RUSSIA UNLEASHES HELL

MARIUPOL, A UKRAINIAN PORT CITY ON THE BLACK SEA, HAS COME UNDER HEAVY BOMBARDMENT BY RUSSIAN TROOPS SURROUNDING IT - WITH THE DEPUTY MAYOR SAYING THE BARRAGE HAS KEPT UP FOR 15 HOURS NON-STOP WITH HUNDREDS DEAD, WHILE THE MAYOR SAID A 'FULL-SCALE GENOCIDE' IS UNDERWAY, DAILY MAIL REPORTED. MEANWHILE KHARKIV, HUNDREDS OF MILES TO THE NORTH, ALSO CAME UNDER ATTACK BY MISSILES THAT DESTROYED GOVERNMENT AND POLICE BUILDINGS. THE CITY, UKRAINE'S SECOND LARGEST, WAS ALSO HIT BY HEAVY STRIKES IN THE NIGHT WHICH SEEMED TO BE TARGETING AN AIRFIELD. IT IS A DARK SIGN OF THINGS TO COME FOR CITIES SUCH AS KYIV AS VLADIMIR PUTIN'S TROOPS, WHO WERE HANDED A SERIES OF HEAVY DEFEATS CARRYING OUT PRECISION STRIKES IN THE EARLY DAYS OF THE WAR, SWITCH TO BRUTE-FORCE TACTICS IN AN ATTEMPT TO CARVE OUT A BLOODY VICTORY. CHERNIHIV, IN THE NORTH EAST, AND SUMY, IN THE EAST, HAVE ALSO BEEN SURROUNDED AND ARE AT RISK OF BEING STRUCK WHILE KHERSON, ANOTHER CITY IN THE SOUTH, WAS CAPTURED BY RUSSIAN TROOPS AFTER GETTING CUT OFF.

AROUND 17,000 INDIAN NATIONALS HAVE LEFT UKRAINE BORDER

New Delhi: Around 17,000 Indian nationals have left war-torn Ukraine through its different borders since the Indian Embassy in Ukraine issued advisories, the Ministry of External Affairs said on Wednesday. Ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said, that the Embassy in Kiev has been asked to set up a temporary office in Lviv to facilitate border crossing by Indian nationals. Bagchi added that an advisory has been issued by the Indian Embassy urging Indian nationals to leave Kharkiv by 6 p.m. local time based on "information from Russia", adding that they should take any method to leave, including "on foot". "We have issued this advisory based on inputs from the Russian side. We haven't chosen the time. We haven't chosen the location," he said. He also expressed deep condolences over the death of Chandan Jindal, an Indian student from Barnala in Punjab, who died in Ukraine of natural causes.



RUSSIA CONTROLS EUROPE'S LARGEST NUCLEAR PLANT

New Delhi: Russia has informed the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) that its military forces have taken control of the territory around Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant (NPP), Director General Rafael Mariano Grossi said on Wednesday. In an official letter to the Director General dated March 1, the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the International Organizations in Vienna also said personnel at the plant continued their "work on providing nuclear safety and monitoring radiation in normal mode of operation. The radiation levels remain normal." The Zaporizhzhia plant is the largest of Ukraine's NPP sites with six out of the country's 15 nuclear energy reactors.

DOMESTIC PETROL, DIESEL PRICES TO SKY ROCKET

New Delhi: The Russia-Ukraine crisis-led global hike in crude oil prices is expected to push India's domestic prices of petrol and diesel by Rs 20-22 per litre. However, an excise duty cut may dampen the impact on petrol and diesel prices to an extent, but not entirely. The crisis as well as fears of lower supplies have pushed Brent crude oil price to nearly an 8-year high on Wednesday. On Wednesday, the Brent-indexed crude oil prices rose to over \$111 per barrel.

DOMESTIC WHEAT, SUNFLOWER OIL PRICES SET TO RISE

New Delhi: Continuing hostilities between Russia and Ukraine are set to impact the domestic selling prices of wheat and sunflower oil. Both countries produce massive quantities of wheat, while Ukraine is one of the world's largest sunflower seeds exporters. Though India is self-sufficient in wheat, it does import some quantities of high grade grain, analysts said. In terms of sunflower seeds, India is heavily dependent on Ukrainian and Russian imports. Imports are a relatively cheaper option as India's sunflower seed production is constantly hovering close to 60,000 tonnes for the last couple of years.

He says Russians will want to "whittle down" the resistance before they commit their forces. Watling says there is evidence of low morale among Russian troops, citing lost and confused advance units - and their initial surprise at coming under fire from Ukrainians.

But he says the effect of low morale will diminish as Russian troops come together to fight in larger formations, as their mission becomes clearer and as Ukrainians begin to run out of ammunition, BBC reported.

SC TO HEAR PIL SEEKING FIRS, DISQUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES FOR FREEBIES

The Supreme Court on Wednesday agreed to examine a plea seeking registration of FIRs and disqualification of candidates belonging to various political parties, for offering freebies amid the ongoing polls in five states. Advocate Barun Kumar Sinha mentioned the plea before a bench presided over by Chief Justice N.V. Ramana. The bench, also comprising Justices A.S. Bopanna and Hima Kohli, said:

"Election bribing is taking place everywhere. It is not for a particular state." After hearing brief submissions, the bench agreed to list the matter on Thursday.

The petition has been filed by Surjit Singh Yadav, Vice President of NGO Hindu Sena, seeking a direction to disqualify candidates fielded by the Congress, and Samajwadi Party in Uttar Pradesh and also the candidates representing Aam Aadmi Party in Punjab in this year's Assembly election.

5-YR JAIL TERM TO SIX FOR FRAUD IN PMT-10 CONDUCTED BY VYAPAM

New Delhi: A Special CBI Court in Madhya Pradesh has awarded five years rigorous imprisonment to six persons in a case related to the Pre-Medical Test 2010 conducted by Vyapam and also imposed a fine of Rs 3700 on them. The Special Judge, Vyapam cases, Gwalior (Madhya Pradesh), awarded the jail term to Parvez Khan, Pradeep Upadhyay, Rajesh Baghel, Awadhesh Kumar, Hari Narain Singh and Ved Ratan Singh. The CBI had registered the case on December 29, 2015 following a Supreme Court order. Initially the case was lodged with the Cantonment Police Station in Guna area of MP. It was alleged that accused Pradeep Kumar Upadhyay and Parvez Alam alias Parvez Khan appeared in place of original candidates Awadhesh Singh and Rajesh Baghel respectively in the PMT examination held on June 20, 2010, at the Govt Post Graduation college, Guna.

96.8% adults received first dose of Covid vax, 81.3% second, Centre to SC

The Centre on Wednesday informed the Supreme Court that 96.8 percent of India's adult population have been administered with first dose of the Covid vaccine and 81.3 percent have been administered the second dose.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, representing the Centre, submitted before a bench of Justices L. Nageswara Rao and B.R. Gavai that 177,50,86,335 (177.5 crore) total vaccines have been administered.

In the adult population, 96.8 percent of the population (90,92,27,350) has been covered with the first dose, and 81.3 percent of the population (76,35,65,779) has been covered with the second dose. For the population between 15-18 years of age, 74 percent (5,47,94,459) have been covered with the first dose, and 37.1 percent (2,74,87,370) with the second dose. The precaution dose numbers for the adult population amount to 2,00,11,377. The figures are based on data collated on February 28.

The top court was hearing a plea by Jacob Puliyl challenging vaccine mandates issued



by various state governments and seeking direction to also disclose post vaccination data regarding adverse events.

