India-China Border Situation Needs To Be Addressed Urgently: PM Modi

MATTER OF CONCERN...!



A stable India-China relations are important for the entire world, PM Modi said in an interview with US's Newsweek magazine. PM Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah have previously denied that China had captured any Indian territory. India's main opposition Congress party, however, says that the government makes it harder for India to deal with China's "illegal encroachments" each time it "gives a clean chit" to its neighbour. The two countries share an ill-defined, 3,440km (2,100-mile)-long border in the Himalayas, which has been a source of tension for decades.

The India-China border situation needs to be addressed urgently to resolve the "abnormality" in the bilateral interactions, said Prime Minister Narendra Modi, asserting that the two countries share an important relationship.

"For India, the relationship with China is important and significant. It is my belief that we need to urgently address the prolonged situation on our borders so that the abnormality in our bilateral interactions can be put behind us," said the Prime Minister.

He also hoped that the two neighbours will be able to restore peace at its borders through positive engagement.

"Stable and peaceful relations between India and China are important for not just our two countries but the entire region and world. I hope and believe that through positive and constructive bilateral engagement at the diplomatic and military levels, we will be able to restore and sustain peace and tranquility in our borders," he said while speaking to the New York-based magazine. China said it has taken note of the PM's remarks and that "sound and stable ties" serve the common interests of both countries. Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson Mao Ning told a media briefing that the boundary question "does not represent the entirety of the India-China relations" and it should be placed "appropriately in the bilateral

relations and managed properly." Stating that the two sides are in close communication through diplomatic and military channels, she said, "We hope India will work in the same direction with China, handle the bilateral relations from the strategic heights and long-term perspective, enhance mutual trust, stick to dialogue and cooperation, handle differences properly, and put the bilateral relations forward on sound and stable track." India-China ties deteriorated steeply in 2020 after clashes between their troops in the high-altitude Galwan Valley in the Ladakh region. As many as 20 Indian soldiers were killed in the clashes while China took an unspecified number of casualties, prompting top-level diplomatic and military talks.

FEEBLE AND INEFFECTIVE: CONGRESS

New Delhi: The Congress party, reacting to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Newsweek interview, described his remarks on China as "feeble and ineffective" and said that this will only encourage the dragon to assert claim on Indian territory.

Congress party's communications in-charge Jairam Ramesh, taking to X said: "Prime Minister had a chance to send a powerful message to China," but unfortunately, he failed to do so.

PM Modi told Newsweek that the ties between India and China were crucial and that there was an "urgent need to address the prolonged situation" on borders to put the "abnormality in bilateral interaction behind us."

Congress General Secretary, taking a searing jibe, described the Newsweek interview as the one where the Prime Minister was "at his cowardly worst." He said: "Prime Minister's reaction is not only disgraceful but also disrespectful to our martyrs, who made supreme sacrifice in defending our borders."

ADB ups India's growth forecast for 2024-25 to 7 pc, expects inflation to dip

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) on Thursday raised India's GDP growth forecast for 2024-25 to 7 per cent as it expects public and private sector investment along with a gradual improvement in consumer demand to drive up the growth rate. The ADB had in December projected India's economic growth rate at 6.7 per cent for the 2024-25 financial year. The ADB also



expects India's inflation rate to come down going ahead. "The Indian economy grew robustly in fiscal 2023 with strong momentum in manufacturing and services. It will continue to grow rapidly over the forecast horizon. Growth will be driven primarily by

robust investment and improving consumption demand. Inflation will continue its downward trend in tandem with global trends," the April edition of the Asian Development Outlook says. For the 2025-26 fiscal, the ADB has forecast India's growth at 7.2 per cent. The multilateral institution said exports are likely to be relatively muted this fiscal as growth in major advanced economies slows down but will improve in FY2025.

Modi will go to jail if INDIA bloc wins polls, says Lulu's eldest daughter Misa Bharti

RJD leader Misa Bharti's statement that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will go to jail if the INDIA bloc won the Lok Sabha election has caused a flutter in Bihar.

While campaigning in the Maner block on Sunday, Bharti, the eldest daughter of Lulu Prasad Yadav and the Pataliputra candidate, had said, "Who will answer on electoral bonds? Whenever he (PM Modi) comes to Bihar, he makes allegations of corruption against our family. If the INDIA bloc is voted to power, all the BJP leaders including the Prime Minister



will go to jail." Slamming Bharti, BJP leader and Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Kumar Sinha said after the polls people would get to know who would be in jail. "They are afraid of getting caught. The Lulu family used to stay in a peon's quarter and now owns a farmhouse and a shopping mall. They must clarify how they made such a huge property," he said.

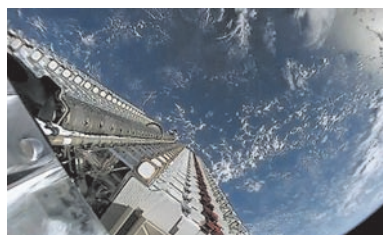
Will Musk announce affordable Starlink internet service during India visit?

Starlink, an affordable satellite-based internet service offered by Elon Musk-run aerospace company SpaceX, has transformed the way people access the web in remote and inaccessible parts of the world. Will Musk announce its arrival in India when he visits the country later this month?

After several failed attempts, Starlink is geared up to launch satellite broadband services in India, which has close to 92 crore broadband subscribers, according to the latest data by the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI).

Reliance Jio Infocomm and Bharti Airtel currently lead the broadband market, followed by Vodafone Idea and



BSNL. Starlink is set to soon get a license after clearing regulatory hurdles. The government in December last year passed The Telecommunications Bill 2023 which allows spectrum allocation for satellite-based services without the need to participate in auctions. The move favours companies such as OneWeb, Musk's Starlink and Amazon's Kuiper. According to experts, India's digi-

tal economy is experiencing a period of significant growth momentum. Increased digital access would empower citizens in 'aspirational India', fostering a wave of entrepreneurship, enhanced access to education and healthcare, and increased participation in the digital workforce. All Starlink subscription plans include unlimited high-speed data on land with no long-term contracts or commitments. Starlink users can get download speeds up to 220 Mbps, with most of them receiving speeds of over 100 Mbps. The cost of Starlink services in India is not known as of now. In the US, the basic Starlink Wi-Fi for homes in rural areas is \$120 per month for unlimited internet sans contract. There are other data plans as well.

Cops at Kashi Vishwanath Dham to wear dhotis

The policemen deployed at the Kashi Vishwanath Dham complex in Uttar Pradesh's Varanasi will now wear dhoti-kurta to present a devotee-friendly image.

An experiment in this regard was held in 2018 also. According to temple officials, the male officers will wear dhoti and a dupatta (shawl) to resemble priests, while female officers will wear salwar kurta. Before deployment, these officers will undergo a three-day training programme to hone their soft-skill communication with devotees. The move is designed to



improve the devotee experience and avoid negative perceptions associated with police uniforms. In addition to the new attire, a "no touch" policy will be implemented for crowd control. Commissioner of Police, Mohit Agrawal, said that devotees often felt disrespected by the way the police handled crowds. He noted that devotees were more accepting of similar actions from temple priests.

DELHI'S VIGILANCE DEPARTMENT TERMINATES CM KEJRIWAL'S PRIVATE SECRETARY



New Delhi: The Directorate of Vigilance of Government of Delhi has issued an order for termination of Bibhav Kumar, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's Private Secretary. The Vigilance Department has pointed out that since the individuals appointed on a coterminal basis are governed by the CCS (Conduct) Rules, it is important to consider Bibhav Kumar's character and antecedents verification that was carried out at the time of his previous appointment as Private Secretary to the Chief Minister. This is because, during his subsequent period of working in the government with the Chief Minister, there were no negative reports against him.

LET TERRORIST KILLED IN PULWAMA ENCOUNTER

A Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist was killed in an encounter with the security forces in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama on Thursday, police said.

The terrorist, killed during the encounter with the security forces in Frassipora village of Pulwama, has been identified as LeT's Danish Aijaz Sheikh, hailing from Ellahibagh locality in the Buchpora area of Srinagar.

