## MVA cracks seat-share formula, Uddhav Thackeray grabs maximum

The Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) alliance has finally sealed its long-drawn seat-sharing deal 'amicably' for the 48 Lok Sabha seats in Maharashtra, top leaders said here on Tuesday.  
As per the arrangement, the Shiv Sena (UBT) led by former Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray will contest 21 seats, the state Congress headed by Nana Patole will fight 17 constituencies and Nationalist Congress Party (SP) led by Sharad Pawar will contest 10 seats. The announcement was made in the presence of all the other MVA allies, including smaller parties like PWP, CPI, AAP, CPM, SP and other Dalit parties. While the main contenders have already finalised/announced their candidates for a majority of the constituencies, the rest shall be done in the coming few days, and the decision was unanimously taken based on the winnability factor in the maximum number of seats, the leaders said.  
Pawar said there was no difference on any seat, while Thackeray appreciated the smaller parties for not building pressures on the alliance to contest seats "in view of the larger aim to save democracy".

## Pakistan High Commission grants 2,843 visas to Indian Sikh pilgrims for Baisakhi

The Pakistan High Commission has issued a total of 2,843 visas to Sikh pilgrims from India to participate in the annual Baisakhi festivities.  
Scheduled to be celebrated on April 13, the festival holds cultural and religious significance for the Sikh community, as it marks the beginning of the Sikh New Year.  
Despite ongoing tensions between the two nations, the tradition of Indian pilgrims visiting Sikh holy shrines in Pakistan for Baisakhi goes on. Pilgrims would visit Gurdwara Panja Sahib, Gurdwara Nankana Sahib, and Gurdwara Kartarpur Sahib.

**THE WARMING MAY SET A NEW RECORD IN 2024 AS SCIENTISTS SAY EL NINO - PERIODIC WARMING OF THE OCEAN SURFACE IN THE CENTRAL AND EASTERN TROPICAL PACIFIC OCEAN -- TYPICALLY HAS THE GREATEST IMPACT ON GLOBAL CLIMATE IN THE SECOND YEAR OF ITS DEVELOPMENT.**

The world experienced the warmest March ever due to a combined effect of El Nino conditions and human caused climate change, making it the 10th consecutive month since June last year to set a new temperature record, the European Union's climate agency said today.  
The Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) said the average temperature of 14.14 degrees Celsius in March was 1.68 degrees Celsius higher than the month's average for 1850-1900, the designated pre-industrial reference period.  
It was 0.73 degrees Celsius above the 1991-2020 average for March and 0.10 degrees Celsius above the previous high set in March 2016.  
C3S said the global average temperature breached the 1.5 degrees Celsius threshold for an entire year for the first time in January.  
A permanent breach of the 1.5 degrees Celsius limit specified in the Paris Agreement, however, refers to long-term warming over many years.  
According to climate scientists, countries need to limit the global average temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial period to avoid the worst impacts of climate change.  
The rise in global average temperature is attributed to the rapidly increasing concentration of greenhouse gases -- primarily carbon dioxide and methane -- in the atmosphere.  
The continuing, albeit weaker, El Nino and



predicted above-normal sea-surface temperatures over much of the global oceans are expected to lead to above-normal temperatures over almost all land areas until May and influence regional rainfall patterns, the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) said in a March update.  
El Nino occurs every two to seven years on

average and typically lasts nine to 12 months. The current El Nino event, which developed in June 2023, was at its strongest between November and January.  
It is associated with increased rainfall in the Horn of Africa and the southern US, and unusually dry and warm conditions in Southeast Asia, Australia, and southern Africa.

## INDIA HEADED FOR A NORMAL MONSOON: SKYMET

**New Delhi:** India is expected to get a normal monsoon in 2024, private weather forecasting agency Skymet said on Tuesday, which is good news for the country's agricultural sector that was hit by an erratic monsoon last year.  
Monsoon rains are expected to be 102 per cent of the long-period average of 868.6 mm for the four-month period from June to Sept, according to

Skymet.  
The forecasting agency said it expects "sufficiently good rains" in southern, western and north-western parts of the country.  
Close to half the country's farm area is unirrigated and dependent on the rains for raising crops.  
A good monsoon also ensures that the country's water reservoirs get filled up and can be used for subsequent irrigation.

## RUSSIA, KAZAKHSTAN EVACUATE OVER 100,000 PEOPLE AMID WORST FLOODING IN DECADES

**Moscow:** Russia and Kazakhstan ordered more than 100,000 people to evacuate after swiftly melting snow swelled mighty rivers beyond bursting point in the worst flooding in the area for at least 70 years. The deluge of melt water overwhelmed scores of settlements in the Ural Mountains, Siberia and areas of Kazakhstan close to rivers such as the Ural and Tobol, which local

officials said had risen by metres in a matter of hours to the highest levels ever recorded. The Ural River, Europe's third largest which flows through Russia and Kazakhstan into the Caspian, burst through an embankment dam on Friday, flooding the city of Orsk just south of the Ural mountains. Downstream, water levels in Orenburg, a city of around 550,000, were rising.

## Raj Thackeray extends 'unconditional' support to PM Narendra Modi

Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) President Raj Thackeray on Tuesday extended his 'unconditional support' to Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the interest of a strong leadership for the future of the country and its youth.  
Making the announcement at a Gudi Padva (Maharashtrian New Year) rally here, the MNS chief also said that he had no expectations for any seats in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls or the Assembly elections scheduled later this year.  
Scotching all speculation, Raj Thackeray said he is not concerned about the ruling



MahaYuti of Shiv Sena-BJP-NCP, or the aspects of seat-sharing in the state.  
The MNS chief also said that he has extended his full support to the firm leadership of PM Modi for the future of the country and its youth, as he hinted at keeping his options open in the coming

days.  
However, he called upon the MNS workers to get cracking for the Assembly elections due around October this year, amid loud cheers and claps at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Park here.  
The announcement by the MNS chief -- who is the estranged cousin of Shiv Sena (UBT) President and former Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray -- is expected to serve as a psychological booster for the MahaYuti ahead of the Lok Sabha elections.  
The development came a day after BJP's Deputy CM Devendra Fadnis expressed hopes that Raj Thackeray would declare his support to the MahaYuti.

## Kejriwal to move SC challenging Delhi HC order: AAP sources

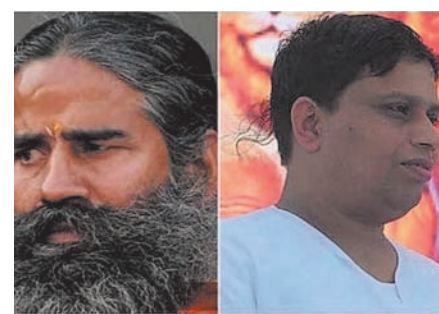

After the Delhi High Court dismissed the plea regarding his arrest by the ED in the excise policy case, incarcerated Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has decided to file an appeal in the Supreme Court challenging the order, AAP sources said.  
"AAP national convenor might go to Apex Court tomorrow," said the sources within the party.  
Delhi High Court on Tuesday dismissed Chief Minister Kejriwal's petition challenging his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the trial court order remanding him to the agency's custody. Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma, who



presided over the case noted ED's submission that Kejriwal was in possession of enough material which had led them to arrest him.  
"The files and material placed before us reveal that the mandate of law was followed by the ED.  
The trial court order is not a two-line order. The statements with ED are of hawala dealers as well as AAP candidates in Goa election," the court noted.

