New Delhi: President Droupadi Murmu in her maiden address to the nation on the eve of Independence Day talked about India's vibrant democracy, success story of Covid vaccines, Atmanirbhar Bharat and the growth of the country's economy after the pandemic. The President on Sunday said that it is a cause of celebration "not only for all of us but also for every advocate of democracy around the world". "When India won independence, there were many international leaders and experts who were sceptical about the success of democratic form of government in India. They had their reasons to be doubtful. In those days, democracy was limited to economically advanced nations. India, after so many years of exploitation at the hands of foreign rulers, was marked by poverty and illiteracy. But we Indians proved the skeptics wrong. Democracy not only grew roots in this soil, it was enriched too," the President said. Murmu said that 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' festival is dedicated to the people of India. "Based on the success achieved by the people, the resolve to build 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' is also a part of this Mahotsav. Citizens from all age-groups have keenly participated in a series of events held across the country," she added. The President said that the pandemic has uprooted lives and also economies in the entire world. "The government and policy-makers deserve credit for beating the global trend and helping the economy flourish. During the last few years, unprecedented progress has been made in the development of physical and digital infrastructure."

IMRAN KHAN ALL PRAISE FOR INDIA'S FOREIGN POLICY



Lahore: Former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan has once again praised India's foreign policy, which he said works for the people of the country. Speaking at a rally in Lahore on Saturday, Khan said that India bought oil from Russia because it was in its people's interest, but the Pakistan government did not have the guts to do so, despite skyrocketing inflation, ARY News reported. "If India can safeguard the interests of their people, why cannot our government do the same? Because they are afraid about their foreign properties," he said. At the rally, as per reports, Khan played a video clip of Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar. "Jaishankar is telling them who are you? Jaishankar said 'Europe is buying gas from Russia and we will also buy it as people need it'. This is what an independent country should be like," Khan said while praising India.

BJP'S VIDEO BLAMES CONGRESS, COMMUNISTS FOR PARTITION

New Delhi: On Partition Horrors Remembrance Day, the BJP blamed the Congress and the Communists for accepting the demand of the Muslim League for a separate nation. In an over seven-minute video released by the saffron party on Sunday, the BJP indirectly blamed Jawaharlal Nehru and Congress leaders for bowing to the demand of a

separate nation raised by the Muslim League led by Muhammad Ali Jinnah, instead of opposing it. While narrating the story of Partition, the video frequently shows Nehru and Jinnah. It also features Cyril John Radcliffe, who drew the map to divide India into two nations, asking how those who had no knowledge of Indian culture, heritage, civilisation

and values drew borders between people living together for centuries in just three weeks. "Where were those people at that time who had the responsibility of fighting against these divisive forces," the BJP asked while sharing the video on Twitter. At the end, the BJP also blamed the Communists for the Partition.

TRAGEDY OF PARTITION CAN'T BE MISUSED TO FUEL HATE: CONG

New Delhi: The Congress on Sunday attacked the BJP for 'using' the tragedy of partition for political goals. Congress General Secretary Jairam Ramesh alleged that the real intent of the Prime Minister to mark August 14 as 'Partition Horrors Remembrance Day' is to use the most traumatic historical events as fodder for

his current political battles. Ramesh said "The truth is Savarkar originated 2 nation theory and Jinnah perfected it. Sardar Patel wrote, 'I felt that if we did not accept partition, India would be split into many bits and would be completely ruined'." "Will the PM also recall Shyama Prasad Mookherjee, the founder of the Jan Sangh, who cham-

pioned the Partition of Bengal against the wishes of Sarat Chandra Bose, and who sat in free India's first Cabinet while the tragic consequences of Partition were becoming evident?" he added. The Congress alleged that the "modern day Savarkars and Jinnahs are continuing their efforts to divide the nation. The politics of hate will be defeated".

PM Narendra Modi likely to announce key health projects today

This Independence Day is likely to witness key announcements including "Heal in India" and "Heal by India" projects in the health sector by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. According to sources, PM Modi's speech from the Red Fort on August 15 may also mention the expansion of the National Health Mission under a new name, "PM Samagra Swasthya Mission". Under the "Heal in India" campaign, the medical infrastructure at 37 institutions in 12

states will be strengthened with a view to establish the nation as a major destination for wellness and medical travel. Highlights of the project also include streamlined visa requirements for international patients and their partners, interpreters and special desks at 10 designated airports, a bilingual portal, and more. The government has selected 44 countries, mostly in Africa, Latin America, the SAARC, and the Gulf, from which a considerable number of people travel to India for medical treatment. They said that the price and standard of care in these countries were also taken into consideration. Similarly, as part of Heal by India initiative, the Health Ministry is creating an online database of healthcare professionals, including doctors, nurses, and pharmacists. Heal by India initiative aims to position the country as a global source of trained and competent labour in the health sector. The database will also include a section where professionals can specify the country in which they are most interested in providing their services.

'NAGA NATIONAL FLAG' HOISTED TO CELEBRATE 'NAGA I-DAY'

All eyes are on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Independence Day speech from the ramparts of Red Fort on Monday morning.

The Naga tribals hoisted the "Naga national flag" and organised programmes in Nagaland and at many villages in the Naga dominated areas of Manipur on Sunday to celebrate the "Naga Independence Day". A considerable number of Naga tribals inhabited in many of the 16 hill districts of Manipur while there are Kuki tribals in these hill districts, bordering Nagaland, Assam, Mizoram and Myanmar. A statement said: "All Nagas unite with one decision, one faith, and one politics on the principle of Nagalim for Christ. The Nagas have endured 25 years of gruelling ceasefire living up to "our commitment for a peaceful solution of the Naga political issue. We have also waited patiently for seven long years after the historic Framework Agreement was signed on August 3, 2015. We have not left any stone unturned of what it takes to bring a solution that is honourable, inclusive, and acceptable to both the Nagas and the Government of India. The ball is now in the court of the



Government of India to make the right move and to fulfil the commitment given to the Nagas." Manipur-based All Naga Students' Association (ANSA) in a separate statement referring to a Manipur government notification said that the blanket

order to hoist Indian National Flag on August 15 circulated in various departments including the education department whereby "directly and indirectly confronting the rights and sentiments of the Nagas and provoking us is condemned".

PUNJAB POLICE BUST ISI-BACKED TERRORIST MODULE

Chandigarh: Thwarting a possible terrorist attack ahead of Independence Day, Punjab Police have busted a Pakistan's ISI-backed terrorist module with the arrest of four members associated with Canada-based gangsters. The accused were associated with Arshdeep Singh, a.k.a. Arsh Dala, and Australia-based gangster Gurjant Singh, a.k.a. Janta. They were apprehended from Delhi during the intelligence-led operation carried out by the Counter-Intelligence unit of Punjab Police with the help of Delhi Police. The Police have also recovered three hand-grenades (P-86), one IED and two 9 mm pistols along with 40 cartridges from the possession of arrested persons, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Sunday. This is the third such module of cross-border smuggling of arms and explosives that has been busted by the Punjab Police in less than a week. Those arrested have been identified as Deepak Sharma of Moga; Sandeep Singh of Ferozpur; and Sunny Dagar and Vipin Jakhar, both of Delhi.



