Upcoming spell of cold wave extreme, never seen temperature go this low: Expert



▶ THE INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT ON THURSDAY PREDICTED THAT THE COLD WAVE CONDITIONS WERE VERY LIKELY IN ISOLATED POCKETS OVER PUNJAB, HARYANA, CHANDIGARH AND DELHI AND RAJASTHAN DURING JANUARY 15TH-17TH. HOWEVER, A WEATHER EXPERT SAID THAT THE UPCOMING SPELL OF COLD WAVE IN INDIA FROM JANUARY 14-19 WAS GOING TO BE EXTREME 2023.

The national capital and the adjoining NCR have reeled under a cold wave over the past week with temperatures dipping to as low as 1.9 degree Celsius. "Don't know how to put this up but upcoming spell of Coldwave in India look really extreme during 14-19th January 2023 with peak on 16-18th. Never seen temperature ensemble going this low in a prediction model so far in my

career," tweeted Navdeep Dahiya, founder LiveWxIndia.

"Also to note this is a historic run so far in 11 days of Jan with the next few days look really cold, January 2023 can be historically coldest - maybe for the 21st century so far," he said in another tweet.

Talking to reporter, he said that the upcoming cold wave will be like freezing. States like Punjab, Rajasthan and some pockets of Haryana will see the temperature dipping below to -4 degree Celsius, while the capital city may witness

1 degree Celsius. Meanwhile, the IMD has said that due to the continuation of prevailing light winds and high moisture near the surface over the Indo-Gangetic plains, dense to very dense fog is likely in isolated pockets during night and morning hours over Uttar Pradesh and Bihar during the next five days. The dense fog is likely to prevail in isolated pockets during night and morning hours over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Assam and Meghalaya and Tripura during the next 24 hours.

10 COUNTRIES WILL SOON LET NRIS MAKE UPI PAYMENTS

The NPCI (National Payments Corporation of India) has recently declared that Non-Resident Indians (NRIs) with bank accounts in India, but with international mobile numbers, can now make UPI payments.

The organisation which manages UPI payments and developments stated in a circular that account holders with international mobile numbers from 10 countries will be able to conduct transactions. The NPCI has instructed UPI participants like Paytm, Google Pay and others to implement the necessary changes by April 30. However, the UPI system will initially be accessible to individuals with NRE-NRO accounts and international mobile numbers from only certain countries. As of now, NRIs from 10 countries can make use of UPI. Talking about the initiative, NPCI said, "All the members are hereby advised to comply with the above directives by 30th April 2023." Additionally, NPCI has stated that all standard onboarding and transaction level checks outlined in current UPI guidelines will apply to these accounts. UPI was introduced in India in August 2016 by the NPCI.

RETAIL INFLATION FALLS TO 1-YEAR LOW OF 5.72% IN DEC, FACTORY OUTPUT RISES TO 7% IN NOV



New Delhi: Retail inflation for December 2022 fell to a year's low of 5.72 per cent, mainly due to low food prices, especially those of fruits and vegetables. This is the second consecutive month when it has remained within the RBI's tolerance band of 2 per cent to 6 per cent. The consumer price index (CPI) based inflation was at 5.88 per cent in November 2022, according to data released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation on Thursday. In October 2022, it was at a higher band of 6.77 per cent. Food inflation stood at 4.19 per cent in December 2022, lesser than 4.67 per cent level of November 2022, as per the official data. Apart from fruits and vegetables, prices of oils and fats as well as meat and fish also fell in December 2022 compared to November 2022. Meanwhile, factory output, which is measured in terms of index of industrial production (IIP), rose 7.1 per cent in November 2022 as against 4 per cent in October 2022, government data

After Joshimath, cracks in Karnaprayag houses trigger panic

After Joshimath, now cracks have appeared in several houses in Karnaprayag of Uttarakhand's Chamoli district, forcing at least 70 families to leave their houses. Cracks in houses in Bahuguna Nagar of Karnaprayag Municipality triggered panic among the locals, after which the civic body sought help from Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami. Apart from Bahuguna Nagar, several houses in Upper Bazar ward of the town are also at risk. Meanwhile, a team of district administration inspected the affected areas in the town on Wednesday. Tehsildar Surendra Dev said that the administration had inspected the areas earlier also and had identified 27 unsafe buildings. Along with this, geological survey and major remediation plan were recommended.

A team of IIT Roorkee has surveyed the areas twice, and the report of the same is awaited, he added. The official also said that unsafe structures will be identified and they will be evacuated. The report of Wednesday's inspection will be sent to DM and further action will be taken accordingly, Dev said.



AMIT SHAH HOLDS MEETING ON JOSHIMATH CRISIS

New Delhi: Union Home Minister Amit Shah called a meeting on Thursday over the Joshimath crisis. Union Ministers Nitin Gadkari, RK Singh, Bhupendra Yadav, Gajendra Shekhawat along with senior officers were present at the meeting. Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla, BRO and NDRF officials also participated. Shah had sought information about the situation in the holy city in a telephonic conversation with Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Wednesday, and provided assurances of help. The Home Ministry and Amit Shah have been closely monitoring the Joshimath situation.

Army relocates Troops from Joshimath

New Delhi: India has relocated some troops from areas surrounding the sinking Himalayan town of Joshimath that's near the Line of Actual Control or LAC with China, Army Chief Manoj Pande said. "25 to 28 buildings of the army have developed minor cracks and the soldiers have been temporarily relocated," the Army chief said. If needed, said General Pande, the troops would be permanently relocated to Auli, he said. "We remain prepared to relocate more units if required, but our operational preparedness remains intact," General Pande said in an annual address. "There has been no impact on our readiness."

SECURITY BREACH AT HUBBALLI ROADSHOW AS YOUTH ATTEMPTS GARLANDING PM

Hubballi: An enthusiastic youth in his eagerness to hand over a garland to the Prime Minister, ended up causing a security scare here on Thursday. The security breach took place during the Prime Minister's roadshow.



Security personnel sprang into action and pulled the young man away. PM Modi who is in Hubballi to inaugurate the National Youth Festival, participated in the roadshow ahead of the function. People in large numbers had lined the route and accorded the Prime Minister a rousing welcome.

EX- UNION MINISTER SHARAD YADAV PASSES AWAY

New Delhi: Former Union Minister Sharad Yadav passed away at 75. Former Union Minister and Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Sharad Yadav has passed away at the age of 75 years old on Thursday night. He was suffering from health-related ailments. The information of Yadav's demise has been confirmed by his daughter through a Facebook post. Yadav, who was one of the top socialist leaders of the Hindi belt, had started his political career during the anti-emergency movement of the mid 1970s.



