Paralympic: Indian contingents remained on top (in different games) at the podium

GOLD, SILVER, BRONZE

- It was double delight for India at the Asaka Shooting Range on Saturday as Manish Narwal and Singhraj won gold and silver respectively as they finished 1-2 in the P4 - Mixed 50m Pistol SH1 at the Tokyo Paralympic Games here.
- Narwal shot a Paralympic record 218 in the final while Singhraj, who had won a bronze medal in the 10m Air Pistol SH1 earlier this week, finished second with a score of 216.7. Sergey Malyshev of the Russian Paralympic Committee (RPC) took bronze with a score of 196.8.



surge to the top of the list. Narwal is the world record holder in the final, set at Al Ain, UAE, in March this year.

Singhraj, 39, shot into the lead after the first elimination round but Malyshev soon came back to open up a two-point lead as Uzbekistan's Server Ibragimov, who topped the qualifying, Iran's Sareh Javanmardi and Serbia's Zivko Papaz all got eliminated one after another.

Narwal remained calm and composed and shot a couple of 10s to claw back into contention, moving to fifth position with 104.3 points. Singhraj was consistent enough to hold on to the third position.

In the second elimination round, Singhraj and Manish were lurking behind each other in fourth and fifth positions with Malyshev leading followed by two Chinese Lou Xiaolong, and Chao Yang in second and third. However, the tables turned with the Chinese slipping to the fourth and fifth with scores of 7.5 and 8.7 respectively and Indians Narwal and Singhraj taking up third and fourth positions.

Haryana announces rewards for 2 Tokyo Paralympics medallists

Chandigarh: Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar on Saturday announced a reward of Rs six crore and Rs four crore respectively along with government jobs for Manish Narwal for taking gold and Singhraj for taking silver in the mixed 50m pistol event at the Tokyo Paralympic games. Both the medal winners are from Faridabad district in the state. Khattar said as per the state's sports policy, awards, government jobs and other facilities for paralympic players are on par with other sportspersons.

ing smoothly, buckled under pressure and shot 6.9 and 8.5, and Narwal shot a 10 and Singhraj 9.2 to jump to the top two positions, the Russian settling for bronze.

In the next two shots, Narwal managed 8.4 and 9.1 while Singhraj made 8.5 and 9.4 respectively but that was not enough for him to overtake Narwal and Singhraj had to be satisfied with the silver, his second medal at Tokyo 202.

Bhagat wins first gold for India in badminton

Tokyo: Pramod Bhagat became the first badminton player from India to win a gold medal at the Olympics or Paralympic Games, beating Great Britain's Daniel Bathell 2-0 in the Men's Singles SL3 final at the Tokyo Paralympic Games on Saturday. Bhagat, the 33-year-old from Bhubaneswar who contracted polio at age four, defeated the Briton 21-14, 21-17, coming back from 4-9 deficit in the second game to claim his first gold medal as badminton made its Paralympic Games debut at Tokyo. PV Sindhu's silver medal in the 2016 Olympics at Rio de Janeiro was the previous best for India in the Olympics and Paralympics. Sindhu has also won a bronze medal at Tokyo 2020 Olympics last month. Bhagat, the top-ranked player in the world, is the reigning World Champion in SL3 class having won the title by beating Bathell in the final in Basel, Switzerland in 2019.



Manoj Sarkar wins Bronze

Compatriot Manoj Sarkar, who had lost to Bathell in the semifinal, came back strongly to beat Japan's Fujihara Daisuke 2-0 in the bronze medal match. Sarkar, ranked fourth in the world, trailed initially but fought back to win the first game 22-20 in 22 minutes. He then rode the momentum to win the second game 21-13 to win the bronze medal at the Yoyogi National Stadium.



Govt revises NLEM: Slashes prices of 39 common drugs

The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has been working for a long time to extend price control on medicines. The Standing National Committee on Medicines was tasked with preparing the list of which medicines should be available in adequate numbers and assured quantity.

Revising the 'National List of Essential Medicines' (NLEM), the central government has slashed the prices of 39 commonly used drugs.

The prices were slashed for the anti-cancer, anti-diabetes, antiviral, antibacterial, anti-retroviral, anti-TB drugs, and also for some that are used in Covid treatment. The experts working on the NLEM list have deleted 16 odd drugs from the list.

The commonly used drugs, which were brought under the price cap includes Teneeligiptin -- an anti-diabetes drug, popular anti-TB drugs, Ivermectin -- used in Covid treatment, Rotavirus vaccine, among others.



The government had begun an exercise for the revision of the NLEM, which was notified in 2015 and implemented in 2016. It is a departure from the present practice, where all essential medicines automatically go under price control.

The committee headed by Balram Bhargava, Secretary

in the Department of Health Research and Director General of the ICMR, send the list to a second committee comprising senior officials from NITI Aayog, Health Secretary and Secretary in the Department of Pharmaceuticals, which decides on which drugs are to be put under the price cap.

Ex-Haryana CM Chautala finally clears Class 10 English paper

Chandigarh: Former Haryana chief minister Om Prakash Chautala scored 88 marks out of 100 in the English paper in the class X exam, the state's Board of School Education said on Saturday. The board announced the results of the supplementary examination. Chautala last month passed the class XII exam but the result was withheld as he hadn't cleared the English paper for class X. He had enrolled in class XII of the board's Open School last year but exams couldn't be held because of the pandemic.

The Chief Justice of India, NV. Ramana, on Saturday thanked the Centre for clearing the names of nine judges in record six days after they were recommended for elevation to the top court by the collegium, and emphasised that he expects the names of judges for appointment at various high courts are also cleared in the same speed.

The CJI was speaking at a felicitation function organised here by the Bar Council of India. It was attended by Law Minister Kiran Rijju and several top court judges, days after the appointment of three women judges, including a future woman Chief Justice, and six other judges at one go in the top court. According to the latest



data, there are 465 vacancies in the high courts across the country against a total strength of 1,098 judges. On Friday night, the Supreme Court collegium sent as many as 68 names -- the highest at one go -- to the Centre for appointment as judges at 12 high courts. Out of the 68, there are 44 lawyers while 24 are judicial officers. Ten

out of the 68 are women. The top court collegium has made the recommendations for the high courts of Allahabad, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Punjab and Haryana, Calcutta, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Gauhati, Karnataka, Madras, Kerala and Jammu and Kashmir. Maximum recommendations have been made for the Allahabad High Court.

The top court collegium has sent the name of Manoj Vankar, the first woman judicial officer from Mizoram, for elevation to the Gauhati high court.