Advocate Prashant Bhushan, representing Puliyl, a former member of the National Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation, contended that a person's fundamental right to not take vaccine cannot be eclipsed by the government only by saying that person not taking vaccine will pose a clear threat to public health.

Bhushan said: "Even, I had Covid. But, I have not taken the vaccine. I have decided not to take the vaccine, come what may."

CENTRE EXTENDS SCHEME UNDER REHABILITATION PROGRAM TILL 2026

New Delhi: The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on Wednesday approved the proposal for continuation of the seven existing programmes under the umbrella scheme 'Relief and Rehabilitation of Migrants and Repatriates' till March 31, 2026 with a total outlay of Rs 1,452 crore. The approval will ensure that assistance under the umbrella scheme continues to reach beneficiaries through MHA. The scheme enables migrants and repatriates, who have suffered on account of displacement, to earn a reasonable income and to facilitate their inclusion in mainstream economic activities. These schemes provide economic relief to the displaced families of Pakistan Occupied Areas of Jammu and Kashmir and Chhamb, Sri Lankan Tamil refugees, Brus lodged in relief camps in Tripura and to enhance relief to 1984 anti-Sikh riot victims. With these schemes, the financial assistance and other facilities will be continued to provide economic reliefs to the families of affected civilian victims of terrorist violence including militancy, insurgency, communal, Left Wing Extremism violence and cross border firing and victims of mine and IED blasts on Indian Territory while the 'grants-in-aid' to the Central Tibetan Relief Committee (CTRC), the officials of the MHA said.

Body Of Tribal Man Preserved For 2 Years As Evidence Of "Fake Encounter"

Two years after his death, the remains of 22-year-old Badru Madavi lie preserved in a village in Chhattisgarh in a large pit using herbs, salt and medicinal oil wrapped in white shroud and plastic.

Badru was killed in a joint operation by the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and the District Reserve Guards (DRG) of Chhattisgarh Police on March 19, 2020, NDTV reported.

Security forces claimed Badru was the in-charge of a Maoist division called the Gangalur Area Committee and an expert in Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) with a cash reward of Rs 2 lakh on his head.



But the residents of Gampur village in Dantewada, about 360 km south of capital Raipur, believe otherwise and hope

they will get justice someday after an official inquiry.

Badru Mandvi's wife says she is still waiting for justice.

And although much of his remains have now decomposed, the villagers are adamant about keeping the body preserved in a pit near the village crematorium.

Sannu Mandavi, Badru's brother, said he was out with him to collect Mahua flowers that are used as food and make a country liquor when he was shot.

But senior police officer P Sunderraj said on March 19, 2020, an encounter took place between Maoist cadres and a joint party of CRPF and DRG.

Badru's family and other villagers, however, refute the allegation of Badru being a Maoist.

TAMIL NADU TO RECEIVE VERY HEAVY RAINFALL ON THURSDAY: IMD

The low pressure area that had formed over southeast Bay of Bengal and adjoining areas of south Andaman Sea and equatorial Indian Ocean has already formed into a well-marked low pressure area and is likely to intensify into a depression by Thursday, bringing heavy downpour in Tamil Nadu and neighbouring areas, the IMD said on Wednesday night. The well-marked low pressure area over central parts of south Bay of Bengal and adjoining equatorial Indian Ocean and the associated cyclonic circulation extending up to 5.8

kms above mean sea level continued to persist at 9 p.m. on Wednesday, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said. It is very likely to concentrate into a depression by March 3 and very likely to move west north-westwards towards Sri Lanka coast during next 24 hours and towards Tamil Nadu coast during subsequent 24 hours, it added. Light to moderate rainfall/thunder shower at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, and Karaikal during March 3-5 with extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places on March 4.

Chola era bracelet unearthed at Maligaimedu in TN

A Chola-period bracelet made of gold and copper has been unearthed during the second phase of excavation by the Tamil Nadu State Department of Archaeology at Maligaimedu near Gangaikondacholapuram. Officials of the Department of Archaeology told reporter: "Only one-fourth of the bracelet could be found and the ornament clearly indicates the wealth of the Chola dynasty."

The officials are confident that during further excavations during the coming months, more simi-



lar treasures would come out and that this would clearly authenticate the

economic prosperity and cultural wealth of the Chola dynasty.

Gangaikondacholapuram was the capital of King Rajendra Chola 1.

During the first phase of excavations at Maligaimedu in 2021, the structural remnants of a royal palace in the form of a brick structure and a large number of decorated roof tiles were unearthed.

The excavations at Maligaimedu near Gangaikondacholapuram had earlier unearthed copper coins, ivory and copper objects, iron nails, glass beads and bangles, decorated stones, and Chinese ware. Archaeologists attribute the presence of Chinese ware like porcelain from the site as an indication of the region's trade with China.



IMPLEMENT WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT PLAN BEFORE NOD TO MINING IN ECO-SENSITIVE ZONE: SC

The Supreme Court on Wednesday directed the Odisha government to complete the process of declaration of the traditional elephant corridor as a conservation reserve aligned with the provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act.

It also asked the state government to implement a Comprehensive Wildlife Management Plan before permitting any mining activity in the eco-sensitive zone.

A bench of Justices L. Nageswara Rao and B.R. Gawai said: "The State of Odisha is directed to implement the Comprehensive Wildlife Management Plan as suggested by the Standing Committee of NBWL (Standing Committee of National Board for Wildlife) before permitting any mining activity in the eco-sensitive zone."

"The state is also directed to complete the process of declaration of the traditional elephant corridor as con-



servation reserve as per Section 36A of the Act expeditiously. The mining operations of 97 quarries shall be permitted only thereafter."

The Advocate General for Odisha submitted before the top court that mining operations will be permitted only after implementation of the Comprehensive Wildlife Management Plan. He added that compliance of Section 36A of the Act for declaration of the elephant corridor as conservation reserve is in the advanced stage of consideration by the government.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing on behalf of Union Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, submitted that it has no objection to the operation of stone quarries outside the eco-sensitive zone if the requirement of Section 36A and the conditions in Comprehensive Wildlife Management Plan are complied with.

The matter reached the Supreme Court, after the Odisha government challenged a National Green Tribunal (NGT) order to stop stone quarrying activities in the vicinity of Similipal-

Hadgarh-Kuldiha-Similipal Elephant Corridor. The lease holders of stone quarries moved the top court challenging the NGT order.

The Odisha government's Forest and Environment Department on January 29, 2001, issued a notification that area comprising of portions of Mayurbhanj, Balasore, Bhadrak and Keonjhar was declared as an elephant reserve - Mayubhanj (Similipal-KuldihaHadgarh) Elephant Reserve, under the Centre's "Project Elephant". The total area of the elephant reserve was shown as 3,213.81 sq km and the core area was 845 sq km of the existing Similipal Sanctuary.

The state government had opposed stopping mining activity in the area which does not fall within the eco-sensitive zone. Its stand was opposed by an NGO contending environmental clearances for any project that falls within 10 km boundary of the national parks and sanctuaries has to be subject to the recommendations of the NBWL.

Tewari questions Punjab CM, Cong leaders on Ukraine

Congress MP from Punjab, Manish Tewari on Wednesday questioned the state leaders for doing nothing for the students stranded in Ukraine.

He said, "I am appalled, great leaders of @INCPunjab Congress are nowhere to be seen/heard when thousands of our children are in jeopardy. Is it only Punjab MPs who have to do heavy lifting?"

He asked where are leaders like Charanjit Singh Channi, Navjot Singh Sidhu, Sunil Jakhar and Harish Chaudhary and said, -- is power is be all and end all to them?