Police said Sheikh had joined the LeT ranks two weeks back.



Army and the police had surrounded Frassipora village, 2 km from Pulwama town, early on Thursday following intelligence inputs about the presence of terrorists there. As the security forces closed on the hiding terrorist, he opened fire, triggering an encounter during which Sheikh was killed. Firing has stopped, but a search operation is still on in the area.

SEVEN STUDENTS KILLED IN HARYANA BUS ACCIDENT

Seven school students were killed and at least 15 sustained injuries after their bus with 40 children onboard lost control and overturned in Haryana's Mahendragarh district on Thursday.

The cause of the accident was negligence and rash driving, said Superintendent of Police Arsh Verma. He said prima facie it appeared the driver lost control of the bus and rammed it into a tree. He might have been drunk, he added.

As per the police investigation, the bus fitness certificate expired six years ago in 2018. The school was functioning despite a



holiday for Eid-ul-Fitr. Class IV to Class X students were from G.L. Public School in Kanina. The students were on the way to the school when the bus overturned while overtaking another vehicle, police said. The injured students were rushed to a nearby hospital. Five children died on the spot, while two succumbed to injuries on the way to the hospital. "Twenty children were brought here, out of which four were brought dead," Ravi Kaushik of Nihal hospital, Mahendragarh, told the media. According to the local administration, 12 injured have been moved to a local hospital, while two were admitted to a Rohtak hospital in critical condition.

CLOUD ENGINEERING A PAINKILLER, NOT SOLUTION AGAINST GLOBAL WARMING: STUDY

Marine cloud engineering, also known as marine cloud brightening (MCB), works primarily by increasing the amount of cloud cover, accounting for 60-90 per cent of the cooling effect, explained researchers at the University of Birmingham in the UK. To investigate the phenomenon, the researchers used aerosol injection from the effusive eruption of Kilauea volcano in Hawaii and created a "natural experiment".

Amid increased interest in cloud engineering, a new study on Thursday showed that the method, while effective in cooling the climate, can work only as a painkiller, not a solution. "Our findings show that marine cloud brightening could be more effective as a climate intervention than climate models have suggested previously," said the study's lead author Ying Chen from the University. However, Ying noted that "MCB does not address the underlying causes of global warming from greenhouse gases produced by human activity". "It should therefore be regarded as a 'painkiller', rather than a solution, and we must continue to improve fundamental understanding of aerosols'



impacts on clouds, further research on global impacts and risks of MCB, and search for ways to decarbonise human activities." They aimed to study the interactions between these natural aerosols, clouds, and climate. Further, using machine learning, historic satellite and meteorological data, the team created a predictor to show how the cloud would behave during periods when the volcano was inactive. This predictor enabled them to identify the impacts on the clouds that had been directly caused by the volcanic aerosols. The findings published in the journal Nature Geoscience showed that the cloud cover relatively increased by up to 50 per cent during volcanic activity, producing a cooling effect of up to -10 watts per square metre (W/m2) regionally.



'SOIL OF MARTYRS' VILLAGES REVEALS KASHMIR CONNECTION': PM MODI

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday sternly criticised Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge over his remarks in which he questioned the relevance of PM Modi raising the issue of Kashmir and Article 370 abrogation during his speeches, saying "many heroes from Rajasthan sacrificed their lives in Kashmir".

Addressing the Vijay Shanknaad Rally in Karauli, PM Modi said: "Congress leaders should understand how Rajasthan is connected with Kashmir. They should go to the families of martyrs in Rajasthan. The soil of martyrs' villages will speak the story of the Rajasthan and Kashmir connection."

"When I talk about Kashmir in Rajasthan, they ask if Article 370 is removed from Kashmir, then what is the concern of Rajasthan? I just want to tell the Congress... listen with open ears and send my video to your leaders also. Go to the homes of the brave martyrs of Rajasthan. The soil of their villages will speak the story of its connection with Kashmir. Many heroes from Rajasthan have



sacrificed their lives on the soil of Kashmir," PM Modi said. PM Modi said that the Congress has become narrow-minded after being away from power. "After being away from power, they have started thinking lowly. Now they are also asking questions about the land of Maharana Pratap," he said, while accusing the Congress of playing the "dirty game of appeasement" for the

sake of its vote bank. In an oblique reference to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, PM Modi, criticising the Wayanad MP, said: "The Congress prince in foreign countries says that India is not a nation. When the army carries out a surgical strike, they ask for proof. Congress was the first to stand with the 'Tukde Tukde' gang." Taking note of the massive crowd

From caste census to Agnipath revocation, Rahul reiterates Cong's five guarantees

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, on a campaign trail in Rajasthan on Thursday, launched a fierce attack on the Centre for its "pro-rich focus" and said that if party is voted to power, it will put an end to "discriminatory" governance besides bringing in a system, where people of all castes and community get adequate representation.

Rahul, addressing a huge public gathering in Bikaner, reiterated the Congress party's five big guarantees including caste census, Mahalaxmi Yojana, apprenticeship scheme, MSP for crops and repealing of Agnipath scheme.

Pitching for caste census as the party's first task, he said that this will be a great step towards social justice as this would end the dominance of a "minuscule" population on the country's vast resources.



credited into their account every year while the apprenticeship scheme will open the doors for employment for youth, besides giving them financial assistance during the training period.

He claimed that the Agnipath Yojana has been brought by the Modi government against the will of armed forces, and if Congress is voted to power, the party will first repeal this law.

Reiterating his charge that 90 bureaucrats run the country, out of which just three hail from backward castes, the Congress leader called for "correcting the errors of past and mark a fresh beginning".

"Though there exists no actual data, 50 per cent of the country's population comprises of backward castes and their representation in government machinery remains

abysmally low," Rahul said at the poll rally.

Rahul accused Modi government of extending favours to a few select 20-25 billionaires of the country and also said that the government has written off the loans of rich and powerful but poor people continue to remain burdened. "PM Modi didn't fulfil his poll promises of providing two crore jobs to unemployed youth, Rs 15 lakh in bank accounts of commoners but went to write off loans to the tune of Rs 16 lakh crore of industrialists," Rahul said, amid cheers from the crowd.

Claiming that the 2024 poll is a fight between nation's 20-25 billionaires in the country and a billion-plus population, he urged the people to vote for an equitable democracy, where all castes and communities have equal representation and country's resources don't remain a preserve of few select ones.

On April 5, the Congress, while launching its manifesto for the Lok Sabha elections, promised five Nyay and 25 guarantees.

K. Kavitha arrested by CBI, to be produced in Delhi court on Friday

Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) MLC, K. Kavitha, will be produced before Rouse Avenue Court in Delhi on Friday, said sources, adding that she was arrested by the CBI on Thursday in the alleged excise policy scam.

According to sources, she was arrested from Jail no-6 in Tihar at 12:50 p.m. on Thursday.

"She will be produced in court on Friday at 10:30 a.m.," the sources added.

The CBI informed a Delhi court on Wednesday that Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) MLC, K Kavitha was examined on April 6 in Tihar Jail in connection with the money laundering case related to the alleged excise policy scam.

On Tuesday, Special Judge



Kaveri Baweja of Rouse Avenue Court extended Kavitha's judicial custody till April 23 in the same case being probed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED).

The ED, while demanding

the judicial custody of Kavitha in the court, in its application, said that she is highly influential, and there is every likelihood, she will influence the witnesses and tamper with the evidence if released.

FIVE FEARED DROWNED IN UP CANAL, RESCUE OPERATIONS ON

Kasganj (UP): Five persons went missing in the Nadrai canal in Uttar Pradesh's Kasganj district on Thursday afternoon and are feared drowned, officials said.

According to reports, eight friends had come for a picnic to the Nadrai canal for Eid celebrations and waded into the waters for a bath.

However, they started drowning and called for help and another youth jumped in to save them. He also started drowning and hearing the commotion, some local people came to their rescue.

The police were informed and divers were pressed into service.

Four persons were rescued and efforts are on to rescue the remaining five.

