Argentina Beat France 4-2 on Penalties

ionel Messi shines as Argentina beat France 4-2 on penalties to win World Cup.

Argentina won the World Cup on Sunday after beating defending champions France 4-2 on penalties, following a dramatic 3-3 draw after extra time. Argentina keeper Emiliano Martinez saved Kingsley Coman's penalty and Aurelien Tchouameni fired wide to give Argentina their first world title since 1986, and third overall

France had come from two goals down to level over 90 minutes with Kylian Mbappe netting twice in two minutes, including an 80thminute penalty. The France striker completed his hattrick in the 118th with another spot-kick after Argentina's Lionel Messi had tapped in for a 3-2 lead in the 109th. Argentina had gone 2-0 up in the first half with Messi, making a record-breaking 26th World Cup appearance, converting a 23rd-minute penalty. They struck again with a sublime



four-pass counter-attack as Alexis Mac Allister's cutback found Angel Di Maria and

he finished well. Argentina star Lionel Messi became the first player in the history of the FIFA World Cup history to score a goal in every knock-out match of the edition.

UGC prepares ground for Bachelor's exams in 12 Indian languages

nationwide change will take place in the higher education system, especially in undergraduate courses as language will cease to be a barrier in BA, B.Com, and B.Sc courses. Students will be able to graduate in their mother tongue.

In view of the same, preparations have begun to make the course books available in languages like Bengali, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Odia, Tamil and Telugu among others.

The University Grants Commission (UGC), under an initiative by the Union Ministry of Education, is engaging with publishers to translate English textbooks to various Indian languages.

Along with these, representatives of Oxford University Press, Orient Blackswan and Elsevier also participated in the high-level meeting. The UGC recently held discussions with representatives of Wiley India, Springer Nature, Taylor & Francis, Cambridge University Press India, Cengage India and McGraw Hill, India on bringing out undergraduate English textbooks in Indian lan-

UGC, as a part of NEP 2020, is working towards getting the most popular textbooks translated for UG programs in higher education institutions across the country in the 12 Indian languages.

UGC Chairman Professor M. Jagadesh Kumar said that the Commission will act as a nodal agency to provide help and support to the publishers with regard to identification of textbooks, translation tools and editing experts so that the books can be made affordable in the digital format.

He added that the Commission will proceed further in two ways, wherein popular textbooks of the programs will be identified and translated and simultaneously, Indian authors will be encouraged to write the textbooks in Indian languages for non-technical subjects.

Kumar was all praise for the publishers who participated in the mission and said that the Commission intends to get several books translated within six to twelve months, for which it has constituted an apex committee to prepare a road map and work towards the goal.Kumar said that the focus will be on the translation of existing textbooks which will later be extended to postgraduate programs.

MAN KILLED STEP-DAUGHTER FOR TALKING OVER PHONE AT NIGHT

Hyderahad: In a shocking inci dent, a man in Hyderabad killed his step-daughter as he was angry with her for talking to someone on mobile phone at night.

The incident occurred at Bakaram under the limits of Musheerabad police station on Saturday night. After strangulating Yasmeen Unnisa (17) to death, Mohammed Sadiq, an autorickshaw driver, went to the police station and surrendered. The accused told police that his daughter used to be engaged on mobile phone till late in the night and despite his warnings she did not mend her way. On Saturday night, he scolded her and in a fit of rage, throttled her to death.

Yasmeen was alone at the house. The victim's mother Raheem Unnisa is said to be employed abroad. Yasmeen was one of the two daughters of Raheem Unnisa from her first husband. After his death, she married Sadiq and later went to Dubai for a job. Police have registered a case and took up investigation.

Google removes thousands of YouTube channels in China

oogle removed thousands of YouTube channels last month. including 7,599 channels, 1 AdSense account, and 3 Blogger blogs as part of its ongoing investigation into coordinated influence operations linked to China.

These YouTube channels and blogs mostly uploaded spammy content in Chinese about music, entertainment, and lifestyle.

"A very small subset uploaded content in Chinese and English about China and US foreign affairs," said the company.The company also terminated 3 YouTube channels that shared sensational content in Chinese that was about the war in Ukraine and relations between mainland China and Taiwan.

The company also terminated 515 YouTube channels



as part of its investigation into coordinated influence operations linked to Azerbaijan and 57 YouTube channels in Brazil.

"We terminated 1 AdSense account and blocked 1 domain from eligibility to appear on Google News surfaces as part of our investigation into coordinated influence operations linked to China," said Google.

Google-owned YouTube said last month it removed over 1.7 million videos in India for violating its Community Guidelines in its third quarter (Q3) report.

In the same period, the streaming platform removed over 5.6 million videos globally for violating its community guidelines. According to the Community Guidelines Enforcement report, more than 94 per cent of these videos were first flagged by machines rather than humans.



