- IIT Bombay was featured in the 281-300 rank range, followed by IIT Delhi (321-340 rank) and Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) at the third rank (361-380).
- IIT Kharagpur was featured in the 551-600 rank range.
- IIT Roorkee was included in the 451-500 rank range of the list.

In the rankings, released in London recently, IIT Bombay was evaluated as India's top higher education institution for its excellence in employability, social concern, and environment.

Apart from this, IIT Bombay was also included in the world's top 100 institutes based on the employability of its graduates.

IIT Delhi was ranked for its employability and envi-

ronment while Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) was ranked for gender equality and removing other inequalities.

In terms of competition and academic freedom, Delhi University ranked fourth in India.

Globally, the University of California was declared the top university, followed by the University of Toronto and the University of British Columbia in second and third ranks respectively. The US dominates the rankings with 135 ranked universities (19.2 per cent of the total). Of these, 30 universities are included in the top 100. Similarly, the UK was ranked second with 67 British universities being included in the rankings.

After the US and the UK, Australia and Germany are at the forefront of this ranking. The students and teachers of JNU are excited by the university's performance in the rankings. The bench compared the importance placed on the role of women in child rearing in India as opposed to the more equal sharing of responsibilities that exists in other countries, including Scandinavian countries. It went on to voice its concerns regarding the safety of the child.

division bench of the Kerala High Court noted that in the Indian context, a female family member is always needed to look after children as we have not reached the level of Scandinavian countries where you have same-sex marriage and everybody is equipped to rear children

Justices Alexander Thomas and Sophy Thomas made this observation while considering a habeas corpus plea moved by a man, who is based in Gujarat, for releasing his 4-year-old daughter, who he alleged was being illegally detained by his in-laws.

egally detained by his in-laws. The court also took note of the fac that the petitioner resided in Gujarat and that there was no material placed before it to indicate that any female family member resided with him who may be capable of taking care of the child. "Irrespective of the gender of the child, it is very difficult for you to look after a child under the age of 10. You will be going to work and children can get exposed to so many dangerous things. Nowadays sexual violence is increasing even against young children, some children below the age of 2 years. It may not be a frequent occurrence but safety of the child is very importance. Especially if you are living in a faraway state in a remote town," the bench said.

note town," the bench said. "Please don't keep any hope, we can give you a judgment on merit. If you don't agree with it, please challenge it. We do not know if the children will be proper and safe with you at this stage. You can come here from Gujarat and see your children and you can have weekly video calls with the child. Suppose you are using parents patriae jurisdiction, first and paramount is the welfare of the minor", the Court said.

"Who will take care of the minor? You are a 38-year-old man living alone and you will take care of a four-year-old child and that too a girl child? No sensible court will allow that request," the bench added.

The bench further said that it cannot find any gross illegality with the

fact that the petitioner's minor daughter is with her grandparents and suggested that he settle the matter of custody in a Family Court rather than attempt to convert a habeas corpus proceedings into a custody matter. The court posted the case to be considered again next week when it will converse with the minor child and her grandparents on video call.

orld's tallest Shiva statue
'Vishwas Swarpoopam' (Statue
of Belief) will be inaugurated
in Rajasthan's Rajsamand district on
Saturday. It will take at least four hours
to watch the 369-feet tall statue built on
Ganesh Tekri of Nathdwara.

Built on a hill of 51 bighas, the statue took 10 years to complete and has been constructed by Sant Kripa Sanatan. It has been part of the dream project of Madan Paliwal, Chairman, Miraj Group, Udaipur.

The statue is styled in a meditation posture and is said to be visible from several kms away. Special lights have also been arranged for this statue so that it is clearly visible even at night. The story of this statue becoming the world's tallest Shiva statue is also interesting. As per plan in 2012, its height was to be kept till 251 feet. But later during construction, its height reached 351 feet. A stream of the Ganga was added on to the matted locks of the Shiva's statue, after which its height fur-



ther increased to 369 feet.
Elevators, stairs, halls, among others, have also been made in this statue.
Around 3,000 tonnes of steel and iron, 2.5 lakh cubic tonnes of concrete and sand have been used during construction. The statue can withstand wind speed up to 250 km. The beauty of the statue is that 10,000 people can come at a time in the hall built inside it.

