AAREY METRO CAR SHED ROW: SC ALLOWS MMRC TO SEEK PERMISSION FOR

DEFORESTATION

“We have arrived at the conclusion that MMRC should be permitted to pursue its application before the tree authority for permission to fell 84 trees for the purposes of the ramp. We clarify that the tree authority would be at liberty to take an independent decision on the application and determine conditions, if any should be imposed.”

The Supreme Court on Tuesday allowed the Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation Ltd (MMRC) to pursue its application before the tree authority for the felling of 84 trees, for the Aarey metro car shed project.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud and comprising justice P.S. Narasimha said 84 trees can be cut subject to permission of tree cutting authority.

The top court modified its status quo order on the felling of trees at Aarey forest in Mumbai for the metro car shed project. The MMRC contended before the 95 percent of the project was over and the remaining part of the project was held up due to these 84 trees.

The bench observed that in such

projects, which involves large outlay of public funds, the court cannot be oblivious of the serious dislocation caused if the public investment goes into the project is disregarded. It further added that the concerns relating to the environment are important, as all development must be sustainable.

The top court was informed that 2,144 trees have already been felled and what remains is the cutting of the trees for the ramp. The bench clarified that it will hear the main petitions at a later stage while disposing of the interlocutory applications.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing MMRC, contended that 95 per cent of the work is over and the original cost of the project

was Rs 23,000 crore.

He said due to the delay caused by the litigation, the cost has increased to Rs 37,000 crore and emphasized that there will be a huge impact on carbon emission going down, and also the traffic on the metro track would be reduced to a large extent.

Mehta pressed that serious prejudice would be caused to the public if due to 84 trees the entire project is stopped and nobody will gain anything, and also the trees will be transported or new trees will be planted.

Senior advocate C.U. Singh, representing activists against felling of trees, said Rs 23,000 crore is the investment for the whole project and not for the car shed and cited committee reports which suggested

Kanjurmarg as a more suitable site for the project in terms of technical feasibility, ability to cater to passenger needs, and impact on environment.

He added that at the metro car shed site, no construction has taken place, except for a pillar.

In November, MMRC moved the Supreme Court to direct the tree authority of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) to decide their plea for permission to cut 84 trees on the 33 hectares plot of the Metro car shed depot land in Aarey Colony.

The apex court had taken suo motu cognisance of the protests against the cutting of trees in the Aarey car shed plot in 2019.

IFFI jury head terms 'The Kashmir Files' as 'vulgar', 'propaganda' film

"I feel totally comfortable to openly share these feelings here with you on this stage. Since, the spirit of the festival can surely also accept a critical discussion, which is essential for art and life," he said. Meanwhile, Vivek

Agnihotri, the director of 'The Kashmir Files', challenged Israeli filmmaker Nadav Lapid to find an event in the movie that is not true.

"Today, I challenge all the intellectuals in this world and this great filmmaker from Israel to find one frame, one dialogue or an event in The Kashmir Files that is not true," Vivek Agnihotri said in a video.

The filmmaker said that if anybody finds a frame that is not true in 'The Kashmir Files', he would stop making movies.

Tanks on streets of China rekindles fears of Tiananmen Square

Several military tanks have rolled through the streets of China as Chinese officials ramp up their crackdown against demonstrators who are protesting against Xi Jinping's disastrous zero-Covid policy, according to a media report.

A video shows a steady stream of tanks trundling through the eastern city of Xuzhou on Monday night, Daily Mail reported.

The footage will rekindle memories of the Tiananmen Square massacre of 1989, when hundreds - if not thousands - of Chinese protesters were killed by soldiers in tanks, the report said.

Xi Jinping's Communist Party officials have ramped up their crackdown on demonstrators, with police officers seen wrestling with protesters before dragging them away.

Footage shows a huge crowd of protesters trying to stop a group of police officers from arresting two men in Hangzhou. But the officers were seen wrestling with the protesters and dragging the two



demonstrators away while holding the scruff of their collars.

While police officers were dragging protesters away on Monday night, military tanks rolled through the streets of Xuzhou.

Locals questioned whether the tanks were heading to Shanghai, but others said it was possible the tanks were merely returning from military manoeuvres.

Hundreds of protesters have taken to the streets since the weekend in protest against China's harsh zero-Covid policy.

They mark the largest anti-government demonstrations China has seen since the Tiananmen Square massacre in 1989, Daily Mail reported.

TATA GROUP TO CONSOLIDATE AIR INDIA AND VISTARA

New Delhi:

The Tata Group on Tuesday announced the consolidation of its airlines, Vistara and Air India. With this consolidation, Air India will be India's leading domestic and international carrier with a combined fleet of 218 aircraft, making it India's largest international carrier and second largest domestic carrier.

Air India, an airline fully owned by Tata Sons, has been the flag carrier of India. Tata Sons, via its fully owned subsidiary, Talace Private Limited (Talace), had acquired 100 per cent stake in Air India on January 27.

Vistara, a 51:49 Joint Venture between Tata Sons and Singapore Airlines Limited ("SIA") was established in 2013 and is India's leading full-service carrier with international operations in the Middle East, Asia and Europe.

Vistara shall be merged with Air India post receipt of requisite approvals. As part of the merger transaction, SIA shall also invest Rs 2,059 crore in Air India. Post the consolidation, SIA shall hold 25.1 per cent shareholding in Air India. XXXXThe transaction is estimated to be completed by March 2024.

After 69 years as a government-owned enterprise, Air India and Air India Express were welcomed back into the Tata group in January 2022. The present management at Air India is driving the five-year transformation roadmap under the aegis of Vihaan.AI to establish itself as a world-class global airline with an Indian heart.



Adani Properties bags Dharavi slum's mega-makeover bid in Mumbai

In a significant development, Adani Group's Adani Properties has offered the highest bid for the ambitious Dharavi redevelopment project in south-central Mumbai, a top official said here on Tuesday.

Adani Properties has offered to invest Rs 5,069 crore, the highest, against two other competitors -- DLF and Shree Naman Developers.

However, the financial bids of only Adani Properties and DLF were opened on Tuesday since the third bidder, Shree Naman Developers, failed to make it in the technical bidding process.

The Commissioner of Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority, S.V.R. Srinivas, said that now it will go for approval from the Maharashtra Government.

The mega-project - intended to change the face of what is dubious as Asia's largest concentrated slum



pocket - was bedevilled by several problems and failed attempts for a makeover in the past over 15 years since it was first mooted.

The entire project, with an estimated timeline of over 15 years, will see construction of over 10 million sq ft in the 520-acre locality with wide roads, residential and commercial areas, schools, hospitals, gardens, playgrounds, and other amenities coming up. Dharavi - literally meaning 'quicksand' - is notorious as the dirty underbelly of Mumbai and houses over a million people crammed in a 2.1 sq km area, with the highest population density in the world.