No turning back, will fight party candidate in Shivamogga: Rebel K'taka BJP leader Eshwarappa

The fight for the high-profile Shivamogga Lok Sabha seat has intensified with senior BJP rebel leader, KS Eshwarappa announcing on Thursday that he will file nomination as an Independent candidate for the seat on Friday.

Speaking to reporters on Thursday in Shivamogga, Eshwarappa who has vowed to defeat BJP candidate, BY Raghavendra, son of former Chief Minister, BS Yediyurappa stated that withdrawing from the contest was out of the question.

Eshwarappa and Yediyurappa were part of the core team that built the BJP in the state from scratch.

"There is no scope for negotiation now. I have entered the battlefield of



election. There is no question of going back now. If I withdraw it will be an injustice to my workers and sup-

porters who have already started work," Eshwarappa stated.

Eshwarappa asserted that

he would use the photos and videos of Prime Minister Narendra Modi while campaigning.

Eshwarappa addressed the press conference sporting a saffron shawl bearing the picture of the PM with the tagline, 'Rashtra Bhaktara Balaga (group of patriots).'

While answering a question about objections from some quarters on him using the PM's photos, Eshwarappa stated, "I challenge BJP candidate Raghavendra, his father Yediyurappa and his brother state President BY Vijayendra to campaign without the picture of Prime Minister Modi."

"Let father and sons go to the voters of Shivamogga without taking the name of Prime Minister Modi," he challenged.

Akali leader's daughter-in-law joins BJP, likely to contest against Harsimrat Kaur Badal

In a big jolt to the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD), its senior leader Sikandar Singh Maluka's daughter-in-law and former bureaucrat Parampal Sidhu on Thursday joined the BJP in Delhi.

Sources said she is likely to be fielded against Akali leader and former Union Minister Harsimrat Kaur Badal. Last week the 2011 batch officer of the Punjab cadre took voluntary retirement from the Indian Administrative Service (IAS). There is speculation that she may get the ticket to contest from the Bathinda parliamentary seat, currently represented by SAD leader Harsimrat Kaur Badal, wife of Akali Dal chief Sukhbir



Badal. Maluka's son Gurpreet Singh also joined the saffron party in the presence of the party's general secretary Vinod Tawde, Union Minister

Hardeep Puri and other leaders. Senior Akali leader Maluka was the education minister of the Akali government till 2017.

FIVE KILLED AS BIKES COLLIDE AND DUMPER RUNS OVER THEM IN UP'S PILIBHIT

Pilibhit : In a shocking incident on Wednesday morning, five people died after being trampled by a dumper in Pilibhit district.

The accident took place when two bikes collided near Nisra in Jehanabad police station area on Bareilly-Haridwar Highway.

A dumper coming from behind ran over them, killing them on the spot. The driver fled after the accident. The deceased include Aaqib (21), Saheb (25), and Arbaaz (26). The three youths were on their way to offer prayers on Eid.

Owais (33) and his wife Sakra Begum (30), who were riding on the second bike and were going to celebrate Eid with their relatives, also died in the accident.

From 2020 to 2024, she was Chief Executive of the National Cyber Security Centre.

She has also served as Director General of the Northern Ireland Office in the UK.



Rohan Gupta, Another Ex-Spokesperson, With Congress For 15 Years, Joins BJP

Former Congress spokesperson Rohan Gupta joined the BJP today, marking the defection of yet another visible opposition face to the ruling party in the election season.

Rohan Gupta, along with some other leaders, joined the BJP in the presence of Union minister Hardeep Singh Puri and its national general secretary Vinod Tawde. Slamming the Congress, a party he had been associated with for

nearly 15 years, Rohan Gupta said it has become directionless and full of contradictions, leading to loss of credibility.

He cited the Congress's stand on a host of issues, including its decision to not attend the Ram temple consecration ceremony, opposition to the CAA and aligning with parties like AAP, to make his point. Rohan Gupta expressed his support to the BJP leadership's agenda of a "viksit Bharat" by 2047 and lauded Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision.

Son of Beant Singh who assassinated PM Indira Gandhi, contesting Lok Sabha election

A relative of one of the assassins of late Prime Minister, Indira Gandhi, is contesting the parliamentary elections in Punjab from the Faridkot (Reserved) constituency as an Independent.

A Class XII dropout, Sarabjit Singh Khalsa (45) is the son of Beant Singh, one of the two killers of the late Prime Minister.

In 2014 and 2009, Sarabjit Singh Khalsa unsuccessfully contested the Lok Sabha polls from the Fatehgarh Sahib (Reserved) and Bathinda seats, respectively.

In 2019, he was the Bahujan Samaj Party candidate. Beant Singh and Satwant Singh, bodyguards of then PM Indira Gandhi, had riddled her with bullets on October 31, 1984 at her residence.

In 2014, Sarabjit Singh Khalsa had declared assets to the tune of Rs 3.5 crore in the election affidavit.

His mother, Bimal Kaur, and his grandfather, Sucha Singh, became MPs from Ropar and Bathinda, respectively, in 1989.



Either Rahul or Priyanka will contest from UP: AK Antony

Veteran Congress leader and CWC member A.K. Antony has said there will be one person from the Gandhi family who will contest either Rae Bareilly or Amethi in Uttar Pradesh.

Antony said this while speaking to a TV channel here on Thursday.

When asked if one member of the Gandhi family would be contesting from the traditional seat of the Gandhi family, Antony said, "Yes, there will be one", and when further probed if that would be Robert Vadra, he shot back and said, "it would be either Rahul or Priyanka."

Elaborating further, Antony said with every passing day, the confidence of the INDIA Bloc was increasing, while that of the BJP-led NDA was coming down.

"Just look at the body language of Prime Minister and it tells the tale..." added Antony.

The country's longest-serving Defence Minister and three-time former Chief Minister of Kerala, is now



leading a retired life but continues to visit the state party headquarters here every day.

He said due to his health, he has not yet decided if he will hit the campaign trail for the Congress-led UDF candidates. His son Anil Antony is the BJP candidate in the Pathanamthitta Lok Sabha constituency.



PEOPLE HAVE REJECTED CONGRESS, IT CAN NEVER RETURN TO POWER: AMIT SHAH

'DON'T EVER DARE TO CHANGE ARTICLE 370'

Bhopal: Union Home Minister Amit Shah, while addressing a public rally in Madhya Pradesh on Thursday, warned Congress, saying "don't ever dare to change Article 370 from Jammu and Kashmir".

The Home Minister said the decision to abrogate Article 370 from Jammu and Kashmir is of the BJP workers and Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

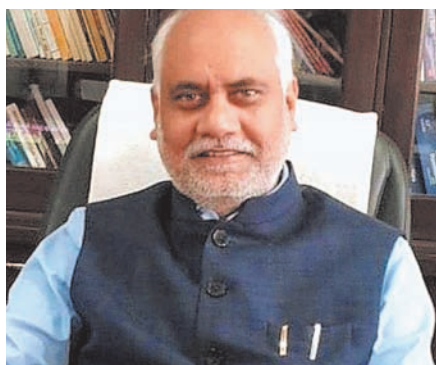
RGPV Scam: Accused Prof. Sunil Kumar arrested in Raipur

Nisha, now 22, is a warehouse executive with a monthly salary of Rs 18,000. While supporting her family, she wants to save some money to be able to renovate the family home.

Like Nisha, Swati Patel, from Dithwara in Katni, also took up the same course at the Saksham cen-



tre in Kymore. Recently, she also landed a job with Amazon India, with a starting salary of Rs 13,500.

Swati's sister Priyanka is a beauty therapist and runs her own parlour. Priyanka had completed a beautician's course from the same Saksham centre. "My sister and I are grateful to the Adani Foundation for training us to become financially independent and self-reliant," Swati says.

Last year, 13 women from the warehouse packers' batch, which had 16 women and 4 men trainees, got placed in Amazon India at Sanand, Gujarat.

Nisha, Swati, and Priyanka are setting a shining example for the multitude of women from remote villages who have limited opportunities. The time they spent at the skill development centre prepared them to secure their future and create a better life for their families.