Akasa Air founder, top broker Rakesh Jhunjhunwala passes away

Top broker-investor and founder of the recently-launched Akasa Air Rakesh Jhunjhunwala, passed away here on Sunday morning, a close friend said. A Chartered Accountant by qualification and training, he was 62 and is survived by his wife Rekha and two children. Often referred to as the 'King of Bulls' in the stock markets, Jhunjhunwala's latest venture Akasa Air's maiden flight took off exactly a week ago on August 7, last Sunday. He had also shot into the limelight for his palace-like new residence coming up at Malabar Hill in



south Mumbai, and had been on the board of several top companies. Jhunjhunwala had an estimated net worth of \$5.5 Billion (as of July 2022), which made him the 36th richest man in India. Jhunjhunwala was

also chairman of Hungama Media and Aptech, as well as a director of Viceroy Hotels, Concord Biotech, Provogue India, and Geojit Financial Services. Jhunjhunwala invested Rs 5,000 in capital in 1985 which grew to Rs 11,000 crore by September 2018. The first big profit of Rakesh Jhunjhunwala was Rs 5 lakh in 1986. Between 1986 and 1989, he earned almost Rs 20-25 lakh profit. Akasa Air is an Indian airline co-founded by Rakesh Jhunjhunwala and former Jet Airways CEO Vinay Dubey. The airline currently has two aircraft with additional order for 70 more aircraft and flies to three cities as of August 9.

CUET RESULT FOR UG ADMISSIONS LIKELY IN EARLY SEPTEMBER

New Delhi: The result of Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for undergraduate (UG) admissions in colleges and universities is likely to be announced in early September. The exams are being conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The examinations, that are being held in six phases due to several instances technical glitches leading to postponement and cancellation, started on July 15 and will end on August 30. The result of CUET-UG will be released on the website of NTA. Along with this, the results will be sent to various concerned Central and other universities. The universities and colleges will release the cut-off list on the basis of this result after which the new session of the first year will start in the colleges. Around 6.31 lakh students have appeared in the CUET-UG examinations so far in 3 phases. Admit cards are being issued to the candidates for the CUET-UG examinations' fourth phase scheduled on August 17, 18 and 20. A total of 3.72 lakh candidates will appear in this phase. As per the NTA, the CUET-UG phase 5 examination will be held on August 21, 22 and 23, for which the admit card will be issued on August 17.



Tribal woman Panchayat president in TN to hoist national flag for first time

An Irula tribal woman, Saraswathi Vijayan who is the president of Velukkattai Panchayat in Krishnagiri district, will hoist the national flag for the first time since she assumed office two years ago. The Tamil Nadu Untouchability Eradication Front (TNUEF) conducted a recent survey in 24 districts of the state and found that several Panchayat presidents of the Dalit community were not allowed to hoist the national flag and many were not even allowed a seat in office.


It may be noted that after the survey report was carried extensively by the media, Tamil Nadu Chief Secretary, V. Irai Anbu ordered all the district collectors to prevent caste discrimination while hoisting the national flag during the Independence day celebrations. Saraswathi Vijayan, who became president of Velukkattai Panchayat in January 2020, was not allowed to hoist the flag on the Panchayat premises. During Republic Day celebrations in 2020, she had to hoist the flag at Panchayat Union Middle school instead of the Panchayat office. After this news came to light, Velukkattai

Panchayat secretary and BDO went to the spot on Thursday and erected a pole on the premises of the Panchayat for the president to hoist the national flag on the Independence day celebrations. While the Dravidian political parties of Tamil Nadu have been professing the ideology of Periyar, in practice clear demarcation and discrimination are happening to many Dalit families in Tamil Nadu. It may be recalled that in October 2021, there were a series of murders in South Tamil Nadu with Dalits and upper caste clashing against each other.

CHANCE ENCOUNTER BREAKS OUT IN SRINAGAR

Ahead of the Independence Day, a chance encounter has started between terrorists and security forces at Nowhatta in downtown Srinagar on Sunday, officials said. "Chance encounter started in Nowhatta area of Srinagar. Police and CRPF are on the job," police said. Additional reinforcements of police and security forces have reached the spot and the area has been cordoned off. There have been a series of encounters between terrorists and security forces across Jammu and Kashmir since the beginning of this year in which many terrorists and their commanders have been eliminated. One scooter, one AK-47 rifle and two grenades were recovered by the security forces from the site of the chance encounter in the old city area of Srinagar on Sunday.



The police said one scooter used by the terrorist, one AK-47 rifle and two grenades were recovered from the Nowhatta old city area in Srinagar where a chance encounter took place between the security forces and a terrorist on Sunday evening. One police constable,

Sarfraz Ahmad from Batote in Ramban district, was injured in the encounter. Ahmad has been shifted to the hospital where his condition is stated to be stable so far. Searches are on to trace the terrorist, who was injured in the encounter.

GUNFIGHT BREAKS OUT AT RAJOURI IN J&K

Srinagar: An encounter has started between terrorists and security forces at Kandra hills area in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district, officials said on Sunday. The firefight started after a joint team of police and security forces got an input about the presence of terrorists in that area. Security forces cordoned off the area. Terrorists hiding there started firing, drawing retaliation by the security forces. "Today, at around 7.30 p.m., operational contact has been established by troops of Indian Army, Rashtriya Rifles and SOG with terrorists at Kandra Hill in district Rajouri (J&K)," army said. There have been a series of encounters between terrorists and security forces across Jammu and Kashmir over the last few months.

Bid to create violence in Manipur on I-Day foiled; 8 militants held

Eight top cadres of banned militant outfit People's Liberation Army (PLA) were arrested from four districts of Manipur and their attempt to create violence ahead of the Independence Day was foiled, defence sources and police said on Sunday. A defence spokesman said that in a major blow to the proscribed insurgent group PLA's nefarious design to disrupt the 75th Independence Day celebrations in Manipur, Assam Rifles alongwith Manipur Police launched a series of intelligence-based joint operations from August 11 to 13 and foiled major sabotage activities. He said that eight hardcore insurgents of PLA were arrested from Imphal East, Imphal West, Thoubal and Kakching districts. During the operation, two 9 mm pistols with magazines, 35 live rounds and two



hand grenades were recovered. These insurgents were also involved in killing of non-Manipuri local residents at Kakching town and Andro village in Imphal East district, recently. This successful joint operation would be a big step in ensuring peace and tranquility in Manipur, the

spokesman said. Apprehended insurgents along with recovered arms and ammunition were handed over to Manipur Police. A senior police officer said that following the preliminary investigation, it was revealed that the extremists have been targeting non-locals in the valley districts.

Punjab resumes Bhagat Singh award for youth

On the eve of the country's 75th Independence Day, the Punjab government on Sunday announced to restart the Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh State Yuva Award, which was lying defunct for long. Two youth from each district of the state will get the award. The aim to resume this award is to make the youth a partner in the development of the state, besides empowering them. The Yuva Bhavan constructed in Chandigarh is also being renovated and revived as a centre of excellence. Sports and Youth Services Minister Gurmeet Singh Meht Hayer said the government is making efforts to disseminate the ideology of Bhagat Singh and prepare



the youth for taking leadership role in the state. The award carries a cash amount of Rs 51,000, a medal, a scroll, a blazer and a certificate. The award is given to two persons in the age of 15 to 35 years from each district of the state.