"Reason to be in public life is public service. Elections are not beginning and end of Politics. Can't you see the videos, hear the cries of our children? Is this your Punjab Model? I hang my head in shame at your sheer callousness. Wake up gentleman, there is a life beyond elections," he added.

The MP from Punjab called upon Minister of State for External Affairs Meenakshi Lekhi and requested her to sensitise the government about need to further augment and reinforce evacuation efforts of Indian nation-



als stuck in war zones in Ukraine especially our kids in Kharkiv -- far from the western borders of Ukraine.

Amritsar MP Gurjeet Singh Aujla informed that 1,100 of our children are stuck at Kharkiv railway station. Ukrainians are not allowing them to board trains out of Kharkiv. They are prioritising their own citizens in evacuation. They need urgent help, he said.

Mamata thanks people after resounding victory in Municipal polls

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Wednesday congratulated the people after the ruling Trinamool Congress won 102 of the 108 municipalities in the state. The Left Front managed to get one municipality and the newly formed 'Humro Party' won the Darjeeling municipality but BJP failed to open its account.

Taking to Twitter, Banerjee said, "Heart-felt gratitude to Ma-Mati-Manush for yet another overwhelming mandate to us. Congratulations to the winning candidates of All India Trinamool Congress in the Municipal Elections. Let victory enhance our respon-



sibility and dedication. Let triumph impart humility. Let us work together for peace, prosperity and development of the state. Jai Bangla!"

The Left Front secured its victory in Taherpur Municipality in the Nadia district. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which had emerged as the main Opposition party in West Bengal after winning 77 seats

in the Assembly polls last year, failed to open its account. The Congress too failed to win a single seat. Surprisingly, the newly-formed Humro Party won the Darjeeling Municipality. Four municipalities had a hung result.

The civic body polls recorded a 77 per cent turnout, marred by violence. Reports of intimidation allegedly by the TMC workers, electoral malpractices and attacks on journalists emerged from various parts of the state on the polling day. The BJP, meanwhile, has demanded a repoll. On Monday, the party called for a 12-hour strike against the violence and alleged electoral malpractices -- a charge denied by the ruling TMC.

Gold jewellery worth over Rs 16 cr, fake currency seized, 4 detained in Odisha

Thirty-two kg gold jewellery worth over Rs 16 crore and fake currency with face value of over Rs 7 lakh were seized from Bhubaneswar city in two separate cases on Wednesday, an official said.

The Government Railway Police (GRP) has seized such a huge cache of gold jewellery from Bhubaneswar railway station and detained four persons in this connection.

The accused have been identified as Dixit Hasamukhlal Jain, Mahesh Uma Sare, Suresh Sahadev Khabe and Dipak Ananta Padel. All the accused belong to Mumbai, said Chandrasekhar Sahu, SDPO, Khurda Road railway zone.

The gold ornaments were transported from Mumbai to Bhubaneswar by the Konark Express, Sahu said. "They have evaded tax



payment and not mentioned the buyers' name. As their movement was suspicious, we detained the accused," he said. "The detained persons have claimed that they brought these jewellery items to sell in local shops in Bhubaneswar and nearby areas," he

informed. Similarly, in another case, the Commissionerate Police seized fake Indian currency notes with a face value of over Rs 7 lakh from Bhubaneswar city and arrested the accused identified as Satya Narayan

Prusty and Bhula Pradhan. During the investigation, the police found that both have decided to start manufacturing fake currencies to become rich.

The duo duped two people of Rs 24 lakh on the pretext of providing them job, said Arun Swain, inspector-in-charge, Kharavela Nagar police station.

While printing different notes, the accused were able to print the counterfeit currency notes of Rs 200 denomination in a proper way and tried to exchange those fake currencies, he said.

The police have seized a laptop, colour printer, ink jet and other materials used for printing the fake currency.

UNIDENTIFIED MAN KILLED, SET ON FIRE IN UP'S KANPUR

Kanpur: A 25-year-old man was killed and set afire by an unidentified miscreant under the limits of Naubasta police circle in Kanpur. The victim's identity, however, is yet to be ascertained by the police.



The incident came to light after the locals of the area spotted flames emanating from a hut. When they reached there, they saw a body burning after which they poured water to douse the flames and alerted the police control room.

Senior police officers, including the Joint Commissioner of Police arrived with the forensic team. The incident took place near the toilet located at the Yashoda Nagar bypass intersection.

"One Sunny Gupta, who runs a 'sabji-puri' cart in the area, said that late on Monday night, his friend Vinay came running to his house and informed him about the fire in a nearby hut. Immediately, they reached the spot and extinguished the fire. Later, they came across a half-burnt body of a 25-year-old man inside the hut. The miscreants, prior to setting the man on fire, had crushed his head and face with bricks," said the police.

The police further said, "The body was in a shirt, trousers and sports shoes. Also, there was a snake tattoo on the right hand of the deceased." he police are interrogating Sanjit Singh Chauhan, a resident of Samastipur in Bihar and Sunil Jha, a resident of Vaishali in Bihar, who live nearby.

6 killed in Telangana road accidents

Six persons died and over 10 were injured in four separate accidents in Telangana since Tuesday night.


According to police, rash driving and negligence resulted in the accidents which happened.

Two youths were killed and seven others injured in a road accident at Medchal on the outskirts of Hyderabad on Tuesday night.

According to the police, a car which was heading towards Suchitra Road from Medchal crashed into the road median near the Medchal checkpoint.

A group of nine people were travelling in the car which was being driven at a high speed. The driver lost control of the vehicle and rammed it into the median.

While one person died on



the spot, the other died on the way to hospital. Seven others injured in the accident were shifted to the government-run Gandhi Hospital for treatment. The deceased were identified as Gaurav Singh and Dibbu Singh. Police said that the group was returning to the city after attending a party and were reportedly in an inebriated condition. Two youths died

and two others were injured in a collision between two two-wheelers in Suryapet district around midnight. The accident occurred when a motorbike on which three youths were returning from a fair on the occasion of Maha Shivaratri hit another motorbike coming from the opposite direction. Two of the youths riding the first motorbike were killed in the acci-

dent which occurred near Kodad. A software engineer was killed and another person was injured when the car in which they were travelling was hit by a private bus in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district. Suresh, who was on his way from Hyderabad to Kakinada in neighbouring Andhra Pradesh was killed and the person accompanying him was injured.

TELANGANA HAS BECOME SLAVE TO 'BIHARI GANG': REVANTH REDDY

Hyderabad: Reiterating his claim that Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao has his roots in Bihar, state Congress chief A. Revanth Reddy on Wednesday alleged that Telangana has become slave in the hands of a group of IAS and IPS officers of Bihar origin. He told a news conference that the Chief Minister appointed IAS and IPS officer of Bihar origin on key posts and entrusted each of them 6-8 departments to, what he called "loot the state". Revanth Reddy, who is also a member of Parliament, said that while hundreds of people of Telangana laid down lives for separate state, local officials were totally ignored in appointments. He said this had caused heartburn among those who actively participated in Telangana movement. He claimed that the appointment of officials from Bihar posed a grave danger to the very identity of Telangana. Reddy alleged that Chief Minister appointed Somesh Kumar to the post of Chief Secretary though the latter was not eligible for the top post. He said IPS officer Anjani Kumar was made Director General of Police by sending the incumbent DGP on leave.