Modi heading, Opposition lagging

Determined to return to power for a third straight term with a huge majority, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken an unsurpassable lead over the opposition in campaigning for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. Displaying massive zeal and an exceptional level of energy, PM Modi has so far covered the length and breadth of the country, sharing with the voters his clear vision about how his government aims to achieve the goal of 'Viksit Bharat'. Political watchers feel that "it seems PM Modi is exhibiting a significant campaign intensity leading up to the 2024 general elections". In what shows his deep dedication to work and duty, PM Modi remains engaged in sending his views across to the people down to the grassroots levels. Another method to reach out to people from various strata of society is through interviews with regional and national media. By giving interviews to regional media outlets like *Thanthi* in Tamil Nadu, the *Assam Tribune*, and *Amar Ujala* in Uttarakhand, PM Modi aims to resonate with the voters on local issues and concerns. In global outreach, he also engaged with international publications like *Newsweek* and interacted with influential figures like Bill Gates. This reflects PM Modi's broader vision for India's future and an attempt to project leadership on the global stage. His recent interaction with online gamers was a significant engagement. It was an engagement with the first-time voters through interactions with gamers which showed an innovative approach to connect with a younger demographic. Meanwhile, the opposition appears to be lagging in terms of campaigning intensity that keeps PM Modi going, with little or no significant efforts by the INDIA bloc being reported. Political observers say that their complaints about a lack of a 'level playing field' suggest frustration and possibly a sense of being overwhelmed by the BJP's campaign blitz.

Golden-voiced maestro whom classical musicians esteemed, playback singers emulated

Soon after he revolutionised Indian film music with 'Babul mora naihar', top classical musicians, meeting in Calcutta, decided that Ustad Faiyyaz Khan, who had sung the thumri earlier, should tie a ritual thread to K. L. Saigal to signify discipleship. The Ustad wanted to meet the singer alone first, and after an hour, someone checked to find that both, in high spirits, were insisting on calling each other their Ustad. This was revealed by santoor maestro Pandit Shivkumar Sharma, who heard it from music director S. D. Burman, a disciple of top ustadhs then and an eyewitness, but a more attested incident is of the Ustad, doyen of the Agra Gharana, telling Saigal that he had nothing to teach him that would make him a greater singer. Then, Ustad Abdul Karim Khan, of the Kirana Gharana, visited a cinema hall for the first time only to hear Saigal's rendition of a song in 'Devdas' (1935) and was moved to tears. That was the prowess of Kundan Lal Saigal, born on this day (April 11) in Jammu in 1904, and went on to become Hindi cinema's first - and sole - male singing superstar, and a significant cultural icon. In the film industry, all major singers who followed him - Mukesh, Mohd Rafi, Talat Mehmood, and Kishore Kumar - wanted to emulate him, and Rafi counted it a major achievement to sing in the chorus of one of his songs. On the other hand, Lata Mangeshkar, who was five when she saw him on screen, solemnly declared that she wanted to marry him when she grew up! But Saigal's path was not easy or straight as he tackled the challenges of his changing voice in adolescence, his father's opposition to his musical passion, and a variety of jobs - from railway timekeeper to typewriter salesman to hotel manager - before his tryst with films. He was twice rejected by HMV, then India's biggest music recording company, for "lack of training". Yet, he was so proficient in pitch that musicians used to tune their instruments by asking him to sing a note. He also became the first non-Bengali allowed to render 'Rabindrasangeet' with Rabindranath Tagore himself giving him permission. HMV's loss was Hindustan Records' gain and he became a top-selling artiste for them. One 1933 record, containing just the bandish 'Jhulana Jhulao Re' and bhajan 'Hori O Brajraj Dulare' on the flip side, sold a whopping half a million pieces in the days when gramophones were rare. Then to him, goes the credit for giving a new life to the ghazal and enabling all of India to hear his renditions of Mirza Ghalib, right from 'Nuktacheen hai gham-e-dil' from 'Yahudi Ki Ladki' (1933) - his first hit. However, succeeding ages have not been very fair to Saigal. If not forgotten, he is mocked, or at



best, parodied as an exponent of "old-fashioned" sorrow and pathos-imbued songs, especially his swan song 'Jab dil hi hot gaya' from 'Shahjehan' (1946) - where he did not play the title role! But then, Saigal is never for the superficial listener. As all accounts of him and his singing agree, he requires a measured and mellow outlook to appreciate, and his baritone/tenor mix, with just the slightest hit of a twang, slowly entrances you with his intensity and intricate art. In a career lasting just a decade and a half, spanning Calcutta and Bombay, and comprising 36 films - 28 Hindi, 7 Bengali, and one Tamil - he sang 185 songs, including non-film, in Hindustani, Bengali, Punjabi, Tamil, as well as Persian and Pashto. These include rare gems like 'Dukh ke ab din

beatat nahi' ('Devdas', 1935), 'Ek banla bane nyara' ('President', 1937), 'Karoon kya aas niras bhayi' ('Dushman', 1939), 'Ae qatib-e-taqdeer' ('My Sister', 1943), among others. Then there was 'Mai kya janoon kya jadoo hai' ('Zindagi', 1940), with the various shades he imbued in the second 'kya' - which is not easy to sing, or 'Diya Jalao' ('Tansen', 1943), where he emotes perfectly - especially where he seems a bit unsure of the raga's potency and closes his eyes mid-note. Then there is the breezy 'Mere Sapnon ki Rani' (Shahjehan) - where Rafi debuted as a chorus singer, and 'Hum apna unhein bana na sake' from 'Bhanwara' (1944) where he laughs mid-song.

And while he rendered many Ghalib ghazals, his version of Zauq's 'Laai hayat aaye.' is matchless. However, his liquor habit - though he was not a heavy drinker - led to his health deteriorating in December 1946, and he returned to his hometown Jalandhar, where he passed away on January 18, 1947, aged just 42. Naushad, his composer for 'Shahjehan', penned the perfect epitaph: 'Aisa koi fankar-e-mukammal nahi aaya/ Naghmon ka barasta badal nahi aaya/ Mausiqi ke maahir bahut aae lekin/ Duniya mein koi doosra Saigal nahi aaya.'

S.Korea's Opposition bloc wins landslide Parliamentary vote

The main opposition Democratic Party (DP) retained a majority in the National Assembly in Wednesday's general elections in another major setback for the ruling People Power Party (PPP) and President Yoon Suk Yeol. With almost all votes counted, the DP won 161 out of 254 directly contested seats, while the PPP won only 90 seats. Including proportional seats, the DP and its satellite party were expected to win 176 seats and the PPP and its satellite party 109 seats in the 300-member National Assembly, Yonhap news agency reported. The wider opposition bloc, including the Rebuilding Korea Party led by scandal-tainted former Justice Minister Cho Kuk, is expected to win more than 180 seats combined, as Cho's party is expected to secure 12-14 proportional seats. The New Future Party (Saemira), formed by former Prime Minister Lee Nak-yeon, and the New Reform Party led by ousted former PPP leader Lee Jun-seok are expected to secure one and three seats, respectively.



The results illustrated the seriously soured public sentiment toward the Yoon administration just two years after he came into office, with the PPP barely managing to prevent the broader opposition bloc from taking a two-thirds majority. In the previous elections four year ago, the then ruling DP also clinched a landslide victory by securing a combined 180 seats with its satellite party while the United Future Party, the PPP's former name, and its sister party got 103 seats. Of the votes cast for the 46 proportional seats, more than 93 per cent have been counted. In the proportional race, the PPP's sister

People Future Party was leading with 37 per cent, followed by the DP's sister Democratic United Party with 27 per cent and Cho's Rebuilding Korea Party with 24 per cent. This year's vote carried extra weight for the PPP as a failure to regain a majority could potentially render the Yoon administration a lame duck for the remaining three years of his single five-year term, ending in 2027. The PPP has pleaded for voter support, imploring that the Yoon administration has been unable to push its reform agenda properly forward for the past two years due to the uncooperative Parliament under Opposition control. The DP, on the other hand, has urged voters to pass stern judgment on what it calls the "incompetent" Yoon administration, accusing it of causing the economy and the livelihoods of the people to worsen seriously and mishandling a series of controversial issues for the past two years. Following the release of exit poll results on Wednesday, PPP leader Han Dong-hoon expressed disappointment.

