India's CPI inflation eases to 9-month low of 4.85 pc in March

India's consumer price inflation eased to a 9-month low of 4.85 per cent in March bringing relief to household budgets, figures released by the Ministry of Statistics on Friday showed.

Retail inflation has come down closer to the RBI's mid-term target of 4 per cent after which the central bank would be in a position to cut key interest rates to spur economic growth.

The country's CPI inflation had stood at 5.09 per cent in February and 5.1 per cent in January.

The declining trend in cooking oil prices continued in March with a 11.72 per cent fall during the month. The price rise in spices slowed to 11.4 per cent in March from 13.28 per cent in February.

The inflation in pulses also slowed to 17.71 per cent during the month compared to 20.47 per cent in January.

However, the data shows that vegetable prices shot up by as much as 28.34 per cent in March which remains a pain point for consumers. The prices of cereals also increased by 8.37 per cent during the month.

The consumer price inflation is still above the RBI's mid-term tar-



get of 4 per cent and is the main reason why the central bank has not gone in for a cut in interest rates to rev up growth.

The RBI is keen to keep inflation under control to ensure stability and has held the repo rate steady at 6.5 per cent for seven consecutive times in a row in its bi-monthly monetary policy reviews.

The RBI stated in its monetary policy review on April 5 that it expects inflation to come down to 4.5 per cent in 2024-25, assuming a normal monsoon this year.

Going forward, the inflation trajectory will be shaped by the evolving food inflation outlook. Rabi sowing has surpassed last year's level. The usual seasonal correction in vegetable prices is continuing, though unevenly, the RBI said.

India's forex kitty surges to new all-time high of \$648.56 bn

India's foreign exchange reserves went up by \$2.98 billion during the week ended April 5 to scale a new all-time high of \$648.562 billion, data released by the RBI showed on Friday.

This is the seventh consecutive week marking a jump in the overall reserves. The forex kitty had increased by \$2.95 billion during the preceding week ended March 29, after notching a cumulative \$26.5 billion rise in the previous five weeks. Gold reserves, which also form part of the forex kitty held by the RBI, shot up by \$2.398 billion to \$54.558 billion during the latest week, while foreign currency assets increased by \$549 million.

The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were up by \$24 million to \$18.17 billion. RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das referred to the record foreign exchange reserves as a reflection of the strength of the Indian economy. "It is our prime focus to build a strong umbrella, a strong buffer in the form of a substantial quantum of forex reserves which will help us when the cycle turns, or when it rains heavily," Das said while unveiling the first monetary policy review of the current financial year that began on April 1. Rising foreign exchange reserves



are a positive sign for the economy as they reflect an ample supply of dollars that help strengthen the rupee.

An increase in the foreign exchange reserves gives the RBI more headroom to stabilise the rupee when it turns volatile. This is because the RBI intervenes in the spot and forward currency markets by releasing more dollars to prevent the rupee from heading for a free fall.

Conversely, a declining forex kitty leaves the RBI less space to intervene in the market to prop up the rupee.

India's forex reserves, including the central bank's forward holdings, can now cover more than 11 months of imports, which is a two-year high.

The RBI Governor also said the Indian rupee remained largely range-bound as compared to both its emerging market peers and a few advanced economies during 2023-24 and was the most stable among the major currencies during this period.

BJP drops names of Eknath Shinde, Ajit Pawar from list of star campaigners for Maha

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Friday released a revised list of 40-star campaigners for Maharashtra after it dropped the names of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar.

BJP's move comes days after the NCP (SP) had filed a complaint with the Election Commission against the BJP for violating the Representation of the People Act and poll code by publishing the names of individuals from other parties (CM Eknath Shinde and DCM Ajit Pawar) as their star campaigners released last month.

NCP (SP) had argued that the BJP had published the names of various individuals from other political parties as part of their Star Campaigner List which is violative of Section 77 of the Representation of People's Act.

The revised list was released when the polling for 5 constituencies from East Vidarbha is slated for April 19.

The new list comprises Prime Minister Narendra Modi, BJP President J.P. Nadda, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Home Minister Amit Shah, Minister



of Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant, Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, Vishnu Deo Sai, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma, Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, Chandrashekhar Bawankule, Shiv Prakash, Minister of Textiles, Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal, Minister of Information and Broadcasting Anurag Thakur, Minister of Civil Aviation Jyotiraditya Scindia, Minister

Bengaluru cafe blast case

NIA arrests bomber, his accomplice from West Bengal

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested bomber Mussavir Hussain Shazib and his accomplice Abdul Matheen Taha from a hideout on the outskirts of Kolkata city in West Bengal on Friday in connection with the Bengaluru cafe blast case.

After gathering inputs about their movements in Assam and West Bengal, the NIA arrested the accused, carrying Rs 10 lakh reward.

Shazib a.k.a. Shazeb, 30, is a resident of Thirathahalli town in Karnataka's Shivamogga district. Another conspirator, Taahaa a.k.a. Matheen a.k.a. Taha a.k.a. Vignesh. D a.k.a. Sumit, was also wanted in other cases.



"Shazib is the accused who placed the Improvised Explosive Device (IED) at the cafe and Taha is the mastermind behind the planning, execution of blast, and subsequent evasion from the clutches of law," NIA sources said. Confirming the arrests, West Bengal Police department said that, "Two suspects in the Rameshwaram Cafe blast case have been arrested from Purba Medinipur in a joint operation by the West Bengal Police and the central intelligence agencies."

DON'T TRAVEL TO IRAN OR ISRAEL TILL FURTHER NOTICE: MEA

New Delhi: India on Friday issued a travel advisory for its citizens, advising them not to travel to Iran and Israel "till further notice" due to the escalating tension in the region.

"In view of the prevailing situation in the region, all Indians are advised not to travel to Iran or Israel till further notice," the travel advisory issued by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

"All those who are currently residing in Iran or Israel are requested to get in touch with Indian Embassies there and register themselves. They are also requested to observe utmost precautions about their safety and restrict their movements to the minimum," it added.

Several other countries have also issued similar travel advisories for their citizens over the last 24 hours, warning them not to travel to the region due to security reasons.

Cong complains to ECI, accuses Gujarat Speaker of campaigning for BJP

The Gujarat Congress Committee has lodged a formal complaint with the Election Commission of India against Shankar Chaudhary, Speaker of the Gujarat Legislative Assembly, for allegedly violating the Model Code of Conduct.

Manish Doshi, spokesperson for the Committee, submitted the complaint to the ECI along with video evidence to support the allegations.

The controversy stems from activities that allegedly took place after the Lok Sabha elections were announced on March 17, activating the Model Code of Conduct across India.

Manish Doshi said, "According to Parliamentary Systems and Procedures Part-1, Chapter-9, upon appoint-



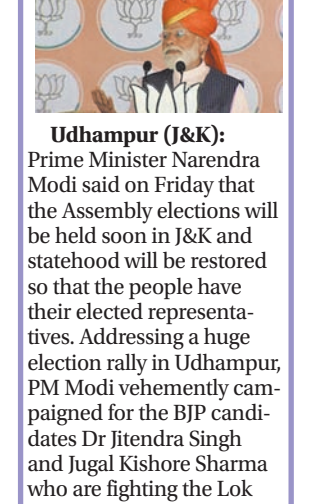
ment, the Speaker must detach from any political affiliations and remain completely impartial in political matters."