Girls with unconventional careers

Rajasthan, which was once known for its low sex ratio and lower literacy rate for women, is now making news with its girls winning laurels for the state by earning name and fame while choosing the most unconventional careers, irrespective of whether they were brought up in rural or urban areas of the state.

Avani Lekhara (19) is the latest example. She won the gold medal in women's 10m air rifle standing event in the SH1 category at the Tokyo Paralympics. She was brought up in a small town Dholpur and had met with an accident due to which her spinal cord was injured.

Avani, wanting to do something different, chose shooting. The accident left her demotivated but the biography of Olympic gold medalist shooter Abhinav Bindra instilled fresh hope in her and she worked hard to add a feather in her cap.



In the same series, 10-year-old athlete Pooja Vishnoi from Guda Vishnoiyan village of Jodhpur was in the news for her six packs which she developed when she was 7. Besides being an athlete, she is a cricketer too and is the only member from Rajasthan in the Virat Kohli Foundation. Pooja recently shot an ad with cricketer Mahendra Singh Dhoni. Presently, she is working hard



to bring a medal for India in the next youth Olympics to be held in 2024. The Virat Kohli Foundation manages her sport and diet plan too. She is the youngest member among 16 kids selected by the Foundation.

Another young woman Megha Kapoor is hitting the headlines by being a certified health coach and has clients from Delhi, Mumbai, USA and even Africa while being located at

Jaipur.

When young, she was irritated with comments related to body shaming which inspired her to take up this unconventional profession. After somebody at her sister's wedding asked her if she was eating for 2 people, it hurt her and her self-esteem and gave birth to a whole lot of body image issues. She then chose this career and went to London to pursue the course. "Being a female fitness coach means competing in a very male dominated industry in India - not easy but that should never stop us," says this founder of Megha Squad adding "Unfortunately, in India, not many people know about being a certified health coach. However, the COVID pandemic has taught us to take health awareness seriously and act upon it. So, people have started being more conscious of their lifestyle choices when it comes to health and hence the career is now drawing more credence."

young girls and women. Teena, 17, hails from the Malikhedra village, Dungarpur. "During the pandemic, I volunteered and created awareness around the Covid symptoms in my community."

Community efforts in adolescents, is a great effort to engage the young ones in civic services. Rinku, 18, from the Jaal ki Jhonpariyani village in Bundi district, studies in Class 12 and is an active member of the FAYA group. In a



nation where female hygiene and anatomy is an unspoken taboo, this initiative sensitises young girls towards a naturally biological process. Also generating awareness around the spread of Covid and motivating community members to wear masks, is 15-year-old Anil, from Bawdi, Tonk, 15-year-old Limka from Talibpura village and 17-year-old Umesh, from Mohammed Nagar of Tonk district.

AMIT SHAH'S REMARK ON BOMMAI HAS NOT GONE DOWN WELL WITH PARTY LEADERS

Union Home Minister Amit Shah's statement on winning the next Karnataka assembly elections under the leadership of Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai has not gone down well with senior party leaders.

Former chief minister Jagadish Shettar who refused to join the cabinet of Bommai saying that it hurts his self respect to be under his junior, on Saturday met B.S. Yediyurappa, who recently stepped down from the CM's post to make way for Bommai.

Both leaders discussed for about 30 minutes the developments in the Karnataka BJP. Sources said that both are unhappy with Amit Shah's statement projecting Bommai as the future leader of the party. Those close to them opined that there was no urgency to make such an announcement as there is still time for assembly elections.

Minister for Rural Development and Panchayat Raj K.S. Eshwarappa contradicted the statement of Amit Shah in Shivamogga by stating that



he is for collective leadership in the state. "Amit Shah has said that BJP will come to power in the next elections under the leadership of Bommai. I don't know under what

circumstances Amit Shah issued those statements. The party is for collective leadership. Bommai will also play a key role," he maintained.

No hurry, can wait till next polls: Vijayendra

B.Y. Vijayendra, Karnataka BJP Vice President and son of former chief minister B.S. Yediyurappa on Saturday said that he would wait till 2023 as he is not in a hurry to contest elections.

Vijayendra clarified his stand as it was speculated that he would contest in the upcoming by-elections of Sindhagi and Hanagal assembly constituencies. The by-elections are being held due to the death of Sindhagi MLA M.C. Managooli and Hanagal MLA and former minister C.M. Udasi.

Vijayendra's statement came right after the announcement by Home Minister Amit Shah that party will go to next elections under the leadership of Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai.

President Kovind greets teachers on the eve of Teachers' Day


President Ram Nath Kovind on Saturday greeted teachers across the country on the eve of Teachers' Day.

After TN and Kerala, now K'taka to ban online gambling

The Karnataka government has decided to impose a ban on online gambling & betting in the state barring lottery and horse racing at Saturday's cabinet meet. The government also announced that it has earmarked Rs 17.7 crore for the purchase of medicines to treat Covid patients.

Minister for Law J.C. Madhuswamy explained that the government will amend the Karnataka Police Act in the upcoming session (Sept 13) to ban online gambling. This has been done as per the directions of the High Court. However, the ban will not include lottery, wagering, betting on horse races, he said.

"The ban includes all forms of wagering or betting



including in the form of tokens valued in terms of money paid before or after its issue, electronic means, virtual currency, electronic transfer of funds with any game of chance," Madhuswamy explained.

The government had submitted to the court that it is drafting a bill on banning online betting, gambling in July. Tamil Nadu and Kerala have already banned online gambling. Madhuswamy

explained that in order to be ready to face the Covid third wave, the government has allotted Rs 17.7 crore towards the purchase of 50 medicines including Remdesivir. He further said that the cabinet discussed withdrawal of the night curfew in the state. The cabinet gave authority to Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai to take a call after discussing with DC's and SP's of districts and experts, he added.

Missing woman found 6-ft under lover's kitchen

Thiruvananthapuram: The Kerala Police on Saturday exhumed a woman's mortal remains from a pit dug inside her lover's home in Idukki district after she was reported missing since August 15, said an officer.

The body that was dug out from the kitchen was identified by her youngest son, who confirmed it to the police.

Sindhu, a mother of three, has been staying with Binoy, her lover, for the past four years after she separated from her husband.

The two along with her 12-year-old son were staying in a very small house near Adimali that belonged to Binoy.

The police and the locals started the search for Sindhu, after her relatives approached the local police and filed a petition that she has been missing since this Independence Day.

