process. The



government is working extensively at every level from research to infrastructural facilities for providing Green and Clean mobility in the country." "Currently the present scrapping procedure in the country is not productive. The energy recovery is next to nil. High strength steel alloy cannot be recovered to its full value. Precious metals also cannot be recovered. Last year, we had to import scrap steel worth Rs 23,000 crore," Modi said.

BJP rebels in touch with us, but Cong not in a hurry: Harish Rawat

The Congress in Uttarakhand is adopting a wait and watch policy in the wake of the internal rift in state BJP in the run up to the Assembly elections scheduled early next year. Former Uttarakhand Chief Minister and the chairman of Congress' campaign committee, Harish Rawat, told IANS, "The Congress is not in a hurry to take any decision on BJP rebels. However, many of them are in touch with us and a final call will be taken at an appropriate time." Though he did not disclose any names, sources said that those who had jumped ship from the Congress to the saffron camp are eyeing



a comeback, while some from the BJP too are looking to join the party, though the Congress will only back those who will prove to be beneficial to the party. Many prominent leaders, includ-

ing ex-Chief Minister Vijay Bahuguna, former ministers Harak Singh Rawat, Satpal Maharaj and Yashpal Arya had left the Congress for the saffron party, but some of them are reportedly upset ever since the BJP last month appointed Pushkar Singh Dhami as the new Chief Minister of Uttarakhand. Rawat alleged that the BJP has changed three Chief Ministers in the state in recent times and its leaders are fighting for themselves, and not working for the state. Stating that there is no dearth of issues in the state as unemployment and inflation are on the rise, Rawat said the government is in a denial mode, but the public is very much aware of the hardships they are facing.

Terrorist killed in Kashmir gunfight

One terrorist has been killed in an ongoing encounter between the terrorists and security forces in South Kashmir's Kulgam district, officials said on Friday.

Two security forces' personnel and two civilians have been injured in the encounter that started on Thursday.

"So far one terrorist killed. Complete search of building yet to be done," Kashmir police quoting Inspector General, Kashmir Vijay Kumar tweeted. Earlier, the police said on Thursday at about 3 p.m. terrorists fired upon

a convoy of the BSF on the Srinagar-Jammu National Highway near the Malpora Mir Bazar area of Kulgam. However, the fire was retaliated by Road Opening Party (ROP) of police and security forces. Reinforcement of the police and Army reached immediately and cordoned off the area. Besides, the joint party ensured not to give any chance to the terrorists to escape from the spot and the terrorists managed to take shelter in a nearby building.

The holed up terrorists fired indiscriminately upon the joint party of the police and security forces which retaliated leading to an encounter.

Assam, Bihar, UP, Jharkhand continue to face flood situation

Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, and Assam stay threatened by floods as per data from over 50 Central Water Commission (CWC) stations across these states, the CWC said on Friday.

One station in Bihar is showing extreme flood situation, 28 - 18 in Bihar, seven in Uttar Pradesh and one each in Assam, Jharkhand, and West Bengal - a severe flood situation and 24 stations - 12 are in Bihar, seven in Uttar Pradesh, and five in Assam, above normal flood situation, the CWC flood bulletin said.

Meanwhile, the Ganga basin comprising large parts of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand & West Bengal has been witnessing continuous flooding due to combined effect of river runoff from Yamuna and northern tributaries of Ganga, including those coming from Nepal.

The main Ganga is flowing in severe flood situations from Patna (Bihar) to Murshirabad (West Bengal), from Prayagraj to Ballia (both Uttar Pradesh), it is in falling to steady state, where as from Patna and downstream, it is flowing with rising trend.



Currently, Ganga, at the CWC site Hathidah in Patna district, is flowing above high flood level mark. The present water level observed at site is 43.22 m and expected water level at 8 a.m. of Saturday is 43.29 m. The middle reaches of the Ganga in districts such as Badaun and

Farrukhabad (Uttar Pradesh) are in above normal flood situations. River Ghaghra in Barabanki, Ayodhya and Ballia (UP) and Siwan and Saran (Bihar) districts is flowing in above normal flood situation.

Rivers Sone and Punpun are flowing in severe flood situation in Patna, and the Rapti is flowing in above normal situation in Balarampur district (UP), it said.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecasted heavy rainfall over the Rapti in next 24 hours, the release said, and suggested alert may be kept in Shravasti, Siddharth Nagar, Basti, Sant Kabir Nagar and Gorakhpur (UP) districts.

Currently the flood originated in tributaries of Yamuna last week is passing through Ganga and it may take another three to five days to pass through completely; in such situation, a further runoff created due to intense rainfall in the catchments of north tributaries of Ganga may not stream into Ganga easily. The flooding situation in districts such as Ballia and Prayagraj (UP), and Saran, Bhagalpur, Katihar (Bihar) may get accentuated, the CWC said.

Center's PM Cares for Children scheme for children orphaned by Covid epidemic



10 lakh rupees will be available at the age of 23. Beneficiaries of Chief Minister Covid-19 Child Service Scheme will also be eligible

Children whose parents, legal guardians or adoptive parents have died due to corona epidemic by the central government, they will be supported in the "PM Cares for Children" scheme. For this scheme the Chief Minister of the state Kovid- Child beneficiaries of 19 Bal Seva Yojana will also be eligible.