Noting IAS officials Rajat Kumar, Arvind Kumar, Jayesh Ranjan and Sandeep Kumar Sultania, who all hail from Bihar, were each holding charge of several key departments, he asked how the Chief Minister found only these officials eligible among 157 IAS officers and 139 IPS officers in the state.

Revanth Reddy alleged that Chief Minister KCR had colluded with what he called the 'Bihar gang' for wrongdoings. He claimed that Somesh Kumar was rewarded with the post of Chief Secretary for deleting 30 lakh voters from the list of voters when he was the Commissioner of Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC).

Car hits Raje's Mercedes in Jaipur, no injuries

Coordination lacking among NDA alliance partners in Bihar: Tejashwi

Leader of the Opposition in the Bihar assembly Tejashwi Yadav has claimed that Chief Minister Nitish Kumar is running an opportunistic government and it has been proven through the mud slinging at the leaders of all the four alliance partners. Nitish Kumar is not running a Sarkar (Government) but a circus in Bihar, he added.

"JD-U national president Rajiv Ranjan Singh alias Lalan Singh said that the alliance between his party JD-U and the BJP is based on circumstances. A former minister from the BJP quota had levelled corruption charges at current land reforms minister Ram Surat Rai who is also from the BJP. Several ministers openly say that officials are not listening to them. The Speaker (Vijay Kumar Sinha) of the Bihar Vidhan Sabha claimed that the SHO of a police station in his home district was not listening to him. Jitan Ram Manjhi is challenging the liquor ban decision of Nitish



Kumar and has levelled allegations against senior officials for drinking liquor after 10 p.m. every day. A BJP leader, Hari Bhushan Thakur, is threatening Muslims and the chief minister is silently watching them. He is not running a Sarkar but a circus," Tejashwi said.

He also gave the example of Mullah Nasiruddin (a character from folklore) in the Bihar Vidhan Sabha during the discussion on the Governor's

speech. "Mullah Nasiruddin purchased one kg of meat and asked his begum (wife) to cook it. While the cooking process was underway, Mullah Nasiruddin went to the market to eat paan. Until then, delicious meat was cooked. As he had not returned home, his wife tasted the gravy of the meat. As it was delicious, she ate the one kg meat. When Mullah Nasiruddin returned home and asked his wife to serve the meat,

she served an empty plate. When Mullah Nasiruddin asked where the meat was, she blamed a cat for eating the entire meat. Mullah Nasiruddin caught the cat and put it on the weighing scale. The cat was exactly 1 kg. Then Mullah Nasiruddin asked his wife, "If it is meat then where is the cat and if it is a cat then where is the meat. The speech of the Governor is similar to the story of Mullah Nasiruddin. If he (Governor) claimed that the state is running on the development path then why is unemployment so high in Bihar and youth are migrating to other states in the search of jobs? Why did Niti Aayog declare that Bihar is at the bottom on every front? If crime is under control, why is the NCRB saying that crime is high in the state? Why is the constitution under threat? Why are farmers not satisfied with this government?" Tejashwi asked.

Following the allegations of Tejashwi Yadav, chief minister Nitish Kumar said that the crime graph in Bihar has come down significantly.

5-yr jail term to six for fraud in PMT-10 conducted by Vyapam

A Special CBI Court in Madhya Pradesh has awarded five years rigorous imprisonment to six persons in a case related to the Pre-Medical Test 2010 conducted by Vyapam and also imposed a fine of Rs 3700 on them. The Special Judge, Vyapam cases, Gwalior (Madhya Pradesh), awarded the jail term to Parvez Khan, Pradeep Upadhyay, Rajesh Baghel, Awadhesh Kumar, Hari Narain Singh and Ved Ratan Singh.

The CBI had registered the case on December 29, 2015 following a Supreme Court order. Initially the case was lodged with the Cantonment Police Station in Guna area of MP. It was alleged that accused Pradeep Kumar Upadhyay and Parvez Alam alias Parvez Khan appeared in place of original candidates Awadhesh Singh and Rajesh Baghel respectively in the PMT examination held on June 20, 2010, at the Govt Post Graduation college, Guna. "Pradeep Kumar and Parvez Khan were caught by the invigilators from the respective

examination halls while they were appearing in place of the original candidates (Awadhesh Kumar and Rajesh Baghel) respectively," said the CBI official. The CBI learnt during the investigation that Rajesh Baghel and Awadhesh Kumar applied for PMT-2010 in offline mode through middleman Harnarain Singh giving a common address to facilitate delivery of the TAC (Test Admit Card). The CBI traced Parvez Alam and arrested him in 2017. He was examined. His specimen signature/handwriting and thumb impression as well as the specimen signature/handwriting and thumb impression of Pradeep Kumar Upadhyay were obtained and sent to the CFSL for an expert's opinion. It was found that the candidates Rajesh Baghel and Awadhesh Kumar did not appear in the examination. After investigation, a supplementary chargesheet was filed in August 2017 against the accused. The trial court found the accused guilty and convicted them.

Varanasi: Ready for final phase of polling

Rebel leaders of the Bahujan Samaj Party are posing a major problem for the party in the last two phases of elections in Uttar Pradesh. BSP president Mayawati has clearly instructed her party cadres to 'teach the rebels a lesson and ensure their defeat' but it is easier said than done. Most of the senior rebel leaders of the BSP are contesting on SP tickets now. Ambedkar Nagar, which is regarded as a BSP bastion, now has Lalji Varma, Ram Achal Rajbhar and Tribhuvan Dutt - all BSP rebels -- contesting elections from the district, known as the birthplace of socialist Ram Manohar Lohia, on a Samajwadi Party (SP) symbol. Lalji Varma, a Kurmi and five-time MLA, was the BSP's legislature party leader in the Uttar Pradesh Assembly. Ram Achal Rajbhar, also a five-time MLA, is a former BSP state president and a key OBC face in the region. Tribhuvan Dutt is a Dalit, is a former two-time MLA and a former Lok Sabha MP. The fourth SP candidate, Rakesh Pandey, is the father of sitting BSP MP from Ambedkar Nagar, Ritesh Pandey but he is contesting on a SP ticket. The defection of these BSP leaders to SP has undoubtedly bolstered the prospects of Samajwadi Party in the district. The SP hopes to challenge the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at the cost of the BSP in Ambedkar Nagar, where four out of its five candidates are former BSP leaders. Mayawati, at a recent rally, explained to voters why she had to 'throw them out' of the BSP. She accused the rebels of encouraging factionalism in the party. The BSP, and the BJP, are now working overtime to ensure the defeat of Swami Prasad Maurya, another BSP rebel, who joined and quit the BJP.