2,000 HEPATITIS C CASES IN UP VILLAGE, LOCALS SAY GROUNDWATER CONTAMINATION HIGH

Shamli (Uttar Pradesh) Agencies

ore than 2,000 people have been reported to be suffering from Hepatitis C in a village in Shamli district due to contamination in the groundwater.A lake in the Maamour village in Shamli district has subjected the people to slow poisoning since Kairana's effluent is directed towards this water body.

The contamination has adversely affected the groundwater too, and the Maamour village (population of 2,500) is the worst affected. Villagers claim that around a dozen people have died in the past one year due to this. Two brothers, Noor and Salman died due

to Hepatitis C last month. Hepatitis C and cancer cases are on the rise along with skin-related diseases. Villagers claimed that the groundwater has been con-

taminated up to about 250 feet in the village. Farmer Rajiv Chauhan said, "The lake is spreading cancer and jaundice here. About 500 people in the village are suffering from

black jaundice and the lake is continuously increasing in size. Over a thousand bighas of farmers' land has

already been submerged. We get drinking water from a place 3 km away.

According to the health department, around 2,100 Hepatitis C patients have emerged in the past one year, and most of

these are from the Kairana region. District Magistrate (Shamli), Jasjit Kaur, said, "A water treatment plant is being constructed at a cost of about Rs 38 crore under the Namami Gange scheme to dispose of the contaminated water of Maamour lake. We are preparing an action plan on an ATM-based RO water plant to provide pure drinking water

Fake currency worth Rs 137cr seized in 3 yrs, most are Rs 2000 notes notes in 2019 were seized.

ake currency notes, with face value of crores of rupees are being caught every year, indicating an increase in their circulation in the country. This creates trouble for the common people and poses a big challenge for the government and the police.

According to sources, police and other security forces have seized fake currency worth the face value of Rs 137 crore in the last three years. The seized counterfeit new notes of Rs 2000 are also amount to crores in face value. Fake currency is mostly traded or smuggled from Pakistan and is sent to India across the border among other routes, sources said. The Border Security Force (BSF) and the police forces have been successful in seizing such notes to an extent, but a lot still remains to be done. The Central government claimed to curb fake cur-

rency by demonetisation, whereas statistics reveal a starkly different reality. According to data provided by the Union Home Ministry, fake notes of face value Rs 137,96,17,270 crore were caught from 2019 to 2021.As many as 3,10,066 lakh fake notes were seized in 2021, whose face value was Rs 20,39,27,660 crore.

A total of 8,34,947 lakh fake notes with face value of Rs 92,17,80,480 crore were confiscated in 2020, apart from 2,87,404 lakh fake notes of face value Rs 25.39.09.130 crore in 2019.

According to the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), fake currency of the denominations of Rs 2000 and Rs 500 were seized in large amounts in the last three years

In 2021, the face value of seized fake notes of the Rs 2000 denomination was Rs 4,84,78,000 crore, while the seized notes of Rs 500 had face value of Rs 12,57,99,000 crore.

As many as 2,44,834 lakh notes of Rs 2000 in 2020 and 90,566,000

Apart from this, fake notes of Rs 500 denomination have also been seized in lakhs from across the country over the years. The MHA apprised that the figures did not indicate any specific pattern regarding the circulation of Fake Indian Currency Notes (FICN).

The government claimed that the intelligence and security agencies of the Central and state governments had been keeping a keen eye on the elements involved in the spread of FICN and took action against reported violations. Several steps are being taken by the MHA to thwart the same. According to the government, an FICN Coordination group had been constituted by the Home Ministry for sharing information among the security agencies of the state and Centre to combat the problem.A Terror Funding and Fake Currency (TFFC) Cell has been constituted in the National Investigation

Agency (NIA) to conduct focused investigation of terror financing and fake currency cases. The government claimed to have strengthened the international border security by deploying additional men for round-the-clock surveillance, by setting up surveillance posts along the border, erecting fences and intensive patrolling. An MoU has been signed between India and Bangladesh to prevent and combat smuggling and circulation of counterfeit currency notes, while training programmes have been organised for state police officers as well as those of Nepal and Bangladesh to make them aware about the problem.

The Reserve Bank of India has prepared a strategy to curb counterfeit notes, reportedly taking various measures, including raising security standards on bank notes, to make counterfeiting difficult and costly and organising awareness programmes for the public.

CRISIS DEEPENS IN TELANGANA CONGRESS, 13 LEADERS QUIT PARTY POSTS

he crisis in the Congress Telangana unit deepened on Sunday with 13 leaders, who had defected to the party from the TDP in the past, announcing their resignations from party posts.

Narender Reddy, Seethakka, Vijay Rama Rao, Erra Shekhar, and others said they would send their resignations to Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) Working President.

This came a day after some senior leaders announced the launching of "save Congress in Telangana" movement to protect the party from leaders who came from other parties. They called a battle between the original Congress and migrants from the Telugu Desam Party (TDP).