Assistance to child beneficiary in the scheme

In the PM Cares for Children scheme, a provision of Rs 10 lakh corpus has been made in the name of the child on the child beneficiary attaining the age of 18 years. Monthly financial assistance will be given to the child from

this corpus. 10 lakh will be given to the child beneficiary on attaining the age of 23 years. Under the Ayushman Bharat scheme, a health insurance cover of up to Rs 5 lakh will be given to the child beneficiary.

Under the scheme, by admitting the child beneficiary as a non-residential student in the nearest Kendriya Vidyalaya or private school till the age of 10 years, the fees will be borne by the Central Government as per the provisions of the Right to

Education. Apart from this, expenditure on books, notebooks, uniforms will also be provided to them.

Under PM Cares for Children scheme, when the child beneficiary is in the age group of 11 to 18 years, he will be admitted to Kendriya Residential Schools like Navodaya Vidyalaya, Sainik School etc. If the beneficiary is residing in a joint family, then the nearest Kendriya Vidyalaya or private school will be admitted as a non-residential student.

Application procedure

The process of identification of eligible children under the scheme will be done by the District Collector. The entry of all eligible children will be uploaded on the portal pmcaresforchildren.in. Apart from this, the application can be filled directly from the "Citizen Login" or the application can also be made from the login of the Child Welfare Committee. It is not mandatory for the parents to have a death certificate from Covid in the scheme. But the child will be benefited only after the collector is satisfied and verified about the death of the parents of the child due to Covid. Maximum 10 applications can be fed from one mobile number under Citizen Login.

Now, 24x7 COVID-19 vaccination centre in Bhopal

In a bid to speed up vaccination against COVID-19, the Madhya Pradesh health department on Friday set up another 24x7 centre in Bhopal, where citizens can get inoculated any time of the day, an official said.

The state government had earlier set up two such facilities at Katju Hospital and Rashidiya School in the state capital, the official said.

State Medical Education Minister Vishvas Sarang inaugurated the new centre



at Sardar Patel School in his constituency Narela in Bhopal district, he said.

Speaking on the occasion, the minister said the 24x7 vaccination facility will give people an option to take either doses of the vaccines and the registration can be done online or at the centre itself.

The state government is working hard to ensure that all eligible persons in the state are inoculated at the earliest, he added.

As per an official release, a total of 3,66,86,401 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in Madhya Pradesh so far.

Restrictions on direct recruitment in civil services relaxed

The state government has relaxed the restrictions on recruitment for civil services. It is noteworthy that the state government has authorized the administrative department, relaxing the condition imposed by the Finance Department in the year 2019 to fill up to 5 percent of the vacant posts of the total sanctioned posts for civil services. Concurrence of Finance Department will be necessary for approval to fill vacancies of more than five percent direct recruitment. Instructions have been issued by the Finance Department to complete the process of appointment on the vacant posts of direct recruitment expeditiously.

According to the circular issued by the Finance Department, the number of vacancies in direct recruitment will be counted in every civil service on the first January of the year. Those working on non-numbered posts will be taken into account against regular posts. 5 percent will be calculated on the basis of the total number of sanctioned posts in the cadre. Only 5 percent of the total number of posts of the cadre or the number of vacancies of direct recruitment of the cadre, whichever is less, the process of appointment can be done by the administrative department. For the process of appointment to the posts in excess of the limit, the procedure laid down by the Finance Department will have to be followed. It will be the responsibility of the concerned department to follow the other conditions prescribed for direct recruitment like reservation rules etc.

Madhya Pradesh becomes ideal state in wildlife conservation

The beauty of nature increases manifold due to the free movement of wild animals. Wild animals keep reminding them of the state of coexistence while living around the common people. Nature has made Madhya Pradesh a very rich green state. Therefore, Madhya Pradesh has spared no effort in creating a wildlife-rich state by paying special attention to wildlife conservation and management. The result is that the state has got the status of Tiger State. Now the number of leopards is also the highest in the country. In terms of number of alligators and vultures, it has come in a position to become number one at the national level. The pleasant aspect is that the Satpura Tiger Reserve has been included in the potential list of UNESCO World Heritage Site. Satpura Tiger Reserve is the ideal shelter for many wildlife including tigers and the most favorable place for breeding.

Vulture and alligator become pride

According to the state-wide vulture census conducted this year, there were 9446 vultures in the state, which is the highest in comparison to other states. The Vulture Conservation and Breeding



Center was established in 2013 in the Kerwa area of the capital Bhopal. It is jointly operated by the Bombay Natural History Society and the state government. In the report presented by Wildlife Trust India, maximum 1859 gharials are in Chambal Sanctuary. Four decades ago, when the number of alligators was on the verge of extinction, there were only 200 alligators left in the world. Of these, then

there were 96 in India and 46 in Chambal river. There are gharial breeding centers established at Deori in Morena district. The eggs of alligators are hatched safely. Alligator eggs are kept in the sand of hatchery at a temperature of 30 to 36 degrees. During this, calling comes from the eggs and the babies start coming out of it. When they grow up, the habitat is left naturally in the water area.

