PM MODI INAUGURATES INDIA'S 'MOST MODERN' RAILWAY STATION

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA MODI ON MONDAY INAUGURATED THE REVAMPED RANI KAMALAPATI RAILWAY STATION (PREVIOUSLY KNOWN AS HABIBGANJ) IN MADHYA PRADESH'S BHOPAL CITY.

► THE STATION HAS BEEN REDEVELOPED AT A COST OF AROUND RS 450 CRORE IN THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP (PPP) MODE.

► DESIGNED AS A GREEN BUILDING, THIS RAILWAY STATION HAS ALL THE MODERN WORLD-CLASS AMENITIES THAT ALSO TAKE INTO ACCOUNT EASE OF MOBILITY FOR THE PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED.

During inspection, he interacted with the tribals and congratulated them for Birsa Munda's birth anniversary. In his speech, he highlighted several schemes introduced by the BJP-led Centre in the last seven years.

India allows foreign tourists as Covid cases decline

India on Monday decided to reopen the entry of all foreign tourists following a sharp and sustained decline in Covid-19 cases.

According to the officials, now the foreign travelers will be allowed to visit India without a mandatory quarantine. India has now allowed entry to fully inoculated tourists from 99 countries including the UK, USA, Israel, Brazil, Canada, Greece, Kuwait, Colombia, Russia and Germany, who have already recognized the Indian vaccination certificates or WHO-recognised vaccinated Indian travelers in their countries. The government only requires that such tourists monitor their health for 14 days after their arrival in India.



In case of a foreigner who has taken only one shot, will have to go for RT-PCR test at the airports or any entry points in India and will have to go for seven days self home quarantine stay in case of a positive report and on the 8th day, the RT-PCR test will be done again and then they can walk free in the country. In case a person is found positive in the second RT-PCR test, he will have to stay in home quarantine for another eight days.

For the first time, India may have woman FM and CEA

Woman power may make a strong statement in next years Union Budget as the economic policy recommendations may come from Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman at the top, ably guided by a first-ever woman Chief Economic Advisor (CEA). The process of selection of the new CEA, which is underway now, has participation from more women this year with a strong chance that the country for the first time may have a dual combination of a woman FM and CEA guiding the Budget making process for 2022-23. Sources said that three names are being

bandied about in the corridors of power. These include Dr Pami Dua, Professor at Delhi School of Economics; Poonam Gupta, Director General of the National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) and Gita Gopinath, chief economist at the IMF, who vacates her office in January 2022 making her available for assignment in India.

The government has invited applications for the post of CEA which will fall vacant next month (December 7) as present incumbent K V Subramanian completes his three-year tenure. Subramanian has said that he will be leaving the finance ministry to return to academia following the completion of his tenure.

Biden's ties with Harris are in crisis

US President Joe Biden's ties with Vice President Kamala Harris is in crisis, with the latter's staff furious that she is being 'sidelined', while the President's team is increasingly frustrated by how Harris is playing with the American public, the Daily Mail reported.

Harris' approval rating has plunged even further than Biden's in recent months, with rumours swirling that the US President is considering appointing her to the Supreme Court as a backdoor method of selecting a new Vice President, the report said.



Harris and her top aides are reportedly frustrated with Biden for handing her 'no-win' issues like the border crisis, White House insiders told CNN.

They cited how the President

defended 'white man' Pete Buttigieg, the transportation secretary, more vigorously than her.

At the same time, Biden's staff are reportedly disappointed with Harris over self-inflicted controversies, like her 'awkward' laughter when asked about visiting the border by NBC's Lester Holt.

They blame her failure on the border crisis for sliding poll numbers. A new ABC News/Washington Post poll shows Biden at 53 per cent disapproval and 41 per cent approval -- down 11 points from April, the report said.

Publicly, the White House insists that the relationship between Biden and Harris remains harmonious and productive.

Taliban conducts large-scale operations against ISIS-K in Kandahar

Provincial officials in the southern Kandahar province said that Taliban officials conducted large-scale operations against ISIS-K fighters in four districts of Kandahar province, Khaama Press reported. Local residents have said that the operations started at midnight and continued until early morning the following day and claimed that three civilians have also been killed during the operations. Taliban's provincial officials in Kandahar said that they killed three ISIS-K affiliates and arrested ten more but did not say anything about civilians, the report said. In the meantime, it is rumoured that an ISIS-K affiliate has blown his explosives in a room that killed the affiliate, the report said. The provincial officials and interior ministry have not said anything about the casualties of the Taliban fighters. The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria-Khorasan branch (ISIS-K) confirmed that Saturday's explosion in the western part of Kabul was conducted by them, Khaama Press reported. The explosion that happened on Saturday, November 13 in Dasht-e-Barchi of Kabul left three dead and six more wounded.

DOOR-TO-DOOR RATION: SC REFUSES TO INTERFERE WITH DELHI HC ORDER

The Supreme Court on Monday refused to interfere with Delhi High Court's interim order on door-to-door supply of food grains by the Delhi government.

