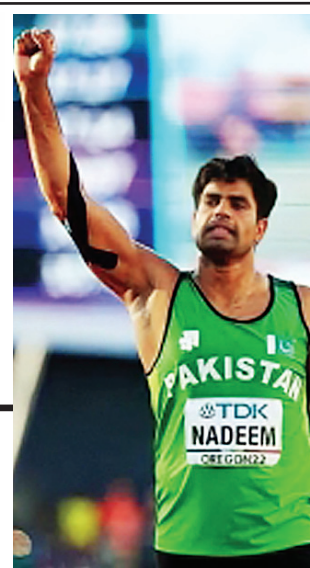

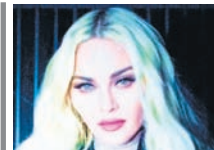

INDIA coordination committee's first meeting on Sept 16-17, say sources

I.N.D.I.A WITH DIFFERENCE

Amid all the bonhomie on display, the third meeting of the INDIA alliance also saw one of the first major differences emerge between the opposition parties since they decided to band together in June. While an election resolution was adopted at the Mumbai meeting, a political resolution had to be dropped after a disagreement over the inclusion of a demand for a caste census, sources told

The INDIA bloc on Friday announced the 14 member coordination committee with Venugopal, Pawar, Baalu, JMM's Hemant Soren, Shiv Sena's Sanjay Raut, RJD's Tejashvi Yadav, Trinamool Congress' Abhishek Banerjee, AAP's Raghav Chaddha, Samajwadi Party's Javed Ali Khan, JD-U's Lallan Singh, CPI's D Raja, National Conference's Omar Abdullah, PDP's Mehbooba Mufti as its members. The CPI-M will give the name of their party leader for the committee later.



They said that the 14 member coordination committee will be the highest decision making body of the INDIA alliance and it will start the discussion on seat sharing in the states. Congress general secretary KC Venugopal, NCP supreme Sharad Pawar and DMK's TR Baalu will lead the coordination committee till the time a national convener is decided, said the sources. The sources added that during the informal meeting on Thursday night, Trinamool Congress leader and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee informed the leaders that she

was battling the BJP all alone in her state and if she is given an opportunity then she can lead in the role of convener. The sources said that Bihar Chief Minister and JD-U leader Nitish Kumar too told the leaders that he had initiated the talks for bringing all the like minded parties together for the

2024 Lok Sabha elections and he too is ready for all the responsibilities he will be given. The two-day third meeting of the INDIA alliance took place here with 63 leaders from 28 parties participating. They discussed several issues to take on the BJP in next year's crucial Lok Sabha polls.

INDIA WILL WIN, MODI GOVT WILL BE OUSTED IN 2024: OPPN LEADERS

Mumbai: Several leaders from the Opposition parties on Friday said the INDIA bloc will oust the "arrogant and corrupt" BJP-led government at the Centre in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

"It will be the outcome of the INDIA bloc that those who are at the Centre will now lose. It is clear that they will go," said Bihar Chief Minister and Janata Dal (United) leader Nitish Kumar while addressing the media after the conclusion of the third meeting of the INDIA bloc. Taking a swipe at the ruling dispensation, Kumar said, "They want to change the history of the country, but unitedly we will not allow them to do so." He informed that the INDIA bloc will start its campaign at various places, adding that the elections may be held before the scheduled time. Echoing a similar sentiment, former Chief Minister and national president of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) Lalu Prasad Yadav said, "From the very beginning, we are fighting against the BJP. We have taken a pledge to oust (Narendra) Modi ji. Since the Gujarat riots, I have been fighting against Modi and Amit Shah. You all know what their history is."

"Now everybody is unhappy with the BJP to whom they had given power... The government does not have its feet on the ground."

Even as the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) on Friday announced a 14 member coordination committee, its first meeting will take place in the second week of this month, sources said.

According to the sources, the meeting of the INDIA alliance coordination committee will take place on September 16 and 17, once former Congress president Rahul Gandhi returns from his three-nation European tour. The sources said that soon some Congress secretaries will be appointed to assist in the work.

Centre forms panel to study 'one nation one election' proposal under ex-Prez Kovind

The Central government on Friday announced the setting up of a high-level panel to study the proposal of 'one nation, one election'. Former president Ram Nath Kovind will head the panel and submit a report on the proposal.

The move comes a day after the government announced a special session of Parliament from September 18 to 22.

Soon after the announcement of the special session, speculation began over the 'one nation, one election'



proposal, which a section of the media had reported, could be discussed during the session.

The proposal refers to holding the Lok Sabha and state Assembly polls simulta-

neously across the country. The BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi have spoken on the issue on several occasions, and it was also a part of the party's manifesto for the 2014 Lok Sabha polls.

Conducting polls simultaneously was the norm in India until 1967 and four elections were held this way. The practice stopped after some state Assemblies were dissolved prematurely in 1968-69.

The Lok Sabha was also, for the first time, dissolved a year ahead of schedule and mid-term elections were held in 1971.

Countdown for India's rocket mission to the Sun begins at 12.20 pm

The countdown for the Saturday morning launch of India's third interplanetary mission -- this time to the Sun - Aditya-L1 -- will begin at 12.20 p.m. on Friday, said a senior official of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO).

"The countdown will begin at 12.20 p.m. today (Friday)," the official told reporter.

The Aditya-L1 -- named after the Sun God in Hindu mythology -- will be carried by the Indian rocket Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle-XL variant (PSLV-XL). On Saturday, the rocket will blast off at 11.50 a.m. from the Sriharikota rocket port in Andhra Pradesh, the ISRO said.

Initially, Aditya-L1 will be ejected in a low earth orbit (LEO). Then the orbit will be elliptical. As the spacecraft travels towards L1, it will exit the earth's gravitational Sphere of Influence (SOI). The total travel time from launch to L1 would take about four months for Aditya-L1 and the distance will be about 1.5 million km from the Earth. The distance between the Earth and the Moon is about 3,84,000 km. Aditya-L1's seven payloads are



expected to provide the most crucial information to understand the problem of coronal heating, coronal mass ejection, pre-flare and flare activities and their characteristics, dynamics of space weather, propagation of particle and fields and others, the Indian space agency said. The ISRO said the major science objectives of Aditya-L1 mission are: Study of solar upper atmospheric (chromosphere and corona) dynamics, study of chromospheric and coronal heating, physics of the partially ionised plasma, and initiation of the coronal mass ejections, and flares. It will also observe the in-situ particle and plasma environment providing data for the study of particle dynamics from the Sun.