INDIAN STOCK MARKETS TOUCH NEW HEIGHTS FOR 2ND DAY

Chennai: For the second day in succession, the Indian stock markets flared up with the Sensex of BSE and Nifty of NSE touching record highs on Tuesday. The Sensex of BSE on Tuesday touched a record high of 62,877.73 points after opening at 62,362.08 points and touched a low of 62,362.08 points during the day. The Sensex closed at 62,681.84 points, up by 177.04 points.

On Monday, the Sensex had closed at 62,504.80 points after hitting an all time high of 62,701.40 points.

At the NSE, the Nifty opened 18,552.45 points after previously closing at 18,562.75 points. Then the Nifty rallied up to 18,659.75 points, touched a low of 18,552.15 points and closed at 18,618.05 points.

Continued foreign portfolio investors buying in India has boosted the mainline indices which may continue to do well for the next two months with some intermittent corrections. The Sensex rose 0.28 percent to 62,681.84, while the Nifty rose 0.30 percent intraday to 18,618.05.

PROTEST MARCH TURNS VIOLENT IN PATNA, SEVERAL POLICEMEN INJURED

A protest march by the Pasi community turned violent in Patna after the police did not allow the protestors to go towards the Vidhan Sabha on Tuesday. The protestors claimed that the police is unnecessarily arresting people of their community on the charge of selling tari. They also demanded that the state government remove the ban on tari.

Tari is a drink which is generally consumed by poor people in the rural areas of Bihar. It's effect is similar to liquor and hence it is popular in the rural areas. People of the Pasi community have a traditional business of farming tari from palm trees and earn their livelihood by selling it. After the Bihar government banned liquor in 2016, tari was also put in this category. The state government also banned the sale of raw tari. Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on several occasions, appealed to the people of the Pasi



community to purify it in the form of Nira and then sell it. As liquor is not easily available, the majority of the people in the rural areas drink tari," said a protestor Ravi Kumar.

On Tuesday, people from across the state assembled in Patna for the silent protest. They wanted to gherao (lay siege) to the Vidhan Sabha. When they reached a roundabout near it, the police barricaded the road and did not allow them to move further towards the Vidhan Sabha. This led to a scuffle between the two sides. The protestors who were in large numbers, broke the barricades and advanced towards the Vidhan Sabha.

When the situation seemed to be getting out of control, the police lath-charged the rallyists. The protestors retaliated by pelting stones and bricks at the police. Several policemen were injured in the clash. Some mediapersons were also hurt in the stone pelting.

HYDERABAD COPS TOW AWAY CAR WITH SHARMILA SITTING INSIDE

A car with YSRTP leader Y.S. Sharmila in it was towed away by police here on Tuesday when she was heading towards Chief Minister's official residence to protest the alleged attack by TRS supporters on her padyatra in Warangal district on Monday. The YSR Telangana Party (YSRTP) leader herself was driving the car and proceeding towards Pragathi Bhavan as a mark of protest against the attack by ruling Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS). Police stopped her on the way. As Sharmila refused to get down from the car, the police called a crane which towed away the vehicle with YSRTP leader sitting in it.

Sharmila, who is sister of Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, was arrested and taken to S.R. Nagar Police Station.

After reaching the police station, she refused to get down from the car. Police personnel forcibly opened the car door and whisked her away into the police station. Meanwhile, some YSRTP workers who reached the police station to stage the protest were arrested. A case was registered against her at Panjagutta Police Station. The case booked under Indian Penal Code (IPC) section 353 (assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharge of his duty), section 333 (voluntarily causing grievous hurt to deter public servant from his duty) and section 327 (voluntarily causing hurt to extort property, or to constrain to an illegal act). Meanwhile, Sharmila's mother Y.S. Vijayamma was placed under house arrest by the police as she was leaving for S.R. Nagar Police Station to meet her.



PAKISTAN-CANADA BASED TERRORISTS BEHIND TARGETED KILLINGS IN INDIA, REVEALS NIA PROBE

Smileths of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), who on Tuesday conducted raids at more than 13 locations belonging to gangsters across the country in connection with the terrorist-gangster nexus case, have recovered a number of incriminating documents along with various types of contraband and ammunition.

According to information, the NIA raided more than 13 locations in Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, UT Chandigarh and the Delhi-NCR region.

The districts targeted were Fazilka, Tarn Taran, Ludhiana, Sangrur, Mohali in Punjab, Yamunanagar of Haryana, Sikar in Rajasthan and the Outer North District of Delhi.

"We conducted raids to dismantle and disrupt the emerging nexus between terrorists, gangsters and drug traffickers based in India and abroad," said a NIA official.

This was the third round of raids and searches by the NIA on organised criminal syndicates and networks, top gangsters, their criminal and business



associates based in Punjab, Haryana and Rajasthan and arms suppliers based in Rajasthan and Delhi.

Other gangsters whose houses were raided included Kaushal Chaudhary of Gurugram-Rajasthan, Vishal Maan of Prahallpur-Delhi,

Binny Gurjar of Sangrur-Punjab, Ravi Rajgarh of Ludhiana-Punjab and their associates.

The NIA said that it will continue to dismantle such terror networks as well as their funding and support infrastructure. The official said that

preliminary investigations revealed that these gangs were carrying out targeted killings and were also raising funds for their criminal activities through smuggling of drugs and weapons.

"The recent sensational crimes and extortion calls by criminal syndicates and gangsters to businessmen, professionals, including doctors etc, had created widespread scare among the people. These gangs were using cyber space to publicise these crimes to create terror among the public at large," the NIA said.

The NIA has also learnt during the investigation that such criminal acts were not isolated local incidents but there was a deep rooted conspiracy amongst terrorists, gangsters and drug smuggling cartels and networks, who were operating from both within and outside the country. Many gang leaders and members had fled from India and are operating from foreign countries, including Pakistan, Canada, Malaysia, Australia. Most of these conspiracies were being hatched from inside the jails in different states and were being executed by an organized network of operatives based abroad.

"Do You Have 100 Heads Like Ravan?" Row over Congress Chief's remark on PM

Days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi clapped back at a Congress leader's "aukat" comment, the party's new chief Mallikarjun Kharge has delivered a new controversy for the party, just before the Gujarat election, by targeting the Prime Minister with a "Ravan" reference.

The BJP has accused Kharge of "insulting Gujarat's son" repeatedly. Kharge made the comments while addressing a rally in Ahmedabad ahead of polls next month.

"Modi ji is Prime Minister. Forgetting his work, he keeps campaigning in corporation elections, MLA elections, MP elections, everywhere... All the time he's talking about himself - 'You don't have to see anyone else, just look at Modi and vote'. How many times do we see your face? How many forms do you have? Do you have 100 heads like Ravan?" Kharge said, drawing laughter and applause from his audience.