Over 70 lakh weddings likely in next six months, expenditure estimated at Rs 13L crore

As per estimates drawn by the Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT), around 70 lakh weddings will be solemnised all over the country during this period with a massive flow of about Rs 13 lakh crore by way of wedding purchases and utilisation of various marriage-related services.

- The wedding season will begin from January 15 and continue till June 27. This time, there are 53 auspicious dates for marriage.
- It is estimated that in Delhi alone, more than 7 lakh weddings will be solemnised with an estimated expenditure of about Rs 1.25 lakh crore.
- During November-December last year, 32 lakh marriages were solemnised all over the country with an expenditure of Rs 3.75 lakh crore.

The trading community across the country is in an upbeat mood and hoping for much better business prospects as the next phase of wedding season commences on January 15. CAIT national president

B.C. Bhartia and secretary general Praveen Khandelwal informed that in the coming marriage season, about 10 lakh weddings will have an estimated expenditure of Rs 3 lakh per wedding, in about 10 lakh marriages, the expenditure per wedding will be around Rs 5 lakh, 15 lakh

weddings will cost Rs 10 lakh per marriage, 10 lakh weddings will have an expenditure of Rs 15 lakh each, 10 lakh marriages will cost Rs 25 lakh per wedding, 10 lakh wedding will cost Rs 35 lakh per marriage, 3 lakh marriages will have Rs 50 lakh expenditure per wedding, while 2 lakh marriages will each have an expense of Rs 1 crore or more. CAIT said that in view of the good business prospects during the wedding season, traders from across the country have made elaborate preparations, as they want to continue the sentiments emanated from the record business figures of last year's wedding season.

Your mobile calls may turn pricey in 2023

Mobile phone users are likely to shell out more for their calls with the service providers likely to increase their rates for 4G services, said BNP Paribas Securities in a sectoral report. According to the report, the telecom operators would also look to lift their average revenue per user (ARPU) from 5G subscribers by offering them larger data quota at a lower cost/GB. "For CY23, we expect double-digit revenue growth to continue for the industry, with the consolidation trend continuing," BNP Paribas said. "The 5G handsets remain expensive, and we will watch out for the introduction of a cheaper 5G device by Jio," it notes. "Delays in fundraising and its inability to invest in 5G could further erode VIL's (Vodafone Idea Ltd) competitive position among postpaid customers. Airtel appears well positioned to benefit from this, in our view. This, on the other hand, remains an overhang for Indus Towers. Airtel is yet to collect 75 per cent of its Rs 210 billion rights issue, which it is set

to collect in two tranches. We believe one of the tranches could potentially be collected in 2023," the report said. According to BNP Paribas, the capex in 2023 by the industry players is set to increase gradually as operators accelerate the pace of 5G network roll-out. "For Indus Towers, we expect 1.5k tower additions and lower q-q revenue and EBITDA as it saw a boost in 2QFY23 revenue from the settlement of old dues," the report said. As to the events that are likely to happen in 2023, BNP Paribas said the fund raise by VIL and the central government is likely to acquire a stake in the company. The company's debt exceeds Rs 2 trillion. The payables to some of its vendors have been delayed and its capex is well below its peers due to its ongoing liquidity issues. Moreover, VIL's efforts to raise funds have not yielded results. A partial conversion of its dues to the government into equity has also not fructified. Inability to pay vendors and invest in business could hurt its operations, especially its ability to retain high ARPU postpaid customers, the report said.



ADOPTED MEASURES TO CURB MENACE OF MONEY POWER IN ELECTION, WILL CONTINUE: EC TO SC

The Election Commission has informed the Supreme Court that it has time and again adopted various measures to curb the menace of money power in polls and one of the reasons for more money being seized today ahead of all elections is due to its increased vigilance and efforts.

The poll body's response came on a plea by Prabhakar Deshpande seeking directions to come up with a comprehensive plan to curb excessive poll spending by political parties and candidates, and action against erring candidates and parties.

The EC, in an affidavit, contended that such a mechanism already exists and it has substantially managed to curb excessive poll spending by political parties.

One of the reasons for more money being seized today is the increased vigilance and efforts, it said.

"The ECI has time and again adopted various measures to curb the menace of money power in elections and will continue to do so in future...", said an affidavit filed by



V.K. Pandey, Director, Law, EC.

The poll body emphasised that it is seriously concerned about the increasing use of money power in elections. "To curb this menace, the ECI has effectively and successfully enforced the Election Expenditure Monitoring mechanism in the elections since the general elections to Bihar Legislative Assembly, 2010. In

order to keep the election expenditure within the statutory limit prescribed under Rule 90 of the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961 and also to curb excess expenditure/unaccounted expenditure, the ECI has introduced a robust mechanism for election expenditure monitoring during elections," it said in the affidavit. The poll body added that this

includes deployment of expenditure observers, video surveillance teams, video viewing teams, accounting teams, complaint monitoring and call centre, media certification, and monitoring committee, flying squads and static surveillance teams.

It further added that each candidate has to open a separate account for poll expenditure and maintain a register for day to day expenditure.

"The Election Expenditure Statements of National Political Parties and State Recognised Political Parties are uploaded on the website of the Election Commission of India and Chief Electoral Officer of State/UT concerned respectively.

"Incurring or authorising of expenditure by a candidate in contravention of Section 77 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 is a 'corrupt practice' under Section 123(6) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951," it added.

The EC contended that it requisition services of all law enforcement agencies and deploy their teams for election expenditure monitoring in poll-bound states and Union Territories.

Punjab rakes up claim over river waters, Chandigarh

The 20th meeting of the Northern Zonal Council Standing Committee, dealing with inter-state issues of the northern states, on Thursday saw Punjab putting forward its case pertaining to its rights.

The meeting in Mohali near here saw officers from the Inter State Council

Secretariat of the Union Ministry of Home Affairs in attendance along with Chief Secretaries of Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh and Adviser to the UT Chandigarh, besides Secretaries of the different departments of Chandigarh. Punjab presented its viewpoint on whole gamut of sen-

sitive issues viz. river waters of Punjab, the state's right to Chandigarh and Panjab University, demand for a tribunal to assess current situation with regard to the river waters, increasing international flights from the Mohali airport, starting UDAN scheme from four airports, strengthening the international borders, uniform policy for purchasing land, etc.

In his inaugural speech, Punjab Chief Secretary Vijay Kumar Janjua battled for the cooperative federalism and said such meetings are the right platform for bringing to the fore inter-state matters and debate upon their solutions. He made it clear that as per the current state of river waters, Punjab itself is facing shortage of water, hence it doesn't have extra water to spare for the other states.