## Misleading ads by Patanjali Baba Ramdev, Acharya Balkrishna tender unconditional apology before SC

Baba Ramdev and Patanjali Ayurved's Managing Director Acharya Balkrishna have tendered an "unconditional and unqualified apology" before the Supreme Court in response to the contempt issue issued to the company over the continued publication of misleading advertisements.  
In affidavits filed before the apex court, the duo said that they undertake to always uphold the majesty of law and justice, adding that they would not make any public statements which may amount to a breach of the undertaking given to the Supreme Court in November last year.  
Patanjali had earlier assured the top court that it would not make any casual statements claiming the medicinal efficacy of its products or advertise or brand them in violation of law and would not release any statement against any system of medicine



to the media in any form. In the previous hearing, a bench of Justices Hima Kohli and Ahsanuddin Amanullah declined to accept Patanjali's contention that its media department was not aware of the SC undertaking and rebuked Ramdev and Balkrishna for filing improper versions of affidavits.  
It did not dispense with their personal appearance and ordered them to remain present on the next date of listing as well.

## 106 govt employees suspended in Telangana for attending BRS meeting

As many as 106 government employees in Telangana's Siddipet district have been suspended for attending a meeting of Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) in violation of the Model Code of Conduct.  
Siddipet District Election Officer and Collector M. Manu Choudary suspended 106 staff members of District Rural Development Agency (DRDA) Siddipet (MGNREGS & SERP). They had attended the BRS meeting at Reddy Function Hall in Siddipet within the Medak parliamentary constituency on April 7 in violation of MCC. The action was taken after BJP's former MLA and party candidate for Medak Lok Sabha seat Raghunandan Rao complained to the Assistant Returning Officer and



Revenue Divisional Officer over the phone that DRDA staff was attending a meeting of BRS in connection with ensuing Lok Sabha elections and that money was also being distributed.  
A flying squad team visited the venue and found 10-15 persons still in the meeting. It collected the CCTV footage from the management and found that BRS organised the meeting without obtaining permission from Assistant Returning Officer, Siddipet. A police complaint was also lodged against two leaders of BRS. Based on the CCTV footage, the election authorities identified 40 employees of DRDA who attended the meeting.

## HOW OFTEN SHOULD ADULTS CHECK THEIR BP LEVELS?

Adults aged between 18 and 40 must get their blood pressure checked every three years to gauge any underlying diseases, and to enable a faster diagnosis and treatment, said doctors here on Tuesday.  
According to a recent study by the Indian Council of Medical Research-National Centre for Disease Informatics and Research (ICMR-NCDIR), Bengaluru, about 30 per cent of Indians have never tested their blood pressure.  
"People older than 40 years should have their blood pressure checked one time a year. The ages between 18 and 40 years old should get their blood pressure checked every three to five years unless they fall into the high-risk category," Dr Tushar Tayal, Lead Consultant, Department of Internal Medicine, CK Birla Hospital, Gurugram, told IA correspondent.  
"All hypertensive patients should monitor blood pressure at least once monthly with a digital BP monitor, ideally after 15 mins of rest and cuff tied to mid-arm," added Dr Ajay Agarwal -



Director, Internal Medicine, Fortis Hospital, Noida.  
He explained that in patients without risk factors, blood pressure must be below 140/90 mm Hg. And among those with risk factors such as diabetes or kidney disease to reduce the risk of target organ damage (in kidneys, heart, or eyes), it should be less than 130/80, Dr Ajay told correspondent.  
The study also showed that about 34 per cent of Indians are in the prehyper-

tensive stage -- an intermediate state between normal blood pressure and hypertension. The research showed it is equally concerning, as it contributed substantially to cardiovascular diseases.  
"It is important to check BP and keep it under control (with or without medication) because undiagnosed hypertension is a risk factor for stroke, heart attack, kidney damage, and eye damage," Dr Tushar said.

## Congress opposes PIL against opposition alliance use of 'INDIA' acronym

Congress, through its affidavit, has firmly opposed a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed before the Delhi High Court, seeking direction to stop using the acronym INDIA (Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance) for their bloc.  
The Delhi High Court on April 2 granted the last chance to several opposition parties including the Congress, TMC and the DMK to respond within a week to the PIL by businessman Girish Bharadwaj, aiming for resolution before the first phase of the Lok Sabha election scheduled for April 19.  
A division bench of Acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Manmeet Pritam Singh Arora will hear the matter on April 10.  
In its affidavit, Congress labelled the PIL as politically motivated and lacking in



substance.  
The affidavit stated that the PIL was devoid of concrete examples or evidence to substantiate its allegations against Congress or its alliance partners. Moreover, it accused the petitioner of deliberately concealing their close association with the Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP), a right-wing organisation linked to the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS). Pointing to the petitioner's political affiliations, the affidavit argued that the PIL was filed with the ulterior motive of advancing political agendas rather than addressing genuine public interest concerns.





# 'CULTURE TO CONNECTIVITY': PM MODI'S TAMIL NADU VISIT GIVES FURTHER PUSH TO NDA'S MISSION SOUTH

Having repeatedly highlighted that Tamil Nadu's development reflects the development of the nation, Prime Minister Narendra Modi continues with the ruling government's 'South Push' as Chennai gears up big time for the PM's mega roadshow on Tuesday.

It was only last month that while addressing a public gathering in Salem, PM Modi urged the people of the state to ensure a decisive victory for the NDA and emphasised the importance of NDA securing over 400 seats for the development of Tamil Nadu and the nation.

"The overwhelming blessings for NDA and Modi have unsettled the DMK government. The INDI alliance is troubled due to the love Tamil Nadu has shown to the BJP. Now, Tamil Nadu has decided to vote for BJP and NDA on April 19, infusing new vigour into NDA's mission to develop Tamil Nadu," Prime Minister Modi said in Salem on March 19.

Ensuring that BJP's focus remains intact on South India, PM Modi then interacted with BJP Karyakartas from Tamil Nadu via NaMo App on March 29, underscoring the importance of booth-level efficiency and grassroots



engagement in winning elections.

Earlier in January, while announcing development projects worth more than Rs 20,000 crore in Tiruchirappalli, PM Modi had specifically mentioned his government's intense focus on Tamil Nadu, saying that more than 40 Union Ministers from the Central government have toured the state more than 400 times in the past year.

"India will progress with the progress of Tamil Nadu," he stated. As he had done in the past, PM

Modi mentioned the development of the Trichy Airport as a great opportunity for the world to connect with the Tamil culture and heritage.

"Tamil Nadu is home to the ancient language of Tamil and it is a treasure trove of cultural heritage," the Prime Minister said as he mentioned Saint Thiruvalluvar and Subramania Bharati among others who created magnificent literature.

"I believe in the continuous expansion of the contribution of Tamil cultural inspiration in the

development and heritage of the country," he added while referring to the rich heritage of Tiruchirappalli.

As the political atmosphere gets charged up in the run-up to Lok Sabha elections, Congress and DMK too will be keeping a close watch on PM Modi's two-day visit to the state.

During his earlier visit, PM Modi had accused the INDI Alliance of deliberately insulting Hinduism and the followers of the Hindu faith.

"Leaders of INDI alliance are intentionally insulting Hinduism and their statements are also well-planned and thought out. Congress and DMK, in particular, don't hesitate in denigrating Hinduism with their profane remarks, as they are not so generous for other beliefs and religions," said PM Modi at the Salem rally.

It is also expected that while highlighting his government's recent projects spanning roadways, railways, ports, airports, energy and petroleum sectors, PM Modi will highlight how it has created more employment opportunities for the youth of the state.

"I can see the rise of a new hope in the youth of Tamil Nadu. This hope will become the energy of Viksit Bharat," PM Modi said in Salem, last month.