5 killed, 20 injured in Manipur in last three days, non-stop firing still on

At least five persons, including a tribal song composer and a Village Defence Volunteer, were killed and 20 others injured in Manipur's Bishnupur and Churachandpur districts during the past three days while gunfights between Kukis and Meiteis were still on till Thursday night, officials said.

Sources said that the death toll in the incessant firing exchanges was six to seven in three days but officials were yet to confirm it.

The five slain people included L.S. Mangboi Lungdim, 50, who composed the song "I Gam Hilou Ham (Is this not our land?)" after the ethnic violence broke out in Manipur on May 3. His songs became a rallying cry for tribal unity. The dead also included VDV Jangminlung Gange. Firing was continuing in the foothills of

Bishnupur and adjoining areas in Churachandpur district till late Thursday evening, after a fresh gunfight between two rival ethnic groups started early morning, police officials said in Imphal. Two persons, who sustained splinter injuries during firing in Manipur's Bishnupur and Churachandpur districts, succumbed to their wounds on Thursday. Police said that a youth, who sustained splinter injuries on his head from a bomb blast on Wednesday, died while he was being shifted to Guwahati hospital for medical treatment via Mizoram. Another injured person of Wednesday's firing died on Thursday in Churachandpur district hospital, where he was undergoing treatment, a police official said. Defence sources said that in a prompt and effective response, the Army's quick action team foiled an attempted arson incident near Leimakhong on Thursday evening.

New China map draws more rejection, Asian countries back India's call

New Delhi: Vietnam said China's official map released this week violates its sovereignty over the Spratly and Paracel Islands and jurisdiction over its waters, according to a statement posted on the nation's government news website.

China's sovereignty and maritime claims based on the nine-dotted line on the map are "invalid," said the statement, which cited Pham Thu Hang, the spokesperson for Vietnam's foreign affairs ministry. Vietnam "resolutely opposes all China's claims in the South China Sea based on the dotted line," Hang added in the statement. The countries have also rejected the map. India on Tuesday took issue with a part of the map that shows sections of Arunachal Pradesh under China's control. And the Philippines said it doesn't recognize China's expansive claims in the South China Sea. Governments of Malaysia and Taiwan have also issued strongly worded statements accusing Beijing of claiming their territory.

CCI grants approval for merger of Vistara and Air India

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) granted approval on Friday for the merger between Tata Group's airlines - Vistara and Air India.

This significant development opens the door for Air India to potentially become India's largest international carrier and the second-largest domestic carrier, trailing only IndiGo. This decision follows several months of scrutiny, during which the CCI had issued a show cause notice to Air India back in June, seeking clarification on why the proposed merger with Vistara should not be subject to investigation due to concerns regarding competition within the aviation sector.

"C-2023/04/1022 CCI approves the merger of Tata SIA Airlines into Air India, and acquisition of certain shareholding by Singapore Airlines in Air India subject to compliance of voluntary commitments offered by the parties," the regulator said in a tweet on X (formerly known as Twitter) on Friday evening.



Vistara and Air India, both full-service airlines under the Tata Group, have a significant connection. Singapore Airlines (SIA) has a 49 per cent ownership stake in Vistara. Under this agreement, SIA is set to invest Rs 2,059 crore into the increased share capital of Air India, securing a 25.1 per cent stake in the company. The remaining majority stake of 74.9 per cent will be held by Tata Sons in the newly-formed entity.

RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das rated 'A+' in Global Finance Central Banker Report Cards 2023

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das has been rated "A+" in the Global Finance Central Banker Report Cards 2023, Central Bank said on Friday.

Taking to X (former Twitter), RBI said, "We are happy to announce that Governor Shaktikanta Das has been rated 'A+' in the Global Finance Central Banker Report Cards 2023. Das has been placed at the top of the list of three central bank governors who have been rated A+." The Bank Governors who earned an "A+" grade in the Global Finance Central Banker Report Cards 2023 are Shaktikanta Das from India,



Thomas J. Jordan (Switzerland), Nguyen Thi Hong (Vietnam)," an official statement issued by Global Finance magazine said. The Central Banker Report Cards, published annually by Global Finance since 1994, grade the central bank governors of 101 key countries, territories and districts, including the European Union, the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank, the Bank of Central African States and the Central Bank of West African States.

2 sisters including one minor gang-raped in Raipur; 10 arrested

Two sisters, including a minor, were allegedly gang-raped here when they were returning to their home, the police said on Friday, adding 10 people have been arrested in connection with the incident.

Police said the incident happened on Thursday when the women who had gone to celebrate Raksha Bandhan at some other location in the capital city of Chhattisgarh, were on their way back home along with a man on a two-wheeler. The accused individuals, on several motorcycles, cornered them.

Raipur Senior Superintendent of Police Prashant Agrawal said the accused first forcibly took



both the sisters to an isolated place and raped them while the man who was accompanying them was beaten up mercilessly. Agrawal said a search operation was

launched soon after the victims lodged an FIR at a police station late on Thursday.

The police officer said that as many as 10 accused involved in the case had been

arrested by Friday.

"All the accused have been booked after being booked under relevant sections of the IPC and the POCSO Act," Agrawal added.

Former PM Deve Gowda's grandson Prajwal Revanna disqualified as MP

In a major development, the Karnataka High Court on Friday disqualified JD-S Hassan MP Prajwal Revanna, the grandson of former Prime Minister H.D. Deve Gowda.

A bench, headed by Justice K. Natarajan, declared that the election of Revanna null and void.

The decision came on a petitions contesting his election, filed by advocate G. Devarajegowda, and the BJP's defeated candidate in 2019 parliamentary elections A. Manju, alleging that Revanna did not provide the details of full assets to the Election Commission.

The bench has also directed the Election Commission to initiate action against Revanna in connection with



election malpractice, as per the Conduct of Election Process Rules.

However, the court has rejected the petition by Manju seeking declaration by the court that he is the winner. The court has refused his submission following allegations of malpractice in elections being also proved against him.



'PM, BJP NEXUS OF CORRUPTION': INDIA REPRESENTS 60% POPULATION, SAYS RAHUL GANDHI

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday said that it is impossible for the BJP to win as the 60 per cent population is represented on the stage of INDIA.

He slammed the government saying that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the BJP is a nexus of corruption and that is the first time the alliance will demonstrate and prove.

Addressing the press conference here after the two-day meeting, Rahul Gandhi said: "Two very big steps were taken. The most important thing is to understand that this stage represents 60 per cent of the population. If the party on the stage unite, it is impossible for the BJP to win the election."

He said that the task in front of us is to come together in the most efficient ways. He said that the two steps taken by INDIA is formation of the coordination committee and committees under it and the second step is that we will expedite the seat sharing decision and discussions.