The Delhi High Court had on September 27 cleared the way for the implementation of the doorstep delivery of ration scheme, against which the Centre moved the Supreme Court.

The Delhi government assured the Supreme Court that it will not implement its door-to-door ration delivery scheme till the Delhi High Court takes up the main petition pending there against the validity of the scheme on November 22.

The Delhi government also brought on record that its scheme is "fully compatible with one nation one ration card (ONORC) scheme".

A bench headed by justice L. Nageswara Rao and comprising justice B.R. Gavai queried Senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, representing the Delhi government: "Have you started implementing the scheme (doorstep delivery of ration)?" Singhvi submitted that 90 per cent of the citizens have



applied for this scheme -- 69 lakh people out of 72 lakh have been registered.

Singhvi added that these days Amazon is making home deliveries, food is being delivered at home, and also liquor, therefore there is nothing wrong in delivery of food grains at the doors of poor people under public distribution system (PDS).

He added that there are lobbies, which do not want the Delhi government to fill the leakage in the system.

The bench queried, "Has the Delhi government implemented the scheme?" Singhvi replied, "Not started in full

swing, preparations are going on". The bench posed the second query, does it take care of ONORC scheme?

Singhvi replied the Delhi government takes pride in making the scheme absolutely free from corruption, as everything has been computerised, and biometrics is also there. "Fully compatible with ONORC scheme", submitted Singhvi. After hearing the arguments in the matter, the bench initially recorded in the order that the Delhi government should not implement the scheme till the disposal of the matter by the High Court.

2 TERRORISTS KILLED IN SRINAGAR ENCOUNTER



Srinagar: Two unidentified terrorists have been killed in an ongoing encounter between terrorists and security forces at Hyderpora in Central Kashmir's Srinagar district on Monday, officials said.

"One more unidentified terrorist killed (Total 2). Operation going on," police said. The firefights between terrorists and security forces took place after a joint team of the police and the army cordoned off the area and launched a search operation on the basis of specific information about presence of terrorists.

People can die if they consume liquor: Nitish Kumar



A head of an assessment meeting on liquor scheduled on Tuesday, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar reiterated on Monday that people can die if they consume liquor.

"People can die if they consume liquor. It is a bad substance. I don't understand why people drink liquor," Nitish Kumar said while interacting with mediapersons after the 'Janta Darbar' on Monday.

The Chief Minister said that he would interact with every district magistrate, superintendent of police and senior officials of the state at the assessment meeting scheduled on Tuesday. The meeting comes after over 40 persons died in the state after consuming illicit liquor in the past few weeks.

"We had imposed the ban on liquor after receiving complaints from women, and the opposition leaders and MLCs had passed the



take stringent action against the violators," he said.

The Chief Minister also said that the ban on liquor in the state was imposed with the consent of the opposition leaders in April 2016, but now some people are opposing the same.

"We had imposed the ban on liquor after receiving complaints from women, and the opposition leaders and MLCs had passed the

resolution then. After the ban, a large number of people had quit drinking. But some people are still addicted to alcohol and they are the ones indulging in wrongdoings. We will take stringent action against them," Nitish Kumar said. "We have decided to conduct the assessment meeting on Tuesday to take further decisions in the matter."

TN to monetise assets owned by religious bodies under HR&CE department

The Tamil Nadu government is planning to monetise the assets owned by religious institutions under the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment (HR&CE) department.

The state government recently floated a tender for selecting an agency for the preparation of a roadmap on the matter. The Tamil Nadu government has found in a study that the assets owned by the religious institutions are not properly utilised and several properties owned by the HR&CE department are subject to encroachments.

The government pointed out that 38,652 Hindu and Jain religious institutions are under the control of the HR&CE department. The government maintained that it is involved in the administration of the religious institutions and charitable endowments to enable

their religious autonomy, financial viability and sustained development. It may be noted that the temples own large parcels of land comprising commercial, residential and agricultural categories. These properties are located in the municipal corporations, municipalities, town panchayats and village panchayats.

The ownerships of the properties would remain with the concerned religious institutions, but the development rights for a specific period are being proposed to be offered to the developers. The income generated through this development could be used for the maintenance of the respective temples. A consultancy agency would soon be appointed for the preparation of a roadmap for the monetisation process of all the 38,652 Hindu and Jain religious institutions that are under the control of the HR&CE department.

Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav has said that when his party comes to power, he would change back the names of various districts.

"Even before the paint on the new name dries up, we will be back and will revert to the original name," he said at a press conference here on Monday.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday had suggested that Azamgarh, which is Akhilesh Yadav's parliamentary constituency, could be changed to Aryamgarh.

The SP chief alleged that the BJP had destroyed Uttar Pradesh.

"They are doing now what we did five years ago. They could not give an oxygen plant to Azamgarh during the Covid peak - what development will they give to Uttar Pradesh now," he said.

