# SUISSE SECRETS

Switzerland is a well-known destination for money from all over the world, in part because of its banking secrecy laws. There is nothing inherently wrong with having a Swiss bank account. But banks are supposed to avoid clients who earned money illegally or were involved in crimes - and reporters identified dozens of corrupt government officials, criminals, and alleged human rights abusers among Credit Suisse account holders, the Organised Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP) said in a report.

The 'Suisse Secrets' project investigates bank account information leaked from Credit Suisse, Switzerland's second-largest lender. The leak included more than 18,000 accounts that held in excess of \$100 billion at their peaks. It is the only known leak of a major Swiss banks client data to journalists. The documents have been compiled after more than 163 journalists from 48 media outlets in 39 countries across the world spent months analysing bank account information leaked from Credit Suisse. OCCRP stated that the leak included more than 18,000 accounts that held in excess of \$100 billion at their peak. It is the only known leak of a major Swiss bank's client data to journalists. Despite their notoriety - which, in some cases, would have been obvious from a quick Google search - Credit Suisse maintained relationships with some of these clients for years, though it is

possible that some accounts were ordered frozen by law enforcement. The Suisse Secrets project investigates these account holders, whose exploitation of Swiss banking secrecy is a prime example of how the international financial industry enables theft and corruption. The Suisse Secrets data was provided to the German newspaper *Sueddeutsche Zeitung* by an anonymous source more than a year ago. Nothing is known about the source's identity. The source, however, did provide a statement explaining his or her motivations. Those cases that merited publication involved clients known to have been high-risk: politically connected people or those accused or convicted of serious crimes. OCCRP said dozens of Credit Suisse accounts belonged to prominent figures, alongside the scandals, criminal investigations, or high-profile political events they were involved in. The larger story that unites these cases is that of a major financial institution that allowed clients to

Credit Suisse, which is a global investment bank and financial services firm based in Switzerland, on Sunday (February 20) said that it "strongly rejects" allegations of wrongdoing. Credit Suisse is apparently Switzerland's second-largest lender. Multiple media outlets have published results of investigations into a leak of data on thousands of accounts held there in previous decades. The documents termed "Suisse Secrets" have been published by Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP). It is an international investigation into one of the world's wealthiest and most important banks.

## PAK LINKED TO 600 ACCOUNTS

New Delhi: Around 1,400 individuals domiciled in Pakistan are linked with around 600 accounts opened in Credit Suisse, *The News reported*. The data also contained information of the accounts which have been closed now but remained operational in the past. A leak from a Swiss bank has unmasked the hidden fortune of its wealthy clients in 128 countries and they range from the business individuals to politically exposed persons and those investigated, at times convicted, in connection with different criminal activities.

## NSE fraud: CBI grills former NSE chief's advisor Subramanian

The CBI, which is probing the "yogi" fraud at the NSE, has questioned the bourse's former Chief Strategic Advisor, Anand Subramanian, who has appointed to his position despite lack of experience and paid a hefty salary, but found him to be "evasive", sources said on Monday. A source told reporter that his statements were recorded for three consecutive days at Chennai. "His statement is over. We have asked him not to leave the country. He will be summoned again whenever we will have a need. He was evasive throughout the questioning," the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) source said. Subramanian, who was brought to the NSE by its then CEO and MD Chitra Ramkrishna, reportedly had

The source added that another team of the CBI searched the SEBI office in Mumbai, and recovered some incriminating documents, evidences and digital documents. ## K'TAKA HINDU ACTIVIST'S MURDER: 3 HELD; PROTESTERS TORCH POLICE BUS

Karnataka Home Minister Araga Inanendra said on Monday that the police have arrested three persons in connection with the killing of Harsha (26), a Bajrang Dal activist who was stabbed to death in Shivamogga on Sunday night. Meanwhile, the situation in Shivamogga continues to be volatile with protesters torching a police bus on Monday. The procession march organised for Harsha turned violent as incidents of stone



pelting, and torching of vehicles were reported from Shivamogga, forcing the police to use tear gas and lathi charge against the protesters. Meanwhile, the Bajrang Dal has called for a state-wide bandh on February 23 condemning the killing of one of its activists. The police have arrested a person named Kasif in connection with the murder. Based on the information provided by him, two other accused have been arrested from Bengaluru.

## SKYMET FORECASTS NORMAL MONSOON FOR INDIA IN 2022

SkyMet, India's leading weather forecasting and agriculture risk solutions company, has come out with the 'Preliminary Monsoon Forecast Guidance for 2022'. SkyMet expects the upcoming Monsoon to be 'normal'. SkyMet has been predicting Monsoon since 2012, except in 2020 when it abstained for strategic reasons. SkyMet intends to release a detailed report on the prospects of Monsoon 2022 in April. SkyMet is in the process of gathering data sets pertinent for a comprehensive monsoon forecast. Ascertaining authenticity is absolutely essential and that is a long-drawn procedure. Therefore, it is a bit premature to share the collated figures but suffice to present preliminary guidance. Monsoon has large inter-annual fluctuations in its arrival, intensity,

duration, and withdrawal. It is rather early to decode all these aspects at this stage. However, there are precursors to get an early glimpse and gauge its health during the four-month-long season. The last two Monsoon seasons have been driven by back-to-back La Nina events, which has started shrinking now. It also means that Monsoon 2022 is going to be a devolving La Nina to start with and turn neutral later. Negative sea surface temperature anomalies in the equatorial Pacific Ocean are weakening. This warming inclination of the Pacific Ocean, albeit within neutral limits, may not lead to an above-normal or excess rainfall but chances of a 'corrupt' monsoon are also ruled out. This could be one of the 'normal' monsoon years making a robust start and finishing around the midway mark of the normal range, the range of normal rainfall is 96-104% of LPA (880.6mm).

## LALU SENTENCED 5-YR JAIL, RS 60L FINE IN 5TH FODDER SCAM CASE

Crores of rupees were illegally withdrawn in the name of transporting animals and arranging fodder for them in Bihar's animal husbandry department. The animals included bull, buffalo, cow, goat and sheep. The documents submitted by the department regarding the transportation were found to be fake. The vehicle numbers shown in the documents were of scooters, mopeds and motorcycles.

A special CBI court in Ranchi on Monday sentenced Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) chief Lalu Prasad to five years

imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 60 lakh on him in the Rs 139.35 crore Doranda treasury scam, the fifth fodder scam case. The former Bihar chief

minister along with other accused was pronounced guilty by the court on February 15. Lalu, 75, appeared in the court virtually. He is in judicial custody and is admitted to the Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) due to his poor health conditions. Beside Lalu Prasad, the court had convicted 74 others, including former MP Jagadish Sharma, Public Accounts Committee president Dhruv Bhagat in the case while 24 were acquitted for want of evidence. Earlier, the former Bihar chief minister was found guilty in four cases related to the Rs 950 crore fodder

scam, and is serving a sentence of 27.5 years of imprisonment. In the fifth case related to the scam, an FIR was lodged in the Doranda police station in 1996 and later the CBI took over the case for investigation. Initially, in case number RC 47 A/96, a total of 170 were accused of corruption, of which 55 have died, seven became witnesses, two confessed to the crime while six are still absconding. During the hearing of the case in the CBI special court, 575 people testified on behalf of prosecution, while 35 from the defendants. The probe agency produced 15 documents in the case.