Youth welfare activities, NCC, NSS, social services, cultural activities, sports, national unity, blood donation, awareness against drugs, educational merit, heroic deeds, scouts and guiding and adventure activities are the criterion for bestowing the award.

Gang posing as Mumbai Police officials loot wellness company in Delhi

Inspired by Akshay Kumar-starrer Bollywood flick 'Special 26', four persons, including two women, posing as Mumbai Police officials robbed a wellness company in the national capital, an official said on Sunday. The gang comprised eight members in total, of which seven have been arrested by Delhi Police. They have been identified as Prashant Kumar Patil (29), Jahid (43), Neha alias Anjali (30), Neha Kashyap (22), Imran (20), Faisal (42) and Sanjay Manocha (52). Search is on for the eighth accused. Furnishing the details, Deputy Commissioner of Police (northwest) Usha Rangnani said that Vijay Yadav, the complainant who owns a wellness company located in Netaji Subhash Place Complex in Pitampura, approached the police on August 10 and said that four persons, claiming to be from the Mumbai Police, entered his office on the pretext of conducting a raid. "They started physically assaulting Yadav and demanded Rs 20 lakh from him. They also forced the complainant to call his wife at gunpoint and ask for the money. The complainant's wife then came with Rs 5.75 lakh, which was collected by a female gang member from outside the office," the DCP said.



At around 5:30 p.m., the robbers locked the complainant and his four female employees in the office and left with the cash, 10 mobile phones, one laptop and around 45,000 cash collected from inside the office. During investigation, the police came to know about few other suspects who had accompanied the four robbers, but didn't enter the office. It was suspected that these other accused persons might have been known to the complainant due to which they

didn't go inside the office. "Raids were conducted at several locations and one suspect, Prashant Kumar Patil, was nabbed," Rangnani said. On sustained interrogation, Patil disclosed that he along with seven others, including two women, were involved in this robbery. On Patil's instance, both the accused women were nabbed from different locations in Delhi. During further interrogation, it was found that two other accused -- Jahid alias Guru Jee and Sanjay Manocha -- had fled to Mewat in Haryana, while three others -- Majid, Faisal and Imran -- fled to Bhopal and Vidisha in Madhya Pradesh. The police then conducted multiple raids and arrested Jahid from Mewat, Imran from Vidisha, Faisal from Bhopal, and Sanjay from his hideout in Delhi. "Within 72 hours of the incident, seven out of the eight accused persons were nabbed by the police. The cash they had robbed has also been recovered," Rangnani said. During the course of investigation, it was found that Mazid, Faisal, Imran and Neha alias Anjali had entered the office of the complainant, presenting themselves as Mumbai Police officials. Since, the other accused persons were known to the complainant, they didn't go inside. Jahid and Prashant were the main conspirators of this robbery.

Ghana national held for running Customs clearance racket

New Delhi: The Intelligence Fusion and Strategic Operations (IFSO) unit of Delhi Police's Special Cell has arrested a Ghana National who was part of a module of cheaters engaged in duping people on the pretext of Customs clearance for high valued overseas gifts. The accused, identified as Godfrey Appiah alias King Kevin, was living in India even after his visa had expired. Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) of IFSO, K.P.S. Malhotra, said that a complaint was received wherein the complainant had alleged that he had been duped of Rs 12,75,000 on the pretext of Customs clearance on a purported gift sent by a woman named Salviya Graffin. The woman, after befriending him on Facebook in May, gradually started chatting with him and after gaining his confidence, told him that she has sent a gift to him. "Soon after, he started receiving phone calls from unknown persons claiming to be from the Customs department and other agencies, asking him to pay for the Customs clearance and other charges for the gift. Accordingly, a case was regis-

Dam breach: Situation 'under control now:' CM

ON THURSDAY, LEAKAGE WAS REPORTED FROM THE DAM, BEING CONSTRUCTED ABOUT 35 KM FROM THE DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS, FOLLOWING WHICH A FLOOD ALERT WAS SOUNDED DOWNSTREAM OF THE RESERVOIR.

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Sunday said the situation in Dhar district, where a breach was reported in a wall of the reservoir, is under control now. He also said about a bypass channel being created, which will help enable the discharge of water to reduce the pressure on the reservoir walls.

On Thursday, leakage was reported from the dam, being constructed about 35 km from the district headquarters, following which a flood alert was sounded downstream of the reservoir. "The whole team is keeping an eye on the Dhar dam. Preparations are on to ensure the



safety of the public," the chief minister added. On Sunday, the Indian Air Force (IAF) deployed two medium-lift helicopters to Indore following a request by the state government for humanitarian assistance disaster relief (HADR) near the Karam River dam. Meanwhile, the IAF is working with the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and the state government for any operations that have to be undertaken, it said in a statement.

Around 200 army personnel, including engineers, and three teams

of the NDRF from Bhopal and Gujarat's Vadodara Surat are at Dhar. Besides them, eight groups of the State Disaster Emergency Response Force (SDERF) are also at Dhar to bring the situation under control.

The water started releasing safely through the channel at 3 am on Sunday, local officials said. A pause in rains in Dhar since Friday has also stopped water from accumulating further in the reservoir. The local officials further said that almost 18 villages downstream

would have submerged had the dam burst.

As a precautionary measure, people from 12 villages in Dhar district and six villages in Khargone district have been shifted to safer places.

State water resources minister Tulsilawat and industries minister Rajvardhan Singh Dattigaon had gone to the dam site to take stock of the situation.

Notably, the dam is coming up at a cost of Rs 304 crore, of which Rs 174 crore has been spent so far.

People's life, Safety is our priority: CM

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has given necessary instructions to the concerned officials after getting information about safe and harmless drainage of water from the dam of the Karam Medium Irrigation Project under construction in Dharampuri tehsil of Dhar district. Chouhan said that it is good to note that the speed at which the drainage started from last evening has picked up pace. Efforts to secure the dam have been successful. Our priority and commitment is also the safety of the lives of the people. It has also been ensured that there is no harm to cattle along with humans. Not only this, instructions have been given that there should be no harm in the villages too.



Chouhan was getting updated information about the work of safe drainage of water as well as accommodation, food and other arrangements for the residents of nearby villages at the Situation Room in Mantralaya on Sunday. He instructed the administration to make necessary arrangements for the people living in the relief centres.

Chouhan reached the Situation Room located at Mantralaya on Sunday morning following continuous monitoring and issuing necessary instructions and received information while discussing with Water Resources Minister Tulsiram Silawat, Chief Engineer Water Resources Madan Singh Dabur, Chief Engineer Chandrashekhar Ghatale and Dhar Collector and SP. Two other ministers, Rajvardhan Singh Dattigaon and

Prabhuram Choudhary are also visiting the dam area to take stock of the arrangements. CM also discussed with the member of Dam Safety Authority Vivek Tripathi. CM took the information about the current water level of the dam and took details of the aspects of its coming to a safe condition. Chouhan discussed over phone with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah and Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat this morning and gave them information about the plan and its implementation to secure the lives of the residents of the dam area and the release of the water to the river by constructing a separate route from the dam.