# After 10-yr stint in BJP, Haryana's Jat leader Birender Singh rejoins Congress

After spending a decade in the BJP, former Union Minister and Haryana's one of the tallest Jat leaders, Birender Singh and his wife Premlata Singh rejoined the Congress in Delhi on Tuesday.

Their son and sitting MP Brijendra Singh joined the Congress last month. The family commands a big influence in Haryana, which will likely go to the Assembly polls in October after the Lok Sabha elections for the 10 seats on May 25.

Prem Lata Singh is a former BJP legislator from Haryana, while Birender Singh served as Union Minister in the first Modi Cabinet. He previously served Congress for over four decades. They joined in the presence of Mukul Wasnik and two-time Chief Minister Bhupinder Hooda, among others.

On the reason for quitting the BJP, Birender Singh said he joined the BJP in 2014 due to "certain reasons".

"When I joined BJP, I knew the ideology of this party



would be different and there would be some differences between the ideologies of the two parties. Later on, I experienced that there was a wider gap," he said. On the farmers' agitation, he said he had raised the issue on party platforms and urged that their grievances be resolved. "I felt that while I was giving suggestions, those were not being heard."

A well-known leader from the Jat community, Birender Singh joined the BJP in August 2014, just before the elections to the Haryana Assembly.

His induction into the Congress is seen as a move

to woo the Jat voters in Haryana, Rajasthan, and western Uttar Pradesh.

On March 10, Birender Singh's son Brijendra resigned as a BJP MP and joined the Congress citing "compelling political reasons".

Brijendra Singh quit the BJP five months after his father gave an ultimatum to the party at a rally in Jind that he would leave the BJP if it continued an alliance with the Jannayak Janata Party (JJP). Singh joined the Congress, the BJP snapped ties with the JJP.

Brijendra Singh is the great-grandson of prominent Jat leader Sir Chhotu Ram.

# CEC gets Z-category security in view of potential threat 'People's problems cannot be solved by making speeches': Ajit Pawar taunts Supriya Sule

After a threat perception report prepared by the central security agencies recommended strong security cover for Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar, the Central government has provided Z-category VIP security to him, sources said on Tuesday.

Kumar, a former IAS officer from the 1984 batch, assumed the role of the 25th CEC on May 15, 2022, after being appointed as an election commissioner within the electoral commission on September 1, 2020. Sources said that the Central Reserve Police Force has been tasked by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs to deploy



around 40-45 personnel, following security agencies' recommendation for enhanced protection for the CEC. This decision coincides with the ongoing preparations for the

seven-phase general elections starting on April 19. The armed commandos will accompany the CEC during his nationwide travels, as per sources.

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister and NCP President Ajit Pawar on Tuesday took a dig at her estranged sister and the NCP-SP nominee Supriya Sule saying that the problems of the people cannot be solved by just making speeches in parliament.

He also targeted his estranged uncle Sharad Pawar during his speech at an election rally urging the voters to give him and his party's nominee a chance during this year's elections.

"Till today you have stood behind senior Pawar. Even during the upcoming elections, vote where you see senior Pawar so that you will get the satisfaction of voting for Pawar," he said while addressing an election rally in the Baramati constituency.

He said that senior Pawar and his daughter will make emotional



speeches but people should not vote for them due to the emotional rhetoric. "I have been elected seven times in my political life so I understand all

these nuances," he said. He said that Baramati's problems are not solved by just making speeches in Parliament.

# Four of a family killed while crossing railway line in Bihar's Siwan

Four members of a family, including two children, died after being run over by a train in Bihar's Siwan district on Tuesday afternoon.

The accident occurred at Laxmipur village near Mairwa railway station on the Siwan-Gorakhpur rail section.

"The victims had gone to their agricultural land for farming. While returning, the children were crossing the track when a speeding train came on it. The two women named Sunita Devi and Neetu Devi tried to save their children, but came under the train. All the four died on the spot," said Ajay Bhaskar, Village Head of Murhari Panchayat.

The deceased were residents of Laxmipur village which is located right on the edge of the railway track.

Following the incident, a large number of villagers assembled at the place and protested against the rail-



way officials. They demanded adequate compensation to the family members of the victims. Officials of

the GRP, RPF and the railways have reached the spot. The bodies have been sent for postmortem.

# THREE FOOTWEAR FACTORIES GUTTED IN DELHI, NO CASUALTIES

New Delhi: A massive fire was reported in three footwear factories in Delhi's Mundka area on Tuesday, the Fire Department said, adding that no casualty has been reported so far. Delhi Fire Service Director Atul Garg said that a call regarding a blaze at a factory was received at 11:12 a.m. on Tuesday, following which fire tenders were rushed to the spot. Upon reaching the spot, it was found that the flames had engulfed three footwear factories. "A total of 25 fire tenders were rushed to the site. Fire is extinguished and cooling operation is going on," Garg said, adding that the cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained.

# SC grants interim bail to Abbas Ansari to attend father Mukhtar's 'fatiha' ritual

The Supreme Court on Tuesday granted interim bail to Abbas Ansari - who is currently detained in Kasganj district jail - to attend the 'fatiha' ritual of his deceased father Mukhtar Ansari. A Bench presided over by Justice Surya Kant took note of the fact that the petitioner could not attend the funeral of his father since he was under judicial custody.

Gangster-turned-politician Mukhtar Ansari - accused of the killing of Awadhesh Rai, brother of Ajay Rai - died of cardiac arrest on March 28.

Imposing a slew of conditions, the Bench, also comprising Justice KV Viswanathan, said that Uttar



Pradesh Police will bring Abbas Ansari from Kasganj jail to his native place in Ghazipur under adequate security for observing the 'fatiha' ritual on April 10. "Keeping in view the distance between the two places, we direct that police and jail authorities ensure that

the petitioner could start his journey by today at the earliest but no later than 5 pm," the apex court ordered.

It added that after the ritual scheduled on Wednesday gets over, Abbas Ansari may be temporarily shifted to a local jail at Ghazipur.

# ELECTION TO MP'S BETUL LS SEAT CALLED OFF AFTER CANDIDATE'S DEATH

Bhopal: The election to the Betul Lok Sabha constituency in Madhya Pradesh has been cancelled after the BSP candidate in the fray died of cardiac arrest on Tuesday, officials said.

Family members of BSP candidate Ashok Bhalavi told media persons that he complained of pain last night and was taken to a hospital in Betul where he died on Tuesday.

The election to the Betul Lok Sabha seat, along with five other seats of the state, was scheduled in the second phase on April 26.

Madhya Pradesh Electoral Officer, Anupam Rajan said the election in the constituency has been cancelled after the death of the BSP candidate. The BJP has retained the Betul Lok Sabha seat since 1996.

# Proclaimed offender arrested for multi-crore real estate scam in Punjab

In a major breakthrough in the multi-crore Nature Heights Infra Scam, Punjab Police on Tuesday said that they have arrested the main accused, Neeraj Thathai, alias Neeraj Arora, who was absconding for the past nine years and was declared a proclaimed offender.

He was arrested from the Poudi district in Uttarakhand. The modus operandi used by the accused to collect the huge amount of money was to lure innocent people in lieu of giving them residential and commercial plots.

The development comes close on the heels of the arrest of Amandeep Kamboj, alias Aman Skoda, of Fazilka, who was proclaimed offender in eight cases, and in 18 cases he jumped bail. He was arrested from



Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh on March 15. Inspector General of Police (Faridkot) Gursharan Singh Sandhu and Deputy Inspector General (Ferozepur) Ranjit Singh Dhillon, in

a joint press conference, said police teams from both the districts headed by Senior Superintendent (Investigation) Pardeep Sandhu arrested the most wanted criminal

Neeraj Arora from Shri Nagar Garhwal in Uttarakhand.