MADHYA PRADESH WILL REMAIN TIGER STATE

Three years ago in the year 2018, the state got the status of Tiger State with 526 tigers in the tiger census. About 60 percent of these tigers are available in tiger reserve areas and 40 percent in other forest areas. Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve has maximum 124 tigers. Based on the preliminary trends of tiger census to be held in three phases in October this year, it can be said with confidence that Madhya Pradesh will again be on top in terms of tiger population. This number is expected to exceed 700. The name of "Kalar Kali" tigress of Pench Tiger Reserve, which has made a very special contribution in getting the status of Tiger State, also holds the unique record of highest number of deliveries and birth of cubs in the world.

During the last one and a half decade under the leadership of Chief Minister Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan, this position has been achieved due to efforts of excellent and sustainable wildlife management. Efficiency and speedy disposal of animal-loss, human-injured and human-loss cases in forests outside protected areas, best management of human-wild-life conflict, strict control on wildlife crime, wildlife These proud achievements have been achieved by better management of habitats, participation of local communities in conservation efforts, displacement of villages from protected areas and availability of high quality additional wildlife habitats.

The number of tigers in the regional forest divisions of Balaghat district was zero till 9 years ago, whereas Kanha is an important component of the Pench corridor and has always been an excellent forest area of these forest divisions. As a result of the continuous efforts of the department, the presence of 30 to 40 tigers is now found in these forest divisions. The forest areas of districts like North Shahdol, Umaria, Katni, Dakshin Seoni, Chhindwara, Betul, Hoshangabad, Bhopal and Sehore etc. are examples of such.



DELTA+ : MAHA RECORDS 3RD DEATH IN RAIGAD

Maharashtra has reported its third death of a patient infected with the Delta Plus Covid-19 virus variant, as the total number of patients with the variant stood at over 65 till date, officials said.

A 69-year-old man diagnosed with Delta Plus has succumbed in Nagothane, Raigad, while a middle-aged woman infected by the same variant is under treatment in nearby Uran town.

Late Thursday, the BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) received the Delta Plus positive sample reports of a 60-year-old woman from the eastern suburbs of the city, who had passed away on July 24.

Prior to that, the first patient of Delta Plus in the state -- an 80-year-old man -- had expired in Ratnagiri on June 25, said the officials.

On Wednesday, the Maharashtra Health Department had pegged the number of Delta Plus variant patients in the state at 65 till date, as per data from the Institute of Genomics Integrative Biology lab.

Among these 65, the highest 13 are from Jalgaon, 12 from Ratnagiri, 11 from Mumbai, six each in Thane and Pune, three in Palghar, two



each in Raigad, Nanded, and Gondia, and one each from Sindhudurg, Aurangabad, Kolhapur, Sangli, Beed, Nandurbar, Akola, and Chandrapur. The patients include 33 women and 32 men, and a whopping 33 cases -- or nearly half -- of those infected are in the 19-45 age group, while 17 are 46-60 years and seven in above-60 age group.

As a precaution, the Health Department has started searching for the close contacts of these infectees on a war footing, their travel history, vaccination status, recent medical status and other relevant details to prevent more infections, said the officials.

Bombay HC hopes Maha Governor will clear list of 12 MLCs soon

Commenting on the delay by the Maharashtra Governor in clearing the list of 12 nominated Members of Legislative Council, the Bombay High Court on Friday said that "eight months was more than enough time" and expressed hope that the matter would be resolved soon. Disposing off a PIL, a division bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice G.S. Kulkarni said that under Article 361 of the Constitution, the court could not give any directions to the Governor on the matter.

However, it also expressed the clear view that it was the Governor's duty to inform the

Chief Minister about his reservations to the nominations "within a reasonable time", failing which "the statutory intent would stand defeated". The Maha Vikas Aghadi's council of ministers, headed by Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, had, in November 2020, submitted the list of nominated MLCs to Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari and the bench felt that "eight months on facts seems to be beyond reasonable time".

The court added that considering the gravity of the issues involved and the necessity to fill up the 12 vacancies as well as the aims of the Constitution, "would consider it desirable" if the government's application "is discharged without undue delay".

Drug peddlers again attack Mumbai NCB sleuths

For the third time in nine months, a Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) team was attacked by armed drug peddlers, including some foreigners, during a raid late on Thursday, officials said here on Friday.

The shocking incident happened at Mankhurd in the northeast suburbs of Mumbai when the NCB team was following a tip-off on a gang of foreigner drug peddlers operating from the forests near the railway lines, NCB Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede said. "The gang of drug-peddlers suddenly

pounced on the NCB team with weapons, machetes, and stones. One of the officials suffered a head injury while 4 others suffered superficial wounds," he said.

This is the second attack on the NCB sleuths in a week and the third in 9 months, since the November 2020 incident in Goregaon by aggressive drug peddlers fighting the anti-narcotics actions against them. However, the NCB managed to nab one Nigerian and seized a huge haul of drugs comprising 7.5 gms cocaine, 254 gms heroin and 52 gms Mephedrone, totally valued over Rs 1 Crore in the illicit markets, he said.