GERMANY'S MILITARY RENAISSANCE

After a continuous barrage of criticism for overlooking the Russian aggression dubbed as itsnaivete, Germany has announced new military plans, which might change the regional and global geopolitics dimensions once again. In a historic announcement to the parliament, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz announced on Sunday additional funding of 100 billion euro to boost Germany's armed forces, besides a sustained increase in its defence spending over the coming years. The country, which one could say was at the centre stage of the flared up Russian-Ukrainian crisis, has taken the world community by surprise after its latest announcement to boost up its military power. Germany was at the centre of the flared-up conflict between Russia and Ukraine as the Nord Stream 2 gas pipeline from Russia to Germany, bypassing Ukraine, played a major role in flaring up the sentiments on both sides. It was responsible for revenue loss for Ukraine in the first place and secondly it was giving sleepless nights to western and particular American political, geopolitical and military experts and advisers as they could foresee a future with increased Russian influence and it becoming one of the most dominant energy supplier to Germany and Western Europe. In fact Vladimir Putin's expansionist policies have unintentionally achieved what Western allies have long struggled for, to get Germany act with an assertive foreign policy and increase its military might despite its World War guilt. **German Plans** Olaf Scholz received a standing ovation from the Bundestag, when on Sunday he announced a dramatic hike in Germany's military spending after the Russian invasion of Ukraine. The speech is being heralded as historic as it marks a paradigm shift in German foreign and defence policy. Scholz said Germany from now on would invest more than 2 per cent of its economic output on defence up from around 1.5 per cent currently, after years of resisting pleas from NATO allies to do so, and set up a 100-billion-euro (\$112 billion) fund to re-equip the military. More importantly, as per the American desire, he also outlined plans to reduce



Germany's dependence on Russia for its gas needs, thus increasing hopes that Berlin might consider geo-strategic concerns more in all its trade relations. On Sunday, he announced a 100-billion-euro fund - more than double than its last year's defence budget - to modernise its military, including buying armed drones and new fighter jets, obviously from America significantly. Scholz described the current conflict as "Putin's war", adding that "the requirement is as much diplomacy as possible without being naive". He also assured that Berlin would support its eastern NATO neighbours and stick "with-out ifs or buts to its alliance obligations". **German Renaissance** The latest German move could be termed as a German Renaissance as it has for decades faced calls for playing a more dominant role on the world stage commensurate with its size as Europe's largest economy. Its old policies were reviewed and scrutinised throughout the build-up of the Ukrainian crisis, and some leading commen-

tators, particularly among its strongest ally -- the United States -- used to describe Germany as the weakest link in NATO's western military alliance. The Nord Stream 2 Baltic pipeline from Russia to Germany despite Western allies' concerns that it would undermine the security of traditional transit country Ukraine was supported by the successive German governments. More recently, it resisted calls to cut Russia off the SWIFT global payments system as part of a Western sanctions package, saying it would then struggle to pay for Russian gas. However, in a 180-degree turnaround, Scholz on February 22 suspended the Nord Stream 2 agreement and on February 26 agreed to cut Russia off of SWIFT and said Germany would build up its coal and gas reserves and try to hasten its long-stalled plans to build more LNG terminals. In the past, German military generals had long pleaded for more equipment and the current army chief vented his frustration over the long-running neglect of military readiness on LinkedIn on February 24, a few hours after Russia invaded Ukraine.

German forces were drastically scaled down after the end of the Cold War -- with the number of battle tanks drawn down from more than 3,500 in the 1980s to 225 in 2015. Later, the forces were trained mainly for missions such as in Afghanistan where the adversary was poorly equipped and not an armed force with the most modern weapons. More recently, Germany's new three-way coalition vowed in December, after coming to power, to pursue a more values-based foreign policy reflecting growing anxiety over the rise in authoritarianism worldwide and threats posed by strategic rivals like China. Thorsten Benner of the Global Public Policy Institute (GPPi) has described the speech as a starting point for a further fundamental re-think as part of Germany's National Security Strategy that will also have to include challenges posed by China seen in tandem with Russia. As some other analysts have termed: Germany has just become a normal power, again.

KREMLIN PLANNING TO DECLARE EX-PREZ YANUKOVYCH AS NEW HEAD OF UKRAINE

Fugitive former Ukraine President Viktor Yanukovich is currently in Minsk, and the Kremlin is currently preparing him for a special operation, according to Ukrainian intelligence. According to one scenario, the Kremlin will try to declare him the "President of Ukraine" there, Ukrainska Pravda reported. The information obtained indicated that the Kremlin may be preparing an informational operation or action to return former President Yanukovich to Ukraine or to publish an appeal on his behalf to the Ukrainian people in the near future, the report added. There are reports emerging that the Russian forces have been shelling Mariupol with various weapons continuously for 12 hours. Vadym Boichenko, Mayor of Mariupol, on the unified TV



and radio broadcast of the Ukrainian media said, "We have been flattened non-stop for 12 hours. The racist-fascist troops are razing my hometown to the ground." According to Boichenko, there has been total destruction of residential infrastructure.

THOUSANDS FIGHT TO GET ON TRAINS OUT OF KIEV

New Delhi: A video has shown people's desperate bid to flee Kyiv overnight as explosions struck residential areas and as many as 15,000 troops -- an entire Russian army division -- bore down on Ukraine's capital, Daily Mail reported. Footage from Kyiv station showed hundreds of civilians, some with young children, trying to cram onto an already packed train amid fears that the city could soon be turned into a war zone, the report said. Airstrikes rocked residential suburbs of the capital on Tuesday night as a 40-mile long convoy of Russian military vehicles inched closer, with fears that President Vladimir Putin's troops will soon lay siege to the city. Another convoy was reported to be moving towards Kyiv from the south-east, with plans to encircle it, Daily Mail reported. On Tuesday afternoon, outrage followed an eruption of explosions around the capital's 1,300ft TV tower, built by a ravine where as many as 1,50,000 people were killed by the Nazis -- including 34,000 Jews in two horrific days in 1941 -- during Adolf Hitler's campaign against the Soviet Union. Five people, reportedly a single family walking together, were burned alive in the blasts.



N.Korea's reluctance to forgo nukes could increase amid Ukraine crisis'

Russia's invasion of Ukraine could further increase North Korea's reluctance to abandon nuclear arms, former US Forces Korea (USFK) chiefs have said, raising the need for Seoul and Washington to beef up their combined readiness. In its monthly newsletter, the Korea-US Alliance Foundation (KUSAF) released a summary of their recent comments on the Ukraine crisis and its ramifications on the Korean Peninsula without identifying them, Yonhap news agency reported. Their comments came amid a view that Russia's attack on the pro-West country last week could be a foretaste of what a weak nation could face in a world of power politics. "The Ukraine situation could further solidify the North's determination against abandoning nuclear arms," the USFK commanders were quoted by KUSAF as saying. The commanders also said



that the Ukraine crisis could be an opportune time for "mischief," stressing the need for South Korea and the US to strengthen their combined training and intelligence capabilities. For the North, the armed conflict in Ukraine could offer a lesson for modern-day warfare combining cyber incursions, information warfare and other maneuvers that proceed under multi-domain operations. But the commanders forecast the current situation in Ukraine will not directly affect the security of the peninsula, while offering a reassuring message: The US support for South Korea in a contingency will not weaken. "Rather, (the US) response to North Korean threats will be swift and sturdy," they said. The North, meanwhile, fired a ballistic missile on Sunday, marking its eighth missile launch since the start of the year. The test came amid concerns the North could fire a long-range rocket under the disguise of a satellite launch or conduct other provocative acts following its veiled threat last month to suspend its voluntary moratorium on nuclear and intercontinental ballistic missile tests.

BIDEN ANNOUNCES CLOSURE OF US AIRSPACE TO RUSSIAN PLANES

Washington: President Joe Biden has announced that the US will close its airspace to all Russian planes in response to Moscow's ongoing military operations in Ukraine. Biden made the announcement on Tuesday while delivering his State of the Union address, the first of his presidency, to a joint session of Congress, Xinhua news agency reported. "Tonight I'm announcing that we will join our allies in closing off American airspace to all Russian flights, further isolating Russia and adding additional squeeze on their economy," Biden said. The US move followed similar ones made by the European Union and Canada on Sunday. In retaliation, the Russian aviation authority said Monday that Russia will ban airlines from 36 countries, including the 27 members of the EU, from using the country's airspace. While condemning Russia and reaffirming US support for Ukraine, Biden reiterated in his speech that the US forces "are not engaged and will not engage in the conflict with the Russian forces in Ukraine."