BOMB CALL GROUNDS SPICEJET'S DELHI-PUNE FLIGHT



New Delhi: A call claiming there was a bomb on Spicejet's Delhi-Pune flight sent security personnel at the IGI Airport into a tizzy on Thursday evening.

Soon after receiving the call, the Delhi Police personnel, and CISF officials immediately swung into action and the whole flight was thoroughly checked. A senior police official said that they didn't find any suspicious material. "Security drill was followed as per SOP. The flight was stopped," said the official. Further details are awaited.

Bihar Education Minister refuses to withdraw controversial statement on Ramcharitmanas

Bihar Education Minister Chandrashekhar Yadav on Thursday refused to withdraw his controversial statement on Ramcharitmanas.

"There are five to six 'Chand' of Ramcharitmanas' Sundar Kand and Uttar Kand which are objectionable and I have objection to it. That's why I said that it spreads hatred in society. I am firm on it and will not withdraw at any cost. A person announced a Rs 10 crore bounty for slitting my tongue, I want to say that please, someone get rich by doing it," Yadav said.

"Ramcharitmanas spreads hatred in the society. It stops Dalit, Backward Class people and women from education. It stops equality for them in society. Manusmriti spread hatred in the first era, Ramcharitmanas in the second era and M.S. Golwarkar's 'Bunch of Thoughts' in third era," he said.

"If people would want to shoot me, they can do it but I will not withdraw my statement and cannot apologise," he further said.

Earlier, Ayodhya seer Jagadguru Paramhans Acharya announced a bounty of Rs 10 crore for anyone who slits the tongue of Chandrashekhar Yadav if he does not apologise for his statement in one week.

Meanwhile, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar said



that he will ask the education minister for his comment on Ramcharitmanas. "I am in Darbhanga and I have no details about his actual statement," he said.

Union Minister Choubey faces stone-pelting in Bihar's Buxar

Union Minister of State for Environment, Forest, and Climate Change Ashwini Kumar Choubey had to flee the protest site in Bihar's Buxar after farmers pelted stones on his convoy on Thursday afternoon.

As per videos uploaded on social media, Choubey, after reaching the protest site, faced stiff resistance from agitating farmers, who pelted stones on him and his convoy. The situation reached such a stage when Choubey had to hurriedly move away to save himself. Police rescued him and took him to his car.

The farmers were protesting for 86 days now to seek compensation, according to the fresh circle rate, of their lands in Banarpur village under Chausa block after a thermal power com-



pany had acquired them. They turned violent after Buxar police allegedly carried out a baton charge on them in the intervening night of Tuesday and Wednesday.

Choubey, despite being a local MP, did not go to Banarpur village even as the farmers were protesting against the thermal

power company for the last 86 days. Following the police action in the night, where allegedly women and children were also targeted, the farmers went on rampage and set afire more than 20 vehicles, including half a dozen police vans, on Wednesday morning. The situation is currently very tense in the village.

FSSAI NOTIFIES FIRST-EVER REGULATORY STANDARDS FOR BASMATI RICE

New Delhi: For the first time in the country, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has specified identity standards for basmati rice (including brown basmati, milled basmati, parboiled brown basmati, and milled parboiled basmati)

The standards, vide Food Safety and Standards (Food Products Standards and Food Additives) First Amendment Regulations, 2023 and notified in the Gazette of India, are aimed at establishing fair practices in the trade of basmati rice and protect consumer interest, both domestically and globally. These standards will be enforced from August 1. As per these standards, basmati rice shall possess natural fragrance characteristic of basmati rice and be free from artificial colouring, polishing agents, and artificial fragrances. These standards also specify various identity and quality parameters for basmati rice such as average size of grains and their elongation ratio after cooking, maximum limits of moisture, amylose content, uric acid, defective or damaged grains and incidental presence of other non-basmati rice etc.

Maha Cong MLC nominee withdraws, foists son as 'Independent' candidate

In a huge embarrassment for the Congress, Sudhir Tambe, the party's official candidate for the January 30 biennial elections to the Maharashtra Legislative Council (MLC) for Nashik Division Graduates' constituency, backed out of the race here on Thursday.

Instead, his son Satyajeet Tambe has filed his nomination as an Independent candidate, saying he will seek support from all the parties, including the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), and meet Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis soon, though the latter has not committed anything.

"I have decided to step back in favour of youthful leadership of my son," Sudhir Tambe told media-



persons, amid speculations that the father-son duo may switch loyalties to the BJP.

Tambe's abrupt decision took the Congress by shock and rekindled memories of the rude political setbacks that the party had suffered during the MLC bypolls in June 2022, followed by the collapse of the Maha Vikas

Aghadi government.

The top state and central leaders of the Congress were at total loss to comment on the developments with state Congress chief Nana Patole claiming that he is yet to get a full report as to what exactly transpired and how the official nominee did not file his papers as directed.

MAN DETAINED IN DELHI FOR SUSPECTED LINKS WITH KHALISTANI TERRORIST

New Delhi: A man has been detained by the Special Cell of Delhi Police from the national capital's Jahangirpuri area for allegedly having connections with a Canada-based Khalistani terrorist, an official said on Thursday. A team of Special Cell had picked up a few people from the Jahangirpuri area. They were suspected to have links with the Canada-based Khalistani terrorist, ahead of the Republic Day.

"They were questioned and one person has been detained in connection with the matter," a senior police officer said.

Samudrayaan Mission: India aims to send 3 persons to 6K meters below sea level

- The Centre had approved the Deep Ocean Mission at a total budget of Rs 4,077 crore for five years.
- The estimated cost for the first phase for the three years (2021-2024) is Rs 2,823.4 crore.
- India has a unique maritime position, a 7,517 km long coastline, which is home to nine coastal states and 1,382 islands.
- The mission aims to boost the Central government's vision of 'New India' that highlights the blue economy as one of the ten core dimensions of growth.

India is aiming to send three persons to 6,000 meters below sea level as part of the Samudrayaan Mission, officials said, adding the mission heralds India's ushering into an era of "Blue Economy" which is going to play a major part in building India's overall economy during the years to come.

Sharing the details, Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences Jitendra Singh said Prime Minister Narendra Modi had referred to the Deep Sea Mission in his Independence Day address in two consecutive years in 2021 and 2022. He elaborated that a vehicle called MATSYA will carry three persons to a depth of 6,000 meters for explo-



ration of deep-sea resources like minerals. This mission, he said, is expected to be realised in the next three years. Singh added that MATSYA 6000 is being designed and developed by the National Institute of Ocean Technology (NIOT), Chennai under the Ministry of Earth Sciences.