Following secret tips that a gang of 4-5 foreigners was conducting the illicit drug peddling business, the NCB laid a trap and intercepted Obiorah Ekwelar of Nigeria's Onisha. The gang, carrying weapons had become a nuisance for the entire area as they operated from the swampy area near the Mankhurd railway lines with the Thane Creek on one side, and many locals had complained of the menace. While Ekwelar was arrested, the others managed to escape taking advantage of the difficult terrain and the darkness, said the NCB.

NO CHANGE IN FUEL PRICES

Mumbai:

Petrol and diesel prices in the country remained static for the 27th consecutive day on Friday. Accordingly, in the national capital, petrol continued to be sold at Rs 101.84 per litre, while diesel was unchanged at Rs 89.87 a litre. Global crude prices have now softened to just around \$71 a barrel after it swung in all directions in July starting with a low of \$70 a barrel to quickly rise to over \$77 a barrel, only to fall soon below \$70 a barrel and crossing \$75 a barrel later in the month.

Lower oil and product prices should have actually resulted in consumers getting relief by way of a cut in retail price of petrol and diesel, rather, the OMCs have decided it's best to wait and watch the disruption now as crude price are still swinging. The pump price of fuel has been static since July 18. In Mumbai, petrol is at Rs 107.83 per litre and diesel at Rs 97.45, the highest among metros.

ED files charge sheet against ex-Maha MLA in money laundering probe

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has filed a charge sheet against former Maharashtra MLA Vivekanand Shankar Patil and Karnala Nagari Sahakari Bank Ltd in connection with an Rs 560 crore money laundering probe, officials said.

An ED official here said that the agency filed a charge sheet against Patil, a four time Peasants and Workers Party MLA and also ex-Chairman of the Panvel-based cooperative bank, and against the bank under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act.

The ED case of money-laundering is based on the FIR lodged by the Economic Offences Wing of Navi Mumbai police last year against 76 persons after the Reserve Bank of India detected the fraud following an audit. The official said that the audit revealed that Patil was siphoning off funds since 2008 from the bank through 63 fictitious loan accounts to the loan accounts of



Karnala Charitable Trust and Karnala Sports Academy, which were founded by him. It was found that management of the bank was under his control.

The ED arrested him on June 15 this year. The official said that the PMLA probe against Patil revealed that the defrauded amount was to the tune of approximately Rs 560 crore, including interest in respect of 67 fictitious accounts. He said that to hide the siphoning, the available funds were routed to these ficti-

tious accounts and from these accounts to the several bank accounts of entities founded or controlled by Patil. "These funds were utilised by the Karnala Charitable Trust, Karnala Sports Academy etc for construction of properties such as Sports Complex, College and Schools and for other personal gains, thereby using the proceeds of crime and projecting the same as un-tainted in contravention of offence of money laundering," he added.

Maharashtra Adds 6,388 Fresh Covid Cases, Deaths Top 200 After 11 Days

The official said among the eight regions of Maharashtra, the Pune region reported the highest 2,828 new COVID-19 cases followed by 1,472 cases in the Kolhapur region. Maharashtra reported 6,388 new coronavirus cases and 208 fresh fatalities on Thursday, taking the infection tally to 63,75,390 and the death toll to 1,34,572, a health department official said. Notably, the daily coronavirus infections in the state have gone over 6,000 after a gap of four days, while for the first time since July 31, the fatalities have crossed the 200-mark.

The state witnessed an increase in Covid-19 cases and fatalities as compared to Wednesday, when it had reported 5,560 infections and 163 deaths. The official said 8,390 patients



were discharged from hospitals across the state in the last 24 hours, taking the cumulative number of recovered cases to 61,75,010. Maharashtra now has 62,351 active

cases, he said. The state has 3,98,397 people in home quarantine and 2,507 in institutional quarantine, according to the official. Maharashtra's Covid-19 recovery

rate now stands at 96.86 per cent, while the fatality rate is 2.11 per cent, he said. The cumulative number of tests conducted in the state climbed to 5,03,26,812, of which 2,10,674 were done in the last 24 hours, the official said.

He said Mumbai city witnessed 281 new COVID-19 cases and seven deaths, while Pune city reported 313 fresh infections and two fatalities. Among 62,351 active cases in the state, Pune district has the highest at 14,423, according to the official.

He said among the 61,75,010 recovered patients across the state, the highest - 10,67,600 - were from Pune district. Coronavirus figures for Maharashtra are as follows: Total cases 63,75,390; new cases 6,388; total deaths 1,34,572; total recoveries 61,75,010; active cases 62,351; total tests 5,03,26,812.

2 callers impersonate Sharad Pawar, police nab one suspect

In a bizarre development, two persons allegedly impersonated Nationalist Congress Party President Sharad Pawar in two different incidents in Mumbai and Pune, sending shockwaves in the political circles on Thursday. Separate complaints were lodged with the Chakan Police in Pune and the Gamdevi Police in Mumbai, leading to the detention of one suspect. Further investigations are underway. In both instances, the callers made calls from a number purportedly belonging to Pawar's residence -- Silver Oaks in south Mumbai -- and 'spoke' in his voice.

In the first instance, a call was made to a senior bureaucrat in the Mantralaya seeking some official favour, with the caller claiming to be calling from the home of Pawar. The alert officer, smelling something fishy, called back Silver Oaks to verify the call, only to



discover that the 81-year old leader was even not present at home.

