CRUISER DRUGS CASE: NCB GIVES CLEAN CHIT TO 6 PRIME ACCUSED INCLUDING ARYAN KHAN

CULPRIT, VICTIM, SCAPEGOAT?

The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) will soon prepare a supplementary charge-sheet in the drugs-on-cruise case in which Bollywood star Shah Rukh Khan's son Aryan Khan and five others have been given a clean chit.

In a huge anti-climax, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) on Friday dropped charges of drug possession against 6 prime accused - including Aryan Khan, son of Bollywood mega-star Shah Rukh Khan, an official said here. The NCB's clean chit has gone to Aryan, Avin Sahu, Gopal Anand, Samir Sehgal, Bhaskar Arora and Manav Singhal, as per its charge sheet in the sensational case filed before a Special Court.



While Sahu was a guest on the ship Cordelia Cruise that was swooped on by a team led by the then NCB Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede, the others were the organisers of the alleged rave party on board. The NCB has said in its charge sheet that narcotics were found on all - except Aryan Khan and Mohak Jaiswal - in the case that hogged international media attention for months.

In a terse statement, NCB Deputy Director-General Sanjay Kumar Singh said that

SIT TO FIX RESPONSIBILITY OF NCB OFFICIALS

► The SIT formed in the drugs-on-cruise case might be filing a report with the Ministry of Home Affairs to fix responsibility for conducting shoddy probe in the matter, sources in the Narcotics Control Bureau have suggested. The MHA is keeping a close eye on the matter.

► Earlier, NCB official Ashish Ranjan Prasad was placed under suspension. Later his suspension was revoked and he was transferred to CISF. Another NCB official who faced the music was Intelligence Official V.V. Singh who filled the

arrest memo of Aryan Khan. Singh was placed under suspension which has not been revoked as of now.

► Sameer Wankhede, who was heading the Mumbai Zone of the NCB, was sent to the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI). Vishwanath Tripathi, who was the part of the NCB team which conducted the raid was also suspended.

► Sources have said that the officials who directly or indirectly implicated any innocent in the matter will not be spared. If any person who was travelling on Cordelia

Cruise was falsely booked, the official can face the music. The team which conducted raid at Cordelia Cruise committed huge blunders -- chats leaked to media before the court hearing was one of them.

► Action can be suggested against a few officials for not conducting the blood test of Aryan Khan before placing him under arrest. The SIT has also learnt that some witnesses were not trustworthy but they assisted the NCB team in the raid. They only harmed the NCB reputation and its investigation.

six persons will be free now as there's "no evidence to proceed against them, and the charges have been dropped" by the NCB. The development comes as a major relief for Aryan Khan who was among

those nabbed in a high-profile raid on the ship with 1,800 people on board by Wankhede on October 2 last year, and underwent nearly a month in police and judicial custody. Based on intel, the NCB

Mumbai had raided the Cordelia Cruise and detained, besides Aryan, Arbaaz Merchant, Nupur Sarika, Munmun Dhamecha, Ismeet Singh, Mohak Jaiswal, Gomit Chopra and Vikrant Chhokar.

10 SACKS OF LEMONS, 35 CRATES OF TOMATOES STOLEN FROM GURUGRAM VEGETABLE MARKET

Amid a sharp rise in vegetable prices, 10 sacks of lemon, 35 crates of tomatoes and 15 pouches of capsicum were stolen from a wholesale market in Gurugram early on Friday, police said.



According to police, the incident took place on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday. Driver Sandeep, a resident of Charkhi Dabri, had informed the police

that on Thursday night, he stored the vegetables inside shop no-64 at Khandasa market but the next morning, he found that the shop shutter was half-open and some of

the stock missing. He said that the rise in prices of vegetables and lemons could be the reason behind the theft. The stock was worth Rs 60,000-70,000 in the wholesale market while it would be around 1.50 lakh in the retail market, he said. The police said they registered a case against unidentified people under Section 380 (theft in dwelling, house etc) of the Indian Penal Code at the Shivaji Nagar police station.

Hardik Patel hints at joining BJP next week

Patidar Anamat Andolan Samiti (PAAS) convener and former Congress working president Hardik Patel will be joining BJP either on May 30 or May 31 in Gandhinagar. He gave the hint on Friday in Ahmedabad and even hinted at contesting elections.



Patel in a programme on a TV channel has hinted that he is joining the BJP, and the party will decide from which constituency he will contest the assembly elections. He also said that he is going to lead an Ekta Yatra from Somnath temple to the Statue of Unity. It will be a grand show of Hardik Patel joining the BJP, party sources

said. He was given two options on how would he like to join BJP, in presence of National President in New Delhi, or in presence of Gujarat BJP in-charge Bhupender Yadav or B.L. Santhosh in Gandhinagar. He has selected the second option. Hardik and the BJP are planning to address a large gathering on the day, sources said. Since the day Hardik resigned from Congress, he has been attacking the party, saying the party is anti-Patidar and anti-Gujarat. He said that even the party national leaders' action is anti-Gujarat.

NOW VVSS DEMANDS BAN ON DISCLOSING GYANVAPI VIDEO CONTENT

Jitendra Singh Vishen, head of the Vishwa Vaidik Sanatan Sangh (VVSS), which is among the petitioners in the Kashi Vishwanath-Gyanvapi complex case, has now written to the District Magistrate of Varanasi, demanding a complete ban on publicising and disclosure of photography and video content of Gyanvapi Commission in the interest of national security and commu-



nal harmony of the country.

In his letter, Vishen said that the video survey of Gyanvapi premises was conducted as per the orders of Court of Civil Judge, Senior Division, Varanasi, and the said photography and video content was submitted along with Advocate Commissioner Report to the Court.

He said that the content of said photography and video is part of court record of the case which stands pending adjudication.

"As the matter is apparently serious and concerned with national security and communal harmony of India, disclosing or publicizing of said photography and video content of aforesaid Gyanvapi Commission on any platform could be against the national interest," he said.

Vishen said that anti-national elements can publicize and disclose the content of photography and video of said Gyanvapi Commission to provoke, the religious sentiments

of both communities concerned with matter and utilize it as a tool to harm national security and communal harmony of India.

He said that it is important that the content of photography and video should be confined to the court proceedings and not be disclosed or publicized at any public platform. He further demanded action against anyone found disclosing the aforesaid information at any platform.