Despite these stipulations, "Chaudhary is accused of engaging in political campaigning." The complaint details

that "Chaudhary organised and participated in meetings in Banaskantha District and the Vav-Tharad area, advocating on behalf of the BJP's Lok Sabha candidate, which could be a significant breach of conduct for a sitting Speaker."

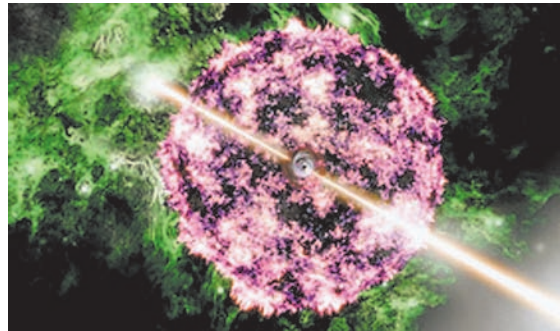

Supernova behind brightest gamma-ray burst of all time in 2022: Study

The brightest gamma-ray burst (GRB) ever recorded by scientists, in October 2022, was the result of a collapse and subsequent explosion of a massive star, or supernova, revealed a new study on Friday.

In the research, published in the journal Nature Astronomy, the team speculated that evidence of heavy elements, such as platinum and gold, might reside within the newly uncovered supernova. The team's extensive search did not find evidence of these elements, yet they noted that the origin of heavy elements in the universe continues to remain one of astronomy's biggest open questions. When we confirmed that the GRB was generated by the collapse of a massive star, that gave us the opportunity to test a hypothesis for how some of the heaviest elements in the universe are formed," said lead author Peter Blanchard, a postdoctoral fellow at Northwestern's Center for Interdisciplinary Exploration and Research in Astrophysics (CIERA). "We did not see signatures of these heavy elements, suggesting that extremely energetic GRBs like the B.O.A.T. do not produce these elements. That doesn't mean that all GRBs do not produce them, but it's a key piece of information as we continue to understand where these heavy elements come from. Future observations with JWST



will determine if the B.O.A.T.'s 'normal' cousins produce these elements," he added.

Blanchard started his search, about six months after the GRB was initially detected. It is because GRB was so bright that it obscured any potential supernova signature in the first weeks and months after the burst, he said.

Using the JWST's Near Infrared Spectrograph he observed the object's light at infrared wavelengths and found the characteristic signature of elements like calcium and oxygen typically found within a supernova.

"Surprisingly, it wasn't exceptionally bright -- like the incredibly bright GRB that it accompanied," he said.

Uddhav Thackeray hops onto Mumbai local train after campaigning in Palghar

Shiv Sena (UBT) President and ex-Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray on Friday did what millions of Mumbaikars do daily -- hop onto a Mumbai suburban local train for a quicker commute home.

Along with party MP Sanjay Raut, other leaders, and security staff, Thackeray hopped onto a train going from Dahanu in Palghar district to Bandra in the country's commercial capital, around 110 km apart.

As hundreds of curious commuters gawked for a glimpse of the VIP traveller among the commoners, Thackeray looked relaxed, though a tad bothered by the sweltering heat measuring around 33-degree Celsius.

After he boarded the crowded evening train, a prime window seat was arranged for him in the First Class compartment where he sat with Raut next to him, with the Mumbai Police personnel keeping a close watch around them.

As the train started for its usual long journey of approximately two hours from Dahanu to Mumbai, many commuters clicked videos, and tried to take selfies with Thackeray, while several television crews jostled for a perfect shot. Some excited commuters also raised slo-



gans in favour of Thackeray, making the commute quite noisy though nobody seemed to mind.

Earlier, Thackeray, Raut, and other party leaders visited the Palghar (ST) LS constituency to campaign for Shiv Sena (UBT) candidate Bharti Kamdi, where the former CM launched a scathing attack against the MahaYuti government, and its constituents Shiv Sena, BJP, and NCP.



AMIT SHAH SLAMS CONGRESS CHIEF KHARGE OVER REMARKS ON ARTICLE 370

Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday criticised Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge over his recent remarks on the abrogation of Article 370.

Speaking at a rally in Moradabad, HM Shah said: "Mallikarjun Kharge asks what people of Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh have to do with Kashmir. I want to tell them (the Congress) that every child of Moradabad is ready to give his life for Kashmir. For 70 years, Congress has nurtured Article 370 like its child."

The Union Minister said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Kashmir has been united with India forever.

Speaking at the rally, HM Shah said that the BJP flag will fly on all seats of Uttar Pradesh in the Lok Sabha elections. The state has 80 Lok Sabha seats.

HM Shah also said that law and order was weak in the previous governments. He said that smugglers and goons had earlier ruled Uttar Pradesh.

"Everyone defeated the Samajwadi Party together. Today,



during Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's rule, mafia and gangsters are migrating. After this, the development started here," HM

Shah said.

He said that there was a time when Hindus were migrating from Uttar Pradesh. He also gave the example of Kairana. "Today, goons are migrating instead of Hindus. Yogi Adityanath has worked to improve the law and order situation in Uttar Pradesh within seven years. Today, there is a rule of law in Uttar Pradesh. The mafia rule has ended," the senior BJP leader added.

HM Shah also said that airports are being built all over Uttar Pradesh. "Expressways and six-lane roads are being constructed in Uttar Pradesh. The government is working to provide electricity to 80 lakh villagers.

PM Modi-led government has done the work of providing free treatment up to Rs 5 lakh to more than three crore poor people.

"Besides, 2 crore toilets were built in 10 years and 14 crore people have been availing the benefits," HM Shah added.

The Home Minister also said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has provided houses to more than 4 crore people and gas cylinders have been given to 14 crore people.

Congress launches campaign song, amps up social media electioneering

Stepping up its electioneering in the digital space, the Congress on Friday launched its campaign song on social media to draw the attention of netizens and garner their support on its key electoral issues, ahead of the Parliamentary elections 2024.

The campaign song was released by the official handle of the Congress on Friday and also shared by top leaders including Rahul, Priyanka Gandhi and party spokespersons.

The 30-second video clip highlighting the plight of farmers tries to hard sell the point, 'how one vote can change their destiny'. The three demands highlighted in the video include - the MSP guarantee for crops, GST-free farming and loan waivers.

The campaign song mentions the historic Rs 72,000 debt waiver for farmers by the UPA government (in 2008) and urges the farming community to raise voice for their rights.

As the Congress reiterates



"Haath Badlega Halaat," its campaign song sends across the message that farmers should cast their vote in favour of the party as this is their 'real voice' and it is the one that will fight for their rights.

Notably, social media has emerged as the new 'battle zone' in the run-up to the 2024 elections and is being optimally utilised by the political parties to amp up their campaign and lure new voters.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in particular has taken

the lead in this space and has been pushing multiple campaign songs and also customised videos to drum up the support of netizens.

Recently, BJP launched a series of campaign songs including "Sapne Nahin Hakikat Bunte hain..." and "Bharat Ka beta Modi..." in as many as 12 languages. It also released videos to show the Opposition in bad light. The video titled 'INDIA alliance mein fight but Main Hi Hoon Dulha right' became a runaway hit, drawing lakhs of views within 24 hours.