Thereafter, a complaint was lodged with the Gamdevi Police, who are investigating the matter after detaining one suspect from Pune.

In the Pune incident, the caller imitating Pawar's voice allegedly made some demands pertaining to an old business deal, but the other party smelt a rat and lodged a police complaint. However, the exact nature of the conversations in both the incidents is not clear yet. Senior NCP leaders like Jitendra Awhad, Mahesh Tapase, besides opposition leaders Devendra Fadnis and Pravin Darekar have expressed shock over the incidents, raising security and other implications. They have demanded that the police should track the culprits and take stringent action against them for impersonating one of the senior-most political leaders in the country.

NIO BACKS DOWN ON STUDY ON MICROPLASTIC TRACES IN GOA TAP WATER

A day after a scientist attached to the Goa-based National Institute of Oceanography (NIO) confirmed the presence of microplastics in government tap water in various parts of the state, the top marine research institute in a clarification on Thursday said that the study conducted along with a consultancy firm was preliminary in nature and "firm conclusions on the risk associated with ingestion of microplastic particles through drinking-water" could not be determined.

The clarification was issued by the NIO, along with an official statement from the Chief Minister's office on Thursday, which also questioned the authenticity of the study, adding that the state government had not been officially contacted during the research.

"The report only indicates the presence of microplastics in tap water and in water reservoirs. The findings of the current report does not make any assessment on the quality of drinking water... Although this study is made on

the tap water collected from Goa but presence of microplastics can be identified in tapwaters from other states and cities too," the NIO said in its clarification on Thursday.

"The sole purpose of the study is academic and finding scientific data. We have just reported the preliminary study based on a one time sample collection. Based on this limited body of evidence, firm conclusions and the risk associated with ingestion of microplastic particles through drinking-water cannot yet be determined," the report states, adding that the "no data suggests overt health concerns associated with exposure to microplastic particles through drinking-water".

On Wednesday, NIO scientist Mahua Saha, along with a research consulting agency, Delhi-based "Toxic Links" at a press conference had said that 26 types of polymers were detect-



ed in samples sourced from tap water and treatment plants in Goa, which raised serious concerns about exposure of microplastic exposure for the residents of the state.

In a statement, the Chief Minister's Office has questioned the authenticity of the study's findings, basis and methodology.

"The research agency nor Dr. Mahua Saha during their research study never approached this Department and the findings of their research study was also not shared with the Department and why Goa was selected for the study is also surprising," the CMO statement said.

"Hence, the authenticity of this team led by Dr. Mahua needs to be looked upon and the team has to indicate/inform the reasons why testing was not carried out in other states and also for bottled water and what are their future plans," the statement said.

Pollution Control Boards are non-transparent

A majority of India's pollution control agencies remain closed entities when it came to sharing information with the public with a mere handful of India's pollution control boards and authorities are adequately putting out environmental and governance information into the public domain, a new rating study by Centre for Science and Environment (CSE). For calculating the Transparency Index and rating of pollution control boards on public disclosure - as the study is titled - the CSE assessed the data disclosure performance of 29 state pollution control boards (PCBs) and six pollution control committees from across the country. Of these, only 17 boards and committees scored 50 per cent or above. These are from Odisha, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Goa, Karnataka, Haryana, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, Maharashtra, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Andhra Pradesh and Rajasthan. CSE says that Governance and functioning-related data remains paper-bound: Information on functioning, actions taken by a board against polluting industries, public hearing data on new projects etc are rarely disclosed or remain difficult to access on the websites. Only 12 states have shared their latest annual reports on their websites and only five boards have shared minutes of their board meetings on their websites: It is mandatory for SPCBs to meet at least once every three months. Board members in these meetings are supposed to discuss issues related to the functioning of the board, action plans, compliance and monitoring, and devising innovative methods to improve enforcement of laws. Putting in the public domain the crucial pollution-related information, data and details of actions taken is critical - it can help policy-makers take the discussions to the next level of pollution management. SPCBs and SPCCs, therefore, must focus urgently to become more transparent by putting out data and improving the quality of their outreach for public engagement."

IMRAN KHAN BLOWS UP THE COVER -- REVEALS PAKISTAN AND TALIBAN ARE CONJOINED TWINS

Pakistan's garrulous Prime Minister Imran Khan has made an astounding foot-in-the-mouth statement. Speaking on behalf of the Taliban, he revealed that the extremist will not hold peaceful negotiations so long as Afghanistan's elected president remained in power. By making, some would say, a not-so-smart statement, the Pakistani Prime Minister has blown up the cover. He has simply confirmed, which insiders always knew, that Islamabad and the Taliban were conjoined twins, and any attempt to separate the two was fiction, scripted by the generals occupying the General Headquarters in Rawalpindi, amplified by their bullhorns in high places. In an open confession that the Taliban is in touch with Pakistan on the inside, the Pakistani Prime Minister made it clear that the Taliban will not talk to the present Afghan government led by the president Ashraf Ghani. According to the Dawn newspaper, Khan told the media that he did try to persuade the Taliban leaders when they were visiting Pakistan to reach a settlement. "The condition is that as long as President Ashraf Ghani is there, we (Taliban) are not going to talk to the Afghan government," Khan said, quoting the Taliban leaders as telling him. Talking to foreign journalists in Islamabad, the Pakistani PM said he tried to persuade the