He claimed that his party had helped migrant workers during the pandemic but the BJP government was inaugurating only those projects that had been initiated in his regime.

Akhilesh Yadav alleged that the quality of the Purvanchal expressway had been compromised. He said that there were no expressway facilities but the government was rushing to inaugurate it. He promised that when he comes to power, he would construct mandis along the expressway so that people could benefit.

Centre should reduce LPG prices by Rs 300 to Rs 350: Cong

The prices of domestic LPG should be reduced by Rs 300 to Rs 350 at the least, All India Congress Committee secretary in-charge of Goa Dinesh Gundu Rao said on Monday.

He claimed that the fuel prices were reduced only after the ruling BJP suffered setbacks in the recently held bypolls in various states.

Rao also said that the Congress in poll-bound Goa will launch a five-day programme 'Mhargayecho Jagor' from November 18 to create awareness about the steep rise in the prices of essential goods. "Situation for the common man is difficult. Rise in prices of essentials,



construction material, anything that is required for anyone, prices have gone through the roof. Foodgrains, food items, cooking oil, pulses have gone through the roof," Rao said.

The AICC official said that five groups of Congress workers would fan out across Goa to highlight the issues related to price rise.

Journalists held for spreading hatred in Tripura, get bail

Two Delhi-based women journalists, who were arrested by the Tripura police on Sunday for "creating hatred between communities by concealing record and criminal conspiracies", were granted bail on Monday by the chief judicial magistrate's court in Tripura's Gomati district.

Senior lawyer Pijush Kant Biswas, who sought bail for journalists Samridhi K. Sakunia and Swarna Jha, said that the court granted bail on a surety of Rs 75,000 and asked them to report before the Kakraban police station on Tuesday.

"I have told the court that if necessary, the police can question the journalists," Biswas told reporter.

Sakunia and Jha were detained by the police in Assam's Karimganj district on the request of the Tripura police. A Tripura police team then went to Assam and arrested them on Sunday night before bringing them to Gomati district.

A statement by Tripura

police said on Sunday that the two journalists had come to the state on Thursday, and a case was filed against them in the Kakraban police station on Sunday under various sections of the IPC for "creation of hatred between communities by fabricating, concealing of record etc. in furtherance of a criminal conspiracy as revealed from the Twitter posts by Samridhi Sakunia".

"Taking cue from the recent state of violence in Amravati and other parts of Maharashtra as a repercussion of communal incident, it has become clear that some vested interests are trying to flare up the communal incident in Tripura. "The investigating officer felt it wise to lodge a suo-moto complaint for creating hatred between religious groups by false fabrication and concealing documents etc.," said the statement. It said the police asked the two journalists to share the documents visible in their videos, but instead of coming to Agartala, the two reporters made an escape towards Assam.


The Kasganj case of the custodial death of a 22-year-old Muslim boy is turning murkier by the day.

After alleging that he was forced to give a clean chit to the local police, the deceased's father, Chand Miyan, has claimed that he was paid Rs 5 lakh cash by the policemen after forcing him to put his thumb impression on paper and telling him to keep quiet on the issue.

Chand Miyan's son, Altaf, was allegedly found hanging from a 3 feet-high water pipe in the washroom of the police station lock-up on Tuesday, last week.

Chand Miyan claimed the policemen told him that the money was from the government, and asked him not to proceed with the matter. He also claimed that he was provided the cash in bundles of Rs 500 notes in the presence of senior officials of the police and the administration at the Goraha police outpost.

Chand Miyan said the money is still with him. "I



am ready to return it. All I want is justice for my son," he said. The father said that in the paper (which has now gone viral), it was written that his son was suffering from depression and had committed suicide in the washroom of the lock-up at Kotwali Sadar police station.

He said that his relatives were also warned not to

speak about the matter to the media and ensure the body is buried peacefully.


"Station house officer (SHO) Virendra Singh Indolia (now suspended), along with some other policemen, a sub-divisional magistrate and a local activist were present at the Goraha police outpost when the money was handed over to Altaf's father," said another relative of the deceased.

Kasganj Superintendent of Police (SP) Botre Rohan Pramod, however, denied the allegation.

Additional DGP Rajeev Krishna said, "I have no knowledge about any such transaction. Even if the cash was handed over to cover-up the entire matter, it is irrelevant now. An FIR has been registered on a complaint by the deceased man's father. The focus of the investigation is on custodial death. A magistrate and departmental probe is also being conducted."

Meanwhile, the Kasganj police have recovered the 16-year-old Hindu girl who was allegedly kidnapped by Altaf and an "unknown friend". She will be produced in court to record her statement, a senior police officer said.

IMA calls for booster dose for healthcare workers



to the fact that a policy document on booster dose is underway, IMA has also consolidated its stand on the booster dose for healthcare workers and other high-risk citizens across the country. Dr J.A. Jayalal, National President, IMA, said, "The booster dose for healthcare workers was initial-

ly desirable and we were not demanding it. But now we demand that healthcare workers should be given a booster dose as ample vaccine stock is available."