The Congress chief said in every election, candidates sought votes in the name of PM Modi. "I've been seeing that votes are sought in the name of Modiji, be it municipality elections, corporation elections or state elections... Ask for votes in the name of the candidate. Is Modi going to come and work at the municipality? Is he going to help you in times of your need," the Congress veteran asked.

Amit Malviya, who heads the BJP's IT Cell, shared the video with a sharp comment. "Unable to take the heat of Gujarat election, pushed to the fringe, Congress national

president Mallikarjun Kharge loses control over his words, calls Prime Minister Narendra Modi Ravan. From "Maut ka Saudagar" to "Ravan", Congress continues to insult Gujarat and its son..." Malviya wrote.

The tweet referred to former Congress president Sonia Gandhi's controversial "Maut ka Saudagar (merchant of death)" comment during the 2007 Gujarat election, targeting PM Modi - who was Chief Minister - over the 2002 riots.

Gujarat will vote on December 1 and 5 and the results will be declared on December 8.

Mother-daughter burnt alive in Bihar's Arwal district

Woman and her 7-year-old daughter were burnt alive in Bihar's Arwal district on Monday night.

The accused, Nand Kumar Mahto, had his eye on the woman named Suman Devi (32) and had misbehaved with her several times in the past. On Monday night, under the influence of liquor, he barged into her house and tried to rape her. "The victim resisted and forced him outside the house. Nand Kumar, who failed in the rape attempt, brought petrol, poured it on her house and set it on fire. The accused also locked the door from outside," said an official of Kaler police station.

Suman Devi and her daughter Radhika Kumari were rescued by the villagers and taken to Sadar hospital Arwal. Since their condition was critical, the doctors there referred them to PMCH Patna but they died on the way.

"In a dying statement in Sadar hospital, the



victim revealed her ordeal and the sequence of events. We have registered an FIR against Nand Kumar Mahto and raids are on to nab him", said the police.

The deceased's husband Ajit Paswan was recently arrested for consuming liquor and sent to jail. The accused got a free hand after Ajit was jailed.

KERALA GIRL GANG RAPE

Accused posed as good samaritans, medical test revealed crime in K'taka

The investigations have revealed that the accused in the gang rape case posed as good samaritans and maintained that they gave shelter to the 22-year-old victim in their room when she was unconscious, police said on Tuesday.

Karnataka Police had arrested three friends including a girlfriend of the accused in connection with gang rape of the girl from Kerala in Bengaluru. The arrested persons are identified as Shahabuddin (26) and Akthar (24). The police are yet to give the identity of the female accused.

According to police, the incident took place in the limits of Electronics City police station and came to light lately.

After committing the crime, one of the accused had called his girlfriend to the room where the victim was taken by the accused in an unconscious state. The accused and one of the accused's girlfriends maintained that they rescued her.

They further stated that the victim was given shelter and protection when she went unconscious while riding with the accused bike taxi driver, police said.

The victim believed them and went home. After reaching, she

developed body pain, sickness and went to the doctor. The doctor after diagnosis told her that she had been raped.

The girl had realised that she was gang raped by bike taxi driver and his friend. Later, she lodged a complaint with the Electronics City police station in Bengaluru.

The victim worked as a freelance graphic designer in a company in BTM Layout in Bengaluru. On Thursday night, she had booked a bike taxi to reach her house. Police said that the girl was in an inebriated state when the bike taxi driver arrived on the spot. While travelling towards Neeladrinaragar, she became almost

unconscious. The bike taxi driver took advantage of the situation and took her to his room. Later, the accused called his male friend and both raped her.

When the victim regained consciousness, they acted and pretended that she was in grave danger that night when she went unconscious and they rescued her and gave her shelter, police said.

The victim after coming to know what had happened with her, lodged a complaint with the police. The police arrested the accused including the girlfriend who helped the accused. More details are yet to emerge in the case. Further investigation is on.


Hindu activists detained for giving boycott call against Muslim traders

The Karnataka Police on Tuesday took three Hindu activists into preventive custody for threatening to stage a protest against the decision to allow Muslim traders to do business in the Subramanyeshwara temple in Bengaluru's VV. Puram locality.

The Hanumanthanagar police in Bengaluru detained Punith Kerehalli of Raastha Rakshana Pade and others in a preventive measure.

Chikpet constituency BJP MLA Uday Garudachar said that the Hindu traders could do their business in the vicinity of dargahs and mosques. "The Hindu community people do not trouble others. A few individuals create problems and



raise objections," he said.

He clarified that there would not be any new rules because of the demands put forth by the Hindu activists. The permission was given to people of all religions.

He said, "The old rituals would be followed. Giving opportunities only to the Hindu traders is not tenable. If anyone tries to create problems in the fair, legal action would be initiated against them." "We are elected representatives and get elected after getting votes of people belonging to all religions.

There is no room for discrimination. The tradition which has been followed for years will be carried forward," he said.

U'KHAND: TWO PRADHANS, BDC MEMBER QUIT AFTER BIRTH OF THIRD CHILD

Two pradhans and a BDC member had to resign after the birth of a third child. Representatives with three children are ineligible for the post of pradhan, BDC and are disqualified according to the notification implemented during the 2019 panchayat elections.

In October, the government asked for a list of such seats whose representatives had more than two children, to remove them from their positions.

The village pradhan was elected in the 2019 elections in Selta chapar of Lamgara block in Almora, and had given birth to a third child this year.

She resigned soon after on August 12. In Lal Nagari of Syalde block, the pradhan



resigned as she gave birth to her third child in 2019.

The BDC member elected in 2019 in Dol village of the district, resigned on July 22 after having a third child.

By-elections will be held for the vacant seats.

Gopal Singh Adhikari, DPRO, Almora, said that it was necessary for a representative to resign after the birth of a third child.

In 2021, an Assembly member was removed after the birth of a third child.

With server down, Delhi AIIMS sees high number of incoming patients

The All India Institute of Medical Sciences continued to work on a manual mode seven days after the server was hacked and on Tuesday witnessed a heavy rush of patients.

The number of incoming patients visiting the hospital increased significantly leading to a rush like situation as people trooped in directly after the online appointment service stopped working.

After the hacker's attack on the server system, the standard operating procedures (SOP) issued by the hospital underlined that the admission, discharge and transfer of patients would be done manually at the hospital till E-Hospital was down.

From the online appointment to the sharing of the patients' report was being done manually. It has also led the AIIMS authorities to deploy additional staff to run the OPD services, diagnostics and laboratory works.