"These are two powerful steps to ensure we defeat BJP," he said, adding there is a clear nexus between the Prime minister and the particular businessman.



He said that G20 is taking place and it is very important for India's credibility that the Prime Minister makes his position clear and begins an inquiry in regard to Adani.

"The PM and the BJP are a nexus of corruption, and that is the first thing that the INDIA alliance will demonstrate and prove," Rahul Gandhi said.

He said that the idea behind Prime

Minister Modi's government is to extract money from the poor people and transfer it to a limited few.

"So we are going to propose a clear path, a development path, a clear set of ideas that will once again involve the poor people, the farmers, and the workers in the progress of this country," Rahul Gandhi said.

"There are people more senior to

me but real work in this alliance is the relationship forged between the leaders and I can say with confidence that these meetings have done a huge good to build rapport among the leaders. I can see that there is flexibility among all the leaders in the way we are approaching things. There are differences but I am impressed to see how these differences are being minimised and ironed out."

Talking about his recent visit to Ladakh, Rahul Gandhi slammed Prime Minister Modi and said: "I spent a week in Ladakh and went to Pangong Lake. Right in front were the Chinese. I had detailed discussions with politicians and especially with the shepherd of Pangong Lake. They told me that the Chinese have taken Indian land, and Prime Minister Modi is lying when he says that the Chinese have not taken our land. Every single person in Ladakh knows this. The people in Ladakh and India have been betrayed."

"There is clearly accommodation between the government and the Chinese. The borders have changed. This is known to everybody. Unfortunately, the media does not talk about these issues. It is shameful what has happened in Ladakh."

Long-standing BJP leaders continue to abandon party in poll-bound Madhya Pradesh, former MLA is 4th in last 5 months

Madhya Pradesh's ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) continues to witness jolt after jolt in the run-up to the Assembly elections as several leaders continue to quit and join other parties.

A day after a sitting MLA from Kolaras in Shivpuri district resigned, two-times former MLA Girija Shankar Sharma, a strong leader from Narmadapuram, also left the party and is likely to join the Congress very soon.

His resignation from the BJP may be deemed the routine musical chairs politicians perform during the elections, but on the other hand, if he shifts into the opposition, he would be the fourth leader associated with the BJP for decades to be poached by the Congress.

Sharma resigned from the BJP, accusing the saffron party of ignoring veteran leaders and workers after the advent of new leaders in the party.

The former MLA said he would ensure that the BJP candidates don't win from the seat, as the return of the

present government isn't in the state's larger interest.

About his political future, Sharma admitted that he has recently met state Congress chief Kamal Nath and senior leader Digvijaya Singh once, but he is yet to take any final decision on joining the opposition party.

"I will support the best opposition candidate from Hoshangabad Assembly seat. But it remains to be seen whether that will be done by being inside the Congress or outside. It's still a month and half before polls are announced, whether I'll join the Congress, the AAP or any other opposition party will be decided later," he said.

The Hoshangabad seat is one of the four seats of Narmadapuram district (earlier named Hoshangabad). All four seats were won by the BJP in 2018.

Sharma is the son of veteran BJP leader and former state assembly Speaker Sitasaran Sharma and the family have been influential in Narmadapuram since 1990. However, Sharma's resignation BJP's primary membership happened amid reports of possibility of the

BJP denying ticket to anyone from the Sharma family on the Hoshangabad seat for the first time in 33 years.

Key sources in the BJP claimed that the Sharma family is also dejected over being ignored in the recent cabinet rejig by Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. Sharma is the fourth from old BJP family to get disenchanted with the party in five months.

Before him, Rao Yadendra Singh Yadav who is the son of three-time former BJP MLA (late) Rao Deshraj Singh Yadav, quit the party to join the Congress in March. In April, former BJP MP from Khargone-ST seat, Makhan Singh Solanki also quit and joined the Congress. His nephew Sumer Singh Solanki is the BJP member of the Rajya Sabha.

In May, former CM late Kailash Joshi's son and former state minister Deepak Joshi also ended his decades-long association with the BJP to join the Congress. He is keen at contesting against Chouhan from the latter's political pocket-borough Budhni in central MP's Sehore district.

INDIA RECORDS 49 NEW COVID CASES

New Delhi: As many as 49 people have tested positive for Covid-19 in India during the last 24 hours, the Health Ministry said on Friday.

With the addition of the 49 new cases, the total caseload rose to 4,49,97,216, as per the ministry. On the other hand, 71 people have recovered from the disease, taking the tally to 4,44,63,788. The recovery rate stood at 98.81 per cent.

According to the Health Ministry, the death toll stands at 5,31,930, while active cases at 1,498. Over 220.67 crore doses of Covid-19 vaccine have been administered so far.

TOURIST FOOTFALL IN UP GOES UP BY OVER ONE CRORE

Over 14 crore tourists visited various destinations in Uttar Pradesh in the first half of the year, according to an official data shared by the UP tourism department.

"This is almost 1.1 crore over the number recorded in the previous year for the same period. This is an outcome of the steps taken by the state government towards boosting the tourism sector," said the official spokesman.

Officials said that the tourism sector has massive potential for income generation and job creation the sector has to offer, especially with the Ram Temple in Ayodhya set to open in the beginning of 2024. Officials also revealed that in 2022, nearly 31.86 crore tourists came to UP - a 190 per



cent increase over the previous year. "The UP government is poised to open the doors of employment opportunities through domestic tourism. Last year witnessed an astounding 190 per cent surge in the number of tourists, and the current year's pace is even more remarkable. In January, once the Ram Temple's sanc-

tum sanctorum is unveiled, we will witness a surge of pilgrims from across India. The tourism sector has huge potential for employment, and, as Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, will act as a catalyst for economic growth and job creation," said the official.

Jaiveer Singh, minister of tourism and culture said, "The

growth in the number of tourists in UP is a promising sign. The continuous development of religious, historical, and cultural sites is expected to further boost tourism. Simultaneously, employment opportunities will also expand. Our goal is to establish UP on a global map in the tourism sector."