As UP Assembly goes paperless, MLAs fumble with tablets

The e-Vidhan that has made the Uttar Pradesh state Assembly go paperless, is proving cumbersome for the legislators, many of whom are not tech-savvy. While the BJP MLAs and ministers are going an extra mile to learn how to operate the tablets installed on their seats and some are even taking classes from their children or others to learn the functioning of the device, opposition members are vocal about their reservations of the new system.

"The Vidhan Sabha officials should have implemented the new system in a phased manner and allowed the house to function in a hybrid mode for some time. We are left grappling with the tablet and tend to miss out on the proceedings," said a Samajwadi Party (SP) MLA. Another SP MLA said that the government wanted to leave the opposition grappling with the new system so that focus could be diverted from other important issues.

Several MLAs can be seen peering into blank tablets and some SP MLAs managed to fix their party logo on their screens. A BJP MLA, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said that a minimum training of one week was required to make the legislators familiar with operating the tablets.

India votes for US-sponsored UNSC resolution to raise N Korea sanctions, China, Russia veto it

India has voted for a United States-sponsored resolution to strengthen sanctions on North Korea which was vetoed by China and Russia.

The US launched the unsuccessful effort on Thursday to punish North Korea which had tested three missiles on Wednesday after US President Joe Biden had wrapped up a visit to South Korea and Japan.

Speaking on the resolution, US Permanent

Representative Linda Thomas-Greenfield warned that North Korea was preparing for an imminent nuclear test. The failed resolution would have tightened sanctions on a wide range of products ranging from crude oil to tobacco and frozen the assets of a cyber-criminal outfit.

The vetoes marked another stage of intensification in the confrontations in the Council between the western countries and China and Russia.

The other 13 countries in the Council presented a



united front on the North Korea issue. The issue will now go to

the General Assembly under new procedures adopted by it following Russia's vetoes

of resolutions in the Council condemning its invasion of Ukraine.

Although the Assembly does not have the enforcement powers of the Council, it will now take up issues vetoed by a permanent member in the Council in the expectation that it will show the isolation of the veto-wielder.

India, which had stayed neutral on the resolutions on the Ukraine conflict that Russia had vetoed, did not abstain on this resolution for which the prime opposition came from China.

7 SOLDIERS KILLED, 19 INJURED IN LADAKH ROAD ACCIDENT

Srinagar: Seven soldiers were killed and 19 others injured in a road accident in Ladakh on Friday, defence sources said.

According to the sources, 26 soldiers were injured in the road accident in Turtuk area of Ladakh.

"Seven soldiers died on the spot while 19 others were injured. The injured soldiers have been airlifted to military hospital in Chandigarh," a defence source said.



NHRC NOTICE TO CENTRE, BIHAR OVER ILLEGAL HEALTHCARE FACILITIES

The NHRC on Friday issued notice to top officials of the Central and Bihar governments over a report alleging that a large number of hospitals, clinics, and nursing homes are running illegally without any registration in the state's Munger district despite a specific 2013 state law.

Taking suo motu case of the report, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has sought detailed reports from the Union Health and Family Welfare Secretary, Bihar Chief Secretary, and the National Medical Commission Chairman in the matter within four weeks, including steps taken or proposed to be taken against the illegally running clinical establishments in the region.



ments in the region.

Reportedly, out of 40 private hospitals running in the district, only four are lawfully registered, the NHRC said in a statement.

It has also observed that the right to life and health are basic human rights and such serious violations by the clinical establishments, if true, is a matter of concern. "According to the media

report carried today on May 27, 2022, the information has been reportedly collected by an RTI activist. Reportedly, as per the provisions of the Bihar Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation Act, 2013), the registration of health care facilities is mandatory and the violators have to pay fine," the NHRC said.

Parliament's Privileges Committee summons Maha officials over arrest of Navneet Rana

Parliament's Privileges and Ethics Committee on Friday asked Maharashtra Chief Secretary and Director General of Police, and Commissioner Mumbai Police to appear before it on June 15 for oral evidence over the arrest of Lok Sabha Member Navneet Rana.

The Committee also asked Superintendent of Women District Prison, Byculla (Mumbai) to appear before it on June 15 for oral evidence. An office memorandum issued by Privileges and Ethics branch Lok Sabha Secretariat said: "Committee of Privileges has directed that Manu Kumar Srivastava, Chief Secretary, Government of Maharashtra be asked to appear before the Committee for oral evidence on the above subject matter on Wednesday, June 15, 2022 at 1230 hours in Committee Room '2', Parliament House Annexe Extension, New Delhi."

The office memorandum (OM) further stated that the Ministry of Personnel and Public Grievances and Pensions are accordingly, requested to ensure that the official referred to above, appear before the Committee of Privileges, Lok



Sabha on the date and time indicated above.

"Necessary confirmation, in this regard, may please be sent to this Secretariat latest by June 7, 2022. The receipt of this OM may kindly be acknowledged," it added.

Another office memorandum said that the Committee of Privileges has directed the following officials be asked to appear before the Committee for oral evidence on the above subject matter on Wednesday, June 15 at 12.30 p.m. in Committee Room '2', Parliament House Annexe Extension, New Delhi.

"The undersigned is directed to state that Director General of Police (DGP) Maharashtra Rajnesh Seth, Commissioner of Police, Mumbai Sanjay Pandey and Superintendent, Women District Prison, Class-2, Byculla, Mumbai." The Ministry of Home Affairs are accordingly, requested to ensure that the officials referred to above, appear before the Committee of Privileges, Lok Sabha on the date and time indicated above," it said.

Officials are asked to appear before the committee regarding April 25 complaint of Navneet Rana alleging patently illegal arrest and the consequent inhuman treatment meted out to her in Khar Police Station, Mumbai.

TELANGANA CONG CHIEF'S REMARKS ON REDDYS-VELAMAS TRIGGER ROW

Less than a month after Congress leader Rahul Gandhi visited Hyderabad and warned party leaders against airing their differences in public, the party's Telangana unit is witnessing an uproar over certain remarks made by state chief A. Revanth Reddy about a particular caste.

Finding fault with Revanth Reddy's remarks, some Congress leaders asked him to withdraw the same as they hurt the sentiments of a community and may damage the interests of the party.

Revanth Reddy had said on Sunday that Reddys were better than Velamas in providing leadership and steering a state to development.

Chief Minister K. Chandrababu Naidu is a Velama while Revanth and several leaders of Congress are



Reddys. With Revanth Reddy's comments and reaction by some party leaders

sparking a new row in the party, MP and in-charge of party affairs in Telangana Manickam Tagore posted

the video clip of Rahul Gandhi's speech at TPCC headquarters at Gandhi Bhawan.