5 women held for targeting Metro passengers in Delhi

Delhi Police on Friday claimed to have busted a gang of thieves, who used to target passengers travelling in the metro and arrested five women, an official said.

The accused, all residents of Anand Parbhat, used to carry infants in lap to divert attention or to pick up quarrels from fellow passengers on the pretext of raising false allegations. According to police on April 9, one woman reported that while she was travelling by metro train on the blue line between Rajiv Chowk Metro Station and Rajendra Place Metro Station, her purse containing Rs 50,000 cash was stolen by some unknown persons.

During the probe, the police team scanned the CCTV cameras and tracked the movement of the victim till she boarded the Metro train on the blue line towards Rajendra Place.

"Thereafter the CCTV footage of Metro bogey was checked and it was apparent that five women surrounded the complainant from all sides in the crowd. Surprisingly, two of them were carrying infants in their laps and both were trying to divert the attention of the



complainant," said Deputy Commissioner of Police (metro) KPS Malhotra.

The police team then followed suspects' movements at R K Ashram Marg where they were seen exiting from the station and boarding in an autorickshaw. "All the accused women were nabbed, on the basis of specific information, from the Connaught Place area on April 10 when they were moving towards Metro station Rajiv Chowk," said the DCP. On interrogation, the accused revealed that all of them joined together to operate in a group with the common intention of committing theft at crowded Metro stations.

3 VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS INJURED IN EXCHANGE OF FIRE IN DIFFERENT MANIPUR DISTRICTS

Imphal: After a lull, incidents of armed clashes were again reported in different districts in Manipur on Friday, leaving three village volunteers injured, police said. A police official said that heavy exchange of fire between different armed groups was reported at the peripheral areas of Heirok of Thoubal and Tengnoupal districts, and also along Pallel of Kakching and Tengnoupal districts. The three injured were shifted to the hospital. After the firing exchange in Heirok, an irate group of village volunteers, along with a large number of villagers, retaliated against the rival ethnic group. Some angry armed attackers also burnt down a sawmill. Combined teams of security forces including Manipur Police, and commandos rushed to the mountainous areas and three attackers were apprehended and arms and some ammunition seized from them.

Schools may face disaffiliation if buses found 'unsafe' for students

Gurugram district administration on Friday issued a fresh set of guidelines asking schools to either ensure the safety of students in school buses or lose affiliation.

Gurugram Deputy Commissioner (DC) Nishant Kumar Yadav said this while addressing the meeting of officers in Gurugram on Friday.

Haryana Chief Secretary T.V.S.N. Prasad also ordered the DC, Superintendent of Police (SP) and other officers of all the districts of the state including Gurugram through video conference that school vehicles should be checked in every district in the next ten days. The latest warning by the district administration comes after the recent major school bus accident in Kanina in the Mahendergarh district which claimed several student's lives.

Meanwhile, while checking the school buses on Friday the Gurugram Police fined 16 buses and 11 buses were



impounded that failed to complete guidelines. At present, there are about 527 private schools and 2,600 school buses in the rural and urban areas of the district. The Surakshit School Vahan Policy lists some basic norms that school buses must meet. These include CCTV cameras in buses with storage of footage for 15 days, speed governors, contact numbers on the front and back of buses, reflective strips and the presence of a lady attendant in the buses.

The police also mandate that a driver have at least two years of driving experience. A fitness certificate from the civil surgeon is also required. The drivers are

strictly prohibited from using their mobile phones as well as interacting with passengers on board while driving.

In addition to this, the bus should have a Regional Transport Authority (RTA) clearance certificate, insurance and pollution certificate. The schools will have to ensure bus parking inside their premises and that the students are boarded and dropped within the premises, as per the policy. Moreover, no school bus is allowed to increase the speed above 50 kilometres per hour, all school buses should have a fire extinguisher and first-aid box and all bus drivers should undergo medical tests every three years.

A driver who has been challaned even once for the offence of over-speeding, driving dangerously or being charged under sections of the Indian Penal Code for any accidents, cannot be employed.

The Transport Department's helpline number and registration number of the vehicle shall be displayed at prominent places inside and outside the bus in contrasting colours.

Rs 34 crore blood money for Keralite on death row in Saudi Arabia set to be achieved, mother thankful

Fatima, mother of Abdul Rahim, who is on death row in Saudi Arabia, cannot hide her happiness as a staggering Rs 30 crore, of blood money to save him from execution, has been raised through crowdfunding.

Abdul Rahim requires another Rs 4 crore as a court in Saudi Arabia ruled in October last year that if he pays Rs 34 crore as blood money to the family of the victim, then he will be free. The last date for the payment of the blood money is April 18.

His house here is buzzing with activity after Fatima last month issued a passionate plea seeking help from all to save her son.

First, the local mosques came to her support and soon when the media took it up, an action committee to save the life of Abdul Rahim was formed and an app seeking contributions from all kind-hearted



souls from across the globe was created. "On March 19, we were able to raise only Rs 1 crore and on Friday,

we touched Rs 30.11 crore. At the moment, we have decided to stop as it was decided to do an audit. We will resume it again later in the day and given the fantastic response that we saw, we are confident we will be able to achieve the target and Abdul Rahim and his mother will be able to meet soon," a representative of the group behind this crowdfunding venture said. An auto driver here, Abdul Rahim was drawn to the Gulf to make more money. He reached Saudi Arabia in 2006 and got a job as a personal driver-cum-care taker of a 15-year-old physically challenged boy, who also had a medical ailment where he breathed through an external device connected to his body. The boy, according to Abdul Rahim, misbehaved with him while he was driving and as he was trying to quieten him, his hand accidentally touched the external medical device and it fell down and the boy died.

Samajwadi Party President Akhilesh Yadav on Friday said that the realisation of the strength of farmers had made the BJP government at the Centre scrap the three "black" farm laws.

Launching his election campaign from Pilibhit, he said the people of Pilibhit have made up their minds to defeat the BJP and the ruling party is scared.

"The faces of BJP people turn 'peela' (yellow) on hearing the name of Pilibhit," he said. The SP President also attacked the BJP government over the issue of electoral bonds and demonetisation. The Samajwadi Party, Congress and All



India Trinamool Congress are contesting the polls in Uttar Pradesh as part of the INDIA alliance.

Misa Bharti says media 'twisted' her statement on PM Modi

RJD Rajya Sabha MP and Patliputra Lok Sabha candidate Misa Bharti, on Friday, blamed the media for "twisting" her statement on Prime Minister Narendra Modi. She further claimed that the media did not release her full statement.

Misa Bharti on Thursday had said that if INDIA bloc forms a government at the Centre, then a lot of BJP leaders, along with PM Modi, will go to jail.

Misa addressed media persons on Friday: "I said that the Supreme Court had made a remark on electoral bonds and termed it unconstitutional. If our government comes to power in the Centre, we will start an investigation into it and the culprits will be punished. My statement was twisted by the media."

Addressing the election campaign in the Maner area under Patliputra Lok Sabha constituency on Thursday, Misa had said: "BJP leaders are taking action against the Opposition through ED and CBI but this is not an issue. He (PM Modi) is not raising issues like unemployment and price rise in



the country." "We are talking about doubling the income of farmers and implementation of Minimum Support Price (MSP) and he (PM Modi) is blaming us for doing appeasement," Misa added.