Heavy rain likely in Kerala, Andaman & Nicobar in next 5 days: IMD

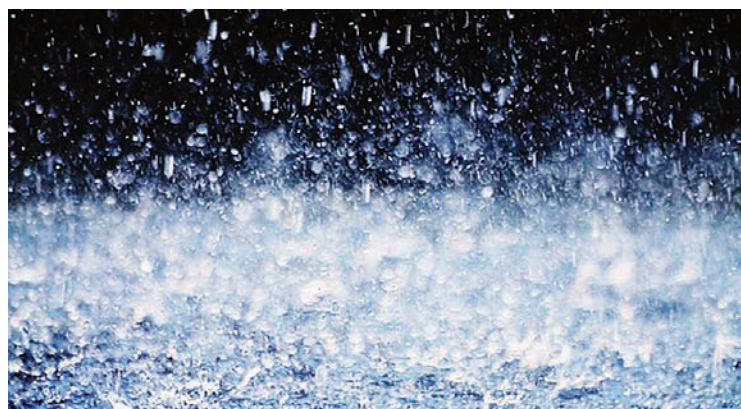

The India Meteorological Department on Friday forecast an increase in rainfall activity over East and East Central India from Saturday, while isolated heavy rain is likely over Kerala and Andaman and Nicobar Islands during next five days.

In Northeast India, till September 3, there is a forecast of light to moderate scattered to fairly widespread rainfall, with isolated heavy rainfall expected in Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura.

The next five days in East India will likely bring light to moderate fairly widespread to widespread rainfall, thunderstorms, and lightning.

"Isolated heavy rainfall is expected over the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. On September 3, Gangetic



West Bengal is likely to experience these conditions, and from Saturday to September 5, Odisha may see similar weather patterns," said the IMD. In Central India, from September 3-

5, there is a forecast of light to moderate fairly widespread to widespread rainfall, thunderstorms, and lightning. Isolated heavy rainfall is expected in Vidarbha and Chhattisgarh.

Moving to South India, on Friday and Saturday, there is a prediction of light to moderate scattered rainfall, with isolated heavy rainfall expected in Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, and South Interior Karnataka.

"On September 3 and 4, North Interior Karnataka may experience similar conditions, and from Friday to September 5, Kerala is expected to see this pattern," said the weather forecast agency.

Additionally, on September 3 and 4, Rayalaseema is likely to have these weather conditions, and from September 3 to 5, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Telangana may experience them. However, for the rest of the country, subdued rainfall activity is expected over the next five days, the IMD predicted.

Ahead of G20 summit, Delhi HC declares Sep 8 holiday for itself, lower courts

The Delhi High Court on Friday issued a notification declaring a holiday on September 8 for itself and all district courts ahead of the G20 Summit, which is scheduled to be held in the national capital on September 9 and 10.

It was announced that September 8, has been designated as a holiday for both the high court and the subordinate courts, and to compensate for the holiday, the high court would be in session on December 16 (Saturday), and trial courts would operate on December 9 (a second Saturday).

Regarding cases scheduled



for hearings, orders, and judgments on September 8, the notification outlined that these matters would be taken up on September 11, in addition to the cases already listed for that day. The declara-

tion of September 8 as a holiday aims to facilitate preparations and security measures for the G20 Summit, which is expected to host prominent leaders from various member countries.

'Fan' deceives Pune's 'Gold Man' over 18 tola gold chain

Social media figure Monu Badekar, known as the 'Gold Man', was deceived by a supposed fan, Mahesh alias Mallappa Sahebanna Hosmani (31) from Katraj in Pune district.

Badekar, who boasts a following of 4.6 lakh on Instagram, loaned an 18 tola gold chain to Hosmani in January. Instead of returning the chain, Hosmani pawned it for Rs 20,000, citing urgent financial need.

Despite Badekar promptly transferring the required sum to retrieve the chain, Hosmani continued to evade him with various excuses over the following months.

Matters intensified as Badekar learned of Hosmani's criminal past and his involvement in theft cases. Confronting him for the chain's return led to threats from Hosmani, who insinuated Badekar's involvement in his illegal activities.

Hosmani then made defamatory online statements, claiming Badekar owed him money. Ultimately, Badekar was fleeced of Rs 2 lakh by Hosmani under threat of further defamation and legal action.

The Loni Kalbhorr police have lodged a case



against Hosmani, charging him under multiple sections of the Indian Penal Code, including criminal breach of trust, extortion, and defamation.

WOMAN FOUND HANGING IN GHAZIABAD, BOYFRIEND ARRESTED

A woman was found hanging at her house in the Vaishali area, the police said on Friday, adding that her boyfriend has been arrested as her death looks suspicious.

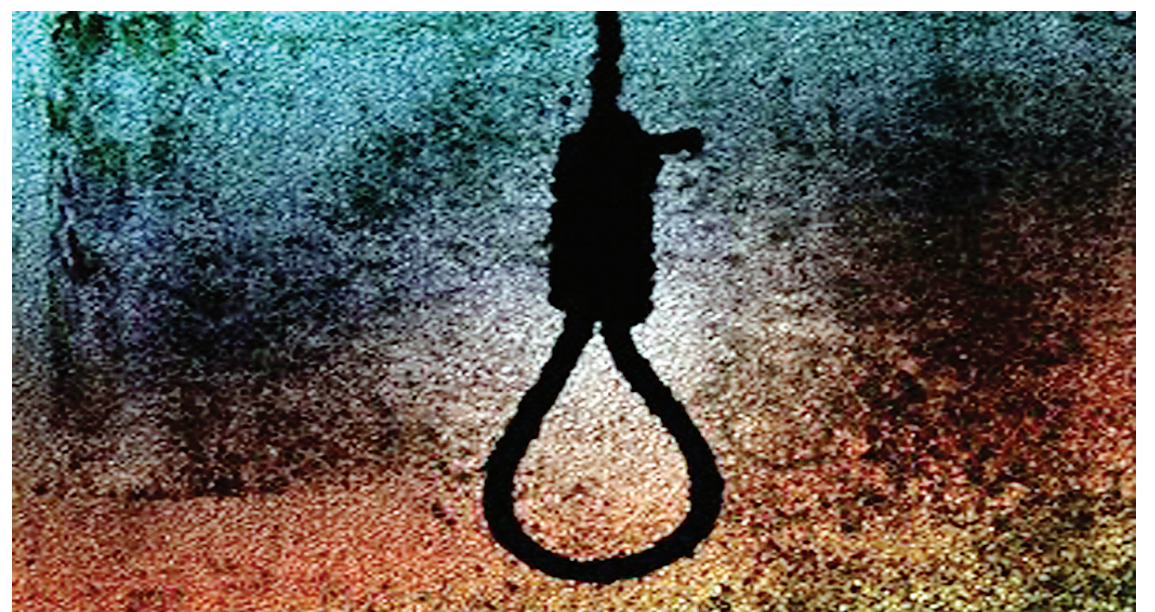
The deceased has been identified as Pinky Gupta, who lived in a rented accommodation in Sector-3, Vaishali.

Initial probe suggests there was some dispute between the couple who had been in a relationship for about four years.

Pinky used to work in a gym. Though her family stays in Ghaziabad, she was living separately with her partner, Shahid Khan, in Sector-3 for the past three months.