## SC-APPOINTED PANEL SUBMITS INTERIM REPORT IN PEGASUS SNOOPING CASE

The Pegasus panel, appointed by the Supreme Court, is learnt to have submitted an interim report appraising the apex court about the progress on the probe. According to sources familiar with the development, the panel has submitted an interim report in the apex court. A bench headed by Chief Justice N.V. Ramana and comprising Justices Surya Kant and Hima Kohli will take up the petitions in the matter on February 23. The panel had earlier said that only two people submitted their mobile phones with it for forensic examination. On October 27 last year, the top court said it was compelled to take up the cause to determine the truth, as it appointed an independent expert technical committee supervised by a retired top court judge, Justice R.V. Raveendran, to probe the Pegasus snooping allegations. The top court had authorised the technical committee to devise its own procedure to effectively implement and answer the terms of reference. The committee can hold an investigation it deems fit and take statements of any person in connection with the inquiry and call for records of any authority or individual.



## Smartphones may reveal your identity, breaching privacy

The time a person spends on different smartphone apps is enough to identify them from a larger group in more than one in three cases, say researchers, who warn of the implications for security and privacy. Researchers from Universities of Lancaster and Bath analysed smartphone data from 780 people. The researchers then tested whether models could identify an individual when provided with only a single day of smartphone activity that was anonymous and not yet paired with a user.

"Our models, which were trained on only six days of app usage data per person, could identify the correct person from a day of anonymous data one third of the time," said David Ellis from the University of Bath. While that might not sound like much, when the models made a prediction regarding who data belonged to, it could also provide a list of the most to the least likely candidates. The findings published in the journal *Psychological Science* showed that it was possible to view the top 10 most likely individuals that a specific day of data belonged to. As a result, the researchers warn that software granted access to a smartphone's standard activity logging could render a reasonable prediction about a user's identity even when they were logged-out of their account. Therefore, it is important to acknowledge that app usage data alone, which is often collected by a smartphone automatically, can potentially reveal a person's identity. While providing new opportunities for law enforcement, it also poses risks to privacy if this type of data is misused, the researchers said.

## COVID PANDEMIC MAY END IN 2022: WHO



Moscow: If there are no more major Covid outbreaks after Omicron, the pandemic may see an end in 2022, the World Health Organisation (WHO) Representative in Russia has said. However, it does not mean that the virus will vanish completely, Melita Vujnovic was quoted as saying

in an interview with TASS news agency. "It's hard to make predictions at the moment but we hope that if nothing else happens, the pandemic may end in 2022. "What does an end to the pandemic mean? It means that there will be no major outbreaks, but it doesn't mean that the virus will vanish. "A great number of cases means that the virus is capable of mutating so we don't know how the situation will unfold. However, there is cautious optimism that major outbreaks will end once Omicron spreads across the globe," she said. According to Vujnovic, the WHO is trying to predict when it will happen, but it's difficult because countries "are now changing their testing strategies".



# WEARING HIJAB NOT ESSENTIAL RELIGIOUS PRACTICE, K'TAKA AG TO HIGH COURT

Wearing hijab is not an essential religious practice in Islam and it can't come under the Constitution's Article 25 (Freedom of conscience and free profession, practice and propagation of religion), Advocate General Prabhuling Navadagi argued in the Karnataka High Court on Monday.

He said that petitioner students have approached the court not just seeking the permission to wear headscarves, but want to wear hijabs to attend classes as part of their religious right.

Contending that the petitioners can't press for right to wear a hijab under Article 25, he said that the provision doesn't state it as a fundamental right.

"It is impossible to define religion. Article 25 does not protect the practice of the religion but, which is essential religious practice, so they narrowed it to essential religious practices. In Sabarimala case also, they used the word 'essential'," he said.

The core religious practices, those things without which any religion is no religion, shall be considered as



religious practices which could be considered under the right to religion, he said. The practice which is prevented and feared to cause fundamental change in the character of religion is essential practice, he said, adding that essential practice is what causes a religion to vanish if the practice is not allowed. Food and dress shouldn't be considered as essential part, Navadagi said, and went on to quote Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's statement of not allowing religion into the institutions and

how it should be consciously kept out, which could be in the present context of religious symbols.

He also cited imposition of religion on others and noted when the Parliament discussed adoption of secularism, it was argued if it is necessary to have religious rights? The Parliament, at the time of throwing open of temples to all Hindus, stated that social reform must be brought to all religions.

The Advocate General maintained that the question of whether

wearing of hijab is an essential religious practice must be settled and then other issues could be addressed. He reiterated that the petitioners simply would not come to the court with a request to permit them to wear headscarves, but seeking they be permitted to wear it as a religious practice.

At this, the bench questioned Navadagi as to what is the stand of the government on wearing of hijab, and if the government order is not specifying anything on hijab, what is the stand - can hijab can be permitted or not? "If institutions are permitting students with hijab, will the government has any problem?" it asked. The bench also asked that the petitioners are seeking to wear same colour headscarf as the uniform, can be treated as part of the uniform? If they are wearing dupattas, can they wear it around their neck? As he said that complete freedom is being given to the College Development Committees, and as a matter of principle, students are proposed to have secular outlook and can't display religious symbols, the bench asked whether wearing of cloth around neck is religious?

# BJP, RSS want one ideology, culture to prevail in India, Cong to promote diversity: Rahul

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday said that the vision and ideology of the BJP and the RSS is to promote one idea, one culture and one language maintaining these are superior to all other ideas, all other languages and all other cultures.

Gandhi referring to his recent Lok Sabha speech on "Union of states" said the Congress always wanted to protect and develop the diverse culture of people of all the states and Union Territories of India.

He said that the BJP and the RSS did not like the reference of "Union of states" because they have a different vision of the country.

"Prime Minister Narendra Modi, BJP and RSS leaders are coming to Manipur not with respect to the people of the state, not with understanding, they come with a sense of superiority. PM comes to Manipur with the idea that he has a superior vision, superior language and he has the right to define about India.

"I come Manipur with humility; because I understand that you (people) have a lot to give. I come here to learn a lot from you because there is a diverse culture, languages and traditions here. PM will come to Manipur on Tuesday with an air of superiority to tell you what he thinks and not to learn from you," the Congress leader said. While addressing his first election rally in poll bound Manipur at Hapta Kanjeibung in Imphal, Rahul Gandhi said the Congress believed in an India where every state had equal rights and the right to have its own language, culture and history. Modi earlier promised to give two crore jobs in a year,



deposit Rs 15 lakhs in the bank account of every Indian and he would change the destiny of the farmers, Gandhi said. "But now he is not talking about those commitments...he is not talking about three black farm laws. He is not talking now about the severely bad effect of 'Notebandi' (demonetisation). He is not talking about the flawed GST." The faulty GST was created to help two to three millionaires and to destroy the small and medium industries and enterprises. India is now witnessing the highest number of unemployed in 40 years," Gandhi referring to the Rs 11,000 crore National Palm oil cultivation mission of the government, said that this cultivation would not help the farmers of Manipur, it would destroy the economy of Manipur. "Companies like Patanjali and large business organisations would be benefited and make profit from this cultivation. We are not interested to help Baba Ramdev and punish Manipuri people. We are always keen to protect the interest of Manipur and to make the state self-sufficient in rice production," he observed.