"Don't forget the words of our leader Rahul Gandhi on May 7 th 2022 at Gandhi Bhawan," tweeted Tagore.

Describing Congress as a family, Rahul Gandhi had warned the leaders against voicing their grievances publicly.

"If there are grievances or complaints we have an internal system. You can openly say whatever you want to say but if anyone goes out and tells something to the media, he will be damaging the Congress party and we will not accept this," he had said. He gave the warning as differences in the party's Telangana unit came to fore on several occasions. Leaders critical of Revanth Reddy's style of functioning had been speaking publicly.

Senior nurses in Bengal to play doctors' role now in rural areas

The West Bengal Health Department has devised a unique initiative to cope with the problem of shortage of qualified doctors in the rural areas of the state, especially in the community health centers.

It will shortly start a three-week "doctor's training programme" for senior nurses employed under the department and after successful completion of the training, these nurses will be upgraded as community health officers and be posted in different community health centers. A state Health Department official said that



these community health officers will do the initial treatment in case of minor ailments and substitute in case of non-availability of doctors in the community health centers. However, these community health officers will not have the right to issue prescriptions or death certificates." The entire project is the brain-child of Chief Minister, Mamata Banerjee,

to open the career growth avenues for the nurses employed with the state government," the official said.

He also said that in the initial phase, 704 nurses will undergo this "doctor's training programme". During the training period, they will receive a special allowance of Rs 10,000.

An announcement on these lines was made by Chief Minister Banerjee in August 2021, when she said that the state government is planning to open the promotion avenues for experienced nurses, contending these were capable of providing medical services just like qualified doctors.

2 centuries-old idols seized: TN idol wing continues probe

The idol wing of the Tamil Nadu police on Friday continued its investigation in connection with the seizure of two-centuries old metallic idols from a smuggler in Tiruchi.

The idols were seized from a smuggler in Myladuthurai district of Tamil Nadu. Idol wing in a statement on Friday said that of the two idols, the statue of Buddhist Goddess 'Tara Devi' is believed to be 700 years old, while that of 'Vinayagar' is around 300 years of age.

The police are probing the origin of the idols and according to inputs from the idol wing, it is likely to have originated from Tibetan area. Idol wing sleuths are probing as to how the smuggler could get hold of these idols. On Thursday, the idol wing got confidential information that a man was in possession of metallic idols in Myladuthurai district and that he had concealed it in a den in a village. Idol wing ASP R.Rajaram and other officers posed as potential buyers and established contact with Suresh (32) who was in possession of the idols. The sleuths agreed to buy the idols at Rs 2 crore and asked Suresh to show them the idols. When the smuggler showed them the idols, the policemen pinned him down and took him into custody.

It is to be noted that the Tamil Nadu idol wing has retrieved several valuable idols from within and outside the country and has restored most of them to the temples from



where they were stolen.

According to idol wing officers, Suresh, who is remanded in judicial custody, will be taken for questioning and find out how he got the idols. Officers said that on detailed interrogation of the smuggler, they will get to know more about the idols and can trace it down.

The idol wing of the Tamil Nadu police has already informed all the antique sellers to get proper papers before they purchase or sell any antique metal pieces or will have to legal issues including arrest.

ALLIANCE WITH JD(U) IS IMAGINARY: TEJASHWI YADAV



Patna: Amid speculation that the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) is attempting to forge an alliance with Janata Dal (United), Tejashwi Yadav, the leader of opposition in the Bihar Assembly has said that forming a government with Nitish Kumar in Bihar "was just an imagination" and there was no truth in it. After returning from London on Thursday evening, when Tejashwi was asked about forming a government with Nitish Kumar, he said: "All these things are imaginary. I don't see anything to reunite again to form a political alliance for the formation of the government in Bihar."

He further said: "Caste-based census was my initiative. I had written a letter to the prime minister to meet Chief Minister Narendra Modi last year."

Life imprisonment for Telangana's serial killer who murdered 17 women

A serial killer, who murdered 17 women, has been awarded life imprisonment by a court in Telangana's Joggulamba-Gadwal district.

Yerukali Srinu (47), who used to target women after befriending them at toddy shops, was awarded the sentence in one of the murder cases.

Third Additional District Magistrate held him guilty and on Thursday sentenced him to life imprisonment for the murder of Chitti Alivelamma (53). The serial killer was arrested in 2019 in Alivelamma's murder case. The investigations revealed that he killed 16 other women in the last one decade. Srinu's wife Salamma was also arrested for stocking the stolen property.

Srinu, addicted to liquor, would befriend women who come to toddy shops to drink, would take them out to isolated places in the name of picnic and after drinking with them would kill them and decamp with their gold and silver ornaments.

Srinu, who had also murdered his own brother, was finally caught when police cracked the murder case of Alivelamma, whose body was found on December 17, 2019 near a village in



Mahabubnagar district.

The police investigations had revealed that the accused targeted lone women at toddy shops at various places in Rangareddy and Mahabubnagar districts.

Srinu was convicted and jailed in a few criminal cases. In 2009, he was sentenced for life for killing his brother but was given remission in 2013 for good conduct in jail. However, there

was no change in him. After the last time he was released from jail in 2018, authorities had provided him a job at a petrol bunk run by the prison department with the hope that he would mend his ways. However, he continued to indulge in drinking and commit crimes. He was acquitted in 11 cases. In two of the cases, he was acquitted recently. Police have appealed against his acquittal.

Non-alcoholic beverages sector adds Rs 7,91,599 mn value, over 6,90,000 jobs: Report

The non-alcoholic beverages sector added Rs 7,91,599 million value to the Indian economy and created an estimated 6,91,491 jobs, a report released on Friday said.

The report, 'Contribution of Non-Alcoholic Beverages Sector in Indian Economic Growth and #AtmanirbharBharat' was released by Food and Public Distribution Secretary Sudhanshu Pandey, at an event organised by the Indian Beverage Association, wherein he highlighted the need to reduce wastage of fruits and making Indian beverage industry competitive while matching the global quality standards in the sector.