After the alleged report of hacker's demand for Rs 200 crore from the AIIMS administration, the hospital on Monday said, "The data restoration and server cleaning is in progress and is taking some time due to the volume of the data and the large number of servers for the hospital services".



"Measures were being taken for cyber security. All hospital services, including Out patients, In patients and the laboratories continue to run on manual mode," AIIMS said in the statement. However, police have denied reports that hackers have asked for Rs 200 crore in cryptocurrency as ransom to restore the system at the AIIMS.

According to a source, the officials from the National Investigation Agency have also visited AIIMS and were working on the case. The AIIMS had said that to restore the digital services and support was being sought from Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In) and National Informatics Centre (NIC).

Love story of five elderly men ends in murder in Bihar's Nalanda

A case of love story involving four elderly men and a 30-year-old widow tea vendor turned ugly when a fifth old person also exhibited interest in the woman which led to his murder.

The sensational case was unearthed in Bihar's Nalanda district on Monday evening when district police arrested the four elderly accused along with the widow.

The deceased was identified as Triptit Sharma (75), a native of Awthawa village. Dr Shibli Noman, the DSP of Nalanda (Sadar) said: "Pino Devi (30), who is a widow, was running a tea stall at Asthawa village and four elderly persons, namely Krishna Nandan Prasad (75), Surya Mani Kumar (60), Banaras Prasad alias Loha Singh (65) and Vasudev Paswan (64) were the regular customers at Pino Devi's tea stall. They used to drink tea every day



at her stall."

The four were attracted towards Pino Devi and they had expressed their feelings to her. They also used to visit her house. All was going well for them till a fifth elderly person, Triptit Sharma (75) also became a regular customer at the tea stall and expressed his love for Pino Devi. Pino Devi accepted his friendly proposal and she would give him priority over

the other four. Soon jealousy crept in and the situation turned to such an extent that they decided to teach Sharma a lesson. Those four elderly persons shared their plan with Pino Devi and asked her to come alongside them. Pino Devi initially hesitated but later she agreed.

As per the plan, Pino Devi invited Triptit Sharma to her house on October 19. When he reached there, the other four elderly lovers were already present there and a verbal argument broke out which soon turned violent and one of them smashed a brick on the head of Triptit Sharma. Sharma fell dead. After committed the murder, the other four smashed his face to hide the identity. The accused took the dead body and disposed of it in a water tank of an under construction building of the district polytechnic college.

The deceased's son Mithu Sharma along with other relatives started searching for him but then filed a

police report. The local police were also searching for him and finally reached the water tank as the foul smell was coming from there. Sharma's body was found there.

"We have registered the FIR of murder against unknown persons and his son or any other relatives have not mentioned the names of any suspects. Triptit has no enmity with anyone. Initially, we were clueless about this case and there was no hint or lead about this case," Noman said.

"Since the murder had happened on October 19 and accused get relaxed as police did not reach them and one month gone by. On Monday, the phone which was kept by Pino Devi, was switched on and the district police immediately found its location. We reached there and arrested her. When we strictly interrogated her, she broke down and revealed the entire sequence of events. Then we also arrested other four accused as well," Noman said.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday said demonetization and the GST rollout by the Centre broke the backbone of the common people, especially small traders. Gandhi was addressing a public meeting in Ujjain after taking the darshan of Lord Mahakal in Ujjain as the Bharat Jodo Yatra led by him continued its onward journey in state. "Demonetisation (implemented in 2016) and GST broke the backbone of the people, especially those doing small businesses," Gandhi said. "I have not done any tapasya (penance) by marching in Bharat Jodo Yatra. Labourers who walked long distances during COVID-19 lockdowns, farmers who are producing food



grains for the people, and small traders are the real 'tapasvis' of the country," he said. Unfortunately, they are not getting their dues whereas only 4-5 industrialists are being benefited, he alleged. "Small shop owners and traders provide employment to a large number of people in the country, but their hard work is not recognized. The money is snatched from their pockets and given in the hands of the 4-5 industrialists," Gandhi said. Referring to the VYAPAM scam, Gandhi said such frauds deprived youths of employment despite studying hard. "Media wanted to show reality to the people but they are unable to do so because their hands are tied," he added. Pradeep Motiani, 26, died on November 13, while Sanjay Giri, 35 years old died on October 29. Mayor-in-Council (MiC) member Rajesh Hingorani said, "Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) is taking all precautions and measures to check mosquitoes borne disease. It is a matter of concern that four dengue deaths have been reported in Bhaingarh."

BJP leads in money power in Gujarat polls

The BJP leads the list of major political parties in Gujarat Assembly polls having the maximum number of 'crorepati (millionaire)' candidates. Moreover, two among the top three candidates with the highest declared assets, contesting in the Gujarat Assembly Elections 2022 are from the BJP. While Jayantibhai Somabhai Patel (BJP) has declared assets worth Rs 661 crore, Balvantsinh Chandansinh Rajput (BJP) has declared assets worth Rs 372 crore. A report by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) showed that the share of crorepati candidates has gone up over the last five years. Out of the 1,621 candidates, 456 (28 per cent) are crorepaties in these polls as against out of 1,815 candidates, 418 (23 per cent) were crorepaties. "The role of money power in our elections is evident from the fact that all major political parties give tickets to wealthy candidates. Among the major parties 154 (85 per cent) out of 182 candidates analysed from the BJP, 142 (79 per cent) out of 179 candidates analysed from the Congress and 68 (38 per cent) out of 181 candidates analysed from AAP have declared assets valued more than Rs 1 crore," said ADR report. Among the major parties, the average assets per candidate for 182 BJP candidates analysed is Rs 16.56 crore, 179 Congress candidates analysed is Rs 7.99 crore, 181 AAP candidates have average assets of Rs 3.68 crore and 26 Bhartiya Tribal Party have average assets worth Rs 21.68 lakhs. The Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and Gujarat Election Watch have analysed the self-sworn affidavits of all 1,621 candidates, who are contesting in the Gujarat Assembly Elections Phase I and II. Out of 1,621 candidates analysed, 476 are from the national parties, 219 are from the state parties, 302 are from

EXODUS IS A POLITICAL WEAPON, BUT KASHMIRI PANDITS HAVE NO VOICE IN POWER PLAY

The Assembly elections, as and when they are held in Jammu and Kashmir, do not have much significance for the beleaguered Kashmiri Pandit community. Their scattered population hardly counts in the vote arithmetic of the now defunct state.

Forced out of Kashmir, the community of over seven lakhs has shrunk to a few lakhs in the Union Territory with a major concentration in Jammu and a nominal presence in Kashmir, the place of their origin. Most of the community members are living in Delhi-NCR, Mumbai, Pune, Bengaluru and other parts of the country and in other countries also. The scattering has totally reduced the community's significance in the political power play.