Following investigations and after finding that Binoy suddenly too, went missing, on Friday, the police along with the others carried out a



thorough search at his premises, and also decided to dig up the kitchen.

Sindhu was found buried in a six feet pit. The crime and the cover-up was carried out with expertise -- this became clear as lot of chilly powder was put in the pit along with the body to distract sniffer dogs, experts

said. After the body was located the police stopped digging and it was on Saturday morning they returned with forensic experts and the body was taken out.

The Idukki police, which is overseeing the operations said that the

body will now be taken to the Kottayam Medical College for conducting an autopsy.

Sindhu's relatives said that Binoy on August 10 took her youngest son who stayed with them to his relative's house and came back alone.

On August 11, Sindhu reportedly called her daughter who lives with her father. She complained about being harassed by Binoy.

And after that there was no communication from Sindhu.

On August 14, the youngest son returned to Binoy's house and found his mother missing and the message was passed on to her relatives, who the next day filed the missing complaint.

Even though the police came, they did not give much significance to the statement of her young son, that the kitchen of the house was re-done and they left.

However, things started to move faster, once Binoy went missing. The police decided to dig up the kitchen floor after her relatives raised more doubts. A man hunt is underway for Binoy.

Purging Nehru from Indian history like skipping Ronaldo from football records: Chidambaram

Wiping out the name of the country's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru from Indian history is akin to skipping Cristiano Ronaldo from the history of football or the Wright brothers from the history of aviation, former Union Finance Minister P. Chidambaram said on Saturday.

Speaking at a Congress meeting in South Goa's Margao town, Chidambaram also said that homogenisation efforts by the BJP-led Central government is the "biggest enemy of India".

"Imagine if the history of football is written, Cristiano Ronaldo will not be there? If the history of motor car is written, Henry Ford will not be there? If the history of aircraft is written, the Wright brothers will not be there? The BJP is attempting to rewrite history. We



must stand up against this. And the party which can stand up against this can only be the Congress," Chidambaram said.

The former Union minister said this while referring to a poster released by the Indian Council for Historical Research on the occasion of the 75th anniversary of India's Independence, in which, Chidambaram said, Nehru was missing. "And let me warn you. If

you allow this trend to continue, they will remove Jawaharlal Nehru chapters from history books. Yes, Sardar Patel is there, and we are happy with that. Maulana Abul Kalam Azad is there, we are happy. But why is Jawaharlal Nehru not there," Chidambaram asked.

The senior Congress leader is currently on a three-day visit to Goa in his capacity as the All India Congress Committee's senior observer in-charge of the 2022 Goa Assembly polls.

Chidambaram also singled out the 'attempts to create a homogenised culture in the country' as one of the biggest threats facing India.

"There are forces in this country who want to homogenise India. One language, one religion, one culture, one food habit. How can we accept that? Not only how should I accept it, but why should

K'TAKA WOMAN RAPED INSIDE HOSTEL, ACCUSED ARRESTED

Mysuru: A 23-year-old was raped by a known person inside a ladies hostel in Mysuru, police said, adding that the accused has been arrested.

The incident took place on Friday and the accused is a driver of a religious study centre. According to the police, the accused after seeing the girl all alone raped and injured her with a knife before escaping. The incident came to light after her hostel mates returned, after which the victim was rushed to the hospital.

The police said that the victim and accused were known to each other.

Law and Order DCP Pradeep Gunti visited the crime scene and police officers collected CCTV footage from surrounding areas. They also recorded statements by the victim's friends and hostel mates.



Nitish Kumar reacts casually to his MLA's behaviour in train

Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar on Saturday reacted casually to the alleged indecent behaviour of his party's legislator Gopal Mandal.

Gopal Mandal, the JD-U MLA from Gopalpur in Bhagalpur district, was walking in his undergarment in the AC First Class compartment of the Patna-New Delhi Tejas Rajdhani Express on September 2. He was also allegedly involved in arguments with fellow passengers after the latter objected to his behaviour.

An FIR has been registered against Gopal Mandal by the Government Railway Police at New Delhi railway station.

When reporters asked Nitish Kumar about what action is being taken against Gopal Mandal for his behaviour, he said: "These things keep happening. The investigation is underway. (E Sab To Hota Hi Rahta Hai. Jaanch Bhi Ho Hi Raha Hai)." He said this while laying the foundation stone of a double decker flyover on Patna's heavily congested Ashok Rajpath road.

The RJD and the LJP have slammed Gopal



Mandal for walking in his undergarment in a train. RJD spokesperson Chitranshu Gagan said: "The indecent behaviour of the MLA has tarnished the image of Bihar. It is because of such leaders, people of other states mock us."

"We have to maintain the dignity of the place we are living in. There is some decorum that we have to follow as there are women, children and elderly people around. The behaviour of that MLA was condemnable. Nitish Kumar should take action against him," said Chirag Paswan during his Ashirwad Yatra in Arrah.

GOA ON ALERT OVER HEAVY RAIN WARNING IN NEXT 48 HOURS: CM

Panaji: The Goa administration has been put on high alert amid a warning issued by the India Meteorological Department about heavy rainfall in the state over the next 48 hours, Chief Minister Pramod Sawant tweeted late on Saturday.

"In view of the warning issued by the IMD, Goa, regarding Heavy Rainfall in the state over next 48 hours, I have directed the state administration to be on high alert & to immediately spring into action for taking all precautionary measures and prepare for the oncoming showers," Sawant tweeted. Goa had been previously paralysed for several days due to heavy winds and rain which accompanied Cyclone Tauktae, which led to a loss of Rs 148 crore in the state due to damage to property.



AAP says people of Punjab want development like Delhi

NO SERIOUS HEALTH EFFECTS LINKED TO MRNA COVID VACCINES

► The analyses compared specific health events among all Covid-19 mRNA-vaccinated people during the first 3 weeks after inoculation with health events among similar types of patients during the 3 to 6 weeks after mRNA vaccination.

► The total number of people evaluated was 6.2 million for the first dose of either mRNA vaccine and 5.7 million for the second dose.

► Outcomes tracked included neurological disorders such as encephalitis and myelitis, seizures, and Guillain-Barre syndrome; cardiovascular problems such as acute myocardial infarction, stroke, and pulmonary embolism; and others such as Bell's palsy, appendicitis, anaphylaxis, and multisystem inflammatory syndrome.



ADMINISTER 2ND DOSE TO ELIGIBLE PERSONS: CENTRE

New Delhi: The Centre has asked the states to quickly saturate the first dose coverage among the 18+ population. In a review meeting with the north-east and hill states on Saturday, health secretary Rajesh Bhushan told the states to saturate the 18+ age group with the 1st dose and focus on the 60+ age group and administer the 2nd dose to those eligible.