Chouhan informed that till yesterday there was a situation of release of about 10 cumecs, which has been suc-

cessfully increased three and a half times today to 35 cumecs. Measures to increase it are also being considered. The entire action is being taken keeping in mind the safety of life and property. CM said that efforts are being made on a war footing to ensure that the people are completely safe and the dam should be in a safe condition due to the drainage started by constructing a bypass channel. The situation is completely under control. Once the drainage started, the earthen wall was expected to widen and allow more water to drain out, but the expected amount of water did not drain due to side wall. Now the effort is to create a completely safe environment by removing maximum water from the dam as soon as possible. We will not rest until this task is completed.

MP set to become fifth state to implement Model Tenancy Act

Madhya Pradesh is preparing to become the fifth state to implement the Model Tenancy Act (MTA) which was approved by the Union cabinet in June 2020.

Madhya Pradesh is preparing to become the fifth state to implement the Model Tenancy Act (MTA) which was approved by the Union cabinet in June 2020.

The process to implement the tenancy laws has been initiated and a draft has been prepared by the urban development department of the Madhya Pradesh government. The state government has recently sought public suggestions regarding the implementation of this law and this proposal is likely to be put before the cabinet soon.

Sources claimed that once the proposal gets approval from the cabinet, it can be introduced in the Monsoon Session of the Assembly. The Monsoon Session is scheduled in September.

Officials who are associated with this development said the state has prepared the Madhya Pradesh Tenancy Act on the basis of the Model Tenancy Act, 2021 of the Centre. The officials said the intention of the government is that the tenancy market should grow and should be regulated by proper norms.

"There are many important aspects of this act, the most important of which is that the mutual agreement between the landlord and the tenant will now become a right. This agree-

ment shall be within the legal framework," said an official in the urban housing department.

At present, such agreements are done on nominal stamp paper and they do not remain in any legal framework. After the MTA system is introduced, the tenant will not be able to occupy the house illegally. If someone wants to rent a house for living, then he will have to give two months advance payment and if he wants to take the place for business then he will have to give six months advance payment.

Similarly, the owner of the building will have to appeal to the competent authority to vacate the premises before the expiry of the contract.

If the contract is to be renewed, then a request has to be made one month before the expiry. The tenancy system will also be applicable to the premises of government buildings, universities, organisations, religious institutions.

The agreement will have complete details of the premises, Aadhaar number and there will be full information with the photos of both the tenant and the landlord, as per the draft prepared by the state government.

It said that the information about the agreement has to be given to the Gram Panchayat or Panchayat Samiti or Zila Panchayat or Municipal Corporation or Municipality or Nagar

Panchayat or Development Authority or Housing Board within one month.

The competent entity will give a number to the tenancy agreement. It will be uploaded on the digital government system. Tenants will not be able to keep another tenant in the same premises. There will be no sub-agreement.

The security amount will be refunded to the tenant on the date of vacating the premises. There will be two copies of the agreement. One will remain with the owner and the other with the tenant. Both the owner and the tenant will be responsible for repairing common wear and tear.

If both refuse to do any work, then the owner will be able to get the repair done by deducting the security amount and the tenant after deducting the money from the rent.

Notably, over a year since the Union Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry circulated the Model Tenancy Act (MTA) in June 2021, only four states have so far revised their tenancy laws.

Earlier in July, Union Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs Kaushal Kishore replying to a query in the Rajya Sabha said, "As per information available with MoHUA, the States of Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and Assam have revised Tenancy Acts on the lines of MTA."

'Jhanda Ooncha Rahe Humara'

The family of Shyamlal Gupta Prashad, the writer of the patriotic song 'Jhanda Ooncha Rahe Hamara' will be felicitated in his village at Narwal in Kanpur at Ganesh Sewa Ashram. Shyamlal Gupta's three grandsons Rakesh Gupta, Sanjay Gupta and Rajesh Gupta live with their families in a dingy lane of Jagannath Road in Generalganj, Kanpur. Gupta, who belonged to Kanpur, had vowed to walk barefoot till the country attained freedom from the British. Vinayak Singh, Block Development Officer of Sarsaul, said that the freedom fighter's school, Omar Vaishya Inter College on Birhana Road in Kanpur, is holding Tiranga Yatras and a lecture series with a theme centred on him. Shyamlal Gupta was born on September 9, 1896 as the third child of Visheshwar Prasad and Kaushalya Devi. He penned the 'Jhanda' song on March 3, 1924 and it became a sensation in no time. The song became so popular that Khanna Press had published 5000 copies of it. Among several patriotic numbers written in those times, it was given the title of 'Jhanda Geet' or the flag song. The same year, the All India Congress Committee also recognised it as the flag song and it was sung for the first time on Jallianwala Bagh Diwas on April 13, 1924 at Phoolbagh, Kanpur, in the presence of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. Sarojini Naidu presented this song at the Haripura session of the Congress in the presence of Mahatma Gandhi in 1938, and she even sung it in the film "Azadi ki Raah" 10 years later. Several historians have expressed dissatisfaction that Shyamlal Gupta Prashad remain a forgotten freedom fighter. Among the freedom fighters, he was unique. He not only walked barefoot, but also never used an umbrella till India got its freedom.

India is celebrating 75 years of its independence. An apt time to reconcile the republic's gains and losses and also assess where the critics of the current government have gone wrong. 15 August 2022, India and Indians have travelled a long way on the road to democracy during the last 75 years. We have every reason to be proud of our country and its achievements. The government has planned big events across the country to commemorate the 75 years of Independence as 'AmritMahotsav'.

However, the critics of the current government say that the Indian democracy is under siege. They point out further that Indian democracy is in serious decline according to major international democracy rankings, or that India may no longer be a democracy at all.

What the critics say

Critics also allege that due to the social engineering initiated by the BJP, historically oppressed Bahujan (backward) communities who do not conform to the image of a good Hindu are sought to be marginalised as do the religious minorities who find themselves identified as internal enemies. Bemoaning further they allege that liberals and leftists, activists who have raised issues of the environment and human rights, and anyone else perceived to be "anti-national" have been included to the list of internal enemies. They turn hoarse saying dissent is muzzled, increasingly through official edicts. Old controversies like in Mathura and Varanasi over temples and mosques are reignited, and claims that mosques were built upon the demolition of temples have resurfaced. They allege that the social fabric

knitted together by India's diverse communities is being torn and new religious flashpoints have been created.

But here it would be pertinent to note that India shares its democratic degradation with many other countries across the world. This process has been variously described as authoritarian, populist, ethnocratic, exclusionary and fascist.

But to be sure, the dominant groups in ethnocracies value democracy - at least for themselves - and often take pride in their democratic institutions. But a polity based on the structural exclusion of a section of its population cannot reasonably be said to qualify as a democracy.

India under Modi

Indeed, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has gone on to extol India as the mother of all democracies, invoking the country's heritage of participatory decision-making and checks and balances.