N.Korea's Kim Jong-un vows to deal 'death-blow' to enemy in event of confrontation

North Korean leader Kim Jong-un has vowed to mobilise all means to deal a "death-blow" to the country's enemy without hesitation should it opt for military confrontation with North Korea, state media said on Thursday. Kim made the remark during his visit to the Kim Jong-il University of Military and Politics on Wednesday, according to the Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) said as quoted by Yonhap news agency report. "He said that now is the time to be more thoroughly prepared for a war than ever before and that North Korea should be



more firmly and perfectly prepared for a war, which should be won without fail, not just for a possible war," the KCNA

added. Kim was also quoted as instructing the university to nurture new military talents who are absolutely loyal to the

party central committee and are capable of overwhelming the enemy with "ideological, mental, militant, moral and tactical superiority," it said. North Korea has been ramping up weapons tests this year, including launches of cruise missiles from both sea and land and firing drills involving super-large multiple rocket launchers. Last week, it claimed to have successfully test-fired a new intermediate-range ballistic missile tipped with a hypersonic warhead, saying that all missiles the country has developed are solid-fuel, nuclear capable with warhead control capability.

Australian PM welcomes US Prez's consideration of dropping prosecution of WikiLeaks founder

Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese on Thursday welcomed news that US President Joe Biden is considering a request to drop the prosecution of WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange. Albanese expressed encouragement after Biden's remark in Washington that the US is mulling over Australia's request to drop the charges against Assange for the release of confidential records in 2010, Xinhua news agency reported. "I believe this must be brought to a conclusion and that Mr. Assange has already paid a significant price and enough is enough," Albanese told state media Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) television. "There's nothing to be gained by Mr. Assange's continued incarceration, in my very strong view."



An Australian citizen who founded WikiLeaks in Australia in 2006, Assange is currently trying to appeal his extradition from the UK to the US to face trial for the 2010 leaks. The UK High Court in March asked the US for assurances that Assange would have a fair trial and not face the death penalty if convicted before making a final decision in May on whether he can appeal the extradition order. Albanese in February supported a motion raised in the federal parliament by independent MP Andrew Wilkie calling for Assange's return to Australia. Wilkie was among a delegation of MPs who in September traveled to Washington where they urged politicians and officials to abandon extradition efforts for Assange. On Thursday, Wilkie told ABC radio that Biden's comment was very encouraging.

17 killed as truck plunges into ravine in Pakistan

At least 17 people were killed and 40 others injured after a truck plunged into a ravine in Pakistan's Balochistan province, local media reported. The incident occurred on Wednesday night when the truck, carrying 50 people, was proceeding towards Shah Noorani shrine, Dawn reported quoting a police official as saying. The rescue operation concluded on Thursday morning, as per Manan Baloch, the Edhi Foundation's Hub in-charge. In the morning, Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Sarfraz Bugti expressed grief over the loss of lives in the accident. He directed the authorities to provide the best medical facilities to the injured. Frequent accidents with high fatalities are common in the country due to the lack of adequate safety measures, insufficient driver training, and outdated transport infrastructure. Pakistan recorded over 27,000 deaths in road accidents in 2018, as per WHO estimates.

China tried to interfere but Canadians decided the polls in 2019, 2021: Justin Trudeau

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has said China tried to meddle in the election process in his country twice -- 2019 and 2021, but asserted that it was fair. The elections were decided by Canadians, Trudeau said on Wednesday in his testimony before a commission probing alleged foreign interference in the polls. The commission was set up last year after media reports about China's interference in the polls. However, the Chinese Embassy in Canada denied any interference in Canadian affairs. The commission is set to complete its initial report by May 3 and final report by 2024 end, The Guardian reported.

Earlier, India was accused of meddling in the polls and later the allegation was ruled out by Canada. Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) on Monday said that China has "clandestinely and deceptively" interfered in the Canadian elections. "We know that the Peoples' Republic of China (PRC) clandestinely and deceptively interfered in both the 2019 and 2021 elections," CSIS said during a briefing to the commission. Trudeau's Liberal Party had won both the elections. The Conservatives lead campaigner, during the 2021 election, Erin O'Toole, estimated Chinese "interference" cost his party up to nine seats.



Wardha BJP MP's estranged daughter-in-law in fray as independent, slams family

In a huge embarrassment to Wardha's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MP Ramdas Tadas, his estranged daughter-in-law on Thursday accused his family of harassment, assault, and torture, and is challenging him in the Lok Sabha elections as an Independent. Pooja Pankaj Shendre-Tadas, along with her 17-month-old son, flanked by Shiv Sena-UBT Deputy Leader Sushma Andhare, narrated her plight with the Tadas family for over three years at a media meet this afternoon. She contended that she was forced into marriage allegedly to save her husband Pankaj R. Tadas from a rape charge nearly three years ago, but after that, she "was tortured, beaten with an iron rod, thrown out of a flat where she lived, and even denied food on several occasions". "Prime Minister Narendra Modi is coming to Wardha on April 20 for election campaign. I plan to meet and appeal to him for justice as a daughter of the country," Pooja Tadas said.



but after the son was born, her husband disowned him and he, along with her father-in-law Ramdas Tadas, asked her to conduct a DNA test to prove the child's paternity. "I have been undergoing such abuses, humiliation in the name of a DNA test for our baby, and other forms of harassment... If Ramdas Tadas, as an MP, cannot give justice to his own daughter-in-law, then what will he do for the people of society? I want PM's intervention to help me," she demanded.

Pooja Tadas claimed that when she had visited Ramdas Tadas' home once, she was abused and assaulted with an iron rod, and after she was thrown out of the flat which the Tadas family sold off, she had no place to live.

On his part, Tadas, who is contesting the LS polls for a hat-trick win,

denied all the allegations and said: "I have no relation with my son (Pankaj) or his wife (Pooja), they don't live with me", adding they got married without informing him.

Pooja Tadas countered this by asking that if he had disowned his son (Pankaj), then why is he still living in Tadas' house while kicking her out along with her toddler son?

Intervening, Andhare said that the BJP talks of things like women's reservation and empowerment, the Modi Parivar, etc, then why is the daughter and child of a family member of the BJP Parivar being denied justice?

Tadas said that the issue of his son's marriage was very old, but "it is being raked up now by the Opposition parties to make political capital" in the LS elections. His son Pankaj Tadas claimed that he was "honey-trapped" into the whole mat-



ter and there are half a dozen police and court cases pending on different aspects, including a divorce case in which his estranged wife is not cooperating.

The issue erupted in the public domain over two years ago when the Maharashtra State Commission for Women Chairperson Rupali Chakankar tweeted a video, and the police provided security to Pooja Tadas. Pankaj Tadas alleged that two politicians were involved in defaming his father just before the elections, such attempts were made even before the 2019 LS polls, and even the latest episode is a conspiracy of the Opposition parties to mar his father (Ramdas Tadas)'s prospects. Pooja Tadas has decided to contest the Wardha LS seat as an independent against her father-in-law, and Andhare said she will support her as a distressed woman crying for justice.

Praful Patel is lying on Sharad Pawar's stance regarding BJP, says NCP(SP)

On Thursday rejected as "blatant lies" the claims by rival NCP leader Praful Patel on Sharad Pawar's stand regarding the BJP in Maharashtra. Praful Patel told a private channel that in July 2023, NCP(SP) President Sharad Pawar had made up his mind "50 per cent" to extend support to the BJP after his nephew Ajit Pawar split the party to join the ruling Mahayuti government. However, Sharad Pawar dithered at the last minute and it did not materialise, contended Patel. He added that while Ajit Pawar took oath as Deputy CM on July 2, 2023, a fortnight later, the breakaway faction leaders met Sharad Pawar in Mumbai and Pune, but the latter hesitated at the last minute. Dismissing Patel's statements as "blatant lies", NCP Chief Spokesperson Mahesh Tapase said this was a deliberate attempt by the NCP leader to sow confusion in the minds of the people ahead of the Lok Sabha elections.