"It has an endurance of 12 hours under normal operation and 96 hours in case of emergency for human safety." "The design of the vehicle is completed and realization of various components of the vehicle is in

progress. Manned submersible facilitates the direct observation by the human in deep ocean in exploring mineral resources rich in nickel, cobalt, rare earths, manganese etc., and collection of samples, which can be used for analysis," said the Minister. The Minister added that apart from the scientific research and technological empowerment as the benefits, the mission has immediate spin-offs in the form of underwater engineering innovations in asset inspection, tourism and promotion of ocean literacy. MP HC denies bail to Raja Pateria

Pateria had approached the HC after his bail plea was denied by a district court a few days back. However, the Congress leader got no leniency for his alleged remarks on Prime Minister Modi during a meeting with party workers in Panna district.

"It is noticed that it has become a fashion for some public leaders to seek popularity of the followers without caring for the consequence of delivrance. This practice is not only belittling the image of public leaders in the society but also becoming a cause of increase in criminality in the politics," Justice Sanjay Dwivedi observed while hearing Pateria's bail plea on Wednesday.

The court also mentioned that the use of foul language was not expected from a public leader. The bench said there was no occasion



for the applicant, who is a public leader, to use such derogatory language for the prime minister of the country. "The manner in which the crime has been committed, the applicant cannot be granted bail as it will give a wrong message to the society," Justice Dwivedi said while dismissing Pateria's application.

Congress MLA demands plots, Rs 2 Lakh compensation for slums dwellers whose houses were removed for road construction

Congress MLA PC Sharma and corporator Pravin Saxena have demanded plots and Rs 2 Lakh compensation for slums dwellers removed from Kolar Tiraha (Trisection) besides, Rs 50,000 for the shop keepers of the locality. Notably, slums were removed for the construction of a 6-lane and 16 kms cement concrete road from Kolar Trisection.

Talking to the media, Sharma said, "The slum dwellers have leases for that land from 1984 and every government has renewed those leases. The houses were removed in the biting cold when the collector ordered for closing even the schools." "The duo called it a



pathetic situation. The Congress MLA and Saxena added that the slum dwellers are being misled with assurances of allotment of plots.

"But the reality is that even after one month, they are living in the open, in biting cold, they added. Administration should immediately allot plots and

Rs 2 lakh compensation for the slum dwellers along with Rs 50,000 for shopkeepers. Even demarcation was done earlier but the administration took a U-turn and dismantled the slums for construction of the road. No one is protesting road construction but slums dwellers should be properly rehabilitated," said Sharma.

MP Pragya Thakur faces ire of ex-officers

More than 100 retired bureaucrats -- IAS and IPS officers -- who are the members of 'Constitutional Conduct Group' have sought action against BJP MP Pragya Thakur over her controversial statement in Karnataka's Shimoga.

government- Sharad Baihar, former Foreign Secretary Shivshankar Menon, ex-IPS A. S. Dulat and many more.

"We are a group of former officers of the All India and Central Services who have worked with the Central and State governments in the course of our career. As members of the Constitutional Conduct Group, we believe in impartiality, neutrality and commitment to the Indian Constitution and safeguarding its values," CCG's letter to Birla read.

"Parliament has a greater role in safeguarding Constitutional values, which makes the laws. Its members shouldn't be allowed to violate the principles of the Constitution. Therefore, we request the Lok Sabha Speaker to take action in the matter," it further read.

Responding to the letter, Thakur said that she stood firm on what she had said in Karnataka. "I had said that for the safety of women and I am not afraid of any such letter. If my statement was unlawful, you know that many enemies are here to attack me."

Ahirwar was accompanied by other policemen, who immediately started chasing the vehicle. The accused took ASI Ahirwar to Barkoti village, where he assaulted him. After this, he left Ahirwar on the spot and ran away. When the policemen chasing the vehicle reached the spot, they

found Ahirwar in an injured condition.

On the complaint of ASI Ahirwar, a case has been registered against accused Chandrahas under sections 353, 186, 332, 365 of the Indian Penal Code as well as the SC/ST Act. 'New Joshimath' on lines of Tehri

The government has been considering the making of a new Joshimath, along the lines of Tehri, which is being opposed by the locals who insist on staying in the holy city. The government has selected three places to shift the people, including the land of the horticulture department near JP Colony, the ground near Pipalkoti and near Gauchar. In a meeting between the administration and the residents, it was announced that a compensation of Rs 1.5 lakh would be provided to the affected families, which was refused by the locals. The survey of the affected buildings is being conducted and the district administration has been temporarily moving people to safer places. An amount of Rs 1.5 lakh is being provided as interim assistance to the affected families, where Rs 50,000 will be given in advance for house shifting and Rs 1 lakh for disaster relief, which will be adjusted later. The main opposition Congress has been criticising the state government on the matter. Former Chief Minister Harish Rawat registered his protest by observing a day-long fast on Wednesday. Rawat staged a demonstration along with his supporters at Gandhi Park, and termed the policy of demolition without any rehabilitation, as unjust. He demanded a one-time settlement for the buildings that are to be demolished. Joshimath, a temple town that is the gateway to popular pilgrimage sites like Badrinath, is facing a crisis with yawning cracks appearing in buildings and roads after years of unplanned infrastructure building. The region is prone to earthquakes and has seen disasters in recent years blamed on melting glaciers and incessant construction and drilling in the mountains. In 2021, at least 200 people were killed in flash floods in Joshimath and surrounding areas in a disaster partly blamed on excessive development.

Putin demotes 'General Armageddon', publicly humiliates deputy PM for 'fooling around'

Russian President Vladimir Putin ordered yet another shake-up of his war cabinet, demoting the head of his forces in Ukraine after only three months on the job, the media reported.

General Sergei Surovikin, who earned the fearsome nickname 'General Armageddon' for employing brutal tactics during Russia's intervention in Syria, was named as Russia's overall military commander on October 8.

Putin on Wednesday replaced Surovikin with General Valery Gerasimov, Russia's chief of the general staff who was seen by many as the top architect of the invasion. But critics have already blamed him for Moscow's military setbacks.

Putin also humiliated one of his deputy prime ministers on a video



conference call, blasting the official for failing to procure civilian and military planes and accusing him of "fooling around", Daily Mail reported.