However, all these shrill noises of criticism and dissent beg a question. If all these accusations are true, then what has prevented the other political parties of India to prevent this bulldozing by the BJP and adopt the practices and systems which have made the BJP - a party which it is today.

Critics say that mobilisation of interest groups and booth management efforts are underway in full swing as is the momentum for the next general elections. Is there anything that can stop the BJP juggernaut?

There is a good reason why the BJP is in power in 18 states out of 28, and has more than 400 members in Parliament, and 1,300 legislators in state assemblies.

Driving the party is its 'here and now' approach. There is no room for political complacency - with an energetic prime minister who communicates with the people directly; there is simply no other option for the karyakartas (workers).

Contrast this with other political parties, BJP's careful planning,



managing its cadres and execution resulted in these victories, whereas the GOP of India i.e. the Indian National Congress had lost the plot much before the 2014 elections.

Opposition parties

The INC it seems had taken the electorate for granted, the young emerging leadership of the party was side-lined by the old satraps, its party management at the legislative and ground-level both had floundered completely. I myself had witnessed 2 general elections in UP before 2014, where at both level the party had no other agents or managers to manage the voters.

We also should not forget the long list of communal riots, which happened under the Congress rule: from Moradabad to Aligarh to Bhagalpur to Nellie, Assam. The long process to bring the culprits to justice, the court ruling in Hashimpura case came after 31 years of the massacre.

It claimed to be concerned for Muslims but in fact no confirmatory action was taken by any Congress-led government after the Ranganath Misra Commission's report of 2004 or Sachar Committee's report of 2006. So the words were only hollow with no concerted action forthcoming.

ing. Before that the Communists, too had lost the plot completely. Their rout was more or less linked to the booming of the Indian economy after India opened up its economy and the market reforms rolled in. The middle class which now had access to more consumer goods and could aspire to a more lavish life style, had no place for the politics of demonstrations and agitations.

The other smaller parties like the Samajwadi or the RJD or the NC, except the south Indian parties were interested in furthering their own petty selfish goals and they were nearly decimated under the BJP juggernaut.

As far as the minorities of India are concerned and particularly the largest minority i.e. the Muslims, they themselves are to be blamed for their woes. After independence the community as a whole seems to have withdrawn into a shell. It was not seen as part of the Indian mainstream, their self-promoting leaders kowtowed to their political masters by assuring them of the Muslims' votes for their own personal benefit.

These leaders failed to

drive their community to a path of greater learning and become an essential part in the growth of the country, as the other minorities like Sikhs and Parsis did. By neglecting this they neglected their own growth also.

Future scenario

Right now it is a right-wing push that is dictating the frenetic pace of statecraft now, but there is nothing wrong in this, as the right wing has come to power using the democratic tools available to every party.

If the political critics of the BJP bemoan the so-called social engineering engineered by the BJP, use of social media to further its messaging, then who had stopped them to follow or use the same tools.

In an interview Badri Narayan, social historian, columnist, opined that there is no political party like the BJP anywhere, which starts working for elections two years in advance as well as governing, both at the same time. It is a mega political machine in every sense.

Senior academic and researcher at the LSE, Manisha Priyambhas been quoted as saying that the BJP under Prime Minister Modi is an electoral party, more than an ideological one. It takes every election at every level very seriously, not just the Lok Sabha polls.

This makes us ponder what has stopped the other political parties from adopting the same strategy and planning? If they are not up to it then they themselves are to be blamed. No one else! Stop bemoaning! Get your act together!

After 75 years of independence, we Indians indeed need a new political system in the country, where every section could contribute and reap the benefits of progress and development, equally and which should put a stop to the political spoils of all political parties.

US LAWMAKERS ARRIVE IN TAIWAN DAYS AFTER PELOSI'S VISIT

Five US lawmakers arrived in Taipei for a surprise visit on Sunday amid escalated tensions across the Taiwan Strait, following a trip earlier this month by Nancy Pelosi, the Speaker of the US House of Representatives.

According to the American Institute in Taiwan (AIT), which acts as the de facto US embassy, the two-day visit is part of a larger trip to the Indo-Pacific region. Discussions are to focus on regional security, trade and investment, among other issues, dpa news agency reported.

Taiwan's foreign ministry welcomed the visit, saying that the delegation will meet with President Tsai Ing-wen and Foreign Minister Joseph Wu.

The visiting lawmakers, from both Republican and Democratic



parties, are Senator Ed Markey and Representatives John Garamendi, Alan Lowenthal, Don Beyer and Aumua Amata Coleman Radewagen.

China increased pressure on Taiwan both militarily and economically after a 19-hour visit to

Taipei by Pelosi on August 2-3.

Taiwan has had an independent government since 1949, but China considers the island part of its territory. In 1979, Washington formally cut diplomatic ties with Taipei and built relations with Beijing.

AT LEAST 41 DEAD IN COPTIC CHURCH BLAZE IN EGYPT

At least 41 people have died in a fire at a Coptic church in Giza near Cairo, the Health Ministry of Egypt said on Sunday. The fatalities were due to thick smoke and a stampede triggered by the blaze, Health Minister Khalid Abdul Ghafar said in a statement, dpa news agency reported. Fourteen others were injured in the fire at the Abo Sefein Church in the city of Giza. Twelve are still in hospitals, while two others have been discharged. The Coptic Church said a large blaze broke out during a morning mass service on Sunday.



The fire was due to a faulty electric circuit caused by an air conditioner in the church building, the Interior Ministry said. The blaze was later brought under control, the ministry added in a statement. Five civil defence personnel were injured in the incident.

Images in the Egyptian media showed the facade of the church partially blackened out due to the fire that gutted parts of the building's interior.

Egyptian President Abdel-Fattah al-Sissi offered condolences to the Coptic Pope Tawadros II, the presidency said. Egypt has the largest Christian community in the Middle East, accounting for around 10% of the country's mostly Muslim population of more than 100 million.

Europe's rivers run dry as drought could be worst in 500 years

Across Europe, drought is reducing once-mighty rivers to trickles, with potentially dramatic consequences for industry, freight, energy and food production - just as supply shortages and price rises due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine bite, local media reported. Driven by climate breakdown, an unusually dry winter and spring followed by record-breaking summer temperatures and repeated heatwaves have left Europe's essential waterways under-replenished and, increasingly, overheated, The Guardian reported.

With no significant rainfall recorded for almost two months across western, central and southern Europe and none forecast in the near future, meteorologists say the drought could become the continent's worst in more than 500 years, The Guardian reported.

"We haven't analysed fully this year's event because it is still ongoing," said Andrea Toreti of the European Commission's Joint Research Centre. "There were no other events in the past 500 [years] similar to the drought of 2018. But this year, I think, is worse."

Germany's Federal Institute of Hydrology (BfG) said the level of the Rhine, whose waters are used for freight transport, irrigation, manufacturing, power generation and drinking, will continue dropping until at least the beginning of next week, The Guardian reported.

A vital part of northwest Europe's economy for centuries, the 760 miles (1,233km) of the Rhine flow from Switzerland through Germany's industrial heartland before reaching the North Sea at the megaport of Rotterdam.