"Sharad Pawar has firmly rejected any notion of supporting the BJP, both in principle and action, not once but on multiple occasions in public and private. This unequivocal dismissal stands as a testament to Sharad Pawar's unwavering commitment to his political convictions," Tapase pointed out.

Hitting back, Tapase said that Sharad Pawar's rejection of their purported proposal "is a clear source of frustration" for rival NCP leaders like Ajit Pawar, Patel and others and "they recognise their total dependence on Sharad Pawar's leadership to remain relevant in Maharashtra politics."

Taking a potshot, Tapase pointed out how the recent closure of certain serious

cases against Ajit Pawar have exposed the real motives behind his group's allegiance to the BJP, against the proclaimed notions of "genuine developmental intent."

The NCP(SP) Chief Spokesperson said that adding to the woes of the rival group is the fact that Ajit Pawar lacks the moral authority to control the NCP name and 'Clock' symbol which he grabbed by backstabbing his uncle Sharad Pawar's leadership.

Tapase warned that the people of Maharashtra were observing these things very closely and as the polls approach, the NCP(SP) remains committed to public welfare under Sharad Pawar's leadership and "the voters will choose wisely."

Delhi murder convict nabbed in Mumbai after three-year run

A life convict in a murder case, who jumped parole and was on the run for the last three years, was arrested from Mumbai, a Delhi Police official said on Thursday. To evade arrest, the accused, identified as Mohd. Mustaq, had changed his identity by shaving his beard and moustache.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime Branch) Amit Goel said that Mustaq, along with his two friends, had an altercation at a tea shop and the complainant's son informed the shop owner due to which accused persons got angry and threatened him.

On the next day, the accused persons called complainant's son and after some time, the complainant heard loud noise. When the complainant came out of his house, he found his son in a pool of blood. The complainant's son died



during treatment.

The complainant further alleged that out of grudge, all three accused persons had thrown his son from the fifth floor.

"After completion of the trial, Mustaq was sentenced to life imprisonment. He was released from jail on emergency parole for 90 days during COVID-19 pandemic on May 15, 2021 but he did not surrender and has been absconding since then," said the DCP.

However, on April 6, specific input was received that he is presently living in Mumbai.

"Acting upon the inputs, the team traced the convict/parole jumper from the densely populated slum area Govandi, Mumbai. As there was no specific address, the team acted as Election Officers and went to more than 500 houses to make voter cards for the upcoming Lok Sabha Elections. The untiring efforts of the team resulted in the apprehending of the convict," said the DCP.

On interrogation, Mustaq disclosed that after he was released on emergency parole, he went to his village and got married.

"He did not have any source of income there and police were also looking for him so he went to Mumbai and started working there in embroidery godown," the DCP added.

Have SOP for hospitals concerning termination of pregnancy beyond 24 weeks: HC to Maha govt

The Nagpur bench of the Bombay High Court has directed the Maharashtra government to formulate a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for handling cases related to termination of pregnancy beyond 24 weeks.

A division bench of Chief Justice Devendra Kumar Upadhyaya and Justice Nitin Sambre in its order of April 5 noted that the amended Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act permits termination of pregnancy beyond 24 weeks in cases of severe abnormalities in the foetus.

Under the amended provisions of the Act, the state government is required to constitute medical boards in each district which has the power and discretion to allow or deny termination of pregnancy beyond 24 weeks of gestation period.

The bench was hearing a petition filed by a woman seeking termination of her



32-week pregnancy due to abnormalities in the foetus. As per the plea, the general hospital in Wardha informed the woman about the fetal abnormalities during her 24th-week scan.

While giving relief to the woman, the bench noted that it was disturbing that instead of referring her to the medical board directly, the hospital asked the petitioner to approach the court to seek termination of the pregnancy.

The high court said the provisions of the amended MTP Act permit termination

of pregnancy exceeding 24 weeks if the medical board thinks that way and has diagnosed that the foetus has substantial abnormalities.

"Under the Scheme of the MTP Act as amended up-to-date, there is no such requirement of seeking any permission from the court by any woman who intends to get her pregnancy terminated even if the pregnancy is beyond 24 weeks," HC said.

The bench permitted the woman to terminate the pregnancy and directed the general hospital in Wardha to bear the expenses.

Medical officer, his nurse wife booked for amassing 'disproportionate assets'

A case has been registered against a medical officer and his wife posted at a government hospital for allegedly amassing assets disproportionate to their known sources of income, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) said, reported news agency.

The accused were identified as Dr Vijay Eknath Gavli (57), who is currently serving as a medical officer at the Sub Divisional Hospital at

Panvel, and his wife Varsha (54), employed as a staff Nurse with the Sub-district Hospital at Pen (both in Raigad district), an ACB release said. During their government service, the couple misused their position and collected disproportionate wealth, it said. On September 19, 2018, an offence of demand and acceptance of a bribe was registered against the doctor, it said. Following that, an inquiry was conducted into the income of the family

members for the period from January 2008 to September 2018, and it was found that the couple had collected wealth to the tune of Rs 1,52,40,530 which was more than their known sources of income and hence a case was registered against them, the ACB said.

Based on the complaint filed by the ACB, the couple was booked under the Prevention of Corruption Act at the Pen police station on Wednesday, the agency added.

Eight African women rescued after police bust sex racket; two others arrested

Police on Thursday arrested two African women for running a sex racket in Navi Mumbai, and rescued their eight female compatriots, an official said, reported news agency. The arrest was made after a raid was conducted at a row house in Kharghar area of Navi Mumbai around 9 pm on Wednesday, senior inspector Rajiv Shejwal said.

"Acting on a tip-off that some women from Africa were running a flesh trade at the row house, the police raided the premises and arrested two of them. Another woman managed to escape from the spot during the raid," he said.

"Eight African women, all in the age group of 25 to 30 years, were rescued. They are currently lodged at a rescue home," Shejwal said. A case was registered against the arrested duo and their absconding accomplice under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 370 (trafficking of person) and 120B (criminal conspiracy) and under the Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, he said.

Over 1.50 lakh new voters added in eight LS seats of Maharashtra

More than 1.52 lakh new voters have been registered in eight out of total 48 Lok Sabha constituencies in Maharashtra in the latest round of electoral roll revision, in which the number of new women voters was more than their male counterparts, officials said, reported news agency. In this special drive conducted by the Election Commission of India (ECI), as many as 82,658 new female voters were registered as against the 69,652 new male voters

in these eight constituencies - Buldhana, Akola, Amravati, Wardha, Yavatmal-Washim, Hingoli, Nanded, and Parbhani. However, the total number of female voters across these eight segments is way below the count of male voters. There are 53,99,057 female voters as against the 77,21,374 male voters. There are 432 voters registered as transgender, an official statement issued by the chief electoral office of Maharashtra. These eight constituencies will go to polls in the second phase on May 7.

Man booked for raping, impregnating social worker

The Navi Mumbai police have registered a case against a man for allegedly raping a 35-year-old Navi Mumbai social worker on several occasions and impregnating her, an official said, reported news agency. The 40-year-old accused, Nitin Gavand, hails from Avre village at Uran in Raigad district, while the victim belongs to Kopri in Navi Mumbai's Vashi, he said. "In 2018, the accused befriended the Navi Mumbai social worker and assured to take care of her son. He repeatedly raped her at different locations and impregnated her. He also forced her to undergo abortion," the official of Vashi police station said. "Besides this, he purchased herbal medicines worth Rs 50,000 from the victim, but paid only Rs 31,500 in return," he said.

The case against him was registered under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 376 (rape), 376(2)(n) (repeated rape of same woman), 420 (cheating), 313 (causing miscarriage and death of a woman), 504 (intentional insult) and 506 (criminal intimidation), he said, adding that a probe was on.

The roster includes notable names such as Francis Ford Coppola with 'Megalopolis' starring Adam Driver, George Miller with 'Furiosa' featuring Anya Taylor-Joy, and 'Star Wars' creator George Lucas, who will be feted with an honorary Palme d'Or.