# Wet spells over NE, NW India from Today

The IMD on Monday predicted a wet spell over northeast India on Tuesday and over Western Himalayan Region till February 24 and over adjoining plains of northwest India on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Delhi may get light rains on Tuesday. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) also predicted another wet spell over east India on February 24 and 25.

Under the influence of an approaching Western Disturbance and its likely induced cyclonic circulation, scattered to fairly widespread light/moderate rainfall/snowfall is very likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Himachal Pradesh from Tuesday till February 24 with maximum activity on February 22 and 23 and iso-

lated/ scattered rainfall/snowfall over Uttarakhand during the same period.

The IMD also said there is isolated heavy rainfall/snowfall very likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on Tuesday. Isolated hailstorms are also very likely over Uttarakhand on February 23.

Isolated light rainfall is likely over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, and west Uttar Pradesh on Tuesday and Wednesday and over Rajasthan on Tuesday.

Strong surface winds (25-35 kmph) are very likely to prevail over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and east Rajasthan on Tuesday while dust raising winds (25-35 kmph) are also very likely to prevail over west Rajasthan on Tuesday.

Meanwhile, there is a cyclonic circulation over

Bangladesh in lower tropospheric levels and a trough in lower and middle westerlies runs roughly across, and under their influence, scattered to fairly widespread light/moderate rainfall is likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, and Tripura during next 24 hours and will reduce thereafter.

Isolated to scattered light/moderate rainfall is very likely over Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha and West Bengal-Sikkim on February 24 and 25, the IMD said.

A gradual rise in minimum temperature by 2-3 degrees Celsius is very likely over the central India and no significant change thereafter while there is no significant change in minimum temperatures very likely over rest parts of the country during next five days.


# "Bombs Were Kept On Cycles": PM's Swipe At Samajwadi Party's Symbol

Days after a court convicted 49 people for the Ahmedabad serial blasts, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said he had vowed to punish the perpetrators even if they took refuge in "paatal", and accused the Samajwadi Party of being sympathetic to such terrorists.

Addressing a BJP campaign rally in Hardoi in Uttar Pradesh, PM Modi slammed the Samajwadi Party for being sympathetic towards terrorists and claimed that the previous government headed by it had sought to withdraw cases against several terror accused.

PM Modi said, "When I was the chief minister of Gujarat, the Ahmedabad serial bomb blasts took place. I can never forget that day when the earth was reddened by the blood of the victims of the serial blasts. There were uncontrolled tears. I picked up the blood-soaked soil and took a 'sankalp' (vow) that



my government will track these terrorists, even from 'paatal' (netherworld), and punish them."

Mocking the Samajwadi Party and its election symbol 'bicycle', PM Modi said, "...in the initial blasts, the bombs were kept on cycles...I wonder why they (terrorists) opted for cycles."

# INSULT TO BICYCLE IS INSULT TO NATION, SAYS AKHILESH

Lucknow: Samajwadi Party (SP) President Akhilesh Yadav has said that an insult to the bicycle was an insult to the nation.

Reacting to Prime Minister Narendra Modi statement that the Ahmedabad serial blast perpetrators had planted bombs on bicycles and that the SP's election symbol too happens to be a bicycle, Akhilesh Yadav said that the bicycle was integral to the lives of poor who use it as a means of transportation.

"Bicycles help farmers pedal their way to prosperity. Our bicycle ferry our girl child to school. Our bicycle is the only mode of commutation on which price rise cannot take its toll.

"Our bicycle is an aeroplane for the common man and a matter of pride for rural India. Insulting a bicycle is like insulting entire nation," Akhilesh tweeted in Hindi.



# DELHI MAN SODOMISES WOMAN AFTER KILLING HER, HELD

A 26-year-old man was arrested for allegedly killing a woman in Delhi and sodomising her dead body, Delhi Police said on Monday.

The accused, identified as Aman Bisht, was apprehended from Jaipur and charged under the Indian Penal Code's Sections 302 (punishment for murder) and 377 (unnatural offences - carnal intercourse against the order of nature).

On February 19, a call was received at the Burari police station, stating that a girl has been murdered at Kaushik Enclave in Burari area.

"As a police team reached the spot, the caller submitted that when she arrived at her home in the evening, she found a dead body of a girl lying on the floor of her bedroom," Deputy Commissioner of Police Sagar Singh



Kalsi said.

A crime team was called to examine the spot and take all evidence. The needle of suspicion was pointing towards her husband, Bisht as he was absconding. During investigation, the

accused's location was traced to Jaipur after which a police team was deployed and he was apprehended there. "From Jaipur, the accused Bisht was planning to flee to a safer location, possibly Nepal or somewhere in

north India," the DCP said.

It was learnt that the accused, under turmoil of a "unsatisfied sexual life with his wife", found refuge in drugs and virility drugs. He was also irked as his friends taunted him over his "cold" married life and sought to use his closeness with the victim to satisfy his urges. The interrogation revealed that on the day of the crime, Bisht brought the victim to his residence on the pretext of getting a saree for his wife. "After getting brushed off by her, the accused tried to overpower her and then in a fit of rage, used brute force on her neck, killing her in an instant," the DCP told IANS, adding that he then allegedly sodomised her dead body. There are traces of sexual act done by the accused for which the police are awaiting forensic test results. "Further investigation is on," the DCP added.

# Minor girl gang-raped, strangled to death in Delhi; one held

A 32-year-old man was arrested in connection with the gang-rape and murder of a 14-year-old girl in the national capital, an official said Monday.

The other accused, however, is still at large, he added.

Sharing details of the case, DCP (Outer north) Brijendra Kumar Yadav said a kidnapping case was registered on February 15 against unidentified persons after a girl went missing in the Narela Industrial Area Police Station.

On February 19, an information was received from one Rahul Rai of village Sannoth, who had returned from Jhansi, regarding a foul smell emanating from his shop and a labourer working there missing. Acting on the information, a police team searched the shop and found partial-

ly decomposed body of the missing girl hidden under gunny bags containing cow dung cakes. "The spot from where the body was recovered, was also examined by a Crime Team and the body was shifted to the mortuary of BJRM Hospital Jahangirpuri," the DCP said.

The police then immediately swung into action and deployed several teams to nab the accused. "Finally, a tip-off was received and one of the accused was arrested from the outskirts of the Sannoth Village on the intervening night of February 20-21," Yadav said, adding the accused was trying to flee to Mumbai.

During interrogation, the accused, a native of Hardoi district of Uttar Pradesh, revealed that he, along with another person, lured the victim to the work place after consuming liquor. The duo then sexually assaulted her.

# READY TO QUIT CONG AND REVIVE PATIDAR AGITATION: HARDIK PATEL

Hardik Patel, the Gujarat Pradesh Congress Committee working president, on Monday threatened to revive the Patidar agitation if the pending demands are not met by March 23, and said he was ready to quit the party for this.

He said that demands related to the 2015 agitation put forth by the Patidar Anamat Andolan Samiti (PAAS) have still not been fulfilled. And this has forced him and other Patidar leaders to revive the agitation.