Taliban to negotiate with the Afghan government, but Taliban leaders refused to talk about the political settlement, saying that it is difficult in the current Afghan situation. But it was equally obvious that no attempt was made to pressurise the Taliban, dependent on Pakistani supplies lines to change course. According to Pakistani sources, Imran Khan told foreign journalists that the group viewed Ghani and his government as US puppets and that was the reason why the Doha talks had been "stalled" by the Taliban. When asked about Pakistan providing safe heavens to the Taliban and Pakistani soldiers fighting in Afghanistan, Khan once again denied and called this anti-Pakistan propaganda. "When they say that Pakistan gave safe havens, sanctuaries to Taliban, where are these safe havens? There are camps of 100,000 people. And Taliban are not some military outfits. They are normal civilians. And if there are some civilians in these camps, how is Pakistan supposed to hunt these people down?" Khan repeated the same argument. He added the world has pressurised Pakistan to take military action. No country has done more than Pakistan to bring the Afghan Taliban to the negotiating table and it is very unfair to blame Pakistan for what is happening in Afghanistan. Blaming the US and president Joe Biden, Khan said that the US is currently putting pressure on Pakistan to influence the Taliban

to come back to the negotiation table. But that is not possible. Pakistan is useful only in the context of the "mess" it is leaving behind in Afghanistan after 20 years of fighting, Khan observed. The former cricketer is miffed with US president Joe Biden has not called him -- a call that he has been waiting for since Biden took charge of the US presidency in January this year. Khan's problem is that Biden has been talking to his neighbours -- Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Afghan President Ashraf Ghani. "I think that the Americans have decided that India is their strategic partner now, and I think that's why there's a different way of treating Pakistan now," Khan observed. In an interview with The Financial Times, National Security Adviser Moeed Yusuf said Pakistan has other "options" if President Biden keeps ignoring "calls" from the Pakistani PM. For the last two days #SanctionPakistan hashtag has been trending on twitter with more than eight lakh tweets as the Taliban's onslaughts on Afghans are on rise. Netizens believe that without Pakistan's active support, the Taliban could not have come so far. One of the main proponents of the trend has been a prominent Afghan journalist Habib Khan Tokhail. "If you are Afghan or a friend of Afghanistan, speak up," he tweeted. Pakistani Information minister Chaudhry



Fawad Hussain and NSA Moeed Yusuf were quick to blame India for the tweets. Releasing a "Deep Analytics Report" on "Anti-State Trends prepared by the Digital Media Wing of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Yusuf said that Pakistan will expose those who are behind this anti-Pakistan campaign. Reacting to this, Reham Khan said in a post, "I'm embarrassed to share this by the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting of Pakistan. Naming me & others as Anti State because we raise human rights violations, the issue of missing persons & mysterious killings is only humiliating the state. Don't defame Pakistan officially." NE India's 2nd Toy Train service to launch in Arunachal

Sujit Chakraborty To attract tourists, northeast India's second Toy Train service after eastern Assam's Tinsukia district would be introduced in the picturesque town of Tawang in Arunachal Pradesh on the international borders with China and Bhutan, top officials said on Friday. A senior official of Arunachal Pradesh government said that Chief Minister Pema Khandu, while meeting the officials of Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) led by its General Manager Anshul Gupta on Thursday, gave his nod to the proposal of the NFR to launch the 'Toy Train Project' in Tawang in western Arunachal

Pradesh. Gupta told the Chief Minister that the project envisages a tourist-centric Toy Train service in and around Tawang that would include a park with facilities like food courts and craft bazaar, among other amenities. The Toy Train would have at least three bogies carrying 12 passengers each. A team of NFR officials and engineers is set to visit Tawang next week for a joint survey and finalisation of the project with the Tawang district administration. "Gupta has assured that once everything is settled, NFR would complete the project within six months," an official from the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) told correspondent. The NFR is

already in the process of constructing a broad-gauge railway line from Bhalukpong in the foothills to Tawang, covering a distance of 378 km reaching a height of 10,000 ft, of which about 80 per cent will pass through tunnels. Tawang houses India's largest Buddhist monastery, which was founded with the help of the local people by Mera Lama Lodre Gyatso in late 1681. The NFR's Chief Public Relations Officer (CPRO), Subhanan Chanda, said that the entire cost of Rs 4 crore for the Toy Train Project would be borne by the state government and the Railways would lay 400 to 500 metre new railway track for introducing the service in Tawang, which is situated at a

height of 3,500-metre from the sea level on the mountainous range of northern Himalayas. "The Toy Train service would be the second of its kind in northeast India after the facility operational for many years in the Railway Heritage Park-cum-Museum in eastern Assam's Tinsukia district. The museum also seeks to promote and preserve the rich heritage of Indian railways," Chanda told correspondent. Tinsukia's Railway Heritage Park-cum-Museum includes centuries-old trains ranging from Britain-built original turntable manu-

factured in 1892, and railway wheels used by the US Army during the Second World War, among others. The NFR, which has already connected Guwahati (adjoining capital Dispur), Tripura and Itanagar, is laying tracks to connect the capital cities of three more northeastern states -- Imphal, Aizawl and Kohima -- by 2023-24. The NFR, one among the 17 railway zones in India, operates fully and partially in six of the eight northeastern states, excluding Meghalaya and Sikkim, along with seven districts of West Bengal and five in north Bihar.