Noting the requirement of a holistic eco-system including a specialised logistics chain management system for better efficiency and productivity in the sector, he also drew attention towards the opportunities for generation of employment in rural areas and potential for investment in a diversified manner throughout the country. The report, which seeks to understand the contribution of the sector towards the Indian economy, examine the strengths and best practices, identify challenges and suggest a way forward to make India one of the world's leading beverage processing hubs,



found that the non-alcoholic beverage sector contributes significantly to the Indian economy in terms of value addition and job creation. The Input-Output model estimated that for every Rs one crore of output produced in the non-alcoholic beverage sector, a total of 8.9 additional jobs are created in the economy due

to both the direct as well as indirect impact, the report said. However, it also pointed out that employment creation is still below potential, as processing is much lower than in other developing countries in the ASEAN or in China. Foreign investment inflows are below one per cent and exports are much behind

what is required for India to become a \$17 trillion economy by 2047, it said.

The global non-alcoholic beverage market was worth \$1,180 billion in 2020 and is projected to reach \$2,175 billion in 2026, with a compound annual growth rate of 7.3 per cent.

In 2019, India ranked 19th, much below other developing countries such as Mexico (6th), Brazil (7th), Indonesia (8th) and Nigeria (10th). Global trade was \$77.36 billion in 2019. Over 60 per cent of the global market was accounted for by carbonated soft drinks (CSDs), ready-to-drink (RTD) tea/coffee, energy drinks and sports drinks.

The per capita consumption of CSDs is lower in India compared to other countries such as the US. Mineral water (packaged drinking water/natural mineral water) has the highest growth projection in Asia, with India being one of the largest markets, the report highlighted. The report also pointed to the top four challenges to the growth of this sector. These are unfair competition from the unorganised sector and counterfeit products, negative perception regarding the industry, high goods and services tax (GST) and additional "sin tax" (as applied based on the Subramaniam Committee Report) and infrastructure related issues.


2 LASHKAR TERRORISTS KILLED IN SRINAGAR GUNFIGHT WERE LOCALS




Srinagar: The two terrorists who were killed in a gunfight with the security forces at Soura in Central Kashmir's Srinagar district on Friday have been identified, officials said.

Both the terrorists belonged to the Lashkar-e-Taiba and were local residents. "The two killed terrorists of LeT have been identified as Shakir Ahmed Waza and Aftab Aftab Malik, both residents of Trenz Shopian and 'C' categorised. Incriminating materials, including arms and ammunition recovered," police said.

The gunfight took place after a joint team of the police and the security forces cordoned off the area and launched a search operation on the basis of specific information about the presence of terrorists. As the security forces zeroed in on the spot where the terrorists were hiding they came under a heavy volume of fire that triggered the gunfight.



Ray of hope against new virus

A team of researchers have found that some antiviral medications might have the potential to shorten symptoms and reduce the amount of time a patient is contagious with Monkeypox virus. In the paper published in *The Lancet Infectious Diseases* journal, researchers described a retrospective study of seven patients diagnosed with Monkeypox in the UK between 2018 and 2021. It also reported the first off-label use of two different antiviral medications - brincidofovir and tecovirimat - to treat the disease. The study found little evidence that brincidofovir was of clinical benefit but concluded that further research into the potential of tecovirimat would be warranted. The initial three patients were treated with brincidofovir seven days after the initial onset of the rash. Brincidofovir was not observed to have any convincing clinical benefit in treating Monkeypox and alterations in liver blood tests were observed. The researchers note that it is not known whether brincidofovir administration earlier in the course of the disease or at a different dosing schedule would have yielded different clinical outcomes. Despite this, all three patients, plus the fourth hospital transmission patient, made a full recovery. Of the three further cases of Monkeypox reported in the UK in 2021, one was treated with tecovirimat and experienced a shorter duration of symptoms and upper respiratory tract viral shedding than the other cases in this cluster. All patients experienced mild disease and were treated in a hospital setting for infection control purposes and not due to the severity of the infection. No patients experienced the commonly recognised severe complications of monkeypox such as pneumonia or sepsis, however, one patient experienced a mild relapse six weeks following hospital discharge, and another patient developed a deep tissue abscess that required drainage. Patients were also found to experience low mood, likely stemming from isolation.

Myanmar's humanitarian crisis

India has taken a measured stance on the situation in Myanmar since the military took over power in February 2021. This stance is necessitated by the need to keep in mind the China factor in ties with Myanmar and continue to keep that nation at the centre of its Act East policy. These considerations remain paramount even today. India needs to step up humanitarian assistance to Myanmar, where over 9 million people remain internally displaced. The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) recently hosted a meeting attended by high level representatives from the region, Myanmar, UN specialised agencies and other international organisations to discuss the humanitarian situation. The May 6 meeting held in the Cambodian capital, Phnom Penh aimed to revive the five-point consensus reached by ASEAN in April 2021, one part of which dealt with the provision of humanitarian aid to the people of Myanmar. The issue is: Can India take a lead in this direction? According to the UN Refugee Agency, some 9,24,800 people remain displaced across Myanmar as of April 25, including 5,78,200 people who have fled their homes as a result of conflict and insecurity since the military takeover. Consequently, humanitarian access to conflict-affected and displaced people remains restricted and significant gaps remain in assistance to these communities despite continued efforts by humanitarian partners and local organisations. In the Chin state alone, for example, nearly one-fifth of the population have fled their homes. Estimate indicates that more than 50,000 people are currently internally displaced across the nine townships of Chin State, while at least 40,000 may have crossed the border to become refugees in Mizoram. India realises that refugees will continue to come as long as there is instability in Myanmar. The humanitarian agencies and institutional donors must find further ways to directly provide funds and resources to local groups doing this important work. Perhaps the lead can be taken out of the Afghanistan example, where organisations like the World Food Programme and other UN organisations are distributing aid directly to the people of Myanmar. Recall that India's vaccine diplomacy was also conducted through the good offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross. However, the need of the hour in this regard is actually bilateral cooperation. Remember that India had provided vaccine



doses to the people of Myanmar and earlier, had provided education, healthcare and infrastructure development assistance. This indicates that the present Myanmar government is not averse to seeking India's assistance when needed. The best illustration of this is the gift of one million vaccine doses by former Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla when he visited Myanmar in end-December 2021. During the visit, he also held substantive discussions with military leader General Min Aung Hlaing. This has to be capitalised on. Just as India extended development assistance to Myanmar some years ago for the construction of houses in the Rakhine state, India could look at extending assistance to meet the immediate humanitarian crisis. Specifics can always be worked out diplomatically. The major benefit of such an understanding will be that India will be seen as having reached out to the people of Myanmar. Challenges however will remain for both countries in practical terms. These are not insurmountable and should be creatively