This was seen as an open revolt against state chief A. Revanth Reddy, who came to the Congress from the TDP a few years ago. Meanwhile, the Revanth Reddy group is planning to counter the allegations made by senior leaders, who were unhappy with him over packing recently announced party executive with migrants from

The group wants to highlight that the allegations made by the dissidents will weaken the organisation.



In another development, the central leadership of the party has taken a serious view of the happenings in the state unit. AICC in charge Secretaries are reported to be in touch with dissident leaders. Some central leaders are likely to meet the dissident group on Monday. Senior party leaders, who have

been in the party from the start of their respective political careers, on Saturday declared that they are launching a 'Save Congress in Telangana' movement to protect the party from what they described as a leader who came into the Congress after shifting loyalties from party to

The meeting of the senior leaders was held at the residence of Congress Legislature Party leader Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka. Former state President N. Uttam Kumar Reddy, MLA T. Jagga Reddy, Madhu Yashki Goud. Damodar Rajnarasimha, and A. Maheshwar Reddy were among those

Advocates booked for assaulting 176 UP secondary schools may face derecognition

he UP Madhyamik Shiksha Parishad (UP Board) issued show-cause notices to 176 secondary schools over complaints of mass copying. These schools may lose their affiliation if their replies are

Divyakant Shukla, secretary of UP Board, has sent a list of the 176 schools to the district inspectors of schools (DIoS), so that these schools are not made centres for the 2023 board examinations.

The UP Board received complaints of copying in these schools during the board and internal examinations. The board has already de-recognized 20 of the 176 schools.

The maximum numbers of schools, 27, are from the Azamgarh division while four are in the Prayagraj division. Shukla said, "These schools have been served show-cause notices for anomalies in the previous exams.



The board will follow the set procedure to formally de-recognise these schools in due course of time, as we issued notices to them. At the same time, we have also forwarded the list to DIoS concerned, so that these schools are not made exam centres

for Classes 10 and 12 board exams in

2023." The cases and replies of the schools will be placed before the UP Board's recognition committee and its recommendations would be sent to the state government for clearance before the recognition is withdrawn.

Officials said that in many cases, reports have also been sought from

the DIoS concerned and the divisional joint director of education (secondary) of the area.

There are some schools for which recommendations were made for withdrawal of recognition, right at the level of DIoS as well as the joint director of education. Strict action of withdrawal of recognition may also be taken against schools guilty of aiding mass copying during exams last year.

Four schools of Prayagraj, too, are facing withdrawal of recognition. Show-cause notices have been issued to New Children School, at Sindhi Tola in Shankargarh, and its case has been referred to the recognition granting committee of the UP Board.

A report has also been sought from the joint director of education in the case of Shri Bachai Singh Singraur Inter College at Chandrasen and UD Memorial Inter College at Asrawe Kalan. Action against Pancham Lal Ashram Inter College of Gayasuddinpur in Transport Nagar, Dhumanganj, is also underway.

Three children hit by speeding car in Delhi

AYODHYA TO HAVE UNIFORM COLOUR CODE

o give it a distinct identity, the temple town of Ayodhya will soon have a uniform colour coding for various establishments. The Ayodhya Development Authority is finalising the scheme of colours to be used in buildings of different nature.

There will be a dedicated colour each for commercial, residential, religious and historical buildings.

The colour of the temples leading to Ram Janmabhoomi site will be saffron. There will be a uniformity of colour in different buildings and pavements in their vicinity. Ayodhya Development Authority vice-chairman Vishal Singh said, "There will be different types of colour choices for commercial, residential, religious and for the buildings of archaeological importance. We are yet to finalise which shades of colours to be painted on which type of buildings. However, the colour of the



temples leading to the Ram Janmabhoomi site will be saffron." According to the sources, other than the temples on the Ram Mandir way, all the private buildings - from Saadatganj area of the Faizabad city to the banks of Saryu - will also have the same

Besides, agencies involved in

the construction of the grand Ram temple are taking special cognisance of the security of Ram Janmabhoomi complex. A double-layer security wall with a 50metre foundation will ensure permanent security for the temple, said Anil Mishra, member of Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust.

After Mumbai ban, dance bar girls moved to Goa, now face local ire

ance bar culture, which was banned in Mumbai-Maharashtra in the year 2005, has spread its wings in in Goa.

Facing nuisance, BJP leaders in the coastal belt from North Goa are up in arms against it, claiming that it is tarnishing the image of the Along with Goa's BJP MLA Michael Lobo,

sarpanch Joseph Sequeira from Calangute constituency, in North Goa, has demanded state police to act against the mushrooming of dance bars in their area, claiming they are being operated illegally.

These elected representatives have also submitted a letter to the state government and the Director General of Police, demanding action. Sources informed that not only in Calangute, but whereever there is good footfall of domestic tourists, these dance bars are being operated by availing licence meant for 'restaurant'.