Police teams have also recovered one luxury BMW car, mobile phones and fake documents from the possession of accused Arora.

Sandhu said the accused has been facing 108 first information reports (FIRs) registered in 21 districts for defrauding people by promising money or plots to people in the state.

Of a total of 108 FIRs, 47 were registered in Fazilka, eight in Ferozepur, six each in Patiala and Fatehgarh Sahib, five each in Rupnagar, Mohali and SAS Nagar; four each in Faridkot, Sri Muktsar Sahib and Jalandhar Commissionerate.

Accused Arora, arrested by the police in February 2016, had jumped bail and was declared a proclaimed offender in February 2017.

# Six of family charred to death in Bihar's Rohtas

Six persons of a family were charred to death in Bihar's Rohtas district on Tuesday afternoon after their huts caught fire, police said.

The fire incident occurred at Ibrahimpur Bridge in Kachwan village under the Kachwan police station.

The SHO, Kachwan police station said that the deceased included three women and three children. Another victim sustained burn injuries and was admitted to the hospital. Eyewitnesses said there were three huts adjoining the Kachwan bridge and they caught fire after a short-circuit occurred in an electric transformer and sparks fell on their roofs. In the heat, the blaze spread rapidly to engulf all three huts.



While some residents managed to save themselves, six could not escape.

Residents called for the fire brigade and also tried to douse the fire but were unsuccessful. Firemen reached the spot and extinguished the flames, but till that time, the six had died.

Following the blaze, a large number of people reached the spot. Teams of police and civil administration also reached the spot and sent the dead bodies for a post-mortem examination.





# MVA to ECI: Act against Mungantiwar for 'crass comments' in PM's presence

The Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) on Tuesday appealed to the Election Commission of India (ECI) to take strong action against Maharashtra BJP minister and Chandrapur Lok Sabha candidate, Sudhir Mungantiwar, at a rally addressed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday evening. Livid at the utterances by the BJP nominee, the MVA leaders like Congress General Secretary Sachin Sawant, Nationalist Congress Party (SP) National Spokesperson Clyde Crasto, Shiv Sena (UBT)'s National Spokesperson Kishore Tiwari, called upon the ECI to 'cancel' Mungantiwar's LS candidature for the shockingly low-level language in public, with PM Modi sitting on the stage.



gests their 'blessings' for such profanity and it's the ECI's duty to take exemplary action and cancel his (Mungantiwar's) candidature from Chandrapur.

Unfazed by the uproar, Mungantiwar posted early on Tuesday that when the Congress is reminded of its 1984 atrocities, "so many chillies fly." "The Congress cannot hide the injustice done to the people by making a partial clip viral. Congress leaders should tell me that such atrocities did not take place in the 1984 riots. I will always speak against the dictatorial regime of the Congress and will not be intimidated by your mischief," he posted. Issuing a veiled warning that "the Opposition has

to merely speak the truth to counter such language", Sachin Sawant said the "fear of losing has tipped the scales, and referred to the ECI notices slapped on AAP Delhi Minister, Atishi Marlena, Congress Spokesperson, Supriya Shrinete and Andhra Pradesh CM, YS Jagan Mohan Reddy. They were warned by the ECI that "violations of the Model Code of Conduct will not be tolerated."

Sachin Sawant demanded that the same must be made applicable to Mungantiwar now for his false accusations and objectionable language.

"A humble question to the Honourable PM and all those who shared the stage with Mungantiwar when he made such disgusting utterances: Do you endorse his speech?" asked Crasto.

Using an old Sanskrit phrase, 'vinaashakale vipareet buddhi', Tiwari said that neither Mungantiwar's comments nor the BJP's silence on it are surprising as the party is bracing for a rude shock in the Lok Sabha 2024 elections not only in Maharashtra but across India.

While challenging the INDIA bloc's pleas on democracy being threatened under the BJP, Mungantiwar made vague references to the 1984 riots in Delhi, on how spouses and their children were separated and a "brother and sister were stripped naked and made to lie on a cot."

Meanwhile, activists of different local, social and political groups have expressed concerns over such comments that did not find favour with the masses there, especially the women and the youth, besides unleashing a storm on social media.

# Congress leader Raju Waghmare joins CM Shinde-led Shiv Sena

The chief minister said his government has removed negativity and brought in positivity in politics, and its good work has given people confidence.

On opposition leaders targeting him for holding political meetings at his official residence 'Varsha', CM Eknath Shinde said that there was nothing wrong with holding such meetings there.

All well with the ruling 'Mahayuti' alliance, CM Shinde said, informing that its candidates for the remaining Lok Sabha seats in Maharashtra will be announced soon.

# Shops and establishments in Mumbai not displaying Marathi boards to pay double property tax

Shops and establishments in Mumbai without Marathi nameplates will have to pay double property tax from May 1, the BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation announced on Monday.



Also, the license issued for an illuminated signboard (glow board) not in the Marathi language will be cancelled with immediate effect and a new registration will have to be done. If the glow sign board license is revoked, the establishment owners concerned will be charged a penalty ranging between Rs 25,000 and Rs 1.5 lakh.

These decisions were taken at the meeting chaired by BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation Commissioner and Administrator Bhushan Gagrani.

It is binding on the shops and establishments in Mumbai to put up nameplates in Marathi written in Devnagari script following the order issued last year by the Supreme Court.

The BMC conducted an inspection from November 28, 2023, to March 31, 2024, and it

was found that of the total 87,047 shops and establishments inspected, 84,007 (96.50 per cent) had complied with the Supreme Court's order. However, the remaining 3,040 shops and establishments did not put up the boards as per the rules and the BMC had served legal notices to them.

# Private offices in Mumbai suburbs to face action if leave not granted on polling day

The Mumbai Suburban District Collector and District Election Officer Rajendra Kshirsagar on Monday said that action will be taken against private establishments for not granting paid leave or concession of two hours to employees on the polling day. The action will be initiated based on the complaints. The polling in Mumbai Suburban district is slated for May 20. Kshirsagar has already issued instructions to private establishments to grant leave or concession of two hours in duty hours to their employees on the polling day.

# Eknath Khadse's daughter says will stay in Sharad Pawar's party

Nationalist Congress Party (Sharadchandra Pawar) leader Rohini Khadse, whose father and MLC Eknath Khadse is set to return to the BJP, on Monday ruled out any switch over and asserted she will remain with her current party and follow its ideology, reported news agency.

Eknath Khadse, a former state cabinet minister, has said he would be returning to the BJP in a fortnight after snapping ties with the NCP (SP), which he joined in 2020 post spending almost four decades in the

Notably, the BJP has given ticket to Eknath Khadse's daughter-in-law Raksha from the Raver Lok Sabha constituency in Jalgaon district, from where she is the party's sitting MP.

# Four labourers killed after suffocating inside sewerage treatment plant in Virar

At least four labourers died at a project site while cleaning a sewerage treatment plant at Virar West in Maharashtra, the officials said on Tuesday. The incident took place at the Sandipani project located at Global City in Virar West, they said.

The police said that the labourers died due to suffocation in the plant.

According to police officials, the incident occurred at around 11 am on Tuesday when as many as four labourers entered the sewerage treatment plant, which is 25-30 feet deep. During the process, they experienced suffocation which resulted in their deaths. Following the incident, locals immediately informed the police and fire brigade that rushed to the spot to rescue the labourers. All of them were removed from the sewerage treatment plant and were rushed to the hospital where they were declared dead before admission.

The deceased were later identified as Shubham Parkar (28), Amol Ghatale (27), Nikhil Ghatale (24), and Sagar Tendulkar (29).

The Amala police in Virar have registered an Accidental Death Report (ADR) in the matter and launched an investigation into the incident.