Kevin Costner will also be on hand with the first installment of his Western epic, 'Horizon. An American Saga'. Some of the high-profile films in the pipeline for this year's competition, according to

'Variety', include 'Poor Things' helmed by Yorgos Lanthimos; 'Kinds of Kindness', a stylised three-part story set in the present that reunites the Greek director with Emma Stone and Willem Dafoe; Paul Schrader's 'Oh Canada' with Richard Gere, based on a screenplay by the late Russell Banks ('Affliction'); Jacques Audiard's musical melodrama 'Emilia Perez' with Zoe Saldana and Selena Gomez; Paolo Sorrentino's 'Parthenope' starring Gary Oldman; and David Cronenberg's 'The Shrouds' featuring Vincent Cassel and Diane Kruger.

There's also Coralie Fargeat's 'The Substance', a female-powered horror film starring Demi Moore and Margaret Qualley. 'Barbie' director Greta Gerwig will be presiding over the jury.

Last year, the festival set a record

"Maybe you like that country better than the country you left behind. All I can say is, don't worry (about aging). It's cool."

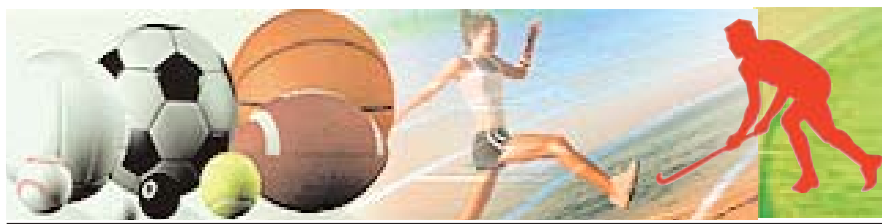
The Academy Award-winning actress also feels that life is about "taking risks" and that people should be more keen to take on "challenges" that might scare them.

IPL 2024: Ishan, Surya hammer blazing fifties as Mumbai Indians thrash RCB by 7 wickets

Ishan Kishan and Suryakumar Yadav hammered blazing half-centuries in a brilliant display of power-hitting as Mumbai Indians thrashed Royal Challengers Bengaluru by seven wickets with 27 balls to spare for their second successive victory in Match 25 of Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024 at the Wankhede Stadium here on Thursday.

Ishan Kishan set a breakneck pace as he hammered a 23-ball half-century on his way to a 34-ball 69, adding 72 runs off the first six overs and raising a century-partnership with Rohit Sharma (38) as Mumbai Indians raced to 199/3 in 15.3 overs, Jasprit Bumrah had set up Mumbai Indians for victory with a sensational bowling display, claiming 5-21 off after Faf du Plessis (61), Rajat Patidar (50) and Dinesh Karthik (52 not out) struck superb half-centuries to help RCB reach a challenging 196/8 in 20 overs.

Suryakumar Yadav then took over, hitting a 17-ball half-century, the second fastest this season only in his second match on return from an ankle injury and a sports hernia operation



in Germany. He scored 52 off 19 balls, hitting five boundaries and three sixes. This was Mumbai Indians' fifth victory at the Wankhede and second victory in five matches in IPL 2024, which took the five-time champions to seventh position in the 10-team competition after Hardik Pandya won the toss and asked RCB to bat first.

Suryakumar Yadav continued to torment the RCB bowlers. A four and a six followed by two more boundaries off Topley in the 13th over as SKY sliced, scooped and flicked off his wrists as he stormed to his half-century off 17 balls. He was finally out in the 14th over, finding the fielder off Vijaykumar Vyshak, scything it

straight to deep point for Lomror to pick a fine catch.

Hardik Pandya, who was booed once again by the crowd but also had a section of the stands rooting for him, started with a six off Will Jacks off the first ball. He hammered Vyshak for a six in the 14th over before sealing victory with a six, a brilliant shot to end the match as Mumbai Indians chased down 197 in 15.3 overs, giving their Net Run Rate a much-needed boost after starting IPL 2024 with three successive defeat. Hardik remained unbeaten on 21 with Tilak Varma remained 16 not out as Mumbai Indians won the match with 27 balls to spare. Akash Deep conceded 1-55 in 3.3 overs while Vijaykumar Vyshak claimed 1-32 for RCB.

Joe Root to make red-ball return for Yorkshire after two years

Joe Root is all set to play in the second round of the County Championship this week against Gloucestershire, marking his first red-ball outing for Yorkshire in nearly two years.

Root's absence from the domestic scene since May 2022 has been felt keenly, his sporadic appearances in T20 cricket and the Hundred unable to quench the thirst of the Yorkshire faithful. Now, with the Ashes and subcontinent tour behind him, Root's focus shifts back to the traditional format, where his elegant stroke play and astute leadership promise to reignite Yorkshire's fortunes.

Root will play the next four rounds after missing the initial match against Leicestershire due to the two-month tour of India. The seventh round, which starts on May 24, will take place away from home in Northamptonshire. The 33-year-old, who had resigned as Test captain, had not played first-class cricket for



his home county since May 2022 against Warwickshire.

Joining Root in the fray is the dynamic Harry Brook, who had not played since England's white-ball tour of the West Indies in December 2023 after withdrawing from the India series following the death of his grandmother Pauline. Brook scored scintillating unbeaten century in his comeback in 69 deliveries. Indian campaign ends as Prannoy, Sindhu suffer second round defeat

India's campaign came to an early end at the Badminton Asia Championship as Olympics medalist PV Sindhu and Asian Games medal winner HS Prannoy lost their respective second-round matches on Thursday.

Sindhu lost to 6th seed Han Yue of China in a three-game battle with a scoreline of 18-21, 21-13, 17-21. On the other hand, HS Prannoy was defeated by World No. 19 Li Chun Yi in a disappointing straight-game defeat, losing 18-21, 11-21.

Coming into the match, Sindhu had a lead of 5-0 over Han Yue in head-to-head record. The Indian star fought valiantly, her resilience shining through as she battled her opponent in a grueling three-game encounter. Despite a sensational fightback in the second game, Sindhu's hopes were dashed as Han Yue emerged victorious, cheered on by the fervent local crowd.

The disappointment weighed heavy on Sindhu's shoulders, echoing the struggles she had faced in recent tournaments. From the All England Open to the Madrid Open, she had



encountered setbacks, grappling with inconsistency since her return from a long injury layoff. India's doubles hope also vanished as Ashwini Ponnappa and Tanisha Crasto lost to 3rd seeds Nami Matsuyama and Chiharu Shida 17-21, 12-21 in the women's doubles second round. While Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty opted out of the premier continental tournament, Paris-bound shuttles Sindhu, Prannoy and Laskhya Sen were shown the door early.

MAYBE KISHOR WILL GET TO 90M BEFORE ME: NEERAJ CHOPRA

Tokyo Olympic champion Neeraj Chopra remarked that while he's often questioned about reaching the 90m throw, he suggested that maybe his compatriot Kishor Jena would achieve the mark before him.

Jena, a rising javelin throw star, won silver with his personal best throw of 87.54m at the Asian Games last year, finishing behind Neeraj who reclaimed the gold. For the first time in the history of the Asian Games, Chopra and Kishore Kumar Jena made it a javelin one-two in Hangzhou 2023.

With his silver-winning throw at Asiad, Jena has breached the Paris Olympic qualification mark of 85.50m.

During the virtual media interaction, when asked about Jena's resurgence at the international stage and having two Indian javelin throwers competing at the World level, Neeraj hailed his compatriot and said it would be a dream come true if there were two Indians on the podium at the Olympics.

"It would be a dream come true if



we had two Indians on the podium in Paris. Who knows, there might be more than two as well. We already had two on the podium at the Asian Games... but it would be even more satisfying if we had two at the Olympics. I think Jena will be working hard to make that happen. I think he will throw well there.

"Last year, he progressed well from the Worlds to the Asian Games. He's made a lot of improvement, while I've been stuck at 88m since 2018. And

since everyone keeps asking me about getting to 90m, who knows maybe Kishor will get to 90m before me!"