L-G SENDS BACK 'RED LIGHT ON GADDI OFF' FILE, ADVISES TO RECONSIDER WITH HIS OBSERVATIONS

elhi Lt. Governor V.K. Saxena has sent the file pertaining to 'Red Light On Gaddi Off' campaign to the Chief Minister with advise to reconsider the proposal in light of observations made by him (LG) on the file and resubmit again.

Underlining the use of Civil Defence Volunteers (CDVs) at extremely polluted traffic intersections and sites, the LG has highlighted that "the basic premise of the campaign which seeks to risk the health of 'few individuals' 'on the assumption' of protecting the 'health of many' is faulty and does not appear to have any parallel in any other civilized metropolitan city."

"Moreover, any effective and sustainable solution to this longstanding problem will involve technological interventions and not ad hoc steps, year after year and in the long run technological solutions need to be found for enforcement of such measures, rather than deploying humans and putting them at risk," he observed.

"It is well documented that though air pollution threatens us all, the poor and marginalized sections of the society bear



greater and disproportionate impact of the pollution, often created by those who are well off. The deployment of volunteers under the proposed campaign seems to reinforce and perpetuate the same inequality, which is unfortunate and in contravention of the basic right to life and equality," the LG noted.

"Outcome of the previous campaigns is not reflected in the proposal and there is no impact assessment report provided to support the effectiveness of the earlier campaigns in improving air quality in the city. lso, the multiple risks posed to the safety and health of the volunteers proposed to be deployed at the traffic cross sections under the campaign, merits seri-

He opined "The people of Delhi who suffer the most due to air pollution, are aware and alert citizens who are conscious of their duties and will undertake any measure on their own, to mitigate such

Underlining the legal tenability of the proposal to allow the engagement of volunteers for the proposed campaign, the LG has instructed to examine it in consultation with the Law Department and Revenue Department. He also noted "The proposal was pending at the level of Hon'ble CM for more than 10 days from October 11 to October 21 and the file was received in my office only on October 21."

statement that LG should not do politics with the lives of people in Delhi, the LG said, "I am constrained to mention that such frivolous behaviour entailing baseless allegations, false accusations and political insinuations, on part of a minister is unbecoming to say the least. That it was done against a Constitutional Authority, solely for political one-upmanship and publicity is extremely improper and unfortunate.

Mumbai: A minor boy was killed and at least two others injured when the portion of a tenement crashed at Govandi in north-east Mumbai, late on Saturday, the BMC Disaster Control said.

Girl's marriage to be governed by Muslim personal law: HC

bserving that a girl's marriage continued to be governed by the Muslim personal law, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has directed the handing over of a minor Muslim girl's custody to her husband.

A bench of Justice Vikas Bahl was hearing a habeas corpus petition by the husband for the release of the wife in the custody of Ashiana Home in Panchkula. The Bench was told that both the petitioner and the detainee belonged to the

TRS releases 'chargesheet' against

Muslim religion.

Seeking the petition's dismissal, the counsel for state said the detainee was minor as her date of birth was March 15, 2006. Justice Bahl observed

that as per the reply and a statement recorded on July 28 before the Judicial Magistrate First Class in Panchkula would show that the detainee had run away from her house, along with the petitioner, out of her own will.

She said her family forcibly engaged her with her maternal uncle, but she performed "nikah" with the petitioner and did not wish

to stay with her family. In fact, she was married to the petitioner and wished to reside with him. "After considering all the aspects, the coordinate Bench of this Court had further observed that in case she wishes to accompany the respondent, she would be entitled to the same. The respondent in the case was a person who had married the Muslim girl more than 15 but below 18 years of age. The law laid down in the judgment would apply to the facts of the present case," Justice Bahl

Teen stabbed to death by 2 juveniles in Delhi

17-year-old teenager has been stabbed to death by two juveniles near his house here in Patel Nagar area, the police said on The deceased has been

identified as Manoj Kumar Negi, a police officer said, adding the two accused have been apprehended.

The gruesome episode was captured in a CCTV camera installed in the area.

In the CCTV footage, two teenagers are seen engaged in a scuffle. After a while, another boy comes -- seems to be carrying something in his hand, comes there, and attacks the victim.