In Italy, the flow of the parched Po, Italy's longest river, has fallen to one-tenth of its usual rate, and water levels are 2 metres below normal. With no sustained rainfall in the region since November, corn and risotto rice production have been hard hit.

The Po valley accounts for between 30 per cent and 40 per cent of Italy's agricultural production, but rice growers in particular have warned that up to 60 per cent of their crop may be lost as paddy fields dry out and are spoiled by seawater sucked in by the low river level, The Guardian reported.

Salman Rushdie off ventilator and talking following stabbing in US

Author Salman Rushdie has been taken off his ventilator and is talking as he recovers from being stabbed in the US.


British-American writer Aatish Taseer said, in a since-deleted tweet, that the 75-year-old was "off the ventilator and talking (and joking)", which was then confirmed by the author's agent Andrew Wylie. Wylie had earlier said Salman was using the ventilator and could lose an eye after he sustained injuries to his arm and liver in the attack, dpa news agency reported.

The Indian-born Briton, whose novel "The Satanic Verses" led to death threats from Iran in the 1980s, was about to deliver a lecture in New York state on Friday, when he was attacked.

The man accused of stabbing him pleaded not guilty on Saturday to charges of attempted murder and assault. A lawyer for Hadi Matar, 24, entered the plea on his behalf during a formal hearing at a court in western New York.

Salman was stabbed at least once in the neck and once in the abdomen, according to police, before he was taken to hospital.

Salman began his writing career in the early



1970s with two unsuccessful books before "Midnight's Children", about the birth of India, which won the Booker Prize in 1981.

The author lived in hiding for many years in London under a British government protection programme after the fatwa.

Liz Truss holds a commanding lead over Rishi Sunak in race to be next UK PM

Foreign secretary Liz Truss holds a commanding 22-point lead over British-Indian ex-minister Rishi Sunak in the race to become the next Tory leader and UK prime minister, according to an exclusive poll of party members for The Observer.

With less than three weeks to go before the September 2 deadline for voting, the survey by Opinium of 570 Conservative members puts the foreign secretary on 61 per cent and the former chancellor on 39 per cent, The Guardian reported.

Truss' lead is, however, less than in some other recent polls of the Tory electorate, possibly suggesting that Sunak may have closed the gap in recent days.

She has come under increasing pressure over her refusal to back what she describes as "handouts" to help people with their energy bills, and was heavily criticised for a U-turn over pay rises for public sector workers outside London and the south-



east of England. Opinium's detailed questioning also uncovers a striking lack of enthusiasm for either candidate when members are asked whether they would prefer one of them to Boris Johnson to run the party and country, The Guardian

reported. Opinium asked members what the main single reason was that they backed one of the two candidates. For Sunak the most cited reason was that he would be better at managing the economy (22 per cent), while 10 per cent said they regarded

him as the most competent or intelligent. A main reason mentioned by people who backed Truss was dislike of Sunak (14 per cent). The same proportion (14 per cent) said the foreign secretary was more honest and trustworthy, while 10 per cent chose the fact that she had remained loyal to Johnson and not called on him to resign. Some 2 per cent of Tory members cited race or ethnicity as a reason for supporting Truss and not Sunak. Chris Curtis of Opinium said that despite an apparent growing nostalgia among Tory members for Johnson - and a less than ecstatic response to either of the candidates bidding to replace him - it was now hard to see how Truss could fail to become the next prime minister, The Guardian reported.

"From the moment we knew the final two candidates, it has been clear that Truss has had all the momentum, and our latest poll sets out just how large her lead among the party members has become," he said.



MAHA CABINET: BJP TAKES THE CAKE, SHINDE GROUP SETTLES FOR CRUMBS

Shinde will handle Urban Development, GAD, IT, PWD (Public Projects), Transport and other departments, as per an official announcement.

Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis has been given a bagful of big portfolios, including the crucial Home, Finance and Planning, Law and Justice, Water Resources, Energy, Housing and Protocol.

The much-awaited distribution of portfolios came five days after the CM expanded his Cabinet on Tuesday by inducting 18 ministers, nine each from Shiv Sena Shinde Group and BJP, though there are no women in the team so far, after Shinde and Fadnis took oath on June 30.

The portfolio allocation was announced after approval from Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari, even as the Leader of Opposition, NCP's Ajit Pawar, the Congress and the Shiv Sena took regular potshots at Shinde-Fadnis for the delay in

Face of Maratha movement Vinayak Mete killed in car crash, probe ordered

Veteran politician and President of Shiv Sangram Party Vinayak Mete -- who espoused the cause of the Maratha community for over 3 decades -- was killed in a road accident on the Mumbai-Pune Expressway here on Sunday morning, officials said.

Mete, 52, was coming from Beed via Pune to Mumbai in his SUV to attend a Maratha panel meeting scheduled with top state leaders this afternoon, when the mishap occurred. He was rushed to the MGM Hospital in Kamothe, Navi Mumbai where the doctors declared him dead on admission.

A doctor at MGM Hospital later told mediapersons that he didn't exhibit any signs of life and with grievous head, neck and limbs injuries, had been killed instantaneously in the accident. Chief Minister Eknath Shinde -- who rushed to the hospital along with

Deputy CM Devendra Fadnis -- announced a probe into the incident. The Raigad Police have set up eight teams to investigate the accident and shall also interrogate the SUV driver Eknath Kadam, who has survived and also a police bodyguard, who is presently said to be critically injured. Mete was at the forefront of the agitations in the past to demand reservations for the Maratha community which fructified, and he headed a key committee that was executing the project to construct a grand memorial for Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj in the Arabian Sea. Mete's body was taken for an autopsy at Sir J.J. Hospital and handed over to his family and taken to his Wadala residence. After keeping it for public 'darshan', the body is likely to be flown to his native Beed district where the funeral is expected to be performed later. According to Raigad Police, around 5.05 a.m., Mete's Ford Endeavour

(SUV) was proceeding towards Mumbai when the driver reportedly lost control of the vehicle.

The speeding SUV rammed into an unknown vehicle in the lane ahead and crashed beside the road, fatally injuring Mete and seriously hurting the police bodyguard and the driver Kadam. However, owing to some delayed communication, a police team rushed there only after an hour and shifted the three victims to the MGM Hospital.

Besides Shinde and Fadnis, Leader of Opposition Ajit Pawar, Nationalist Congress Party President Sharad Pawar, Shiv Sena President Uddhav Thackeray, state Congress President Nana Patole, state cabinet ministers NCP MP Supriya Sule, Chhagan Bhujbal, Dhananjay Munde, Pankaj Munde, Deepak Kesarkar, and other leaders across the political spectrum grieved Mete's sudden demise.

Raju Shrivastav's nephew shares health update, urges fans to not believe rumours

There has been a minor improvement in comedian Raju Shrivastava's health. His nephew, Kushal Shrivastava, revealed on Saturday that the comedian, who is on ventilator in ICU in AIIMS, New Delhi, is 'getting better'.

sign. Also, Raju Ji moved his hand and fingers which doctors have informed us. He is a fighter, he will be back.'