The IMA said that as of now the vaccine production has been augmented and availability of vaccine has also been increased.

IMA President said, "IMA demands the union govt to prioritize vulnerable population including healthcare workers and immuno-compromised citizens and permit them to take their third dose". He added that the third dose needs to be given on priority basis in India.

The IMA has also demanded that vaccination should be promoted for all people with diabetes and if needed third dose of vaccine should also be given to them. "In this Covid era as Diabetic people are more prone and vulnerable to serious Covid complications, IMA demands the vaccination should be promoted for all Diabetes people and if needed third dose of vaccination should be also given to them", said IMA in a statement.

2 days after PM's meet, parl panel discusses crypto currency

Two days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a high-level review meeting in connection with crypto currency, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Finance on Monday discussed the same with industry experts, association heads and stakeholders.

After listening to the stakeholders' views, the majority of the members were of the opinion that the advent of digital currency is inevitable but it cannot go ahead without regulation, sources said.

The Parliamentary panel, headed by former Union Minister and BJP MP Jayant

Sinha met to discuss 'Hearing of views of associations/industry experts on the subject 'Crypto Finance: Opportunities and Challenges'. Over the last few years, even as scores of private establishments have offered it as an attractive investment option, hundreds and thousands of Indians have invested in the highly volatile crypto currencies, a market which is not yet regulated. Newspaper advertisements and enticing audio-visuals on television and OTT platforms are constantly streamed to capture newer markets. This has put common investors' money at high risk.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday targeted the Congress for ignoring the welfare of tribals, adding efforts are underway to ensure development of regions which remained backward during the "previous" regimes.

Modi said India is celebrating the first Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas after Independence, adding the tribals' art and culture, and their contribution to the freedom struggle and nation-build-



ing is being remembered with pride.

The country cannot forget the bravery of Gond queen Durgawati or the sacrifice of Rani Kamlapati, he said. The struggle of Veer Maharana Pratap cannot be imagined without the brave Bhil tribe who fought shoulder to shoulder and made sacrifices, Modi said. "The previous regimes have committed a crime by ignoring the tribal icons and their contribution. The contribution of the tribal society was either not told to the country and even if told, very limited information was given," Modi said. Modi launched multiple initiatives for the welfare of the janjatiya community, including the Ration Aapke Gram scheme in Madhya Pradesh. The scheme is aimed at delivering the monthly quota of PDS Ration to beneficiaries from janjatiya community in their own villages every month, so that they don't have to travel to the

Fair Price Shop to collect their ration. Modi also handed over genetic counselling cards to beneficiaries, marking the launch of the Madhya Pradesh Sickle Cell (Hemoglobinopathy) Mission. The Mission has been developed to screen and manage patients suffering from sickle cell anaemia, thalassemia and other hemoglobinopathies and to increase public awareness about these diseases, whose impact is seen to be more profound on the janjatiya community of Madhya Pradesh. The PM also laid the foundation stone of 50 Eklaya Model Residential Schools across various states and UTs including Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Tripura and Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu. Kashmiris kill Kashmiris

Militants in Kashmir are out to kill Kashmiriyat. The Recent killing of a Muslim salesman of a Kashmir Pandit businessman in Srinagar's old city has once again shown that terror has no religion and anyone can become a victim. He can be a Muslim or a Hindu. Kashmir was known as the abode of sufis and saints due to the centuries-old indigenous tradition of communal harmony and religious syncretism in the Valley known as Kashmiriyat, which emerged around the 16th century and was characterised by religious and cultural harmony, patriotism and pride for their mountainous homeland of Kashmir. It exemplifies the joint Hindu-Muslim culture, festivals, language, cuisine and clothing in Kashmir. But after the outbreak of Pakistan sponsored armed insurgency in 1990, the gun-toting militants carried out the selective killings of Kashmiri Pandits which led to the mass exodus of the entire community from the Valley. Selective killings, including that of Kashmiri Pandit, Makhan Lal Bindroo, two teachers - a Sikh woman, Supinder Kaur and a Hindu man, Deep Chand, five non-local labourers and an assassination attempt of Sandeep Mawa, are clear indications that madness in Kashmir seems to be a never-ending process. The indoctrinated ultras at the behest of their handlers sitting across the Line of Control (LoC) are killing the innocents and have torn apart the very ethos of Kashmiriyat. Militants who are targeting members of the minority community are making things difficult for Kashmiri Muslims. The Kashmiri militants who have embarked on the mission to kill innocents and target the members of a particular community are creating a notion that every Kashmiri is a terrorist and no one except ethnic Kashmiri Muslims can live in the Valley.

Muslims to change the course of voting!