DELHI COURT SEEKS ED, CBI REPLY ON MANISH SISODIA'S INTERIM BAIL PLEA

Delhi court on Friday sought response of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on the interim bail plea of Aam Aadmi Party leader and former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia.

Sisodia has sought interim bail to campaign for his party for the upcoming Lok Sabha polls. Special Judge Kaveri Baweja of Rouse Avenue Court has listed the matter for next hearing on April 20.

Judge Baweja had, on Wednesday, said that she will hear, on April 15, Sisodia's bail application in the excise policy-related money laundering case.

The court had heard arguments from Sisodia's counsel, who opposed the submissions made by the ED, saying that the probe agency was reiterating arguments previously presented before both the Delhi court and the Supreme Court.



The AAP leader's judicial custody was extended till April 18 in the case.

Last time, the ED had contended that Sisodia and the other accused

persons were delaying the trial in the case.

Last week, Sisodia's bail application was filed by his counsel alleging delay in completing the investigation in the case.

Sisodia's counsel Mohit Mathur had argued there has been no evidence linking his client to the alleged bribe money.

He had argued that the alleged proceeds of crime were not proven to cause any loss to the exchequer or private consumers. He had stressed the delay in the trial, stating that the Supreme Court's order, allowing him to approach the court, is six months old, and the investigation should have been completed by now.

Citing the bail granted to another accused, Benoy Babu, Mathur had argued for Sisodia's bail, saying that he no longer holds a position of influence. He had also stressed that Sisodia met the triple test for bail, as outlined by the Supreme Court, and urged for a speedy trial.



CM Shinde, Ajit tell Mahayuti candidates, cadres to avoid controversial remarks

As campaigning in Maharashtra gathers momentum, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has urged Mahayuti candidates, leaders and functionaries not to make any controversial statements and attract the wrath of the Opposition and the electorate. In an emotional appeal at the Mahayuti rally in Pune late on Thursday night, CM Shinde went on to add that the alliance is looking to increase the voting margin of its nominees and not reduce it. "So, refrain from making controversial remarks and from objectionable behaviour. Our focus is to win the maximum seats in Maharashtra and thereby contribute to the 400 plus target at the national level to make Narendra Modi the Prime Minister for the third term," said CM Shinde.

Deputy Chief Minister and NCP National President, Ajit Pawar also advised the Mahayuti functionaries at the rally to be polite. "Keep ice on your head before leaving home. Do not get angry but be patient and cordial," advised Ajit Pawar in the same rally. "The Mahayuti leaders and functionaries should take due care not to be arro-



gant and boastful as it is not Maharashtra's culture. Our aim is to win more than 45 seats in Maharashtra and not less than that. Therefore, our behaviour in public places and also in rallies should be decent," he added. The advice by Shinde and Pawar came in the wake of unsavoury statements by the Shiv Sena nominee from Kolhapur, Sanjay Mandlik against the Congress' nominee and Chhatrapati Shivaji's descendant Chhatrapati Shrimant Shahu Maharaj and also by BJP nominee and state Forest Minister Sudhir

Mungantiwar in connection with the 1984 riots. Mandlik stoked controversy after he questioned the royal credentials of Chhatrapati Shrimant Shahu Maharaj. Mandlik commented that the present Maharaj (Chhatrapati) from Kolhapur is "not the true heir, but is adopted", and it is "the people of Kolhapur" who are the genuine legacy holders. NCP SP chief Sharad Pawar assailed Mandlik's statement saying it shows the level the Mahayuti leaders have stooped to. He further said that

adoption is not a new thing in royal families. Further, former Congress Minister Satej Patil demanded that Mandlik should offer an apology to the people of Kolhapur who would not tolerate objectionable statements against Chhatrapati Shrimant Shahu Maharaj. After strong criticism from various quarters Mandlik issued a clarification fearing damage to his poll prospects. Furthermore, Mungantiwar triggered a row after he made references to the 1984 riots in Delhi on how spouses and their children were separated and a "brother and sister were stripped naked and made to lie on a cot". The Congress party took strong objection to this and filed a complaint with the Election Commission of India urging it to cancel Mungantiwar's candidature for his incendiary speech. Though Mungantiwar tried to counter the criticism by accusing the Congress of cherry-picking certain parts of his speech and distorting his statements, he received a lot of flak on social media for his speech, leading the party seniors to advice caution to its candidates.

Maha govt orders panchnama of unseasonal rain-hit crops spread over 50,000 hectares

Maharashtra's Relief and Rehabilitation department has ordered panchnama (on-the-spot assessment) of crops hit by unseasonal rains and hailstorms in about 11 districts in the state. The badly affected crops of jawar, wheat, mangoes, oranges, bananas and Rabi are spread over 50,000 hectares of land in Nagpur, Amravati, Akola, Yavatmal, Washim; Vidarbha region and Parbhani, Beed, Nanded, Latur, Dharashiv and Hingoli from the Marathwada region.

The weather bureau has predicted unseasonal rains and hailstorms for two more days which has been a cause of worry for the farmers. State Agriculture Minister Dhananjay Munde said the district administration has been asked to early complete the panchnama and submit reports suggesting the financial assistance to be given by the government. The minister admitted that due to model code of conduct, there are curbs on the relief and rehabilitation department to declare the financial aid. However, the government will initiate the



action to provide relief to the farmers, he assured. The department's directives are crucial as amid the ongoing Lok Sabha elections, the opposition Shiv Sena UBT, NCP SP and Congress have targeted the MahaYuti government for the damage to crops and the subsequent loss incurred by the farmers. Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has countered the opposition's move by making it clear that the government will provide all the necessary assistance to the farmers affected by nature's fury. In Amravati district alone, Rabi crops and fruits

including oranges, mangoes, bananas, spread over 40,000 hectares were severely damaged. In the adjoining Akola, crops spread over more than 4,060 hectares in 74 villages were hit. In Buldhana, crops spread over 3,500 hectares from 100 villages were affected. NCP(SP) has slammed the BJP on the farmers' distress, saying that the party has now divided the farmers into which party they are associated with. "BJP is approaching farmers only to seek votes but they will not allow such an insensitive government to continue," the NCP(SP) said.