IMF, World Bank to boost financial & policy support to Ukraine

World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has announced that they are working together to support Ukraine on the financing and policy fronts and are urgently increasing that support. IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva and World Bank Group President David Malpass said in a joint statement that commodity prices are being driven higher and "risk further fueling inflation," which hits the poor the hardest, Xinhua news agency reported. "Disruptions in financial markets will continue to worsen should the conflict persist," they said, adding



that the sanctions announced over the last few days will also have a "significant" economic impact. The two institutions are assessing the situation and discussing appropriate policy responses with their international partners. The IMF is responding to Ukraine's request for emergency financing through the Rapid Financing Instrument, which the IMF Board could consider as early as next week. The World Bank Group, meanwhile, is preparing a \$3 billion package of support in the coming months, starting with a fast-disbursing budget support operation for at least \$350 million that will be submitted to the Board for approval this week, followed by \$200 million in fast-disbursing support for health and education.

UKRAINE URGES POLAND, FRANCE, GERMANY TO PROVIDE MORE WEAPONS, AID

Kiev: Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba has called on the foreign ministers of Poland, France and Germany to increase sanctions pressure on Russia and provide more weapons and financial support to Ukraine.



"(I have) met online with Foreign Ministers of the Weimar Triangle of Poland, France and Germany. I urged (them) to step up sanctions pressure on Russia... and provide Ukraine with more weapons, financial and humanitarian support," Kuleba tweeted on Tuesday. Kuleba also said via an online briefing that Ukraine is working with its partners towards various solutions to close the airspace over the country, Xinhua news agency reported.



NCP TOUGHENS STAND, SAYS MALIK WON'T BE FORCED TO QUIT

Toughening its stance, the Nationalist Congress Party on Wednesday made it clear that its Minister Nawab Malik "will not be forced to resign come whatever may", on the eve of the Maharashtra Legislature Budget Session starting on March 3 (tomorrow, Thursday). State NCP President and Minister Jayant Patil told media persons that the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) made it clear last month -- after Malik was arrested by Enforcement Directorate (ED) on February 23 in an alleged money-laundering case -- that he would continue in the ministry. "Let the Opposition Bharatiya Janata Party create any ruckus in the House... Our stand is unchanged -- No resignation means no resignation," a grim Patil said. Attacking the BJP, he said it has become habitual for the opposition party to hurl false allegations against the government prior to the legislative sessions, demand resignation and then



disrupt the legislature. Patil also said that the MVA is ready to hold the Speaker's election during the session and urged the Opposition to sit across the table and decide. "We shall invite them for the session-eve tea-party as always, but they will boycott it as usual. We appeal to the Opposition to join the tea-party, hold discussions with the to ensure all issues are resolved," Patil exhorted. His comments came against the backdrop of the BJP state President Chandrakant Patil's threat on Tuesday that they would not allow the legislature to function until Malik resigned. NCP President Sharad Pawar has convened a review meeting with all-party ministers this afternoon, followed by a MVA meeting to discuss the major issues likely to figure during the Budget Session. At the evening meeting, all ministers of the Shiv Sena-NCP-Congress will join the discussions even as the BJP sharpens its knives on various issues to corner the MVA government during the session.

CBI to grill Anil Deshmukh in Rs 100cr money laundering case

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has got the permission from a Special Court to record the statement of former Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh in connection with the Rs 100 crore extortion case involving former top Mumbai cop Param Bir Singh. The CBI had recently moved a plea before the special court requesting to grant them permission to record Deshmukh's statements. The CBI will have to visit Arthur Road Jail to record his statement. Deshmukh is currently lodged there. According to the information, the federal probe agency will record his state-

ment for three consecutive days -- March 3, 4 and 5. The CBI has so far recorded the statement of as many as seven persons in the matter. A source said that the seven persons whose statements were recorded were from police. They were reportedly deployed in the security of Anil Deshmukh. Singh had accused Deshmukh for missing his post. He had alleged that it was Deshmukh who was forcing him to collect Rs 100 crore every month from bars and restaurants in Mumbai. He made these allegations when he was removed from the police commissioner post. Deshmukh had denied all the allegations leveled against him. On April 21, 2021, the CBI

had filed an FIR against Deshmukh and had initiated a probe. The raids are in connection with this FIR. The source said that they were scanning the financial transactions of the last three years. The team is also gathering information about the business dealings of Deshmukh. The CBI wants to know about the business associates of Deshmukh. The transactions made between them will be scanned by the team. On November 1, 2021, Deshmukh was placed under arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in connection with Rs 100 crore money laundering case pertaining to the alleged posting and transfer of the officials.

Covid Restrictions Eased In 14 Districts: Cinema Halls & Restaurants To Function At Full Capacity

90 percent of the eligible population has taken at least one dose of anti-coronavirus vaccines in these districts, said a government notification.

Minister Uddhav Thackeray-led government on Wednesday eased Covid-19 pandemic-related restrictions and allowed shopping complexes, restaurants, cinema halls and theaters to operate at 100 percent capacity in 14 out of 36 districts in Maharashtra. 90 percent of the eligible population has taken at least one dose of anti-coronavirus vaccines in these districts, said a government notification, PTI reported. The government notification added that over 70 percent people are fully vaccinated in these districts. The Covid positivity rate in these areas is less than 10 percent and occupancy of oxygen-supported or ICU beds is less than 40 percent. Covid-19 pandemic-related restrictions have been eased in the districts of Mumbai city, Mumbai suburban district, Pune, Bhandara, Sindhudurg, Nagpur, Raigad, Wardha, Ratnagiri, Satara, Sangli, Gondia, Chandrapur and Kolhapur. The notification said social, sports, entertainment, academic, cultural, religious, political and



festival-linked events, including those related to marriages and funerals and other gatherings and congregations, are now permitted in these districts with attendance at 50 percent of the venue capacity. The District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) will have to be informed if a gathering is expected to be of more than 1,000 persons. The DDMA may impose reasonable restrictions. The attendance at such events for other districts will be capped at 50 percent of the capacity or 200, whichever is less. The notification said all shopping complexes, cinema halls, restaurants and bars, sports complexes, gyms, spas, swimming pools,

religious places, drama theatres, tourist places, entertainment parks etc are allowed to operate with 100 percent capacity in these 14 districts. The state government's decision comes as Maharashtra has witnessed a steady decline in new daily Covid-19 cases. Easing some restrictions, the state government had earlier on January 31 while issuing the guidelines said that swimming pools, water-parks, theatres and restaurants can operate with 50 percent capacity subject to permission of the competent authority in the districts of Mumbai, Pune, Bhandara, Sindhudurg, Raigad, Ratnagiri, Satara, Sangli, Gondia, Kolhapur and Chandrapur.

Maharashtra govt trying to appease a community, says Fadnavis as he demands Nawab Malik's resignation

Maharashtra Leader of the Opposition (LoP) Devendra Fadnavis on Wednesday said that the state government is attempting to appease a specific community. Fadnavis also demanded Nawab Malik's resignation.