The teenagers later can be seen fleeing while the victim can be seen faltering and taking his mobile phone out of the pocket. But soon he collapses near a bike on the street, and a knife can be seen stuck on his back.

While he was lying in a pool of blood on the streets, people kept watching and passing through the narrow street without helping him, as per the CCTV footage.

A senior police officer said that at 9.22 p.m. on Friday



night, an information was received at Patel Nagar police station about a stabbing incident. Manoj was taken to Sardar Patel hospital where he was declared brought

"On the basis of a statement given by the victim's father, Chandan Singh Negi, a case under section 302 (murder) and 34 (common intention) of the IPC has

been registered," the police official said.

"In his statement, Manoj's father also alleged when he was taking his son to the hospital, Manoj told him that the two juveniles were making comments on his sister and had indulged in eve teasing," said a police officer.

"Manoj had even warned and slapped one juvenile a few days ago. Aggrieved by this act, the accused with the motive to take revenge, stabbed Manoj multiple times with knives on Friday night while he was coming home after attending computer class," said the police officer.

"The accused juveniles have been apprehended and a knife used to commit the crime has also been recovered from their possession."

Police said that till date no complaint has been made by the victim girl or from her family members regarding molestation or sexual harassment at Patel Nagar police

"Further investigation is going on and if any conspiracy on the part of any other person shall be found, legal action shall be taken up accordingly," the police said.

BJP ahead of Munugode bypoll

he Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS) on Saturday released a 'chargesheet' against the BJP for miserably failing the country and for its indifferent attitude towards Telangana.

TRS working president and minister K. T. Rama Rao (KTR) released the chargesheet ahead of the November 3 by-election to Munugode Assembly

The minister lashed out at the BJPled central government for what he called its failed promises and blatant Mentioning a host of contempo-

rary issues in the chargesheet, KTR

came down heavily on the ruling dispensation at the centre. He told reporters that the TRS is filing the chargesheet on behalf of various aggrieved sections of the society. The TRS leader alleged that the BJP

government has not allocated even a single rupee to Telangana in the last eight years. "We are asking for votes by show-

casing the development done in the last eight years and promising what we will do to Munugode if we win. On the contrary, the BJP is resorting to personal abuses and making degrading remarks on our honourable chief minister," KTR said.



The chargesheet has mentioned that the BJP did not get moved by the plight of fluoride victims in Munugode nor they safeguarded the livelihood of weavers. It also speaks about the ruling BJP's gross injustice towards Telangana like dishonouring the reorganisation act promises, and the party's decisions against the interests of Telangana.

The document also highlighted the effect of the skyrocketing prices of daily essentials on the commoners and how Prime Minister Narendra Modi's anti-farmer policies are sounding a death knell for the farm-

The 13-page document also

explains in detail how the central BIP government and some BIP-ruled states cheated the backward classes. It also speaks about how the BJP misled the citizens of the country and how they fooled the youth of the nation and the way they discriminat-

ed against the students of Telangana. KTR said that the BJP has sold the Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) and many navaratna and miniratna companies. He added that the Modi government has tripled the price of cooking gas cylinders thus making life miserable for crores of

The minister went all guns blazing on the BJP for benefitting their 'corporate friends'.

"On one hand, Prime Minister Narendra Modi wrote off corporate loans worth Rs 11.5 lakh crore while on the other, he is terming the welfare schemes given to the poor as freebies and revdis," KTR said.

He pointed out that after the independence, in 67 years, all the PMs have cumulatively made a debt of Rs 55.97 lakh crore while PM Narendra Modi himself made a debt of Rs 110 lakh crore in just 8 years.

KTR has appealed to the voters of Munugode to be aware of the 'jumlas' and 'jhoot' of the BJP and asked the electorate to punish the saffron party in the ensuing bypoll.