# Conmen tell Mumbai college lecturer he is accused in murder case, try to extort money

incident, the official said.

The exact motive behind the firing and the role of Parveen is being investigated while a search is on to trace Shetty, he said.

Shetty had allegedly barged into the house of Akash Swami (30) and fired at him with a country-made pistol, leaving him seriously injured, police said.

"Our investigation revealed that Shetty had multiple cases pending against him. Two to three cases were also registered against the victim," the official said.

Meanwhile, a 23-year-old man from Navi Mumbai in Maharashtra allegedly lost Rs 4.92 lakh after being lured with high returns in the trading of shares, police said on Monday.

The police have registered an FIR in this connection against an unidentified person.

The accused contacted the victim, resident of Kopolli in Panvel area and employed with an airline, between November 1 and 3 last year and lured him to indulge in shares trading while promising him high returns.

The victim subsequently invested Rs 4,92,000 in shares through the accused, an official from Navin Panvel police station said.

When he sought returns and the invested amount, the accused demanded an additional sum of Rs 8 lakh for facilitating benefits of Rs 1.29 crore to him.

Sensing deception, the victim refused to comply, following which the accused threatened him with the forfeiture of both the invested amount and returns, the official said.

The victim approached the police with a complaint, based on which an FIR was registered under relevant provisions on Monday, he added.

# BMC to survey roads for potholes, activists not hopeful

Team Absolute | Mumbai

The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has decided to survey roads to identify bad patches that may turn into potholes. However, activists believe the city will still face pothole problems despite pre-monsoon work, as it does every year.



Additional Municipal Commissioner Abhijeet Bangar said, "We have decided to survey roads to proactively repair bad patches before the monsoon."

According to BMC officials, potholes mostly occur on stretches of asphalt road where the upper layer is damaged. Repairing these bad patches before the monsoon could reduce the number of potholes during the rainy season.

Even last year, BMC identified and repaired bad patches before the monsoon. However, data shows that despite these efforts, around 50 thousand potholes were repaired during the mon-

soon. BMC spent approximately Rs 273 crore on repairing potholes during both the monsoon and pre-monsoon periods.

In 2022, BMC repaired 38,310 potholes; in 2021, 43,249 potholes were repaired; in 2020, 65,617 potholes were repaired; and in 2019, 94,918 potholes were repaired.

There are 2,050 km of roads, with 450 km under the concreting project and approximately 100 km under the defect liability period. Potholes on these roads will be repaired by the respective

contractors, while BMC needs to maintain around 600 to 700 km of roads.

Meanwhile, a civic activist questioned the quality of BMC's work. He said, "Even though BMC performs pre-monsoon work, there are still around 50 thousand potholes, according to BMC data. There is a question about the quality of the work."

Another activist said, "Potholes have occurred at places where BMC repaired patches before the pre-monsoon. BMC should seriously consider strict monitoring."

## India is seeing a rising trend of diseases

**I**ncreased stress in life and a sedentary lifestyle combined with a spike in consumption of junk food, smoking tobacco, and alcohol is behind the surging cases of diseases in India, said experts here on Tuesday. About one in three Indians is pre-diabetic, two in three are pre-hypertensive, and one in 10 suffers from depression, reveals a recent Health of Nation Report by Apollo Hospitals. The prevalence of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) such as cancer, diabetes, hypertension, cardiovascular diseases, and mental health disorders has surged to critical levels, raising alarm for the nation's health. "Amongst the 1.4 billion population of India, the biggest health issues are related to a major jump in fatty liver diseases, obesity, diabetes, coronary artery diseases in the youth, and a plethora of malignancies of many organs affecting every section of society. This changing trend is more obvious as one encounters heart attacks and paralytic attacks in younger generations with alarming regularity," Dr Anil Arora, Chairman, Gastroenterology, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, said. "A combination of stressful life and sedentary lifestyle has catapulted us to newer illnesses which were not a reality in this younger lot, till recently," he explained. Infectious disease expert Dr Ishwar Gilada said the "altered lifestyle" followed by the young generations is making them more prone to the diseases. "Our youth is going berserk on junk food, smoking, tobacco, alcohol," and inviting diseases, he said. He also blamed the work-from-home culture that was introduced during the COVID-19 pandemic and continues to some extent with few companies. "We need to stop it because people, who are working from home, do not do any exercise, or walk. That will cause a problem," said Dr Gilada, Secretary General People's Health Organisation-India. He advised people to make health their own "responsibility".

## 1984 anti-Sikh riots: Wound not over but victims grateful to Modi govt for mitigating their woes

**W**hile the 1984-anti Sikh riots and massacre will continue to remain a blot for the country, it is also a grim reminder of the highly anguished moment and painful times that the Sikh community went through, post former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's assassination on October 31, 1984. Even after 40 years of massacre, many riot victims vividly recall the horror tales of the massacre, allegedly sponsored by the then Congress regime. However, many of them are thankful to the Modi government for bringing 'justice' to their endless fight and also healing their decades-old wounds. The first sense of closure for them came in 2022 when the SIT team, formed in 2019, arrested 44 accused after three years of investigations. The deadly riots broke after former Congress PM Indira Gandhi was brutally killed by her two Sikh bodyguards. Thousands of Sikhs were killed in the riots and Delhi was worst hit, followed by Kanpur. A couple of Kanpur residents on Sunday narrated the 1984 horror and also explained how the Modi government nursed their wounds in recent years. Harjit Singh, a resident of Ashok Nagar, Kanpur Harjit Singh, a victim of the 1984 anti-sikh riots, says that he lost his father and uncle in the bloodshed and also accused Congress of trying to save its leaders despite their direct involvement in the 1984 riots. Harjit Singh, a resident of Ashok Nagar, Kanpur, who was just 14 years old during the riots, says, "My uncle's (father's younger brother) marriage was about to be fixed. My father was coming back from his shop when a peace protest march was being carried out by Sikhs of Kanpur against the riots. The mob attacked with stone pelting on the Sikh protest march at Bhadoyia Chauraha. My father was hurt during the stone pelting and when my uncle tried to help my father, someone from the mob fired bullets at him and then finally both my father & uncle were burnt alive along with the tractor". While putting the entire blame on Congress, Harjit Singh said, "At night, the mob came to burn our house but a Hindu family who were our tenants saved us". He further said, "My grandfather took care of the family and I had to leave my education and join our family business as the economic condition of the family was not good. I lost my mother due to a brain haemorrhage in 1989 as she couldn't bear the loss of my father in riots. Congress never tried to give us any justice, rather they only saved their leaders who were involved in the riots". Thanking Modi government, he said, "We had lost all hope for getting justice but when PM Modi came in 2014, things moved quite fast. Many cases of Kanpur riots have been solved as the culprits have been put behind bars and the victims have received Rs 5 lakh compensation." Manjit Singh Chawla, another victim of anti-sikh riots in Kanpur Manjit Singh Chawla, another victim of anti-sikh riots in Kanpur, says that highly irresponsible statements by top leaders of Congress triggered riots, resulting in the killing of innocent Sikhs. Manjit Singh Chawla, recalling the horror, says, "When the word of Indira Gandhi's death spread, the next morning itself our neighbours accompanied by hordes of mob started ransacking shops, assaulting people and looting houses. Hundreds of Sikhs were killed by the rioting mob. The mob went on a killing spree due to the protection of police officers, administration and leaders of the Congress government; though miscreant elements from all different sections of society were involved in the massacre." The entire bloodshed took place under the political protection by leaders of Congress government and local administration to the goons. There were clear instructions not to leave anyone behind and kill all sar-



gars. The people living in our neighbourhood changed all of a sudden and started attacking us. This was the utter failure of the Congress government at the time as no help was provided to rehabilitate the victims of anti-Sikh riots; we all have to struggle a lot to stand on our feet again and make a living for ourselves again. The government of the time clearly had a hand in the massacre and irresponsible statements by top leaders of the Congress government triggered riots when a mob went on a rampage. These wounds have been etched on our souls for this lifetime and cannot be healed ever again," Chawla said. 1984 riots were plotted by the Congress govt, says Gurinder Singh Vasu Gurinder Singh Vasu Prince, the General Secretary of Shri Guru Singh Sabha Kanpur and a social worker says that he was in Class X at the time of the anti-Sikh riots of 1984.