Maharashtra Opposition leader Devendra Fadnavis has said the state government's support for minister Nawab Malik - who has been arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in connection with a money laundering case - is unfortunate and reiterated that Malik should resign. "For the first time in the country's history, a minister has remained in office despite being arrested for dealing with people accused of

bombings. The state government is supporting him. His transactions have been found with people associated with Dawood Ibrahim. He is being supported by a government whose chief minister is Shiv Sena's President," Fadnavis said. Fadnavis further said, "When allegations were made against Sanjay Rathod, he was asked to resign as a minister. However, Malik has been granted this privilege in order to appease a specific community. But how can we dismiss terror funding so casually? "There are numerous other issues that need to be addressed in the assembly, but the government must

also cooperate. We will protest if they refuse to discuss," he added. Malik was arrested by the ED in a money-laundering case related to a land deal with Sardar Shahwali Khan, convicted for life over the 1993 serial bomb blasts in Mumbai, and Mohammad Salim Patel, who was the driver of Dawood's sister Haseena Parkar. Malik is alleged to have bought 2.80 acres of land at LBS Marg in Kurla for Rs 30 lakh when the market rate was Rs 2,053 per square feet. He allegedly paid Rs 15 lakh to Khan and Rs 5 lakh to Patel. Fadnavis slammed the state government for failing to listen to people's concerns. "Maharashtra had an assembly session that lasted seventeen or eighteen days after a long delay. Our role is to raise the concerns of the people of Maharashtra. However, it is also the responsibility of the ruling party to hold a discussion," he said. Under pressure from the opposition, the university bill was with-

drawn. If the government does the same in this session, we will protest," Fadnavis stated. He had said in the previous session that the power would not be cut, but the power connections are being cut off as if there is a competition. As a result, the farmer is forced to watch the standing crop rot." Devendra Fadnavis also stated that the Sultani crisis has been plaguing farmers for over two years. "The way the Energy Minister is speaking about farmers' electricity bills is insensitive and gives the impression that we are under dictatorial rule. This government has only aided the alcohol industry," Fadnavis said. Farmers in the state have been protesting the Maharashtra State Electricity Distribution Company Limited's suspension of power supply to agricultural consumers (MSEDCL). The farmers have also alleged that there are discrepancies in the power bills, which they claim could be reduced by up to half if corrected.

4 suffocate to death while cleaning septic tank

Four labourers suffocated to death while cleaning a clogged septic tank at a residential complex in Loni Kalbhor on the outskirts of the city, police said here on Wednesday. The tragedy occurred at the Kalamvak Vasti's Malhar building around 11.30 a.m. when the four workers descended into the septic tank. Officials said that while two of the men went inside first, the other two followed to assist them, but following a commotion, they were pulled out. The deceased are identified as Rupesh Kamble, Padmakar Waghmare, Krishna Jadhav and Sikandar Kasabe, and it is suspected that the asphyxiation may be due to inhaling poisonous gases accumulated inside the septic tank, is the cause of death. The Loni Kalbhor Police have registered an accidental case and are probing the incident. The bodies of the four deceased have



been sent for autopsy, the reports of which are awaited, before they will be handed over to their families. Locals said it was not immediately clear whether the conservancy workers wore masks or safety gear for the work in septic tanks, considered a high-risk job as they are filled with toxic gases.

ARYAN KHAN 'NOT' CLEARED OF DRUG CHARGES -- FEW TAKERS FOR NCB DENIAL

The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) on Wednesday dismissed as 'speculation' some reports suggesting that the agency has cleared Aryan Khan, son of Bollywood megastar Shah Rukh Khan, who was nabbed in a drugs case in October, though few found it credible. Soon after certain reports surfaced, NCB Deputy Director-General Sanjay Singh and the Special Investigation Team (SIT) issued a statement claiming that "the media reports are not true and they are just speculations", since "the investigation is not yet complete". Singh added that "these reports were not cross-checked with the NCB, and it would be premature to say anything at this stage". However, few in Maharashtra believed the agency's contentions, as state political leaders whacked the NCB, reiterating how "central probe agencies" are being "grossly misused" by the BJP against the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government. The ruling MVA allies -- Shiv Sena-Nationalist Congress Party-Congress -- said now it is clear that though there was no evidence against Aryan Khan, he was deliberately "framed" by the for-



mer NCB Mumbai Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede. The media reports claimed that the NCB-SIT ostensibly found no evidence to link

Aryan Khan with the larger drugs conspiracy or an international drugs syndicate, besides pointing at the glaring lapses in the high-profile raids on the luxury ship Cordelia Cruise on October 2, 2021 in full media glare. Shiv Sena MP and chief spokesperson Sanjay Raut said this was "another case of abuse of the central agencies", and demanded to know who was behind it. "Those who are misusing the central probe agencies will go to jail. The NCB-SIT report has come and it proved that Aryan Khan was framed because he's Shah Rukh Khan's son. The truth has finally emerged, hasn't it," Raut asked. Referring to the case, NCP state President and minister Jayant Patil pointed out that a senior MVA minister, Nawab Malik, has been targeted with false charges because he had exposed the NCB last year. Congress state General Secretary Sachin Sawan said that the SIT has revealed how Aryan Khan didn't have drugs with him and has exposed the mistakes committed by Wankhede's team during the (ship) raids. Sawan said it's clear now that the allegations of an extortion racket were true, and demanded why no action has been taken against NCB officials for visible violation of the NCB's rulebook. "Since October last year, I have been saying

the NCB's claims that the action was taken as per the procedures when these were seriously violated while nabbing the so-called accused in the ship raid. Now it seems the NCB wants to shove the matter under the carpet," Sawant said. Sena farmer-face and MoS Kishore Tiwari said he smelt "something fishy" in the entire episode from the beginning and had demanded in October last year that the Supreme Court should appoint a sitting judge to probe the fundamental rights violation of Aryan Khan by the NCB. "The BJP is on a vendetta spree with the help of central probe agencies. Nawab Malik's exposure has proved to be correct... Even if the NCB denies its SIT report NCP spokesperson Mahesh Tapase said the NCB-SIT report has confirmed Nawab Malik's campaign for the past five months that the "whole Cordelia Cruise ship raid was a big 'farjivada' (hoax)" with the direct involvement of BJP activists working in tandem with Wankhede. "The SIT report has also exposed the NCB's style of functioning, the gross mistakes during the raids, why they were not videographed and help of BJP persons taken to trap innocent youngsters," Tapase said. Sena MP Priyanka Chaturvedi said

Maharashtra had exposed how CBI was mis-used by the Centre during the Sushant Singh Rajput case whose final closure report is still awaited. "Now, NCB is forced to admit wrongdoing on the part of its officials in the drugs case. Next will be exposing ED officials misusing their authority to please the Centre," said Chaturvedi, dropping broad hints. Pune-based RTI activist Prafulla Sarde said that akin to the Sushant Singh Rajput case probe delayed by the CBI, "the NCB is also dragging the Aryan Khan matter to please the BJP and help it politically". "After the report has been leaked, the NCB must be under pressure from its BJP 'masters'. I am filing an RTI plea seeking the SIT report in public interest and not for the vested interests of some politicians or officials," Sarde said. It may be recalled that former Attorney-General of India, Mukul Rohatgi, had labelled the NCB as "an Ostrich with its head buried in the sand" while the rich kid Aryan Khan was "paying the price for being a celeb". The sensational raids on Cordelia Cruise led to a total of 20 persons being arrested, including many from the glamour world like Aryan Khan. Later all were released on bail.

'The Lost City', 'Sonic the Hedgehog 2' release halted in Russia

Paramount Pictures is the latest Hollywood studio to pause the theatrical release of its upcoming films in Russia following the country's invasion of Ukraine last week. "As we witness the ongoing tragedy in Ukraine, we have decided to pause the theatrical release of our upcoming films in Russia, including 'The Lost City,' and 'Sonic the Hedgehog 2.'"

"We stand by all those impacted by the humanitarian crisis across Ukraine, Russia, and our international markets and will continue to monitor the situation as it unfolds," a studio spokesperson said in a statement, reports variety.com.