Britain's Ministry of Defence (MoD) said promoting Gerasimov above Surovikin is 'an indicator of the increasing seriousness of the situa-

tion Russia is facing, and a clear acknowledgement that the campaign is falling short of Russia's strategic goals. The MoD added in a tweet that Russian ultra-nationalists and military bloggers critical of Gerasimov are likely to greet the news with 'extreme displeasure', Daily Mail reported.

The Russian Defence Ministry's formal explanation for the reshuffle was that expanded military tasks and the need for 'closer interaction between branches of the military as well as increasing the quality of supplies and the efficiency of directing groups of forces' prompted the leadership changes.

The move appeared to buttress Gerasimov's standing with Putin amid growing resentment and dissent in the army. Gerasimov is seen as a loyalist with no political ambitions, and is likely to side with Putin on any strategic decisions - likely the reason for his promotion.

Surovikin, meanwhile, was made deputy in an announcement made not by Putin, but by defence minister Sergei Shoigu, who has also been widely criticised for his bungling of Moscow's operations, Daily Mail reported.

Google hits back in US search antitrust lawsuit, says doesn't block rivals

Google has hit back at a US government antitrust lawsuit over its search engine, saying its search deals -- including agreements with Mozilla and Apple -- don't prevent users from trying other search platforms. The US Department of Justice and a coalition of state attorneys general had sued Google in 2020 under the Donald Trump administration.

The complaint alleged that Google used its "incumbent power" and its Android operating system to lock up the search market, denying competitors "vital distribution, scale, and product recognition".

Google said in its filing that "no evidence suggests that Google coerced Apple, Mozilla, or any other browser developer into adopting a design that includes a single default search engine".



The tech giant also argued that its contracts with Android phone makers don't constitute exclusive deals.

The lawsuit against Google had contended that the company harmed competition by entering revenue share agreements with web browser developers that provide that Google will be the pre-set default general search engine on their browsers.

Plaintiffs also contend that Google has harmed competition through three

sets of agreements with companies that manufacture and/or sell Android devices," said the Google filing.

Android is a mobile operating system, licensed open source, in which Google has invested billions of dollars since its release in the fall of 2008.

Google said although ITS agreements with browser developers are individually negotiated and differ in some respects, they have three important commonalities.

WHO alert against use of Indian cough syrups in Uzbekistan

Geneva | Agencies

The World Health Organization on Thursday warned against the use of two Indian cough syrups for children that have been linked to deaths in Uzbekistan.

The WHO said the products, manufactured by Marion Biotech, were "substandard" and that the firm had failed to provide guarantees about their safety, the BBC reported.

The alert comes weeks after Uzbekistan alleged that 18 children died after consuming a syrup made by the company.

The firm has not yet commented on the alert.

After the deaths were reported in Uzbekistan, India's Health Ministry suspended production at the company.

This week, the food safety department in Uttar Pradesh, where Marion Biotech is based, also suspended the company's production licence.

In the alert issued on Thursday, the WHO



said that an analysis of the two cough syrups -- Ambronol and Dok-1 Max -- by the quality control laboratories of Uzbekistan's Health Ministry found unacceptable amounts of two contaminants -- "diethylene glycol and/or ethylene glycol", the BBC reported.

Diethylene glycol and ethylene glycol are toxic to humans and could be fatal if consumed.

"Both of these products may have marketing authorizations in other countries in the region. They may also have been distributed, through informal markets, to other countries or regions," the global health body said.

It added that "the substandard products" were "unsafe and their use, especially in children, may result in serious injury or death", BBC reported.

India is known as the "world's pharmacy" as it produces a third of the world's medicines, meeting much of the medical needs of developing countries.

The country is also home to some of the fastest-growing pharmaceutical companies.


PAKISTAN FACES THREAT OF HUNGER

The World Economic Forum (WEF) sees Pakistan facing a huge threat of hunger and distress amid a prevalent cost-of-living crisis, warning that it may be further aggravated by extreme weather events and constrained supply.

About Pakistan, the report identifies that a combination of extreme weather events and constrained supply could lead the current cost-of-living crisis into a catastrophic scenario of hunger and distress for millions. This can also turn the energy crisis towards a humanitarian crisis, Geo News reported.

Energy shortages -- because of supplier shut-offs or natural, accidental, or intentional damage to pipelines and energy grids -- could cause widespread blackouts and fatalities if combined with seasonal



extreme weather. Amir Jahangir, Chief Executive Officer Mishal Pakistan, the Partners Institute for New Economy and Societies Platforms of the WEF, said: "The Global Risk Report 2023 identifies that for Pakistan, both the affordability and availability of basic necessities can stoke social and political instability.

The report identifies that the cost-of-living crisis is the biggest short-term risk while the failure of climate mitigation and climate adaptation is the largest long-term concern, Geo News reported.

The geopolitical rivalries and inward-looking stances will heighten economic constraints and further exacerbate both short and long-term risks.


5 KILLED IN SUICIDE BLAST OUTSIDE AFGHAN FOREIGN MINISTRY

Kabul: At least five people were killed in a suicide bomb attack outside Afghanistan's Foreign Ministry in Kabul, police said. The Islamic State terror group's Khorasan unit (IS-K) has taken responsibility for the attack which took place at around 4 p.m. on Wednesday evening, the BBC reported. According to the Taliban-led Afghan government, the suicide bomber had tried to enter the Ministry premises but failed. Several countries have embassies in the area, including China and Turkey.

The Italian humanitarian agency, Emergency NGO in Kabul said it had received more than 40 wounded people and the casualty numbers were continuing to rise. "We have received more than 40 patients in the hospital, it is difficult to draw up a final number, we are continuing to respond," TOLO News quoted Stefano Sozza, the NGO's Country Director in Afghanistan, as saying in a statement late Wednesday.

"This is the first mass casualty in 2023, but certainly one of those with the most patients since the beginning of 2022. So much so that we have also set up beds in the kitchens and canteen."

Spokesman for the Kabul security department, Khalid Zadran said the Taliban regime has condemned the "heinous" attack and will punish the perpetrators. There was widespread condemnation for the attack.



CM SHINDE TO LIMIT DAVOS STAY FOR ATTENDING PM'S FUNCTIONS; RAUT SAYS HE IS MORE WORRIED ABOUT BMC

Chief Minister Eknath Shinde will cut short his visit to Davos for the World Economic Forum (WEF) gathering as Prime Minister Narendra Modi would be in Mumbai on January 19, a close aide of Shinde said on Thursday.

Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis has cancelled his visit to Davos as he would be overseeing preparations for the Prime Minister's events, he added.