Pinning the blame on the then Congress government, he said, "On the day of the incident, I was alone at home with my five sisters and mother when a mob of thousands of people attacked our house. Our entire family was inside the house, still, it was burnt by the rioters. All the wedding stuff kept in the house for my sister's wedding was looted. There was violence in the locality for three days. The neighbouring Jain family protected us. These riots were pre-planned. The then government helped the rioters because they had lists of names and houses of Sikhs. We had to go to the camp to save our lives. My father was a senior Sikh leader and Ward Congress Committee President for 18 years but after the incident he quit the Congress. Culprits like Jagdish Tytler, Sajjan Kumar, Lalit Maken, and Kamal Nath should be punished. We are happy that the culprits are now being punished during the PM Modi government." He further said, "Sikh community will never forgive Congress who are the perpetrators of genocide of our mothers, fathers, brothers and sisters". Praising Prime Minister Narendra Modi, he said, "Modi ji has knowledge of Sikh religion. He has done many things for the Sikhs like opening the Kartarpur Corridor, and celebrating the martyrdom of Chhote Sahabzads at national and international levels."

## Toronto, other Canadian cities go dark as millions watch total solar eclipse

**T**oronto and many other cities and towns of Canada fell into darkness as millions of people flocked into public places to watch the total solar eclipse. In Toronto, which won't see the next total solar eclipse until 2144, clouds obscured the sun during the period of the eclipse. But when the time for total solar eclipse (99.7 per cent) came, it became pitch dark and very cold.

At Toronto's York University where thousands of students converged on top of one of its science blocks to watch the once-in-a-lifetime phenomenon, lights went on during the short duration of total eclipse at 3.19 pm on Monday.

Canada's top astronomer and York University former professor Paul Delaney, who was on hand to explain the significance of this solar eclipse, said, "From the point of view of science, when you are blocking the sun, you are changing the dynamics in the atmosphere and the



atmosphere responds very differently during a total eclipse. Radiowave propagation is impacted. NASA is launching its sounding rockets into the upper atmosphere from Niagara Falls to monitor changes as radiation is depleted from the atmosphere."

He said, "This total solar eclipse has allowed studying the diameter of the sun which has come under great scrutiny of late because scientists think it is changing. This eclipse is an opportunity to measure the diameter. They are looking at the sun's corona and corona sphere. It will tell us about magnetic fields around the sun. There is a lot of information that we will gain from this solar eclipse."

Toronto had its last total solar eclipse in 1925. "It was a cloudy day in Toronto back in 1925. Toronto University scientists tried to measure the change in the intensity of light coming from the sun that day. That total solar eclipse came quickly after the 1919 total solar eclipse when British astronomer Arthur Eddington verified Einstein's famous theory of relativity," he said.

Total solar eclipses occur every 18 months somewhere around the world, but North America's next total solar eclipse won't happen till August 23, 2044.

Russia supports the Global Security Initiative, and is willing to deepen cooperation with China on multilateral platforms to promote the establishment of a more just and democratic international order, Lavrov added. The two sides also had in-depth exchanges of view on the Ukraine issue, the Palestinian-Israeli conflict, the situation in the Asia-Pacific region and other international and regional issues of common concern.

## Egypt, Jordan, France urge immediate ceasefire in Gaza

**E**gypt, Jordan, and France have urged an immediate ceasefire in the Gaza Strip, which has been under Israeli siege and bombardment over the past six months. In a joint article on Monday, Egyptian President Abdel-Fattah el-Sisi, Jordanian King Abdullah II, and French President Emmanuel Macron called for an immediate and unconditional implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 2728, which demands an immediate ceasefire in the conflict-stricken enclave, Xinhua news agency reported. "We warn against the dangerous consequences of an Israeli offensive on Rafah, where more than 1.5 million Palestinian civilians have sought refuge. Such an offensive will only bring more deaths and suffering, heighten the risks and consequences of mass forcible displacement of the people of Gaza and threat-



immediate regional escalation," said the leaders. Noting that there is an urgent need for a massive increase in the provision and distribution of humanitarian assistance, the leaders urged Israel to ensure the flow of humanitarian assistance to the Palestinian population, a responsibility it has not fulfilled. They demanded an

immediate release of all hostages and reaffirmed their support for the negotiations brokered by Egypt, Qatar and the United States dealing with ceasefires, hostages, and detainees. The massive conflict in Gaza has so far killed 33,207 Palestinians, in addition to many unreported under the rubble, and injured 75,933 oth-

ers, according to the update released by Gaza's health ministry earlier on Monday. Israel launched a large-scale offensive against Hamas in the Gaza Strip in retaliation to a Hamas rampage in southern Israel on October 7, 2023, during which about 1,200 people were killed and more than 200 were taken hostage.

## 6.0-magnitude earthquake jolts Indonesia



**J**akarta | Agencies A 6.0 magnitude quake hit Indonesia's eastern province of West Papua on Tuesday, but did not trigger a tsunami warning, the country's meteorology, climatology and geophysics agency said. The agency initially reported the quake's magnitude to be 6.1 before revising it, Xinhua news agency reported.

The earthquake occurred at 07.02 a.m. Jakarta time (0002 GMT) with its epicenter situated 46 km southeast of Ransiki

town, and a depth of 11 km under the seabed, the agency said. The intensity of the quake was felt at III to IV MMI (Modified Mercalli Intensity) in the Ransiki town, it added. The agency did not issue a tsunami warning as the tremors would not potentially trigger giant waves.

Indonesia, an archipelagic country, is prone to earthquakes because of its location along the Pacific Ring of Fire, a tectonic belt of volcanoes and earthquakes.

## One killed, three injured in explosion in paper factory in Vietnam



**H**anoi | Agencies One paper factory worker died and two others were injured in a huge explosion in Vietnam's Bac Ninh province on Tuesday morning, Vietnam News Agency reported.

The explosion occurred at around 10:30 a.m. at Hung Loi Paper Joint Stock Company in Phu Lam industrial cluster when the workers were repairing machines, Xinhua news agency reported.

A 31-year-old worker died on the scene, while two others were taken to hospital in an emergency.

A gas pit explosion was initially identified as the primary reason. According to Vietnam News Agency, Hung Loi company has faced administrative sanctions for not having an environmental permit and been required to suspend the operation of the waste generation source for 4.5 months since January this year.

Vietnam recorded 1,179 fires and explosions in the first three months of 2023, which left 24 people dead, 18 others injured and caused property losses of about 71.1 billion Vietnamese dong (2.8 million U.S. dollars), said the General Statistics Office.





## ACTION AGAINST CORRUPTION WILL SPEED UP IN 3RD TERM OF MY GOVT: PM MODI

However, the BJP wrested the seat from Congress in 1998 and since then, the party has been retaining it by winning it for six consecutive terms, including in 2019.

Meanwhile, Saiyam, who was transferred from Betul to Jabalpur, filed an application in the High Court against the government order. Since Saiyam's retirement is after two months in May. Therefore, the court put a stay on the transfer and now two additional collectors are working here.