Before the 1989-1990 terror onslaught, the community had a sizeable presence in pockets of all Kashmir districts with a major concentration in Srinagar. Their leaders were given space in the political set up and were made ministers as well.

The major political parties, the National Conference and the Congress, had good representations from the minority community. Late Pyarelal Handoo was a minister in the Farooq Abdullah government and was an MP in the ninth Lok Sabha.

Khem Lata Wakhlu held important political positions in the National Conference, the Awami National Conference and later in the Congress. She also served as a member of the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly for 12 years and was the state minister of tourism from 1984 to 1986. She was the chairperson of the state's social welfare board with the status of a minister of cabinet rank from 2010 to 2014.

Prior to them, there were stalwarts like D.P. Dhar, who was the

Chairman of Policy Planning in the External Affairs Ministry and played a crucial role in the 1971 India-Pakistan war leading to the creation of Bangladesh.

He was a member of the Jammu and Kashmir State Constituent Assembly from 1951 to 1957 which endorsed Kashmir's accession to India. He was also a member of the state Assembly from 1957 to 1967, and was appointed as cabinet minister.

Makhn Lal Fotedar, who was initiated into the Congress by Jawaharlal Nehru, became a political advisor to Prime Ministers Indira Gandhi and Rajiv Gandhi.

The Kashmiri Pandits had a big say in the Centre and the erstwhile state politics. But all this changed as the terrorists targeted the community in late 1980s which finally led to their exodus. The community fled to Jammu first, and from there they migrated to other parts of the country and world. With the dispersion, the community's political strength also nosedived.

Since their exodus in 1990, Jammu and Kashmir has witnessed elections to Assembly, Parliament, Panchayat and the District Development Council (DDC) as well. In the elections held in the '90s, the community's participation declined both as contestants as well as voters.

Post exodus, only a few Kashmiri Pandits have managed to enter the political arena. Raman Mattoo, an independent candidate who won the elections in 2002, became a minister in the Congress-led PDP coalition government.

Former Vice Chancellor of University of Jammu, Amitabh Mattoo, served as an advisor to late J&K Chief Minister Mufti Muhammad Sayeed till his death and later to Mehbooba Mufti.

Then there is J&K BJP chief Ravinder Raina, who is seen more as a hardcore RSS man from Jammu than a Kashmiri Pandit.

With declining political voice, the



community also laments that since 1990, the Kashmiri Pandits have not been able to exercise their bona fide democratic right to vote as well. The members, who have been living outside the Valley, are registered voters from the constituencies they originated from in Kashmir, but they are unable to vote as they cannot go back to the Valley out of fear.

The Election Commission does have polling booths for the migrants in Jammu or New Delhi, where the Kashmiri Pandits can exercise their franchise. In Jammu, the Jagti camp sees a booth every time there is an election. The residents vote as voters from the constituencies they were registered in Kashmir. This means that they have to vote for a candidate who stays and works in that particular seat in Kashmir. And, he or she who finally wins is least concerned about the voters from who live in Jagti.

The Jagti migrants' camp has around 5,000 families, but they have no say in electoral power politics. Similar is the case with other migrant camps and the community members scattered all over.

In the 2000s, the community again tried to seek its space in the Valley. There are thousands of Kashmiri Pandits who want to return, and in the past decade many have taken up jobs and are living with their families in the Valley. The trend started during the UPA regime under Manmohan Singh when the Centre took a number of steps to create a conducive atmosphere in the Valley for the Kashmiri Pandits.

According to estimates, a few thousand migrant Kashmiri Pandit families, including the employees, are residing in the Valley.

The panchayat elections in 2019 and the DDC polls later saw participation of the community. But the intermittent targeted killings have ensured no major return of Kashmiri Pandits.

The Narendra Modi-led government at the Centre has also failed to come out with a rehabilitation plan, thus leaving the community to its fate.

The younger generation of Kashmiri

Pandits, born after migration, have not been listed as voters in Kashmir. The government and the Election Commission have made no arrangements that could help enlist new voters from the community. This had added to the already dwindling numbers of the Kashmiri Pandit voters.

With no numbers to reckon with as a vote bank, the Kashmiri Pandits have no say in J&K's power politics. Their plight is a weapon for the political parties to whip the sentiments, but beyond that there is no significant plan for making the community an electoral force.

The community, which has scattered in pursuit of jobs and sustenance, has also failed to produce a leadership that could raise its voice on different platforms.

In the absence of electoral strength and lack of internal leadership, Kashmiri Pandits have no say in Kashmir's vote politics.

20 KIDS HOSPITALISED IN JAPAN AFTER SULFUR-LIKE ODOR LEAVES THEM ILL

Tokyo: Twenty children in Japan's Osaka prefecture were hospitalised on Tuesday after a sulfur-like odor at their school left some of them feeling unwell.

The fire department was called shortly after 9 a.m. after the odour in the elementary school in Osaka's Toyonaka City was noticed, Xinhua news reported.

In response to the emergency call, more than 10 ambulances and fire trucks were deployed to the school.

Firefighters entered the building in an attempt to locate the source of the sulfur-like smell, while 20 children aged between seven and 11 were reportedly taken to hospital for checkups as they were feeling ill.

WORLD'S LARGEST VOLCANO IN HAWAII ERUPTS AFTER NEARLY 4 DECADES

The world's largest active volcano, the Mauna Loa in Hawaii, has erupted for the first time in nearly 40 years, authorities said.

The eruption began at Moku'aweoweo, the volcano's summit caldera, at 11.30 p.m. on Sunday, the first since 1984. Xinhua news agency quoted the US National Park Service as saying in an update on Monday.

The volcano's alert level has also been upgraded from an "advisory" to a "warning" -- the highest classification.

The eruption continues at the summit and all vents to the summit area remain restricted.

There is currently no indication of any migration of the eruption into a rift zone, according to the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory.

Lava flows in the summit region are visible from Kona, it added.

At this time, lava flows are con-



tained within the summit area and are not threatening downslope communities, according to the Observatory.

Residents at risk from Mauna Loa lava flows should review preparedness and refer to Hawaii County Civil Defence information for further guidance, said the US Geological Survey (USGS) on Monday.

"Based on past events, the early stages of a Mauna Loa eruption can be very dynamic and the location and advance of lava flows can change rapidly," the agency warned.

If the eruption migrates beyond the walls of the summit caldera, lava flows could "move rapidly downslope", it added.

A series of recent warnings said

that an eruption was possible after a spate of earthquakes in the region, including more than a dozen reported tremors on Sunday.

Mauna Loa, located inside Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, covers half of the US state's Big Island, the BBC reported.

The volcano rises 13,679ft above sea level and spans an area of more than 5,179 sq.km.

According to the USGS, Mauna Loa has erupted 33 times since 1843.