The Centre asked the states to closely monitor the stock from State Vaccine Stores to Cold Chain Point, check rational distribution and restrict vaccine

wastage to below 2%. They should update data on eVIN on a daily basis, check supply of other denomination syringes as per availability (0.5 ml/1ml/2 ml/3ml Auto Disable/Re-use Prevention Syringes/Disposable) for Covid vaccination.

Meanwhile, India continues to report a higher number of daily Covid cases. A total of 42,618 new Covid cases were reported in the last 24 hours, pushing the total tally to 3,29,45,907. In the same duration, 330 deaths were reported across the country.

'LACK OF GLOBAL STANDARDS KEY BARRIER TO IMPLEMENT COVID CERTIFICATES'

London: The lack of global standards for Covid-19 certificates is a key barrier to their successful implementation around the world, a new report has warned.

Experts have called for widely-accepted international standards for documentation that records Covid-19 vaccination and health status, although implementing them quickly will be difficult.

The report emphasised that Covid-19 health status certificates should be available to all, not only those with high levels of digital literacy but highlighted

the risks of fraud associated with paper-based certificates.

The researchers call for policymakers to ensure coronavirus health status certificate providers abide by basic data protection principles, including lawfulness, fairness and transparency, purpose limitation, data minimisation, accuracy, storage limitation, integrity and confidentiality and accountability.

It identifies three key barriers to implementation -- lack of trust, lack of global standards and lack of a holistic approach.

BENGALURU NURSING COLLEGE SEALED AFTER IT REPORTED 34 CASES



Bengaluru: The Karnataka government has sealed the nursing college in Horamavu, Bengaluru where 34 cases of Covid infections were reported. The decision was taken to conduct Covid tests for people living in surrounding areas. After a nursing college in KGF was found with Covid positive cases, Christian Nursing College in Horamavu reported 34 cases of infections. Infected students have been shifted to Covid Care Centres for isolation. College will be shut for 7-8 days and then testing will be conducted again. The area has been declared as micro containment zone and 700-800 residents around the college will be tested as a precautionary measure, the minister said, said Health and Medical Education Minister K. Sudhakar.



AERIAL FIRING BY TALIBAN CLAIMS AS MANY AS 70 LIVES

The Taliban fighters on Friday night opened gunshots in the air across the country, which killed over 70 people around Afghanistan, and the numbers may be higher due to the absence of reports from the provinces. An emergency hospital in Kabul has that confirmed that 17 bodies and 40 wounded people were rushed to the hospital on Friday night, Khaama News reported.

Unconfirmed reports from Jalalabad in Nangarhar province said that 17 people have been killed or wounded in Friday night's gunshots. The Taliban officials, meanwhile, condemned the gunshots and warned of tough repercussions in case repeated. The head of the military commission and son of the founder of the Taliban, Mullah Yaqoob Mujahid, said that Panjshir province has not been taken and no one is allowed to shoot in the air. He added that the culprits will be arrested and disarmed if the aerial shots are repeated again.

WILL NEVER GIVE UP: AHMAD MASSOUD



New Delhi: Leader of the anti-Taliban resistance forces in Panjshir province, Ahmad Massoud has said that he will never stop his resistance for the sake of God, justice, and freedom. Massoud said that the resistance in Panjshir and protest for the rights of women by women in Afghanistan indicate that people never give up when it comes to standing for their legitimate rights, Khaama News reported. On Friday night, the war in Panjshir province intensified and there were reports of its collapse which were then denied.

A team of researchers combining the health records of 6.2 million patients found no serious health effects that could be linked to the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna mRNA Covid-19 vaccines. Centre signs Karbi peace pact with 6 militant groups of Assam

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on Saturday signed a tripartite 'Karbi Peace Accord' here bringing to an end the decades long agitation and unrest in Assam.

The peace agreement was signed in the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal and representatives of the six Karbi outfits.

The militants groups are People's Democratic Council of Karbi Longri (PDCK), Karbi Longri NC Hills Liberation Front (KLNLF), Karbi People's Liberation Tiger (KPLT), Kuki Liberation Front (KLF) and United People's Liberation Army (UPLA).

Describing the agreement as historic, the Union Home Minister Amit Shah said, "By signing the Historic Karbi



Anglong Agreement, the government is committed to resolving the decades-old crisis, ensuring the territorial integrity of Assam." Assam Chief Minister meanwhile said the Karbi Anglong agitation had as much mass support as the Assam

agitation, and lauded the peace accord being signed. The Karbi peace pact will ensure greater devolution of autonomy to the Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC), protection of identity, language, culture of Karbi people and focussed development of the Council area, without affecting the territorial and administrative integrity of Assam.

The Karbi armed groups have agreed to abjure violence and join the peaceful democratic process as established by law of the land. The Agreement also provides for rehabilitation of cadres of the armed groups. The Government of Assam shall set up a Karbi Welfare Council for focussed development of Karbi people living outside KAAC area. The Consolidated Fund of the State will be augmented to supplement the resources of KAAC and the present settlement will give more legislative, executive, administrative and financial powers to KAAC.

RPI TO PROPOSE 'ONE CHILD POLICY' BILL

Gandhinagar: Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Ramdas Athawale-led Republican Party of India (RPI) on Saturday said it will put up a proposal before Prime Minister Narendra Modi soon to bring a law on 'One family, one child' to check the increasing population of the country.

"Rising population is a thing of worry for our country. If we want to develop our country then our population needs to be brought down. Earlier there was a slogan 'Hum Do, Humare Do' for family planning. But it is our party's view that now it should be 'Hum Do, Humara Ek'," Athawale told the media in Ahmedabad.

Seven arrested for irregularities in on-going JEE examination

The Central Bureau of Investigation has arrested seven people, including two directors and four employees of a private company, in its investigation on allegations of committing irregularities in the on-going JEE (Main) Examination-2021.

Three of the arrested were produced before a Delhi court and sent to police custody till September 9.

Six of the arrested accused -- Siddarth Krishna, Vishambhar Mani Triaphi, Ritik Singh, Anjum Dawoodani, Animesh Kumar Singh, and Ajinkya Narhari Patil - are from Affinity Education Private Ltd. One accused has been identified as Ranjeet Singh Thakur.

It was alleged that the said company and its Directors were manipulating the online examination of JEE (Mains) and facilitating aspiring students to get admission in top NITs in consideration of huge amount by solving the question paper of the applicant through remote access from a chosen examination centre in Sonapat (Haryana).