BJP leader Joseph Sequeira said, that around 16 illegal dance bars are operating in his panchayat jurisdiction.

"We have not permitted anyone to operate dance bars, licences are issued only for restaurants. There is no provision to issue a licence for a dance bar, hence the restaurant licence is being used for illegal purposes," Sequeira said.



'No sooner had the dance bars been banned in Mumbai, they looked at Goa as an opportunity to spread this concept here. My village name is getting spoilt for this illegal trade. This should be stopped. Our elected representatives (MLAs) should discuss this issue in the Assembly session and put a ban on it," Sequeira added.

According to Sequeira, he has served notices to all the 16 dance bars.

'We have sought a reply from them and have told them to remove all banners and hoardings (mentioning as dance bars) from the village. We will take further action," he said.

He said that there will be no impact on

tourism activities if these dance bars are banned. "There will be absolutely no effect on tourism business," he said, adding that they are conducting surprise checks.

According to local MLA Michael Lobo, because of these dance bars, touts have become active, who cheat tourists visiting the

"I am confident that the police will take action. Earlier, there were 700 to 800 touts. But after my appeal to the Chief Minister, the police acted and now only 200 to 250 touts are there, who operate during night time," Lobo claimed. Lobo said that tourists visiting the

state should get safety. "We need to send a message to the world that tourists are safe here. Illegal things should be stopped. Panchayat has given liecnces for restaurants, but they convert them into dance bars. It is totally illegal. I had stopped this earli-

er, but again it has started," he said. "Last time, the panchayat and the Planning Development Area (PDA) had taken action against these dance bars and they were demolished. But again they have been constructed and now 12 to 13 dance bars are established," Lobo said. In the past few days, he claimed that numerous incidents of touts have been reported, who cheated tourists of large amounts of money by making false promises.

ACADEMIC PRESSURE DRIVING UP ANXIETY DISORDERS, MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

n August 31, Rahul Binggumalla, a student of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Hyderabad, was found hanging in his hostel room and the police investigation revealed that the second year MTech student killed himself due to placement and thesis pressure.

It was not an isolated incident. Hyderabad and other parts of Telangana and the neighbouring Andhra Pradesh have reported many such incidents in recent times.

Rahul's case highlights the pressure of studies at the educational institutions and how some students succumb to it.

A native of Kurnool district in Andhra Pradesh, Rahul wrote in the suicide note that the institute should not force students to complete the thesis. "If he is exhausted, he will do more research on suicide and ultimately his research will succeed. Because of this, I did smoking and drinking to come out of the pressure but I could not," he wrote in the note which police retrieved from his laptop.

In 2019, IIT-Hyderabad saw three suicides and in all the cases, students cited academic pressure, peer-pressure and depression as reasons for taking the extreme step.

M. Anirudh, a third-year mechanical and aerospace engineering student, ended his life in January.

Mark Andrew Charles, a second year masters student and a native of Varanasi district in Uttar Pradesh, hanged himself in July. He was depressed over poor academic performance. He wrote in the suicide that he felt the world does not treat well those who do not succeed

Pichikala Siddharth, a third-year student of computer science, died by suicide in October. The 20-year-old jumped off the third floor of the hospital building. Before taking the extreme step, he sent emails to his friends stating that he lags in studies and is afraid of failure in making a career.

Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, known for several leading educational institutions and also best coaching centers to train students for country's top professional courses, account for a large number of students' suicides in the country.

Data collated from the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) shows that more than 3,600 students committed suicide in



Stress of study and peer pressure are stated to be the cause of a large number of suicides. Charan Teja Koganti, consultant psychia-

trist, KIMS Hospitals, Kondapur, said that these days a lot of students are coming to him with anxiety disorders, depression and panic attacks due to academic pressure.

"Unfortunately these cases are only increasing with each year. According to data by NRCB , nearly 12,526 students in India committed suicide between 2019-2021. This pressure is not just with academics but also often related to physical appearance, body image issues, cyberbullying, performance in extracurricular activities, social interactions, cultural standards, friendship or any romantic relationships," Charan Teja said.

He continued: "Today, students live in a super competitive world where everyone is trying to be perfect or excellent to achieve success in life. This adversely affects the ways students view success. Students who perform poorly in academics often receive harsh criticism and are subject to constant comparisons by family, teachers and friends.

"Parental pressure was once the main cause but since the pandemic I see a shift where parents are little relaxed about academics and are more concerned about the overall personality development of their children.

"But students have self-induced pressure and constantly compare themselves with their fellow students sometimes even with a

stranger on social media. Also schools enroll students in way too many programs at such an early age and it's difficult for some students to cope with.'