handled. While the direct route of connecting with the people through Naypyidaw is always there, India could also go the Japan route, which has challenged aid and assistance, in cooperation with international organisations and the ASEAN Secretariat, taking into account the local situation and humanitarian needs and urgency. India is best placed geographically and has the diplomatic advantage of being able to reach out to the military government. Therefore, one option would be for donor governments and international agencies to immediately offer their help to India, and to the local groups trying to reach local communities in Myanmar. The only catch here will be for India to be willing and able to undertake such an initiative. Past experience shows that India has the capacity to engage with Myanmar to provide aid and assistance. A similar story has unfolded in Sri Lanka where India became the first responder to the island nation's call for assistance with fuel and medicines. The narrative of

support is positive and provides reassurance that India is willing to take the first step to help. Addressing this issue will require deft diplomatic strategies entailing both direct and indirect connects to the government, NGOs and others in Myanmar. What is immediately needed is raising awareness of the problem and giving solutions, both bilateral and regional. At some stage, consensus will have to be reached on the way forward. There is much to be learnt from the experience of bilateral cooperation. Engagement with the military government as well as others concerned about the well-being of the people of Myanmar is the first step. For this, an invitation could be sent for Myanmar's Foreign Secretary to visit India at an opportune time to discuss matters. The long-term view is ready, what is needed is action on the ground.

MONKEYPOX SPREADS TO MORE THAN 20 COUNTRIES: WHO

The monkeypox virus has spread to more than 20 countries, with about 200 confirmed cases and over 100 suspected cases in nations where it is typically not found, the World Health Organization (WHO) said. The global health body has urged nations to increase surveillance of the infectious disease as outbreaks grow. According to Maria Van Kerkhove, the WHO's Covid-19 technical lead, more cases of the rare viral illness will likely be reported as surveillance expands, but added that the recent spread is containable, CNBC reported. "We expect more cases to be detected. We are asking countries to increase surveillance," Van Kerkhove said during a Q&A on the global health agency's social media platforms. "This is a containable situation. It will be difficult,



but it's a containable situation in non-endemic countries." Since the first reported case on May 7, from the UK, monkeypox has spread to North America and Europe in recent weeks. The outbreak is driven by a milder West African strain of the virus and most patients recover in a few weeks. No deaths have been reported so far. As per the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control, the European Union (EU) has confirmed 118 cases of monkeypox. Spain and Portugal have reported the largest outbreaks in the EU with 51 and 37 cases, respectively. The UK Health Security Agency has

confirmed 90 cases of the virus. The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) identified nine cases across seven states, while Canadian health officials have confirmed 16 cases of monkeypox, all detected in the province of Quebec, the report said. CDC Director Rochelle Walensky noted that some patients in the US haven't travelled to countries with active outbreaks, suggesting that the virus is spreading domestically. Health officials in these countries have said a majority of the patients are gay or bisexual men, with the virus spreading in many cases through sex. However, the officials emphasised that monkeypox can spread to anyone through close physical contact regardless of sexual orientation. But, monkeypox is not a

sexually transmitted disease. The virus can spread through any kind of sustained skin-to-skin contact with an infected person who has a lesion. It can also spread through body fluids, contaminated bed sheets and clothing, or respiratory droplets if a person has a lesion in their mouth. Van Kerkhove suggested health-care professionals to consider monkeypox a diagnosis for patients with rash illnesses that present at sexual health clinics, emergency departments, infectious disease clinics, primary-care physicians and dermatologists, the report said. "It doesn't mean that anyone with a rash will have monkeypox but we need to raise awareness about what monkeypox is and isn't, and we need to ensure that countries have the capacity to test and provide the right information."

Countries attempting to isolate Russia only hurt themselves: Putin

Russian President Vladimir Putin said that the countries, which are attempting to isolate Russia, are primarily only harming their economies. While addressing the plenary session of the First Eurasian Economic Forum on Thursday, Putin said it would simply be unfeasible and impossible to isolate Russia, and "those, who aspire to do so would harm themselves the most", reports Xinhua news agency. The President noted that the current state of the global economy demonstrates that Russia's position is right and justified, as opposed to the countries, which are trying to "pursue short-sighted policies". Those advanced economies are experiencing their worst inflation in 40 years as well as growing unemployment, he said, adding that logistic chains



were breaking, and global crises were intensifying in such areas as food. "This is a serious issue that is affecting the entire system of economic and political relations," Putin said. The Russian leader said that the sanctions and restrictions, which aim to primarily weaken and contain countries that wish to

pursue independent policies, are ultimately futile. "There are many countries that want to and will pursue an independent policy... and no world policeman will be able to stop this global process... there will not be enough power for this and the desire to do so will evaporate due to a host of domestic problems in those countries," Putin said.

Pakistani rupee drops to all-time low as IMF talks fail

Pakistan's rupee hit a historic record on Thursday of 202.01 against the US dollar in the interbank market, below the previous close of 201.92, after the failure of talks with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the media reported. Pakistan and the IMF have failed to reach a staff-level agreement for the revival of the \$6 billion programme as the Fund emphasised the "urgency of concrete policy actions, including removing fuel and energy subsidies", Geo News reported. In line with the financial pundits' predictions, the local currency continued its downward slide following the delay in the revival of the IMF programme, Geo News reported.

The IMF assistance has been stalled since a disagreement with the previous government over energy subsidies in late February. Pakistan is facing a fast depletion of foreign exchange reserves and analysts have been warning that the country is at risk of defaulting on its external debts. The mounting political unrest, after the former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan marched towards the federal capital and gave a six-day ultimatum to the government to force early elections, shook investors' confidence in the economy, putting pressure on the local unit. The country needs foreign inflows to bolster its forex reserves, which have fallen to \$10.2 billion, enough to meet the cost of fewer than two months of imports.

50 CIVILIANS KILLED IN BURKINA FASO ATTACK

Ouagadougou: At least 50 civilians in Burkina Faso's Madojari region were killed during an armed attack, according to an official statement. Residents from the Madojari town who were trying to reach Nadiagou, in the town of Pama, were targeted by unidentified armed men, Xinhua news agency quoted the statement from the regional government as saying. On May 14, an attack on civilians in the same area left 17 dead and seven injured. On May 19, another attack against the military detachment of Madojari left 11 soldiers killed and 20 others injured. Security in Burkina Faso has worsened since 2015 as terrorist attacks have killed more than 1,000 people and displaced more than 1 million others in the West African nation.