"During the month preceding the ultimatum date of March 23, which is Bhagat Singh's death anniversary, we have planned to hold four programmes. The Patidar leaders and all those who want to join the agitation will approach the elected representatives and submit their memorandum. Similarly, the government offices at Tehsil and districts will also be approached," said Jayesh Patel, Hardik's aide and convenor, Patidar Anamat Andolan Samiti (PAAS).

"The BJP government has not heeded to our demands so far and their assurance of fulfilling all the pending demands have proven to be just a lollipop. I am once again raising this issue. If the demands are not met, then we will once again revive the Patel agitation, and it will be of the same intensity



as was in 2015," said Hardik.

He said the PAAS's demands regarding the reservation for the Patidar community was justified since the state government and the Centre had made provisions to give reservation to the poor and backward classes and 10 per cent quota for the economically backward upper castes.

"The government can take our ultimatum of March 23 as a request as well as a threat. We have been requesting the government to fulfill their assurances," Hardik Patel said.

"Anandiben as the chief minister withdrew many cases but the Vijay Rupani-led government has not withdrawn any. So we are repeating our demands to the new leadership. If the government wishes to have vengeance against me let it be, but at least withdraw the sedition cases against 202 others," said Hardik.

Hardik said that as many as three to four thousand youths were still affected due to those cases. "They are having trouble in securing government jobs, studies or for going abroad," said Hardik.

4 accused arrested for plotting conversion in Betul

CRUCIAL PHASE FOR BJP, CONGRESS

The stage is now set for the fourth phase of polling in Uttar Pradesh in which 59 Assembly constituencies, spread across nine districts, will go to polls on February 23. This phase includes 16 reserved constituencies. A total of 624 candidates are in the fray for 59 Assembly seats. In the fourth phase, polling will be held in Rohilkhand, Terai region, Awadh and Bundelkhand regions. In this phase, voting is also taking place in state capital Lucknow which has nine Assembly seats. Of these, eight are with the BJP. Polling is also scheduled to be held in this phase in Lakhimpur Kheri which has become a focal point of the farmer movement, especially after the October 3 incident in which four farmers were mowed down by an SUV owned by union minister Ajay Mishra Teni's son Ashish Mishra. Ashish Mishra was recently released on bail from jail last week. The opposition has been constantly targeting the BJP on this incident and Mishra's release has further stoked the fire. This phase is crucial for the BJP which faces the challenge of retaining its 51 seats. The party is facing resistance in the Terai region where BJP MP Varun Gandhi has been speaking up on issues against his own party. Varun is MP from Pilibhit, a farmer dominated constituency. Then the party faces hostile voters in Lakhimpur where the opposition is refusing to let the October incident fade from public memory. In Sitapur, the BJP faces rebel candidates. For the Congress, the biggest challenge of these elections comes from Rae Bareilly that also goes to polls this week. Both the Congress MLA, Aditi Singh and Rakesh Singh, have turned rebels and joined the BJP. Rae Bareilly is the parliamentary constituency of Congress president Sonia Gandhi and the party will face major embarrassment if it fails to win seats here.

Bridging the education gap for underprivileged children amidst pandemic

More than 3000 volunteers across nation and from others parts of the world successfully ran online classes constantly for 2 years. Amidst distress and losses volunteers as young as 14-years-old contributed in running online classes



When schools were shut and attending online classes was a distant dream for many children from underprivileged communities amidst pandemic, around 3000 volunteers as young as 14 years and as old as 50 years dedicated their days and nights to ensure learning for more than 4500 children. Out of these 3000 volunteers 600 were from Delhi alone. The activity based learning model developed by Child Rights and You (CRY) and its volunteers helped children from underprivileged communities of 13 states who either had poor or no access to resources to join online classes. CRY volunteers in collaboration with partner organisations not only made devices like mobile phones, laptops, tablets available to conduct online classes but also ensured that as many children must attend classes every day. Despite residing in a conflict zone in Israel amidst unrelenting airstrikes and bombings, a CRY volunteer Jiya Udenia, 21, who was part of ideation team for online classes ensured that classes don't stop even for a day. Jiya who works with South Delhi Action Group of volunteers since, March 2021 used to conduct classes from bomb shelters. "Initially, I felt it is going to be really hard for me to take classes from the underground

bunkers and in between deafening noises of bombardments and air strikes; but I chose not to give up. I had this realisation that my sessions were extremely important for these children who were away from schools for months due to pandemic, and were waiting eagerly to connect with me online, for their lessons. And their lives were even harder than mine but still they always smiled and never lost hope. I asked my children not to pay attention to the noise of missiles and bombardments going on in my background and just to focus on what I am teaching", she said. On the other hand a group of Phd scholars from Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Roorkee arranged laptops through crowd funding for the children of a settlement in Majra village of Roorkee so that they can get access to online classes. They also introduced One Child One Mentor programme during pandemic so that quality learning of every child joining online classes can be ensured. BineetMaurya, a PHD scholar from IIT Roorkee and mentorship head for the year 2020-21 said "one of the biggest challenges in online mode was the need of devices and ensuring that they are operated properly. Initially we arranged a mobile phone, later we bought 2 laptop through crowd funding in our institute itself and shifted to laptop. There

were other challenges like convincing children to come to classes' everyday amidst so much of distress due to COVID-19 but we were able to successfully conduct the online classes for over 18 months. To ensure learning of every child in online mode as well we introduced 1 Child 1 Mentor programme to track proper progress of each and every child". Online learning was ensured by a group of volunteers in remote areas of Badaun district of Uttar Pradesh as well. Around 62 children of two remote areas- GaiharBasti in Meer Saray and RasoolpurNagla village of Badaun are being provided with access to online classes run by volunteers since October 2020. Despite poor connectivity issues and many other challenges, volunteers came forward with solutions for every obstacle in providing education to children from underprivileged communities of Badaun. "These 2 areas where we are conducting classes are remote villages where there is always connectivity issues. To resolve that we even approached various telecom companies so that we can provide a stable medium to these children to connect with us online every day. Despite difficulties and lack of resource we were determined to con-

duct classes, thus, children also started showing a lot of interest in our activity based learning. We have seen a lot of change in reading and writing skills of these children. It gives us an extremely fulfilling experience", said Naman Rai, a computer science engineer from Haridwar and a CRY volunteer. These volunteers have been tirelessly working day and night since pandemic hit the nation not only to provide online classes but also to ensure relief material, vaccination awareness and sensitizing children and their families from underprivileged communities. Explaining the essence of volunteerism Regional director, CRY - North, Soha Moitra said "CRY has always believed that volunteering is not just helping and supporting under-served communities. Rather it's a mutual process. Volunteering gives you the opportunity to understand the society at large, especially the issues and challenges that under-served communities go through. It gives you the power to work on the problems in the society that has been displeasing you. It teaches you how even a small contribution to the society can lead to massive changes".