"The body was shifted for post-mortem. Based on the information gathered by the police, Shahid has been taken into custody," said

Pinky's family also demanded the filing of a complaint against Shahid for allegedly pushing Gupta into committing suicide.

According to the police, Pinky and

Khan had been in a relationship for four years and were living together in Vaishali for the past three months. Pinky had maintained a personal diary since 2021, in which she chronicled her daily life and expressed her

thoughts through poetry.

Prior to her tragic demise, Pinky seemed to have written about her feelings of unreciprocated love and her willingness to do anything for her partner.

Woman dragged, thrashed in public as 5-month-old infant lies on ground; three held

In an inhumane act, a woman in Madhya Pradesh's Sagar was seen being dragged, thrashed, and kicked even in public as she cried and pleaded for mercy, even as her five-month old infant lay unattended on the ground, as per a viral video.

The woman was being punished allegedly for arguing with a shop owner for milk to feed her baby.

As per the officials, the video showing disgraceful incident was recorded on August 12 at a bus stand in Sagar district, and surfaced on social media from Wednesday night.

Coming to know about the incident, local police started investigation and found that the incident occurred after the woman had a spat with a shopkeeper.

"Preliminary investigation revealed that the woman had gone to shop for milk for her child, when she had a verbal argument with shopkeeper. She was asked to leave the place, but she resisted, subsequently, some people started thrashing and beating her. Further details are being collected,"



Additional SP, Sagar, Lokesh Singh said.

He also told the press that three accused involved in thrashing the woman have been arrested on Thursday evening and sent to jail. The accused have been identified as Pravin Raiwar, 26, Vikki, 20, and Rakesh, 40.

In the viral video, the distraught woman can be heard wailing: "Bhaiya, mujhe mere parivaar se milwa do," (brother, please help me find my family), even as the mob continued to thrash her.

It was also claimed that the woman would sit on the roadside and abuse passersby and shopkeepers, however, police was yet to say anything on this part so far.

Sick Leopard abused, harassed by Dewas villagers dies in Indore

Leopard, with whom villagers were spotted playing and taking selfies at a village in Madhya Pradesh's Dewas, died at a zoo in Indore during treatment on Friday.

The leopard was seriously ill and was undergoing treatment at a veterinary hospital in Indore, an official said.

"The animal was brought from the Dewas forest range around 10 am and the treatment began at 11 am. The primary symptoms were noticed seamed neurological," Dr Uttam Yadav, in-charge of Kamla Nehru Prani Sangrahalaya, said.

There could be multiple reasons for the death, he said, adding that the villagers were treating and handling the leopard like a calf, which was very surprising.



"This is a case of neurological disorder in which the animal forgets its identity. It was seen in the viral video that the leopard neither roared nor attacked anyone. The villagers were

treating it like a calf," Dr Yadav told news agency.

"A team of Dewas Forest Department came to Indore with the leopard and we started treating it.

There can be many reasons - either a dumped form of rabies or the canine distemper virus," Dr Yadav said.

According to the veterinarian, partial blindness was also found in the leopard and it was having fits every half an hour, like in epilepsy. The animal's body was stiff and the body temperature was high. However, it was brought under control. There was also dehydration due to the leopard being hungry and thirsty for a long time. According to him, the leopard's fits and epilepsy reduced in the last 24 hours but its condition remained critical.

A team of Wildlife Forensic and Health from Jabalpur collected samples from the animal for further examination.

The age of the leopard was about 10 years and there were no injury marks on its body.

Senior BJP leader Girija Shankar Sharma resigns from the party

Study suggests long Covid-brain fog linked to blood clots

Researchers have found that blood clots after a Covid infection may be due to ongoing cognitive problems, commonly referred to as 'brain fog'.



Brain fog is common and debilitating, and can affect the ability to work, yet their biological underpinnings remain unknown. It can affect people's thinking, concentration or memory for at least six months.

Researchers from the University of Oxford, UK said that high levels of two proteins at the time of Covid-19 have been found in patients who later experienced cognitive problems, including 'brain fog'.

The study gave a major clue as to one cause of their symptoms: blood clots, said researchers from the University of Oxford, UK.

The team looked at blood tests from 1,837 people who had been hospitalised with Covid to find potential proteins (biomarkers) associated with subsequent cognitive problems, with symptoms including serious and persistent problems with thinking, concentration and memory.

Their memory was assessed at six and 12 months after hospitalisation using both a formal test and by asking them their own subjective view about their memory.

In a new paper published in Nature Medicine, they identified two separate profiles of biomarkers. The first was having a high level of a protein called fibrinogen, and the second was a raised level of a protein fragment called D-dimer. "Both fibrinogen and D-dimer are involved in blood clotting, and so the results support the hypothesis that blood clots are a cause of post-Covid cognitive problems. Fibrinogen may be directly acting on the brain and its blood vessels, whereas D-dimer often reflects blood clots in the lungs and the problems in the brain might be due to lack of oxygen," Dr Max Taquet and colleagues from the varsity.

"In line with this possibility, people who had high levels of D-dimer were not only at a higher risk of brain fog, but also at a higher risk of respiratory problems," Taquet said. Other aspects of the profiles suggested they are likely to reflect blood clots. The main findings were replicated using electronic health records in a separate population.

Professor Paul Harrison, from the University who supervised the study, said: "Identifying predictors and possible mechanisms is a key step in understanding post-Covid brain fog. This study provides some significant clues." "The ultimate goal is to be able to prevent and reverse the cognitive problems seen in some people after Covid-19 infection. Although our results are a significant advance in understanding the basis of these symptoms, more research is needed into the causes and effects before we propose and test interventions," Taquet said.

COVID HOSPITALISATIONS RISE IN US AMID CALLS TO MAKE MASKS MANDATORY

The nationwide Covid hospitalisations in the US have increased by nearly 19 per cent in a single week and deaths by more than 21 per cent, as the country goes through a late-summer spike in Covid infections.

According to the latest Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) data, up to 10,000 people a week have been hospitalised with Covid, reports NPR.

The rising Covid cases have prompted some schools, hospitals and businesses to encourage, or even require, people to start masking up again.

CDC Director Mandy Cohen cautioned that Covid remains risky for people who are unvaccinated.

The risk is especially high for unvaccinated individuals who haven't gotten the virus before



and those who are older or have underlying health conditions.

"About 70 per cent of hospitalisations are among those who are 65 and older," she was quoted as saying in the report late on Thursday.

The health officials are watch-

ing two new variants -- Omicron variant EG.5 (Eris) which is dominant in the US and BA.2.86 which is starting to spread.