MASSIVE 6.9-MAGNITUDE QUAKE JOLTS PERU

A massive earthquake measuring 6.9 on the Richter scale jolted Peru's Puno region, with no report of casualties or material damages, authorities reported. The Geophysical Institute of Peru (IGP) said the quake was registered at 7.02 a.m. on Thursday, with its epicentre 20 km northeast of the town of Ayaviri in Melgar province and a depth of 240 km, reports Xinhua news agency. The quake was felt strongly in the districts of Ayaviri, Asillo and Azangaro in Melgar province, and moderately in Orurillo, Pucara, Tirapita and San Jose, the National Emergency Operations Centre said. IGP President



Hernando Tavera said that in spite of the quake's magnitude, "we have no information of damages", although it alarmed the population in a region that borders Bolivia. Meanwhile, the Peruvian Presidency has called on the population to remain calm in the face of possible after-

shocks on its Twitter account, as the government is coordinating the evaluation of possible casualties or material damage. Peru is located in the area called the Pacific Ring of Fire, where about 85 percent of the world's seismic activity is recorded.

STRONG 6.5-MAGNITUDE QUAKE HITS INDONESIA

Jakarta: A strong 6.5-magnitude earthquake struck off Indonesia's eastern province of Maluku on Friday, but there was no initial report of damage or casualties, disaster officials said. The country's meteorology, climatology and geophysics agency did not issue a warning for a tsunami as the jolts did not potentially trigger giant waves, Xinhua news reported. The quake struck at 9.36 a.m., with the epicentre at 85 km southwest of Maluku Barat Daya district with a depth of 104 km, the agency said. However, they said the risk assessment for the quake impacts was underway.



NCB LETS OFF ARYAN: MVA FEELS 'VINDICATED', SAYS ITS A 'SLAP' FOR BJP

THE RULING 3-PARTY MAHA VIKAS AGHADI GOVERNMENT ON FRIDAY SAID IT STANDS 'VINDICATED' AFTER THE NARCOTICS CONTROL BUREAU (NCB) GAVE 'CLEAN CHIT' TO ARYAN KHAN AND FIVE OTHER ACCUSED IN THE SENSATIONAL RAIDS ON A CRUISER IN OCTOBER 2021.



Malik -- currently in custody of the ED -- had run a major expose-campaign against the NCB city head Wankhede and termed the Cordelia Cruise ship raid as a 'farjiwada (fraud)' perpetrated in collaboration with the Bharatiya Janata Party. NCP Chief Spokesperson Mahesh Tapase said that Malik's observations of how the entire raid was conducted and selection of witnesses having 'close affinity with BJP' was valid and now is laid bare by the NCB. "We have always maintained that NCB is a very credible organisation with an impeccable track record, but recent actions put a question mark on its reputation. Malik's serious allegations against Wankhede earned the ire of some powerful people in New Delhi and he is now paying the price for speaking the truth," said Tapase. Congress Chief Spokesperson Atul Londhe said the cruiser raid and subsequent happenings were part of the "huge conspiracy by the BJP government misusing the central probe agencies to discredit and topple the MVA government" which have failed. "Now, they have got a slap on their face... Instead of continuing to indulge in such tactics, it will be better if the BJP learns now that it works for the welfare of the people," Londhe said, terming the development as 'Satyameva Jayate'.

To avoid 'horse-trading,' Chhatrapati scion opts out of RS race

Citing 'self-respect' and to prevent 'horse-trading,' Yuvraj Chhatrapati Sambhajiraje, the scion of the Kolhapur throne, opted out of the Raja Sabha race here on Friday.

Sena's MoS Kishore Tiwari said that his statements in the PIL filed by him stand 'fully vindicated' that the entire raids was a 'fake' perpetrated by Wankhede and his BJP supporters to tarnish the MVA regime and hog publicity. "I will pursue the PIL and seek criminal proceedings against Wankhede, all the BJP men who were exposed later by Minister Malik, how innocents like Aryan Khan were trapped in their extortion rackets and the fake raids, etc., till its logical conclusion," said a grim Tiwari. Following the NCB's statement giving a 'clean chit' to Aryan and others, Malik's Team demanded to know: "Will the NCB take action against Wankhede, his team and the private army, or will it shield the culprits." An NCB official said that it will prosecute only the 14 against whom solid evidence along with circumstantial evidence has been found, and charges will be dropped against the remaining (six). He also said there was no evidence of any 'conspiracy', 'international drug syndicate', 'common intent', based on WhatsApp chats, etc., as claimed by the previous team led by Wankhede which probed the case. The matter started a furious debate on social media with the NCB coming under fire for the ship raids and how its credibility lay shattered, though no prominent BJP leaders have reacted so far.

Team Absolute | Mumbai He said that two Sena MPs had met him in a five-star hotel recently to discuss the issue and conveyed the CM's desire that Sambhajiraje should become a Shiv Sena member and the party would immediately nominate him for RS. "I made it clear that I wish to contest as an independent with the support of the extra votes of various parties and independents - said his decision arose out of 'self-respect', to prevent 'horse-trading' and concern for the masses who are his real strength. The 13th direct descendant of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj also attacked Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, accusing him of "not honouring" his word to support his solo candidature and insisting that he (Sambhajiraje) should first join Shiv Sena before getting a ticket. "For me the RS seat is not the concern... The welfare of the masses is more important for me... I will go on a statewide tour to strengthen the idea of 'Swarajya' now and see my strength," said Sambhajiraje with a tinge of disappointment in his voice. He made it clear that he had no 'angst or ill-will' against any party as they all had their respective agendas to pursue and he respected that. Sena MP Arvind Sawant denied Sambhajiraje's allegations against the CM and blamed him for not accepting the Sena's offer and missing a 'great opportunity'. "He was earlier an NCP member then what prevented him from joining Sena... You stick to your views, we stand by our opinions" said Sawant. BJP Leader of Opposition (Council) Pravin Darekar slammed the Sena for 'insulting and humiliating' Sambhajiraje and said the

people of the state will not forgive them. Congress President Nana Patole said it desired Sambhajiraje to enter the Raja Sabha and whether he is an MP or not, the Congress will always stand with him. A few days ago, the Chhatrapati had announced his plans to contest the RS polls solo with the backing of all other parties like the ruling Shiv Sena-Nationalist Congress Party-Congress, the Opposition Bharatiya Janata Party, smaller parties and independents. Though most parties kept silent, the Shiv Sena was prepared to offer him a ticket with a pre-condition that he should join the party as it wanted to increase its tally in the Upper House of Parliament. Last week, the Sena invited him to CM's residence to tie the 'Shiv Bandhan' and join the party, but Sambhajiraje spurned the offer. A day later, Thackeray finalised the name of Shiv Sena Kolhapur District President Sanjay Pawar, who - along with Chief Spokesperson Sanjay Raut - filled their RS nomination papers on Thursday.