HERAT GOVERNOR, ISMAIL KHAN SURRENDER TO TALIBAN AS CITY FALLS

Kabul: Former mujahedeen leader Mohammad Ismail Khan has surrendered to the Taliban as Herat, the third-largest city in Afghanistan, fell to the Taliban on Friday. All key government institutions were captured by the group. All government officials, including Herat Governor, police chief, head of the NDS office in Herat, former mujahedeen leader Mohammad Ismail Khan, the Deputy Minister of Interior for Security, and the 207 Zafar Corps commander surrendered to the Taliban after the province fell to the group, media reports said. Clashes on the outskirts of Herat city were underway for almost three weeks as the Taliban faced resistance by the security and defense forces who were accompanied by public uprising forces led by Ismail Khan. This comes as Nimroz, Farah, Ghor and Badghis provinces, all located in the west zone, have also fallen to the Taliban in the last one week. The Taliban so far have captured at least 17 provincial capitals. Heavy clashes are underway in the centre of Logar province, 70 km south of Kabul city.



Zambia 'restricts' WhatsApp, Twitter on polling day

Team Absolute | New Delhi As social media platforms face greater scrutiny in several countries, including in India, Zambia has restricted the use of WhatsApp, Twitter, Facebook, Instagram and Messenger on the general election day on Friday. Several users from the country took to Twitter informing that WhatsApp has been restricted amid the ongoing general elections. Internet monitoring firm Netblocks tweeted that Zambia has restricted access to various social messaging platforms. "Warning sign Update: Real-time network data confirm that social media and messaging platforms including Twitter, Facebook,



Instagram and Messenger are now restricted in #Zambia on election day in addition to the earlier WhatsApp restriction," the organisation posted. "WhatsApp messaging app restricted in #Zambia on election day; real-time network data show loss of service on multiple internet providers as polls get underway, corroborating widespread user reports," it added. The Zambian govern-

ment, however, denied the reports, calling them "malicious." "The government expects citizens to use the Internet responsibly. But if some people choose to abuse the internet to mislead and misinform, the government will not hesitate to invoke relevant legal provisions to forestall any breakdown of law and order as the country passes through the election period," Information and Broadcasting Services Permanent Secretary, Amos Malupenga was quoted as saying in reports. Several African nations like Cameroon, Congo, Uganda, Tanzania, Guinea, Togo, Benin, Mali and Mauritania have faced social media restrictions and Internet shutdowns during elections in the past.

FLASH FLOODS KILL 27 PEOPLE IN TURKEY

Ankara | Agencies Flash floods that hit three provinces in Turkey's Black Sea region have killed at least 27 people, the country's disaster management authority said on Friday. Turkey's Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency said that 25 people died in Kastamonu province and two others in Sinop, while one person was reported missing in Bartin, reports Xinhua news agency. Rescue workers evacuated more than 1,700 people by boat and helicopter, it said. Nearly 1,000 people took shelter in student dormitories. However, some media reported the number of missing at 100. "This is the heaviest flood disaster I have ever seen," Interior Minister Suleyman Soyulu told reporters on the scene. Soyulu said the damage in infrastructure was significant, and efforts to bring life back to normal continued non-stop. Videos aired by broadcasters showed extensive damage in the area, including collapsed buildings, damaged bridges, heavy debris along the roads, and cars piled up.



DOHA MEETING ON AFGHANISTAN CALLS FOR CEASEFIRE

Doha | Agencies Representatives of countries taking part in the Doha meeting on Afghanistan have called on the Afghan warring parties to expedite the peace process, reach a political settlement and comprehensive ceasefire as quickly as possible, stressing their rejection of any government imposed by force. Issued on Thursday evening at the final session of the meeting, a joint statement made it clear that the participants have agreed on the need to accelerate the peace process as a very urgent and key issue for negotiating concrete proposals between the Afghan government and the Taliban, reports Xinhua news agency. The participants said that they would not recognise any government in Afghanistan that is forcibly imposed and are much concerned about the ongoing violence, large numbers of civilian casualties, allegations of human rights violations, and destruction of infrastructure, which prolongs conflict and makes reconciliation efforts more difficult. They pledged to provide assistance



to reconstruction process once a viable political settlement is reached between the two sides. The statement stressed the guidelines of the political settlement, which include all-out governance, respect for human rights including the rights of women and minorities, mechanism for forming a representative government, the commitment not to make Afghan territory a threat to other countries, and respect for the international law, including international humanitarian one. The participants called upon all

Afghan parties to act in accordance with these guidelines and build upon them in the future political settlement, according to the statement. At the invitation of Qatar, special envoys and representatives from China, Russia, Pakistan, the US and the UN, as well as other regional countries and international organisations, have gathered in Doha since Tuesday to hold talks over the deteriorating security situation in Afghanistan. Through exchanging views with the representatives of the Afghan government and Taliban, the participants have been discussing contributions that the international community can make to helping the peace process. Since the withdrawal of the US-led forces on May 1, the Taliban has continued to gain ground in Afghanistan. On Friday, the Taliban took control over the key southern Afghan cities of Lashkar Gah and Kandahar, after weeks of heavy clashes. The insurgent group captured Ghazni city, the capital of eastern Ghazni province on Thursday, bringing the number of provincial capitals captured so far to more than 10 in less than a week.