The CDC warned last week that BA.2.86 may be "more capable of causing infection" in people who have previously had

the Covid virus or vaccines. "All of that has driven some institutions around the country to reinstate mask mandates, at least temporarily," said the report.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has designated EG.5 or Eris as a "variant of interest" as cases rise globally. "EG.5 is a descendent lineage of XBB.1.9.2, which has the same spike amino acid profile as XBB.1.5. EG.5 was first reported on February 17, 2023, and designated as a variant under monitoring (VUM) on July 19, 2023. With this risk evaluation, we are designating EG.5 and its sub-lineages as a variant of interest (VOI)," according to the WHO.

According to WHO, the largest portion of EG.5 sequences are from China (30.6 per cent, 2247 sequences). However, it believes the variant does not pose a significant risk.

9 soldiers killed, 5 injured in suicide attack in Pakistan

Islamabad: Nine Pakistani soldiers were killed and five others injured in a suicide attack in Bannu district of country's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province.

A motorcycle-borne suicide bomber exploded himself near a military convoy in the Jani Khel area of Bannu district of the province on Thursday, army's media wing Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said in a statement. The area has been cordoned off by security forces and an operation is being carried out to eliminate any terrorists found in the area, Geo news reported quoting the statement. Security forces are determined to eliminate the menace of terrorism and such sacrifices of soldiers would further strengthen the resolve, Pakistani Army said. Caretaker Prime Minister Anwaar-ul-Haq Kakar said that he was "heartbroken" by the loss of nine "valiant soldiers" to a cowardly terrorist act that injured many. Earlier last week, six soldiers and four terrorists were killed in a clash in South Waziristan district of KP province, according to the military.

US woman sets record for world's longest female mullet

A 58-year-old US woman has earned Guinness World Record for the longest mullet of any female measuring 172.72 cm (5 ft 8 in), media reports said.

The woman, Tami Manis, who is a public health nurse in Knoxville city in the US' Tennessee state, had last cut her hair on February 9, 1990.

She told Guinness that she began growing her hair in the 1980s, after watching 'Til Tuesday's' music video for its song, 'Voices Carry'.

"The girl had a rat tail and I really wanted one of those," she said.

In 1989, when Manis had went to salon, hairdresser told her that the style did not suit her, after which she decided to go for the hair do. However, she immediately regretted the decision and has not cut it since, as per New York Post.

"I've been blessed that my hair grows and now it's the world's longest mullet and I'm very happy



with it, she told Guinness.

She shared that her friends and family ask questions about her mullet which has become frequent topic of conversation.

Manis said that people recognise her from 20 years ago because she has kept the same hairstyle.

She credited her good genes for so long and thick hair and said her hair care involves washing her mullet with hask hair products, including shampoo and conditioner. In 2022, Manis competed in the "Femullet" division of the 2022 US Mullet Championships in which she stood second and took home the \$300 prize.

PHILIPPINES: SUPER TYPHOON SAOLA LEAVES 1 DEAD, DISPLACES OVER 3,87,000

Super typhoon Saola, which triggered floods and landslides in the Philippines, has left at least one dead and displaced 3,87,242 people across the country, the government said on Friday.

Saola grew into a super typhoon, dumping heavy rain and severe winds in the main Luzon island and central Philippines, Xinhua news agency reported.

The National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council said more than 21,000 are still in temporary shelters.

The country continues to experience rain even after Saola exited the country this week, with many areas flooded, including Metro Manila. Meanwhile, severe tropical



storm Haiikui, which intensified into a typhoon on Friday, is enhancing the southwest monsoon and threatening to dump more rain over the weekend, the state weather bureau said. The bureau last spotted Haiikui 785 km north-east of Batanes province, blow-

ing westward at 20 km per hour, packing 120 km per hour winds and gusts of up to 150 km per hour.

Haiikui is the eighth typhoon to lash the archipelago country this year. The bureau added that another severe tropical storm is also approaching.

Trump pleads not guilty in 2020 Georgia election case

Former US President Donald Trump has pleaded not guilty to charges of attempting to overturn his 2020 presidential election defeat in the southeastern state of Georgia. "As evidenced by my signature below, I do hereby waive formal arraignment and enter my plea of NOT GUILTY to the Indictment in this case," Trump said in a court filing on Thursday in Fulton County Superior Court, Xinhua news agency reported.

Trump and 18 others were indicted on August 14 over alleged efforts to overturn the results of the 2020 presidential election in Georgia.

Trump was charged with 13 counts, including violating the state's racketeering act, soliciting a public officer to violate his oath, conspiring to impersonate a public officer, conspiring to commit forgery in the first degree, and conspiring to file false documents.

Fulton County Superior Court Judge Scott McAfee had set arraignment hearings for Trump and other defendants charged in the case for



September 6. That plea means the former Republican president will not appear in person in court next week to face the charges.

Trump's lawyers also asked the judge to separate his case from some of his co-defendants who sought a speedy trial in the case.

Last week, Trump turned himself in at the Fulton County jail in Atlanta, Georgia, becoming the first former president to have a mug shot taken. Trump, the front-runner in the 2024 Republican presidential primary, has been indicted in four criminal cases -- two by the Justice Department, and two by state prosecutors in New York and Georgia, separately. The Georgia case is the fourth criminal case to be brought against him.

Trump has criticized the cases against him as part of a politically motivated attempt to keep him from recapturing the White House.

Marital dispute ends in tragedy as woman jumps to death with infant son

In what seems to be a fall-out of a marital dispute, a 26-year-old woman allegedly leaped to her death from a high-rise building, along with her one-year-old son, in this district of Maharashtra on Friday.

Kasarvadavali Police Station said. The couple had a disagreement after the man disallowed his wife to visit her sister's house for Raksha Bandhan. He voiced his reservations against travelling with their infant child. A distraught Mohite then jumped off the balcony along with her son. They were

found in a pool of blood by the neighbours who rushed them to a nearby hospital.

Both were pronounced dead upon arrival by the doctors.

The bodies have been shifted to a government hospital for post-mortem.

A case of accidental death has been registered.

SC doubts its earlier order permitting house arrest for Bhima Koregaon accused Gautam Navlakha

The Supreme Court on Friday asked the National Investigation Agency (NIA) to file a reply in four weeks' time to activist Gautam Navlakha's plea seeking to be shifted to a house in the Alibaug area of Maharashtra.

Navlakha is currently under house arrest at a Mumbai public library in connection with the Elgar Parishad-Maoist links case.