It was also alleged that the accused used to



obtain Class 10 and 12 mark sheets, the user IDs, passwords, and post-dated cheques of aspiring students in different parts of country as security and once admission was done, they used to collect heavy amount ranging from Rs 12 to Rs 15 lakh per candidate.

Searches were conducted at 19 places including at Delhi and NCR, Pune, Jamshepur, Indore, and Bengaluru which led to recovery of voluminous incriminating documents and devices.



ANOTHER BJP MLA, FOURTH SO FAR, RETURNS TO TRINAMOOL

Kolkata: On a day when the Election Commission announced the bypolls in Bhowanipur from where Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee will seek to get elected to the West Bengal Assembly, the Trinamool Congress received a boost with another BJP MLA joining the ruling party on Saturday, taking the tally of saffron party MLAs joining the Trinamool camp to four.

Kaliaganj MLA Soumen Roy on Saturday joined the Trinamool Congress in Kolkata in the presence of state minister and party leader Partha Chatterjee.

Justifying his return to the party, Roy said, "I had to contest from Kaliaganj on a BJP ticket due to some circumstances. But my soul and heart belong to Trinamool. I joined the party again to support Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's efforts. I apologise to the party for the time I was not with it."

Ever since the Trinamool swept the polls to retain power in West Bengal, many leaders who had switched to the BJP from the Trinamool camp before the Assembly polls have returned to the party.

gory, 23.3 per cent respondents are from Manipur, followed by 11.2 per cent from UP, 11.1 per cent from Uttarakhand, 7 per cent from Goa and 2.8 per cent from Punjab. In the 'country is moving forward and my life too' section, Goa tops with 40.5 per cent, followed by Uttarakhand at 36.8 per cent, UP at 31.4 per cent, Manipur at 27.2 per cent and Punjab at 10.5 per cent.

In the 'my life is improving but the country is in poor state' category, 11.8 per cent respondents are from Manipur, 8 per cent from Punjab, 6.3 per cent from Uttarakhand, 4.1 per

cent from UP, and 2 per cent from Goa. In the 'my life and country both are in a poor state' section, Punjab has highest number of respondents at 75 per cent, followed by 69 per cent in UP, 44.5 per cent in Goa, 43.9 per cent in Uttarakhand and 33.3 per cent in Manipur. The overall sample size for the survey was 81,006 in five states covering 690 Assembly seats. This state poll is part of the largest and definitive independent sample survey tracker series carried out in India over the last 22 years, conducted by independent international polling agency CVoter.

EC announces bypoll for Mamata on September 30

After much speculation, the Election Commission of India announced the date for the bye-elections in Bhabanipur and elections in two other assembly constituencies - Samsargunj and Jangipur in Murshidabad district on Saturday. The elections in these three constituencies will be held on September 30 and counting will be held on October 3.

The elections in Samsargunj and Jangipur were withheld because of

the death of the candidates before polls during the recently concluded assembly election in West Bengal. On the other hand, a bye-election in Bhabanipur assembly constituency is scheduled because the existing MLA Sovondeb Chattopadhyay resigned to make room for chief minister Mamata Banerjee.

Banerjee lost to the Leader of Opposition Suvendu Adhikari in Nandigram in the recently concluded polls and is still not an elected member of the legislative body.



Pune plot case:

KHADSE, KIN IN FRESH TROUBLE AFTER ED FILES CHARGESHEET

There was fresh trouble for senior Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader Eknath Khadse after the Enforcement Directorate (ED) filed a chargesheet in the Pune MIDC plot case, officials said here on Saturday.

The ED has named Khadse, his wife Mandakini, son-in-law Girish Chaudhary, a former government sub-registrar Ravindra Muley and a realtor Benchmark Buildcon Pvt. Ltd., in the deal that was effected in 2016.

Earlier in April 2017, the state Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) had lodged a case against Khadse following a complaint by an activist Hemant Gawande who claimed irregularities in the Bhosari MIDC land deal which led to a huge loss to the exchequer.

The complainant contended that when Khadse was the Revenue Minister in the erstwhile Bharatiya Janata Party-led government, he had allegedly pressurized government officials to clear the land deal.

While Khadse was forced to quit as minister in June 2016, a judicial commission headed by retired



Justice Dinkar Zoting was set up to probe the matter.

After the ACB case, the ED lodged a complaint and summoned Khadse and others in December 2020, while his son-in-law Chaudhary was arrested in July. The central agency also questioned other officials involved in the controversial transactions.

The ED said that the land sale deed was executed in the name of Mandakini Khadse and Chaudhary

at Rs 3.75 crore by the owner Abbas Aqani, and the amount was much lower than the prevailing market valuation of over Rs 31 crore.

The transaction was intended to get compensation of thrice the market rate of the plot from the MIDC for which Khadse allegedly misused his powers as a minister.

The ED probe also said that they allegedly used Benchmark Buildcon Pvt. Ltd to launder Rs 2 crore to Chaudhary and it found several

shell companies used to route the funds. Later, the ED attached assets, properties and bank accounts of the Khadse couple and Chaudhary, in Pune and Jalgaon districts.

Khadse was summoned and questioned by the ED in January and July, but his wife had skipped the summonses on health grounds.

Meanwhile, after remaining in the political wilderness for over six years, Khadse joined the NCP in October, 2020.

Maha factory blast:

1 killed, 1 missing, 6 injured

At least one factory worker was killed, another missing while six others were injured when an explosion ripped through a textile unit in the Boisar MIDC area followed by a huge blaze, police said here on Saturday.

The incident occurred around 5.30 a.m. at the Jakharia Fabrics Pvt. Ltd. when a handful of night-shift workers were on duty, said Boisar MIDC Police Station Senior Inspector Suresh Kadam.

The massive blast, followed by a raging fire reportedly ripped through the boiler room of the two-decade-old company manufacturing blended polyester cotton, viscose fabrics, yarn dyeing,

cotton linen, fabric yarn processing and other products.

At least one worker was killed, one more said to be missing and six more injured in the tragedy.

Police teams along with three fire tenders from Boisar rushed to the scene and doused the flames in an hour, according to the fire brigade officials.

The Directorate of Industrial Safety and Health has sent a team to join the probe, while the police have summoned the company's

top executives from Bhiwandi (Thane) for enquiries.

The injured are identified as: Ganesh Patil, Arvind Yadav, Murali Gautam, Amit Yadav, Umesh Rajwanshi and Mukesh Yadav and they have been rushed to a private hospital for treating their burns.