SEVERAL KILLED IN SHOOTING IN UK'S PLYMOUTH

London: Several people were killed in a shooting in Plymouth, a port city in Devon in southwest England, on Thursday evening. Devon and Cornwall Police said in a series of tweets that police were called to "a serious firearms incident" in the Keyham area of Plymouth at around 6.10 p.m., the Xinhua news agency reported. "There have been a number of fatalities at the scene and several other casualties are receiving treatment. A critical incident has been declared," it said. "The area has been cordoned off and police believe the situation is contained," it added. Luke Pollard, Member of Parliament for Plymouth, Sutton and Devonport, called it "a very grim day for our city and our community" on Twitter and advised people not to share any images or videos of any of the victims. "The incident in Plymouth is shocking and my thoughts are with those affected," British Home Secretary Priti Patel tweeted.

Global Covid-19 caseload tops 205.3 mn

Washington | Agencies The global coronavirus caseload has topped 205.3 million, while the deaths have surged to more than 4.33 million and vaccinations soared to over 4.57 billion, according to the Johns Hopkins University. In its latest update on Friday morning, the University's Center for Systems Science and Engineering (CSSE) revealed that the current global caseload, death toll and vaccination tally stood at 205,368,850, 4,334,088 and 4,570,571,196, respectively. The US continues to be the worst-hit country with the world's highest number of cases and deaths at 36,305,005 and 619,098, respectively, according to the CSSE. In terms of infections, India follows in the second place with 32,077,706 cases. The other worst countries with over 3 million cases are Brazil (20,285,067), France (6,469,753), Russia (6,447,229), the UK (6,208,908), Turkey (6,018,455),



Argentina (5,066,253), Colombia (4,856,595), Spain (4,677,883), Italy (4,420,429), Iran (4,320,266), Germany (3,814,335), Indonesia (3,774,155) and Mexico (3,020,596), the CSSE figures showed. In terms of deaths, Brazil comes second with 566,896 fatalities. Nations with a death toll of over 100,000 are India (429,669), Mexico (246,203), Peru (197,146), Russia (165,201), the UK (131,016), Italy (128,334), Colombia (123,097), Indonesia (113,664), France (112,700) and Argentina (108,569).


Cameron Diaz: QUIT ACTING TO MAKE LIFE MANAGEABLE

ROOT TAKES ENGLAND TO 119/3 AFTER INDIA SCORE 364 ON DAY 2

Skipper Joe Root defied Indian bowlers (48 not out off 75 balls) as England went to stumps at 119/3 on Day 2 of the second Test here at Lord's on Friday. They are still 245 runs adrift of the 364 that India made in their first innings. England, who lost two wickets off successive balls immediately after tea to Mohammed Siraj (2/34), were reduced to 23 for two before Root and opener Rory Burns (49) added 85 for the third wicket to stabilise the innings.

However, towards the end of play on Friday, pacer Mohammed Shami struck to get rid of Burns leg-before to bring India back. Jonny Bairstow (6 off 17 balls) saw off the day in the company of Joe Root. India were earlier bowled out for 364, adding only 88 to their overnight 276/3 as James Anderson (5/62) took his 31st five-wicket haul. India lost centurion K.L. Rahul and vice-captain Ajinkya Rahane early. Though Rishabh Pant and Ravindra Jadeja offered resistance, the tail failed to wag as India were all out soon after lunch. Centurion Rahul was the first to go. He could add only two runs to his overnight score and fell for 129, lobbing a catch to cover off Ollie Robinson on the second ball of the day.

Five balls later, Anderson forced Ajinkya



Rahane to nick his first ball of the day to slips as India were reduced to 282/5 from the overnight 276/3. Wicketkeeper-batsman Rishabh Pant and Ravindra Jadeja added 49 in 18.5 overs for the sixth wicket before the former fell when he nicked an attempted cut off Mark Wood to wicketkeeper Jos Buttler, 30 minutes before the end of the first session. Mohammed Shami was dismissed by Moeen Ali soon after as India went for lunch at 346/7. With Jadeja at crease, India were hoping they would get close to 400. Both Jadeja and pace bowler Ishant Sharma hung around after lunch before the latter

fell to an Anderson beauty which jagged back in and caught him LBW. Bumrah was dismissed by Anderson for his fifth wicket on the last ball of his 29th and Indian innings' 126th over and on the first ball of the next over by Mark Wood, Jadeja was caught at mid-on. He added, "I feel more complete as a cricketer and a human being and I am ready to take the leap of faith and enter into a new territory and contribute my best." Since his debut in 2010, Chand played in 67 First-Class matches, scoring 3379 runs with an average of 31.57. In 120 List A matches, Chand amassed 4505 runs at an average of 41.33. In 77 T20s, he made 1565 runs at an average of 22.35.

LUKAKU RETURNS TO CHELSEA FOR 97.5M POUNDS