Muslims are an important constituent in Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections with around 19 per cent population in the state being Muslim but various surveys and different voting pattern suggest that unlike previous elections, the community will not vote homogeneously in the 2022 Assembly elections for any political party in the fray. Like others, the community too has certain other considerations to vote for in the next election in UP. This trend has started taking shape from the last two elections more obviously.

A survey by Pew Research Centre on religion, caste, nationalism and attitudes in India has suggested that around 20 per cent Muslims voted for the BJP in 2019 Lok Sabha elections. Around 8 per cent Muslims voted for the BJP in 2017 UP Assembly elections as per some other estimates. But for 2022 elections, situation is going to be different on many counts and more Muslims may vote for the BJP which was earlier touted to be the biggest element of the community.

So, what has changed now? Actually, there are several factors to decide which way Muslim voters would go that was otherwise anti-BJP block among all the voters. Looking at the past pattern, Muslim community was deciding on voting the party that was hinted at the Khutba (sermon) of the Friday prayer which was obviously to vote the party defeating the BJP candidate. But some kind of fragmentation has started taking place in the homogeneity of Muslim vote bank as various sections in the community started realising and questioning that the community as such doesn't have shared problems rather has different problems within the community. So, they certainly need to be addressed specifically varying from pocket to pocket and people to people. Giving devil its due as if social media incites them, it also empowers them by disseminating information about development works carried out to benefit them. They have started realising that voting en-mass failed to serve the purpose of addressing the issues of community per say. Though it gives them the government of their choice but not the government sensitive towards their welfare. Most of the time voting pattern of the community is based on emotive factors which are unproductive.

How are they divided? A section of Muslim women is not only comfortable but vocal in support of the BJP on two counts that is promised fulfilled of making law against Triple Talaq, safety and security issue; a section of youth is buying the argument of AIMIM leader Assaduddin Owaisi that Muslims need their



own representatives; the biggest section is still favouring the Samajwadi Party being messiah of the community; the aggressive Congress confused a minuscule section basically upper class Muslims who get along well with the upper caste Hindus; a new section in the community that is happy with the law and order situation in the state and a section that would be voting for the candidate from the community irrespective of the party fielding it.

There is no doubt about the SP, BSP, AIMIM and the Congress fielding Muslim candidates but the BJP too will also be fielding some candidates in UP Assembly polls and a UK-based Indian origin Muslim leader of Conservative Party has been entrusted with the responsibility of selecting Muslim candidate for the party. He is not only meeting prospective candidates but also visiting those places from where the candidate plans to try their luck in the hustings. Different political parties have different ways to woo Muslim voters if Akhilesh Yadav and his alliance partner and SBSP leader Om Prakash Rajbhar are invoking Jinnah in their public meetings, the BJP and its ecosystem is showing its work like passing Triple Talaq Law, Mudra Scheme, PMGAY, PMUAY and many other such scheme equally benefiting the community. The Congress and AIMIM are resorting to the old strategy of frightening the community of the BJP by branding it a Hindutva party. One of its leader Salman Khurshid has gone to the extent of equating

the ideology with ISIS and Boko Haram.

But voices coming from the community are like this: There was no Shia and Sunni riots in Lucknow from the past seven years which was otherwise an annual affair. Silence of Sunni community over terrorist attack on Shia mosques in Afghanistan has weakened the fact of unity in the community. This is also being realised by a section in the community that the government is tough on such elements who cause trouble in the society. A section of pasmanda (OBC) Muslims like Behna, Faqir, Dafali and Julaha who were traditional voters of the Samajwadi Party are disappointed.

The BJP played an important role in the drastic change of rupturing the very perception of homogeneity of Muslim vote bank that can influence victory or defeat of any political party by their political shifting. For the first time in 2014, the BJP proved that if broader Hindu mobilisation emerges in the favour of the party, there is no need to run behind Muslim votes. The BJP also proved that there is no need for appeasement politics to bring Muslims under the domain of development, alongside other communities. This has started a new kind of politics from stopping Iftar parties to temple visit.

So, the BJP has brought about two considerable shifts in the political scenario of the country in general and UP in particular. First it challenged the overestimation

of Muslim votes, and it proved that appeasement politics for electoral victory in a democracy is not a brand equity. But the opposition in Uttar Pradesh in no way will shun practising their conventional methods of Muslim mobilisation. Though the aggressive rise of the BJP's politics has sent them a bit defensive about their appeasement politics prompting them to project their soft Hindutva image, but these parties are still heavily dependent on their conventional political strategy, which is riding piggyback on secularism. But this time round, Muslims are unlikely to behave as a cohesive homogeneous vote bank in 2022 Assembly elections. Not only Muslim women but upper middle class along with a section of poor and downtrodden Muslims will move towards the BJP due to developmental schemes such as Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, Ujjawala Yojana and several other cash transfer benefits. However, it is too early to judge at this juncture whether Muslims will respond as an identity-craving community or as development-aspiring people in the UP assembly 2022 elections but it is certain they will not go the same way as they were traditionally trending.