Reacting to Shinde and Fadnis changing their Davos plans, Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut said the government was more worried about the civic elections in Mumbai than it was about bringing investments. CM Shinde will visit Davos and participate in the World Economic Forum on January 16," his close aide said. The WEF annual meeting is scheduled from January 16 to 20. The CM will return on the night of January 18. He will be present for all the events of Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the next day, the aide added. Modi will be visiting Mumbai for the first time after the Shiv Sena faction of the Shiv Sena joined hands with the BJP and formed a government.

Maresh Tapase, spokesperson of the Nationalist Congress Party, an ally of Shiv



Sena (UBT), said the chief minister should tell the people how much investment he will bring from Davos.

"They are not at all serious about it (bringing investments to the state), Almost all chief ministers and their delegations are going to Davos. Even Gujarat chief minister is going. But the Maharashtra chief minister and deputy chief minister are more concerned about BMC elections than about investments," The Maharashtra government could ask the prime minister to reschedule his visit for the inauguration of projects in Mumbai as the dates of the Davos meet cannot be changed, Sanjay Raut told reporters.



Anushka Sharma goes to Bombay High Court over taxes

Bollywood actress Anushka Sharma on Thursday challenged in the Bombay High Court the orders of the Maharashtra State Tax Department hiking levies on the payments she has received for endorsements and hosting award functions.

When the matter came up before a division bench of Justice Nitin Jamdar and Justice Abhay Ahuja, government pleader Jyoti Chavan sought time to file a reply.


Accordingly, the court has directed the state government to file its response in two of the pleas which were taken up and posted the matter for further hearing on February. 6.

Anushka has questioned the orders of the Deputy Commissioner, Sales Tax raising her dues for the assessment years 2012-2013, 2013-2014, 2014-2015, and 2015-2016, under the Maharashtra Value Added Tax Act.

She has contended that the assessing officer had wrongly levied the ST and said that for 2012-2013, the ST was Rs 1.20 crore on her income of Rs 12.30 crore and for 2013-2014, the ST was Rs 1.60 crore on around Rs 17 crore payments received by her.

In her plea, Sharma said that the assessing officer had erroneously held that she had acquired copyright through endorsements and anchoring function and had sold or transferred the same.

The actress, through her lawyer Deepak Bapat, has pointed out that the copyright of



videos is always retained by the producer who also owns such videos and performer's rights which are not capable of being transferred or sold.

Bapat said in the petition that as per the MVAT Sec. 6(1), there shall be levied a sales tax on the turnover of sales of goods, and unless it is established that there is a sale of goods, sales tax cannot be levied on it.

Police nab Gujarat man for bomb threat to Ambani School

The Mumbai Police have arrested a man from Gujarat for making bomb threat calls to the elite Dhirubhai Ambani International School in Bandra Kurla Complex, a top official said here on Thursday.

According to Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Dikshit Gedam (Zone VIII), the two calls were received on the headline of the DAIS between 1600-1630 hours on Tuesday afternoon after all the students had left for home. The unknown caller first called shortly after 4 p.m. to warn that he had planted a 'time-bomb' in the school premises and abruptly disconnected.

A few minutes later, he again called up and repeated the threat even as the panicked school authorities



approached the police.

A complaint was lodged under various IPC Section and a manhunt was launched using tech-intel to track down the caller within 24 hours, said DCP Gedam.

"He was traced to Morbi town in Gujarat where a team of officers rushed and took him into custody. He has been identified as Vikram Singh Zala, working as a driver. He was placed under arrest and brought to Mumbai," DCP Gedam added. As per initial probe, the accused reportedly wanted to attain fame in the media and felt that after the

police probe and arrest even industrialist Mukesh Ambani would know him. In the second call, he even provided his full name, and said that "after the calls, the police will go to catch him, throw him in jail, and I will attain fame on social media", besides sharing other details of his identity and whereabouts with the school's chief of security.

As a precaution, the bomb squad scanned through the entire DAIS where children of top celebs study campus but nothing suspicious was found even as the police team located him in Gujarat.

CBI raids Pratibha Industries officials in Rs 4,957cr loan fraud case

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has lodged a case of a bank loan fraud of Rs 4957 cr against Pratibha Industries, it's Directors and others and is conducting raids in Mumbai and Thane.

According to information, a complaint was lodged on September 12, 2022 by Sanjay Kumar Tiwary, Deputy General Manager, Stressed Assets Management Branch, Bank of Baroda, Mumbai against Pratibha Industries Limited, it's Directors Ajit Bhagwan Kulkarni, Ravi Kulkarni, Sunanda Datta Kulkarni, Sharad Prabhakar Deshpande and others for causing a wrongful loss of Rs 4957.31 crore (Rs. 4735.67 crore as per the complaint made by Bank of Baroda and Rs 221.64 crore as per the mandate dated 13.09.2022 given by SBI - one of the Consortium Member Bank) to the Consortium of Banks led by Bank of Baroda. The CBI after



receiving the complaint lodged a case under sections 120-B, 420 IPC and 13(2) read with 13(1)(d) of the PC Act and formed a team to look into the matter.

The account of Pratibha Industries was classified as NPA on December

31, 2017. Subsequently the accounts were also declared as fraud by the members of the consortium banks.

Pratibha Industries was into development of infrastructure projects, which included designing, engineering and execution, construction of

complex, integrated water transmission, distribution projects, water treatment plants, mass housing projects, precast design and construction, road construction and urban infrastructure etc.

"The accused had diverted huge amount of money from the borrower company to its related parties & subsidiaries and subsequently, these advances were written-off by the company. The company had entered into fictitious sales & purchase transactions in order to inflate its turnover. Further, to avail credit facilities from the lender banks, the work-in-progress was allegedly inflated and huge amount of Vender Liability was directly adjusted against Customer Account without having any supporting document for the same," the CBI said. On Thursday the CBI conducted raids at 14 locations belonging to the accused and bank officials which led to recovery of several incriminating documents and articles.

Three booked for duping people of Rs 56 lakh on pretext of starting hospital

Police have registered a case against two men and a woman for allegedly cheating some people of Rs 56 lakh after approaching them to set up a pharmacy and a lab at a hospital which they planned to start in Maharashtra's Thane district, an official said on Thursday. One of the victims told the police that the accused approached him saying were launching a hospital in Kalyan town and asked him to set up a pharmacy at the facility.

The accused allegedly asked the victim for a sum of Rs 32 lakh as deposit, which he and his partner paid to them, an official from Manpada police station in Dombivli said quoting the complaint.

The accused also approached a woman and her partners in a health care company and offered them to set up a lab in the hospital for which they took an amount of Rs 24 lakh from them as deposit, the official said.

The financial transactions took place



between January and May 2021 and thereafter, the accused told the victims that the hospital could not be run in the locality.