Russian battleplans call for 'overwhelming intensity of fire' on Ukraine

Russian battleplans have called for an "overwhelming intensity of fire" on Ukraine that could kill "tens of thousands" within the opening days of a conflict, as President Vladimir Putin moved his troops within three miles of the two countries' border, the US

Russian battleplans have called for an "overwhelming intensity of fire" on Ukraine that could kill "tens of thousands" within the opening days of a conflict, as President Vladimir Putin moved his troops within three miles of the two countries' border, the US has warned. Tanks, trucks and artillery have been spotted just two and a half miles from Ukrainian territory in Russia's Belgorod region as new satellite

images reveal convoys and troops hiding in civilian areas and the tree-lines of forests in Soloti and Valuyki - a short distance from Ukraine's Kharkiv region where major military bases are located, the Daily Mail reported. Diplomacy is continuing despite the threat, though the Kremlin on Monday downplayed the possibility of a meeting between US President Joe Biden and Putin after

the White House said that the American leader had agreed "in principle" to talks brokered by France, provided war did not break out in the meantime. "It's premature to talk about any specific plans for organising any kind of summits," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said, adding that no "concrete plans" had been put in place for a meeting, the Daily Mail reported.

The next high-level negotiations between the two sides are due for Wednesday this week, when US Secretary of State Antony Blinken and Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov will meet with the issue of Biden-Putin talks expected to be on the agenda. Meanwhile Russian military exercises in Belarus which were due to end on Sunday were extended to an unspecified date, meaning 30,000 men plus ballistic missile launchers, artillery and tanks will remain in place on Ukraine's northern border and within easy striking distance of Kiev. Biden warned at the weekend that Putin has already given the order to attack, leaving the world guessing as to where and how hard the hammer will fall. American officials who claimed to have seen some of the Kremlin's battle plans warned that a full scale bombardment of the country is being prepared. "We were told to expect tens of thousands of casualties in the opening days," one of the officials told The New York Times.

Pak concerned over presence of foreign terror groups in Afghanistan

The Pakistani ambassador to Kabul has expressed the countrys serious concerns over the active presence of foreign terrorist groups in Afghanistan, who use Afghan soil to carry out terror related attacks and activities in Pakistan.

Ahmed Khan said that terror groups like Daesh and Al-Qaeda pose a serious threat to Pakistan as they facilitate, support and operate in tandem with terror groups in Pakistan. "Terrorist organisations present in Afghanistan have been posing threats to the security of Afghanistan as well as to other countries, including Pakistan. Daesh is there, and remnants of Al-Qaeda may be there too. Then there are elements like Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), Baloch insurgents and many other groups," said Ahmed Khan during an interview with Afghanistan's Tolo News. Khan also expressed security concerns along the Durand Line, hoping to resolve the matter with the Taliban leadership in Afghanistan. "The fence was erected or installed in the previous years when cross-border terrorism was at its highest. One of the ways the

Pakistan government could deal with this issue was to erect a fence," he said. Khan's reservations raise questions over the Taliban leadership of the Islamic Emirate, as it does not agree to the presence of foreign terrorist groups on its soil. Afghan Taliban have also assured that Afghan soil would not be used against anyone. It is pertinent to mention that the Taliban regime does not recognise the Durand Line, an issue that has escalated tensions between the two countries in the recent past, when Taliban fighters removed the fence, claiming that the Pakistani authorities had installed the fence on Afghanistan territory. "Considering the current difficult condition, Afghanistan should have good political, economic and social relations with its neighbors, particularly Pakistan," said Sayed Haroon Hashmi, a political analyst.

DEATH TOLL FROM BRAZIL LANDSLIDES REACH 152

Brasilia: The death toll from the major landslides in the Brazilian municipality of Petropolis has risen to 152, with 165 people still missing, local civil defense agency reported.



According to the agency, more than 500 firefighters were working in the area where the landslides occurred, aided by about 40 sniffer dogs, as they searched for the missing, reports Xinhua news agency.

Local residents also offered a helping hand for the search, especially in the area of Morro da Oficina, where at least 80 homes were destroyed. The mayor's office in Petropolis, a city located 68 km away from state capital Rio de Janeiro, began on Sunday a mega clean-up operation in the area, where roads and buildings were damaged by flooding and landslides. "I never imagined something like this and, look, I have served four terms and seen a lot of rain. This is the biggest tragedy in Petropolis. I am going to dedicate all my energy to fighting right now," Mayor Rubens Bomtempo told reporters. The rains on February 15 that triggered the landslides were the worst the city has seen since 1932, according to Rio de Janeiro State Governor Claudio Castro.

China to provide J-10C fighter jets to Pakistan

China will deliver 25 J-10C fighter jets to Pakistan within weeks in a major boost to the countrys military capabilities to defend its airspace, The News reported.

China will deliver 25 J-10C fighter jets to Pakistan within weeks in a major boost to the countrys military capabilities to defend its airspace, The News reported. UK's Financial Times reported that the first batch of combat aircraft is being tested in Chengdu, the base of its manufacturer Chengdu Aerospace Corporation. "They will be transferred to Pakistan once Pakistan Air Force pilots and technicians complete an introduction to the aircraft," a journalist, working with a Chinese military publication, told FT. Senior officials in Islamabad said the jets would be delivered before the end of the month, the report added.



The images of the J-10C fighter jet with the marking of Pakistan Air Force (PAF) recently surfaced on social media and were widely circulated by media outlets. First published on social media last week, the images

show two J-10Cs, equipped with China's domestically developed WS-10B Taihang turbofan engines, undertaking test flights at an undisclosed location. "If confirmed, this could be the first time China has exported the J-10 series fighter and also the first time it has exported the WS-10 series engine," observers said. Commenting on the matter, Chinese analysts have lauded the latest defence cooperation between the two countries, saying that the move yields great significance to them, in terms of boosting combat capabilities of the Pakistan military, promoting China's aviation equipment, and responding to their security interests in the region, The News reported.

JAPANESE PM TO JOIN ONLINE G7 SUMMIT OVER UKRAINE TENSIONS

Tokyo: Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida will take part in an online meeting of the G7 countries this week and the talks will be aimed at measures to de-escalate tensions between Russia and Ukraine, the government said on Monday. Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida will take part in an online meeting of the G7 countries this week and the talks will be aimed at measures to de-escalate tensions between Russia and Ukraine, the government said on Monday. Kishida said he would make his utmost efforts in lockstep with the G7 and other members of the international community to deescalate and ultimately resolve the crisis on the Russia-Ukraine border, Xinhua news agency reported. Addressing Parliament, he said that "while the situation remains critical, Japan will continue to make diplomatic efforts with other countries to ease tensions". Kishida urged Russian President Vladimir Putin last week to find an "acceptable" diplomatic solution to the current impasse and held a teleconference with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky during which a number of pertinent issues were traversed, government sources said. Kishida's participation in the Thursday summit, meanwhile, to be hosted by Germany, was announced by Chief Cabinet Secretary Hirokazu Matsuno.

"Whether he considers it or not, Uddhavji is our friend. He is the son of Shiv Sena supreme late Balasaheb Thackeray. We have worked together for several years," he said. "Who is Sanjay Raut? He came to the Shiv Sena lately and who is he teaching? The BJP leader further said. "We would like to tell Uddhavji that as per what we understand, Raut is working on an agenda given by Pawar Saheb. The agenda is to remove you from the chief minister's position as you

have completed two-and-a-half years as CM," Patil claimed. "...And since Supriya Sule cannot be made CM, for him (Pawar) making Raut the chief minister will be as good as making Sule the CM," Patil added. Sule, the Lok Sabha member from Baramati in Pune, is Pawar's daughter. Notably, after the 2019 Maharashtra Assembly polls, the Shiv Sena had snapped ties with its long-term ally BJP over the issue of sharing the chief ministerial post. The Thackeray-led party had then forged an alliance with the NCP and Congress to form government in the state. To a query, Patil deplored the language used by Rajya Sabha member Raut in some of his statements against BJP leaders and said "using such kind of language is not our culture".