Before this, the issue of posting of Ratlam District Panchayat CEO Aman Vaishnav to the post of Additional Collector in Anuppur had also got entangled. Shringar Srivastava, who was posted in Dhar, was posted in place of Vaishnav. Srivastava reached to join but Vaishnav, who was transferred on March 16 itself, was not relieved that day. After this, due to implementation of the code of conduct, Ratlam and Anuppur Collector had to seek guidance from GAD and Election Commission on his relieving and joining.

The podcast host asked, "Today, they would never let you do that," to which Williams replied, "Why?" "Blackface?" Maher questioned in a tone of surprise.

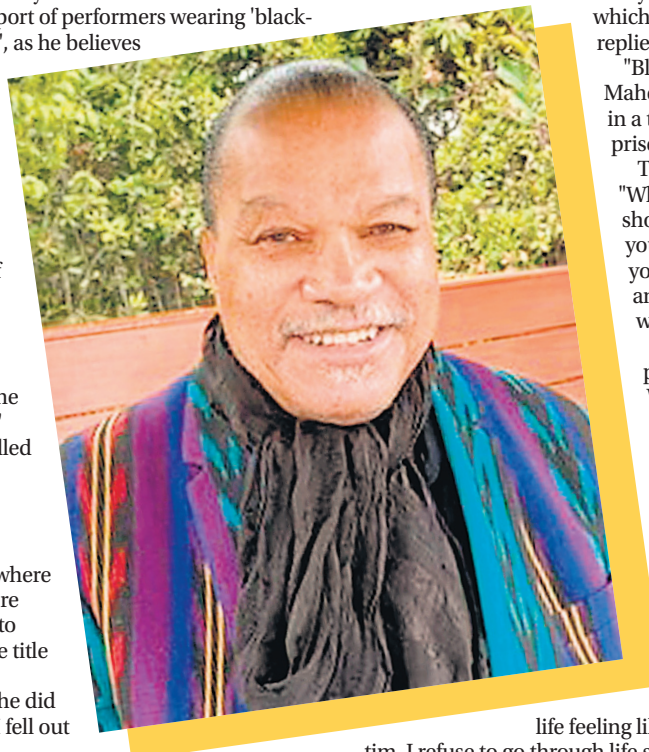
The actor said: "Why not? You should do it. If you're an actor, you should do anything you want to do."

Christchurch, Wellington, and Hamilton will host New Zealand's three match Test series against England scheduled in November 2024. New Zealand Cricket (NZC) confirmed the venues ahead of the home Test schedule.

Hagley Oval will host the first test on November 28. The second and third tests will take place on December 6 and 14 at the Basin Reserve and Seddon Park, respectively. The test series is part of the World Test Championship (WTC).

This is the only home Test series that New Zealand will be playing at home. They have an extensive run overseas before that with a one-off game scheduled against Afghanistan followed by two matches in Sri Lanka and three in India through September and October.

NZC said there had been an "extremely competitive venue allocation process" for the Tests which will likely see a strong influx of England supporters. There were sellout crowds for seven of the eight days of play between New Zealand and Australia last month.

"In the past, there's often been a lot of talk in New Zealand about the popularity of Test cricket - without that translating into ticket sales or viewership numbers," NZC chief executive Scott Weenink said. "The difference



over the past summer, and in terms of the upcoming Tests against England, is that the interest is being converted to bums on seats and is driving record viewership numbers.

"We're looking forward to that continuing over the upcoming summer, and to welcoming the England team and their fans to the Tests, and of course all the Kiwi-based supporters as well."

## Frattesi's late winner helps Inter turn around Udinese

Inter Milan marched another step toward their 20th Scire A title as they rallied to beat Udinese 2-1 away on Monday, with Davide Frattesi scoring a last-gasp winner.

The Nerazzurri dominated the game from the very beginning but it was the home side that broke the deadlock in the 40th minute with a stroke of luck when Lazar Samardzic's strike took a slight deflection and went into the net, leaving Yann Sommer rooted to the ground, reported Xinhua.

Carlos Augusto thought he had grabbed the equalizer for Inter straight after the break, but it was wiped out due to Lautaro Martinez's offside position when flicking the ball. But Inter eventually got



back on level terms in the 55th minute when Marcus Thuram earned a spot-kick, and Hakan Calhanoglu stepped up to convert it.

Inter continued the pressure and it paid off in the dying minutes when

Lautaro's attempt smacked the woodwork, and Frattesi was alert to tap it into the net.

With the victory, Inter lead the table on 82 points, 14 points ahead of second-placed AC Milan with 7 rounds to spare.

## BIG GAINS FOR DEVINE, JONES IN ICC WOMEN'S ODI BATTING RANKINGS

New Zealand captain Sophie Devine and England's wicketkeeper-batter Amy Jones have progressed in the ICC Women's ODI Batting Rankings after the end of their ICC Women's Championship series which England won 2-1.

Devine, who missed the fifth match of a preceding T20I series and the first two games of the ODI series due to a quad strain, produced a 93-ball 100 not out to win the final match for her team, moving from 20th to a career-best-equaling 10th position in the batting rankings. Jones struck 48 and 50 in the last two matches of the series played in Hamilton that were taken into consideration in the latest weekly update to the women's rankings, progressing five slots and attaining a career-best 12th position.



New Zealand's Brooke Halliday (up nine places to 43rd) and England's Maia Bouchier (up 19 places to 71st) are among others to gain in the batting rankings. England's new-ball bowler

Kate Cross is up one place to third while New Zealand's leg-spinning all-rounder Amelia Kerr moved up four places to 10th position. Amelia's sister Jess Kerr has also moved towards the top

10 of the bowling rankings, her five wickets in two matches lifting her from 16th to 12th position, the ICC informed in a media release on Tuesday.

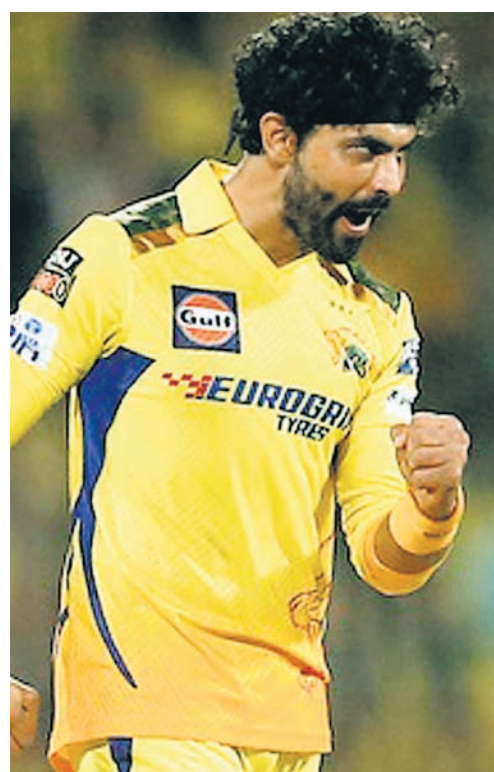
Nat Sciver-Brunt (up nine places to 17th) and Hannah Rowe (up three places to 21st) have moved up after finishing with four wickets each in the two matches. Sciver-Brunt and Amelia are also up to second and third on the all-rounders' list.

In the ICC Women's T20I Player Rankings, Sri Lanka captain Chamari Athapaththu advanced two places to seventh position after a match-winning 46-ball 73 against South Africa helped clinch the series 2-1. Harshitha Samarawickrama's score of 54 not out helped her advance two slots and reach 18th position while spinners Sugandika Kumari and Inoshi Fernando have gained in the bowling rankings.