Raj Thackeray's 'Engine' hitched to Sunetra Pawar's Baramati LS poll bandwagon

Barely 72 hours after Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) President Raj Thackeray announced unconditional support to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the ruling MahaYuti government, he suddenly found himself catapulted from the political fringes onto the electoral mainstage, here on Friday. The MNS chief -- whose party symbol is a 'Railway Engine' -- finds a place of pride on the new posters, banners, handbills and publicity material of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) candidate from Baramati, Sunetra Ajit Pawar. Baramati has already made it among the handful of top Lok Sabha 2024 constituencies with a 'Big Fight' scheduled between NCP President and Deputy CM Ajit Pawar's wife Sunetra, and his cousin sister, Nationalist Congress Party (SP) Working President Supriya Sule, daughter of the Maratha strongman Sharad Pawar. The visibly tough fight between the 'bhabhi' (Sunetra) and 'nanad' (Supriya) has sparked huge interest not only among the locals but all over the country, even labelled as a contest between a 'rook-



ie' and a 'veteran' -- with all the men and women coming to the aid of the party on both sides. Now, with Raj Thackeray's entry, Sunetra A. Pawar's position seems to have beefed up, and his bespectacled photo in a saffron kurta is seen rubbing shoulders with the other bigwigs, occupying a

respectable spot. They are Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, Deputy CMs Devendra Fadnis and Ajit Pawar, Raj Thackeray, RPI (A) President and Union Minister Ramdas Athawale, Rashtriya Samaj Party leader Mahadev Jankar, and Rayat Kranti Sanghatana head Sadabha Khut. At the top left is perched former Deputy Prime Minister Y. B. Chavan -- who was the Bombay State's last CM and the first CM of the newly-created state of Maharashtra, besides the founder of the original Shiv Sena Balasaheb Thackeray. Facing an onslaught of opposition from almost the entire Pawar clan, Sunetra A. Pawar is earnestly campaigning to wrest the Baramati LS seat from Supriya Sule's clutches. Nobody believes it will be a cakewalk for Sunetra A. Pawar -- after all, the Baramati LS has elected Sharad Pawar five times, plus one by-election, Ajit Pawar Pawar once and Supriya Sule three times. It has been a traditional Congress-NCP (undivided) bastion from the 1957 LS elections, barring two occasions -- during the Janata Party wave of 1977 and a bypoll in 1985.

Chhagan Bhujbal refutes reports of contesting from Nashik on 'lotus' symbol

Even though the MahaYuti partners in Maharashtra -- the BJP, Shiv Sena, and NCP -- are yet to arrive at an understanding on the candidate for the Nashik Lok Sabha constituency, state minister and senior NCP leader Chhagan Bhujbal on Thursday denied reports of contesting the seat on BJP's lotus symbol. Bhujbal, who has not hidden his desire to contest the Nashik seat, made it clear that he will fight only on the party's clock symbol. "I have had a word with party President Ajit Pawar and Working President Praful Patel for the nomination from Nashik," said Bhujbal, as he called the reports claiming he will contest from Nashik on the lotus symbol 'completely false' and 'incorrect'. "Ajit Pawar has already staked the party's



claim on the Nashik seat, and a final decision will be taken by the MahaYuti leaders," he added.

Congress miffed as Shiv Sena (UBT) covets Mumbai North LS seat

In another twist, the Shiv Sena (UBT) is keen to contest the Mumbai North Lok Sabha constituency which has been allotted to Maha Vikas Aghadi ally Congress, party leaders said here on Friday. SS (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut said that "if given, we are ready to fight Mumbai North" and expressed confidence that its candidate would win. Simultaneously, the prime contender, SS (UBT)'s local heavyweight Vinod Ghosalkar also aired his desire to contest Mumbai North and defeat the main rival, Bharatiya Janata Party's Union Minister Piyush Goyal. "It is not a question of who is my opponent... the ground situation is that I have a strong base and the support of people in this constituency. People are also keen to see a SS (UBT) candidate in the fray as they have been shocked by my son's killing in February," Ghosalkar said.



The Raut-Ghosalkar claims are likely to create fresh frictions between SS (UBT)-Congress which are openly at loggerheads over the Sangli Lok Sabha seat. Congress leaders have slammed the state leadership and negotiators for not doing tough talk which saw the Sangli constituency slipping out of its hands and the SS

Congress: Shiv Sena must apologise for slur on Kolhapur Chhatrapati's royal bloodline

The Congress has demanded an apology from Shiv Sena MP Sanjay S. Mandlik who raised questions on the royal credentials of his rival and INDIA bloc-MVA-Congress nominee Chhatrapati Shrimant Shahu Maharaj, here on Friday. As an ignoble row continued for the second day, Kolhapur Congress strongman, MLA Satej D. Patil, alias Bunty, slammed Mandlik for his utterances and clamoured for his apology. "He has insulted the descendants of the legendary Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj by such comments. He must tender an apology to the people of Kolhapur, Maharashtra, and the Chhatrapati's family members," said an indignant Patil. Unfazed by the raging controversy, Mandlik denied committing any disrespect or casting aspersions on the Chhatrapati Shrimant Shahu Maharaj. "What I meant was that this Chhatrapati is not from Kolhapur, he was adopted and is an outsider... We have the highest regards for the Chhatrapati. Why should I offer any apology," demanded Mandlik. Patil shot back by asking "who has given Mandlik the 'script' to read out" and why did he suddenly remember the Chhatrapati's royal lineage after six decades. Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut said that the people of Maharashtra "will not forgive or forget" the slur by Mandlik on the Chhatrapati who is a revered personality, and the 12th direct descendant of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. Vanchit



Bahujan Aghadi (VBA) President Prakash Ambedkar said that "the whole world has accepted Chhatrapati and his family", so it's not appropriate to comment on someone's remarks against him. At an election rally on Thursday, Mandlik, hoping for a repeat term in Lok Sabha, raised the issue of the Chhatrapati's distinguished ancestry, and claimed that the latter was actually "an adopted royal". Mandlik questioned whether the Maharajas (Chhatrapati) are really from Kolhapur, and contended that "they are not the true heirs, but are adopted", and it is "the people of Kolhapur" who are the genuine legacy holders. Kicking up a fracas, Mandlik's comments attract-

ed flak from the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi, including Nationalist Congress Party (SP) President Sharad Pawar, Shiv Sena (UBT)'s Sanjay Raut and Kishore Tiwari, and Congress' Atul Londhe. "Adoption in royal families is not new... Many have become kings/rulers in this way in the past. For, once they are adopted, they become the rightful representative of that royal lineage. Chhatrapati Shrimant Shahu Maharaj is a highly revered figure in the public mind," said Sharad Pawar. He lamented that Mandlik's remarks indicated the depths to which the ruling party players can stoop, and showed their mentality towards the Opposition candidates.

Waiting for LS ticket, Shiv Sena MP says BJP must take care of allies

Sitting MP from Mumbai North West and veteran Shiv Sena leader Gajanan Kirtikar on Friday said the BJP should fulfil its slogan of 400 plus seats, but at the same time, it must also take care of its allies. Kirtikar, who is unclear about his re-nomination from the same constituency, also said that the BJP should respect the opposition too. "Now the slogan of '400 par' is being given. We will also take the initiative to make Narendra Modi the Prime Minister. But some BJP leader's attitude can create trouble for him," said Kirtikar. Kirtikar said, "I have



completed 57 years in Shiv Sena. But I have never been deceitful. I announced I would campaign against Amol Kirtikar (his son, who is the Shiv Sena UBT nominee in Mumbai North West)," Referring to the inquiry by

the Enforcement Directorate against Amol Kirtikar in connection with the alleged Khichdi scam, Gajanan Kirtikar defended his son and claimed that nothing would come out of the ongoing investigation. "Amol is accused of the Khichdi scam. But that company was founded by Sanjay Mashelkar. These people were doing social work during Corona. After the concept of a jumbo hospital came up, Mashelkar's company did the work of providing materials for it. Amol and Suraj Chavan, who is from Shiv Sena UBT and is currently under judicial custody in connection with the scam, are not involved in it. They helped with the supply chain. There is no scam in this. Amol got his remuneration. Income tax was also levied on it," said Gajanan Kirtikar. Mumbai North West constituency will go to polls on May 20.