### COVID-19: HC asks Maharashtra govt if it will withdraw ban on unvaccinated people from travelling in local trains

A bench of Chief Justice Datta and Justice MS Karnik was hearing two public interest litigations seeking that all people in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) be allowed to travel in local trains, irrespective of their vaccination status.

The Bombay High Court on Monday asked the Maharashtra government if it was willing to withdraw its notification issued last year prohibiting people not vaccinated against COVID-19 from travelling in local trains in the city. "Let bygones be bygones. Let there be a new beginning," Chief Justice Dipankar Datta said, adding that Chief Secretary Debashish Chakraborty must inform the court on Tuesday if the state government will withdraw its decision to permit only fully vaccinated people to travel

in local trains, irrespective of their vaccination status. The PILs challenged three notifications issued by the Maharashtra government in July and August last year that prohibited unvaccinated people from travelling in local trains, which are considered as the lifeline of Mumbai. Niles Ojha, the counsel for one of the petitioners, had earlier argued in the HC that the prohibition on use of local trains by unvaccinated people was illegal, arbitrary, and in breach of the citizens' fundamental right to move freely across the country, as

guaranteed by Article 19 (1) (d) of the Constitution. He had argued that the government's move discriminated between the vaccinated and unvaccinated people, though neither the Centre nor the Maharashtra government had made vaccination mandatory. On the previous hearings, the HC asked for the state files on the three notifications under challenge and realised that the decision to prohibit unvaccinated people from travelling in local trains had been taken unilaterally by the then chief secretary Sitaram Kunte.

The high court on Monday said, "Chief Secretary has to withdraw order (the notification on such prohibition). Whatever has been done by his predecessor (Kunte) is not in accordance with law." "Withdraw this and allow people. Now, the COVID-19 situation has improved. Maharashtra handled it beautifully. Why are you inviting a bad name?" the court said. The state must be sensible and not treat the issue as an adversarial litigation, the court said and sought the chief secretary's response by Tuesday afternoon.

the last rites today on the banks of the River Warana. Nationalist Congress Party state President and Sangli Guardian Minister Jayant Patil said that it was Chavan's childhood dream to join the Indian Army and defend his motherland. "He not only fulfilled his dreams,

but also earned the honour of being a brave and conscientious soldier of the army. The country has lost a courageous soldier at a very young age... The people of Sangli will never forget his sacrifices," said Patil. Chavan had joined the Army in March 2017 and was serving with the Mahar Regiment 4 under the

Rashtriya Rifles Battalion when the tragedy struck. He is survived by his aged parents and a younger sister, who were present at the funeral, besides hundreds of villagers from Shigaon and surroundings, top district and military officials and political leaders across party lines.

In a press conference on Saturday, Narayan Rane had repeated his allegations that Sushant Singh Rajput's man-

ager Disha Salian was gang-raped and murdered. Shiv Sena leader and Mumbai Mayor Kishori Pednekar lodged a complaint against the minister over his statement. "It is unfortunate that Disha is being defamed even after her death. Even the CBI has investigated the matter and this despite the post-mortem report stating that Disha was neither raped nor was she pregnant," Pednekar said in her complaint. The mayor claimed that even Disha's parents had said the same thing accepting the post-mortem report. Taking cognisance of the complaint, Maharashtra State Women's Commission chairperson Rupali Chakankar tweeted the directions. "The Maharashtra State Women's

Commission has directed the Senior Inspector of Police, Malvani Police Station to submit a report in this regard within 48 hours," she said in a tweet. Narayan Rane made the allegations a day after he got a notice from the Shiv Sena-ruled Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) for inspecting his bungalow in Juhu for alleged violations. On Monday, BMC officials inspected Rane's bungalow for alleged violations. The Union Environment Ministry too issued a notice to Rane's seaside bungalow in Malvan for alleged violations of the Coastal Regulatory Zone (CRZ). Rane had alleged the action by the state government as vendetta politics.

### BJP DEMANDS BUDGETARY PROVISION FOR DHANGAR COMMUNITY



Mumbai: BJP leader Gopichand Padalkar has written a letter to Maharashtra Finance Minister Ajit Pawar reminding him to make provisions in the budget for the Dhangar community.

Ahead of presenting the state budget, BJP leader Gopichand Padalkar has written a letter to Maharashtra Finance Minister Ajit Pawar reminding him to make provisions for the Dhangar community.

The BJP MLC pointed out the failure of the Maha Vikas Aghadi government that could not spend Rs 1,000 crore meant for the community in the past two years.

In the letter, Padalkar said, "Dhangar community has contributed a lot in development of Maharashtra. They were at the forefront in fighting with the British. Maharaja Yashwantrao Holkar who belonged to Dhangar clan fought for the rights of the backward and oppressed. However, now the community is struggling for its rights for the past 30 years. And your government has failed to keep any promise with the community."

Recalling the promise given by the community by earlier BJP government, Padalkar said that the then state Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis was the only one 'who understood their problems'.

"In a major political change, Devendra Fadnis government came to power in 2014. For the first time, he recognised the seriousness of the issue and assured them that the community would be entitled to 22 welfare schemes meant for tribals till they get the Scheduled Tribe certificate. He had immediately announced Rs 1000 crore and sanctioned Rs 500 crore."

"The schemes included educational scholarships, hostels, measures to elevate social and economic status, housing benefits, etc... However, the government changed and not a single rupee has been spent on the Dhangar community. Covid-19 pandemic, diseases of sheep and goats, lack of basic facilities at dwelling places of Dhanagar community have marred their economy," he said.

Requesting the government to boost the morale of the community, the BJP leader said they need justice.

"Fadnis government announced the schemes for them, now those schemes have only remained on paper during your tenure. There is anger in the community and that perhaps explode one day. I expect you to at least make some provisions for the community in the coming budget session and bring some relief in their present situation," Padalkar added in the letter.

The ED officials said that the court after accepting the charge sheet took cognisance of it. "On February 15, we filed the charge sheet while the cognisance of the charge sheet was taken on February 18". The ED initiated money laundering investigation against Badshah Majid Malik and others on the basis of prosecution complaint filed by the DRI in a case relating to seizure of Red Sanders worth Rs 3.16 crores in 2015. Investigations by DRI had established that Badshah Majid Malik was the kingpin of the syndicate involved in the smuggling of Red Sanders.

The ED had on December 20, 2021 conducted searches at eight locations in Mumbai and Thane resulting in the seizure of incriminating documents. On December 21, 2021, a day after the raid, ED had arrested Badshah. The ED, during the investigation, learnt that Badshah Majid Malik and others had laundered the proceeds of crime generated by Malik's illegal activities in the guise of share subscription premium in one company that had been incorporated by him and his associates. The money was subsequently transferred to the accounts of the promoters of the Company including Badshah Majid Malik and was used for purchasing properties, luxury cars and paying off loans.