Silpi Sahoo, chairperson, SAI International Education Group, said that it is sad to see the degree of pressure put on children for marks. "NEP 2020 emphasises on raising the happiness quotient in children so that we can raise a happy country in future. At school level, we should not standardise the learning approach as it leads to loss of creativity, boredom and lack of concentration.

"It is important therefore to have tailor made instructions to meet the needs of children and develop an interest in learning at school and at home. We need to engage wellness counsellors at schools to have regular interactions with children as well as parents.

Anitha Rayirala, Consultant Psychiatrist, Amor Hospital, Hyderabad, said: "The fear of exams, absence of proper preparations and planning, comparisons with others, pressure from teachers and more importantly from parents, fear of failure, anxiety and depression due to inability to cope up will drive the students to commit suicide.

Advising students to just work hard and not obsess over results, Rayirala recommended a strategy for students to destress: "Proper planning and preparation, proper revision,

taking breaks in between, good

food, sleeping well, listening to music will decrease the stress." Charan Teja underlines the importance of teaching about warning signs of depression, stress and anxiety to students as a part of mental health education in school curriculum. "We should train students about dealing with failure, coping skills and other skills which can prepare them for life's challenges. Train the parents, wardens and teachers to recognise warning signs of suicide in any affected student and get professional help immediately," he said.

Jini Gopinath, clinical psychologist at YourDost, one of the leading mental wellness platforms, cited a recent study which shows that 56 per cent of millennial reported good mental health levels while 44 per cent are dealing with a variety of mental health chal-

"It is most certain that there has been a rise, simply because Gen Z mostly looks for quick fixes and wishes things to change instantly. When they understand that their call for help is not heard, these patterns become more prominent," Gopinath said. He pointed out that suicide rates among primary and high school students are the highest.

A recent NCERT study conducted in 2022, states that 3.8 lakh students across the country have also identified frequent mood swings as an area of concern across grades, gender and types of schools. As many as 81 per cent of the respondents reported academics as their cause of anxiety. Gopinath continued, "Most of the people in this generation are smart and when all toppers come together, the problem that arises is the newness of what it means to compromise. Pressure builds and the students make sure they go to all extent to emerge becoming the first rank holder. Among them, those who do not make it among the top rankers end up having issues of under confidence, and negative thinking patterns, and are open to major risks.'

He added: "Gen Z is also vulnerable as they live in virtual space, which means they are open to multiple triggers. Their dependence on social space is more, and feelings of aloofness and loneliness started focusing on these individuals' lives. This also resulted in social disengagement where they preferred being their person with their own set of recreational

N.KOREA FIRES 2 BALLISTIC MISSILES INTO EAST SEA: S.KOREA

orth Korea fired two ballistic missiles into the East Sea, the South Korean military said on Sunday, the latest in a

Korean Peninsula. The Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said that it detected the launches from the Tongchang-ri area, North Pyongan Province, between 11:13 a.m. and 12:05 p.m. It did not provide other details, Yonhap News Agency reported.

"While strengthening our monitoring and surveillance activities, our military is maintaining a full readiness posture in close cooperation with the United States," the JCS said in a text message sent to reporters.

The launch came a month after the North fired an intercontinental ballistic missile thought to be capable of reaching the whole of the continental US. The previous day, the North commemorated the 11th anniversary of the death of Kim Jong-il, the former leader and father of current leader Kim Jong-un.

The latest saber-rattling could be Pyongyang's reaction to last week's passage of a UN resolution calling for global efforts to improve human rights conditions in the North, observers said.



On Friday, Japan's Cabinet also endorsed a key security document that embraced "counterstrike capability" that would pave the way for the country to launch a counterattack should it and its ally, the US, come under attack, possibly from the North

SEVEN DIE IN FIRE AT HOUSE

Manila: Seven people were killed after a fire broke out at a two-level house in the Philippine canital on Sunda ing. Firefighter Eugene Briones said the fire broke out around 9 a.m. local time in Muntinlupa City and was extinguished 23 minutes later, Xinhua News Agency reported, Citing an initial investigation, Briones said a family of 10 was living in the house. He said firefighters are looking for three others who were reported missing. It was not sure whether they were out of the house or not

when the fire broke out. Briones added that the victims were probably asleep when the fire broke out and failed to escape. An investigation is underway to determine what caused the fire.

Paekdu in Samjiyon to map out plans for

"If Kim had skipped Saturday's event North Korean people would have a hard time accepting that," Hong added. "But if he had indeed visited Mt. Paekdu, which is considered sacred, then the people would understand it as a trip to lay the foundation for a turning point."

On December 6, South Korean government sources said the draft for the country's defence white paper, to be published in January, includes an expression referring to North Korea and its military as an enemy for Seoul. The word had last been used to describe North Korea in South Korea's defense white paper in 2016. Meari, a North Korean propaganda outlet, took exception to the move on Sunday, saying it revealed South Korea's true intentions for confrontations. Another propaganda site, Uriminjokkiri, said South Korea will push inter-Korean affairs to the brink if it goes ahead with plans to publish a report on North Korean human rights.