They tried but failed to lure Sharad Pawar': Jayant Patil on Praful Patel's claims

Nationalist Congress Party (SP) state President Jayant Patil on Friday said that the rival Ajit Pawar-led Nationalist Congress Party made attempts to lure Sharad Pawar on its side, but failed. Patil said that Sharad Pawar did not compromise on his ideology and principles and hence he would never side with the Bharatiya Janata Party or the ruling MahaYuti. "They tried a lot to take him (Sharad Pawar). But he has always been clear on his ideological principles and would never support the BJP. Despite the claims by the (rival) NCP, has anybody gone there," asked Patil. On the BJP's claims that the NCP (SP) is a "fake", Patil laughed and said it was strange that first they break a party and then call the original party a fake, as they did with the (undivided) Shiv Sena which split in June 2022, followed by the



However, Sharad Pawar dithered at the last minute and it did not materialise, contended Patil. He added that while Ajit Pawar took oath as Deputy CM on July 2, 2023, a fortnight later, the breakout faction leaders met Sharad Pawar in Mumbai and Pune, but the latter was reluctant at the last minute. Top NCP (SP) leaders, including Sharad Pawar, Jayant Patil, Clyde Crasto, Mahesh Tapase and others, dismissed Patil's statements as "blatant lies" terming it as a deliberate attempt by the rival NCP leader to sow confusion in the minds of the people ahead of the Lok Sabha 2024 elections. The NCP (SP) has cautioned that the people of the state are observing all these things very closely and as the polls approach, the party remains committed to public welfare under Sharad Pawar Sahab's leadership and "the voters will choose wisely", Patil said.

Women voters show power in Mizoram

Women voters have once again outnumbered men voters in Mizoram who constitute over 51.56 per cent of the total 8,56,364 electorate for the lone Mizoram Lok Sabha constituency, where elections will be held in the first phase of voting on April 19, officials said on Friday. According to election officials, like all previous elections, 4,41,559 women voters outnumbered the male electorate of 4,14,805 in the electoral rolls, which were published early this year after a special summary revision of the voters' list. Of the eleven districts in Mizoram, only in the Mamit district, the number of female voters (32,856) is higher than their male (32,278) counterparts. The officials said that in last year's November 7 Mizoram assembly election, 1.21 per cent more women voters exercised their franchise than their men counterparts. Around 80.66 per cent (6,87,334) of the total of 8.57 lakh voters exercised their franchise in the assembly polls in which female voters' turnout was 81.25 per cent while 80.04 per cent male voters cast their votes across the mountainous state. The ruling Zoram People's Movement, which is contesting the Lok Sabha election for the first time, has put up entrepreneur Richard Vanlalhmangaiha while the opposition Mizo National Front (MNF) fielded its sitting Rajya Sabha member K. Vanlalvena, the Congress nominated Lalbiakzama and BJP put up its state President Vanlalhuaka. The lone female nominee Rita Malsawmi, a singer and lyricist, was fielded by the Mizoram People's Conference and one independent candidate vying for the Mizoram Lok Sabha seat, reserved for the tribals. Congress candidate Lalbiakzama (64) is a former police officer and Mizoram's ex-Home Secretary. MNF's sitting Lok Sabha member from Mizoram C. Lalrosanga had expressed his reluctance to contest again, prompting the party to choose Vanlalvena.

From a firebrand BJP face to rebel leader, ex-K'taka Dy CM Eshwarappa at 'crossroads'

Senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader K.S. Eshwarappa is one of the frontline members of the party in Karnataka and has played a key role along with former chief minister B.S. Yediyurappa in making the BJP a force to reckon with in the state. The 76-year-old leader is the face of OBCs and the Kuruba community. The man who is regarded as one of the key leaders who built the BJP from scratch in Karnataka is today at 'crossroads', having vowed to defeat the candidate of his own party from the Shivamogga Lok Sabha constituency in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, in a strange turn of events. Eshwarappa has announced that he will file his nomination on Friday as an Independent candidate. He also asserted he would win the seat and "dedicate his victory on the feet of Prime Minister Narendra Modi". This decision has surprised everyone. Initially, everyone assumed that Eshwarappa would mellow down after the party high command spoke to him. However, his resolve to contest against the BJP candidate has become a major concern. The senior BJP leader would be contesting from Shivamogga as an Independent candidate against BJP candidate B.Y. Raghavendra -- the son of Yediyurappa. Eshwarappa wanted a BJP ticket from the Haveri Lok Sabha constituency for his son, K.E. Kanthesh. However, the party fielded former Karnataka CM Basavaraj Bommai from the Haveri seat -- a development that made Eshwarappa upset, with the ex-Deputy CM eventually deciding to contest against Yediyurappa's son in the Shivamogga Lok Sabha constituency. Eshwarappa expressed his outrage against Yediyurappa for not ensuring a ticket for his son Kanthesh for the Haveri LS seat. Following the incidents of the brutal murder of Bajrang Dal activist Harsha in Shivamogga and the suicide of a contractor Santhosh Patil, Eshwarappa was denied the ticket to contest Assembly election from Shivamogga seat, which he represented for five terms. When former CM Jagadish Shettar and ex-Deputy CM Laxman Savadi quit the BJP and joined the Congress last year ahead of the Karnataka Assembly polls following the denial of tickets to them, Eshwarappa remained calm and stated that he would abide by the party's decision. The "love-hate equation" between former Karnataka CM B.S. Yediyurappa and Eshwarappa is well known in Karnataka political circles. Sources within the party submitted that Eshwarappa is in a "hyper-sensitive" phase of his political career. And a defeat in the upcoming election could push him to a corner in the state's political arena. Karnataka unit BJP president B.Y. Vijayendra has already stated that "if Eshwarappa is willing to end his political career in this manner then no one can help him". Eshwarappa, a seasoned campaigner, has also seen a series of setbacks in his political career. He was asked to announce his resignation from the Cabinet in connection with the case of the suicide of a contractor in April 2022. Eshwarappa was denied ticket to contest from Shivamogga Assembly seat which he represented traditionally. And much to his chagrin, the party allotted ticket to his close aide Channabasappa, and he got elected. Eshwarappa, who did not speak a word then and kept toeing the party line has rebelled this time. He has vowed to challenge the



supremacy of his 'friend-turned-foe', B.S. Yediyurappa, in the party. "I can't simply sit and watch one of his sons becoming Union Minister, another becoming BJP state unit president and getting ready for the CM post. The BJP is in the clutches of the Yediyurappa family and I will get the party out of his clutches," Eshwarappa said. Eshwarappa's parents were daily wage earners. Motivated by his mother's wish to see him 'doing good in life', he went on to become one of the prominent politicians of Karnataka. Eshwarappa was born in Bellary district. His father Sharanappa and mother Basamma moved to Shivamogga in the early 1950s. His parents worked as daily wage earners. As a boy, Eshwarappa wanted to join his parents in the work. However, his mother did not allow him, and asked him to focus on education and "earn a good name in the society". His mother's words motivated him to continue his studies, and more so, focus on social work. Later, he was introduced to RSS through Narasimha Murthy Iyengar, a VHP leader from Shivamogga.