### Declare Marathi 'Classical Language' by Feb 27, Maha urges Centre

A day after dispatching 4,000 postcards to President Ram Nath Kovind, Maharashtra on Monday made a strong pitch to the Centre to accord the status of "Classical Language" for Marathi by February 27 - celebrated as Marathi Language Day.

A day after dispatching 4,000 postcards to President Ram Nath Kovind, Maharashtra on Monday made a strong pitch to the Centre to accord the status of "Classical Language" for Marathi by February 27 - celebrated as Marathi Language Day. Marathi Language Minister Shubhash Desai went to New Delhi and called on Union Culture Minister G. Kishan Reddy and discussed the long-pending issue with him. "We have submitted a letter and a booklet to him detailing how the state government has completed all the formalities and why Marathi deserves to be given the status of a classical language at the earliest," he said.

Desai said that Reddy was extremely open to the suggestion and even conveyed that there is no doubt that Marathi deserves the honour. "We have invited Minister Reddy to come to Maharashtra on February 27 and make the momentous declaration granting the classical language status which would be welcomed by the 13 crore people of the

state," he added. Earlier, Desai and his team comprising officials like Bhushan Gagrai, film personality Shrirang Godbole and others gave a detailed presentation showing that Marathi language satisfies all the parameters for been made a classical language. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah have displayed a positive approach to the state's demand and Reddy assured that the Centre would take a decision soon in the matter. On Sunday, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray dispatched a box containing around 4,000 postcards to the President to demanding classical language status to Marathi. The postcards - sent in a gift-wrapped box with the slogan "Abhijat Marathi Jan Abhiyaan (Mass Campaign for Classical Marathi)" printed on it - are part of an ongoing state-wide campaign which the state government hopes will fructify by February 27. This was the second lot of postcards - earlier another lot of 6,000 was sent to the President with the same plea. In the past couple of months, people all over the state - ranging from celebs to commoners - have dropped over 125,000 postcards to Rashtrapati Bhavan.



Last December, Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar fired the first postcard to the President, neatly typed in Marathi and signed by him, kick-starting the trend. Presently, only six Indian languages - Sanskrit, Tamil, Kannada, Telugu, Malayalam, and Odia - have been bestowed the status of classical language, based on various parameters. Maharashtra's ruling Maha Vikas Aghadi pointed out that although the Centre took the decision in 2004 to confer the classical language status to various languages, Marathi was ignored despite repeated requests. Even a high-level committee of language experts appointed by the Centre had unanimously approved a proposal to this effect seven years ago, but there has been no further progress in the matter. Pawar had said in his postcard to the President that it was necessary to grant the status of a classical language to Marathi as recommended even by the Sahitya Akademi, at the earliest. "Marathi is not only an ancient language but also the state language, used by litterateurs, intellectuals, by people of religion besides the common masses, and ranks among the major languages in the world," he said. The

Maharashtra Legislature passed a unanimous resolution recommending to the Centre to accord classical language status to Marathi in 2020. In anticipation of the exalted status, Thackeray in October 2021 cleared the proposal to construct a 'Marathi Bhasha Bhavan' on a 2,500 square metre plot in south Mumbai - a project which had been on the backburner for nearly eight years. Coming up within the Jawahar Bal Bhavan complex at Marine Drive, the work on the project is starting shortly with a completion target of 18 months, comprising a library, an expo centre, conference halls, etc, to promote the Marathi language. During the tenure of Congress Chief Minister Prithviraj Chavan, a committee chaired by litterateur Rangnath Pathare had prepared a voluminous report running into 500 pages on the same issue. The report was forwarded to the government in July 2013, but the matter remained unresolved after the change of guard both at the Centre and the state. The Akhil Bharatiya Marathi Sahitya Sammelan, which started in 1878, has demanded the classical language status for Marathi several times in the past. The status paves the way for two prestigious international-level awards for scholars of eminence in the Indian classical language, setting up centres of excellence for studies, the University Grants Commission creating or starting certain number of Professional Chairs in these languages besides dedicating various institutions for the same to promote the study and research in such classical languages.


Productions.


## JUSTIN BIEBER TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID, POSTPONES LAS VEGAS CONCERT

## INDIAN TEEN PRAGGNANANDHAA BEATS NO.1 CARLSEN IN ONLINE CHESS TOURNAMENT

India's 16-year-old Grandmaster Rameshbabu Pragganandhaa shocked world champion Magnus Carlsen of Norway in the eighth round of the Airthings Masters online rapid chess tournament on Monday. Pragganandhaa halted Carlsen's three-game winning streak on the second day of the 16-player all-play-all online tournament which is part of the Champions Chess Tour. Both Pragganandhaa, the youngest player in the field, and Carlsen had a rough first day of the event which has four games played on each of three days (Feb 19-21) of the preliminary stage while three rounds will be played on Tuesday (Feb 22). Carlsen had racked up three wins in a row as he charged up the points table of the event hosted by his company Play Magnus Group. But then he ran into Pragganandhaa in the eighth round and stumbled again as the Indian player capitalised on a blunder by the reigning world No. 1 to record his first win against Carlsen



in any format of chess.

After losing three successive games on Sunday night, the Indian Grandmaster from Chennai ran into Carlsen and scored a memorable win.

Opting for Tarrasch variation in French Defence, Pragganandhaa got an advantage as Carlsen blundered and the Indian won in 39 moves. This was his second win in eight games in this event.

Earlier, he defeated Armenian-American Levon Aronian and drew with Dutch GM Anish Giri and Le Quang Liem of Vietnam but lost to China's Ding Liren, Eric Hansen of Canada, Jan-Krzysztof Duda of Poland and Shakhriyar Mamedyarov of Azerbaijan.

Pragganandhaa was thus placed 12th among 16 players with eight points in an event with football-style scoring in which a player gets three points for a win and one for a draw.

Russia's Ian Nepomniachtchi scored three wins on the second day of the tournament that ended early on Monday and was leading with 19 points from a possible 24 points. Ding Liren and Hansen were sharing the second spot with 15 points each.

Carlsen (13 points) was sharing the fifth spot with Vincent Keymer of Germany while Aronian followed in the next position in the event in which the top eight placed players qualify for the knockout stage on February 23 which will also be played on chess24.com's online platform.

## India climb to top of T20I rankings

India's 3-0 whitewash of West Indies in the T20I series has helped them overtake England at the top of the ICC Men's T20I Team Rankings released on Monday.

India won the third and final T20I by 17 runs against the Kieron Pollard-led side in Kolkata with young wicket-keeper-batter Ishan Kishan (34), Shreyan Iyer (25),

Suryakumar Yadav (65) and Venkatesh Iyer (35 not out) coming up with useful contributions as the tourists could manage only 167/9 in reply to India's 184/5.

The triumph helped India leapfrog England at the top of the T20 team rankings, with Rohit Sharma's side now matching the top rating of 269.

While England and India both have the same rating (269), India have a total of

10,484 points, 10 more than England's 10,474.

Pakistan (rating of 266), New Zealand (255) and South Africa (253) round out the top five countries, while Australia (249) remain in sixth after their 4-1 series victory over Sri Lanka.

India are fourth in the ODI rankings with a rating of 110, with New Zealand (121), England (119) and Australia (116) occupying the top-three spots.