1 KILLED, 26 INJURED AS **OIL TANKER CATCHES** FIRE IN AFGHANISTAN

Kabul: One person was killed and 26 others were injured as an oil tanker caught fire inside a tunnel in Afghanistan's Parwan

province. "The gruesome incident took place inside Salang tunnel around 09:00 p.m. local time Saturday and rescue team has shifted one dead and 26 injured to nearby hospitals," provincial administration spokesman Hekmatullah Shamim told Xinhua.

Salang Tunnel with 3,000 meters above the sea connects Afghanistan's capital Kabul to the northern eight provinces and the accident has caused traffic suspension for a while, Xinhua News Agency reported quoting

Shamim also noted that the fire had been extinguished and rescue operation goes on to see if there were anymore victim left in the area.

Six Indians charged in multimillion-dollar tech scam in US, Canada

ive Indian men and a woman have been charged in connection with a transnational technical support scam that targeted more than 20,000 victims, many of them elderly, in the US and Canada.

Gagan Lamba, and Harshad Madaan, from New Delhi; Jayant Bhatia, from Ontario, Canada, and Vikash Gupta, from Faridabad, were charged with conspiracy to commit wire fraud, computer fraud, and substantive violations of wire fraud and computer fraud, US Attorney Philip R Sellinger said.

Lamba, Madaan, Bhatia, and a fifth defendant, Kulwinder Singh, of Richmond Hill, New York, are also charged with conspiracy to commit money laundering, money laundering, and engaging in monetary transactions in property derived from specified unlawful activity.

The sixth defendant, Meghna Kumar of Edison, New Jersey, pleaded guilty last week to information charging her with engaging in monetary transactions in property derived from specified unlawful activity, based on her role in the scheme.

Sellinger said that the scamsters frequently targeted senior citizens and scared them into paying for unnecessary and useless computer repair services. According to documents filed in this case and



statements made in the court, the defendants and others were members of a criminal fraud ring that operated a technical support fraud scheme in the US, India, and Canada from 2012 through November 2022. The scheme targeted victims across the US and Canada, including New Jersey, many of whom were elderly, the press statement read. The primary objective was to trick victims into believing that their personal computers were infected with a virus or malware and then convince the victims to pay hundreds or thousands of dollars to the fraud ring for phony computer repair services.

Over the course of the conspiracy, the fraud

ring generated more than \$10 million in proceeds from at least 20,000 victims.

The fraud ring caused fraudulent pop-up windows to appear on victims' personal computers. The pop-ups were designed, at times, to "freeze" the victims' computers, which prevented the victims from using or accessing files on their computers. Sometimes the pop-ups warned victims to not shut down their computers.

In reality, the pop-ups were a hoax, designed to trick the victims into believing that their computers were infected with viruses that did not actually exist. Victims who called the technical support phone numbers appearing on the pop-ups were connected to one or more call centres in India associated with the fraud ring.

The Indian authorities had arrested Madaan on December 14, and Gupta a day after on local charges for their involvement in the tech support scheme. While Lamba remains at large, Bhatia was arrested by Canadian authorities pursuant to a provisional arrest request from the United States, the Department of Justice release noted. Singh, who was arrested at his home in New York, made his initial appearance on December 14 before US Magistrate Judge Michael A Hammer in Newark federal court and was released on \$100,000 unsecured bond.

Foxconn removes Covid restrictions at main iPhone factory

pple iPhone supplier Foxconn has lifted Covid-19 restrictions at its primary iPhone factory in China, which will allow employees to move around again freely.

According to Bloomberg, it means that the company's "point-to-point" system will be eliminated, which prohibits workers from going between their dorms and the factory campus, reports AppleInsider.

Additionally, Foxconn has reopened its on-site cafeterias and has stopped offering free meals. From December 16 to December 31, the company will pay regular workers 15 yuan per day but meal expenses will be deducted from their pay.

However, Foxconn will continue to provide Covid patients who choose to stay in accommodations provided by the company with free meals, the report said.



"Foxconn will now need to address the potential increase in sickened staff and a possible shortage of workers," said Will Wong, senior research manager, International Data Corporation.

"More initiatives will need to be taken to appease staff, other than financial compensation," Wong added.

Meanwhile, last month, it was reported that Foxconn required 1,00,000 new workers to get back to full capacity, but due to a shortage of quarantine space, it had frozen the hiring.

Congress promises farm loan waiver revival in state comeback bid

The Congress in Madhya Pradesh has promised that if it is voted to power in the state assembly polls next year, it would reintroduce the farm loan waiver scheme that it had brought after forming a government in 2018. The party's state unit president and former chief minister Kamal Nath made this announcement last evening when he also said that the farm loan of every farmer in the state would have been cleared by now if his government was at the helm.