For South Africa, Anneke Bosch (up one place to 16th among batters) and Nadine de Klerk (53rd among batters and 38th among bowlers) are the main gainers.

Australia's 3-0 win over Bangladesh, which included two matches over the past week, is reflected in the gains for their players. Grace Harris is up 15 places to 40th among batters while in the bowling rankings, Ashleigh Gardner and Annabel Sutherland have moved up two places each to occupy 17th and 22nd positions, respectively.

Others to gain in the rankings include Tanya Ruma of Papua New Guinea (up three places to 29th) and Zimbabwe captain Chipo-Mugeru Tiripano (up seven places to 47th) among batters, and Bangladesh's Rabeya Khan (up five places to 16th) and Nahida Akter (up two places to 24th) among bowlers.



## He is a proper all-rounder and CSK are lucky to have him: Rayudu

Spinner Ravindra Jadeja's superlative bowling effort for Chennai Super Kings against Kolkata Knight Riders at the MA Chidambaram Stadium in Chennai has earned him praise from West Indies legend Brian Lara and former India and CSK teammate Ambati Rayudu. Jadeja claimed 3-18 in four overs and with pacers Tushar Deshpande and Mustafizur Rahman claiming 3-33 and 2-22, helped CSK restrict Kolkata Knight Riders to a below-par 137/9. CSK won the match by seven wickets with skipper Rituraj Gaikwad scoring 67 not out.

Speaking exclusively on Star Sports Cricket Live, Rayudu expressed his views on Jadeja's bowling performance against KKR. "I think he tries to bowl on the seam. He attempts to get the seam into the wicket and get that grip on the surface. Additionally, he varies his speed. When he bowls to a left-hander, he tries to bowl quick, as he did to Venkatesh Iyer and Sunil Narine. It was wide, it was really fast, and he bowls directly into the wicket. He

knows the surface really well and he knows his bowling is now much better than it used to be. He's a proper all-rounder, and CSK is lucky to have him."

Lara too shared his thoughts on Jadeja's bowling performance against KKR and said the spinner knows where to bowl at the Chepauk Stadium pitch. "When he has the pitch that suits him, it's difficult. He's got a very low trajectory of the ball. Also, he bowls so quickly, giving you little time to think about what to do. He finishes his over in under two minutes sometimes. So, he's at you all the time. But he has a great amount of experience at that cricket ground (Chepauk), and he knows the size of the boundaries, he knows where to bowl the ball. And you see a lot of the guys getting out into the deep, Venkatesh Iyer, even Sunil Narine. So, I think worldwide, he's a great bowler. But at this particular ground, he's dangerous when the conditions are in his favour," Lara told Star Sports on Cricket Live on Monday.

Rayudu was also impressed with CSK skipper Rituraj Gaikwad's performance as he struck 67 not out off 58 balls to help CSK win the match.

## 'This is her time,' ex-India coach BI Fernandez backs Nikhat Zareen for Paris Olympics medal

Long-serving boxing coach Blas Iglesias Fernandez has backed Nikhat Zareen to return with a medal from the upcoming Paris Olympics. The 68-year-old Cuban, who changed the face of Indian boxing since arriving in India for the first time in 1990, feels Lovlina Borgohain can win too but "only if she shows killer instinct."

"Fernandez, the only overseas coach to have ever won a Dronacharya award, is back in India after being appointed by the Sports Authority of India as High Performance Coach for a two-year period. Fernandez is stationed at the National Boxing Academy in Rohtak, Haryana. Speaking recently on the sidelines of the multi-



nation camp for junior boxers at the SAI's National Centre of Excellence in Rohtak, Fernandez evaluated India's chances at the upcoming Summer Games.

The much revered coach, who at various times during his stint with India, has been at the corner of legendary boxers like Dingko Singh, Vijender Singh, Sarita Devi and Mary Kom, said India can win "at least two medals" in Paris and Nikhat Zareen (50 kg) had a high probability to bag one of them. "I love the

boxing (style) of Nikhat. She is very intelligent. She has good ring tactics. She knows when she is winning and when she is losing," said Fernandez to SAI Media, indicating that the two-time world championships gold medalist, was a boxer who was always in control of her bouts. "This is Nikhat's time to prove herself. It's true that she had lived in the shadows of Mary Kom but now it's her chance to prove herself and make India proud," said Fernandez.

## Real Madrid request UEFA permission to play Manchester City under a closed roof: Report

Real Madrid have asked UEFA administration for permission to play Manchester City under a closed roof at the Santiago Bernabeu for Tuesday's Champions League quarter-final first-leg tie against the Premier League side, said a report.

According to ESPN, Madrid have made the request to UEFA, and the decision on whether to play with a closed or opened roof will be taken at a routine pre-match technical meeting on Tuesday.



The final decision will be made by UEFA in conjunction with match referee Francois Letexier, with the provision that the game must end under the same conditions as it started, unless severe weather forces the roof to be either opened

or closed.

City won their first Champions League title last season, and are due to face Madrid for the third-successive season in the competition. Pep Guardiola's team drew 1-1 at the Bernabeu in last season's semifinal first-

leg and lost 3-1 in Madrid in the semifinal second-leg 12 months earlier, while the club that won the first leg of the previous season finished 1-1 at the Bernabeu. The retractable cover was built to the stadium during renovations that increased the capacity to 85,000 spectators, but Madrid is now trying to make the most of it after losing 5-1 on aggregate in the semifinals of the previous season. tion for Carlo," Guardiola said at his pre-match press conference. "But sometimes when you have the experience, because I was in Barcelona, when Real Madrid lose it was really, really bad and they have to think that the other team was better. "In football, it happens. That game, we were better, not because Real were bad. We made a lot of good things, but in those clubs, we are always judged as really bad and not good. "I try to think differently. Sometimes I came here and they beat me and I can say they were better."

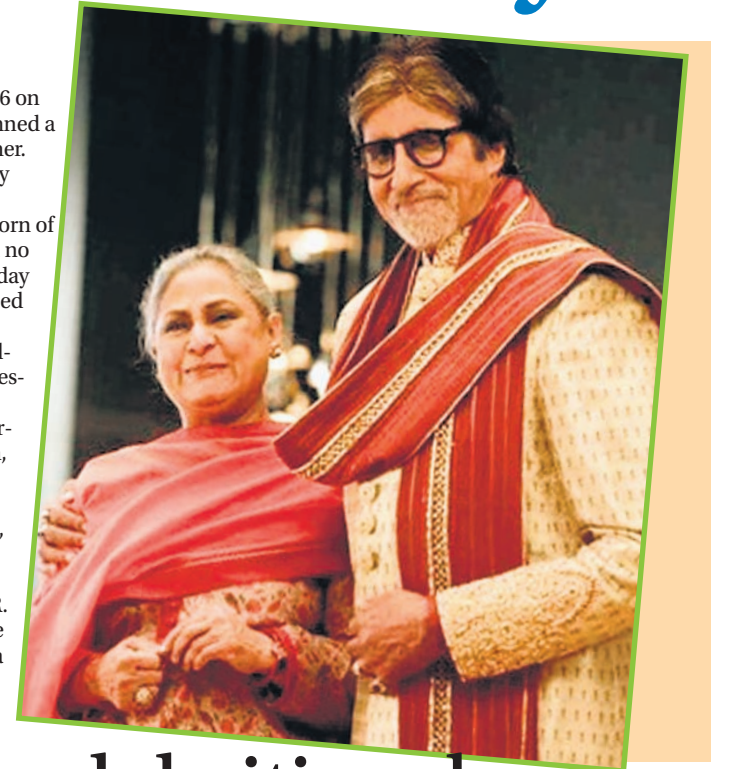