Counter-terrorism police called in after car blast in Liverpool

British counter-terrorism police were called in after a taxi exploded at a hospital in Liverpool, leaving one dead and another injured, though this has not been declared a terrorist incident.

Police in the city confirmed the blast happened at around 11 a.m. on Sunday at the Women's Hospital in Liverpool city centre, reports Xinhua news agency.

Photographs posted on social media showed a taxi in flames and ambulances and fire fighters were also called to the scene.

Police placed a cordon around the hospital while inquiries continued to determine the cause of the explosion. "Work is still going on to establish what has happened, and could take some time before we are in a position to confirm anything," Merseyside Police said in a statement. "We are keeping an open mind as to what caused the explosion but given how it has happened,



to Merseyside Police," the statement said.

Three people have been arrested after the blast by counter-terror police, Sky News reported.

Saudi Arabia launches 1st non-profit city

Riyadh: Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud announced the launch of the first non-profit city.



The Prince Mohammed Bin Salman Non-Profit City in Riyadh is expected to be a model for the development of the non-profit sector globally and an incubator for youth and volunteer groups as well as local and international non-profit institutions, Xinhua news agency quoted a local media report as saying. The city will be built on an area of around 3.4 square kilometres and will support innovation, entrepreneurship and qualifying future leaders by defining non-profit work. The city that implements the digital twin model, will host academies, colleges, schools, a conference centre, science museum, creative centre offering a space to support the ambitions of innovators in sciences and new generation technology, the Crown Prince said following the launch on Sunday. In addition, the city will host venture capital firms and investors to support and incubate innovative enterprises to drive community contributions from around the world. The launch of the city comes days after the announcement of the offering of Saudi nationality to some talented individuals, in order to promote creativity and innovations.

Afghan women protest for rights to employment, education

The delay in providing right to education and employment to women by the Afghan Taliban led interim government in Afghanistan has triggered protests and uproar in the country.

On Sunday, dozens of Afghan women took to the streets of Kabul again, demanding their right to learn and seek employment under the new Islamic Emirate rule. Chanting slogans for their rights, protesters also lashed out at the international community for what they called ignoring the dire need for provision of basic rights to women in the country.

"We can tolerate hunger, can live without food, but we cannot tolerate injustice. We ask for freedom and justice in our country", said one of the protesters.

The latest protest is part of a series of protests that the Afghan women have been staging since the time Taliban took control of Afghanistan.

In the recent past, the Taliban security officials manhandled female protesters while media persons covering the protest were also assaulted and kept under custody. The Afghan Taliban interim government later announced through its Ministry of Interior (MoI) that demonstrations without the permission of the relevant ministry would not be allowed. Later, a pro-Taliban female rally was held in Kabul, where women chanted pro-Taliban slogans and expressed their support to the newly imposed Islamic law in the country. The Taliban claims of ensuring provision of all basic rights to women as per the teachings under the Islamic rule of law, will be provided to its female citizens, including right to work and education, they said.



Recently, a girls' school in Herat was opened while Taliban claimed that female nurses and doctors have been coming to work without any problems.

AUSTRALIAN PM LOSES POPULAR SUPPORT: POLL

Canberra: Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison has lost ground as the nation's preferred leader, a poll has revealed. The latest Newspoll, which was published on Sunday night, revealed that the leader of the opposition Labor Party, Anthony Albanese, has closed the gap to Morrison, reports Xinhua news agency.



It found that 46 per cent of respondents identified Morrison as their preferred Prime Minister compared to 38 per cent for Albanese.

It is the tightest gap between the two since March 2020 and marks a major turnaround from February when Morrison led 61-26. The poll of 1,524 voters was taken in the wake of Morrison's appearance at the COP26 climate summit in Glasgow where he committed to a 2050 net zero emissions target. Albanese has been a fierce critic of Morrison's signature climate policy, describing it as a "scam" that lacks detail. The Labor leader promised that he would release his own climate policy before the end of 2021. According to Newspoll, Labor leads Morrison's coalition 53-47 on a two-party preferred basis, a slight swing in the government's favor from 54-46 at the start of October.

Thirty-eight per cent of respondents said they intend to vote Labor as their first preference at the next general election, which is due to be held by May 2022, compared to 37 per cent for the coalition.

Massive 6.4 quake jolts Iran; 1 dead, 47 injured

Teheran | Agencies

A massive earthquake measuring 6.4 on the Richter scale followed by an almost as intense aftershock and more than 17 other tremors, jolted Iran, killing at least one person and injuring 47 others, according to official media.

The 6.4 quake originated near the small inland town of Fin at 3.37 p.m. on Sunday, Xinhua news agency quoted the Iranian Seismological Centre (ISC) as saying in a monitoring report.

Less than two minutes later, there was a 6.3-magnitude aftershock, very close to the same location in the southern province of Hormozgan. Among the 17 quakes registered by the ISC in the next five hours following the first aftershock, eight had magnitudes between 4 and 4.5 on the Richter scale.