The previous eruption in 1984 sent lava flows within 5 miles of Hilo, the island's most populous town.

Mauna Loa is the world's largest active volcano. There are other larger volcanoes but these are classified as dormant, meaning they have not erupted for a long time, or extinct, meaning they are almost certain not to erupt in future.

The volcano shares the Big Island with Mauna Kea, which is the tallest mountain in the world when measured from its underwater base nearly 20,000ft below the ocean surface.

POLICE CLAMPDOWN IN CHINA AFTER DAYS OF PROTESTS

Beijing: China's protests against Covid restrictions which erupted over the weekend appear to have died down, as authorities begin clamping down, the media reported. A heavy police presence has been reported in several cities, and some gatherings were quelled or failed to materialise, reports the BBC.

Reports have emerged of people being questioned and their phones searched. But overseas Chinese have continued protesting, in at least a dozen cities across the world. The weekend demonstrations, a rare sight in China, had grown after a fire in a high-rise block in Urumqi, western China, killed 10 people on November 24. It is widely believed residents could not escape the blaze because of Covid restrictions, but local authorities have disputed this. As a result, thousands took to the streets for days, demanding an end to Covid lockdowns, with some even making rare calls for President Xi Jinping to stand down, the BBC reported.

But on Monday, planned protests in Beijing did not happen after officers surrounded the assembly point.

In Shanghai, large barriers were erected along the main protest route and police made several arrests.

On Tuesday morning, police could be seen in both cities patrolling areas where some groups on the Telegram social media app had suggested people should gather again. Many also gathered outside Chinese embassies in major cities around the world like London, Paris and Tokyo, and universities in the US and Europe.

15 killed as security forces end 20-hr hotel siege in Mogadishu

Somali security forces have said they have ended a more than 20-hour siege at a popular hotel in the Somali capital, Mogadishu, that left at least 15 people dead including six attackers.

Sadiq Dudishe, Spokesman of the Somali Police Force, on Monday said five of al-Shabab attackers were shot dead, one blew himself up after the militants stormed Villa Rosa Hotel in Mogadishu at 8 p.m. on Sunday.

Dudishe added that eight civilians and one soldier were killed and five were wounded in the attack which has been roundly condemned by the international community, Xinhua news agency reported.

"Sixty people were safely rescued from the hotel," he told a televised news confer-



ence in Mogadishu.

The heavily fortified hotel is a popular hangout spot for senior government officials, including the business community, and three Ministers were inside the facility at the time of the attack, the police said.

It was unclear how the extremists stormed inside the heavily secured hotel which is near the presidential

palace but witnesses said they first heard gunshots at the gates of the hotel before the attackers stormed inside.

Al-Shabab, which has waged nearly two decades of insurgency to topple the internationally-backed government, claimed responsibility for the latest attack, saying its fighters were targeting a gathering of officials inside the hotel.

The latest hotel assault is the third attack by the al-Shabab since the new government took over in May.

The militants in August killed 21 people at Hayat hotel in a siege that lasted for 30 hours and an attack on Tawakal Hotel in the southern city of Kismayo in October where 11 people lost their lives.

The Villa Rosa Hotel attack came hours after the government announced that more than 100 al-Shabab extremists were killed in an operation backed by the international partners in the central region, two days over 60 militants were killed in the southern part of the country.

Al-Shabab extremist group was driven out of Mogadishu in 2011 but it is still capable of conducting attacks, targeting government installations, hotels, restaurants, and public spaces.

Pakistan holds talks with Afghanistan after TTP calls off ceasefire

A high-level delegation headed by Pakistan Minister of State for Foreign Affairs Hina Rabbani Khar is in Kabul to hold talks with Afghanistan's Foreign Minister Amir Khan Mutaqqi as the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) called off their months-long ceasefire, local media reported.

Khar arrived in Kabul on Tuesday on a day-long visit during which she discussed matters of bilateral importance with Amir Khan Mutaqqi focusing on political consultations between the two governments, Geo News reported.

Moreover, the issue of the TTP ceasefire is likely to come under discussion between the two sides.

"Hina Khar will certainly convey the concerns about attacks on Pakistan security forces emanating from Afghanistan, regulating the movement of people to and from trade matters in view of the increased trade. Improved

clearance process and facilities on Afghan side and finally assure the Afghan side of Pakistan's humanitarian assistance," former foreign secretary Jilil Abbas Jilani told The News.

Announcing the end of the ceasefire, the TTP leadership cited the latest military operation against their fighters in the Lakki Marwat district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as a reason.

According to a report published in The News, Pakistani militants had become active in southern parts of KP and particularly in South Waziristan, North Waziristan, Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Tank and Dera Ismail Khan.

The government had to postpone the polio campaign in Lakki Marwat



district on Monday due to frequent attacks by the militants on police and operation launched against them.

Several rounds of talks were held with the Taliban leaders in Afghanistan to find an amicable solution to the years-long armed conflict.

Religious leaders and tribal leaders were also involved and sent to Kabul to persuade the Pakistani Taliban to soften their demands.



ELECTION COMMISSION CALLS BOTH FACTIONS OF SHIV SENA ON DECEMBER 12

The Election Commission will hear the warring factions of the Shiv Sena led by Uddhav Thackeray and Eknath Shinde on December 12, official sources said. They said the symbol dispute of the party has reached the stage of "substantive hearing". December 12 has been set as the date for first personal hearing of the two factions and the required order was issued today. The poll panel has also directed both the groups to submit any further statement or documents by 5 pm, December 9. Earlier this month, the Commission had asked the Shiv Sena factions to submit fresh documents

to back their claim to the party's name and its symbol by November 23. The poll panel had also asked them to exchange the documents, submitted to the poll panel, with each other. In an interim order in October, the Commission had barred the two factions from using the party name or its 'bow and arrow' symbol. Later, it had allotted 'ShivSena - Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray' as the party name for the Thackeray faction, and 'Balasahebanchi Shiv Sena' (Balasaheb's Shiv Sena) as the name for the Eknath Shinde group of the party. The Election Commission had said the interim order will continue "till the final determination of the dispute".



Former MLA Krishna Hegde joins Eknath Shinde faction

In a major setback to Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray), former MLA Krishna Hegde on Monday joined the Eknath Shinde faction. The development comes weeks after Shiv Sena MP Gajanan Kirtikar recently joined the Eknath Shinde camp. Eknath Shinde took oath as the Chief Minister of Maharashtra on June 30 earlier this year. This came after a faction of Shiv Sena under Shinde shifted its alliance to Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) from MVA.