Internet & social media platforms now potent toolkit of terrorists: EAM

xternal Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar on Saturday said the internet and social media platforms have turned into potent instruments in the toolkit of terrorists and militant groups for spreading propaganda, radicalisation, and conspiracy theories aimed at destabilising soci-

The Minister was speaking at a special meeting of the **UN Security Council's** Counter-Terrorism Committee

"In recent years, terrorist groups, their ideological fellow-travellers, particularly in open and liberal societies and 'lone wolf' attackers have significantly enhanced their capabilities by gaining



access to these technologies. They use technology and money, and most importantly, the ethos of open societies, to attack freedom, tolerance and progress. Internet and social media platforms have turned into potent instruments in the toolkit of terrorist and militant groups for spreading

propaganda, radicalisation and conspiracy theories aimed at destabilising soci-

Terrorism, he said, remains one of the gravest threats to humanity. The UN Security Council, in the past two decades, has evolved an important architecture, built primarily around the counter terrorism sanctions regime, to combat this menace. This has been very effective in putting those countries on notice that had turned terrorism into a state-

funded enterprise.

"Despite this, the threat of terrorism is only growing and expanding, particularly in Asia and Africa, as successive reports of the 1267 Sanctions Committee Monitoring Reports have highlighted," he added.

'MLAS POACHING' CASE HITS BJP CAMPAIGN IN MUNUGODE BYPOLL

he 'MLAs poaching' case has impacted the BJP's campaign for Munugode Assembly by-election, while the of Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS) is working aggressively to cash in on the alleged attempt by the saffron party to buy its

In an apparent fall-out of the case, the BJP has cancelled the October 31 public meeting which was scheduled to be

addressed by its national president J.P. Nadda The decision came amid the political storm triggered by the alleged attempt by three BJP agents to 'buy' four TRS MLAs. The arrests and leak of sensational audio tapes of the telephonic conversation between the accused and TRS leaders have caused a huge embarrassment to the BJP and put the saffron party on the defensive ahead of the November 3 by-election. After the arrest of three alleged agents of BJP on October 26 from a farmhouse near Hyderabad, the TRS went aggressive in its campaign. The ruling party leaders are targeting the saffron party for the conspiracy to topple the TRS government.



Though the saffron party has denied any link with the aMLAs poaching' case, it is apparent that the episode has rattled the party in the midst of a by-election campaign.

The proposed public meeting to be addressed by Nadda was planned as the highpoint of the BJP campaign and also a counter to the October 30 rally to be addressed by Chief Minister and TRS president K. Chandrasekhar Rao.

The BJP, however, denied that the cancellation of the public meeting had anything to do with the case. Its leaders said the party decided to organise mandal level public meetings instead of a large public meeting. In August this year, the high court had recalled its December 21, 2011 order by virtue of which it had upheld the February 9, 2011 order by the trial court in Shopian district.

The petition filed by the government in 2011 seeking fresh trial of the case or the transfer of the case to Jammu was dismissed by the high court. On March 23, 2003, LeT terrorists had lined up 24 Kashmiri pandits in Nadimarg village and killed them in cold blood.

Terrorists had disarmed the police guards posted for the security of the 11 Pandit families comprising 54 members in the village.

Justice B. Vijaysen Reddy asked the state government and other respondents to file the counter by November 4.

more than 900 international wickets before retiring in 2003, began using cocaine while working as a television expert around the In an interview with the Times, the 56-year

old revealed that he has mentioned about

the addiction in his new autobiography. "The culture of fame in South Asia is all consuming, seductive and corrupting. You can go to 10 parties a night, and some do. And it took its toll on me," Akram was quoted

as saying by BBC.The former left-arm pacer also mentioned about the selfless act of his first wife Huma, who died suddenly in 2009 from a rare fungal infection."Huma's last selfless, unconscious act was curing me of my drug problem. That way of life was over, and I have never looked back," he said. After making his international debut in 1984, Wasim played 104 Tests and 356 one-day internationals for Pakistan, winning the 1992 World Cup. He led Pakistan in 25 Tests and 109 ODIs between 1993 and 2000 and is widely regarded as one of the best bowlers of all

According to Akram, he "developed a dependence on cocaine" while he was travelling away from Huma and their two sons, who were living in Manchester.

"It started innocuously enough when I was

offered a line at a party in England; my use grew steadily more serious, to the point that I felt I needed it to function," the former cricketer further revealed.