According to the Iranian Red Crescent (IRC), the 22-year-old victim was killed in



Bandar Abbas, capital city of Hormozgan province, by a falling electric post.

A spokeswoman for Hormozgan University of Medical Sciences told local media on Sunday night that 47 people had suffered injuries. Mokhtar Salahpour, head of the IRC in Hormozgan, said the necessary equipment for emergency accommodation had been deployed in parks, schools and sports halls for the night, and items such as blankets and tents had been sent to affected areas.

Iran working to clear obstacles in rapprochement with Saudi

Tehran: Iran is currently working to remove the existing obstacles in the ongoing rapprochement with Saudi Arabia, a senior legislator said here.

"Given the statements and the welcoming approach of Saudi Arabian officials concerning the establishment of relations with the Islamic Republic, follow-ups to remove obstacles are underway," said Mahmoud Abbaszadeh Meshkini, spokesman for the national security and foreign policy commission of Iran's parliament. As quoted by Parliament's official news agency,

Abbaszadeh Meshkini stressed the capacity of Saudi Arabia to determine foreign policy preferences of "some countries" in West Asia, reports Xinhua news agency.

The senior representative noted that more than one deputy ministers of foreign affairs had presented reports to the chamber, adding that Iran is determined to expand relations with its neighbours.

Israel regulates digital currency transfer to curb money laundering

Israel has imposed new rules on the transfer of digital currency in an effort to combat money laundering and terror financing, according to an official statement.

Tel Aviv | Agencies

The new obligations are included in an ordinance imposed on service providers in financial assets, such as bonds, loans, stocks and bank deposits, reports Xinhua news agency.


The ordinance applies to providers such as credit, fintech and crypto companies that operate with virtual currencies.

It includes obligations to identify and verify customers, report their activity, control and monitor risks, and manage records.

It also imposes rules on electronic transfer of funds in Israel and abroad, and the transfer of financial assets in virtual currencies.

The new rules will as well allow the transfer of profits from cryptocurrency investments to Israeli banks if trading in these currencies is legal. The ordinance will allow the use of virtual currencies more securely and will let the authorities distinguish between legitimate use and illegitimate purposes, such as money laundering or terror financing, the statement said. The rules were jointly formulated by the IMPA and Israel's Capital Market Authority, Insurance and Savings.

The striking Employees of the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC) remained firm on their demand for the loss-making corporation's merger with the state government and continued their strike.

On Sunday, nearly 4,000 employees had reported to duty and the corporation operated around 80 buses



on different routes, they said.

"However, bus operations at all 250 depots are shut today, though many workshop employees have rejoined duty," a spokesperson of the MSRTC said. The employees started the

indefinite strike from October 28 and intensified it earlier this month.

They have refused to budge from their demand for the merger of the MSRTC with the state government. The merger will give them the status

of government employees, besides better salaries. The Maharashtra government has formed a committee to look into the demand of the employees. Last week also, all 250 depots of the MSRTC were closed since Monday. The MSRTC issued a pamphlet on Friday, urging the employees to call off the strike immediately. Accumulated losses of the corporation have risen to Rs 12,000 crore, still it paid the salaries for the last 18 months by taking a financial assistance of Rs 3,549 crore from the state government, it said.

The pamphlet had also mentioned the fulfillment of other demands such as increase in the dearness allowance and house rent allowance and a Diwali gift for the employees.

Ordinary commuters have been suffering and the MSRTC is losing Rs 15 to 20 crore every day due to the strike, it had said, also warning of the long-term financial impact.

MAHA MLC BY-POLLS: CONGRESS FIELDS PRADNYA RAJEEV SATAV

Mumbai: The Congress has nominated Dr. Pradnya Satav -- the widow of the late MP Rajeev Satav as the party candidate for the upcoming by-elections for a single seat to the Maharashtra Legislative Council, an official said here on Monday. A medico, Dr. Pradnya Satav is an OBC face of the party, and had missed the race for the Rajya Sabha bypoll in September, but is now being fielded for the MLC by-elections. The MLC bypolls will be held on November 29 for which the Opposition Bharatiya Janata Party has nominated its Aurangabad city president Sanjay Kinekar, and the tenure of the seat going for the by-elections will be till July 2024. The indirect elections shall be held with the legislators casting their votes.

Similar bullock cart races are held in Karnataka too, especially the areas that are adjoining Maharashtra.

There have been obvious comparisons with Jallikattu, another traditional sport from Tamil Nadu related to bulls.

The Nagaraaja case had resulted in the Supreme Court banning all such bull-related sports.



At the time, Purandare -- known for his bold views and courting controversies -- recalled some anecdotes of his childhood years and expressed a desire to live a few more years to serve society.