Ahead of the last assembly polls, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had promised to implement a farm loan waiver scheme in the state if the party came to power.

The party delivered on its promise as Kamal Nath signed the file for waiving loans of up to ? 2 lakh soon after taking oath as the chief minister in December 2018. It is widely believed that the grand old party's promise of farm loan waiver was one of the major factors behind its victory. Sharing the order of the loan waiver scheme issued on December 17, 2018, the day he took oath as Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister, Nath said in a tweet, "On this day, the order for loan waiver of the farmers of the state was issued. Had the democratically elected Congress government been in power now, the loan of each and every farmer of the



Nath assured that the loan of farmers would be waived if Congress returns to power in the state. "There is nothing to worry about. As soon as the Congress government is formed next year, this order will be issued again and the loan of each and every farmer brother will be waived," he said in another tweet. The BJP-led government in state with much fanfare became the first in the country to introduce an MBBS course in Hindi medium, but two months later it has no information on the number of first-year MBBS students who have opted for Hindi.

For instance, in Gandhi Medical College (GMC) in Bhopal where Hindi medium MBBS course was supposed to start as an experiment, there are a total 250 students in the first year, however, there is no system to identify the numbers who have opted for Hindi medium.

"The system of opting for a medium of language for students is yet to come. Those willing to study in Hindi, will have translated books. We are also planning to provide separate classes for those who want to study in Hindi medium," said Dr Arvind Roy, Dean of GMC.On the lack of a system to identify the number of students opting their medium of study in Hindi, doctors in GMC itself put varied



questions -- as to how to figure out how many students are taught MBBS syllabus in Hindi? Also, if there are language opting systems for students, then how will the exams be conducted?

To justify the system, the college administration, however, said: "Syllabus will be the same for all students, and it is up to the students to decide whether to write answers in Hindi or English." To this, Dr Roy added: "See, the system (Hindi medium MBBS) has been introduced aiming to encourage Hindi medium students or those who are weak in English. It is to ensure that language should not be a barrier. It is just a beginning and the system will be upgraded as per the needs of the students."

A doctor, who is also a senior professor in GMC, said that only a few books of first year's syllabus have been translated from English to Hindi and presenting that as "MBBS is in Hindi" will be unjust.

"I believe that at least medical students would not do it. Students, even those doing MBBS courses in Hindi, should improve their English otherwise they will face problems. Because, it is totally a research-based study and the entire research and books are in English," said a professor, requesting

VYAPAM SCAM PROBE EXPECTED TO LEAD TO BJP LEADERS, EX-MINISTERS

The political temperature in Madhya Pradesh is expected to rise over the probe into the Professional Examination Board (Vyapam) scam which is expected to affect many BJP leaders and former ministers.

The Vyapam scam has been in the limelight since the last decade with the death of more than 50 people linked to it and more than 2,000 being jailed. The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) along with the Special Task Force (STF) has been probing the mat-

Many leaders associated with the Congress, the BJP and the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) have come under the scanner in this case. Leaders of both the political parties, along with former minister Lakshmikant Sharma and two office-



bearers of the RSS have been jailed in the case. In the complaint given by former Chief Minister and Rajya Sabha member Digvijaya Singh on October 6, 2014, the STF had registered a case against eight students enrolled in the medical college. It took around eight years for the STF to register the case which has raised questions on the timing of the FIRs. Singh, in his complaint said that in the examinations conducted by Vyapam after 2006, people colluded with its officials, MP government ministers and senior BJP leaders to get financial benefits. He added that the scam was perpetrated with the direct and indirect connivance of the leaders. Singh's complaint states that possibilities of fraudulent admission existed with some students' residential

address being identical, with cases of students passing Classes 10 and 12 from the Uttar Pradesh Board and their MP domicile certificate being doubtful.

Along with this, differences were also observed in the photo affixed to the exam form and in the one affixed during seat allotment. The probe revealed that the accused students made imposters sit in the exams of 2008-09 and procured admission in Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal, through the same.

It is being speculated that many BJP leaders and the names of those holding influential posts will also come up in the probe. Political analysts believe that the complaint registered before the assembly elections to be held in 2024, will be used for political gains. The content of the FIR has raised apprehensions of its large impact on the state's politics.

4 killed in dumper truck accident, driver arrested

our men were killed and two others injured after they were hit by a speeding dumper truck in Chhindwara district of Madhya Pradesh, police said on Sunday.

The accident took place in Chandangaon area close to Chhindwara city late Saturday night, they said, adding that the condition of one of the injured persons was critical.

"The dumper truck hit two motorcycles and a pedestrian before ramming into a road divider. Three persons died on the spot while another one succumbed to the injuries at a hospital where he was admitted," Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Sanjeev Uikey

At the time of the accident, three persons were going on one motorcycle and two others on another, he said.