Since then, Eshwarappa never turned back in his life. From a student leader in ABVP, he became city unit president of the BJP in Shivamogga and went on to establish himself as a mass leader by defeating a heavyweight leader, then minister K.H. Srinivas, in the 1989 Karnataka Assembly elections. To date, he lost only once in elections from Shivamogga Assembly segment. Eshwarappa became Deputy Chief Minister in the erstwhile Jagadish Shettar-led Cabinet in 2012. He served as the Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Minister in the previous Basavaraj Bommai-led Cabinet. He was also appointed state unit party president twice. However, he was also known for controversial remarks throughout his political career. Seen as a Hindutva leader, his remarks at times drew national attention. BJP President J.P. Nadda had once advised him to "slow down" for his "hoisting saffron flag on the Red Fort" remark.

'Sound & stable' India-China ties serve interests of both countries: Chinese FM spokesperson

Sound and stable India-China relations serve the interests of both countries and are conducive to peace and development in the region and beyond, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning said on Thursday. Mao made the remarks at a daily press briefing when asked to comment on Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent remarks about the bilateral relations between the two countries. Xinhua news agency reported. In an interview, Prime Minister Modi said that for India, the relationship with China is important and significant, and the two sides need to urgently address the prolonged situation on the borders so that the abnormality in the bilateral interactions



can be put behind. He added that stable and peaceful relations between India and China are important for not just the two countries, but the entire region, as he expressed hope and belief that through positive and constructive bilateral engagement at the diplomatic and military levels, the two countries will

be able to restore and sustain peace and tranquility on the borders. Mao said the boundary question does not represent the entirety of India-China relations, and it should be placed appropriately in bilateral relations and managed properly. She also said that China and India maintain close communication through diplomatic and military channels on handling issues related to the border situation. "We hope that India will work with China, approach the bilateral relations from a strategic height and long-term perspective, keep building trust and engaging in dialogue and cooperation, and seek to handle differences appropriately to put the relationship on a sound and stable track," Mao said.

Thermal power plant near Kiev destroyed in missile attack

The Trypilska thermal power plant (TPP) outside the Ukrainian capital has been completely destroyed in a Russian missile attack, the media reported, citing an official. Andriy Hota, Chairman of the supervisory board at the Ukrainian power plant Centrenergo, said on Thursday that a massive fire erupted in the plant's turbine room after the attack, Xinhua news agency reported. "All the workers who were on shift during the strike are alive," Hota said, adding that efforts to extinguish the fire were



underway. Located 45 km south of Kiev, Trypilska TPP is the largest power generating facility in the Kiev region with an installed capacity of 1,800 MW. On Thursday morning, Russia fired 42 missiles, including six Kinzhal aeroballistic missiles and 40 combat drones, said the Ukrainian Air Force, which shot down 18 missiles and 39 drones. The Ukrainian authorities said that the attack targeted energy infrastructure facilities in five regions.

Russian regions grapple with severe flooding amid rising water levels

At least 13,000 people have been evacuated in parts of Russia as of Thursday, as multiple regions continue to battle extreme floods amid rising water levels, local authorities said. In some of the worst flooding in decades due to a continuous rise in daily average temperatures, snowmelt and rivers thawing, Russia's western Siberia, the Volga region and the Central Federal District have been flooded. A state of emergency has been declared in the Orenburg, Kurgan and Tyumen regions, Xinhua news agency reported. In the worst-hit western Orenburg region, 7,800 people have been evacuated, according to the regional government, with water levels in the Ural river around the

region breaking records last Thursday night. The flooding is expected to peak in the region in the near future, the Russian Ministry of Emergency Situations said. In the Kurgan region, more than 6,000 people have been evacuated, said regional governor Vadim Shumkov. In the Tobol river near the region's severely affected Zverinogolovskiy district, water levels have surpassed 10 metre, over one metre above the critical level, and are expected to rise above 11 metre in the near future, local media reported. In the Tyumen region, water in the Ishim and Tobol rivers rose by 56 cm and 22 cm in one day, local authorities said on Thursday, adding that the peak of the flood is expected by April 23 to 25.



Sudan conflict claims thousands of civilian lives, displaces millions in one year: UN

The UN Fact-Finding Mission in Sudan reports that nearly a year of fighting in the country has left thousands of civilians dead and millions more displaced, a UN spokesman said. "It said that fighting between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) has killed thousands of civilians since it began in April last year," said Stephanie Dujarric, Chief Spokesman for UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, on Thursday. "Over six million people have been displaced internally, while almost two million refugees have fled to neighbouring countries. Nearly 24 million people need aid," the spokesman added as quoted by Xinhua news agency report. April 15 marks the widespread conflict's first anniversary. Dujarric said France, Germany and the European Union will co-host a Humanitarian Conference for Sudan and its Neighbours in Paris on Monday. He added that Assistant Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs, Joyce Msuya, will attend alongside other UN officials and advocate for scaled-up resources to expand aid operations in Sudan and the region. Msuya will also advocate for improved humanitarian access so that agencies can ensure the timely delivery of life-saving supplies to communities in need. The spokesman said the Secretary-General will have a video message for the conference. Sudan has been engulfed in violent clashes between the SAF and the RSF since April 15, 2023. The violence has killed thousands of civilians, displaced millions more, and destroyed much of the country's infrastructure, especially in the capital of Khartoum.

Ukrainian Parliament passes law to toughen army mobilisation

The Ukrainian Parliament has passed a law to tighten military mobilisation rules, lawmaker Yaroslav Zheleznyak said on Telegram. The legislation, which aims to recruit more troops for the country's armed forces, was supported by 283 votes in favour, surpassing the required minimum of 226, Xinhua news agency reported on Thursday. According to the government-run Ukrinform news agency, Ukrainians liable for military services will be obliged to register at military enlistment offices or electronic cabinets once the legislation comes into effect. The new law also introduces some penalties for evaders, such as a ban on driving vehicles and restrictions on consular services. The mobilisation law is to be signed by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky before it comes into force.

29 killed in Israeli airstrike on Gaza

At least 29 people were killed in an Israeli airstrike on a residential building here on Friday, Palestinian news and information agency WAFA reported. Dozens of people were injured in the airstrike, said the report, without giving further details, Xinhua news agency reported. The Israel Defense Forces said in a statement on Friday that the airforce has attacked more than 60 targets in the Gaza Strip during the past 24 hours. Decomposed bodies of 13 people have been recovered from the Al-Balad area and the Al-Amal neighborhood in Khan Yunis Governorate. Details are awaited in Israel's response to the October 7 Hamas attack, 33,545 people have been killed.

Britain-trained Ukrainian saboteurs destroyed in Kherson region: Russia

Russian authorities have said that they have foiled the landing in the Kherson region of Ukrainian sabotage groups trained in Britain. The landing had been "planned by British special services" and was thwarted by the Russian Federal Security Service (FSB) and the Russian



Defence Ministry, said a statement by the FSB on Thursday as quoted by Xinhua news agency report. One Ukrainian

soldier was captured alive, and the soldier confirmed that the saboteurs were trained in Britain, it added. The FSB said that the Special Boat Service, a British maritime special forces unit, is supervising the activities in the Ukrainian military behind such operations, which "indicates the direct involvement of the UK in the war".