They shut the facility and informed the victims that they would refund the deposit money in six months, but did not do so, official said.

The victims then approached the police, who registered a case against the three accused on Wednesday under Indian Penal Code Sections 406 (criminal breach of trust), 420 (cheating), 506 (criminal intimidation) and 34 (common intention), the official said. No arrest has been made so far. A probe is on into the case, the police said.

MISSING BOY FOUND IN MP'S KHANDWA TOWN

Mumbai: A nine-year-old Mumbai boy, who went missing five days ago after his tuition teacher told him to complete his homework, has been traced to Khandwa town in Madhya Pradesh, a police officer said on Wednesday. The boy, a Std IV student, left his home in Santacruz on Saturday evening to attend his tuition class but did not return home, said the Vakola police station officer.

His worried family members enquired with their relatives and the tuition teacher, who told them that she had told the boy to complete his homework and bring it back, he said. The boy left the tuition teacher's home around 8 pm, but did not reach his residence. His father, who works with a restaurant aggregator and food delivery company, searched for his son at different locations in the city, to no avail, said the officer. He took the help of social media influencers and circulated his son's pictures on different platforms, but did not get any clue about his whereabouts, he said. Later, the minor's family members approached the Vakola police station and lodged a kidnapping complaint. On Wednesday, the Mumbai cops got a phone call from their counterparts in MP's Khandwa town informing them that a minor boy from the city was in their custody. He was the same boy whom the Mumbai cops had been looking for, said the officer. How the boy reached Khandwa was not yet known and a team of the Vakola police was on its way to the MP town to bring him back to Mumbai, he added.



ED arrests head of Karan Group Builders & Developers in Rs 500cr fraud case

Enforcement Directorate (ED) said on Thursday that it has arrested Mahesh B. Ojha, the head of Karan Group Builders & Developers, Mumbai, in a fraud and cheating case involving an amount of more than Rs 500 crore. Ojha was produced before a special PMLA court here, which sent him to 10-day ED custody.

The ED said that multiple FIRs related to fraud and cheating in the name of investment in real estate projects were registered by Karnataka Police.

"Our investigation revealed that the complainant had invested a total of Rs 526 crore in different real estate projects undertaken by various groups and individuals. Subsequently, this amount was siphoned off by showing it as to be paid to various persons and collecting cash and commission in lieu of bank entry," an ED official said.

The ED said it has learnt that out of the total investment of Rs 526 crore made by the



complainant, a bulk amount of Rs 121.5 crore was invested in a real estate project undertaken by Karan Group Builders & Developers, headed by Ojha.

This amount was routed through various entities and subsequently diverted by Ojha through another network of entities and people. Ojha was earlier arrested by the CID, Bengaluru, and is presently in judicial custody.

Disrespect to national anthem case: Court sets aside summons issued to Mamata Banerjee

A special court in Mumbai on Thursday set aside the summons issued by a magistrate to West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee in a case pertaining to alleged disrespect to the national anthem. Noting the magistrate didn't follow the mandatory provisions, Special Judge R N Rokade, after hearing both the sides, set aside the summons and asked the magistrate to proceed with the case from the stage of verification (of the complainant).

The special judge directed the magistrate to give fresh consideration on the issuance of process against Banerjee.

Vivekanand Gupta, a functionary of the Mumbai unit of Bharatiya Janata Party, had approached the magistrate court with a complaint claiming the West Bengal CM did not stand while the national anthem was being played at an event during her visit to Mumbai in December 2021.

Gupta had sought the registration of a First Information Report (FIR) against Banerjee under the Prevention of Insults to National



Honour Act. Taking cognizance of Gupta's complaint, the magistrate court had issued summons to Banerjee, who moved a review petition before the special court against it.

Banerjee's lawyer had earlier told court no sanction, mandatory under the Code of Criminal Procedure to prosecute a government servant, was taken.

However, Additional Public Prosecutor Sumesh Panjwani had argued Banerjee's visit was political and not official and, hence, no sanction was required. After hearing both the sides, the judge allowed Banerjee's plea.

India's longest sea bridge

MUMBAI-NAVI MUMBAI TRAVEL TIME TO REDUCE TO 15 MINS

Team Absolute | Mumbai

A three-hour ordeal to travel from India's financial capital Mumbai to its satellite city Navi Mumbai will be cut to 15 minutes when the country's longest sea bridge opens later this year, Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has said.

The 22 km-long Mumbai Trans-Harbour Link (MTHL) will open to the public in November this year, linking connect upscale South Mumbai to Navi Mumbai and Raigad, Shinde told said.

"The current travel time from Mumbai to Navi Mumbai is 2.5 to 3 hours. It will be reduced to 15 minutes," Shinde said.

The bridge will also be the first in the country to have an Open Road Tolling (ORT) system, a technology in use in countries like Singapore where



a vehicle does not have to stop to pay a toll. Of its 22 km length, 16.5 km will traverse the sea. "This bridge has international technology. This project will give a big boost to the economy," Shinde said. The Trans-Harbour Link will also be connected to the under-construction eight-lane coastal highway which begins from Marine Drive to the Worli end of the

Bandra-Worli Sea Link. "The MTHL will save a lot of fuel. By reducing travel time from hours to minutes, it will play a huge role in reducing air pollution," the Chief Minister said. Shinde added that his government is working with the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) to begin various developmental works in Mumbai. He alleged that there has

not been any real work done in the city in the last few years. "This is a project of superlatives. India's longest sea bridge, the first project to use OSD technology, reverse circulation. Construction of the bridge took the ecosystem into account, which is why pelicans and flamingos are back despite heavy machinery functioning," SVR Srinivas, Additional Chief Secretary and Metropolitan Commissioner said. Srinivas said the number of wires used in the project if joined together, can go around the earth.

"Most importantly, the impact of this project will not only benefit Mumbai but also the country at large. As the islands get connected with the mainland, it will open up new avenues for further growth," he said. Srinivas added that almost 90% of the construction has been completed.

EZRA MILLER TO PLEAD GUILTY IN VERMONT BURGLARY CASE

Actor Ezra Miller is expected to plead guilty to a lesser charge of unlawful trespassing in a Vermont burglary case, with two other charges against the actor being dropped.

The 'Fantastic Beasts' and 'The Flash' star is reported to have entered a plea deal, after being accused of stealing several bottles of alcohol from the pantry of a neighbour last May. Miller was charged with burglary last August, reports 'Variety'. According to a police report, authorities discovered that bottles were missing from the homeowners' residence. After collecting statements and reviewing surveillance footage, police found probably cause to charge Miller with felony burglary.