The body of the deceased worker -- whose identity is yet to be established, has been sent for an autopsy to Palghar, and further probe is on, said Kadam.

Water department finds pollutants in 291 samples collected in Raigad

The department had collected samples from all talukas to keep a check on illnesses caused due to polluted water in the region: Official

At least 291 out of 4,640 water samples collected in Maharashtra's Raigad district were found to be polluted, an official from the local administration said on Saturday.

The water department of the Raigad Zilla Parishad had collected samples from all talukas to keep a check on illnesses caused due to polluted water in the region, the official said.

Out of the 4,640 water samples collected by the department, 291 were found to be polluted, he said, adding that the samples were



sent to a district-level laboratory and five other taluka-level testing facilities.

At least 125 samples from Karjat were found to be polluted, which is the highest, while pollutants were detected

in two samples each from Uran, Roha and Poladpur talukas, the official said.

No pollutants were found in water samples from Murud, Tala, Mhasala and Shrivardhan, he said.

Assembly polls, Taliban likely to be discussed in RSS meeting



A two-day meeting of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) has commenced in Nagpur in which the assembly elections in several states next, current issues of the country and the world including the Taliban takeover in Afghanistan would be discussed.

The meeting is being held in the presence of more than three dozen affiliated organisations of RSS and top BJP functionaries.

The main agenda of this meeting -- on September 3 and 4 -- is to "achieve all the goals by improving the mutual coordination between all the affiliated organisations of the Sangh".

In this meeting led by Sangh's Sarsanghchalak Dr. Mohan Bhagwat, Sahakaryavah Dattatreya Hosabale, the strategy of the Sangh and its affiliated organizations in the next year's Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab,



Gujarat and Goa assembly elections is likely to be drawn.

An appeal could be made to all the affiliated organizations to extend proper cooperation to the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in these elections.

Also, the farmers' agitation against

the Centre's newly passed farm laws has been going on in the country for a long time. The impact of this movement is being felt in areas dominated by farmer leaders in Punjab, Haryana and western Uttar Pradesh. In such a scenario, the issues related to farmers

are also likely to be discussed.

The biggest concern of the RSS is the assembly polls in Uttar Pradesh, the country's largest state. Therefore, two provincial level coordination meetings have already been held in Lucknow.

Nagpur-based RSS ideologue Dilip Deodhar told reporter: "The coordination meeting of the Sangh in Nagpur is very important."

On the other hand, Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh's Akhil Bharatiya Prachar Pramukh Sunil Ambekar said in a statement issued in connection with the meeting, "In Nagpur, a small general informal coordination meeting of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh is being held on 3-4 September 2021. The meeting includes some national level officials of the Sangh and some different organisations like Vishwa Hindu Parishad, Vidyarthi Parishad, Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh among others."

Solution for OBC quota in sight

All-party meeting agrees for asking state backward class commission to collect empirical data even as some ruling partners are hell-bent on asking information from Centre

A week after they met to find a solution to restoring the OBC reservation in local bodies, major political parties in the state deliberated on the issue again on Friday. A difference of opinion persisted this time as well, with some hell-bent on asking the Centre for the empirical data. They were, however, also in agreement with the majority view that the state's backward class commission (BCC) should also be asked to collect the data required as early as possible to reinstate the reservation.

There was unanimity on postponing the elections, scheduled for February next and throughout 2022, if the quota wasn't restored. But, since the state government can recommend to the state election commission only in exceptional cases, and the absence of OBC quota isn't a formidable excuse that can be given to delay the elections, the COVID-19 situation is most likely to be a strong reason to postpone the polls till the data comes in, either



from the Centre or BCC. Mumbai, Thane, Pune and Nagpur are among the big-ticket civic corporations that are scheduled to go to the polls next February. Almost two-thirds of the state's zilla parishad and

panchayat samiti bodies and a host of small- and medium-size city municipal councils will also elect new members. In addition, some municipal bodies that could not have polls in 2020 and 2021 because of the pandemic will be part of a mega exercise that assumes the significance of mini assembly polls. The stakes are very high for all parties, especially the ruling trio. The OBC quota was quashed earlier this year by the Supreme Court, which wants the state to do certain things before allowing it to be restored. The order was in a case related to five districts where the 28 per cent quota for the OBCs was disproportionate to their population. The SC had stated that the total reservation cannot exceed 50 per cent and directed the state to conduct the triple test.

The chief minister's office said in a statement that it was decided unanimously to direct the backward class commission to prepare empirical data at the earliest, after seeking Advocate General's advice. "It was also decided to postpone the polls if the data and BCC's report are delayed."

CISF CYCLE RALLY REACHES AGA KHAN PALACE



Mumbai: In Maharashtra, the cycle rally of Central Industrial Security Force, which started from Yerwada Jail in Pune in the morning, reached the historic Aga Khan Palace this afternoon. This rally, being held as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, was flagged off by CISF Additional Director General of Southern Zone Anil Kumar. Earlier, a cultural programme was organized in front of Yerwada Jail from where the rally started. Yerwada Jail is the place where historic Poona Pact was signed when Mahatma Gandhi fasted to protest against the communal award. This place has been used as a prison by Britishers for Mahatma Gandhi, Kasturba Gandhi and Mahadeobhai Desai during the 'Quit India Movement'. Marble memorials were put later on in the memory of Kasturba and Mahadeobhai as both of them breathed their last in this place. Along the 1,703-km-long route, the rally will cover historically significant spots and birthplaces of heroes of India's freedom struggle, over a period of 27 days. A team of 12 CISF cyclists are participating in the rally led by an Assistant Sub Inspector.

COVID-19:

Maharashtra cumulative vaccination tally crosses 6.15 crore

In the ongoing vaccination drive, Maharashtra on September 3 has vaccinated 7,24,505 in 3,533 sessions. According to data released by the government, Maharashtra, as of 7 am on September 4, inoculated 6,15,16,137 people.

As per the state government data, 2,04,15,180 individuals aged between 18 and 44 years received their first vaccine dose and 25,15,560 received their second dose since the inoculation drive for this age group began on May 1.

So far, 12,92,670 health care workers have been administered the first dose of the vaccine, while 10,07,964 of them have got their second dose.