The legendary quick sought help after his late wife discovered his drug use, but said he had a bad experience in a rehab facility in Lahore and fell back into the habit during the 2009 Champions Trophy, where he worked as a pundit.Akram said the drugs were "a substitute for the adrenaline rush of competition, which I sorely missed" but Huma's death shortly after that tournament spurred him to quit. He has since remarried and has a young daughter with his second wife.

The former Pakistani cricketer also addressed allegations of match-fixing during his career, again denying any involvement in

STAGE III OF GRAP IMPLEMENTED WITH IMMEDIATE EFFECT ACROSS NCR

Team Absolute New Delhi

he sub-committee for invoking action under the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) of the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) in the National Capital Region (NCR) and Adjoining Areas held an emergency meeting on Saturday to address the deteriorating air quality in the NCR.

While reviewing the overall air quality parameters during the meeting, the Commission noted that due to unfavourable meteorological conditions with slower wind speed and sudden spike in farm fire incidents, it is considered necessary to implement Stage III of GRAP with immediate effect in the entire NCR.

The sub-committee reviewed the air quality scenario in the region and noted that the air quality parameters are likely to dip in the coming days and in an effort to address the AQI of Delhi-NCR, it took the call to invoke all actions as envisaged under Stage III of GRAP -- 'severe' air quality



(AQI ranging between 401 and 450) -- on Saturday with immediate effect in the entire NCR. This is in addition to the restrictive actions mentioned in Stage I and Stage II of GRAP. Various agencies responsible for implementing measures under GRAP and pollution control boards (PCBs) of NCR and DPCC (Delhi Pollution Control

Committee) have also been advised to ensure strict implementation of actions of Stage III under GRAP during this period. The air quality is likely to deteriorate and remain in severe' category from October 31 to November 1 and for the subsequent 6 days, the air quality is likely to fluctuate between 'severe' to 'very poor' category. The winds are forecast to be calm in the coming days and the wind direction is likely to change course frequently.

Further, the CAQM appealed to the citizens of NCR to cooperate in implementing GRAP and follow the steps mentioned in the Citizen Charter under GRAP.

The Commission advised people to choose a cleaner commute -- share a ride to work or use public transport or walk or use cycle. People whose positions allow working from home may work from home, it said.

The CAQM also banned use coal and wood for heating purpose. Individual house owners may provide electric heaters (during winter) to security staff to avoid open burning, it said.

Others who forfeited their security are former NCP ministers like Nawab Malik, presently in jail, Dhananjay Munde, Narhari Zirwal and Eknath Khadse, Congress state President Nana Patole, Vijay Wadettiwar, Balasaheb Thorat, Satej Patil and Sunil Kedar, besides Sena (UBT)'s Bhaskar Jadhav, Anil Parab, Varun Sardesai and MP Sanjay Raut, currently in jail, and MP Kalaben M. Delkar from the Union Territory of

Dadra & Nagar Haveli. In contrast, a trusted aide of Thackeray and MLC Milind Narvekar has been given a 'Y-Plus-Escort' cover, on par with the NCP's Leader of Opposition Ajit Pawar and ex-home minister Dilip Walse-Patil, while

two ex-CMs of Congress Ashok Chavan and Prithviraj Chavan have been provided 'Y Security' cover.

For instance, a young woman was filmed running across the road to dance at a busy intersection in Indore last year. Later, the stunt performed for an Instagram video, landed her in trouble with the police charging her for violating traffic rules. The woman was identified as Shreva

Kalra, who had shared the video on her

ndian shuttler S Sankar Muthusamy Subramanian stormed into the men's singles final at the World Junior Badminton Championships 2022 with a 21-13, 21-15 win over Thailand's Panitchaphon Teeraratsakul in the semifinal, here on Saturday.

With this win, S Sankar became the first Indian badminton player to make the finals of a junior badminton world championships since Siril Verma in 2016. Overall, he became the fourth Indian to reach the Junior World Championships final after Aparna Popat, Saina Nehwal and Siril Verma.

Notably, former world No.

1 Saina remains India's only junior badminton world champion till date, having clinched the women's singles title in 2008.

Despite Teeraratsakul clearly enjoying the height advantage and an extended reach, Subramanian, India's highest-ranked junior men's singles player at world No. 4, looked to take the game to his opponent and score quick points early.