Born on July 29, 1922 at Saswad near Poona (now, Pune), Purandare was fascinated by Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj from an

early age, penned essays and stories which were later published in a book form, 'Thinagya' (Sparks). In over eight decades of his writing and theatre career, Purandare delivered more than 12,000 lectures on Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, studied all the fort and history of the Maratha Empire, making him an authority on the subject. He scripted and directed a historical play 'Jaanta Raja' (1985) a theatrical magnum opus, performed by over 200 artistes, elephants, camels and horse on the stage. The much-applauded play has been translated and enacted in five languages, clocking over 1,250 stage shows in Maharashtra, Goa, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh and the

United States.

Deshmukh sent in 2 weeks judicial custody "Eat Jail Food First" Court On Maharashtra Ex-Home Minister's Request

"You eat jail food first. If not, then I will consider," the judge told former Maharashtra minister Anil Deshmukh.

Former Maharashtra minister Anil Deshmukh arrested in a corruption case earlier this month was sent to judicial custody for 14 days on Monday. The special court, however, turned down his request for home-cooked meals. "You eat jail food first. If not, then I will consider," the judge said.

The court, however, accepted his appeal for a bed in view of the medical condition of the 71-year-old.

Deshmukh, the former Home Minister of Maharashtra, was arrested on November 1 in connection with a case of money laundering. The Enforcement Directorate made the arrest after questioning him for 12 hours at their office in Mumbai.



The agency started its investigation against Deshmukh after the Central Bureau of Investigation filed a corruption case against him in April.

The money laundering case stemmed from former Mumbai Police Commissioner Parambir Singh's Rs 100 crore bribery allegation.

The agency contends that

Deshmukh had misused his position as the home minister and collected Rs 4.70 crore from bars and restaurants of the city with the help of dismissed police officer Sachin Waze.

Deshmukh has denied all allegations of wrongdoing and argued that the agency's case was just based on malicious statements made by a tainted cop (Sachin Waze). Deshmukh had stepped down from his post earlier this year amid a row over bribery allegations by Parambir Singh, who is currently missing.

His resignation came hours after the Bombay High Court ordered a preliminary CBI investigation into the allegations of Mr Singh on the issue which started with the discovery of a car full of explosives near industrialist Mukesh Ambani's Mumbai home in February. The agency was given 15 days to submit the report. Now Parambir Singh faces corruption allegations and cases have been filed against him by the Mumbai Police and the state's Anti-Corruption Bureau.

BJP leader Kirit Somaiya to visit violence-hit Amaravati

Maharashtra awaits SC nod for bullock cart race

Turin: Italian Matteo Berrettini's campaign in the year-end Nitto ATP Finals began on an inauspicious note as the home star was forced to retire early in the second set of his match against Germany's Alexander Zverev due to an injury to his left oblique, in the Red Group of the elite eight-player tournament.

Tokyo Olympic Games gold medalist Zverev won a tightly-contested first set 7-6(7) in 79 minutes and led 1-0 in the second set when Berrettini was unable to continue late on Sunday night (IST). Following a medical timeout, the Italian attempted to continue, but after only one more point, he walked to the net to shake hands. Zverev climbed over the net to console him.

India are in Pool C and begin their campaign on December 6 against Russia. They will take on defending champions Argentina on December 7 in the round-robin league, followed by the match against Japan on December 9. The knockout matches will take place between December 10 and 16.

The teams in the fray include the Netherlands, Korea, Ireland, Zimbabwe in Pool A, England, Belgium, Canada and Uruguay in Pool B. Argentina, India, Japan and Russia in Pool C while Germany, Spain, United States and South Africa are in Pool D.

IPL 2022:

BCCI yet to give Letter of Intent to Ahmedabad owners

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has still not given the Letter of Intent to American company Irelia Co Pvt Ltd (CVC Capital Partners), who were awarded the franchise rights of the newly induced Ahmedabad team for the next season of the Indian Premier League.

IPL will be a ten-team affair from the 2022 season with the introduction of two new teams based at Ahmedabad and Lucknow. RPSG, made the winning bid of Rs 7,090 crore to acquire the Lucknow franchise while CVC Capital Partners was awarded the Ahmedabad franchise for a bid of Rs. 5,625 crore.

However, questions are being raised about CVC for its business



interests in betting firms in the international market. According to past press statements issued by CVC

Capital Partners, it acquired a majority stake in Malta-headquartered betting operators Tipico,

which has a major base in Germany too, in 2016 after taking a controlling stake in UK's Sky Betting and Gaming in 2014. Notably, betting is legal in those regions. But, none of these entities have business operations in India, where betting is illegal.

In the latest development, CVC's successful bid to win the Ahmedabad franchise of the IPL has gone into negotiations with the company trying to explain to the BCCI officials that its investment in a UK betting firm, which has become a bone of contention, is not illegal. As a result, there has been a delay in BCCI giving the Letter of Intent, which has already been submitted to the RPSG Group of Sanjiv Goenka, who has successfully bagged the Lucknow franchise.

Morata's late goal books Spain's ticket to World Cup finals