He also asked everyone to stop spreading rumours about Shrivastava's condition. He said: 'There are also rumours that he exercised a bit too much on the day when he suffered a heart attack which is baseless. He would always run on the treadmill, he never indulged in lifting heavy weights. He was doing his daily exercise.'

Raju has been a part of the entertainment industry since late 1980s. He received national recognition after participating in the first season of the stand-up comedy show 'The Great Indian Laughter Challenge' in 2005.

'Golden joint' launched on Chenab Railway Bridge in J&K

Decked with the national flag, the 'Golden Joint' of the Chenab railway bridge was launched on Saturday thereby inaugurating the World's highest railway bridge.

To commemorate 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav', the world's highest bridge in Reasi district of J&K was decked up with the Tricolour by the workers on this occasion.

The workers were seen celebrating and hoisting the national flag with love and pride right in the middle of the bridge at the golden joint. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav took to Twitter to showcase a video of the launch of the golden joint and the deck closure ceremony from the Chenab bridge. The 40-second video added in the tweet shows the workers celebrating atop the world's highest bridge as they have worked tirelessly for years to achieve this feat.

Sanjay Gupta, CMD Konkan Railway told reporters, 'From the two ends of the Chenab River valley, the bridge superstructure on the arch was gradually pushed so that it eventually connected at the centre of the arch... This has been a long journey. The term 'golden joint' was coined by

civil engineers. It's the world's highest railway bridge.

A few days before laying the golden joint, Afcons Infrastructure Ltd Deputy Managing Director, Gridirhar Rajagopalan had told IANS, 'Both ends will finally meet to complete the bridge overarch deck and the segments will be joined with the help of High Strength Friction Grip (HSFG) bolts to mark the critical 'golden joint' on the iconic structure. This will complete the Chenab River bridge, 359 metres above the riverbed, an extraordinary achievement and heralding a new chapter in the history of J&K.'

The bridge comprises 93 deck segments, each weighing around 85 tonnes, launched simultaneously from both ends of the valley over the massive steel arch and work on joining five segments in full progress on the single line linking Katra (Jammu) with Qazigund (Kashmir), some 75 km away, he said.

The project is part of the ambitious 272-km long railway line from Udhampur to Baramulla joining Jammu with the Kashmir valley as an all-weather highspeed alternative, named the 'Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link Project'.

SATARA'S APSHINGE VILLAGE BOASTS OF 'HAR GHAR SOLDIER'

Satara's tiny Apshinge -- also known as the 'army village' -- is renowned for its huge contribution to the country's military establishments in its more than four centuries of existence but, arising from a need to conquer hunger pangs, and survive the local economic challenges.

Over the centuries, Apshinge gained national fame for dedicating at least one person to serve in the armed forces, with many sacrificing their lives in the service of the 'Matrubhoomi' (Motherland).

At the entrance, there is a War Memorial, which bears the names of those who were martyred in different wars, chronologically, with the grateful British rulers engraving a proclamation - 'The only military village in the country!' - a permanent and historic stamp on its service credentials.

However, this distinct honour and sacrifice emerged out of different compulsions as Apshinge and its surroundings had barren soil, rocky land, with little or no irrigation facilities for agriculture, thus pushing the youngsters to the sole profession of army service in those days, Nationalist Congress Party Satara Lok Sabha MP, Shrinivas D. Patil, told correspondent.

'There was also a gender imbalance, with a higher male population in that region, and coupled with poor farming opportunities, many took to the military service for a living, they were compensated well and the whole tradition started,' said Patil, whose wife Rajani's 16 relatives were/are in the armed

forces. Thus, 'armed' with a professional alternative, Apshinge folks have served the Maratha army, the British Indian Army, Azad Hind Sena and now the Indian Army with distinction, participating in World War I and World War II, the India-Pakistan and the India-China wars.

During World War I, 46 bravehearts from Apshinge made the supreme sacrifice, four in the 1962 India-China war, two in the India-Pakistan war in 1965 and one in the 1971 war that led to the birth of Bangladesh in 1971. Many of their kin still live in the village.

Prior to that, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's Azad Hind Fauj had four fighters from Apshinge, and back in history, many defended Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's kingdom through his armies in different places.

'Almost each home has given a soldier or an officer or a martyr to the country. The kids here live in an ambience of military ranks, uniforms, medals or honours, pictures of heroes or mar-




tyrs hanging in their rooms, and they grow up well-versed with army culture, discipline, protocols and rigours, which inspires others,' said a forest official from Satara, Rohan Bhat-Shah.

Bhate-Shah's freedom fighter grandfather Kalyanji J. Shah alias Babubhai Masurkar, was honoured with a Copper Plate (Tamra Patra) on behalf of the then PM Indira Gandhi to mark the Silver Jubilee of I-Day in 1972, in Satara.

Apshinge attracted and hosted scores of dignitaries, including the then Governor of Bombay Province John Colville, Viceroy of India Lord A. P. Wavell, former Governor-General of India Lord Louis Mountbatten, India's first Chief of Army Staff Field Marshal (Gen.) K. M. Cariappa, and more.

Located around 17 kms from Satara town, Apshinge is populated by around 3,000 people, and currently over 1,600 are serving in the



armed forces. Almost 90 percent of the youths were recruited to protect Great Britain during World War I.

Though there is no formal military academy here, the armed forces seemingly act as a 'magnet' for the youngsters here with generations from some families serving the army and the nation even today, said Bhat-Shah.

On Independence Day on Monday, Mumbai's Sri Shanmukhananda Fine Arts & Sangeeta Sabha (SSFASS) will honour 75 war heroes from Apshinge at the hands of Lt. Gen. H. S. Kahlon, the GOC, Maharashtra, Gujarat and Goa.

'Apshinge children get military training during school, so we shall set up a state-of-the-art gymnasium to enhance the physique and performance of those desirous of joining the armed forces,' SSFASS President Dr. V. Shankar told correspondent.

The SSFASS will also redevelop the existing school building, construct a community hall with facilities for army men and other amenities, he added.

'On I-Day, the SSFASS shall confer 'Shanmukha Shaurya Ratna Award' to Apshinge village with a cash prize of Rs. 500,000, a citation and mementos, 25 War Widows of Martyrs shall be felicitated with Rs. 200,000 reward and 75 students will render the full (five stanzas) of the National Anthem,' SSFASS Spokesperson K. A. Viswanathan added.

Today, prosperity smiles on Apshinge, the village has modern facilities, a sense of 'army camaraderie' and helpful nature among the people, even cultivation has improved in the vicinity with modern techniques, but the centuries old tradition of serving the Motherland continues.

According to Deadline, Rowling publicly asked Twitter to intervene,

asking @TwitterSupport, "Any chance of some support?" but Aziz's post currently remains in place. He had previously described the man arrested for attacking Rushdie's, Hadi Matar, as a "revolutionary Shia fighter".

Deadline further states that Rowling confirmed that the police are involved, telling followers: "To all sending supportive messages: thank you. Police are involved (were already involved in other threats)."



Birmingham 2022 successes could mark the start of a new era in Indian athletics

The 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham was a huge success for India and athletics was one such discipline which gave fans opportunities to celebrate record-breaking moments.