## Spanish teenager Alcaraz makes history, becomes youngest ATP 500 titlist



Spanish teenager Carlos Alcaraz made history, becoming the youngest ATP 500 titlist since the category was created in 2009, defeating third-seeded Diego Schwartzman of Argentina 6-4, 6-2 on Monday (IST).

Interestingly, Alcaraz had won his first ATP Tour match as a 16-year-old at the Rio Open two years back. It is the second tour-level title in the teenager's career following his breakthrough in Umag last year.

When the Spaniard had stunned countryman Albert Ramos-Vinolas in Rio two years ago, he was No. 406 in the ATP Rankings but with the title triumph, the teen is expected to move into the ATP top-20 for the first time.

Alcaraz overwhelmed the world No. 14 Schwartzman



with his power and gritty play, winning 12 of the final 16 games. He also converted five of his six break points in the match.

Alcaraz employed a lot of power and used tactical drop shots at the net to finish the job. It was an impressive week for Alcaraz, who lost his first set of the tournament on February 15 against Jaume Munar of Spain by a 6-2 margin. But after that, the teenager played sensational tennis to excel on the South American clay.

## La Liga Review Good weekend for Real as Sevilla only top-6 side not to win

Real Madrid reopened a six-point lead at the top of La Liga after they won 3-0 at home to Alaves, while second-place Sevilla were held to a 1-1 draw away to Espanyol on Sunday evening.

Marco Asensio, Vinicius Jr and Karim Benzema were all on target as Real Madrid scored three goals in the last 27 minutes to claim a 3-0 win at home to struggling Alaves.

Sevilla looked to be on track for a win away to Espanyol when Rafa Mir finished at the far post to put them 1-1 up in the 36th minute, but Sergi Darder's second goal in two games, early in the second half saw the points shared.

Betis remain just a place behind their neighbors after a tight 2-1 win at home to Mallorca which came thanks to an 83rd minute William John penalty for handball.

FC Barcelona remain fourth with a convincing 4-1 win away to Valencia in



the Mestalla Stadium.

Barca were hugely effective in attack, getting all six of their shots in the game on target, with four of them hitting the new, Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang scored twice, while Frenkie de Jong also netted to finish off an excellent move as Barca went in 3-0 at the break.

Athletic Club Bilbao kept in touch with the battle for Europe on Sunday evening with a 4-0 thrashing of local

rivals, Real Sociedad in the Basque derby. Arnaut Danjuma's scored a hat-trick as Villarreal continued good form with a 4-1 win away to Granada, which leaves the home side in trouble.

Danjuma put Villarreal 2-0 up by halftime and although Luis Milla's penalty gave Granada hope of a comeback, Danjuma also scored a penalty, before Moi Gomez added a fourth in injury time.

## Qatar Open Azarenka overcomes Putintseva in Doha comeback

Former World No.1 Victoria Azarenka of Belarus had to stage an incredible fightback in her opening match at the Qatar Open, outlasting Yulia Putintseva of Kazakhstan 5-7, 6-2, 7-5.

Two-time Australian Open champion Azarenka will have her first meeting with Madison Brengle of the United States in the second round. Brengle defeated Turkish wildcard Ipek Oz on Sunday, 7-5, 6-3. No.12 seed Azarenka, winner of back-to-back Doha titles in 2012 and 2013, was down 0-4 in the third set and saved a match point at 5-4 in the decider before prevailing after 2 hours and 48 minutes of intense tennis.



Azarenka has now improved her stellar career win-loss record in Doha to 18-2, as she aims to become the first three-time Doha champion.

Putintseva is still seeking her first main-draw win of the season after a first-round defeat at the Australian Open and a loss to Marketa Vondrousova in Dubai qualifying.

## India cricketer V.R. Vanitha hangs her boots

India cricketer V.R. Vanitha on Monday announced her retirement from all forms of cricket at the age of 31. Vanitha informed about the decision to retire from cricket in a post through her Twitter and Instagram accounts.

"19 years ago, when I started playing cricket, I was just a little girl who loved sport. Even to this day, my love for cricket remains the same. My body says stop. It's been a journey of struggles, joy, heartbreak, learning and personal milestones," wrote Vanitha.

Vanitha made her international debut in an ODI against Sri Lanka in January 2014. She went on to represent India in six ODIs and 16 T20Is, scoring 85 and 216 runs, averaging 17 and 14.40 respectively. Vanitha was a part of India's squad during the 2016 Women's T20 World Cup at home, where the hosts' failed to reach the semi-finals.

In domestic cricket, Vanitha represented her home state Karnataka before making a switch to Bengal ahead of the current domes-



tic season. Vanitha was last seen captaining Aryan Club in the inaugural edition of Bengal Women's T20 Blast, a league organised by the Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB). She had played a crucial role in Bengal reaching the semi-finals of the Senior Women's One-day Trophy, scoring 225 runs in six innings at an average of 37.50.

Hockey India on Monday named a 22-member squad for the weekend matches, with promising young forward Sangita Kumari from Jharkhand -- who has made an impression during her stint with the junior India side -- included.

Chief coach Janneke Schopman said she was happy with the improvement shown by the new players.

## Strandja Memorial Boxing SUMIT UPSTAGES WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS MEDALLIST

On a mixed day for India, pugilist Sumit put up a power-packed performance to make a sensational start to his campaign at the 73rd Strandja Memorial Boxing Tournament, outclassing 2021 World Championships silver medalist Dzhambulat Bizhamov on the opening day in Sofia, Bulgaria. Playing his only second senior international tournament, the reigning national champion Sumit produced a flawless show to register a dominating 5-0 victory against his Russian opponent in the 75kg opening round match. The Indian will now face Ukraine's Oleksandr Khyzhniak in the second round. While Sumit made it to the next round, Narender Berwal (+92kg), Varinder



Singh (60kg) and Lakshya Chahar (86kg) made exits with defeats in their respective opening round matches, Boxing Federation of India (BFI) informed in a release on Monday. Narender went down fighting 2-3 against the Spanish boxer Ayoub Ghadfa Drissi while Varinder and Chahar lost to their Russian opponents Artur Subkhankulov and Sharabutdin Ataev by 0-5 and

1-4 margin respectively.

The second day of Europe's oldest international boxing tournament on Monday will see four Indian boxers starting their campaigns. Shiksha will face a tough challenge against the reigning Asian champion Dina Zholaman from Kazakhstan in the 54kg opening round match. Nitu (48kg) and Anamika (50kg) are the other two Indian women to take the ring on

Day 2. Among men, Akash Sangwan, who received a bye in the opening round, will play against the German pugilist Daniel Krotter in the 67kg second round match late on Monday night.

The prestigious tournament, which will be played till February 27, has been witnessing the participation of over 450 boxers from 36 countries around the world, including strong boxing nations such as Kazakhstan, Italy, Russia and France.

A 17-member Indian contingent, including seven men and 10 women, is participating in the tournament which is the first from the Golden Belt Series and also a testing event for International Boxing Association's World Boxing Tour format. It is also the first exposure trip for Indian boxers this year.

## Winless India hopes to achieve first victory on tour of New Zealand


## ASHISH TRIVEDI: VIEWERS NO MORE JUDGE ACTORS OVER ONSCREEN ROLES