Similarly, 21,40,648 frontline workers in the state have till now received their first vaccine dose and of them, 15,14,391 got their second dose. Meanwhile, Maharashtra on Friday reported 4,313 new coronavirus infections and 92 fatalities, which pushed the caseload to 64,77,987 and death toll to 1,37,643, the



state health department said. Pune region recorded the highest 35 deaths during the day. As many as 4,360 patients recovered from the viral infection, taking the total of recovered

patients to 62,86,345. There are now 50,466 active coronavirus cases in Maharashtra. The state's case recovery rate stands at 97.04 per cent while the fatality rate is 2.12 per cent.

Drama theaters, auditoriums, other cultural programmes to resume in state from November

Drama theatres and Auditoriums and other cultural programmes could resume in Maharashtra from November, as Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray has given in principle approval to open the drama theatres from 5th of November. Similarly, Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar has said that the State Government will not increase the restrictions during the upcoming festive season, but may come out with harsh decisions on the very next day if any violation of COVID-19 protocol is seen anywhere in the state.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray has given in principle approval to open the drama theatres and auditoriums and resume the cultural programmes from November 5 in the backdrop of the improving situation in the state. A delegation of Marathi theatre personalities and producers met him in Mumbai yesterday and sought permission to reopen the drama theatres. While consider-



ing their demand he gave in principle approval and made it clear that he will be compelled to impose lockdown if the oxygen demand crosses beyond 700 metric tonnes in the state. Speaking in another meeting Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar also gave the similar assurance of not imposing strict restrictions during Ganesh Festival in the state. But at the same time appealed the people to avoid crowding and issued stern warning of imposing strict restrictions immediately after the violation of COVID Appropriate Behaviour. He said that people should not forget that the global pandemic has not ended yet and they will have to follow the COVID-19 protocols keeping this in mind.

'No one needs to panic': Cops amid evacuations at Mumbai airport as flyers fume

Amid the mock drill, several flyers complained of chaos and alleged that Covid-19 protocols were flouted during the process.

Mumbai airport's Terminal 2 was evacuated on Saturday morning for a mock drill, police said, urging people not to panic as several photographs on social media showed passengers being moved out of the area. "A mock drill is being conducted at Mumbai international airport. No one needs to panic," an official of the Mumbai Police told media persons. Even as authorities assured that the mock drill was not expected to affect the

flight schedule, several passengers did not know about the evacuation process. Later, officials at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA) said they conducted a "simulated mock drill exercise as per scheduled security protocols." "The mock drill was held this morning at Terminal 2 location in collaboration with (the) CSMIA's multiple stakeholders," CSMIA said on Twitter. "After all successful assessments and checks, the terminal was continued to be declared safe with the drill completed at 11:48 hours," it said.

Minor beaten up for suspected love jihad

A 16-year-old Hindu boy who had allegedly run away with a girl was beaten up by a group of men in Madhya Pradesh's Dewas district allegedly on suspicion that it was a case of so-called 'love jihad', police said on Saturday.

No arrest has been made so far in connection with the incident which took place four days ago. Both the girl and the boy hail from Uttar Pradesh, police said. A video of the incident also went viral on social media. The boy had reportedly run away with the 12-year-old girl from Balia in Uttar Pradesh and police in Dewas had been alerted to look out for them, said an official.

A team of police personnel spotted them in a bus at Bhunsara toll booth, 17 km from Dewas city, said Sonkach area sub-divisional officer of police (SDOP) Prashant Singh Bhadoria. Just as the police was taking them away, over a dozen men, who were apparently following the bus in two cars,



appeared on the spot and set upon the boy, he said. The video showed several men slapping, hitting and punching the boy even as the policemen tried to stop them.

The accused apparently thought that the boy was Muslim and had run away with a

Hindu girl, said another police official. Both are in fact Hindu, he said.

"They thought it was a case of 'love jihad'. We were telling them that both were from the same community, but they didn't listen," he said, adding that if the boy had not


been rescued by the police in time, he might not have survived.

"Love jihad" is a term used by some right-wing leaders who claim that there is a "conspiracy" to lure Hindu girls and convert them to Islam through marriage.

The girl and the boy were taken to a safe place and later handed over to the Uttar Pradesh police, the SDOP said.

On Friday, Dewas district police registered a case against four men who were identified from the video, and 15 other unidentified persons under IPC sections 353 (use of criminal force on any person with a public servant in the execution of his duty as such public servant), 147 (rioting), 323 (voluntarily causing hurt) and 294 (use of obscene word).

"We are trying to identify the other accused. As the charges against the accused are bailable and do not invite punishment of more than seven years, we are going to serve notice to them (before deciding on arrest)," SDOP Bhadoria said.



Ethan Hawke is 'trying to stay alive'

Hawke said that the movie will "feel a lot bigger" than Robert's previous picture 'The Lighthouse', which featured Willem Dafoe and Robert Pattinson.

FOURTH TEST: ROHIT SHARMA'S TON PUTS INDIA IN CONTROL

Opener Rohit Sharma's maiden overseas century and his important partnerships with Cheteshwar Pujara and K.L. Rahul helped India wrest initiative and move into driver's seat on the third day of the fourth Test against England at The Oval on Saturday.

Sharma, who had scored seven Test centuries before and all of which came in India, added 83 for the first wicket with Rahul (46) and 153 with Pujara (61) to take India into a position from where they can hope to take 2-1 lead in the series which is level at 1-1.

When bad light stopped play, India skipper Virat Kohli was unbeaten on 22 and Ravindra Jadeja was not out on nine. The two have added 33 runs so far for the fourth wicket.

India opener Rohit Sharma and No. 3 batsman Cheteshwar Pujara tweaked their respective batting styles and curbed natural instincts to drive India into a position of strength.

Thanks to Sharma's gritty and circumspect eighth Test century -- his first overseas -- and Pujara's uncharacteristic attacking display at the start, India had already taken a 100-run lead by tea on the third day to overturn a 99-run first innings deficit and move into a place from where they can dictate terms to the tiring England side.

By tea, the two had put on an unbeaten 116-run partnership for the second wicket.

Pujara had come in after the fall of K.L. Rahul's wicket in the first session with the score of 83 and raced to 14 off 21 deliveries before lunch to take India past the deficit.

He hit fours Ollie Robinson and Craig Overton -- on a full and a short delivery -- as bowlers found it difficult to find assistance from the pitch.

India are 171 runs ahead and have seven wickets in hand. There are two more days to play.

US Open:

Teenager Alcaraz stuns world No 3 Tsitsipas

Spain's Carlos Alcaraz bagged the biggest win of his career at the US Open, upsetting world No. 3 Stefanos Tsitsipas of Greece 6-3, 4-6, 7-6(2), 0-6, 7-6(5) in a high-quality contest to become the youngest player to reach the fourth round at a major since 1992.