As expected, India experienced a medal rush in boxing, wrestling, weightlifting, badminton and table tennis in CWG. However, the one field which helped shoot up the country's medal tally was athletics.

The performances in track and field by youngsters like steeplechaser Avinash Sable, triple jumpers Eldhose Paul and Abdulla Aboobacker, walkers Priyanka Goswami and Sandeep Kumar, javelin thrower Annu Rani, long jumper Murali Sreeshankar and high jumper Tejaswin Shankar were heartening which stole the show.

The undoubted star for India in track and field in Birmingham was Avinash Sable, who challenged the Kenyan hegemony in the 3000m steeplechase, finishing second, los-



ing the gold medal by 500th of a second. Abraham Kibiwot, the gold medallist, presented a brave front but it was sure he had his heart in his mouth for a few seconds as Sable made a late charge to the finish line, virtually hanging onto the Kenyan runner's shoulder as he crossed the finishing line.

Eldhose Paul, who led a 1-2 finish in triple jump, was the other big gain for India from track and field, one who could be further groomed into a medal winner at Paris.

In men's long jump, Murali Sreeshankar won the first-ever silver medal for India in the event.

Sandeep Kumar, who won bronze in men's 10km race walk, did it with a personal best timing, while Priyanka Goswami took the silver in the women's event, shattering the national record with a personal best timing of 43:38.83.

By clinching the bronze, Annu Rani won a first-ever medal for India in women's javelin throw at CWG.

Around one year ago, Neeraj Chopra's gold at the Tokyo Olympics gave Indian athletics a new lease of life. It changed the mentality of Indian athletes and gave them a new identity at the global level.

Going by India's credible show at CWG 2022, one can say that the success in Birmingham could be the beginning of a new era in athletics for India.

European Swimming Championships

ROMANIAN TEEN SHATTERS 13-YEAR-OLD 100M FREESTYLE WORLD RECORD

17-year-old Romanian world champion David Popovici became the youngest swimmer to break the men's 100m freestyle world record at the European Swimming Championships here on Saturday.

Popovici stormed home in a time of 46.86 seconds and shattered the 13-year-old world mark of 46.91 set by Brazil's Cesar Cielo at the 2009 FINA world championships, which also were held at the same pool at Rome's historic Foro Italico.

In the men's 100m freestyle final, Popovici was the second in the first 50m with 22.74 and turned to dominate the field with 24.12 in the second half, beating Hungarian butterfly world champion Kristof Milak 47.47



and Italian Alessandro Miressi 47.63, respectively. Popovici also broke the world junior record, European record, European junior record and meet record at the same time.

The Romanian young sensation claimed two gold in the 100m and 200m free at the FINA worlds in Budapest, Hungary in June. Popovici was convinced that this

was his chance to erase the name of Brazil's Cesar Cielo's from the record books and replace it with his own; but only by swimming .05 faster than the 46.91 mark that was set in this very same pool at the 2009 FINA World Championships.

It took a step by step improvement to achieve a new world record of 46.86, one that brought a huge smile to the face of 17 year old David Popovici and brought the crowd at the Foro Italico pool to its feet. Popovici shaved 0.05 off a dusty world record that was set in a shiny suit. The Romanian split 22.74 in his first lap coming back in 24.12 beating Hungary's Kristof Milak by .61 of a second. He became the youngest world record holder in history in this event. A historic mark at a historic venue.

National Bank Open

Carreno Busta stuns Evans, sets final clash with Hurkacz

Pablo Carreno Busta reached his first ATP Masters 1000 and National Bank Open final after registering a 7-5, 6-7(7), 6-2 victory over Daniel Evans in the semifinal, here.

The 31-year-old had a match point in the second-set tie-break but saw his perfect set streak on the week snapped at nine before storming back in a dominant final set on Saturday night. After so little separated the competitors for most of the two-hour, 58-minute marathon, Carreno Busta raced through the finish line by winning the final 12 points, including eight on return.

The Spaniard will next face eighth seed Hubert Hurkacz as he bids to become the first unseeded champion at the National Bank Open since Argentina's Guillermo Canas in



2002. The World No 23 advanced to his second final of the season (Barcelona) by pairing his aggressive baseline game with a dominant first-serve performance in which he won 79 per cent (49/62) of points on his first delivery. He fired 43 winners and broke on five of his eight chances as he took control of the match down the stretch.

Rayo hold Barca in Camp Nou, while Villarreal off to a flier

Simona Halep moves into Toronto final; set to enter Top-10 in latest WTA rankings

Romania's former world No. 1 Simona Halep, a two-time major champion, beat the challenge from No. 7 Jessica Pegula of the US to advance to her fourth National Bank Open final and biggest since 2020.

With her impressive run in the WTA 1000 tournament, the 30-year-old Halep, who will take on Beatriz Haddad Maia of Brazil in the final here, will return to Top-10 in the world when the latest ranking are released on Monday.

Two-time champion Halep entered the final of the tournament defeating Pegula 2-6, 6-3, 6-4. Toronto is Halep's first final since winning the Melbourne 250 in January and the biggest final for the former No. 1 since winning Rome in 2020.

Currently ranked No. 15, Halep saw her 373-week reign in the Top-10 end nearly a year ago when she dropped out on August 9, 2021. She can rise as high as No. 6 if she wins the title on Sunday, according to wtatenn



nis.com. Into her 18th WTA 1000 final, Halep is bidding to win her ninth WTA 1000 title and 24th career title.

Facing Halep for the first time, Pegula raced through the opening set cashing in on her flat baseline game and efficient work at the net. Halep struggled from the baseline, with her backhand breaking down often. But Halep shifted gears early in the second set, breaking the

American twice to build a 4-1 lead.

"I changed a little bit the tactics," Halep said. "In the first set, it was a little bit too fast. She was hitting super strong and I didn't feel the rhythm.

Then I just calmed down and I tried to just push her back a little bit more."

The victory is Halep's 37th of the season, tying her with Tunisia's Ons Jabeur for the second-most wins on tour.

David de Gea was at fault twice as Josh Dasilva and Mathias Jensen put Brentford two up inside 18 minutes, before Ben Mee and Bryan Mbeumo ensured Brentford became only the third side to put four past United in the first half of a Premier League game.

While the Bees could not inflict further misery on Ten Hag and United, it mattered little as the damage was already done.

United gave Thomas Frank's men a helping hand for the opener as De Gea inexplicably let Dasilva's 25-yard effort squeeze into the bottom-right corner after Ronaldo had been robbed.

The floodgates then opened. Shortly after United escaped a similar



situation, Christian Eriksen was dispossessed inside his own box following an ill-advised pass from De Gea, and Jensen applied a disguised finish with 18 minutes played.

The off-balance Mee nodded in at the back post as United failed to cope with the hosts' physicality, and by the 35th minute it was 4-0 -- Dasilva racing onto a clearance to play an exquisite pass into

the box where Mbeumo held off Luke Shaw to score. Ten Hag made three changes at the break and that at least helped stem the flow of goal concessions. United improved as an attacking threat, with Ronaldo presented with a couple of half-chances and Eriksen testing David Raya with a header.