In a turn of events, the apex court on Friday raised doubts on its November 2022 order allowing Navlakha to be released from detention and placed under house arrest on grounds of his deteriorating health. Such an order, the court orally observed, might set the 'wrong precedent'. On November 10, last year, the top court had allowed Navlakha to be placed under house arrest after considering his deteriorating health and also asked him to provide local surety of Rs 2 lakh by November 14.



Navlakha's counsel apprised a bench of Justices M.M. Sundresh and J.B. Pardiwala that the top court had directed the NIA to file its reply in April but it has not submitted its response to date. The court then adjourned the hearing for eight weeks until the end of October. Stressing on the urgency of his application the

court was told that he would have to vacate his current residence soon.

On the other hand, Additional Solicitor General S.V. Raju reiterated the central agency's concerns over the order of house arrest.

He said: "This is an unusual order of house arrest. Probably the first of its kind... And this plea for house arrest was on grounds of his sickness. He said one lady would stay with him. But she is not staying with him most of the time, when in jail, there would be a force to look after so many people." "To which, Justice Sundresh said that the court had its reservations about its earlier order and said that such an order for one person might set the wrong precedent. The judge said: "Prima facie we have our reservations, but a lengthy order has been passed... Without going into the merits of the case, this might set a wrong precedent. His plea may have one hundred per cent merit and we are not saying anything on that."

MAHA LEADERS SLAM CENTRE'S MOVES FOR 'ONE NATION, ONE ELECTION'

The state Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) leaders slammed the purported moves by the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) to push through the agenda of 'One Nation, One Election' at the upcoming Special Session of Parliament, here on Friday.

Congress' Leader of Opposition (Assembly) Vijay Wadettiwar attacked the move, saying that "the BJP government is running scared and indulging in such things, but all the national opposition leaders attending the INDIA Conclave will discuss the issue today". Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Priyanka Chaturvedi said that already three committees have been constituted earlier for 'One Nation, One Election' and have submitted their reports as well. "So this 4th committee is nothing but a red herring to take attention away from INDIA and Peoples' agenda... When will the



Centre form a committee on record-breaking price rise, unemployment, growing atrocities against women, Adani Group financial frauds, farmers' unrest, China adding Arunachal Pradesh, Aksai Chin in its territorial maps? Till the core issues are unresolved, this is nothing but a distraction," said Chaturvedi sharply. Chaturvedi questioned how the

government can do this without accepting the previous committees' reports, taking the consent of the Election Commission of India, all the parties, state CMs, and others, and vowed that the entire Opposition will oppose it. Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) National Spokesperson Clyde Crasto wondered "how any proposal for 'One Nation, One Election' can pos-

sibly be pushed through in a democracy, the infrastructure is not in place, the Opposition parties are not consulted, and the people of the country are not prepared for it."

"What is the BJP's motive... Is it so scared of the INDIA alliance's growing influence and wants to ground it before it takes off? Why is the BJP suddenly being desperate and trying to push the country to a precarious position without taking the nation into confidence...," asked Crasto.

Congress' former CM Prithviraj Chavan said that "this means the BJP is rattled by the INDIA alliance" and is resorting to such diversionary tactics, but they will not succeed.

Sena (UBT) MP and Chief Spokesperson Sanjay Raut said that the Opposition parties will oppose any such moves strongly at the INDIA Conclave where many crucial decisions are likely to be taken.

INDIA will sweep 2024 LS elections: Uddhav Thackeray

30 Investors duped of Rs 32 crore by firm near Mumbai, case against 2: Police

The police have registered a case against two people, including the owner of a firm, in Maharashtra's Thane district for allegedly cheating 30 investors of nearly Rs 32 crore on the promise of large returns on investments, an official said on Friday.

The case was registered against Parag Thakker, the proprietor of Indo-Pacific Global Services Company, and its manager Sagar Chinnarampelli, he said.

"Between January 2022 and February 2023, the accused lured people into investing in their firm and promised to give 12 per cent returns on investments," the police official said, quoting the complaint. "A total of 30 people invested money



between Rs 50 lakh to a crore each in the company. The accused issued promissory notes to the investors and later gave them cheques. But the cheques bounced as the bank accounts were already frozen," he said.

On realising they have been cheated of Rs 31.95

crore collectively, the victims approached the police and filed a complaint, he added. An offence under relevant Sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) for cheating, criminal breach of trust, and common intention was registered today, but no arrests have been made so far, the police said.

VP Dhankhar launches MDL's 4th stealth frigate 'Mahendragiri'

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Friday launched 'Mahendragiri', the fourth Stealth Frigate of Project-17 Alpha, being built by the Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd (MDL).

The fourth and final ship of the Nilgiri Class being constructed by the MDL, the 'Mahendragiri' has been designed by the Indian Navy's Bureau of Naval Design and will be fitted with advanced state-of-the-art weapons, sensors, communication facilities and other systems.

The first ship in the P-17A 'Nilgiri' was launched in September 2019 and is expected to go for sea trials around mid-2024, the second ship P-17A 'Udaygiri' was launched in May 2022 with sea trials in the second half of 2024, and the third 'Taragiri' was launched in September 2020 with delivery expected by August 2025.

Named after a mountain peak in the Eastern Ghats in Odisha, the keel of 'Mahendragiri' was laid in June 2022, and like the previous versions, is being built with integrated construction methodology.



The P-17A series is valued at a total Rs.27,500 crore and the MDL Mumbai is constructing four of the seven ships in this class.

The 'Mahendragiri' will be around 149 metres long and 16 metres wide, with a displacement of around 6,600 tons and a speed of some 30 knots.

Akin to the other three frigates, the steel used in the hull construction is indigenously developed DMR 249A, a low-carbon micro-alloy grade steel manufactured by SAIL.

The P-17A ships are far more advanced than any other frigates operated by the Indian Navy and come with powerful weapons and sensor packages which are capable of neutralising threats from three dimensions - air, surface, and sub-surface. The indigenously-designed 'Mahendragiri' will have state-of-the-art weaponry, sensors, advanced action information system, integrated platform management system, world-class modular living spaces, sophisticated power distribution system and other modern features.

It will be fitted with a supersonic surface-to-surface missile system, and its air defence capability designed to counter enemy aircraft threats and anti-ship cruise missiles will revolve around the vertical launch and long-range surface-to-air missile system.

The ship will have two 30-mm rapid-fire guns for close-in-defence capability and an SRGM Gun will provide effective naval gunfire support, plus other 'punches' like an indigenously developed triple tube lightweight torpedo launchers and rocket launchers for anti-submarine operations.