In a battle of swinging fortunes, the 18-year-old ranked 55th in the world rallied from 2-5 in the third set, saving three sets points and breaking twice to avoid going down two sets to one, before advancing in four hours and six minutes.

Alcaraz is the youngest player to beat a top-3 rival at a major since Michael Chang, 17, defeated world No. 1 Ivan Lendl and world No. 3 Stefan Edberg at the French Open in



17, defeated world No. 1 Ivan Lendl and world No. 3 Stefan Edberg at the French Open in

1989. Alcaraz, whose previous biggest victory came against then World No. 14 David Goffin of Belgium at the Great Ocean Road Open in February, will next play qualifier Peter Gojowczyk after the German defeated Swede Henri Laaksonen 3-6, 6-3, 6-1, 6-4. The Juan Carlos Ferrero-coached player is the youngest to reach the fourth round at a major since Ukraine's Andrei Medvedev, 17, at the French Open in 1992 and the youngest in New York since Chang, 17, in 1989. The Spaniard now holds a 2-0 record in fifth-set matches.

Alcaraz captured his maiden tour-level title in Umag and reached the last four in Winston-Salem.

FERNANDEZ ENDS OSAKA'S TITLE DEFENCE

New York: Canada's Leylah Fernandez, ranked 73rd in the world, accounted for one of the biggest seeds in the first week of the US Open, defeating No. 3 Naomi Osaka of Japan 5-7, 7-6(2), 6-3 to end the 2020 champion's title defence in the third round. The win is the 18-year-old's second top-5 win of her career and puts her into her first Round of 16 at a Slam, where she will face 2016 US Open champion Angelique Kerber of Germany. Fernandez is a former junior champion at 2019 French Open who made her top-100 debut a year ago after the US Open. A left-hander who chose tennis over football, Fernandez won her first WTA title earlier this season on the hardcourts of Monterrey. Since that triumph in March, Fernandez had not won back-to-back main draw matches until her first two rounds in New York.



Naomi Osaka might take a break from tennis

World No. 3, Naomi Osaka of Japan, has said that she is unsure when she will play her next match following her third-round defeat at the US Open against Canadian 18-year-old Leylah Fernandez. Osaka, 23, came into this year's event as the defending champion, but Fernandez came up with an inspired performance on Friday evening to win 5-7, 7-6(2), 6-4. Afterward, Osaka was quoted as saying by wtatennis.com that she doesn't "feel happy" when she wins. In May, Osaka pulled out of the French Open, citing mental health reasons. She then opted to skip Wimbledon. Osaka returned to the court in July at the 2020 Tokyo Games, where she became the first tennis player to light the Olympic torch. The US Open was just Osaka's second tournament since the Olympics. She played the Western & Southern Open two weeks ago, where she defeated Coco Gauff of the US in her opening match before losing to eventual runner-up Jill Teichmann of Switzerland.

TTFI questions Manika's timing of bringing up serious allegations against national coach

The Table Tennis Federation of India (TTFI) is bemused why star player Manika Batra remained silent for more than five months and then levelled serious charges against national coach Soumyadeep Roy that he tried to influence her to lose in an Olympic Qualification tournament in March this year, only after being served a show-cause notice in August for indiscipline.

Manika had made history at the Tokyo Olympic Games by becoming the first TT player from the country to reach the third round at the Games before losing to Austria's Sofia Polcanova.

In a controversy that has been festering for some time now, Manika had refused national coach Roy's help dur-

Speaking to reporter from Lucknow, TTFI secretary general Arun Banerjee said that when Manika's personal coach Sanmay Paranjape was not accredited for 'field of play', there was no way he could sit courtside and guide Manika.

Banerjee questioned Manika's logics behind waiting for five months to allege that national coach Roy had pressurised her to concede her match to his student during the Olympic qualification tournament in March.

Anyone who gets the new ball will no doubt take it with both hands... I'll certainly be putting my hand up for that as much as I can," said Annabel in an interview to cricket.com.au. "But no matter who takes the new ball, it will be a pretty good line-up. I think (bowling to) Shafali in particular, how hard she comes at the ball is in the power-play, it'll be a really good challenge and one all the girls are really looking forward to." Annabel is back in the Australian team after being ruled out of the series against New Zealand at the last minute due to a stress reaction in the femur of right leg. She revealed that the call to not take part in the away tour to New Zealand was due to the risk of early signs developing into a serious injury.

RAIKKONEN OUT OF DUTCH GP



Zandvoort: Alfa Romeo's Formula 1 driver Kimi Raikkonen will not take part in the Dutch Grand Prix at Zandvoort circuit after testing positive for COVID-19. Robert Kubica will fill in for Raikkonen for his first race since Abu Dhabi 2019 alongside Antonio Giovinazzi for the race on Sunday.

Raikkonen, who announced on the eve of the race at Zandvoort that he will retire at the end of the season, returned the result at an on-site test after taking part in the practice race on Friday.

The 41-year-old is currently isolating in his hotel, with the Alfa Romeo team saying he is "displaying no symptoms and is in good spirits".

After lacklustre first game, India looks to bounce back vs Nepal

Nepal ahead in the 35th minute was nothing short of a shocker. Almost all through the game, the Nepalese attackers looked threatening.

India would be under tremendous pressure on Sunday. In the lead-up to the first game, Stimac had said these two games will provide India with a big practice opportunity ahead of the 2021 SAFF Championship which will kick off in the Maldives next month. The Croatian had also admitted that the expectations are high from his boys in the five-team tournament and that they will be heading into the competition as favourites together with hosts Maldives.

Ben Stokes could miss T20 World Cup in the UAE

England all-rounder Ben Stokes could miss the men's T20 World Cup in Oman and the UAE in October and November. Stokes has been on an indefinite break from all forms of cricket since July to take care of his mental well-being and give time to his left index finger to heal after surgery.

Stokes is not a part of the ongoing five-match Test series against India and will not take part in the second leg of IPL 2021 starting from September 19. West Indies pacer Oshane Thomas has been called in as a replacement for Stokes in Rajasthan Royals.

"Whether he does travel to Dubai to feature in England's attempts to unite both global white-ball belts next month is unclear, although sources close to Stokes say 'he is not even thinking about cricket at the moment'," said a report by the Daily Mail on Saturday.

The T20 World Cup on September 10, England's selectors are expected to meet this weekend to decide on the 15-member squad and three reserves. An announcement on the squad could come by September 9, a day before the start of the final Test against India at Manchester.