Under heavy pressure, the 17-year-old Indian worked his angles well and made good use of his clever shuttle placement to comfortably bag the first game.

The Thai shuttler tried to infuse extra pace and power in the second game to try and disturb the Indian shuttler's technical style but Sankar did well to keep pace. His consistent returns frustrated the Thai player as he started making unforced errors and often placed his shots outside

the scoring lines. The ploy eventually paid off as the Indian badminton player settled the 40-minute affair in straight games

Vienna Open

Medvedev marches into final with win over Dimitrov

7orld No. 4 Daniil Medvedev marched into the final of the Vienna Open after downing Grigor Dimitrov 6-4, 6-2 in their semifinal clash, here on Saturday.

The 26-year-old came up against a confident opponent striking the ball cleanly but the top seed had all the answers. Just as it had against Jannik Sinner in Friday's quarterfinals, Medvedev's relentless retrieving and precise serving proved the difference as he charged to a 85-minute victory to reach the championship match in Vienna for the first time. Dimitrov had hit his stride en route to the semifinals in Vienna, where he was particularly impressive in taking out third seed Andrey Rublev in the second round. Yet despite hitting 21 winners to



seed's defences frequently enough to gain a strong foothold in the match. As it had in his previous wins against Nikoloz Basilashvili, Dominic Thiem and Sinner this week in Vienna, Medvedev was dialled in on serve against Dimitrov. He won 87 per cent (27/31) of points behind his first delivery to improve his ATP head-to-head series record against the Bulgarian to 4-2.

World No.1 Iga Swiatek to lead Tracy Austin Group

Texas (US): The stage is set for the 2022 WTA Finals, as the groups for the round-robin matches of the prestigious year-ending championships were drawn on Friday in Fort Worth, Texas.

Each singles player or doubles team will face off against all of the other participants in their respective group during the first six days of the tournament. At the end of the round-robin matches, the top two players or teams from each group will

advance to the single-elimination semifinals. World No.1 Iga Swiatek, the winner of eight titles this season including Roland Garros and the US Open, leads the Tracy Austin Group. Austin is a former World No.1 in singles -- the four group names are inspired by four legendary American champions. Swiatek will have a rematch of the Roland Garros final against No.4 seed Coco Gauff during round-robin play. The two youngest players in the field, 21-year-old Swiatek and 18-year-old Gauff, have both landed in the Tracy Austin Group.

Hobart. India had hosted South Africa in seven T20Is in June and September this year, with the Rohit Sharma-led side being 4-3 ahead.

With the bat, India would like for KL Rahul to get amongst the runs before the race to reaching the semifinals heats up. Rahul, who got 51 not out and 57 against South Africa at home in September, would take some inspiration from the

previous good showings ahead of Sunday's clash against the Proteas.

With the bat, India have to be careful and decisive in attacking against the high pace generated by South Africa's tall fast-bowling attack. In the Proteas camp, their batters also have to be wary of the damage India's bowling attack can do. They will bank upon Rilee Rossouw, who got an unbeaten hundred against India in Indore and slammed a magnificent 109 against Bangladesh in their second Super 12 match at Sydney, to lead the charge with the bat, as well as opener-keeper Quinton de Kock. South Africa will also be praying that captain Temba Bavuma gets the big runs, which have eluded him for so long.

With them going to play against Pakistan and Netherlands in the upcoming week, the Proteas have to battle it out for a win on a pacy Perth pitch, while India will back themselves to make it a hat-trick of victories in the tournament at a place where fast bowlers called the shots at the nearby WACA Ground.

"Roston Chase has returned to the squad as an allrounder and we believe his experience and skill set will be beneficial and Shamarh Brooks has also returned to bolster the middle-order batting," added Haynes.

West Indies will play two Tests in Australia under the leadership of Kraigg Brathwaite.



The first Test between these two teams will be played at Perth Stadium (November 30 to December 4) and second Test will be held at the Adelaide Oval (December 8-12), which is a day-night Test match.

The Test squad is expected to assemble in Australia on 10 November. As part of the preparations for the two-match series, the visitors will have a three-day warm-up game against an ACT/NSW XI at the Philip Oval, Canberra from November 17-19.