"The two injured men were admitted to a hospital and the condition of one of them is critical," he added. The victims, all residents of Chhindwara, were in the age group of 20 to 35, the ASP said, adding that their bodies were sent for post-mortem.

The driver of the dumper has been arrested and charged for rash driving. The vehicle has also been impounded, Uikey said.

ELDERLY COUPLE DIES AFTER THEIR HUT CATCHES FIRE IN NARMADAPURAM

Narmadapuram: An elderly couple was burnt to death after their hut caught fire in Narmadapuram district of Madhya Pradesh, police said on Sunday. The incident occurred at Kharkali village under Bankhedi police station limits during the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday when the victims were asleep, an official said.

Barkhedi Police Station in-charge Shrinath Jharwade said, "Some villagers said that post-midnight, they saw that the hut was on fire, following which they tried to douse the flames." But after the blaze was extinguished, the victims - a 65-yearold man and his 62-yrold wife - were found dead at the spot, he said. A case was registered and further investigation is underway, he said.

Three killed, 10 injured after two buses collide on Yamuna Expressway

A t least three people died and ten others were injured after a collision between two buses on the Yamuna Expressway in Uttar Pradesh's Greater Noida Sunday morning.

A senior police officer said they got a PCR call at about 5.30 a.m. about the accident.

One bus was going towards Delhi from Uttar Pradesh's Pratapgarh while the second bus was on its way to Anand Vihar Terminal in Delhi from Madhya Pradesh's Shivpuri.

"Both the bus drivers lost their control over the vehicles and they collided. A police team was sent to the spot after receiving the call. All the injured were rushed to Greater Noida's Yatharth Hospital and district government hospital where three of them succumbed during the course of treatment. Ten others were undergoing treatment," the police officer

The police said that they have impounded both the vehicles. A case of rash and negligent driving has been lodged in this respect at Police Station Knowledge Park.

Amid rising demand to ban the film in theatres, the issue is likely to be discussed in the upcoming winter session of the Assembly scheduled to commence from today.

The controversy around Pathaan' was triggered after state Home Minister Narottam Mishra objected to a song from the film titled Besharam Rang', claiming that it hurt religious sentiments of the Hindu community. Mishra said the way the colours saffron and green have been used in the costumes used in the song is objectionable.

Assembly Speaker Girish Gautam went one step further and asked Shah Rukh Khan if he would dare to watch his movie 'Pathaan' along with his daughter.

"Will he (Shah Rukh) dare to watch film with his daughter? I am asking Shah Rukh Khan, your daughter is 23-24 years old, watch your movie with her," Gautam said on Saturday. With the five-day winter season set to begin on Monday, the issue is likely to be raised by the BJP on the floor of the House. Besides the BJP and other right wing groups, some Congress members and several Muslim organisations have also demanded a ban on the release of 'Pathaan'.

Meanwhile, some other politicians are of the view that boycotting the film will not be



the right step. Congress Rajya Sabha MP Vivek Tankha has come forward in support of the movie, saying he doesn't support boycotting something as it is an anti-social process.

"No matter you like the film or not, it is for the censor board to decide if a movie should be released. If anyone has any problem, he/she should bring it to the notice of the censor board. The censor board will see if there are any objectionable scenes and suggest to delete them accordingly," Tankha said.He said that if people start making personal comments against the artistes of a film, there is no end to it and it is also not good for the image of the country or the society.



"The office-bearers of the children's commission recently carried out surprise inspections of such illegallyrun madrassas. They found that 30-40 children were kept without a healthy environment. There was an insufficient arrangement for food. I fear it may be a case of human trafficking," Thakur had alleged.



uldeep Yadav, Axar Patel and Mohammed Siraj took out the remaining four wickets as India took 50 minutes on day five to defeat Bangladesh by 188 runs in the first Test at Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium on Sunday.

For India, left-arm spinner Axar took four wickets in the fourth innings, while Kuldeep picked three scalps, followed by Umesh Yadav, Mohammed Siraj, and Ravichandran Ashwin taking a wicket each. The win also boosts India's prospect of reaching a second successive World Test Championship

final, going past Sri Lanka to



be third in the table with 55.77 points percentage.

There were multiple heroes for India, starting from fifties by Cheteshwar Pujara, Shreyas Iyer and Ashwin, along with Kuldeep's 40 taking the first innings total to 404 after being 48/3 at one point. Siraj burst through Bangladesh top-order in the first innings, while Kuldeep took a five-for to bowl them out for 150. With a massive 254-run lead, India chose not to follow-on and batted again, with Pujara and Shubman Gill notching up respective centuries to give Bangladesh a target of 513.

Bangladesh's openers had a 124-run stand with debutant Zakir Hasan registering his maiden Test century. But India's bowlers, who had to toil hard on a slow-turning track which had some turn and bounce, fought back post lunch on day four to seal the victory.