Since then, Maharashtra has been witnessing a tussle between both the factions of Sena as to who is the real inheritor of the legacy of Bal Thackeray. On October 11, The Election Commission of India allotted the 'Two Swords and Shield symbol' to the Eknath Shinde faction of Shiv Sena a day after the group was allotted 'Balasahebanchi Shiv Sena' (Balasaheb's Shiv Sena) as the name for the group of the party. Shinde faction had submitted 'shining sun', 'shield and sword' and 'Peepul tree' as its election symbol options to the Election Commission

(EC) for the upcoming bypoll in Andheri East assembly constituency next month. Whereas the 'flaming torch' (mashaal) election symbol was allotted to the Uddhav Thackeray faction of Shiv Sena, rejecting their claim to the 'Trishul' citing religious connotation. The Election Commission also allotted 'Shiv Sena - Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray' as the party name for the Thackeray faction. Meanwhile, the ECI rejected 'Trishul' and 'Gada' (mace) as election symbols claimed by the two factions of the Shiv Sena, citing their religious connotation.



Police takes underworld don Chhota Shakeel's relative Salim Fruit's custody

The Anti extortion cell (AEC) of the Mumbai Police on Tuesday said that it has arrested Underworld gangster and Dawood Ibrahim's close aide Chhota Shakeel's relative Salim Fruit in a fresh case of land grabbing. The police said a family based in South Africa had filed a complaint saying that their property in the Umerkhadi area of South Mumbai was allegedly grabbed by preparing fake documents. A case under relevant sections of the IPC was registered by the Economic Offence Wing of the city police and it was later transferred to the AEC. Initial investigations revealed the involvement of five people including Salim Fruit in the matter following which the police arrested the suspects, an official said. The police said the complainant had said that his property which is worth over Rs 25 crore was grabbed by making fake documents. The property was originally owned by his father. "Salim Fruit was lodged in jail. He had been arrested by the NIA in a previous case. With the court's permission, we have taken him into our custody and he is arrested in the matter," said DCP Prashant Kadam. The police said the arrested suspects were produced before a court that sent them to police custody. Further investigations into the matter are going on.

MMRDA completes 58m-long FOB linking 2 metro lines in 15 days

The MMRDA has constructed a 58-metre-long foot over bridge linking the Mumbai Metro 1 and Mumbai Metro 7 lines in a record 15 days, a top official said here on Tuesday. The project linking the two lines at Western Express Highway Station and Gundavali stations, respectively, is part of the project to integrate the Mumbai Metro network, said Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority Commissioner S.V.R. Srinivas. The new FOB is 58 metres long, 4-8 metres wide superstructure which was built in just two weeks, and will help commuters interchange between the two lines with ease, said Srinivas. The FOB structure has used around 340 tonnes of steel including reinforcement

and structural steel and it involved clearing several hurdles including shifting public utility lines from the site. The MMRDA head said that the Gundavali Metro Station junction is a very congested one and the new FOB will provide people hassle-free interchangeable connectivity between the Lines 1 (Versova-Andheri-Ghatkopar) and 7 (Dahisar East-Andheri East). At the same time, the infrastructural works on the second phase of Metro-7 and Metro 2A (Dahisar-DN Nagar) are completed and after the inspection by the Commissioner of Metro Rail Safety, shall be fully opened to Mumbaikars, said Srinivas. The phase one operations of both these lines started in April 2022, while the trial runs for the second phase have been going on since the past nearly three months, officials said.

Measles Outbreak: 11 New Cases, One Suspected Death

Mumbai has reported 11 fresh measles cases and one suspected death amid the outbreak of the viral infection in the city, a civic official said. With the latest cases, the infection tally in the metropolis so far this year has gone up to 303. The number of confirmed deaths from measles stands at eight and the suspected fatalities are three, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation official said on Monday. The civic body in a statement said Mumbai will inoculate 1,34,833 children in the age group of nine months to five years. They will receive the additional dose (special dose) in 33 health posts from December 1. "A total of 3,496 children in the age group of six to nine months in 13 health posts, where measles cases in the age group of less than nine months have been reported, will also be given an additional dose of Measles-Rubella vaccine," the statement said. The BMC has surveyed 53,66,144 houses so far and 4,062 cases of fever with rash have been found, it said. One death reported on Monday was of an unimmunised one-year-old girl residing in Andheri in the western part of the city, the statement said. "It was a known case of congenital heart disease (ventricular septal defect and patent ductus arteriosus) and until two weeks back, the patient was admitted at a private hospital for treatment of the condition. She was admitted in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) of Kasturba Hospital here on Saturday with fever, rash and difficulty in breathing," the civic body said. Her condition deteriorated and she passed away at 1.30 pm, with the cause of death being cited as acute respiratory failure, measles with bronchopneumonia in a case of ventricular septal defect with patent ductus arteriosus, the civic statement said.

'THE KASHMIR FILES' ROW

SANJAY RAUT BACKS IFFI JURY CHIEF NADAV LAPID

Terming 'The Kashmir Files' as a propaganda by one party against another, Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut came out in defence of the International Film Festival of India (IFFI) jury chief Nadav Lapid who slammed the Vivek Agnihotri film, here on Tuesday. "This is true about 'The Kashmir Files'... It was propaganda by one party against another... The maximum number of killings in Kashmir have taken place after this film. Kashmiri Pandits and security personnel were killed... But, a party and the government were busy with publicity," said Raut to mediapersons. He asked where "The Kashmir Files" people were when the killings were going on in Kashmir, with even the children of Kashmiri Pandits launching an agitation.




"Nobody stepped forward then... and there were no plans for a 'Kashmir Files 2.0' then... Let them make it," said Raut. The Sena (UBT) leader's comments came a day after the 53rd IFFI-2022 jury head Lapid lashed out at the inclusion of 'The Kashmir Files' in the list labelling it as "a vulgar, propaganda film, inappropriate for an artistic, competitive section of such a prestigious film festival".

The Israeli film-maker also observed at the closing ceremony in Goa how the jury was "disturbed and shocked" that the film was screened at the festival, inciting a row in different circles. Lapid's comments attracted condemnation from the Israel Ambassador to India, Naor Gilon while a Delhi-based lawyer Vineet Jindal has lodged a complaint seeking action in the matter.

As storm rages over 'The Kashmir Files', 'X' on his luggage upsets Vivek Agnihotri

Mumbai: Vivek Agnihotri, whose film 'The Kashmir Files' is in the middle of controversy triggered by the Israeli film-maker and jury chairman of the International Film Festival of India (IFFI), Nadav Lapid, has slammed the Union Minister for Civil Aviation and Steel, Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, after he discovered that his luggage was marked with an 'X' at the Mumbai airport. The director took to Twitter and shared his concern with the minister, saying, "Dear @JM_Scindia ji, Please stop this pathetic system of marking bags at Mumbai airport with an 'X' made with chalk." He then added that how this practice projects India in a bad light globally as filers from all over the world see their luggage on the conveyor belt marked with an 'X'. Agnihotri tweeted that this was "very bad etiquette" and showed India as a "primitive and uncivilised country spe-



cially when PM @narendramodi is talking about making India a global leader". What 'The Kashmir Files' helmer may not have known is that cross-marking luggage at airports is a worldwide practice because all bags are X-rayed by Customs authorities before they are released into the conveyor belts. Usually, heavier-than-usual bags are singled out because the authorities may suspect that they have dutiable items that have not been declared by the persons to whom the bag belong.