After kick-starting his season at the Doha Diamond League meet on May, Neeraj will compete at the Paavo Nurmi Games in June to face a high-quality field of competitors which include the name of Germany's Max Dehning, who became the youngest javelin thrower to breach the coveted 90m mark earlier this year with

90.20m throw, which is the world-leading mark.

Addressing the prospect of competing against Max, the reigning world champion expressed that it's nothing new to face off against someone who has thrown 90m. He added that he's eager for the opportunity to compete against Max.

"When I competed at the Tokyo Olympics and also at last year's world championships and other events, many athletes had throws over 90m. So, it's not a new thing to compete against people who have thrown that distance," he said.

"Like I always said; what matters is what you can throw on that day. I am excited to get a chance to compete against them. The more they throw in competition, the more fun it becomes. When we are competing together, the main factor that determines the winner is who handles the pressure on that day better than the others.

"I will compete with Max at the Paavo Nurmi games. I've never competed with him before. He went from throwing 79m straight into 90m. He skipped the 80m page completely," he added.

Sinner sweeps past Korda, Tsitsipas dispatches Etcheverry in Monte-Carlo

In his first match on clay this season, Jannik Sinner sweeps past Sebastian Korda 6-1, 6-2 to reach the third round at the Monte-Carlo Masters.

Sinner saved all three break points he faced and was impressive on his first-serve, winning 95 per cent (20/21) of points behind his first delivery to advance after 76 minutes.

The 22-year-old will next play Jan-Lennard Struff after the German defeated Borna Coric on Tuesday to earn his 200th tour-level win.

Sinner is chasing his second crown on clay after winning in Umag in 2022. He is making his fourth appearance in the Principality, where he advanced to the semi-finals last season.

Meanwhile, two-time champion Stefanos Tsitsipas also raced into the third round after the Greek dispatched Tomas Martin Etcheverry 6-1, 6-0 in just 64 minutes to set a third-round clash against Alexander Zverev.

Tsitsipas, a champion in 2021 and 2022 in the Principality, struck 22 winners and broke Etcheverry's serve six times according to ATP Stats to improve to 16-3 at the clay-court event.

The fourth seed Daniil Medvedev reached the third round in the Principality for the third time with a 6-2, 6-4 win over Frenchman Gael Monfils. Medvedev, who reached the semi-finals in

Monte-Carlo last season, will next play Karen Khachanov after the World No. 17 defeated Francisco Cerundolo 4-6, 6-4, 6-3.

Medvedev enjoyed success on clay last year, winning his maiden tour-level title on the surface at the ATP Masters 1000 event in Rome. The 28-year-old is chasing his first trophy of the season this week, with his best result in 2024 a final run at the Australian Open.

Casper Ruud dispatched Chilean Alejandro Tabilo 6-2, 6-4 in one hour and 23 minutes to reach the third round.

Ruud, who has captured nine of his 10 tour-level titles on clay, will meet 10th seed Hubert Hurkacz following his 21st tour-level victory of the year.

In other action, Holger Rune was leading 6-3, 2-1 when play was suspended for the day due to rain. The 20-year-old, who is competing in his first clay-court match of the season, reached the title match in Monte-Carlo last year.

Grigor Dimitrov, fresh off his final run in Miami, held a 6-4, 2-1 advantage against Miomir Kecmanovic when rain halted their match.

STEVEN SMITH JOINS MAJOR LEAGUE CRICKET'S WASHINGTON FREEDOM

Australian cricket star Steven Smith has officially signed with Major League Cricket (MLC) franchise Washington Freedom ahead of the second season starting from July 4. Smith, who owns an apartment in New York, expressed his excitement about the opportunity, calling it "pretty cool" to be part of the burgeoning cricket scene in America.

With a successful stint in the Big Bash League under his belt and a desire to make an impact on the global stage.

(22 off 11), Gujarat Titans pulled off a thrilling last-ball win over Rajasthan Royals on Wednesday night.

Before showcasing his batting skills, the 25-year-old Afghan all-rounder bowled an economical spell, finishing with figures of 1-18 in his four-over quota. He was adjudged Player of the Match for his all-round show in GT's win.

Speaking on to Star Sports on Cricket Live, Gavaskar praised Rashid's commitment to the game. "Yeah he didn't hit the wickets like he usually does, but when he was needed with the bat he came and delivered. This is the reason he's such a wanted player by franchises all around the world. sometimes can be a little concerned about diving on their bowling shoulder,

because if they dislocate their shoulder careers are in threat. Not

with Rashid Khan, he just wants to give 100%." "There's another cricketer who is not playing in this IPL but who's again similar is Ben Stokes. Anytime you see Ben Stokes batting, bowling or fielding he's a 100%, he gives it everything. And those are the cricketers that coaches and captains want, they might not always deliver but you know the percentage is not going to be anything less than a 100%," he added. Former Australia cricketer Aaron Finch echoed the same sentiments on Rashid's performance against RR, he said, "It's not easy picking Rashid Khan, particularly when he bowls in the powerplay and he created a couple of chances too, Mathew Wade put a couple of tough chances down. In a game where almost 400 runs were scored, for a guy to go below 20, it's extraordinary. We talked about it pre game that

he may be back to his best after surgery, but he put us all to shame tonight. He just got the job done and that's the great thing, always gets his 100% and gets the job done."

Besides GT batters, Rajasthan Royals' in-form batter Riyan Parag also stole the show with his impressive batting display. He hit three fours and five sixes in his third fifty of the season coming at a strike-rate of 158.33. Parag's tally in IPL 2024 now stands at 251 runs in five matches, which is only second behind leading run-getter Virat Kohli. Gavaskar also shared his thoughts on Parag's performance, saying, "The way he's been batting, if he had got another eight deliveries to play, he could have scored 30 to 35 runs more in those eight deliveries. So, that would have resulted in Gujarat Titans chasing 225 instead of 197."

"And during a rehearsal, classmate Chris Borthwick, who plays the Inspector, suggests the famous line to be spoken at a particular

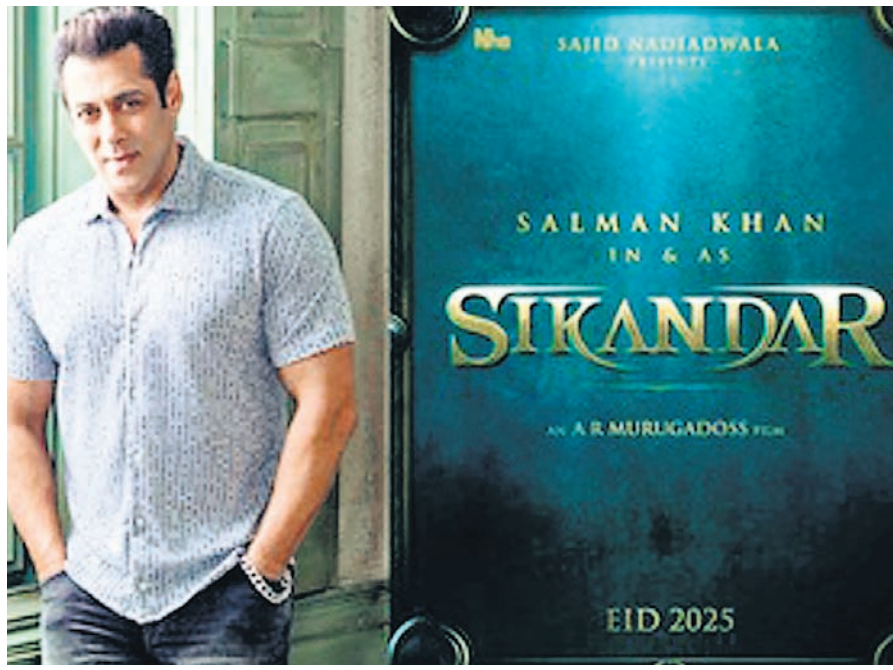


scene - impromptu... and the entire Hall comes down... It was the most popular song of the World... and gives me my best actor Cup - the Kendall Cup."