According to NBC News, a clerk for Vermont Superior Court confirmed that the parties have agreed to drop two charges, one of petit larceny and another of burglary in an unoccupied dwelling. Miller is expected to plead guilty of unlawful trespassing on Friday in Bennington County Superior Criminal Court. Court documents indicate that prosecutors are recommending that Miller face 89 to 90 days in a suspended sentence, in addition to a year's probation and a \$500 fine. The maximum sentence would have been 26 years. Last August, Miller apologised for their behaviour and stated that they would be undergoing mental health treatment. The actor was introduced as Barry Allen a.k.a. The Flash in 2017's 'Justice League'. Miller will star in the superhero's first solo film, set to hit theaters on June 23.

RAHUL'S UNBEATEN 64 CARRIES INDIA TO HARD-FOUGHT FOUR-WICKET WIN

Chasing 216, Rohit Sharma and Shubman Gill smacked six boundaries in the first four overs. But Rohit fell in the fifth over to Chamika Karunaratne, giving a regulation catch to the keeper while looking to punch it through covers without any footwork.

Gill smacked Lahiru Kumara for back-to-back fours in the next over. But the pacer had the last laugh as Gill picked out short mid-



wicket through a short-arm pull. Kumara inflicted more damage by getting a length ball to come in sharply and Virat Kohli, stuck in the crease, got an inside edge to the stumps, as India's top three fell in power-

6-3, 7-6 (3) just a day after her win over former Roland Garros champion Barbora Krejickova.

The world No.8 held two match points at 6-5 in the second set but eventually closed it out in a tiebreak to enter her 11th semifinal since her career resurgence began at the start of 2020.

U19 WOMEN'S T20 WC: INDIA LOSE TO BANGLADESH BY 3 RUNS IN WARM-UP MATCH

Johannesburg: India and hosts South Africa suffered disappointing losses to Bangladesh and Australia respectively in their warm-up matches while Rwanda warmed up for their first-ever ICC World Cup with a thrilling surprise victory over Ireland.

Bangladesh made 121/7, thanks to an unbeaten 75 off 54 balls by Shorna Akter, including two fours and seven sixes at St Stithians ground in Johannesburg. India looked to be in control of the chase with all but two of their wickets in hand, but miscalculated what was required and ended agonisingly short of their target on 118/2.

Hosts South Africa, on the other hand, were bowled out for only 61 against the highly-fancied Australia. Karabo Meso (24 from 20 balls) played a lone hand as the only South Africa batter to reach double figures, while Rhys McKenna (3/7) and Charis Bekker (2/6) did the damage for Australia.

Real Madrid squeeze into Spanish Super Cup final after penalty shootout

Real Madrid qualified for the final of the Spanish Super Cup after beating Valencia in a penalty shootout here on Wednesday.

Thibaut Courtois saved Jose Luis Gaya's spot kick for Valencia after Eray Comert had fired over the bar, while Karim Benzema, Luka Modric, Marco Asensio and Toni Kroos all scored for Real Madrid.

It was cruel on Valencia, who produced a hard-working and disciplined display, making Madrid look ordinary for long periods of the second half and extra time. Real Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti surprisingly left Modric on the bench while Nacho Fernandez filled in at left-back for the injured David Alaba and Ferland Mendy.

Meanwhile, Kroos was partnered in midfield by the ener-



getic duo of Fede Valverde and Eduardo Camavinga.

The first half saw each side have spells of pressure, with Rodrygo firing wide for Real Madrid, before Benzema's run ended with his shot just going wide of the near post and Valverde shooting just wide from 30 meters. Valencia then

had some promising attacks, with Edinson Cavani forcing a good low save from Courtois, who was then lucky not to concede a penalty after he caught Toni Lato as the Valencia player tried to dribble past him. There were no doubts when Real Madrid took the lead in the 39th minute when Benzema

beat the offside trap and Comert caught his thigh as he shaped to shoot. Referee Hernandez pointed to the spot and Benzema made no mistake, sending the keeper the wrong way, reports Xinhua.

Modric came on at the start of the second half, but Valencia levelled directly from the kick-off as the ball came to Lato, who crossed for Samuel Lino to score at the back post.

Valencia then kept their shape and pressed Madrid, who were limited to playing a string of horizontal passes. It was only in the closing minutes that they threatened with Valencia keeper Giorgi Mamardashvili saving at full stretch from Kroos and then blocking Vinicius' shot.

Fran Perez had the chance to win the game for Valencia in extra time, but Courtois made a magnificent save, and his stop from Gaya saw him named man of the match.

Australian Open: Nadal handed tough draw; to open against Draper; Djokovic, Kyrgios in same quarter

Spain's World No. 2 Rafael Nadal, the most successful men's singles player in tennis with 22 Grand Slam titles, was on Thursday handed a tough draw at the year's first Grand Slam with an opening round encounter with Britain's in-form Jack Draper at Melbourne Park.

The 2021-winner Novak Djokovic, who is close on Nadal's heels with 21 Grand Slam titles, and Australia's Nick Kyrgios are in the same quarter

of the draw in the bottom half and are scheduled to meet in the quarterfinals.

Defending champion Nadal will need to be sharp from his first match against Draper, a 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals competitor. The 21-year-old, who owns two Top 10 wins, has made a quick start to his season. The World No. 40 will compete in the Adelaide International 2 semifinals on Friday. Nadal, on the other hand, has struggled in the United Cup, losing to Cameron Norrie, Draper's compatriot, as Spain failed to advance in the

United Cup. If Nadal navigates past the British star, his path will not get much easier, with one of two Americans - Mackenzie McDonald or Brandon Nakashima - waiting in the second round.

Also in the Spaniard's quarter is seventh seed Daniil Medvedev, which means a rematch of the 2022 Australian Open final between them could be played in the last eight. Sixteenth seed Frances Tiafoe, who upset Nadal at last year's U.S. Open, is a potential fourth-round opponent for the lefty.

Australia has decided to withdraw from their three-match ODI series against Afghanistan men scheduled to be played in March 2023 in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) over the Taliban government's restrictions on women's sports and outdoor activities in their country. "Following extensive consultation with relevant stakeholders, including the Australian Government, Cricket Australia has decided that it is unable to proceed at this time with the upcoming ICC Super League three-match Men's ODI series between Australia and Afghanistan scheduled for the UAE in March 2023," Cricket Australia announced on Thursday. This decision follows the recent announcement by the Taliban of further restrictions on women's and girls' education and employment opportunities and their ability to access parks and gyms, Cricket Australia said further in its statement.