Taylor Swift's Eras Tour set to get its own concert film in US theatres

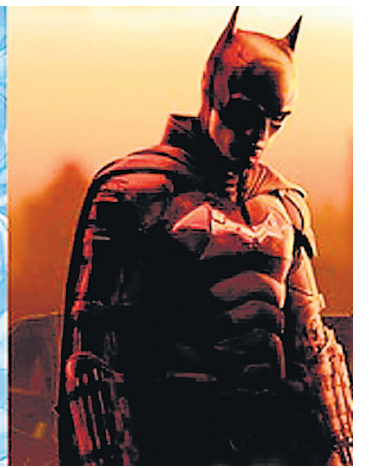

FOCUS ON INDIA'S MIDDLE-ORDER IN FACE-OFF WITH CONFIDENT PAKISTAN AMIDST RAIN THREAT

In the cool and serene surroundings of Sri Lanka, fans from around the world will witness another chapter being added to the India-Pakistan rivalry when the two neighbours clash in a Group A match of the Asia Cup at the Pallekele International Cricket Stadium on Saturday.

In India's opening match of the Asia Cup, they will be without wicket-keeper-batter K.L. Rahul due to a niggle unrelated to his right thigh injury, which has kept him out of action after May 1 this year. Though they have a like-to-like reserve player in Sanju Samson, it seems that Ishan Kishan could bat in the middle-order to fill in for Rahul's absence.

Though Kishan hit three consecutive fifties in ODIs against West Indies in July, the top three of Shubman Gill, captain Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli have been set for a long time. Especially with the Men's ODI World Cup squad selection deadline on September 5, the Indian team won't be looking at tinkering the top three just to fit in Kishan for a stop-gap period.

Moreover, Kishan brings in the left-handedness in the middle-order, something which India has missed and can be sandwiched between



right-handers Shreyas Iyer and Suryakumar Yadav.

Amidst the middle-order headache, India will be glad that Iyer is back. His return solves India's concerns at No.4, with Iyer's ability to use his feet and dominate the spinners taking the team's charge in middle-overs batting.

On the bowling front, the long-awaited return of Jasprit Bumrah and his testing the likes of Pakistan captain Babar Azam, Imam-ul-Haq and Mohammad Rizwan will be keenly witnessed.

India will need to see who between Mohammed Shami, Mohammed Siraj and Prasad Krishna will be join-

ing Bumrah in leading the charge with pace. Regarding the composition of their spin attack, Ravindra Jadeja and Kuldeep Yadav will be the front runners, but if conditions aid more spin, then Axar Patel can come into play too. It's a no-brainer that India's batting will be largely tested by the Pakistan fiery pace trio of Shaheen Shah Afridi, Naseem Shah and Haris Rauf in the early part of their innings with the bat. In their unique ways, the trio provide fire, pace and variety to rattle the batters, with leg-spin and left-arm spin duo of Shadab Khan and Mohammad Nawaz to complement them.

With the bat, Azam scored his 19th

ODI century in the opening game of the Asia Cup against Nepal under testing conditions in Multan and was ably supported by power-hitter Iftikhar Ahmed's first international century. Pakistan would be hoping that their other batters like Rizwan, Imam and Fakhar Zaman come to the party against India's bowlers.

According to weather.com, there is an 84 percent chance of thunderstorms and an 80 percent chance of rain on Saturday, putting the match under serious doubt. With a capacity crowd expected to throng the stadium for the high-octane India-Pakistan clash, expect another humdinger to be added to their rivalry provided the rain stays away.

The Diamond League finals is scheduled for September 16-17 in Eugene (US).

Kohli, Bumrah among Lisa Sthalekar's five players pick for dream ODI XI for World Cup

What he can do with his pace and if he gets a bit of movement.

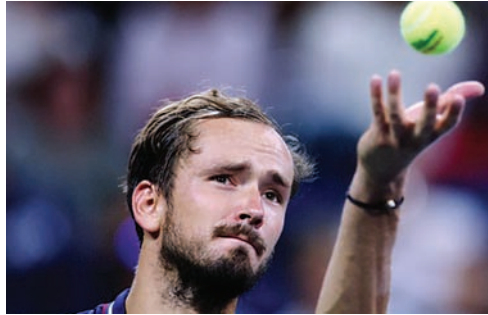
Medvedev, Zverev, Rublev advance to third round; Veterans Murray, Isner out

Russian Daniil Medvedev secured his 250th hard-court victory late at night against Australian Christopher O'Connell on Day 4 in the US Open. In the third set tie-break, Medvedev outclassed the Australian with his depth of the court and ability of ground coverage.

With this win, he went straight into the third round clocking back at 2021 when he won the US Open final defeating Serbian Novak Djokovic straightaway in three sets.

Another Russian, Andrey Rublev, the eighth seed, also impressed, showcasing his resiliency and consistency in defeating Gael Monfils. Both players' tenacity was on display during their protracted rallies, but Rublev's higher level of consistency allowed him to move to the third round. Alexander Zverev, who had previously reached the US Open final, also kept up his quest for a major championship. The German increased his prospects of making it to the



ATP Finals after defeating countryman German Daniel Altmaier in a gripping match. Former champion Andy Murray and American powerhouse John Isner saw their journey come to an end on a day of intense action and compelling matchups. Under the hot sun at Arthur Ashe Stadium, Murray had to contend with Grigor Dimitrov. Meanwhile, Isner, who is renowned for his extended bouts, made a spirited attempt but was ultimately unsuccessful in the sin-

gles competition. The American became well-known for playing Nicolas Mahut in a historic 11-hour, 5-minute Wimbledon match in 2010.

However, Isner declared his retirement plans but was unsuccessful in claiming a victory to round off his career. Isner didn't get the send-off he had anticipated when fellow countryman Michael Mmoh came back from being down two sets to overcome him. Earlier in the tournament defending champion Carlos Alcaraz continued his dominance and propelled to third round after a dominant performance against South African Lloyd Harris. Alcaraz will face British player Daniel Evans in the following round as he moves on to face yet another tough foe. Some outstanding performances in the women's competition raised the excitement of Day 4 much more. With a score of 6-3, 6-1, third-seeded Jessica Pegula easily defeated Patricia Maria Tig in her match. By coming back from a set down to overcome American Sofia Kenin, Russian Daria Kasatkina demonstrated her tenacity.

On a given day anyone can beat anyone, says Rohit Sharma ahead of key clash with Pakistan

Look in the nets, we don't have Shaheen, Naseem or Rauf. We practice with who we have. They are all quality bowlers. We just have to use our experience to play them tomorrow."

With the Asia Cup being a preparatory tournament ahead of the Men's ODI World Cup in India, Rohit stressed being in the present and taking things one step at a time. "We try to keep our goals small and see what's in front of us. We have Pakistan to face tomorrow and we will focus on that first and then look ahead."