The CBI on late Thursday arrested Pune-based realtor and politician Avinash Bhosale in connection with the DHFL-Yes Bank scam case.

MAHA BJP CHIEF TELLS SUPRIYA SULE TO 'GO HOME AND COOK', LANDS HIMSELF IN SOUP

Maharashtra BJP president Chandrakant Patil took a jibe at Nationalist Congress Party MP Supriya Sule, advising her to "go home and cook" instead of indulging in politics, and found himself in a hot soup, here on Thursday.

Patil's comments came on Wednesday during a procession against the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government demanding OBC reservations, and a day later it became a raging row as he was slammed by various political parties, women leaders all over India and female activists. The BJP chief, responding to Supriya's statements, had said: "Why are you in politics even. Just go home and cook. Go to Delhi or go to a crematorium but get the OBC quotas."

Rushing to his wife Supriya's defence, hubby Sadanand Sule attacked Patil for his way of speaking about his spouse, terming it as "an insult to all women". "I have always maintained that they (BJP) are misogynistic and demean women whenever they can. I am proud of my wife who is a homemaker, mother and a successful politician, one amongst many other hardworking and talented women in India," said Sadanand Sule. NCP Women Wing President Vidya Chavan said Patil - who had denied a ticket to a sitting woman BJP MLA Medha Kulkarni to contest the Kothrud (Pune) seat himself - "had no right to bad-mouth an MP who has been honoured with the 'Sansad

Ratna Award' twice" for her good performance in parliament. "We know you believe in Manusmriti, but we won't keep quiet any more. (Patil) should learn to make chapatis and help his wife at home," Chavan said sharply. Ruling Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) ally Shiv Sena Spokesperson Manisha Kayande hit out at Patil, asking how at his age, he could be saying such things about a woman and termed the BJP as a 'party of goons'. Other senior women politicians like CPI-M's Suhasini Ali and DMK MP Kanimozhi, Shiv Sena MP Priyanka Chaturvedi, several Congress leaders and women's activists also gave a piece of their minds to Patil.

Floundering under attacks from various quarters, Patil claimed that his statements were in a rustic style of speaking and meant no disrespect to Sule or women, and said whenever he meets her (Sule) they always greet each other with respect. Several other NCP leaders castigating Patil including Mahesh Tapase, Samir H Dalwai, Rupali Chakankar, Clyde Crasto, who questioned the BJP's attitude towards womenfolk and whether this was the party's opinion in the "progressive BJP's vision" for the Indian women. Demonstrations and protests were organised against Patil in Pune and other places and memes mocking him were also circulated on social media.

The court while awarding the sentence also imposed a fine of Rs 45,000 on the accused. The court said that the prosecution has established its case against Khan and has convicted him for offences punishable under sections 13, 16, 18, 20, 38, 39 of Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, section 120-B of IPC and sections 4, 5, 6 of Explosive Substances Act. The case pertains to a conspiracy hatched by ISIS operatives in Syria for radicalising Indian youth through the internet, wherein an IED was assembled locally on their directions. The case was initially registered in 2016 with the ATS Police Station in Mumbai and later, the probe was taken over by NIA. After the investigation, a charge sheet was filed in October 2016. The court had earlier awarded seven years of rigorous imprisonment to another accused in the matter, Naser Bin Yafai (Chaus), in March 2022.

Sacked fund manager slaps legal notice on Axis MF

FUND MANAGER AND CHIEF DEALER AT AXIS MUTUAL FUND, VIRESH JOSHI, WHO WAS SACKED LAST FORTNIGHT, HAS SERVED A LEGAL NOTICE TO THE COMPANY CHALLENGING WHAT HE TERMS AS HIS ILLEGAL TERMINATION.

Team Absolute | Mumbai Fund manager and Chief Dealer at Axis Mutual Fund, Viresh Joshi, who was sacked last fortnight, has served a legal notice to the company challenging what he terms as his illegal termination. Joshi was first suspended and later relieved of his charge on May 18, as per a statement issued by the AMF on May 19, for his purported role against allegations of 'front-running' (or,

tailgating) at the company which conducted an internal probe into the matter. He has hired leading law firm, Mansukhlal Hirralal & Co. to challenge his termination order. Confirming the development, lawyer Chirag M. Shah told IANS: "We are in communication with Axis Mutual Fund on behalf of our client Viresh Joshi and have duly replied to the unlawful termination notice." Shah added that AMF terminated Joshi unceremoniously on unsubstantiated charges of alleged 'front-running' and he has sent a notice to the company against the unlawful termination. The AMF further stated that it had been conducting a suo moto internal investigation into the issue since February 2022 using a reputed external advisor to assist with the ongoing probe. "Further to our investigation, his conduct and following the decision to suspend him, the employment of Mr. Viresh Joshi has been terminated with effect from May 18, 2022," said the company.

Broker-fund manager nexus modus operandi

The nexus between fund managers and brokers is well known. We often hear that they work hand-in-glove. Today we will take a closer look at how this actually happens.

Team Absolute | Mumbai The nexus between fund managers and brokers is well known. We often hear that they work hand-in-glove. Today we will take a closer look at how this actually happens. An order to buy shares or sell shares is decided by a fund manager who then intimates the same to his dealer or chief dealer, who then passes on the order to an empanelled broker to execute the same. Prior to passing on the order to the broker to execute the same, a position is taken through an accommodative broker in the F&O segment if the share is traded there. Say for example an order is issued to buy a stock which is a part of the large cap stock category. This would trade in the F&O segment. A position to buy futures would be taken. This would help to generate returns as the size of order could be significant and would move the market price of the stock being purchased. Once the ordered quantity is near completion, the futures trade would be reversed and the position taken thus squared off. The difference between the buy price and the sell price is pocketed without anyone knowing anything. The order in the cash market is completed. Similar would be the case if the order is a sell order. Go short in futures and towards the end of the order square up the short future. This method is fine where the stock is in the futures segment. Let us now come to a situation where the stock is from the Midcap or Smallcap segments and is not traded in the futures segment. The situation changes. In case of a buy order, a position is taken in the cash markets prior to execution of the order starting. On completion or near completion, it is reversed. In case of a sale order while the reverse does