OPPONENT DEMANDING CASTE-BASED SURVEY TO DIVIDE SOCIETY: BJP CHIEF J P NADDA

BJP president Jagat Prakash Nadda on Friday said the INDI alliance is demanding a caste-based survey, but its real agenda is to divide the people in the name of caste and creed.

"BJP wasn't against the caste-based survey in the country, instead we stand with the proposal, but their (opposition's) purpose is to divide the people, which the BJP won't allow ever," he said. Addressing a public rally in Chhindwara Lok Sabha constituency, the BJP chief said Prime Minister Narendra Modi emphasised on GYAN. Elaborating further, he said G stands for 'gareeb' (poor), Y for

Politics of appeasement will no longer stand in the country. Congress has always played politics of appeasement, now they are exposed and they have nothing to say to the people," he claimed. He appealed to the citizens of Chhindwara to elect BJP's Vivek Banti Shahu as their Lok Sabha MP, to make an end to "parivarvad".

I would appeal to the citizens of Chhindwara to elect a BJP candidate as your MP this time," he added. Congress top brass running away from contesting elections: Shivraj Singh Chouhan

Rahul Gandhi was defeated in the last general elections by the Smriti Irani in Amethi. As of now, Rahul Gandhi has filed his nomination only from Kerala's Wayanad constituency.

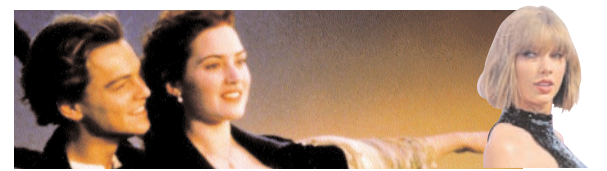
Guggal worth Rs 930 per kg bought for Rs 1700 per kg, fraud worth more than Rs 30 lakh

Due to the patronage of Additional Chief Secretary Forest JN Kansotiya, Managing Director of Minor Forest Produce Association Bibhas Thakur is also not able to stop the irregularities in the purchase of raw material in MFP Park Barkheda Pathani. The latest case of Google purchase has come to light. The in-charge SDO and production manager instead of purchasing at the tender rate, purchased from Aryan Pharmacy at the rate of Rs 1700 per kg. Absolute India don't endorse these allegations but as per the report, The manager of MSP Park had floated a tender for the purchase of raw materials including jaggery, black pepper, asafoetida, punarnava etc. In the tender, the rate of Herbal Automation Haridwar for Guggal was Rs 930 per kg. Instead of purchasing from Herbal Automation Haridwar, the SP Park owner purchased 4000 kg from Aryan Pharmacy at a price of Rs 1700. Neither work order was given nor any kind of correspondence was done from Herbal Automation Haridwar firm. The Sangh had to pay an excess of Rs 30 lakh 80000 due to the purchase from Aryan. During the tenure of



in-charge SDO and Production Manager Sunita Ahirwar, payments for the purchase of raw materials worth more than Rs 3 crore have been made out of the government supply of Rs 6 crore, out of which the bills of Rs 2 crore were from Aryan Pharmacy. Apart from this, repairs worth Rs 30-35 lakh have been made, says report. After the removal of Prasanna Fuljhale, CEO of Minor Forest Produce Processing Centre, Barkheda Pathani, the arbitrariness of SDO in-charge Sunita Ahirwar has increased. Even promoted IFS Archana Patel has been made CEO as a dummy in place of Fuljhale. The park officials and employees are meeting with ACS and the main reason for this is said to be conservation. Thakur, Managing Director of Minor Forest Produce Association, had instructed ACF Mani Shankar Mishra to submit the investigation report within 7 days to investigate the storage, but more than 15 days have passed and the investigation has not started yet.

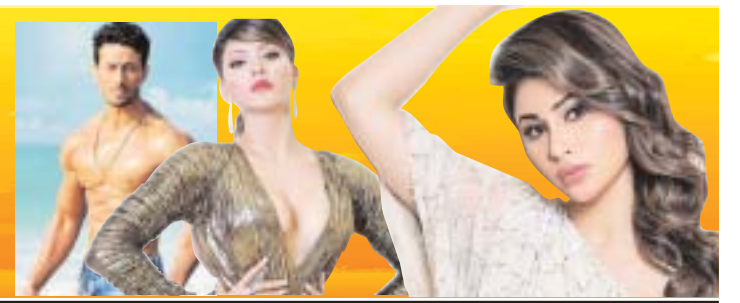

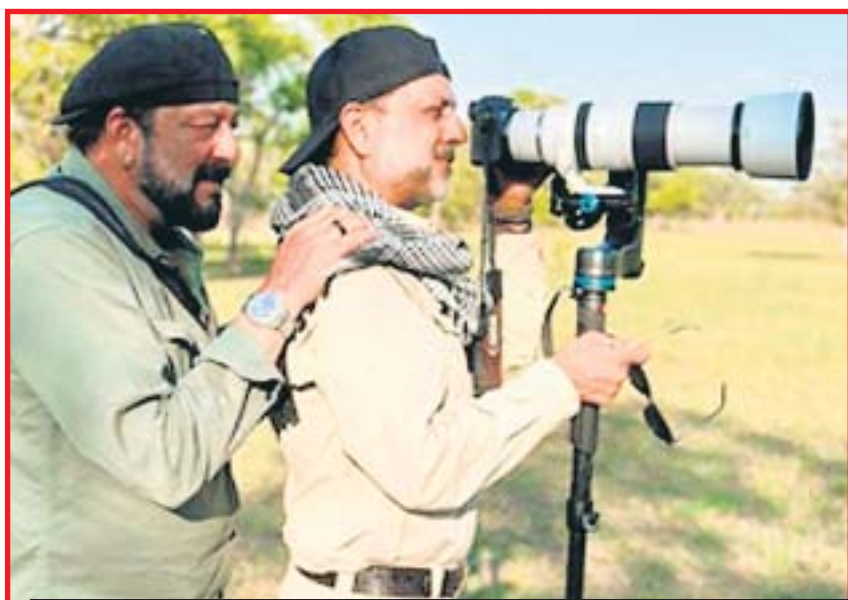
class, by using the excuse of cramps. I liked Hindi but didn't enjoy the class.

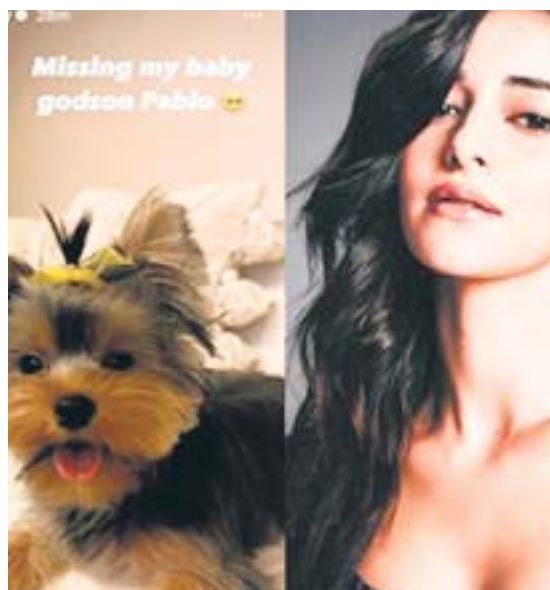