PET KICKED, DOG WALKER BEATEN FOR REFUSING TO ALIGHT ELEVATOR IN SOCIETY

A 24-year-old dog walker was allegedly beaten up and a pet dog was kicked for refusing to exit an elevator of a housing society in Sakinaka, the police said on Tuesday, reported the PTI. According to a police official, the incident took place at Arum housing society in Nahar Amrit Shakti area of Sakinaka on Monday night when the victim, Sunil Rathod was using the elevator to come to the ground floor to take a dog for a walk. "When the elevator reached 9th floor, a woman asked him to exit the elevator, as she was allergic," an official said. He added, the victim refused to alight and reached the building's lobby. Soon the woman's husband and a security guard allegedly followed him to the parking lot and started swearing at him. After slapping him twice, the accused snatched a stick from Rathod's hands and started beating him with it. He also kicked the dog twice, the official said. He later approached the Sakinaka police station and a non-cognisable report (NCR) under sections 323 (voluntarily causing hurt) and 504 (intentionally insulting) of the Indian Penal was filed against the suspects, he said.



BJP leaders spar over proposed hospital in Belapur

Two BJP leaders from Navi Mumbai are in a face-off over a proposed hospital and medical college in Belapur. One of them has been pushing for the hospital and has alleged that the other is behind the protest against the hospital. Belapur BJP MLA Manda Mhatre has been following up on the proposed hospital, for which the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMCC) has chosen a land in sector 15 A, which is used as a playground. Villagers and local sports people have asked the NMCC to find another plot. "The local MLA is being unfair to the villagers and project affected people. We villagers lost our lands when they developed the city. Now they are forcing us to lose our playground, too," said Prakash Keni of Diva Koliwada. Mhatre said, "This protest is politically motivated. Former minister Ganesh Naik is backing it. The city needs a super-specialty hospital. The

City and Industrial Development Corporation (CIDCO) has suggested this plot. One needs at least 7 acres of land to construct a hospital and medical college. This land fulfills the criteria. Both authorities are ready to give another piece of land to villagers for a playground." Naik did not respond to calls and messages. In the 2014 Assembly election, Mhatre defeated Ganesh Naik. He joined BJP before the 2019 assembly election. Now he is an MLA from the Airoli constituency. According to sources, the political dispute between Mhatre and Naik in Navi Mumbai is old. Sources said even when they were in NCP they had disputes. They still don't get along well. BJP Mahamantri of Navi Mumbai Vijay Ghatge said, "There is no dispute between the two MLAs about the hospital. Mhatre has been following up on it but the proposed land was chosen by the authority. Not Mhatre. Naik has demanded the villagers get a playground. The demands of both MLAs are in the interest of the citizens and the city."

SBI Govandi suburban branch in Mumbai changes weekly off to Friday

In a move that has raised eyebrows in some quarters, the public sector State Bank of India's Govandi Branch is understood to have changed its weekly off from Sundays to Fridays, with effect from December 1. A notice to the effect went up outside the branch premises this week and the move is purportedly intended to facilitate the local minority population living in and around Govandi, a north-eastern suburb. Despite repeated attempts, top SBI officials were not available for their comments on the potentially controversial decision, ostensibly taken at the local levels. As per the notice, come December 1, the SBI Govandi Branch will remain shut on



all Fridays, and the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month. From Sunday to Thursday, the business hours will be normal -- from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. daily -- as stated in the notice.

Apprehensions were expressed in some quarters that even the SBI Millenium Branch in Dadar would follow suit, but branch officials on Tuesday outright dismissed the claims.

Incidentally, branches of certain other banks in the city and some other parts of the country also provide a Sunday half-day working -- which is compensated by all Saturdays off, in view of local people's convenience. The Govandi SBI Branch move has elicited strong reactions on social media with objections to the Friday closure to cater to "the demands of the local demographics", and called for regional coordination for uniformity in the concerned areas. Banking circles pointed out that in the digital era, when most banking functions are conducted online, "there's little meaning to weekly offs or public holidays" as the bank operations continue irrespective of the calendar dates.



PORTUGAL JOINS BRAZIL, FRANCE INTO KNOCKOUTS STAGE OF WORLD CUP

A brace from Bruno Fernandes helped Portugal to a 2-0 win over Uruguay and a place in the knockout stage of the FIFA World Cup.

On Monday, in the last match of the day at Lusail Stadium in Qatar, Portugal's second successive win took them to six points and to the top of the Group H standings leaving Uruguay, Ghana and South Korea to fight for the second qualification spot from the group.

Portugal joins Brazil and France, the other two teams which have made it to the knockout stage so far. Portugal started well on the ball, enjoying the lion's share of possession but Uruguay fashioned the best chance. Rodrigo Bentancur worked his way brilliantly through Portugal's defence but squandering the game's best chance in the 33rd minute, firing straight at Diogo Costa from a one-on-one situation.

S.KOREA STILL HOPES; IFS AND BUTS IN TALKS

Doha: By losing to Ghana 3-2 in their second Group H match of the FIFA World Cup on Monday, South Korea dug themselves into a hole -- though it's not deep enough that they won't be able to get out of it. South Korea will not be able to control their own destiny when they take on Portugal for their final Group H match on Friday at Education City Stadium in Al Rayyan, west of Doha. The first part of the equation is straightforward. South Korea must win Friday. And then, if Uruguay beat Ghana that same

evening, South Korea and Uruguay will end up tied at four points and a tiebreaker will come in to play, while Ghana will finish in last place. In this scenario, South Korea's margin of victory must be bigger than Uruguay's. If South Korea win and Ghana win Friday, South Korea will be sent home, with Portugal and Ghana moving on to the round of 16 at six points apiece. A tiebreaker will be necessary to determine the top seed. In case of a South Korean win and a Ghana-Uruguay draw, South Korea and Ghana will be dead-

locked at four points, with Uruguay finishing last with two points.

Ghana currently hold a slight edge in goal difference at 0 to -1. But in the next tiebreak category, goals scored, Ghana enjoy a substantial lead at 5-2.

It will be a tall order for South Korea to score more than three goals against Portugal.

The Group H runners-up will face the Group G winners in the round of 16, and at the moment, World No. 1 Brazil are in a prime position to win Group G.