happen, it needs to be borne in mind that irrespective of completion, the short sale has to be squared off before the day ends as all cash sales have to result in deliveries. If the order continues the next day, similar positions are taken on the following day once again. Let us now take another case where shares are available from a market counterparty. Here the share price at which the deal would be done is finalised. The price starts moving up as the order is executed and the difference between the

buying price and the negotiated price is settled. The key players in this entire modus operandi are the fund manager, dealer or chief dealer and the accommodative broker. In most cases if the scale of operations is large, there would be an understanding between the dealer/chief dealer and the fund manager. The spoils are shared between the broker on one side and the fund manager and dealer on the other side. Percentages would vary on size, number of people involved and so on. Confidentiality being the key, sharing is more or less on equal terms which are pre-decided. Various options are used which include trading in different names and so on. The key is that all these leave trails and there have been unmet cases where trades done in the names of family members have been detected subsequently. Hence a proper, non-trail system has to be put in place. Even TV channel anchors trading in family members' names have been caught. The solution, which is relatively safer, is that the broker provides an entity in which these trades are done and all profits are settled in cash. Can this nexus be detected or broken? Yes. There have been various audits which are being done by fund houses, which see the details of the order through trades as it gets filled. Dealing room calls are all on recorded lines which make life more difficult. While there are chances of getting caught in anything illegal being done, no one can save a person who invites attention by driving a car which is an icon by itself. The Lamborghini car, which is so much in the news, has made the fund manager and chief dealer a person who others have become envious of because of unasked and unwarranted limelight. Should be an easy case for the regulators to crack and plug many loopholes.

Uvalde effect: Country singer Lee Greenwood pulls out of NRA concert

Following Don McLean, Larry Gatlin and Larry Stewart, right-wing country singer Lee Greenwood has announced he is pulling out of the concert scheduled to take place at the rally to be organised by America's discredited gun lobbying group, National Rifle Association (NRA), in Houston on May 27, reports Variety.

Greenwood, whose decision was clearly spurred by the massacre of school children at Uvalde, Texas, was followed by T. Graham Brown and Danielle Peck, according to Variety. Their departures leave the concert

with one remaining performer, Jacob Bryant. Sources expect the concert to be cancelled on Friday.

In a statement, Greenwood said: "As a father, I join the rest of America in being absolutely heartbroken by the horrific event that transpired this week in Texas. I was scheduled to perform at the NRA's private event on Saturday with my band. After thoughtful consideration, we have decided to cancel the appearance out of respect for those mourning the loss of those innocent children and teachers in Uvalde.

The concert is part of a larger rally organised by the NRA, which also features speeches from former President Donald Trump, Texas

Governor Greg Abbott and Texas Senator Ted Cruz, besides "over 14 acres of guns and gear and 800 exhibitors", a firearms law seminar, a prayer breakfast and other activities.

The event is going forward even though it is taking place less than a week after -- and less than 300 miles from -- Uvalde, where a school shooting on Monday killed at least 19 children and two adults.

It was the deadliest and at least the tenth mass shooting, besides being the 27th school shooting in the U.S. this year alone -- including one in Houston just two weeks ago, in which two men were killed and three critically wounded, notes Variety.

IF PANT PLAYS MORE THAN 100 TESTS, HIS NAME WILL BE IN HISTORY BOOKS FOREVER: SEHWAG

Former India opener Virender Sehwag claimed that if wicketkeeper-batter Rishabh Pant completes 100 appearances in Test cricket, his name will be written forever in the history books. Pant came into prominence due to his exploits in T20 cricket. But of late, he has been a force to reckon with in Test cricket, amassing 1920 runs in 30 matches at an average of 40.85, including four centuries and nine half-centuries. In India's last Test assignment, a two-match home series against Sri Lanka in March, Pant, 24, made 185 runs at a strike rate of 120.12, including a 28-ball fifty, the fastest by an Indian batter, on the second day of pink-ball Test at Bengaluru.

"If he goes on to play 100-plus Tests, his name would be etched in the history books forever. Only 11 Indian cricketers have achieved this feat, and everyone can recall those 11 names," said Sehwag in an upcoming episode of Home of Heroes show on Sports18, to be aired at 7pm on Friday.

Sehwag himself had been one of the most destructive players to feature in Test cricket, compiling 8586 runs, averaging 49.34 at an



astonishing strike rate of 82.23 apart from 8273 in ODIs at 35.05 with a strike rate of 104.33.

It wasn't surprising that Sehwag still feels that Test cricket will remain the ultimate format of the game in the future despite the T20 format turning out to be more popular and lucrative. "In my humble opinion, Test cricket is the ultimate cricket. Why does Virat Kohli emphasise so much on playing Tests? He knows that if he plays 100-150 or even 200 Tests, he will be immortalised in the record books."

Asian Games postponement gives us more time to prepare like Tokyo Olympics: Hockey captain Savita

Indian women's hockey team goalkeeper and captain Savita is taking the postponement of the 2022 Asian Games in Hangzhou as an opportunity to train harder for the quadrennial showpiece continental event, quite like the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, which too were postponed by a year.

The one-year postponement for the Olympics gave us significant time to improve and, personally for me, I got to work closely with (women's head coach) Janneke (Schopman) who had a great impact on my improvement as a goalkeeper."

India are scheduled to play hosts Belgium on June 11 and 12, followed by matches against Argentina on June 18 and 19 and the United States on June 21 and 22 in the FIH Pro League.

KIYG: Daughter of a plumber, star sprinter Avantika eyes gold

Avantika Narale, the daughter of a plumber, has come a long way. She shot into the limelight as a 15-year-old, when she rewrote Dutee Chand's 200m junior national record in 2018.

she had somehow failed to hear the start gun. She, however, more than made up for the loss by clinching the 200m gold. Avantika's path to

the top has not been on a bed of roses. Her mother supported her plumber husband by working as a maid in neighbouring houses.

Yet, they never let anything come in Avantika's dream of becoming one of India's biggest hopes. Her father now looks after her training schedule, taking her to the venue (Sanas ground) and back home every day.

"I am proud of my family. They support me and the rest at home in every possible way. I have started to reap some fruits, but have a long way to go," Avantika revealed.

In 2019, Avantika won the Asian Youth Athletics Championship 100m gold medal (11.97 secs) in Hong Kong to show her mettle at the highest level. She also won the silver in the 200m, finishing in 24.20 secs, the same as her junior national record. She also won silver in the medley relay.