Universal joined the boycott later on Tuesday, meaning the five major Hollywood studios have officially cut off their movies from Russia for the time being. Universal doesn't have a big release until Michael Bay's 'Ambulance' opens in April. "In response to the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Ukraine, Universal Pictures has paused planned theatrical releases in Russia," a Universal Pictures spokesperson said Tuesday afternoon. Earlier this week, Disney, Sony and Warner Bros similarly announced they will not allow new movies, such as 'Turning Red', 'Morbius', and 'The Batman', to play in Russian movie theatres "in light of the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine".

INJURED DEEPAK CHAHAR TO MISS MAJORITY OF IPL 2022 FOR CHENNAI SUPER KINGS: REPORT

Injured Deepak Chahar may miss the majority of the IPL 2022 season for Chennai Super Kings, said a report by ESPNcricinfo on Wednesday.

Chahar had sustained a right quadriceps injury while turning out for India in the final T20I against West Indies at Kolkata and was ruled out of the subsequent T20I series against Sri Lanka. Chahar has been at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) for further management and recovery from the injury. "Chahar, who suffered a quadriceps tear in the third T20I against West Indies last month, is likely to take several weeks to heal, meaning he could miss the IPL which will be played between March 26 and May 29. It is understood that the Super Kings are awaiting a final assessment from the National Cricket Academy in Bengaluru, where Chahar is currently undergoing his rehabilitation," said the report.

Chahar had been on an upswing with his performances with the Indian team. He took 2/54 and



made a quick-fire 54 in the final ODI against South Africa at Cape Town, which India narrowly lost by four runs. In the two ODIs he played against the

West Indies, Chahar made 54 and 38 with the bat apart from picking 2/53 and 2/41 with the ball. Just before getting injured, Chahar had taken out two quick wickets in the final T20I against the West Indies. The impressive performances for the Indian team translated into Chahar earning a huge paycheck of INR 14 crores in the IPL Mega Auction from CSK. Sunrisers Hyderabad and Delhi Capitals commenced the bidding first for Chahar. The two franchises came out all guns blazing as Chahar's value breached the 10-crore mark.

Hyderabad then backed out and Chennai entered the fray. Rajasthan Royals joined in late at 13.25 crore but Chennai was successful in buying back Chahar for INR 14 crores, continuing their with him since 2018. It was also the very first time Chennai spent more than INR 10 crores on roping in a player. After spending two seasons with the now-defunct Rising Pune Supergiant, Chahar was picked by CSK for INR 80L in the 2018 IPL Mega Auction. Chahar has been a vital cog in the wheel for picking 58 wickets in four seasons, especially proving to be effective in power-play as the MS Dhoni-led side won the title in 2018 and 2021.

Krish Pal gives India winning start at Asian Youth & Junior Boxing



IPC allows Russian, Belarusian athletes to compete as neutrals at Beijing Winter Games

The International Paralympic Committee (IPC) said on Wednesday that Russian and Belarusian athletes can compete as neutrals at the Winter Paralympics in Beijing starting March 4-13, despite calls to ban them after Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

However, the IPC Governing Board has also decided, both in its role as the global guardian of the Paralympic Movement and as the international federation for 10 Para sports, that it will not hold any events in Russia or Belarus until further notice. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) this week recommended that sports federations suspend teams and athletes from the two countries but



added that they could compete as neutrals if time or legal constraints prevented their removal. "They will compete under the Paralympic flag and not be included in the medal table," the IPC said in a statement. "In deciding what action to take, the Board was guided by the IPC's core principles, which include a commitment to political

neutrality and impartiality, and an unwavering belief in the transformative power of sport. These are key components of the new IPC Constitution that was approved at the 2021 IPC General Assembly held just over three months ago," the statement said. A number of sports federations, including world soccer governing body FIFA, have banned.

Shreyas Iyer jumps to 18th after T20I success against Sri Lanka

India batter Shreyas Iyer has moved up a massive 27 places to 18th in the latest ICC Men's T20I Player Rankings for batters released here on Wednesday.

India's recent home-series win against Sri Lanka has had major impact on the Men's T20I Player Rankings, aiding top-order batter Iyer to make a quantum jump.

The 27-year-old Iyer scored three unbeaten half-centuries during India's 3-0 win against Sri Lanka in February, with the cricketer amassing 204 runs at a strike rate of 174.

His team-mate, seamer Bhuvneshwar Kumar, jumped three spots to 17th on the bowler rankings. Sri Lanka's Pathum Nissanka scored an impressive 75 in the second



game of the series, and he was rewarded with a six-spot rise to ninth on the rankings, while former India captain Virat Kohli -- who was rested

for the series -- fell out of the top-10 after dropping five places to 15th.

The other big mover with the bat in T20I cricket this week is Muhammad

Waseem of the UAE. His unbeaten century against Ireland in the final of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup Qualifier A, helped him reach the 12th position with the bat. That is the highest T20I ranking by any UAE batter, surpassing Shaiman Anwar's 13th place achieved in 2017.

Sri Lanka's Lahiru Kumara's five wickets in the series with India have lifted him into the top 40 bowlers for the first time. Other bowlers who enjoyed a successful time at the ICC Men's T20 World Cup Qualifier A include Zahoor Khan of UAE (up 17 places to joint-42nd) and Ireland's Josh Little (up 27 places to joint-49th).

Rohan Mustafa's successes with bat and ball have enabled him to move up to sixth place among all-rounders, just one place below his best of fifth achieved in February 2020.

ICC WC: KOHLI 'CHEERS' FOR WOMEN IN BLUE AHEAD OF IND-PAK CLASH

New Delhi: Former India skipper Virat Kohli on Wednesday called everyone to cheer for 'Women In Blue' ahead of the India and Pakistan match in the upcoming Women's ODI World Cup.

The Women's ODI World Cup gets underway from Friday and India and Pakistan will meet for a mouth-watering clash on Sunday.

Kohli, who is slated to play his 100th Test at Mohali, has posted a rousing video to cheer India's women cricketers. "No better time to cheer for the #WomenInBlue and show the strength of #HamarBlueBandhan than this, 'cause it's time for the ICC Women's World Cup 2022!"

"So set your alarms for 6.30 AM on Mar 6, 2022," Kohli wrote on Koo. The interest in women's cricket has spiked tremendously in India over the last few years. Women cricketers like Smriti Mandhana, Mithali Raj and Jhoolan Goswami have become household names.

Anya Shrubsole then got Lara Goodall caught behind before producing her own wicket maiden as captain Sune Luus went for a duck, unable to add to the 86 she made against India as South Africa slipped to 19/3 in 7.3 overs. Mignon du Preez fell not long after before Tazmin Brits gave Ecclestone her first wicket and South Africa slumped to 47/5 in just

18.5 overs. Chloe Tryon and Marizanne Kapp combined for a 65-run partnership as the latter went on to make 52 off 60 balls and was the last of South Africa's nine dismissals as they huffed and puffed their way to a modest 138. In reply, Tammy Beaumont and Lauren Winfield-Hill (14) added 26 for the first wicket before captain Heather Knight came in to make just five off 16 deliveries. Beaumont eased

her way to 35 off 45 balls prior to being dismissed with a misjudged attempt at a drive down the ground. Vice-captain Nat Sciver reached 33 not out before retiring hurt in order to make way for Danni Wyatt to get some time in the middle. Wyatt was there to hit the winning runs alongside Sophia Dunkley as England chased down the target with 8.4 overs to spare.
